# Catskills COVID crisis finally over

Local horsepeople are relieved Monticello Raceway will reopen on Monday after being dark to racing for six months while its casino was closed.

Harness racing's crisis in the Catskills is finally over.

According to Monticello Harness Horsemen's Association (MHHA) general counsel Joe Faraldo, based upon a gentlemen's agreement, Monticello Raceway will reopen on Monday (Sept. 21).

Faraldo said he expects the official agreement to be signed this week and in his personal opinion, there is a direct correlation between the reopening of the casino and the reopening of the track.

"I believe that someone said to them, 'We're not going to let you open unless you're going to have some sort of agreement with these horsemen," Faraldo said. "Because the attitude that we were facing went 180 [degrees]."

Meghan Taylor, vice president of government affairs and community relations for Genting New York State, which owns Empire Resorts, the operator of Monticello Raceway, provided the following statement:

"The Monticello Raceway has a long and storied history in the Catskills, and we are excited to reopen the track in the coming days. The reopening of Monticello marks another important milestone in moving New York forward and we are extremely fortunate to have the support of the community and our local and state leaders as the region's economy begins to recover."

Monticello held qualifiers yesterday (Sept. 14) and is scheduled to hold more if needed today (Sept. 15). When racing resumes next week, they're expected to go back to their usual four days a week, nine races a day, provided they can fill the races.

"I know one thing: those guys are all chomping on the bit to go," Faraldo said.

One reason the Monti horsemen are raring to go is because they were sidelined longer than any other track in North America.

"[The other tracks] hadn't raced for three months and we haven't raced for six months," said Jim Doherty Jr., one of the top trainers at the Mighty M.

Doherty, who grew up in the business as the son of Hall of Fame trainer Jim Doherty, had about 23 or 24 horses stabled at Monticello Raceway when the coronavirus pandemic closed the track in mid-March.

Doherty tries to structure his stable so that his horses pay for themselves. He doesn't keep a horse in the barn if it can't pay its way, but when COVID-19 shut everyone down, his system didn't matter anymore.

"I had one guy who owned 100 per cent of a horse. He did it for a few months and he said, 'Listen I can't do it anymore,' and he sold the horse and I don't blame him," Doherty said.

Doherty was lucky to keep most of his horses, thanks in no small part to help given out by the MHHA.

President of the MHHA, Alan Schwartz, said it was a no brainer to him, when this pandemic hit, that his group had to look out for their own. As a former marine who served in Vietnam, Schwartz knows all about looking out for his band of brothers.

"These guys will have absolutely no money coming in and a lot of them struggled when they were racing," Schwartz said. "How are they going to care for the horses when they're not racing?"

The MHHA paid for all the feed, hay and straw during this period, so the horsemen stabled at the track wouldn't have out of pocket expenses.

Horsemen also received some financial support in the form of a total of three stimulus checks to the grooms, drivers and trainers.

"If we hadn't received those funds and that help, I wouldn't have been able to have 20 horses six months down the road," Doherty said. "I would have had to sell one every couple of weeks to support my employees and feed my remaining horses. I'd probably have five horses or seven horses now."

In addition, the Monti horsemen also had some food donated to them thanks to owners and amateur drivers, David Yarock, Mal Burroughs and Bob Krivelin.

Yarock is the president of the GSY Amateur Racing Club, which created a scholarship fund in 2008 and has given away over \$200,000.

"This year, instead of scholarships we gave out aid, because people had other issues," Yarock said. "They needed to survive."

Yarock reached out to Krivelin, a food distributor, who sells food to restaurants, universities and hotels, among others.

"[My business] was down 75 per cent at that point and I didn't know whether I was going to survive, but I knew that the people in Monticello were in worse shape than me," Krivelin said.

In addition to Yarock, Krivelin said he was also contacted by Hambletonian-winning driver Burroughs.

"I said, 'Can I help?' He said 'Sure. Send me some money and I'll buy some food and give it to them," Burroughs said. "[Monticello] is where I started with Distant Thunder and Bones Vaughn. That was my home base for a few years."

Even though Krivelin wants to give all the credit to Yarock and Burroughs, it should be pointed out that he offered the food at cost in addition to donating some himself.

"I felt it was important to help them as much as I possibly could because I love the industry and I've had a lot of luck and a lot of fun," Krivelin said.

Once racing was allowed to reopen in New York and neighboring states, things unfortunately did not get better for those at Monticello since their track remained closed and they were not welcome elsewhere.

To be fair, some of the Monticello horses weren't good enough to race at the other tracks, but for trainers like Doherty – who had horses that could compete elsewhere – it was very difficult.

"Many tracks had local preference for the first 30 days when they reopened and then they would only take entries as needed," Doherty said. "So, I would enter half a dozen horses and maybe one of them would get in and it wouldn't be every week."

"It was very difficult not being able to race at other tracks even when they didn't have a full field of horses," said owner Adam Friedland. "You're not even filling your card and you won't let us race?"

Driver Bruce Aldrich and his fiancée, trainer Laura Perino, said the whole experience for them was very stressful.


"It's been six months of working on them every day for nothing, for no money because they didn't have the chance to earn any," Aldrich said. "I'm just glad it's over."

# It's 24/7 horses for the multi-talented Alexis Schwartz

Alexis Schwartz's life in horse racing has been, at every stop along the way, a perfect fit.

A fourth-generation horsewoman who grew up in the industry, the 22-year-old native of Court House, OH has spent time working in both the standardbred and thoroughbred

industries, taking on numerous roles in each.

Currently, Schwartz is working for the United States Trotting Association (USTA) in Westerville, OH.

"Right now, I have multiple jobs," started Schwartz. "I'm working at the USTA – I was hired in January after I graduated the University of Kentucky [majoring in Equine Science and Management] – in the members' services department. I do all of the paperwork for the members. My dad [owner/trainer Bret] also has a racing stable of his own – we have 20 horses, give or take. With COVID, now that I'm working at home, I go into the barn at six every morning, and clean out stalls. I come back home at eight and then start my work with USTA and finish around 4:30. After that, I go to the track and paddock, or go to the barn and finish up what I started in the morning."

Schwartz has also worked in the thoroughbred world, including as a BETologist at Keeneland Race Course in Lexington, KY.

Fans, usually those new to betting or race-goers seeking

expert picks for the day, can book a BETologist through the track's website.

"I worked at Keeneland, on and off for the four years I was at the University of Kentucky. I was a BETologist and it was really awesome to be able to interact with people at the racetrack. It was unique in that you got to meet so many people – some who aren't even from the U.S. I helped break some language barriers, and helped teach them some new things. Seeing their excitement during the races was something I'll never forget."

Schwartz also won't soon forget another job she had at the racetrack.

She was happy to dress for the part.

Literally.

"There was also a kids' club I was involved at in Keeneland," said Schwartz, who worked in client relations [helping at yearling sales, etc.] in her last year at the racetrack. "Believe it or not, I was their mascot, Buckles. I got to be in a mascot uniform from time-to-time. It's something I want to do eventually in the standardbred world, to make a kids' club / youth club, to get younger people involved in the sport."

Schwartz is grateful what her standardbred and thoroughbred experiences taught her.

"All of what I've done has been so helpful and educational. I worked in the barns for thoroughbreds and in the office as well. I've had my hand in a lot of different things. I was nervous to work with thoroughbreds because you hear that they are so high-strung compared to standardbreds. But, honestly, when I was interning and working at a farm, there really wasn't much difference in the horses' nature. The way they're prepped is different than standardbreds, but I didn't see that many differences.

"I took care of the broodmare strands and foaled a lot of mares out. I even got to take those mares to the breeding farm to get bred, and I was able to see American Pharoah [the 12thTriple Crown winner in U.S. thoroughbred history] and Justify [the 13thTriple Crown champion], both of whom were in the breeding shed. That was a once-in-a-lifetime experience. I have to say I've been really blessed to do everything that I've done in racing."

Being around horses has been a big part of her life for as long as he can remember.

One look at her family tree provides the foundation behind her love of all things equine.

Her great-grandfather purchased his first horse, Zip And

Zap, with her grandfather and father. The son of Ohio-bred pacer Nobleland Sam won his first start with them at the Coshocton County Fair on Oct. 2, 2006.

It was Zip And Zap that kick-started a harness racing love affair for the family, a bond to the sport that remains strong to this day.

"I owned my first horse when I was five," said Schwartz.
"Her name was Spongebob Alexis. My dad, when I was little, he let me rename all the horses. There was Lexis Cruiser, Lexis Dreamer... what can I say? Dad let me have that job when I was little."

As it turns out, Schwartz was no one-trick pony.

More than 15 years after her horse-naming exploits, it wouldn't be that far-fetched to say Schwartz, whoalso helps her grandfather Dr. Robert Schwartz, a veterinarian with Midland Acres, on his farm calls, seemingly works nearly 24/7.

In fact, it would be quite appropriate for the woman whose career goal is to become an equine pharmaceutical sales representative.

But she wouldn't have it any other way.

"In high school, I had other priorities, things I was heavily involved in, so that took away from more time spent with the horses. I was playing basketball and softball year-round, but I still managed to sneak out to the fairs when dad was racing, helping him out any way I could. What can I say? The horses have always been a huge part of my life. They still are and I know they always will be."

It's why she agrees, accompanied by a laugh, that a majority of free time outside of horses and horse racing is dedicated to just what one would expect: horses and horse racing.

A certain flair for fashion is a prime example.

"Recently, I've started this little side business of making shirts. Of course, it comes back to horse racing. I'm making stable shirts for people. In high school, I was really big into my art classes and I really enjoyed printing. Since the whole thing with COVID started, I've had a little bit of down time during the day, and I thought, 'I'm just going to splurge and buy the stuff to make some shirts.' It would be cheaper to do it on my own, so I could make gear for our barn. When I first did it, I didn't anticipate selling a bunch. I thought it would be for our own personal use. But people saw what I put on Facebook and it just took off."

One more reason as to why horse racing continues to suit Alexis Schwartz to a tee.



# Goshen Yearling Sale almost on par with 2019 despite pandemic

Sale average declined just 1.3 per cent despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. Cameo Hills was the top consignor and sold the sale topper, Yes Indeed, who fetched \$46,000 from Erv Miller.

The Goshen Yearling Sale was held at the Mark Ford Training Center on Monday (Sept. 14) and despite year-long challenges the industry has faced due to COVID-19 restrictions, a brisk host of buyers nearly matched the average price per horse realized from last year's record sale.

"I didn't know what to expect this year due to the pandemic, but I was very pleased with the way it all worked out," said Mark Ford. "We took fewer horses this year due to social distancing but the quality was there and the prices proved that. There was strong bidding all day and a good amount was purchased in the \$30,000 range. At the end of the day I think we had a lot of happy buyers."

Cameo Hills Farm was the top consignor with the highest average sale price for their 13-horse consignment (\$24,462) that included the sales topper, pacing colt (Hip 32) Yes Indeed (Huntsville-Please Me Please) who was purchased for \$46,000 by Erv Miller.

The 86 yearlings that went across the block commanded an average price of \$14,767 versus \$14,964 in 2019 with the total gross for the sale just under \$1.3 million. In 2019, the sale grossed over \$1.6 million for 107 yearlings sold, 21 more than this year. The 2019 gross was up some 15 per cent from the 2018 sale.

This year, 32 pacing colts averaged \$15,750 each, 28 pacing fillies averaged \$13,464 each, 12 trotting colts averaged \$16,292 each and 14 trotting fillies brought an average of \$13,821 each.

Once again, Cameo Hills Farm was the top consignor with the highest average sale price for their 13-horse consignment (\$24,462) that included the sales topper. That was pacing colt (Hip 32) Yes Indeed (Huntsville—Please Me Please) who was purchased for \$46,000 by Erv Miller.

Cameo Hills also sold pacing colt (Hip 27) Just Mercy (Huntsville—Pardon) purchased by Jim DeArmond for \$36,000, trotting colt (Hip 26) Harvey Two Face (Chapter Seven—New Sensation) who was sold to Steve Pratt for \$30,000 and pacing colt (Hip 84) El Pistolero (Huntsville-Discoverer) who went to Robert Sholes, also for \$30,000.

Winbak Farm's 37 yearlings were headed by trotting filly (Hip 35) Bak A Winner (Credit Winner—Roberta's Fantasy) who brought \$28,000 from John Ball. They also sold pacing filly (Hip 78) Clear The Way (Bolt The Duer-Clara) for \$24,000 to John Como Jr.

Blue Chip Farm's top money-getter from its five-head consignment was the pacing colt (Hip 21) Faith In Joe (Roll With Joe-Blind Faith) who was purchased by Paul O'Mara for \$22,000.

"I can't say enough about the good people at Cattle In Motion, who ran the online bidding and video," Ford said. "They were phenomenal; the best in their business. They were very efficient, very professional and they made the entire sale better than it has ever been. I believe this was the first standardbred sale to take online bids and I felt it went very smoothly considering it's never been done before. We look forward to working with them much more in the future."

About \$200,000 of the total sales came from online bidding, which is a very solid number given the first time it's been offered. Plus all the early feedback from those who used the new format was very positive.

# Creating a Zoom Room to grow raceways' virtual betting audience

First, I offer a disclaimer. I have no personal or financial interests in Zoom Video Communications, Inc. (ZVC), nor am I receiving any recompense from ZVC or anyone connected to promoting the product by spotlighting the use of Zoom in the text that follows. Anything Alternative Actions (AA) suggests in this article is done so in the interest of attracting business to pari-mutuel harness racing venues.

When Eric Yuan founded ZVC, he scrounged for financial support because investors thought the video-telephony market was saturated. ZVC produced Zoom, a cloud-based peer-to-peer software platform for teleconferencing, telecommuting, distance education and social relations. Yuan marketed Zoom claiming it is easier to use than its competitors' products, as well as it has a high degree of employee efficiency. Still, ZVC existed for a few years with no significant cash on hand.

All of that changed in 2020, due to the unfortunate circumstances provided by the COVID-19 pandemic. As countries went on lockdown, Zoom usage experienced huge global increases from quarantine measures, scooping 2.22 million users. By March 2020, the Zoom app was downloaded 2.13 million times, with average users rising to over 300 million daily. ZVC's stock went from less than \$70 per share to \$150 per share and by June 2020 the company was valued at over \$67 billion.

It is no stretch of the imagination that for the rest of 2020, at least, everyone, working remotely independently or with a company or organization, has and uses the Zoom app. It is September 2020; maybe it is time harness raceways utilize Zoom to incite customers and attract more bettors; maybe it is time to create a raceway Zoom Room.

AA proposes a basic idea a raceway could develop — an idea centered on keeping veteran bettors involved in wagering on harness racing and attracting new bettors to the sport at your raceway.

On their simulcasting feeds, in-house broadcasts and ADW platforms, every raceway offers racing picks for their betting programs, mostly using the track's public relations staff. These are, as commonly noted, the "experts." However, with all due respect to those of us that share our handicapping experiences on pari-mutuel wagering theaters, anyone betting on horse races has an opinion about what is going to happen in any particular race — and most are willing to share those opinions.

Let's face it, in terms of handicapping, the title of "expert" is negotiable; after all, no one has to pass a test or get a license to tout horse racing probabilities. That being true, a raceway (like our fictional Delaney Downs) could spotlight members of its betting audience "into the Delaney Downs Zoom Room, where he or she or they add their expertise to that of the track's usual handicapping suspects — via Zoom.

There should be no wanting for participants in your Zoom Room, considering the Zoom app has become a fixture on just about every digital gadget this side of science fiction. As well, with Zoom, a broadcast could include as many audience handicappers as it cares to collect. Zoom provides a near-infinite number of participating talking heads at once.

Think of it; what better group of people exists than racehorse handicappers to pontificate punting using their personal perspectives? Nowhere else in public life do personal opinions incubate more than they do in a pari-mutuel betting atmosphere where the question, "Who do you like?" gets more attention than shouting "fire" in a crowded theater.

The timing is perfect, too, since raceway attendance has gone from "actual" to "virtual" and no one has any idea when raceway aprons and grandstands will once again host live audiences. Even when warm bodies return to the track, there will still be hoards of people available to attend your Zoom Room, since, due to Zoom's popularity and its global reach, bettors can be situated anywhere on the planet to appear real-time on a Delaney Downs Zoom Room show. As long as they have something to say about your local races, bring them on.

Let your PR people coordinate ways to let the word out that your Zoom Room is open and scout for guests from your audience. Your regular on-air broadcast crew should promote it aggressively and humbly. Write a script they use, telling bettors things like, "We know so many of our bettors are terrific handicappers and we would like them to "share and compare" their picks with us on a broadcast in the [Delaney Downs] Zoom Room..."

Paying attention to anyone adding scratch to your betting pools is of utmost importance, as AA emphasizes with every scheme it insinuates. With a Zoom Room, your track is acknowledging more than the business your customers provide, it is respecting how they think by requesting their expertise, raising them to the stature of the professionals paid to do the same things.

# Fighting Evil gets lifetime mark in Keystone Classic

**Fighting Evil** launched the decisive move past the three-quarters and rolled home in a career-best 1:52.2 in Tuesday's (Sept. 15) Keystone Classic at The Meadows. **Darby Hanover** took the other split in the \$79,900 stake for freshman filly pacers.

Sniper Hanover opened up a sizable lead after three-quarters but was no match for the rally of Fighting Evil, who overwhelmed her in the lane and held off Peep N Weep by a head for Mike Wilder. Ocean's Apart completed the ticket.

"This filly just loves to chase," said Dane Snyder, who trains the daughter of Sweet Lou-Evil Fight — a \$12,000 yearling acquisition — for Danielle Snyder and Jason Ash. "She's not very big herself, but she has a big heart. She has one more

race this year — the Standardbred at Delaware. She's little, and she needs some rest."

Although Darby Hanover was forced to a :27.4 opening panel to reach the point, she had little trouble thereafter, cruising home for Andy Miller and trainer Julie Miller in 1:53.1. Natchez Belle was second, beaten 2-1/2 lengths, with Lady Newton third.

"When she came back to me at the half, she relaxed, so I felt all right from there on," Andy Miller said. "She's putting together a pretty nice year, and she has a few more races to go. She'll probably go to the Liberty Bell next. We might try a big race later in the year."

The daughter of Betting Line—Darena Hanover has finished in the money in all seven career starts for owners Andy Miller Stable and Carroll Huffman.

In the \$84,000 Keystone Classic for freshmen trotting fillies, this year's Pennsylvania Stallion Series champion, **Love Muffin**, was out to extend her winning streak to three — and she did just that with a front-end victory in 1:56.2 for Jim Pantaleano, trainer David Wiest and owners Edward Kimmel and Don Wiest. Long shot Cheesy Hanover was 2-3/4 lengths back in second with the first-over Frankly My Dear third.

Although the daughter of Andover Hall—Pine Yankee has been ahead at every call in her current streak, David Wiest indicated she actually prefers chasing.

"She'd do better off the pace, but she's that quick off the gate," he said. "She has two more races this year, both at Chester."

In the other split, Julie and Andy Miller teamed up again to triumph with **Pub Crawl** who, on paper, at least appeared to lay over the field. The 1-5 favorite did nothing to dispel that notion, jogging in 1:56.1 and defeating Keystone Barracuda by 4 lengths. Myreanna earned show.

"She's been racing some pretty good fillies, and she found a little better spot today," Andy Miller said. "She still has quite a few races to go. We'll probably go to the Liberty Bell next."

The daughter of Bar Hopping—Myth now has banked \$132,763 for Andy Miller Stable, Louis Willinger, Kapildeo Singh and Phillip Helmuth.

## Four Wheelin three-for-three in Grassroots action

**Four Wheelin** scored his third Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots win at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Monday (Sept. 14) and wrapped up the regular season atop the 2-year-old trotting colt standings with a perfect total of 150 points.

"I like the way he's coming on. He seems like he's getting stronger every start," said trainer Marcel Barrieau. "Talking to Louis-Philippe he said, 'Geez, it never took nothing out of him, he was strong right to the end,' so that's a good sign."

Louis-Philippe Roy piloted Four Wheelin to the front-stepping victory from Post 4. The fan favorites put up fractions of :28.3, :59.2 and 1:29 on their way to a three length victory in a personal best 1:57.1, the fastest of the three \$23,000 Grassroots divisions. Pocket-sitter Rosies War Bonds finished second and Tymal Chrome was third.

Barrieau shares ownership of Four Wheelin with Gestion Mastel Inc. of Longueil, QC. In six career starts Four Wheelin has not missed a check. In addition to his trio of Grassroots victories, the Wheeling N Dealin son delivered two fourth-place efforts against the Gold Series colts and was third in an Aug. 11 overnight at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"He wasn't always strong. My other colt was stronger than him, Stoked Blue Chip, and it's funny, when I got back to Canada after Florida they just turned around, this one got stronger and the other one got weaker," said Barrieau. "That's one thing I've learned, you can't tell training or nothing. When you put them behind the gate, that's when you find out what you've got."

Stoked Blue Chip delivered a third-place effort in the second Grassroots division to finish the regular season with 45 points and give Barrieau two colts in the top 20. The top 20 point earners advance to the Oct. 1 Grassroots

Semi-Finals, with the top five finishers earning a berth in the \$75,000 Grassroots Championship on Oct. 10 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Stoked Blue Chip finished seven lengths behind **Highland Mowgli**, who also delivered a commanding front-end performance. Starting from Post 3 with Yannick Gingras in the race bike, Highland Mowgli took command from Rocketing just after the :28.2 quarter and then rolled through a :58.2 half and 1:28.2 three-quarters on the way to a 1:58.1 victory. Kilauea finished second, six lengths behind the fan favorite.

Gingras crafted the win for trainer Amanda Fine of Guelph and her co-owner Highland Thoroughbred Farm of Inglewood, ON. The win was the Archangel son's first in eight tries and was doubly satisfying for his owners, who were not sure the colt would ever make it to the races let alone win an OSS event.

"He got really, really sick and we just weren't sure if he was even going survive. He was really that sick," said Fine of the rocky start to Highland Mowgli's 2-year-old year. "He's pretty special to us all."

After his recovery, Fine said Highland Mowgli was babied through the spring, but still managed to qualify in time for the first leg of the OSS program. The colt made his debut at the Gold Series level and logged one fourth and one second before Fine opted to drop him down to the Grassroots. In his Aug. 25 debut in the Grassroots program, Highland Mowgli finished second to Four Wheelin, so he heads into the post season in eighth spot with 75 points.

The final division went to **Lifelong Wish**, who also started his career with a pair of Gold Series starts before joining the Grassroots program in the fourth leg. The fan favorite, with Mike Saftic in the race bike, left smartly from Post 5 and powered through fractions of :27.4, :57.4 and 1:27.3 before digging in down the stretch for a narrow victory in a personal best 1:58. Moscow Moon was a head back in second and Insanity was one length back in third.

"He gets a little excited so Mike tried to back him off, but he didn't want to. He thought he would be a little bit quieter leaving the gate, but once he got there it wasn't happening," said trainer Pam Forgie, who shares ownership of the gelding with Donald Sholdice of Brussels, ON. "He might have got a little bit tired at the end there, but that was a big effort, front end trip the whole way. He doesn't like to give up, that is for sure. He sticks it out to the end, he is tough that way."

The win was the Royalty For Life son's second straight in Grassroots action, giving him 100 points and a share of fourth in the standings.
