
How Al Crawford's promise to his dying father led to Hambletonian glory

Twelve years ago, Jim Crawford's dying wish was for his son to keep Crawford Farms in the family. Saturday, Al and Michelle Crawford more than made good on that promise when the filly they bred beat the boys in the 95th Hambletonian.

Al and Michelle Crawford remember the recent conversation that led to Ramona Hill's entry into the 95th Hambletonian, foregoing the \$600,000 Hambletonian Oaks to take on the boys and a shot at the lion's share of the \$1 million purse.

Last fall, the Muscle Hill filly delivered a Breeders Crown championship for trainer Tony Alagna and the partnership of Brad Grant, Robert Leblanc, In the Gym Partners and

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic which forced a limited capacity at The Meadowlands racetrack, Ramona Hill's breeders and part-owners Michelle and Al Crawford weren't going to miss cheering their filly on to victory.

Crawford Farms Racing. In turn, that led to the Dan Patch Award as the sport's top freshman trotting filly. Now, the group had a chance at history on the sport's biggest day.

"We met Tony at the farm. He came to look at Ramona's sister," Al said. "We told him we'd like to go (to the Hambletonian). Brad owns 40 per cent and he had talked to Tony. He had done it before and he knew a filly could do it. He told Tony, 'If the Crawfords want to go, I want to go."

The Crawfords and Grant were members of the partnership — also including trainer Rick Zeron, Holland Racing Stable and Howard Taylor — behind filly Atlanta's historic 2018 Hambletonian triumph over the boys.

Saturday afternoon, the Crawfords returned to the winner's circle not just owning a piece of the newly-minted champion — the 15th filly to claim the top prize in trotting — but they also have the distinction of breeding Ramona Hill.

A \$70,000 yearling at Lexington, Al and Michelle bought back in for 25 per cent after the gavel fell.

"Maybe we were disappointed that she only brought \$70,000," Michelle said. "We talked to Tony after the sale and he said they didn't have it all partnered up yet. We said we would love to stay in on a piece of her. So doing that and watching this filly develop and grow over the last two years, nobody ever dreamed that we were going to be in the winner's circle watching her beat the boys today in the Hambo. It was insane!"

The filly is the first foal out of Lucky Chucky mare Lock Down Lindy, whom the Crawfords campaigned in partnership with In The Gym Partners, Mystical Marker Farms and Joe Sbrocco. Alagna conditioned the filly during her two seasons



of competition. Lock Down Lindy hit the board in 13 of 22 starts, taking a sophomore mark of 1:51.4 at the Meadowlands winning her Hambletonian Oaks elimination. Sent off as the slight second choice, the trotter broke stride at the half and finished last. She retired as a broodmare with earnings of \$192,929.

"When we had Lock Down Lindy, we knew how fast she was and she was a really, really nice mare. When it came time for her to be a broodmare, we bought her out and we wanted to breed her to something that was going to be dynamic," said Michelle. "We thought Muscle Hill was the best bet for that and would give her the best shot."

Hours after Ramona Hill's victory, and still processing the day's events — the Crawfords are also part owners of Oaks champion Sorella and Cane Pane champ Tall Dark Stranger — Al talked about how far Crawford Farms has come from its early beginnings in Durhamville, NY. His parents, Jim and Patricia, established Crawford Farms in 1966, and the operation supported the New York program. His father also served as a president of the Harness Horse Breeders of New York State.

"It was always a small, New York Sires Stakes farm. My dad and my mom bred to Precious Fella, Most Happy Fella; we stayed heavily in New York," Al said. "My dad passed away about 12 years ago at 68. I wish he was here with us today because the farm has come a long way to breed a Hambo winner."

The fact that the farm still exists is due to a conversation between father and son shortly before Jim's passing from cancer.

"He said, 'Your mom and your brother are probably going to want to sell the farm. It's in tough shape," Al said of the exchange. "'Could you do me a favor? Could you keep it?' I said, 'Yeah, dad, I can do that.' He passed away three days later."

Al Crawford admits the first five years were tough. The 10 mares on the farm were all barren, and the facilities were showing their age. Thus, the work began to revitalize Crawford Farms. In a concerted effort by the couple, the farm has dramatically increased its visibility in the sport. Through sponsorship of major races, investment in top racing and breeding talent, and involvement in endeavors including horse rescue, the focus is on building a brand and backing it with results. The operation now boasts around 350 horses that include mares, babies, yearlings, racehorses and retired racers. The couple has purchased 1,100 acres near Cazenovia Lake that is currently under development as the next stage in the burgeoning farm. With a Hambletonian champion to

its credit, Crawford Farms is building a reputation for producing winners.

"We're trying to bring the farm to a national prominence to where you can say it is on par with some of the top breeders in the business," Al said.

This fall, Crawford Farms will have 62 yearlings to sell. One filly in the group, La Vie En Blanc, is a half-sister to Ramona Hill, the sport's newest millionaire. Al Crawford is debating whether to keep the Chapter Seven filly or consign her for auction. Should she catalog, she would attract a great deal of attention after big sis stormed to a 1:50.1 victory, a mark that equaled her sire Muscle Hill's stakes record. Al has to make the tough decision by Monday.

Whatever the Crawfords decide. Jim Crawford would be proud that his son honored his wishes, and together Al and Michelle have transformed Crawford Farms into the force it is today.

\$1 million Hambletonian

Ramona Hill equals 1:50.1 Hambletonian record

Her victory in the 95th Hambletonian equalled the stakes record set by her sire, Muscle Hill, and made her the 15th filly — and second in three years — to beat the boys.

The sensational filly Ramona Hill took a well-deserved gulp from the Hambletonian trophy after beating the boys on Saturday (Aug. 8) in the \$1 million trotting classic at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

It was the latest chapter in the developing saga of harness racing's newest superstar.

Ramona Hill became the 15th filly to win the Hambletonian when Andrew McCarthy steered her to a 1:50.1 victory that tied the stakes victory set by her sire, Muscle Hill.

The victory, the 15th by a filly in the race's illustrious history — and the second in three years — was hardly a surprise. She was the 2-5 favorite following the previous week's jaw-dropping win from an impossible spot, kicking home with a :25.4 final quarter in the Hambletonian eliminations.

It was the first Hambletonian victory for trainer Tony Alagna (left with caretaker Victor Rosales).

She was just as good in the final. Andy McCarthy turned Ramona Hill loose down the backside and she easily surged past Threefiftytwo to take command for good.

"When I came out early there, I sensed I could find the front," McCarthy said. "I went for it, and she knows her job."

As Ramona Hill made the lead, main rivals Ready For Moni —


As Ramona Hill made the lead, main rivals Ready For Monithe other elimination winner — and Back Of The Neck took up the chase.

Through the lane, Ramona Hill remained solidly in command, beating Ready For Moni by a length with Back Of The Neck third.

"She was starting to work a little bit towards the wire, but she finished it off," McCarthy said.

The time for the mile only confirmed what observers already knew: Ramona Hill is the real deal. The 1:50.1 clocking equaled the stakes mark set by her sire Muscle Hill in 2009.

It was a muted winner's circle celebration with access limited and everyone masked to ward off the coronavirus.

"What a great performance by a tremendous filly," Campbell said. "Throughout history, society has dealt with crises and troubles, but great horses and great horse racing have found a way to bring people together to forget about what's going on in their everyday lives. I think that's what's happened here today."

It was the first Hambletonian victory for both McCarthy and trainer Tony Alagna, who took a very patient approach with his talented filly. The race was only her fourth of the year and 11th of her career.

"People talked earlier about how COVID affected this filly's schedule," Alagna said. "Honestly, this was our schedule from the beginning, with or without COVID. She's very much like a thoroughbred. She doesn't need the starts to be at her best."

Of course, the Hambletonian Oaks for fillies earlier in the day was a possible target. But after Ramona Hill cruised to a convincing win in the Del Miller on July 18, Alagna set his sights on the bigger goal.

"We always had it (the Hambletonian) in the back of our minds, but nobody wanted to be the first one to say it," Alagna said. "After the Del Miller, it became a reality."

It had already been a great afternoon for McCarthy with four victories. Number five, the Hambletonian, will be the one he'll always remember.

"It was a very good start to the day and I was trying to keep my cool, and I was trying to let it sink in too much because I still had a lot of work to do," McCarthy said.

The driver and the filly completed the mission in style.

"The adrenalin you get from winning a race like this, words can't explain it," the Australian reinsman said. "It's an amazing event and a privilege to be involved."


With the victory, Ramona Hill improved her record to 9-0-2 in 11 starts for Brad Grant, Crawford Farms Racing, Robert LeBlanc and In The Gym Partners. The 2019 Breeders Crown and Dan Patch Award winner is the second filly to capture the Hambletonian in the last three renewals, joining Atlanta (2018).

If you couldn't make it to the track the Meadowlands provided us with numerous ways to view the entire card of racing that even included watching on their own website without paying for it. That was a smart step for Gural and company. It should be like that every day.

Alagna and Andrew McCarthy. US Captain at 26-1, pulling the

Angers Bayama started off the day with a brilliant 1:48.3 effort to win his third race in a row for Crawford Farms, Tony

"White Knight for the first time, was second making it an Alagna exacta in race one.

Kudos to race caller **Ken Warkentin** for bringing up the great losses to the racing community from the COVID-19 virus that devastated the Brennan and Fusco families.

Alagna and McCarthy continued their roll with **Reflect With Me** steamrolling by stablemate Lady Lou in the Shady Daisy.
The Brittany Farm and Brad Grant owned filly won her fourth

in a row to remain undefeated in 2020. It was the second McCarthy/Sears exacta in a row.

Very smart move by Ake Svanstedt in the third race, the Steele Memorial, to push Manchego to a :54 half with Plunge Blue Chip. Unfortunately, he could only garner second money, but he made the race for **When Dovescry** who marched by for David Miller and Brett Pelling.

Fabulous post-race interview with Gabe Prewitt and Brett who is never at a loss for intelligent conversation with a microphone in his hand.

* * *

On the ugly side, Tim Tetrick gave a gift in the fourth race — the Continentalvictory named after one of the loves of my life — to Andrew McCarthy and **Caviart Eva** by a little over urging of Sweet Shirley Mae in the last sixteenth of the mile. She had a 21/2 length lead and looked to be a comfortable winner. It was the third win in the first four races for McCarthy. It was the first win of the afternoon for Nancy Takter.

My take from the **Jeff Gural** interview: it's good that the track is holding its own and betting is better than he expected. It's bad that he is worried about the state renewal



of the horse racing financial supplement and it's ugly that it seems imminent Vernon Downs and Tioga Downs will close for the season on Labor Day.

In an absolute romp, **Darlene Hanover** provided Andrew McCarthy his fourth win on the afternoon for Brett Bittle and Yankeeland Farm in the Jim Doherty Memorial, a race named after one of the nicest men I have had the pleasure to call my friend.

* * *

Talk about ugly, **the clock has been off** at the Meadowlands for two consecutive races by almost two seconds in the last quarter.

* * *

The sign of a great horseman is a trainer that can right the ship. Bettors Wish, a truly great colt, went through a funk for almost a month but Chris Ryder had him 110 per cent for the Sam McKee (who was very close to me and nicknamed himself "Little Gurf"). Owned in part by Art and Leah Zubrod, who are also very close to me, **Bettors Wish** charged to the front going to the half in :52, the three quarters in 1:19 and holding off the late charge of Backstreet Shadow for the victory.

Gabe Prewitt is a young breath of fresh air in what has been called an old man's sport. He is bright, upbeat and very articulate. He is knowledgeable on every facet of the game and has a talented eye for a good horse. Not that anyone is a good handicapper but he is better than the average. It's this writer's opinion that he would make a great addition to the Meadowlands on a permanent basis.

* * *

The day continued to get better as it went on as more of my buddies entered the winner's circle. The Mark Harder trained and Emma Petterson babied, **Zenith Stride**, a \$350,000 yearling owned by the Rosatis —no strangers to big ticket yearlings — was craftily guided by the "White Knight" to a handy Peter Haughton victory that paid \$177 to win.

* * *

In the early interviews, Yannick Gingras almost guaranteed a win for **Sorella** in the Hambletonian Oaks with the statement "she will be racing without shoes and will be a full second faster." She did not disappoint and the listening audience must have been paying attention to Yannick's disclosure as she paid only \$3.60 for the win. Another big

win for Crawford Farms this afternoon and a big win for the Fannins — breeder and owner of the winner — and trainer Nancy Takter. The clock was wrong again and anyone who knows harness racing was most likely annoyed at the end of the race as I knew it was wrong, and they never made the correction until after the interviews and the replay. Stupid, stupid, stupid.

* * *

Lindy The Great and Andy Miller did a great job coming first up on Atlanta and wearing her down in mid-stretch to enable the White Knight to win his fifth in a row with **Gimpanzee** in the John Cashman Memorial. Lindy the Great was a hard-fought second. With his earnings from the victory, Brian Sears went over the \$200 million mark in lifetime earnings. The time of 1:50 was a new lifetime mark for the horse trained by Marcus Melander and owned by Courant and SRF. It was also a stakes record.

The Hambletonian certainly didn't disappoint. Not only did **Ramona Hill** prevail, but in doing so she tied the Hambletonian record of 1:50.1. Congratulations to Tony Alagna "the great American hope" on the trotting scene, as well as driver Andy McCarthy — with his fifth win on the afternoon — and all the owners Brad Grant, Crawford Farms,

Robert Leblanc and In The Gym Partners. The Crawfords were also the breeders of the filly.

Frank Antonacci made the comparison of the race to Lindy Lane and Continentalvictory. Although I am prejudiced, I think Ramona Hill was stronger at the wire than "Connie" was. Antonacci's Ready For Moni truly was a fabulous second coming first up against the great filly and beaten by a diminishing length.

I have a theory that to win the Hambletonian you should race exclusively at the Meadowlands Racetrack prior to the event and the only horses in the field that followed that theme finished one ,two, three.

John Campbell's post-race speech concerning the world situation at this time was poignant and rather eloquent. It is not surprising as he is always a good extemporaneous speaker.

It was great to see **Tall Dark Stranger** bounce off the mat as did Bettors Wish earlier in the day. It makes me wonder if it wasn't for Lasix would we see more of these two very special horses. In winning the Cane in stakes record time, Tall

Dark Stranger gave the Crawfords their third big stakes win on the day and congratulations to their partners Marvin Katz, Howard Taylor and Caviart Farms as well as the awesome team of Gingras and Takter.

The real ugly was **TVG** again. No surprise as we were up against the Travers and the Ellis Park Derby, but there was little or no effort to give us any serious coverage on our biggest day. However, I will say that their announcer today was a lot more cognizant of the ins and outs of harness racing than most of their broadcasters usually are.

Last but not least, to my friend **Dave Brower**: please never say she bled a little. That's like saying she's a little bit pregnant.

Observations from races on Hambletonian Day that ran mostly as expected

The Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks generally run to form, and this year was no exception.

Nearly all other major races through the stakes-laden card had somewhat predictable results, as well, with one notable exception, though the action certainly wasn't lacking.

Early in the card a pair of 1-9 shots were featured. **Reflect With Me** was able to survive and get up late by a neck over stablemate Lady Lou in the Shady Daisy, but Manchego didn't share that same fate in the John Steele Memorial. Seemingly having it her own way on the front, Manchego couldn't fend off an attack from **When Dovescry** that came at about the 3/8th's and had to settle for third when Plunge Blue Chip passed her also from the inside. There was no show betting in the small field, but there was somewhat bridge jumper place prices with When Dovescry paying \$11.20 to win and a not much less \$8.60 to place, while Plunge Blue Chip paid \$16.40 for second.

The price on When Dovescry was no doubt inflated by the overpowering mile that Manchego was coming off at Plainridge. It's always easy to say in retrospect, but her win was no surprise on paper. Making her third start of the year, she faced males in both the Hambletonian Maturity in a race won by Gimpanzee, and then just missed against an iron-tough veteran in JL Cruze. And if there were any doubters as to the talent of When Dovescry, hopefully this race put an end to that. Formerly trained throughout her career by Rene Allard, she made her third start for new trainer Brett Pelling and showed that her success, including a win on this same day last year in the Hambletonian Oaks, should be attributed to nothing other than her own talent. While Manchego didn't fire her best following her win the Spirt of Massachusetts Trot, neither did the runner-up from

that race, Atlanta. But who did fire a big one on Saturday that exited that same race was Lindy The Great.

Set off at 28-1 in the John Cashman Memorial Trot, Lindy The Great came first-over to put away Atlanta and lead into the final stages of the race. An upset looked within reach, but Gimpanzee was able to be one of the few horses to close from off the pace on the day and got up by less than a length for the team of Sears and Melander. One of the horses that I liked in the race and touted here in Friday's column (full story here) was Guardian Angel As. After leading early and then yielding to Atlanta for the pocket, Guardian Angel As was locked in behind that leader with nowhere to go for half the stretch and once he found room with apparent trot, promptly broke. It seems when you need it, the inside never opens up on these mile tracks, but when you have the leader it seems like the inside opens up about five paths at the top of the stretch. As for **Gimpanzee**, he's now run his unbeaten record this year to 5-for-5 and is in the midst of building a very impressive seasonal resume. For the winning drivers Sears, he went over \$200 million in career earnings with that win.

And speaking of Sears who arguably remains the best big money driver, sometimes things go to plan and sometimes they don't. In the Sam McKee memorial, nothing went right about DancinLou as the slight 2-1 favorite. In that race, after a brief tuck into 4thearly, Sears attempted a quarter-move after an opening pane of :25.3 that became pretty apparent wasn't going to happen. **Bettor's Wish** was having none of it as he parked out Dancin Lou past a half mile of :52.1 and did it rightfully so, as he managed to last all the way in 1:47.3 as the third choice in the wagering for Dexter Dunn and trainer Chris Ryder.

In the very next race though, Sears produced one of the highest paying horses ever on Hambletonian Day when his drive **Zenith Stride** paid \$177. A Muscle Hill colt trained by Mark Harder, the 85-1 chance won the \$319,000 Peter Haughton Memorial and in pretty comfortable fashion in the





end. When horses of odds that high win, you can look at the program 10 more times and still won't get how a win was possible. But in this case, there's actually a clear case that could have been made. Now it's easy to look at it in retrospect and I unfortunately didn't have it either, but there was always talent here. In debate of how useful qualifiers can be in handicapping, this should serve as a prime example that there is sometimes value. Over a month ago on July 3, Zenith Stride trotted a qualifier in 1:55.3. As if that time wasn't impressive in itself, the colt he ran second to and was only two lengths behind was Captain Corey, the unbeaten PASS star and arguably the best 2-year-old trotter in the sport right now. Zenith Stride's biggest issue then was simply being able to stay on stride, but with a flat mile it wasn't unfathomable to think that he could have been in the mix.

Conversely, there were no surprises with the 2-year-old filly trotters in the Jim Doherty Memorial. In that race, **Darlene Hanover** took all the money off her 7-2 morning line, was made the even-money favorite over morning line choice Altar and won dominantly as part of a career day for driver Andrew McCarthy.


The signature races on the card, the Hambletonian and the Oaks, couldn't have gone any more to script. In the Oaks, **Sorella** was

rightfully made the favorite over Hypnotic Am and won the race with her tactical advantage. Hypnotic Am was left with too much work to do after starting from post 12 in the second tier but was able to just hold off a hard-closing Panem, who rallied from the inside. It was a similar story in the Hambletonian, as the top three choices in the wagering ran 1-2-3. Hambletonian heroine **Ramona Hill** was hammered down to 2-5, and credit to McCarthy for making a decisive quarter-move which then forced Ready For Moni to have to come first-over. Back Of The Neck had every chance, but couldn't quicken off cover and had to settle for third.

Tall Dark Stranger continued with another odds-on win as he avenged his defeat from the prior week to the wrath of Captain Kirk. Responding to first time Lasix after bleeding last week, he looked as dominant as ever in posting a new career best time of 1:47.1.

Concluding the stakes on the day was **Shartin N** who once again asserted herself and delivered as another heavy favorite in the Lady Liberty. In winning the race for the third time in 1:48.2 and paying \$2.80, she made a group of talented mares look ordinary.







Michelle and Al Crawford had their greatest day ever being part of the winner's circles for three major stakes — the Hambletonian (Ramona Hill), Hambletonian Oaks (Sorella) and Cane Pace (Tall Dark Stranger).

Caviart Farms was well represented on Hambletonian Day, winning twice on the card highlighted by Tall Dark Stranger in the Cane Pace.

Weaver Bruscemi were rewarded twice on Hambletonian Day, and the Courant Stable has been a major presence as Marcus Melander got money in the Hambletonian final for his fourth straight year.

Alagna scratches seven-year itch

The seven year itch has been scratched. Tony Alagna became the first American-born trainer to win the Hambletonian since George Ducharme did it in 2013 with Royalty For Life. That was also the last time a favorite won.

Andy McCarthy's massive day

Andy McCarthy scored five victories (and \$840,000 in purses) on the day — Ramona Hill (Hambletonian), Darlene Hanover (Jim Doherty), Reflect With Me (Shady Daisy), Caviart Eva (Continentalvictory) and Angers Bayama (overnight)

Yannick Gingras won four races, Brian Sears won two, Dexter Dunn won two and Tim Tetrick, David Miller and Matt Kakaley won a race apiece.

The 2009 HOY and the 2012 HOY – both with 1:50.1 Meadowlands lifetime marks – dominated on the siring front on Saturday at the Big M. Muscle Hill had a record 28 entered, and captured the Hambletonian and the Oaks- again — with Ramona Hill and Sorella, respectively.

He first did it in 2016 with Marion Marauder and All The Time.

The Oaks win was the fifth in a row — unprecedented in Oaks or Hambletonian history. Muscle Hill also captured the Peter Haughton with longshot Zenith Stride. Don't forget the fastest trotter on the entire card was by Muscle Hill's daughter When Dovescry (1:50) taking the Steele Memorial.

Chapter Seven won the Cashman with Gimpanzee with Atlanta, his 2018 Trotter of the Year, going off as the second favorite. Darlene Hanover is a daughter of Chapter Seven, and runner-up Material Girl a Muscle Hill. Reverse that in the Oaks when Muscle Hill won it again, but...yes... Chapter Seven's Hypnotic AM overcame some terrible 5/8ths cover to get second money.

Ready Cash debuted in style second and third in the Hambletonian with Ready For Moni and Back Of The Neck, respectively.



Driver Andrew McCarthy led the day with five victories, including his first Hambletonian, and purse earnings of \$840,000 on the

For the first time at age 4 Bettors Wish was not favored. He was let go at 3-1 and he responded with a 1:47.1 victory. This after hitting the half in :52.1 and withstanding serious pressure from Dancin Lou. Remember it was that duo on the wire 1-2 in the 2019 Breeders Crown. Andy McCarthy was a favorite son on this memorable day. He won with three of the four favorites he drove.

The richest 3YO in the Hambletonian field at \$690,040 going in, Amigo Volo had bad luck that likely cost him a board spot stuck behind a tiring Threefiftytwo at the 5/8ths.

COVID-19 pandemic produced strange, but satisfying Hambletonian

"It's definitely the strangest Hambletonian I've ever been a part of," said Moira Fanning, chief operating officer of the Hambletonian Society.

Since COVID-19 forced racing to shutdown at the Meadowlands on March 7, both owner Jeff Gural's staff at the track and the Hambletonian Society have worked on what they would or could do if racing re-opened in time for the 95thedition of the Hambletonian.

"I would sit here and watch the news and listen to [New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy] speak and I would start an operational plan just based off of whatever the news was that day and then kind of tweak it," said Marianne Rotella, assistant general manager of the Meadowlands.

Fanning admits that she honestly thought that by August the virus would no longer be an issue, but when her wishful thinking didn't come to pass, it was necessary to face the hard facts that the laundry list of things that needed to be done for this Hambletonian would be different.

John Campbell, president and chief executive officer of The Hambletonian Society, like Fanning, had a hopeful view in March but as the months went by he became uneasy with the fast-approaching date of the Hambletonian.

"My main concern was are we going to get open in enough time to get these horses the proper prep for the Hambletonian," Campbell said.

He spent time speaking with the connections of many of the horses who believed that, if indeed, the track was back racing by the beginning of June, there would be no issue with the preparedness of the competitors.

When racing returned on June 5, there was a plan in place for the paddock, but as with all other professional sports, there were no fans allowed in the stands.


On July 3 that changed and they were allowed 25 per cent capacity indoors in addition to a 500-person social gathering limit on the apron, but no indoor dining.

"It was a matter of getting creative within a couple of days. How do we offer outside dining to maximize our capacity and get people back to racing?" said Rotella.

On Hambletonian Day, food was offered via reservation on the West Deck and Café overseen by Chef Dennis Sammarone, while Jennifer Jordan with ARC Meadowlands was in charge of the Backyard.

Rotella said they couldn't do what they normally do but that it drove them to make what they could do better.

Many of the events that led up to Hambletonian Day were

cancelled, such as the press conference, the charity night, the owners' party and on the big day there was no autograph session or party of the roof with a DJ. At 25 per cent capacity, the press box was limited to three.

"Through all of this I've realized that we're working just as hard, if not harder, to provide the best service we can provide for much less capacity," said Rotella.

At the end of the day for the winning connections it was a happy moment that came out of a difficult time.

Michelle Crawford was a Hambletonian winning owner two years ago with Atlanta, and even though she was so happy to win this prestigious race it wasn't the same.

"It was 1000 per cent different. You're standing in a line and getting your temperature taken and filling out a form and you're wearing a mask. I'm claustrophobic so it's not an easy thing for me. We haven't traveled anywhere to go to any of these races just because of that. And I've had cancer so I'm predisposed and I have older parents and an 11-year-old and if somebody goes to the hospital you can't go with them. So

why would you take your chances and travel outside your bubble?"

But since Crawford bred Ramona Hill she took a chance, as did her partner John Fodera who won his first Hambletonian.

"It was the greatest thrill, a phenomenal feeling and nothing could take away from that [not even COVID-19]," he said.

Fodera has been going to the Meadowlands since opening night in 1976 and has never missed a Hambletonian Day.

But this one was for sure different since his wife of 48. Barbara, was not with him because she did not want to isolate when they travel to see their grandchildren the next day.

"Not to have her there was different, but she was watching at home" said Fodera.

The Hambletonian view from Sweden

Hambletonian Day has fascinated European harness racing fans for several years and maybe there is a simple explanation why this particular Saturday in August is special on both sides of the Atlantic Ocean. American trotters are, in most of the European harness racing countries, dominant in the stud books — and have been for many years.

In Sweden, ATG (the national betting company for horse racing) broadcast the simulcast from the Meadowlands and three Swedes translated the show from ATG's own studio — one anchor man, one man who called the races, plus one expert with knowledge of American harness racing after an active career as groom and second trainer and trainer in USA.

Björn "Bernie" Norén, with many years' experience working for Jimmy Takter and Åke Svanstedt — in addition to his own career as trainer in America — served the viewers in Sweden with information about horses and American harness racing in general that few other "experts" could have presented today.

For the interested and curious crowd, Norén's knowledge is helpful and even if you're not interested in betting, you get to know something about many horses, trainers, drivers and owners.

This year, it took only two races from Meadowlands for there to be a stir on social media from Swedish harness racing fans critical of one-handed whipping. It's well known that racing rules in all countries differ. Harness racing doesn't have an international governing body that sets the rules worldwide as FIFA does in soccer.

Every Hambletonian Day, Swedes tend to fall into the same

pattern around the whipping issue. They have a choice — accept the rule difference, as much as Yannick Gingras, Doug McNair and James MacDonald did when they competed in World Driving Championship in Sweden last summer, and watch the races, or stay away from the broadcast.

On the track, Europeans are a little bit spoiled with several great victories in New Jersey over the year, so there were expectations for Saturday's race card.

Nancy Takter and Marcus Melander presented horses in great shape in two of the most prestigious races on the card ahead of the Hambletonian and from a European point of view, many fingers were crossed for Ready For Moni and Back Of The Neck, both sired by French sire Ready Cash.

In the end, the Hambletonian was something of a déja-vu-experience for European harness racing fans since Muscle Hill (sire of Ramona Hill) and Ready Cash are the two dominating stallions in many countries on both sides of the Atlantic ocean.

The home stretch never really developed as a tough fight between the top three horses, but anyway, it was Muscle Hill and Ready Cash that dominated even on American ground and we can imagine that French fans, with their closed stud book, are pretty proud with the successes from Ready Cash's offspring in the U.S.

Big congrats to the connections of Ramona Hill from Europe. What a filly!

And that driver... McCarthy something... that's a man I would like to see on a five-eighths mile track north of Stockholm soon.

The fun started early when Gabe Prewitt - who seems to be part of every broadcast crew in America and was working at the New Jersey Mecca of harness racing yesterday - got the


Send It In Army stirring.

There was plenty of reason for Prewitt's unabashed optimism as it turned out because Darlene Hanover trotted a huge mile mostly on the rim to win going away in an impressive effort. But Prewitt's large social media following — which has been a boon to both Pompano Park and Scioto Downs — may have hurt him here as the 2-year-old daughter of Chapter Seven out of the Cantab Hall mare Danielle Hanover was pounded down to even money from a 7 to 2 morning line quote.

That prompted this tweet from Prewitt post-race: Time to fess up, who pounded this filly down to even money?? That was some serious action... but she was giant in another win.

The answer was simple to Century Downs announcer Murray Slough. Gabe you put out the word far and wide, your

army pounds the filly down to even money. Easy to figure out! Parked all the way, too, Slough tweeted, and sometimes it's just that simple.

Of course, there were deserved plaudits for Hambletonian winner Ramona Hill, who was exceptional in tying her sire Muscle Hill's stakes record of 1:50.1.

Regular racing tweeter Chris Cuzzo's simple tweet told the story in just a few words. The Filly, Ramona Hill crushes them in **#Hambo20**, and crush them she did, Cuzzo tweeted. Horseman Jay Hochstetler agreed. Ramona is just insanely fast. Great choices by McCarthy there too, he tweeted.

Robert Reid Jr., who writes the handicapping Journal for the Woodbine Mohawk Park official program marvelled at driver Dexter Dunn's steer with Bettor's Wish as he blazed around the track on the engine, taking no prisoners in the Sam McKee Memorial. Reid tweeted: Dexter Dunn is incredible. He literally just pitched a perfect game on Bettor's Wish.

When Sorella led from the 1/4 pole to the finish and bottomed out the field in the Hambletonian Oaks, harness writer Darin Zoccali noted driver Yannick Gingras' recent dominance in this race. Seriously, it's death, taxes and @Gingras3 winning the Hambletonian Oaks, Gingras has won the Oaks 6 of the last 7 years.

Zoccali also noted the turning point in the Cashman that may have been the difference between winning and losing for harness racing's #1 ranked horse, Gimpanzee. Brian Sears should send a thank you to Dexter Dunn, who inexplicably didn't move into a third over position with Soul Strong, but instead elected to stay on the pylons. This allowed Gimpanzee to take the spot third over and that was the difference in the race.

On a day where closers weren't closing much, it was another stellar performance by Gimpanzee to reach up late from third-over. Could he have got there if he had to navigate a fourth-over trip? We'll never know.

My favorite tweet of the day came from owner and better Pedro Baez who liked 85 to 1 shot Zenith Stride enough to bet \$100 win on him. Big race Brian Sears taking it home with a \$177 winner today on **#Hambo20** day. Really love betting **@TheMeadowlands** and the Standardbreds. It brought me back up for the year," tweeted a happy Baez.

As usual, Hambletonian Day didn't disappoint and we'll give the final tweet to Zoccali who summed it up perfectly.



\$600,000 Hambletonian Oaks

Sorella's slide into Hambletonian Oaks glory

Driver Yannick Gingras won his record sixth Oaks title in seven years.



On Hambletonian Day 2019, the division appeared in the hands of Marcus Melander trainee Hypnotic AM, who won the Jim Doherty Memorial to maintain her then-unbeaten record. However, a new star emerged late in the season when Ramona Hill pulled an 18-1 upset to win the Breeders Crown final, claiming the title of divisional leader in the process.

Nowhere in the conversation was Sorella, a Muscle Hill filly bred and co-owned by Elmer Fannin and in the barn of Staffan Lind. The filly competed mainly in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes as a 2-year-old, managing to finish second in the \$252,000 final at Harrah's Philadelphia. Sorella did foray onto the Grand Circuit late in the year at Harrah's Hoosier Park and The Red Mile. She finished fourth in the \$215,000 Kentuckiana and lost stride to finish sixth in the \$71,800 International Stallion Stakes.

Over her 2-year-old year, Sorella managed to bank \$135,313 for the Linds before switching stables when the Linds shipped tack back to their home country of Sweden. Sorella then landed in the barn of Nancy Takter. With a 1:54 qualifier under her belt at the end of May, Sorella's name quickly rolled into the Hambletonian Oaks conversation.

"Yep we're very excited about Sorella," said Brent Fannin, son of Sorella's breeder Elmer Fannin and co-owner along with his father and Crawford Farms Racing. "We bred Kadaelia [Sorella's dam] and we knew one day she was gonna' throw a good one, we just kept being patient and

bringing her to one of the better sires we could, and along came Sorella and we're real excited. We lost her mom earlier this year, who was in foal to Father Patrick, so hopefully Sorella can carry the torch from here."

Through June and late July, Sorella uncorked large mile after large mile, culminating in a 1:50.2 win in the \$61,000 Reynolds Memorial where she beat Ramona Hill in her first start at three. Meanwhile the other established leader — Hypnotic AM — strolled in a division of New York Sires Stakes and the \$207,250 Empire Breeders Classic Final.

Come July 18, the first real matchup was held. Sorella, Ramona Hill and Hypnotic AM hooked up in the \$253,500

Del Miller Memorial. Going a hard-fought trip first over as the 2-5 favorite, Sorella faltered to fourth behind Hypnotic AM (finishing third) in a 1:50.3 mile uncorked by Ramona Hill. But again the conversation changed.

Ramona Hill, instead of facing her own ilk in the Oaks, broadened her horizons to compete against the boys in the \$1 million Hambletonian. Sorella, despite her loss, remained aimed at the Hambletonian Oaks, which attracted 12 entrants. When the field received their posts for the \$600,000 final, Sorella was handed a golden situation.

Hypnotic AM drew post 12 — starting behind Jim Campbell trainee Next Level Stuff — while Sorella drew post 7 with regular driver and five-time Oaks champ Yannick Gingras picking up the reins on trainer Nancy Takter's first-ever starter in the Oaks. At the gate's unfolding, the draw proved paramount.

Gingras shot Sorella to the lead while Whose Blues secured the pocket and Solsbury Hill, from post 9, slid into third. Next Level Stuff mounted a bid against Sorella up the backstretch, rolling first over into a :54.3 half as Whose Blues began to tire at the inside.

"I thought it was three horses that really stood out in the race, the other two had posts 11 & 12," Gingras said after the race. "When I left the gate I could see that they were going to get away somewhere in the mid-pack. They weren't getting anywhere too, too close, so I was taking no prisoner from there. I figured she was the one to beat at that point and I didn't take any chances."

Hypnotic AM meanwhile raced in traffic from the start, sitting seventh at the quarter before being sent four wide into the final turn to circle Solsbury Hill and May Baby as they stalled moving to three-quarters.

"In the last turn I knew I had Timmy beat," Gingras said, "and behind me they weren't keeping up too good so I took a look back, I could see Brian was there making his move three deep so I figured it was time to get away and try to get as much of a jump on them. My filly really responded, they weren't getting close to her at the end. I think she raced tremendous."

Sorella landed a jump on the field, kicking to a three-length lead off three-quarters in 1:22.3. Through the stretch Hypnotic AM had to play catch up, gaining ground on Sorella but ultimately admitting defeat in the final sixteenth. Sorella stopped the clock in 1:51, finishing

one-and-three-quarter lengths better than Hypnotic AM with Panem — also trained by Nancy Takter — overcoming post 11 for third.

"I thought my horses both raced super," Takter said to the USTA after the race. "I wish Panem would have gotten up a little bit more, but they were both really good. It kind of worked out the way I expected, so that's good when things go that way."

"We've been looking forward to this for a long time," Brent Fannin said after the race.

With the victory, Takter joins a long-list of Oaks winning trainers as the first woman ever to land in the winner's circle. Her name also falls onto the same list as her father's, whose eight wins in the Oaks sits as the record for any trainer in the event including his five-year win streak from 2014 through 2018. All five of those winners were piloted by Gingras, who now has won the race a record six times. Elmer and Brent Fannin of Delaware grabbed their first Oaks trophy as well as Crawford Farms Racing, who also co-owns Hambletonian winner Ramona Hill.

"We knew she was a little bit fractious last year and we turned her out after her 2-year-old year and we really took care of her," said Michelle Crawford after the race. "We're so pleased with the partnership with Elmer and Brent. This was so exciting."

When Dovescry upsets in Steele; Manchego third

When Dovescry (\$11.20) sustained a first-over strike on the far turn, dueled down champion mare Manchego and became harness racing's newest millionaire by way of a 9-2 upset in the \$166,550 Dr. John R. Steele Memorial for trotting mares on Saturday (Aug. 8) at The Meadowlands.

"She's a very beautiful mare, beautiful to be around," said winning trainer Brett Pelling. "Her manners are fantastic and she just trots great... She actually goes to race in pony bridle and no boots, so she's gorgeous.

The 4-year-old daughter of Muscle Hill out of Cedar Dove challenged Plunge Blue Chip for the early lead before retreating to the pocket on the first turn. After drafting closely behind a :26.4 quarter, When Dovescry was relegated to third up the backstretch when Dexter Dunn brushed 1-9 favorite Manchego out from fourth to clear the lead at a :54.3 midway split.

Driver David Miller angled When Dovescry off the pegs with three-eighths to go, and she quickly made up 2-1/2 lengths before engaging Manchego past three-quarters in 1:23 and setting the stage for a stretch duel — but Manchego offered little resistance to When Dovescry's advance into the lead an eighth from home. From there, Miller kept When Dovescry to task, and they defeated Plunge Blue Chip — who

rallied up the pegs in deep stretch — by a half-length while driven out in 1:50. Manchego could only muster third, another three-quarters of a length in arrears.

"Manchego is amazing," Pelling said. "I just love watching her... it's just been a treat for the last three years. But, you know, racing, for whatever reason, they can't be 100 per cent all the time, every day."

When Dovescry, whose 11 career wins include the 2019 Hambletonian Oaks, is owned by Yves Sarrazin, Dumain Haven Farm, Singh and Soulsby, and John Lengacher. She was bred by William Weaver and sold for \$205,000 at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

"Our plan this year, really, was to only race her six or seven times and really get her ready for five and so far it's working out good," Pelling said.

"There's a race next week in Tioga, so we'll play it by ear, how we come out of it. There's not very many races and they are spaced apart, so we're really looking forward to taking her to Lexington and that's the primary goal."

At that point, Altar, the second choice at 3-1, galloped while uncovered heading to a :56.3 half.

Darlene Hanover ventured into the far turn with no cover, racing sixth, and began to advance towards Mazzarati. By three-quarters in 1:26.3, Darlene Hanover ranged to within a length of command and soon downed the tiring pacesetter at the head of the stretch. The Chapter Seven—Danielle Hanover filly strolled through the lane in progress to a 1:55.1 victory while chased by Material Girl, who rallied from third-over to take second. Ineffable closed for third.

Darlene Hanover was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms and sold for \$130,000 as a yearling at the 2018 Standardbred Horse Sales Company auction in 2019.

Zenith Stride stayed on gait as two favorites broke stride, allowing driver Brian Sears to steer the Muscle Hill—Open Access colt easily down the middle of the track for an 87-1 upset in the \$339,000 Peter Haughton Memorial for 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings Saturday afternoon (Aug. 8) at The Meadowlands.

Favorite Plumville Prince never got started, breaking as the gate swung open and allowing Moonstone S to leave for the early lead over Venerate. As the first quarter ticked in :28, Type A took over the lead from Moonstone S, while Venerate followed the pair to the half in :57.

Moonstone S came out of the pocket and reclaimed the lead as Type A began to gallop, letting Venerate inherit the catbird seat. Moonstone cut three-quarters in 1:25.3 as Venerate began a hard chase. Sitting with cover all the way and with plenty of trot left, Zenith Stride circled the front pair and flew past the top two with no urging to cross the finish line in 1:55.1. Moonstone S dismissed a late charge

from Venerate to finish second.

"I liked this colt the first time I sat behind him," said Sears. "He had a few issues, made a few breaks, but I never lost confidence in him. I knew one he matured a bit, he'd come around and be the horse we thought he was."

Mark Harder trains Zenith Stride, who won her first race in four starts for owners Emilio and Maria Rosati. Sears recorded his fourth Peter Haughton Memorial win.

Zenith Stride paid \$177.00 to win.

Brian Sears patiently kept Gimpanzee off the pace in the early stages while double millionaire mare Atlanta brushed clear of Guardian Angel As beyond a :26.3 first quarter. Atlanta maintained a quick tempo through a :54.1 half and braced for a stern challenge from Lindy The Great on the far turn, while Gimpanzee slipstreamed live cover from third-over.

Off the home corner, Lindy The Great began to wear on Atlanta, and Sears fanned Gimpanzee four-wide upon straightening for home — but he didn't accelerate at first asking. As Lindy The Great gathered Atlanta in with 150 yards to go, Gimpanzee found his best stride and stormed home to win by the better part of a widening length in the final strides in a career best 1:50. Lindy The Great finished

second, and Soul Strong emerged out of traffic to finish third.

Marcus Melander trains 22-time winner and double millionaire Gimpanzee, a son of Chapter Seven out of Steamy Windows, for Courant Inc. and the SRF Stable.

"He's just an amazing horse, he's shown that so many times before," Melander said. "This start was the first against the elder horses and we had a bad post, but Brian worked out a good trip for him and he finished strong.

"He always does what he's supposed to do."

Prohibitive favorite Tall Dark Stranger and driver Yannick Gingras commanded sophomore pacers to win the \$273,125 Cane Pace on Saturday (Aug. 8) at The Meadowlands. The time for the mile, 1:47.1, is a stakes record and personal best for the son of Bettor's Delight and Precocious Beauty.

Captain Kirk and Manticore went to the front off the gate, with Moneyman Hill and Put To Right following, as Tall Dark Stranger settled into fifth through a :26.2 first quarter.

Manticore got the lead for a few steps before Captain Kirk retook the top. Tall Dark Stranger then made his move, going first- over to take the lead through a :53.1 half.

Once leading, Tall Dark Stranger began to dominate, cutting three-quarters in 1:21 with Captain Kirk fully extended to keep the place spot while Capt Midnight led the outer tier, closing fast into the stretch and passing Captain Kirk.

Gingras glanced behind his charge once and drew away to a definitive 3-1/4-length victory. Capt Midnight took the second spot with Captain Kirk finishing third.

It was Tall Dark Stranger's fourth win in five starts this season for trainer Nancy Takter.

"He was better today; we added Lasix to him," Takter said. "He bled a little bit last week (in the Geers Stakes). He had a little bit of a tough race, he got all windy. It's just one of those

things ... You can't get all worked up about it, you just gotta fix the problems."

"Yannick (Gingras) said if he would've known it was that close, he would've let him go a little bit in the third quarter, but he raced super and we're just thrilled with him," Takter said.

Tall Dark Stranger, who also won the Meadowlands Pace, is owned by Crawford Farms Racing, Marvin Katz, Caviart Farms and Howard Taylor.

The \$410,500 Åby Stora Pris at Åby racetrack in Sweden was held on Saturday afternoon (Aug. 8) and the long test over 3,140 meters (2 miles) for the older elite is always a spectacular show. For the third year in a row the race has been contested over this actual distance and Propulsion has crossed the wire first both 2018 and 2019.

The field for 2020's Åby Stora Pris was equable, a very open edition waited when the car left 12 contenders and Handsome Brad was the horse that left most quickly in the first 150 meters. From post 6, first choice Who's Who and Örjan Kihlström opened surprisingly fast and the duo could hit the lead a half mile into the race. When Who's Who reached the front position, the pace went down and

everything seemed to go Who's Who's way this day. But Finnish guest Don Williams made the trip more testing for Who's Who, who became eager in front after half the distance and the power he used at that moment would turn out to be important ingredients that he lacked for at the end of the story.

Then Björn Goop sent his Norwegian-bred Moni Viking (Maharajah) in a whirlwind three wide attack in the last trip up the backstretch and when Moni Viking landed outside of leader Who's Who, Goop got the advantage. Moni Viking and Who's Who were side by side at the top of the stretch, but Goop had more power to use in his 7-year-old chestnut trotter and Moni Viking claimed the trophy in a mile rate of 1:56.2 over 1.95 miles.

"I trust this horse a lot when he races. Moni Viking has performed very well at every occasion here in the Nordic countries and I like him very much. I knew it would be tough with Who's Who in front, but as I said, I trust Moni Viking," said Goop after the victory.

Who's Who (Maharajah) held strongly for silver medal while Cyber Lane (Raja Mirchi) finished quickly from impossible post, 11, as third.

Melanie Wrenn – Trainer

It's every horseperson's dream to break and condition a yearling that one day becomes a world champion. It's the reason so many of us stay in the business, year after year, confronted with unexpected illness, injuries and even fatalities to our four-legged kids.

This year that dream came true for trainer Melanie Wrenn. On July 10, her 3-year-old trotting mare, Guinevere Hall, not only broke the track record at Northfield Park in Ohio, but also a world record (for both mares and colt trotters) in 1:53 on a half-mile with husband Peter in the bike.

Melanie grew up in the business. Her father, Bill Deters, was a respected and successful trainer from Michigan.

"My brother Mike (Deters) and I spent our weekends and holidays with dad and the horses early on. We stabled at Pompano Park in Florida in the winters and resided in Coconut Creek.

"Summers were wherever dad decided to go. We spent a couple living in this great bungalow in Monticello, New York, and other times at Jack Richard's farm in South Lyons, Michigan.

"We moved to Michigan when I was in the 5thgrade and made a permanent home there, which I'm sure made things a lot easier on my mom, Marilyn.

"My brother Mike and I have always been close. He is three years my senior and for whatever reason he never minded me tagging along."

When talking about her father, Melanie starts to tear up.

"My dad was probably the hardest working person I've ever known. In 1985 he died of cancer and the horsemen had a memorial for him at Northville Downs in Michigan. "Mike took over his dad's horses that were stabled at Gilchrist Farm in Bell, Florida, despite at that time he was attending Michigan State University. Thankfully, it all worked out for him.

"One thing my brother and I inherited from our father was a great work ethic. Between that and Mike's natural horsemanship, he's ran a successful barn ever since. Not to mention he's just a great quy."

Although it was a great loss losing her father, something good came out of it. In life, things happen for a reason and being in the right place at the right time holds true for Melanie.

"Shortly after dad died my friend Troy Boring asked me to meet him for his birthday at a get together. At first I didn't want to go, but Troy coaxed me to get out of the house. Shortly after I arrived, in walked a man who I would eventually marry and father my 3 children."

The man Melanie is talking about is none other than trainer/driver Peter Wrenn.

"Peter rolled in, we started talking, and 35 years later we're still together."

And what a team they make. Peter Wrenn was no stranger to harness racing for at that time he was a top trainer/driver racing mainly in Michigan.

"Peter started going to Florida around five years ago to winter train. We generally have 20 to 30 horses, although that number seems to be growing.

"We focus mainly on stake horses and winter train at Sunshine Meadows in South Florida.

"Peter stays in Florida those months and I usually go visit one week every month. Being a mother I couldn't see myself giving up any more time with my kids. Although I miss my husband and being with the horses, I love being a mom.

"We have two boys and one girl and I'm very proud of all of them. Courtney and Billy don't live at home anymore, but Tyler still does and will be attending Indiana University this year.

"During the summer I oversee our stable at Hoosier Park while Peter's on the road a lot with our young stake horses." Besides their world record mare, Guinevere Hall, the Wrenns have several super horses.

"I'd say Guinevere is our best trotter. Peter and I are so

excited to have achieved such a goal. I pretty much go with her on a daily basis for she seems to like women better than men.

"But I can't take all the credit for Peter has put so much horsemanship into this filly for owners M T Pockets and Dave McDuffee.

"Until recently our best pacer was a horse named Mainstreet. He is special, for he was our first really good horse.

"And Rockin Serena definitely deserves a huge shout out. We bought her as a yearling and she is still competing and winning. Bruce Trogden bought in on her and wanted to breed her, so we pulled three eggs from her and today have two live foals; and a surrogate mare is carrying Serena's third. All the foals are sired by Fear The Dragon.

"We are really looking forward to breaking her first foal — a filly, this year. Throughout this process, Serena has barely missed a beat. Since returning to racing in 2020 in three starts she has two wins and one second. She's awesome."

Yes, Serena rocks, but there are several other rock stars in the Wrenn stable; especially one called Odds On Osiris, who is making quite a name in the sport. "Odds On Osiris, the son of Rockin Image, was Indiana's Two – Year-Old Pacer in 2019. Owned by Dana Parham of Odds on Racing, the colt won 7 of his 10 starts as a two-year-old. He has come back real strong this year and we are hoping to take him to the North America Cup and the Breeders Crown."

Although Melanie has trained and owned many horses throughout the years, a mare called Grandpa's Ashley (and her foals) hold a very special place in her heart.

"Peter bought Ashley at Harrisburg for his owners. When he got home they informed him they didn't want a mare, so we wound up keeping her. At the time, it wasn't the easiest thing to do for we had just moved back from New Jersey and were building a house. I was pregnant with my son, Billy, and it was quite a struggle.

"Although Ashley's racing career was short lived, one of her foals, Catcharaider, wound up making a lot of money for us."

Coping to get through difficult times the COVID-19 virus has caused horsepeople and our wonderful sport, the Wrenns keep working hard. That's what they do best.



"Keep the change," he said, "I told you I wasn't any good."

"And you didn't lie. You need some social distancing from that golf swing. Your backswing looks like you're harpooning a whale, while your front foot moves like a Tango dancer."

I tried to hand the coin back to him, "Use this for golf lessons. That wasn't gambling, it was a heist."

He waved me off. "Fair and square, five strokes each side."

Examining the coin, I asked," Is this thing legit?"

"It's a double eagle. I carry a few in my bag to pay off golf gambling debts. They stopped making them in 1933. I invested in a roll of circulated 1932's."

I nodded, "I think The Stable is a great method of getting investors involved in buying and racing young horses. The concept I'm talking about is similar but different. Sponsors don't select and invest in a horse. They invest in a person. Samantha and her three-horse stable. She ekes out a living while attempting to establish herself."

He said, "Finding those investors might be a challenge."

"Sure, but it's a lot easier in the cyber world for Samantha. She could phish in new waters. Social media has unlimited doors for people to knock on. There is a big world outside of harness racing. Look at this sample investor pitch from a golfer that landed on the radar screen of a person a few years ago, a retweet. I handed him my phone and directed him to this link.

He handed my phone back.

I continued, "A similar pitch would be a good idea for our Samantha in the harness racing world, a person who believes in herself and is looking for investors. Simple as that. She can set it up any way she wants. Imagine she tries to sell a hundred shares at a thousand dollars per share. She will make a budget that details how she will purchase three yearlings to race at two and three. She will regularly report to shareholders on zoom, and she will send monthly reports."

"You think anyone would purchase shares?" he asked as he drove the cart towards the clubhouse.

"They do in golf. These kinds of contracts with fledgling golf pros number in the thousands. Listen to the words of a

guy who bought into the golfer's post that I just showed you." I read off my phone.

"The concept of buying shares of a professional golfer had a natural appeal to me. Financial planners always stress how important it is to diversify your portfolio. What's more diverse than investing in a British golfer you've never heard of? I found my player online. I'd never come across such an opportunity until I happened to see a retweet of a tour pro named Dave Coupland. Dave was looking for investors in himself, and I was intriqued."

"I read Dave's bio on his website. Buy low, sell high is all I could hear as I read Dave's resumé. "I WIN, YOU WIN!" seemed like a pretty good deal to me. So why would this golfer/commodity offer up a cut of his earnings? Because being a tour pro is ridiculously expensive, and often, this is the only way to make the dream of playing golf for a living feasible."

"It's common," Coupland said of players selling shares in themselves. "A few guys I know did it before, and I discussed it with them and thought, why not give it a shot?"

"Why not give it a shot is also what I thought when I saw a seemingly reasonable price per share. And once I let the idea creep into my head, the fear of missing out on a good bet that often fuels gambling decisions took over. I needed a piece of the action."

I asked David, "Why can't this be transferred to young harness horse trainers? Why can't Samantha use social media and hustle up investors to invest in her small stable, especially investors who might not know much, or anything at all, about harness horse racing?"

David said, "The money part could get dicey."

"I thought the same thing, but these young golf pros offer investors a signed contract, very detailed, and very specific. Coupland set up a budget that included entry fees for tournaments, transportation, hotel bills, equipment, food, caddy fees, etc. And at the end of the contract, Coupland tallies up and divides all his tournament earnings and deposits the purse money into a separate bank account. The contract is in-depth and official. These contracts are not unusual in other sports."

David said, "There's a lot of variables in horse racing, plenty of decisions to make."

"Not for investors. The deal is the investor pays the money and watches the stock rise or fall. They don't have a say about what horses are purchased or where they race, that's Samantha's call. Here's another example from the investors' POV."

I read some more.

"As an investor, it's not like I influenced his schedule or any club selection, but I got excited each time Dave put himself in contention, and even a little proud whenever he earned a paycheck. And I can only imagine how exhilarating it would be to watch Coupland come down the stretch of a tournament in contention."

David said, "Wannabe golf pro, or wannabe top harness trainer, the investor/angels are backing a living, breathing, HUMAN long-shot. That is huge. And a trio of yearlings in her stable would push up the odds that new investors would see at least some action."

I nodded, "Usually, these contracts state that anycash the player wins goes toward paying off the investors first. Earnings above the original investment get divided among the golfer and investors 50/50, but the contracts vary."

"It is a social investment, sort of an offbeat experiment." He said.

"For sure. Most investors probably accept that they won't see all of their money again. The math will show that young golfers or young harness horses don't make enough to pay back their backers--at least not in full. They are investing in a human being playing a difficult sport. It's a chance to follow a dream."

I could hear the excitement in David's voice when he said, "And in these times people may be looking for diversions. It's an opportunity for new people to find your game. They could digitally get to know Samantha and other investors and learn a unique sport in more detail. The Internet, Twitter, and social media would allow Samantha to offer a hell of a fun ride to her investors."

I slipped the gold coin in my wallet and grabbed my keys, "Yeah, Samantha could make lifelong friends, a network of future owners for when she goes on her own. And most importantly, she could get her career off the ground."

After we hoisted our golf bags into the trunk of the Lexus, he turned and asked me, "What are you going to do with the coin?"

I sighed and said, "Well, if it's worth a grand, maybe I'll invest in a Samantha."

Summer Touch, Merry Ann with world records at Northfield

Five fields of fillies provided Northfield Park harness racing fans with sizzling miles, including a new track and world record clocking of 1:51.4 by **Summer Touch** the 1-5 favorite in the first of two \$50,000 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) for 2-year-old pacing fillies on a lovely Friday (Aug. 7) evening.

The Ronnie Burke-trained daughter of Well Said—Real Touch was given a perfect steer by Chris Page as she captured her second OHSS contest, having captured Leg two on July 24 at Scioto Downs in 1:54.2. This homebred is owned by Burke Racing, Knox Services, Slaughter Racing and Weaver Bruscemi. Rainy Day Chic, a 20-1 longshot was second for Brett Miller, followed by 45-1 longshot She Knows It All (Ryan Stahl) in third.

Burke harnessed another filly — this one a trotter — to another track record performance and also equaled the world record for a 2-year-old trotting filly on a half-mile oval as **Merry Ann** trotted to a 1:56 clocking in the first of three \$40,000 OHSS events. The 1-9 favorite used a front-stepping performance with Chris Page in the sulky for owners Burke Racing, Knox Services and Weaver Bruscemi as she notched her third win in five tries. This homebred daughter by Southwind Spirit-Witty Girl-SJ's Photo also captured Leg two in 1:57.4. I'malovelyladywas second at 11-1 for Anthony MacDonald while 10-1 Ozma got up for third with Aaron Merriman doing the driving.

Burke continued his dominance as his **Pinknperfect** captured the second \$50,000 OHSS for 2-year-old pacing fillies in 1:52.4, holding off a pair of determined rivals at the wire. Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., steered the 7-1 daughter by Well Said-Pink Camo-Pine Valley for Burke Racing, S. Jefferis, J. Smith and Weaver Bruscemi as she captured her first OHSS contest. Bred by Rtk Racing, Pinknperfect upped her career earnings to \$37,500. Leave Her Wild was second for Mike Wilder at 3-1 while 9-5 Gucci was a close third for Aaron Merriman.

My Jazz cruised to a front-end victory for driver Anthony MacDonald and trainer Jason McGinnis in 1:57.1, a new lifetime mark, in the second OHSS division for 2-year-old trotting fillies. The daughter of My MVP, out of the Incredible Abe mare Loving Jazz left the gate at 3-1 odds, besting 45-1 rival I Am Winning (Brett Miller) easily and 10-1 Fiesty Pistol (Aaron Merriman) in late stretch. My Jazz, who was bred by Jake Wickey, Jr., had finished third in leg one and fifth in leg two of this series.

Herculisa captured the third OHSS trotting test handily, looking much the best for driver Brett Miller as the 1-5 favorite and stopping the clock in 1:56.1. The daughter of My MVP out of the Andover Hall mare Herculotte Hanover is owned by the Jesmeral Stable and trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr. She has won both previous OHSS legs, in 1:58.1 and 1:56.2 and pushed her career earnings to \$61,812 with this latest triumph. Herculisa was bred by Billy Walters, Joe McLead and Up Front Racing. Celebrate With Me (Kurt Sugg) was second best at 5-1 with 20-1 Ciao Baby Hall getting up for third with Aaron Merriman at the lines.

Southwind Tyrion stays perfect in Big M's Garden State

Southwind Tyrion continued his impressive winning ways Friday night (Aug. 7) at The Meadowlands, upping his lifetime record to three wins in as many starts after taking the \$60,000 Garden State – sponsored by the Standardbred Owners and Breeders of New Jersey – for 2-year-old colts and geldings on the trot in 1:54.3 over a track labeled 'good'.

The popular 1-9 favorite swung wide off the far turn and sprinted past his foes through the stretch to record a safe 1-length win for trainer-driver Ake Svanstedt. Cricket Fashion was second with Red Redemption third.

Two weeks ago, Southwind Tyrion took the New Jersey Sire Stakes Final in a lifetime-best 1:54. He now has earnings of \$122,500 for owners S R F Stable, Ake Svanstedt, Knutsson Trotting and Brittany Farms.

In the first of two Garden State divisions for 2-year-old fillies on the trot, Lindys Dollywood, the 4-1 third choice in the wagering, came from off the pace to nail Beautiful Game at the wire. The George Ducharme-trained, Scott Zeron-driven daughter of Muscle Hill—Lindys Crazy won for the first time in three career starts after stopping the clock in 1:54.

The Svanstedt-trained **Presto** made it two wins in three lifetime outings in the second division, hitting the wire in a lifetime-best 1:56.2. Yannick Gingras guided the product of Trixton—Susie's Magic to an easy score as the 1-5 favorite.

Dune Hill ran her winning streak to four in the Continentalvictory for 3-year-old filly trotters, holding off Ms Savannah Belle by a nose in 1:53.4 in winning for the sixth time in 16 starts for trainer Ron Burke with Gingras in the bike. The daughter of Muscle Hill—Quite POHSSible paid \$9.20 as the third choice in the betting.

Hillexotic, a Muscle Hill—Exotic Destination colt trained and driven by Trond Smedshammer held off the late-charging 3-5 favorite Play Trix On Me in the Muscle Hill for 3-year-old colts and geldings on the trot. The winner, who was sent to the gate as the fourth choice in the betting at odds of 6-1, won for the first time in four career starts, hitting the wire in 1:53.

Both nights will feature entertainment for both the casual and serious racing fans in a variety of forms. To complement the Dan Patch Stakes, Friday's festivities will include music from DJ

Alex B, a free Dan Patch mask with the purchase of a \$3 Dan Patch commemorative program and a Dan Patch water bottle giveaway to the first 500 Caesars Rewards members. Indiana radio personality Laura Steele, as well as guest handicapper and racing analyst Peter Lurie, will be present for the race. Saturday will see live circus performances roaming around the property as well as a competitive live racing card.

The Dan Patch Stakes kicks off The Championship Season at Harrah's Hoosier Park, where the latter half of the meet is accented by the best in Grand Circuit Racing such as the third edition of the Caesars Trotting Classic and the Monument Circle Pace. The 2020 Championship Season will be highlighted by the return of the Breeders Crown on Oct. 30 and 31.

Strangles confirmed in standardbred in Ontario

There will also be five \$20,000 divisions of the companion Stallion Series during the card.

Allywag Hanover, a son of Captaintreacherous trained by

Brett Pelling for the Allywag Stable, opened eyes by winning his first three seasonal stars, including a Sire Stakes at Philly, and since then has been third in The Meadowlands Pace and second in the Geers Stake, beaten less than a length in each. Tim Tetrick is scheduled for sulky duty as "Allywag" starts from the middle of the eleventh race field of seven, which also includes Sire Stake winners Lake Charles and No Lou Zing.

A race earlier, the only winner in both the previous Sire Stakes legs, The Greek Freak, starts from post three for trainer Ron Burke and driver Matt Kakaley. Another son of Captaintreacherous, The Greek Freak won PASS legs at Philly and The Meadows, won his Adios elimination, and then was fourth, beaten ¾ of a length after hard usage, in the Adios Final. Starting just outside of The Greek Freak will be another previous winner in the Sire Stakes, Sandbetweenmytoes, with driver Dexter Dunn listed for trainer Jim Campbell.

The fifth race first division finds a pair of colts with a first and a second in Sire Stakes competition. The Sweet Lou gelding Tito Rocks starts from post four in a field of six for trainer Robert Cleary and driver Dexter Dunn, while the Captaintreacherous colt Sea Of Life begins from post two for trainer Tony Alagna and driver Scott Zeron.

The five Stallion Series races contain six horses who triumphed in one of the first two StS contests. The only entrant who won twice in the Stallion Series so far this year is in the fourth race division – Seriously Hanover, a Western Ideal colt who will have to overcome post six in a field of seven for driver Scott Zeron and trainer Ron Coyne Jr.

A day earlier, there will be two divisions of the third prelim of the PA Sires event for 2-year-old pacing fillies, a stake worth \$210,134, along with six \$20,000 divisions of Stallion Series action. Between the two Sire Stakes races for the babies, the 11th race division will attract the greater attention, as it contains no fewer than four winners in the PASS already, including the only miss to post two victories – the Always B Miki-Western Silk filly Grace Hill, who will start from post three in a nine-horse field for trainer Nifty Norman and driver Dexter Dunn.

The Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championships for 2-year-olds, with a card worth over \$1 million in purses, is set for Pocono on Saturday afternoon, Sept. 5.

First post for both this Monday's and Tuesday's afternoon cards is set for 12:30 p.m.

I guess since feedback and inquiries are going unanswered coupled with outrageous take out rates I will continue to support and send my dollars to the larger tracks like the Big M with principled oversite.

Integrity in question?

The computer will replace the live horses with a computer generated replica? No owners, trainers, stables and no need for race horses. The casinos will love it!
