### The million-dollar gift

Pepsi North America Cup finalist and \$20,000 yearling purchase Desperate Man has proven to be an exceptional wedding gift for Paul and Nikki Davies and a surreal present for the entire Cecchin family.



The handsome bay known as Desperate Man has been a little bit of everything over his short life, from a wobbly-legged weanling, to a wedding gift, to a wily competitor set to take on the world.

When the pacing son of Shadow Play steps onto to the racetrack and into the spotlight on Saturday night (Sept. 11) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, everyone connected to the horse with the modest price tag and big heart will no doubt take a brief moment to wrap their minds around what has been a most unexpected journey.



And then, the reality of the moment will sink in: their horse, the one who cost \$20,000, will square off against the best 3-year-old pacers on the continent in the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup.

"It's been quite the journey, one that I don't think any of us ever expected we'd be on," said Kathy Cecchin. "It's kind of surreal, but we couldn't be any happier. It's just so hard to believe. It's really difficult to put into words. He really has been a gift."

But not just for the horsewoman who holds the reins as the trainer of Desperate Man, known around the barn as "Slick."

Cecchin co-owns the horse with her husband John, daughter Nikki and son-in-law, Paul Davies, a horse racing family affair in every sense.

When Paul and Nikki were married on Dec. 8, 2018, there was a particular present, one that wouldn't be found on any bridal registry, that would become just as memorable as they day itself.

As Paul recollected, his parents-in-law offered to help out with the down payment on a new house, or to have part ownership on an unraced colt.

For the newlyweds, one gift represented a sure thing, while the other was quite the opposite.

The couple, horsepeople themselves, talked it over and quickly discovered they were on the same page with their decision.

"We chose to accept the very generous offer of half ownership in the horse," Paul said. "Nikki and I have been fortunate to co-own (along with Deborah Pinel) Outlawgrabbingears, who has been amazing for us. So, he paid for the down payment of the house."

A 5-year-old son of Smart Shark, Outlawgrabbingears has won 27 starts and banked over \$330,000 in an outstanding career that is still very much on the fast track.

"His barn name is 'Trucker,' and Nikki and Paul's son's name is Deacon John Trucker Davies," said Kathy. "You can see how special that horse is to them and to us too. They sent the horse to me after his three-year-old year. I was honored they would trust us with him."

The pacer also played a role, a big one, in the story of Desperate Man.

"I never saw him," said Kathy, of Desperate Man. "I picked him only based on his family. His mother and the mother of Outlawgrabbinggears are sisters. There was a Mach Three filly selling at Forest City and I thought she was going to be out of our price range, and then we found Desperate Man selling in Lexington.



"Trevor Henry, John McLeod, and Jimmy Fleming were there. Trevor looked at him for us and said he was correct. He had chips out of his left hock, which they disclosed, but everything about him looked good. Jimmy Fleming actually bought him for us, which is a big ask. We're forever grateful. So, Jimmy did, and that's how we got him."

It was love at first sight for Kathy, who has trained a small stable of horses since 1996.

Although he certainly looked the part of a good horse, there were no illusions of grandeur at that point in time.

"There are no expectations when you buy a yearling," said Kathy. "When the money is spent, the money is gone. We gelded him because one day we thought he could be a riding horse. We never expected it to turn out the way it has."

Not until the morning of June 20, 2020 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

With Henry in the race bike for the 2-year-old qualifier race, Desperate Man lined up behind the gate for the first time.

Less than two minutes after the field was sent on its way, Henry and the rookie pacer crossed the wire nearly a length ahead of their closest pursuer.

"I don't think I had any idea of how good he could be until that first baby race," said Kathy. "When he came home in :26-flat, everyone was speechless. He is a May 31st foal, so the whole time coming up to racing, we thought the first sign he shows us stress, we're going to stop. I thought if he could be a nice Grassroots horse that would be great. But that baby race, I thought, 'Okay, he might be an overachiever. He's a pretty average Joe."

She was happy to be proven wrong.

Fast-forward to the present and Desperate Man has amassed \$353,014 in winnings and gone hoof-to-hoof against his fleet-footed contemporaries.

Desperate Man's two-year-old campaign yielded three wins in his six starts. All of those wins came in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold division, including a mark of 1:51.2 at Mohawk.

He notched his first victory of 2021 on July 25 at Georgian Downs in the OSS Gold series, winning in a lifetime best 1:49.4, and in the process, bested sophomore heavyweights Bulldog Hanover and Meadowlands Pace winner Lawless Shadow.

Now, fresh off a second-place finish to Bulldog Hanover in one of two North America Cup eliminations on Sept. 4, Desperate Man, who crossed the line in 1:49.1, cutting the final quarter in :25.4, will look to go one better on the big stage.

"He's a good horse and we're very proud of him," said John, a lifelong horseman and trainer who worked with Hall of Fame trainer Jimmy Takter in the 1990s, as well as the late Mark Austin, who played a major role in the success story of standout pacer

Fool Me Once and many others. "He's just so well mannered. He never gets shook up. He's one of the few horses in that caliber of horse that doesn't wear earplugs or get riled up. I'll put it this way... he's smarter than we are. I can definitely tell you that."

All four of his owners are dealing with the stress of being in a prestigious race in decidedly different ways.

Admittedly, they will be on the same page come Saturday night.

"I'm nervous, for sure," said Kathy. "There are lot of people that aren't in this race, so we are extremely grateful to be in this position. But I'm definitely getting more nervous as the race gets closer."

"The nerves aren't there yet," said Nikki. "We have a few of our own to race in the meantime, so it's on a delay for now. But I'm sure they'll come. I'll let mom do all the worrying for now."

Paul, who also drives and trains, is operating on an even-keel approach.

But, if last week's elimination is any indication of how he'll react this weekend, containing his excitement and decibel level won't be an easy task.

"I think Saturday the nerves will kick in. When they were coming down the stretch last week in the elims, I might have been a little loud. I'll try to keep my composure on Saturday night, but I wouldn't bet on it."

And speaking of betting, there could be a wager of sorts by some of Desperate Man's owners in the minutes leading up to the race.

But it won't be placed on the horse that will line up behind the gate in post-position six.

"They always tease me because I never watch him race," said Kathy. "They bet as to where I'll hide. I'm a replay watcher. John is the watcher."

"I watch the race," added Paul. "I'm not afraid to take my eyes off it." Nikki is somewhere in between her husband and her mother.

"I said that maybe we'll be lucky if she decides to watch a race for a change. She wants me to come in the paddock and help her out a little bit on Saturday, so maybe I'll have to try and convince her to come out and watch the race. I am the same with Outlawgrabbingears. I never watch the beginning when they come off the gate, but once they're clear, then it's alright."

Whether they watch part of the race or all of it, each co-owner will have a sense of pride of having a horse in a race that's crowned some of the sport's biggest names.

Win, top-three, or finishing off the board, Desperate Man will be held in the same high regard by those closest to him.

"His future is pretty well mapped out no matter what happens," said John. "Hopefully, we can have a nice horse for three or four more years and after that, we'll buy him a saddle and he can enjoy a great life that he deserves."

"I'm always proud of this horse," added Kathy. "He always gives what he's got to give. He's not like some of the other horses. He needs things to go his way with the trip. He doesn't leave aggressively, but he always shows up in the end. That's all we can ask of him."

It's a sentiment shared by her daughter and son-in-law.

"We're just proud of him and of all the work mom and dad have done," said Nikki. "It's so crazy how it all happened. Outlaw has been a horse of a lifetime for us, and to think mom selected Desperate Man because of Outlaw... it's just hard to believe how things work out sometimes."

"You can't go in there expecting to win, but you hope that you do," offered Paul. "If the trip does work out, I think he does have a good shot. But no matter what, we know how lucky we are to have a horse like this."

A gift, they all say, wide smiles included, that keeps on giving.

### Plenty of wagering opportunities on Pepsi North America Cup night

Woodbine Mohawk Park has been on a betting roll of late with the last two Saturday cards each topping \$3 million in wagering.

Handle has been surging at Woodbine Mohawk Park, and that's bound to accelerate even more on Saturday's (Sept. 11) \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup card. After posting a handle of \$3.2 million two Saturdays ago, the track upped it to over \$3.4 million last Saturday. From a wagering standpoint, the North America Cup card features two separate \$100,000 guaranteed Pick-5's, as well as a mandatory payout on the final races Jackpot Hi-5 which brings into it a carryover of \$300,257. Pool for that race alone will be well over \$1 million. Here are my picks and analysis for the night.

#### Race 3, \$392,000 Peaceful Way

No one has been able to get close to VENERABLE yet and she is simply faster than anyone else at this stage. She can do it either way and maybe Miller will put her on the front to not take any chances, just like he did in the NJSS final. ADARE CASTLE is the other unbeaten filly in here, though seems a consistent couple of seconds slower on paper. DABRA DAY was interesting in her Peaceful Way elimination. She opened wide leads and two different parts in her mile and still held off everyone comfortably except for VENERABLE; may be able to be there with a kinder rating and is bound to be moving forward early again. That was a strategic drive last week from Miller on AMERICAN BEAUTY to get second. DELILAH HANOVER has come within 4 lengths the last two times she's faced the impending favorite; should be a massive price from post 10.

#### Race 4, \$213,170 Champlain

BOB LOBLAW was an unfortunate sixth last Saturday in his Gold OSS race and maybe that will help with the price for this Sunshine Beach gelding. After showing early speed, Filion elected to sit in with him approaching the three quarters and he was trapped for the rest of the mile while seemingly having pace whenever he tried to angle. Two back he won with a :26 final quarter. NAUTICAL HANOVER is another that was buried recently in his race two back, that one coming in the Dream Maker against True Blue Lindy. Once free he was able to get up for second though never threatening the race winner, though he disappointed last out as the 4/5 favorite in the Nassagaweya. MARKET BASED who is best known up to this point for being a half to One Eight Hundred didn't fire two back at the Meadows and then was a vet scratch from the PA Sire Stake final. He obviously has talent though current form is a total guess. MANY MOONS would have been favored against these a month ago but folded two back and wasn't a serious threat last out; needs to bounce back, ATLAS HANOVER and CENTURY INSPECTOR. start from the two inside posts and are a combined 0-for-14 lifetime but don't seem all that outclassed, there aren't any killers in here.

Picks: Bob Loblaw, Market Based, Century Inspector

#### **Race 7, \$240,000 Goodtimes**

LOCATELLI won the faster of the two Goodtimes eliminations last week and I thought that was a well-earned win for him. Hambletonian finalist came first over in that race and still had enough to sustain his wide momentum after PUBLICITY SEEKER popped the two-hole. FASHION FRENZIE had it all his own way in his elimination, getting off with a cheap :58 half mile split on the front end. He hasn't been headed in his last pair

and will look to lead the way once again. What do we do with DANCINGINTHEDARK M? He would have crushed these in July, but he's now lost five straight races – all of which have come at odds-on prices. He couldn't get to the race leader in his elimination following the slow half, but at least he trotted the entire mile. LOGAN PARK was no match for FASHION FRENZIE last week but did beat him three back. I guess ON A STREAK just isn't the same horse he was last year at 2.

Picks: Locatelli, Fashion Frenzie, Dancinginthedark M

#### Race 8, \$425,000 Fan Hanover

After not firing in the Lynch at Pocono from post 9 despite the best possible drive that McCarthy could have put on her, it was back to the big track last week and HOT MESS EXPRESS responded. Unbeaten in all but one start this year, she fought off a brave challenge in her elimination from SCARLETT HANOVER before opening up late and looks the best. FIRE START HANOVER looked like she might run into traffic in her elimination sitting last on the inside, though she was able to weave her way off the pylons and surge from there as Jamieson curiously moved OFF THE RECORD into the three-path to make room for her. Dunn may elect to secure a better early spot this time as to not let HOT MESS EXPRESS too far ahead. VOELZ DELIGHT had good late pace up the inside in her elimination after losing momentum to a tiring leader in front of her. NOTORIOUS PINK paced to consecutive 1:49.1 wins at the Red Mile two and three back.

**Picks**: Hot Mess Express, Scarlett Hanover, Fire Start Hanover

#### Race 9, \$180,520 Champlain Stakes

Upset call here with BOUDOIR HANOVER. Granted that was only a field of four that she beat most recently at the Red Mile, but those were two higher regarded fillies that this \$200,000 yearling sprinted past in the stretch and McCarthy looked like he was sitting comfortably at the end of that :25.1 final quarter. SILVER LABEL is yet to lose in five career starts and she won as MacDonald pleased in her last two Gold wins. I LOVE ONGAIT had some late pace up the inside last week and then ran into traffic; promotionally named filly will be up close once again from the rail. BIG BETTOR HANOVER couldn't quicken off a pocket trip where she didn't have to tip until mid-stretch, ditto for TREACHEROUS KISS.

#### Race 10, \$640,000 William Wellwood

In addition to the winner's share of the \$640,000 purse, the winner of this race will once again get an auto-birth into Mohawk Million. DULY RESOLVED was looked right in the eye

last week by the heavily backed LETSDOIT S and turned that one away and those two split clear of everyone else in the stretch. Two back he likely would have beat TEMPORAL HANOVER if not for traffic. LETSDOIT S had every chance last week and was one of many that couldn't go by after two-hole trips; now moves to the outside. KING OF THE NORTH was another big favorite to go down in the Wellwood eliminations and last week's defeat was the first of his career. He seemed clear but was caught up the inside by PERICULUM who showed speed early in the mile, and then sprinted with apparent ease through the lane once he had clearance; seems more advanced than when seen at the Meadowlands in July. TEMPORAL HANOVER beat WORLD AT WAR DEO in an elimination that those two had mostly to themselves throughout.

#### Race 11, \$1,000,000 Pepsi North America Cup

Pepsi North America Cup XXXVIII pits PERFECT STING against BULLDOG HANOVER with a few others not being far behind. In his elimination, PERFECT STING was headed by WHICHWAYTOTHEBEACH after pulling pocket in the stretch. It looked like he was a half-length down at one point, but PERFECT STING came back again to reassert himself in the end, you don't see that too often. He has a ton of guts. Almost as impressive that night was BULLDOG HANOVER. He took even more action than I thought he would, being bet down to 30 cents on the dollar against the Cane Pace winner. In that race, BULLDOG HANOVER came first over from fifth, paced a wicked third guarter while parked, and was relentless through the stretch. He's the real deal and the top two are almost impossible to split. WHICHWAYTOTHEBEACH looked like he was going to take it to last year's 2-year-old champ and was one of many over the last week to not capitalize off the pocket trip when it seemed like he was poised to do so. Still no disgrace at all in that race and he gets a third crack this year at Sting. ROCKYROAD HANOVER does his best work from off the pace but I'm not sure he can afford to get away 9th in here; it will be interesting to see how Dunn approaches the start. DESPERATE MAN closed well in his elimination after sitting off that big third panel; he isn't without a chance and will offer a price.

# Jamieson excited for the chance to prove Bulldog Hanover is the best sophomore pacing colt in North America

Two-time Pepsi North America Cup-winning driver is hoping to add a third NA Cup win with Jack Darling's talented colt.

Driver Jody Jamieson said he can't wait for Saturday's \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup at Woodbine Mohawk Park to have the opportunity to back up his statement that Bulldog Hanover is the best sophomore pacing colt on the continent.

"He's done everything I've asked of him and, lately, he's done it with ease," Jamieson said of the son of Shadow Play out of BI's Squall. "I'm really excited about Saturday night to see what he can do and show off some more talent that he has. He's just



such an exciting horse and the best that I've ever driven because he's never gotten tired. I've gotten horses tired and got them beat and whether or not I get him beat or not, I haven't got him tired yet. I'm hoping that he stays that way."

The Pepsi North America Cup is race 11 on Saturday's jampacked stakes card that also includes the \$392,000 Peaceful Way final for 2-year-old trotting fillies (race 3), the \$240,000 Goodtimes for 3-year-old trotters (race 7), the \$425,000 Fan Hanover final for 3-year-old pacing fillies (race 8), the \$640,000 William Wellwood Memorial for 2-year-old trotters (race 10) and two divisions of the Champlain for 2-year-old pacers (race 4 for open pacers and race 9 for pacing fillies). First race post time is 6:30 p.m.

Bulldog Hanover, a winner of 6 of 8 starts in 2021, is trained by Jack Darling, who owns the colt in partnership with Brad Grant. With no dominant U.S. star in the division, Jamieson points to Bulldog Hanover's races as the evidence for the statement that the pacer is the top of the class.

"I just think he's the most impressive one. He got beaten his first start, which wasn't his fault. He got beaten in Georgian, struggling around the turns on a track that was loose and they've had tons of complaints all year about the track surface. No excuses because everyone else had to race on it, too, but he got beat by a half-length in :49.4 on a terrible track and not the greatest trip with traffic," Jamieson said.

"He's just a great, big, strong, perfect individual."

The driver said Bulldog Hanover's last two starts - a career-best 1:48.2 performance on Aug. 28 in his \$85,250 Somebeachsomewhere division and a wrapped-up 1:49 victory on Sept. 4 in his \$50,000 NA Cup elimination - were both impressive, with the latter being the slightly better performance.

"He was so dominant last week," Jamieson said. "Someone said it looked like you gave him a tap with the whip and away he went, but I don't think I did tap him with the whip. I might have pushed his tail with it, but I don't think I tapped him with it. He was pacing so hard, he didn't need any encouragement. He

knew his job and he knew what he had to do. Down by the wire, I just let him pull up a little just to conserve some energy for next week, but he was so damn good."

Bulldog Hanover defeated Desperate Man by a length to earn the right to pick post four for the \$1 million final.

Jamieson said he's been watching a lot of replays of his competition this week and thinking a lot about how the NA Cup may unfold.

"Perfect Sting was the other division winner, so he's a good one, but there's other horses in there. I think Rockyroad Hanover will be heard from. I think Whichwaytothebeach will be heard from. The McNair horses (Jimmy Connor B and Bettor Sun) drew 1-2. I've beat them, but you never know. It's a horse race and that's why we run the races... If I was to say one horse it would be Perfect Sting, I suppose, but there's a couple in there that are going to take a shot and we'll see how it plays out," Jamieson said.

#### MOMENT DECADES IN THE MAKING

As for landing the drive on Bulldog Hanover at the start of the horse's racing career, Jamieson said he owes the opportunity to drive the NA Cup favorite to Darling listing him to drive Northern Sky 18 years ago when Jamieson was just a 26-year-old up-and-coming driver.

"I would come up (to Mohawk) from London to drive one horse

in the mares open and it was Northern Sky. You'd have to ask Jack why he used me, but he's been using me for that long. I'm his number one, go-to-guy each year and I couldn't be happier about that," Jamieson said.

"Everybody wants to drive at the big show, and that's Woodbine Mohawk Park and I was no different, so I would leave five or six drives on the table at London. I'd drive a couple and then I'd take off to drive to Northern Sky or, as a 4-year-old, Junior Mint. I got to drive him as a four-year-old. I was a bit in awe at the time, especially driving in Jack's old Telstar with the outside stirrups. Looking back at it, it's kind of funny now thinking about it, because he still has that bike... Anyway, it was that long ago that Jack gave me the call. You'd have to ask him why, but I definitely appreciate it and we've raced some really nice horses together and Bulldog is the best one we've raced together. I think Jack even stated he was the best horse he's ever trained."

Jamieson said he's blessed to drive for Darling.

"(Darling is) the consummate professional," Jamieson said. "We joke a little bit sometimes, but normally the last thing he says when we go on the track is that he could use the money and I say, 'Yep, I know. I'll try to get you some.' That's usually what we say, no matter what race it is.

"He's great to drive for and he's always been great to drive for. He always lets me do my thing and lets me get to know the horse and drive them the way I think they need to be driven. I don't know how many times he's ever been upset with me because if I don't win I don't see him in the winner's circle and he just goes home. When we win, I see him in the winner's circle."

In the other stakes on Saturday, Jamieson will drive **Samosa** in the Peaceful Way (post 7), **Logan Park** in the Goodtimes (post 8), **Off The Record** in the Fan Hanover (post 10) and **World At War Deo** in the William Wellwood (post 1).

Jamieson said his best shot, other than Bulldog Hanover, is likely with Logan Park.

"He didn't draw great, but with the new slanted gate it's not the worst-case scenario. Logan Park has a really good shot. He was really sharp last week and I was caught in the two-hole. I should've been second, probably, but got shut off right at the wire and was loaded with trot. I think he's got a shot from the eight-hole," said Jamieson who added World At War Deo has the talent to win. "He just got trotting not great down by the wire, but (trainer) Dave (Menary) will have him as good as he is possibly going to be on Saturday and he's got the inside. He'll get to go the shortest way around, so I like his chances, too."

Overall, Jamieson said he's hoping to have a big night Saturday.

"I've got a really good line-up. I think it's all going to culminate in the 11th race. I hopefully will have a good night and get some checks, hopefully win a couple before I get there and then you're settled right into the night and you're working hard and trying to do your best and you get to the best race of the night... it's sort of the routine of every night, you just treat it like every other night, even though we're going for a million."

The driver won the North America Cup in 2007 with Tell All and in 2011 with Up The Credit for his father, Hall of Fame trainer Carl Jamieson. Jody said his NA Cup victory with Tell All for trainer Blair Burgess will always be a favorite racing memory.

"Tell All that was the first year (the NA Cup was) at Mohawk and I was coming right back off Doonbeg the year before, who bounced off the gate. I think it was probably my fault that he made a break, but just being a rookie driver in the North America Cup and I probably had some nerves," Jody said.

"The second year, with Tell All, I really felt confident in the horse and didn't feel the nerves as much."

Jody said he knows all too well that it is rare to have a horse talented enough to win the North America Cup.

"I've been lucky enough to be in it a few times and to win it twice with a couple of horses that were really well-prepared for that night," he said. "It's an amazing experience. I had a lot of confidence in the times that I won it and I have a lot of confidence in Bulldoq going into Saturday night, too."

In recent years, Jody has often brought a victorious horse along the tarmac rail so he could slap hands with fans on the way to the winner's circle. That likely isn't possible now since the track was resurfaced and there's an incline between the edge of the track and the railing making it dangerous to steer horses too close to the fans. But, should Jamieson pull off a third Pepsi North America Cup victory, he said he hopes to bring racing fans along for the ride, somehow.

"These last two Saturday nights, especially in the summer time, have been great crowds... I'm hoping to get some high fives in on Saturday night. We'll see what happens," he said. "A few months ago we weren't sure if we were going to have a North America Cup, let alone a North America Cup night with all these races on the undercard, so it's really nice to know that a bunch of the guys are all racing in those races. All the guys from up here that were locked down, everybody has at least a drive in one of the big races and it really does make it all worthwhile and puts the lockdown a long way in our rear-view."

### Melander looks to be a factor in Mohawk trots

Marcus Melander might not end up with a favorite in Saturday's stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park, but the trainer still looks to be a factor in the night's three Grand Circuit trots, sending out three horses in the William Wellwood Memorial and one in each of the Goodtimes and Peaceful Way.

Melander's trio in the C\$640,000 Wellwood Memorial for 2-yearold trotters features two elimination winners, Periculum and Temporal Hanover, and an elimination runner-up, Letsdoit S.

Periculum handed New Jersey Sire Stakes and Peter Haughton Memorial champion King Of The North the first loss of his career, winning by three-quarters of a length in 1:54.3. Periculum led to the quarter in :27.2, then settled in third behind King Of The North and Twin B Archie before coming home in :27.2 for the victory.

Doug McNair will drive Periculum from post four in the final. The son of Muscle Hill—Amour Heiress has three top-three finishes in six races this season, with his first win coming last week. He missed the Peter Haughton because of sickness.

"He's a strong horse, but he's the type of horse that likes to chase other horses," Melander said. "Doug drove him perfectly last week. The optimal trip for him is like the one he got in the elimination, or at least to find some cover, and he can really sprint the last quarter."

Temporal Hanover has four wins and two seconds in seven races and enters Saturday off back-to-back victories at Mohawk, in his Wellwood elim and a division of the Champlain Stakes. The son of Walner—Think Twice was second to King Of The North in the New Jersey Sire Stakes championship after capturing two preliminary divisions.

His only off-the-board effort came in the Peter Haughton final, when he started from post nine and battled his way to the lead in a :26.3 opening quarter.



Tim Tetrick will drive Temporal Hanover from post five in the Wellwood final. McNair was in the sulky for the elimination, which Temporal Hanover won by a neck over World At War Deo in 1:55.1.

"He got a tough trip in the Peter Haughton and he just got tired that day," Melander said. "Other than that, he's done nothing wrong. He's a little bit more laidback, but he's a very nice horse. He was very good in his elimination."

Letsdoit S missed by a neck in his Wellwood elimination, which was won by Duly Resolved in 1:55.1. Letsdoit S has two wins and two seconds in five races and also was a Champlain division winner.

McNair drove Letsdoit S in his elimination, but Dexter Dunn will get the assignment in the final. Dunn and the son of Nuncio—Bacio will start from post nine.

"He got beat by a very good horse in his elimination, but it was some slow fractions and they sprinted home," Melander said. "I was very happy with him. Obviously, the nine hole is not the best, but hopefully he can leave out of there and get some position. He's a good horse and might overcome it.

"I think the favorite is going to be King Of The North. He was probably a little short last week because he hadn't raced since Hambo Day (in the Peter Haughton on Aug. 7). But all of my horses raced very well. I'm confident in my horses."

The winner of the Wellwood gets the final spot in the 10-horse Mohawk Million for 2-year-old trotters later this month.

In the C\$392,000 Peaceful Way for 2-year-old female trotters, Melander sends out Peyton Hanover. She will start from post five with McNair in the sulky. Last week in her elimination, the daughter of Muscle Hill—Pennies From Above finished third behind Adare Castle and American Beauty. She was beaten by

three-quarters of a length.

Peyton Hanover won her career debut, in the Tompkins-Geers Stakes at The Meadowlands, and has finished third a total of three times. She finished seventh in the Jim Doherty Memorial final on Aug. 7 and did not race again until last week.

"I thought she was going to be better in the (Doherty) final, so we gave her a break," Melander said. "We changed a little bit of the training with her, and she was good in the elimination. She never got any clearance, really. I was happy with her. We drew good and the horse feels good, so I'm excited about her."

Adare Castle, who is undefeated in five career races, won her elimination in 1:55.4. The other elim went to Venerable, unbeaten in six career starts, in 1:54.2.

"It might be hard to beat Venerable, but behind her, I think (Peyton Hanover) is one of the better fillies," Melander said. "Venerable is a fantastic horse. But I'm confident in my horse. She raced good. Hopefully, we get the right trip. You never know; it's horseracing."

In the C\$240,000 Goodtimes for 3-year-old trotters, Melander's hopes ride with the enigmatic Dancinginthedark M. The colt has seven wins and four seconds in 17 career races, with his six off-the-board finishes coming in races where he went off stride. He made breaks in three of his four starts prior to his Goodtimes elimination, when he was second behind Fashion

Frenzie in 1:53.2.

Dancinginthedark M, a son of Readly Express-Leila, counts four Grand Circuit stakes among his seven lifetime victories, including a 1:50.1 score in a division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial in July at The Meadowlands.

Tim Tetrick will drive Dancinginthedark M, who leaves from post six. Elimination winners Fashion Frenzie and Locatelli start from posts five and three, respectively.

"After some miscues, it wasn't bad," Melander said about his colt's elimination. "It was a very slow half (:58), which was not optimal for him. But we drew okay, which was the most important thing after not winning.

"You can't really trust him a hundred per cent but if he stays (trotting), in my opinion, he's the horse to beat. We tried some new shoes last week but it's still a work in progress. Hopefully, I can figure it out."

Racing begins at 6:30 p.m. (EDT) Saturday at Mohawk. The card also includes the C\$1 million North America Cup for 3-year-old pacers and C\$425,000 Fan Hanover for 3-year-old female pacers. For complete entries, click here.

#### Looking back on the early history of the Pepsi North America Cup

Can it really be 35 years since John Campbell debuted with favored Amity Chef and was second to Quite A Sensation in the 1986 Pepsi North America Cup?

This year marks 34 years since Canada's very first million-dollar event was held and Jate Lobell dug in to hold off Frugal Gourmet in the 1987 NA Cup.

#### Yes, sire

Jate Lobell won the first seven-figure event on Canadian soiland then sired three winners of the NA Cup in a six-year span:

1992 Safely Kept

1995 Davids Pass

1997 Gothic Dream

#### Oh, Canada

Canadian-born drivers swept the board six times in the early years of the NA Cup:

1986 - Trevor Ritchie, John Campbell and Walter Whelan

1988 - Yves Filion, William Gale and Lyle MacArthur

1990 – Bud Fritz, Doug Brown and Trevor Ritchie

1993 - Ron Waples, Tony Kerwood and John Campbell

1996 — John Campbell, Tony Kerwood and Carl Jamieson

1997 - John Campbell, Paul MacDonell and Mike Lachance

#### Last, but still tremendous

Camtastic was the 1987 Breeders Crown winner and made \$2,117,619.

Beach Towel was the 1990 Horse of the Year and the first ever winner of \$2 million in a season (1990).

They both were last in the NA Cup in 1988 and 1990, respectively.

#### 29 years and counting

It has been 29 years since Joe Holloway last won the NA Cup in 1992, upsetting Western Hanover with Safely Kept. Perfect Sting looks to make another statement for Hall Of Fame trainer.

In early June of 1995, Holloway had the two best sophomore pacers in the land — No Standing Around and Jennas Beach Boy. The NA Cup was right on their schedules until fate took over. The ill-fated No Standing Around didn't make it and Jenna suffered an injury that prevented him from racing all summer.

### Formula 1's recent growth proves old sports can learn new tricks

Maybe it's time to revisit harness racing's marketing and growth experiments

Formula 1 – a Eurocentric open wheel car racing series – was in the doldrums. Decreased viewership and attendance along with corresponding revenues made it a prime target for take-over. In 2016, Liberty Media took the bait and paid \$4.4 billion for control.

Their problem, which should sound familiar to us, was about attracting new (and younger) fans to a traditional sport some would call an anachronism.

"It's going to be a very slow process to turn around the format of Formula One from what it was, looking at big old cars going round in circles, which was spectacular, but it has very little [to do] with what kids growing up now understand the world of transportation to be," **noted Jennie Gow**, a motorsports presenter and journalist.

Liberty's catch-all approach was aggressive.

First, they invested heavily in digital, including in emerging fan markets like China. It started off slow (as it often does), but by 2020 F1 was the second fastest growing major sports league across the four main platforms. In terms of engagement, F1 achieved 99 per cent year-over-year (YOY) growth, well ahead of second place UFC and far ahead of the NHL, MLB and NFL. Seventy-seven per cent of the growth came from the 16-35 demographic.

Second, they devised an esports series, where expert players compete weekly in paid events, culminating in a World Championship at the end of the season. The events were viewed 23.8 million times during the last (pre-pandemic) season.

Third, they created a series some of you may have watched, called "Drive to Survive," distributed through Netflix. Now in its third season, the reality show has been rumored to have monster ratings, and the fan base has blossomed.

"The F1 thing is sneaky AF. I previously had no s---s to give," **tweeted** tech investor Chris Sacca. "Then that Netflix series happens and now I have multiple fantasy teams and set my alarm to watch it live with the kids."

"The series has made it easier for fans in the U.S. to understand our sport, which is one of the key barriers we face when engaging non and casual fans," said **F1's Director of content Ian Holmes**.

About now maybe you're saying (as I did while studying this) that it all sounds well and good, but where's the proof it's translating to dollars?

On Sky Sports in the U.K., 2021 television ratings are through the roof, culminating in an all-time record audience of 2.23 million (records are unheard of in pro sports in today's world) for a recent Grand Prix. In the U.S. — where the sport has historically been a massive outlier with low ratings — the results are similar. ESPN reported a 50 per cent increase in YOY viewership to about a million per race so far in 2021. For comparison, the NBA playoffs (an ESPN staple), averaged about 3 million viewers on the network.

The proof, as they say, seems to be in the pudding.

Does this provide horse racing with anything actionable? It would be foolish to conclude that what F1 has implemented can be replicated in such a small sport; F1 is apples and harness racing is oranges. But the parallels – a shrinking fan base, a sport built for a different time, a younger demographic not showing any interest at all – are noteworthy. It at the very least makes us think, doesn't it?

Several years ago, a digital marketing strategy was attempted in harness racing but it was defunded not long after. The sport, through the USTA and others, have dabbled in other projects; again, for mostly a very brief period. As F1 has proven, this is not a battle, it's war. Changing perception and growing more fans, bettors and owners takes not only investment, but time and patience.

Perhaps it might be wise to revisit marketing channels in the sport of harness racing once again; some tried, some not tried. If the narrative can be changed where old cars going around in circles see a resurgence, perhaps there's something to it for horses, too.

# Ashley and Dean Wilson's growing breeding operation a reflection of their passion

The couple will have 29 yearlings to sell this fall -23 in the London Virtual Yearling Sale and six in the Ontario Select Yearling Sale.

'Pride' and 'passion' often get lumped together as catchphrases and slogans, but in spite of their overuse there might not be two better words to describe Ashley and Dean Wilson and their Kerwood, ON breeding farm.

Dean has owned and bred horses in partnership with his uncles Melvin and Keith and father Raymond Wilson since the mid-1980s, nurturing a love of standardbreds alongside his primary occupation as a cash crop and beef cattle farmer. In 2011, he opened the doors of his barn to a few outside horses and one of his new boarders was Ashley, who grew up in the show jumping and dressage worlds, but wound up just down the road at Westwind Farm after graduating from Kemptville College's Equine Studies program.

After dating for two years, the couple wed in 2014 and gradually started to expand their breeding operation. Five years ago, Ashley gave up a job with an accounting firm to focus on the horses and Dean has handed more responsibility for the cash crop and beef cattle operation to two of his adult sons, Brandon and Curtis.

On a property that has been in the Wilson family for more than 140 years, the operation currently consists of 43 mares, some 29 soon-to-be weanlings, 29 soon-to-be-sold yearlings and five yearlings getting ready to go directly to trainers. Fifteen of the mares belong to the couple, while the other 28 are owned by people from across North America whose broodmares are enrolled in the Ontario Resident Mare Program.

"That's over max," said Dean with a chuckle. "We only had around 20 to 30 (broodmares) and then last year everybody seemed to think they needed one, so we got a whole bunch of maidens in and we ended up jumping to 43."

Until this year, the couple have been the operation's sole employees, relying on assistance from Brandon, Curtis, and Dean's other sons, Drew and Trevor, as needed, along with website expertise from Dean's brother Owen and nephew Josh. This summer, they hired two young women to help with yearling preparation and are hoping one will stay on part-time for the remainder of the year.

Of the 29 yearlings they are preparing for sale, six are headed to the Sept. 26 Ontario Select Sale in the Princeton Farms consignment. Raised by Dr. Steve Taylor of Kitchener, ON, the Wilsons put the final polish on the youngsters and will show them off to interested buyers in the coming weeks. The other 23 yearlings will be sold through the London Virtual Yearling Sale, 16 having been born and raised on the Kerwood farm, while the other seven arrived for yearling season. The Wilsons are the second largest consignor behind Seelster Farms in the virtual sale, which begins Oct.16.

"We raised more and we had a few more ship in from last year," said Ashley. "It's nice that people send them, but I think that we're big enough that we won't have the manpower and the time next year probably."

"We'll probably just stick with our own in the future," Dean added, noting that 39 of the 43 mares on the property are in foal at present. "This year we took on some extras, but probably in the future, with that many mares, we won't take any outsiders."

The Wilsons were satisfied with their results in both sales last fall. All About Addie, an Archangel half-sister to 2020 2-year-old Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots champion Four Wheelin, was their top seller in the London Virtual Sale at \$39,955 for breeder Christina Tieszer of London, ON. Archangel—Lady Bling daughter A Precious Stone topped their Ontario Select Sale offerings at \$42,000 for breeders Blair and Erna Corbeil of Beaumont, AB.

"It was a lot of work at the farm. Every day it felt like people were here to look at them, because they didn't want to buy

them without seeing them," said Ashley. "We didn't have that big hustle at the end; it was just a lot of steady work throughout the season. We can't complain; they sold well."

While the near-daily stream of visitors has yet to start this year, the couple expects things will pick up in the coming weeks as videos are posted and their advertisements start to run. Among the youngsters in this year's consignment are a Lookslikeachpndale half-brother to All About Addie and a Muscle Mass half-brother to A Precious Stone, along with a Wheelin N Dealin half-sister to 3-year-old trotting colt Ontario Sires Stakes

Victoriahasasecret (Holiday Road-Diamond Victoria) as a

Gold Series leader Logan Park and a Resolve half-sister to Dream Of Glory champion Publicity Seeker, who currently sits fourth in the sophomore trotting colt Gold Series ranks. Both Logan Park and Publicity Seeker will compete in the \$240,000 Goodtimes Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday, Sept. 11.

"It's nice to watch them racing each week head-to-head; you don't know who to cheer for. It's exciting to know that they were born on this farm," said Dean. "It's just as nice to watch them race for somebody else as when you own them."

The couple still race the odd horse, and the Sept. 1 claim of 5-year-old trotting mare Victoriahasasecret was a tender topic two days later. The couple bred the daughter of Holiday Road and Diamond Victoria and she had earned \$79,335 under the tutelage of trainer Brittany Kennedy before the claim.

"When Victoria was going in London we'd go out to watch her, and then when COVID hit Brittany would let me go with her and be the groom," said Ashley of the mare, who was the Three-year-old Trotting Filly of the Year at The Raceway at Western Fair District in 2019. "It's a lot more fun going. We like to go, and we have two little kids (Caitlin and Ryan) so we'll bring them with us."

"But the computer is a great thing, you can watch it all live too, so that's a huge help," Dean added. "We try to watch all ours that we've sold over the past years, watch them race every night. We keep an eye on the entries every week."

The most successful horse the couple has bred and raised from one of their own mares is Archangel–Dream Taker son Knight Angel, who was a Gold Series winner at both two and three and has earned \$283,205 in his four-year racing career. Looking ahead, they would like to produce a few more well-bred trotters without increasing the overall size of the broodmare band.

"We've built a couple barns in the last few years and a lot of paddocks, really built the place up and I'm kind of tired of building now," said Dean with a chuckle. "It's a lot of work now, so you don't want to get any bigger, we're happy with the way it is right now."


"We have more pacers, but we're trying to get up in trotters more," Ashley added. "But it's tough to get a nice trotter. Last year we went and bought a yearling filly just because of her pedigree."

For now, the pair is focussed on having the yearlings in tip-top shape for the upcoming sales. Once the last yearling has left for its new home they will wean and work with the 2021 foals, before beginning preparations for the 2022 foaling season.

"It's just a cycle. There used to be a break, but now it's just a big cycle," said Ashley with a chuckle. While the cycle requires countless hours of time and dedication, it is clear the couple would have it no other way.

"Nothing is more gratifying than raising a foal that goes on to win a race," said Dean.







#### Extra school pays off

The addition of a leg of the Kindergarten Series for 2-year-olds helped The Meadowlands fill this week's cards.

"This week was way better than last week," said Big M race secretary Scott Warren. "[Adding a leg of the Kindergarten] was discussed after we moved the Reynolds last week and I told them all that if we get the same numbers as the Reynolds, it served its purpose. And we actually got more numbers than the Reynolds. We ended up with seven divisions."

The Meadowlands is usually dark for about nine weeks following Hambletonian Day, but for the second straight year, they're racing in September due to COVID-19.

After a three-month shutdown early in 2020, they came back in September and raced just one day the first week, which was Kentucky Derby Day, before returning to their usual two nights a week for the remainder of the month.

This year, to make up for the Thursdays that they'd normally race in December, they brought back September racing on Friday, Sept. 3, but only 158 horses dropped in the box.

"I think it caught us all off guard," said Meadowlands chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. "I thought we'd be a little short coming back in September with horses scattered all over the place, but I didn't foresee that coming, that is for certain."

Warren left no stone unturned trying to get more horses. He even carded three GSY amateur races.

"It was planned that we were going to have two races," said Dave Yarock, president of the GSY. "And then [Scott] said 'We're really short' and I went to work and I was able to get a total of three races."



With amateur races also taking place at Pocono Downs, at this time it's not always easy for Yarock to get horses even though the GSY has a unique feature. They give four per cent of the purse to the horses that finish sixth through 10th, meaning everyone that enters is guaranteed a minimum \$600 payout.

"Pennsylvania was racing the amateur race at Pocono for \$9,900 and they bumped the purse up, so I turned around and bumped my purse up this week," said Warren. "They went for \$15,000, so I went from \$12,500 to \$15,000."

"I started to put \$15,001 on the condition sheet," he added with a laugh. "We're in a bidding war for amateur horses."

Rather than canceling a night, as Harrah's Philadelphia had to do due to a lack of entries for its special Labor Day card, The Meadowlands had an ace in the hole. The conditions of the Reynolds Stakes, scheduled for that Friday at Tioga Downs, allowed for the change of date and venue.

"We actually own that stake and The Meadowlands puts it on for us," said John Campbell, president and chief executive officer of the Hambletonian Society. "They did reach out and consult with us that they were making the change, so I was aware of that. It's an unfortunate situation. People want to know where the race is. The conditions clearly say they can change the venue or the date and The Meadowlands chose to exercise that right. It's not unprecedented. The Cane was moved from Tioga to Pocono [in 2011 due to flooding] after the draw was made."

The boxes at Tioga and The Meadowlands closed at 9 a.m., and by 10 a.m., the move was announced. Everyone who dropped in was contacted and according to Nick Salvi, stakes administrator for both Tioga Downs and The Meadowlands, most were happy about the change.

"After we made it known, I received a few texts from trainers who were not pleased saying they would have entered horses had they known the race would be at The Meadowlands," said Salvi. "By then, it was too late to do anything about that. No entries were taken after 9 a.m. and no one took out of the box after 9 a.m. There was eventually one scratch from the five races.

"The Reynolds situation was not perfect, we all would have preferred to leave it as scheduled, but under the circumstances we did what needed to be done. Adjusting has become a part of all businesses over the past 18 months."

Some horsemen chose to express their opinions on social media but none of them contacted Settlemoir directly.

"We try to consider our customers, owners, trainers, drivers, grooms and employees to make sure it's all right for everyone," said Settlemoir. "We're trying to accommodate everybody."

The Meadowlands has gone out of its way this year by adding legs to series like the Kindergarten and Miss Versatility, picked up some legs originally scheduled for Canada and even added a short series for pacing mares to help horses get raced.

Some may be unhappy with the circumstances surrounding the Reynolds, but looking at the track's past performances for the entire year, far more are thrilled with the overall results of the East Rutherford mile oval.



#### Huntsville progeny vie for supremacy on New York Night of Champions at Yonkers

While numbers can often be manipulated to support almost any opinion, in the case of stallion Huntsville and his progeny, it's impossible to see anything but success with his first crop. As sire of seven of the 16 2-year-old pacers set to compete tonight (Sept. 10) in the \$1.6 million New York Night of Champions at MGM Yonkers Raceway, Huntsville has arrived in a big way.

Led by multiple-leg New York Sire Stakes winners Stretch The Line, Pickup Man Hanover and Just Divine, Huntsville, who stands at Cameo Hills Farm in New York, has an opportunity to capture both the \$200,000 final for colts/geldings and fillies.

Huntsville hasn't just been in a "New York State of Mind" in 2021. His foals sit third in total earnings and fourth in average earnings per start by 2-year-old pacers nationally. His Caviart Camden recently became the fastest freshman pacing colt in history when stopping the timer at The Red Mile in 1:48.3.

Race four tonight is the third of eight \$200,000 finals for 2- and 3-yearolds of both gaits and sexes. It features freshman colt and gelding pacers travelling one mile to determine the Empire State champion. Four sons of Huntsville in a field of eight will line up behind the gate and they are arguably led by the aforementioned Stretch The Line in terms of talent.

A \$16,000 Goshen Yearling Sale purchase in 2020 and the fifth foal from broodmare Jessalilmixup, Stretch The Line has been enigmatic to some extent for trainer Erv Miller, who also shares ownership with Rock & Roll Stable Inc. In five wins, his average margin of victory is more than three lengths, but his three losses have all been due to making breaks at various points in the mile. There was even one New York Sire Stakes start at Saratoga where he combined his two passions and broke at the start yet came back to win.

"He's a puzzle, isn't he," joked Miller about Stretch The Line, who will make his final start of 2021 in the Sire Stakes final. "He's got a cannon bone on his back ankle that bothers him. I don't know if that is all that is causing the breaks or if it is also immaturity. After the race we'll turn him out. Usually the cannon bones do pretty well from 2 to 3 and normally they don't bother them as much."

In Stretch The Line's most recent start he was poised to fire off cover and win at Yonkers in the final NYSS leg when he rolled off stride for no reason on the final turn. "Tyler [Buter] told me the other night when he made the break that he was just counting how much he was going to win by because he was loaded with pace," said Miller.

Stretch The Line will start from post 3 with new driver Jordan Stratton taking the lines.

"For sure, changing from one guy to the next is always an issue. It would've been nice to stay with Tyler through the final, but he had committed to the other people [Forrest Blu] already," said Miller. "Normally I would have [my son] Marcus [Miller] drive him, but he has the other horse [Flip My Chip] in there."

Flip My Chip has been ultra-consistent for Erv Miller with Marcus in the bike, compiling three wins in six starts including two in the Sire Stakes. A son of Heston Blue Chip bred by Winbak Farm, his only off-the-board finish came in his career debut at Pocono back in June.



"In his first start he was dehydrated and a-fibbed, but has come back really good since," said Erv about Flip My Chip, who will start from post 1. "We got lucky with the draw, so hopefully everything is going right for him now."

Like Stretch The Line, Pickup Man Hanover is by Huntsville and a threetime Sire Stakes winner this year. The Hanover Shoe Farms-bred will start from post 7 for the team of trainer Monica Krist and driver Billy Dobson. The Dennis and Simone Noud-owned gelding has never been worse than third in seven career starts.

Hurrikane Chuck (Dan Dube) and Greg The Leg (Ray Schnittker) complete the Huntsville quartet in the 2-year-old male pacing split. They start from posts 4 and 8, respectively.

The morning-line favorite at 2-1 is Pleaseletmeknow, a Fiddler's Creek Stable homebred son of American Ideal-I Said Please. Matt Kakaley will drive the Springfield stakes winner from post 2.

"He's got a big shot," said Pleaseletmeknow's trainer Travis Alexander. "He needed that last start after missing time and still almost won."

The leading money-winner among Huntsville foals starts in the \$200,000 2-year-old filly pacing final. Just Divine (\$95,808), the first foal from \$880,335 earner Divine Caroline bred by Steve Jones, is a Friday victory away from easily surpassing her \$160,000 Lexington Selected Sale price.

Just Divine has produced a stellar 5-3-2-0 record while winning three NYSS legs along the way. In her last appearance at Yonkers Raceway, she powered away to a five-plus length win in 1:53 2/5, just missing the track record.

"She's a tremendous filly, one of the best I've sat behind," said driver Yannick Gingras about the Ron Burke trainee. "Maybe she's a little better chasing than she is on the front, but she's done things on the racetrack that have been really impressive and I like her a lot."

Owned by Bill Donovan, Craig Henderson, Joe Sbrocco and Purnell & Libby, Just Divine starts from post 4 tonight as the 5-2 second-choice on the morning-line. The filly will be joined in the race by fellow Huntsvillesired young ladies Reenactment (post 7) and Twenty Grand (post 8).

The 2-1 early choice in the field, carded as race 5, is Gotthegreenlight (post 3, Dexter Dunn), an American ideal filly trained by Nifty Norman for Patricia Stable and Kovach Stables LLC. The \$40,000 Standardbred Horse Sale purchase has won five of six starts in 2021, including by a nose over Just Divine at Tioga Downs in her last pari-mutuel start.

"It was a little my fault," said Gingras about the loss with Just Divine. "I had Dexter right where I wanted him and I opened up at the top of the stretch and he let me go easily. I just opened up a little too quick. His filly is a top filly, too, and mine got a little lost in the stretch. I think [Just Divine] is as good if not better than [Gotthegreenlight]. I have all the confidence in her."

A fellow American Ideal-sired contender is Joyride Hanover, who set a track record (1:54 2/5) earlier this year at Monticello Raceway. Tim Tetrick will guide the Hanover Shoe Farms-bred filly from post 2 for trainer Eddie Dennis and owner Eric Good.

The 10-race Night of Champions card kicks off at 7:15 P.M. EDT and concludes the live racing week. Racing resumes with a Monday to Saturday schedule starting Sept. 13.

Woodbine Entertainment supportive of government requirement for guests to provide proof of vaccination to access racing venues and casinos

Woodbine Entertainment said Thursday (Sept. 9) that it is fully supportive of the **Government of Ontario's requirement** for guests to provide proof of vaccination in select settings which includes horse racing venues and casinos beginning Sept. 22, 2021.

To add a further layer of safety, Woodbine Entertainment announced internally last week that it is implementing a COVID-19 Vaccination Policy for its staff, horse racing participants and contractors starting on Sept. 15.

Here is how it will work for the various groups:

#### **GUESTS**

As per the Government of Ontario's new policy, guests entering Woodbine Racetrack or Casino Woodbine, Woodbine Mohawk Park Racetrack or Elements Casino Mohawk, Greenwood Teletheatre and WEGZ Stadium Bar will be required to provide proof of full vaccination.

#### WOODBINE ENTERTAINMENT EMPLOYEES

Employees will be required to provide proof of full vaccination to gain entry to its properties — Woodbine Racetrack, Woodbine Mohawk Park, Greenwood Teletheatre and WEGZ Stadium Bar.

Employees who are not fully vaccinated or choose not to disclose their vaccination status will be required to participate in an Enhanced Screening Program which includes rapid testing (Antigen).

#### CASINO EMPLOYEES

The majority of employees working in Casino Woodbine (at Woodbine Racetrack) and Elements Casino Mohawk (at Woodbine Mohawk Park) are not employed by Woodbine Entertainment and therefore would not be subject to the Woodbine Entertainment Vaccination Policy for employees.

#### HORSE RACING PARTICIPANTS

Horse racing participants will be required to provide proof of full vaccination to gain entry to Woodbine Racetrack (including the stabling area) and Woodbine Mohawk Park (including the paddock areas). Horse racing participants who are not fully vaccinated or choose not to disclose their vaccination status will be required to participate in an Enhanced Screening Program which includes rapid testing (Antigen).

#### CONTRACTORS, VENDORS AND SUPPLIERS

Upon each visit, contractors, vendors and suppliers who will be on-site for more than 30 minutes will be required to be rapid tested for COVID-19 or show proof of full vaccination.

"We are very supportive of the Government of Ontario taking this next step and for including horse racing venues and casinos in the list of establishments that will require proof of full vaccination for entry," said **Jim Lawson**, CEO, Woodbine Entertainment. "We have been planning for this possibility which is why we were prepared to implement a vaccination policy for our employees and horse people that will provide another layer of protection for our staff, horse racing participants, guests and the larger community."

#### Trotting colts remain undefeated in ISS at Hoosier Park

Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino kicked off another busy week of stakes action on Wednesday, (Sept. 8) with three \$44,000 divisions of Indiana Sires Stakes for the 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings and two \$66,000 divisions for the 2-year-old trotting fillies.

Leaving from the rail, Dover In Motion settled off the gate in second before moving to the lead just before the half and was quickly on top by two lengths. Dover In Motion closed home in :27.3 under minimal urging from Macomber Jr. to get the victory. Iwont Back Down AS and Elliot Deaton finished second while Swan Harbor and Brandon Bates finished third. As the heavy betting favorite, Dover In Motion returned \$2.20 to win.

The Jamie Macomber trainee is now undefeated in five starts this season and sent his lifetime purse earnings over the \$100,000 mark with the victory. Dover In Motion is owned in partnership by M&M Racing and Norbert Joseph Maza. The gelded son of Dover Dan—Keystone Sadie was bred by Lyle Dean Slabach.

Ponda Adventure and Trace Tetrick utilized similar tactics and extended a win streak of their own in the second split of the stakes action for trotting colts. Scoring in 1:55.1, Ponda Adventure grabbed the lead down the backside en route to a three-length victory. Swan Captain and John DeLong rallied well late for second while DJ Dan and Michael Oosting were third. As the heavy betting favorite, Ponda Adventure returned \$2.10 for the win.

Ponda Adventure is now undefeated in six starts this season and sent his seasonal earnings over the \$100,000 mark. Ponda Adventure's victory was one of four training wins on the evening for trainer Erv Miller and one of four driving victories for Trace Tetrick.

Ponda Adventure is owned in partnership by Engel Stable, L A Willinger, and J D Graham. The gelded son of Swan For All—Wildflower was bred by Pond-A-Acres.

In the final division of the stakes action for the 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings, Head Games and LeWayne Miller were able to overcome an unfavorable trip to score as the betting favorite. Stopping the timer in 1:55.1, Head Games was parked but pressed on to the lead and is now undefeated in two lifetime starts. The 1:55.1 score was a new lifetime best effort.

Trained and driven by LeWayne Miller, the gelded son of Swan For All—Southwind Goddess is owned in partnership by Bill E Beechy and Flying Manes LLC. Head Games was bred by Larry Troyer.

On the trotting fillies side of the stakes action, the favorites also prevailed in their respective divisions. **Fleurie** and Peter Wrenn were able to overcome a tough assignment from post nine to score in 1:56.1.

The homebred daughter of Muscle Massive—Renees Pockets is owned by M T Pockets Stables and trained by Melanie Wrenn. Fleurie has now won four of five lifetime starts and has amassed \$101,670 in lifetime purse earnings.

**M-M's Dream** was able to overcome a difficult trip of her own to score in the second split of the stakes action for 2-year-old trotting fillies. With driver Sam Widger in the bike, M-M's Dream faced pressure for much of the mile but pressed on and went on to win by two lengths in a new lifetime best of 1:56.2.

Trained by Henry Graber Jr., the daughter of Swan For All—Trading Places is owned in partnership by Eleven Star Stables, F Baldachino, and Hillside Stables. M-M's Dream was bred by Mervin J. Miller.

Indiana Sires Stakes action will continue at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Thursday, September 9 with the two-year-old pacing fillies highlighting the evening's 14-race card. #### Kindergarten, Pick-6 highlight tonight's card at Big M

When racing resumes at The Meadowlands tonight (Sept. 10) at 6:20 p.m., bettors have much to look forward to as seven highly competitive \$20,000 divisions of the Kindergarten Series for 2-year-olds of each sex and gait will create opportunities for players, especially those who like to play the 20-cent Pick-6.

The wager figures to have plenty of money in the pool, as last Saturday, the Pick-6 saw no winning tickets. That has created a carryover of \$9,776 heading into tonight. The last time there was a P6 carryover, over \$40,000 in "new money" was added to a carryover of \$10,855, creating a total pool of almost \$52,000. Those who correctly selected all six winners collected a handsome \$2,720, even though the sequence featured three favorites and no horse who was sent to the gate at odds longer than 3-1.

The wager could prove to be a gem for players, as the pool could once again pay out more than it takes in.

How?

The carryover is not subject to the already low 15 per cent takeout, thus, if there is \$60,000 in new money bet, the "rake" would be only \$9,000. You would then add the remaining \$51,000 to the carryover and get a total of just a hair under \$61,000, approximately \$1,000 more than the total wagered, which is a "negative takeout."

### Thurman Downing to receive 2021 Neville Award

Thurman Downing, owner of the 1973 Little Brown Jug champ Melvin's Woe, will be honored as the 2016 Joseph Neville Memorial Award winner by the Little Brown Jug and the Delaware County Fair.

Mr. Downing was a graduated from Case Western Reserve University and served as an Army Ranger during the Korean War. He later became President and CEO of Downing Coal Company.

Mr. Downing was actively involved in breeding and training


standardbreds, owning a pair of breeding farms in Coshocton County and Downwyn Farms in Wellington, OH.

His father, Richard, owned Bret Hanover, the 1965 Triple Crown winner and three-time Horse of the Year. Thurman earned his Jug glory in 1973 when his homebred Melvin's Woe overcame lameness and a field of 17 to take the 28<sup>th</sup> edition of the Little Brown Jug.

Mr. Downing was a director of the United States Trotting Association, Harness Racing Hall of Fame, and a member of the Little Brown Jug Society.

Thurman Downing died in May 2019 at the age of 87.
