On Aug. 3, Jody Jamieson reached a rare milestone at Woodbine Mohawk Park, when he became the first Canadian-based driver to hit \$150 million in purse winnings. As of Friday (Sept. 13), his lifetime driving earnings had reached \$151,074,559 (\$132,614,433 U.S.), and showed no sign of slowing down.

Speaking outside the Mohawk paddock on Friday night, the 47-year-old reinsman looked back on a track that helped shape his career from an early age.

"Some of my favorite memories are from Sackville Downs," he told HRU, naming the defunct Nova Scotia half-mile being celebrated today (Sept. 15) at Truro Raceway in Nova Scotia. "We had one of the first barns on the left, with a big haymow, one of

those big bank barns. I think it was just inside the [backstretch] gate."

Jamieson's father, Carl Jamieson, was a prominent trainer/driver at Sackville Downs prior to the suburban track's closure in 1985. In 2006, Carl's decades-long rise in the sport earned him the O'Brien Award of Horsemanship. Jody called Jeremys Boy (p, 5, 2:00.2h; \$76,362) Carl's "first decent horse."

The younger Jamieson aspired to become a driver.

"I always wanted to do it," Jody said." I can't remember a time when I didn't want to do it."

Long before he was able to make a career in the sulky, he raced other aspiring drivers — on foot.

"I remember running on the backstretch; we had a little 'track', me and Heath Campbell, Scott McCain," He said, naming some other younger horsemen with roots going back to Sackville Downs.

Jody also apologized for not remembering the names of everyone that he ran with.

"There were a couple of other guys there too. We had 'trotters' and 'pacers.' If you were trotting, you had to run with your knees higher. I was the youngest of those guys, so they had to sometimes not try as hard when I was racing with them, but there were some pretty big races on the backstretch, on that fence. Dad would jog by [with a horse], and we'd be running back and forth between races, with whips in our hands, like we were driving our own horses."

Between real races on Friday night at Mohawk, Jamieson laughed about another memory from Sackville Downs.

"I remember trying beer for the first time, sitting on the stairs in the barn at Sackville Downs," he said. "I thought it was the worst thing in the world. It was out of one of those little stubby bottles, remember those?"

Carl was listed to drive Sunday (Sept. 15) at Truro Raceway, in a special event (race 8) for former Sackville Downs drivers.

"I kind of wish he wasn't driving, but he loves that," Jody said. "He was pumped to go back there and bump shoulders with the guys that he used to, you know, bump wheels with on the racetrack. I'm a little bit devastated that I'm not there."

Jody, a two-time World Driving Champion (2001 and 2011), said he remembered seeing drivers from Greg Peck to Dave Carey enjoy success at the Lower Sackville, NS track.

"I was a big fan of Doug Walsh," he said, naming the driver associated with Maritime champion Winners Accolade (p, 5, 1:57.3; \$234,853). "He was probably one of my favorites.

"So that was our start in harness racing, other than sitting on a bucket outside the gate of Truro [Raceway], where you had nowhere to go. There was a guy who wouldn't let us [kids] in, somebody who was just doing his job, right?

"We moved to Waterdown, ON, 38 years ago this Boxing Day. I was 10. I got my groom's license when I got to Ontario, so I was allowed in the paddocks in Ontario."

That family tradition carries on today. Jody's 13-year-old son, Jett, recently earned praise from grandfather Carl for paddocking Ontario Sires Stakes Gold winner Fifth And Five (p, 2, 1:51.4; \$107,903) at Mohawk on Aug. 31.

Despite growing up at Maritime and, later, Ontario tracks, Jody said he never anticipated that he would one day drive horses for a living at Woodbine Mohawk Park, let alone reach career pinnacles like winning the 2006 Dan Patch Rising Star Award and being voted a three-time O'Brien Driver of the Year (2007, 2009, 2011).

"No, I don't think anybody ever thinks of that," he said.

His first drives came on Sept. 4, 1994 at the Paris, ON fair, with J M Skinny (p, 4, 2:01.1h; \$8,884) in two heats, plus maidens Clayborn Chessy (p, \$274) and Miche Lamont (\$192). He went winless in the four drives, but a small personal victory allowed him to even compete.

"I was only 18, and I didn't actually have a driver's license," he told HRU. "I just told them I had a license, and I drove. Then I went to Ohsweken to race at the fair, and they came down and told me I couldn't drive. The judges realized I had no license."


That kind of boldness has served him well in his career.

"People have been telling me, ever since I was old enough to actually think I wanted to be a driver, that, 'Oh, you're too big to be a driver," Jody said. "So, I want to thank all those people who said that, because it just motivated me to be the best that I could be. I don't know how to explain it. I've just been successful at it, and I love it."

He returned to the paddock, and moments later, drove 2-year-old trotting filly Medley Seelster (2, 1:55.3s; \$134,599) to a gutsy front-end victory in her 1:56.4s Champlain Stake division.




Dr. John "Tad" Egloff on a life well lived

Dr. John "Tad" Egloff is now in the ninth decade of a life well lived. The proprietor and founder, along with wife Judy, of Vieux Carre Farms in historic Gettysburg, PA, is also a well-accomplished veterinarian, a prominent and very successful horse breeder and an all-around good guy. He is in the midst of, so to speak, handing the lines over, to his sons Mark and Jay.

"Don't get me wrong," Tad said. "I hope I'm still a long way from completely retiring. But I'm 82 years old and I've turned a good part of the heavy lifting here on the farm over to my two sons."



"When I was born, my granddad looked at me and said that I had a big head and a small butt, just like a tadpole. Ever since then, I've been Tad."

You are from the great state of Texas, where the standardbred is virtually unknown. How did you become involved with our breed?

"It took a while before I became affiliated with standardbreds, but I've been consumed with a love of horses all of my life. It was a lifelong desire of mine to become a veterinarian, more specifically an equine veterinarian. I followed my dream at Texas A & M University.

"After I graduated from vet school. I had the chance to go to work at the world-renowned equine vet practice of Hagyard-Davidson-McGee in Lexington, KY. It was while at Hagyard-Davidson-McGee that I first was introduced to the standardbred. One of Dr. Art Davidson's clients was Frank Ervin. Among the horses we helped take care of were the legendary Bret Hanover and Kerry Way.

"It was while I was there that Dr. Bill McGee was approached by Alan Leavitt, the owner of Lana Lobell Farms in Hanover, PA. Leavitt was looking for a vet specializing in equine reproduction. Did Dr. McGee have someone in his practice that he would recommend? I quess that someone was me. Alan approached

me with an offer. I turned him down. He came back again with a better offer. I turned him down again. Dr. McGee then asked me if I got an offer that I couldn't refuse, would I consider it? I said sure. Then Alan came back and asked me what it would take to get me to come to Lana Lobell. I came up with what I thought was a crazy price. Alan said, 'I'll have a plane there on Monday to pick you up.' Thus began my life's journey to beautiful Adams County in Pennsylvania."

You began working at Lana Lobell in 1967.

"I was to stay there for 20 years with a short break where my wife Judy and I spent a breeding season in Australia at the great thoroughbred farm Widden Stud. We were there for a single season. They wanted us to stay indefinitely, but we were homesick and came home. Dr. McGee wanted me to rejoin his practice. Alan wanted me back at Lana Lobell. I decided that I'd prefer to be the big fish in the small pond at Lana Lobell, rather than the small one at the huge Hagyard-Davidson-McGee operation. It's a decision I've never regretted."

Looking back at your Lana Lobell years what thoughts come to mind?

"There are many. I was privileged to work with Jim Harrison for a decade. There were very few who knew more about the

standardbred than Jim. He was one of the hardest workers that I've ever known. He not only worked hard himself, but he was very demanding of everyone who worked with him. We had what I look back as being an all-star team in breeding farm management with Jim being in charge; Tom Stewart, who went on to manage the stud careers of Meadow Skipper and Nevele Pride at Stoner Creek Stud at his flank, Mike Klau who now runs Southwind Farms where Muscle Hill, Walner and Tactical Landing stand was with us and I was picking up the rear. Jim would say 'Alan owns the farm but I'm the one who runs it.'

"Two of the first stallions I was involved with were Noble Victory and Overtrick. It was from those two that I learned that when dealing with stallions there is absolutely no relationship between virility and fertility.

"Noble Victory was as virile a stallion as I have ever been associated with. It could be difficult to prevent him from hurting himself. When he was ready to breed, you had better be prepared as well. Otherwise, you might get run over. But his fertility left a lot to be desired. Your mare had better be right on the money if you expected her to get in foal.

"Overtrick on the other hand was as fertile a stallion as ever lived. If you didn't want your mare to get in foal, you had best not get her inseminated by him. But his virility? I'm not even sure that he had any. There were times when we had him down

in the breeding shed for two hours or more before we could even hope to collect him. We'd try him with mare after mare, before we came across one that he might have shown a liking for. John Goodnough who was the farm manager for Leonard Buck's Allwood Farm had this gray mare that Overtrick showed a liking to. We would hope that she would be in heat. If she was, it would sometimes mean a shorter day in the breeding shed for everybody.

"We had Speedy Crown at the farm in Hanover before Alan decided to move him to New York. He was the perfect stallion or pretty darn close to one. In addition to him becoming one of the greatest stallions the breed has ever known, he was perfect in numerous areas. He was both virile and fertile. He was a perfect stallion to work with. When he left to go to New York, I rode along in the truck with him. That was the very last time I have done that. When that happened, the handwriting was on the wall for Lana Lobell Farms of Pennsylvania. We had been breeding somewhere in the area of 400 mares a breeding season. That was now down to a trickle of that number. The center of operation was moving to New York and New Jersey. By that time, Judy and I had developed a deep love for South Central Pennsylvania. I didn't want to move. I was raising my family here. This was home. I had gathered a few horses of my own. I had bought a nice piece of land in Gettysburg. I felt it was time for me to go out on my own."

In 1987, you went on your own.

"I was fortunate enough to have put together a pretty decent practice of my own. I had several outstanding clients including Hempt Farms, Lloyd Arnold, Fox Den Farms, Charlie Keller's Yankeeland Farm and K. D. Owen. I was also putting together my own small place. I was approached by Don Seiling who had boarded his mares at Lana Lobell. He asked if I would take them to my new place. I said that I didn't think I was quite ready to take on resident horses. He asked me where I was going to board my own horses. I told him, at my place, of course. [He said,] 'If that is the case, then you need to take mine as well. If your place is good enough for your horses, it should be good enough for mine.' That is how I got my first client.

"Through the years my client base both through my practice and at the farm grew. We became consignors at both Harrisburg and Lexington. I as well as some of my clients are invested in many of the sport's major stallions. I've cut down on my workload in the last 10 years or so. Two of my colleagues, Dr. Hurtgen and Dr. Dye suffered heart attacks and died while delivering dystocias. I took that as a warning sign. I was now 72. It was time to cut down some. I stopped delivering problem mares. My two boys Mark and Jay were ready to seize the baton."

Let's talk about your boys.

"Mark is my first born. He has always been 'horsey.' He has been active on the farm since I started it. He is an accomplished polo

player and was a competitive wrestler while in college. He attended University of Virginia on a wrestling scholarship, but switched to polo after a summer working for my best friend ever, George Hempt at his Hempt Farms. George introduced him to polo and Mark became in love with the sport. He soon switched from wrestling to polo at UVa. He made the team and ultimately joined the National Championship team. He is now the farm manager. We are in good hands with him in charge.

"Jay is next in line. He attended LSU on a wrestling scholarship. While there, he began playing football. Within a while he had made the varsity team and became the starting fullback at LSU. After college he enlisted in the United States Marines Corps where he served as a fighter pilot. He is now retired as a Lieutenant Colonel after serving for 22 years, including stints in Iraq and Afghanistan. He is 'retired,' if you call it that, but he works at the farm as Mark's right-hand man. Both boys are exceptional horseman and neither is afraid of work. I'm still around to help out with some advice and I am available for any vet work which I might be called upon to perform. It has been a very good life, one to which I would not consider making any changes even if I were able to do so."

Dunn sweeps Peter Haughton and Jim Doherty Memorials at Harrah's Hoosier **Park**

Driver Dexter Dunn made his way to Harrah's Hoosier Park on Friday (Sept. 13) and swept the two richest races in the state of Indiana, taking the \$390,000 Peter Haughton Memorial with Maryland, before Champagne Problems scored in the \$305,000 Jim Doherty Memorial.

The 2-year-old trotting colts stepped into the spotlight first in the Haughton, with Maryland sent off as the 6-5 favorite in the field of 10.



1:54.1 on Friday at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

Leaving from post 8, Maryland and Dunn found themselves the widest of a four across battle for the lead going into the first turn, with Father TJ (driven by Tyler Buter) first to the guarter on the inside in :27.1. Hidalgo (Yannick Gingras) pressed on to the lead briefly before Maryland assumed command and slowed the tempo to the half in :57.4. The top trio remained in straight alignment on the final turn, with Maryland leading the field to three-quarters in 1:27.

Maryland began to assert himself at the top of the stretch, trotting clear by three lengths midway through the lane with Hidalgo fending the others off for the minor spoils. Sprinting home in :27.1, Maryland crossed the wire 3¼-lengths clear, stopping the clock in 1:54.1. Hidalgo held for the place position, with Eugene The Genius (Mike Oosting) beating out Father TJ for show.

"Quite a few sprinted out of there which you expect in a race like this," said Dunn in the winner's circle. "Once we got to the front, we got things pretty cheap and he sprinted home and felt great tonight."

Trained by Marcus Melander, Maryland entered the Peter Haughton off of a 17-1 upset score in the \$425,500 William Wellwood in a career best 1:53.4. Bred by Hanover Shoe Farms, the son of Chapter Seven—Crucial is owned by Courant Inc., Pcw Racing LLC., Holly Lane Stud East LTD., and Sstewartrthorn Stable. Now a winner of three of six, Maryland sports a career bankroll of \$425,378.

"He's been such a good horse from the start," said Melander. "He felt like a good horse when we trained him down, he's classy and did it easy tonight.

"We gave him a little bit of time off this summer but feel like he's coming into the fall extremely sharp."

Dunn hinted that Maryland will have his sights set on another major prize next weekend, as the star rookie will head back north of the border for the Mohawk Million. In addition, Maryland secured his spot in the \$700,000 Breeders Crown final and a starting gate position between 1 and 5 with the victory in the Haughton.

The Nancy Takter-trained Champagne Problems followed suit and secured her spot in the Breeders Crown with a front-end score in the Jim Doherty Memorial for 2-year-old trotting fillies.

Leaving from post 7 as the 5-2 second-choice, Dunn slotted Champagne Problems third early as Royal Mission (Scott Zeron) hustled to the front from post 9 to cut the quarter in :27.3. Dunn sent Champagne Problems to the front down the backstretch,

taking command before reaching the halfway point in :57.1. No challenge came to Champagne Problems on the far turn who had things her way to the three-quarter pole in 1:26.3.

Champagne Problems began to pour it on at the top of the lane, trotting clear by 2½ lengths with an eighth to go while Royal Mission battled Pink Chou Chou (Gingras) for the place spot. Takter stablemate Pink Chou Chou continued to close in deep stretch, but Champagne Problems coasted to a 1½-length victory in 1:54. Royal Mission held for third to round out the trifecta.

"She was a little fired up in Canada her last couple starts," Dunn said. "Nancy made a few changes since then and she was back to normal tonight and raced great."

The daughter of Tactical Landing—Miss Caviar was a \$35,000 yearling purchase and has banked \$327,504 for owners Rojan Stables, Family Business, Patrick Hoopes and Caviart Farms.

SABONIS WINS HOOSIER CUP

Sabonis headlined the Peter Haughton undercard, crushing in the \$75,000 Hoosier Cup final for Indiana sired 3-year-old pacing colts for his 11^{th} -consecutive victory. The Hoosier Cup was featured along with nine divisions of Indiana Sire Stakes with purses on the night totaling \$1.275 million.

Sent off as the bettor's choice at 1-9 from the rail, regular pilot Joey Putnam got Sabonis away in good order third early while Midnight Rocker (driven by Trace Tetrick) led to the first quarter in :27. Putnam moved Sabonis from third on the backstretch, taking command before reaching the half in :55.1. Putnam cut Sabonis loose entering the final turn, powering away by 3½ lengths at three-quarters in 1:22.4.

The fast-break by Sabonis continued turning for home, racing away by 5½ midway through the lane with M-M-s Bud (Pete Wrenn) and Dale Yea (Marvin Luna) racing for place. Putnam geared Sabonis down in deep stretch, relenting late to cross the wire clear by 1¼ lengths and stopping the clock in 1:49.3. M-M-s Bud finished second, Dale Yea was third.

Trained by Aaron Stutzman, Sabonis has won 14 of 15 on the season while banking \$388,250 this year alone. Owned by Pat Miller, the son of Tellitlikeitis—Gypsy Bellevue has only tasted defeat twice in his career, hitting the board in all 16 of his lifetime outings.

Along with the Hoosier Cup, the penultimate leg of Indiana Sire Stakes for rookie pacers and sophomore trotters were contested on the 14-race card.

2-YEAR-OLD PACING FILLIES

A race after Putnam and Stutzman won with Sabonis, the duo immediately followed it up with a victory in the \$68,000 first division of sire stakes for 2-year-old pacing fillies. The 2-5 favorite grabbed command early from post 5, before outlasting a surging JK Pearl Stone (Wrenn) to record her fifth consecutive victory with a clocking of 1:52.2. Heart Song (Tetrick) finished third.

The \$13,000 bargain buy at last fall's Hoosier Classic has earned \$142,750 during a campaign which has seen her win five of six. James Miller owns the daughter of JK Endofanera—Get Your Armor who was bred by Brookview Farms.

Can'ttouchthese rebounded from a defeat to Brookview Fancy in her last outing to score in the second \$68,000 division. Driver

John De Long secured the pocket position behind JK's Flirty Girl before squeezing through traffic turning for home to cross the wire 2¾-lengths clear in a career best 1:52.3. Vel Cinderella (Tetrick) closed from second-to-last turning for home to be second, Wunderkindbluechip (Jordan Ross) finished third.

The homebred daughter of JK Endofanera—Can't Touch This was bred by William and Patrick De Long along with Douglas Riccolo. A winner in four of six this season, Roger Welch trains the earner of \$96,620.

2-YEAR-OLD PACING COLTS

Odds On Brahmastra was able to overcome post position 8 to score his maiden breaking win when it mattered, in the fifth round of the \$46,500 Indiana Sire Stakes for 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings in 1:51.1. Driven by Peter Wrenn, the son of Odds On Equuleus—Mach Some Noise took advantage of torrid first half fractions of :26, and :53,4 and utilized a :27.1 closing kick to get the win by a head over Big Al Derosa and Jordan Ross. Checking Out and Scott Zeron also rallied well late for third. Sent off at odds near 30-1, Odds On Brahmastra returned \$61.20 for the win.

Owned and bred by Odds On Racing, Odds On Brahmastra scored his first win in seven starts. The freshman colt is trained by Melanie Wrenn and pushed his lifetime bankroll to \$28,180.



Chandler Bing utilized similar tactics to score in the second division of the stakes action for 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings in 1:50.4. Ahva Sholum and Kyle Wilfong were responsible for the first half splits of :27.3 and :56 while Chandler Bing waited patiently off the pace. Driver Jay Cross found late racing room down the lane and Chandler Bing responded gamely with a :26 closing quick to get the win by a half-length over Avanti and driver John De Long. The Family Man and Michael Oosting rounded out the trifecta. Chandler Bing returned \$24.60 for the upset victory.

Trained by Alvin Miller, the 2-year-old gelded son of Tellitlikeitis—Northern Beauty scored his third win from seven starts this season. Owned in partnership by Alvin Miller and Twila Harts, Chandler Bing now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$68,540 and a new lifetime mark with his 1:50.4 clocking.

3-YEAR-OLD TROTTING FILLIES

A pair of \$50,000 Sire Stakes divisions for 3-year-old trotting fillies saw the favorites deliver in front-end fashion in each. **Hail Broadway** and Jordan Ross took command from the outset, having things her way on the lead before sprinting away from pocket-sitter Agent Of Fortune (Robert Taylor) with a :27.1 final quarter to stop the timer in 1:54.1. Somebody Special (Scott Zeron) edged out Star Pilot (Tetrick) for the third spot.

Trained by Luis Quevedo, John Barnard's homebred daughter of Swan For All—Pray With Me has won six of 11 on the year while banking \$188,600 and sitting just shy of \$200,000 in earnings lifetime.

Robert Taylor did one better in the second division, teaming up with **Danger** to overcome post 9. Parked to the quarter in :27.4, Danger was able to back things down in the middle half before rocketing home in :27.2 to score a 3¼-length score in a career best 1:53.4. Skyway Paige (LeWayne Miller) finished second, Starlit Dora (Mike Oosting) finished third.

Taylor also trains for owners Anthony Lombardi and George Colemes. Bred by Steve Stewart and Chris Beaver, the 3-year-old rookie daughter of Swan For All—Chim Swift has won seven of eight while sporting earnings of \$112,521.

THREE-YEAR-OLD TROTTING COLTS

Dashing Danny continued his divisional dominance in the second split of the Indiana Sire Stakes action scoring in 1:54.1 with regular pilot Kyle Wilfong in the bike. In near gate-to-wire fashion, Dashing Danny reached the lead just after the quarter :28 and went on to dictate fractions of :57 and 1:26.2 before trotting away from his competition. Dashing Danny finished two lengths to the good over Flirtinwiththepilot and Peter Wrenn while Ira Who and Jared Finn completed the trifecta. Sent off as the heavy favorite, Dashing Dany returned \$2.10 for the victory.

Trained by Jeff Cullipher, the gelded son of Dover Dan—Sashay recorded his sixth win from seven seasonal starts. With the win, Dashing Danny pushed his lifetime bankroll to \$344,837 for owners Pollack Racing LLC and Jeffrey Cullipher.

In the opening division of the stakes action for sophomore trotting colts, **Winslow** and driver/trainer Dan Shetler got up in the final strides to pull the slight upset in 1:53.3. Cs Flying Co-Pilot and driver Trace Tetrick dictated fractions of :27.4 and :57.1 while Winslow was along the rail in fifth. Turning for home, Shetler tipped Winslow past tiring cover and he responded with a :27.1 closing kick to put a nose in front of Helpem Dance and driver Dexter Dunn. Cs Flying Co-Pilot held on for third. Winslow returned \$7.40 for the victory.

The gelded son of Swan For All—Allie Labrook recorded his fourth win from 12 starts this season. The 1:53.3 clocking was a new lifetime best for the 3-year-old gelding who is owned in partnership by Dojea Stable and Shetler, who is also the breeder.

Driven by James MacDonald, Monalishi got out to the lead and posted fractions of :29, :59.1 and 1:27.3, while Lasting Dream sat on her back. Monalishi got some separation at the head of the lane, but Lasting Dream was in full flight late to make it a photo finish.

The MacIntosh trained Monalishi trotted home in :27.1 for the 1:54.4 victory, while the Blais trained Lasting Dream delivered a :26.4 final-quarter. Grand Reserve, who made a first-up challenge on the far turn, finished third.

A daughter of Green Manalishi S, Monalishi is now an impressive five-for-seven on the season and has surpassed \$400,000 in earnings for owners Tim Klemencic and MacIntosh.


MacIntosh confirmed post-race that Monalishi does have a spot in next Saturday's Mohawk Million.

In the stretch, Medley Seelster fought gamely to reach the wire first, holding off a charging Beersnsunshine Deo by a neck and first-up challenger Southwind Milk.

Medley Seelster paid \$10.90 to win.


Emoticon Legacy turned in an eye-catching final-quarter to win the \$164,785 Champlain Open Trot in 1:55.1.

Stars shine at Illinois State Fairs

Seventeen State Fair championship races offering \$447,164 in purses were held at DuQuoin on Aug. 27 and eight championship races and seven consolation races, with purse money totaling \$545,000, were contested on Sept. 11 at Springfield.

The Illinois Department of Agriculture gave the state's harness racing community a much-needed financial boost by presenting a total of seven racing programs for Illinois-breds at the State Fairs at Springfield and DuQuoin.

Except for the finale on Sept. 11, all of the programs were part of the fairs and were simulcast for betting at Hawthorne Race Course, Illinois off-track locations, out-of-state sites and internet and phone betting.

Rain that made the track unsuitable for racing forced postponement of the fourth Springfield program scheduled for Aug. 15 and it had to be rescheduled for Sept. 11 after the fair had ended.

That was the only rainout.

All of the purse money was provided by the Department of Agriculture in contrast to the non-betting races funded by the Hawthorne purse account that were held in June and July and will resume this month and continue through early October.

Following the conclusion of the Hawthorne thoroughbred meeting the standardbreds will return on Oct. 19, racing there for the first time since Feb. 12.

Seventeen State Fair championship races offering \$447,164 in purses were held at DuQuoin on Aug. 27 and eight championship races and seven consolation races with purse money totaling \$545,000, were contested on Sept. 11 at Springfield.

All of the championships at Springfield had purses of \$55,000 and the consolations each had pots of \$15,000. At DuQuoin the richest race was the \$50,250 Pronto Don for 3-year-old Illinoisbred colts and geldings.

Trainer Erv Miller and his driver/son, Marcus, captured three of the Springfield championships. Their winners were **Gorgeous Big**

Guy in the race for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers, **Tru Cash** in the race for 3-year-old colt and gelding trotters and **Louise's Legacy** in the race for 2-year-old colt and gelding trotters.

As is his custom Gorgeous Big Guy led all the way in winning for the eighth time in eight races this year and for the 15th time in a 19-race career in which he has never been worse than second. The gelded son of Ashlee's Big Guy—Gorgeous Ranger by Palone Ranger defeated another of Miller's horses, second place Fox Valley Durham, by a head in 1:50.2. The winner's stablemate was driven by Kyle Wilfong.

Tru Cash had won only once in his nine prior outings this year but had finished worse than third only once. This time the gelded son of Lindy's Tru Grit—Betcha, by Cash Hall, took an early lead, extended it by a wide margin at the stretch call, and won by three-quarters-of-a-length over Lous Private Eye, who was coming off a compelling conquest in the Pronto Don. Tru Cash was clocked in 1:55.3, by far the best time of his 18-race lifetime.

Louise's Legacy came from second to overtake Sunburnt Silverado and win by a quarter-of-a-length in a career best 1:58.4, reversing the outcome of their Aug. 27 encounter at DuQuoin. It was the second victory of a seven-race career in which the daughter of Lou's Legacy—Lima Simplicity, by Rocky Balboa never has finished worse than third.

Trainer Amy Husted and her driver husband, Kyle, were double-winners in the Springfield championship races, with Thebeautifulthings in the race for 2-year-old filly pacers and Fox Valley Sadie in the race for 3-year-old filly pacers.

"We've loved her since the day we broke her," Amy said after Thebeautifulthings earned her fifth victory in six starts by holding on to nose out Wildcat Abby in 1:53.1. "She's a big, strong-gaited filly. She's got a bit of a sassy attitude but she fights at the right time. She loves to win and finds a way to put her nose in front at the right time."

Thebeautifulthings is a daughter of Somestarsomewhere—Ok Godiva, by Well Said, while Fox Valley Sadie is a daughter of Time To Roll—She Likes It All, by The Big Dog.

Fox Valley Sadie gained the lead halfway through her race and defeated Fox Valley Tessa (a filly with the same sire) by a length in 1:52.1. The victory was her fifth in 10 races this year and the 10th of her 18-race career.

"She's not the strongest but she's got a big heart," Amy said. "She broke a split bone and had two surgeries as a 2-year-old and got off to a late start. She had an infection in her joint; it was a mess

"To have the year she had last year and for her to race at the level she does now is pretty special."

The winners of the other championship races at Springfield were: **Cash Money Twenty** in the race for 2-year-old colt and gelding pacers; **Kays In Charge** in the race for 2-year-old filly

trotters; and **Calypso Moon** in the race for 3-year-old filly trotters. Casey Leonard drove Cash Money Plenty to his fifth victory in six outings for trainer Mike Brink; Travis Seekman was at the reins of Kays In Charge for trainer Tom Simmons; and Wilfong was in the sulky of Calypso Moon for trainer Curt Grummel when she nosed out Fox Valley Tiegen.

In the Champions Day races at DuQuoin, **Lous Private Eye** hit the jackpot in the main event by defeating Tru Cash by a head in a lifetime best 1:54.4 performance.


Leonard did the driving for trainer Steve Searle and Flacco Family Farms, the owner and breeder of the son of Lou's Legacy—Bands One Eye Love, by Band's Gold Chip.

Searle Felt a break in stride cost Lous Private Eye the victory in his Springfield rematch with Tru Cash.

"It doesn't show on the chart as him making a break but he did seem to run for a couple of steps at the head of the stretch," Searle said. "He came back trotting and still almost won."

The Springfield setback left Lous Private Eye with seven triumphs and a second in nine starts this year. His other race saw him finish a distant fifth in a county fair race.

"We timed his last half mile and he trotted it in :56 flat at that little fair track," Searle said. "At times he loses it for a few steps and then comes back strong. Because he's so full of himself we'll warm him up two times before his races.

"He's a very good horse. I wish I had a barn full of them like him."

A daughter of Lou's Legacy, **Lou's My Number**, gave Searle and Leonard a victory earlier on the card in the \$35,125 second division of the First Lady's Cup for 2-year-old fillies. It was her fifth start and the conquest came following three seconds and a third.

Leonard also won two races for trainer Curt Grummel, the second division of the \$35,125 Governor's Cup for 2-year-old male trotters with **Sunburnt Silverado** and the \$25,125 second division of the Windy Skeeter for 3-year-old filly trotters with **Whiskey Lou**.

Grummel earlier achieved success in the Windy Skeeter's \$25,125 first division when Wilfong guided **Calypso Moon** to victory.

Travis Seekman was the star driver at the DuQuoin extravaganza with five winners.

Two of the triumphs came with horses trained and co-owned by Jamaica Patton, **Adalecia** in the \$25,125 first division of the Time Dancer for 3-year-old filly pacers and **Hypeyourbestieup** in the Time Dancer's second division.

Seekman also annexed the \$35,125 first division of The First Lady's Cup for 2-year-old filly trotters with **Kays In Charge**, the \$23,416 second division of the Director's Cup for 2-year-old

male pacers with **Battlin Bob** and the \$25,125 Dudley Hanover for 3-year-old colts and geldings with **Guitar Man**.

Amy and Kyle Husted prefaced their success at Springfield by collaborating to take two of the DuQuoin races, the \$35,125 Lieutenant Governor's Cup for 2-year-old filly pacers with **Thebeautifulthings** and the \$12,000 last race on the card for older male pacers with **Fox Valley Landen**.

In addition, Kyle drove **Dialogue** to victory for trainer Kimberly Roth in the \$35,125 first division of the Director's Cup.

FINISH LINES: The major races at Springfield and DuQuoin serve as a sneak preview for the biggest night in Illinois racing, the Night of Champions for state-breds on Nov. 9 at Hawthorne... The Illinois racing dates for 2025 will be announced on Thursday (Sept. 19) following hearings by the Illinois Racing Board. Hawthorne is the only remaining pari-mutuel harness track in the state and also is the lone thoroughbred track in the Chicago metropolitan area. The state's other thoroughbred track is downstate Fairmount Park, across the Mississippi River from St. Louis.

The unbearable lightness of being a harness-racing driver, Part 2

Part 1 is here.

Popularity — as Yogi Berra may have defined it — is merely a matter of how many people like you. Harness drivers do not have press agents campaigning to lift them from obscurity or maintain any kind of fanbase. But harness racing fans — bettors mostly — have always developed allegiance to personal favorites (or as Yogi may have defined them, ones you like better than other ones).

Most people may think a bettor's darling drivers are based upon how much dough they assisted in contributing to a betting bankroll. It is hard to argue with that even though it rarely could be confirmed in any empirical study.

Casual bettors mostly find their driver heroes using generic statistics based upon seasonal records at their home track; these are the bettors likely to wager on horses due to the driver assigned. It is rarely a profitable state of mind but let us face it, none of the bettors keep accurate records if any at all concerning details about their betting choices (no less their bankrolls).

I was both a casual and a professional bettor over the decades and found in either case that any affection I developed for a driver was mathematical; that is, they met a set of elements common to two or more sets of my prejudice. Or, as Yogi may have defined it: I am partial to ones I like because of things I like more than other ones.

Enter the harness racing driver making the biggest impression on my relationship with the sport: Shelly Goudreau.

My individual set of elements made him qualify immediately when I was moving a bankroll at Western Harness Racing at Hollywood Park. Among a few affinitive elements marked by a community of my interests and similarity in nature or character, it was his French-Canadian connection (see my Aug. 14 column) that demanded my attention.

I did not search for any of his local or international stats. Before details I bought the images: I liked how he handled the sulky and looked stronger than the other drivers; he appeared to wear the sulky more than ride on it. A closer look revealed a handsome man with a moustache classically called "a horseshoe."



In style he resembled a figure drawn by famed comic-book artist Jack Kirby (The Fantastic Four, Sargeant Rock, et al) whose heroes' expressions were penned with defined muscles and invincible eyes always filled with determination. I liked and respected how he stood out among the other drivers, even if much of my evidence for that was because of my personal romantic set of heroic elements. In any event, it was a feeling no other driver on the west coast harness circuit gave me and I refused to ignore it. Good thing, to, because the man with the gold and orange silks went on to earn my reverent attitude.

There I was long before James Quinn convinced me to address all matters of intuition when handicapping measuring Goudreau's value solely by embracing a "Yogi-ism." The homeplate philosopher may have said, "Remember [Frank] that no matter what, 90 per cent of what you do is mental."

But the "Shelly Factor" — as I deemed it — was working for me. My oblique acknowledgment of his importance to my wagers — a factor I learned later in my betting career was moot — produced dollars. And at that time of my life dollars were my salvation.

After cashing a considerable number of tickets helping me survive as a vagabond comedy writer, my career began to thrive. I took time off from the track. While I was gone the Shelly Factor met its demise in the worst way. Goudreau died in 1982 at age 34 as a result of a race accident at Hollywood Park.

In 1982 I interviewed a few west coast circuit drivers for a generic article in *Gambling Times*. One of them was veteran horseman Gerald Longo. I asked him about Goudreau's accident which took place during a race. Longo walked me around the track and stopped at the spot where Goudreau hit the track hard to receive injuries that would be fatal a week later.

Goudreau's fatal race added to a contemporary list of harness drivers' deaths during races. When Billy Haughton died four years later in 1986, he was the fifth harness driver since 1979 to die in a race accident. That lethal result alone outnumbered all fatal driver accident deaths occurring from 1932 to 1978 (according to the U.S. Trotting Association). Any recorded number of drivers surviving severe accidents surely registers five digits.

The death and injury statistics defy all perceptions of crooked drivers. The facts are that harness horsemen steer their steeds with such precision they make every race look like a leisurely task; these horsemen don't get the credit they deserve for making a death-defying act look uncomplicated.

Think harness drivers are not the subject of such irony? Tell that to Shelly Goudreau.



In his defense, police officer LaMonte Williams had a lingering sinus infection and was at the end of a graveyard shift. He had three reports to file before clocking out. 
A woman in a flannel nightgown, curlers in her Beetlejuice hair, and a cell phone raised in the air stepped out the front door to the front porch. She waved at Officer Williams and smiled. Like Juliet speaking to Romeo, her elbows on the porch railing, she said, "False alarm. When I took out the dog and saw the red curtains, I called the police from the bushes. Then I called Burt, my husband, who works the night shift at the stamping plant. He explained everything. He was replacing a screen in the window when his sister called to bitch about her son-in-law. Walt beamed. "Well, my dear, that was a bang-up job showing great initiative."


She punched him playfully on his orange shoulder. "I have an idea."



Habanero Blues is owned by Fiddlers Creek Stables and trained by Travis Alexander. It was his second career victory.



'Sweet' homebreds lead Burke's Kentucky Championship hopefuls

Ron Burke and the Burke Brigade have always believed in Sweet Lou as a stallion, and Sweet Lou continues to repay their faith in him. Today's (Sept. 15) \$400,000 Kentucky Sire Stakes Championship Series finals provide examples.

Sweet Lou, trained by Burke during the horse's Hall of Fame career, sired Burke Brigade homebreds Louprint and Looksgoodinloulou, who are the morning-line favorites in the finals for 2-year-old male pacers and 2-year-old female pacers, respectively.

Both accumulated the most points in their groups during the four preliminary legs of the series while another of the Burke Brigade homebreds, Sweet Ballad, finished second to Looksgoodinloulou among the freshman filly pacers.


Mark Weaver, who was among the breeders of all three horses, said the Burke Brigade made the best of a lull in Sweet Lou's breeding career several years ago to increase their homebred stable.

"Breeders are fickle; it's kind of 'what have you done for me lately' with the stallions," Weaver said. "With Sweet Lou, all the breeders rushed to him with the best mares possible his first year. Then he had a couple year gap. There was a year, we still own quite a bit of him, so we had extra breedings. Believing in the Lou, we bred all the mares we could. We didn't want his breedings to go unused, so we bred mares that we had, or went out and bought mares, and ended up breeding 16.

"The result of that, three of them are in the finals. It's really been a three- or four-year process for this to all come to fruition. It's certainly paying dividends."

Those dividends also include 2-year-old filly pacer Rose, who won the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes final on Sept. 5. Rose and Looksgoodinloulou are the season's co-fastest freshman filly pacers, with a mark of 1:50.2.

"Ronnie thinks Looksgoodinloulou may be the best pacing filly we ever had," Weaver said. "That says a lot when we've had horses like [two-time Dan Patch Award winner] Warrawee Ubeaut and some of the other ones."



Looksgoodinloulou has won two of three races this season. She heads to the KYSS final off an eighth-place finish on Sept. 1 but started from post 10 after missing the prior leg of the series while dealing with a minor issue.

"She basically had everything go wrong that could go wrong," Weaver said. "But she trained this week better than any horse we have. We expect that she will be back to the filly we think she is."

Looksgoodinloulou, out of the mare Looksgoodinaromper, will start from post 7 with driver Yannick Gingras and is 2-1 on the morning line. Sweet Ballad, out of the mare Write Me A Song, has a win and three seconds in six starts. She leaves from post 2 with driver David Miller and is 8-1.

Louprint is the even-money favorite in the final for the freshman boys. The colt, out of the mare Rockin Racer (purchased by Weaver on onGait for around \$10,000 as one of the additional broodmares for Sweet Lou), is a neck from being unbeaten in six races this season. He will leave from post 5 in a field of five, with Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. in the sulky.

His stablemate Sippinonsearoc, a son of Downbytheseaside—Queen Ann M, is the 9-5 second choice. He has won four of six races, including a 1:48.2 score that made him history's fastest 2-year-old pacer, and will leave from post 3 with Gingras.

"I think Louprint seems pretty special at this point," Weaver said. "And Sippinonsearoc has been super. He's been a little bit of a work in progress. He maybe likes to go faster than what we would like early in the mile, so we're still tinkering with him. But he trained really well Thursday."

Marcus Melander also will send out two morning-line favorites in today's championships.

Luna Lovegood is the 9-5 choice in the final for 2-year-old female trotters. The daughter of Gimpanzee—Southwind Venus has won three of four races this season, all in KYSS action. Her loss came in her second start when she made an interference break in the first turn after leaving from the second tier in a 12-horse field.

Date Night Hanover, a returning KYSS champion, is the 9-5 favorite in the final for 3-year-old female trotters. The daughter of Chapter Seven—Don't Wait Up has two wins and a second in three KYSS starts this year. For the season, she has hit the board in eight of 11 races, winning three.

Dexter Dunn will drive both fillies for Melander.

Another returning KYSS champ, Karl, is the 7-5 favorite in the final for 3-year-old male trotters. Trained by Nancy Takter and driven by Gingras, the son of Tactical Landing—Avalicious brings a five-race win streak into today's action, with the victories including the Hambletonian and three KYSS preliminary rounds. The colt has hit the board in all 20 career starts, winning 18 and earning \$1.91 million.

Nuclear is the 2-1 favorite in the final for 3-year-old male pacers, which also includes returning champ Better Is Nice. Nuclear, a son of Always B Miki—Can'tgetenuffofyou trained by Joe Holloway, has a win, two seconds and a third in the series. He will have Dunn in the sulky.

The 8-5 favorite in the final for 3-year-old female pacers is Its A Love Thing. The daughter of Bettors Delight—Love For Sail won her only start in KYSS action this year and also counts the Fan Hanover Stakes and Jerry Silverman Memorial among her seven triumphs in nine races this season. James MacDonald will drive the filly for trainer David Menary. The field also includes returning KYSS champ Geocentric.

Go Dog Go is the **3-1 favorite** in the final for 2-year-old male trotters. The son of Greenshoe—Primary Target has two wins and a second in four starts this season for trainer Carter Pinske and driver Todd McCarthy.

Twin B Joe Fresh dominates Milton final, pushes unbeaten streak to eight

Twin B Joe Fresh continued her dominance of the older pacing mare ranks, handily winning the \$205,000 Milton Stakes final on Saturday (Sept. 14) at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 1:49.1 at odds of 1-9.

It was the eighth straight win for the 4-year-old daughter of Roll With Joe—Fresh Breeze owned by her trainer Chris Ryder, her driver Dexter Dunn, Peter Trebotica and Barry Spak. Twin B Joe Fresh was bred by Brittany Farms.

Canada's reigning Horse of the Year, Sylvia Hanover, finished a solid second in the field of six. Silver Label was third and her stablemate Prohibition Legal was fourth.

Sylvia Hanover led the field through the first-quarter station reached in :27.1, but Dunn had Twin B Joe Fresh out and rolling before the half. The pair took command before the pedestrian :56 half and the 1:23.2 three-quarters before putting the field away in the stretch and finishing with the earplugs still in place.

Speaking to John Rallis in the winner's circle, Dunn said, "She felt great. Actually, in the post parade it was the best she's felt all year. She is extremely bright at the moment and is feeling good. I was really happy with her going to the gate.

"She's so intelligent. She's a dream to drive... and she's just so versatile."

The victory gave Twin B Joe Fresh victories in both the Milton and Roses Are Red at Woodbine Mohawk Park and improved the mare's record to 8-1-0 in nine starts this year and 27-6-1 in 36 lifetime outings. Twin B Joe Fresh has earned \$522,462 on the year and \$1,962,665 lifetime.

Twin B Joe Fresh is currently the #1 horse in the weekly Hambletonian Society / Breeders Crown poll.

Ohio Selected Jug Sale attains second highest gross ever

The Ohio Selected Jug Sale enjoyed another robust session of active bidding, which led to the second highest gross in the sale's history.

The loftiest price for a yearling sold was by Rose Run Farm's Hip #208, Rose Run Butler for \$140,000. A sharp colt by top sire Downbytheseaside, he was purchased by Dana Parham's Odds On Racing.

Elated over their first ever sale-topping yearling, Rose Run Farm owner Arch Yoder was quick to credit his right-hand man Marlin Miller with the striking appearance and excellent condition that his yearlings are known for.

"I have trainers from all over Ohio tell me to 'make sure I keep Marlin around," Yoder said. "He does a great job prepping our yearlings. We have a nice sized crew for the sale, but back home it's just me and Marlin doing all the work."

Ohio Harness Horse Breeders president Senena Esty was pleased with the sale overall, and how her consignment was accepted by the buyers.

"We had a great sale, which was well attended and the crowd stayed strong through to the end," Esty said. "All the consignors that I have spoken to were happy with the results.

"With all eyes on the Delaware County Fair and the Little Brown Jug this week, the strength of our Buckeye State program will be on full display as 90 per cent of the races are filled with Ohio breds. It really is our time to shine, nationwide."

Overall, the gross sales totaled \$8,010,500 for 269 yearlings sold, resulting in an average of \$29,779 per horse. This was a slight three per cent decrease from last year's record-setting auction, but was up 10 per cent on gross and six per cent on average over the 2022 auction. The median was \$23,000.

The sale is conducted by the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale Company, and general manager Bruce Brinkerhoff was very satisfied with the strength of the sale, and said, "It's the second highest gross in the 30-plus year history of the sale, and the second time we grossed over eight million. The Ohio breeders and consignors have continued to improve their products and it has shown in the auction ring and out on the racetrack."

Looking at the numbers more closely, for the fourth consecutive year the highest average price for all pacing sires was garnered by Downbytheseaside at \$51,560 for 25 sold.

The highest priced pacing filly came from Midland Acres, who also stands first crop sire Summa Cum Laude. His daughter, Hip #53 I'ma Sight To See, brought \$130,000 from purchaser Jeff Berger. Summa Cum Laude led all sires in gross sales with \$1.47 million for 52 sold resulting in an average of \$28,327. Pacing fillies led the divisional averages with \$31,133 for 60 sold.

First crop sire In Range led the trotting ranks (for stallions with more than five sold) with an average of \$39,760 for 25 sold.

The highest priced trotter in the auction was Hip #180 Buckeye Triumphs, a Triumphant Caviar colt consigned by Double Spring Farm, who was purchased by Chris Beaver for \$120,000.

An In Range filly topped the trotting distaff section with Hip #66 Jelta bringing \$110,000. The half-sister to world champion Jet Hill was consigned by Trackside Farm and Martz Creek.

Midland Acres topped the consignor gross sales category with \$1,291,000 in total for 51 sold. They were followed by Hickory Lane Farm with \$1,047,000 (26) and Spring Haven Farm with \$1,008,000 (36).

Rose Run Farm led the consignor average category at \$47,412 for 17 sold. Weaver Standardbred Farm was second in consignor average (with more than five sold) with \$42,286 for 14 sold, followed by Hickory Lane Farm at \$40,269 for 26 sold.

Soft Shot comes into Delaware off a gate-to-wire win in the filly and mare open pace at The Meadows (Sept. 4) in a lifetime best time of 1:51.

Earlier this year, the Heston Blue Chip lass had an eight-race win streak.

The New York bred is owned by Paul O'Neil and conditioned by Jessica Roegner.

The rest of the Jugette field and the entire Wednesday card will be drawn on today (Sept. 15) after the entry box closes.

Karl headlines KYSS Championships worth \$3.4 million at The Red Mile

This afternoon (Sept. 15), Hambletonian and Dan Patch Award winner, Karl, seeks his second Kentucky championship at The Red Mile in a 10-race extravaganza worth \$3.4 million. There are, however, many other competitors in the seven other divisions, including budding superstars and some regally bred individuals in two \$100,000 Kentucky Commonwealth Series finals.

Fans will have to wait until the sixth race for Karl's bid for his second Kentucky crown and his sixth-consecutive victory, but the five contests staged prior to his pari-mutuel appearance offer plenty of opportunities to witness some of the best athletes this sport has to offer.

FRESHMAN AND SOPHOMORE FILLY TROTTERS VIE FOR GLORY

Deja Blu (Yannick Gingras), Kadena (Dexter Dunn) and Voguish (James MacDonald) square off in the \$100,000 Commonwealth Series final for 2-year-old filly trotters. All three fillies possess victories in series legs.

Deja Blu is by Muscle Hill and the first foal out of 2018 Hambletonian winner and world champion Atlanta. She leaves from post position 1 and is 8-5 on the morning line. She seeks her fourth consecutive win for trainer Nancy Takter and owners Crawford Farms Racing and Thomas Pontone.

Kadena (Gimpanzee – Mission Brief) is 9-2 on the morning line and will begin trotting from post position 5 in the field of 10 for conditioner Marcus Melander and owners Jeffrey Snyder and S R F Stable. She is 4 2-2-0 in her young career and her world champion dam is a full sister to Tactical Landing, the sire of the last two Hambletonian winners.

Kadena was the \$800,000 sales topper at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Voguish's family tree is no less impressive than her rivals. The daughter of Gimpanzee—Jolene Jolene is a half sibling to 2021 O'Brien Award winner Venerable (Walner, \$1.18 million).

The filly is trained by Andrew Harris. She is 7-1 on the morning line and will leave from post position 7. She is owned by Bill Pollock, Bruce Areman and her trainer. Her record is 5 2-0-1.

Pisco Sour (Tim Tetrick) captured three legs of this series and is poised to claim the divisional title in the Commonwealth Series event for 3-year-old filly trotters. The daughter of Walner—Blessed is trained by Ake Svanstedt and owned by Jorgen Sparredal Inc.

The filly will leave from post position 9 in the field of 10 and is 5-2 on the morning line.

The question is can she overcome the outside draw?

Only she can answer that query.

LOUPRINT, LOOKSGOODINLOULOU READY TO ROLL

Louprint (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) will begin his mile over the red clay from post position 5 in a field of five as the even-money morning-line selection. The son of Sweet Lou—Rockin Racer competes as a homebred and enters this event off three consecutive wins, including one over the only horse to defeat him, stablemate Sippinonsearoc (Gingras). That loss was by a neck and Sippinonsearoc is the fastest 2-year-old in the history of the sport with a 1:48.2 mile over this course on Aug. 13.

Louprint, however, was not a member of that field. He competes as a homebred for Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi and Phillip Collura.

Looksgoodinloulou (Gingras) pursues her crown after suffering her first career defeat in the final leg of this series on Sept. 9, but the fledging star left post position 10 in the second tier and had plenty of traffic problems.

The daughter of Sweet Lou—Looksgoodinaromper drew post position 7 in the field of eight for this event and is 2-1 on the morning line. Her lifetime mark of 1:50.2 ties her with Pennsylvania Sire Stakes champion and stablemate, Rose, as the swiftest freshman pacing filly in 2024.

Looksgoodinloulou races as a homebred for Weaver Bruscemi and her conditioner, Ron Burke. Her resume stands at 3 2-0-0.

KARL, DATE NIGHT HANOVER DEFEND THEIR CROWNS

Karl, one of the top candidates for Horse of the Year, will make his bid for a second championship in the Bluegrass from post position 7 in the field of seven for trainer Nancy Takter. The son of Tactical Landing—Avalicious is 7-5 on the morning line and takes on familiar foes Secret Agent Man (Andy Miller, 5-2), who drew the rail, as well as Dame Good Time (Scott Zeron, 7-2) who leaves from post position 5.

Karl has been simply sublime since his second career defeat and only loss in 2024 from 10 trips to the gate in the \$135,000 Stanley Dancer Memorial at The Meadowlands on July 13. The colt is owned by Christina and Nancy Takter, Black Horse Racing, Crawford Farms Racing and Bender Sweden Inc.

Date Night Hanover (Dunn) looks to return to the winner's circle after finishing second in the fourth leg of this series on Sept. 2 to Woman Of Passion (Todd McCarthy), who is also in this field of eight. Woman Of Passion is 2-1 on the morning line after drawing the 5-hole.

Trained by Marcus Melander, Date Night Hanover, is 9-5 on the morning line and leaves right next to her rival from post position 4.

The daughter of Chapter Seven—Don't Wait Up was in top form at this facility establishing and equaling her lifetime mark of 1:51.2 after going off-stride in the \$525,000 Hambletonian Oaks on Aug. 3.

Owned by Jeffrey Snyder and ONDA Racing Stable, Date Night Hanover is competing for her fourth win from 11 starts this season.

The defending Kentucky champion has demonstrated an affinity for this surface.

LUNA LOVEGOOD, SUPER CHAPTER RESUME THEIR EFFORTS FOR CROWNS

Luna Lovegood (Dunn) is 9-5 on the morning line and will begin trotting from post position 3 in a field of eight in her bid to capture championship honors for trainer Marcus Melander and owner Holly Lane Stud.

The daughter of Gimpanzee – Southwind Venus has only one loss from four starts, all in this series, and that was in the second leg after starting from the second tier. She went off-stride behind the gate and had an adventurous journey but has rebounded with two strong victories.

Super Chapter (Dunn) looks to collect a Kentucky crown after breaking behind the gate in the \$225,000 New York Sire Stakes final for his age, sex and gait at Yonkers Raceway on Sept. 7 as the favorite.

The colt, trained by Melander, won the first two legs of this series before finishing third to Chat Room (Gingras, 7-2) who had a more advantageous draw as he does again here. Chat room leaves from post position 2, while Super Chapter will commence his mile from post position 8 in the field of 10. They are exactly the same posts they started from in their last meeting.

By Chapter Seven and out of 2014 Hambletonian Oaks winner Lifetime Pursuit, Super Chapter is owned by Jeffrey Snyder and Arthur Ponti. The colt's record is 6 3-1-1.

ITS A LOVE THING, NUCLEAR FAVORED

Its A Love Thing (MacDonald) will bid for her first Kentucky title in the event for sophomore filly pacers. The daughter of Bettor's Delight—Love For Sail is on track for her fifth victory in a row after scratching from the \$112,480 Simcoe Stakes at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Sept. 7.

Trained by David Menary, Its A Love Thing captured the \$310,250 Fan Hanover at Woodbine Mohawk Park and the \$100,000 Jerry Silverman Memorial at The Meadowlands prior to her lone appearance in a series leg in Lexington on Aug. 6.

She is 9 7-2-0 on the season and has placed \$462,174 in the bank for owners Erik Good, Thomas Biederman, Josh Green and Rich Lombardo Racing.

Its A Love Thing is 8-5 on the morning line and commences her mile from post position 4 in the field of seven.

Nuclear (Dunn) is 2-1 on the morning line in his respective finals division. The gelded son of Always B Miki—Can'tgetenuffofyou leaves from post position 4 in a contentious field of eight for trainer Joe Holloway.

Nuclear won the second leg of this series after finishing third to defending Kentucky champion Better Is Nice (Andrew McCarthy, post position 2, 7-2) in the first leg then losing by a neck to upsetter Dancin Champion (David Miller, post position 3, 15-1) in the third leg.

The gelding dead-heated for second with Women Layer (Todd McCarthy, post position 6, 5-2) in the fourth leg of the series behind Better Is Nice.

Nuclear is owned by Val D'Or Farms. He was fourth in the \$700,000 Breeders Crown last year at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

The first post for the culmination of the 2024 Kentucky Sire Stakes Championship Series is at 5:05 p.m. Racing continues with six \$100,000 Kentucky Commonwealth Series finals on Monday (Sept. 16) and Tuesday (Sept. 17) with eight \$50,000 finals of the Kentucky Golden Rod Series. The first post for Monday and Tuesday is at 1 p.m.

More than \$455,000 granted for New York industry improvements

More than \$455,000 in grant funding will support improvement, growth and maintenance of New York's harness racing industry in 2024-25, following grant announcements from the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund.

The Fund, which promotes agriculture through the breeding of standardbred horses, equine research and the state's robust harness racing program, held its annual Grant Awards Ceremony at the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame in Goshen last week. Fund chair Brian O'Dwyer announced the grant recipients

with fellow Fund board members Richard A. Ball and Steve Jones as well as Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund executive director Ralph Scunziano in attendance.

"These grants build on New York's commitment to standardbred horse breeding, racing, education and research, and the Fund is proud to recognize these organizations and assist in continuing their positive contributions to the industry," said Scunziano.

Five organizations were awarded grants to support research, educational programs and promote harness racing in New York:

- New York State 4-H Horse Program \$200,000 for its statewide program
- Morrisville College Foundation \$109,349 for Standardbred Breeding Expansion Project
- \bullet Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame \$100,000 for its education department and exhibit
- Goshen Historic Track \$34,442 for ongoing restoration and upgrades
- Therapeutic Horses of Saratoga \$12,000 for Harnessing Hope

The grants are funded via statutory payments from racetracks, off-track betting corporations, video lottery terminal facilities and casinos. The Fund board reviewed all submissions and voted unanimously to award grants to these five entities in recognition of the important role they play in supporting the harness racing industry.

The New York Sire Stakes just hosted its 2024 Excelsior finals on Friday (Sept. 13) at Vernon Downs Casino Hotel in Vernon, NY, following the successful New York Sire Stakes Day of Champions and County Fair Series finals that took place earlier this month.

The Fund announced last week that all three Series finals will award record-setting purse totals in 2025, as well as marking a significant increase to the Breeders Award Program next season. Click **here** for more details.
