Tall Dark Stranger and Captain Kirk win Pepsi North America Cup eliminations

Party Girl Hill and Peaky Sneeky win Fan Hanover elims.

Tall Dark Stranger will have an opportunity to make history following a game performance to win one of two eliminations for the 37th Pepsi North America Cup on Saturday night (Aug. 22) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

A pair of \$50,000 eliminations were contested to determine the field for next Saturday's \$1 million final.

Top-ranked Tall Dark Stranger fought off rivals from all directions to win the first elimination, while **Captain Kirk** surged to victory in the second elimination.

Nancy Takter trainee Tall Dark Stranger will now have an opportunity to become the first horse to ever win the Metro Pace and Breeders Crown at age two and then return to win

Despite the fact Tall Dark Stranger's earplugs failed, Yannick Gingras still managed to hold off the charging Capt Midnight (4) by a head to win the first Pepsi North America Cup elimination in 1:48.4.

the Pepsi North America Cup at age three.

The hard-fought first elimination saw Tall Dark Stranger parked around the first turn while making his way towards the front. Odds On Osiris and driver Sylvain Filion fired out to the lead and forced the speedy Tattoo Artist into the two-hole. The opening-quarter was paced in :26.1.

Tall Dark Stranger promptly cleared to the lead in the second-quarter and led the field up to the half in :55.

Beaumond Hanover angled out from fourth going to the half, appearing to try and flush out Tattoo Artist, who remained along the wood. 'Beaumond' made the grind first-up to the leader's wheel at three-quarters with Capt Midnight second-over, Beach Blanket Book and Captain Barbossa third and fourth-over, respectively.

Tall Dark Stranger turned the field for home off three-quarters in 1:22.1.

The stretch battle saw all starters in the hunt to create a finish where first through seventh was separated by just 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ lengths.

Tall Dark Stranger held off the charging Capt Midnight by a head to win in 1:48.4. Odds On Osiris came up the rail to finish third by half a length. Captain Barbossa split between rivals to finish fourth. Tattoo Artist was trying to find room up the inside and just edged out Beaumond Hanover for the fifth and final spot in the final.

"It was definitely closer than I liked," admitted Gingras following Tall Dark Stranger's win. "The horse just refused to lose, he's a winner. Halfway down the stretch I thought he'd definitely be beat, and he just kept putting his nose in front."

The hard-fought victory came despite an equipment issue

for Tall Dark Stranger.

"The ear-plugs got stuck," said Gingras. "I tried to kick it with my foot and they wouldn't come out and then I grabbed it with my hand and I grabbed it so hard the whole thing came back to me, but the ear-plugs are still in his ears."

A son of Bettors Delight out of Precocious Beauty, Tall Dark Stranger has now won five of six this season and earned \$505,131 for owners Crawford Farms Racing, Marvin Katz, Caviart Farms and Howard Taylor. The winner of \$1.4 million lifetime now has 13 trips to the winner's circle during his racing career.

Trainer Takter won last year's Cup with Captain Crunch and will be searching next Saturday for the repeat. Tall Dark Stranger will look to become the first Metro Pace winner to

come back and win the Cup since Captaintreacherous completed the feat in 2013.

A \$2 win ticket on Tall Dark Stranger paid \$2.50.

Captain Kirk powered home strongly to pick off Allywag Hanover in the second elimination.

Allywag Hanover and driver Louis-Philippe Roy left hard and claimed the front just ahead of a :25.4 opening-quarter. Roy slowed things down in the second-quarter to grab a soft :55.3 half.

Captain Kirk and driver Bob McClure moved out from fifth in the second-quarter and started moving first-up.

Allywag Hanover and Roy took off in the third-quarter going :26.3 to create separation of a couple-lengths at

three-quarters in 1:22.1. Captain Kirk remained first-up and still three-lengths from the lead.

In the stretch, Allywag Hanover couldn't go the distance and watched Captain Kirk power by late with a :25.4 final-quarter to win by three-quarters of a length in 1:49.3. Mayhem Hanover crossed the line third, while Moneyman Hill and Denali Seelster completed the top-five.

"We didn't get away as good as I wanted, but when Louis (Roy) really backed down that second-quarter which kind of helped me," said McClure of the winning-trip. "He got to mosey his way up around the front without doing too much work... when we straightened away, I kicked the plugs and he just dug and dug and dug. He's a classy horse."

Trained by Tony Alagna, Captain Kirk now has two wins in six starts this season and \$119,274 earned. The son of Captaintreacherous—Aria Hanover increased his career numbers to three wins and \$194,280 earned for owners Brittany Farms, Marvin Katz, Brad Grant and Captain Kirk Racing.

Captain Kirk entered the Cup eliminations off a third-place finish in the Cane Pace. His prior start was a career-best 1:48.3 victory in the Geers Stakes, a race in which he defeated first elimination winner Tall Dark Stranger.

A \$2 win ticket on Captain Kirk returned \$5.

The elimination winners earned their connections the right to select their post for next week's final. Tall Dark Stranger won the draw to choose first and selected post-four, while Captain Kirk selected post-three.

Velocity Rukkus won the draw to be the first also eligible, while Beaumond Hanover is the second also-eligible.

The post-position draw will be completed on Monday



Party Girl Hill improves to seven-for-seven in Fan Hanover elim

Party Girl Hill kept her perfect record alive winning one of two \$35,000 eliminations for the Fan Hanover on Saturday evening at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The 3-year-old daughter of Captaintreacherous fought off Lady Lou to win by half a length in 1:50 for driver Doug McNair, trainer Chantal Mitchell and owner Tom Hill.

"She's got a real big engine on her," said McNair after steering Party Girl Hill for the first time. "I talked to Dexter (Dunn) about her this week and she was exactly how he said she would be, she just kind of relaxes on the lead and then when you want her to go she goes."



Party Girl Hill and McNair made a second-quarter move to the top from third, leading by the half in :55.3. Lady Lou got her cue to roll on the far turn and rushed up alongside the leader at three-quarters in 1:23.4.

Party Girl Hill (Doug McNair) kept her perfect record alive winning one of two \$35,000 eliminations for the Fan Hanover on Saturday evening at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 1:50.

The sensible fractions played into the hand of Party Girl Hill, as she held off Lady Lou with a :26.1 final-quarter. Karma Seelster was third, while Lauras Love and Priceless rounded out the top-five.

Sent north to Mitchell by trainer Chris Ryder, Party Girl Hill has been sensational in her first season on the track, winning now all seven of her starts. Her victory Saturday moves her over \$200,000 in earnings for her owner/breeder Hill.

Party Girl Hill paid \$2.40 to win.

Peaky Sneaky, debuting on Lasix, charged first up at Perfect Storm racing to three-quarters and power away in the lane to win the first elimination in a career-best 1:49.1. Yannick Gingras guided the Nancy Takter trainee to her third win of the season for owners Howard & Judith Taylor and Order By Stable.

"Nancy (Takter) told me she bled in her last start, so kind of forget about that start and other than that I think she's been really consistent all year," said Gingras. "She had been on the front a few weeks in a row, so I figured I'd try and give her a target, but she paced home really strong tonight."

Perfect Storm took command in the second-quarter and led by the half in :54.4 before engaging in a third-quarter battle with Peaky Sneaky to reach the third-marker in 1:21.4.

O'Brien Award winner Alicorn rallied for second, finishing 3 ¾ lengths behind the winner. Beach Sports, Perfect Storm and Nectar completed the top-five to advance to next week's \$400,000 final.

A daughter of Bettors Delight, Peaky Sneaky is now three for seven in 2020 with \$48,388 earned. Her elimination victory boosts her career totals to five wins and over \$160,000 earned.



Horses always a pleasant distraction for the brilliant legal mind of WEG chairman Clay Horner

It's December of 2011. By just about every possible measurement, you have the world in your hands.

You are the chairman of Osler, Hoskin and Harcourt, the largest and perhaps the most influential law firm in all of Canada. Almost 500 attorneys work with you and your name is on top of the firm's stationery. You have a wonderful family, two sons, a daughter and the greatest wife you could possibly ever hope to have. Money will never be an issue for you or your family. Then everything changes in an instant.

You and your family are on a skiing vacation in Vail, CO. Although you are an accomplished skier, you fall hard and awkwardly on an icy knoll and slide off the trail into a tree. So quickly does this life of ours give one a kick in the ass.

Not only are you critically injured, there is doubt that you will live. But if you do, it will be impossible that you will be able to function physically as you once did.

Thus, Clay Horner, the chairman of the board of Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) was faced with the greatest battle of his life.

"For the first two years after the accident, all my efforts were directed towards becoming functional physically," Horner said. "I reached the point where I was quite mobile



and was able to walk up to two miles, but the pain, especially on the upper left side of my body was intolerable. I just couldn't handle it. Together with my doctors, we decided that an operation which was designed to alleviate the pain was in order. The operation worked. I wasn't in extreme pain anymore. But I had also lost some of the hard earned gains I had made in terms of being mobile and physically functional. I determined this was the way it was. Hopefully, it would improve again, albeit at a slower pace."

He needed to get back to doing what he did best - the mergers and acquisitions aspect of law.

In the space of a few years, he was again leading three of the most significant mergers and acquisition deals made during that decade — the merger of Wendys and Tim Horton's; Shoppers Drug Mart and Loblaws and the takeover of Cirque de Soleil by TPG Capital.

Those were the kinds of business page headline deals he had been leading for 20 years. But it was even more satisfying to be doing it after such a battle. Deal making had changed and the largest deals were now being made taking more advantage of technology without the need to be in the same boardroom.

These weren't near the biggest or most important deals in which he had been involved, but they went a long ways towards showing him that he still had the ability to do what he had been able to previous to the accident.

Interestingly enough, Horner said that none of those deals went the way the various parties expected them to end.

The same applied to the approximately 1,500 other deals with which he has been involved. There was always some give and take involved.

He then decided that he had done enough in that area of law.

Horner had been a director of WEG since 2002. When David Willmot was CEO and chairman, Horner became vice-chairman. When Jim Lawson became CEO, Horner ascended to the role of chairman.

Speaking of Willmot, Horner said that if not for him and the late Bob Anderson, harness racing would still be the redheaded step child at WEG. Through their efforts, the breeds have reached parity. It is now a 50 per cent partnership between harness racing and the thoroughbreds.

The life of Clay Horner began in the tiny Quebec town of Shawville (population 1,487).

His mother, Evelyn, was a school teacher and his dad, Brent, was the advertising manager of several small local newspapers.

As small as Shawville was, it had what was called a horseman's driving club.

His father had horses, as had his father before him.

Shawville had an annual race day where some of Canada's top horsemen competed; among them were the Filions, the Plouffes, Dr. John Findlay and Dr. Rolly Armitage.

The club's membership included two former presidents of the Canadian Trotting Association — Dr. Armitage and Hugh Proudfoot.

Horner recalls walking the track prior to the yearling race and ridding it of the stones it had accumulated over the year.

Upon graduation from high school, his dream was to attend Queen's University from which he graduated first in his year's class in the Faculty of Arts.

He then went to the University of Toronto's Law School where he attained the Viscount Bennett scholarship for a Canadian law student intending to pursue graduate studies in law.

This in turn led to him receiving the Frank Knox Fellowship, the first prize in corporate law which gave him a full scholarship to the Harvard Law School plus a prize of \$25,000.

Here's a quick timeline of his career from his Harvard qraduation:

1986 — He was called to the Bar and received a first in corporate law. That same year, he joined Osler, Hoskin and Harcourt, the firm with which he was to remain through the duration of his legal career. Simultaneously, he taught negotiation at the University of Toronto Law School.

In 1990 he moved to New York City as the founding and managing attorney of Osler's New York's law office. That was also the year that he married his wife Robin in Bloomfield Hills. MI.

In 1992, he was named a partner in the firm.

In 1995, he and his family returned to Toronto where they have since resided.

In 1997, he was elected to the executive committee of the firm.

From 2007 through 2016, he was the chairman of the firm, presiding over 475 lawyers and 1,250 employees in six different cities.

In 2010, the International Bar Association named him as one of the 10 leading M & A lawyers in the world.

Through his career he has been involved in corporate deals valued at in excess of \$400 billion dollars in 40 different countries.

Throughout his education and the years following, Horner kept up with and was involved in harness racing one of the loves in his life.

His dad had always been content to own the rejects; those that weren't good enough to race at the Montreal tracks Blue Bonnets and Richelieu Park.

Clay and his younger brother, Scott, had higher hopes. They entered the yearling game hoping to get a champion or two.

Duncan MacTavish had become a friend and they asked him to buy a yearling for them. Duncan was going to Lexington and bought them a Tyler B filly for \$10,000.

She wasn't much.

They then went to Blair Burgess, who was then a rising star with young stakes horses on the Ontario scene and asked him if he would train a yearling for them. He unexpectedly said no. He wasn't taking on any new clients on the basis that he was running a private stable for existing clients.

The first really good horse Clay had was Fiddlers Fun which he had with Duncan MacTavish. He won a series and the final at Blue Bonnets. Clay remembers going up to Blue Bonnets for the final and then dining at Bill Wong's across the road from the track. Bill Wong's and Ruby Foo's almost next door were the favored destinations of horse owners after they had had a good day or night at the races. If one had a particularly good experience, one might be able to go to Rib N Reef, just down the road on Decarie Blvd.

Duncan's hope was to take Fiddler's Fun to Lexington

where he would take on and hopefully beat some of the best 2-year-olds in North America.

As with many dreams, this one did not come to fruition. On arrival in Lexington, Fiddler's Fun got sick.

At 3, he came back well and set a track record at Mohawk. They were offered lots of money for him. But to paraphrase Mrs. Helen Buck when she said no to an offer of a million dollars for her great star Overtrick: "There are lots of people who have a million dollars, but I'm the only one who owns Overtrick." They were not offered anywhere near a million for Fiddlers Fun, but they wanted to still be his owners.

"Of all the trainers I've had, I guess we've had the most success with Stew Firlotte. Our first horse bordering on greatness was His Mattjesty. He earned more than \$800,000 as a 2-year-old and won the Breeders Crown.

"Stew was a great person and a great horseman, but wasn't the very best business man. Sometimes his bills would arrive as much as three or four months late.

"Perhaps the most wonderful person I've known in or out of the horse business is John Fielding.

"It's kind of strange. We were partners on a horse Daylon Trooper who earned lots of money for us and we had never met. If there is a finer person on this planet than John, I haven't met him.

"He has it all. He is highly intelligent, kind and generous, has a beautiful outgoing personality and as he sometimes says, he is one of the luckiest people ever born. I prefer to think that he has made most of his luck. He has a great memory and a tremendous sense or anticipation of what will happen. Most importantly, he is the greatest friend a person could possibly have. I have met numerous wonderful people in my life, but John Fielding is one in a billion."

Let's talk about WEG.

"I consider WEG to be the greatest racing entity in the world. It is patterned after the dreams of E P Taylor who wanted the improvement of racing and the horses in it to be the highest priority. It's wonderful right now, but it's nowhere what it's going to be when Woodbine is completed and there is direct transportation from downtown Toronto to the business and entertainment empire that will be situated there. Eventually, something similar, but perhaps on a smaller scale, will take place at Woodbine-Mohawk."

Is it correct that you are very proud and pleased with the efforts of Jim Lawson, Jessica Buckley and their respective staffs?

"Both of them and the people they have working with them are All Stars. They are both extremely hard workers and highly intelligent. The future of WEG is in great hands."

How about Clay Horner's racing interests today?

"Right now on both the racing and breeding fronts I am more involved than I've never been. Together with David Willmot, we own Cabrini Hanover, a couple of her daughters and some of their yearling and sucklings. It's kind of amazing how quickly one's numbers multiply when breeding horses.

"I've got parts of a dozen or so that are in training or racing right now.

"Although he hasn't quite yet got it all together, I think that Mayhem Hanover (who qualified for the North America Cup final last night with a third-place finish in his elimination) has the potential to be one of the best horses we've ever had. He is the 19th horse from that immediate maternal family that we've been involved with. Unless things change quite significantly, I doubt that he will be the last."

Let's talk about the trainers with whom you have your horses. Per Engblom

"My experience with him has been excellent as it has been to varying degrees with all of my current trainers. He is honest and quite low key. He is a good communicator and keeps me well informed as to how my horses are doing."

Linda Toscano

"She is a true professional and is as honest as the day is long. She tells it as it is, which is what every trainer should do, but unfortunately not all do. An added bonus is that her husband Brad McNinch is a Canadian and providing he undergoes the prescribed quarantine period, he can run the stable here without any problems."

Nifty Norman

"He is an extremely hard working guy, who from my experience with him has been spot on with his assessment of any horses that I've had with him. This is actually my second go around with Nifty. I was partners with Bill Perretti on a good filly that Nifty was training for us. I hadn't heard from Nifty for a while, so I called him to see how my filly was doing. Nifty said, 'I haven't had that filly in a couple of months. Perretti took her away and gave her to Greg Peck.' I owned half the filly and Bill changed trainers without even telling me. But that's just one of many Bill Perretti stories."

Gregg McNair

"He is a wonderful and experienced horse trainer with a great temperament. He really cares a great deal about his owners and strives to keep his bills as fair as he possibly can."

John Kopas

"Johnny is a wonderful professional. We've had a few good horses together and done pretty well. He is a gentleman in every respect."

Brett Pelling

"Brilliant and articulate. He would have excelled in everything that he tried. He is focused and extremely smart. I had a very talented horse called Articulator who was functioning at a level far below his ability. I called Brett and asked him if he would take the horse and see if he could help him. Brett knew the horse and said that he'd take him for a month and see if he could help. If he couldn't help, he'd send him back and there would be no bills. After the month, I spoke with him and he said that he COULD become what he was meant to be, but he would have to start all over with him as though he were a yearling first learning his lessons. He did that and within a relatively short period of time he was functioning at a very high level.

"Brett's knowledge is far from only limited to horses. We speak often and we have a rule that no more than a third of the conversation can be about horses."

Tony O'Sullivan

"An excellent horseman, who sees more than horses. He is well versed with the entire industry. I wouldn't hesitate to have him train any of my horses, but see him situated in the industry as more than a horse trainer. I'd love to see him in racetrack management. His dad did the nightly news in New Zealand as a newscaster in the mode of a Lester Holt in the United States. Tony learned a great deal of savoir faire from his dad. I think if it came to pass, he would make an exceptional addition in terms of a horseman's perspective to any track's management team."

What does the future hold for Clay Horner?

- "1. I hope to continue in my role with HBH Strategic Advisors. We advise CEOs and businesses with strategic and governance matters.
- "2. To help with the growth of WEG and its next generation of board members.
- "3. Continue my small breeding partnership with David Willmot and hopefully to continue owning some good racehorses.
- "4. Most importantly, being able to watch my family grow and thrive."

Ready For Moni (Matt Kakaley) set a 1:51.1 track record in the Harry M. Zweig Memorial open class for 3-year-old trotters.

King Alphonso (Dexter Dunn) left the gate first, but Big Oil (Andy Miller) gained control just before hitting the first quarter in :26.4. As they reached the backstretch, Back Of The Neck (Scott Zeron) was the first to make a move going first-over to lead to the half in :56. Ready For Moni (\$3.30) followed the move second over and swooped to the lead as they headed for the final turn. He was strong on the lead using a :27.1 third quarter to get to three-quarters in 1:23.1.

As they reached the stretch, second-place finisher Back Of The Neck gave it everything he had in the chase. Ready For Moni had a lot in the tank and easily won setting a track record for sophomore trotting colts. King Alphonso was a distant third.

Ready For Moni is a 3-year-old colt by Ready Cash out of Nothing But Moni. He was bred by the Moni Maker Stable and is trained by Nancy Takter for owners John Fielding, Herb Liverman, Lindy Farm Of Conn, and Bud Hatfield. It was his third win this season with his only loss of the year to Ramona Hill in the Hambletonian. He now has seven career victories none faster than his Zweig win.

Ambassador Hanover (Ake Svanstedt) and Ahundreddollarbill (Jason Bartlett) each nabbed NYSS wins. Unbeaten Ambassador Hanover (\$3.10) won the \$51,300 first division.

Ambassador Hanover went straight to the front but Black Tie Bash (Brian Sears) took over the top spot and led to the first quarter in :28. He slowed things down using a :30.1 second quarter to hit the half in :58.1. He continued on the lead and hit three-quarters first in 1:26.1.

As they made the turn for home Ambassador Hanover popped out of the pocket and came charging at Black Tie Bash in the stretch. The two were slugging it out it all the way down the stretch and were joined by a late bid from Dee's Red Delicious (Corey Callshan), who came flying three-wide in deep stretch forcing a three-way photo finish with Ambassador Hanover picking up the win in a lifetime best of 1:56. Bash had to settle for third.



Alessandro Gocciadoro's Yankee Glide son Vivid Wise As has really impressed in his performances since he was less than good in the month of May when he was one of the favorites to win the Elitloppet at Solvalla.

On Saturday night, Gocciadoro went to the French Riviera, to Cagnes-sur-Mer where the \$154,000 Grand Prix du Departement des Alpes Maritimes, contested over a mile, was on the schedule.

Pierre Vercruysse's Drole de Jet was the bettors' first choice

in the seven-horses field, but even though Drole de Jet quite easily kept the lead from post 3, he couldn't defend himself over the home stretch when first-over trotter Vivid Wise As was told to put it in higher gear by Gocciadoro. Vivid Wise As left his opponents and sprinted to a safe 1:52.2 win.

Drole de Jet held to second place ahead of Bahia Ousnot. Vivid Wise As has three victories in a row since he came back to Gocciadoro's barn in June.

Last year, Vivid Wise As and Gocciadoro also won the Grand Prix du Departement des Alpes Maritimes, that time with a 1:50.2 mile.

Thirty-six reasons the Woodrow Wilson was a critical part of harness racing history

Why does the Woodrow Wilson matter? Well, every time you watch a race — anywhere, anytime, anyplace — remember that the six richest standardbred races ever contested were all Woodrow Wilsons.

The race for 2-year-old pacers was a mid-August staple for years at the Meadowlands from 1977-2012.

A century has passed since Woodrow Wilson's presidency and it has been eight years since the last Wilson was contested.

Here's a close look, by the numbers, at the 36 colorful and eventful years of the Woodrow Wilson.

- 1. It's been 36 years since the 1984 Wilson that carried a purse of \$2,161,000 and was won by Nihilator with Bill O'Donnell driving for the first time for trainer Billy Haughton. That purse remains the sport's high water mark.
- 2. The three times the Wilson was the richest race ever contested to that point was: 1979 \$862,750,1980 \$2,011,000 and 1984 \$2,161,000.
- 3. The two smallest Wilson purses were the first and last 1977 \$280,000 won by No No Yankee and 2012 \$309,500 won by Captaintreacherous.
- 4. No other race in harness history has ever gone for \$2 million and the Wilson did it twice 1980 Land Grant won the \$2,011,000 event (becoming the sport's first single-season millionaire overnight) and the aforementioned 1984 Wilson.
- 5. Only Niatross, Nihilator and Captaintreacherous won the Wilson and the Meadowlands Pace. And there was a 27-year gap between Nihilator (1984-1985) and The Captain (2011-2012).
 - 6. Fifteen lengths, then 16 lengths? Times change, for sure,

but the three Wilson winners who went on to capture the Meadowlands Pace improved on their predecessor by three seconds and all were track records:

1979 - Niatross 1:55.4

1984 - Nihilator 1:52.4

2012 — Captaintreacherous 1:49.3

7. The richest race not named the Woodrow Wilson was the \$1,520,333 Hambletonian won by Muscle Hill in 2009.

8. From 1980 to 1987 the winning driver of the Wilson never before or again won a bigger purse:

1980 - Del Insko \$2,011,000 Land Grant

1981 — Billy Haughton \$1,760,000 McKinzie Almahurst (Haughton did train a bigger winner — Nihilator 1984)

1982 – Eldon Harner \$1,957,500 Fortune Teller

1983 - Carl Allen \$1,700,000 Carls Bird

1984 - Bill O'Donnell \$2,161,000 Nihilator

1985 - Ray Remmen \$1,3440,000 Grade One

1986 — Buddy Gilmour \$1,561,000 Cullin Hanover

1987 - Ben Webster \$1,422,000 Even Odds

Richie Silverman added his name to this list in 1990 with Die Laughing \$1,043,500

- 9. Twice a Wilson winner in the 1980s paid \$100 or more! Grade One (\$100.40) in 1985 and Land Grant (\$141.60) in 1980.
- 10. Five of those nine names just mentioned as having won their biggest pot did so in a close photo:

1980 — Land Grant (head)

1981 - McKinzie Almahurst (nose)

1983 — Carls Bird (nose)

1985 - Grade One (head)

1990 – Die Laughing (nose)

11. Niatross is the last horse and only one in modern history to twice win the sport's all-time richest ever race:

1979 – Woodrow Wilson \$862,750

1980 - Meadowlands Pace \$1,011,000

- 12. Ten of the 11 editions of the Wilson from 1980-1990 went for \$1 million plus, then never again.
- 13. The last five Wilsons went for a combined \$1,905,250. Three Wilsons individually went for more.
- 14. Sugar Dust and Denali both were third in the Wilson from post 11 1977 and 1979, respectively. Million-dollar races stopped having 12-horse fields as of 1989.
- 15. Free-for-all legend Genghis Khan, the two-time track record setter at the Meadowlands and the winner of the first

World Cup in 1982 at age 6, was fifth in the 1978 Wilson.

- 16. The richest Wilson and Meadowlands Pace came in the same year (1984) Nihilator won the former for \$2,161,000. The Pace had a pot of \$1,293,000 and On The Road Again won it. He also edged Nihilator for Pacer of the Year honors.
- 17. A Down Under-bred, Testing Times, raced in the very first Wilson but tired to finish 11th. He remains the only Wilson starter to have race lines from the previous year on his card.
- 18. Niatross was not favored in either his elim or the final of the Wilson in 1979 Whamo, the runner-up, was.
- 19. How big a deal was winning the Wilson? From 1985-1989, the Wilson winner earned 26 times more at 2 than what he would earn at 3:
- 1985 Grade One \$873,208 at 2, \$1,940 at 3
- 1986 Cullin Hanover \$857,654 at 2, \$37,501 at 3
- 1987 Even Odds \$950,108 at 2, \$26,575 at 3
- 1988 Kassa Branca \$724,793 at 2, \$14,100 at 3
- 1989 Sam Francisco Ben \$529, 415 at 2 \$60,600 at 3

\$788G per Wilson winner at 2 for a total of \$3,940,178

\$28G per for that same Wilson winner a year later at 3 for a total of \$140,716

- 20. John Campbell, the all-time leader in Wilson wins with five, didn't get any money in his debut in the 1979 Wilson with Burt Paloma against Niatross.
- 22. Can you identify the only trainer to win the Wilson and then the 2YOCP division title and also have the companion freshman pacing filly of the year in the same barn that year? In 1995, Liz Quesnel had A Stud Named Sue and the filly Chippies Ruler.
- 22. Wilson driver scorecard (winners of more than one): Campbell 5, Brian Sears 3, Ron Pierce 3, Luc Ouellette 2, David Miller 2, George Brennan 2 and Mike Lachance 2.
- 23. Hall Of Fame trainers who won the Wilson: Joe Holloway, Jerry Silverman, Bob McIntosh, Billy Haughton, Del Insko, Clint Galbraith and Bill Popfinger.
- 24. When Land Grant won the 1980 Wilson, eventual divisional winner French Chef was not in there. He didn't make it out of the elims. Land Grant and Niatross won the first two seven-figure races in the sport's history that year, but French Chef would attract the love vote for Horse of the Year in 1980 that did not go Niatross' way.
- 25. In 1980, the Wilson went for \$2,011,000 the same year the Kentucky Derby purse was \$336,000.
- 26. Eleven of the 36 Wilson winners also won their division.
- 27. Jeremys Gambit won over \$1.1 million lifetime greatly aided by his \$800,000 Wilson score of 1996. He was the 1997 Breeders Crown runner-up. But, get this, he never won a

- race outside of the Meadowlands, All 10 victories came in East Rutherford. He is the only millionaire ever to win at just one racetrack.
- 28. Back-to-back Wilson winners did not race at 3: 1999 Richess Hanover and 2000 Whitefish Falls. The latter was put up via DQ in 2000 when The Firepan was disqualified.
- 29. The average purse of the first 18 Wilsons was \$1,206,819. The average purse of the last 18 Wilsons was \$535,125. The average purse of all 36 Wilsons was \$870,910.
- 30. Billy and Peter Haughton each drove in the first two Wilsons in 1977 and 1978. Billy was 6th and 9th with Wellwood Hanover and Social Outcast, while Peter was 4th both times, with Worthy Blue Chip and J Js Metro. The relevance? 1977 was the year of the richest ever pacing event where a father-son driver combo finished 1-2: Jack and John Kopas in the \$286,300 Cane Pace with Jade Price and Nat Lobell.
- 31. Trainer Tony Alagna won the last two Wilsons in 2011 and 2012 with Major Bombay and Captaintreacherous, respectively.
- 32. The first four Wilson favorites did not get it done: Keystone Topper at 5-2 was off the board in 1977... Sonsam was second at 3-5 in 1978... Whamo was 6-5 and second to Niatross the last time Niatross would not be favored in any race and Slapstick was fifth at 4-5 for Jack Parker, Jr. and Lee Broglio in the first ever \$2 million contest, the Wilson of 1980 won by a 69-1 shot Land Grant.
- 33. How's this for turning the tables? In 1980, Lee Broglio trained the 7-for-7 favorite Slapstick who was fifth, beaten by a \$100 horse Land Grant. In 1985, Lee Broglio won the Wilson with a \$100 horse Grade One, who is a son of the 1980 Wilson favorite Slapstick and the favorite finished fifth after going into the race 7-for-7 Sherman Almahurst.
- 34. Buddy Gilmour was and is the only driver to twice win a better than million-dollar race from post 12:
- 1984 Meadowlands Pace On The Road Again 1986 Woodrow Wilson — Cullin Hanover
- 35. The 1978 Woodrow Wilson winner Scarlet Skipper sired the 1986 undefeated Horse of the Year Forrest Skipper. Three times this has happened. Niatross did it with his son in 1985 (Nihilator) and Magical Mike, the 1993 Wilson winner, sired 2000 HOY Gallo Blue Chip.
- 36. Areba Areba was the only filly to compete in a Wilson final in the 36-year history. In 1980, she was fourth for Jack Kopas.





Melanie Wrenn – Caretaker Katie Remmerswaal

If you're in the sport of harness racing you may own, train, drive, but you might also be the person who spends more one-on-one time with the horse than anyone else. These people called the "unsung heroes" of the sport are the grooms, caretakers, stewards, or caregivers.

In reality, they are the horse's best friend and mother or father for they feed, bathe, groom and tend to the horse when sick or injured.

It is every owner or trainer's dream to one day have a horse win a Breeders Crown, Hambletonian, or set a world record. It is just as important to the groom.

Katie Remmerswaal cares for not one, but two superstars — Manchego and Tall Dark Stranger.

Originally from Canada, Remmerswaal relocated to the United States eight years ago to work with horses. No stranger to the business, Remmerswaal was in the barn before she could walk.

"My parents trained horses and always had a stable so I was brought to the barn early on," she said. "Horses have always been my passion. My earliest memory was when I was 5 years old and my parents had a horse named Dr. Gene who I would take for walks and graze. I would get to brush him and pick up his feet, which I loved. When we lost him in a claiming race it broke my heart, but a little while later we claimed him back. We raced him until he got injured and retired him.

"I always helped my dad whenever I could: weekends, summers and school breaks. If I was allowed in the barn, I would be there.

"When I got older I worked for several trainers and moved around quite a bit, and at one point even had my own stable.

"Since moving to New Jersey I've worked for Brett Pelling and currently work for Nancy Takter. I have nothing but praise for both trainers for they do a great job with their horses.

"We start early and work long days, but it shows for the horses look and feel the best. Nancy is a great boss and easy to communicate with.

"I have a lot of respect for Nancy for she knows everything about her horses and does her best to keep them healthy and sound.

"She shows up early every day to train and jog and usually never misses a race, unless she is racing at multiple tracks.

"Nancy is very organized and has great second trainers and caretakers she can rely on."

When talking about her "kids," Remmerswaal beams.

"Manchego is probably my favorite for she is so classy with everything she does and has a great attitude to be around. Every time she races I get goosebumps for she never disappoints and gives 110 per cent. She is just great to be around for she's so sweet and loves attention, but being a mare, she can also be sassy when she wants to.

"Like when she comes in from being turned out and isn't ready, she lets us know.

"Currently I take care of five horses, four superstars and one 2 year-old hopeful potential. Besides Manchego, there's Tall Dark Stranger, Kissin In The Sand, Don't Let Em and Monterey Jack.

"Tall Dark Stranger is a colt that is full of energy in the morning, but after he gets turned out, jogged or trained, he'll take 2 or 3 naps before lunch — a sign of a good horse, for he takes care of himself.

"Like Manchego, Stranger loves attention, too, which of course I'm all too willing to give.

"I can't say enough good things about this boy and he was certainly appropriately named, for he is tall, dark and beautiful.

"I truly love them all. They're all my kids. They're all so different, yet wonderful. I try to keep them happy and always do what's best for them. Even if my day is longer then most, they make it worth every second."

Empire Breeders Classic pacers hit Tioga today

Tioga Downs will play host to the top New York-bred sophomore pacers in today's (Aug. 23) Empire Breeders Classic (EBC) finals. Purses for the EBC are funded by the Agriculture & NYS Horse Breeding Development Fund, New York farms that stand stallions, Tioga & Vernon Downs and the owners of the eligible horses.

Hen Party (Andy McCarthy PP 2) is the top chick in the \$223,500 filly pace, race 7 on the card. The Roll With Joe lass is the New York Sires Stakes (NYSS) point leader with three wins in the state-bred program and looked nifty winning in 1:50 in last Sunday's elimination for trainer Tony Alagna and owner Crawford Farms.

Chief among her eight rivals are the winner of the other

elimination, Pettycoat Business, and So Rude who missed by picking up Hen Party by about an inch last week.

The \$240,600 colt final required no elimination with all 10 of the declarees lining up for race 8 in what shapes up to be a very even contest.

While Splash Brother, Groovy Joe and Major Betts have been generating headlines in the NYSS events, a strong case could be made for Roll With JR who has been following the Grand Circuit trail and chasing the division's best this summer.

A winner in the Bluegrass Stakes last fall at The Red Mile, Roll With JR actually gets what could be considered class relief in the EBC and a new driver in Scott "Money" Zeron for trainer Jeff Cullipher who owns the colt in partnership with Tom Pollack as Pollack Racing.

The NYSS will be represented on the card by three divisions of freshman trotting fillies and four Excelsior divisions.

Time To Dance claims 2020 Gold Cup and Saucer


COVID-19 restrictions limited the race to Maritime-based connections as Marc Campbell claimed his third driving win in Charlottetown's premier event and first as a trainer.

The 61st edition of The Guardian Gold Cup and Saucer had a different look long before the Cup Trials went behind the starting gate. Usually, Old Home Week is an occasion for thousands of racegoers to gather at PEI's Red Shores Charlottetown Driving Park, with the big race getting underway late Saturday night. COVID-19 changed that, bringing about mandatory travel restrictions that meant the Gold Cup would revert to horses with Maritime-based owners, trainers and drivers.

The Charlottetown track's signature event has drawn far-flung fields for decades. Only one Island-bred horse has ever won the Gold Cup and Saucer (Dr Walter C, in 1973). Jerry McCabe says Dunachton Gale (p, 6, 1:53.1; \$177,016 US) was "the last Maritime-bred finalist with a legitimate chance to win it"; that was in the 2008 edition won by Pownal Bay Matt, which the PEI racing historian calls "the most competitive field" in the race's six-decade history. "For a lot of years, that's the way it was: One or two Maritime horses, who didn't really have a chance in the open era, when the Native Borns and the Stouts started coming, and really since then."

Even a Maritime circuit star who was not locally-bred, like Bramalea Road (p, 3, 1:52.2s; \$329,266 US), did not pose a serious threat, observes McCabe. When racing for trainer/driver Doug MacGregor and the Maritimer Stable, the Abercrombie son finished second to Southwind Balsam in the 2002 Consolation, but could finish no better than seventh — twice — in the main event, both times behind double Gold Cup champion Sand Olls Dexter (2003 and 2004).

Proponents of restricting the Gold Cup and Saucer to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and PEI horses have voiced that wish for years. The late Canadian Hall of Fame racing journalist Doug Harkness advocated for it, although McCabe says, "My feeling is we have to have the best of the best, or it would not quite be the 'Gold Cup experience' in another 10 years." Before the pandemic, that meant invitations extended to prominent owners and trainers from outside the region. This year, with an "Atlantic bubble" zone stringently limiting visitors from other parts of Canada and the United States, Red Shores opted to keep the Gold Cup and Saucer local, in order to offer it at all.

The result, while lacking the star power of some editions,

has yielded stories like that of Friday night's \$20,000 (Can.) James "Roach" MacGregor Memorial Gold Cup Consolation: Avatar J and Gilles Barrieau overtaking sentimental favourite Yankee Osborne and Neil MacInnis in the stretch for the 1:52.4h victory. Avatar J (American Ideal—Arts Fantasy) is a 6-year-old stallion bred by Ohio's Steiner Stock Farm, currently co-owned by Dean Larkin of Edwards, ON and Jody Sanderson of Cornwall, PEI, and trained by Daniel MacDonald. The win was the well-travelled pacer's eighth win in 20 starts this year; the clocking, just shy of his 1:52.1h lifetime best, set at Yonkers. Avatar J encountered just one Maritime-bred in the Consolation — JJ Powerball (Image of Dawn x NY Lotto by Bettors Delight), who finished fourth.

Kent Oakes says he "takes great pride as an Islander" in Pownal Bay Matt's 2008 Gold Cup and Saucer final win for Earl Smith. The veteran trainer/driver was honored with a trackside presentation Saturday night, celebrating Smith's rare achievement of official driving wins now spanning seven decades. Is the focus on the local product beneficial, especially this highly-unusual year? "Absolutely. I can't wait until the next Prince Edward Island, hopefully, or Maritime, horse wins the Gold Cup and Saucer." Oakes told HRU. "I'm a big fan of having as many local horses in the race as possible. We absolutely appreciate all the people that come in, and we encourage everybody to come and participate in this great race. I think we have something very special here."

It could have easily been otherwise. "We're extremely fortunate that through the good work of the industry and Red Shores and the province working together, we were the first track to come back to stakes racing, and doing it safely, which is the main important thing," continued the retired Standardbred Canada board member, who has looked after harness racing policy for the province of PEI for 32 years. He said he is hopeful that the usual welcoming of outside competitors and fans can resume in 2021, but "this year, in this environment, circumstances just didn't permit it." Even the racino's Top of the Park dining room reduced the number of seats to 100, from the normal 250, as a pandemic precaution.

Five official Offsite Gold Cup and Saucer parties were held to give fans the experience that they couldn't access at the track this year, plus a larger-than-usual number of unofficial ones. The Island Drive-In Festival even screened the big race at the Charlottetown Event Grounds after a local film called "Small Things. Great Love." There was no Foiled Again at Old Home Week 2020, or even a chance for Rock Diamonds N to defend his 2019 title for trainer Heidi Gibb and driver Mitch Cushing. But an eight-horse final comprised of pacers with a

rare opportunity to chase the region's famed \$60,000 invitational held its own appeal for both the limited 400-450-person audience allowed at the track (by advance reservation only, sold out long in advance), and for the



thousands who will undoubtedly pack the venue again at the next approved chance.

On a super-fast surface where the overall track trotting record of 1:56.3h was equalled by New Brunswick-bred Mile Hill Willy (driven by Gilles Barrieau) in the \$4,000 Colonel Dan Trot, expectations ran high on the pacing side. But the all-age pacing record at Red Shores CDP was indisputably safe: It was established in the 2016 Gold Cup final, when Rene Allard-trained Ys Lotus (p, 4, 1:49.3f; \$420,633 US) and catch driver Louis-Philippe Roy scorched the oval in 1:50.1h. It was the first year that the Atlantic Provinces Harness Racing Commission (APHRC) permitted the use of Lasix. Ys Lotus received the medication before setting a 1:51.4h track record at Red Shores Summerside in its Governors' Plate Invitational that year, opening up on local favourite DGs Camme for the six-length win that July 16 – the same win margin he would maintain over runner-up Go Daddy Go in the Gold Cup final.

When #2 Time To Dance (Marc Campbell) claimed the first-turn lead ahead of rail horse Lisburn (Ken Arsenault) the 4-year-old lived up to his name, accelerating to a "Boom! Just like that!" :26.2 opening quarter with that rival pocketing up behind him. When 3-5 betting fave #6 Casimir Ritchie P (Dale Spence Jr.) came calling first over, the aggressor ended up dangerously parked, followed second-over by #5 Woodmere Ideal Art (Dave Dowling) to the :54.1 half. Time To Dance shrugged off an "all-out third" Casimir Ritchie P in 1:23.3, who backed away before Lisburn pulled the pocket and Woodmere Ideal Art kept closing in the shadow of the wire. Campbell's horse prevailed by one-third of a length over next-best 12-1 shot Lisburn and 23-1 longest shot Woodmere Ideal Art (third) in the perfectly-timed 1:51.4 new lifetime mark. Time To Dance was sent off at 2-1.

Brent Campbell of Charlottetown — who owns Time To Dance with Matthew McDonald of Edwards, ON — is related to the winning trainer/driver, "distantly, but on the MacDonald side", he told HRU. "We've been friends since high school, at least." When he set out to locate a "Saturday-night class, top class horse" to race in PEI, the Charlottetown resident noticed Time To Dance in a \$15,000 claiming race at Flamboro Downs, and asked friend Robert Shepherd about the 4-year-old A Rocknroll Dance—Mystical Gypsy gelding,

bred by Diamond Creek Farms of Pennsylvania. "He wasn't really for sale, so we claimed him, and gave him to Mitch Tierney for a couple of starts up there [Ontario]. My other co-owner, Matt MacDonald, raced him a couple of times up in Ottawa, but the plan was to bring him home."

Brent, who trains himself and helps Marc on race nights, took the week off his day job to assist on the backstretch and farm during Old Home Week. They refer to the newly-minted Gold Cup and Saucer champion as a "farm horse" at heart, who enjoys being turned out every day at the former farm of Dr. Ian Moore, and just trains a couple of days to get ready before a race. "He's just not made to be at the racetrack."

Crediting driver Campbell as "making a world of difference" in the final, Brent also praised his horse. "He's just been a machine for the past two or three weeks," he says, describing the young pacer's rapid adaptation to the Maritimes' Invitational-calibre competition. Time To Dance won his Aug. 15 Gold Cup Trial in 1:52.4, earning his ticket to the big dance. "We're going to give him a couple of weeks off; I think the plan is to leave him here on PEI for the winter, and hopefully have a nice horse here for a couple more years."

Handle was \$184,274 for the 14-race card. From the winners' circle, Marc Campbell puts things in perspective post-race: "Everybody's in the same boat; everybody's dealing with COVID. There's still people who are pretty excited; these people [the winning owners] are pretty happy. People like seeing these other horses [from outside Atlantic Canada] come, no doubt they do, but maybe people that live here would go buy horses to compete in it again" if top local events became more regionally-focused. "I don't know about Maritime-bred," he clarified, adding that he knew the limited entries this year meant a more level playing field than in many recent editions. Time To Dance's victory gives Campbell his third driving win in the coveted event, following up on his past success catch-driving trainer Ron Burke's Escape the News (2013) and Take It Back Terry (2015). It was the Driver of the Decade's first training win in the Gold Cup and Saucer, which he says may sink in more the next morning.

A lesson from Robinhood

"How is Trey's young horse doing on the racetrack this season?" asked my techie friend.

"Brutal, a perfect storm of how to lose money in the harness racing game."

"Sorry to hear that," he said.

"Don't be. My horse racing during the plague of 2020 gave me plenty of new material for a self-published, nonfiction book —23 Ways to Lose Money Investing in a Yearling Trotter and Laugh about the Escapades."

He smiled, "A bit of a niche audience."

"To sell books, you need to have search words for potential customers in the title. Customers use filter words to find book titles. I used filter words such as money, nonfiction, trotter, escapade, and investing."

He chuckled, "Anybody searching for all those matching words will land in an uncluttered space. Is self-publishing viable?"

"Hell no. Self-publishing makes investing in yearlings look smart. I'd rather sell my book out of the trunk of the Lexus."

"I'm sure some self-published books make it out of the



swamp," he said.

"Yeah, about as many as horses that win the Hambletonian. Do you know who buys self-published books? The answer is nobody. Self-publishing is a combination dream and scam, a moneymaker for shady sharks that prey on wannabe Hemmingways. There may be more books self-published than books that people read from cover to cover.

"A tad pessimistic."

"Realistic. But I have my fingers crossed that the trotters and pacers keep chugging along, so I can keep playing the harness game and playing author."

"You need more chapters?"

"Sure, but more importantly, I'm keeping busy writing books because I don't want to end up in crazy town."

"You might have missed that train."

Ignoring the shot, I said, "I get plenty of bang for my lost bucks in harness racing. This year, dreaming of elusive winners has been the one constant that keeps me afloat. Thinking about the horses and the races kept me off the ledge. Allow Trey to offer a bold statement."

"Offer away."

I cleared my throat for dramatic effect. "Should this virus linger, as many experts fear, the marketing opportunity to



find new participants in the harness racing ownership and wagering ranks may never be as promising. I'm telling you that the lingering pandemic will drive people crazy. Today I read that college football games are toast. The winter could be bad. If the word could break through to the masses that investing in a harness horse is a wonderful, interesting, time fulfilling remedy, and that for the most part, you can participate remotely, the game could pick up some players."

He nodded, "You may be on to something. Boredom has created a cultural phenomenon that is another form of gambling, an app for trading stocks name *Robinhood*. The app is super-hot. A lot of the players are young. Without bars, sports, or restaurants, they are looking for ways to fill the void."

I perked up and chirped, "I've told you 10 times that investing in a yearling is more exciting than stocks. I know a few guys who play the stock market. When I read their tea leaves, these amateur investors don't make money. Compared to the thrills, chills, and ups and downs of a living breathing animal that may race for money, reading numbers on a screen isn't exactly a festival of fun."

"Maybe harness racing could take some lessons from *Robinhood*."

"What, that it's easy to lose money?"

"Ease of entry. Robinhood is ultra-simple to get involved in,

you can set up an account and start trading stocks or options in a few minutes. They lure people who do not know very much about the markets but are trying to fill long days with something new."

"How does the company make money?"

"Commissions. It's complicated, but they grab people with a 'free' trading marketing plan, but nothing is free. Robinhood is like buying a yearling, a gamble. The app is like the flip of a river card in poker or wagering a trifecta. The lure is that you can make a lot of money. In your rational brain, you know it isn't easy, but you always think deep down in your mind that you can beat this game."

"That's our sport in a nutshell."

He nodded, "This could be a good time for your sport. An extended period of boredom will lead to problems. People will be looking hard for new things to do, activities they may not normally consider, new ways to spend money, new pastimes where they can get involved. Since the lockdown started, *Robinhood* picked up three million new customers.

I replied, "And harness racing, a sport that is inherently a more dynamic product, should be able to pick up thousands."



David Miller records 13,000th career win

Hall of Fame horseman David Miller became only the fifth driver to reach 13,000 career sulky victories when he won with Mr Censi in the 12th race on Friday afternoon (Aug. 21) at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Miller got away third with the winner as the favorite The Wall laid down hot numbers of :25.4 and :54.1 to the half, then moved uncovered late in the backstretch, with Lifeonthebeach A on his back by the 1:21.3 three-quarters. The late battle came down to these two horses on the outside, with Mr Censi just proving more photogenic than his rival in 1:51, returning \$56.00 to win to his scattered backers.

David Miller, a 55-year-old native Ohioan who entered the sport's Hall of Fame in 2013, now trails only Dave Palone, Tony Morgan (who was third in Miller's milestone race), Herve Filion, and Cat Manzi in lifetime driving victories. He is second to the retired John Campbell in lifetime earnings of horses driven with \$244.5 million bankrolled. Miller is currently tied for third in the Harrah's Philly driver standings.

Sandbetweenmytoes clinches championship berth with PASS win

Sandbetweenmytoes rolled to an easy victory in Saturday's \$94,378 Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) division at The Meadows, clinching a spot in the \$260,000 PASS championship set for Sept. 6 at Harrah's Philadelphia. **No Lou Zing** captured the other division in the event for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers, known as the Tarport Effrat, giving driver Dexter Dunn a stake sweep.

Dunn quarter-poled to the front from fourth with Sandbetweenmytoes, a move he might have been reluctant to make earlier in the season when the horse was still learning.

"He was a green horse for a while," said winning trainer Jim

Campbell of the Somebeachsomewhere—Galleria gelding, a Fashion Farms homebred. "But he's really put everything together. He's a big, strong horse, and he's just starting to figure everything out. He has a top mother, and I think his mother's coming out in him."

Sandbetweenmytoes scored in 1:49.1, 2-1/4 lengths better than The Greek Freak, who also wrapped up a spot in the championship. Chief Mate completed the ticket.

Sandbetweenmytoes, who lifted his career earnings to \$160,007 collected three wins and a second in the four PASS preliminary legs while The Greek Freak tallied two victories and as many seconds.

Dunn had a chance for an early tuck with No Lou Zing, but when he saw Cattlewash and David Miller looming up outside, he kept moving between horses until securing the lead and, ultimately, the pocket.

"I wanted to follow Dave; I didn't want to come first up with him," Dunn said. "The two-hole was available, and following Dave was the right move. He was a difficult horse earlier, but he's getting better and better."

No Lou Zing triumphed in a career-best 1:49.3, 2-1/4 lengths better than Cattlewash, with Manticore third. No Lou Zing contested only three PASS preliminary legs, but with two wins and a second, he's a likely finalist. Nancy Takter trains the Sweet Lou—Terroronthebeach gelding, who pushed his career bankroll to \$146,418, for 3 Brothers Stables, Rojan Stables and Caviart Farms.

Seeyou At Thebeach and **Tru Lou** provided trainer Ron Burke with a double in Saturday's subfeature, the Pennsylvania Stallion Series, while **What The Luck** set off tote board fireworks with his 26-1 upset in the third split.

Seeyou At Thebeach, who banked more than \$136,000 at 2, was without a stake victory this year entering the day. He and Tim Tetrick took care of that when they zipped to the front from post 6 and held off the sustained bid by Ruthless Hanover by a nose in 1:51.2, matching his life mark. Gingras Beach earned show.

"I loved him last year, but he had some issues," Tetrick said. "If they get those fixed, I think he's a top horse."

Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, Purnel & Libby and Kitefield Stable campaign the son of Somebeachsomewhere—Persistent.

Atoning for a break in his last stallion series event, Tru Lou assumed the lead early for Matt Kakaley and denied the Lightning Lane charge of Sunuma Beach by a length in 1:51.1, fastest of his career. Stop Action finished third.

"He's been facing a little tougher than he was today — they put him in the Adios, right?" Kakaley said. "But he's a nice colt, and he was really good today. I wanted to put him on the lead and control things."

The Sweet Lou-Real Touch gelding races for Burke Racing

Stable, Knox Services, Slaughter Racing Stable and Weaver Bruscemi.

The Meadows will play host to all eight \$40,000 stallion series championships on Monday, Sept. 7.

Dave Palone piloted five winners on the 15-race card while Burke enjoyed a four-bagger.

Henry sweeps Gold Series with freshman sons of Shadow Play

When Trevor Henry arrived at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Friday (Aug. 21) he was expecting to drive division leading **Desperate Man** in the second of two \$107,200 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series divisions for the 2-year-old pacing colts. He did not have a drive in the first Gold division.

Fortunately for Henry, Jack Darling had just learned that Randy Waples was unable to drive Friday and the trainer was in need of a replacement to steer **Bulldog Hanover** in the first split. Henry was happy to step into the breach and eight races later he had piloted both colts to Gold Series victories.

Starting from the outside Post 9, Henry dropped Bulldog Hanover down to the rail in seventh and sat at the back of the main pack as Lawless Shadow sprinted out to a :26.3 quarter and battled Springbridge Duel to a :55.3 half. Springbridge Duel kept the tempo lively through the 1:23.4 three-quarters as No Bettor Joy and Bulldog Hanover started to advance up the outer lane. Turning for home Henry moved Bulldog Hanover into an open lane and the colt sprinted down the stretch to a three length victory in a personal best 1:52. Favorite Lawless Shadow finished second and Flash Cube was third.

"He raced good for the nine-hole He had a lot of luck, three of them made breaks, and he landed in a good spot, but yeah he raced really well," said Henry. "He's a nice colt."

"Trevor did a good job. When he drew the nine-hole you're kind of expecting the worst, but actually the trip worked out perfect and he got around all the breaking horses," added owner/trainer Darling. "So he got a little bit lucky and ended up getting a good trip, but he raced big too. That was a nice mile."

Bulldog Hanover started his OSS campaign at the Grassroots level, finishing second in the July 6 season opener and romping to a five length win in the July 20 leg, both at Woodbine Mohawk Park. With a month in between the second Grassroots leg and Friday's test, Darling gave the Shadow Play son a tightener in an Aug. 11 qualifier, where Bulldog Hanover cruised to an 11 length win in 1:56.

"He's basically been a nice colt all the way through; he just

kept getting better and better as we went. He qualified good, he won the Grassroots kind of handy, so we gave him a try in the Gold and it looks like he's a nice Gold horse too," said Darling. "He's just a nice horse. He's just that cocky type, always feeling good, got lots of try to him, and a beautiful looking horse. Most of the Shadow Plays are great looking horses and he is one of them."

Another good-looking son of Shadow Play, Desperate Man lined up at Post 3 in the second Gold division and left well enough to land in fourth as Bettor Sun and Darling-trainee Avion Seelster hustled to a :26.2 quarter. Bettor Sun marched on to a :55 half, with Henry angling Desperate Man off the rail and catching a windbreak from Ucanttouchthis. As Bettor Sun paced by the 1:23.2 three-quarters, Desperate Man had advanced to third and once the colts squared up in the stretch Henry asked the favorite for another gear and Desperate Man drew away to a one and one-quarter length victory in a personal best 1:51.2. Bettor Sun stayed game for second and Socrates Blue Chip closed to be third.

"Tonight he got second-over and kind of got towed up into it," said Henry. "I figured he would be a little short because he hasn't raced in a while, and then the qualifier we had him in he made a break at the gate and he never got a real good workout that day, but he still finds a way to win. Good ones do."

Desperate Man romped to victory in the July 3 Gold Series opener and the July 18 Gold leg, both at Woodbine Mohawk Park, and then dropped into the same Aug. 11 qualifier as Bulldog Hanover for his prep in advance of Friday's start. However, things did not go according to plan for Henry, trainer Kathy Cecchin and her co-owners, husband John Cecchin, daughter Nicole Davies and son-in-law Paul Davies, all from Arthur, ON. Desperate Man made a break behind the starting gate and was never part of the action.

"He was just behind the gate so long, because with the 2-year-olds they bring the gate way to the back here and he was behind it for quite a while," Henry said. "He actually, when I schooled him the once he did it, but then he landed right away and I got away with him, but that day he just didn't land and it was just one of those things. Better going for nothing than when he's going for money."

While Henry does not foresee any long term issues for the colt behind the starting gate, he said it is unlikely Desperate Man will be hustling off the wings this season.

"I don't think you'd want to really rush him out of there, it takes him a while to kind of get in gear; he's a big colt. He'll come to that when he gets older, but for now it takes him a while to get in the motion," said the driver. "He's not maybe as quick off the gate as some of them, but he always, he's quicker home than the rest of them."

The 2-year-old pacing colts will make their fourth Gold Series start at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Sept. 5 before

Grassroots double for McClure at Hiawatha

Hiawatha Horse Park welcomed the 2-year-old pacing colts on Saturday, Aug. 22 for four \$23,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots divisions and driver Bob McClure kicked off the program with wins in the first two splits.

Starting from Post 1 in the first division, McClure and **Next Big Thing** got away second behind Lil Red Sportsstar, who led the field of eight to a :28 quarter. The driver sent Next Big Thing to the front before the :56.4 half and the gelding fought off a sustained challenge from fan favorites No Plan Intended and driver Jody Jamieson through the 1:26 three-quarters before pulling away to a one and three-quarter length victory in 1:54.4. No Plan Intended settled for second and Beef N Cheddar was third.

"I watched the Gold that he was in when Desperate Man won (July 3) and he was locked and loaded and he went a very big mile that night and I thought he was going to be very legit," said McClure, who had not driven the gelding before Saturday's contest. "After that, I guess he doesn't really like the front and he ended up on the front a couple times, and they said he had some sickness issues, so it looks like they've got everything ironed out now because he was lethal today."

McClure engineered the win for trainer Bob McIntosh of Windsor and his co-owner/breeders Dave Boyle of Bowmanville, ON and C S X Stables of Liberty Center, OH. The Shadow Play gelding started his OSS career at the Gold Series level, finishing third in both the July 3 season opener and the July 18 leg, both at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"He was going against the Gold colts and just coming up a little short so, confidence is a big thing, and I decided to drop him down and see if we couldn't braven him up. I did make a big change, he had a blind bridle on and once he made the front he would get lost and just let a couple by him, but I put an open bridle on him and I trained him in the open bridle and he was much better," said McIntosh. "Today, I just watched it on the Hiawatha website, but if he had the blind bridle on he probably would have let Jamieson go by, but with an open bridle he fought him off.

"I think with the open bridle on he might go back to the Gold. He'll be proud of himself now."

McClure was back in the winner's circle after the second Grassroots division with fan favorite **Adrenaline Rush**, who took command just after the midway point and opened up to a three and one-half length victory in 1:57. All Cheddar was second and Hez My Buddy finished third.

"He's been off a month, I didn't know what to expect," said McClure. "When I moved him out first-up he was coming, and then he cleared the front, and you know what, he took care of the rest from there, but that was a surprise because I thought he'd be a bit short."

The win was the second straight in Grassroots action for McClure and the Royal Mattjesty gelding. The pair was also victorious in the July 20 event at Woodbine Mohawk Park on behalf of trainer Kevin McMaster and fractional ownership group TheStable Adrenaline Rush of Guelph, ON. Saturday's win moved Adrenaline Rush to the top of the division standings with the win with a total of 102 points.

Cantstoplying claimed the third Grassroots title, outsprinting Next Big Thing's stablemate Last Bet for a neck victory in 1:55.1. Finkle Is Einhorn was one length behind the battling leaders in third.

Louis-Philippe Roy piloted Sunshine Beach gelding Cantstoplying to his first lifetime win for trainer Nick Gallucci and owner/breeder Millar Farms of Stouffville, ON.

"I was really happy with how he beat the horse down the stretch. It looked like he might have been second there, but he fought back and won the race, so I was really impressed with that," said Gallucci. "He's still learning; every race he seems to get a little bit better. He's very fast, it's just a matter of getting his mind more into being a racehorse and I think that will come with time."

Take Control claimed the final Grassroots division, overtaking pacesetting favorite Proline on the final turn and romping home to a 15 length victory in 1:54.3. Mustang Beach, who led the main pack as a distant Proline rang up fractions of :26.4, :53.1 and 1:23.4, finished second and Marlboro Seelster was third.

Anthony Haughan engineered Take Control's first lifetime win for trainer Dan Lagace of Cambridge and his co-owner Ben Mudry of Toronto, ON. The partners were delighted with the result and with the progress the Control The Moment son has shown through his five lifetime starts.

"He's a nice little colt. Ben was kind of looking for a Control The Moment colt because he owned Control The Moment and so he had approached me in the fall about looking at some babies," said Lagace. "So this colt was in London (Selected Yearling Sale) and I said I'd go to \$15,000 on him and Ben's like, 'Well you know when you say \$15,000 they always go for \$20,000'. And I said, 'Well I'm only buying a

quarter, you're buying three-quarters so if we go to \$20,000 I don't care.' So I went in and made one bid and bid \$8,000.

"You know that commercial where the girl is leaving Walmart and she's leaving the building and she's like, 'Start the car!' I said that's the way I felt. He's not a great horse or anything, but you know he's maturing into a nice horse. And for \$8,000 you can't go wrong; \$8,000 is my wheelhouse."

The two-year-old pacing colts will make their last two Grassroots starts at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Sept. 8 and 17. The top 20 point earners through the five regular season events will then move on to the Oct. 1 Semi-Finals at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Sophomore geldings clock new lifetime marks in ISS action

Lifetime marks were lowered in two \$34,000 divisions of Indiana Sires Stakes action featured on the evening's 13-race card on Friday (Aug. 21) at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. It was the 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings' turn to tussle, and the fourth round of action brought victories from both a favorite and a price, **Crook Boyzz** and **Family Recipe**, respectively. Both sophomore geldings bested their own lifetime marks by almost a full second.

Kicking off the stakes action for the night, Crook Boyzz with Brandon Bates found the winner's circle in a near gate-to-wire fashion. As the field passed the start pole, Frankiepark with Ricky Macomber Jr. grabbed the early lead while Tar Zan Dan with Sam Widger sat in the pocket. Crook Boyzz found a spot toward the back of the pack, but didn't stay there for long as he maneuvered around his competitors from fifth to first just after the first quarter in :26.2.

Clocking fractions of :54.2 and 1:22, Crook Boyzz bolstered his lead on the field, handily pacing toward the finish. With a lead of four lengths, Crook Boyzz crossed the wire in 1:50.1, besting his previous mark of 1:51. Northern Cadilac with Joey Putnam staged a late rally for second, while Nassau Desire with Trace Tetrick dug in to claim third. Crook Boyzz paid \$4.80 to win at the betting windows.

"He seems very versatile," Bates said after the victory.
"Taking him right off the gate ended up not being his best spot so I moved him early and he was really strong from there. He drives nicely but doesn't like to stand around afterward; He likes to keep moving."

Crook Boyzz, who was lightly raced as a 2-year-old, has now won four of 11 lifetime starts, sporting a lifetime bankroll of \$44,480 for owners John Esposito, Robert Esposito and Brett Selby, who also trains the gelding. The son of Always A Virgin-Magic moments was bred by Wilber Lengacher.

The second division of the stakes action saw a 9-1 upset from Family Recipe who took advantage of a pocket trip to dig in gamely for a 1:49.4 win. Driven by LeWayne Miller, who also trains and co-owns the gelding, Family Recipe found late racing room to get the win by two lengths.

The heavily-favored Island Of The Sea with Trace Tetrick had his nose on the gate as it opened, followed closely by Family Recipe. Through fractions of :26.1, :54.2 and 1:22.2, Family Recipe sat patiently in the pocket while the rest of the field raced nose-to-tail.

As the pacers turned for home, Family Recipe tipped from the pocket and was matching strides with Island Of The Sea. Utilizing the passing lane, Family Recipe surged ahead and reached the wire in 1:49.4 while Island Of The Sea settled for second. Sawyer's Desire with Ricky Macomber Jr. rallied late in the stretch to finish in third. With the upset, Family Recipe paid \$21.80 to win for his betting backers.

"I think he races best off the helmet, but he's quick and very handy," Miller said after the win. "He's been racing well all year, even with tougher trips. He's also a barn favorite — very playful and friendly."

The son of Always A Virgin—Tia Maria Hanover has now won four of 18 lifetime starts. With the win, Family Recipe surpassed the \$100,000 mark in purse earnings, bringing his lifetime bankroll to \$115,480. Miller co-owns Family Recipe with Arnold Manders, Joseph Vieria and the Never 2 Late Stables. He was bred by Lyndar Stables.

Fashion Frenzie and Macho Martini sharp in Gold Series

Two-year-old trotting colt **Fashion Frenzie** made the leap from the Grassroots to the Gold Series on Thursday (Aug. 20) and sailed around the Woodbine Mohawk Park oval to his fourth straight victory.

Coming off a track record performance in the July 25 Grassroots event at Hiawatha Horse Park and seven-length victories in overnight action at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Aug. 4 and 11, fans made Fashion Frenzie and trainer/driver Dustin Jones their top choice in the first \$106,400 Gold Series division. Starting from Post 4, the Archangel son and Jones were sitting on the outside in third when Venturesome reached the quarter in :27.1, but they had taken command by the :56.2 half. On top by two lengths at the 1:25.2 three-quarters, Fashion Frenzie dug in down the stretch to hold off a charging Full Of Muscles for a neck victory in 1:55.2. Tokyo Seelster finished third.

"That was actually the one I was worried about because I raced against him the week before and in the race he came the same last half as I did, on his fractions, and I thought

he'd be tough," said Jones about the stretch battle with Full Of Muscles. "So anyway, we got the job done. For a \$7,000 yearling he's got four starts, four wins and he's got \$80,000 made, so pretty damn good. And he got stung pretty hard the first three-eighths of a mile. He got to the front just down the backstretch, first quarter in :27.1 I think, and we were marching, not too many would live after that the way he did, so I was pretty happy."

Jones conditions Fashion Frenzie for Ecuries Francis Richard Inc. of Becancour, Ferme Auclair of Saint-Antoine-de-Tilly, Pierre Guillemette of Becancour and Mario Bourgea of Stanbridge East, QC. Francis Richard developed the youngster after his purchase at the London Selected Yearling Sale and sent him to Jones just after a July 4 qualifier at Hippodrome Trois-Rivieres.

Jones qualified the colt twice, changing his shoes after Fashion Frenzie made a break in the first one, and then entered him for the second Grassroots leg. Since then the colt has done nothing but delight both trainer and owners.

"A \$7,000 yearling, everybody hopes to have a Gold winner when you buy one, but you don't expect them to do what he's done so far. But that's what the sales are all about and that's what the business is all about. That's what keeps the small owners dreaming, to get a horse like that," said Jones. "The girl in the paddock beside us, she goes, 'Is he a homebred?' And I said, 'No they bought him at the sale for \$7,000.' And she goes, 'Darn, I could have bought the horse for that price.' Everybody could have. I could have too, but I didn't even look at him so there you go, it's all about grabbing the right halter."

With just the Ontario Sires Stakes on his schedule, Fashion Frenzie is now looking forward to a mid-season vacation before preparing for the last two Gold events on Sept. 19 at Woodbine Mohawk Park and Oct. 7 at Flamboro Downs.

In the second \$106,400 Gold division **Macho Martini** cruised to his fifth straight win and third Gold title. The heavy favorite and driver Bob McClure went straight to the front from Post 8, romped through fractions of :29.2,:59 and 1:27.1 and then sailed home to a one and three-quarter length victory in 1:55.4. Emotions Riches finished second and Harry was third.

"He's a very mature horse. I think he knows what he's doing, he's very comfortable right now," said trainer Luc Blais, who conditions the Muscle Mass son for Determination of Montreal, QC. "You see tonight, :59 (half), he's very easy. You can do what you want with him, that's a plus for a horse, I think."

Unlike Fashion Frenzie, in the coming weeks Macho Martini is eligible for a full slate of Grand Circuit events at Woodbine Mohawk Park, including the Aug. 27 Champlain Stakes, the William Wellwood Memorial, with eliminations Sept. 3 and the final Sept. 12, and Determination is the

owner of one slot in the inaugural Mohawk Million on Sept. 26.

"We'll see, we go week-by-week," said Blais. "We have a big month now, it's Champlain, after that it's the Wellwood and million dollar race; he's got lots of stuff coming, tough races. We're going to go week-by-week and see how he is."

Blais and his team will be focussed on keeping Macho Martini in tip-top physical and mental condition, a task made easier by the colt's easy-going attitude.

"He's a happy camper, he's a nice horse to be around," said the trainer. "He's got a good temperament, he's a cool horse. He's like more high, a little bit, than Forbidden (Trade), but they've got the same manner I think. I think that's a sign of a good horse."

Forbidden Trade was the Ontario Sires Stakes division champion at both 2 and 3 and the 2019 Hambletonian winner. If Macho Martini's ability is also similar to his stablemate's, Determination and the Blais stable could be in for an enjoyable autumn.

Flagman, Emma Town Bud capture stakes victories at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Three-year-old trotting colts and geldings were back in action on Thursday (Aug. 20) at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino as two \$31,500 divisions of Indiana Sires Stakes were featured on the evening's 14-race card. The sophomore trotters were competing in the fourth round of their seven round series.

Flagman, with driver, trainer Rick Plano in the bike, turned in an impressive effort to pull the 7-1 upset in the opening division. Scoring in 1:54.1, Flagman recorded his first win of the season and established a new lifetime best in the process.

Leaving from post six in the field of six, Plano wasted no time and sent Flagman to the front through the opening panel in :27.2. Trace Tetrick had Anchors Away on a mission to the front and they ranged up to take command just before the half in :56.1. Flagman sat patiently in the pocket while the heavy post time favorite, Dude Included and John DeLong, were on the attack from first-over through the three-quarter clocking in 1:25.3.

While Dude Included and Anchors Away were battling on the front, Flagman was winding up to strike from behind

them. Plano tipped Flagman out and he surged past the top two to get the win by three parts of a length. Dude Included held on for second while Speedball Swagger and LeWayne Miller rallied well late for third. Sent off at odds of 7-1, Flagman returned \$17.20 at the betting windows.

"He's just coming into himself," driver, trainer Rick Plano said after the victory. "He's getting better with every start and we're getting to the point now where we can make some changes with his shoes and things to really help him."

Owned by Cinderalla Stables, the gelded son of Guccio—Magic Lindy recorded his first win of the season from 6 starts and fourth lifetime victory from 18 outs. Flagman pushed his lifetime bankroll to \$73,369 with the win.

In the second division, **Emma Town Bud** and Michael Oosting converted a pocket trip into a decisive 1:52.4 score. With the win, Emma Town Bud recorded his second straight victory and lowered his lifetime mark by nearly a second.

Oosting sent Emma Town Bud away from the gate just enough to grab a pocket seat behind TJ's Top Pick and Trace Tetrick. The heavily favored Swan In Motion and Ricky Macomber Jr., who had an undefeated streak on the line, found a spot along the rail in third. TJ's Top Pick clicked off fractions of :28, :56.4, and 1:25.1 before ever feeling a threat from the rest of the field.

Turning for home, TJ's Top Pick was still on top but Emma Town Bud saved his best for last. Utilizing a :27.1 closing kick, Emma Town Bud tipped out from behind the tiring leader and powered home a winner, holding off a late surge from Swan In Motion. Swan In Motion was forced to settle for second while TJ's Top Pick held on for third. Sent off as the betting publics' second choice, Emma Town Bud returned \$6.20 to his backers.

Trained by Byron Hooley and owned by Summit Pacing Acres LLC, Emma Town Bud now owns a 18-6-5-2 lifetime record. The son of Big Stick Lindy—Centerfold Lady has amassed \$169,957 in lifetime purse earnings.

Final Ohio Sires Stakes leg contested for freshmen

Celebrate With Me captured the first of three \$40,000 Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) for 2-year-old trotting fillies in the final leg of the four-leg series, on Aug. 21 at Scioto Downs. The daughter of Full Count—Glisten Hanover scored the victory in a career best 1:56.2 with Kurt Sugg driving for trainer and owner Marty Wollam and Toni Dean. The victory pushed Celebrate With Me's bankroll to \$78,622. Bred by Marvin Raber, this coal black filly also took leg two in 1:56.4, and she was the 3-5 favorite in this fourth leg. Katies Lucky Day was

second at 21-1 for Trevor Smith, while 7-1 Imalovely lady was third with Anthony MacDonald at the controls.

Herculisa cruised to a new track record and lifetime mark of 1:55.1 in the second OHSS contest for 2-year-old trotting fillies with Brett Miller at the lines in a front-stepping performance. Bred by Joe McLead, Billy Walters and Up Front Racing the My MVP—Herculotte Hanover lass notched her fifth straight triumph in as many career starts as the 1-9 favorite and upped her earnings to \$81,812 for the Jesmeral Stable of Scarsdale, NY. Ciao Baby Hall was brought up for second at 11-1 by Aaron Merriman while 21-1 Rose Run Whitney was third for Chris Page.

1-9 favorite **Merry Ann** picked up the final OHSS contest easily with a front-end 1:58 victory. Steered by Chris Page for trainer Ronnie Burke and owners Burke Racing, Knox Services and Weaver Bruscemi, the daughter of Southwind Spirit—Witty Girl notched her fourth wins of the year in six starts and now has career earnings of \$95,200. This homebred finished well in front of 48-1 longshot Incomeorexpenses (Tyler Smith), with 6-1 My Jazz (Anthony MacDonald) third.

Winning Ticket captured his second OHSS leg (he won leg two in 1:57.1) by taking the first of two \$50,000 divisions in a new lifetime and track record clocking of 1:55.3 for driver Aaron Merriman. The son of Triumphant Caviar—Lotto Winner is trained by Chris Beaver for owners Beaver, Steve Zeehandelar, T. Homan and J. Burnett. This triumph was his third in five starts and pushed his career earnings to \$65,000. Winning Ticket left the gate as the 1-2 favorite, followed by 9-2 Triple M Storm (Dan Noble) and 8-1 Panzano (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.).

Street Gossip captured the second OHSS Leg for freshman trotting colts in 1:58.1 with Brett Miller at the lines. Virgil Morgan, Jr., conditions the son of Cash Hall—The Young Princess for owners Carl Howard and the Jesmeral Stable. Street Gossip, who was bred by Morrisville College, now has \$69,714 in career earnings from his three wins in six starts. This bay gelding left the gate as the even money favorite, and bested rivals 6-5 Replica Hanover (Tyler Smith) and 10-1 third-place finisher Rose Run Wilson (Mike Wilder).

Mag N Lady, Hall Win victorious at Hippodrome 3R

Driver Jean Francois Maguire had not won a race for 34 months, and the 2-year-old trotting filly **Mag N Lady** had never won before, but the two looked like regular, no-nonsense pros in winning the \$10,000 filly division of her Coupe de L'Avenir's first preliminary leg during the Friday

(Aug. 21) twilight card at Hippodrome 3R.

Maguire, the horse's trainer and co-owner with Julie Malenfant and Richard Legris and a veteran horseman who does not compete that much these days, wasted no time in hustling the daughter of Royalty For Life—Ulittleripper to the top from the outside post in the field of four. She set fractions of :29.3, 1:00.2, and 1:31.1 en route to an 8½ length score in 2:02, not far off the 3R track record of 2:01.2, co-held by Meganou and Claudi P V. Twice second and once third in Ontario Grassroots races, Mag N Lady has already bankrolled nearly \$20,000.

It was apparent that a son of Angus Hall was going to win the \$10,000 L'Avenir's colt division, but a hot stretch battle revealed that it was **Hall Win**, a colt out of the mare Beer Maggs, who would emerge first by ¾ of a length over Incredible Hall, taking a maiden mark of 2:05.2 in just his second lifetime start. The youngster is trained and was driven by Kevin Maguire for Ecurie Maguire Inc.

Dragon Striker breaks track record at MGM Northfield Park

Dragon Striker became the fasted horse in the history of MGM Northfield Park when he won a \$8,400 conditioned pace in 1:48.4 on Saturday (Aug. 23).

The previous all-age track record of 1:49 had been attained three times: Scott Rocks (Aaron Merriman) in 2016, Cams Valentino (Aaron Merriman) in 2018 and None Bettor A (Joe Bongiorno) in 2019.

Brian Loney owns and trains his recent acquisition – the horse came to his barn about five weeks ago. Aaron Merriman was in the sulky for the winning drive.

Dragon Striker (Dragon Again–Lady's Portrait) started from the rail. He left from the gate and led every call through fractions of :26.4, :54.3, 1:21.2 and 1:48.4, besting his closest competitor by 4 ½-lengths.

Dragon Striker now has four wins in 12 starts this year. Saturday's victory represents his 15th career score and bolstered his bankroll to \$145,971. He was heavily favored and returned \$3.20 to win.

In a dramatic photo finish, it was determined that Elver Hanover (Chris Page), the 5-2 choice, bested 1-5 favorite Stanford Court (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) by a whisker at the wire in a seasonal mark of 1:49.4.

Trained by Ronnie Burke for Burke Racing, B. Jablonsky, J. Melillo and J&T Silva-Purnel&Libby, Elver Hanover had also captured OHSS leg two in 1:51. The gelded son of Yankee Cruiser now has \$455,200 in his career coffers from 11 wins in 15 starts. He recorded a top mark of 1:48.3 last season as a 2-year-old at Lexington's Red Mile.

Can B Perfect was third at 13-1 for driver Tyler Smith, with 30-1 Worthabuck(Ryan Stahl) fourth and 70-1Rock Smart (Greg Grismore) fifth.

The top nine point earners from each of the 2- and 3-year-old divisions are now eligible to compete in the \$300,000 Championships on Super Night, Saturday, Sept. 5 at Scioto Downs.
