The enduring legend of The Thin Man

Interviewing 96-year-old legend Keith Waples is a dream assignment. The multiple Hall of Famer has had a profound impact on a huge number of the sport's greats — though you won't hear Waples talk about that.

TALES FROM THE CURMUDGEON with MURRAY BROWN

The first recollection I have of Keith Waples was of him driving an overnight trotter by the name of Ben Boy somewhere in the early '60s at Richelieu Park.

Ben Boy had previously won the Maple Leaf Trot in 1954 for Ruth Wray of Schomberg, ON, the mother of well-known Canadian racing participants Joanne and Jack Wray, but by the time I saw him he was just a solid overnighter.

Back then, harness racing was well covered by the leading Montreal English speaking newspaper *The Montreal Star*. The Star had two writers — Baz O'Meara and Elmer Ferguson — who not only covered the sport well, but also were avid fans of it.

The French-speaking Montreal newspapers, specifically *Montreal Matin* and later *le Journal de Montreal* covered it far more thoroughly. It wasn't unusual to see three or four full pages devoted to racing, most of it to Blue Bonnets Raceway or Richelieu Park, whichever one was racing at the time.

Their leading harness racing writers Jacques Beauchamp and Bob Chicoine were also great fans of the sport.

Back then, Keith Waples was the man or more specifically "The Thin Man" as he had been named by O'Meara.

There were all the other drivers and there was Keith Waples at the summit.

It is no accident that he is a member of both the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame and the Harness Racing Living Hall of Fame at Goshen. Both honors, and several others including the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame, were also well earned.

I was privileged to have a conversation with the soon-to-be-97-year-old legend this past week.

Knowing of Keith's aversion to publicity, especially publicity relating to himself, I figured there was little or no chance that I'd get to speak with him, especially as a "journalist."

I have known him for over 50 years, but never as someone who was to be a subject of a story. Heck, I'd never even written stories with anything resembling regularity until last year. I never considered myself to be a writer. For the record, I'm not sure that even now I am.

I'd see Waples at Harrisburg most years. We'd talk for a little while. We would sometimes reminisce a little. He'd ask

me if there was a particular yearling I liked, but that was about it.

A little over a month ago, I had a conversation with a friend who asked me why I hadn't done a story on Keith Waples. "The man is a living legend," he said. "You owe it to history to do it."

Of course he was right. In terms of being a legend, he, Herve Filion and John Simpson Sr were the most legendary people of the sport I had been privileged to have a relationship with.

The question hit me as though he were asking, "Why hadn't I taken a spaceship to Mars." I would love to do both, but the chances of either transpiring were probably about the same.

Then I got to thinking "Why not?"

Enter Karen Hauver, Keith's daughter who is a friend of mine on Facebook. I sent Karen a note on Messenger asking if she thought that there was a chance that her dad would be receptive to the idea.

Karen agreed with me that people of this generation were mostly unaware of what a great influence her father had on the sport and more specifically as a teaching model for many young drivers. His history should not be left behind.

Karen said that she had her doubts, but she agreed to ask him. A day later, I received a note from her telling me that



not only had he agreed to speak with me but that she really hadn't even had to coax him too much.

Was I ever excited! Here I am an old guy of 79 and I'm as excited as a young hockey fan getting to spend time with Bobby Orr.

How to start? How about at the beginning? I mentioned to him that I had heard that he had first jogged his first horse at the age of 4 and had won his first race at the age of 12. He said that the former might have been a slight exaggeration, but that in fact he had won his first race at the age of 12 driving a free-legged pacer named Grey Ghost.

I asked which was the best horse he had ever driven, expecting the answer to be Tie Silk, Strike Out or Mighty Dudley, the first horse to break the 2:00 barrier in Canada.

It was none of the three, but rather Silver Almahurst which he acquired at the age of 67 and who went on to earn over a million dollars and became his first sub-150 performer.

We talked a little about the three horses I was most familiar with.

"Mighty Dudley, who I co-owned with Jacques Girard was a good horse, but he wasn't as good as he is generally given credit for being, due to that first 2:00 mile in Canada. Champ Volo, who I was racing at about the same time, was better and more consistent. He was a real warrior who always came prepared to race.

"Strike Out was about as handy and well-mannered a horse as any I've ever driven. You could do anything with him. His versatility and great manners made him a lot of money.

"Tie Silk was a top trotter, maybe not a great one, but very good. Things worked out for us on the evening of the International Trot. Su Mac Lad was the heavy favorite, but we managed to get a decent trip and I went by at the end."

I remarked that I had watched the replay of that

International Trot (available here) very shortly before speaking with him. The one thing that stood out to me was that while Stanley Dancer driving Su Mac Lad was furiously whipping and flailing, that Keith never used the whip once on Tie Silk. Keith's response was that I was giving him undue credit.

"Tie Silk was a horse that you couldn't get results from if you used the whip. If you hit him, he would stop trying."

Nevertheless of the many hundreds of times I saw Keith Waples drive I rarely saw him use the whip. When he did, it wasn't used to any great degree.

When he had Tie Silk, he was the contract trainer/driver for the Miron Brothers, then by far the leading racing stable in Canada and one of the most powerful in all of North America.

"It was a great opportunity to be associated with so many good horses and it was certainly good for the pocketbook, but the lifestyle was not for me. I quess I was essentially a

homebody. I like to sleep in my own bed, get up in the morning and have a purpose. I wanted to be able to supervise my horses, take care of them, not be traveling around from racetrack to racetrack and city to city every day. I suppose that's probably the main reason why I never took my whip and colors to the New York tracks. I guess at heart I'm a country boy."


Keith, there was a time in the '70s where you really cut down on your racing activities and went into racetrack ownership and management.

"From a financial standpoint it was very rewarding. Jim Keeling was a long-time owner and friend He was a great person and a great businessman. He invited me to be his partner along with Doug Gillespie of Owen Sound. Our first venture was in building Orangeville Raceway which became quite successful.

"Then we expanded out west to British Columbia and opened Cloverdale Raceway(now Fraser Downs) and Sandown Park. Jim's son, Tony, was also a huge factor in those enterprises.

"We did well on those ventures, but I missed the horses and went back to them. I felt an emptiness in my life not working with horses each day. I doubt that there has ever been a time in my life since then when I didn't have an involvement with a horse or more than one."

(Unbeknownst to Keith someone posted a YouTube video

of the then 95-year-old training a 1:57 mile at First Line Training Center in 2018).

Keith, I know that by nature you are a quiet and unassuming person who is quite reluctant to blow his own horn, but saying that, do you have any idea of the great esteem in which you are held by virtually anybody who has had any contact with you? Names like Filion, Lachance, Chapman, Gilmour, Wellwood, Feaqan, Kopas, Dostie, Hayes and numerous others.

As perhaps would be expected, Keith's response was no response. As I said above, he is not one to blow his own horn.

If I were asked, other than his great skills as a horseman how would I best describe Keith Waples. The one word I would use would be "teacher."

But Keith Waples is not a teacher in the usual sense, that is, by instruction. He is a teacher by setting example. As his cousin, Ronnie Waples said to me the other day, "I worked for Keith and his brother Murray for over 10 years. He didn't tell me how I should do things. But if you followed him and did things like he did, both on and off the racetrack, you would learn a great deal."

I asked Keith about some of the sometimes verbose characters such as John Hayes and J. Russell Miller with whom he had been associated.

"I preferred to let them do most of the talking. I did the listening. They were both very good horsemen. John Hayes had a knack for picking out good horses. I really appreciated him giving me the chance to drive Strike Out, especially in his win in the Little Brown Jug. Russ Miller was a brilliant man who would have been successful in anything that he attempted." (video here).

What was your greatest skill as a driver?

"I suppose it would be that I rarely would allow myself to become rattled. Knowing the horse and patience would also be very important."

What do you think about the lean-back style used by many of today's drivers.

"I've never been against progress. I suppose the theory behind it is that it cuts down wind resistance. If I were driving today and I felt that it would help me win more races, I'd certainly give it a try and adapt to it if necessary."

In the few days before writing this story I reminisced about some of what I knew about Keith from other horsemen and from some who I spoke with recently.

Herve Filion - One of my first recollections about harness racing's Babe Ruth was that in his late teens and early 20s he so admired Keith Waples, that before every race card he

would go to the judge's stand and carefully watch the films (no video then) of every race that Keith Waples had been in the evening before. It was from these viewings that Herve picked up the ability previously only done by Waples to somehow pick up the bike a few inches in order to quickly create space for him and his horse.

Ronnie Waples - "To a very large degree, everything that I achieved in harness racing was learned in the 10 years or so that I worked for Keith and his brother Murray. If you watched and listened to what Keith said you had to learn. Here's a funny story that I remember. I was just starting to achieve a little success as a driver. One night I won three races on a single card. That was incredible to me. Here I was all pumped up and so pleased with myself. After the races, I came back to the tack room to change. Keith was sitting there. I expected him to say something about my three wins. 'Ronnie,' he finally said, 'Make sure the horses' water buckets are filled before you leave.' Little did I know that three wins, weren't all that much to a man who had previously, on three occasions, won nine races on a single card."

Mike Lachance - "Plain and simple, Keith Waples is the greatest horseman that I've ever seen and known. Maybe the numbers don't tell it, but to have seen and learned by watching him, I've never known a horseman who was as great a combination of a driver and trainer as he was."





John Kopas - "Keith is a man without a single shred of jealousy in his entire being. He was especially generous in his praise and support for any young people trying to make a future in the sport. I remember after winning my first race in 1974, he was the very first person to congratulate me. If a horse was capable of leaving the gate, he could get there as quick as anybody I've ever seen. He could drive in any manner — from in front, from behind. It depended on the individual horse and its competition. My dad and he were great friends. They shared many great times together, but on the racetrack generally friendship was forgotten."

Fred Grant - "Keith was very kind and generous to people, especially young people. I remember back in the '70s he was racing his stable at Blue Bonnets. He asked me if I would

keep him company on the hundred or so mile ride to Rideau Carleton Raceway where he had three colts racing in two divisions of the Canadian Juvenile Circuit. Would I? Of course. Spending a few hours with Keith Waples, who would turn that down? He said that I might as well bring my colors along to help him warm up. He won with the two favorites of the three, but I was shocked to find that he had put me down to drive the other part of his entry in one of the divisions. Imagine, me a young kid being put down to catch drive one for Keith Waples. When I asked him about it he said, 'I wasn't going to give you a free ride to Ottawa without making you work for it."

What does the future hold for Keith Waples?

"I guess I've slowed down some. I'm going to be 97 on December 8. My wife Eileen and I are still planning to go to Florida for the winter. I'll probably have a couple in training with Gregg McNair and hope to get up to see them occasionally. I've been one of the very lucky ones. I've lived a very good life."

When heavy favorite Ready For Moni make a break in deep stretch, Chestnut Hill zipped up the inside to victory in the \$560,000 final at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

A scramble finish with multiple breakers saw Chestnut Hill at 60-1 shoot up the rail to a stunning victory in the \$560,000 Canadian Trotting Classic on Saturday (Sept. 19) at Woodbine Mohawk Park (replay here)

All eyes were on heavy-favorite Ready For Moni in the rich event for 3-year-old trotters. The Nancy Takter trainee and driver Yannick Gingras made the front in the second-quarter

and appeared poised to close out the victory coming down the lane, but a rare miscue in the final eighth opened the door for several closing rivals.

Chestnut Hill and driver Andrew McCarthy had been following along sixth and had ducked down to the rail for his late bid. The 'Nifty' Norman trainee was full of trot late and somehow was able to avoid losing all momentum when

squeezing by the breaking Ready For Moni, reaching up by half a length in 1:53.2.


"Pretty close," said McCarthy when asked about how close he was to danger when avoiding the breaking horse. "I kind of yelled out to let Yannick (Gingras) know there was someone on the inside of him.

"It worked out that he heard me and didn't want to crash into me, so he did a good job getting that horse out of the way safely... and I got to sneak up there."

Play Trix On Me made a first-up bid on the far turn and nearly came through for the victory, finishing second in the middle of several rivals. HP Royal Theo was charging on the outside in the lane when he also made a break, finishing third placed sixth for a lapped on break.

Jula Trix Treasure was moved up to third, while Threefiftytwo jumped up to fourth.

A son of champions Muscle Hill and Poof Shes Gone, Chestnut Hill was coming into Saturday off a win in the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes consolation and now has three wins in 11 starts this season and five wins overall. The



"She was as good as ever tonight," said McCarthy. "She's just such an amazing filly, it's just an unbelievable experience to sit behind a horse like that.

"She never really got out of second gear tonight, just kind of worked her way to the front and never really had to ask her at all, she just did it pretty easy."

The Tony Alagna trainee watched early from fifth as Trina shot out to post a :27 opening-quarter before Warrawee Vicky cleared to the top. Sister Sledge quickly moved up to the lead in the second-quarter and just as quick was confronted by Sorella, stretching that rival out to a :55.1 half.



The victory capped a big night for driver Andrew McCarthy, who also won the Canadian Trotting Classic with Chestnut Hill and one of two Metro Pace elims with Abuckabett Hanover.




Ramona Hill got her cue to go just before the half and marched first-up around the far turn, overtaking Sorella by a pair of lengths at three-quarters in 1:23.1. The daughter of Muscle Hill out of Lock Down Lindy cruised home confidently with the earplugs still in to her sixth win in seven starts this season.

Sister Sledge got by Sorella to finish second, while Fortune Starlet was fourth.

Ramona Hill went over \$940,000 in seasonal earnings with the Elegantimage victory and now sports career numbers of 12 wins and \$1.3 million earned in 14 starts for owners Brad Grant, Crawford Farms Racing, Robert LeBlanc and In The Gym Partners.

"I've never won this race and it's on my bucket list being right in our own backyard," said Grant. "To have her here and really not know how good she is, as Andy said she was in second gear, so if that doesn't excite you I don't know what does."

Ramona Hill was bred by Crawford Farms and sold for \$70,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. She paid \$3.10 to win.



Owned by VIP Internet Stables, Falcon Racing and Paul Lang, Trillions Hanover was making her first start since finishing second in the Roses Are Red on Aug. 29. She's now earned over \$110,000 this season and sports career numbers of 12 wins and \$362,869 earned.

Ohio Select Jug Sale average up 17 per cent

The median was up \$3,000 from 2019, as well. Spring Haven Farm sold the sale topper for the sixth straight year as Springbridge Dragn was sold to Burke Racing for \$120,000.

Standardbreds by highly sought-after first-crop sires, coupled with a considerable increase in auction attendance, resulted in Friday's (Sept. 18) Ohio Selected Jug Sale enjoying a 17.4 per cent increase in average over last year's sale.

A total of 272 Ohio-bred yearlings passed through the sales ring at the Pickaway Agriculture and Event Center in Circleville, OH for a sales gross of \$6,709,000 resulting in an average price per yearling of \$24,665.

Prices were strong throughout the day as the median of \$20,000 gained \$3,000 from 2019. In addition to the strength and secure opportunities inherent in the Buckeye state harness racing program, a handful of first-crop sires significantly bolstered the coffers of the premier sale's flagship consignors.

As they have done for six years in a row, Jeff and Senena Esty's Spring Haven Farm sold the sale topper. Hip# 175, SPRINGBRIDGE DRAGN was hammered down to Burke Racing of Fredericktown, PA for \$120,000.

From Stonebridge Damsel p,1:53.2h (\$206,000), the half-brother to Springbridge Duel p,2,1:51.3-'20 (\$92,000) was by Midland Acres' sire Fear The Dragon. Also the co-breeder, Senena Esty was ecstatic following the sale.

"Our job is our hobby. It's our life... it's our love," said Esty.

"We bred this colt with our partners from Ontario, Dr. Cal Stiller and his wife Angie, and we couldn't be more thrilled."

Also one of the biggest consignors at the sale, Spring Haven sold over 50 horses for a gross of \$1.286 million.

"The success of this sale is shared across the board," Esty said. "These are our friends...and our family. The Ohio breeders are a close knit group. Many of the consignors that sold here today under their own banner, they also send horses with Spring Haven to sell in Lexington. We all root for each other."

Through much of the first half of the sale, the buzz was all about pacing yearlings sired by Downbytheseaside. Boasting an average over \$40,000 for 37 sold (\$44,833 for 24 colts), the son of Somebeachsomewhere had three colts bring \$100,000 each.

The first to break the six figure mark was Hip# 78, SEASIDE TEA TEA, when he was bought by Brian Brown for a cool \$100,000. The first colt from the Western Hanover mare Tea Pot Hanover p,3,1:52.3f (\$188,000), he was consigned by Albert and Mark Adams' Winterwood Farm, Agent.

Diamond Creek Farm, who manages the stallion career of Downbytheseaside, but stands him in at Sugar Valley Farm, Delaware, OH, consigned Hip#102, MOSCOW MITCH, the first foal from WICKED INTENTIONS p,4,1:53.1f (\$221,000), she from a half-sister to MYSTICAL MADDY p,4,1:50 (\$1.4 million). Greg Luther of Reynoldburg, OH signed the ticket.

Prominent breeder and racehorse owner Adam Bowden was quick to confirm his stallion's place in the hierarchy.

"This is the type of sale we thought that Downbytheseaside would have. They look the part and I think that people in Ohio, and outside of Ohio, are looking for this kind of horse. I don't think you can consider him a regional horse at this point," Bowden said.

In addition, Hip# 103, FIRE BY THE SEA sold for \$100,000 by Spring Haven Farm, Agent, for Enos Weaver, and was purchased by Brian Brown, Agent, Ostrander, OH.

The big numbers began with Ohio Standardbred breeding stalwart Midland Acres, who teamed up with Hanover Shoe Farms for this auction and sold Hip# 57, SEASIDE HANOVER, a Downbytheseaside half-brother to The Little Brown Jug heat winner WESTERN FAME p,1:48.1f (\$1,747,000) for

\$90,000 to Peter Wrenn, Agent, Carmel, IN.

Midland Acres also enjoyed success with two first crop sires: Fear The Dragon, with 33 sold that averaged \$26,700 (\$32,800 for 15 colts); and Long Tom, the son of Muscle Hill that had 17 go through the ring for an average of \$24,000 (\$27,750 for 10 colts).

Midland Acres also sold the most horses (64) of any consignor, for a gross of \$1.4 million, which included a dozen for Hanover Shoe Farms.

The highest priced trotter of the day was a colt by Long Tom that sold for \$80,000 to Dennis Owens, Hamilton, OH. Hip# 198, BAMBOO, was consigned by Anvil and Lace Farm, Agent, for Walstan Farm.

Another trotter with a great first showing was Hickory Lane's What The Hill, whose 44 colts and fillies averaged \$26,693, the highest of any trotter in the sale with more than three offered.

"From beginning to end it was just a very solid sale...all the way through the catalog. We were up nearly 20 per cent and it truly shows the steady growth we have had over the last five or six years," said Kevin Greenfield of Hickory Lane Horse Farm.

"The enthusiasm was off the charts. I have never seen a crowd as big as we have had in Ohio this year."

Ohio Harness Horse Breeders president Randy Haines of Cool Winds Farm agreed.

"The buyers clearly wanted the product we had to offer," Haines said. "The first crop stallions were extremely well-received. Ohio is a great place to race. The buyers were here in full force, and they showed that they were ready to pay good money for our product."

Explosive Matter mare wins \$105,000 German Derby

The \$105,000 German Derby for 3-year-old mares was held in Berlin on Saturday afternoon and Michael Nimczyk drove winner **Kyriad Newport** (Explosive Matter), but the duo was certainly not the winner when the field turned for home. Nimczyk, who represented Germany in the latest edition of World Drivers Championship in Sweden, served his horse a pocket trip and Kyriad Newport couldn't attack before 100 meters to go in the 1,900 meters long race.

The mile rate of 2:00.2 was enough to claim the big trophy and Kyriad Newport continues to show that she's got the right morale. The Derby win was the 3-year-old mare's fifth consecutive win. She has only lost one race in six attempts.

The \$215,000 German Derby is scheduled of today (Sep. 20) and it seems like Europe's winningest driver in history, Heinz Wewering, 70, has a great shot behind Arnold Mollema

trained Keytothehill (Quite Easy). Wewering has won over 16,900 races and grabbed the World Driving Championship title two times. It's 55 years since Heinz Wewering won his first race, according to **sulkysport.se** and today afternoon he chases his ninth win in the German Derby.

Gocciadoro wins all three Italian Derby elims

Three eliminations for the \$1 million Italian Derby for 3-year-olds were held in Rome on Saturday afternoon (Sept. 19) and Alessandro Gocciadoro was successful, to say the least, since he won all three races.

Gocciadoro had 10 horses in the eliminations card and began with **Boltigeur Erre** (Voltigeur de Myrt), who won after a pocket trip signed by Giampaolo Minucci. Gocciadoro's drive Babirussa Jet finished second from the lead and Baresi Effe, trained by Gocciadoro, took the bronze medal.

Bubble Effe (Nesta Effe), driven by Gocciadoro, took a safe wire to wire victory in the second elimination and stablemate Bigbusiness Ard finished second ahead of Belezebu' Jet.

Gocciadoro's third winner, **Bepi Bi** (Donato Hanover) had to do the heavy job outside of leader Bleff Dipa during the last mile of the 1.3 miles long race and in summary, Alessandro Gocciadoro has great chances to grab the prestigious Italian Derby once again. The "yellow" trainer won the Derby in his home country 2017 with Valchiria Op and 2018 with Zlatan.

Little Brown Jug odds n ends through the years

1. Dr. Ken Seeber won the 1989 Cane and Messenger with two different colts, but neither was in the Jug that year. **Cane**:

Dancing Master \$2.60 (Sandman Hanover was second as the 1-5 entry went 1-2). **Messenger**: Sandman Hanover \$8.60 (Dancing Master not in it). He 1-2 in the Cane, won the Messenger with his only entrant but was not in the Juq.

- 2. Tall Dark Stranger in 2020 joins the list of top colts NOT Jug bound that includes: Somebeachsomewhere (2008), Cam Fella (1982), Jennas Beach Boy (1995) and Captaintreacherous (2013).
- 3. Not once in the 1940s and 1960s did the Jug-winning driver also drive another sophomore in the Jug that same day. The year 1957 was the only time in the first 25 editions that it happened at all. John Simpson, Sr. won it with Horse of the Year Torpid, but also handled Nyland Hanover (6th) that same day.

It became commonplace after that for winning drivers to have multiple Juq horses.

- 4. From 1982-1988 Bill O'Donnell had 19 Jug drives, eight wins, three seconds, a couple of thirds and no missed checks, winning back-to-back finals with Nihilator and Barberry Spur in 1985 and 1986.
- 5. The 1992-1999 Meadowlands Pace winners seemed to take it on the chin come Jug time.
- 1992 Carlsbad Cam was not in the Jug.
- 1993 Presidential Ball was third after being second in the Cane and Messenger.
- 1994 Cams Card Shark was scratched that day and never did race again, but was an easy choice for HOY.
- 1995 Davids Pass was not in it.
- 1996 Hot Lead was not in it.
- 1997 Dream Away was last as the even money favorite.
- 1998 Day In A Life was third from post 8 totally dismissed in the wagering at 55-1.
- 1999 The Panderosa was last in his heat and did not make it to the final.
- 6. Phantom Lady in 1954 was 1-6-2 for Frank Ervin. She took her shot at becoming the first filly to win it. Adios Harry ended up being victorious, but, consider that just three days before the Jug, Phantom Lady won the Filly Breeders Stake!!
- 7. The 1946 Jug went for \$35,358.25, which was the all time biggest pot for sophomore pacers to that point in history.
 - 8. Little Brown Jug debuts:
- Brian Sears was fifth with 2-1 favorite in 2001 with Pine Valley.
- Dave Miller in 1992 with Ruff Hewn was second and third and did not make the Fake Left-Western Hanover-Crouch-Gamma Ray race-off.
- John Campbell debuted in the 1981 Jug that was marred by multiple interference. His Armbro Wolf did not finish, but Campbell did win it the next year with Merger, a horse Campbell owned, in part.
- Bill O'Donnell was first and fourth in the final with Temujin in 1982.
- Mike Lachance got it going in a hurry winning his first two Jugs ever — the only driver to do so back to back. B J Scoot and Goalie Jeff each won both.
- The Waples three: Keith debuted in 1969 with Penn National (third and sixth); Ronny got going with Coal Harbor (second and third in 1982) and Randy was scratched in 1998 with Memphis Flash and then raced Elmos Blaze (7th in 2000).

- 9. June Weller was 10th and ninth in 1972 in the Jug, but remains today the only female driver to compete in the Jug.
- 10. 252-1 shot Savvy Almahurst (Dave Rankin) finished third in the 1983 Jug final, right behind 61-1 shot Skirt Lifter and favorite Ralph Hanover, who won it. Too bad show wagering was barred from this one. And 252-1 was not the longest shot in this field. Salute Hanover was 8th at 305-1.
- 11. John Campbell was second in three straight Jugs (1985, 1986, 1987):

- 1986 Amity Chef to Barberry Spur
- 1987 Redskin to Jaguar Spur
- 12. Cam Fella wasn't in the 1982 Jug. He was ineligible, though he did win the Cane and Messenger via the supplemental route. Pat Crowe waited a year until his debut in 1983 with a pair of horses Elarfus and Ludell Hanover. Both were fourth and did not advance.
- 13. HOYs that failed in the Jug. In 2000, Gallo Blue Chip finished second to Astreos in the Jug but was an easy choice for HOY. In 2005, Rocknroll Hanover was the no-doubt HOY, but was second and third in the Forty Seven year.
- 14. In 1999, Luc Ouellette won at Delaware, OH with Jet Laag for Linda Toscano in a world record half-mile track effort in 1:49. He also won paying double digits twice in the Jug heats —\$10.00 Royalflush Hanover (last in the four-horse race-off) and \$10.60 Mystical Shark. (third in four-horse race-off with Jack Moiseyev driving).
- 15. Clint Galbraith had only one Jug drive prior to 1980 when he won with Niatross and it was 14 years earlier in 1966 with Niagara Byrd (7th and 8th).

Lillian Delaney from the Vincent Delaney Memorial

The one thing on my bucket list I hope to check off before I check out is to attend The Vincent Delaney Memorial in Portmarnock, Ireland, the second weekend in August.

What has grown into one of the most highly anticipated and exciting weekends in harness racing, the V.D.M. draws people from all walks of life and corners of the world.

In the nine years since the V.D.M. first launched, the festival has transformed into a major international event on the harness racing calendar.

Renown track announcer Roger Huston flies in to call the races and top U.S. drivers Mike Wilder, George Brennan, Dan Noble, Aaron Merriman, Jordan Stratton, Wally Hennessy; Canadian driver Jody Jamieson, and New Zealand drivers Dexter Dunn and Anthony Butt have all competed in the races and enjoyed the lush greenness landscape, smoked Salmon, and Irish Whiskey.

So how did this all begin? It evolved from a tragedy. The Delaneys turned something negative into something positive. In 2011, when the youngest brother, 27-year-old Vincent, suddenly died from a massive heart attack, brothers James and Derek Delaney decided to launch the first Two-Year-Old Classic Race, in honor of the horse enthusiast.

"James and Derek wanted to do something that was going to help racing both here in Ireland and the UK, so they obtained a major high street bookmaker as a sponsor and a substantial purse (race) specifically for 2-year-old pacers, which has helped stimulate the breeding and improve racing. Indirectly, it also helped harness racing in the United States. Thankfully, it has snowballed from there and exceeded all our expectations — something we as a family are very proud of," said Derek's wife, Lillian.

The three brothers were born in Dublin and found their way into the sport of harness racing through the ponies and

carts of their childhood, collecting scrap, delivering coal, and helping out in a harness racing stable at Newtown Stud.

They were not only brothers, but were the best of friends who united not only by their genes and heritage, but bound by their love of horses.

"Vincent worked with my husband Derek, and brother-in-law James dealt with the pedigrees and breaking the young horses. When Vincent died our family was devastated. We wanted to honor and keep Vincent alive the best way we knew how," said Lillian, "and that was through his love and passion for harness horses."

Initially, James did the training until the brothers decided to focus full time on breeding and hired UK trainer Sally Teeboon.

Today, James and Derek own and run a breeding farm called Oakwood Stud. In 2017, Oakwood Stud stood Rachmaniov Seven, (winner at Vincennes) who was the first French trotter in Ireland. That was the first time a French trotter had ever stood in Ireland.

Oakwood Stud also stands the great stallion Foreclosure N. American stallions Sweet Lou and Always B Miki are also available via frozen semen.

Derek's wife, Lillian, plays a very big part in the annual grand event as hostess who organizes the hotel stays for quests, plans all trips, and hosts the popular Ladies Day.

"Normally our international guests start arriving from Tuesday onwards and stay in The Grand Hotel located in the seaside town of Malahide in North Dublin.

"I organize trips from there into Dublin City and down to Oakwood Stud in Co Offaly for our guests. Friday evening we kick off the weekend at a fabulous restaurant, then it's racing at Portmarnock Raceway Saturday and Sunday. There is a hospitality tent set up at the track serving food and drink both days and we provide Irish musicians and dancers to perform all weekend for our guests.

"Sunday is 'Fun Day' — which is Ladies Day. I arrange the competition and hire some local makeup artists and hair stylists to come to the hotel for our guests, basically turning a hotel room into a beauty salon in the morning.

"Ladies Day has become a social event in itself — the ladies sharing stories and having 'craic' — the Irish word for fun. We even vote on Best Dressed Lady, Best Dressed Man, Best Dressed Couple and of course, the Best Hat," she said. "Basically, I handle all the 'glam' things for the V.D.M."

I asked Lillian how harness racing in Ireland differs from the United States.

"Racing is far more professional in America then it is here. I suppose it's because it's an industry with a lot of money in the sport in the USA. We don't have simulcast off course wagering over here, so it's more about the fun of winning and the celebration afterwards."

2020 has been a horrendous year for everyone due to the dreaded onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, and sadly, The Vincent Delaney festival had to be cancelled until 2021.

Plans for next year — which marks the big 10-year anniversary of the VDM weekend are now being worked on.


"Although the COVID has settled down a bit here, there are still restrictions and some counties placed a lockdown again last week. It has affected the starting of the season and has stopped the tracks from opening to the public," said Lillian. "Anyone can attend the VDM. 'Sting' aims to stay perfect in KYSS final

The word perfect is the perfect adjective in Perfect Sting's name at this point in his career. Trainer Joe Holloway believes another adjective might suit the 2-year-old pacing colt as his career continues: Special.

Perfect Sting, a son of two of history's fastest horses, stallion Always B Miki and mare Shebestingin, is five-for-five this season for Holloway and breeders/owners Brittany Farms and Val D'Or Farms. His next start comes today (Sept. 20) in the \$250,000 Kentucky Sire Stakes championship for 2-year-old male pacers at Lexington's Red Mile, where he will leave from post five with regular driver David Miller and is the 6-5 morning-line favorite.

Red Mile plays host to all eight Kentucky Sire Stakes finals for 2- and 3-year-old pacers and trotters today. Meadowlands Pace and North America Cup winner Tall Dark Stranger, ranked No. 2 in harness racing's current Top 10 poll, headlines the championship for 3-year-old male pacers. Reflect With Me, unbeaten in six starts this year and ranked No. 9, leads the group of 3-year-old female pacers.

Perfect Sting debuted July 28 with a dead-heat win at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono and followed with a neck victory at The Meadowlands. Since then, he has won three Kentucky Sire Stakes starts at Red Mile, all by a minimum of a length. His 1:49.2 triumph on Aug. 25 is the season's fastest mile for a 2-year-old pacer. Only 11 freshmen in history have been faster.

"A long time ago, I said I think this is going to be the best horse I ever trained," Holloway said. "So far, so good. But he's got to do it. We've got five more starts, at the most six, to see. They each get tougher now, but I think he can handle it. He's never been tired yet."

During his Hall of Fame career, Holloway has trained a number of standout pacers, including three-time Dan Patch Award winner Jenna's Beach Boy and millionaire Always A Virgin as well as Hall of Famer Always B Miki (who shares the record for history's fastest mile, 1:46, with Lather Up) at ages 2 and 3. So his praise for Perfect Sting speaks volumes.

"He's just far more advanced than Jenna, Miki, Always A Virgin; any of those," Holloway said. "David trained him (in the spring) and said when he puts it all together, he's going

to be great. Each time out he's getting a little bit better and he's learning more. David said in three or four start he'd figure it out. He's still not quite there, but he'll get there. He does it effortlessly, so let's hope he continues that way.

"It's too early to proclaim him the best, but I think he's got a real chance to do something special. Maybe he won't, maybe he will. But if he does, it will be a fun ride.

"I called it early, David called it early, and now we just have to see."

In addition to training Perfect Sting's sire during the early part of his career, Holloway trained Shebestingin throughout her career. Shebestingin was the sport's all-time fastest female pacer until 2019, when Shartin N's 1:46.4 mile bettered Shebestingin's mark by one-fifth of a second.

"The mare deserved to have a great horse," Holloway said. "Hopefully he continues on."

Following the Kentucky Sire Stakes championship, Perfect Sting is slated to start in the Bluegrass and International Stallion stakes at Red Mile before going to the Breeders Crown at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

"This was the plan the whole time, we're shooting for everything at the end," Holloway said. "Right now, everything seems to be working okay."

Racing begins at 1 p.m. (EDT) today at Red Mile and the Kentucky Sire Stakes finals are the first eight races. Following are the morning-line favorites in each final, in race order.

The heartwarming story of Marie Ortolan Bar and colt Cuatro De Julio

Marie Ortolan Bar can succinctly sum up the fairytale she is living with colt Cuatro De Julio, this season's fastest 2-year-old trotter thanks to his near world-record-equaling 1:51.4 mile two weeks ago, and winner of eight of 10 races as he heads to today's (Sept. 20) \$250,000 Kentucky Sire Stakes championship at Red Mile.

"It's a story about faith, love, and friendship," said Marie, who trains Cuatro De Julio. "He is a gift. It is a wonderful story."

Cuatro De Julio arrived in Marie's life when she most needed a gift like him. The colt was bred by partner Jean Pierre Dubois' Dream With Me Stable and raised by Marie in Kentucky. She realized quickly he was different. She realized, too, he was a horse to change her life.

For more than a decade, Marie battled a variety of debilitating health conditions, from blood disorders to a rare congenital heart defect known as Ebstein's anomaly. She nearly died on multiple occasions and was forced to give up training horses for the better part of eight years. She still worked with babies at Dubois' breeding farm, but her illnesses had taken a toll on her physically and mentally.

"When you fall very sick, they fix one problem but then another one comes," Marie said. "It is not fun to be sick. Your spirit wants to go, but your body says no. I was so weak. One day you say enough."

Marie's faith helped sustain her during this period. "If you do not have God in your life, you have nothing," she said.

And on March 22, 2018, a colt by **Trixton** out of the Ready Cash mare Clarabelle arrived and renewed her strength and outlook. It was Cuatro De Julio, or Fourth of July, which is Dubois' birthday.

"I would say when he was one month old, he was very special; very special, very smart," Marie said. "When he was four months, he would follow me everywhere. I would say, go play with your friends. But he followed me everywhere. He was the dominant one. He was always the first for everything.

"The way he moved was not so beautiful, there were others more elegant, but what I loved was the shoulder, the neck, the bottom, and he was never sick. He was never weak. I told everybody, when he was seven months, I have a good horse. I told everybody that this one is special. If you meet Cuatro, you will fall in love."

So special, Marie decided to get her trainer's license again. With the help of numerous friends, including Judi and Henry Lunsford and Lee and Al Eferstein, she began training Cuatro De Julio.

"This horse gave her the thrill and happiness and the will to come back and train again," said Lee Eferstein, whose husband Al has become Cuatro De Julio's regular driver. "He brought all of that back for her. He is just so special for so many reasons."

Said Marie, "You never train a horse alone. You train a good horse with good people around you, people who love the horse. Without Lee, I'm nothing. She gave me my confidence back. Without all the friends and advice, I'm nothing. Everybody helps. We are a team."

Cuatro De Julio's career began on the Kentucky fairs circuit, where he won six of seven races including the season-end final at Lexington's Red Mile. His only loss came in his debut when Marie drove him at the Ballard County Fair.

"That was a very bad idea," Marie said, laughing. "This horse is not easy. If you fight with this horse, you will lose."

Following that first start, Al Eferstein, a veteran of the Kentucky fairs, took the seat behind Cuatro De Julio. After sweeping the remainder of their fair circuit starts, they tackled the Kentucky Sire Stakes. Cuatro De Julio won his first KYSS start, made a misstep in the second, and rebounded by nearly matching Walner's world record for a 2-year-old trotting colt on a mile track in the most recent.

"People are always asking me, when are you going to put up a catch driver?" Marie said. "He goes very well with Al. We

won eight races easy. When something works, why would you change?"

Following the Kentucky Sire Stakes championship, Cuatro De Julio is eligible to the Grand Circuit races at Red Mile and the Breeders Crown at Harrah's Hoosier Park. But there is no reason to look to the future. The present is a wonderful story as it is.

"Working with horses is a passion," Marie said. "We all have a dream and we have to follow the dream, but there is a lot of sacrifice. The recompense now is Cuatro. This horse saved my life."

Racing begins at 1 p.m. (EDT) today at Red Mile and the Kentucky Sire Stakes finals are the first eight races.

"So, what's your plan?" I asked (full story here).

He reached for his phone and began to scroll. When he found what he wanted, he said, "I'm putting the cart before the horse, using my budget to target people who have no previous connection with horseracing. I'm fishing in freshwater online."

I moaned, "Please don't tell me it's clickbait, one of those annoying popups that lead you to cyberspace Never-Never land. Those ads that you can't click off the screen and make you want to punch your I-pad in the throat?"

"No, my idea isn't a popup, it's a simple landing page designed to generate referrals. The goal is to have the viewer refer the product to someone else." He slipped into a professorial tone, "Technically, this classification of advertising is a CTA, call to action. A CTA can involve a banner, button, graphic, or text on a website meant to prompt a user to act."

"That sounds like clickbait to me."

"Not really. This click leads to a **conversion funnel**. In online marketing, this is an essential part of **inbound marketing**, sometimes known as **permission marketing**. Permission marketing is an invitation to the user to forward a non-evident need, insight, or a hidden truth based on human behavior. The goal is a *push*, sending information to another person. A private *push*, from a trusted person, has



always been the ultimate in marketing. A good push makes everyone feel good."

"Hey, that happened to me at the beginning of the pandemic. My ex-sister-in-law, Twyla, forwarded me a link to a movie streaming service named *Sundance Now.* The link had a note — Hey Trey, this site is great. Plenty of weird stuff that might be perfect for my favorite weird guy. Cheers, Twyla."

He nodded, "That is a perfect example of a push."

"It worked! I subscribed to *Sundance Now* and loved it. I'm glad she thought of me and clued me in. I'm in the middle of an epic Swedish series with subtitles about a family that owns a restaurant during World War II. Do you think this approach will work, that it could do the impossible and find new owners?"

"That depends on the pushers." He handed me his phone and said, "This is my simple CTA. The hope is that a few people like Twyla send it along."

I looked up. He gave me a nod. I pushed the button.

Since you have landed on this page, you have likely discovered that harness horse racing can be a passion that fills your mind and nourishes your soul (if not always your bankroll). Amazingly, the world contains people who have yet to find the fulfillment that can result from our sport.

These are strange times.

You may know someone who can no longer take that cruise around the world or stroll the streets of Paris. Their bowling team is no longer rolling, and dinner parties are solitary affairs. Their world, like yours, has changed in many ways. They are in a mental rut. While there may not be a cure for coronavirus lockdown, learning our game via virtual horse ownership may be good medicine.

Boredom is no small matter. Lack of new challenges can lead to health issues. Social psychologists who study boredom know that in such periods, people make poor choices, such as increased drinking, drugs, unhealthy eating, and doom scrolling. In a pandemic, the boredom problems will accentuate.

Find a rhythm as a buffer from boredom. By creating new routines, you can restore a sense of meaning.

Seek out new activities. Finding activities that are challenging enough to keep one occupied and engaged is not easy, and sometimes takes a push.

Try something new. Boredom urges many of us **towards novel** experiences. Embrace that urge. Experiment with home repairs, learn to tap dance, or get digitally involved in harness racing. Doing new things not only relieves boredom, but it also helps us acquire new skills and knowledge. Evidence shows that embracing new experiences can help us lead not only a happier and more meaningful life, but also a **psychologically richer** one.

Connect with others. Making new friends or keeping in touch with old friends is a challenge in lockdown but using Zoom or skype is better than sitting alone.

Again, this message is not for you. You already understand and appreciate the rewards of our sport and partial horse ownership. During these trying times, people who do not know our sport will be looking for new outlets, especially during the coming long winter days. You know in your heart that racing can help. You know our sport has engaged you mentally.

Tattoo Artist remains perfect in Gold Series action

Ontario's talented 3-year-old pacing colts returned to Gold Series competition on Friday, Sept. 18 at Woodbine Mohawk Park after spending the last month competing in Grand Circuit stakes.

The sole \$156,400 division featured a showdown between point leaders Beaumond Hanover and Tattoo Artist, both riding three-race win streaks in Ontario Sires Stakes action, along with six other Gold Series rivals.

As they have in virtually every start this season, Tattoo Artist and driver Bob McClure rocketed away from Post 8 and led the field into the first turn. Beaumond Hanover and driver Jody Jamieson found themselves in the outer lane from Post 2 and opted to carry on, reaching the front heading by the :26.2 quarter, but McClure and Tattoo Artist quickly reclaimed the lead. The fan favorites rolled through a :54.4 half and 1:23 three-quarters and then kicked home for a one and one-quarter length victory in 1:50.1. Beaumond Hanover finished second and Rhythm In Motion was third.

"He's really a pleasure to drive," said McClure. "Horses as handy as him, as smart as him and with the lungs he has don't come around often. I look forward to seeing him between every start."

The win, Tattoo's Artist's seventh in 10 sophomore starts, came as a bit of a relief to trainer Dr. Ian Moore, who said the colt was not as sharp as he usually is on the training track this week.

"He actually didn't train very good on Tuesday, for the first time. Normally he trains really good and he wasn't so keen there Tuesday. I didn't tell Bobby that of course, but he did warm up very sharp tonight so I did tell him that," said Moore with a chuckle. "I'm going to talk to Frank Cannon and Eric Cherry tomorrow and I think that we're probably going to try him in the U.S. next Friday (Sept. 25) at Hoosier for the Jennas Beach Boy, which Century Farroh won last year, because Century Farroh has one the same night, so I think I'll send them both."

Cannon of Sanford, FL and Cherry, through his Let It Ride Stables Inc. of Boca Raton, FL, share ownership of Tattoo

Artist and if the pair is in agreement the colt will be reunited with his winter caretaker Brad Firlotte at Indiana's Hoosier Park.

"He's worked for me in Florida for the last ten years and he looked after Tattoo as a two-year-old and then he looked after him again last fall until he left as three-year-old," said Moore of Florida-based Firlotte, who will fly up to Indiana. "He won't have Giselle with him, his regular caretaker Giselle Loder, but that's the way it is at the border, right."

The 3-year-old pacing colts have one Gold leg remaining, Oct. 9 at The Raceway at the Western Fair District, and the Super Final, Oct. 17 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Those are the only stakes engagements remaining on Tattoo Artist's calendar, unless Cannon and Cherry opt to supplement the son of Hes Watching to the Breeders Crown eliminations Oct. 24 at Hoosier Park.

"No matter what happens for the rest of the year, he's had a great year. I think that puts him over half a million for the year, so I don't think anybody will complain," said Moore. "He's a sweet little guy, no doubt about it. We've had a lot of fun with him and enjoyed every minute of it."

Sophomore pacing colts sizzle in ISS at Hoosier

Three-year-old pacing colts and geldings were on display on Friday (Sept. 18) at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino in the sixth leg of Indiana Sires Stakes action. The night saw victories from both a heavy favorite and a longshot, proving the competitive nature of the division. **Odds On Osiris** fulfilled the role of post-time favorite, winning his first start back at Harrah's Hoosier Park after Grand Circuit action. **Dojea Gizmo** provided one of many upsets on the evening's card in the second division after a near gate-to-wire score for his first Indiana Sires Stakes win.

In the first split of the stakes action, Odds On Osiris made a triumphant return to Harrah's Hoosier Park, crossing the wire in 1:50.1, a little over a length to the good. With Peter Wrenn in the bike, Odds On Osiris followed through as the 1-5 favorite, paying \$2.60 to win.

When the gate opened, Odds On Osiris settled into a spot mid-pack, letting his competitors set the fractions. Crook Boyzz with Brandon Bates led the field through an opening quarter of 26.2. Wrenn gave Odds On Osiris the go ahead soon after, moving second-over and surging past the leaders.

Crook Boyzz still called the shots at the half in 55.2, but his lead wouldn't last long.

Odds On Osiris was out and powered up to take command at the third quarter in 1:23.2. As the field turned for home, Crook Boyzz appeared ready to battle but Odds On Osiris was too strong and dug in to get the victory leaving Crook Boyzz to settle for second. Always And Again with John De Long rallied well late in the stretch for third.

"We decided to add Lasix because he did bleed a bit in the North American Cup," trainer Melanie Wrenn revealed after the win. "He's been a consistent athlete. At two we tried to find how he likes to race best but this year he has really found his way to race."

Odds On Osiris has now won 10 of 17 lifetime starts, boasting a lifetime bankroll of \$576,425 for owners Odds On Racing. The son of Rockin Image—Antigua Hanover was bred by Merlie Schwartz.

Rounding out the stakes events for the night was Dojea Gizmo providing the 15-1 upset for driver, trainer Dan Shetler. Equaling his lifetime mark of 1:51, Dojea Gizmo made his game winning move down the backside to score his fifth lifetime win.

As the wings of the gate opened, Family Recipe with James Yoder surged to the front through the first quarter in :27.2. Dojea Gizmo was ready to attack and was on top by a length at the half in :56.4. Dojea Gizmo continued unchallenged through third quarter in 1:24.3.

As the field turned for home, Doeja Gizmo felt Family Recipe digging in behind him. The pair ended up matching strides for much of the stretch but it was Dojea Gizmo who came out on top. Family Recipe held on for second. Clever Character with Ricky Macomber Jr. recovered from a break at the start, rallying late for third. Dojea Gizmo paid \$32.40 to win with the upset.

"We didn't really race him as a 2-year-old," Shetler said in the winner's circle, "but I always knew he had that speed. He's incredibly versatile and durable."

The son of Tellitlikeitis—Postmark, Dojea Gizmo has now won five of 18 starts. He sports a lifetime bankroll of \$74,343 for owners Dan Shetler and the Dojea Stables, who also bred the gelding.

Stars align for Logan Park in Gold Series victory

Ontario's talented 2-year-old trotting colts were featured on another spectacular night of harness racing at Woodbine Mohawk Park Saturday (Sept. 19) and this week fortune smiled on **Logan Park**.

The lightly rated son of Archangel and driver Louis-Philippe Roy got away fourth from Post 7 in the lone \$158,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series split and watched Emotions Riches ring up a :26.3 quarter before yielding to Sweet Soul David. Heading by the :56.4 quarter

Roy sent Logan Park after the leaders and the colt had an edge on Sweet Soul David at the 1:26.4 three-quarters. In command at the top of the stretch, Logan Park dug in to hold off Full Of Muscles by a head in 1:55.3. Tokyo Seelster was three and three-quarter lengths back in third. Favorite Macho Martini finished at the back of the field after suffering interference and making a break in the stretch.

"He was good. When he stays trotting he's as good as any of them," said trainer Rob Fellows. "He's made a lot of breaks at inopportune times and had to qualify and missed a couple sires stakes, but he was good tonight."

The win was the first in OSS action for Logan Park and his second of the season. The colt's other victory came in the Aug. 6 leg of the Millard Farms Series at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Among Logan Park's miscues, which number four, was an error in last weekend's William Wellwood Memorial Final when he was sitting third heading into the final quarter. Fellows was hopeful a shoeing change would work in Logan Park's favor on Saturday, but admitted he and Roy had been hopeful before.

"We've been confident before and lost him in the first turn. Last week I was confident when he got around the first turn and then of course he didn't get around the last turn," said Fellows, who noted that Saturday's shoeing change was far from the first. "It used to be trotting around the turns was his forte, but then he started making a lot of breaks in the turns and, you know, we have to take it as it is. I mean they're two-year-old trotters, they're growing every step as it goes too, they grow and their gait changes, it's very tough."

Outofthepark Stable of Rockwood, breeder Reg Higgs of Strathroy and Arpad Szabo of Bradford, ON share ownership of Logan Park, who boosted his career earnings to \$123,300 with the win and jumped from thirteenth to third in the division standings with 70 points. The top 10 point earners after the final Gold Series leg, Oct. 8 at Flamboro Downs, will advance to the \$250,000 Super Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Oct. 17.

Amigo Volo professional, purposeful in Keystone Classic win

Amigo Volo powered to a professional, purposeful victory in Friday's (Sept. 18) Keystone Classic at The Meadows, serving notice to his division rivals that he'll be a force to be reckoned with in rich late-season stakes. Patriarch Hanover

took the other division in the \$79,700 stake for 3-year-old colt and gelding trotters.

Considered one of the division's best early in the year, Amigo Volo finished third in his Hambletonian elimination and fourth in the final, despite being stuck with post 10. While that performance may have downgraded him in the eyes of some, he's now won three straight — including the \$252,000 Pennsylvania Sires Stake championship — and appears razor sharp.

"He's on his way out to Lexington, so it was the perfect spot for him to come here and come calling through," said winning driver Dexter Dunn. "He's in his top form at the moment. As long as he keeps that form, I'm sure he'll be competitive in the big races."

In the Keystone Classic, the Father Patrick—Margarita Momma gelding shrugged off the unexpected first-up challenge of long shot Focus Pocus and prevailed in 1:54.3. The pocket-sitting Harley K was 2-1/2 lengths back in second while Focus Pocus saved show.

Amigo Volo now has banked \$966,644 for trainer Nifty Norman and owners Pinske Stables and David J. Miller.

Patriarch Hanover quarter-poled to the point for Matt Kakaley and downed early leader Town Victor by 3/4 lengths in 1:55.3, with Nezblanc third.

"He's just a step behind a couple of the top sires stake horses," Kakaley said of the son of Father Patrick—Personal Style, "but he gives his all every time, and he's made some money. He's had a respectable year so far."

Ron Burke trains Patriarch Hanover, who lifted his lifetime bankroll to \$235,266, for Burke Racing Stable, William Switala, James Martin and Weaver Bruscemi LLC.

In the \$68,300 Keystone Classic for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings, **Sandbetweenmytoes** scored in 1:50 giving him three wins in the last four starts — all in 1:50 or faster. Trainer Jim Campbell agreed that Fashion Farms' homebred Somebeachsomewhere—Galleria gelding is more confident and sure gaited than he was early in the season.

"Unfortunately, his only bad race in the last four was the PA Sites Stake championship," Campbell said. "We'll take him to Delaware for the Jug. I think he'll get around there good. He gets around a five-eighths-mile track pretty good, and that's the best half-mile track in the country at Delaware. I don't foresee any problems."

Sandbetweenmytoes quarter-poled to the top for Scott Zeron and defeated early leader Tru Lou by 2-1/4 lengths. Seeyou At Thebeach completed the ticket. The winner extended his career earnings to \$177,142.

Harness Racing Update

You knew Burke would make some noise in this stake — he sent out 10 of the 17 starters — and he spoke loudly in the other split, sweeping the exacta with **Cattlewash** and The Greek Freak. Cattlewash shot the Lightning Lane for David Miller to prevail in 1:51. Ruthless Hanover earned show.

"He's coming around at the right time, and I'm happy to be on board," Miller said. "If he goes to the Jug, he'll handle the half-mile track just fine. He's a beautifully gaited horse."

The son of Somebeachsomewhere—Road Bet now boasts \$424,908 in career earnings for owner William Donovan.

After a delay, OSS trotting fillies wrap up their regular season

It took a few days longer than anticipated, but the 2- and 3-year-old trotting fillies wrapped up their Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots and Prospect Series regular season at Flamboro Downs on Saturday (Sept. 19).

Originally scheduled for Thursday (Sept. 17), the event was suspended after just one Grassroots division had been contested due to an electrical fire in a light standard. As a result, two divisions of Grassroots fillies and both Prospect Series divisions returned to the Dundas oval on Saturday, competing in a special four-race, non-wagering event prior to the regularly scheduled Flamboro Downs program.

Before Thursday's program was suspended **Top Of The Bar** had romped around the half-mile oval to a three and one-half length victory in a personal best 2:02.1. The fan favorite and trainer Mark Etsell bested All Muscle N Sass and Snowfalla to score their third Grassroots victory and move to the top of the two-year-old trotting filly Grassroots standings.

"I kind of wanted to go to the front just to change it up a bit, make her not have to work so hard, because she's come first up the last two starts," said Etsell on Thursday. "And it just turned out with two horses breaking the decision was really easy. She's a pleasure, she doesn't get bully she just does whatever you ask her."

Etsell shares ownership of Top Of The Bar with Robert
Newton of Walkerton, Graham Hopkins of Chesley and Peter
Porter of Port Dover, ON. The Muscle Mass daughter was also
victorious in the July 29 Grassroots leg at Grand River
Raceway and the Aug. 29 leg at Hanover Raceway and
finished third in the July 13 season opener at Woodbine
Mohawk Park, giving her a total of 162 points and top spot in

the standings heading into the postseason.

When the fillies returned to Flamboro Downs on Saturday, **Doing It All** and driver Stephen Byron lined up at Post 5 in the first \$22,450 Grassroots division and fired out to a :31.1 quarter. The filly marched on to a 1:02.2 half and, although she came under pressure from Ban Ban Deo heading by the 1:31.3 three-quarters, was able to accelerate away to a two length victory in a personal best 2:01.3. Ban Ban Deo finished second and Darling Please was eight lengths back in third.

It was the Kadabra daughter's second straight win in Grassroots action and impressed both Byron and John Bax, who trains Doing It All for Menhammar Stuteri AB of Paris, KY.

"She opened up and won comfortably, I guess you could say, so she's learning. Steve was pretty happy with her," said Bax. "I think we're heading in the right direction."

With two wins, one fourth, one fifth and one seventh, Doing It All heads into the Oct. 1 Semi-Finals in fourth spot in the standings with 115 points. The top 20 point earners advance to the Semi-Finals and the top five finishers from each Semi-Final will earn a berth in the \$75,000 Grassroots Championship at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Oct. 10.

The second of Saturday's Grassroots divisions was won in near-identical fashion by driver Mike Saftic and **HP Mama B**, who powered to the front from Post 2 and rang up fractions of :29.1, :59.2 and 1:30.1 on their way to a five and one-half length win in 2:00. Tipsy In Dixie finished second and Kadillac Girl was four more lengths behind in third.

"I said, 'Call me when the race is behind the gate and tell me what's going on'. So she called me and said, 'Oh we're parked, oh we're clear now, we're in the front'. And I said, 'Okay, if we're in the front the race is pretty much over if she doesn't miscue or something," said trainer Ben Baillargeon, who was readying seven starters to compete at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday night and did not make the second trip to Dundas. "I think she'll be a very nice three-year-old that mare, she's very big. She made a few breaks at the beginning, it was just inexperience and immaturity, but she's okay now."

Baillargeon also bred and raised HP Mama B, who is owned by Guylaine Picard of Guelph, ON and Celine Paquin of Ayers Cliff, QC. The Royalty For Life daughter wrapped up her regular season with two wins, one second and one ninth in Grassroots action for a total of 125 points and third spot in the standings.

Vet: race day Lasix a benefit to the horse; Williams has it right

I have been reading a lot of discussions about race day Lasix, Russell William's criticism, and the support of federal government regulation. My first response is based on science, the second two are opinions.

First off, Lasix. Last I looked, Lasix is often administered by injection. At the end of that syringe is a licensed veterinarian who has taken an oath. Most likely, that same veterinarian has scoped and diagnosed the patient with pulmonary hemorrhage. Then, the good doctor will prescribe treatment aimed at helping the patient. Race day Lasix is one of those treatments. I and my colleagues take offense to any suggestion that race day Lasix is anything but a benefit to the horse.

As for Russell Williams, I am familiar with the farm and can attest to the fact that he and the farm are very concerned with the welfare of the horses they breed and raise. I can't imagine he would ever want to support legislation that negatively effects the welfare of the horse. Quite the opposite.

And federal legislation? Really? Can we rake a vote to see if any of the proponents of federal oversight would want a government agent lording over their business. I think not.
