# Remembering the Legendary 'Pop' Geers on the 100th anniversary of his tragic death

September 3rd marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of one of the greatest losses in the history of harness racing – the tragic death of Edward Franklin 'Pop' Geers at the age of 73.

Geers (pronounced Jeers) was born on a farm about three miles from Lebanon, TN on Jan. 25, 1851.

A young Geers was given a pair of cows to oversee and he taught them to line drive. Geers eventually traded those cows for a 2-year-old colt trotter. Thus began one of the greatest careers in the fledgling sport of harness racing.

Geers' first notable success came with an imported Morgan chestnut stallion, about 14.5 hands high, called Little Dave. He was a pure-gaited trotter and gave the 21-year-old his first driving victory in 1872.

Geers dominated the Grand Circuit during his 50+ year career. He is credited with earnings of more than \$2 million.

In addition to his skill as a driver, Geers was noted for developing and handling more champions than any other horseman. Not only did his horses establish several single harness records on the trot and pace, he also held the "team records" and the "triplicate team" record – a 2:14 mile with three horses hitched abreast to a four-wheeled wagon.



The Honorable Howard Mason Gore, who in just a couple of months would become the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture and later the Governor of West Virgina, gave a brief eulogy. He concluded his comments by noting that "a great man has passed to his reward."

It was noted by many that Geers displayed self-control and "slowness to anger." He seldom whipped a horse and never raised his voice. He didn't drink. The press reported that his passions were cigars, clean sportsmanship, philanthropy and ice-cream.

Months prior to his death, Geers played host to 3,000 school children at the Sandusky (OH) County Fairgrounds for their annual play and field day. Geers drove several exhibition heats with various horses for the children's enjoyment and benefit.

On Aug. 16, 1916, Geers, then 65 years old, guided Napoleon Direct to a 1:59.¾ mile at the Columbus (OH) Driving Park – Geers' first two-minute mile.

After years on the Grand Circuit, Geers was urged by family and friends to quit racing. He had been involved in many accidents and was aging. His semi-retirement consisted of exhibitions and only a few purse starts.

In March 1924, Joseph McGraw, the future Hall of Famer and the superintendent of speed, announced that he had closed a contract with Geers to exhibit his world champions — Peter Manning and Sanardo — at the 44th annual West Virginia State Fair in Wheeling during Labor Day weekend.

Peter Manning would try to better his own trot record of 2:02.1/2 over a half-mile track. Sanardo would aim to best the 2:02 pace record.

The state fair officials were so excited to have the "Silent Man from Tennessee" attend their meet, they dubbed Tuesday (Sept. 2) as Pop Geers Day.

Heavy rains, a soft track and swampy conditions caused a postponement of the original Geers Day. The expected crowd of 20,000 would have to come back on Wednesday to watch history.

Prior to the exhibition miles, Geers entered Miladi Guy in the 2:14 Class Trot. The filly was one of Geers' favorites, but also known to have weak knees, a fact that would soon prove fatal for the famed driver.

#### **Harness Racing Update**

As the field of five went postward for the first heat, Geers was reported to tell the track officials, "I'm just giving the old game one more whirl boys and then it's back to Memphis to stay."

Geers and Miladi Guy finished third in the first heat, timed in 2:13.14. The crowd was disappointed, but they were sure Geers would win the second heat.

As the field of five passed the half-mile station, Geers was sitting third and pulled his filly to the outside and drew even with the leading Santa The Great and Judge Blair.

Miladi Guy found a soft spot on the track, broke stride, stumbled and fell. Geers was catapulted over the fallen horse and landed in a heap, some 15 feet ahead of the filly.

Geers' limp body was carried to the outer edge of the track and he was quickly attended to by a trio of physicians – Drs. Will Cruse, L. A. Clark and L. N. Harris. He suffered a broken neck, a crushed forehead and a bruised chest. The doctors found a faint heartbeat but the prognosis was grim.

While waiting for an ambulance, caregivers moved Geers to his stable and laid him on a cot just a few feet from the stall of his star, Peter Manning. The champ sensed the seriousness of the incident and whinnied lightly.

Geers was eventually transported to Ohio Valley General Hospital where he briefly regained consciousness and softly muttered, "I had a fall." He closed his eyes and the "Grand Old Man of the Trotting Turf" drifted off and died peacefully.

The next day, a reported 50,000 citizens came back to the island track for a public memorial service at the fairgrounds.

Just after 2 p.m., the time of the previous day's accident, Peter Manning, Sanardo and Miladi Guy, with black crepe draped around their necks, were led silently onto the track by white coated attendants.

Taps was played and the service ended.

Geers' casket was taken to the Wheeling railway station and shipped to Memphis for the funeral service. He was interred at the Rose Hill Cemetery in Columbia, TN.

In 1926, thanks to the support of fans, owners and fellow drivers, more than \$4,000 in donations were raised and a 45-ft granite monument and park was dedicated in Geers' memory in Columbia.

Geers was elected to the Harness Racing Hall of Fame as an Immortal in 1958.

# Brad Chisholm, compatriot combine at Chester

The young Aussie driver teams with a trio owned by champion trainer Luke McCarthy.

Young Aussie Brad Chisholm is starting to make his mark in the U.S.

The 26-year-old's biggest opportunity yet comes at Harrah's Philadelphia on Sunday (Sept. 1) when he will team with the first three U.S. horses owned by champion Aussie trainer Luke McCarthy.

Chisholm drove the trio — Bondi Lockdown, Mahomes and Muscle Bart — to win qualifiers at Chester last Tuesday (Aug. 20) and was thrilled when McCarthy told him he would take the reins for their first races.

"It was a bit of a surprise," Chisholm said. "I'm chuffed. Right place, right time, I guess.

McCarthy, 41, is no stranger to the U.S., having spent plenty of time there over the years, including a stint which saw him drive the great Muscle Hill to win the 2009 World Trotting Derby.

And, of course, he is the older brother of Andy and Todd, who have enjoyed huge success in the U.S.

Luke plans to spend a lot more time in the U.S., but is currently heavily committed in Australia with the world's richest race, the \$2.1-million TAB Eureka on Sept. 7. He trains two of the 10 starters – Eye Keep Smiling and Don Hugo.

But Luke did squeeze in a quick recent trip to the States to check on five horses that he and some fellow owners sent across from Australia to continue their career about four months ago.

For now, Luke's horses are in the care of friend Aaron Lambert.

In addition to Bondi Lockdown, Mahomes and Muscle Bart, Luke has also sent across two former top level Aussie Grand Circuit pacers in Spirit of St Louis and Expensive Ego.


Spirit Of St Louis is the most decorated of them. He's raced 78 times for 28 wins, 24 placings — so many in the biggest races Down Under — and won almost \$1.5 million.

Expensive Ego, who was an outstanding younger pacer, has also earned almost \$1 million with 25 wins from just 57 starts, while Bondi Lockdown earned almost \$500,000 with his 17 wins.

They were three serious Down Under pacers.

"There's some serious class amongst them," Chisholm said. "Bondi Lockdown went 1:52 winning the qualifier last week, but Spirit of St Louis was just as good finishing third.

"They both surprised me," Chisholm said. "You don't often see horses, even as good as them, go that quick at their first qualifier. But Luke's done it well. They've been here four months and had a long slow build-up with plenty of time to settle in, getting used to the new surroundings and the humidity, which is crazy here. They've had a great foundation.



"I expect them all to [race] well this week on what they did at the trials."

Chisholm, who drove 178 winners Down Under, moved to the U.S. in March, last year and started working for Richard "Nifty" Norman on April 1.

"It's been great," Chisholm said. "Nifty's been awesome. As the driving opportunities have grown for me in recent times, we make it work. I live on the farm and I'm here every morning and we'll make a plan if I've got drives somewhere. We know four days in advance.

"Moving here was on my mind for a long time. I was born here, so I've got dual citizenship, which is a massive help. I can come and go whenever I like, but it's home here now. I'm sure I'll be here quite a while, apart from the occasional trip back home to see family.

"I'm not the best at organizing things, so it was really my dad [Kevin], who told me to just do it and helped me pull it all together."

Brad's parents, Kevin and Alison, have enjoyed plenty of success in training ranks Down Under and had a stint in the U.S. when Brad was born.

Their best horse was Australia's top pacer of his time, Sunshine Band through the mid-1990s.

The son of Laser Hanover won 32 of his 60 starts and banked over \$630,000. He won the Group 1996 WA Cup and Group 1 1995 Queensland Championship, along with finishing second in the 1996 Perth Inter Dominion final.

"He was before my time, but I've heard all about him and seen the replays," Brad said with a laugh.

Brad, who said he's nearing 30 driving wins in the U.S., is focused on making the most of his opportunities in coming months.

"It's my chance," he said. "As I said, the big guys are spending so much time in Kentucky, which means I might have eight or 10 drives instead of one or two.

"And I'm setting myself for a big winter. Rain or snow, I don't care. The big names take the chance for a holiday when the racing isn't so big, but it's another chance for me to get more drives and set myself up. I'm so happy I made the move over now, rather than waiting until I was, say 40. I can really give it a crack now.

"I'm learning so much and I love the lifestyle. That's a big thing, you actually have a life outside of racing here and it's hard to get back home. Take today, it's like a half day's work for me. Drive an hour to Chester for a few drives, come home and go out for a beer and a steak for dinner. I've got time to play golf and watch sports with some mates. There's so much to like about it."

# Driver Samuel Fillion is having a career year

When a teenage Samuel Fillion first sat in the sulky to jog one of his father's horses, he had no idea that a career in harness racing would one day come calling.

"I was 14 or 15 and it didn't really hit me at that point," Fillion said. "Then one day I jogged another one and thought, 'This is fun."

And so began the young reinsman's journey to becoming one of Canadian harness racing's brightest young stars.

Fillion's meticulous rise up the ranks first started to take shape when another renowned Mont-Joli, QC, racing family took an up-and-coming Fillion under their wing.

"I met Louis [-Philippe] Roy and his brother [Pierre Luc], and then his family and they showed me the way of racing even more," Fillion said.

Studying the game under the Roy brothers, particularly Louis-Philippe, who's earned north of \$48.6 million across 2,647 wins (14,984 starts and counting), set the foundation for Fillion to steadily progress both at home and around Ontario's B-track circuit.

"It was a step-by-step journey for me," Fillion said. "I started out slow and from there I wanted to drive more. Then, I got some momentum in Quebec and wanted to do even more again. That's when I went to Rideau Carleton.

"I didn't know where it was going to take me but here I am." Fillion has certainly made quite the name for himself after moving to Ontario four years ago.

The 26-year-old was named a finalist for the O'Brien Award as Canadian harness racing's Future Star in 2021 before earning said honors in 2022, his second year as a full-time driver.

While Fillion's strides from 2021 to 2022 (added 65 more wins and more than \$616,000 in purse earnings year-over-year), are nothing to scoff at, he's ascended to an entirely different level in 2024.

Through 1,280 starts and counting, Kawartha Downs' runaway leading driver has already surpassed the 200-win benchmark and \$1.3 million earnings mark (over \$140,000 higher than his previous career high in 2021).

Even in the face of great success, Fillion remains a pillar of modesty.

"We all try to do well but I think when you do find success it's because you get good horses to drive and the people in the barn are doing a great job," he said. "At the same time, you have to get a bit lucky because you need to do well enough to continue getting good horses.

"Obviously, you want to give yourself credit too, but you can't get too much in your own head. If you think you're too good, then you won't do as well. It really is a team sport."

Buoyed by an all-star cast of supporters and an honest approach to the game, Fillion has learned his fair share of lessons over the years.

None, however, have had as profound an impact on his career as a fresh mindset driven by a change of scenery.

"The biggest lesson for me this far has been more about life than anything," Fillion said. "When I moved here from Quebec, and this applies to driving too, we'd hang out after the races, and I learned to enjoy these moments and not focus too much on what people might be thinking or saying about me.

"I learned that here, because in Quebec, I couldn't do it. I wasn't doing it. And now, coming here, I just stopped worrying and started having more fun with people who have now become friends."

An often-overlooked element of Fillion's storied rise to prominence is the culture shock of moving from a Francophone province to a predominantly English-speaking region.

Not only did he have to familiarize himself with Ontario's horses, tracks, and drivers, but also a new language entirely.

"When I first arrived in Ontario, I couldn't speak English at all either," Fillion said. "So, everything was harder. But now, you meet some friends — and we all know on the track it's business — but if I can talk to more drivers and horse people it's going to be easier for me.

"It's been all about learning since I got here."

There is one practice, however, that Fillion needed no introduction to.

Like most horse people, the in-demand reinsman is well-versed in the value of downtime — even if only for a moment — during an arduous racing season.

"On the B-tracks, we race every night, but if you want to be happy in this business you have to find time to do something different when you get time off," he said. "Right now, like so many other horsepeople, I always go for a nap after my lunch. Even if it's only for 15-20 minutes, I feel so much better after."

But like his life on the track, Fillion's nap schedule doesn't always go according to plan.

"It's funny because, in the winter, they cancel the races sometimes if there's a snowstorm or something; on those nights, I don't take a nap because we usually go do something," said Fillion, adding with a laugh, "but then after lunchtime, my body just wants to take a nap. It's like, my body is saying 'I need it, you have to give it to me."

On top of some much-needed shut-eye, Fillion, although rare, also enjoys playing hockey outdoors after putting in his time at the barn.

As the rising star put it, before horses it was hockey.

Now, with the roles of each sport firmly reversed, Fillion is fully invested in taking his skills in the sulky to new heights – no matter where it may take him.

"We all want to be better drivers, right?" Fillion said. "And like I said, it's all step by step. If next year, I have the same kind of year, I'll be happy about it. Maybe in two years, I'll be at Mohawk, and I'll also be happy about it.

"Year after year, you want to be better because if you don't want to challenge yourself and move up, there's no point in doing it."





# Hail Mary to Åke Svanstedt

Swedish harness racing media reported on Thursday (Aug. 29) about the new adventure for Hail Mary. After his participation in the \$1,000,000 Yonkers International Trot on Sept. 7, the 8-year-old Googoo Gaagaa son will stay in America and be trained by Åke Svanstedt.

Hail Mary won the \$800,000 Derby as a 4-year-old in 2020 and continued by winning the Breeders Crown that same fall. After an unsuccessful season as a 5-year-old, the horse was moved from Robert Bergh to Daniel Redén, where Hail Mary developed into one of the best trotters in Europe.

Hail Mary crosses the Atlantic Ocean with 28 wins in 52 starts, a mile record of 1:50.2 and approximately \$1,650,000 in lifetime earnings.

#### FAME AND GLORY SEEKS FAME AND GLORY

Timo Nurmos' trained Fame And Glory (Tactical Landing) has all the qualities required to follow up last year's triumph in the \$800,000 Kriteriet with another big victory as the \$800,000 Swedish Derby at Jägersro awaits Sunday (Sept.1).

Fame And Glory confirmed his position as the leader of the 2020 Swedish bred crop when he pretty effortlessly jogged to a win in the 2023 Kriteriet; and the start of his sophomore season has been promising. Nurmos' trotter won his elimination for the Derby on Aug. 20 without needing to show all of his big register. Björn Goop is Fame And Glory's constant reinsman and there are similarities between Fame And Glory and his older half-brother Calgary Games (winner of the Derby in 2021). The way of making up ground in an energy saving way applies to both of the horses and Sunday will most probably demand a high-class performance by the 4-year-old son of Tactical Landing, because there are opponents that show at least the same qualities as the probable favorite.

Goop, the long-time dominating driver in Sweden, has his best shot ever to win the Derby this year. In 2005 he steered

Conny Nobell to his, as yet, only victory in one of the biggest races there are in Sweden, but one must say that the streak of losses in the Derby very well can be broken on Sunday.

A nice and touching story ahead of the Derby is the one about the horse Trogir (Love You). Trogir is trained in Germany, but is bred in Sweden and therefore allowed to race in stakes races, and the connections around Trogir have decided to give away \$400,000 if the horse wins on Sunday. The owners of Trogir, Stall Trippel Tom, own the racetrack Mariendorf in Berlin and Trippel Tom is the track's mascot. Three names behind the mascot stand for all the costs around the horse and all earnings that Trogir collects go to charitable purposes, even so on Sunday.

SchutzengelWerk is one organization that collects charity from Stall Trippel Tom's race horses. A purposive leisure time for kids is that organization's main occupation. And besides that project, Stall Trippel Tom also helps young people getting into the sport of harness racing, in terms of sponsoring new racing colors or something similar that will ease the obstacles entering the sport.

Trogir will be cheered on in the Swedish Derby, that's for sure and the whole story is just what the business sometimes needs.

# Trainer Nikki Kosciolek is embracing the spotlight

There was a time, not so long ago, when standardbred trainer Nikki Kosciolek bristled at the very thought of stepping into the spotlight. Not anymore.

Working in relative anonymity, whether it was on a farm, in the stables, or the paddock on race night, seemed to be an ideal fit for the young woman from Rochester, NY.

"I enjoyed flying under the radar," said Kosciolek. "Any relationship I have been in with someone in the industry, I preferred to be in the background with the racing. It's not as though I don't enjoy being the backbone and keeping things together, but I liked being off the radar."

The pursuit of accolades, applause and adulation has never guided Kosciolek in her life or career.

That mindset remains the same, but with somewhat of an asterisk.

Whereas she was once uncomfortable embracing success in a more outward manner, time and experience has prompted her to look at her career through a different lens.

"I wanted to prove that I could do this, the training, to myself and to others," she said.

Kosciolek's path to the harness racing world began at a New York horse farm.

A long-held love of horses brought her to the property.

"I am not from a horse family at all – not racing, not riding, not anything," she said. "I did, however, take riding lessons when I was younger. The farm I happened to be at was Barb and Clint Galbraith's daughter's place. She was my trainer and friend.

"They needed help with the racehorses one day and I kind of got thrown into it. I decided I liked making money more than I did winning ribbons, so that was it for me."

At the farm, Kosciolek had a room with a view, literally.

"You were on call 24/7," she said. "You are the one always there. It was demanding, but when you walk down the stairs and see a foal who was born 40 minutes earlier – it was a job

where it was a little bit of everything. You get to work with the retired horses, the babies, the stallions, ones who need to rest from racing. I could walk right out back and watch horses training on the track.

"I worked with Barb for quite a few summers, helping with the breeding and a lot of things. I had an apartment above the barn. So, it was quite the way to start, working with a multiple Hall of Fame family. It set the bar high. I just fell in love with the standardbreds. I have taken quite a few from off the track and shown them, but it isn't anywhere near the thrill of racing – so, here I am."

Where she is, though unexpected, has been better than she could ever imagine.

It was those times spent on the farm, often early mornings and some late nights, that helped set the standard for Kosciolek's approach to her craft.

"Working on a horse farm might be overwhelming for a lot of people, but for a horse girl, it was a dream come true," she said. "I think that experience is what gave me my work ethic. You literally do everything."

A myriad of roles was the perfect prescription for Kosciolek.

"I didn't always want to work with horses," she said. "I have always been very driven, someone who sets goals and does my best to reach them. I went to school to be a pharmacist, but a big reason I came back to the horses is that I felt if I had done the former, I would have been very bored."

Her time in racing has been anything but tedious.

Quite the opposite, in fact.

"I have worked for a lot of great people," Kosciolek said. "After I left Barb and Clint, I worked in the Buffalo and Batavia area. I did some travelling — I worked at a farm — and I worked for Kenny Holliday for a long time, at his farm and in Ohio. I also worked for John Mongiello.

"I know some people are labelled as a barn jumper, but that is not the case. I am very committed to the people I work with, and I am very loyal."

Kosciolek is also an avid student of the game.

"It's awesome to take bits and pieces from everyone I have been associated with in the sport," she said. "There are a lot of great horse people who have so much knowledge to offer. You might be working towards the same end goal, but there are so many different ways to find that solution.

"It's great to see the different perspectives and approaches people have. It's so helpful to work for people who keep you learning and do what is best for the horses."

Much of that knowledge gained has found its way into her own training regimen.

While her game plan for conditioning horses is very much her own, it does contain traces of other horse people's philosophies when it comes to creating a winning formula for pacers and trotters.

In this, her first year of training, Kosciolek is staying with the moment, rather than looking too far down the stretch drive.

"I never thought I'd be where I am with this, but I am glad I took a dive and gave myself a chance," she said. "I don't have goals in terms of how many wins I would like to get. I prefer to look at things in a day-to-day approach."

Owners and others have taken notice of her talents.

"I have one owner who told me that wherever I go, he would support me," Kosciolek said. "It has worked out well. I have four horses right now, racing two, and a couple who needed some time off."

Kosciolek, who also works in the barn of fellow trainer Jeff Brewer, has already shown a keen eye for picking out winning types.

That was evident on the evening of April 3 at Miami Valley.

A horse — she didn't know his name — caught her attention in the paddock.

"I had no idea who he was," Kosciolek said. "Something about him – I loved his look, and he had this great personality. I spoke with Jeff [trainer, Brewer] and asked him to find out who he was because I wanted to claim him."

Just who was the striking 9-year-old chestnut gelding?

"I found out his name is Mighty Breeze," she said. "A few weeks later, I claimed him for \$8,000. We had some figuring out to do, and he just took off soon after."

Right to the winner's circle.

The son of Straight Shooting—Bramblerose delivered Kosciolek back-to-back victories, including her first training win, on May 18 and 24.

"He is a great horse," she said. "When I meet him in the winner's circle, I swear he knows how much that means to me and how much I appreciate how hard he tries. He is a very smart and willing horse."

One who happens to have a distinctive look.

"All my geldings get mohawks – everyone knows them in the paddock," she said. "He is such a ham, and he has the craziest personality."

Fashion statements aside, the well-traveled pacer has also earned a rightful reputation as a steely competitor.

"He's a hard worker," Kosciolek said.

Just like his adoring trainer.

"I will probably end up getting a few more horses," she said. "I have a couple of people who are interested in sending me some horses, so I will likely get a bit bigger."

But not too big.

"I have no intention of having dozens and dozens of horses in the barn," she said. "I like the smaller scale, so somewhere between 10 and 12 horses would be ideal."

That number would also accommodate Kosciolek's passion for travel.

It has taken time for her to find the right balance between barn work, biking, backpacking, beach life, or sightseeing beyond the shedrow and training track.

"Travel is very important to me," Kosciolek said. "You miss a lot of life for these horses. I have had to convince myself that it is okay if someone else takes care of them for a few days and that they will be there when I get back. So, I enjoy the chance to travel when I can, even if it is for a couple of days.

"I did a 24-hour trip to Disney World with some friends a little while ago, and I am going there again soon."

An opportunity, albeit brief, to enjoy life at a leisurely pace, away from the racing spotlight.

And when she does step back into that world, Kosciolek won't ever feel out of place.

Life, she will gladly tell you, isn't so bad when you are on the radar.

"I want to prove to myself and others that I can do this on my own," she said. "For a long time, I was in the background, but that has changed... and I couldn't be happier."

# **Determination fuels 'Ardan' success**

When owner Bill Peshina bought Irish-bred pacer Oakwood Ardan in late December, he said he was just hoping for a nice racehorse he could watch every week and be proud of.

Eight months and 10 wins later, Peshina added, "He's sure done that for me."

Oakwood Ardan, trained by Robert Cleary, has finished worse than second only once in 15 races since arriving from Great Britain last fall. The 5-year-old gelding will make his next start Saturday (Aug. 31) in the \$540,000 Canadian Pacing Derby at Woodbine Mohawk Park, which will mark his first appearance in a Grand Circuit stakes event. He is the 3-1 second choice on the morning line in a field of 11.

"It's amazing the progress the horse has made," said Cleary, who has trained Oakwood Ardan since his arrival in the U.S., first for the horse's previous overseas connections and then for Peshina's Royal Wire Products since the sale. "You could tell when training him that he had a big engine and could carry speed. You could tell he wanted to be a good horse right off the bat.

"It wasn't like he was real flashy, but you could feel the power there. And you could tell he really wanted to do his job. He wants to do his job probably more than any other horse I've ever been around. The only thing he wants to do when he goes to race is win. He's not looking for excuses, he wants to get it done."

Oakwood Ardan, a half-brother to Grand Circuit-winner Ideal Cowboy, won his first six races in the U.S., all at The Meadowlands, before a second-place finish by a neck snapped his streak. Following a two-month respite, the son of Sweet Lou—Trend Setter returned to win three consecutive starts at The Big M, then headed to Mohawk for the Gold Cup Invitational, where he finished fifth despite a :25.4 last quarter mile as he attempted to rally from eighth in the nine-horse field.

He bounced back with two more victories at The Meadowlands, then returned to Mohawk for his two

most recent races, both second-place finishes in the preferred.

Last week, Oakwood Ardan was nipped by a nose by Abuckabett Hanover (the 5-2 morning-line favorite in the Canadian Pacing Derby) after providing first-over cover to his rival around the final turn and into the stretch.

"I would have liked an easier start going into the final, but he still raced good," Cleary said. "He's a horse with such a good attitude. All he wants to do is please you and win. He's got speed, determination, and ability. He's really been the full package. He's just a real pleasure to be around."

Oakwood Ardan has raced from off the pace in all 15 of his North American starts and come home with a last quarter of :26 or faster on eight occasions. He has come home in :26.2 or quicker in 10 of his past 11 races.

"I like the way he can finish a race," Peshina said. "That's the biggest thing. That's really what I like to see."

Oakwood Ardan and regular driver Andy McCarthy will start the Canadian Pacing Derby from post 1. Abuckabett Hanover, a 6-year-old son of Betting Line—All Tucked Up who counts the Dave Brower Memorial and William R. Haughton Memorial among his victories this year, will leave from post 6 with Dexter Dunn in the sulky for trainer Andrew Harris. Oakwood Ardan was eligible to the Brower

and Haughton but did not draw into the fields, which were based on 2023-24 earnings.

Taurasi, who has won 11 of 17 races this year including the Aug. 17 preferred at Mohawk in his most recent start, is the 4-1 third choice. The 5-year-old son of Racing Hill—Voluminous will start from post 11 with Doug McNair driving for Gregg McNair. Four-year-old Voukefalas, the Graduate Series champion, is 9-2 and will leave from post 9. Jordan Stratton will drive the son of Lazarus N—Inittowinafortune for Mike Russo.

"We'll see what happens Saturday," Peshina said. "I'm sure [Oakwood Ardan] will do the best he can. He's a very nice horse and Robert has done a real nice job with him. Like always, we hope he comes through the race safely, and everybody else also. We'll just hope for the best."

The Canadian Pacing Derby will share the spotlight Saturday with the \$600,000 Maple Leaf Trot for older trotters at Mohawk. Periculum, who won his Maple Leaf Trot elimination by 4¾ lengths in 1:51.2 is the 9-5 morning-line favorite. Scott Zeron will drive the 5-year-old son of Muscle Hill—Amour Heiress from post 5 for trainer Marcus Melander.

# Asweetbeachhere glides home, Luna wins six at The Red Mile

On Tuesday (Aug. 27) **Asweetbeachhere** set a new lifetime mark of 1:49.2 fending off Direction by a neck to claim victory by tossing down a :25.4 final panel in the third \$80,000 Kentucky Sire Stakes Championship Series (KYSS) leg for 3-year-pacing fillies, while Marvin Luna continued to sizzle by reining six horses home over the red clay.

Direction (Todd McCarthy) picked up right where she left off after her triumph in the second leg of this series — in front — as the field of seven commenced pacing their mile. The filly clicked off fractions of :26.4, :55.1 and 1:23.1. Meanwhile the winner, with Dexter Dunn at the controls, was sitting in fifth, then fourth but advanced to third by the top of the lane.

As the fillies made their final drive to the wire, Asweetbeachhere had improved to third and Direction was overtaken by a nose by the pocket-sitting favorite Geocentric (Tim Tetrick).

These three ladies put on quite a show advancing to the finish line; however, it was the other gear Asweetbeachhere possessed that enabled her to outlast her rivals. Dan Patch Award winner and Kentucky champion Geocentric rounded out the trifecta.

Asweetbeachhere is a daughter of Sweet Lou—Some Fancy Filly. She is trained by Andrew Harris and notched her second win from nine starts this season. The filly's career resume now stands at 20 6-4-4 and her bankroll swelled to \$305,532.

Bred by Courant A B, Asweetbeachhere is the third foal from her dam and was sold at the 2022 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale for \$115,000 under the name Louisana Raing to Douglas Overhiser.

After a freshman campaign where she was conditioned by Erv Miller and earned \$177,360, Asweetbeachhere was purchased privately in November by her trainer, Bill Pollock and Bruce Areman.

Asweetbeachhere has been knocking on the door. She was third in the \$104,255 Adioo Volo and finished out of the money in the \$100,000 Jerry Silverman

Memorial. As a 2-year-old she was fourth in the \$400,000 Kentucky Sire Stakes Championship behind Geocentric.

The filly is a half-sibling to So Irresistible (Always B Miki, \$269,789) and her granddam, Fancy Filly, is a world champion, as well as a Dan Patch and O'Brien Award Winner. Fancy Filly earned \$1.08 million.

Those who supported Asweetbeachhere at the windows collected \$9.36.

#### **LUNA MAKES A STATEMENT**

New Jersey native Marvin Luna is experiencing a breakout season in 2024. The soon to be 23-year-old entered this year's meet at The Red Mile after finishing second in the driver standings to Atlee Bender at Oak Grove Racing, Gaming and Hotel.

He is also currently sitting in fourth place in the driver standings at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Luna has nearly doubled his starts from last season with 1,160 and has more than doubled his earnings (\$2.42).

Luna, who was introduced to harness racing through his father, Angel, didn't jump right in the deep end of the pool when he began driving in 2020. In fact, he only steered 20 horses and three of those finished third, but Marvin was more intent on acquiring an education and to demonstrate he was here to stay.

While still in high school, Marvin was gainfully employed by Trent Stohler and then became a pupil of Tony Alagna.

Now he can add capturing six races on a single card to his blossoming list of achievements.

Marvin began his hot streak in race 8 with **Betustay** (\$7.58) for Stohler and the duo teamed up for victories in race 10 with **Odds On Liquidity** (\$4.16), race 11 with **Gloryview Image** (\$2.90), race 13 with **Under The Desk** (\$4.24) and the nightcap with **Hungry Girl** (\$7.02).

Marvin also annexed race 9 with **Morningstarbeach** (\$18.28) for Greg Henderson.

#### HEAVY FAVORITES STRONG POISON, ADMIRAL HILL CAPTURE KYSS DIVISIONS FOR 4-YEAR-OLDS

**Strong Poison** (Yannick Gingras), who gave the sport's top ranked horse, Twin B Joe Fresh, all she could handle on this circuit for the last two seasons collected her third win in her last four starts in the second \$35,000 KYSS leg for 4-year-old pacing mares in 1:50.4.

The heavy favorite led at every call through fractions of :27.1, :56.4 and 1:24.3 while never facing significant resistance. Prosecco Princess (T. McCarthy) was second and longshot Keep My Secret (Tony Hall) was third.

Strong Poison, a daughter of Always B Miki—Fiyonce was bred by Steve Stewart, Charles Nash and Julie Nash. She was purchased privately by Let It Ride Stables and Odds On Racing last fall and was previously trained by Ron Burke.

Strong Poison paid \$2.64 to win.

**Admiral Hill** provided Gingras with a sweep of the KYSS events for 4-year-olds. He was a heavy favorite like Strong Poison but had some anxious moments prior to hitting the line in front by a nose in 1:49.1 in the second \$35,000 leg for male pacers.

Blue Lou (David Miller) led the field through a first fraction of :27 but was content to sit in the garden spot as Admiral Hill swept to the front before the half-mile pole. The son of Sweet Lou—Laura Hill went a half in :55 and three quarters 1:23. Speaking Volumes (Hall) did just that as he closed stoutly from fourth with a :25.2 final quarter to just miss. Blue Lou held for third.

Trained by Per Engblom, Admiral Hill was bred by Thomas Hill and is owned by Morrison Stables. Like Strong Poison, he is no stranger to the Bluegrass. In fact, the gelding won the \$50,000 Kentucky Golden Rod Series final as a freshman and the \$100,000 Kentucky Commonwealth Series final as a sophomore while in Chris Ryder's barn.

Admiral Hill has now earned \$535,258 in purse money and improved his record to 38 17-6-5. He is 12 8-1-1 this year and enjoying his best season to date with \$251,450 in the bank.

The favorite paid \$2.66 to win.

Racing continues at The Red Mile on Sunday (Sept. 1), Monday (Sept. 2), and Tuesday (Sept. 3). Sunday's first post is 5:05 p.m., with Monday and Tuesday beginning at 1 p.m.

# Brookview Fancy, JK Pearl Stone pace to career bests in Indiana Sire Stakes

Freshman pacing fillies took to the track on Wednesday (Aug. 28) at Harrah's Hoosier Park with a pair of \$67,500 Indiana Sire Stakes divisions for their fourth leg. The streaking **Brookview Fancy** won her fourth straight, while **JK Pearl Stone** rallied late to score in their respective divisions, each in a lifetime best time.

Brookview Fancy was sent away from post 5 as the 9-5 second-choice on the toteboard with pilot Joey Putnam aboard. Putnam pointed Brookview Fancy to the lead right off the gate, powering clear after an early tussle with Kaks The Boss (driven by Kyle Wilfong) through a hot opening quarter of :26. Putnam stayed on the throttle up the backstretch with Brookview Fancy, guiding the field of seven to the halfway point in :54.4. Brookview Fancy began to separate herself from the field on the final turn, opening up to a 2½-length lead at three-quarters in 1:23.3.

Turning for home, the lead would only continue to grow for Brookview Fancy who opened up by four lengths midway through the stretch with Wunderkindbluechip (Jordan Ross) now in pursuit in second at big odds. Putnam geared down Brookview Fancy late, coasting to the wire a length clear in 1:51.2. Tarshish (Brandon Bates) rallied up the passing lane to finish second at 35-1, while Wunderkindbluechip rounded out the trifecta at 32-1.

Aaron Stutzman trains Brookview Fancy who has won four of five to begin her young career for owner James Miller. Bred by Brookview Farms, the daughter of JK Endofanera—Get Your Armor was a \$13,000 yearling purchase at the

2023 Hoosier Classic and has now banked six-figures with \$108,750 in earnings following the win.

Daughters of JK Endofanera swept the stakes action on the evening following JK Pearl Stone's deep-stretch rally to secure the second division with driver Pete Wrenn. Saddled with post 6 in the field of seven, Wrenn got JK Pearl Stone away in good order, landing in the pocket behind CC Rockin Rosie (Jordan Ross) who laid down the first quarter of :27. CC Rockin Rosie went unchallenged to the half in :55.3 before Trace Tetrick moved Heart Song from fourth to start the outer flow. Heart Song surged alongside CC Rockin Rosie on the turn, putting her nose in front at three-quarters in 1:25.2 while JK Pearl Stone waited for racing room in third.

It looked as though racing room may come too late to JK Pearl Stone as Heart Song skipped away to a four length lead up top before Wrenn could angle JK Pearl Stone to the passing lane. Once in the clear, JK Pearl Stone rocketed home in :27.1 to chase down Heart Song, motoring clear by a length on the wire in 1:52.4. The 4-5 favorite Loveyoucookie (Ricky Macomber, Jr.) finished third, five lengths back of the top two.

Melanie Wrenn trains JK Pearl Stone who was won three of five this season for owners Let It Ride Stables and J L Benson Stables. The daughter of JK Endofanera—Whetstone Hanover was bred by Midland Acres and now sports a bankroll of \$64,840.

# My Debt Collector sets national season's mark in NYSS at Batavia

Record breaking, total domination is the only way to describe the performance put on by **My Debt Collector** (Chapter Seven—Magic Presto) at Batavia Downs on Wednesday (Aug. 28) night who was absolutely peerless while winning the \$102,500 New York Sire Stake for 2-year-old trotting fillies.

My Debt Collector's time of 1:56.4 gave her a new lifetime record, set a new Batavia Downs track record for 2-year-old trotting fillies and established a national season's mark for 2-year-old trotting fillies over a half-mile track. The previous mark of 1:58 was set by Chapvious in NYSS action at Yonkers Raceway on June 25.

Driver Jim Morrill, Jr. sent My Debt Collector right to the front and extended his lead with every stride after that. My Debt Collector hit the quarter in :28.4 up by 2¾ lengths, flew by the half in :57.4 leading by six, and extended that bulge to nine lengths as she passed three-quarters in 1:27 flat. With the other four fillies clearly no match, Morrill had My Debt Collector wrapped up and cruising as she hit the line in front by seven in 1:56.4.

It was the second-straight win and third victory of the season — all in NYSS races — for My Debt Collector (\$2.40) and increased her 2024 bankroll to \$185,259, which now makes her the second richest 2-year-old trotting filly in North America behind only Canadian trotting standout, Monalishi (\$273,125). My Debt Collector is owned by David McDuffee, Melvin Hartman and Little E, who also bred the filly in partnership with Herb Liverman.

There were also two \$20,000 Excelsior races on the card.

In the first, **Flashchap** (Chapter Seven—Wing Flash) won in 2:00.3 for driver Tyler Buter, trainer George Ducharme and owner Purple Haze Stable. John Cummins bred the winner.

The very next race, **K J Title** (E L Titan—Aren't I Hanover) also won in 2:00.3 for driver Drew Monti, trainer Alex Giuliani and owner/breeder Scott Woogen.

After her 4½-length score last week, **Ragtime Red** delivered a similarly dominant performance in the second Maryland Sire Stakes preliminary round for 2-year-old fillies, held Wednesday (Aug. 28) at Ocean Downs, pacing a lifetime-best 1:55.2 mile in her \$10,000 division. Pacer **Lu's Darling** and trotter **K J The Thirteenth** also repeated in their respective divisions.


Ragtime Red sat the pocket behind 19-1 pacesetter Post Jolene through a :58 half before Trae Porter moved her off the pegs and brushed to the lead in a :28.1 third split. Once activated, the Getitoffyourchest—Red High Heels filly sped four lengths clear of her six rivals, and she maintained that margin at the winning post over Toys Little Tinker, who rallied for second. Post Jolene faded to third.

Michael Hall trains Ragtime Red, a three-time winner who competes as a homebred for David Banks. She paid \$2.10 to win.

The other pacing split saw Lu's Darling (\$3.00) and driver Eric Davis turn aside a backstretch challenge from Charlotteslove before evading pocket foe Mygirlmia by 2¼ lengths and winning in a career-best-equaling 1:59.2. Jerry Nock owns, trains and bred the four-time winner, a daughter of Rusty's For Real—Southern Lulu.

In the lone trotting division, K J The Thirteenth (\$2.40) and trainer/driver John Wagner strolled through the first three-quarters in 1:33 before withstanding a late charge from Yall Just Love Me by a diminishing neck in 2:02.3. The Il Mago—My Kid Sister filly has won four times for owners Kelsey Wagner and Scott Woogen.

Davis, Russell Foster and Johnathan Ahle all scored driving doubles on the 11-race card.



# It's My Show seeks more Mohawk magic in Pacing Derby

Although his first three years on the Grand Circuit left his connections wanting more at times, there is no doubt It's My Show knows how to captivate an audience on the big stage.

The son of Sweet Lou—Put On A Show is keyed in ahead of the \$615,000 Canadian Pacing Derby, with the chance to add yet another prestigious item to his already sterling resume.

A trip back to Woodbine Mohawk Park, the site of his valiant 2023 Pepsi North America Cup Victory, comes at the perfect time for It's My Show, who has the class and talent to remind his contemporaries what he's capable of.

One person not in need of a refresher is owner/breeder Richard Young.

"I watched the [NA Cup] replay quite a few times for the first month or so," said Young. "I don't think I've seen it this year, so there's no reason to keep going back. Hopefully, there's a new one coming soon."

The 2024 campaign hasn't exactly gone to plan for Young and the 4-year-old bay gelding, who's 1-2-2 record through 10 starts is a far cry from a monstrous 16 9-4-0 line in 2023.

However, Young firmly believes that the downturn in production is merely a product of tough luck.

And the evidence agrees.

For a horse who routinely posts final quarters in the :26 to :28 second range, Young was baffled by a curious :34.1 in the Prix d'Été on Aug. 18 at Hippodrome Trois Rivieres.

"You look at a horse that paces a mile in [1]:50, [1]:48, and [1]:47, coming home in :25 and :26 in virtually every start, and then all of the sudden, comes home in 34 seconds, and paces a mile in almost two minutes," said Young. "And you go, 'What happened here?'

"In this case, he hit the gate as they were starting, and he went to the front in an extremely fast quarter on a cuppy track, and it was not going to work out well."

It's My Show was back to his explosive ways with an impressive :26.1 final panel in a tune-up effort last time out on Aug. 24 at Mohawk.

"Normally, we would say, 'He raced well, we don't need to do this prep race," said Young. "But because of the Prix d'Été result — you come home in 34 seconds — although you believe it's a throw out, you want to be sure it's a throw out. "So, you race in a prep race you normally wouldn't have gone in, and you race him conservatively, hoping that things can work out. He had a lot coming home. He looked really good, and we said, 'Okay, that was a one-time thing, now we just need to get some racing luck."

It's My Show (34 10-8-3 lifetime) is in good hands with driver Scott Zeron for what will be their 26th start as a tandem.

On the year, to date, Zeron has recorded 124 wins, a UDRS of 0.286, and more than \$6.7 million in purse earnings across 924 starts.

While the circumstances heading into Saturday may feel different than the NA Cup, Young, who bought his first horse in 1987, is confident in his million-dollar homebred pacer (\$1.44 million in lifetime earnings).

"I went into the NA Cup thinking, 'We have the best horse," said Young. "Maybe we didn't have the best horse, but we got our own way, so to speak, and did win the race.

"Going into this race, we're certainly not the favorite, but we're certainly not 15-1, either. I like his chances because he's flexible. We can do what we want to do with him. He's won coming from off the pace, and he's won it in front. We prefer to come off the pace, but sometimes the field and the post position dictate and you have no choice."

The number of eyes on It's My Show might be down from last year, but Young knows his ratings are as strong as they've ever been.

"It's hard to forget about It's My Show," he said. "To completely forget about him is probably a mistake — I don't think they forget about him much — but they're not thinking of him in the manner of which he was thought of last year, which is fine with me."

# Meadowlands' "Mini Meet" kicks off today

If it's true good things come in small packages, the upcoming two weeks at The Meadowlands are not to be missed. That's because the mile oval will be conducting a brief "Mini Meet" where live action will be contested over a two-week period where four programs will be in the spotlight before harness racing takes a five-week break.

The Mini Meet race dates are Aug. 30 and 31 and Sept. 6 and 7. Post time is 6:20 p.m.

"This meeting might be brief," said Big M chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "But it will have some serious racing as the New Jersey Classic will take center

stage with eliminations during our opening weekend and eight championship finals — with total purses estimated at \$1.7 million — during closing weekend."

For those of you who follow Big M happenings, you know the track just took a three-week hiatus after another highly successful Hambletonian Day, where Karl gave driver Yannick Gingras his first-ever Hambletonian win while trainer Nancy Takter notched her second-consecutive score in harness racing's version of the Kentucky Derby, which was seen live coast-to-coast on broadcast television on FOX Sports.

Betting, as usual, was a Hambletonian Day delight. For the sixth time in the last seven years, all-source handle on the Hambletonian Day program topped \$7 million, with the 2020 COVID-19 card the only one to fail to reach that plateau.

Despite several downpours during the course of the day, a total of \$7,427,223 was wagered on the blockbuster 16-race program, good for an average per race of \$464,201.

Business was predictably brisk on the Hambletonian itself, as \$1,115,982 was pushed through the windows on "America's Trotting Classic," the third year in a row where betting busted the million-dollar barrier.

Taking a look further down the road, when The Meadowlands returns on Oct. 18 after the Mini Meet concludes, the action will be sizzling from the start as the Breeders Crown — harness racing's \$7-million end-of-the-year championship extravaganza — will come to town with eliminations on the 18th and 19th, followed by the big-money finals one week later, on the 25th and 26th.

By the way, fans of thoroughbred and standardbred racing are in for a treat on Oct. 18. That Friday will see a rare doubleheader at The Big M, when the harness action gets underway at a special early post time of 12:30 p.m. before a program of turf racing for the "runners" begins at 7 p.m.

# Logan Park continues to make his mark

Rob Fellows had circled Hip #54 in his notebook well before the tall, sleek horse set foot into the sales ring.

It was a moment he had anticipated and prepared for, the one when the trotter who would become known as Logan Park entered the building at the London Select Yearling Sale in October of 2019.

The horseman with a wealth of experience and success had not come to the sale on a whim.

It was, of all things, familiarity with a Standardbred family tree that prompted Fellows to be there that day.

"That year, as a 2-year-old, I had a little horse called All Wrapped Up. He was out of the first crop of Archangel. I only paid \$11,000 for him and he went on to make \$600,000. He wasn't mentally all there, but I liked the way he trotted, so I was looking for another Archangel at the sale."

And there he was.

The only dilemma for Fellows and his partners was the price tag.

There were two Archangel offspring on the auction block, so the group had a decision to make.

At least that is what Fellows had originally thought.

"We could only afford one," he said. "So, Logan Park was our pick. He came out first and we spent the money to buy him.

"He looked racier, tall, thin – a bigger version of All Wrapped Up. His disposition was fantastic, he looked good, and he was very well-prepped as a yearling."

Standing in line to make the purchase official, Fellows felt a tap on his shoulder.

"The irony was that I was waiting to pay for him and my partners went and bought the other Archangel," Fellows said. "They handed me a ticket and said, 'We bought the other one.' We paid \$60,000 for that one, Mooseonyourcaboose, and they trained down as a team together to about 2:15."

Their respective racing careers would yield vastly different results.

Mooseonyourcaboose has posted a lone victory and \$28,565 in purse earnings over a 21-race career that ended a little over two years ago.

Logan Park, on the other hand, is still very much at the top of his game after 74 starts, 31 wins, and close to \$1.3 million in career earnings.

"He was always our favorite," said Fellows. "He was sensible."

And talented.

As a rookie, Logan Park won two races, one of them an Ontario Sire Stakes race.

"We did geld him because he was more aggressive in the barn than we wanted him to be," Fellows said. "We are not aggressive trainers. They show it to us when they start racing. We keep them fit, try to keep them healthy – but I thought he was a pretty damn good horse."

As a sophomore, Logan Park showed signs of what was to come.

That year, he won five races, four in ONSS events, before he headed to the U.S. to contest the Breeders Crown at The Meadowlands. After a second in his elimination, he was saddled with post 10 in the final. He broke stride shortly after the start.

At 4, with Fellows' son, Kyle, now doing the training, Logan Park climbed the trotting ladder ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park, and competed in the Maple Leaf Trot, Charlie Hill Memorial and Caesars Trotting Classic. He finished fifth in the Breeders Crown, which was held at his home base in Milton, ON.

In 2023, he hit his best stride and became front-page racing news.

Logan Park won 12 out of his 20 starts. He came out on top in seven of his first 10 races of the year against top-ranked competition at Woodbine Mohawk Park. On July 4, he took the free for All there by  $5\frac{1}{2}$  lengths in 1:50.3, which set a new track and Canadian record for an older male trotter.

He then netted a natural hat trick in the fall, tying his lifetime best of 1:50.3 two times in succession in October.

Logan Park then travelled to Hoosier Park where he took top prize in his Breeders Crown elimination in 1:52.1, and finished fourth in the \$600,000 final, less than three lengths behind the winner.

His efforts did not go unnoticed come trophy season.

At the O'Brien Awards, Logan Park was named Older Trotter of the Year in 2023.

If there were questions as to whether he would be able to replicate that brilliant campaign, he has provided an emphatic answer in the form of an outstanding 2024 season.

In 10 starts this year, Logan Park has won seven times, finished second twice, along with one third.

His biggest payday came in the Earl Rowe Memorial Trot in August at Georgian Downs when he took the \$100,000 race by  $1\frac{1}{4}$  lengths in 1:54.2.

On Aug. 23, he won his Maple Leaf Trot elimination in 1:51, coming home in :27.4 with Doug McNair in the race bike.

On Saturday, Logan Park, now 6, will be back on track to take on nine talented rivals in a race he has contested twice before. He was fifth in both 2022 and 2023.

McNair will be in the sulky for the \$600,000 final.

"I went through seven or eight drivers, including Louis-Philippe Roy, Jody Jamieson, James MacDonald, but it has all worked out well," said Fellows. "He's been good for everyone who has driven him. He's a nice horse."

One who has come a long way from a not-so-smooth beginning.

"I love his gait," said Fellows. "He would make a break as a young horse at a point in the first turn. He would lead with his left front into the turn and when he was going at that high speed, he just couldn't handle it.

"So, we put trotting hobbles on him and every year, I have toyed with the idea of taking them off, but I don't have that luxury of time at times. Being a non-driving trainer, you have to have them perfect so that they can perform at a high level for whoever gets in the race bike."

As for the blueprint to a successful voyage in Saturday's big race, Fellows has the luxury of sending out a trotter who can get the job done any number of ways.

"He has speed," Fellows said. "He can leave like a pacer, but once he sits in a hole, he can sit and follow all day too. He's not a hot horse who will race over top of one in front of him. He's an easy, happy horse to drive."

Fellows would know.

"My grandson, who is 3, when he is around, he wants to sit on my lap when I jog Logan Park. We have some trails through the woods here and he'll do anything you want."

Win or lose come Saturday, Logan Park will continue to take his connections on a treasured thrill ride.

Every now and again, Fellows will take a moment to recall that life-changing day at the London yearling sale.

While it would be understandable if he were slightly boastful of his good fortune, it is not in the nature of the man with 1,570 career training wins.

Being grateful, however, certainly is.

"When you start out, these are the horses you dream of having," he said. "All the people in the sport that you have the utmost respect for, you look at their success and ask yourself, 'Could that happen to me one day?'

"With Logan Park, we have truly been blessed."

# Marty Adler, 81, dies

Former Windsor Raceway track announcer and harness racing advocate Martyn 'Marty' Allan Adler passed away peacefully on Aug. 24, 2024 at the age of 81 after putting up a long and courageous fight with cancer.

Marty was born to Sol and Belle (Isenberg) Adler on July 1, 1943 in Windsor, ON. Marty was the older brother of Cheryl and Richard. After changes to district boundaries, he attended three high schools: Patterson, Kennedy and Massey Collegiate. He then studied at the University of Western Ontario where he planned to become Marty Adler MD, but left and became Marty Adler DJ.

Marty developed his work ethic during his teen years waking up at 4 a.m. to deliver baked goods for the family bakery. Marty was a huge fan of life in Essex County and promoted it throughout his life. Some will remember him as host of Reach for the Top or for his sportscasting 'shtick' on the CBC. Besides reporting on all the pro sports, he loved highlighting the high school teams and especially enjoyed giving students their '15 minutes of fame'. Later, he went on to produce commercials and corporate videos for local businesses at his production company, Great Lakes TV.

Others will remember Marty as the Windsor Raceway track announcer where he spent many late nights for 40 years. He loved all facets of harness racing, including training and driving his own horses. He was a tireless advocate of the sport.

In retirement, Marty moved to Amherstburg, falling in love with its quaint small-town feel. He wanted his last hoorah to be for this town and after three years and numerous obstacles, CKBG – The Burg, flooded the airwaves on July 3, 2023. A year later, CKBG was awarded the platinum designation for radio from the Windsor Community Voters. He last signed off the air on July 13, 2024 during his do-op dance party as Marty Adler DJ, coming full circle.

Marty was just as creative and passionate in his personal life always going over the top for his children doing things in his own zany way for Marcie Howard (Jeremy), Michael Adler (Irina) and Gregory Adler and his grandchildren Russell, Alden, Sophia, Ewan, Cael and Sammy. He was also friends until the end with his ex-wife, Lynne. He will be missed by many more friends and family, including brother Richard Adler and sister Cheryl Brody, nieces and nephews Jason, Adam, Seth, Noah, Erin and Amanda, and many others.

A graveside service was held on Monday (Aug. 26, 2024), at Shaar Hashomayim Cemetery, in Windsor, ON.

The Burke Racing consignment also featured the solid Hoosier Park conditioned pacer Flirtin JK purchased by William Hart of Maine for \$38,000.

Sale runner-up honors belonged to another open pacer, Odds On Blockchain consigned by Spring Haven Farm, agent. Luke Hanners of Ohio, signed the ticket for \$45,000 for the son of JK Endofanera with lifetime earnings of \$202,431 including \$66,120 this year racing in Kentucky.

The yearling portion of the sale represented the first opportunity for horsemen to get started on next year's dreams. Interest was strong and the crowd diverse with the 139 yearlings going to buyers from 14 states and Canada. Pump Action, a classy bay son of Ohio stalwart Long Tom, was purchased by Rosy Weaver of Ohio for \$29,000 from Walnut Valley Equine. Dublin Valley Farm brought a nice consignment that was led by the What The Hill colt, Dublins Sidney, with Dalton Walls of Ohio signing the ticket for \$28,000. Midland Acres' well-turned-out consignment included the filly Nice Set Of Pipes from the first crop of Summa Cum Laude. She was purchased by Dana Parham for \$22,000.
