TETRICK one step closer to being the greatest driver of all time

Last week, the driver surpassed both 13,000 wins and \$250 million in earnings.

Over the course of a week, Tim Tetrick surpassed two major driving milestones. On Wednesday, Aug. 31, Tetrick notched career win 13,000 at Harrah's Philadelphia. Six days later at the Red Mile, he joined John Campbell and David Miller as the only drivers to earn more than \$250 million lifetime.

Already a member of the Hall of Fame — he was formally inducted last year — it's not too early to now ponder where Tetrick ranks as an all-time great and more specifically, the greatest of all time. A completely subjective question for sure, but one worth exploring.





As a benchmark, John Campbell is generally regarded more than all others as the greatest driver in the history of the sport. His talent and storied career go far beyond a number, but needing some objective measure, his career earnings of \$299,892,141 is a record that only three or four drivers total to this day have any chance to reach. Those drivers include Tetrick, as well as fellow Hall of Famer Dave Miller.

In all likelihood, Tetrick will reach \$300 million, short of any unfortunate and unforeseen circumstances. It's still quite possible for Miller, too.

It was only about 18 months ago when Tetrick got his 12,000th win, and at that time his career earnings were just over \$228 million. Having earned \$22 million in that span alone, including \$9.3 million in 2022 to date, it would seem that at worst, Tetrick will reach \$300 million within five years. Today, Miller bests Tetrick in the career earnings department by about \$16 million. But that gap was more than \$20 million a year ago, and will continue to presumably narrow as Tetrick, 40, has a near 20-year advantage in age over Miller who will turn 60 in two years.

The challenge with comparing Tetrick to Campbell – and Miller is somewhat of a bridge between both of them – is that they raced, for the most part, in different eras. The purse structures were different, particularly with overnights, as was driver competition.

Sticking with the turn of this century excluding a lion's share of major stakes wins over two decades prior, Campbell competed at the Meadowlands five nights a week with full fields against the likes of Mike Lachance, Ron Pierce, George Brennan, Miller, Luc Ouellette, Cat Manzi and a host of others. Similarly, Tetrick has competed throughout his career against a hyper competitive group of drivers that include Yannick Gingras, Brian Sears, Miller, a fresh rivalry with Dexter Dunn, and an overall deep group of top to bottom drivers no matter the competing track.

If there's one area where Campbell has a decided advantage, it's in the classics. For example, Campbell leads Tetrick in Meadowlands Pace wins 7 to 5, Pepsi North America Cups 6 to 2, Hambletonians 6 to 1 and Little Brown Jugs, 3 to 0. But those numbers could change dramatically in the coming years as Tetrick remains relatively young, and still driving in the prime of his career.

As Tetrick continues to march towards the magical \$300 million number as well as almost never achieved career win numbers, his case will continue to be bolstered. Numbers alone won't make him the greatest ever, but they'll certainly put him in a debatable position.

POST SCRIPT

Included in Tetrick's whirlwind past 10 days, in which he overtook the season's-long leader Jason Bartlett in earnings, were wins in four separate \$252,000 PASS Finals and an upset in the \$463,600 Canadian Trotting Classic. One of the more interesting races though was a \$40,000 invitational in which he drove Allywag Hanover to tie an all-time world record of 1:47.3 for an older gelding pacer on a five-eighths mile track.

What made that race noteworthy, aside from the record, is that it was a real race essentially conducted the same way a time trial would be. In the race, Dan Dube took Ruthless Hanover to the front and went wild through fractions of :25, :51.4 and 1:19.1. I'd have to think that at least one or all of those fractions are records for the Harrah's Philadelphia track. But Ruthless Hanover did all that while Allywag Hanover sat nicely in the pocket after beginning from the rail; and he didn't have to move until the top of the stretch at which point he paced clear with a final quarter in :28.1 to complete the mile in 1:47.3.

Contrast that to Bulldog Hanover's 1:45.4 mile when he was wide, parked, used and pressed. If Bulldog Hanover does race this fall at Lexington as is currently on the radar and someone is willing to set similar fractions for him, it's possible he might be able to break 1:46 for a second time.

SPEAKING OF BULLDOG...

Bulldog Hanover is a certified star and has the potential at this point to complete one of the most historic seasons ever for a 4-year-old pacer. He continued his domination last week with a win in the Canadian Pacing Derby on Saturday, which coincidentally was the same day that a 4-year-old thoroughbred horse named Flightline drew comparisons to Secretariat with a 20-length Grade 1 win. It's all relative of course, but both horses from different sides of the breed


are creating substantial buzz in their respective industries. Bulldog Hanover was (finally) made the top ranked horse unanimously this past week after winning over a couple of holdouts, and eyes on him will continue to grow as he travels onward to Hoosier, Lexington and then hopefully the Breeders Crown back home at Woodbine Mohawk.

TEST OF FAITH DÉJÀ VU...

HRU received a letter from a reader last week, calling into question the integrity of a winners over race last Friday at Harrah's Philadelphia in which Test Of Faith lost at odds of five cents on the dollar. An eerily, almost identical scenario played out three months ago that I

wrote about then in HRU. So, no need to rehash every detail, but I will add this: If there is going to be a legitimate high stakes quality horse allowed to race in an overnight condition, then a race secretary needs to take action by simply barring the horse from wagering. Enough is enough.

Don't Panic

The Meadowlands' decision to cancel Thursday's card was due in part to a lack of entries for the New Jersey Classic Series which is having some growing pains early in its tenure.

When The Meadowlands had to cancel racing on Thursday (Sept. 8) due in part to a lack of entries for the New Jersey Classic Series (NJCS), the future of this new event could have been called into question.

"We simply didn't get the numbers we anticipated for the NJCS 2-year-old elimination races," said Meadowlands chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "We added the two Thursdays (Sept. 1 and 8) to accommodate those stakes and still get the overnight horses raced. Clearly, we were stretched last week to fill three cards and with today's box, the Friday and Saturday cards were going to be very thin."

But as anyone who's read "The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy" knows, don't panic.

New things can take time to gain traction and it's hard to judge success or failure off one attempt.

The NJCS is split into an "A" and "B" division and it's that top "A" level for 2-year-old trotting and pacing fillies that drew fewer entries than anticipated.

With no eliminations necessary, the five filly trotters and six filly pacers will move on to their Sept. 16 finals estimated at \$300,000 and \$150,000, respectively.

With a total of 36 pacing fillies having made the April 15 \$400 sustaining payment and 110 trotting fillies making their \$700 sustaining payment on that same date, it's understandable that a well-supported box would not be a reach. But with the "A" and "B" levels combined, only 17 pacers and 23 trotters actually dropped in.

But The Meadowlands isn't alone when it comes to short fields. The Red Mile, currently hosting a series of their own, has also seen reduced field sizes in some categories as well.

"A lot of the \$80,000 races, they're like Pebble Beach's races, they've got five horses and it's the same with the 2-year-old pacing fillies," said trainer Noel Daley.

Pebble Beach has been staying down in Kentucky and racing in the Kentucky Championship Series for 3-year-old colt pacers, the top level of Kentucky's three-tiered system comprised of four legs and a \$400,000 final.

In fact, 12 freshman trotting fillies that were eligible to the race in the NJCS raced, instead, in Kentucky in the fourth leg of their series. Two of those competed in that top-tier equivalent to the NJCS "A" division, but since only four dropped in, it was raced as a non-bettor before the card.

There was only one NJCS eligible freshman pacing filly that competed in Kentucky this week, the "A" division Daley-trained Devilish Dreams.

"I just had her down there because I wasn't beating Linda [Toscano's Ucandoit Blue Chip] here [in New Jersey], so I just thought I'd take a shot," said Daley. "If we weren't already committed to being there for other horses, I would not have taken her out there, because it costs you a fortune.

"I rented a house so I haven't had to deal with hotel rooms, but it's not a cheap operation to be there."



More than one horseman has said that Kentucky's just got crazy money there right now, so it's no surprise that several Jersey-based trainers would take a shot, much in the way many professional golfers have joined the extremely lucrative LIV Golf Tour.

"I love being in Kentucky, but for many years it's been a losing proposition for what you can bill out and what it costs you to be there," said Daley.

2022 Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks winning trainer Jim Campbell can't speak to why some would choose to race in Kentucky over New Jersey, but he's very clear on what works for him.

"My opinion is I choose New Jersey," said Campbell. "The less travel I have to do for horses and people the better off it is, but everybody has their own different opinion of what they want to do so I can't really answer for other people. But for me, if the money's there in New Jersey and the horse is ready, able and willing, then I'm staying in New Jersey.


"We can stay right on our home base and race at The Meadowlands. You're racing on one of the best tracks in the country and not having to travel is the biggest reason of all."

Oaks champ Fashion Schooner is competing tonight (Sept. 9) in the \$275,000 NJCS "A" level final for 3-year-old trotting fillies.

"I think for the Jersey Classic, for it to be in September the way it is, I think the elimination and the final is ideal because we're a month-and-a-half away from the Breeders Crown, so you don't want to be throwing extra starts that you don't want to throw into a horse," said Campbell. "I hope these races continue and they can take off because I'm a Jersey guy and if I can stay here and race for this kind of money, then that's a bonus."

Wilfong in the driver's seat for Saturday's Night of Champions at Hawthorne

After Kyle Wilfong ended Casey Leonard's six-meeting reign as the champion driver during Hawthorne Race Course's winter meeting, the former's career has skyrocketed during the summer meeting.

On Sept. 3, Wilfong warmed up for the main event on the Illinois racing calendar, Saturday's Night of Champions, by putting on what is believed to be the finest driving performance in Hawthorne harness racing history.

He drove seven of the winners on the 10-race card and finished second in two races.

Indicative of how much Wilfong is in demand as a catch-driver, the winners came from the barns of six trainers.

"I'm confident the horses I'm driving are razor sharp," said Wilfong, who sat out only one race.

Five of his conquests came in Night of Champions qualifying races:

Marvelous Mystery and Radiant Diamond won their eliminations for the \$125,000 Fox Valley Flan for 2-year-old filly trotters;

Funky Wiggle was victorious in her prep for the \$85,000 Beulah Dygert Memorial for 3-year-old filly trotters;

Annas Lucky Star captured her qualifier for the \$62,000 Carl Becker Memorial for older trotting mares;

Scorecard Dandy was successful in her elimination for the \$62,000 Tony Maurello Memorial for older pacing mares.

Wilfong's two runner-ups also advanced: Fox Valley Kia will be competing in the \$185,000 Incredible Tillie for 2-year-old filly pacers and Dandy's Mnm earned a spot in the \$105,000 Plum Peachy for 3-year-old filly pacers.

The preceding night, Wilfong drove three elimination winners: Fox Valley McKee in a qualifier for the \$154,000 Incredible Finale for 2-year-old colt and gelding pacers; Fox Valley Crete in an elimination for the \$93,000 Robert F. Carey Jr. Memorial for 3-year-old male pacers; and Goomster in a prep for the \$144,000 Kadabra for 2-year-old male trotters.

The five races worth more than \$100,000 are the most lucrative on the 12-race card that is exclusively for Illinois-conceived and foaled standardbreds.

Harness Racing Update

Named in honor of the long-time Illinois breeder, track announcer and auctioneer who died last year, the Carl Becker Memorial is a new addition to the program.

The introduction of the Becker Memorial means that the queen of Illinois standardbred racing, Annas Lucky Star, no longer have to face male foes as she did last year when came in third in the Plesac for older trotters.

With Wilfong in the sulky, the 8-year-old set a Hawthorne record for older mares on Aug. 6 when she won an open race in 1:53.3.

Annas Lucky Star is going into the Becker Memorial with 54 triumphs in her 121 lifetime starts and earnings of \$576,708 highlighted by a career best clocking of 1:53.1 as a 4-year-old at the Springfield State Fairgrounds.

Following last weekend's stellar showing Wilfong has what looks like an insurmountable lead in the summer meeting driver standings — 63 winners versus 46 for the runner-up Leonard and 45 for third place Atlee Bender.

Vying with Wilfong for the spotlight on the Night of Champions will be Fox Valley Gemini in the \$62,000 Robert S. Molaro Memorial for older male pacers. Owned by Jim Ballinger, trained by Terry Leonard and driven by his son, Casey, the 7-year-old gelding will be in quest of his sixth straight Night of Champions triumph after winning the Molaro for the last three years, the Carey Memorial in 2018 and the Incredible Finale in 2017.

In his elimination last weekend, Fox Valley Gemini gave every indication that he's ready to try to embellish his remarkable success story. Leading all the way, he won by a widening 10 ½ lengths in 1:52.4. It was the 52nd victory of a 102-race career in which he has won 52 times and earned \$662,537, and it gave him a 22-race 2022 resume highlighted by 7 wins, 5 places and 6 thirds.

Casey Leonard is taking the latest victory with a grain of salt because it was a three-horse race and an absentee was He'zzz A Wise Sky, scratched by the track veterinarian due to sickness. In his last two starts the 5-year-old horse finished out of the money in races at Scioto Downs and Hoosier Park.

"But those were stakes races and he's unbeaten at Hawthorne this summer," pointed out Leonard, who is very aware that Fox Valley Gemini finished behind He'zzz A Wise Sky in the latter's last three starts there. In each of these races the younger horse, who is trained by John Filomeno and driven by Wilfong, went off the favorite. Two of the races were won in 1:49.4 and the other in 1:50.

Earlier in the year, He'zzz A Wise Sky recorded one of his 12 victories in 21 outings in a career best time of 1:48.3 at the 5/8ths mile track Oak Grove.

He'zzz A Wise Sky was victorious in his Night of Champions races as a 2-year-old and 3-year-old (when he was the Illinois Horse of the Year) but last year he finished third as the 3-5 favorite in the Molaro Memorial after leading until the final eighth.

Harness Racing Update

Fox Valley Gemini left from post 6, while He'zzz A Wise Sky had the No. 7 slot.

Both Leonard and Wilfong felt the post positions were a significant factor.

"If Gemini draws outside of me it's totally different," Wilfong said. "I wouldn't have had to park so long on the first turn and wouldn't have had to go so hard.

"But give credit to Gemini – he's a terrific horse."

Fox Valley Gemini is one of eight winners in the 2021 event trying to replicate their triumphs Saturday night:

- Fox Valley Exploit is attempting to defend her championship in the Maurello Memorial.
- Apple Valley and Fox Valley Ozzy are moving up to the Plum Peachy and Carey Memorial after winning their championship races for 2-year-old pacers.
- Funky Wiggle in the \$85,00 Beulah Dygert Memorial and Lousdobb in the \$88,000 Erwin Dygert Memorial are trying to do the same thing in their trotting events.
- Defending champion Talk About Valor will be challenged by last year's Erwin Dygert Memorial winner Rndmnunpredictable in the \$62,000 Plesac for aged male trotters.

As he did last year, Leonard will be driving Lousdobb for trainer Steve Searle and Fox Valley Ozzy for Gary Rath.

Fox Valley Ozzy has 4 wins and 7 places in 15 races this year. One of the seconds came in the elimination when the 1-10 favorite lost to 11-1 longshot Fox Valley Crete by a neck. His previous two starts saw him win at Springfield and DuQuoin.

Lousdobb has taken four in a row, giving him seven victories in nine starts this year. He was second and sixth in his only losses.

According to Leonard, Lousdobb had an excuse for finishing sixth on July 22 at Hawthorne. "There were a bunch of rocks on the racetrack and I punctured a tire," he said. "It was by no means his fault that he lost."

Like Wilfong and the Leonards, Flacco Family Farms, LLC is going into the Night of Champions with a sky-high profile.

Last year, horses solely owned or co-owned by Dr. Richard Flacco's stable, won three of the 11 races and all three of the winners were homebreds (Rndmnunpredictable, Lousdobb and Ryan's Loan Shark).

Lou's Legacy, the Flacco stallion, sired two of the winners and three third place finishers. In the five trotting races the now 16-year-old son of North America's 2004 Trotter of the Year Windsong's Legacy and Lady Love McBur sired 40% of the contestants (19 of 47).

"He was a gift from God," said the 80-year-old doctor, who has trainers Steve Searle, Roshun Trigg and Jill Brown sending out offspring on the Night of Champions.

Saturday night 14 horses solely owned or owned in partnership by Flacco Family Farms will be represented, including 5 of 10 in the Fox Valley Flan. "We're not as optimistic as we were the last two years," said Dr. Flacco, who prefaced last year's fine showing by winning with two homebreds in 2020. "But we're happy.

"Your hole is important and you need racing luck."

Finish Lines: Former Illinois Governor Jim Edgar is the co-owner and co-breeder of Fox Valley McKee, a 2-year-old gelding competing in the Incredible Finale...

While Wilfong is on his way to winning the driver title in a landslide, there was a deadlock in the trainer standings after last weekend's action. Erv Miller and Amy Husted, wife of driver Kyle Husted, each had 22 winners...

The Hawthorne summer harness meeting that began on June 30 will reach the finish line on Sunday night. The thoroughbreds will take over the track on Sept. 23 and race for the duration of the year. A Jan. 7-March 20 harness meeting began Hawthorne's unprecedented racing year followed by a spring thoroughbred meeting...

Hawthorne came into the racing world as a thoroughbred track in 1891 and in 1970 had the distinction of being the oldest of the seven Chicago metropolitan area racetracks when it held its inaugural harness meeting. Starting this year it has the distinction of being the only survivor.







Big stakes weekend in Oslo

Bjerke racetrack in Oslo, Norway plays host to massive race cards Saturday (Sept. 10) and Sunday (Sept. 11) when the biggest races for 3-, and 4-year-old trotters are scheduled.

Eliminations were held during the last week in August and some really promising horses will show up already on Saturday's card, when the \$150,000 Kriterium for 3-year-old fillies is on the menu.

Geir Vegard Gundersen trained Lexie B.R. (SJ.'s Caviar) is undefeated after four starts so far and she is probably the horse to beat as she starts from post 1 behind the gate.

Saturday is ladies day and Bjerke's stakes races this weekend number eight in total (four of them are for cold blooded trotters).

The \$200,000 Derby for 4-year-old mares closes the Saturday card and even in that race, Team Gundersen has the probable favorite. Readyforwine (Ready Cash) was 10-2-1 in 13 starts as a 3-year-old and has five wins in six starts 2022. Readyforwine and Thai Brooklyn (Broadway Hall) were the two biggest favorites in the elimination for the mares' Derby and they both won their qualifying race, respectively.

Lisa Giannelli was sentenced Thursday (Sept. 8) to 3 ½ years in prison as part of the federal government's sweeping investigation into horse doping at race tracks across the country.

Giannelli, 56, was found guilty of peddling illegal performanceenhancing drugs to trainers to dope horses and faced a maximum of five years in prison. Her lawyers appealed for a no-jail sentence of probation.

"This was not a one-time thing," Judge Mary Kay Vyskocil said in U.S. District Court in New York. "For 18 years, Ms. Giannelli marketed and sold what she knew were illegal and powerful performance-enhancing drugs."

Vyskocil said that with its verdict the jury had rejected Giannelli's argument that she didn't know that what she was doing was illegal when she worked for Equestology, a Florida company owned by veterinarian Seth Fishman.

Giannelli, of Dalton, DE, was also sentenced to two years of supervised release after she gets out of prison. She was also ordered to pay a fine of \$100,000 and to forfeit \$900,000.

Her surrender date is Jan. 9, 2023.

The government's investigation into the illegal use of PEDs to dope horses led to charges against 31 individuals. Since the charges were announced 30 months ago, Giannelli and Fishman have been convicted by juries, and 22 others have pleaded guilty. Fishman was sentenced in July to an 11-year prison sentence.

Those who have pleaded guilty include trainer Jorge Navarro. He was sentenced to five years in prison.

Trainer Jason Servis was also charged and is awaiting a trial scheduled to begin in New York in January.

Prosecutors said Fishman had designed PED to increase a horse's performance and endurance by building red blood cells and masking pain. The substances were designed to avoid showing up in post-race tests conducted by racing regulators.

At the sentencing, Prosecutor Sarah Mortazavi said Giannelli's actions on behalf of Fishman's company warranted the maximum sentence.

"Her criminal conduct touched hundreds of trainers and led to the doping of thousands of horses," she said.

She said Giannelli has yet to really accept responsibility for her actions and that it was only after the jury's verdict that she offered a "mealy-mouthed explanation for her conduct."

Giannelli came to court with 13 supporters. Among them was a man she married while under indictment and his mother.

"It was never my intention to break the law," Giannelli said.

She said that her arrest and conviction have left her life shattered.

"It was never my intention to hurt anyone or to hurt any animal," Giannelli said. "Everything in my world now is upside down.

"At this point I wish I had never met Fishman.

"I thought I was doing good. I never knew it was not legal."

Defense lawyers pleaded for a sentence of probation in court papers that detailed Giannelli's troubled upbringing and her abusive relationships with men. She said she obtained a license to train horses at harness tracks. She said she met Fishman in 2004 and became his sales representative.

Lawyer Alex Huot said Giannelli was not doing anything she wasn't instructed to do by the doctor.

"She took Dr. Fishman at his word," Huot said.

But Vyskocil told Giannelli she should have known better because the conduct she engaged in occurred when she was an adult.

The judge said Equestology's PEDs were powerful substances that she believed could have and did kill horses.

Vyskocil said that in fashioning her sentence took into account Giannelli's background, her character, and more than 50 letters from Giannelli's family and friends.

"The letters all reflect that you are a kind person, and have a passion to make things better," the judge said.

At the end, she told Giannelli that she was sorry for her, for the situation that brought her to court.

"I do believe you are a good person," the judge said. "You have your whole life ahead of you."

NJSS champs aim for Classic crowns

After winning New Jersey Sire Stakes championships earlier this year at The Meadowlands, 3-year-olds Fashion Schooner and Pretender will return to The Big M tonight (Sept. 9) hoping to add to their collections of trophies for state-sired trotters.

Fashion Schooner, trained by Jim Campbell, is the 8-5 morning-line favorite in the \$275,000 New Jersey Classic "A" final for 3-year-old female trotters. In addition to capturing the NJSS championship in May, she counts the Hambletonian Oaks and a division of the Delvin Miller Memorial among her six victories this season.

Pretender, trained by Nancy Takter, is the 4-1 second choice in the \$275,000 New Jersey Classic "A" final for 3-year-old male trotters. In addition to his NJSS title, the colt has hit the board in five Grand Circuit races this season and eight of his past nine starts overall.

The inaugural New Jersey Classic Series, sponsored by The Meadowlands and the Standardbred Breeders & Owners Association of New Jersey, features "A" and "B" divisions for 2-and 3-year-old trotters and 2-year-old pacers. The \$100,000 "B" finals for 3-year-old male and female trotters also are on tonight's card, as well as "B" eliminations for 2-year-old male and female trotters and 2-year-old female pacers.

Tonight's 14-race slate also includes the fifth leg of the Miss Versatility Series for older female trotters. Bella Bellini is the 8-5 morning-line favorite.

Fashion Schooner, a daughter of Walner—Broadway Schooner bred and owned by Fashion Farms, was limited to three starts as a 2-year-old. This season, she has hit the board in all nine of her races, winning six and earning \$481,062. Her 1:50.1 victory in the Miller is the fastest mile of the season for a 3-year-old female trotter.

"She showed speed last year, but before they do it, you just don't know how well a horse in her case is going to transition from (1):54 to (1):50," Campbell said. "That's always the unknown, but she did show a lot of ability last year in her limited amount of starts."

Fashion Schooner has started once since the Aug. 6 Hambletonian Oaks, winning an Open for 3-year-old filly trotters last week at The Meadowlands in 1:52.1. She will start the Classic final from post four with regular driver Tim Tetrick.



"I was real happy with her last race and she's had a good week, so everything seems good with her," Campbell said. "She's been very good, consistent, all year long. I'm thrilled with what she's done for us. Hopefully, we can keep her fresh for the rest of the season."

Campbell also has the 3-1 morning-line favorite in the Classic "B" final for 3-year-old female trotters, Misswalner Fashion. She has won back-to-back starts after making breaks in two consecutive starts. For her career, she has won seven of 16 races and earned \$379,469 for breeder-owner Jules Siegel of Fashion Farms.

"She had a couple bad starts, but she's put it together her last couple races," Campbell said. "The first time (she made a break) I thought she tried to go too fast too quick. The second time, there was no excuse for it. We lightened her up in front and she responded really well to it."

In the Classic "A" final, Pretender enters off a second-place finish behind Temporal Hanover in the Earl Beal Jr. Memorial on Aug. 20 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono. Temporal Hanover, who earlier this season won the Dr. Harry M. Zweig Memorial and was third in the Hambletonian, is the 3-5 favorite in the Classic's four-horse field.

Pretender, who defeated Temporal Hanover by a neck in the NJSS championship, has hit the board in nine of 11 starts this year, winning three. He has earned \$300,653. For his career, the son of Muscle Hill-Maven has won five of 23 races, hit the board an additional nine times, and earned \$416,281.

"He's a consistent horse," said Herb Liverman, who bred Pretender with John Fielding and Joyce McClelland and owns the colt with those two partners as well as Caviart Farms. "He's not that big, but size doesn't always matter. I've had a lot of good small horses. Some little horses have big, long gaits. And you can't see their heart.

"Pretender is a nice horse. He hasn't always had the best luck, but he tries very hard. He does his best. Quite often he's hung in there when he's had first-over trips or cutting-out trips. He keeps trying right to the end."

Andy McCarthy will drive Pretender, leaving from post one. Brian Sears will drive Temporal Hanover for trainer Marcus Melander from post two. Rounding out the compact field are Melander-trained Periculum and Ray Schnittker's King Of The North.

In the \$100,000 Classic "B" final for 3-year-old male trotters, Robertsin is the 3-1 favorite.

I Did It Myway, Special Way and Confederate have annexed three legs of the Championship series in their respective divisions and seek to collect crowns in the finals on Sept. 18.

I Did It Myway (Andrew McCarthy) defeated North America victor and Kentucky champion Pebble Beach (Todd McCarthy) for the third occasion in the rescheduled \$80,000 Championship race for sophomore

male pacers. The son of Captaintreacherous—Flyme To The Moon received a pocket-sitting trip behind Dancin Sancho (Trevor Smith) who clicked off fractions of :27.2,:54.3 and 1:22. Pebble Beach was in fourth position throughout most of the mile. I Did It Myway overtook Dancin Sancho in the drive to the wire with Pebble Beach in pursuit. Despite a last quarter in :25.3, Pebble Beach was unable to pass I Did It Myway, who stopped the clock in 1:48.2. Dancin Sancho held for third.

Trained by Tony Alagna, I Did It Myway has now earned \$378,658 and has a record of 20 10-1-3. The colt collected his third consecutive victory.

I Did It Myway was bred by Joe Sbrocco and is owned by Country Club Acres, Sbrocco, Don Latore and Alagna and Fodera Racing. He is the first foal from his dam and his ownership group was assembled privately.

Special Way also notched her third consecutive triumph and her third in the Championship series for trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt in the Championship split for 2-year-old filly trotters. The daughter of Walner-Special Hill out-finished leader Walner Payton (Dexter Dunn) to improve her record to 5 3-1-0. Life Itself (Tim Tetrick) was third.

The filly has earned \$125,975 competing as a homebred for Brittany Farms, Marvin Katz and Al Libfield.

Special Way hit the wire in 1:53.4 with a :26.3 last quarter.

Confederate and Tetrick took the Championship division for freshman male trotters in 1:50.4. Blue Lou (A. McCarthy) and Bamboozler (Dunn) were second and third.

Command assumed exactly that off the gate but after the first quarter Confederate was in control with fractions of :56, 1:24 and 1:50.4. The son of Sweet Lou—Geothermal has a record of 4-3-0-1 and has banked \$96.200.

Confederate paid his supporters at the windows \$4.44 to win.

The colt was bred and is owned by Diamond Creek Farm.

Combustion remained perfect with a 1:50.4 win in the Commonwealth series for 2-year-old male pacers. The son of Captaintreacherous—Acquavella is trained by Brett Pelling for Diamond Creek Racing, Thomas Dillon, Scott Dillon and Cooper Silva Stables. Todd McCarthy was in the bike.

The colt was purchased for \$260,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. He is a half sibling to Fine Art (Bettor's Delight, \$103,785) and Heart Of Mine (Roll With Joe, \$350,565). Combustion is a full brother to Captain Ahab (\$143,309).

He paid \$2.82 to win as the favorite. Cannibal (Yannick Gingras) was second and Kaptain

Karlos (David Miller) was third.

Railee Something (Dunn) rebounded after going off stride in the third leg of this series for 2-year-old trotting fillies to win her event in 1:54.2 for Chris Ryder. Caviart Gwen (A. McCarthy) was second and Moni Lisa (Gingras) was third.

Owned and bred by Ronald Mersky, the daughter of International Moni—Railee Priti has banked \$112,306 from a record of 9 5-1-1.

Railee Something paid \$4.04 to win as the favorite.

The six Golden Rod series events for freshman and sophomore trotters and pacers were won by **Saffron Girl** (Gingras), **Summer Trader** (D. Miller), **Larceny** (D. Miller), **Grande** (Gingras), **Captain's Choice** (Devon Tharps) and **Toulouse Lautrec** (Dunn).

Sire stakes action continues Sunday (Sept. 11).

TWO-YEAR-OLD PACING FILLIES

The betting public keyed in on the 1-5 favorite Even Stevens (Bruce Aldrich Jr.). Starting from the rail, he set the tempo for most of the mile with fractions of :29.1, 1:00.1. At the 5/8 pole, **Hunts Flower** and Brian Cross exploded with a strong brush to overtake the leader in the blink of an eye and had five lengths on his contemporaries in the paddock turn. The daughter of Mets Hall was driven by Todd Cummings and is trained by Tammy Cummings and set a new lifetime mark in the process.

THREE-YEAR-OLD PACING COLTS

The top five point earners in the division raced for bragging rights. The favorite, Davey Day Trader, hailing from Post Position 7, left swiftly to get the lead, and set fractions of :27.4, :57.3, 1:27.4 in a spread-out field. The trio had open lengths on the rest of the pack as a confidant Jason Bartlett steered Paya Tuesday to a two-length win in

The lead would diminish as the two paced down the lane but Kisses From Above held off Wild Dude by a neck in 2:00.1 - \$3.70. Jimmy Boltthe Door was third. Kisses From Above was a \$7,000 yearling purchase by American Ideal and is trained by David Dewhurst. It was her fifth win on the year and pushed her seasonal earnings over \$20,000.
