Phaetosive steals the show in thrilling Elegantimage

Filly nips Hambletonian Oaks champion Manchego at the wire by a neck with Hambletonian winner Atlanta third.

Phaetosive (Trond Smedshammer) edged Manchego by a neck to win the Elegantimage at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 1:52.2.

Phaetosive and trainer/driver Trond Smedshammer went from blocked at the rail to reaching up just in time on the outside in a wild \$340,000 Elegantimage Stakes on Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Although it was a field of seven 3-year-old trotting fillies competing, the Elegantimage Stakes was essentially a three-horse race with superstars Atlanta, Manchego and Phaetosive clashing for the first-time this season.


Hambletonian champion Atlanta was blasted to the lead by driver Scott Zeron, posting a :27.1 opener. Manchego and driver Yannick Gingras got away right behind Atlanta, while Phaetosive and Smedshammer left from the rail in third.

Zeron used his position on the lead to grab a soft second-quarter of :29.2.

The tempo ramped up on the final turn, as Blonde Magic and driver Jody Jamieson started pushing up on the outside from fifth. The outside mover gave Gingras his cue to pop the two-hole nearing three-quarters, while Smedshammer stayed in with Phaetosive.

Harness Racing Update

Atlanta reached three-quarters in 1:24.4 and led the fillies into the lane with Manchego at her wheel. The Hambletonian Day heroes engaged in battle with Manchego overtaking the lead in the final-eighth.

As the lead pair battled, Phaetosive attempted to come up the inside, but no lane was available and Smedshammer went inside one pylon while taking back. Despite losing momentum, Phaetosive came across to the far outside and unleashed a furious late push to nail Manchego at the line for a 1:52.2 victory. The margin of victory was a neck.

Atlanta finished third, beat 2 ½ lengths.

The AGCO Judges reviewed Smedshammer's stretch drive and determined there was no violation committed.

"Up until the three-quarter pole everything went like I planned," said Smedshammer following the victory. "When Yannick (Gingras) pulled in front of me, I thought it was going to be easier to go inside, I really thought they were going to sprint home a little bit more.

"The rail didn't open up. I tried inside Scotty (Zeron), but he wasn't going to open up anything and I actually skimmed a pylon there, but I went back outside. She had every opportunity to get beat tonight."

A daughter of Explosive Matter—Phaeton bred by Hanover Shoe Farms, Phaetosive picked up her sixth win of the season Saturday and 10thwin in 15 career starts. The Smedshammer trainee has only two losses this season with the first being against colts in her season debut and most recent being a second-place finish to Manchego in the Hambletonian Oaks on Aug. 4.

"She's been great her whole life and Manchego's been getting the best of her in every start before, but today was our turn," said Smedshammer, who has managed his star filly carefully. "She is fresh. She had a couple of incidents after the Oaks that set her back a little bit. She shipped up here yesterday and I knew today she was very calm and very good in the paddock. Everything was her way tonight."

Phaetosive, who entered the Elegantimage off a victory in the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes Championship, has now earned \$567,864 this season and \$845,604 in her career for owner Wanda Polisseni's Purple Haze Stables LLC of Fairport, NY.

A \$2 win ticket on Phaetosive returned \$11.30.

Green Manalishi S romps in William Wellwood Memorial



Trainer Marcus Melander admitted he was nervous before the start of the \$400,000 William Wellwood Memorial on Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park. As it turned out, he didn't need to be.

In the seconds leading up to Canada's richest race for 2-year-old trotters, Melander, who conditions top-flight trotter Green Manalishi S, admitted he was battling butterflies before the field of 10 got underway.

A three-length triumph, timed in a career-best 1:53.4, changed that trepidation to pure elation.

"He was very good tonight as well," said Melander, of the horse

that took one of two Wellwood eliminations last Saturday. "I'm very happy to win this race. I was a little nervous before the race, actually. I'm not normally like that. After that race last week, he was really impressive. I was just very happy that we could show them that he's as good as he was last week."

Sent off as the 3-5 mutuel favorite, Green Manalishi S, with Tim Tetrick in the sulky, got away third as Swandre The Giant and Yannick Gingras powered to the front as the trotters made their way into the first turn.

After a quarter-mile in a tepid :28.2, Tetrick made the decision to go for the front after Union Forces, a 33-1 upset winner in the other Wellwood elimination, broke stride.

With a confident Tetrick at the controls, Green Manalishi, who reached the half in :57.1, began to dash away from Swandre The Giant, who broke stride as the field turned for home.

Easily keeping his rivals at bay, the son of Muscle Hill—Naga Morich, who won his Wellwood elim seven days ago, flexed his muscles down the lane, crossing the wire the easiest of winners.

"That was really fun," said Tetrick. "First off, I just want to say it's a great honor to win the Wellwood race. A great family and proud to get to win this race.

"I was going to go ahead and go," continued the veteran reinsman of his decision to push for the lead prior to the mid-way point. "I wanted to get through the first turn clear and safe. Down the backside, I let him trot. We got a good half and from there it was his race to win or lose."

The longshot parade for second, third and fourth spots went to Smart As Hill (27-1), Okeanos (50-1) and Kings County (27-1), respectively.

Green Manalishi S paid \$3.30 for the win, combining with Smart As Hill for a \$45.40 exactor. Okenaos capped a \$378.80 triactor, while a \$1 superfecta (Kings County) returned \$2,876.45.

Members of the Wellwood family were on hand to make the trophy presentation.

It was the fourth win from six starts for the bay colt that had a runner-up finish in the \$422,350 Peter Haughton Memorial on August 4 at The Meadowlands.

"He's special," praised Tetrick. "He trots beautiful and he acts like an eight-year-old out there. He loves his work. Marcus and the crew







have done a great job with him. He makes me look really good out there."

Owned by Courant Inc. and bred Ab Svensk Reklamfinans of Solne, Sweden, Green Manalishi S will now set his sights south of the border.

"We'll ship him down to Lexington next week and he's going to race there one or two times," said Melander. "We've got the Breeders Crown left and I think we have the Valedictory as well. But we'll take one race at a time. He's a very nice horse."

Crystal Fashion makes statement from post 10 in Canadian Trotting Classic


This year's edition of the \$665,000 Canadian Trotting Classic was a hoof-to-hoof heavyweight battle from start to finish, with Crystal Fashion coming out on top in the final strides.

Saddled with the daunting post 10, Crystal Fashion, a bay son of Cantab Hall—Window Willow, needed a little racing luck and plenty of grit to get the job done in Canada's richest trotting event of 2018.

On Saturday evening at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the Jim Campbell trainee had plenty of the latter.

Sent off as the 5-2 second choice to 3-5 Mets Hall, Crystal Fashion, piloted by Tim Tetrick, was full of trot as the gate took off from the field of 11 sophomore stars.

After taking his rivals through an opening quarter in :27.3, Crystal Fashion then found himself sitting in second spot once Mets Hall, with Andy Miller driving, went from second to first.

The see-saw tussle between the leaders continued through a half in :56.2 and three-quarters in 1.25-flat, with the final round coming as the field straightened for home.

Down the stretch, Crystal Fashion, on the outside, and Mets Hall, to his inside, put on a show for the packed house at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

At the wire, Crystal Fashion (\$7.90 to win) eked out a hard-fought half-length triumph over his rival, in 1:52.1. Fiftydallarbill was third, while Lawmaker was fourth.

The 10-2 exactor returned \$21 and a 10-2-8 triactor paid \$91.60. A \$1 superfecta (10-2-8-5) was worth \$444.85. There was a pari-mutuel refund for Winning American, who had a broken equipment issue prior to the start of the race.

"It worked out good today," said Tetrick who two races earlier teamed with Green Manalishi S to win the William Wellwood Memorial. "We got out of there good and got on the right foot. He crossed over well, in-hand, and the favourite came and we had to let him go, so I got a dream trip."

Both Crystal Fashion and Tetrick had to work overtime to finally reel in a stubborn Mets Hall.

"I went ahead and pulled the pocket at the top of the lane," he said. "We had a horse race to the wire, but today my horse out-grinded him. With Crystal, you never know for sure. He always gives a pretty good effort, but sometimes he can look at butterflies."

Tonight, he stung like a bee.

It was lifetime win No. 13 from 25 starts for the bay gelding, owned by Fashion Farms LLC. In 13 starts this year, Crystal Fashion, bred by Hanover Shoe Farms, has nine wins and a trio of seconds.

"Very impressed," said Campbell. "Timmy did a great job getting him out of there to put him in good position. The



horse, he digs. If he's got a target to go at, he goes after it. He's just been a tremendous horse to train this year."

Crystal Fashion will soon head to the Bluegrass State for his next engagements.

"He's been good at both two and three," said Campbell. "He seems to get better. He'll go down to Lexington and have two races there and then he'll go to the Breeders Crown."

The Ice Dutchess wins Peaceful Way by open lengths

Even-money betting favorite The Ice Dutchess made every step a sure one on her way to victory in the \$385,000 Peaceful Way final on Saturday evening at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The Jimmy Takter trainee won in 1:54.2, three open

lengths ahead of her nearest rival, Evident Beauty (Dave Miller; 4-1). Longshot Angies Luckeylady (51-1, Trevor Henry) was a distant third.

Evident Beauty cut the :27.1 opening quarter after four fillies' hopes were dashed in the early going. In rein to Yannick Gingras, The Ice Dutchess made the front easily by the :57.1 half, trotting past the early leader without a fight and taking command. She led by two lengths over Evident Beauty at the three-quarter

pole, reached in 1:26, and sustained her reign right to the wire.

A late effort from the other elimination winner, Sisters Promise, ended when she broke stride moving from fourth to third in the stretch.

John Floren's Coyote Wynd Farms of Vancouver, BC owns The Ice Dutchess, who was a \$320,000 yearling purchase. Floren noted he bought the daughter of Muscle Hill—The Ice Queen after selling a Muscle Hill colt for the same price.

"I said, 'She's the nicest filly in the sale. If I get her for \$320,000, not a dollar more, I'll go for it' and that was my last bid," said Floren. "You look for these kind of horses your whole career. I've been in this sport for 30 years and you get one now and then. I always was patient and always was hopeful and now we have one and we're going to enjoy every step of the way."

The Ice Dutchess was bred by Stephen Dey III of Allentown, NJ and David Reid of Briarcliff Manor, NY.

The Jim Doherty Memorial champion has rebounded strongly after consecutive early breaks and distanced finishes in both a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes event at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono and a Champlain Stake division at Woodbine Mohawk Park last month.

The Ice Dutchess is undefeated since the addition of trotting hobbles, which trainer Takter remarked upon from the winner's circle.

"I think she will grow out of that... I think she will be better without that," said Takter, who feels The Ice



Dutchess has another step to take. "I don't think she is quite ready... I don't feel that she's really there yet."

Dr. Cal and Angie Stiller, the breeders and former owners of Canadian Hall of Fame trotter Peaceful Way (inducted 2008), presented the namesake stake's trophy to the winning connections.

The Ice Dutchess paid \$4 to win.

Captain Ahab and Stag Party punched their ticket to next week's \$890,000 Metro Pace final with impressive victories in Saturday's eliminations at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

A group of 17 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings were split into a pair of \$40,000 eliminations.

Captain Ahab will head into the Metro Pace final a perfect seven-for-seven after winning his elimination in 1:50.4 for driver Andrew McCarthy and trainer Tony Alagna.

A son of Captaintreacherous—Acquavella, Captain Ahab got away fourth in a field of eight and watched Captain Crunch cut an opening-quarter of :26.3. McCarthy sent 'Ahab' after the lead in the second s, clearing to the top in a :55 half.

Captain Ahab paced his third quarter in :27.4 with first-up pressure from Lyons Night Hawk and the six for seven De Los Cielos Deo sitting second-over.

In the stretch, Captain Ahab finished his mile with a :28 final-quarter to secure the victory. De Los Cielos Deo paced

into second, getting to the leader's wheel at the wire. Goldberg finished third, while Lyons Night Hawk was fourth. The final ticket to next week's final was grabbed by Better Up.

Captain Ahab established a new career mark with the 1:50.4 victory and has now earned \$137,616 for owners Brittany Farms LLC, Brad Grant, Vince Barbera and Captain Ahab Racing. The colt was bred by Brittany Farms.

"I kicked the ear-plugs out tonight and made him pace in the stretch because I've got so much respect for Burke's colt (De Los Cielos Deo)," said McCarthy following the victory. "I was getting flushed early, so I went ahead and put him on the front and he was fine about it."

A \$100,000 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale purchase, Captain Ahab will head into the Metro Pace undefeated and as the likely favorite. The Alagna trainee has collected five of his seven wins at Mohawk Park.

McCarthy said he is confident heading into the final, but not overlooking any of his opponents.

"It's not going to be easy. I've got a lot of respect for the other colts, so we just got to figure out the trip and hopefully it works out for us."

A \$2 win ticket on Captain Ahab returned \$2.50.

Casie Coleman trainee Stag Party rebounded from a second-place finish in the Champlain for an impressive 1:51 victory in the first Metro elimination.

Driven by David Miller, Stag Party took his time in the beginning, getting away sixth in the field of nine. Cruise Captain, who defeated Stag Party in the Champlain, posted a :27.1 opening-quarter before surrendering the lead in the second-quarter.

Shake That House moved third to first entering the backstretch, but was followed by Semi Tough, who overtook the top spot and led by the half in :55.4.

Miller angled Stag Party to the outside at the half and the Coleman trainee charged first-up to draw within half a length of Semi Tough at three-quarters in 1:24.

In the stretch, Semi Tough dug in gamely in an attempt to hold off Stag Party, but the Coleman student muscled by in deep stretch to win by a length and a half in a career-best 1:51. Semi Tough held second, while Shake That House was third. The top-five was completed by Lyons Johnnyjnr and Buddy Hill.

A son of Bettors Delight—My Lady Day, Stag Party now has five wins in seven starts and has earned \$197,489 for owners John Fielding, Mac Nichol, McKinlay & Fielding and West Wins Stable. Stag Party was bred by Fred Hertrich III of Seaford, DE.

"Casie told me he just wasn't right health wise (last week) and she got him good in a week and he went a big trip tonight," said Miller when asked about the rebound victory. "She does a great job conditioning horses and getting them ready."

Stag Party was purchased as a yearling for \$125,000 at the Harrisburg Sale.

A \$2 win ticket on the Coleman trainee returned \$3.90.

The post-positions for next week's \$890,000 Metro Pace final were drawn following the eliminations. Captain Ahab and Stag Party earned their connections the right to select their post.

Field set for Shes A Great Lady

Ideation Hanover and Tall Drink Hanover posted victories in Saturday's Shes A Great Lady eliminations at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

A total of 19 rookie pacing fillies competed over two hotly contested \$35,000 eliminations.

Ideation Hanover and Jody Jamieson took charge early and made their point when it counted the first 'Great Lady' elimination.

Never worse than third in her eight career races, Ideation Hanover was an overlooked 10-1 at the betting windows, motoring up the inside path to take down tiring leader Treacherous Reign and fend off a late-charging Sylph Hanover on the outside.

The 1:51.2 clocking was a lifetime best for the Bettors Delight—Ideal Weather (Western Ideal) daughter. Trainer Dave Menary admitted post-race that he was pleasantly surprised: "I didn't know how it would all play out."

Announcer Ken Middleton described the "backstretch blast"

unleashed by Treacherous Reign as that filly powered out of third to circle Ideation Hanover and Sylph Hanover by the :56 half. Treacherous Reign continued to set the pace, leading by two open lengths over the eventual winner at the 1:23.4 three-quarter-mile mark. With that leader vulnerable in deep stretch, Jamieson's tactics worked to Ideation Hanover's perfect advantage.

He called Ideation Hanover "the kind of filly who likes to go forward" every start. Stepping out of the shadow of stablemate Quebec Blue Chip after a "disappointing" third-place finish in her last race, a Champlain division at Woodbine Mohawk Park, Ideation Hanover was "back on track" for next week's Shes A Great Lady final, said Menary.

The winning filly's conditioner noted the \$50,000 yearling purchase was a bargain: "This family comes from a great pedigree... People got off the bandwagon for Bettors Delight. I was happy to bring her home for 50."

Queen of the Pride (Dave Miller) finished third, over Treacherous Reign (Andrew McCarthy) in the first elimination.

Ideation Hanover is owned by Ontario-based Menary

Racing Inc., Michael Guerriero, and Alan Alber. Saturday's win was her third career victory, returning \$22 for a \$2 win ticket.

An unfortunate incident in deep stretch removed two of the top contenders in the second Shes A Great Lady elimination. Dueling on the lead, Warrawee Ubeaut (Yannick Gingras) appeared to veer into Quebec Blue Chip (Jody Jamieson), taking both out of the race with late breaks and setting the scene of an inquiry.

The inquiry resulted in Warrawee Ubeaut being set back twice for creating interference: from sixth back to seventh, then again to ninth in the nine-horse race. Quebec Blue Chip finished eighth, and was placed seventh. Blossom Onthebeach finished seventh and was placed sixth. Deb was ninth, placed eighth.

Prescient Beauty (Doug McNair) had launched to a two-length lead on the front end (:27.3), with Quebec Blue Chip and Warrawee Ubeaut second and third behind her at the opening quarter. Quebec Blue Chip stepped out to claim the lead by the :55.2 half, with Prescient Beauty settling in third and Warrawee Ubeaut on the attack outside at the three-quarters, which was reached in 1:24.1.

Tall Drink Hanover loomed second over in fourth at the three-quarters, a fortunate position for driver Andrew McCarthy's filly. When the battling leaders made physical contact in the stretch, the Captaintreacherous-Take Into Account (The Panderosa) daughter escaped difficulty and powered to a going-away triumph in 1:51.2—a new personal



best, by two-and-a-third lengths over Prescient Beauty.

The judges inquiry did not affect the top four finishers in the elimination. Odds On Lucie (another Tony Alagna trainee) was third, over fourth-place Carousel.

Winning conditioner Tony Alagna, who has three fillies going to the stake final, said Tall Drink Hanover (a \$35,000 Harrisburg yearling sale purchase) had "a six-week deficit behind these other fillies (over the winter), but she just continues to improve."

Sympathizing with the connections of Quebec Blue Chip and Warrawee Ubeaut, he added that their accident took nothing away from Tall Drink Hanover's performance: "I felt good halfway down the lane that she was going to get there anyway." It was the fourth win in seven starts for the Eternal Camnation and Whenuwishuponastar winner, who is owned by Alagna Racing LLC of New Jersey, Marvin Katz of Ontario, and Riverview Racing LLC of Florida.

The post-positions for next week's \$590,000 Shes A Great Lady final were drawn following the eliminations.

Nirvana Seelster defeats Lazarus in preferred

Nirvana Seelster denied Lazarus N a rebound victory with a huge coast-to-coast 1:48.1 victory in Saturday's \$34,000 preferred at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The 7-year-old Bill Budd trainee was blasted to the lead by driver Trevor Henry and posted fractions of :26.3, :54.1 and



1:21 before powering home in :27.1 for his eighth win of the season.

Lazarus N finished second, beat two lengths. The Jimmy Takter trained 6-year-old left from post-seven and settled in fourth. Driver Yannick Gingras angled Lazarus N to the outside nearing the half and grinded away first-up on the final turn, drawing to within a length and three-quarters of the lead at the third-marker.

Nirvana Seelster had no quit in him pacing down the lane, as Lazarus N had to settle for the runner-up finish.

Owned by Bruce Davy, Nirvana Seelster just missed matching his career-mark of 1:48, which he took last season at Mohawk Park. The fan favorite, who surpassed \$1 million in career earnings last week, has now earned \$208,170 in 28 starts this season

Nirvana Seelster and Lazarus N were the only two horses in Saturday's nine-horse field that competed in the \$600,000 Canadian Pacing Derby on Sept. 1. Lazarus N finished second, while Nirvana Seelster was eighth.

A \$2 win ticket on Nirvana Seelster returned \$24.80.

Hoosier Darling

After earning \$200,000 as a freshman, Chris Beaver-trained trotting filly Custom Cantab has dominated the Indiana Sires Stakes as a sophomore thanks to talent, speed and remarkable consistency.

How do you improve upon a \$200,000 freshman campaign? Sophomore trotting filly Custom Cantab has managed to do so by dominating the Indiana Sires Stakes this summer with nine wins in 11 seasonal starts. The Chris Beaver trainee now drops into Grand Circuit company for the second time in her career next Friday in the \$150,000 Moni Maker.

In 2017, the Mr Cantab—Custom Model lass hit the board in each of her 12 freshman starts. The trotter managed two wins while finishing second seven times, often to ISS rival O So Easy. Custom Cantab earned \$214,486 last season for owners Beaver, Donald Robinson and R.B.H. Ventures, Inc.

"She's extremely consistent. You don't have to worry about having a different horse every week when you race," Beaver said of his pupil. "Every time I race her she's exactly the

same. It makes her very easy to train. Besides that, she's got just about everything in a good horse; she's sound, she's smart, she takes care of herself, and she's fast."

For all the consistency of her freshman campaign, Custom Cantab began the 2018 schedule with an obstacle. That obstacle was an entrapped epiglottis, and it produced breathing issues for the filly. With the Indiana Sires Stakes set to begin, the trainer set about preparing his charge without knowledge of the restriction.

"Going into the first elimination I trained her up. She had a few weeks that she wasn't racing, and I thought she trained well, but I told my vet to stick a scope in her anyway just to check her out," recalled Beaver. "We were four or five days out from the first elim. He saw it then and he did not think she would race any good. Once we found it, the plan was to go ahead and take care of it once we got through the first elimination and final."

The veterinarian was not optimistic for good results, but Custom Cantab won her \$24,000 ISS elimination by a nose in 1:54.4 as the second choice. Returning for the first \$85,000 of the season, the filly raced third, recording a 1:54.1 effort. Despite the impairment, the 3-year-old had managed to

prove competitive in the state's top program.

"It's just a testament to how good she is. The vet thought she wouldn't have anything coming home with that type of airway problem," the trainer said. "She was pretty darn good."

Surgery was performed after the May 30 final, and the filly was ready for action when the second round of eliminations kicked off June 27. Custom Cantab lined up behind the gate without a qualifier in the weeks between starts, but that did not present a problem for the trotter. With regular driver Peter Wrenn in the bike, the sophomore reached the winner's circle via a 1:54.2 performance. That victory began a string of successes, as Beaver's filly reeled off seven wins in eight starts, including five straight. Her latest victory came Sept. 12 in the last \$85,000 final of the season. Tabbed the favorite, Custom Cantab circled Hoosier Park's oval in a time of 1:54. The win pushed her career earnings over the \$400,000 threshold, while seasonal earnings are now \$197,550.

With the last of the points-paying finals in the books, the filly will enter the \$200,000 Super Final next month as the prohibitive favorite. Before then, however, Custom Cantab will take on open company in the Moni Maker at Hoosier Park on Sept. 21. Last season, she dipped her hoof into Grand Circuit action in the \$240,000 Kentuckiana, finishing second and collecting a cool \$60,000.

"I'm pointing her to the Super Final, but we're racing the Moni Maker along the way," Beaver said. "I made the decision because she's there every week (Hoosier Park), racing there, and it's not taking her out of her normal routine. The way it fits into the schedule, I would need to race her or train her very hard anyway to keep her good for the final."

The list of eligibles for the Moni Maker includes 31 fillies, headlined by superstar Manchego. Outside of the Jimmy Takter-trained trotter, Beaver feels his entry can mix it up with any from the group that drop in the box this week. Custom Cantab also staked to the Elegantimage at Mohawk, but the trainer decided to stay home and focus on finishing

out the Indiana Sires Stakes season strong.

"I see one horse coming in that might be clearly better than her, but other than that, it's going to be a lot of the same kind of horses that she's been racing with and beating," he said. "Once you get past Manchego, Atlanta, and a couple of those other fillies in the Elegantimage that aren't staked to this race, I think she does look really good in there. I had her staked to the Elegantimage, but I decided not to take her there because I knew how good the competition was there, and I wanted to keep her good for the races here at Hoosier Park."

The Buckeye trainer has not started Custom Cantab anywhere outside Hoosier Park during her two campaigns. The familiarity with the track could provide home field advantage and play in the filly's favor in the Moni Maker. Win or lose, through two seasons and 23 starts, the trotter has shown she has all the attributes of a champion.

"We love her. She's a fantastic racehorse," Beaver said. "It's nice having one that when you race them you get their best every time."

Jean-Michel Bazire-trained Davidson du Pont (Pacha du Pont) was impressive winning the Prix de l'Etoile (\$280,000) at Vincennes in Paris on Saturday afternoon.

The 5-year-old son of Pacha du Pont won Criterium des 5 ans (\$250,000) at the same track two weeks ago and Bazire seems to, once again, have managed to dvelop a trotter with high international status.

In the Prix de l'Etoile, Davidson du Pont started 50 meters behind the front horses (3-year-olds) but despite the tough conditions, Bazire's trotter was outstanding when the top driver decided to give his horse the order to attack with a little less than a half mile to go in the 1.4 mile long race.

Davidson du Pont easily disarmed leader Fabrize du Gite before the last turn passed into home stretch and the 5-year-old came home in an impressive mile rate of 1:54, which is in tangent with the earlier stakes record set by Balero Love from 2016.

Sophomore trotter Follow You (Ready Cash) finished second in 1:56.4 and Django Riff (Ready Cash) showed great speed in the home stretch finishing third in 1:54.2.

Connections happy with Jug prep for Courtly Choice

Meadowlands Pace champion Courtly Choice prepped for next week's Little Brown Jug with a 1:52 win in a qualifier Tuesday morning at Harrah's Philadelphia with regular driver David Miller in the sulky. The colt set all the fractions, going :28 to the quarter, :55.4 to the half and 1:24.2 to three-quarters over a surface labeled "good."

"The rail wasn't that great, so Dave kept him two wide the whole way," trainer Blake MacIntosh said. "We just wanted to make sure everything was good. Dave couldn't be happier with him, so we're very happy. He was real good. We'll head to the Jug next week."

The 73rd Little Brown Jug for 3-year-old pacers is Sept. 20 at the Delaware County Fair in central Ohio and is the third jewel in the Pacing Triple Crown. Stay Hungry won the first two — the Cane Pace and Messenger Stakes — and will attempt to become the 11th pacer to complete the sweep. The most recent Pacing Triple Crown winner was No Pan Intended in 2003.

Courtly Choice was not staked to the Little Brown Jug, but is eligible to supplement to the race thanks to his win in the Meadowlands Pace. The fee to supplement is \$45,000. The colt's owners have already spent nearly \$100,000 to supplement to the Meadowlands Pace and Cane Pace, where Courtly Choice finished fourth for his

only loss in his past seven races.

"What's another \$45,000?" MacIntosh said with a laugh. "Everybody wants to win the Jug. There are three races that you always want to win: the Meadowlands Pace, the North America Cup, and the Jug. Hopefully we can get two out of three. We'll see what happens."

The Little Brown Jug, which contests eliminations and final on the same day, is expected to feature three of North America's top-rated horses. Courtly Choice is ranked No. 5 in the current Hambletonian
Society/Breeders Crown poll while North America Cup winner Lather Up is No. 8 and Stay Hungry is No. 10.

In the first <u>Little Brown Jug future pool</u>, Lather Up was the 3-1 favorite followed by Courtly Choice at 9-2 and Stay Hungry at 6-1. The second pool opens Sunday.

Courtly Choice will enter the Jug with a three-race win streak while Stay Hungry and Lather Up both have won back-to-back starts and three of their last four.

"Those three horses are on top of their games right now," MacIntosh said. "It's going to be an exciting race. I hope the crowd shows up and everybody enjoys it."

Courtly Choice has won nine of 12 races this year and earned \$655,393 for owners Hutt Racing Stable, Mac And Heim Stables, Daniel Plouffe, and Touch Stone Farms. For his career, the son of Art Major out of Lady Ashlee Ann has won 11 of 24 starts and \$708,744.

Miller is a four-time winner of the Little Brown Jug — he got his first with No Pan Intended — and will be attempting to equal the record for career driving victories in the event. Billy Haughton and Mike Lachance share the mark with five each.

MacIntosh will be making his first appearance in the Little Brown Jug.

"I know I'll be nervous," MacIntosh said. "It's going to be an exciting day."

I grabbed a handful of popcorn from the plastic basket on the table and said, "We will need to call Uber."

He nodded, "It's amazing how you careen from irresponsible to responsible."

"It's amazing to hear the word "careen" in this establishment. How do you like my responsible new haircut?"

He shrugged, "I was getting used to the ponytail."



"I was starting to feel like a cliché, like a Lebowski wannabe. I need to mix things up. Now that I'm in the horse business, I'm going for respectable. Don't worry, it won't last."

It's A Herbie wins Indiana Sires Stakes final, sets lifetime best

After finishing second in his elimination last week, It's A Herbie rebounded gamely Saturday to find the winner's circle in the featured event of the evening, the \$75,000 Indiana Sires Stakes final for 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings, at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Driven, trained, and owned by Verlin Yoder, It's A Herbie went gate to wire to deliver as the heavy favorite and establish a new career best of 1:54.2.

Leaving from post six in the competitive field of 10, Yoder sent It's A Herbie straight to the front to reach the first quarter in :28. Trump This and Sam Widger grabbed a pocket seat while Mocedes Boy and LeWayne Miller were next in line third. It's A Herbie went uncontested through splits of :57.2 and 1:26 as the field remained in single file order down the backside.

As the field rounded the final turn, Yoder asked his mount for more and he trotted evenly on to the wire to finish two lengths in front of Trump This. Mocedes Boy used a ground saving trip to finish third. As the 3-5 favorite, It's A Herbie returned \$3.20 at the betting windows.

"He's a big clumsy colt that's just starting to come into himself," Yoder said. "I knew he needed time and it wouldn't be till later in the season that he would come around. He's a smart horse and has done everything right — just needed time."

With the win, It's A Herbie improved his lifetime record to 9 2-6-1. The son of Here Comes Herbie—Psychic Image also pushed his lifetime earnings over the \$100,000 mark with

the victory. It's been a great week for the Yoder Stable as they also scored a victory in the New York Sires Stakes earlier in the week with Woodside Charm who shattered the North American record for 2-year-old trotting fillies at Saratoga Casino with a 1:53.4 mile.

Jug entry deadline moved to Monday

The entry box for the 73rd Little Brown Jug will remain open until Monday (Sept. 17) at 10 a.m.

The condition sheet on the USTA website listed the Little Brown Jug, with the other races scheduled to be conducted on Thursday, Sept. 20, as having a "three-day box."

"We have a unique situation where our largest stakes events, the Little Brown Jug and Jugette, have a five-day-box and the remaining events with a three-day box," said Tom Wright, director of racing. "We want to make 100 per cent sure everyone had access to the same information before they entered their horse. We are sorry for the delay, but we felt this decision was in the best interest of the horsemen."

The retention barn rules will not be impacted. The Jug horses will be required to be on the grounds Tuesday, Sept. 18 by noon.

When will things change?

There is a constant amount of talk throughout the sport in North America with regards to the minimal or slap on the wrists that are handed out to offenders. If the authorities who are supposed to police and govern the sport are not doing anything about it, then why are not track operators not calling these same authorities to task about what is going on? Yes, we all understand and believe in innocence until proven guilty, but when the lab comes back with a drug overage, and the drug is on the banned list why is it that the offender has a week to answer back to the judges to accept their judgement? Or drivers not putting in any effort to try and win or finish in the money? If I operated a track, I surely would not want my customers talking about how I don't care about them, my customers who fuel the sport and support my track should deserve better. If the customers' complaints keep falling on deaf ears the sport will not survive. Even the occasional bettor can easily connect the dots from breeder to the betting window, and these same bettors with little knowledge can see the breaks in what should be a solid on track product because what they have just witnessed with their eyes. The racing public, is their voice, is it too small or do the track operators and governing authorities really just not care? The fan and honest horsemen are trying to keep the domino tiles standing, but this lack of actions by track operators and authorities in my opinion will lead to the Domino Effect, when one tile falls they will all follow.

The elimination races are typically boring and unbettable. The favorite goes to the lead, slows the pace to a crawl and the race is over. The stars shouldn't have to race in elimination races. They should be given a bye based on some kind of point system. Maybe take a cue from golf's FedEx cup point system. The top 4 point earners get a bye into the final. The rest of the field race for the remaining spots. This would make for more exciting eliminations and finals. You could also have some kind point system to qualify for the Breeders Crown.

I don't have the time to figure this out, but someone out there does. There has to be a better way to increase interest. We can't keep doing the same thing. Things are changing faster than ever and people get bored easily.

Tracks should space out big races also. Why have all big races on one night? The tracks would probably get a bigger bang from having three big races on three separate nights then one big night. Have the Breeders Crown for one big night. For a big race the track could give customers a card with a horse's stats for a big race. The customers with the winning horse could redeem it for a hot dog or something.

We have to get them involved. Have a website link available so patrons can use their phone to learn how to read a program or access top picks and put that on the front cover.

The most important thing is to try something, you never know what is going to work. By trying eventually you WILL find something big. The effort needs to be made.

Pandolfo on outside posts on half-mile tracks

When Jimmy Freight drew post 8 in the Messenger Stakes Final, it put him in a difficult situation. Even though the 3-year-old had won his elimination race impressively, the Messenger has an open draw, and post 8 at Yonkers is winning at 4 per cent. And, that number might be somewhat inflated because of the mile and a quarter trot races. In the one-mile races, post 8 is brutal.

And so it started the usual debate: maybe the winner's of the eliminations should be able to choose their own post for the final. Well, that's been tried before. When they used it for the Hambletonian for several years in a row, it resulted in some of the most boring Hambletonians in the history of the race, as the heavy favorite gunned to the early lead from the inside and the race was over.

Personally, I think that all elimination races should be non-betting events, and all finals should have an open draw.

But I have to say, when I saw all of the various opinions about the Messenger, I had to laugh. To use an old saying, here we go again, putting the cart before the horse. The problem has nothing to do with how you draw the entries, or even how you race the eliminations.

The problem is the speed and post bias! I guess I'm older than a lot of folks but I remember plenty of horses winning stakes races, and handicap races, from post 8 at Yonkers, and other half-mile tracks. I know, because I used to bet post 8 a lot... before the speed bias started. Post 8 wins about half as often as it did when we raced in wood bikes.

Should we try to fix the problem by creating another problem? Why not just fix the speed and post position bias? Race them longer than a mile, or start the race farther back, or go back to the slower bikes, or something. But let's not continue to make things worse, and believe me, if you let the winner's of the elimination races pick their post, they'll get post 1 and the race will be over sixty feet after it starts. And the fans will continue to find some other sport to get them excited.
