Atlanta equals 1:50.4 stakes record winning \$560,000 Maple Leaf Trot

She is the third mare to win Canada's most prestigious race for older trotters in its last six editions.

Atlanta bounced back from a miscue in her last start to win the \$560,000 Maple Leaf Trot in 1:50.4 on Saturday night (Sept. 5) at Woodbine Mohawk Park (replay here)

The 5-year-old Chapter Seven—Hemi Blue Chip mare shot off cover for driver Yannick Gingras at the head of the stretch and powered by rivals for a four-length score. The Ron Burke trainee matched the stakes record held by Guardian Angel As (2019) and Mister Herbie (2012).

"All the credit goes to Ron Burke," said Gingras of Atlanta's bounce back performance off a break in last Saturday's Armbro Flight. "A guy like him with the brain he has, right away after the race last week he called me and said I know what the problem is.

"We changed the shoes four starts back and it went good the first start, the next start it was a little worse and then a little worse and then last week she made a break, but the memory the guy has is unreal and all the credit to him tonight because she definitely bounced back big."

Early action saw Crystal Fashion blast to the lead for a :26.3 opening quarter. Lindy The Great ignored a rail spot and kept marching on, clearing to command quickly in the second-split. The new leader saw the front briefly, as Manchego and driver Louis Philippe Roy had their eyes on making the front despite a second-tier starting spot.

Atlanta (Yannick Gingras) equalled the 1:50.4 stakes record Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park while becoming the third filly to win the Maple Leaf Trot in its last six editions.

Manchego hit the half in :54.3 and Roy kept his foot on the gas pedal, trotting a :27.2 third-quarter to reach that marker in 1:22.

Guardian Angel As, last year's champion, moved to the outside racing to the half to lead the outside charge, while Atlanta and driver Gingras moved out from fifth and received a second-over tow around the final turn.

In the stretch, Atlanta stormed by her rivals and off to her third win of the season and 23rd lifetime. Lindy The Great dug in and grabbed second, while Gimpanzee, the even-money favourite, finished third after following Atlanta. Crystal Fashion was fourth, while Manchego dropped back to fifth.

"(Atlanta) felt so strong and I had a handful of trot in the last turn and when I tipped her she came off cover like a sports car," said Gingras. "I knew right then even though (Manchego) was up by five that I'd catch (her), she was tremendous."

Atlanta adds the Maple Leaf Trot to her Hall of Fame career. The victory is not only redemption from last week's break, but also a runner-up finish in last year's Maple Leaf Trot.

"She's a great mare and Ronnie said after last week not to worry, made a couple of adjustments and we'll win her," said co-owner Brad Grant. "I don't know what to say, but to do it here (at Mohawk Park), I wish it was crowded."

Atlanta has now earned over \$400,000 this season to bring her career total to \$2,392,403 for owners Crawford Farms Racing, Grant and Howard Taylor. She paid \$7.60 to win.

The Maple Leaf Trot has now seen a mare win three of the last six editions, as Atlanta joins Hannelore Hanover and Bee A Magician as recent winners.

Atlanta was bred by Order By Stable and sold for \$60,000 at the 2016 Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA.

Ready For Moni overcame some tense moments in the middle-half to win the \$215,000 Goodtimes on Saturday evening (Sept. 5) at Woodbine Mohawk Park (**replay here**)

The son of French sire Ready Cash out of Moni Maker's daughter Nothing But Moni and driver Yannick Gingras navigated a less than ideal trip and steering troubles to power down the center of the track and stop the clock in 1:52.1 for a 2 ½ length score over a rallying Hot Wheelz at 40-1.

McClure started a bid for the front racing to the half, but were left parked with Hayek's Ben Baillargeon stablemate HP Royal Theo on his back.

Ready For Moni and Gingras, sitting fifth, tussled for a moment to the outside and back to the rail before finally sitting on the back of HP Royal Theo and ultimately catapulting by in the stretch for the victory.

HP Royal Theo settled for third, while Capricornus hugged the pylons to a fourth-place finish.

Trained by Nancy Takter, Ready For Moni is now five-for-six on the season with over \$600,000 earned to bring his career numbers to nine wins and \$886,520 in earnings for owners John Fielding, Lindy Farms of Conn., Herb Liverman and Bud Hatfield. His only loss this season was a runner-up finish in the \$1 million Hambletonian.

Ready For Moni, bred by the Moni Maker Stable, was sold for \$220,00 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Ready For Moni is eligible to the upcoming Canadian Trotting Classic. He paid \$2.40 to win.

Dorsoduro Hanover gives MacDonald another Pacing Derby stunner

A week after returning from injury, driver James MacDonald pulled off a 40-1 upset in the \$540,000 Canadian Pacing Derby at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Driver James MacDonald engineered his second consecutive Canadian Pacing Derby stunner, guiding **Dorsoduro Hanover** to a 40-1 upset on Saturday night (Sept. 5) at Woodbine Mohawk Park (replay here).

The victory gave trainer Ron Burke a sweep of the card's two biggest stakes after his pupil Atlanta won the Maple Leaf Trot earlier in the night.

Dorsoduro Hanover and MacDonald sat fifth-over turning for home and swept by rivals promptly for a 1:48.4 victory in the \$540.000 event.

"I always though the seven claimer was my race," joked MacDonald, who also drove Courtly Choice to a 34-1 upset in last year's event. "I'll take the Derby, it's a real honour just to be in it and to win it...I can't even put it in words."

A hot opening-quarter of :25.1 was put up by American History after rocketing off the gate along with rail starter Bettors Wish and Backstreet Shadow. Bettors Wish quickly rushed from third to first and led by the half in 52.4.

The third-quarter saw Backstreet Shadow come first up at Bettors Wish with the pacers dueling by three-quarters in 1:21.1.

The field fanned out wide with the front horses tiring at the head of the lane, setting up a wild finish that saw Dorsoduro Hanover sweep by after being ninth to win by 3 ½ lengths.

Dancin Lou came from third-over to finish second, while Century Farroh was third after sitting second-over turning for home. Sintra finished fourth.

A 5-year-old gelding, Dorsoduro Hanover (Somebeachsomewhere—Deer Valley) was bred by Hanover

Driver James MacDonald scored back-to-back Canadian Pacing Derby victories after piloting Dorsoduro Hanover to a 40-1 upset in 1:48.4 in the \$540,000 event.

Shoe Farms and sold for \$100,000 at the 2016 Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearlings sale in Harrisburg, PA. Dorsoduro Hanover came into the 'Pacing Derby' off a hard-closing third-place finish in the Dan Patch at Hoosier on Aug. 22. The Burke trainee is now three-for-eight on the season and sports career numbers of 17 wins and over \$1.9 million earned for owners Burke Racing Stable, J and T Silva Purnel & Libby, Weaver Bruscemi and Wingfield Brothers.

"Mark Weaver had messaged me earlier in the week and told me the horse had been great, but just had been drawing terrible and then the draw came out and he drew (post-eight)," said MacDonald. "It was one of those races when it looks like there is four or five or six that can win, if you're in the outer flow and they get battling it's usually a long shot that comes in.

"Ronnie did such a great job, they were at the half in :52.4 and I was just standing up in the stirrups, like he was ready to go. Thanks a lot for the drive."

A \$2 win ticket on Dorsoduro Hanover returned \$88.

from the deuce and powered by for his second consecutive sub-1:50 score, just missing his mark of 1:49 from a week ago.

Beaumond Hanover finished 4 ¼ lengths behind in second, while Mayhem Hanover and Aneto completed the Superfecta.

Warrawee Vital is five for eight on the season. The Fellows trainee missed a considerable amount of time after January and did not return to the race until August, where he has since won two of four.

Owned by Blair Corbeil, Yolanda Fellows and M&S Racing Stable, Warrawee Vital has now banked \$102,253 in 10 career starts. He was bred by Warrawee Farm and sold for \$32,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Warrawee Vital paid \$6.10 to win.

Coming in off a runner-up finish in the Pepsi North America Cup, **Tattoo Artist** returned to the winner's circle with a 1:49.2 win in the second division (**replay here**).


Driven by Bob McClure, Tattoo Artist went to the front and never looked back, posting fractions of :26.2, :54.4 and 1:22.2 before closing out the mile with a :27 kicker. Captain Barbossa rallied from second-over to come up about half a length short in second.

Rhythm In Motion was third, while Capt Midnight was fourth.

A son of Hes Watching out of Stylish Artist, Tattoo Artist was bred by Tara Hills Stud of Port Perry, ON and is trained

by Dr. Ian Moore for owners Frank Cannon and Let It Ride Stables. He's now won six of nine and earned over \$450,000 this season.

The career numbers for Tattoo Artist jump to 11 wins and nearly \$700,000 earned. He paid \$3.70 to win.







PASS freshman Championships in the books at Pocono

Captain Corey, Southwind Gendry, Flawless Country and Blue Diamond Eyes all win \$253,000 finals.

The best of the Pennsylvania-sired babies came in for their closeup on Saturday afternoon (Sept. 5) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, racing in four \$253,000 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) Championships, with a \$50,000 consolation event also for the 2-year-olds in each division of sex and gait.



After studying the sterling forms of the entrants, it turned out that all you needed to know about the Championships was this: bet Åke Svanstedt in the trots, and bet the team of driver David Miller and trainer Ron Burke in the paces.

Flawless Country (Åke Svanstedt) won the \$253,000 PASS Championship for 2-year-old trotting fillies in 1:54.3.

Two-year-old trotting colts — Captain Corey

Svanstedt pupils were 1-2-3 early in this Championship, with Johan Palema (driver Dexter Dunn; not coupled with the other two because Åke owns no part of him) on the lead, Fly Light (Andy Miller) second, and **Captain Corey** third under Svanstedt's control. They sat that way through fractions of :27.1 and :57, then Svanstedt pulled Captain Corey (a Googoo Gaagaa-Luv U All colt) out raw at the 5/8 to challenge, with second choice (and leading prelim point-winner) In Range advancing to second-over. Past the 1:25 three-quarters Fly Light made a break in the two-hole, bothering several other horses; by this time Captain Corey had moved to within a head of his front-stepping stablemate, with In Range right

behind.

Through the stretch Captain Corey maintained his long and powerful strides, reaching the wire two lengths ahead of In Range in 1:53.3, with Johan Palema another length back in third. An inquiry was posted to look into the incident on the far turn, but Captain Corey was not affected.

The time eclipsed by a fifth the stake record set by Real Cool Sam last year, and lowered his own season's record. Captain Corey is now undefeated in four lifetime starts, three PASS elims and this Championship, and he boosted his earnings to \$264,563. Svanstedt (as Åke Svanstedt Inc.) co-owns the winner with S R F Stable, Knutsson Trotting Inc., and Midnight Sun Partners Inc. It would be surprising if more

Consolation: The Cantab Hall–Jolie De Vie gelding **Jack Fire** had bad luck in the first half, three-wide much of the first quarter, then going first-over, but then he had good luck when he was trying to clear favored pacesetter Bacardi and that one broke, letting him go to an easy lead and winning in a lifetime best 1:56.1 for driver Andrew McCarthy, trainer Nifty Norman, and the ownership of Pinske Stables and Curly Tall Curly Small.

Two-year-old trotting fillies — Flawless Country

Like her stablemate Captain Corey, the Southwind

Frank—Aleah Hanover filly **Flawless Country** found herself third early in the backstretch – but she took a very different route home, though producing the same result.

Flawless Country actually had the lead at the ¼ in :27.3, but the second quarter saw first Gimme Shelter and then Anoka Hanover make their way to the top, the latter in front at the :56.1 half. Svanstedt kept Flawless Country inside as You Ato Dream, the leading prelim point-winner with four PASS seconds, attacked towards the 1:25.1 three-quarters, with pocket-sitter Gimme Shelter following the first-over outside as she gained a small advantage nearing head-stretch.

This move gave Svanstedt room to maneuver Flawless

Blue Diamond Eyes (David Miller) equaled the 1:51 stakes record set by Pure Country while winning the \$253,000 PASS Championship for 2-year-old pacing fillies.

Country to the Pocono Pike, and the baby filly responded to the challenge like a seasoned pro, quickly kicking in gear to beat out the unfortunate You Ato Dream (if a maiden with earnings of \$157,556 can be considered "unfortunate") by a neck, with Anoka Hanover another 2½ lengths back in third.

Flawless Country started her career finishing second in photo decisions, and since has won four in a row, swelling her earnings to \$263,496 for Åke Svanstedt Inc., Wolfgang A Table inc., and Borje Nasstrom.

Consolation: The Cantab Hall–Evermore filly **May Karp** was moved to the lead in front of the stands by driver Dexter Dunn and left her field far in arrears while taking a new

mark of 1:55.4. Third in her only PASS start and coming off two Stallion Series victories, May Karp is at the peak form of her young career for trainer Lucas Wallin and Shermay Stables.

Two-year-old pacing colts — Southwind Gendry

Both of the Svanstedt winners were crowd favorites, as was the colt winner in the Miller/Burke sweep, the Always B Miki-Gambler's Passion gelding **Southwind Gendry**, who won in off-the-pace fashion in 1:51.3.

Bayfield Beach led the field to the quarter in a sharp :26,

with Always A Miki, the top point-winner and second betting choice, going to the lead in front of the stands and slowing the half to :55.3. Chase H Hanover, who tucked fourth early from the outside post nine, came up to pressure the leader, passing the three-quarters in 1:23.4 and carrying the fight around the turn – until Always A Miki made a break nearing headstretch, briefly bothering Bayfield Beach.

Chase H Hanover continued on after his rival's misfortune, but Southwind Gendry, who had been on his back most of the way, went wide and was the fresh horse late. Chase H Hanover was 1½ lengths behind the winner and a length ahead of a recovering Bayfield Beach.

So far Southwind Gendry's scorecard shows four wins, two breaks, and \$217,144 in earnings for Burke Racing Stable LLC, Phil Collura, Knox Services Inc., and J&T Silva- Purnel & Libby, with a lot of the stakes trail still to go.

Consolation: Favored Whichwaytothebeach, setting the pace, looked like he might be under siege by a sweeping Sweet Angel Boy at headstretch, but that one ran in in early stretch and lost momentum straightening away, leaving the Somebeachsomewhere—Swinging Beauty colt able to retain his lead to the wire, stopping the clock in 1:52.1. Marcus Miller drove the winner for trainer Roland Mallar and owners Alan Johnston and John Craig.

Two-year-old pacing fillies — Blue Diamond Eyes

The Captaintreacherous—Aria Hanover filly **Blue Diamond Eyes** was the only non-favorite to win a 2-year-old
Championship, but at 4-1 she was hardly overlooked, and she opened some eyes with a victory in 1:51, equaling the stakes record of Pure Country and also the national season's record.

As was the case in the other filly Championship, there was plenty of early activity, with Blue Diamond Eyes on top at the :27.3 quarter, but then having point-leader Marsala Hanover and then favored Grace Hill go by her before a :55.1 half. Continualou, one of four Burke entrants in the race went first-over and was within a length of the leader at the 1:23.1



three-quarters; after she backed off, Marsala Hanover moved outside, giving the room for Blue Diamond Eyes to go to the Pocono Pike.

Blue Diamond Eyes took full advantage of the inner route, going past Grace Hill by ¾ of a length, with Thebeachiscalling gaining inside the winner in the Pike to

take third ahead of Marsala Hanover.

Blue Diamond Eyes now has three wins and a second in six starts, a new record, and earnings of \$191,542 for Thomas and Scott Dillon.

Consolation: Trainer Nifty Norman, driver Dexter Dunn, and the Pinske Stables collected a second consolation victory when the Somebeachsomewhere Fit To Frame filly **Fire Start Hanover** forced favorite Mackie Hanover to work hard to clear for the lead at the half, then came back in the lane to pass that rival and win while taking a new speed badge of 1:52.3. The Pinske Stables' partners in this filly are David Hoese and Lawrence Means.

The 3-year-old Pennsylvania-sired stars will be at Harrah's Philadelphia this afternoon (Sept. 6) for their Championships and consolations. On Monday The Meadows will play host to the Stallion Series Championships, as Labor Day Monday afternoon will find no fewer than four Pennsylvania tracks in operation during the afternoon: pari-mutuel tracks Pocono, Philly, and The Meadows, and also the Bloomsburg Fair.

Trainer Morgan looks for "Super" Night in Ohio

Eldorado Scioto Downs' top conditioner Virgil Morgan, Jr. has four shots in \$300,000 Sire Stake finals.

Trainer Virgil Morgan, Jr. knows his way to the Eldorado Scioto Downs winner's circle. The Grove City, OH based conditioner, at the end of the current meet, will have won the training title at Scioto for a record 26 straight years. Thanks to a quartet of trotters, Morgan hopes to make several trips the winner's circle during tonight's (Sept. 6) Ohio's Super Night featuring \$300,000 Sire Stakes finals.

Action Uncle was installed as the even money favorite in the 3-year-old colt trot. The Uncle Peter colt swept the four preliminary legs and his only defeat this season came last weekend by a neck against older conditioned trotters.

"(Scioto) didn't have any qualifiers scheduled. I wasn't thrilled about racing him against aged horses, but he did fit the 'non-winners of 10 pari-mutuels," Morgan said. "I went ahead and chose to race him. He got locked in and shot the rail and had a ton of trot left, so it worked out good."

Action Uncle was owned by the Kenneth Sommer Trust in 2019 and was sold to Carl Howard, Joyce McClelland and Larry Wills for his sophomore season. Morgan trained both Action Uncle at 2 and his dam, Action Broadway (\$1.1 million in career earnings).

In 2019, Action Uncle was an Ohio Triple Crown winner and set a new North American record for a freshman trotting colt on a half-mile track by winning a division of the Ohio Breeders Championship at the Delaware County Fair in 1:54.



He became a double world champion with his 1:53.2 mile on June 13 at MGM Northfield Park.

Action Uncle has a 9-3-1 record in 13 career starts and has earned \$395,825.

Despite some early post draw bad luck, Morgan was glad that Action Uncle fared better.

"After the first two (OHSS final) draws I was really frustrated. I got the nine hole (with **Herculisa**) and then got the eight hole (with Street Gossip). It actually came down to post #2 or post #9 with Action Uncle. I was like 'no way I can get the nine here.' Fortunately he drew the two hole. It worked out alright for him."

The 8-5 morning line choice in the 2-year-old filly trot is the undefeated Herculisa.

The My MVP filly was a \$5,000 yearling purchase for EG Trot and was purchased privately by Steven A. Finkelstein's Jesmeral Stable after just one start – a 2:08.3 score at the Paulding County Fair.

"She qualified at Scioto once and she caught my eye," said Morgan "She looked good. We purchased her after (a June 25qualifier at Northfield Park)."

Despite winning all four OHSS legs, Herculisa ran into some bad luck when she drew the outside post #9 for the rich final.

"She had the nine hole before here at Scioto and won in (1):56.1. Post nine is not what I wanted for her, but she can overcome it. She's a real handy, classy filly. She actually loves to pass horses. In this situation, Brett (Miller) is going to have her on the gate and go forward the first eighth (of a mile) and look over and see how things shake out."

Street Gossip, Morgan's 2-year-old colt trot entry (7-2 in the morning line), joined the stable in July after a pair of solid efforts to start his career.

"He raced pretty good at Northfield (the July 3 opening OHSS leg) and finished third and we acquired him. He raced really good his first start (with us) and won in (1):57. He's had a few throat issues and I think we've addressed that.

Hopefully he will be peaking for this start."

Street Gossip is owned by the partnership of Jesmeral Stable and Carl Howard. The Cash Hall colt has earned \$69.714 in six seasonal starts.

In the \$300,000 3-year-old filly trot, Morgan will send out **Uncle Peter's Love** (10-1) from post #2.

With the Uncle Peter-Love Me Two Times lass, it is either feast (a win and a second) or famine (two breaks and last place finishes) in the four sire stakes legs.

"That's it. She has a mind of her own. When she's good, she's real good. There is no in-between with her. The post draw (#2) couldn't be better for her. Depending on who shows up mentally, she's as good as anybody. When she won at Northfield in (1):54.2, she was vicious that night. She's had a good week of prep and should be ready to go."

Uncle Peter's Love was purchased for \$95,000 by Carl Howard and Joyce McClelland last August, right before the 2019 Ohio Sire Stakes Final at MGM Northfield Park, where she finished fifth.

Her combined 2- and 3-year-old record is six wins in 17 starts and \$123,387.

All four of Morgan's OHSS finalist will be driven by Brett Miller.

On the Ohio Super Night undercard, Morgan will send out a pair of older pacers in the two \$100,000 #Senditin Invitationals. The William Haughton Memorial winner, **Our Majordan A** (Brett Miller) drew into the tougher of the two divisions and the outside post 9. As a result, the 1:47.3 pacer was tagged as a 15-1 morning line shot.

"That's a little bazaar," added Morgan. "That just shows you how competitive these races are."

Morgan will send **Escapetothebeach** (post #4; 5-1) postward in the second #senditin Invitational with George Brennan driving.


The Ohio Super Night card will offer total purses of nearly \$2.8 million, an amount that was a pipe dream just a few years ago.

"It shows you how far things have come," said Morgan. "It's great for our track and our state."

Cool Winds Farm riding high with Ohio Sires Stakes contenders

Randy and Kim Haines are having the time of their lives. The husband and wife team are uber-psyched for the Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) Championships tonight (Sept. 6) at Scioto Downs.

The Haines', who own and operate Cool Winds Farm in Lima, OH, are giddy with anticipation as 12 of the starters in these OHSS Championships are progeny of Ohio-registered stallions standing or who have stood at their farm.

The Haines' met while both were pursuing degrees in equine reproduction at The Ohio State University and married in 1993 after graduation. In 2002, the couple established Cool Winds Farm on 130 acres in Lima. Besides foaling, breeding and reproduction facilities, the picturesque facility includes more than 100 acres of prime Ohio pastureland.

"We worked for Dr. Steiner at Steiner Stock Farm for 10 years before we started our own farm," Kim said. "It's taken a while and we don't always have the top stallions in the state, but we try to get the best quality of horse we can and take care of them well. I think our diligence and hard work paid off this year."

Eighteen years later, they are witnessing the fruits of their labors.

"We have foals in every Championship except for the 3-year-old filly pace and 3-year-old colt trot, "Kim added. "So that's pretty exciting."

Seven Ohio-registered stallions currently stand at Cool Winds Farm and three of those have foals who will go postward in the OHSS Championships, including Bring On The Beach, Coraggioso and Rockin Amadeus. Two former Cool Winds stallions, Cash Hall (who died in 2019) and Arthur Blue Chip (exported to Canada) also have progeny in these events.

Rockin Amadeus p,4,1:48.4f (\$728,392) has produced 74 starters to date who have earned \$1,532,777, with 21 foals clocked in 1:55 or faster. Now standing his sixth year, he is represented by 3-5 morning line favorite **Ocean Rock** p, 3, 1:48.4f (\$345,677) in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes 3-Year-Old Colt Pace Championship (Race 10).

Ocean Rock is both Rockin Amadeus' fastest and highest-earning performer to date and will leave from post



four with Danny Noble driving for trainer Christi Noble and owner/breeder Sandra Burnett of Wilmington, OH. Ocean Rock captured leg 3 of the series in a blistering 1:48.4 world and track-record setting performance.

Another Rockin Amadeus son, **Worthabuck**, starts in this same Championship for trainer/breeder Jason Elser of Montpelier, OH, who owns the bay gelding in partnership with Rodney Bingman of Fayette, OH. A winner of \$43,328 lifetime, Worthabuck starts from the rail with Josh Sutton driving. He garnered two solid checks in OHSS legs 3 and 4.

Rainy Day Chic, a daughter of Rockin Amadeus, has post six in the \$300,000 OHSS 2-Year-Old Filly Pace (Race 4) for breeder/owner Marjorie Polhamus of Ludlow Falls, OH. Trained by Dan O'Mara and driven by Brett Miller, this bay filly has career earnings of \$58,900 from four wins, two seconds and a third in seven starts. Rainy Day Chic captured OHSS leg 2 in 1:54.1 and was second in legs 3 and 4.

"Both Rockin Amadeus and Bring On The Beach are both easy to collect, very fertile and well-mannered; everything

you'd like to have in stallions as far as a breeder goes," Randy said. "I think a lot of people tend to forget that Bring On The Beach was the only horse to beat Captaintreacherous as a 2-year-old, when he won the Breeders Crown."

Cool Winds Farm stallion Bring On The Beach p, 3, 1:53s (\$12,001) is now standing his fourth year in Ohio, and has produced light foal crops with 19 starters who have earned \$234,838, with four timed in 1:55 or better. This Ohio-registered stallion has a standout in the sophomore pacer **Heart Of Chewbacca**, who will start from post three in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes 2-Year-Old Colt Pace Championship (Race 8) for driver Danny Noble, trainer Ronnie Burke and owners Dennis Owens of Hamilton, Ohio and Norman Rae Racing LLC, of Xenia, Ohio. This coal black youngster captured OHSS leg 3 in 1:51.1 and OHSS leg 4 in 1:51.2 for these connections and has four wins and a second in five career starts, with \$89,375 in career earnings. Bred by Spring Haven Farm, Heart Of Chewbacca been listed as the even-money (1-1) favorite in this event.

Coraggioso 5, 1:52.4 (\$677,398), standing his fourth year at Cool Winds Farm, is represented by three contenders on OHSS Championship night. From 13 starters, with two timed in 2:00 or faster, his progeny have earned \$288,285 to date.

His fastest and richest performer, **Lima Gold** 2, 1:57h (\$108,562) heads up the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes 3-Year-Old Filly Trot Championship (Race 7) from the rail for trainer Chris Beaver, driver Danny Noble and the Spaaaartners, of Ballston Spa, New York. Lima Gold has two wins, four seconds, and a trio of thirds in 15 tries and has never missed a check in her OHSS events.

Panzano, a freshman son of Coraggioso, leaves from post five in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes 2-Year-Old Colt Trot Championship (Race 6) with Chris Page driving for trainer Chris Beaver and Spaaaartners. Panzano is listed as 8-1 in the morning line, with his lone triumph in five starts coming in OHSS leg 3, timed in 1:58.3 at Northfield Park. This bay gelding, who was bred by Christopher Coyle of North Carolina, has career earnings of \$48,520.

The Coraggioso distaff **Incomeorexpenses** will leave from post two in the \$300,000 OHSS 2-Year-Old Filly Trot Championship (Race 3) with Tyler Smith driving for trainer Todd Luther and Black Magic Racing of New Albany, OH. Bred by Cool Winds Farm, this bay filly has two wins and three seconds in eight starts with \$27,777 in her career coffers and was a solid second in OHSS leg 1 and OHSS leg 4.

Arthur Blue Chip stood at Cool Winds Farm during the 2017 and 2018 seasons before being exported to Canada. This former Ohio-registered stallion is represented by **Lady**

Arthur in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes 2-Year-Old Filly Pace Championship (Race 4), leaving from post seven with Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. driving. This homebred bay filly is owned and trained by Dr. Ian Moore for the R.G. McGroup LTD and Serge Savard of Canada and has career earnings of \$56,188. Lady Arthur captured OHSS leg 1 in 1:53.2 and was third in leg 2 and fourth in leg 4.

The ill-fated stallion Cash Hall, who stood at Cool Winds Farm, sadly died in 2019, but his legacy carries on in his foals, four of whom are competing in tonight's OHSS Championships.

Before his passing, Cash Hall produced 344 starters, with 173 clocked in 2:00 or better and 52 timed in 1:55 or faster with \$29,119,269 in foal earnings.

Cash Hall is represented by the undefeated **Guinevere Hall** in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes 3-year-Old Filly Trot Championship (Race 7). Despite being saddled with post eight, Guinevere Hall has been made the 1-1 morning line favorite in the field of nine. Bred by Alan Leavitt, this filly captured all four OHSS legs, in 1:55; 1:54.1, 1:53 and 1:53 for owners M T Pockets Stables and David McDuffee of Pompano and Delray Beach, FL. Trained by Melanie Wrenn, Guinevere Hall has \$265,081 in earnings from nine wins in 16 starts and will have Peter Wrenn in the sulky.

Competing in this same Championship is another Chris Beaver-conditioned Cash Hall daughter, **Delovely Hall**, the

Ciao Baby Hall, another Cash Hall distaff, leaves from post four for driver Aaron Merriman in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes 2-Year-Old Filly Trot Championship (Race 3). Bred by Alan Leavitt, the Robert McIntosh-trained lass has amassed \$31,757 to date and seeks her first career triumph in this Championship. Owned by Robert McIntosh Stables, Dave Boyle, and Mardon Stables of Canada, Ciao Baby Hall has been installed at morning line odds of 6-1.

Street Gossip is a son of Cash Hall who leaves from post eight for driver Brett Miller in the \$300,000 Ohio Sires Stakes 2-Year-Old Colt Championship (Race 6) as the 7-2 choice. This bay gelding, who was bred by the Morrisville College, has career earnings of \$69,714 from three wins, one second and two thirds in six starts for owners Carl Howard of Powell, Ohio and the Jesmeral Stable of Scarsdale, New York. Street Gossip is the OHSS divisional leader with triumphs in leg 2 (1:57) and leg 4 (1:58.1) for trainer Virgil Morgan, Jr.

"The best part of the Ohio program is the Ohio Sires Stakes, it's the tops," Randy said. "I honestly believe that Ohio is the best place to race in the country right now. We have three levels to race at, along with the county fairs. There's something for everyone in Ohio."

The fields of eight horses won their way into the series finales by accumulating points in four preliminary rounds of the Sire Stakes at the Pennsylvania ovals Pocono, The Meadows, and Harrah's Philadelphia.

Here is a summary of the major contenders in each division:

Three-year-old pacing colts (race 9; consolation race 5)

The early morning line favorite among the "glamour division" horses is the Sweet Lou gelding **No Lou Zing**, who has four wins and three seconds in eight seasonal starts for trainer Nancy Takter, including a 1:49.3 - :26.4 victory at The Meadows in his last outing. Dexter Dunn will drive the improved sophomore as they start from post six.

Major contenders are **Allywag Hanover**, a Brett Pelling-trained colt by Captaintreacherous who has been among the North American division leaders all year, and who has a positional advantage in that he starts from post two for driver Tim Tetrick; and the Somebeachsomewhere gelding **Sandbetweenmytoes**, the #1 preliminary point-winner who has really come to hand in his last two starts for trainer Jim Campbell with Sire Stakes victories at Pocono and The Meadows. However, he will have to solve the difficult seven post for driver Andrew McCarthy.

Three-year-old trotting colts (race 10; consolation race 6)

The Father Patrick gelding **Amigo Volo**, who set four world records as a 2-year-old and who won a PASS prelim at Pocono in 1:52, has been picked as the morning line favorite, beginning from post three for trainer Nifty Norman and driver Dexter Dunn. The fast sophomore made the lead from post ten in the Hambletonian, had road trouble, and still was a very good fourth in that premier event; he is likely to have better racing luck here.

The three-ply coupled entry from trainer Åke Svanstedt -Swiss House Onfire (post one, driver George Napolitano Jr.), Gangster Hanover (post seven, Svanstedt up) and EL Ideal (post eight, Andy Miller) – will attract a great deal of



attention, as will the preliminary point-leader Hillexotic, who will be beginning from post two for trainer/driver Trond Smedshammer.

Three-year-old trotting fillies (race 11; consolation race 4)

Only two horses in the history of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes have been the leading prelim point-winner and then Championship winner of their division at both 2 and 3 (point-standing records date back only to 2002) – and they have both been trotting fillies, Coulatine (2003-2004) and Frau Blucher (2012-2013, the latter a Championship winner in a memorable dead-heat with archrival Classic Martine).

Now another trotting filly is in position to join them – the Father Patrick miss **Sister Sledge**, beginning from post six for trainer Ron Burke and driver Brian Sears. Sister Sledge has won 13 of 20 lifetime starts and \$728,849, and she had two wins and a second in the three Sire Stakes events she entered this season, including a 1:52 season's record at her "home track," The Meadows.

Given the best chance to upset Sister Sledge is the Sebastian K S filly **Next Level Stuff** (post one, trainer Jim Campbell, driver Tim Tetrick), who had a win and two seconds in her three PASS outings this season, and who also has the winning habit (9 for 17 lifetime.)

Three-year-old pacing fillies (race 12; consolation race 3)

Most eyes will tend to focus on the unbeaten Party Girl **Hill**, a daughter of Captaintreacherous who was unraced at 2, but has made up for lost time by going undefeated in eight starts in 2020, including the Fan Hanover Final in her last race and the three Sire Stakes events she contested. She holds the season's record of 1:49, not far off the 1:48.3 (Kissmeonthebeach) world record for the division, and she will start from post one for trainer Chris Ryder and driver Dexter Dunn, who could be completing a big afternoon.


But the race is not a mere walkover; look at the credentials of some of her opponents:

- Lyons Sentinel (by Captaintreacherous, post seven, trainer Jim King Jr., driver Tim Tetrick) is the 2019 defending PASS champion, has a lifetime record of 20-10-9-1, and will go over \$1 million lifetime with a high finish;
- Rocknificent (by Captaintreacherous, post five, trainer Linda Toscano, driver Scott Zeron) was the #1 point-earner with three prelim wins and a third, and is always in the mix of races of this type;
- JK First Lady (by Western Ideal, post six), trainer Nancy Takter, driver Andrew McCarthy) set the track record of 1:49.2 here in winning a PASS race two starts ago, and was victorious in a PA All-Stars race last time out.

Post time for the today's Harrah's Philadelphia card is 12:40 p.m.

Pennsylvania Championship Weekend will close out Monday afternoon with eight \$40,000 Stallion Series Championships at The Meadows.

A conversation with Mark Weaver, one of the sport's biggest owners

You, in partnership, probably own as many standardbred racehorses as anybody in the world. Yet, picture this: You are allergic to horses, you are afraid of horses and you have never sat behind a horse although you've owned well over 2.000 of them.

You are Mark Weaver, part of the Mark Weaver-Mike Bruscemi partnership, who together with the Burke family and other assorted individuals have year after year led the money earnings list of horse owners in North America and probably the world (and also won that Canadian Pacing Derby on Saturday with Dorsoduro Hanover).

How did this come to pass?

"My family came from Pittsburgh, but I was raised in Southern California, not too far from Los Alamitos, before the track went down in flames insofar as harness racing was concerned. I've loved sports all my life.

"I especially liked betting on horse racing, both thoroughbreds and harness. That became my passion. I was a regular attendee at Los Al and I did pretty well at the windows. Although my knowledge of horses with regard to pedigree and conformation is limited, I'd be willing to match my ability to watch and analyze a horse race and the abilities of the horses in it against just about anybody.

"Like many young men, I've dreamed of owning and running a sports franchise. Realizing that this is likely impossible, my participation in owning harness horses goes a little way towards realizing that dream.


"We moved to the Pittsburgh area and of course The Meadows became the place to go."

You've been a successful gambler. To what do you attribute this?

"One of the most important rules is that you must have no fear. There is a gambler's saying that says, 'Scared money never wins.' That might not be 100 per cent so, but it is very important. If you have a strong opinion, whether it be on a 'normal' sporting event or a horse race you cannot be afraid to go with your gut.

"The more important thing of course is that you know as much as you can about what you are betting on. Almost as important as knowing what you can about an individual game or race is knowing what you don't know.

"There was a time when to a large degree I made my living betting on horses. In recent years that has been cut down considerably. Today I look for value. If the potential gains in multiple race bets are worth the investment, I'm sometimes challenged by them. For the most part I've been fairly successful, but betting on individual races has become somewhat of a rarity."

You and Mike Bruscemi have been associated with the Burke family for many years. How did this come about?

"When I started going to The Meadows I thought it would be fun to own a horse or maybe a few horses. I hooked up with a local trainer who did alright for me. But I wanted action, more action than I was getting in that stable. I met Ronnie Burke and it was almost like we clicked immediately. We were and still are focused on the entire picture. Racing at The Meadows was fun and somewhat gratifying, but we both wanted to widen our horizons.

"I had become friends with Mike Bruscemi through an annual fantasy football draft that we both attended. I suggested to Mike that he might be interested in having some fun and perhaps making some money in owning some racehorses.

"He said yes. I don't know if Mike had ever been to a racetrack before. We went to The Meadows to watch the first horse we owned together. She was going to win by five lengths when all of a sudden she stuck her toes in and made a horrendous break. I thought to myself, 'I guess that's enough harness racing for Mike.' But that wasn't the case. We've been together since, with of course the Burke family, through mostly good times and the rare bad ones.

Speaking of bad times, how has 2020 with all the terrible events affected your horses and your business?

"It's been a @#*&#%\$@ disaster! We, meaning the stable, had lost millions of dollars. The months that we lost not racing were some in which we are generally able to help offset the expense of running a stable of our size. The horses racing at that time of year were generally the ones carrying the stable including the more than 70 2-year-olds that we had in training, especially the huge costs involved in staking them.

"All of our racehorses were out of action. But the expenses

for the most part were the same. We were paying the bills on more than 300 horses with just about nothing coming in. Our only sources of revenue were the stud fees on the horses that we owned parts of. But those were minimal compared to the overall expenses of operating the stable."

Do you anticipate coming out from all the expenses incurred and the lack of income coming in?

"Actually we are just about reaching the point where we have a chance to have caught up. A great deal will depend on how our horses do this weekend with both the Ohio and Pennsylvania championships coming up. If we do as well in them as I hope we will, we will have likely reached the point where we are no longer net losers. A big part of that is that we have by necessity made significant changes in our way of doing business in the last two months. In a normal year, we would likely buy about 20 racehorses a month. In the last four months, we have bought 10 head and sold 70. That goes a long ways towards righting the books."

Let's talk about some of your better horses.

"There have been so many that its very, very hard to pick one favorite. If I were pressed to the wall I'd be hard pressed to go against:

"Sweet Lou - The number of thrills he has provided us and still continues to do are innumerable. He was a world champion at 2 and raced at the highest level at 3, 4 and 5. He is now one of the best pacing stallions in North America. I will say the very best, mostly to get Myron Bell riled up. If he isn't the best, he is darn close. Speaking on a relative basis, he hasn't had quite the quality of mares to begin with that his number one competitor Captaintreacherous has. But they are coming. His crop of yearlings this year are out of mares comparable to those of any other stallion. Who's the best will likely be ascertained on the racetrack next year and in the years to come. In all my years in the sport perhaps the greatest satisfaction has been derived from the success that he has accomplished from his first few years at stud.

"Foiled Again - Some might say how could you possibly not say that the greatest money-winning horse ever is not your favorite. They might be right. The problem is an exceptionally difficult choice when you've had as many great horses as we have had.



"Warrawee Ubeaut - There's recently been a slightly heated conversation on Facebook regarding who was the greatest filly pacer of all time. I know it is Warrawee Ubeaut. There were others who have thought differently, specifically with regard to Three Diamonds and Countess Adios. I never saw those race, but I've seen every race that Beaut went and I've never seen one close to her. I understand there have also been many others such as Tarport Hap, Eternal Camnation and Silk Stockings. To show you how much we think of her, we've decided to enter her against the boys in the \$100,000 Scioto Downs free-for-all this weekend.

"Mission Brief - I don't care what others may think, I think that Mission Brief at her best was the greatest trotting filly that ever lived — maybe even the greatest trotter. There are a lot of them that I've never seen, but of the ones I've seen she's the best. That includes Atlanta, Manchego and Ramona Hill.

"Southwind Frank - He is undoubtedly the best trotting colt we have ever had. He was a truly great 2-year-old. If not for some soundness issues, he would also have become one of the great 3-year-olds. His first foals are 2-year olds and they are performing exceptionally well. Five from that first bunch have made the finals of the Pennsylvania sires stakes this weekend."

How about racing. Which races do you enjoy most?

"The Little Brown Jug, in my opinion, is the best experience in all of harness racing. The crowd, the ambience, the horses and horsemen are there not only determining who are the winners, but they are also out there enjoying themselves. This is still harness racing at its best.

"I suppose if we hadn't been taken down with What The Hill in the Hambletonian, that would probably have been my favorite. There is no doubt that it was my biggest heartbreak. That was definitely a race where the best horse did not win.

"The many Breeders Crowns that we've won have all been exceptional.

"Of course there is nothing quite like winning The Adios in front of a hometown crowd."

What, if anything, do you see as your chief function in the Burke operation?

"I would say three main things. The first would be in scouting out prospective racehorses for the racing stable. I look for horses that I think we can improve upon and that might thrive under Ronnie's system. I bring them to Ronnie's attention and of course he makes the final decision on all horse related matters. The second which has been recently acquired is helping to determine which horses should be

sold, by what method and for how much money. I try to be realistic and fair in doing that. The third is to act as kind of a liaison between Ronnie and the other people involved in our ownership groups. Ronnie just does not have the time to do that. To be quite frank, I can't imagine how he gets all the things done that he does."

Where do you see the future of the Burke operation in the near term?

"If we've learned anything from the lack of racing opportunities in this terrible year, it's that we've got to cut down the size of the operation. It's clear that the future of Yonkers, where we've earned bucket-fulls of money in recent years, is in doubt. Even if it continues, the purses will be down because, to a great degree, they are predicated on the amount of handle at the casino. That is down this year, way down. The same applies to all the other New York tracks as well as all the Pennsylvania tracks. Purses are already down significantly and many big money stakes have been cancelled."

How do you see yourselves performing at this year's yearling sales?

"A lot of that will be dependent on how the sale of some of our horses, especially prospective broodmares go. If we are able to sell some of the mares for what we think is a good and fair price, then chances are that we will be quite active. If we aren't able to do that, we will likely have to pull our horns in a little. Previous to this year, we have operated on a five to one ratio on racehorses versus yearlings. I suspect that we will likely come close to that ratio again. However I'm pretty sure our racehorse inventory will be down, then so will our activity at the yearling sales."

Let's close out with your basketball prowess. It's pretty clear that you consider yourself a pretty good hoops player.

"I think that with the exception of Nikola Jovic and Sam Bowie, I could put on a good show with everyone that I know is involved in harness racing. I consider myself to be a very good shooter. In terms of speed and athleticism — not so much. Ronnie Burke thinks that he belongs on the all harness racing basketball team, but I'd describe him as being a Bill Laimbeer without any talent."

Landy hopes to create another 'Historic' memory

There is no question Goshen Historic Track is special to Harry Landy. He first visited the upstate New York oval at the age of 9 as a participant in the Harness Racing Youth League. Five years later, Landy won his driving debut in a matinee race at Historic Track and over the next two years he collected 10 more matinee triumphs there.

In 2013, Landy enjoyed an unforgettable day at Historic Track, driving Useful Hanover to victory in a Landmark Stakes for his first Grand Circuit triumph. Useful Hanover, making his career debut, overcame a 15-length deficit to beat Stevensville, who in his previous start won a division of the Pennsylvania All-Stars.

Today (Sept. 6), the 28-year-old Landy will return to Historic Track for another Landmark Stakes, this time with 3-year-old filly pacer Chuppah On.

"I always support Goshen; I love it," Landy said. "Every year I look forward to hopefully having a horse to go there and try to win a race. There is a lot of history there and it's really cool to win a race there. It's a special place."

Today's Landmark Stakes were originally scheduled in July as part of harness racing's Hall of Fame weekend in Goshen. Racing at Historic Track and the Hall of Fame inductions at the adjacent Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame were postponed because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Hall of Fame inductions for the class of 2020 will take place in July, 2021.

Five Landmark Stakes and eight New York Sire Stakes
County Fair finals will be contested today. No spectators
other than owners with reservations will be allowed at
Historic Track, but the races will be live streamed beginning
with the pre-show at 11 a.m. (EDT). First-race post time is
Noon, with the Landmark Stakes topping the card. The link to

Landy has cut down on driving over the past several years to focus on training, but he will drive Chuppah On and always looks forward to driving at Historic Track. His win with Useful Hanover, a horse he co-owned with trainer Blake MacIntosh, seven years ago ranks as a top moment in his career.

"At no point going to Goshen did I think I was going to win," Landy said. "Stevensville was much the best. If it were a betting race, he would have been like 1-9 and I would have been 300-1 or some crazy number.

"Down the lane, I was like, I'm going to catch him. It was cool. If I had to think of one of the coolest races I've won, it's that one."

Chuppah On is a homebred daughter of Art Major out of Bell On Wheels. She is trained by Landy, who also trained and drove Bell On Wheels during her final three seasons on the racetrack. She was Saratoga's Pacing Mare of the Year in 2013.

"Bell On Wheels was the first good mare that I had," Landy said. "She was an unbelievable horse. I'm really excited about all of her babies."

Chuppah On has won five of 15 career races, with four of her victories coming on half-mile ovals. Last year she was fourth-placed-third in the Landmark Stakes for 2-year-old filly pacers at half-mile Historic Track.

"She's coming into it real strong, she's feeling good, and she's the right kind of horse to win at Goshen," Landy said. "She loves to pass horses. If I could work out a good trip, that would be pretty cool. I think she's got a good chance. I'm really looking forward to it."

Jean-Michel Bazire-trained **Cleangame** (Ouragan de Celland) was superior in Saturday's \$171,000 Prix d'Ete at Vincennes in Paris.

Bazire placed his 8-year-old gelding in third over, which became second over midway through the race. With a little less than a half mile to go, Cleangame was pushed to the lead and in the last turn Bazire let his horse sprint away from the opponents. Cleangame came home in stakes record 1:54.1 over 1.6 miles.

Korpi's mare best in Derby

The \$370,000 Finnish Derby for 4-year-olds was held at Vermo racetrack on Saturday afternoon and first choice **Mascate Match** (Muscle Mass) held the chasers behind her after a trip in front.

Stablemate American Hero left quickly behind the gate and got a bit spicy in front during the race's first quarter. Shortly thereafter, Mascate Match hit the front with trainer Pekka Korpi in the bike and the Muscle Mass mare consolidated her position as the best trotter in the Finnish 4-year-old crop.

Korpi asked for an extra gear in the last turn and Mascate Match answered to that command and had everything under solid control at the home stretch, even if runner up Always Ready seemed to be close at the race's end.

Mile rate for Mascate Match was 1:58 over 1.6 miles and Pekka Korpi's mare continues to collect big trophies in Europe. Last year, she won both divisions of \$225,000 E3 and the victory in The Derby pushed her lifetime earnings to \$732,000.

Riordan successful in Helsinki

Double Exposure was the heavy favorite when the \$178,000 Finlandia-Ajo was held at Vermo racetrack in Helsinki, Finland on Friday night (Sept. 4), but another horse trained in Sweden stole the show and impressed a lot.

Finlandia-Ajo is usually held in early May, but due to COVID-19 regulations, the race date was changed this year and the field of 10 trotters was gathered behind the gate late on Friday night.

Heavy raining just minutes ahead of the race made the track a little bit sloppy and the conditions were far from the best, at least if a great mile mark was the object.

Double Exposure came from an impressive win in the \$354,000 Hugo Åbergs Memorial and Örjan Kihlström chased the front position when the car accelerated from the field. It costed to reach the lead for the Donato Hanover mare and after 500 meters, Jerry Riordan's **Zarenne Fas** (Varenne) attacked three wide, an attack that ended in position first over. The pace was set high considering the conditions and in the last turn it was clear that the stride for the win was between the two front horses.

Zarenne Fas wrestled down Double Exposure shortly ahead of the wire and grabbed an impressive win in 1:52.2.

Without doubt, this was one of the season's more impressive performances in European harness racing and Riordan was satisfied after the great victory.

"This race turned into a different race compared to Hugo Åbergs Memorial, where Double Exposure had a quite slow first half mile. Today it was higher pace and Zarenne Fas is a Varenne horse. Everyone that remembers him knows that he got tougher for every hard task he got. This is a horse for the Elitloppet, he's got that speed," Riordan said.

Yonkers Trot paused, but not forgotten

With the Yonkers Trot on pause for 2020, and hopefully not thereafter, let's take a look at some notes for this third and final addition to the Trotting Triple Crown which began in 1955.

Brothers x2

What is the richest race in North America where brothers finished 1-2? And it happened in back-to-back years.

Ulf and Jan Nordin first did it in the 1984 and 1985 Yonkers Trots. In 1984, it was Baltic Speed over Sandy Bowl, The following year, it was Master Willie over Mark Six. Both times, Jan Nordin was the winner. Their dad, Soren Nordin was the trainer of both.

Five decades

When Stanley Dancer finished second in the 1990 Yonkers Trot with King Of The Sea to Royal Troubador, it marked the fifth decade that Stanley had driven in the Yonkers Trot.

P.S. In 1990, the top two drivers in the Yonkers Trot were Carl Allen 60 and Stanley 63. It marked the last time the top two drivers in any Triple Crown race have BOTH been past their 60th birthday.

New York state of mind

New York state has played host to more Triple Crown races than any other state -37 per cent of all the Triple Crown races ever held - trotting or pacing. That is especially high considering the Kentucky Futurity (which debuted in 1893) and the Jug (1946) got a big head start. The Yonkers Trot started in 1955 and Scott Frost won the Triple Crown in year one.

American favorite?

American Winner won the 1993 Yonkers Trot by 10 and a half lengths-and then the Hambletonian by 2 and a half. Think he'd be the favorite going for the Triple Crown in the Kentucky Futurity? WRONG! Pine Chip won at 1-5 and American Winner failed to get money in the final at 8-5.

Yonkers Trot runner-ups

1971 – Savoir who was voted Horse of the Year in 1975.

1972 – Delmonica Hanover went on to become 1974 HOY.

1978 - Doublemint won the 1979 Roosevelt International.

1984 — Sandy Bowl won the first Older Male Trot in the Breeders Crown in 1985.

1987 — Sir Taurus marked Jimmy Takter's debut in the race.

1996 — Kramer Boy the following year was Sweden's Horse Of The Year.

1999 — San Pellegrino went on to sire the 2011 HOY San Pail.

2004 — Cantab Hall the only 2YO Trotter to be named Trotter of the Year (2003) and Hambletonian runner-up.

On a break

While there will be no Yonkers Trot in 2020, consider that the Kentucky Futurity took a four-year break during WW II 1942-1945.

Judgement day

In 2009, Judge Joe won the \$670,774 Yonkers Trot for Jimmy Takter. He was purchased just before the race and became the only trotter in the last three decades to debut in a new barn and win a Triple Crown race in his first start. This has happened twice on the pacing end:

1991 Cane Pace — Silky Stallone for trainer Brett Pelling 2006 Messenger — Palone Ranger for trainer Greg Peck

Smedshammer wins 2 on the road

Trond Smedshammer has twice won the Yonkers Trot and they were coincidentally the same two years it was not held a Yonkers.

In 2004, Windsongs Legacy won at Hawthorne.

In 2005, Strong Yankee won at Freehold.

Yonkers was under construction both years. The slot hall opened in the fall of 2006.

Ladies back-to-back

Ladies won the Yonkers Trot back to back in 1995-1996 when C R Kay Suzie and Continentalvictory did so. Both were named HOY. When Suzie won it in 1995,she won by 7 and 1/2 lengths in 1:56. That time equaled the stakes record set by yet another outstanding lady — Peace Corps from 1989.

Ingrassia still the only one

Jacqueline Ingrassia went first over and won the 2000 Yonkers Trot with Goalfish. She is still the only female to win a Triple Crown event. The following year, Brooke Nickells drove in the Kentucky Futurity (Lavecster) and finished second in the first heat and third in the final, at 78-1 and then 23-1. If female drivers won and finished third in Triple Crown events in consecutive years, then why haven't we seen them in any Triple Crown races since?











Trainer/driver Miriam Toland

Growing up in Rahway, NJ -21 miles from Manhattan and 5 miles from Staten Island - Freehold Racetrack was a 30-minute drive from the Miriam Toland's house.

Miriam, an only child, often accompanied her father to watch the thoroughbred races there.

"That's when I began dreaming of having my own pony and one day becoming a jockey. But I realized I would never be 100 pounds, so that dream went up in smoke," Toland said, laughing.

But little did Miriam know that decades later she would become one – if not— the oldest female driver in harness racing.

Although racing and training horses wasn't her primary career, driving her four-legged-kids in races would eventually take her to racetracks all over the United States.

"I've raced my horses at Pompano Park in Florida, Freehold in New Jersey, Ocean City Downs located in Maryland, Pocono Downs in Pennsylvania, Harrington in Delaware, Foxboro Raceway in Massachusetts and the New York tracks, Goshen, Monticello, Tioga, Batavia Downs and Vernon Downs."

She attended the University of Tampa, majoring in Physical Education. When not in school, Miriam took a job as a waitress at Monticello Racetrack.

"I was working to help pay for my tuition and would watch the races. I couldn't believe the drivers in harness racing came in all sizes, unlike the jockeys of thoroughbreds.

"I was always a person who when putting my mind to something, I followed it through. I thought, 'I could do it' and I did.

"Working as a physical education teacher in New York City,

I had summers off so in 1971 I started working in the barn area — grooming, cleaning stalls, and taking paddocks.

"In 1972, I took the trainer/driver test and passed.

"The next year a trainer/driver at Roosevelt Raceway named Steve Demus saw how hard I was working and actually gave me my first horse, named Madam's B Gallon."

"I raced Madam's B Gallon at the matinees and was devastated when in the race he stepped in a hole and shattered his ankle. My heart broke when we put him down and I wrote a 36-line poem about him, but it never got published.

"In 1973, I got my matinee license and drove at the fairs. When I was 31-years-old (which is considered late for a driver) I began driving.

"In 1976, I got my 'P' license and, as they say, was on my way."

Miriam worked hard juggling both careers at the same time, but somehow it worked.

"On June 3, 1984, I got my 'A' license and had my first pari-mutuel win with my horse, Starry Night."

Decades later, her resume credits her competing in hundreds of races, including 25 Sweetheart Paces held at Pompano Park.

"Unfortunately, I was always a bridesmaid, coming in second many times, but never victorious," she said.

Miriam chose not to marry or have a family. Instead, she chose the life of a career woman.

"I wasn't one of those woman who wanted to get married, have children and a house with a white picket fence, which really upset my mom.

"My mother was my best friend and being an only child she hoped one day to be called grandma, but when she realized that wasn't for me, she accepted my horses as her grandchildren."

"One of the best women drivers in our sport, Bea Farber, was someone I admired and looked up to, as well as driver Sandy Fisher.

"I purchased two horses from Sandy and discovered, like me, she also likes to scuba dive. We became great friends and went on many scuba adventures together."

Sandy Fisher and Bea Farber — two of harness racing's top female drivers that could drive with the best males — have both passed away.

Farber, known as "Queen Bea" to her racing family and fans was the female driver with most wins ever in the sport of harness racing, accumulating 1,801 victories.

Sitting behind a 1,200 pound animal is far from a glamorous lifestyle, and until recently women drivers did not get the credit or recognition they deserve.

Back in 1976, NBC News did a segment called "Women In Sports" which included Miriam. When asked why she gave up everything to become a harness horse driver, she replied, "It's worse than alcohol or drugs, but there's nothing like it! I get a natural 'high' every time I drive."

Thirty-four years later at the young age of 75, Toland still gets a thrill when competing. In fact, on July 3, 2020, Miriam won with her horse Fleetwood Hall, a 10-year-old trotter, at Vernon Downs in New York in 1:55.3 (her fastest drive to date.)

Humbly, she credits five people for her success: First, her mother who was her biggest cheerleader, asset, and best friend; and to harness drivers Bruce Ranger, Sandy Fisher, Bea Farber, and Whitney Bell.

When Toland mentions Whitney she lights up like a Christmas tree.

"Whitney is the daughter I never had and I'm thankful she's in my life."

Harness racing and tracks have a questionable future, but Miriam remains positive.

"I've had a wonderful career and wouldn't trade it for the world. Currently I own four horses: two are retired on a farm in Loxahatchee, Florida, and two are my racehorses.

"My all-time favorites are Starry Night, Jim's Little Red, Nobell Prize, Hi Sweetie (which is on my license plate) and of course, Fleetwood Hall.

"I just love that boy for he really makes me look good. I believe anyone can get behind him and win."

Having had a successful and exciting career and still going strong at the age of 75, does Miriam have any advice for women who would like to drive harness horses?

"Be true to and take care of yourself.Doing what you love to do is the key to a happy and rewarding life. And for all the women drivers: past, present and future: congratulations, for we've come a long way ladies."



Late to the dance

"Are you going to the yearling sales?"

"Nah. I thought about going, but then I googled the national guidelines for agricultural auctions and got depressed (guidelines available here).

He clutched his heart in fake shock, "This is blasphemy. Since when does Trey follow guidance or rules?"

"Since the virus messed with my mind. A yearling sale seems like going to a festival without food and fun. I would need to talk through a muzzle and wash my hands another eight thousand times."

He added, "And you can't physically evaluate yearlings when you bid online."

"Well, honestly, in my case, that's no big deal. I never know what I'm looking at with yearlings. They all look great. I've looked at thousands and never eliminated one.] Not seeing them in person would probably level the bidding field for a person with my lack of conformation chops."

"No buying, no selling at sales this year?" He asked.

"Doesn't look like it for moi."

I paused, then threw out something to kick around. "I did have an interesting experience this year."

"Everybody is having an interesting year."

"I mean on the yearling front, well, technically, on the 2-year-old front. The events made me think about yearling sales."

He chuckled, "I don't believe you have soiled the yearling sales arena with your hair-brained innovations."

"Good, that gives me fertile ground to plow. Here's the thing, last year, I piddled around with our yearling. One day in the fall, we were going to sell him online, then I got distracted. My pal and I talked but didn't act. Days rolled on with other mayhem and projects. Before I knew it, I was

opening Christmas presents and realized that the colt was still on the farm and needed to head out for breaking to harness."

"You got a late start?"

"For sure, our annual yearling usually gets started right after a fall sale. We didn't get this colt to the trainer until late January."

"And?"

"He did fine, even with time lost for gelding. The colt trained down nicely. He qualified with the rest of the 2-year-olds, and he put together a nice season. This delayed start made me think of a wild idea of mine that nobody will agree with for 500 good reasons."

He gave a small shake of his head, "Off you go, marching to a different drum."

"There ain't nothing wrong with being unique. Everybody is unique. Some of us just express it better."

"What is it this time?" he said with a touch of mockery.

"I always thought that the yearling sales should begin shortly after New Year's Day. This past year validated me."

"You seek validation?"

"No, validation is for parking. I don't even post on Facebook."

He sighed, "Of course, you have imaginary reasons for your obvious insanity."

"Absolutely. Right off the bat, you save a couple of months of training bills. Of course, most people who know what they are talking about will tell you about foundation miles, learning lessons, rushing things, yada, yada."

He gave a little shrug, "The need for early training probably varies from horse to horse. Maybe you just got lucky that this horse didn't need as much time."

"True, but it is also possible that some babies need to grow a few more months before stepping onto the training track. Youngsters that train up north might not get out much anyway in bad weather. If the rest of the harness world believes a later sales schedule would be too much of a time squeeze, pushing back the start of the 2-year-old racing season could be a plan."

"Your theory will run into serious headwinds," he said.

"Of course, when trainers, owners, and breeders have been going right for a hundred years, going left will always feel like they fell off the earth."

"They might feel that way because going left may be stupid, and if things go bad, the manure will hit the fan."

"It's called change, which is not a four-letter word. Let me tell you something that was a big plus in 2020 racing for me. This year did not feel like we waited an eternity to see if we had a viable horse. Before we knew it, we were trying to qualify. The wait is too long, especially for newbies. Phil Denton was the last non-racing pal who I brought into a yearling partnership. Between the September sale and late June qualifying, Phil The Thrill met a woman, got married, and got divorced. In all the pre- and post-marital drama, he forgot he was in fractional ownership of the horse. The soon to be ex-wife tweaked his memory when she listed the two-year-old filly as an asset in the divorce papers."

He smiled. "I'm guessing the sale companies and breeders have studied this and find that immediately after the racing season is the optimal time for buyers to raise their hands to bid on yearlings. Plus, farms would need to hold onto the horses longer, which would be an additional expense."

"I'm sure they have considered this carefully. I have studied this idea uncarefully and applied it to my state of mind. Fall is a busy time. Well, it was before the Corona dance. After the holidays, boredom settles over the land. The winter days would give me extra time to study catalogs in front of the fire, to check under the couch cushions for extra money.

Those extra months would give me a chance to visit some hot prospect horses in person."

He said, "If the sales dates were in January, the yearlings would not even be yearlings; they would be two. Selling 2-year-old's NOT in training would be very radical."

I shrugged. "One person's radical is another person's logical. January is a bummer with holiday hangovers, resolutions torched, taxes due, writing the wrong date on checks, sleet pelting down, and sports in a slumber."

He opined, "I imagine the coronavirus has many breeding farms worried about traditional sales this year."

"Yeah, the scene does not look good. 2020 might have been a good year to push back the sales dates. Too bad that I procrastinated with my wisdom."

He gave an eye roll and snickered, "Your wisdom."

"Hey, at least this year, I proved that it's possible to start a yearling later than normal."

"Or, you proved you colt was a fluke, and you are a kook."

Gingras sweeps Gold divisions at Grand River Raceway

Yannick Gingras had a perfect night in Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) action at Grand River Raceway on Friday (Sept. 4), steering the winners of all three \$72,267 Gold Series divisions for the 2-year-old pacing fillies.

Gingras kicked off his driving hat trick with **Twin B Sunkissed**. Starting from Post 3, Twin B Sunkissed left smartly and then yielded to Game Of Shadows heading by the :27.4 quarter. Game Of Shadows continued to lead at the :57.2 half, but was under pressure from Voelz Delight by the 1:26 three-quarters. Circling the duelling leaders at the top of the stretch, Twin B Sunkissed battled Voelz Delight down the stretch and was able to get a head in front at the 1:54.3 finish. Game Of Shadows settled for third.

"She actually raced really good. I'd never sat behind her, and I was really happy," said Gingras, who was making his first appearance in the Sunshine Beach daughter's race bike. "The trip worked out, obviously, but I think she performed really good. It was a good mile here tonight."

Frances Dumouchel trains Twin B Sunkissed for his co-owners Ecurie CSL of Sorel-Tracy and 9174 7998 Quebec Inc. of St-Janvier-Mirabel, QC. The win was the filly's first in six career starts. In her two previous Gold Series appearances the filly had finished fifth and sixth, which gives her a total of 58 points and a spot in the top 10 heading into the last Gold Series leg. The top 10 point earners at the end of the regular season will advance to the \$250,000 Super Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Oct. 17.

Gingras was back in the winner's circle after the second division with lightly rated **City By The Bay**. Also starting from Post 3, Gingras settled City By The Bay in fourth and watched fan favorite Postscript put up a :28 opening quarter. Heading for the :57.3 half, the reinsman tipped City By The Bay out behind Nightlife Seelster and tracked that filly as she challenged the pacesetter through the 1:26.3 three-quarters.

Coming off the final turn Gingras gave City By The Bay a clear look at the wire and the filly powered down the stretch to a one and three-quarter length victory in 1:56. Shiatzu Seelster and Shes A Sassy Beach finished second and third.

"I raced her last week and she really didn't give me, I think, her best effort, but they changed the bridle on her and then I think maybe the smaller track probably played in her favor as well," said Gingras, who calls New Jersey home, but is currently in Ontario for six weeks of stakes action. "She had a good trip, but she really exploded home. I was really happy with how she raced tonight. Last week she didn't have that, but tonight she had a real good kick."

Ashleigh Hensley trains City By The Bay for Burke Racing Stable LLC of Fredericktown, PA, William Switala and James Martin of Clarence Center, NY and Weaver Bruscemi LLC of Canonsburg, PA. The win was the Bettors Delight daughter's first after finishing fourth, second and seventh in the first three legs, giving her 85 points and a share of fourth in the standings.

The final division saw Gingras partner up with Battle Of The Belles champion **Scarlett Hanover** and the filly once again delivered a dominant performance over the Grand River half-mile. Starting from Post 7, Scarlett Hanover had to dodge a breaking Alumni Seelster on her way to the front, but still reached the quarter in :28.2. From there it was all Scarlett Hanover as she rang up a :59 half and a 1:27.1 three-quarters before pulling away to a five length victory in 1:54.4. Fan favorite Best Head West had to settle for second and Sportsdrink completed the top three.

"This one was really, really good, she won super easy. I mean she was really the one I thought that had a good chance to do some good tonight, and she showed up for sure," said Gingras. "She gets around this track so good and she won really easy."

A stablemate to City By The Bay in the Ashleigh Hensley barn, Scarlett Hanover is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC of Fredericktown, PA, Frank Baldachino of Clarksburg, NJ, J And T Silva - Purnel & Libby of Delray Beach, FL and Weaver Bruscemi LLC of Canonsburg, PA. The Bettors Delight daughter has a flawless record of three wins in three appearances at Grand River Raceway.

Her first Gold Series win boosted Scarlett Hanover into third spot in the standings with 88 points. The filly finished fourth, second and fifth in the first three legs.

The two-year-old pacing fillies will wrap up their Gold Series regular season at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Oct. 5.

LeWayne Miller grabs back-to-back ISS wins at Hoosier

Pacing colts and geldings, both freshmen and sophomore, took to the track for Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) action on Friday (Sept. 4) at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. While the 2-year-olds raced their fourth round and the 3-year-olds raced their fifth, driver/trainer LeWayne Miller was the common thread as he grabbed victories in both ages with freshman Jk Going West and sophomore Family Recipe. The first half of the stakes races saw wins from heavy favorites 3-year-old Crook Boyzz and 2-year-old What's Your Beef.

Miller's first victory provided an upset over a heavy favorite when he guided Jk Going West to his first Indiana Sires Stakes victory. While the betting public backed Brookview Bullet with Trace Tetrick, 10-1 Jk Going West dug in in the lane to reach the wire first and stop the clock in 1:52:0, establishing a new lifetime mark.

As the wings of the gate opened, Jk Going West called the shots and held them through the first quarter in 26.4 until PBR Street Gang with Sam Widger moved first-over to grab the lead through fractions of 54.4 and 1:24.1. As the field turned for home, Jk Going West dug in and began to bolster his lead on the pack, a fast-charging Brookview Bullet attacking from behind. The pair matched strides until the wire where Jk Going West was a head to the good and Brookview Bullet held on for a game second. Readyfortheladys with Peter Wrenn rallied from the back of the pack for third. Jk Going West paid \$22.60 to win for his betting backers.

"He's always been right there but I always knew he could get there," Miller said. "He had a tough go at it last time out, but I knew if things went his way he'd get it."

Jk Going West is the son of Jk Endofanera—Southwest and was bred by the Silver Linden Farms. With his first win of the season out of seven starts, he now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$49,183 for owners Bill Beechy and David Ferch.

Through fractions of 26.3, 55.2 and 1:23.4, Family Recipe sat patiently while his competitors made moves from the outside on the leaders. Digging in through a competitive stretch battle, Family Recipe surged forward and crossed the wire a length ahead of his competitors. The Candyman Can held on for second while Dojea Gizmo with Peter Wrenn staged a late rally for third. Family Recipe paid \$5.00 to win.

"He's definitely stronger this year," Miller said about the gelding. "He has a much better attitude and he keeps getting better with every start."

The son of Always A Virgin—Tia Maria Hanover has now won five of 19 lifetime starts, boasting a lifetime bankroll of \$131,980 for owners LeWayne Miller, Arnold Maners, Joseph Vierra and the Never 2 Late Stables. Family Recipe was bred by Lyndar Stables.

The earlier stakes races of the night kicked off with a win from 3-year-old gelding Crook Boyzz, earning back-to-back stakes wins in 1:50.3. In a near gate-to-wire fashion, Crook Boyzz with Brandon Bates stopped the clock over a length in front, paying \$4.40 to win. Sawyer's Desire with Trace Tetrick held on for second and Always And Again with Sam Widger rallied for third. Crook Boyzz, the son of Always A Virgin—Magic Moments, is owned by Robert Esposito and Brett Selby.

In the first event for the 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings, heavy favorite What's Your Beef rebounded in stakes action in 1:51.3 with Trace Tetrick at the lines. After securing a seat in the pocket, What's Your Beef quickly made an attack on the leader and held that lead until he reached the wire over two lengths to the good, paying \$2.80 to win at the betting windows. Tj's Indy Pacer with Sam Widger rallied for second and Aracache Can Dance with Peter Wrenn held on for third. The son of Jk Endofanera—Kats Treasure, What's Your Beef is owned by W Donovan, Joe Sbrocco, Kirk Nichols and Jaf Racing.

The daughter of Always A Virgin—Summer N Sand now boasts a lifetime bankroll of \$84,500 and is undefeated in five lifetime starts. She is owned by Howard Taylor, Edwin Gold, Abraham Basen and Richard Lombardo. The Dylan Davis trainee was bred by Aaron Stutzman.

The second division provided Something To Me her first stakes victory for trainer Michael Arnold. The minor upset lowered Something To Me's lifetime mark by over two seconds to 1:51.4.

When the wings of the gate opened, Skyway Ideal with Brandon Bates fired out for the lead while Something To Me with John De Long sat in the pocket. Through the first quarter in 26.4, Something To Me prepared to attack the leader. Something To Me pulled the pocket and grabbed the lead, carrying it handily through the half in 55.4 and the third quarter in 1:24.4.

With the wire in sight, Something To Me opened up on the field, leaving the remaining six to battle for minor spoils. Something To Me crossed the wire and stopped the clock in 1:51.4 four lengths ahead of her competitors, paying \$10.20 to win. JK She's Gordjus with Trace Tetrick rallied late for second and after sitting in fourth for most of the mile, Sassy Cindy with Peter Wrenn dug in for third.

Owned by Steven Huffman, Something To Me now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$33,705 and notched victory number five from eight starts. The daughter of Jk Endoranera—Sorcha Bluestone was bred by Bluestone Farms, C Agins and S Steven.


"The members of the Quebec Jockey Club in meeting this morning, made this decision," said Mr. Lévesque, following the

Faraldo fires back at Gural over Horseracing Integrity Act

Jeff Gural continues to berate anyone who disagrees with him on any issue (full story here). That is usually done by direct or indirect attacks meant to discredit the speaker. I know very well of what I speak, having been at the receiving end of many such comments, since I so often disagree with his points of view. His latest attacks on the USTA, indirectly against its board and directly against its president, Russell Williams, for their very well considered position on the Horseracing Integrity Act, is just the latest noxious volley.

The USTA has expended much effort to ensure that the Horseracing Integrity Act, while well intended, recognizes that harness racing involves a different breed with a different performance model, and cannot be treated simply as a subsidiary of thoroughbred racing. Thankfully, our breakdown rate is infinitesimal compared to the thoroughbreds; nor do we suffer the global economic concerns centered around the domestic use of Lasix that is repeatedly set forth as the justification for the removal of race day Lasix.

Through its board of directors, the USTA and its president have spent much time attempting to carve harness racing out of legislation that fails to address our differences as a breed and yet seek an inordinate amount of the cost payment from our industry owners. After serious analysis of the bill, the USTA made many trips to our nation's capital to provide a substantive, reasoned response to the bill's contents. Contrary to Mr. Gural's assertions, the USTA's position is neither frivolous nor ridiculous. Rather, it is a position reflective of sincere concerns over the negative effect an ill-crafted federal law would have on our sport; a sport already being cannibalized and wishfully destroyed by

thoroughbred racing interests and casino companies.

Mr. Gural owns one of those aforementioned casino companies in New York. Warnings that our refusal to capitulate to thoroughbred interests and support the federal Act will result in "decoupling" does not serve our interests one bit, but might, in fact, be that author's ulterior motive. The USTA efforts hopefully will achieve its only goal in opposing the Act, and that is to either be carved out of this thoroughbred-centric bill or obtain the concessions we need as an independent industry.

Importantly, the USTA does not argue against or is in any fashion complacent when it comes to integrity.

President Williams and Hanover Shoe Farm have done much, with money in hand, by creating a vehicle, the Standardbred Racing Integrity Fund, to perform independent policing of our sport in the aid of investigations. This will serve to reinvigorate policing which, because of economics, has been virtually non-existent in recent years. additionally, just three years ago, I published a protocol for uncovering beard trainers.

Being opposed to an ill-conceived Horseracing "Integrity" Act, and all it really stands for, creates an easy target for opponents to take cheap shots at the USTA, its chairman of the board, and its efforts endorsed by those who I know to be thoughtful directors, concerned about integrity, independence and economics.

The last cheap shot is the comment that some people had horses with one of those trainers arrested or indicted in 2020. That shot was directed specifically at me. Need I remind the industry that many innocent owners have entrusted horses to trainers who possessed valid state licenses until something was alleged against them, either in the form of racing violations or alleged criminal conduct. Some well-respected owners more prominent than myself have utilized trainers on the list of those recently charged, including Mr. Gural. In this regard, while differences of opinion can foster honest debate, hypocrisy simply minimizes the value of the opposing viewpoint.
