Bettor receives \$20,000 settlement from connections of horse with EPO positive

Jeffrey Tretter, who had the financial backing of PETA, said he hopes the case will encourage other bettors to pursue legal action against trainers and owners when gamblers believe they were cheated out of their bets by those horses that test positive illegal performance enhancing drugs. The lawyer representing the defendants said the case showed there "was no evidence of criminal wrongdoing or they wouldn't have settled so cheaply."

A harness bettor has received \$20,000 in a settlement of claims after suing the connections of a horse that came up positive for banned substance Erythropoietin (EPO) after winning a race at The Meadowlands in 2016.

In a statement, plaintiff Jeffrey Tretter of Granite City, IL said he hopes the case "helps to clean up harness racing" and sets a precedent on behalf of gamblers that would allow them pursue legal avenues when they believe they were cheated out of their bets by connections of horses that test positive for illegal performance enhancing drugs (PEDs).

"We faced a lot of opposition because of the precedent involved, but I hope this will open the door for others to come forward and hold those responsible accountable for their blatant cheating at tracks across North America," Tretter said in a statement. "Bettors must organize and go after the cheats for every verifiable dime that was lost."

The Associated Press (AP) reported (full story here)
Wednesday (Aug. 13) that the settlement — which resulted
from extensive negotiations on behalf of Tretter — was
reached in July of this year and made public this week.



Under the settlement, the defendants agreed to pay Tretter \$20,000 and he agreed to donate \$7,500 of that sum to the New Vocations Racehorse Adoption Program.

The settlement bars the parties from making any future claims related to the case and stipulates that the agreement does not constitute an admission of liability.

Two years ago, Tretter, with the financial backing of the People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA), filed suit in the U.S. District Court in New Jersey against trainer Robert Bresnahan Jr. and owner, J.L. Sadowsky alleging the connections of Tag Up And Go violated state and federal racketeering laws — due to the fact there was interstate commerce — and engaged in fraud by illegally doping the horse that won at The Big M on Jan. 15, 2016.

The AP reported Tretter, wagering online, had bet a superfecta with the four horses that finished directly after Tag Up And Go, whom he did not include in his bet. The suit said Tretter's wagers would have paid a combined \$31,835 if Tag Up And Go had been disqualified.

On Jan. 30, 2016, The Meadowlands announced (full story here) its out-of-competition program had determined Tag Up And Go had tested positive for EPO, a banned substance that stimulates red blood cell production that improves the amount of oxygen blood can carry to a horse's muscles. The test results were determined by the Hong Kong Racing Laboratory.

Bresnahan was barred from competing at Meadowlands — and records show he has not raced there since January of 2016 — but there was no redress for those that bet on the race involving Tag Up And Go.

Andrew Benedict, one of the lawyers representing Bresnahan told the AP that PETA was able to finance extensive litigation against two defendants who had far fewer resources. Benedict said the case was a "David vs. Goliath" situation.

"It was rough for us to defend this case on all fronts, because of the amount of money that PETA was pouring into it," Benedict said. "It shows they had no evidence of criminal wrongdoing or they wouldn't have settled so cheaply."

In a statement, PETA said PEDs "often mask horses' pain, allowing them to race and train with injuries that would otherwise be disabling. Illegal doping and the overuse of medication are rampant and frequently lead to injury, broken bones, and death."

Tretter said he hopes his legal action won't be the last bettors undertake in similar cases.

"Electronic wagering has given bettors a chance to do just this, and we are talking about millions, if not hundreds of millions of dollars," Tretter said. "Hopefully, my lawsuit will lead the way and give others the confidence to do just that. It's very disturbing that people in racing with integrity will eventually be put out of business, but that is what the sport has become. I still believe there are more good than bad in the sport, but the bad are ruining the game for everyone. The people in charge who have failed to protect the honest bettors, trainers, and owners are every bit as much to blame as those holding the syringe."

Tidbits: An Illinois gambler has won a lawsuit and been awarded \$20,000 by a New Jersey District Court involving a tainted race at the Meadowlands Racetrack. (see lead story)

To me, anything that turns up the heat on the cheaters is a giant step forward and although this decision is a bit over the top it bring sa smile to my face. It also represents a threat to anyone thinking of fooling with the outcome of a race.

I am not sure of the exact wording so whether or not it sets a definitive precedent remains unknown at this time.

The bettor, Jeffrey Tretter made the settlement with the defendant's trainer Robert Bresnahan, Jr. and owner J.L. Sadowsky in July of 2020 after their horse Tag Up And Go came up positive for EPO subsequent to the race Treeter had made a significant wager on.

It turns out that PETA financed the law suit for the plaintiff, which alleged fraud and RICO violations.

Interestingly, \$7,500 of the settlement was to be earmarked for a horse adoption program.

We are forever trying to clean up our sport and eliminate cheaters. Instead we are shooting ourselves in the foot day by day. I noticed that a top trainer got a positive test yet was in to race Hambletonian Day when the decision said suspension from Aug. 3 to the 17.

After further investigation, I discovered three of the more prominent trainers at the Meadowlands all got positives in a 24 hour period for bute. To be perfectly transparent, the victims of this ridiculous miscarriage of justice were Kelvin Harrison, Brett Pelling and Jeff Cullipher.

How is it possible that someone in that testing lab didn't realize something was wrong. I could probably give a pretty good explanation of what happened, but I am not in a speculative mood. Just about 50 years ago, yours truly was a victim of such a lark and that is why I am writing this piece. Little RG was, for the first time in my training career, thrown into a mix with Stanley and Vernon Dancer, Jimmy Larente and about six of the more fashionable sportsman with Banamine positives at Liberty Bell Park.

Thanks to the intelligence of Jimmy Lynch (one of the greatest racing secretaries of all time) the investigation didn't last five minutes. It was obvious to all involved something was awry in the testing process. Almost all of the victims had one thing in common, John R Steele and Associates were their stable veterinarians. For sure the spectrograph that measure the amount and presence and amount of foreign substances was not performing properly.

After all these years, you would think this could not possibly happen again. The bottom line is simple. Few pay attention, and for sure it will happen again.

I just wish they would remove the posting under fines and suspensions.

The barns are outside, which no matter what the weather, is a major improvement in the year of COVID-19 over the all-enclosed Harrisburg Farm Show Arena. My personal thoughts were that few people were going to accept that indoor venue and that Lexington would provide the perfect landing spot.

The sales company in effect has achieved the same thing without the long ship to the Bluegrass State.

I understand their mindset, however this is way too much of a stretch of the rule of law to me.

Richie Turmiello asks: Did the 2020 Hambletonian remind you of the 1996 event where Continental victory defeated Lindy Lane?

I have been asked this question a number of times, and the answer is maybe a little bit, but the 2020 horses I think are much better and have a more exciting future post-race than the 1996 horses. Ready For Moni comes into the race undefeated this year and was strong to the wire in stakes record time. I would have liked to see him on the front, but it was impossible for him to get there. He will get better as the year goes on it was only his third start this year and 11th lifetime. I find him to have a very bright future compared to Lindy Lane who did little after the big dance.


I know I will get feedback from this but I think that Ramona Hill is a stronger version of Continentalvictory. They both traveled like stud colts and both were economically gaited and I truly love both of them. Even though my heart is always with "Connie" I feel right now Ramona would win a match race between the two. There is no way to describe her but declare just AMAZING.

As far as the two heats in the coming Kentucky Futurity is concerned as far as Ramona Hill and Ready For Moni are concerned I doubt it will help or hinder either one. They will both be better going forward, it's who improves the most in the next two months that will determine the victor at the Red Mile.

Paula Fontaine asks: What advice would you give to a young trainer with talent on how to reach the top?

The most important things I could say to a young trainer is you will be learning your trade till you die. There is something new every day and ask questions. There are a myriad of Hall of Fame trainers that are no longer with us that went to their grave thinking that I was a total pain in the butt. Buddy Gilmore was the unfortunate one to have me in his barn in the earlier years and I have to say he was more than patient with me. As great a driver as he was, few know that he was a fabulous trainer as were his brothers George, John and Lloyd — all of whom were victims of my queries.

I was having lunch one day at the Chateau, a restaurant across the street from Monticello Raceway with my usual group of Max Brewer, Phil Tully and Peter Rhulen. At the next table was Levi and Eldon Harner. I was relating to Max, an excellent horseman in his own right, the trouble I was having with a 2-year-old colt I had getting him to go straight. He would run out in the straightaway and in on the turns and I deemed myself a perfectionist and refused to use two headpoles. Levi leaned over to me and said, 'I have been watching that colt, take the headpole off the outside and put it on the inside. You will be fine. He was 100 per cent correct.'



The difference between today and 1968 is a big one. The amount of great trainers you could learn from when I was a freshman was immense — not so today.

I really want to stress that a student of the sport today has a big edge. No one will put an end to drugs, but the mindset of the moment is so anti-drug that there is a good chance that horsemanship will prevail.

My second point of advice is don't be afraid to make changes. If you don't they will pass you by. Nothing is forever and just when you think you have it all figured out everything will change. If you can't create you will eventually fail.

I remember a line from the movie Top Gun, Kelly McGillis says to Tom Cruise, "To be the best of the best you have to make mistakes, and then you go on." If you don't make mistakes you are not trying to change. You must make adjustments to succeed.

Billy Bigler asks: After watching the Hambletonian card from the Meadowlands last Saturday do you think there were any performance worth predicting year-end honors in this shortened season?

Fun question. My answer will be entertaining to look back at after the Breeders Crown. That said, I truly feel the die is cast in most divisions and would be surprised if I was wrong with many.

It is way too early to pick any 2-year-old winners, although I have seen some that were quite precocious. The older ones seem almost too easy now.

Ohio-bred Ocean Rock must overcome an outside post and a solid field in Milstein Memorial

The \$250,000 event for sophomore pacing colts goes Saturday at MGM Northfield Park.

With opportunities limited on the national stage, Ocean Rock and the driver/trainer combo of Dan and Christi Noble were hoping for a little luck in the post-position draw. What they got was the outside post #8 and a much tougher assignment in Saturday's \$250,000 Carl Milstein Memorial at MGM Northfield Park.

"We were pretty disappointed," said Christi. "Ocean Rock's got gate speed, so hopefully we can use that to our advantage. A couple of times we raced him in overnights and both times we raced him off the pace and he came home in :27 and :27.2."

"I'll go off how he scores down and how he feels," added Dan. "I'll let him tell me whether to pull back or go forward. He has turned into a versatile horse. At two, it was his way or no way."

Ocean Rock comes into the Milstein off a pair of impressive sub-1:50 miles.

On July 18, in the third leg of the Ohio Sires Stake (OHSS) for sophomore colt pacers, Ocean Rock was gunned from post seven and grabbed the early lead and cruised to a 7.34 length score over Elver Hanover, handing the world champion his first career defeat.


The winning time of 1:48.4 established a new Eldorado Scioto Downs' track record, topping the 1:50 mark established by Gallo Blue Chip in 2000.

Ocean Rock's most recent start (Aug. 1) was an open-length victory in the \$118,000 Ohio State Fair event at Scioto Downs in 1:49, pacing the last half of a mile in :53.

With not many chances to take on the continent's best colts, the Nobles were looking for the chance for Ocean Rock to shine on a more national stage.

"His schedule is pretty set. He has the last leg of the sire stakes (Aug. 22) and then the final (Sept. 5) and the (Ohio) Breeders Championship at Delaware (Sept. 24)," noted Christi.

The connections discussed the possibility of supplementing into the Little Brown Jug, but the recently announced open supplement will not be available until 2022.

The homebred son of Rockin Amadeus has earned more than \$285,000 for his owner Sandra S. Burnett of Wilmington, OH. Burnett is a long-time patron of the Noble family.

"She and her husband had horses with Dan's father (Sam 'Chip' Noble) since he was 19 years old. When Dan and I started our stable, she gave us a couple of her homebreds and we have had some success for her," said Christi.

Dan, who recently notched his 6,000th career win, broke and trained Ocean Rock as a 2-year-old and turned the training duties over to his wife at the start of the 3-year-old season.

At 2, Ocean Rock recorded five wins, a pair of second place finishes and \$156,377 in nine 2019 starts. He collected the Ohio State Fair stakes, a pair of Ohio Sire Stakes legs and a solid second place finish to Elver Hanover in the \$300,000 OSS Final.

MGM Northfield Park's executive vice president of racing/simulcast Dave Bianconi has put together another solid Milstein field of 3-year-old pacing colts.

The top three morning choices all drew the inside three post-positions - Catch The Fire (PP1 - Mike Wilder), Odds On Osiris (PP2) and Elver Hanover (PP3 - Chris Page).

Catch The Fire comes into the Milstein off a gutsy victory in the \$375,000 Adios Pace Final on Aug. 1 in 1:49.3 over a sloppy Meadows surface. John Ackley trains the Captaintreacherous colt, who has earned \$468,413 lifetime for the CT Stables LLC.

Odds On Osiris, the 2019 Indiana Sires Stake champion, has won eight of 13 lifetime starts and has earned \$375,395 for owner Odds On Racing of Boca Raton, FL. Peter Wrenn will drive for his wife, trainer Melanie Wrenn.

The third choice is the Ohio-bred Elver Hanover. The gelded son of Yankee Cruiser started his career with 11 straight victories, including a world record 1:48.3 last fall at the Red Mile in Lexington, KY. Ron Burke trains the \$422,700 career earner for Burke Racing Stable, Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky, Jason Melillo and J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby.

The race honors Carl Milstein, who owned Northfield Park from 1984 until his death in 1999. The Milstein family operated Northfield Park until July 2018.

The Milstein undercard features the \$50,000 Myron Charna President's Pace, an invitational for older Ohio-sired pacers,

\$100,000 (div.) Ohio Sires Stakes for 3-year-old trotting colts and the \$100,000 (div.) OSS for 3-year-old pacing fillies.

The double world champion, Action Uncle (Brett Miller) looks to remain undefeated on the season in the second \$50,000 division of the sophomore colt trot. Trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr., the son of Uncle Peter has a lifetime mark of 1:52.4f and a career bankroll \$367,075 for owners Carl Howard, Joyce McClelland and Larry Wills.

The first post for the 16-race card is 6 p.m.

Bettor's Wish is back on track

When Bettor's Wish finished eighth in the Graduate Series championship last month, it snapped a streak of 24 consecutive top-three finishes for the Chris Ryder-trained pacer. When he was third in his following start, it marked only the second time in his career that he went back-to-back races without either a win or second-place finish.

But as he heads to tonight's (Aug. 14) \$225,000 Dan Patch Stakes for older male pacers at Harrah's Hoosier Park, the 4-year-old stallion does so after returning to his winning ways on Hambletonian Day. Bettor's Wish won the Sam McKee Memorial in a lifetime-best 1:47.3 this past weekend and is the 2-1 morning-line favorite in the Dan Patch.

"He's back on track, I would say," Ryder said. "I was really happy with him. We're on target, everything is good."

Bettor's Wish was harness racing's top money-winning horse in 2019, banking \$1.64 million. He won 13 of 19 starts, finishing second in all six defeats, and was the Dan Patch Award winner for best 3-year-old male pacer. The son of Bettor's Delight—Lifetime Star finished second to pacing mare Shartin N in voting for Pacer of the Year and Horse of the Year.

For his career, Bettor's Wish has won 20 of 36 races and \$2.07 million. He is owned by Ryder, Bella Racing, Fair Island Farm, and Bettors Wish Partners.

Bettor's Wish and driver Dexter Dunn will start the Dan Patch from post three. Backstreet Shadow, who finished second to Bettor's Wish in the McKee Memorial, is the 3-1 second choice from post six with driver Tim Tetrick. Backstreet Shadow is one of five Ron Burke-trained horses in the race.



Century Farroh, third in the McKee Memorial, is 7-2 from post two with David Miller driving for trainer Ian Moore.

Bettor's Wish was put on Lasix following the July 11 Graduate Series final and skipped the William R. Haughton Memorial the following weekend. He finished third in an open at The Meadowlands on Aug. 1 before bouncing back in the McKee.

"Yeah, we did have a little trouble getting him in the winner's circle as a 4-year-old," Ryder said following the McKee. "He needed the Lasix and didn't have the liver right (the previous) week. He got tired going down the lane and that was really our fault not the horse's. I was hoping we'd have it corrected (in the McKee) and he came through.

"It's a thrill to have him, it's a thrill to have Dexter drive him."

Following the Dan Patch Stakes, Bettor's Wish is eligible to the Canadian Pacing Derby, Dayton Pacing Derby, Allerage Open Pace, Breeders Crown, and TVG.

"There are not so many races this year," Ryder said. "But it's okay, at least we have them. We're in good shape. I'm excited."

The Dan Patch Stakes is race 11, with an estimated 9:50 p.m. (EDT) post time. Racing begins at 6:30.

Shnitzledosomethinreturns to Indiana for tonight's \$225,000 Dan Patch Stakes

Howard Taylor has owned a victor in almost major stake contest on the continent, but Shnitzledosomethinowns the owner's heart despite not being a world champion or capturing a Breeders Crown.

Tonight (Aug. 14), the 5-year-old stallion could take a major step toward Crown glory with a start in the \$225,000 Dan Patch Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park, the track that will play host to the Breeders Crown on Oct. 30 and 31.

"I just had to have him after seeing him as a yearling," said Taylor who co-owns the pacer with Edwin Gold, Abraham Basen and Richard Lombardo. "He was from Fred's [Fred And Ginger] first crop and he was just a specimen. Out of all the horses I have owned and all the races I have been fortunate to win. I have been so lucky; this horse is my favorite."

Shnitzledosomethin is out of the Sand Shooter mare Summer N Sand and was bred by Aaron Stutzman of Goshen, IN. Trained by Dylan Davis, he will have Scott Zeron in the bike when he leaves from post position one tonight. He is 20-1 on the morning line.

"My partners thought he was not of the caliber to race in the Breeders Crown [at Hoosier Park in 2018]," Taylor said. "But they told me to go with it. And he finished second by a nose in the elimination and final."

Shnitzledosomethin has compiled a record of 59 18-13-2 during his career. The stallion has banked \$764,344 and enters the Dan Patch Stakes after he paced a lifetime career mark [1:49.3] at Harrah's Philadelphia on Aug. 2. He has never failed to break the \$100,000 barrier in purse money earned each year during his career and shipped to Harrah's Philadelphia after an a usual performance in the \$123,100 William Haughton Memorial on July 18 at The Meadowlands.

"I'm not making excuses for him," Davis said. "All the trainers and horses were in the same situation with detention and protocols. But he just wasn't himself. He's doing great right now and I brought him out to Hoosier early so we are here now. He has not turned a hair all week."

The big, bay stallion is definitely a specimen when it comes to his physical presence and Shnitzledosomethin's conformation, oddly enough, is directly related to how he

received his unusual name.

"He was such a beautiful horse," Taylor said. "Even as a yearling. His breeder said he just had to name him that because he was so big and gangly. He would watch him running and all he could think to himself was, 'Go do something.' And he has."

Besides preparing for the Breeders Crown, Shnitzledosomethinmay be paying attention to his younger sibling Somethingbeautiful (Always A Virgin, \$44,250). This 2-year-old filly has dazzled in each of her two trips the post over this surface. She is also trained by Davis and Taylor is already looking forward to the Breeders Crown.

"Shniztle's sister is special," Taylor said. "And that also shows how special he is. They will both be in the Breeders Crown and I think Shnitzle has an advantage because he has shown he well he races at Hoosier Park."

With combined career purse earnings over \$10 million, the Dan Patch's talented field of 10 includes three world champions and four millionaires. North America's leading money-winning trainer, Ron Burke, will send out a strong contingent of five in the field as he looks to score his third training victory in the Dan Patch Stakes.

As the richest horse in the field with \$2 million in lifetime purse earnings, Bettor's Wish will play the role of morning line choice at odds of 2-1 from post three. With Dexter Dunn listed to drive, the 4-year-old son of Bettor's Delight—Lifetime Star will make his Hoosier Park debut after an impressive 1:47.3 score in the Sam McKee Memorial at The Meadowlands last week for trainer Chris Ryder. After capturing the title of 2019 Dan Patch three-year-old pacing colt of the year and the richest pacer of 2019, the World Champion has won two of five starts this season.

Backstreet Shadow has been enlisted as the second choice on the morning line at odds of 3-1. With Tim Tetrick listed to drive, the 5-year-old son of Shadow Play—Backstreet Sweetie will be looking to make amends after a gutsy second place finish to Bettor's Wish in the Sam McKee Memorial last week. Backstreet Shadow is currently the third highest earning aged horse for the 2020 season.

Also included in the celebrated field of 10, world champion Century Farroh will make his way back to Hoosier Park for the first time this season and has drawn post three for trainer Dr. Ian Moore. With over \$790,080 in lifetime purse earnings, Century Farroh has been tabbed 7-2 on the morning line.

In a continued partnership with Hoosier Park, the local news station WISH-TV Channel 8 out of Indianapolis will

provide exclusive coverage for the Dan Patch Stakes racing action. WISH-TV will be on property to provide racing fans with exclusive coverage of all the festivities happening on and off the race track. Racing fans can also catch exclusive interviews from drivers and trainers racing at Hoosier Park throughout the evening. WISH-TV's live coverage begins at 9:30 p.m. tonight and will include the live showing of the Dan Patch Stakes.

The race will be part of a special weekend tagged as "Dan Patch Festival Weekend". Hoosier Park will showcase some of the most notable names in harness racing alongside special wagers, free prizes, VIP giveaways, and food trucks.

Racing fans will have the opportunity to participate in two special wagers offered for the Dan Patch card. A \$25,000 Guaranteed Dan Patch Superfecta pool will be available along with a \$15,000 Guaranteed Hoosier-High Five pool on the last race of the program as part of the Strategic Wagering Program. Each wager is available through the cooperative efforts of the United States Trotting Association, Hoosier Park Racing & Casino and the Indiana Standardbred Association.

Five lucky racing fans will also have the opportunity to place a \$100 win bet on the horse of their choice in the Dan Patch Stakes. Slated as the eleventh race on the card, estimated post time for the Dan Patch Stakes is 9:46 p.m.

Race analysis as weekend stakes action turns to Northfield and Hoosier

Just a week removed from the biggest race card of the year to date from the Meadowlands, some of the top 3-year-olds are in action at Northfield Park on Saturday in the Carl Milstein, while tonight's Dan Patch stakes takes shape of a rematch from last week's Sam McKee for older pacers.

Starting with the 3-year-olds, there's a competitive group of sophomores trying to break through with a consistent string of top performances to see if they can step up and separate themselves from the rest of the pack. Right now, it's Tall Dark Stranger and then everyone else. In the \$250,000 Milstein, a very good field has been assembled that pits a couple of the best Ohio-breds against the usual powerhouses from other states.

My top selection in the race 10 Milstein is going to be STANFORD COURT. Trained by connections who are no stranger to the track in Brian Brown and Ronnie Wrenn, he's 4-for-6 on the year after winning just once last year as a 2-year-old. The gelding by Nob Hill High has had his only two losses come at the hands of OCEAN ROCK, and that one is severely compromised in this race by the post. STANFORD COURT had the unenviable task of coming first over against that rival at Scioto last week and paced his back half mile in :52:4. CATCH THE FIRE makes his first start since hanging on



and winning the Adios and is obviously aided by the rail. He showed promise right when this season resumed and he's peaking at the right time; a logical favorite but isn't infallible.

ODDS ON OSIRIS was upset in his last at Hoosier at short odds. He probably should have won that race, and the horse that beat him only came back to run second recently at the Indiana State Fair. This seems like a tough ask and will be higher odds than the 7-/2 morning line. CHIEF MATE had no shot in the Cane, but he flew in the Adios final and a case can be made that he's coming around. OCEAN ROCK comes off a track record mile two back and then followed that up with another fast win at Scioto last out. The post is a killer unfortunately. ELVER HANOVER isn't pound for pound as good as #8, but does have a post edge.

Picks:

Stanford Court - Catch The Fire - Chief Mate

The Milstein is the final leg of a \$20,000 guaranteed pick 4, which begins that begins in race 7. Beginning with that race, here is now I see the sequence playing out.

Race 7, open handicap:

Only 20 horses have ever accumulated 100 or more career earnings, and SOUTHWIND AMAZON is inching in on that milestone. A win in this open would give him career win number 98, and he's found a very nice niche in Ohio the past couple years after being a top performer for years in Canada. In fact, his 1:48.3 mark came just three races ago, not bad for age 10! He gave it a very good front-end try against Bllack Hole two back as well as a couple other horses that are in the race 9 Invite; seems like the class of the field. HE CAN FLY N was forced into the pocket last out against BULLY PULPIT after leaving into a hot opening quarter. He gapped the pocket at times in the mile but was gaining on that rival late; gets a driver change also and is playable. The aforementioned BULLY PULPIT once paced a 1:49.4 mile here last year and came to pace last week when he blasted from the rail. He went through fast fractions and lasted; a possibility if that good again. HALLIE'S COMET qualified well but hasn't raced since March. I'M SOME GRADUATE will be aggressively handled; could go either way as a short-priced Burke contender.

Race 8, N/W \$8,500 L4:

JOGGINGTOTHEBANK did just that last week when he crushed lesser in a career best 1:52.4. He now steps up for the fourth straight time while seeking his fourth straight win; I'd continue to play in current razor sharp form. WIND OF THE NORTH drops from the open but was second when

beaten as the even money favorite against similar three back. 10-year-old won't be a cinch at short odds. It's possible that LADYS DUDE could trip out and win. Similar happened three back and I wouldn't want to get beat by a horse like this from Burke at the rail. PALMER'S PRIDE could get some attention with Zeron in town and getting the driving call. BULLY BOY stormed by lesser here in June.

Race 9, invite:

BLLACK HOLE will merit strong favoritism. He won a Graduate leg at the Meadowlands last month and still paced a 1:47:3 mile in the Graduate final despite a horror trip when parked out from post 9 through a :52 and change half-mile. He won comfortably twice since returning to Ohio including a win last out over FFA pacer Workin Ona Mystery; could even be considered as a "single" in the pick-4. MAJOR NEMESIS was heavily bet last out and even with the tough trip he didn't really move forward when tipped three-wide. That was a well-meant winner but still from a lesser condition; lands his best post in a while but hasn't won since June. DANCIN DRAGON had no-shot trips in his last pair but was a 1:49:3 winner four back. SECTIONLINE BIGRY was a monster in the middle of July but his last couple don't look as strong; might take an early shot.

\$20k guarantee Pick 4 races 7 through 10: 3-4-7 / 1-4 / 6-9 / 1-4

Preceding the big Northfield card on Saturday is the Dan Patch Stakes for \$225,000 that goes tonight at Hoosier Park. In the race for FFA pacers carded as race 11 on the 15-race slate, all but one is racing on six days rest following being in action at the Meadowlands last Saturday. Also, trainer Ron Burke sports half of the entries (5) in the field, though most will be longer priced horses.

Dave Miller opts for CENTURY FARROH over OUR MAJORDAN A and that's a noteworthy decision. The Mach Three 4-year-old has been racing far better than the 1 for 7 record indicates and has raced well in tough miles nearly all summer; will be right there with any semblance of a trip. BETTOR'S WISH was dead game Saturday in winning the Sam McKee; he took pressure throughout and kept on going. Will offer an even shorter price now and will need to be just as good. OUR MAJORDAN A has been racing his eyeballs out on the front end in recent races and maybe the second tier start tonight will actually help him; huge potential for recent import and picks up the red-hot McCarthy who had quite a day last Saturday.

WORKIN ONA MYSTERY is an enticing 12-1 morning line and may go somewhat overlooked with Trace Tetrick as regular driver and brother Tim goes for BACKSTREET SHADOW. All of his Graduate races were strong at the

Meadowlands and it took a big mile by another horse to beat him in a 1:49 mile at Scioto last week; could be rolling late. BACKSTREET SHADOW keeps Tetrick off that mile in the McKee last week and he was stronger late in the race than he was the week prior; will look to secure another good early spot. SHNITZLEDOSOMETHIN is back to his home track and he's surprised against these types before; rates a longshot possibility.



Karen Carroll's passion for horses is in her DNA

The third-generation horseperson from Shedden, ON has gone from a trainer and driver to the breeder of high-quality standardbreds at her family's Talbot Creek Farm.

Karen Carroll got her first pony at seven and has rarely been without a horse in the years since. Although she no longer does any driving and training, her Talbot Creek Farm is currently home to 17 broodmares and their offspring.

"My husband says, 'Have you counted them lately?'" Carroll said with a laugh. "I know it's a lot of work, but I guess when you enjoy it, they're part of the family."

It was her family that sparked Carroll's interest in harness racing. Her grandfather, George Bennett, bred and raced standardbreds and was eventually followed into the business by her father Blake Bennett.

"My grandpa passed away and my dad inherited the rest of what my grandpa had, and then he went out and bought Armbro Agile at the next Canadian Classic Sale, I think, and he turned out to be a great horse. That's kind of when I ended up going to help more full-time was when dad had to leave to go to Sweden and I was kind of needed around the farm to look after the rest of the herd that was left at home," recalled Carroll. Armbro Agile competed in the 1984 Elitlopp and Copenhagen Cup for Bennett and driver Trevor Ritchie, finishing out of the money in the former and second in the latter.

"I guess out of all the kids I was more involved with it. The others were busy with their own endeavours; some were milking cows and that sort of thing. I got to go to the races with dad and see that end of it and thought, 'I enjoy it,' and thought I'd take up training and driving."

Both her father and grandfather focussed on trotters and as a trainer/driver that was also where Carroll concentrated. In a career that spanned three decades she would steer 142

winners to earnings just shy of \$500,000 and serve as Ontario's representative in the Women's Driving Championship in Prince Edward Island. As a trainer she posted 43 wins and earnings of \$227,505. Her last appearance as both a driver and trainer came at The Raceway at Western Fair District in October, 2015.

Carroll said the bulk of her success came between 1995 and 2000, when the first of her four children arrived. Soon after starting their family, the horsewoman and her veterinarian husband, Dr. Wayne Carroll, decided it made more sense to operate a breeding farm rather than a racing stable.

"Around 2002 or so we decided I'm going to have to cut back on the training and driving and get some other people to do the training for me, and we decided to do a little bit more of the breeding," said Carroll. "You start out with what you have and what you know, and then try to improve it as you're going along, and I guess that's where we're at now. You've got to change up your broodmare band and keep it current."

One of the early horses that Carroll had someone else train for her was Luck Of Michelle, a 2005 yearling acquisition who had a tremendous freshman season, earning the 2006 O'Brien Award for 2-year-old pacing fillies, and going on to earnings of \$907,709 before beginning her career as a broodmare. Carroll co-owned the daughter of Camluck and Michelles Destiny with Natalie Pentland and John Pentland trained the filly through her 3-year racing career.

"We'd buy yearling fillies that we thought we could train and would be decent race mares that we could keep as broodmares," said Carroll. "And sometimes we'd buy racing stock, a 2- or 3-year-old that somebody'd put in the mixed sale and we thought we might be able to race her as a 4- or 5-year-old and then keep her as a broodmare, and that worked out a little bit for us, we had some luck with those."

The economics of buying yearling fillies and racing stock caused Carroll to expand her focus beyond trotters. At the moment, Talbot Creek is home to nine pacing and six trotting broodmares. Most of the early purchases spent some time on the racetrack, but recently the Carroll's have shifted their focus to acquiring mares that are in foal or ready to breed.

"We bought Gimpanzee's half-sister (Danish Girl) and she's got a Muscle Mass filly this year, a yearling, and she's got a gorgeous Father Patrick filly by her side and she's back in foal to Greenshoe," said Carroll, who offered up \$170,000 for the Credit Winner mare at the 2018 Harrisburg Mixed Sale. "We've got a lot of mares this year that are maiden mares so it will be interesting next year in foaling season, to see what we have."

To date, the most successful product of the Talbot Creek breeding program is \$711,831 winner Backstreet Shadow. The 5-year-old son of Shadow Play and Backstreet Sweetie is currently a regular player in the open stake ranks for trainer Ron Burke.

This fall, the Carrolls will sell seven yearlings, keeping their fingers crossed that buyers will figure out how to navigate the online, telephone and in-person options available to them at each of the yearling sales.

"This year, obviously, is a little different for everyone, so I

guess we're all going to find out shortly how it's going to work," said the breeder. "It's a little harder for smaller farms to entice someone to come out and view your stock when you're only selling maybe seven or eight horses and other farms have 20. And it'll be hard to have Ontario buyers go down to the States when they've got to quarantine for two weeks when they come back."

Carroll said yearling videos — walking, conformation and trotting — are scheduled for the coming weeks with the goal of having them available for viewing by Sept. 1. Among the offerings she hopes will lure buyers to Shedden, ON are the first foals out of Danish Girl (a Muscle Mass filly) and pacing mare True Reflection (a Sunshine Beach colt), a Betting Line half-brother to Mankat and a strapping Muscle Mass filly out of Quantum Victoria.

In addition to their standardbred breeding operation, the Carrolls have also branched out into thoroughbreds in recent years, acquiring two mares and diving into the differences in the thoroughbred stud book.

"There's a lot of thoroughbred stallions, and it's a totally different pedigree to read. If you try to compare that to a standardbred you would think, 'Why are you breeding to that horse?' It's interesting the difference in them, and even the mares," said Carroll. "It's just a different ballgame. Just something interesting to get into and, I guess, to diversify. You're always learning something new."

While all 17 mares and their offspring are a cherished part of Carroll's equine family, she does admit to having a special relationship with Andover Hall mare Northern Flare, who earned \$77,636 for her before entering the breeding program in 2011.

"We bought her as a yearling and I trained and raced her myself, so I guess she has a special spot with me. Her and I get along very well," said Carroll with a laugh, adding that Wayne and children Zachary, Rhys, Makenna and Seth give her a hard time about her fondness for the mare. "Flare is, as Wayne would say, the golden child, in my eyes anyway. You have to have one, right? I think he does it just to rib me."

Carroll's lifelong passion for horses and harness racing has rubbed off on her children. All four contribute to the successful operation of Talbot Creek Farm and eldest son Zachary is currently working full-time at David Anderson's St. Thomas, ON farm, extending the legacy of horsemanship into the fourth generation.











To dream about the future and the great trotting battles to come

It's easy not to think about the future in a year like this. Civilization has been turned upside down in 2020 and the harness racing business is no exception.

However, the horse industry seems to survive in Europe and one is allowed to dream about another season when things might be back as before when the public can find its way back to the tracks. With some really exciting trotters entering the tracks around the globe, fans already are looking forward to the big races in 2021.

Gimpanzee from the USA is definitely a horse that many people would like to see in some of the most prestigious races in Europe next year and trainer Marcus Melander and the horse's owners haven't closed any doors regarding a trip overseas. Face Time Bourbon is the natural choice when it comes to defending Europe's flag in a battle with Gimpanzee, but we cannot set aside the fact that Jean-Michel Bazire's Cleangame (who is a gelding and therefor excluded from the biggest races in France) is a horse to count on one more season.

On Wednesday afternoon, the 8-year-old Ouragan de Celland gelding played with his opponents in \$129,000 Prix

Jean-Luc Lagardere at Enghien in Paris, France. Cleangame came to the lead at an early stage in the 1.8 miles long race and just sprinted home in mile rate 1:59.4. This was Cleangame's third victory in 2020.

Set for another E3 final

Two divisions of the \$217,000 E3 will be held at Romme racetrack in Sweden on Saturday afternoon (Aug. 15) and this time it's time for the shorter version in the series for 3-year-olds.

The E3 contested at 1.3 miles was held in the end of June and Global Badman claimed the division for colts and geldings while Barbro Kronos caught the win for the mares.

None of those two will enter the finals on Saturday's race card at Romme and E3 king Svante Båth, who trains Barbro Kronos, misses the E3 final this time, which is unusual.

Courant Stable invests a lot in harness racing and the red and yellow colored jacket has been seen in winner's circles on both sides of the Atlantic Ocean the past years and Courant will send out the favorite in both divisions of Saturday's E3.

Hell Bent For Am (Muscle Hill) started his career in USA in Marcus Melander's barn and made four starts in America ahead of the trip to Sweden, where Marcus' uncle Stefan trains the horse. Hell Bent For Am won the final of \$210,000 Breeders Cours at Solvalla in late May and qualified for E3 as third after a material mishap in the end of the elimination. From post 10, Hell Bent For Am will be the race's first choice and even in the division for mares Courant Stable seems to be in favorite position since Hilarious Am (Cantab Hall) impressed in the eliminations.

The absolute final look at Hambletonian Day 2020

by Bob Heyden

The first time driver Andrew McCarthy appeared at the Meadowlands for Hambletonian Day was also the last time all the eliminations and the Hambletonian final went to the favorites -2007.

That year, the elimination winners were: Donato Hanover (\$2.40), Adrian Chip (\$3.40) and Pampered Princess (\$3.40). The final was won by Donato Hanover (\$4.00).

This year, it happened again. The eliminations were won by favorites Ramona Hill (\$4.40) and Ready For Moni (\$4.40). The final was won by Ramona Hill (\$2.80 — the lowest win price in the Hambletonian since 2009, when her sire Muscle Hill returned \$2.60)

Peter Haughton Jinx — no denying the numbers

Peter Haughton was at his best with trotters, winning the last two Roosevelt Internationals he was in with Cold Comfort and Doublemint in 1978-1979, respectively. He was and is the youngest driver to win any Triple Crown race doing so in 1976 winning the Kentucky Futurity with Quick Pay at age 22.

But, the 2-year-old trotting colt stakes race named for him in 1981 has not been a sign of things to come in the following year's Hambletonian.

The first 25 years yielded no Haughton winners that went on to win the Hambletonian.

Donato Hanover did so in 2006 and 2007, and then Muscle Hill the same in 2008-2009. And that's it. None of the last 11 Peter Haughton winners have doubled up.

2019 — Real Cool Sam did not make it to the 2020 Hambletonian.

2018 - Dont Let Em finished last in the 2019 Hambletonian

2017 - Youknowyoudo didn't make it to the Hambletonian.

2016 - What The Hill was DQed in the 2017 Hambletonian.

2015 — Southwind Frank was nosed out by Marion Marauder in 2016 in the Hambletonian final.

2014 — Centurion AM didn't make it the following year.

2013 — Father Patrick broke at the start from Post 10 in the 2014 Hambletonian and lost all chance.

2012 — A Perfectyankee managed fourth money in the next seasons Hambletonian.

2011 – Weingartner didn't make it to the Hambletonian.

2010 – The Lindy Reserve didn't make it the next year.

2009 — Holiday Road was last the following year after setting the Peter Haughton record of 1:54 at 2.

Seconds, please

Driver Yannick Gingras has three times finished second in the Hambletonian. Ready For Moni was valiant trotting in 1:50.2 this year, joining Mission Brief 2015 and Southwind Frank in 2016, as those who were second best. The last driver to have three seconds in the Hambletonian was John Campbell — 2010 Lucky Chucky, 2014 Nuncio and 1999 Angus Hall.

ID now required

The average age of the driver who won the Hambletonian from 2005-2015 was 47.7 years of age.

The average age of the driver who won the Hambletonian from 2016-2020 is 35.

Second tiers or tears?

Sometimes it works out. In the first ever \$1 million Hambletonian in 1983, both elimination winners did so from post 12 — Duenna and Joie De Vie. Stanley Dancer en route to his last Hambletonian as a driver the same year John Campbell made his Hambletonian debut.

But in 2020, Hypnotic AM drew post 12 and got caught in a terrible flow and had to flip into another gear just to get second in the \$600,000 Hambletonian Oaks won by Sorella. Brian Sears did the navigating on Hypnotic AM.

Telescopic check

The final check in the 2020 Hambletonian went to Hollywood Story, 16 and a quarter lengths back and over three seconds behind Ramona Hill, yet he still earned \$50,000 for his connections.

That margin is the furthest back of any check-getter in Meadowlands Hambletonian history.

Previously, Cotton Hanover in 1987 was fifth, 16 lengths back for Dick Richardson, Jr. in the Mack Lobell-won

Hambletonian. Another who got the final check in another zip code was Cherry Hills in 1999, 13 3/4s back in Dave Palone's lone Hambletonian check.

Meeting of the board

Or should I say on the board.

Scott Zeron just became the youngest driver to hit the board three times in a Hambletonian final. He is 31. Tim Tetrick also did so at 31, but was 31 years nine months and Scotty is 31 years 3 months.

Back Of The Neck was third this year after Zeron scored twice in his 20s with Marion Marauder in 2016 and Atlanta in 2018.

Tetrick was second with Crazed in 2008, won it with Market Share in 2012 and then was runner-up with Smilin Eli in 2013.

For the record, Billy Haughton was 41, Stanley Dancer 47, Mike Lachance 44 and John Campbell 32. Noteworthy is that Brian Sears' first time on the board in the Hambletonian came at age 41 (2009 first with Muscle Hill).

Family affair

Andy McCarthy did some things no one else has done in the 2st century:

Muscle Hill. He and brother Luke both did, with Luke winning the \$540,000 World Trotting Derby of 2009 with the HOY Muscle Hill.

Streakers

Tim Tetrick now has driven in 14 straight Hambletonian finals.

Shartin N has won three straight Lady Libertys.

Dealt A Winner is the only horse to ever make it to six straight Hambletonian Days! (10th this year). He debuted in 2015 winning the Cane Pace as the Triple Crown for pacers kicked off in East Rutherford that year.

Muscle Hill has won the last three Peter Haughtons in a row as a sire and the last five Hambletonian Oaks.

It was the Determination and Luc Blais show on Thursday night (Aug. 13), as they swept the top two spots in both the \$79,000 Millard Farms and \$84,500 Pure Ivory Series finals for 2-year-old trotters.

Macho Martini kept his perfect record alive with a dominant 1:54.4 score in the Millard Farms, while **Donna**Soprano charged by rivals in the lane to win the Pure Ivory in 1:55.1. Bob McClure guided both horses to victory and both were series record miles.

The Determination-Blais Exacta was completed in the Millard Farms by On A Streak and in the Pure Ivory by Dicentra. Scott Young guided both rookies for Blais.

A son of Muscle Mass, Macho Martini made a second-quarter move to the lead from fourth. The rookie trotting colt led by the half in :57.3 and three-quarters in 1:27 before trotting away with a :27.4 final-quarter to win by 2 ¾ lengths. On A Streak was the early lead and held second, while 65-1 shot Lucky Rascal rallied for third.

"You don't even have to say anything, he speaks for himself," said McClure of Macho Martini. "He's clearly special and we just have to hope he stays healthy and sound and with Luc (Blais) training I'm sure he will."

Now four-for-four, Macho Martini has already amassed \$140,433 in earnings for owner Serge Godin's Determination. He was a \$37,000 yearling purchase at Standardbred Horse Sales Company's (SHSC) auction in Harrisburg, PA.

Macho Martini paid \$2.70 to win.

Donna Soprano's journey to victory was much different than her stablemate, as she was outside the whole way and rallied from sixth at three-quarters to win by 3 3/4 lengths.

Blais trainee Dicentra made a second-quarter move to the top and posted panels of :58.1 and 1:27.1 to lead into the stretch. Donna Soprano, who started from post nine, got away sixth and would follow Amazone Duharas for the entire middle-half to sit second-over and four-lengths from the lead turning for home.

In the stretch, Donna Soprano unleashed a powerful :27.1 final-quarter for the impressive victory. Dicentra was second, while Amazone Duharas was third.

A daughter of Donato Hanover, Donna Soprano is now two for two to start her career. She is the fourth foal from \$1.2 million winner Windsong Soprano and sold for \$190,000 at last year's SHSC yearling sale.

"Donna Soprano is very fast, but her mind hasn't quite caught up to her legs yet," said McClure post-race. "Leaps and bounds better this week on professionalism and if she stays professional she's crazy fast."

Donna Soprano has earned \$52,250 in two starts. She paid \$5.10 to win.

Macho Martini's clocking of 1:54.4 smashed Alarm Detector's previous series record of 1:56 set in 2017. Donna Soprano's mile of 1:55.1 broke Spirit To Win's record of 1:55.3, which was established in 2014.

Other winners were **Feelin Western** 1:57.4, **Pine Grove Racer** 1:58.4 and **Rockinmyshoes** 1:59.

The 2-year-old filly trot was led by **Elegant Gigi** with Ryan Stahl and owner/trainer Rosy Weaver in 2:01.4. The

Dejarmbro filly came home by seven lengths after being 5th at the half and moving first up.

Sophomore fillies vie in final leg of Ohio Sires Stakes

Two \$50,000 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) for 3-year-old trotting fillies set to be held on tonight (Aug. 14) at Scioto Downs, will determine the field for the \$300,000 championships, set to be held at this same five-eighths mile venue on Sept. 5.

This fourth leg of the series features 15 diagonally gaited distaffs, including three each sired by Triumphant Caviar and Uncle Peter, with two each being sired by Break The Bank K, Cash Hall and Manofmanymissions. As well, Ohio stallions represented by one foal each in these contests include Coraggioso, My MVP and Team Six.

The undefeated Guinevere Hall looks to keep her unblemished 2020 record intact in the first OHSS division (Race 3), leaving from post six for driver Peter Wrenn and trainer Melanie Wrenn. This daughter of Cash Hall is owned by the MT Pockets Stables of Pompano Beach, FL and David McDufee of Delray Beach, FL. A winner of \$134,181 in 2019, the bay filly has added \$95,900 additional dollars to her coffers this season, including triumphs in all three previous OHSS legs. Bred by Alan J. Leavitt of Kentucky, Guinevere Hall is the seventh foal out of the unraced Lindy Lane mare Garbo Hall and has a half-brother in the Conway Hall gelding Godspell Hall 1:55.4 (\$38,301).

Kikimora, a winner of two previous OHSS legs earlier this season, will leave from post one in this same division with

Aaron Merriman at the helm for trainer Chris Beaver, who co-owns the daughter of Triumphant Caviar in partnership with breeder Sandra Burnett of Wilmington, Ohio. This speedy bay filly has career earnings of \$257,516 lifetime, with \$47,320 of those monies collected this season. Kikimora is the fourth foal out of the Chip Chip Hooray mare Nessa Rose 3, 1:57.1s (\$38,829) with half-siblings in Evanora (by Pilgrims Taj) 3, 1:56.3h (\$115,348); Ilianora (by Broadway Hall) 3, 1:56.2f (\$56,522); and Theodora (by Stormin Normand) 2, 2:01.2h (\$16,700).

Thestable Globetrotting's Globetrottingheads up the second OHSS division (Race 8) from post eight for driver Anthony Macdonald and trainer Jason McGinnis. This Manofmanymissions lass has \$193,207 in career earnings and captured her OHSS Leg One in 1:55.1, before finishing a rough fifth in Leg Two and a solid fourth in Leg Three. Bred by Steiner Stock Farm, Globetrotting is the fifth and most prolific foal out of the Andover Hall mare Celebrity Deville 3, 1:54.3s (\$338,744). She is a half-sister to Lima Cadillac (by Yankee Glide) 3, Q1:54.4f (\$93,210); Lima Charisma (by Muscle Hill) 3, 1:55.1f (\$75,960); and Iwantmytwodollars (by Muscle Hill) 4, 1:57.1h (\$47,456), among others.

The other previous OHSS leg winner in this same division is A Fancy Face, who starts from post five with Chris Page at the controls for trainer Ronnie Burke. This My MVP lass captured OHSS Leg Three in 1:54.2 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Hatfield Stables, J&T Silva-Purnel&Libby and Weaver Bruscemi. Bred by Spring Haven Farm, A Fancy Face is the first foal out of the unraced Muscle Massive mare Alliomi, and is a half-sister to the Ohio Sires Stakes winning 2-year-old filly A Doll Face (by Dontyouforgetit) 2, 1:59.4h (\$33,704).

Final leg of Ohio Sires Stakes for trotting colts and pacing fillies

A quartet of \$50,000 fourth leg Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) divisions on Saturday, Aug. 15 at Northfield Park will determine the championship fields for Super Night, set for Sept. 5 at Scioto Downs.

Thirteen sophomore trotting colts will line up behind the Northfield Park starting gate while two six-horse fields of 3-year-old pacing fillies vie in the fourth round of the OHSS series.

Of the 13 trotters going postward, four are by Ohio-registered sire Uncle Peter and two each are by Break The Bank K and Triumphant Caviar. Stallions represented by one foal each in these contests include Dejarmbro, Full Count, Manofmanymissions, Winning Fireworks and Wishing Stone.

In the first division (Race One) Doubleyellowline looks like the one to beat, leaving from post two with Danny Noble driving for trainer Bob Stewart and owners Norman Rae Racing and Deborah Noble of Xenia, Ohio. This gelded son of Uncle Peter has finished third twice in two previous OHSS legs and owns a mark of 1:53.3 taken in a Scioto overnight. Bred by Franklin Farms, Doubleyellowline has \$72,896 in career earnings and is the second foal out of the unraced

Glidemaster mare Lady Glider, with a half-sister in Shezajarm (by Dejarmbro) 2, 2:15h (\$13,786). Doubleyellowline currently sits sixth in the OHSS standings.

The second division (Race 11) bears watching as it pits the undefeated Action Uncle (post one, Brett Miller) against two-time OHSS winner Yanks Dugout (post four, Kurt Sugg). The former is a son of Uncle Peter who has swept all three legs of this OHSS division, and currently sits atop the OHSS standings for owners Carl Howard, Joyce McClelland and Larry Wills. Trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr., Action Uncle has amassed \$367,075 in career earnings. He is the first foal out of the Broadway Hall mare Action-Broadway 5, 1:52.3 (\$1,102,073).

The latter is a son of Triumpant Caviar, out of the Muscles Yankee mare Yansky who is trained by Edward Miller and has earned \$89,973 for owners Ivan and Duke Sugg. Yanks Dugout, who is second in the OHSS standings in this division, is the fourth foal out of his dam Yansky 3, 1:57f (\$122,127) with half-siblings in Yanks Ball Girl (by Majestic Son) 4, 1:57f (\$60,722) and Fashion Can Do It (by Cantab Hall) 3, 1:58.1f (\$30,030).

Twelve sophomore pacing fillies vie in two divisions with five of these distaffs sired by Pet Rock, while the following stallions are represented by one foal each: Big Bad John, Dragon Again, Feelin Friskie, McArdle, Mister big, Western Vintage and Yankee Cruiser.

In the first division (Race 2) two-time OHSS winner and divisional leader PJ's Legacy leaves from post five with Ryan Stahl handling the lines for trainer Brian Brown. This daughter of Big Bad John captured OHSS leg one in 1:52, with a 1:51.3 score at Northfield in Leg Two. The winner of \$180,923 lifetime is owned by Jennifer Brown, Hutchison Harness, J. Ridder and M. Kantrowitz. Bred by Walter S. Fister of Kentucky, PJ's Legacy is out of the Jenna's Beach Boy mare Walstan's Lady p, 3, Q1:54.4f (\$29,317).

Also vying in this same division is McMarkle Sparkle(fourth in the standings), an OHSS Leg One winner in 1:50.1 for trainer Jim Arledge, Jr. and owners Laura and Paul Baker, along with Shirley Levin's Penpaperpaige (third in the standings) who captured OHSS Leg Two in 1:53.2 for trainer Jeff Smith.
