McWicked defeats Lazarus in Canadian Pacing Derby thriller

McWicked overcame a quarter crack — thanks to the work of farrier Wayne Crouse — to win the 76th edition of Canada's oldest harness race for trainer Casie Coleman, owner Ed James and driver David Miller.

McWicked (David Miller) won the 76th edition of the Canadian Pacing Derby in 1:49 on Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

McWicked, with a first over trip, overtook 1-5 favorite Lazarus N, The Wonder From Down Under, with an impressive stretch move to win Saturday's \$600,000 Canadian Pacing Derby, at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Trained by Casie Coleman for Ed James' S S G Stables, the 7-year-old son of Mcardle—Western Sahara added to his more than \$3-million in purse earnings while providing Coleman with her first Canadian Pacing Derby title and driver David Miller with his third.

Coleman finished second in the 2012 edition of the Canadian Pacing Derby with Betterthancheddar and was thrilled to go one better this year.

"I've always wanted to win this race," said Coleman. "I was second with Betterthancheddar once but was never able to win it."

McWicked, who banked \$300,000 for the Canadian Pacing Derby win, overcame more than just a Down Under champion.

"He's been off a few weeks and I never told anybody but he's coming off a quarter crack and that's the reason he was scratched from the qualifier," said Coleman. "When he was first over coming onto Lazarus, I wasn't overly happy, but it worked out great. Dave said the scary part is how easy he did it. He said he was just absolutely phenomenal and had lots left.

"(Farrier) Wayne Crouse did a really phenomenal job fixing (the quarter crack) for me. If there were eliminations, we might have not raced and had to scratch (McWicked)."

Coleman also won the \$112,904 Lady Maud at Yonkers on Saturday with Alexis Faith.

"It was a good night," Coleman said, adding that it was partly spoiled by the fact McWicked's owner, Ed James, was in a car accident on the way to the Mohawk. "Hopefully, he's alright," the trainer said.

As for the race, Filibuster Hanover and Nirvana Seelster

powered off the gate with the former marking the opening quarter in :26.4. Lazarus N, pacing in third position in rein to Yannick Gingras, brushed to the front down the backstretch to make the half in :55.1.

Lazarus N, purchased by Taylor Made earlier this year, had won 36 of 46 starts and accumulated \$2.8 million in earnings heading into the Canadian Pacing Derby. However, his lead through the final turn was under serious threat as McWicked, in range and powering up, had the measure of Lazarus and opened up with conviction to secure the upset win as the 7-2 second choice in 1:49. Lazarus N held on strong for place over Split the House.

"It's a great feeling. It's a great race to win, a lot of tradition and a lot of money," said Miller. "You can't take nothing away from (McWicked). A first-over grind into Lazarus, I wasn't too confident around the last turn, but I got into the stretch and my horse felt really strong. I asked him, and he did the rest."

At age seven, McWicked is showing no signs of slowing down.

"He was great as a 3-year-old and won everything I put him in pretty much," said Coleman. "At four, it was a tough year for him. He made \$200,000 but he didn't have a win. I lost him for awhile and he came back, and he's just been phenomenal the past couple years."

Coleman is looking forward to seeing her star pupil continue to battle with the 'Wonder From Down Under' as the season continues.

"It's going to be a fun season. I was having fun without Lazarus, it was a little bit easier competition. There's going to be some exciting racing, we're paid into everything and I'm sure he's paid into everything. I'm sure we'll see each other a lot coming up this summer," said Coleman.

The runner-up finish by Lazarus drops 'The Wonder from Down Under' to 1-for-2 in North America. The Pacing Derby was his first start since winning the Dan Patch at Hoosier Park on Aug. 10.

"He raced good, just a little tired finishing," said Gingras of Lazarus' performance. "He needs some racing. The other horse is a good horse and went a big mile and you've got to give him credit, but I think my horse needs a couple starts." McWicked, bred by Andray Farm of Pennsylvania, paid \$9.70 to win.

Crazy Wow springs 31-1 upset in Maple Leaf Trot

Jody Jamieson wins his second Maple Leaf Trot while delivering the first for trainer Marcus Melander.

Crazy Wow, piloted by Jody Jamieson, posted a barefoot 31-1 upset over favored Marion Marauder in Saturday's \$651,000 Maple Leaf Trot, at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Trained by Marcus Melander for owners Our Horse Cents Stables, Stable 45, J And T Silva Stables LLC and Deo Volente Farms LLC, the 6-year-old son of Crazed—No Pan No Gain was first off the gate and first when it mattered most in the Canadian classic.

Will Take Charge overtook the speedy Crazy Wow and Emoticon Hanover to make the quarter in :27.1 and the half in :55.1. Ariana G moved first over with Marion Marauder following her cover, but it was Crazy Wow, sitting second late in the turn, that had the most to offer down the lane to spring the upset in 1:51.1.

While the public was surprised, Jamieson, who previously won the Maple Leaf Trot in 2012 with Mister Herbie, was not.

"I thought I was even-money," joked Jamieson when asked what he thought of his chances going into the race. "I talked to Marcus (Melander) and he said he was real confident in the horse. We actually hooked up jogging (in the warm ups) with St Lads Neptune and this horse, Crazy Wow, and he said, 'Look at him. Look how happy he is.' I couldn't argue with him, the horse looked amazingly happy. When the horse saw the gate tonight he was just a different animal."

Although it was Jamieson's first time piloting the 6-year-old, the veteran driver performed with confidence.

"I've watched him race plenty of times, but I didn't realize what kind of horse he was," said Jamieson. "That was a big trip tonight and he made it look real easy."

Jamieson made the winning move at the top of the lane, when squeezing inside of Will Take Charge.


"I wasn't sure I was going to get through. Around the last turn, I was following what I figured was the best horse in the race, Will Take Charge," said Jamieson. "And with Ariana G out there I figured maybe I'm going to be third at the very worst, and a little slim lane opened up and I jammed myself through there like I get in trouble sometimes for doing, but he just trotted right through there. Once I got through there clean it was never in doubt that he was going to win."

Melander made the key decision to pull Crazy Wow's shoes

for the lucrative final.

"I've been thinking about that since I got the horse eight weeks ago," said Melander. "We trained him our way and then he qualified good at Pocono. He was a little short last week, of course, after just one qualifier after eight weeks break.

"We were actually supposed to race barefoot last week. But, there were two scratches in the race and we only had to beat one horse, so we kept the shoes on and saved the feet on him. The track was amazing today and it was an easy

decision."

Like Jamieson, Melander approached the Maple Leaf Trot final with confidence noting that he wasn't surprised at all with the winning effort.

"Not really when we got the one-hole. He showed that he's been beating these horses before and the horse felt so sharp going into the race," offered Melander. "He needed a race last week and I was very happy with him this week and he warmed up great. I know he has an


extra gear when I pull the shoes, that's for sure."

Big night at Yonkers for Stay Hungry, Svanstedt trotters

Stay Hungry wins the Messenger and is now one win away from the Pacing Triple Crown. Six Pack won the Yonkers Trot in 1:54.

Stay Hungry moved one step nearer the Pacing Triple Crown with a win in Saturday's Messenger Stakes at Yonkers Raceway while trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt enjoyed a record-setting night in trotting stakes action for 3-year-olds by capturing the Yonkers Trot with Six Pack and Hudson Filly Trot with Plunge Blue Chip.

Plunge Blue Chip won the \$129,014 Hudson in 1:53.1, the fastest trotting mile in Yonkers history and equaled Frau Blucher's world record for a 3-year-old female trotter on a half-mile track, set in 2013 at the Delaware County Fair in central Ohio. Six Pack won the \$500,000 Yonkers Trot in 1:54, the fastest Yonkers Trot ever at Yonkers.

Stay Hungry won the \$500,000 Messenger Stakes for 3-year-old pacers by a neck over favorite Jimmy Freight in 1:52.1. Topville Olympian was third.

The Messenger Stakes is the second jewel in the Pacing Triple Crown. Stay Hungry won the first, the Cane Pace, on Aug. 4 at the Meadowlands and can complete the sweep of the Crown races with a win in the Little Brown Jug on Sept. 20 at the Delaware County Fair.

Stay Hungry, driven by Doug McNair for trainer Tony Alagna, was among four horses racing for the early lead in the Messenger, with Winston, Babes Dig Me, and Jimmy Freight. Stay Hungry, who started from post six, got to the front as the field reached the opening quarter-mile in :27.1 and remained in front from there, but not without a fight.

Jimmy Freight, who started from post eight, came after Stay Hungry as the horses made their way around the second turn and headed to the half-mile point. The two raced together to the half in :55.3 and three-quarters in 1:23 and continued to battle down the stretch.

"I actually had my horse too much up on his toes," McNair said. "I could have taken my time a little bit more (going for the lead), I just thought Jimmy would get over there a little quicker than he did, but it all worked out.

"They both got pretty tired there the last sixteenth (of a mile). We got lucky to hold on.

"Tony does a great job with (Stay Hungry). He's just a pleasure to drive. Every week he gives you a hundred percent. The front end usually isn't his forte, but he showed tonight that he could do it."

Alagna has won the Messenger three times in four years.

"When we're doing the staking, I have in mind horses that I think will suit the racetrack, suit this style of racing," Alagna said. "This horse has always been very good in the turns, even though maybe it's not his forte to do the run-and-gun, but I thought he was a horse that could get around here. After the horse won the Cane, it was a no-brainer; we had to go for the Triple Crown, so that's why we brought him here tonight... We've been very blessed in this race. It's a great race for us."

Stay Hungry has won four of 10 races this year and 10 of 19 in his career, good for \$1.15 million in purses. The colt, a son of Somebeachsomewhere out of My Little Dragon, is owned by Brad Grant and the Irwin Samelman Estate.

Sent off as the 5-2 second choice behind 3-5 Jimmy Freight, Stay Hungry paid \$7.60 to win.

In the Yonkers Trot, Six Pack took the lead from Lindsey's Pride prior to the quarter-mile point and was never threatened the rest of the way. He won by 7-3/4 lengths over Helpisontheway, with Lindsey's Pride finishing third.

The Yonkers Trot is the second jewel in the Trotting Triple Crown. Atlanta won the first, the Hambletonian, but was not eligible to the Yonkers Trot. The third jewel is the Kentucky Futurity, Oct. 7 at Lexington's Red Mile.

"The horse to beat was (Helpisontheway) and he didn't go to the lead today, so I didn't need to stress my horse," Svanstedt said about his methodical drive to the front in the early stages. "It was (Helpisontheway) that I was afraid of."


A son of Muscle Mass out of Pleasing Lady, Six Pack has won six of nine races this year and 10 of 17 lifetime. He has earned \$849,840 for owners Svanstedt, Little E LLC, Stall Kalmar FF, and Lars Berg.

Six Pack, the 1-5 favorite, paid \$2.50 to win.

In the Hudson, Plunge Blue Chip led from start to finish, but had to hold off Supergirl Riley by a nose at the wire. Lucky Ava finished third.

A daughter of Muscle Mass out of Dunk The Donato, Plunge Blue Chip has won four of nine races this year and 13 of 19 in her career. She has earned \$732,316.

"The horses need to be sound and must be good gaited to handle a (half-mile) track," Svanstedt said. "Plunge and Six Pack are good horses."

Sent off as the 1-5 favorite, Plunge Blue Chip paid \$2.50 to win.

Another 1-5 favorite, Alexis Faith, won the \$112,904 Lady Maud for 3-year-old female pacers by a half-length over Solitary in 1:53.4. Jewels Forreal finished third.

Alexis Faith is a daughter of American Ideal out of Cannae Cammie. She has won four of 11 races this season and 10 of 20 in her career, with purses totaling \$455,198.

Driven by Jim Morrill Jr. for trainer Casie Coleman, Alexis Faith paid \$2.60 to win.

Ted Wing's lifelong mission

Horseman Ted Wing is headed for the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2019, but he's far from retired. "I've never done anything else and there's never been an instant where I thought of doing anything else," he said.

"Getting inducted into the Hall of Fame, yes, that's very nice. It's a good pat on the back, but the Hall of Fame is not a place where you should go to die. I'd still rather be out there winning the Little Brown Jug — especially if I could do it with a horse I own myself."

- Ted Wing: speaking about his impending induction into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

Now 70, and laying low while training a horse here and there, Ted Wing belongs to that small but elite group of harness racing drivers who changed the way the harness game was played out on the track in the 1960s and 1970s.

With a clock in his head and not in his hand, his patented

quarter-pole brush to the top, and a bold three-wide tip-and-go at the five-eighths pole that was beloved by half-mile track punters, Wing sped up the pace and the action wherever he drove. His innovative ideas about movement and flow in races – daring stuff for the time – has had a profound and lasting impact on how drivers drive in races today.

Ted Wing was born in Farmington, ME to Morris and Emily Wing. Morris Wing was a manager at Woodlands International Paper Company, but he drove and trained horses on the side. According to Ted, a mare named Northern Maid is probably the horse he first remembers.

"I basically grew up around horses," Wing said. "One day I saw my father jog that mare and I said, 'By God! This is the deal.'

"I think I won my first race when I was about 12 years old. Of course, I did a lot of skiing too, and I'm known for that, but I could only ski when there was snow. Racing and training horses is something you can do at any time and you can earn

a good living as well."

Wing was indeed an Olympic-caliber skier who competed as a Junior against some of the biggest names in slalom and downhill, but the long-believed story wherein he quit skiing because of a blinding injury is simply not true.

"Heck no," said Wing. "I lost my eye long before I ever wore a pair of skis. I stopped skiing because I wanted to train and drive horses. It's what I wanted to do then, and it's what I want to do now. I've never even considered anything else. Like I said, you need snow to ski. It's a seasonal thing. It was the harness horses who pulled me away from my skiing.


"Truth is, I lost my eye when I was a toddler and, messing around like toddlers do, I got a hold of a carving fork and jabbed my eye. I was about two, and my parents drove me all the way to a special hospital in Boston to try and save my eye, but they couldn't, so I went on with my life from there. Having one eye didn't affect my skiing a bit, although it should have, and I was pretty sure it wasn't going to affect my ability to drive horses," Wing said.

"My father knew that I was a good driver, so he took the time to speak to a local guy by the name of Freddie Roullard. Freddie was driving horses for Clearview Farm and he had only one eye too. He gave me good advice, and I listened. I'd also stand around and watch him drive, and I figured out a few things and it helped, but a lot of drivers will tell you that you drive with your hands and not your eyes. I learned how to tip my head one way or the other, just a bit to get the right view, and my hearing took over for my lost eye too. I could tell when a horse was coming and how far away they were. A lot of times I could even hear who the horse was, or at least I sensed who it was."

When Ted was 16, his parents, supportive of their son's driving and training ambitions, dropped him off at Presque Isle Racetrack where he would spend the next two months living in a tack room and racing two horses. That's where things started to snowball.

"I started doing really well and the old-timers were impressed with my work ethic. I'd be there working in the morning before they got in and I'd still be working in my barn after they'd all gone home. There was this one horseman, a truly great horseman named Link Keene. He gave me all the ups and downs. He told me what to do and what not to do. I listened intently, and I learned a lot from that man.

Despite his youth, Ted Wing quickly became a major force on the New England circuit; winning driving titles at Rockingham and Foxboro from 1970 to 1975 while driving against some of the best drivers in harness racing history.

Wing caught the racing bug early and says he was hooked for life.

"Jim Doherty was the toughest driver I ever had to go up against," Wing said. "He was always going forward and so were his horses. Jim was a guy who was under way all the time, but you know, that's how you learn to be better yourself. I was around a lot of guys who really knew how to drive a horse."

At 26, Ted Wing was the youngest American-born driver to win 1,000 races and the second youngest to win 2,000 and 3,000. He is already enshrined in the New England Harness Racing Hall of Fame alongside many of his friendly rivals from the past, including Canadian imports such as Jim Doherty and Bill O'Donnell.

Joe DeFrank, the racing secretary at the Meadowlands, and a man with a keen eye for talented horsemen, asked Ted to come down and give it a try on the brand-new mile oval which had just opened in 1976 to resounding success. In New England, Ted's driving style had always attracted fans to the track and bettors to the window, so it was logical to think that he would do the same thing for the new racetrack in New Jersey. He didn't disappoint.

Nicknamed "The Major" by Roosevelt track announcer Jack E. Lee, Ted Wing became a superstar when, in 1978, he finished up the Meadowlands meet with the leading driver trophy. He also took home driving titles from Yonkers and Roosevelt Raceway while sitting behind horses such as Calvert, Butler BG, Skip By Night, Stabilizer, Total Freight and literally thousands of others. He also had his turn in the bike

with super horses such as Tarport Hap, Gallo Blue Chip and Courageous Lady.

"Catch driving can be very lucrative and it was what I did," said Wing. "The real money, if you want to work harder, is to train and race your own horses. You can make a good living and make some real money. In my barn, I always tried to be in the situation where the best horse in my barn was one that I owned myself."

Ted Wing proved that training his own horses was a viable formula with a horse named Art Attack that he claimed for \$50,000 on Hambletonian Day in 2001. The super-sized stallion went on to win \$650,000 over the next five years and was described by Wing as, "the most amazingly perfect physical specimen you will ever see."

While nowhere near as active in racing as he once was, Ted Wing now lives comfortably in Montgomery, NY with his wife, Jackie Allen Wing. Together, Jackie and Ted have two children, Ryan and Stacey, and four grandchildren, Baldo, Enzo, Melina and Layla. Ted's mom Emily is 96 and lives in Maine. His dad died many years ago.

"Mom is sharp as a tack," Wing said. I speak to her all the time and we visit as often as possible. It's amazing when I'm on the phone with her because it's as if time has never passed. We talk about the same kind of things and it might as well be 60 years ago."

Ted Wing dodges the retirement question before it can even be asked.

"Right now, I'm training one horse, because I've slowed things down a bit, but I don't understand what 'retired' is or what it really means. This is all I've ever done. There is no questioning why I decided to make it my life and there's no questioning that I will continue making it my life. Now I'm in the Hall of Fame for all of that, and that's nice because I'm being recognized for something that I set out to do from the start. I've never done anything else and there's never been an instant where I thought of doing anything else."

My hot (or maybe not so hot) takes on recent harness racing rumblings

There's been quite a bit of news and opinion released recently in the sport, and I have an opinion of my own — you're shocked, I know — on a few of these items. Please allow me to share them with you.

Red Mile million-dollar 2-year-old trot race

Just this week it was announced that Red Mile, Hambletonian Society, Lexington Selected Sale and the KHRC are putting together a race for a cool million for freshman square gaiters in 2019 .This race will certainly help the breeding side of the sport – the winner will more than likely be sinking the lion's share of the purse back into the sales – and there's certainly nothing wrong with that. But I can't help but be a little perplexed.

In Sweden, purse money is large for older trotters. It's one of the reasons why so many of the good 3-year-olds stateside (like Nuncio) move overseas for their older campaigns. As well, because of lesser purse money for 2- and 3-year-old events, the trotters in Europe are given time to develop; and develop they do, sometimes racing at high levels until age 8 or 9. In an ideal world, and in my view, a one million-dollar race for older trotters in the U.S. would be so, so nice.

Open draw blues

Elimination races cause us all much dismay. If it's not bettors wondering why the races are betting affairs — where the lack of effort by some horses and drivers hoping to just make a final cause millions of dollars to be burned each year — to the complaints about the winners not getting a great post for the final, there's griping from everywhere.

If harness racing was thoroughbred racing, there'd be an open draw with eight, or nine, or ten entrants, and off we go. But that's simply not feasible.

Brett Sturman wrote about Jimmy Freight's eight hole blues this week and I mostly agree with his take. Elimination races are just that – races to eliminate horses from a final. They were never designed to give the best horses the best posts when the big money is on the line. In my view, we should look at a final as a stand-alone event and all of them should have open draws.

B is for branding

Back in 2009, I was invited to be a participant on the Breeders' Cup digital marketing committee. I was amazed how focused the Cup's board was on their event and its branding. They work very hard each year to ensure they're branding properly.

Comparing the Breeders Crown to the Breeders' Cup is impossible (just look at the balance sheets), but I was very happy to see the Crown put a big "B" in front of its branding for this year's races at Pocono by announcing lowering takeout for the weekend.

Players and fans have long complained about Pennsylvania's egregious takeout rates, and in my view it has damaged the Breeders Crown brand. This is a great step by the Hambletonian Society and Pocono.

Atlanta versus Manchego

On an otherwise sleepy Friday evening, the action on social media and video screens near you was rampant when the gate sprung for the Casual Breeze at Mohawk. In the end, Manchego handled the (likely not fully cranked) Hambletonian champ Atlanta with relative ease.

Races like these give existing fans something to get excited about, and they help attract others like Thoroughbred fans Ed and Craig, too.


Speaking of thoroughbreds.....

The Kentucky Downs all turf, short five-day meet began this weekend in Franklin, KY and their recent numbers are nothing short of staggering. They've seen handle growth of over 400 per cent (they lowered their takeout to the lowest in the nation several years ago), oversubscribed races (they use instant racing money for purses) and incredible fan interest.

Can harness racing use this sort of meet as a blueprint, or is it pie in the sky? I think the former.

Special performances at Vincennes and the Finnish Derby

Paris track Vincennes offered a great schedule for the trotters on Saturday afternoon and the Criterium for 5-year-olds was the biggest stakes race on the day.

The race turned out to be a battle between two great horses and drivers. Jean-Michel Bazire and Franck Nivard are, without doubt, the two best drivers in Paris and Bazire looked quite comfortable in third over behind Davidson du Pont (Pacha du Pont) until midway in the 3,000-meters (approximately 1.9 miles) long race. With 1,400 meters to go, Davidson du Pont was the new leader of the race and 400

meters later, Nivard had moved Delia du Pommereux to position outside the leader.

The two front horses started a hard battle in the last turn and they left the other trotter far behind in the home stretch. Two horses that fought, two drivers that didn't want to lose and the Criterium des 5 ans was a spectacular show for the spectators at Vincennes racetrack.

The bettors' first choice, Davidson du Pont, won by a nose in mile rate 1:56.3 over the large distance and added \$125,000 to his career earnings of \$478,000 prior the Saturday race.

The 3-year-old trotters battled in two divisions during the day and \$63,000 awaited the winner in the Prix Victor Regis for colts and geldings and in the Prix Uranie for the mares. Ready Cash son Fabulous Wood, driven by Matthieu Abrivard, bested his antagonists in a mile rate of 1:57 over 1.3 miles and moved to the front from fourth over with a half-mile to go. Fabulous Wood's mother Qualita Bourbon (Love You) was a top trotter in France and won 21 of 31 starts. She landed on \$1,790,560 in career earnings.

Ready Cash was the sire of the day since his Fly With Me was an upset winner in 1:57.1 in the Prix Uranie.



Racing under saddle is a big game in France and 8-year-old gelding Arlington Dream really knows how to make a memorable performance on the track. On Saturday afternoon, the son of Ready Cash outclassed his opponents in mile rate 1:54 over 1.3 miles in the \$140,000 Prix Camille Lepecg.

As a 3-year-old, Franck Leblanc-trained Erminig d'Oliverie (Scipion du Goutier) belonged in the upper part of the crop among the mares and in the \$126,000 Prix Guy le Gonidec she was too tough for the 15 opponents. From position first over, driver Franck Nivard had everything under control already in the last turn and the home stretch became an easy stairwell to the victory in 1.58.2 over 1.7 miles.

Hachiko de Veluwe best in Finland

A stunning performance made Timo Nurmos'-trained Hachiko de Veluwe a winner in \$350,000 Derby at Vermo racetrack in Helsinki, Finland on Saturday afternoon.

Driver Jorma Kontio knows how to win the race for 4-year-olds. The victory with Hachiko de Veluwe was his ninth and trainer Timo Nurmos (both working in Sweden, at Solvalla) was noted for his fifth in the biggest race for 4-year-old trotters in their previous home country.

Hachiko de Veluwe (Timoko) had to do it the hard way before he entered the winner's circle. Lexus Dream left quickly for the lead and driver Ari Moilanen decided to let his horse stay in that position while he was allowed to keep the pace down midway through the 1.7 miles long race.

With a half mile to go, Lexus Dream was given order to put in an extra gear and in the last turn, the chasing Hachiko de Veluwe seemed to have problems with keeping up the pace behind the leader.

But Jorma Kontio never gave up the game and the son of Timoko disarmed Lexus Dream in the home stretch to victory in mile rate 1:58.

Lexington sale preview from a stock market trader

The macro-economic picture is incredibly strong for the following reasons:

- 1. The Dow Jones Industrial Average is up 7,717 points or 42 per cent while the Nasdaq Composite is up 2,824 points or 54.3 per cent since the day Donald J. Trump was elected President in November, 2016. So far during 2018, the Dow Jones Industrial Average is up 1,330 points or 5.3 per cent while the Nasdaq Composite is up 1,114 points or 16.1 per cent. Both averages are at record highs and most stock market investors have been enriched, some substantially depending upon their investments.
- 2. The stakes programs may appear safe in numerous jurisdictions. Indiana has an exceptional program, as does Ohio. Pennsylvania looks to have been strengthened from the last announcements I read, and the New York program has always been very, very good. Yonkers Raceway has been sold but the horseman's contract has been extended.
- 3. Stock market gains lead to investors looking to have fun and race for big money while using the tax laws to their advantages. The huge benefit of accelerated depreciation of racehorses if the owners are actively involved and the ability to deduct that from other income is not well understood and greatly under appreciated. Write-offs are very good to have when needed. Nobody needs a Ferrari or a Lamborghini, but some people who can afford them really want them. Nobody needs to win the Hambletonian or the Little Brown Jug, but certain people spend their whole lives trying to win those races. Richard Gutnick won the Hambletonian with Market Share and spent big money at the sales the following year trying to get back to that race after racing in it two years in a row as Chapter Seven was in the race the year prior. Young man Joe Sbrocco came very close to winning the Little Brown Jug and had a chance last year with Downbytheseaside, which I bred with Blue Chip Farms, but the horse didn't draw well on that special half-mile track. Many, many trainers would love to win that Little Brown Jug, but probably none more than Good Guy Award Winner Brian Brown. The classiest act at last year's Little Brown Jug was Ronnie Burke's owners winning the race with Filibuster Hanover, then walking over to Brian Brown's barn after the race and offering their condolences

on his loss. That was true class. That's how important these races are and why people step up to the plate and purchase yearlings at these sales. Many, many horseman will root for Brian Brown to win that race for the first time.

4. Owners want a truly special horse. Who had more fun that the Zeron family winning the Habletonian with a filly? Father and son plus a special horse beating the boys on the biggest day in harness racing is awesome and reminded fans of the fun George Teague had with Wiggle It Jiggleit winning many races with his son driving.

5. From the trader in me, under the surface the stallion career of Chapter Seven is taking off while not being noticed as much as it should. Last Thursday evening at Vernon Downs, both NYSS 2-year-old trotting filly races were won by Chapter Sevens, and the 9th race winner was Woodside Charm, a half-sister to Explosive Matter. Yes, breeding still matters. This was Chapter Seven's third crop and it was a very small crop. The best 3-year-old colt last year was arguably Walner, a Chapter Seven who got hurt just before the Hambletonian, and Atlanta, another Chapter Seven, won the Hambletonian this year. One thing I have not noticed, I haven't seen many or any Chapter Sevens trained by Jimmy Takter or Ronnie Burke. When a stallion's offspring are winning major races without the top two trainers racing them, that's pointing towards a bright future for the stallion as the mares getting bred to the stallion only improve.

With lots of profits being minted in this economy, there's lots of

money sloshing around looking for a home, and some large sums may be pointed at the Lexington Selected sale, then Harrisburg. These sales may be the strongest sales ever recorded at these venues and buyers may not see it until they have been outbid. If sellers have horses that are well bred with great conformation and solid videos, those horses may be in serious demand.

Everyone wants the next Atlanta, the next Wiggle It Jiggleit, or the next Chapter Seven. Ask Richard Gutnick what he would give to win the Hambletonian once again. Bring your checkbooks to the sales, you may need them. Friends ask me if they overpaid on a horse after they signed the tickets. We sold Downbytheseaside to an absolutely great group of owners for \$65,000. If the horse didn't win, he was overpriced. However, the horse was a monster and earned \$2,179,558 in his two seasons racing, not counting what he will earn as a stallion. How much was he really worth?

Next year's fun starts this fall. Enjoy the auctions and the atmosphere. I heard Lillie will still be at Preferred's consignment this year at Harrisburg. The lady is wonderful, and who doesn't enjoy the free sorbets?

I am a semi-pro in the harness racing yearling game, a founding member of the Big Lebowski Bowling League and Social Club.

He is a member of the retired Dot Com Billionaire Cabal with limited experience in the harness racing game. My job is explaining how to conquer the world as investors in a yearling harness horse, a rather whimsical quest.

I put down my Starbucks coffee and began, "It's time to talk females."

He grimaced, "This should be good."

"It's time for a few more of Trey's rules of natural selection. You will be relieved to know that I am much better picking broodmares for stallions than wives. They should have complete pedigree catalogs and videos for dating."

He chuckled, "That's good, between us, we're zero for three in matrimony.

I sighed, "Technically zero for four, but I don't count my Las Vegas fiasco with Megan the Pagan. Married by Elvis and divorced by Friday should be a mulligan."

He looked sad and said, "I played 18 years until I became the other man, never had a clue."

"Hey, you were busy changing the world, things happen." His marriage history sounded like troubled territory, so I switched gears, "Speaking of mulligans, if a broodmare had a first foal that didn't make it to the racetrack, that's okay. But if mom had two babies and neither made it to the races, the third is off our list."

He said, "Money the family earned is a big factor."

"To me, money is tricky. If a stallion has 500 foals, his average earnings per foal are in black and white. The female side has a much smaller pool of horses to contemplate.



Some people go back in the pedigree to the Pleistocene era. For me, mom and grandma are deep enough."

"Obviously, you want moms and her foals to show that they made money?"

I shook my head and tried to explain, "I think people get carried away with money won at the fairs and non-stakes races. Remember, we are only playing the staking game. What mom and her kids did after age three is a big toss for me."

"I noticed that most of the information in the page is about the female's side."

"Yeah. Buyers know all the stallions because most stallions are famous, but not always the mares. The mares are more of a puzzle. For example, the yearling we buy will probably race four or five times at two and maybe a dozen at three. Then we are out. The money that a horse makes in that short span can be inflated or deflated."

"Injuries, sickness?"

"Yeah, a lot of good horses get hurt, especially when they are asked to race at age two. Luck is involved. We had a horse that was lucky in her stakes career. Other horses broke, short fields, soft fields, good posts. She was a nice horse, don't get me wrong. We had another one, a MUCH better horse. She took a while to get good, then in the few stakes races she had left, everyone was a nightmare. She always drew in the with the big dogs, always drew outside, terrible trips. She had horses in front of her stopping and even falling down."

"So how do you factor in luck?"

"Keep digging. It's fun. The computer helps. I look at mom and the brothers and sisters to see where they raced. Sometimes stakes horses can be pretty dang good and not make much money."

"What about fair horses?"

"In some states, fairs are a non-factor. Our last yearling was from a stallion that stood in a state that didn't even have fairs. Ohio has a ton of fairs. A few owners don't mess with

the fairs, it might be an ego thing. They breed the horse or move it if it is not top shelf, but most owners and trainers grind out every dollar."

"You?"

"Do I look like an aristocrat with excess funding? We are shopping for a sires stake caliber horse, everyone is, but fairs are fun. The people are great. Money is money. It is a bit of a red flag if everyone in the family makes some decent money but it all comes from the fairs."

"So fair racing is our fallback position."

"Sure, but in Ohio, we have a level between the fairs and the sires stakes. It's complicated but this mid-level is a notch below the best."

"What about first foals, they don't have siblings to compare."

"Very tricky. I have bought a couple, but for this experience, for your first dance, I think we're going to pitch them and we're going to pitch broodmares that have had over nine foals."

"Trey, you keep chopping the list. We may never find anything that fits your rules."

"Batman you can always find a yearling. I'm trying to find you THE yearling."

He pulled out his iPad and prepared to type, "Give me your filters so far, I want to create a formula, make your thoughts a little more scientific."

I said, "We decided this year to play in Ohio."

"Got it."

"A trotter."

"Got it."

"Out of a proven stallion with three crops on the track.

"Got it."

"Twenty grand is our top end."

"Yes."

I added, "And a brother or sister who raced at the sires stake level."

Okay, so we have - OT (Ohio Trotter), - NPS (minus non-proven stallions), - NSSSR (non-sires stakes race siblings), - 20K MAX."

"And my friend, I have more craziness TBA."

"What if you don't find one that fits?"

"I walk. It's weird, in real life I have been known to be a tad impulsive, a dash irresponsible, but at the sales I'm a rock. I stay stone cold sober and don't get horse fever. I don't have



to get a horse, there are other sales."

"Or we can pay more."

"Nope. My lifelong fiscal swamp has formed my thinking about buying horses. I shouldn't be diverting any of my pitiful revenue streams for wagering on races, golf course green fees or bottled beverages, let alone horse ownership. Breeding farms do not roll out the red carpet when Trey is in the building. I've been to plenty of horse auctions with my lists and nothing worked out. I just figure it was not the right Karma."

"Lists, more than one list?"

"Yeah, I always show up with my Fantasy Island List, 10 horses that I am 99% sure will whiz past my budget limit. But you never know, one time we bought a yearling off the Fantasy Island list, we figured 50 plus, and a filly hung at 12. We got her and were so shocked we thought we bought the wrong horse."

"Did she race well?"

"Pretty good, best we ever had. That was a huge sale with over a thousand yearlings. For every hit like that horse, we have bought six misses that looked like great deals leaving the sales arena. This is a hard game. Finding a diamond in the haystack is rare. The people buying horses are a very sharp bunch, and they don't miss much."

He gave a windshield wiper with his index finger, "The saying is diamond in the ROUGH, or needle in the haystack."

"Whatever. There will be plenty of painful needles and few diamonds standing in the haystack. We have one more week to dig around. Next week will be my secret sauce, some offbeat stuff that we can add to our formula that just might seal a possible deal."

While I understand there are other differences in racing styles between North America and New Zealand-Australia, such an examination might provide some evidence for Pandolfo's theories. Also, a recent column on ustrotting.com by Bob Carson discussed the popularity and competitive nature of amateur racing. Maybe one of the American tracks (Pompano Park, are you listening?) where amateur racing is frequently conducted could incorporate this idea into those events. Make the use of the traditional sulkies a requirement for selected amateur driving events. This would add a new flavor to an already-exciting style of harness racing, and might provide the impetus to use the old bikes on a wider basis on other North American tracks. Those of us involved in the industry are always looking for new ways to bring back the popularity and excitement of our sport. Perhaps one "new" way would be to bring back something "old".


Now that the playing field is level, the best horse will win
