

The brilliant filly is also owned by Brad Grant as well as Brittany Farms who bred her.

In the other division, Alicorn a daughter of Bettors Delight owned by Windermere Stable and Robert Mascara destroyed the competition with a five-length jog for Louis Roy and trainer Chantal Mitchell.

At Yonkers Raceway, Bettors Wish continued his quest for year-end honors easily winning his non-betting Messenger elimination for Chris Ryder and Dexter Dunn.

On the card, Aflame Hanover took his division in hand for Corey Callahan and Linda Schadel.

This is truly a "believe it or not." A reader whose name I refuse to publish tried to make a case that my crusade for integrity in the sport was damaging its overall existence. His claim is that by punishing the criminal trainers we are losing too many big owners because the big owners tend to drop out of the business when their trainers get major suspensions or banishment. Can you top this?

For those of you interested in European racing and a noticeable difference between the French-bred trotter and the American, the Arqana Trot website (https://www.arqana-trot.com/) has an online catalogue of the French Yearlings selling the first week in September. Sires we have seen in America like Ready Cash, and Love You, as well as Bold Eagle and dozens more are represented. Some of the videos are amazing as they portray a larger more imposing figure of an equine than we see in the U.S. in sale videos.

I was particularly impressed with number 40 Idaho Springs, a son of Ready Cash. However, when I looked at his pedigree page although difficult to interpret (more like a thoroughbred catalogue page) I was less impressed. If you have the time and or the inclination, I think you will enjoy a peek.

It's sad Yonkers Raceway has an open draw for the Messenger. Why is simple. Bettors Wish drew the rail — wonderful — but Aflame Hanover winning an elimination and drawing post eight is not acceptable. The rule must be changed or why bother to race your horse in an elimination. May be better off going around twice and exerting enough energy to qualify.

Perry Robbins asks: What do you think about the 2019 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale?

To be honest, I haven't looked past opening night, and that is to me the most powerful first session I have ever seen. If the horses look anywhere close to as good as the pedigree pages do, all previous records will fall. Out of the 121 offerings there is but a handful that are not in the \$100,000 category, and some if they look the part could hit the

\$500,000 plus area. Imagine if the horse and video are great for the full brother to Greenshoe or the first foal of Mission Brief.

Coming next week a special on the amazing Lexington Selected Sale, titled "Are we going to see the first \$1 million yearling in Lexington this October?"

Bill Bigler asks: When I talk to you "Old Timers" you always tell me that the business was so great in past years and just isn't as much fun today, why is that?

I am sure there are many reasons, and no doubt I will leave some out, but I will fill you in on my basic thoughts. To begin with, if you are a performer in any venue you prefer to have a large audience. I started my career at Roosevelt Raceway in the '60s where it wasn't unusual to have 25,000 in the stands and close to 50,000 for a major event. I told the newcomers that the crowds were so big that on the night of the International if you were on the apron and you had a heart attack you couldn't fall down as there was no room.

Then there was the social aspect that totally dissolved when barn areas closed.

In those what I call golden days, we all were stabled at the racetrack. Therefore, after the races we were all in a local area and there was a great social connection. Every track had one or more local hangouts. Roosevelt had Gam Wah where you would find Buddy Gilmour, John Chapman, Carmine Abatiello, Lucien Fontaine, Ben Webster, the Popfingers, Frank and Bill, the Haughtons, the Dancers, and a myriad of other stars nightly.

At the Meadowlands it was the Bottom of the Barrel where nightly appearances of the Remmens, John and Paula Campbell, Billy O'Donnell, Luc Ouellette, Jacky Mo, and other famed horseman would congregate and often be entertained by the voice of Herman Carbone singing Ave Maria and other favorites.

At Monticello, there were so many places. The Chateau, The Down Under, and Johnnies, come to mind, but luckily we had all the hot hotels, the Concord, the Raleigh, the Pines, and

Kutchers to name a few. At any of these spots on a given night you could find members of famous local families such as the Gilmours, the Lutmans, the Manzis, plus names such as Rolla, Gigante, Donofrio, DelGatto, Berkner, DeSantis, Brewer, and Glantz.

In Vernon, it was The Squat 'n Gobble. In Pompano, it was the Greenbrier, the same name as the local horseman's hangout at a Garden State Park. If you were racing at Liberty Bell, it was the Holiday Inn on Street Road.

I could go on and on but I am sure you understand by now that the trend to shipping in has totally changed the social dynamics of the game I have loved so much it gave me a life that would be hard to replicate in a different business.

David Marshall asks: What do you think about the new banked turns at the Meadowlands? Is there some way we can get Pocono to bank it's turn so we could have more competitive racing there?

This is far from a new concept. I have seen this at every track I raced at in some point in time. Yonkers to me was the first really radical change. There was almost a ten foot drop from the center of the track to the rail in the turns.

The good news is that it works, the bad news is that it doesn't seem to stay that way and slowly but surely over time between nature, the track conditioners and graders it levels out. But in the beginning it is fabulous.

It is simple physics. The saucer effect of the graded turn keeps the sulky in on the turn instead of being pulled out by centrifugal force. This makes it easier for a horse to maintain his speed while going two, three or four wide in the corner. It is important to note that the grade must be elevated enough to accommodate a four-wide move so it should encompass a large percent of the track in the turn before it levels out in the straightaway. It will be an improvement and hopefully be maintained properly. The percentage of the grade will ultimately determine the value of the endeavor.

As for Pocono, I hate to beat a dead horse, but they are very cost conscious when it comes to anything horse related. For sure, radically changing the track grade is a very expensive proposition. Their small handle as it is today doesn't suggest that the investment would show much of a return, although I

really believe that it would be a major improvement to their product. They are bottom line guys, so don't expect any radical changes in the near future.

You can't make a comparison between the grading effect at the Meadowlands to Pocono simply because of the popularity of the product and the wagering figures. If you improve the competitiveness at a track handling \$3 million a night by 25 per cent it's a big deal. If you do the same with a handle of \$300,000 what have you achieved? From a pure numbers point of view, not enough to merit that large of an investment.

A huge week of racing, on the trot we had the Champlain 2YOFT trot last night and the colts tonight and the Maple Leaf Trot Saturday at Mohawk, the Hudson Filly and The Yonkers Trot also Saturday, plus the Ohio finals for all gaits Sunday at Northfield as well as the continued KYSS at the Red Mile. On the pace, we have the Lady Maud and The Messenger at Yonkers Saturday and the Simcoe and the Canadian Pacing Derby at Mohawk the same evening. Will Steve Heimbecker show?

The superstitious part-owner of Courtly Choice said it will be a game-time decision whether he comes to Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday to see his champion try to win the Canadian Pacing Derby.

Grand Circuit action gets underway in earnest at Woodbine Mohawk Park this weekend with the finals of the Maple Leaf Trot and Canadian Pacing Derby and while Courtly Choice will definitely contend for the Pacing Derby title, co-owner Steve Heimbecker's attendance is more questionable.

"To be determined, can we say that? To be determined," said Heimbecker with a laugh. "You might see me in the stands and I might not be there."

Heimbecker joined the Courtly Choice ownership group at the beginning of the Art Major son's 3-year-old campaign in 2018, but the Conestogo, ON resident was not in attendance for the two biggest wins of the colt's \$922,158 sophomore season.

"I'm very superstitious so believe it or not the two biggest races that Courtly Choice won, the Meadowlands Pace and the Little Brown Jug, I didn't go. I know that sounds completely weird, but I'm so superstitious that I was literally on my way to the Jug and didn't have a good feeling and went back home," said Heimbecker, who shares ownership of the 4-year-old with trainer Blake MacIntosh of St. George, ON, Hutt Racing Stable of Malvern, PA, Daniel Plouffe of Bromont, QC and Touchstone Farms Inc. of Guelph, ON. "And as it turns out it's one of the most epic Jugs, probably top three, just the way Courtly did it — with his elimination break at the gate, the comeback to make the final and then to win the way he did — and I wasn't there for it, but I enjoyed it immensely, just on Canadian soil."

While the lifelong harness racing fan certainly enjoys winning races, he might derive more pleasure from interacting with his horses, calling it a form of therapy and a reflective place amidst the bustle that comes from life as an entrepreneur, husband and parent of three.

"I think definitely I'm known for just cruising into the barn and kicking the hay around and saying Hi to my horses,

sometimes when people are around and sometimes when they're not. I've been known to have conversations with them too, but those are all privileged," said the owner with a chuckle.

"I love the business. Being around horses of any kind is a real relaxant for me, it's therapy to be honest. If you're fortunate enough to hook onto a good one like Courtly it really just makes everything go perfect, right?"

Heimbecker was introduced to harness racing by his father Fred, who used to take his son to Elmira Raceway in the 1980s. Heimbecker has fond memories of the former half-mile oval and going to the barn to visit horses his father owned. As an adult he continued to go to the racetrack and around 2005 made his first investment as an owner.

"For me it was always a dream, and thankfully after a lot of hard work and success in the business world I was able to fulfill that dream and get involved in some horses. Originally it started with overnight horses," said Heimbecker, who runs a mortgage broker business and a private mortgage company. "In years after that I got more involved and interested in the yearlings, because the Sires Stakes program in Ontario was good — is still good — and I think it's just great to promote the homegrown."

In addition to Courtly Choice, Heimbecker currently owns 25 to 50 per cent of about 25 horses, primarily 2- and 3-year-old pacers, with trainers Blake MacIntosh, Casie Coleman, Tony Alagna and Pat Lachance. While his father has a passion for trotters, Heimbecker prefers pacing colts and says that current 2-year-olds Hushabye (Chapter Seven-Banbury Cross) and Hetalkstoangels (Archangel-J Marie) could be the last two diagonally-gaited horses he owns.

"I can tell you right now, I'm not buying any trotters this year at the sale. They just break your heart, they really do," he said ruefully. "I like the pacing colts. It's basically the furthest thing away from a trotter, right? And you know what, as a business owner and as an entrepreneur, let's face it the pacing colts go for more money."

While none of them will be trotters, Heimbecker does intend to acquire shares in additional yearlings at this fall's yearling sales. While his involvement was moderate, and at some points non-existent, while he and wife Joanna were raising small children, now that Calum, 13, Carys, 11 and Rori, 8, are a bit older Heimbecker is ready to increase his investment.

"My intent is to get in on every horse that Blake purchases, other than trotters, and the same would go for Casie," he said. "I think I'm going to try and ramp it up a little bit this year and get involved with a lot of horses and hopefully — they're good at what they do — we can pick a good one.

"There's a lot of big races I want to win and hopefully I've got the North America Cup winner in my barn for next year, but if not we'll go and pick the NAC winner for 2021 this year. I would love to win the North America Cup. Winning the Jug was a dream come true, but NAC is home soil, it would be a pretty special night."

If one of this year's 2-year-olds should make the North America Cup final next June, you might even find the superstitious Heimbecker and his family in the grandstand enjoying the moment.

Elsewhere in Ontario

In addition to the Grand Circuit stakes action at Woodbine Mohawk Park, it is a busy Labor Day weekend at Ontario racetracks.

Georgian Downs presents its final card of the 2019 season on Saturday, Aug. 31, with racing shifting back to Flamboro Downs on Tuesday, Sept. 3, and Clinton Raceway wraps up its season on Sunday, Sept. 1.

Clinton's season finale will be highlighted by the 39th annual Charity Drivers Challenge, which has contributed \$310,000 to a variety of community groups over the last four decades. This year's challenge will benefit the Royal Canadian Legion branches in Clinton, Seaforth, Brussels and Wingham.

The top four drivers from Clinton, Colin Kelly, Scott Wray,



Natasha Day and Ryan Holliday, will go head-to-head with four of the top reinsmen from Woodbine Mohawk Park, Sylvain Filion, Louis-Philippe Roy, Jonathan Drury and Jody Jamieson.

Jamieson has won the last two driver challenges at Clinton and said earlier this week that he will be looking to make it a hat trick on Sunday. Kelly makes his debut in the event this year and was not prepared to be quite as aggressive in his predictions.

"I'm just more excited to be part of it. It would be nice to hook a good bunch of horses and hope we have some luck with the draw, and then it all goes from there," said the reinsman, who moved to Ontario from Nova Scotia three years ago.

"I just hope everyone has a great time on Sunday. It's very nice that everyone comes together to give back to charity, and hopefully they get a great crowd and some good weather and everyone will have a blast I hope," added the diplomatic youngster.

The drivers challenge takes place in the first seven races on Sunday's card, which gets under way at 1:30 pm. The last four races feature the fourth Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots Leg for 2-year-old pacing colts. Programs for Sunday's event are available here https://clintonraceway.com/programs.

Important moments in Yonkers Trot and Messenger history

1956 — In the Messenger, filly Belle Acton kicked off the final leg of the Triple Crown for pacers with a win for Billy Haughton. Fifty-seven years later, son Tommy also won it with Ronny Bugatti.

1959 — Adios Butler won the Messenger before he embarked on his Horse Of The Year campaigns of (1960 and 61).

1986 — Amity Chef won the Messenger as second choice over 3-5 favorite Barberry Spur. John Campbell and Blair Burgess — a full 20 years before their Triple Crown triumph with Glidemaster — teamed up. H H Shadow, the spectacular filly for Jody Stafford, paid \$4.60 taking her elim and was second in the final.

1988 – The first time a single track – Yonkers – played host to three Triple Crown races in the same season (Roosevelt closed that year). Matts Scooter won the Messenger, Runnymede Lobell won the Cane Pace and Southern Newton won the Yonkers Trot.

1989 — An unusual year for the Triple Crown for pacers. Why? Because Dr. Ken Seeber won both the Cane and the Messenger with two different colts and neither was in the Jug (Sandman Hanover and Dancing Master). That was the year that Goalie Jeff dominated in the Jug after being second

in his Messenger elim and final.

1989 — Valley Victory dominated the Yonkers Trot in 1:59.3 paying \$2.40 in his elim, then a record 1:58.3 returning \$2.60, both times from post 2 for Bill O'Donnell and Steve Elliott in Valley Victory's last career race.

1991- was the year of Die Laughing winning the Messenger for 26-year-old Richie Silverman. Artsplace, in his only appearance in a Triple Crown event, was ninth. The time was 1:51.1- wire to wire for the winner in this 11-horse field.

2022 — Will be the year that harness racing celebrates its 500th Triple Crown event. After 2019, the Yonkers Trot will have been contested 65 times, the Cane Pace 65 times, the Messenger 64 times, the Jug 74 times, the Kentucky Futurity 123 times, the Hambletonian 94 times for a total of 485 Triple Crown events.

Notes

Trond Smedshammer won the Yonkers Trot twice, the two years it was not at Yonkers. He won it in 2004 at Hawthorne with Windsongs Legacy and in 2005 at Freehold with Strong Yankee.

Glidemaster holds the record for the most amount of money to race for in the combined three Triple Crown races: \$2,754,930. He won half of that — \$1,377,465. John Campbell drove him for the first two-the Hambletonian and the Kentucky Futurity and George Brennan was in the bike for the Yonkers Trot.

Glidemaster and Windsongs Legacy won the Triple Crown twice in a three-year span -2004, 2006. Before that was a 32-year gap back to Super Bowl in 1972.

Woodbine Mohawk Park stakes test the unbearable lightness of handicapping subjectively

Bettors Banquet's (BB) search for the best races to wager upon often comes into conflict with programs that offer many stakes races, mostly because they feature so many classy horses per field.

Stakes-laden racing programs are always challenges; they serve so much talent that making a personal odds line (POL) becomes confounding at best.

Even after I learned to write POLs and was saved from the density of losing money while "picking" winners, the challenge of wagering on races including the best horses in the sport upset my focus. I have since realized that such emotions are common, or should be, and that to feel otherwise is an ego defense, a subjective approach as deadly to a bettor's bankroll as tossing darts onto past-performance lines to decide win bets.

A handicapper never becomes self-actualized.

As I write this BB column, I brace myself, because such a program takes place on Saturday (Aug. 31) at Woodbine/Mohawk (or as I like to call it, simply, WoMo), and

it is an overture for more high-profile Grand Circuit events to come — soon.

As handicappers, we must attempt to be accurate, which is one of the toughest parts of the process. I have found that one simple rule is to delete all predispositions when it comes to races like the Maple Leaf Trot and Canadian Pacing Derby.

With horses as mighty as those involved, measuring their talents for a single event by using a POL can thwart accuracy. One or two percentage points (chances) taken from Jimmy Freight (in the "Derby") because you do not believe he shone last week and won't bounce, can prove silly in retrospect — even against Lather Up. Just as reducing Atlanta's chances (odds) because of a recent misstep followed by a loss and a bad post may cause a bettor nausea at the finish line.

As a professional bettor once told me, "It's tough work, but someone has to do it."

There is good news, though. It comes from the likes of those horses we could toss out confidently (explanation follows) in high-caliber stakes races, leaving the few prime contenders we find in the spotlight by process of elimination. Hopefully, dealing with the scant few allows for the public to help us decide which of the best of the rest we may (not "will") bet on—or, if we bet the race at all.

One of the most productive rules of strict money-management wagering (which we will cover in detail come future columns) is this: Never play any horse that you assign odds of over 6-1 in your POL.

This rule goes for races in the bottom barrel of claiming and conditionals to the star-powered, six- and seven-digit purse events. It is a safety feature that will allow you to pass races, but it derives from simple mathematic capabilities we use when calculating anything.

At 6-1, a horse has a 14 per cent chance to win. Assigning

chances lower than 14 per cent produces larger margins of error as the chances lessen. So, a handicapper is apt to be incorrect proportionately when measuring chances of horses to win from 13 per cent to zero.

I find no reason to be liberal when it comes to strong stakes fields and the 6-1 rule. My POL for the Canadian Pacing Derby (CPD), for instance, offers only two horses I may bet — if and only if one of them offers the odds I demand.

This Is The Plan	20-1
Done Well	20-1
Western Fame	9-1
Jimmy Freight	6-1
Lather Up	1-1
Courtly Choice	50-1
Filibuster Hanover	100-1
Casimir Richie P	100-1
McWicked	8-1

I re-wrote that POL five times to equal 100 and reflect as closely as possible my evaluation of the horses' chances. I became satisfied with four contenders — Lather Up, Jimmy Freight, McWicked and Western Fame. However, the 6-1 rule narrows my choices of win wagers to a pair — Lather Up and Jimmy Freight.

This is the point where all predispositions are banished. That is, I will never take another look at the racing program to search for reasons among the first four contenders in order to bet one and not the other three. First of all, I must immediately toss out McWicked and Western Fame based on the 6-1 rule. Then, I will never take another look at the

program to search for reasons to decide which of the remaining two become the win bet because the odds set by the public will determine which gets the bet, if any.

With that, the win wager possibility is then locked and loaded. I get my price or I pass the race.

My POL for the Maple Leaf Trot, by in contrast, has more win-wager possibilities (vis a vis the 6-1 rule).

Contenders in this field equal five, all meeting the 6-1 rule even though my opinion presents a more contentious race than the CPD. The closing odds from all other bettors guide my wager or my pass. This is how to win races worth winning and pass races unworthy of wagers. It resembles Nietzsche's eternal-recurrence theory but for handicappers. Current races are like all the races already raced that will recur ad infinitum. You will better understand that the more you write POLs.

Crystal Fashion aims for rare feat in Maple Leaf Trot

Two horses in history have won the Canadian Trotting Classic at age 3 and Maple Leaf Trot at age 4. Crystal Fashion will try to add his name to the list this weekend.

Crystal Fashion brings a three-race win streak to Saturday's \$600,000 Maple Leaf Trot at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The Jim Campbell-trained 4-year-old gelding won his Maple Leaf Trot elimination last week, following victories in the Cashman Memorial and Hambletonian Maturity.

He will start the Maple Leaf final from post two with David Miller at the lines. Crystal Fashion, who won last year's Canadian Trotting Classic as part of a \$1.08-million season, is the 3-1 second choice on the morning line behind 5-2 favorite Guardian Angel AS, who also was a Maple Leaf elimination winner.

With a win Crystal Fashion would join Market Share and Mr Muscleman as the only horses to win the Canadian Trotting Classic, which is for 3-year-olds, and Maple Leaf Trot in successive years. Market Share accomplished the feat in 2012-13; Mr Muscleman in 2003-04. Mr Muscleman added a second Maple Leaf title in 2005. Ima Lula is the only other horse to win both the Canadian Trotting Classic and Maple Leaf, in 1977, but she captured both at age 4, prior to the CTC being restricted to 3-year-olds.

"We've been very fortunate," Campbell said about Crystal Fashion. "He's come up big in some of the big races. He's always been the type of horse to give us a great effort every time we put him out there.

"He definitely is more versatile this year. You can race him any way you want, which is a huge advantage when you're racing at this level. Even as a 2- and 3-year-old, being first

over never bothered him, but he was always better chasing horses. This year, he can chase after them or he can go on the front end; he can do it from either way. It gives the driver options."

Crystal Fashion, owned by Fashion Farms, has won 18 of 38 career races and finished worse than third only six times. Only once has he been worse than fifth. In addition to his aforementioned victories, his triumphs last year included the Beal Memorial, Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship, and an elimination of the Hambletonian. He finished fourth in the Hambletonian final.

"The biggest change (from last year) is that he's grown and filled out a lot," Campbell said. "But his mannerisms are the same as they have been the last couple years. He's just a nice horse to be around. He's a real pleasure. He's just got a great personality. He's always got his head out (of his stall) and is looking for someone to come up and say hi to him."

Crystal Fashion is part of a talented field in the Maple Leaf. The 10-horse group includes three Trotter of the Year recipients — Atlanta and Marion Marauder in the U.S. and Speeding Spur in New Zealand — as well as divisional award-winners Emoticon Hanover in Canada and Manchego and Six Pack in the States.

Earlier this year, Atlanta trotted the fastest mile in Canadian history when she won the Armbro Flight Stakes in 1:50.2 at Mohawk. Guardian Angel AS became the fastest male trotter in a race on a half-mile track when he won the Cleveland Trotting Classic in 1:52 at Northfield Park.

"This has got to be one of the best races of the year," Campbell said. "I think it sets up for a good betting race. The way it looks, anything could happen. I'm sure there is going to be a lot of action in there.

"You could make a point for a lot of horses in there. There are a lot that have been on their game lately and a couple that are maybe starting to come back into form. For a trainer with a horse in there, it's a tough race; it's hard to say which way it'll go. But on the other hand, for somebody that loves watching horse racing, they're going to see a really good race."

Racing begins at 7:10 p.m. (EDT) Saturday at Mohawk. The Maple Leaf Trot is race five on the card, which also includes the C\$525,000 Canadian Pacing Derby for older pacers (race eight) and C\$171,503 Simcoe Stakes for 3-year-old pacers (race nine).

McWicked back to defend Canadian Pacing Derby title

McWicked, the richest pacing stallion in harness racing history with over \$4.5 million earned, returns to Woodbine Mohawk Park this Saturday (Aug. 31) to defend his title in the \$525,000 Canadian Pacing Derby.

Owned by Ed James' S S G Stables, McWicked sat atop the free-for-all pacing ranks last season with a campaign consisting of 12 wins from 19 starts and earnings of over \$1.6 million. The son of McArdle also won the Horse of the Year title in Canada and the U.S. —making him the oldest recipient of the honour in the U.S.

While McWicked won in his seasonal debut this year, he has since mostly only collected checks in his division's top events — losing thrice to Canadian Pacing Derby favourite Lather Up. However, trainer Casie Coleman has only seen improvement from her stable's star.

"He's always been a great horse, but I think the competition this year is the toughest it's ever been yet," Coleman said. "I think Lather Up is a complete freak and I am scared of him — I think on a smaller track I have a better chance to beat him if he doesn't pace the turns so well, but on a big track that horse is a beast. With Lather Up I realize that I need a lot of things to go my way and a lot of things to not go his way in order to beat him."

Ontario (

McWicked, who Coleman said is training as good as he has ever trained, faces a field composed mostly of 4-year-olds. He will rematch others who have beaten him this year, including This Is The Plan (PP1) and Jimmy Freight (PP4). McWicked starts from the outermost post in the field of nine with David Miller in the bike.

"I wanted to get sick when I saw the draw," Coleman said. "The nine hole in that field... he's got his work cut out for him. That's going to be a tough race. If he had an inside post, I'd feel a whole lot more confident, but the nine hole is going to be tough, especially since Wicked doesn't normally leave a whole lot. He'll definitely be giving it all he's got. It's just that in this class of horses, everybody can come home in :25-and-a-piece and :26. So we need to hope he's not spotted too far off coming down the lane.

"But saying that, the horse is in great shape. He's healthy, sound, feeling great, couldn't have trained any better this morning. Everything seems very, very good with the horse. I just really wish we could've drawn a little better but now we need a little bit of racing luck to work that way."

While McWicked faces a challenge Saturday night, the aged dynamo could have a chance to claim stakes glory as an 8-year-old.

"He's sound, healthy, sharp, you would never know the horse is eight-years-old," Coleman said. "As I've always said, if he was my horse, I would be taking one of these offers to go to stud because I just know how much money these horses make when they go to stud.

"But his owner is bound and determined; if (McWicked's) racing top level and he's healthy, he wants to keep racing. It's great for harness racing that a horse like him can stay on the track this long."

The Canadian Pacing Derby is carded as Race 8 on Saturday's \$1.6 million card at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The \$525,000 Maple Leaf Trot joins the 'Pacing Derby' as a co-main event. Post time is 7:10 p.m.



Uncle Peters Love tops strong Blooded Horse Sale at \$95,000

The Champions Center in Springfield, OH was abuzz with talk of Uncle Peters Love on Aug. 27 for the opening of the two-day Blooded Horse Summer Sale. The 2-year-old trotting filly was coming off her third win in the Ohio Sires Stakes, and the new owners could enter her the next morning in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Championship. Consigned by Spring Haven Farm for Erv Miller Stable, the classy bay daughter of Uncle Peter had already earned \$65,144 and just won a Sires Stakes leg last week from post nine at Scioto Downs. Bidding was spirited, but trainer Virgil Morgan, Jr prevailed for owners Carl T Howard and Joyce Ann McClelland at \$95,000. Uncle Peters Love drew post four and is the morning line co-favorite in the eight horse Championship on Sunday at Northfield Park.

Burke Racing Stable brought a nice consignment that included the very consistent open pacer Winwood Mac that was purchased by Adam Short of Ohio for \$38,000 and the 3-year-old conditioned claiming filly, Twinsburg, that sold to Nick Sodarao of NY for \$29,000. Another competitive conditioned claiming filly, Mary Goodnight, from the William DeLong consignment was purchased for \$35,000 by Mike Dimmers of Ontario.

Tuesday's black type yearling session was topped by the Always A Virgin filly Angels Touch at \$27,000. Burke Racing Stable purchased the beautiful dark Indiana bred from the Bold Bidder Farm consignment. Another Indiana-bred filly, Fear The Heat by Whom Shall I Fear, was purchased by Ira Steinberg of IL for \$21,000 from the Winterwood Farm consignment. Smooth Racer from the first crop of Racing Hill was purchased for \$20,000 by Kelly O'Donnell from Spring Haven Farm's consignment for Emerald Highlands Farm.

This was the strongest Blooded Horse Summer Sale in its 64-year history with a lot of satisfied sellers and optimistic buyers. "The racehorse market is on fire and that also drives demand for breeding stock and yearlings," said sale manager

Jerry Haws. "People love to come to a horse sale, and consignors were well rewarded for bringing their horses. We continue to be real pleased with the new location, too. The stalls are safe and bright; the facility is accommodating and easily accessible."

Baby colt pacers put on a PASS show at Philly

Driver David Miller swept the three divisions of the \$180,855 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) fourth and final preliminary round for 2-year-old pacing colts at Harrah's Philadelphia on Thursday afternoon. Now he will have to make a choice about whom to drive in the division's Championship at Philly on Sunday, Sept. 8 – especially since one of his winners is not assured of a spot in the Championship.

The fastest of the three winners was a maiden, the Somebeachsomewhere–Panera Hanover colt **Papi Rob Hanover**, who scored in 1:50.4 to miss the 2009 Philly divisional track record of Rock N Rock Heaven by a fifth while also tying the filly Sweet Ace for fastest freshman of the year on a 5/8-mile track.

Papi Rob Hanover had shown steady development to the point that he was bet down to 7-5 second choice behind 6-5 double Sire Stakes winner Cattlewash, and "Papi" fronted the chalk and the rest of the field through fractions of :26.4, :54.4, and 1:23.1. Through the :27.3 final quarter, Cattlewash stayed within two lengths but could not get closer as Papi Rob Hanover, second in a PASS in his last start, made the breakthrough for trainer Brett Pelling and owner David McDuffee.

Miller's other two PASS winners were middle-range longshots, including 9-1 proposition **Seeyou At Thebeach**, who lowered his mark to 1:51.2. Miller sent the son of Somebeachsomewhere–Persistent on a wicked brush down the back after fractions of :27 and :54.4 to go right past Adriano Hanover, the heavy favorite off wins in his three previous Sires prelims, just past the 1:22.4 three-quarters, then kept the colt digging to withstand Catch The Fire, a 1:50.4 Lexington winner who had been shuffled behind "Adriano," by 34 of a length.

Seeyou At Thebeach's only other win had been an Arden Downs division on Adios Day. Brian Brown trains the fast freshman for Country Club Acres Inc., Joe Sbrocco, Richard Lombardo, and Chris Page.

The other section had most of the field picking its way through two separate far turn traffic jams, with the Western Ideal–Southwind Playa colt **Manticore** proving the best at 8-1 in 1:53 for his third win in his last four starts.

The race was fiercely contested – Cheerio Hill insisted on the lead, putting favored Caliber in behind twice during fractions of :26.2 and :55.2, with Tell Them Lou, who had been parked, finally making his way to the lead at the latter call. Manticore came up grinding down the backstretch on Tell Them Lou, who hit the three-quarters in 1:23.1, and then there were two incidents: Cheerio Hill tired sharply in the pocket, hindering those who had stayed in, while Tell Them Lou bore out late on the turn, carrying Manticore wide. Manticore quickly righted, went to the lead, then held off closing Captain Barbossa by 1¼ lengths for trainer Bruce Saunders and the partnership of M&L Of Delaware LLC and M&M Harness Racing LLC.

The Bureau of Standardbred Racing within the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission is the official tallier of the points earned in the Sire Stakes and the Stallion Series, but a quick, <u>unofficial</u> calculation performed after the last PASS race Thursday revealed the following horses with the most points: 1. Adriano Hanover; 2.Cattlewash; 3. Caliber; 4. Catch The Fire; 5. Father Nuno; 6. Tell Them Lou; and 7. (tie) Manticore, Papi Rob Hanover, and Seeyou At Thebeach at 60 points each.

Only eight can compete in the Sire Stakes Championship, and the tiebreaker used is money won in the Sire Stakes. That tally showed Nanticoke and Papi Rob Hanover, each with a first and a second, tied at \$45,263, with Seeyou At Thebeach, with a first, third, and fourth, sitting at \$42,230. Again, the State Commission certifies the official final totals and eligibility; also, perhaps somebody above the tied three horses may not declare in.

Wiggle It Jiggleit third in qualifier, timed in 1:54.2

2015 Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit finished third in his second qualifier after almost three years away from the races Wednesday morning at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, timed in 1:54.2 after winning his first qualifier back in 1:53.4 at Philly eight days ago.

In the Philly race, Wiggle It Jiggleit rallied after sitting third-in for most of the mile. On Wednesday at Pocono, George Teague Jr., who handled "Wiggle" in a charted race for the first time since January of his 3-year-old year — son/regular driver Montrell was in action on the afternoon card at Philly — left with the 7-year-old, making the top after a :28.1 quarter, then going on to register splits of :57.3 and 1:25.2.

Wiggle It Jiggleit was still in command at headstretch, but through the lane he was passed by Geez Joe and Stormont Czar A in a 1:53.4 mile, winding up 2½ lengths back in third.

"I feel okay about him. We'll have to do some more work with him, get some more fitness in him," said George. "It'll be at least three or four weeks before he'll be ready to compete. We plan for a couple more qualifiers for him."

Before the qualifier, trainer Clyde Francis said he had been pleased by the horse's performance at Philly, and that the goal was to qualify him a couple more times, "to see if and where we should race him this year, and also to gauge whether we should stake him for next year."

Zero Tolerance, So Awesome win NYSS at Batavia Downs

Zero Tolerance (Heston Blue Chip—Feelinglikeastar) and So Awesome (So Surreal—Teddy Ballgirl), who are the top two 3-year-old pacing fillies in the Empire State, came to compete in the \$111,900 New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) at Batavia Downs on Wednesday afternoon (Aug. 28) and both added wins to their resumes.

Zero Tolerance (David Miller) got away third while Hurrikane Norakane (Carl Garofalo) shot to the front and eased the group to a mild :58.1 half. The pace picked up from there as they motored by the five-eighths pole when Sulky Queen (Jim Morrill Jr.) pulled with Zero Tolerance on her back.

Morrill got Sulky Queen to the front by the three-quarters while Zero Tolerance remained on the outside in second around the last turn. Heading into the stretch, Sulky Queen had a one-length lead but with the whip over his shoulder and the lines firmly in hand, Miller sat chilly while Zero Tolerance blew by to take the lead and won easily in 1:54.2.

"She was comfortable going to the half and when Jimmy (Morrill) came out, she was ready to roll," said Miller. "She finished strong down the lane; she was real good tonight."

It was the fifth NYSS win of the year and sixth win overall

for the heavily favored Zero Tolerance (\$2.10) who now has \$382,423 in earnings this year for owners Val D' Or Farms and Ted Gewertz and Hall of Fame trainer Joe Holloway.

In the first division, So Awesome (Tyler Buter) was a gate-to-wire winner and put in an impressive mile in the process. Buter guided So Awesome through early quarters of :28.1 and :58 with the field in single file behind her. As they approached the three-quarters Matt Kakaley pulled Fool Me Again from third and made an aggressive brush towards the front.

In the last turn, the fillies were pacing wither to wither until the top of the lane where So Awesome got a slight advantage. But Fool Me Again was not done and charged back in deep stretch under heavy urging from Kakaley. However So Awesome simply refused to lose and hung on by a neck in 1:55.1.

"We were lucky we won the draw in that race because Matt's horse was strong and coming down the lane we were right together," said Buter. "She raced real well and finished strong."

It was the third win in the last four starts for So Awesome (\$3.10) who is owned by William Hartt and trained by Scott Di Domenico.

Both fillies will be back at Batavia Downs on Saturday (Sept. 14) for the \$1.8 million NYSS Night of Champions.

Sister Sledge remains perfect, completes PASS sweep, sets stake mark

Sister Sledge did it all in Wednesday's \$180.502 Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) for freshman filly trotters at The Meadows. She extended her career unbeaten streak to six, completed a sweep of PASS preliminary legs and triumphed in a stake-record 1:54.1. In the other division of the Delmonica Hanover, as the stake is known, 11-1 Shishito rallied from well back to spring the upset.

Throughout her streak, no rival had been closer than a length to Sister Sledge at the finish. That was the case Wednesday as well, as she forged to the lead from the rail for Yannick Gingras and defeated the first-over Sorella by 2-1/2 lengths, with Aperfectcrystal third.

"She has a crazy amount of speed; she hasn't been tired yet," Gingras said. "Today I actually was hoping a couple would leave and we could race her from behind. But nobody left, so she took things in hand."

The time erased the stake record of 1:55 established by Can't I in 2016. The daughter of Father
Patrick—Behindclosedoors now has banked \$138,563 for trainer Ron Burke and owners Burke Racing Stable, Jason Melillo, J&T Silva-Purnell&Libby, and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. Sister Sledge figures to be the heavy favorite in the \$250,000 PASS championship, which is set for Sept. 8 at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Shishito was away sixth for Aaron Merriman and trailed by 7-1/2 lengths at the half before picking up live cover and beginning her advance. She edged Sans Defaut by a head in a career-best 1:55.1 while Sherry Lyns Lady earned show.

"She's been good every race so far," said Per Engblom, who conditions the daughter of Father Patrick-Yoga for Black Horse Racing and John Fielding. "I think she's a very nice filly. She's pretty much fully staked after this."

Engblom noted that Shishito is dually eligible in Pennsylvania and Kentucky and appears to have earned a berth in each state's sires stake championship.

Measuredperfection grabs back-to-back stakes wins at Hoosier

A competitive field of sophomore trotting fillies provided for an impressive stakes performance on Wednesday, (Aug. 28) at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino as the evening's program was highlighted by one \$91,000 division for the 3-year-old trotting fillies in round six of Indiana Sires Stakes Action. While the fight to the wire was a gritty one, it was **Measuredperfection**, driven by Trace Tetrick, who dug in for the win and with it, took home back-to-back Indiana Sires Stakes victories.

When the wings of the gate opened, Sam Widger pointed Kota's Swan to the lead from post six. Sophia Lia with John De Long grabbed the pocket seat while Measuredperfection landed along the rail in third. The field continued in straight alignment through opening fractions of :27.4 and :57 while Measuredperfection waited patiently to make her game-winning move.

Once the fillies reached the third quarter in 1:26, Measuredperfection was out applying pressure to Kota's Swan first-over while LeWayne Miller grabbed the cover and was second-over with Grand. When the field turned for home, Grand Swan looked poised to strike but made a costly break, seemingly leaving it to a determined Kota's Swan and a fast-charging Measuredperfection.

While Kota's Swan wasn't going to give up her lead without a fight, Measuredperfection dug in gamely late in the mile with a final quarter of :29 and crossed the wire just under a length ahead of the pack in 1:55:1. Utilizing a late charge, Summit City Swan and Brandon Bates powered home to get up for second while Kota's Swan held on for third. Measuredperfection paid \$3.20 to win for her backers at the betting windows.

"We got a really good position," driver Trace Tetrick said in the winner's circle. "She was first up past the half but she still dug in late. It helps that she's handy and does well no matter where she ends up. It doesn't matter to her — she'll race either way."

Measuredperfection is the daughter of Swan For All—Kalibrated and was bred by Concord Stud Farm LLC. The Ron Burke trainee has now won eight of 18 lifetime starts and boasts a bankroll of \$279,890 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Frank Baldachino, J&T Silva - Purnel & Libby and Weaver Bruscemi.

The 2-year-old pacing colt Captain Groovy saw his bid to win all four of his Pennsylvania Stallion Series preliminaries look good for much of the stretch at Harrah's Philadelphia on Wednesday – until he got a bit tired late and was caught by \$256 shock winner **Keystone Dash** in 1:53.4.

The Sweet Lou-Keystone Dawn colt Keystone Dash did dash away quickly at the start from post seven and had the lead well before the :27.1 opener for Andrew McCarthy. Captain Groovy, starting just to his outside, was patiently guided up to command in front of the stands, and his swift stepping past the middle poles of :56 and 1:25 seemed to have paid off as most of the competition had melted off by the far turn.

Most, but not all – Keystone Dash stayed connected in the pocket, eased out in the drive, and outpaced the Captain to the wire by a half-length, triggering the biggest win payoff at Philly since Thrillonthebeach paid \$264 for \$2 in September, 2017. Far back in his first three races but better in finishing second against "nw2" company in his last race, Keystone Dash continued the improvement with the big upset for trainer Åke Svanstedt and the ownership of Åke Svanstedt Inc.

In another of the three \$20,000 Stallion Series divisions, the Well Said—Bodacious Hanover colt **Lake Charles** took a lifetime best of 1:52, a clocking which matched the fastest posted by this group in either Sire Stakes or Stallion Series action to date. Jordan Stratton went to the lead with the victorious Ray Schnittker trainee by the :27.2 quarter, yielded to the brushing favorite Sandbetweenmytoes as that one took the field past a :56 half and 1:23.3 three-quarters, then moved out for the drive and went by a bit more easily than the ¾ of a length final margin may suggest. Lake Charles is undefeated in three Stallion Series starts for the ownership of Schnittker, Dr. John Egloff, Max J. Hempt, and Steven Arnold.

The other StS division saw another colt remain undefeated in the series, as the Somebeachsomewhere–Temptation Hanover baby **Patriot Nation** made it two straight since dropping down from the Sire Stakes, here lowering his mark to 1:53.4. Driver George Napolitano Jr. used his favored front-end tactics, and after fractions of :27.4, :57.1, and 1:25.3 the youngster had more than enough left, defeating Hunter Hill by 2¼ lengths by trainer Andrew Harris and the partnership of Michael Goldberg and A Harris Racing LLC.

The Bureau of Standardbred Racing within the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission is the official tallier of the points earned in the Sire Stakes and the Stallion Series, but a quick, <u>unofficial</u> calculation performed after the last StS race today revealed the following nine horses with the most points: 1. Captain Groovy; 2. Lake Charles; 3. Lyons Music; 4. (tie) Cheerio Hill and Patriot Nation; 6. Paddy All Day; 7. Complete Kaos; 8. (tie) Sandbetweenmytoes and Sombodyitreasure. All eight of the Stallion Series Championships will be held on Monday, Sept. 9 at Pocono.

Erv Miller trainees sweep stakes action at Hoosier

It was a good night at the office for trainer Erv Miller as he made a clean sweep of the stakes action at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing on Tuesday (Aug. 27) and had a total of three training wins on the evening's 10-race card. Two \$64,000 divisions of Indiana Sires Stakes for 2-year-old trotting fillies were featured on the evening's 10-race card as the fillies were squaring off in round four of the six round series.

Rock Swan was able to take advantage of a costly break by the post-time favorite to go gate to wire in the opening round of the stakes action to score in 1:56.1 The undefeated filly, May Baby, had her four race win streak snapped after she

made an uncharacteristic break behind the gate.

Driven by Trace Tetrick, Rock Swan left alertly from post three to grab the early lead through the opening panel in :29.1 while RJZ First Lady and John DeLong secured the coveted pocket seat. Rock Swan looked comfortable on the front and went uncontested through middle splits of :59 and 1:29.

As the field turned for home, May Baby had recovered and was up to engage the leader. RJZ First Lady also tipped from the pocket to take aim at the leader but Rock Swan was up to the challenge. Using a :27.1 closing panel, Rock Swan kicked away from the lead and kept her challengers at bay to get the win by a length. RJZ First Lady trotted evenly for second while May Baby rallied well late but was forced to settle for third. Sent off at odds of 5-2, Rock Swan returned \$7.20 at the betting windows.

"That's the best she's raced all year," Tetrick noted after the victory. "She was good on the front and when those other horses came to her, she trotted right on. She was strong all the way to the wire, she wanted to win tonight."

With the win, Rock Swan recorded her third straight victory and second straight Indiana Sires Stakes victory. The daughter of Swan For All-Jolly Jessica recorded her fifth win from six lifetime outings and established a new lifetime best in the process. Rock Swan also pushed her lifetime earnings over the \$100,000 mark for owners S&R Racing and Anthony Lombardi.

Trainer Miller would find the winner's circle in the very next race on the program and then went on to record his third consecutive victory on the evening's program in the second division of the stakes action after **Woodside Datendiva** and Ricky Macomber Jr. were able to avoid traffic issues and pull the 22-1 upset. In a race ruled by miscues, Woodside Datendiva stayed on task and trotted evenly to the wire to score in a new lifetime best of 1:56.3.

Trace Tetrick had the even money favorite, Collettes, pointed to the front and she dictated early fractions of :28.1 and :57.4. La Nancio and Jared Finn were the benefactors of a pocket trip while Woodside Datendiva was content to track from third. As the field approached the three-quarters in 1:27.2, Collettes was joined on the outside by I'd Rather Be Red and Brandon Bates.

Turning for home, Collettes made a costly break and took herself out of the race and as soon as I'd Rather Be Red inherited the lead, she also went off-stride. Macomber Jr. kept Woodside Datendiva on task and avoided the breakers to reach the wire in front. Bluebird Ladyluck and Dan Shetler

also avoided the traffic issues to finish second while La Nancio rounded out the trifecta. As the second longest shot on the board, Woodside Datendiva returned \$46.80 for the victory.

"Sometimes it pays to be lucky," trainer Ricky Macomber Jr. noted after the victory. "This filly raced really well tonight but we got lucky and didn't have any issues with all the breakers. She's a very nice filly to drive."

With the win, Woodside Datendiva recorded her third win of the season from eight trips behind the gate. Owned in partnership by Ervin Miller Stable Inc. and Robert McCormick, the daughter of Guccio-Cantab's Choice pushed her lifetime bankroll to \$49,832.
