Tall Dark Stranger makes history in winning the 37th Pepsi North America Cup

The Ontario-sired pacer is believed to be the first colt to win the Metro, Breeders Crown, Meadowlands Pace and North America Cup. He also gave trainer Nancy Takter back-to-back Cup wins and delivered the first for driver Yannick Gingras.

Tall Dark Stranger looked like a million dollars in taking the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup, Saturday night (Aug. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

It was a COVID-19 kiss for winning driver Yannick Gingras from Tall Dark Stranger's part-owner Marvin Katz and his wife Lynne Katz while Woodbine CEO Jim Lawson looked on.


Trained by Nancy Takter, Tall Dark Stranger and Yannick Gingras were content to let Tattoo Artist make his mark on the lead, as the latter powered from post seven to strike the front early in the proceedings.

With Bob McClure in the bike, Tattoo Artist took his nine rivals through an opening mile carved out in a snappy :25.4, with Tall Dark Stranger settling in second. Longshots Moneyman Hill, in third, and Mayhem Hanover, sitting fourth, watch the pacesetting duo set the tone early.

Soon after the quarter-mile mark, Gingras, contesting his ninth Cup, powered his 3-5 favorite to the outside and to the lead, as they cut a half in :53.3.

The \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup was the fourth major stakes win – and most lucrative – for Tall Dark Stranger, who is believed to be the only horse to win the Metro and Breeders Crown at 2 and the Meadowlands Pace and NA Cup at 3.

It was Tall Dark Stranger still calling the shots as the field geared up for the stretch drive. McClure pulled Tattoo Artist to the outside looking to track down the frontrunner. For a brief moment, it appeared as though they were cutting into the lead of Tall Dark Stranger, but he pulled away down the lane for another impressive score.

Tattoo Artist was second, while 127-1 Moneyman Hill

finished third. Odds on Osiris, leaving from post 10, rallied to take fourth.

There was plenty of emotion in the aftermath of the victory, including a teary-eyed Gingras, and an elated Marvin Katz, who co-owns Tall Dark Stranger with Crawford Farms Racing, Caviart Farms and Howard Taylor.

Bred by James Avritt, Sr. of Lebanon, KY, Tall Dark Stranger was sold for \$330,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

It was the second straight Cup title for Takter, who won last year with Captain Crunch.

And it was also a historic triumph.

"I'm overjoyed, I really am," said Katz. "I've been doing this for a very long time and I've been fortunate to have many great horses, but I think this guy really rates up with some of the greatest horses we've ever seen. This is historic. What he's done tonight has never been done before. He won the Metro as a 2-year-old, he won the Breeders Crown – he's come back to win the Meadowlands Pace and he's won the North America Cup. Somebeachsomewhere, Captaintreacherous... they couldn't do it, but he's done it."

The enormity of the accomplishment wasn't lost on New Jersey-based Takter, who wasn't able to watch the race in-person due to COVID-19 border restrictions.

"This is an extra-special colt in extraordinary circumstances," she told Woodbine Mohawk Park. "I'm so proud of the horse and my team."

Gingras had ample praise for the competitive spirit shown by the sophomore superstar.

"I rolled him to three-quarters pretty hard but he just never quits. He's just a tremendous horse – the best pacing colt I've ever driven, there's no doubt in my mind. He's just an amazing animal. I feel awesome, there's no doubt about it. This means so much. I couldn't be any happier right now."

Toronto-based Lynne and Marvin Katz represented Tall Dark Stranger's ownership group at Woodbine Mohawk Park. They share ownership of the Bettor's Delight-Precocious Beauty colt with Crawford Farms Racing, Buck and Judy Chaffee's Caviart Farms and Howard Taylor.



"I think he's just stronger than they are right now, and he can get them tired just by them trying to keep up with him," said Gingras.

Tall Dark Stranger paid \$3.20, \$2.40 and \$2.40, combining with Tattoo Artist (\$4.30, \$3.50) for a \$16.20 exactor. Moneyman Hill (\$20.70) completed a \$2 triactor worth \$476.40. Odds On Osiris rounded out a \$1 superfecta worth \$2,596.30.

Saturday evening's Pepsi North America Cup card established a new Pepsi North America Cup handle record of \$5,619,402. The handle was headlined by \$1.1 million in new money wagered on the Jackpot Hi-5 mandatory payout in Race 13.

The party continues for Party Girl Hill in \$400,000 Fan Hanover

Party Girl Hill remained unbeaten with another sterling effort, this time in the \$400,000 Fan Hanover final (presented by SBOA) on Saturday night (Aug. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

It was Lady Lou who took command early, with the daughter of Sweet Lou taking her rivals through an opening quarter in :26.3. Karma Seelster settled in second with Party Girl Hill and Lauras Love sitting third and fourth, respectively.

Just ahead of the half-mile mark, Doug McNair called on Party Girl to seize advantage and the duo did so with ease, reaching the half in :54.4.

Party Girl Hill and Lady Lou were still one-two after three-quarters, as a confident McNair kept the daughter of Captaintreacherous—Look Cheap to task.

Peaky Sneaky, second choice on the tote board, continued her outside bid as the field straightened for home, but it was to no avail, as Party Girl Hill strode to the wire a sharp 2 34-length winner. Sweet Lou nosed out Peaky Sneaky for the runner-up spot, while Karma Seelster was fourth.

Party Girl stopped the teletimer in 1:49.2 for breeder/owner Tom Hill and trainer Chantal Mitchell who was handling the filly for pacer's regular trainer Chris Ryder. She paid \$3.70 for the win.


"I just kind of rolled her along a little more this week," said McNair. "She can just carry her speed so far. Obviously, you can tell tonight... she paced right through to the wire. I was really happy with her."

It was the eighth win in as many starts for the bay filly who was unraced as a 2-year-old.

The 4-year-old Sweet Lou—Great Memories mare rejected an opportunity to tuck in the pocket entering the first turn and drove on, hitting the quarter in :26.3. She was never headed again, as Yannick Gingras managed fractions of :54.3 and 1:22.2 before kicking away to a two-length 1:49.3 win. Trillions Hanover, who sat second most of the way, mounted a valiant late charge, but ultimately fell short. So Much More grinded out a nightmare first-over trip to take a deserving third, and Soho Burning Love A emerged from a throng of horses for fourth.





Gingras said his mare was on a mission.

"It was more her game plan," he said. "She was on 'go' tonight. She was a little bit anxious in the post parade and going to the gate too, and when she was like that I wasn't going to fight with her — I let her do her thing. But once she got to the front, at least she was able to relax a little bit; she wasn't a runaway or anything like that. I got a decent middle half, and she finished it off."

The millionaire Ron Burke trainee took her second victory of the season from six starts and 21st win lifetime on 36 outings; she increased her earnings to \$1,765,060 with the \$145,000 Roses Are Red payday. Burke Racing Stable LLC, Phillip Collura, Jandt Silva Purnel & Libb, and Weaver Bruschemi LLC own the Pennsylvania-sired mare that had previously been off to a slow beginning to 2020.

Warrawee Ubeaut was bred by Warrawee Farm of

Rockwood, ON and sold for \$70,000 at the 2017 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Gingras applauded his charge's improvement throughout the year and expressed his belief in further improvement.

"She deserves to be winning, and there's no doubt in my mind horses know when they win and when they don't," he said. "So yes, it was a little bit like that, it's a tough jump from 3 to 4 and there's some great mares this year, so it was a little tough for her at the beginning. But she's a big, strong horse, and I think until the end of the year she's going to keep getting stronger, and next year as well."

Warrawee Ubeaut was favoured for the duration of wagering and paid \$5.90 to win.

The 5-year-old daughter of Donato Hanover—Nevis Bi capitalized on an early break by the favored Atlanta and a mild tempo set by second-choice Plunge Blue Chip, who was backing off the pace after a :27.3 opening panel. Hey Livvy blazed to the top near the half in :55.2, and then took her own breather to the tune of 1:23.3 to the three-quarters. The mare then opened up at the behest of driver Trevor Henry, turned away late attacks from Felicityshagwell S, who finished second, and Plunge Blue Chip, who finished third, and brought home victory by two lengths in 1:51.2. A late-rushing Superlative picked up the fourth-place cheque.

"I had no idea that [Atlanta] had run," Henry said. "It might've changed things, but I didn't know she had run."

Jeff Gillis trained Hey Livvy to her sixth victory of the year and 18th lifetime. With her first stakes score, the Pennsylvania-sired, Kentucky-bred mare will add \$110,000 to her previous total of \$246,343 for owners Blue Chip Bloodstock, Ellen Ott, and Trevor Henry.

Henry said he was delighted to own the mare.

"I got part of this horse given to me because I got along with her; she was so hard at the start — and she still is hard

to drive," Henry said, laughing. "But she still is a fast mare and you appreciate it when she wins."

Ten facts about an utterly unique North America Cup card

by Bob Heyden

Here are some facts about the North America Cup card, many of which are unique to 2020:

- 1. Of the 118 horses scheduled to race on the entire card, 118 were scheduled to be driven by a driver born in Canada. Contrast that with 2020 Hambletonian Day, when 151 horses were listed to go 108 driven by a someone born in the USA, 34 by Canadians, seven by Swedes, and one each born in New Zealand and Australia.
- 2. Yannick Gingras is the only driver on the NA Cup card who also drove on the Hambletonian Card. He had 12 drives on Hambletonian Day with two morning line favorites and three second choices. On NA Cup night, he had 12 drives listed with three morning line favorites and three second choices.
- 3. All three members of the active \$200 million driving club are USA born and none were at Woodbine Mohawk Park David Miller ,Tim Tetrick and Brian Sears.
- 4. On Hambletonian Day, Tim Tetrick drove 14 horses, Andrew McCarthy drove 15, Dexter Dunn drove 16 and 27 were sired by Muscle Hill. All watched from the sidelines on NA Cup night.
- 5. Cam Card Shark passed away this year. He was the oldest living HOY at age 29. He won the NA Cup in 1994 and was the first horse to complete the Meadowlands Pace-NA Cup daily double with the same driver John Campbell. In 1991, Campbell and Jack Moiseyev shared the double with Precious Bunny, and again in 1993 it happened with Jack Moiseyev and Ron Waples Ronny subbing for an ailing Jack (bad



back) in the NA Cup with Presidential Ball.

- 6. Cams Card Shark sired the most represented sire on the entire 2020 NA Cup card Bettors Delight, the 2001 NA Cup winner now 22 years of age. Included in there is Tall Dark Stranger among 18 Bettors Delights on the card. Captaintreacherous is next at 12 offspring on the NA Cup card.
- 7. Those were the days. In 2020, there was no New Jersey or New York breds in the NA Cup final. Long gone are the days of New Jersey stallion Cam Fella's Precious Bunny (1991 NA Cup winner), 1992 NA Cup fave Carlsbad Cam, 1993 and 1994 winners Presidential Ball and Cams Card Shark winning both the Pace and NA CUP.
- 8. Fifty-six of 118 entrants on the card were driven on NA Cup night by a driver who did not drive him or her the week prior.
- 9. Fifty-seven of 110 pacers on the card were sired by a stallion who himself won the NA Cup.
- 10. It's been 12 years since the NA Cup winner was also voted Horse of the Year. In 2008, Somebeachsomewhere earned that honor. His lone starter in the 2020 NA Cup was longshot Moneyman Hill.







A conversation with George Segal of Brittany Farms

Integrity, loyalty, wise, fair, generous, brilliant, thankful, liberal, in all senses of the word.

Those are just a few of the words I might use to describe my friend George Segal.

He was born and raised in New York City and recalls periodically going to Roosevelt and Yonkers, but those visits really didn't contribute to the strong place harness racing was to have in his life.

After graduating from Baruch College at CCNY in New York City, he attended the Business School at the University of Michigan.

After Michigan, he found himself in the meat business and residing in Framingham, MA. He recalls reading an article in the *Sunday New York Times* about the Mercantile Exchange in Chicago. At the bottom of the story there was a phone number. The next day he called the number and expressed his interest in learning the business.


He was granted an interview for that Wednesday. That same day he was offered a job as an analyst at twice the salary he was making.

After a quick discussion with his wife Joan, he accepted the offer. They moved to Chicago.

Two things he remembers being told from the interview: 1. You will never find a more interesting business (that was before becoming involved in the horse business, of course) and 2. There is no limit to the amount of money that can be made.

George began working on the floor of the Mercantile Exchange in Chicago. Two of his friends and associates on the floor, Don Stevens and Brian Monieson, were doing the same, but they were also moonlighting in harness racing.

Don was working in the publicity department at

Brittany Farms' owner George Segal.

Sportsman's Park.

Brian published a tout sheet that was sold at the Chicago racetracks Sportsman's Park, Washington Park and Maywood Park.

Don convinced George that Harness racing, in addition to being a great sport was a lot of fun. He told George that he had the perfect trainer for him. His name was Gene Riegle.

Thus began a lifetime association. The first yearling that Gene purchased for George was a Bret Hanover colt named Quick Glancer. He wasn't a star, but he paid his way. George recalls him winning a stakes race at Greenville OH, Gene's hometown.

It wasn't until a few years later, 1980 to be exact, at the first Kentucky Standardbred Horse Sale, that George purchased the horse that changed his status from some involvement in the business, to being in it big time. Her name was Three Diamonds. He bought her for \$100,000.

Those who saw her race would undoubtedly agree that if she wasn't the very best of her generation, she was darn close.

If as I did, you watched her, you would undoubtedly think that she ranks among the greatest race fillies to ever look through a bridle.

As great as she was on the track — and she was awesome — her legacy as a broodmare is even greater. Life Sign, Bettor's Wish, American Ideal and American Jewel are just four of the great champions that descend directly from her. As great as her legacy is, it would likely be far greater if she had not passed at a young age.

Riegle selected her and just about every great champion that George was involved with throughout Riegle's association with him.

From that point on, George Segal was on his way to becoming the most influential breeder of his generation, certainly on a pro rata basis and in any conversation as the greatest breeder in the sport's history.

What about that?

"I'll leave it up to others to assess the achievements of Brittany Farms," George said.

Speaking of Gene Riegle, George says, "He was the greatest yearling selector that I and probably anybody else has ever known. Most trainers have a prototype of the kind of yearling they like, Gene was different. He'd pick the ones that he liked with an assortment of traits. There was no predicting which ones he'd pick and he didn't need to look at one for long. But he was right a whole lot more than he was wrong.

"I remember in 1988 when the first crop of Nihilators came out. We went to Lexington with the intent of buying at least one and maybe more of them. Gene looked at every single one and wouldn't pass on any. Instead he liked a Troublemaker colt out of Cartier in the Dunroven Farm consignment. That horse was Odds Against who even though he was in the same crop of Artsplace, Precious Bunny and Die Laughing ended up making \$1,403,938 for us.

"In 1990, as was our custom we went to Hanover to get a sneak preview of their yearlings prior to the Lexington sales. As was always the case, the Hanover yearlings had just come in from the fields and were in the process of becoming civilized. Nevertheless, Gene said he didn't need them spruced up and looking good. He could look through the lack of shine and civility. When we left the Farms, Gene said to me, 'I don't care what you buy or how much you spend at Lexington, but be sure to keep enough money to buy that little No Nukes colt at Hanover.' I said to him, "Isn't he too

small and what about that capped hock that he has?' 'Don't worry about that. He'll be alright. Just buy him.' That colt was Western Hanover."

There are some who would say that you are the greatest breeder of your generation, certainly on a pro rata basis and you certainly should be among the greatest ever. Let's talk about some of the horses that you've bred and raised.

"Before we do that I think we should speak about the real genesis of Brittany Farms. The breeding operation all began through the purchase of Bill Shehan's Clermont Farm and his broodmare band of 35 mares. Prior to that, I had hired Art Zubrod and his wife Leah in 1981 to be my farm managers. We had leased some space at the famous thoroughbred farm Hamburg Place owned by Preston Madden. The piece we leased with Art and Leah residing in a mobile home was called Clear Creek. In 1985, we made the Shehan purchase. Prior to that, almost all of my mares were pacers. Bill's mares consisted of 25 trotters and 10 pacers."

Artsplace - "His dam Miss Elvira showed a lot of speed as a 2-year-old. She won her first two races effortlessly and then unfortunately bowed a tendon. I owned her with my good friend Brian Monieson. Her first foal wasn't the best individual and became an overnight racehorse. Her next foal was Artsplace who was really good looking, but wasn't a perfect specimen. Most importantly, he passed the Gene Riegle acceptance test. Throughout his first winter, he trained fair at best. He never showed any sparks of potential greatness. In late Spring I remember receiving a call from Alan Riegle, Gene's son, saying, 'You know what George? That Abercrombie colt might be alright.' The rest is history. His performance in the Breeders Crown setting a world record at

Pompano would have to rank, to anybody who saw it, as one of the greatest performances ever. He was very good, but not great at 3. We brought him back at 4 and gave him to Bob McIntosh. He went through the year undefeated and was voted Horse of the Year. As a sire, he has been nothing short of fantastic."

Life Sign - "Here was a horse that had it all. He was impeccably bred, being by Abercrombie, out of the great Three Diamonds, a great individual, an amazing racehorse at both two and three. His victory in the Little Brown Jug was a race for the ages. Yet, although, not a failure as a sire, given all his credentials, one might classify him as disappointing. Such are the vagaries involved in breeding horses."

Father Patrick - "We bought his dam Gala Dream for \$100,000. She exhibited very little ability and a poor attitude in training. But she had pedigree. Everything else is a plus, but pedigree is a necessity to me. She had a few foals before Father Patrick, Pastor Stephen, being the best. Jimmy Takter bought Father Patrick for \$100,000 as a yearling. I thought that he might bring more, perhaps a whole lot more. I and Marvin Katz asked Jimmy if we could get in as partners. We ended up buying 20 per cent each. Jimmy divided the remaining 601 per cent between himself and some of his owners. It's still early in the game, but it appears at this time he might be a great stallion — possibly a game changer."

Self Possessed - "He, as do many of our horses, traces to the group of mares that I first bought from Bill Shehan. He was by Victory Dream, a horse who in my opinion would have become a great sire if not for fertility problems. Ronnie Gurfein trained Victory Dream and was, naturally enough, interested in buying at least one from his first crop. He fell in love with Self Possessed the first time he saw him. He bought him for a group that included David Scharf, Deena Frost and one or two of his other clients. I asked if I could get in for part of him and Ronnie acquiesced. He was the first Hambletonian winner that we bred. When he was at his best, he was just tremendous. As a sire, he started off well, but there was no great consistency to his success. As a sire, one



would classify him as being disappointing, but he sired one horse who was destined for greatness both on the racetrack and in the breeding shed. That horse is of course Cantab Hall who at an advanced age is still producing top trotters including the aforementioned Father Patrick."

We could go on forever in mentioning the horses that Brittany Farms and George Segal played a part in producing. They include, but are not limited to: Western Ideal, American Ideal, Artiscape, Art Major, He's Watching, Mr Muscleman, Bettors Wish, Glidemaster, Six Pack, Continentalvictory, Manchego, Lifetime Pursuit, Lookout Victory, Marita's Victory, Artspeak, Vintage Master, American Jewel, Mr Feelgood, Reflect With Me, Sportsmaster, plus two very exciting 2-year-oldsthis year in Perfect Sting and Making Waves. They include three Hambletonian winners, five Hambletonian Oaks winners and multiple winners of just about every major stakes race in North America.

George, there are also many top horses that you didn't breed yourself, but either bought as a yearling, while they were racing or at the conclusion of their racing career. They include:

Captaintreacherous - "This is another horse that had it all and did it all. I give all credit for him to Tony Alagna who trained him and Myron Bell who was determined to buy him. All of the members of my buying team (which we will get to later) agreed that he was 'the one.' He indeed was on the racetrack and is now making a huge impact in the breeding shed. If he isn't the greatest living pacing stallion, I don't know who you would put up against him."

Valley Victory - "Although I didn't breed or own him as a racehorse, he is the only trotter to this point, that I've owned that I would describe as a breed changer. All credit for his acquisition belongs to others — from Bill Weaver who bred him, to Pat Waldo who picked him out as a yearling for his owner Arlene Traub, to Steve Elliott who trained him, Bill O'Donnell who drove him and most importantly as it relates to me to Tony Pedone who convinced me that he was a great horse who was destined to become a great sire. Apparently, a tentative deal had been made to sell him to European interests. Tony, with his unique power of persuasion, managed to convince Arlene Traub to change her mind and sell him to us. As great a changer of the breed as Valley Victory was, there is no telling how great an influence he would have been if he had good fertility."

Cantab Hall - "He was in Self Possessed's first crop. Ronnie Gurfein, Myron Bell and myself went to Walnut Hall Limited to look at their yearlings. Alan Leavitt had two sensational trotting colts that year. They were Cantab Hall and Cash Hall. They were both as perfect as yearlings could be. I knew that

they would each bring a lot of money. I limited Ronnie to buying just one. It was a tough decision but ultimately Ronnie thought that Cantab trotted a little better in the field. Cash Hall turned out to be a world champion as well, but Cantab was the one. He swept just about everything as a 2-year-old and became one of the few 2-year-olds ever to be voted as Trotter of the Year. He is now generally acknowledged as being one of the world's greatest trotting sires."

Western Hanover - "We spoke about him above and how I came to buy him. He was a very good, but in my opinion not a great racehorse. Although he was voted both 2- and 3-year-old pacing colt of the year. I remember meeting you and Paul E Spears at the Union Square Cafe in NYC at lunch where we consummated the deal to have him stand at Hanover. All of us would be lying if we said that we expected him to become the great sire for the ages that he became. We put together a syndicate and offered shares in him to

every prominent breeder in North America. Only Allamerican Standardbreds bought a single share. None of the others were interested in buying a share or even breeding to him. He came to his success mostly by being bred to mom and pop mares. Certainly, Hanover bred many mares to him and I bred some. Within a very short time, he became recognized as one of the greatest pacing sires ever in harness racing history."

Walner - "He was as talented a colt as I've ever seen. Unfortunately, his racing career was negated by a soft tissue injury which prevented him from going on. When my good friend Frankie Antonacci was putting a deal together to stand him, I was all in. His oldest foals are yearlings. From all that I've heard, they are sensational. We shall see."

George, you use the term "team" a lot. You are known as a person who gives credit to others and has no reluctance to hear other people's points of view. Can you speak on that?

"I've never believed that I have all the answers. There are various people who excel in various areas in this life of ours.

"There are numerous people who have contributed to any success that I've been fortunate enough to have. These include, but are not necessarily limited to, Art and Leah Zubrod, Myron Bell, the Riegle family, Bob McIntosh, Ronnie Gurfein, Jimmy Takter, Tony Alagna, Linda Toscano, Blair Burgess, Trevor Richie, Perry Soderberg, Bill Shehan, Joe Holloway, Brian Monieson, Don Stevens and undoubtedly some that I've neglected to include.

"For all that I know, I don't stand at or near the top in anything. But I am always willing to listen. In terms of teams, I have three main ones with regard to my career in harness racing.

"My yearling selectors - These consist of, but are not necessarily limited to Tony Alagna, Myron Bell, Trevor Richie, Perry Soderberg, Art Zubrod and the various trainers that I use or for whom I anticipate giving the horses. I then rely on myself to make the final decision and the price point to which we will go. When Gene was alive he would cut the list to those who were physically acceptable. Today, it's a somewhat more involved process.

"The racehorse division - Here it's mostly Myron and myself, with, of course, input from the trainers in whose stables these horses are entrusted.

"The breeding end - Here its mostly myself with significant input from Art and Myron. If I have partners on the mares, of course their input is considered."

What are your views on the business in general?

"It's constantly evolving. Just a few decades ago, most felt that we had bred ourselves into a box with Speedy Crown and Super Bowl. Then along came Valley Victory to changes things. Through him came Muscles Yankee and the super sire Muscle Hill. Today we have more variance with trotters that I've seen in all my years in the sport. Chapter Seven came along. Now, because of him, we have Walner. Tactical Landing is another trotter of great promise. We are to a limited degree doing what the Europeans have been doing for a long time. We are breeding American mares to the best French stallions such as Ready Cash, Love You and Coktail Jet and now from out of the woods comes Googoo Gaagaa. We probably now have more diversity and choice among trotters than we do with pacers. The breed somehow always seems to find a way to take care of itself.

"I am concerned with the long life expectancies of our sport in places like New Jersey, Pennsylvania and New York. My gut tells me for the immediate future we are well situated in Ohio, Indiana, Ontario and now Kentucky where together with the Antonaccis and Joe Thomson, we own The Red Mile. It's important not only to the history of the sport, but it remains the very best piece of dirt upon which to educate and bring along a young horse.

"Like just about most everyone else I'm concerned about all the infighting and lack of cooperation prevalent in the sport."

What's the best decision you've ever made in the sport?

"Without a doubt it was the decision to purchase Bill Shehan's Clermont farm and all his broodmares. That became Brittany Farms and led to most of the success we've enjoyed in both the breeding arena and on the racetrack. Coming second was the decision to rescue The Red Mile together with my two wonderful partners, the Antonacci family and Joe Thomson. It was a purchase that as of now has not yielded a financial profit. But it is one that allowed perhaps the greatest racing tradition in North America to continue and flourish."

What's the worst one?

"Allowing Mr Muscleman sell for the absurd price of \$2,000. That comes with an asterisk though. He was sold shortly following 9/11 and very few people were in a frame of mind to purchase horses."

What does the future hold for George Segal?

"In terms of the short term, I just passed my 82nd birthday. I'm in good health and I hope to keep it that way. I won't be going to any sales this year. I will desperately miss not being at Lexington. I expect to be there next year, when hopefully we have COVID-19 contained.

"I expect to keep racing and keep breeding although on a far smaller scale. Brittany Farms once had 150 mares. Now we are down to 30 that are wholly owned, plus several that are owned in partnership.

"In terms of the future beyond myself, none of my family have any interest in horses. Once I'm gone there won't be an entity called Brittany Farms, at least not one involving any of my family."

Relative newcomer Eli Schwartz relishing the success of his trainee Somebodyslilly

The homebred sophomore pacing filly is perfect in her last four starts at Harrah's Hoosier Park, including a 1:50 lifetime best score.

Eli Schwartz is known for his work with many equine breeds, but lately his racehorse, **Somebodyslilly**, has generated plenty of attention in the Hoosier State. The 45-year-old is breeder, owner and trainer of the 3-year-old pacing filly, a recent Indiana Sires Stakes winner at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Schwartz is relatively new to harness racing, a sideline that he is enjoying tremendously with his streaking sophomore.

"I started training horses and I got an outlaw about five years ago. Her name was Baby Jo-Jo. Nobody could train her," said the conditioner. "I got hooked; I really enjoyed it."

Baby Jo-Jo did not accumulate hefty earnings or rack up multiple wins for her owner, but that did not matter. Schwartz, a northern Indiana native that has spent time around horses since the age of five, liked the experience



training and racing the Palone Ranger filly, twice a runner-up in 13 starts. Now living just across the state line in White Pigeon, MI, he purchased the Artiscape mare Somebody's Artist and bred her to Indiana stallion Time To Roll. Prior to Somebodyslilly's arrival in 2017, the mare had produced three previous foals, all starters. So Shanelle, a Panspacificflight filly, took a sophomore mark of 1:52.4 while earning \$30,230 during her career.

Somebody's Artist never produced another foal; however, Somebodyslilly has become the late mare's greatest success. Early in her development, Schwartz could have been discouraged in the progress of his pupil, but she provided glimpses of what would come.

"If you would have watched her jog coming as a 2-year-old she looked at the ground and jogged like 12 miles an hour and that's as fast as we could go," he said, laughing. "So, it didn't look very promising at the start. But as other people

tried to go around her jogging, she never let anybody around her. Even at home, she won't let them. She really does have a lot of heart. I saw that as a two year old. She started coming along real good. She digs in and hates to lose. She's very competitive."

In his day job, Schwartz is a body worker, spending his time performing massage therapy and equine dentistry on horses of all varieties. His focus is on balancing out a horse using a holistic approach. While his experience spans a many breeds, he considers standardbreds his specialty.

"It's always something that calms my soul," he said of the work, which has taken him across the United States.

In her limited racing experiences, Somebodyslilly has blossomed into a top-caliber sophomore in short order. At two, she made 10 starts with two trips to the winner's circle in overnight events and a pair of runner-up performances in Indiana Sires Stakes action. The filly missed a check twice with Aaron Stutzman listed as trainer, and her consistency nearly earned a spot in last fall's Super Final. Her 1:52.1 2-year-old mark was taken in mid-October.

"I don't really believe in racing 2 year olds hard. I like good 3 year olds, and I like them to mature," Schwartz said. "We just about made it to the finals last year, which was a big surprise for me. That was amazing to me, just to watch where she was and how she started developing. It's been a lot of fun."

The 2020 campaign began with a seventh-place finish in her debut before pacing third in the second leg of Indiana Sires Stakes action, held July 17. In that event, Somebodyslilly kicked home in :25.3 to close from seventh to hit the board. Mike Oosting was in the bike that night, and has steered her in each start since.

"Earlier this season, we ran into some kinks with her. When she went around a turn, she made this really weird step," said the breeder. "It turned out she had thyroid issues and it affected her ovaries. When we figured out what was going on and fixed it, she could handle the turns better. I knew we were going to be in for a good season."

Somebodyslilly is perfect in her last four starts. Following the third-place effort, the 3-year-old stormed to a six and one-half length triumph July 25, stopping the clock in a lifetime best 1:50. She backed that up with a 1:51 score in the third leg of ISS action, crossing the wire five lengths in front of the nearest competition. On Dan Patch night, Somebodyslilly turned in a solid 1:50.1 performance leading into her latest test, a 1:50.2 victory over favored Mystical Carrie in the fourth round of sires stakes held Saturday, Aug. 22. The latest score pushed her career earnings into six figures.

"We just started with her. I feel like there is a whole board to be played. I'm just going off of her and what I'm seeing," Schwartz said. "I still feel like we haven't touched bottom yet. There's still plenty of horse left, and she recovers pretty quickly."

Now a six-time winner in 16 career starts, Somebodyslilly is the fastest and richest starter from Time To Roll's first crop. She has raked in \$114,100 and placed herself among the top fillies in the division. Outside of Indiana Sires Stakes, the sophomore is eligible to the USS Indianapolis, Pegasus Series and Circle City Series at Hoosier Park. Some horsemen wait decades for a pacer with this level of talent. Admitting he has come to the game late, Schwartz is enjoying the experience.

"This is a sideline, but I'm really passionate about it," he said. "I love the business. I love the people. I really enjoy it. I feel like I'm home."

Face Time Bourbon wins \$202,000 Criterium

Sébastien Guarato-trained **Face Time Bourbon** is gearing up for a new victory in Prix d'Amérique in January and on Saturday afternoon (Aug. 29), the 5-year-old son of Ready Cash impressed in the Criterium for 5-year-olds.

Björn Goop left Sweden for a day in Paris to drive Face Time Bourbon in the 3,000 meter long Criterium. But 1.9 miles also means that many things can happen during the journey towards the wire and even though Face Time Bourbon opened pretty quickly from position far outside of the wide track at Vincennes, Goop couldn't place his horse in the front of the field directly after start. Instead, Face Time Bourbon successively had to climb three wide towards the front and after 5/8ths of a mile, the champion trotter landed in position first over. Soon thereafter opponents attacked three wide and Goop had to make another move midway through the race. With 1,200 meters to go, leader Falcao de Laurma yielded the front position in favor for the race's big star and Björn Goop didn't jeopardize anything. He let Face Time Bourbon sprint away from the rest of the field and it was one horse at the track during the home stretch.

This was Face Time Bourbon's 22nd win in 26 attempts and there is no doubt about who is the early favorite for the 2021 Prix d'Amérique.

The mile rate over the heavy distance was 1:55.4.

The Criterium des 5 ans was not the only Group 1 race during the race card at Vincennes on Saturday afternoon. Another Criterium, the one for 4-year-olds was held for a purse of \$202,000. Favorite Gu d'Heripre had to trot outside of leader **Go On Boy** (Password) and couldn't challenge for the win in the race's last part. Criterium des 3 ans winner Gunilla d'Atout tried to attack in the home stretch, but leader Go On Boy and driver Romain Deriux had it all under control. Deriux is known as the trainer and driver of Elitloppet winner Dijon and Go On Boy can very well be his next international star trotter. The mile rate over 1.6 miles was 1:56.4.

In the \$178,000 Yearling Cup for 3-year-old trotters, Philippe Allaire trained **Heaven's Pride**, driven by David Thomain, came to the lead midway through the race and held attacking Hades de Vandel behind him in the finish. The mile rate was 1:59.4 over 1.6 miles.

Milligan's School again in Sundsvall

The \$208,000 Sundsvall Open Trot for elite trotters was held at Bergsåker Racetrack in Sweden on Saturday afternoon and, in a sense, it was a rerun from 2018 year's edition.

Stefan Melander trained **Milligan's School** (Yankee Glide) battles among the best horses in the toughest races throughout every season and the 7-year-old colt is performing at a high level almost every time he enters a track.

In 2018, he won the Sundsvall Open Trot paired with Ulf Eriksson and when this year's edition was under way,

Milligan's School managed to keep the lead from post 1, which made the path to victory easier. Ulf Eriksson did everything right in the sulky. The pace was not too high the first kilometer, but still, the horses in the back of the field had to do heavy job three wide during the last lap of the 1.3 miles long race and it was pretty clear that the leader had great control of the field in the last turn. Sorbet, who was served a trip behind the leader, got his chance to challenge already with a quarter of a mile to go, but Milligan's School had a lot of power to give and Ulf Eriksson could note that he was alone and heading for the victory with 100 meters to go.

The Melander owned and trained trotter came home in mile rate of 1:53.3 and Sorbet, who finished as runner up behind Milligan's School in 2018 year's edition, followed as second ahead of quick finishing Who's Who.

Eenymeenyminymoe in Danish Derby for mares

The \$106,500 Derby for mares in Denmark was on the race card at Charlottenlund racetrack in Copenhagen on Saturday afternoon and Flemming Jensen trained **Eenymeenyminymoe** (Västerbo Prestige) had no problem in claiming the trophy from the lead in mile rate 1:59 over 1.3 miles.

Eenymeenyminymoe has been the queen of the crop since last summer and to date she has nine wins in 20 starts.

Eenymeenyminymoe's father Västerbo Prestige has another shot in a Derby today (Aug. 30), since his son Empire is the probable first choice in the \$182,000 Derby for 4-year-olds.

Swedish sale grosses \$3.5 million

The Sweden International Yearling Sale was surrounded by technical problems ahead of Thursday night's (Aug. 27) closing of the event, but overall, the sale went well when it was time for buyers to place their bids on the 140 trotters in the catalogue.

Eighty yearlings were sold for a total price of \$3,481,013 and an average price of \$43,512, which was an increase by \$1,030 since last year's sale.

Sire Ready Cash had the two most expensive trotters sold at the sale and Windmill Jam (out of Swiss Account) sold for 2,000,000 SEK (approximately \$229,315) while On The Move (out of Moving On) landed on 1,600,000 SEK, \$183,450.

Campbell says Red Mile DQ could have been clear cut with universal rules

Hambletonian Society president John Campbell says if individual racing commissions adopted rule changes that have been passed by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) that the furor over a controversial disqualification at The Red Mile last Sunday would have been avoided.

Last Wednesday, I reported on how the disqualification was met with universal scorn on social media from bettors, horsepeople and racing writers.

The incident occurred in Race 11 last Sunday when a filly that had been leading approaching the 3/4 pole broke stride, appeared to lose sufficient ground, came back on to win, then was disqualified.

You can read my full account here.

Campbell referred to a letter that he sent to Harness Racing Update earlier in the year — following a similar controversial judge's decision — that spoke of several rule change proposals to the USTA in 2018 and 2019. In the letter, he explained that the committee had addressed the extended run rule.

According to an excerpt from the letter, the extended break rule — if it had been in use at the Red Mile — would have made the disqualification cut and dry:

It was proposed and passed by the USTA that - An extended break shall be defined as a horse that is not on its proper gait for 25 strides or more. This rule was also passed into Model Rules by the Association of Racing Commissions International [ARCI] however to my knowledge The New York State Gaming Commission and most States have not adopted this rule. Using strides to determine an extended run is not unprecedented as France uses 15 strides to determine whether a horse is disqualified or not.

Campbell spoke of how the extended break rule change would have made the disqualification impossible to challenge. "If you use the 25-stride DQ rule and counted the strides this filly was on a break, it would have been clear cut because you could easily count 28 strides that she was galloping," he said.

Anytime someone posts a poll asking for people to vote on the one thing they want changed about the sport, "uniform rules" at every racetrack always seems to be high on the list. Campbell, who noted that Standardbred Canada had also spearheaded a similar uniform rules change campaign in Canada, indicated the Rules Committee's frustration at the snail's pace at which racing jurisdictions are moving to adopt the changes. He added that the solution is simple.

"There is a clear avenue to find the remedy to these situations, if the racing commissions would just reach out and grab it," he said. "From a participants' level and from a bettors' level, we could have very similar racing rules in the U.S. and Canada if we could just get these jurisdictions to adopt the proposed rules changes."

Gural: opposing the HIA the dumbest of ideas with governors looking to end purse subsidies

Letter to the editor from Jeff Gural, owner of the Meadowlands, Tioga and Vernon Downs

Of all the dumb ideas I have heard, the decision by the USTA to oppose the Horseracing Integrity Act (HIA), that I expect will be passed in Washington, might be the dumbest. Thanks to my efforts, along with (my security chief) Brice (Cote) and The Jockey Club, we just had 29 individuals arrested based on information obtained by the FBI relating to the illegal drugging of horses. I believe all but two of the individuals were related to standardbred racing and were it not for the virus I am sure there would have been many more arrests. Hopefully there still will be once things settle down.

I have always tried to do right by the horsemen, including opening my three racetracks as quickly as possible after lobbying on my part to allow us to open. I did not cancel any of the stakes races, I just funded the shortfall. As you might expect, I have lost a lot of money this year especially in New York.

Whenever any horsemen called me to question my efforts to clean up the sport I would always ask if they thought the current system was working well and 100 per cent of the horsemen responded, 'No, the current system is not working.'

When I first saw that the USTA was planning to oppose the legislation I tried to warn (USTA president) Russell (Williams) that a scandal was coming and that we were going to look foolish and his response was to shut up. The chairman of the USTA employed one of the trainers who was arrested and one of the others was the leading trainer at Yonkers.

How in the world are we supposed to try to convince the governors and legislators in the various states that are now

facing huge deficits that they should continue to fund our purses if they realize that the thoroughbreds and the quarter horse industry have now turned drug testing over to the feds while standardbreds have resisted? Can anything look worse?

I asked Russell what he objected to in the legislation and if I agree with him I would get it changed. Many of his objections are valid but I am sure we could negotiate.

The optics of opposing this legislation and at the same time trying to hang on to the purse subsidies are insane.

I know one thing if we do not change our position I am simply going to drop all the stakes at my tracks because I have not gone to all this trouble and lost all this money to provide a place for dishonest people to race.

We need to do everything possible to put us in a position to convince the governors of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania to continue with the purse subsidies. As we know, the governor of New Jersey has eliminated it, the governor of Pennsylvania wants to eliminate part of it and I can tell you that the other casinos owners in New York all plan to ask the state to decouple. We could literally be looking at the end of the sport as we know it and the last thing we need is to give them a reason since most people think we have always had a problem with integrity going back to when I first got involved in the '60s and everybody thought the drivers were playing games.

I urge our members to reach out to Russell and make it clear that we need this purse subsidy and we do not need to give anyone a reason to take it away. We all know we are not capable of regulating ourselves, nor are the states capable. It requires far greater scrutiny and I am sure we can make the changes we need in the legislation to make it work.

He chuckled, "Sounds like promising programming. Your sport should get into the water."



Joe Bongiorno wins 2,000th career race

Joe Bongiorno became one of the youngest drivers to achieve 2,000 career victories when the 26-year-old sent developing force Nicholas Beach to the lead and just kept pouring it on, winning in a lifetime best 1:49 in the \$11,200 featured pace Friday (Aug. 28) at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Bongiorno had his first 100+ winner year in 2012 at age 18 and has not left that club since, peaking with 399 sulky triumphs in 2016. The horses he has driven have earned over \$25.2 million, \$5.9 million of that last season. Much of his success can be attributed to his relationship with two different trainers – perennial leader Ron Burke, and his sister Jennifer, for whom he handled Nicholas Beach.

Joe Bongiorno is already a star; Nicholas Beach may not be far behind him. He had a win and a place as a 2-year-old, then missed all of 2019. But he's rapidly making up for lost time, perfect in four starts this year, and in Joe's historic victory the Somebeachsomewhere gelding thundered home in :53.3.

Todd McCarthy, a member of the Australian driving dynasty and already a participant in a World Driving Championship, opened his U.S. win account by guiding Soho Wallstreet A to a 1:51.2 victory for trainer Tom Shay and owner Howard Taylor. The 27-year-old son of Aussie legend John and brother of top drivers Luke (Down Under) and Andrew (North America), Todd showed both aggressiveness and patience, moving his horse to the lead early, letting the first-over horse go past down the backstretch, but keeping his equine "fellow countryman" up on the bit and able to come back for the victory.

Chris Lems notches 2,000th career win

Chris Lems made his 2,000thtrip to the winner's circle after winning with Hot Shot Hill in Northfield Park's 15th race on Friday (Aug. 28).

Lems was second-over and swooped three-wide in the backstretch, drawing away by 6 ¾-lengths at the wire. The 1:55 clocking was the 22nd career score for the seven year-old pacer, who returned \$22.20 to win.

The 33-year-old Lems began driving in 2003. His 2,000 wins have helped him garner over \$14.5 million in purse earnings.

Chris drove his first race in July, 2003 at the Canon Fair. It resulted in a third-place finish in a \$2,000 conditioned race with Beyond Bold. Later that month he won his first race of his career at the Oskaloosa Fair, again aboard Beyond Bold, this time for an \$850 purse in 2:12.

Lems primarily raced in New York for most of his career but moved his talents to Ohio in 2017.

He said he feels fortunate to have had good stock to drive in his career and says that winning races is a team effort.

"There have been many people that have given me opportunities and I thank them all," he said. "Many owners and trainers have given me opportunities and I appreciate it so much."

The colts were battling in the third round of their six round series and closed out a week's worth of stakes action at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

PBR Street Gang, with Trace Tetrick in the bike, turned in a dominant performance to capture the first division in 1:52.2. Sassy Cindy and Peter Wrenn rallied well late to finish third. Hot Mess Express returned \$2.10 at the betting windows.

Trained by Jamaica Patton, the daughter of Panther Hanover—My Heart Was True recorded her fourth win from five lifetime outings. Hot Mess Express pushed her lifetime bankroll to \$56,125 for owner Sam Bowie.

In the opening division of the stakes action,

Somethingbeautiful continued her winning ways and turned in another dominant performance to score in 1:53. With regular pilot LeWayne Miller in the sulky, Somethingbeautiful switched up her tactics and opted for a trip off the pace to deliver as the heavy 1-9 favorite.

Unhurried from the gate, Somethingbeautiful eased off the gate to find a spot along the rail in fifth while a host of others left aggressively. Ever Rocking and Brandon Bates were the first to get a call through the opening quarter in :28 and lead the field to the half in :56.4.

When the field reached the three-quarters in 1:25.2, Miller had Somethingbeautiful first-over and on the attack. Utilizing a :27 final quarter, Somethingbeautiful sprinted past her competitors and finished five lengths to the good. Baci Baci and Ricky Macomber Jr. utilized a pocket trip to finish second while Skyway Brittney and Sam Widger rounded out the trifecta. Sent off at odds of 1-9, Somethingbeautiful returned \$2.10 at the betting windows.

With the win, Somethingbeautiful recorded her fourth straight victory and remains undefeated in four lifetime starts. The daughter of Always A Virgin-Summer N Sand is trained by Dylan Davis and owned in partnership by Howard Taylor, E. Gold, A. Basen, and R. Lombardo. Somethingbeautiful now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$64,500.

Trailing horse rule updated in Ontario

The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) is revising Standardbred Rule 22.01 to enhance the consistency of racing, so that participants and the betting public know where a horse will start from.

Effective immediately, in races with two or more trailers, the driver of each horse in the second tier must follow in designated trailing positions; specifically, the driver of each horse in the second tier must follow the **two horses in front of it** as detailed in the rule below.

This amendment is consistent with the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) model rules and the Standardbred Canada Rule Harmonization project.

The AGCO is committed to providing consistency for trailing horse positions and, as such, has made this change in response to requests from industry representatives.

New Rule:

22.01 (h) In the event there are two tiers of horses, the scratching of a horse that has drawn or earned a position in

the front tier shall not affect the position of the horses that have drawn or earned positions in the second tier, except as provided for in handicap claiming races. Whenever a horse is scratched from any tier, horses on the outside move in to fill up the vacancy. When there is only one trailer, it may start from any position in the second tier. When there is more than one trailer, the inside trailer shall follow either the horse in the #1 or #2 position, the next trailer shall follow either the horse in the #3 or #4 position, the next trailer shall follow either the horse in the #5 or #6 position, the next trailer shall follow either the horse in the #7 or #8 position, the next trailer shall follow either the horse in the #9 or #10 position. In the event that there are more trailers than designated positions on the second tier, the Judges will determine where horses will line up.

Chase H Hanover and Southwind Gendry each captured a division of Saturday's (Aug. 29) Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) at The Meadows, giving David Miller a sweep of the event for freshman colt and gelding pacers. Miller's big day didn't end there, as he also won two PA Stallion Series splits and an overnight race to give him five victories on the 15-race card.

"We made a couple changes — we opened him up and put cups on him," said winning trainer Scott Cox, who owns the \$30,000 yearling purchase with Jason Ash. "I hope he still had something at the wire; it looked like he was getting a little lackadaisical. He's kind of easy on himself."

The Captaintreacherous—Calgary Hanover gelding soared over \$100,000 in earnings.

b faced perhaps a sterner challenge, trailing favorite Always A Miki by 6 at the half — and with no cover in sight. When Miller sent the Always B Miki—Gambler's Passion gelding first up, he responded and proved the more determined horse in the lane, defeating Always A Miki by 1/2 length in 1:51.3. Whichwaytothebeach completed the ticket.

"I actually liked the trip because he wasn't going to have to be three wide," said winning trainer Ron Burke. "I knew once he got wheel to wheel with the other horse, he would make that colt race. This horse doesn't get tired, and he tries."

Southwind Gendry races for Burke Racing Stable, Phillip Collura, Knox Services and J&T Silva-Purnel&Libby.

In the PA Stallion Series, Miller powered to the point from the rail with **Bettor Not Talk** and refused to release the two other horses vying for the front. The Hall of Famer knew what he was doing, as Bettor Not Talk never did surrender the lead, blazing to a stake record 1:51.2. Sweet Angel Boy was second, beaten 3 lengths, with Amazing Bet third. The time shaved two ticks from Biggie's previous stake mark.

"I would've turned somebody loose, but there were two of them out there, and I didn't want to get away third," Miller said. "He did it pretty easily. I've thought all along he was a pretty nice horse."

Robert Cleary trains the Betting Line—Talk Time gelding for Allen Wenc. **Somewhereinverona** and **Twin B Edge** took the other stallion series splits.

Locally owned Top Of The Bar impressive in OSS Grassroots win

Locally owned freshman trotting filly **Top Of The Bar** delivered an impressive performance at Hanover Raceway on Saturday (Aug. 29) to earn her second Grassroots victory of the season.

Starting from Post 2 with driver Bob McClure in the race bike, Top Of The Bar settled in third as A Blue Blood led the field to a :31 opening quarter over a rain-soaked and wind-battered oval rated three seconds slower than normal. As A Blue Blood carried on to a 1:04 half, McClure sent Top Of The Bar up the outside and the filly continued to stalk the pacesetter through a 1:35.2 three-quarters. In the stretch, Top Of The Bar finally reeled in A Blue Blood, getting up for a one-half length victory in 2:06. A Blue Blood settled for second and fan favorite Flanagan Destiny was third.

"She's such a solid filly," said McClure. "One thing about Mark Etsell, his horses can trot, so when you go to a track like Hanover you can stand on them pretty good and know they can take it."

McClure engineered the win for Etsell and his co-owners Robert Newton of Walkerton, Graham Hopkins of Chesley and Peter Porter of Port Dover, ON. The Muscle Mass daughter was also victorious in Grassroots action at Grand River Raceway on July 29 and finished third in the July 13 season opener at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"She raced good. When she raced it was pretty muddy, windy and muddy, and she did it, I guess the hard way, first up, and Bob said she was good," said Hanover native Etsell. "He was confident. He knows that she's kind of a rugged

little girl."

Top Of The Bar will make her fourth lifetime start in the last regular season Grassroots leg at Flamboro Downs on Sept. 17 before heading to the Grassroots Semi-Finals at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Oct. 1. With a total of 112 Grassroots points, the filly currently sits second in the division point standings. The top 20 point earners advance to the Semi-Finals.

Doing It All made a leap into the top 10 with her first Grassroots victory in the second \$22,100 division. From Post 1 the Kadabra daughter and driver Stephen Byron got away second behind early pacesetter Snowfalla, who rang up a :31.3 quarter and a 1:04.3 half. Tribeca Seelster tallied the 1:35 third fraction and duelled Doing It All down the stretch, but Doing It All got a head in front at the wire for the 2:07.2 score. Kadillac Girl recovered from an early break to be third.

"They weren't going much today, but it rained pretty good up there. It rained until just about post time," said trainer John Bax. "She's a big, big, good gaited filly who just doesn't know how to race yet and hasn't filled out. I think she's going to be more of a three-year-old."

Bax conditions Doing It All for owner Menhammar Stuteri AB of Paris, KY, who offered up \$100,000 for the filly at last fall's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. In her three previous Grassroots starts Doing It All had finished seventh, fifth and fourth, giving her a total of 65 points.

The final \$22,100 division saw **Tipsy In Dixie** claim her second Grassroots victory with a gate-to-wire effort from Post 3 that saw her trot under the wire in 2:07.2, four and three-quarter lengths ahead of Movin To The Top and Fortune Tellers K.

James MacDonald piloted the fan favorite to the win for trainer Harry Poulton and fractional ownership group TheStable Tipsy In Dixie of Guelph, ON, and the reinsman said he was confident in the filly from the start.

"She just buzzes around the farm track, and she got around Grand River like a hoop on a barrel. I would have been thoroughly, thoroughly shocked if she didn't handle Hanover well. I was pretty confident going in," said MacDonald. "She's just a little beauty. She's just a good gaited, nice little filly, she doesn't do anything wrong. She's a little sweetheart."

With two wins and a second in three Grassroots starts, Muscle Mass daughter Tipsy In Dixie leads the two-year-old pacing fillies into the final leg with 125 points.

Ontario Sires Stakes action continues at Hanover Raceway next weekend, Saturday, Sept. 5, with the final Grassroots leg for the three-year-old pacing fillies.

JK First Lady defeats Rocknificent at Pocono

JK First Lady defeated Rocknificent in a much-anticipated showdown between the two in one of two \$35,000 divisions of a Pennsylvania All-Stars event for 3-year-old pacing fillies on Saturday afternoon (Aug. 29) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

Rocknificent had the post advantage, starting from the rail vs. "JK"'s post six, but with no one else going out particularly hard to challenge the pole horse, Andrew McCarthy behind JK First Lady sent his filly frontward, making the lead just past the :27 quarter, then getting moderate (for this caliber) middle fractions of :55.2 and 1:23.2.

The race came down to a sprint in the last eighth, with JK First Lady generating a :27 last quarter and a final eighth probably not much over :13 in holding safe the inside-charging Rocknificent (who came to this race off three straight photo victories) by a neck.

Despite JK First Lady's setting a 1:49.2 divisional track record at Philly in her last start, she was allowed to go off at 7-5 vs. Rocknificent's 2-5 (she won in 1:50.2 -- :53.2 - 26.1). But being able to dictate the tempo helped bring the Western Ideal—JK She'salady filly to her seventh career

victory and earnings of \$477,506. The pair are likely to meet next Sunday in their Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championship at Philly, where they are likely to be joined by Party Girl Hill and Lyons Sentinel – a spectacular matchup.

The second \$35,000 All-Stars section had fillies who among them had won 10 PA Stallion Series events – and a driver who both was eligible for "nw2 in North America" and who had a brother who had won an All-Stars cut earlier. Todd McCarthy, 26 and one of Australia's top drivers, duplicated brother Andrew's feat by guiding the Captaintreacherous filly **Marloe Hanover** to a front-end 1:51.1 All-Stars triumph.

McCarthy and Marloe Hanover seized the lead from Dance Club in a :27.2 quarter, went on to the half in :55.1, then made the field strain to keep up with a :26.4 third quarter to be at the three-quarters in 1:22. Favored Going Gone Hanover (and Andrew) challenged on the outside on the far turn and into the stretch, and Dance Club loomed in the Pocono Pike, but Marloe Hanover held together to defeat her inside rival by a neck, with her outside rival another length back. Marloe Hanover now has earnings of \$363,759 for trainer Nifty Norman and the partnership of Pinske Stables, David Hoese, and Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky.

Leavitt weighs in on full-brothers to stallions

Tom Santorro's question to Gurfein is somewhat garbled when he calls Maverick at the time he sold a full-brother to a sire (full story here)

Greenshoe was still racing when Maverick sold as a yearling, so he was by no means a sire at that time. Properly, the question would involve a yearling brother to an established sire, i.e. a stallion with foals already at the races, as in Ronnie's example of the full-brother to Father Patrick, et al.

There have been a very few successful full brothers to successful sires — Conway Hall, Andover Hall and Angus Hall coming to mind — but there is one important fact to bear in mind: every horse, including full siblings, has its own particular gametic makeup. So, no two horses are identical as far as their genes are concerned, no matter how close the blood relationship is.

One personal note RE: Maverick: this kid never saw a racehorse with as much speed as Greenshoe, or another horse who burned with as hot a flame. Hoping to find the same thing in a full-brother or sister would, to me, be like expecting lightning to strike twice.

Finally, I can answer for Ronnie the worst thing any sportswriter ever said about him from his standpoint: nothing.
