My summers on the leaky roof circuit - 1970

Trading barn clothes for a suit and tie and a job on the midwestern fair circuit.

Introduction: Earlier this summer in Harness Racing Update, I wrote about my summers (1966-69)as a swipe at Walnut Hall Farm in Kentucky and on the track with a racing stable:

My next two summers I spent as a summer representative to the county fairs for the U.S. Trotting Assn. This meant that I had to put on a dress shirt and tie in June and hit the road to cover fairs in Indiana, Michigan and Ohio. I was one of three traveling reps that the USTA then employed to provide publicity and other assistance to fairs with harness racing.



My summer job in 1970 was set to begin in mid-June after I got out of classes at Ohio University in Athens. But my academic years ended abruptly in May. Those who are long enough in the tooth or who have long memories

will remember that four students were shot and killed at Kent State University in Ohio on May 4 that year.

On that same day at Ohio University, I was welcoming the 80-year-old Edward Bernays, the man considered the father of public relations (also nephew of Sigmund Freud) to the university campus in my role as an officer in the Public Relations Student Society.

(I was introduced to Bernays and he said, "Oh, you look so young to be a Dean." True enough: I was 20 at that time and I was mightily tempted to say, "And I've been a Dean since birth." Not an academic Dean, of course but just a regular Dean).

This was the era of the Vietnam War, and college campus were ablaze with anti-war protests. Protests of the Kent State killing came to our campus and Ohio National Guardsmen were brought in to maintain order. One evening I saw a former roomie and told him I was going uptown to see what was happening.

"Oh, no, man," he told me. "It's crazy there. Students throwing bricks through store windows... trying to turn over cars and set them on fire. I wouldn't go up there. It's too dangerous."

But fools rush in where wise men fear to tread and I continued treading toward the chaos. I spotted National Guardsmen on the rooftops with rifles. They were also on the streets protecting businesses. Students were chanting. Fires were blazing.

Suddenly shots rang out. I wasn't sure where they came from. That was a moot point. I simply turned and ran. I can say without fear of contradiction that Usain Bolt never covered ground faster than I did. No, I probably can't outrun a bullet, but I was determined to give it the old college try.

My room was at the foot of a steep hill and I headed for safety. The National Guardsmen later began tossing tear-gas cannisters down the hill, knowing that they were roll to the bottom where the troublemakers (aka students) lived. The university president came on the college radio station about 3 a.m. and said that school was closed and that students had 24 hours to get off campus.

We learned later that the National Guardsmen were, in fact, firing blanks not bullets. But they sure were not firing blanks when they killed those four students at Kent State. I wasn't planning to find out.

So I had a month before I could start my USTA work and I found a job with a tree-trimming team before I drove from my home in Cincinnati to get my USTA marching orders in Columbus.

The USTA then strongly believed that fair racing was the foundation of the business and that a business was built from the foundation up. The USTA provided a lot of support for county fairs, understanding that many trainers, drivers, owners and horses got introduced to harness racing at the fair level.

Larry Evans was our boss and he wrote a "Fair Affairs" column in *Hoof Beats* each month and spoke to countless horsemen's banquets in the off-season. Larry lived and loved county fair racing.

My territory was Indiana, Michigan, and Ohio. Other summer reps covered other fairs.

Keep in mind this was long before the era of GPS, cell phones, and Internet. No, I didn't travel to the fairs on horseback or in a Conestoga wagon, but travel in that era was much different than today.

Harness racing was different, too. There were 429 tracks (fairs and pari-mutuel raceways) offering harness racing then. Michigan, for example, had harness racing at 29 fairs in 1970. This year it has racing at 11.

Ostensibly the job of the fair reps was to provide publicity or any other assistance needed by a fair. Alas, the racing people at fairs had no idea I was to arrive and I know often they regarded me as a USTA spy to make sure officials were abiding by the rules. I tried to arrange media coverage of the fair racing in advance and also to cover the races themselves if I arrived during the fair.

I went first to Converse in northeast Indiana and there I made friends with Lowell "Tubby" Trimble and his sons and a young teacher named Richard "Pete" Beck who later served in the Indiana legislature and on the racing commission.

I wore a dress shirt and tie and that made me automatically suspicious in the barn area of any county fair. But I recall Tubby bringing a pacer back to the barn one morning and I unchecked the colt and helped Tubby unhook the harness from the cart. I think that gave me instant credibility with Tubby.

Tubby had a top sophomore pacer that season named Golden Boy Dean — a name I rather fancied in that era when I still had blonde hair.

I already knew that the king of Indiana was Jerry Landess, a truck driver by vocation and a horseman par excellence as his avocation. Everyone respected Jerry's work ethic and horsemanship. A half-dozen years after I witnessed his wizardry on the track, Jerry would begin breaking a yearling pacer named Abercrombie at his fairgrounds stable in Indiana.

From Indiana I went north to Michigan and it's difficult to comprehend how the roles of those two states have reversed since my time at the fairs. In 1970, Indiana was still 25 years away from pari-mutuels, so a handful of fairs was all the Hoosier State had to offer. By contrast, Michigan was a pari-mutuel powerhouse with a strong county fair program and numerous breeding farms.

I found accommodations in whatever cheap motels were available and usually paid \$8-10/night. One night when racing was slated in Big Rapids, I chanced into a motel that had color TV in the rooms! Hoo boy---a high-class joint. That night the All-Star Baseball game was slated and rain was

forecast.

The Big Rapids fair had carded a non-winners of \$200 lifetime pace and some of the orangutans among the entries were six or seven years old. You don't need to be a genius to figure out that a horse that old which hasn't earned \$200 lifetime ain't much stock. I assumed that some farmers just pulled horses out of the field and took them to the fair for a little fun.

The Big Rapids track records then were 2:07.2 for pacers and 2:08-3/4 for trotters. That speaks volumes.

It rained all afternoon and I assumed that the fair might cancel racing, and I could watch the All-Star game in my dry motel room. But the fair had 20 heats slated that night and 22 the next night, so they found a way to race over a track that was a sea of mud.

I stood behind the judges stand on the inside of the track and watched horses splash through their warm-up miles. They went several sulky widths from the rail since the inside of the track was a giant marshland.

I noticed a pacer come down the stretch acting strangely as he drifted into the mud and took aim at the hub rail. BAM! He hit the hub rail and went down, catapulting the driver into a free mud bath. I began running to help as soon I saw realized what was happening.

"JUMP ON HIS HEAD! JUMP ON HIS HEAD!" came a chorus of voices from the judges stand.

I knew what to do when I horse went down. This horse was likely one of those in the NW \$200 Life Pace. And I was wearing a sport coat, dress shirt, tie, nice slacks, and good shoes. I mentally calculated that my J.C. Penney attire was worth more than the horse and I figured, "He got down there by himself. Let him get up by himself."

Damned if he didn't! The driver was okay and the horse somehow scrambled to its feet.

I crisscrossed Michigan, doing my best to generate some media coverage for the racing and help fair officials in whatever way I could. Then it was south to Ohio where I hit fairs in Urbana, Lisbon, Marietta, Upper Sandusky, Greenville, Medina, Sidney, Zanesville, and many more.

That summer, a sophomore colt pacer named Sammy Key had a long winning streak going and the black colt rolled along like Ol' Man River until the fair at Upper Sandusky where he was upset. I managed to get some good newspaper coverage for that, as I recall.

All too soon it was time to head back to college for my senior year, but after a few weeks of classes I managed to fit in one more county fair as I played hooky and drove to the Delaware County Fair and watched Most Happy Fella defeat Columbia George in a slam-bang Little Brown Jug.

Mascate Match wins \$207,000 E3 in Örebro

Pekka Korpi steered his Muscle Mass mare Mascate Match to a safe win in the \$207,000 E3 for mares over the mile in Örebro, Sweden on Saturday afternoon.

Mascate Match early found the lead and Pekka Korpis was allowed to keep the pace down until the last turn, when first over racing Global Anarchy tried to challenge the leader. Mascate Match was, once more, superior her opponents and she came home in 1:56.2.

"She can be the best horse that I've ever trained. She's very easy to handle in races and it's always fun to win races like this," said Korpi after the great victory.

How good is Aetos Kronos?

We will never get the answer, but it's part of the harness racing business to speculate about and compare horses and how good they are on both sides of the Atlantic ocean.

When the \$207,000 E3 final for colts and geldings was held in Örebro, Jerry Riordan's Aetos Kronos (Bold Eagle) established who's the best 3-year-old trotter in Sweden, and maybe even in Europe.

Aetos Kronos, partly owned by Jeff Snyder, won the first



edition of the E3 earlier this summer and was in first choice position from post 3 behind the gate when the shorter division was scheduled on Saturday afternoon.

Driver Johan Untersteiner noted early that second choice Global Adventure came to the lead after a quarter of a mile and that Aetos Kronos had to do the heavy job first over while the pace was high. In the last turn, Untersteiner put in the gear that told the outcome of the race. Aetos Kronos disarmed Global Adventure and cruised to safe win in 1:54.

"This horse has a heart of gold and it's rare to drive trotters that fight so much as he does. Among the best 3-year-olds in the world? I'm pretty sure that he belongs in the top of them and he's absolutely the best 3-year-old I've driven," said Untersteiner.

Aetos Kronos pushed his lifetime earnings to a \$372,384 mark and can look back at victories in \$207,000 Breeders Course, Håkan Wallner Memorial at Solvalla and \$207,000 E3 over 1.3 miles in Eskilstuna.





A conversation with Tim Tetrick

Tim Tetrick is accustomed to having good seasons, but 2019 is shaping up to be one of his most memorable. Tetrick is the regular driver of harness racing's No. 1-ranked horse, the New Zealand-bred pacing mare Shartin, and earlier this year reached career win 11,000. And last month it was announced that Tetrick is one of four people on the ballot for the Hall of Fame. The results of the voting will be announced later this year.

On top of that, Tetrick entered Friday leading the sport in earnings by a wide margin. His \$9.12 million in purses were \$2.8 million ahead of second-place Jason Bartlett. In addition, Tetrick had won 505 races, second to only Aaron Merriman's 579.

Tetrick is on pace for more than 800 wins and more than \$14 million in earnings, which are levels only one driver in history has surpassed in the same year. The driver? Tetrick, who accomplished it first in 2007 when he set the record for wins with 1,189 and earnings with \$18.3 million. The following year he again surpassed the 800-victory and \$14-million plateaus, winning 902 races and \$19.7 million. Those earnings remain the sport's record.

For his career, Tetrick ranks fourth all time in purses with \$211 million and ninth in wins with 11,181. He has been named Driver of the Year by the U.S. Harness Writers Association on four occasions.

Tetrick recently took time to speak about his career, the Hall of Fame, and Shartin, who has won 17 of her past 18 races and competes in today's \$137,000 Artiscape at Tioga Downs. The 6-year-old mare has won 12 of 13 races this year and earned \$742,927. Last year, she became the first pacing mare in history to earn \$1 million in a season, reaching \$1.05 million thanks to 19 victories in 24 starts.

KW: You're having such a great year, on pace for over 800 wins and over \$14 million, what have been the keys to success?

TT: Just getting the right horses, that's all. Some years you just don't have the power. This year, I've had good stables and good horses to drive. The right horses get between my arch.

KW: When you get on a roll, does it feel different?

TT: It's definitely a lot easier to get out of bed and go to work when you're winning four, five, six (races), that's for sure. When you have a bad few days or couple of weeks, you start thinking you can't do it anymore, you get down on yourself. I try not to think about it. I enjoy going to work.

KW: Is that the key, trying to enjoy it every day?

TT: Exactly. If you over-think it, you're going to mess up. You can't over-think it. The things that can bother you, you just can't let them bother you. I tried to learn that a long time ago, but it's hard. You've got to be able to turn the page, no matter what happens. You've just got to forget about it.

KW: What have been the highlights for you this year? You're getting to drive Shartin, won your 11,000th race...

TT: All of the above. (And) getting nominated for the Hall of Fame, it's a dream come true. Getting to drive great horses, like Shartin. Getting to compete at a very high level. It's pretty awesome.

KW: What does it mean to you to be nominated for the Hall of Fame?

TT: I never thought about it when I was younger. Over the last four or five years, I've had such great success and the numbers are good, you kind of start looking ahead. You see some of your peers that you still work with get nominated and it's pretty cool to see them go in and what it means to them. It's a Hall of Fame for a reason. They only take the best of the best. To be even considered, it's a great honor. Hopefully it will come true.

KW: Reaching 11,000 wins, do those milestones mean a lot to you?

TT: For sure. I know records are meant to be broken, and stuff like that, but that's a lot of wins. Most people don't get 11,000 drives in their careers and I've been able to go to the winner's circle over 11,000 times. My biggest thing, though, is

the money. I've gotten to win over \$200 million and there are only three guys ahead of me. And I'm only 37. But the wins are awesome. I'm racing against the top 10 guys every day, so to have that many wins is awesome.

KW: Do you get extra motivation from that, knowing the competition you're facing?

TT: I always want to try to beat the best. Not only are they very good at what they do, they're very safe to drive with, and they're smart. It doesn't make your job easier, but it does

make your job easier racing against the best guys in the world.

KW: How have you seen yourself grow over the years and what are you most proud of?

TT: I still learn things every day. I heard (retired driver) Cat Manzi say one time that he learned a lot from watching the younger guys when they came up. You never stop learning, the way you sit in the bike or the way you handle a horse. I like getting a young horse and being able to come off the track and tell a trainer something that I think can make the horse better. And they come back the next week and tell you, man, that really helped. Equipment changes, or whatever it is. That is a lot of fun to me.

KW: It's more than just being on the track with a horse for two minutes.

TT: Exactly. I know I'm a catch driver, but I still think of myself as a horseman. I always put the care of the horse first and try to do what's best for the horse and still make them go as fast as I can. And make a lot of money. (Laughs.)

KW: I wanted to talk about Shartin. Jim (trainer Jim King Jr.) and everybody around the horse say what a great job you've done helping her along, going back to the beginning last year. What has it been like to see her development and how do you view your roll in it?

TT: It's awesome to watch her grow and see what she's turned into. From the first time I saw her, I could never dream she could do what she's done. She's exceeded my expectations, for sure. I think Jimmy and (his wife) Jo Ann are giving me too much credit. Good horses make good drivers look better. She's been a work in progress, a little too eager at times, but Jimmy and me work together. It's different when you race than when you train them. I hear all the time, "They didn't do that at home." Well at home you don't have a starting gate and grandstand and people cheering at you. And there are nine other drivers that are trying to beat you. On the racetrack, she's different. She wants to win and she's very eager about it sometimes. They've done a great job keeping her fit. She actually loves traveling, going places; you see her just get her game face on.

KW: With a horse that can be a little overanxious, what do you do to try to keep them relaxed and focused?

TT: There are different ways. You try to keep her by herself because when she gets around other horses, she wants to go after them almost. When a horse gets close to her, even in the post parade, she thinks it's race time. If you keep her by herself, she takes care of herself after that. She's a beast.

KW: That type of desire, is it something you can sense in a horse?

TT: In her you can. You can feel it in the lines. When you're coasting on the lead by yourself, she's actually really calm and relaxed. But she'll see other horses coming before I do. She watches. She won't let a horse pass her. She wants to fight.

KW: Has she reached her full potential or is there more there?

TT: There's more there. I've never hit the bottom yet. The other day, that wasn't all she had, I know that. Hopefully she doesn't ever have to go faster than that. She's a horse that might last three more years if we take care of her and pick our spots. Why show off if you can make a million dollars a year with a horse? As long as we win. It doesn't pay more if you win by four or five lengths. I just let her do what she wants to do and win by the least amount we can.

KW: How meaningful was it to reach a million dollars with her?

TT: The first (time) was unheard of and she might do it two years in a row. It's just awesome. She's well on her way. She's ahead of her pace from last year and I think she's stronger and more mentally stable than she was at this time last year. She just amazes me every day.

Signature long bombs at the Big M

A \$33.80 Hambletonian win price for Forbidden Trade and \$57 for the Meadowlands Pace winner Best In Show. Never have the Meadowlands' two signature races yielded these kinds of prices in the same season.

In the first 21 editions of the Hambletonian at the Meadowlands, no winner paid in double digits. The highest was \$9.00 (Nuclear Kosmos in 1986) and the average win price was \$4.40. In the 18 Hambletonian editions between 2002 and 2019, 11 times the winner has paid in double digits, with an average win price of \$13.30.

Hambletonian-winning sires not in the Hambletonian themselves

Kadabra sired the 2019 Hambletonian winner Forbidden Trade. He was the sophomore trotting colt of the year in 2002, but was not Hambletonian eligible the year that Chip Chip Hooray won it.

Valley Victory sired the Hambletonian winners in 1994 (Victory Dream), 1996 (Continentalvictory) and in 1998 (Muscles Yankee), but he himself retired after setting the stakes mark in the Yonkers Trot two weeks before the 1989 Hambletonian.

New Age Hambletonian?

Not counting the last four editions of the Hambletonian, the winning driver was under age 30 in the Hambletonian just twice — in 1953, Harry Harvey was 29 when he won with Helicopter; in 1982, Tommy Haughton was 25 when he won with Speed Bowl.

In the last four editions, three times the winning driver had not yet hit 30!

Scott Zeron was 27 in 2016 when he won with Marion Marauder

Zeron was 29 in 2018 when he won with Atlanta

Bob McClure was 28 this year when he won with Forbidden Trade.

What were you doing at 28?

Bob McClure was debuting in — and winning — the 2019 Hambletonian.

Montrell Teague was obliterating the field in a mile and an eighth world record of 1:59.2 in the Sam McKee U S Pacing Championship with Lather Up in a stunning effort.

John Campbell was winning his first ever Hambletonian heat in 1983 with Joie De Vie (who'd wind up with second money that day).

Scotty Zeron was interfered with in the first turn while driving International Moni in the 2017 Hambletonian, thus ruining any chance of three Hambletonians in a row.

Tim Tetrick was capturing his second Meadowlands Pace, just edging by the (eventual HOY) Rock N Roll Heaven on the money in the 2010 Pace for trainer Ray Schnittker.

Billy Haughton set sail on his first of eight straight national money titles. The year was 1952.

Ted Wing was driving at the Meadowlands full time when they opened in 1976 and his buddy Billy O'Donnell, also 28, was warming up.

Poor predictions?

Some of the recent trotting stars were overlooked in the 2018 Predictive Rankings:

Crystal Fashion #44 Six Pack #37 Muscle M Up #59 Lily Stride #35 Tactical Landing #26

Twelve of the top 25 in last year's balloting were fillies, and the top two were certainly on the money: Manchego and Plunge Blue Chip.

Real Cool Sam stays unbeaten with 1:54.4 win in PASS

Real Cool Cam had what you might call a fair-to-middlin' day in Saturday's \$186,016 Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) at The Meadows. Not only did he equal the world record 1:54.4 for freshman gelding trotters on a five-eighths-mile track, but he also extended his career unbeaten streak to six.

The time matched that of Amigo Volo, who logged his record just one week ago at Harrah's Philadelphia. Ironically, Amigo Volo competed in Saturday's PASS, finishing second in a different split. Real Cool Sam's mile also is a track record for The Meadows and equaled the mark for the Florida Pro, as the stake is known.

In the previous wins in his remarkable streak, Real Cool Sam never led at the quarter. The son of Muscle Hill—Cooler Schooner, whom owner Jules Siegel of Fashion Farms named to honor the late race caller Sam McKee, extended that streak as well, getting away third for David Miller before brushing to the point past the quarter.

Real Cool Sam opened a daylight lead and, though King Alphonso was gaining at the wire, scored comfortably by 1-1/4 lengths. Hell Patrol finished third. His six straight wins have earned \$248.134 for Real Cool Sam.

"He looked very comfortable, and Dave said he raced very easily," said winning trainer Jim Campbell. "I'm very blessed to be able to train a horse like Sam. If I were sure he'd make the PASS final without going to the fourth leg, I'm not sure I'd go there. There have been a lot of winners, though, so I have to look into that. I'm trying not to get too many starts into him this year."

Rome Pays Off and Gangster Hanover took the other Florida Pro splits, each in 1:55. Rome Pays Off quarter-poled to the top for Mattias Melander and held off Big Oil by 1/2 length, with Chestnut Hill third.

"I felt in control all the time, but he's still a little immature," Melander said. "He really didn't know what he was doing up front, so I had to keep him on the bit all the time. He feels like he has it all."

Miller extended his big day In Saturday's sub-feature, winning three of the four divisions with Town Victor, Beyond Kronos and Saxon — the latter two for Campbell. Spring Roll captured the other split.

Town Victor prevailed in 1:56.1, fastest of the stake, by saving his brush until the three-quarters and outdueling Loyal Fox Hanover to down him by 1/2 length, with Don Grigio third. It was the second PA Stallions victory for the Winning Mister-P Town Girl gelding.

"He was lucky today when a couple of the favorites made breaks," said Rich Gillock, who trains and owns the homebred with Barbara Richardson. "But I'd rather have some good luck for a change."

Spring Roll rebounded from a near-disastrous outing when he had something other than racing on his mind.

"He had the 9 hole last time and tried to duck out the draw gate," said winning driver Aaron Merriman. "He made a break, but when he came back trotting, he was phenomenal. So I actually was very confident today. He was loaded, and he was well in hand."

On Saturday, he found late racing room between horses and scored in 1:57.4, 1-1/2 lengths better than Matter Of Focus. Libero Hanover earned show. Chris Beaver trains the son of Cantab Hall—Won Ton Hanover and owns with Robert McNerney, Bill Manes and Leo Fleming.

Hickfromfrenchlick looks to score in Empire Breeders Classic

Hickfromfrenchlick is scheduled to race in Indiana later this season, which is likely to attract attention there thanks to his Larry Bird-inspired name, but first the colt will try to close out a successful campaign at home on the New York circuit, beginning with today's \$238,200 Empire Breeders Classic at Tioga Downs.

The Ray Schnittker-trained Hickfromfrenchlick is the 5-2 second choice on the morning line in the EBC for 3-year-old male pacers and will start from post one with driver Matt Kakaley. Hickfromfrenchlick won his elimination this past Sunday by a neck over Shake That House, who is the 2-1 favorite in the final.

Hickfromfrenchlick has won five of eight races this year and finished no worse than third in any start. Last year, the son of So Surreal—My Girl's A Star won four of his first five races, including the Lawrence B. Sheppard Pace, before finishing off the board in his final two appearances.

"He got sore at the end of last year and I don't think we saw the best of him toward the end," co-owner Patrick English said. "Unlike last year, it seems like he's gotten stronger as the year has gone on, so that's been real impressive.

"It's been an absolute thrill having him. He's a gamer. It's like an athlete, when they call your number you've got to be ready to go. He's able to do that."

English got involved owning racehorses in 2016, when he started the Nolamaura Racing ownership group that includes his father, Kerry, among others. The English family owns a beer distributorship in Goshen, NY, and has long been active on the Board of Directors at Historic Track.

Prior to owning horses, Patrick English was taught how to drive by Schnittker. English won a matinee race at Historic Track on Father's Day in 2012. It remains the only time he ever drove in a race.

"I'm undefeated," English said, laughing. "People don't realize how much Ray does for a lot of people around here in the sport. He brought me into it and taught me everything I know. If it wasn't for him, I probably wouldn't be in the sport. I appreciate everything he does for us."

Hickfromfrenchlick was bred by Steve Jones, whose farm is located near Goshen, and purchased for \$47,000 at the 2017 Goshen Yearling Sale. The colt's name is based on the nickname of Indiana-born basketball legend Bird, who was known as The Hick from French Lick.

A week prior to the Empire Breeders Classic eliminations, Hickfromfrenchlick equaled the track record for a 3-year-old pacing colt at Batavia Downs, winning a division of the New York Sire Stakes in 1:51.2.

"That was a good mile to watch, not only because he was the winner, but they were racing the whole way," Schnittker said about the race, which saw Hickfromfrenchlick rebuff multiple challenges from Shake That House and then a late charge from Buddy Hill. "They weren't giving any money away that day.

"He's come back good this year. He's very versatile, a nice horse to drive. I thought he was a very good horse last year, but I didn't know how sound he would stay. Usually, whatever bites them at 2 comes back and bites them at 3. But I got lucky and he's been very sound this year."

Mark MacDonald drove Hickfromfrenchlick for his first six starts this season before being sidelined because of a racing accident. English credited MacDonald with aiding the colt's development.

"Matt has done a great job these last couple races, but it was really tough seeing Mark hurt and not able to be on the bike," English said. "I know he's upset about it. When he wasn't traveling he was at the barn with Ray training with Hick. He's also helped out with our two 2-year-olds, Cigars And Port and Splash Brother. He's been a great help."

Following the Empire Breeders Classic, Hickfromfrenchlick will compete in the final preliminary round of the New York Sire Stakes on Aug. 29 with an eye toward the series championship on Sept. 14. He then is eligible to the Simpson Memorial at Harrah's Philadelphia on Sept. 29 and three races at Harrah's Hoosier Park in Indiana — the Pegasus, Circle City, and Monument Circle.

"We're looking forward to that," English said about the horse's trip to Indiana, adding with a laugh, "I've got to think that name is going to bring some popular betting."

This Is The Plan seeks elusive victory in Prix d'Ete

Wins have been hard to come by, but that hasn't diminished This Is The Plan's performances in the eyes of his owners. After all, if not for history's co-fastest horse Lather Up and defending Horse of the Year McWicked, the 4-year-old gelding would have plenty more to show for his efforts.

This Is The Plan has won one of 12 races this year, with his triumph coming in the Ben Franklin Pace on June 29. Since then, he has been runner-up to Lather Up three times (Graduate championship, William R. Haughton Memorial, Sam McKee Memorial) and McWicked once (Joe Gerrity Jr. Memorial). Overall, This Is The Plan has six second-place finishes in his past seven starts.

The gelding will try to get back to the winner's circle today (Aug. 18) in the \$200,000 Prix d'Ete for 4-year-old pacers at Hippodrome 3R in Quebec. There is no Lather Up, but plenty of competition, including O'Brien Award winner Jimmy Freight and Confederation Cup champ Done Well.

This Is The Plan will start from post four with driver Dan Dube at the lines for trainer Ron Burke. He is 5-2 on the morning line, part of the favored entry with stablemate Done Well.

"We can't complain, he's been super," said Mark Weaver, who is a member of This Is The Plan's ownership group. "Ronnie has thought all along he would be a good fit for us just because he is so handy. He's been able to leave (the starting gate) and put himself in a good position. Unfortunately, when Lather Up comes moving to the front there's not much you can do except try to hold on for second. That's what he's been able to do, which is fine."

This Is The Plan has won eight of 45 career races and earned \$1.19 million. He was purchased by the Burke Brigade last September and paid immediate dividends with wins in the Matron Stakes (in a dead heat) and Progress Pace. He also finished third in the Breeders Crown.

This season, he is No. 2 in purses among older male pacers, with \$551,618. Only Lather Up is richer, with \$677,448.

"Nowadays, especially for the 4-year-olds, so much money is on the smaller tracks," said Weaver, who shares ownership of This Is The Plan with Mike Bruscemi (as Weaver Bruscemi LLC), Burke Racing Stable, J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby, and

Larry Karr. "We try to acquire horses that we think can get around the turns. He can leave and get around smaller tracks so well. That was one of the reasons we were interested in him last year."

Done Well joined the Burke stable at the same time as This Is The Plan. He began this season well, with a second in a preliminary round of the Graduate Series and wins in his Confederation Cup elimination and the final. He was found to be sick following a fourth-place finish in the Camluck Classic and has been off the board in his past six starts. During that stretch, he has started from post eight twice, post nine twice and post 11 once.

For his career, Done Well has won nine of 32 races and \$533,245. He is owned by Burke Racing, Weaver Bruscemi, J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby, and Wingfield Brothers.

Done Well will start the Prix d'Ete from post three with driver Bob McClure.

"To start the year, Done Well was super and This Is The Plan was drawing bad and having bad racing luck," Weaver said. "Now the last month and a half, it's kind of flip-flopped. (Done Well) has been racing against the best and has gone through a couple little ups and downs. But he's certainly a factor.

"We like our horses, we like our posts, we like our drivers, so we'll take our chances from there."

Racing begins at 1 p.m. (EDT) Sunday at Hippodrome 3R. The Prix d'Ete is race 11 on the card. Following is the field.

Rock Diamonds N powers to victory in Gold Cup and Saucer 2019

Heidi Gibbs becomes first female trainer to win PEI's storied race in its 60 years.

Prince Edward Island was affected by widespread electrical outages Thursday night after the races, and again before Friday afternoon's first race went to post at Red Shores Charlottetown. Fortunately, there was no disruption to the Old Home Week racing, and no shortage of power behind the gate in the \$60,000 Gold Cup and Saucer final.

Saturday night (Aug. 17), trainer Heidi Gibbs embodied "girl power" in becoming the first female trainer to capture the coveted trophy. "I'm overwhelmed — words can't even express it," she said as Mitchell Cushing slowed #6 Rock Diamonds N to a walk in front of the grandstand. "The whole thing has been amazing, from start to finish. I'm absolutely thrilled for our whole team back in Maine, everybody who made it possible for us to get to where we are today."

Gibbs' partner of 17 years, Ron Cushing, piloted #2 Bettors Fire N in the final, finishing seventh in the field of eight. "In the race, Louis was launching, trying to make things good for his horse. I did the best I could with mine, thinking about the ones behind us. It's a great race. It's just exciting," he said as he joined his son in the winner's circle.

Mitchell Cushing was surrounded by media, friends, fans, and family post-race. He arrived in Charlottetown on Friday, and was impressed by the attendance. "Even when I warmed up they were already yelling! That's when you start to get the jist of it. It's pretty cool," he said.

Rock Diamonds N also noticed the strong crowd and the unusual degree of ceremony that surrounds the event: "He was pretty proud of himself warming up. He warmed up with no equipment on. Going around, bowing his neck right over, ears up — he was putting a show on. He knew what was going on."

Cushing said his first, triumphant Gold Cup and Saucer drive was anything but expected, even in his own pre-race strategizing. "Most definitely not," he said with a laugh. "You can only go so fast — only so many people can leave and get a spot."

Harness Racing Update

"When they left, and there's three guys leaving hard on the inside, I could've maybe snuck a spot inside of Simon (Allard and #4 Somewhere Fancy), in front of Simon, but that's a tough spot when they're going that fast," Mitchell said. "We just took a gamble at it. There was no plan when we took back in the eight hole... You let the horse take over and hopefully it works out."

Closing from sixth at the three-quarters, Rock Diamonds N advanced rapidly (a :27.4 individual final quarter) through the stretch, hitting the wire one and a third lengths ahead of place finisher #4 Somewhere Fancy (Simon Allard), the 2018 Gold Cup and Saucer champ. Longshot #5 Lisburn (Ken Arsenault) was third.

The race fractions were :26.3/:54.1/1:23.2/1:51.4h.

In a successful effort he described as "just driving with reaction," the younger Cushing credited Rock Diamonds N with handling a half-mile track with authority, a trait the pacer previously displayed with Ron in the bike at Yonkers. "He's really straight; he doesn't run in, he doesn't run out. He's just a really classy horse. No matter the size of track, it doesn't bother him —he can ramble."

The morning before the biggest race day of the year in the Maritimes, Gibbs said her step-son's catch drive was something of a test drive: "Mitchell is excited to come up here and be part of this with (Rock Diamonds N). He's never driven the horse before; Ronnie's the only one to sit behind him so far." The 6-year-old Rocknroll Hanover gelding took his lifetime-best mark at Plainridge just two weeks ago for Ron Cushing.

It was also Mitchell Cushing's first visit to Canada since he was a boy growing up across the border, in Michigan. He said it will not be his last as a professional reinsman. Red Shores Charlottetown is very likely to see the Cushings and Gibbs return.

"If I have a drive or get offered, most definitely," said Mitchell. "It's not about the money. You've just got to experience this."

Trainer Gibbs said she obtained her training license six years ago. She and Ron have a farm in Albion, ME, although they stable their racing stock at a training centre in Sidney, ME. "I'm fairly new in the game, but I've been around horses all my life," said the winning conditioner. "We work together well as a team, and his son's in the business, so that's why our stable is RHM: It's Ronnie, Heidi, and Mitchell." The Maine-based couple's well-regarded New Zealand-breds are both co-owned with friend/agent Frank Ranaldi, and Kevin Sywyk, another long-time friend from Ron's Michigan days.

There was a huge crowd on hand for the 60th Gold Cup and Saucer, a race known for introducing the horses in the post parade with a spotlight.

Rock Diamonds N and Bettors Fire N encountered trip difficulties en route to PEI. "About 7 or 8 Thursday evening we came in," said Ron Cushing. "We had a little truck trouble coming in, and Don MacRae, who's farm we're staying at here, he saved me and bailed me out and towed my truck to a dealership the next day, got us back on the road. For a little bad luck, we've had a lot of good luck, just being with some nice people."

Gibbs and Cushing's duo were stabled at the farm of Don MacRae.

"From the minute we arrived until today, the people are just phenomenal," Ron said. "This was our first trip here; I hope that we'll be back."

The evening card's total handle was a strong \$307,134.

Friday night (Aug. 16), Jody Jamieson reined his own Make Some Luck (p, 7, 1:50.0s; \$404,722) to a 1:52.1h victory in the \$20,000 Gold Cup and Saucer Consolation/James "Roach" MacGregor Memorial. The 7-year-old gelding bounced back as 9-5 betting favorite after finishing eighth in his Aug. 10 Gold Cup Trial. The Stephanie Jamieson trainee capitalized on sizzling fractions (:27,:54.4, 1:23.3) laid down by pacesetter Brave World (Anthony MacDonald), closing in :27.4 for the going-away win over Truro Raceway track record holder Rose Run Quest (Marc Campbell). Customers wagered \$136,665 on the card. "The numbers have been solid all week," said Red Shores Racetrack and Casino marketing manager Lee Drake.

Always a race filled with backstory, the 60th Guardian Gold Cup and Saucer continued that evocative tradition.





Delaware County Fair to honor White and Knappenberger

Hall of Fame publicist Tom White and former Ohio Harness Horseman's Association (OHHA) general manager Jerry Knappenberger will be honored as the 2019 Joseph Neville Memorial Award recipients by the Delaware County Fair.

White was a harness racing reporter for the *Lexington* (KY) *Herald*, *Hoof Beats* magazine and the *Horseman and Fair World*. He served as the publicity director for Scioto Downs and the Red Mile and was the Little Brown Jug's top PR man from 1996 until 2012.

In 2005, White was inducted into the Communicators Hall of Fame in Goshen, NY.

White passed away in February at the age of 84.

Knappenberger began his 50-year harness racing career as a second trainer for Terry Holton. He was hired as the assistant general manager of OHHA in 1990 and was general manager from 1998 until 2015.

Knappenberger worked tirelessly for the introduction of Video Lottery Terminals in the state of Ohio. The VTLs allowed the standardbred industry in Ohio to return to

its place of prominence with increased purses.

Determination sweeps round two of rookie trots

The team of driver Bob McClure, trainer Luc Blais and owner Serge Godin's Determination continued their success with a sweep of Thursday's Define The World and Pure Ivory second leg divisions at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The 2-year-old trot series each featured a single \$15,000 division. The events took a week hiatus following their first-legs on Aug. 1.

Royalty For Life colt **Threefiftytwo** took a break from Ontario Sires Stakes Gold action to defeat eight colts and geldings in the Define The World.

Driven by McClure, Threefiftytwo was a coast-to-coast winner in 1:56.1 (:28.3 final-quarter) to lower his career-mark by two-fifths. The victory was nearly spoiled, as the rookie was inside a pair of pylons in the first-turn, but was not disqualified because no rivals were within a length at the finish line.

Jula Uppercut finished 2 ¾ lengths back in second, while Sebastian Ray was third.

Threefiftytwo was making his third start for owner Determination and trainer Blais following a private purchase. He now holds a record of two wins in four starts and \$100,880 earned.

USHWA president on Hall of Fame nominees

When this year's Hall Of Fame ballot candidates were announced by USHWA (United States Harness Writers Association), the release included this statement (emphasis added for this response):

"The chapters of USHWA, the sport's leading media organization, nominate deserving candidates based on prepared biographical information and discussion within the chapters. This list of names is then considered by the USHWA Screening Committee, with consultation with several Hall of Fame members, on Hall of Fame Day, the first Sunday in July at Goshen, and they then select the candidates for that year's balloting, with the provision that anyone connected to a candidate is excluded from the discussion of and vote on that candidate's viability. A person must receive 75% of the yes-no votes of the USHWAns eligible to vote and the current Hall of Fame members in order to join the Goshen pantheon."

USHWA followed, and has always followed, all possible

safeguards to preserve the integrity of its privilege of conducting the elections to the sport's Hall Of Fame. USHWAns senior enough to have the knowledge to be appointed to the Screening Committee inevitably encounter Hall Of Fame candidates during the course of their careers, but they use their objective judgment in their deliberations; when Committee members are directly associated with candidates, they and USHWA both ensure that they take no part in those discussions and decisions.

"We ... expect that the process to qualify, nominate and induct candidates is above reproach," as the USHWAn who recently wrote a letter to HRU (letter available here) said, and nobody more than USHWA is aware of this responsibility and takes every reasonable step to ensure the entirety of the integrity of the process.
