Burke Bonanza

The same week it was announced that trainer Ron Burke had been voted into the Hall of Fame, he won the Little Brown Jug — with Lou's Pearlman — and the Jugette — with Scarlett Hanover — and saw his parents being inducted into the Little Brown Jug Wall of Fame.


Ron Burke-conditioned Lou's Pearlman (Yannick Gingras) grabbed the lead down the stretch and nipped favored Perfect Sting by a nose to win the 76th Little Brown Jug in 1:52.4.

It has been quite a year for Ron Burke.

In addition to training nearly 700 winners to earnings in excess of \$15 million, he was elected this month to the Harness Racing Hall of Fame. On Wednesday (Sept. 22) he won the Jugette with Scarlett Hanover.

On Thursday (Sept. 23) at the Delaware County Fair, his year got even better.

The Burke-conditioned **Lou's Pearlman** grabbed the lead down the stretch and nipped favored Perfect Sting by a nose to win the 76th Little Brown Jug in 1:52.4 on a windy, 55-degree day.



Whichwaytothebeach finished third.

The win was the third in seven years for the team of Burke and driver Yannick Gingras, who won the 2014 Jug with Limelight Beach and the 2017 edition with Filibuster Hanover. It marked

the first time since 1998 that a trainer captured both the Jug and the Jugette in the same week.

"To win the Jug and the Jugette in the same year, it's hard," Burke said. "It's hard to win one of these things and to win them both, it's very special."

Lou's Pearlman is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, Elizabeth Novak and Howard Taylor, who also owned and raced his sire, Sweet Lou, and dam, Lucy's Pearl.

"This is the first one we ever bred," he said. "That makes it special."

The Jug seemed to be a match race between Lou's Pearlman and Perfect Sting from the moment the pair were installed as dual 2-1 morning line favorites.

The Jug victory capped a memorable week for the Burke Brigade. It was the first time since 1998 that a trainer has won both the Jug and the Jugette in the same year.

Lou's Pearlman got on the board first, capturing his division of the first heat by a widening 1-3/4 lengths in 1:54 for Gingras, despite being challenged much of the mile by Whichwaytothebeach, who ended up second.

"We love this race," Burke Stable assistant trainer Mickey Burke said. "We are a very traditional barn. We like heat racing, and we prepare horses for this race."

Perfect Sting showed he was also ready for the challenge,

capturing his elimination heat by half a length over a fast-closing I'll Drink To That, also in 1:54.

Perfect Sting had faded late in three of his most recent losses this year, but trainer Joe Holloway predicted that heats might be just what the pacer needed to "break him lose."

The race appeared to be his to lose when Perfect Sting drew the rail and driver David Miller, seeking his record-breaking sixth Jug win, sent him straight for the lead with Lou's Pearlman tucked in second.

Gingras pulled his horse going by the half and was quickly joined on the far outside by Whichwaytothebeach.

"I was surprised a little bit, but on the flip side, I could feel [Whichwaytothebeach] on my helmet," Gingras said. "I was going slow because I was trying to control the pace from being first up."

Down the stretch it was a dual of the two favorites, with Perfect Sting hanging tough—but not tough enough.

"I was thinking we were home free, even as they collard us in the last turn," Miller said. "At the head of the lane, he sprinted away. He got a half a length on Yannick and kept pacing right to the wire. He just got caught.

"It's tough to take. With his fractions and everything, I thought we were in good shape."

The win was the fifth in a row and seventh of the year for Lou's Pearlman, who was named for Lou Pearlman, founder of Backstreet Boys and *NSYNC, who died in 2016 serving prison time for a Ponzi scheme. He has now earned \$510,032.

Timing has been key with Lou's Pearlman, who struggled early in the year and failed to finish in the money in his first four starts.

"The first five weeks [of 2021], it was a disaster," Ron said. "And

then after that, we got him turned around, and it's been nothing but great since then.

"[We made] little equipment changes... and boom, this is the horse we thought he was."

Gingras credited the Burkes with preparing horses like few other trainers can.

"They have a great operation," said Gingras, who is joining Ron in 2022 Hall of Fame class. "They have a lot of horses, but a lot of quality horses. He does a great job. Horses have ups and downs, but he is a master when they're down to bring him back up. He knows how to find the problems and how to fix it. All the credit goes to him."

For the Burke family, the win capped quite a week. Counting the Jug and the Jugette, the stable won 15 races — the most in the fair's history. In addition, Burke's parents, Mickey and Sylvia, were inducted into the Little Brown Jug Wall of Fame.

In the winner's circle, as he pondered the magnitude of the moment, Ron Burke's eyes welled with tears. He stared off into the distance, seeking composure and the words to express how far he and his operation had come. He also expressed appreciation for the team that built it, which includes his parents, siblings, assistants, caretakers and drivers like Gingras.

"Our barn isn't one person," he said. "It's all of us. No one person can do this. Not that I'm saying I'm not good at what I do. I am very good at what I do, but I have everybody with me that is very good at what they do.

"It's a whole family thing... Every year gets harder and we just keep plugging along. And if we keep getting the horses, we're going to keep coming here."





When Dovescry (David Miller) took advantage of breaks in stride by Sorella (Dexter Dunn) at the start and by Weslynn Quest (Joe Bongiorno) at the three-quarter pole to win the \$116,500 Ms. Versatility Trot Final in 1:56.2 held on the Little Brown Jug undercard on Thursday (Sept. 23) at the Delaware County Fairgrounds in Ohio.

Ab'sattitudexpress (Yannick Gingras) and Felicityshagwell S (Andy Miller) was second and third.

When Dovescry, a 6-year-old Muscle Hill—Cedar Dove mare, is conditioned by Brett Pelling and is owned by John Lengacher.

Old Oaken Bucket to Sunny Crockett

Andy Miller steered **Sunny Crockett** to a gate-to-wire victory in the \$87,700 Old Oaken Bucket for 3-year-old colt trotters.

The Father Patrick—Moonlight In Miami colt crossed the line a length ahead of Mon Amour (Tim Tetrick) and Swingforthefences (Peter Wrenn) in 1:58.2.

Julie Miller trained the winner for the Willow Oak Ranch and the Andy Miller Stable.

Standardbred Colt Trot to Fiftyfour K

Fiftyfour K (Yannick Gingras) was a popular winner in the \$45,330 Standardbred 2-year-old colt trot.

The Sebastian K—Westfiftyfirst colt defeated Just For Trix (Andy Miller) and Summit City Sonny (Joey Putnam) by three lengths in 2:02.2.

Fiftyfour K is owned by the Here's To Us Stable and is trained by Ron Steck, who is based at the Delaware County Fairgrounds.

"Cowboy' Lassos Standardbred Field

Captain Cowboy (Yannick Gingras) won the \$46,710 Standardbred for freshman colt pacers by 2 ½ lengths over Birthday (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) and Good Deal (Chris Page) in 1:57.1.

The Captaintreacherous—Odds On Lassomyhrt colt won for the fourth time in six career starts for co-owner/trainer Ake Svanstedt and Little E Stable.

Gulf Shores remains undefeated with OBC Win

The 2-year-old Ohio freshman pacing star **Gulf Shores** (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) remained undefeated thanks to a 1:56.2 score in the \$132,667 OBC.

Sling Shock (Dan Noble) and Gulf Shores swapped the lead early lead, but it was a quarter-pole move by the eventual winner that proved to be the winning one.

The son of Downbytheseaside—Western Drag cruised to a two-length win over his rival and Vintage Cowboy (Matt Kakaley).

Gulf Shores, a Brian Brown trainee, won for the sixth straight time for Country Club Acres, Diamond Creek Racing and Wingfield Brothers.

Winning Ticket and Lockbox Take OBC 3CT Splits

Winning Tinning (Aaron Merriman) continued his dominance over his divisional rivals thanks to a 4 ½ length score in 1:58.3 in the \$100,868 (div) OBC for sophomore cot trotters.

The Triumphant Caviar—Lotto Winner colt remains undefeated in the state of Ohio and suffered just one defeat – a third place finish in the \$479,135 Canadian Trotting Classic – this season.

Winning Ticket is co-owned by trainer Chris Beaver, Steven Zeehandelar, Tim Homan and Jim Burnett.

Lockbox (Chris Page) took the first \$50,434 division in 2:00.4 over Double Down K (Yannick Gingras) and Ilikedecupcakes (Hugh Beaty).

The Wishing Stone—Springaround gelding is trained by Ron Burke for the Burke Racing Stable, Purnel & Libby, J & T Silva Stable and Weaver Bruscemi.

3CP OBCs to Charlie May and Gallant Star

Gallant Star used a confident steer by Tim Tetrick and caught Laughagain Hanover (Dan Noble) in the stretch to take the first division of the \$108,700 Ohio Breeders Championship for 3-year-old colt pacers in 1:56.4.

The Well Said—Canary Island gelding won for the fourth straight

time for Carl Howard, Larry Wills and Jeffrey Rector. He is trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr.

Charlie May cruised to a 4 ¼ length score in 1:55.2 in the second \$54,350 division over rival Heart Of Chewbacca (Dan Noble) and Cyclone Union Jack (David Miller).

Don Tiger owns the McArdle—Stipple Hanover gelding. Steve Carter trains and Dexter Dunn picked up the catch drive from an ailing Brett Miller.

Upset in the Lady Pace

She Knows It All (Tim Tetrick) picked a good time to pick up her first win of the season in the \$96,520 OBC for 3-year-old filly pacers.

The Racing Hill—Cat Cora lass went wide into the final turn and passed the tiring leaders to score in 1:55. She paid \$30.40 to win.

Foulk Stables and Triple D Stables own the winner. Clarence Foulk trains She Knows It All, who now has two career wins, but earnings of \$175,710.

Scarlett Hanover and driver Tim Tetrick overcame a day-long rain and a field of eight to win the \$253,800 Jugette for 3-year-old filly pacers on Wednesday (Sept. 22) at the Delaware County Fairgrounds.

In the \$152,280 final, the 43-1 longshot Paula's Bet Hanover (Yannick Gingras) grabbed the early lead and controlled the fractions of :29, :58.4 and 1:28. David Miller came first up with Test Of Faith, providing cover for Tetrick and Scarlett Hanover to sprint past the leaders to record a half-length win in 1:56 over a track rated as 'sloppy.'

"The last half of the card, the front end has not been very good at all, I wanted to get away in the back. I was hoping one or two wanted to take a shot. It worked out perfect... my mare got it done," said Tetrick.

"The track crew did as good of a job as they could. There was a lot of weather, a lot of rain."





Bax believes Mohawk Million will be a tremendous betting race

The trainer of Duly Resolved said bettors "must just lick their lips at this kind of a race," because top 2-year-old trotters from New Jersey, Indiana, Ohio and Ontario will finally all meet.

Trainer John Bax is predicting Saturday's (Sept. 25) \$1 million Mohawk Million at Woodbine Mohawk Park will be incredibly enticing to bettors.

"They must just lick their lips at this kind of a race because, yeah, two horses kind of stand out, but they aren't that far (ahead) and they may beat each other up. They are only a neck better than four or five of the other ones," said Bax, who will send out his Ontario-sired star **Duly Resolved** (post 8, driver Paul MacDonell) in the race for 2-year-old trotters.

The fact the Mohawk Million features a field of rookies from a variety of jurisdictions should also make the handicapping puzzle that much more attractive, Bax said.

"I think the exciting part about this race is that they are coming from everywhere – Ohio, Indiana, the Meadowlands – so there's a lot of uncertainty," Bax said. "It's one thing to go in :52 at The Red Mile and then come up to Mohawk or go in :53 at the Meadowlands and come up to Mohawk. All the tracks are different.

"I think that's what (bettors) look for. Those gamblers are going to say, 'I can make a killing here because I know something that no one else knows or I'm going to key on this one.' I think that's good. Variety is the spice of life."

The field features undefeated filly Venerable (post 9, David

Ontario

Miller) from the Meadowlands, undefeated gelding **Dover In Motion** (post 6, Ricky Macomber, Jr.) from Indiana, division money-leader **King Of The North** (post 2, Mark MacDonald) from New York who spots a record of 6-1-0 in 7 starts and earnings of \$601,890, Ohio champion **The Mighty Hill** (post 7, James MacDonald), who has won five of seven starts and filly **Selfie Queen** (post 10, Dexter Dunn), who sports the fastest mile (1:51.2) in the field.

As for Duly Resolved, Bax said he likes the fact the gelded son of Resolve out of Motown Muscle has home track advantage.

"We're used to this track and you see horses come up here and they don't like the track surface, or they don't truck very well. There's so many variables that come into play in this race," he said.

Duly Resolved has never been worse than second in eight career starts, winning five times to compile earnings of \$342,409. Bax purchased the horse for \$30,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Duly Resolved has won three Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series finals this year already and finished second to King Of The North on Sept. 11 in the \$640,000

final of the William Wellwood Memorial.

"This horse has been God-sent this year and you wish everybody could have a horse like this come along at the time he came along. It's good for everybody, so we're riding it," Bax said. "It's been a tough year-and-a-half for everyone in this business, including us, and to have something like this come along, the timing is good, the karma is good... it's a pretty sunny day for us.

Bax said he's most happy for his fellow owners of Duly Resolved: Dave Hudson, Don Allensen and the Gaelic Stable.

"We've had a chance to sell him, but the guys are small guys and they've been in it for 20 years. To see them standing at the fence with a horse in the Wellwood and having a shot at it in (the Mohawk Million), it's really what we train them for," Bax said. "It's not often that you get that chance to be in that position. Whether you make it or don't make money, just to be there, it's a big deal to them.

"A couple guys in the Gaelic Stable, an older gentleman from Ottawa, Gary Drouin, and he's got his son Todd in it... Gary is getting on in years and to be able to be with his son on this horse and to get a horse this good is pretty satisfying and pretty fulfilling to see the enjoyment that they get out of it."

Bax had hoped to win the Wellwood and earn an automatic berth into the Mohawk Million. Duly Resolved was leading in the stretch, but fell a length short. That led slot owners to seek out the trainer to see if he wanted to make a deal to let Duly Resolved use their slot. It was a process Bax said, laughing, that "was like being the favorite hooker.

"Steve Heimbecker was the first guy to reach out. I talked to him the next morning and then I had another call. So, it didn't take long to come up with a deal," Bax said.

Nine slots for the \$1 million (Cdn) race were purchased at \$100,000 (Cdn) apiece. The rules of the race allow slot owners to use them at their discretion. Slots are considered an entity that can be sold, traded or leased. Ontario-based owner/trainer **Gino Toscani**, Montreal's **Determination Stable** (Serge Godin) and **EquineX** each purchased two slots. Single slots were purchased by **Crawford Farms** of New York (Al and Michelle Crawford) and leading Ontario owners **Brad Grant** and **Steve Heimbecker**.

Four of the slot owners will race their own trotters. Crawford Farms will race their filly **Valentina Blu**, Toscani will use one of his two slots for his colt **Southwind Domino** and Determination will use both of its slots, sending colt **Star Power Hanover** and filly **Mischevious Rose** to the gate.

Heimbecker dealt his slot to Bax, Grant made a deal to allow filly Venerable to use his slot and Toscani dealt one of his two slots to the connections of gelding Dover In Motion. EquineX purchased its two slots as a unique promotion for its software platform which aims to use transparency to increase accountability and integrity in the sport by creating secure, detailed records for every horse placed registered. Those that paid \$400 to register with EquineX were eligible to be chosen by a panel of independent experts to use a slot. From the list of EquineX

clients, the panel selected colt The Mighty Hill and filly Selfie Queen to go to the gate.

Bax said he has the highest praise for the Mohawk Million slot owners that put up big money to allow the race to be held for another year.

"We should be talking about the size of the kahunas on the guys that put their money up," Bax said. "It's like buying a lottery ticket. God love Gino — and Gino did reach out to me because he had two spots. Steve was first and that's where we went, but I know Gino and he put his money where his mouth is and he went and bought a bunch (of trotting yearlings) and they don't always turn out. I give the guy credit... and Determination, I give them credit. They are the people that deserve all the applause for putting their money up."

The Mohawk Million is race 9 in a stakes-laden Saturday card that features over \$3 million in total purses including the \$240,000 Milton Stakes, \$157,975 Simcoe, \$500,500 Shes A Great Lady and the \$824,000 Metro Pace, along with an Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Series event going for \$155,600. Post time is 7 p.m. (Eastern).

A Metro Pace dream call for the man behind the mic

Although admittedly it will be much easier said than done, Ken Middleton, Jr. will — as he always has — call it like it is on Saturday night (Sept. 25) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

His vantage point, one that overlooks the seven-eighths mile racetrack in Milton, ON, offers a most enviable view of the fast-paced action taking place below.

For the man who calls the races with a keen eye, steady voice and unprejudiced tone, the seventh race at Mohawk on Saturday will bring about a unique challenge for the seasoned professional.

When the starters for this year's \$824,000 Metro Pace line up behind the gate, Middleton will have to maintain an unbiased commentary whenever he mentions Bob Loblaw, the 2-year-old gelding he trains, co-bred and co-owns (full story here).

He's up for the moment.

"For me, you just do it the right way. It's very exciting to have a horse in a race like this, but whether I have a horse in a claiming race or marquee event, I'll do it the way it should always be done," Middleton, Jr. said.

The story of Bob Loblaw is an emotional one for Middleton, Jr.,





especially when he speaks of Bill Galvin.

Galvin, whose boundless enthusiasm for horse racing made him a beloved legend within the industry, died in September of 2020 at the age of 89. The Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame inductee bred and co-owned Bob Loblaw with Middleton.

Although the gelding is now owned by Middleton, Dave Walls, Jim Grant and Starting Centre Stables, Galvin is never far from Middleton's thoughts.

"My late partner Bill, he was deeply involved it, financially, but emotionally too. We both love the industry, which is the common denominator between Bill and I. We both love what horse racing is and what it means. We both want it to prosper. This is our way of giving back. He was retired, but he still had his finger on the pulse of the industry. He loved being part of it.

"Owning horses was different for him. It was something he was proud of, something he enjoyed doing. He loved coming out to the farm to see his babies, and to the training centre to see them there too. Ultimately, on race night, he would come out and cheer for his horses. It's something we are very entrenched in and passionate about. I dearly miss him for his friendship, advice and loyalty. I know he'd be thrilled with this horse and how he's done."

The journey of Bob Loblaw has been a bona fide thrill ride for Middleton. But there have been times – one moment in particular stands out – when he's had to work overtime to suppress his emotions when his sophomore pacer was competing.

He can easily recall the night of Aug. 28 at Mohawk, a card that included the \$140,300 Nassagaweya Stakes.

With Sylvain Filion in the sulky, Bob Loblaw rallied in deep stretch to take all the spoils.

The winning margin for the son of Sunshine Beach—Lady Marina: a mere nose.

The Nassagaweya was the horse's second victory. He broke his maiden winning a \$18,509 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots event on July 9 at Mohawk. In all, he sports a record of 2-0-3 in nine career starts, earnings of \$107,927 and a speed badge of 1:52.4.


That gutsy performance at the end of August prompted Middleton to recall the early days of his association with Bob Loblaw.

"Even before he started training, when he was running around out in the field, he just had a presence about him. Every time someone new would come to the farm – anybody that appreciates a horse – I'd say, 'Come and have a look at this guy.' He was smart and the things he did in the field... he'd always stand back and watch what was going around on around him. There was just something about him then. He had great conformation, but he also had a handsome head and body.

"To say that I knew he was a good horse then, I'd be lying. But he did catch your eye. When you go to a yearling sale, that's the kind of horse you'd want to buy. You dream of a having a horse like this, so you treasure that experience."

Having his own farm, owning horses and training them, is a perfect fit for Middleton, who has been calling races for 35 years, including the past 15 seasons at Woodbine Entertainment Group.

While you couldn't see his face in a recent tweet posted by Middleton, he was no doubt wearing a contented smile in the video of him jogging Bob Loblaw.



Content is the perfect word to describe those moments.

"That's a time of day when I just clear my mind," said Middleton. "It's very relaxing. It's quiet on the track and I like it that way. I hit the reset button on my brain because I spend a lot of the other time thinking about what I'm going to do next, or wondering, 'Have I done this? Have I done that?' There are so many bases you have to cover with a horse. It was always the dream to own a farm and own some horses. It's stress relief for me. The time I have on the track, I use it to free my mind, really. It's peaceful. I always look forward to it."

The path to sitting in the jog cart and his present involvement in the sport was plotted out – even if he wasn't aware at the time – long before he ever called his first race.

A life-long fan of harness racing, Middleton developed an instant love for all things standardbred the first moment he stood rail-side and watched the horses rocket by him.

"I have always been a fan of racing. When I was on the backstretch, the days when I was helping out my dad, I was always fascinated by the horses. One day, I decided to get into the ownership side with some lower-level horses. I love the game and it's given me so much. I look at it as my way of giving back to it. And to be around the horses, that's something I've never taken for granted and I know never will."

His bond with horses and horse racing has never been stronger.

Middleton's connection with Bob Loblaw is very much the same.

Come Saturday night at Mohawk, the horse with the star on his right hind pastern will take on 11 formidable rookie stars when he contests the biggest race of his career to date.

His No. 1 fan will be cheering him on the moment the gate swings open and the field is sent on their way.

For as long as the race takes from start to finish, Middleton will do, without having to remind himself once, what makes him one of the best in the business.

"I try to be aware of where my horse is in the race, but I can't always do that. It's easy for me to do my job because I know have capable people taking care of him on race night and the guy [Sylvain Filion] driving him, he's a pro."

Just like the man behind the Mohawk mic.

"I'm always rooting for my horse on the inside, but my job is to call it as it is."

Mohawk Million field is a delightful handicapping puzzle

A year after a colt beat a favored filly in the inaugural edition of the Mohawk Million, the fillies have upped it even more this time around. Up from three last year, four of the 10 entrants in the Mohawk Million time around are fillies and it includes the sensational and unbeaten Walner filly Venerable going up against the once-beaten Walner colt King Of The North.

Top to bottom, the talent in this year's field far surpasses that of last year's, and there are parallels, as well. Last year, the filly Donna Soprano took favoritism over the colt Venerate, and in the end Venerate pulled off the mild upset over Donna Soprano. This year looks similar. King Of The North rates as the 5-2 morning line favorite with Venerable right behind at 3-1 and I can't say who the public will end up making the favorite. If it were me, Venerable would be the favorite but I could see a colt from post two getting more traction than a filly from post nine.

VENERABLE is unbeaten and untouched and for all we know could be a generational type of trotting filly. Through recent years these 2-year-old trotting fillies have held their own against their male counterparts in the speed category and I doubt that driver David Miller is going into the race intimidated. Venerable made some decent filly trotters look ordinary throughout her entire freshmen campaign and I'm not prepared to go against her right now. KING OF THE NORTH is a tougher call. He made hard work of it in the Wellwood final last out despite a perfect second-over trip, but he was eventually able to push past nearing the wire to gain an automatic berth into this race. He could easily win, but his last two haven't been as dominant as those wins at the Meadowlands were during the summer. DOVER IN MOTION reminds me of Swandre The Giant as a precocious looking unbeaten 2-year-old coming out of Indiana to face open company this time of year. I can't add anything more than what you can already see on paper; anxious to see if he's really this good. DULY RESOLVED was awesome when fending off Letsdoit S three back and almost just as impressive when it looked like he was going to hold off King Of The North two back, but then regressed last out in his Ontario Sires Stakes Gold race. He lost that night to STAR POWER HANOVER, whose race prior was a no-excuse third in a non-winners of 1-go figure. SELFIE QUEEN is another filly capable of winning. A 1:51.2 winner three back at Lexington, she took a lot of action four back against Venerable in a race where she broke when stuck to the inside. Driver Andrew McCarthy won this race last year and his chance this time is VALENTINA BLU; seems like a stretch to win but could land a piece.

Race 3 — Milton Pace final

James MacDonald did the job last week subbing in for Tetrick on LYONS SENTINEL as she won impressively with minimal effort. She wasn't asked until right before three quarters when she left the inside for the first time in the race and went by the leaders in no time; there's not any real reason to go against. For MacDonald, it's back to SO MUCH MORE who had the misfortune of landing post 10 for the second straight major final. She was actually very good in the Roses Are Red final when she was shuffled out of it after securing a good early spot from the outside post. She stayed on last week through the stretch when it first looked like she may not be anywhere close; will be blasting and could be a surprise. PEAKY SNEAKY wasn't bad in her elimination, pacing a couple of lengths off the winners cover; McCarthy may have to force the issue early. ROCKNIFICENT is

always right there. KARMA SEELSETER upset from third over in her elimination in a race where it seemed like they were all hanging late.

Race 4- Simcoe

There's no one overly intimidating so let's take a swing with WARRAWEE WHISPER. Trixton gelding has been connecting with Drury and has the speed to be well positioned again, didn't disgrace himself in his Goodtimes races and will offer a price. LOCATELLI looked great in winning his Goodtimes elimination but then gapped off cover and didn't fire in the final; I'm guessing he'll go off as the favorite. PUBLICITY SEEKER is another that raced well in his Goodtimes elimination but then tired from the pocket in the final when he couldn't keep with Fashion Frenzie and was passed late by a wide rally from longshot RITSON. Race 6 — She's A Great Lady

A year after campaigning 3-year-old Party Girl Hill, the same owner, trainer and driver connections send out 2-year-old pacing sensation NIKI HILL. Unbeaten in four starts, Dunn had her geared down last week in an elimination that went nearly two full seconds quicker than the other, could be special. BOUDOIR HANOVER almost beat Niki Hill in that one's first lifetime start at the Meadowlands and gave game chase last week; paced a big third guarter two back in the Champlain. JOYRIDE HANOVER was raging with pace once she was able to angle for clearance in last week's elimination. That was an impressive Woodbine Mohawk debut and there could be more coming. PROHIBITION LEGAL gets the ultimate test to keep her unbeaten streak intact; had it her own way in last week's elimination win. QUEEN OF SUCCESS flattened a bit late from the pocket last week in a race where BALANCE showed quick early foot but was no match for the top pair. JUST DIVINE had the unenviable task of pacing her final turn last out uncovered into Niki Hill; have a feeling that she'll be better.

Race 7 — Metro Pace

The Metro required no eliminations this year, and CAVIART CAMDEN is just two races removed from that world record 1:48.3 mile. That time itself is somewhat of an aberration since him nor anyone else from that race has come close to that time either before or after, but he's obviously talented and I'm anxious to see how his Lexington form measures up here. PA sire stake

champ TRUE BLUE LINDY won the Dream Maker here in August couldn't have been more game in winning his sire stake finals at the Meadows last out; it looked for sure that he was going to be passed at multiple points by WEARINMYSIXSHOOTER after he cleared to the lead with a brush to the front going up the backside. WEARINMYSIXSHOOTER seeks redemption after breaking early here in the Nassagaweya. MARKET BASED popped pocket early in the Champlain but was repelled by the winner; gets a new driver in Andrew McCarthy as Dunn sticks with Taker's colt. BOB LOBLAW looked like he was gapping in the Champlain even before the break.

Picks: True Blue Lindy, Caviart Camden, Wearinmysixshooter

Race 10, Ontario Sire Stakes — Gold

This OSS Gold race pits the North America Cup winner against the odds-on favorite from that race, but there's another contender lurking that could get them both. Starting with the Cup winner, DESPERATE MAN got his due on the big stage when he surged off cover to go past among others, Perfect Sting. He's been out of position in a few of the races he's lost but showed that when close enough he's more than good enough; can't be too far out of it now starting from post two in a field of seven. BULLDOG HANOVER through in a clunker in the North America Cup, simple as that. He was monstrous in his elimination but didn't have the same punch last out in a race where he got off super easy on the front end. Which Bulldog shows up now? POWERTRAIN crushed in the 3-year-old open on the same night as the North America Cup, and won that race nearly two full seconds quicker. That was an extremely impressive race and I think he's both fast and classy enough to beat the top two. BETTOR SUN was actively used last out in the Simcoe.

Mohawk Million preview

The Mohawk Million is now in its second year and will feature four fillies, three geldings and three colts.

The trotters in the inside five posts are 11-for-34 combined — 33 per cent.

Those with the five outside posts are 28-for-36 combines -78 per cent.

The entire field has a win rate of 55.7 per cent (39-for-70)

Julie Miller won the inaugural Mohawk Million with Venerate. Steve Stewart bred last year's winner and he looks to go back to back with Venerable.

Venerate finished at 10 5-0-3 \$772,914 last year as the leading freshman earner among all trotters in the sport.

If Venerable wins, she will close in on the all-time freshman filly mark for trotters in earnings (\$1,252,646 by Snow White in 2007).

If King Of The North wins, he will set the all-time earnings record for a freshman trotting colt surpassing Deweycheatumnhowe's mark from 2007 of \$936,191 — for the same stable (Schnittker). King Of The North comes in at \$601,890.

Steve Jones bred Deweycheatumnhowe, a better than \$3.1 million career earner. He also bred King Of The North along with Ray Schnittker.

Valentina Blu is from the breeders of Somebeachsomewhere: Spring Haven Farms.

Valentia Blu's driver, Andy McCarthy, won the two richest races of 2020 including this one.

The inside four posts are all trained by a Hambletonian-winning conditioner: Ray Schnittker, Luc Blais (#1 and 3) and Tony Alagna.

Sixty per cent of the field is by first-crop sires: Walner (3), Resolve (1), What The Hill (1) and Dover Dan (1).

Four come in off winning streaks: Selfie Queen (three-race streak); Venerable (7); The Mighty Hill (3) and Dover In Motion (6).

If David McDuffee doesn't already have the "Owner of the Year" trophy, he'll be even tougher to beat if Venerable wins. If Venerable wins and remains undefeated it is dé-ja vu for

McDuffee and Mel Hartmann. They were also on board for Bee A Magician in 2013 as the unblemished sophomore filly set the all-time earnings record for a single female trotting season surpassing Moni Maker in the Moni Maker stake.

Who will be the favorite? Only King Of The North and Dover In Motion have been favored in every start. Venerable paid \$7.60 as second choice in her debut.

James Macdonald (The Mighty Hill) and Sylvain Filion (Mischevious Rose) will debut for the first time with their freshmen.

Brothers have never gone 1-2 in the same million-dollar race. James and Mark Macdonald have a chance.

Dover In Motion has won all six by a combined 27 3/4 lengths. (Venerable by 16 combined lengths).

Jamie Macomber won the 2017 Breeders Crown with Beckhams Z Tam over Downbytheseaside at her home track — Hoosier Park. No Indiana-bred trotter has ever won a million-dollar race. Dover In Motion, was bred by Lyle Slabach of Topeka, IN.

Shes A Great Lady

It's been a quarter century since Shes A Great Lady and Jennas Beach Boy won the Breeders Crown in back-to-back races at the Meadowlands for the same connections — trainer Joe Holloway and owner L & L DeVisser.

Holloway is not in this year's race, but his 2015 Breeders Crown winning Divine Caroline is the dam of Just Divine.

Metro maidens

Nautical Hanover and Atlas Hanover are the two maidens in here. The purse is \$824,000. The richest pot ever won by a maiden was this race in 2003 when Camelot Hall won.

Team McNair

All four acknowledge that being a caretaker is not for everyone. A passion for horses and harness racing is a must, and in the McNair barn a good sense of humour is essential. As Cayer talked about the connection she forged with Swift Alley in her first

year with the team, her co-workers chimed in with affectionate jibes about how the now 5-year-old mare runs away from her in the paddock.

One of the youngest members of the team — aside from D. J. Lawrence, who officially joined the staff this spring after spending his childhood following his mom around the barn — Cayer noted that since she started working with horses she has learned as much about herself as she has about harness racing.

"It did help to find out a lot of sides of my personality I didn't know, and make me work on myself way more than every other job I have been in," said Cayer. "I think it made me grow up and made me see a lot of my personality."

Each day, the group works together to get all of the horses exercised and then spends time attending to the unique needs of the horses currently assigned to their care. They all have favourites, both past and present.

"Going back a long time ago, Run To The Bank was my favourite horse," said O'Hagan, who has been working with McNair since the late 1980s after running her own stable for a number of years. "He was my favorite, you couldn't beat old Red. And then I would have to say, more recently, I took care of The Rev, he was a really

good horse, and right now Century Heineken is my favourite."

The team approach also extends to cheering on the stable's horses, like pacing mare Karma Seelster and Century Heineken, who are headed to Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday, Sept. 25 for the \$240,000 Milton Pace Final and a \$155,600 Ontario Sires Stakes three-year-old pacing colt Gold Series Leg.

"It's just a big team effort. If you don't look after it day-to-day you still cheer for it," said Lawrence, as O'Hagan pointed out that summer stakes success seeds the fall yearling sale fund. "Exactly, it goes right back into the pot for next year."

Always-on-the-go Susie McNair said their shared passion for horses and affection for each other has created an environment where the horses thrive and the people genuinely enjoy coming to work each day.

"I look forward to coming to work every day, I really do, except of course if it's snowing," said McNair with a laugh. "Then I want to be in Florida. I'm spoiled with that, as well. It will be our 10th or 11th winter this fall when we go down."

Cayer and Ron O'Neill typically make the trip to Okeechobee, FL with the McNairs each winter, while the rest of the staff stays home to keep the Ontario operation humming along.

Emelia Gillespie, Blake MacIntosh Stable

Emelia Gillespie got her start in harness racing through an equine program in Sweden that offered an opportunity for a work placement in the United States. That experience was the start of an eight-year stretch working as a caretaker in the U.S. before she made the move to Canada. After knowing MacIntosh for a number of years, Gillespie joined his staff three seasons ago and said it will likely be her final stop as a caretaker.

"Blake is a great boss. He's temperamental for sure, like everyone knows, but as a boss he is fantastic. He'd give his shirt off his back for us," she explained. "If I were to do something else I would never go to another trainer. If I quit it would be to do something different."

Like her peers in the McNair barn, Gillespie said a career as a caretaker resembles a calling more than a job and she dedicates countless hours to the horses in her care, including 2-year-old trotting filly Clockwork Orange, who was a Grassroots winner on Sept. 21, and personal favourite Fast N First, who was the sophomore pacing colt Grassroots champion and Little Brown Jug runner-up in 2019 and is currently recovering from an injury.

"I can't even stay away on a Sunday. Even if it is not my Sunday to work I still come in because otherwise I sit at home and stress. I'd rather just come in and check that everything is okay because it's like your kids. I don't have kids and I don't want any, so this is it," said Gillespie, who is married to Woodbine Mohawk Park assistant race secretary Jim Gillespie. "People outside the business are always like, 'Oh well you're working on a holiday.' Yeah, but it's not work though, it's my life. I picked to do this. You've got to love it. That about sums it up I think. You've got to love what you do."

Michelle Olson, Carmen Auciello Stable

As a child growing up in northern Ontario, Michelle Olson used to tell her parents that she wanted to be a jockey when she grew up. The Peterborough resident has not ticked that box on her horse racing resume yet, but she does exercise Quarter Horse racehorses, holds her standardbred trainer/driver license and is an owner and breeder.

She has worked in the Carmen Auciello stable for about five years and there is not an aspect of harness racing that she has not embraced with enthusiasm.

"I like the variety of it all. If I was just to groom horses only, I think I would probably get pretty bored of that. I like to keep my mind very active on all ends of it," Olson said. "I love driving horses, I love babies, I like getting connected with horses in the barn and I like going to the track, so I kind of like most of it to be honest."

Long-term Olson would like to operate her own training business and is soaking up all the opportunities to learn that Auciello's sizeable operation provides. With barns in Port Perry, Guelph and New York the stable door is a revolving one, offering a wide variety of horses to work with and problems to solve.

"It's a very, very fluently run business and it almost takes the guess work out of it," said Olson. "I'm just grateful for all the opportunities I've come across."

Olson currently owns two horses that she works on alongside trainer Roger Ferguson, who introduced her to harness racing in 2009, including Slim Shady, the first horse she took from the foaling shed to the winner's circle.

Sandra Perreault, Richard Moreau Stable

After graduating from the equine program at the Institut de Technologie Agroalimentaire in La Pocatière, QC, Sandra Perreault intended to pursue a career as a trainer. As she gained experience she realised that working as a caretaker was a better fit for her personality and she has spent most of the last three decades plying her trade across North America.

"Later on, I found out maybe that's not really what I want. It's too much going on, too much pressure dealing with the owners, and I didn't want to do that," said Perreault of her original goal. "For me, horses, that's my life. It's so fun to be around them. It's also an outside job, me I don't like to be in an office. You've got to love the horses though, because it's a lot of hours."

Rather than hanging out her own shingle, Perreault opted to purchase shares of horses in the stables where she worked and in recent years she has owned and trained a horse of her own alongside her duties in the Richard Moreau barn. At present she is campaigning five-year-old Sunshine Beach gelding Excaliber Seelster in the claiming ranks at Woodbine Mohawk Park and among her all-time favourite horses is 11-year-old pacing gelding Oakrock Eldorado, who she claimed and lost in 2020.

Among Perreault's current charges for Moreau is pacing mare Lit De Rose, who will face off against Karma Seelster in the \$240,000 Milton Pace Final on Saturday. She also cares for 6-year-old pacing geldings Real Surreal and Stelios and three-year-old pacing filly Windsun Gaga, who will compete in the Prospect Series Finals at Grand River Raceway on Friday, Sept. 24.

"I'd rather take care of babies than racehorses, but at Richard's he doesn't have that many babies. He has more racehorses and claimers," said Perreault. "A lot of grooms don't like it, it's more work and you've got to teach them everything and it's different, but I like working with babies."

Whether they are teaching young horses the ropes, working to keep stakes horses in tip-top shape or nursing a veteran campaigner through an injury, Ontario's caretakers are the engine that keep the industry moving. They have our heartfelt thanks.

Breeders Crown moves to the afternoon for its Saturday dates at The Meadowlands

Since its inception in 1984, change has been part of the Breeders Crown, and this year is no exception.

All 12 finals will still take place on the same weekend at The Meadowlands, with the 2-year-olds on Friday night (Oct. 29), but this time, the 3-year-olds and open races will take place Saturday afternoon (Oct. 30).

The Meadowlands would have preferred to have all the races at night but that isn't possible because Monmouth Park's "Monmouth at The Meadowlands" turf meeting is scheduled at the same time.

"We asked them [if we could race at night on the Saturdays] and they said 'no' and under the law they have the right to race from the day after the Hambletonian to December 12th," said Meadowlands' president and chief executive officer Jeff Gural. "So, they don't have to let us race at all."

Thanks to Gural's good relationship with Dennis Drazin, chairman and chief executive officer of Darby Development, the operator of Monmouth Park, a compromise was reached where Monmouth would not race at all on the two Crown Friday nights and would allow The Meadowlands to race during the day on the two Crown Saturdays, prior to Monmouth's night cards.

"There was a deal, I believe it was directly between the SBOA and Darby Development, to forgo those racing days for the benefit of the Breeders Crown," said John Heims, Monmouth's director of racing/race secretary. "We were approved for our race dates back in November 2020, so those dates are set in stone by the commission. Any change or alteration from that would require commission approval."



Initially, Monmouth was approved to race every weekend in October with the exception of Saturday, the 15th, when the 100th running of the Far Hills race meeting, a steeplechase event in New Jersey, will take place.

The New Jersey Racing Commission met on Wednesday and approved Monmouth's request to drop the two Fridays as well as approve The Meadowlands racing on those Friday nights and Saturday afternoons.

"I'm sure glad that everybody came together and we got a deal done to where we can have the Breeders Crown at The Meadowlands in 2021, because of the tremendous impact it has on the standardbred economy in New Jersey," said Mark Ford, president of the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOA). "Thank you Jeff Gural for going the extra mile."

The weekend of the Crown eliminations, first post on Friday (Oct. 22) is 6:15 p.m., while on Saturday (Oct. 23) the races will kick off at noon. The same post times apply, respectively, to the Finals on Oct. 29 and 30. Monmouth's turf races will take place on Oct. 23 and Oct. 30, starting at 7 p.m.

Everyone connected to the Crown would have preferred to race at night on Friday and Saturday, but are appreciative of not having to change the dates.

"It is what it is," said Gural. "They didn't have to let us do anything. The reality is the Hambletonian is raced during the day. The Little Brown Jug is raced during the day. The Breeders' Cup races during the day. I think racing during the day on Friday would have been bad because people work. We'll have a big crowd there for college football on Saturday afternoon. Keep in mind, we may do better [with the handle]. We'll be able to export our signal to Europe, which may help us."

Daytime racing will have the Breeders Crown vying for attention and dollars with many popular thoroughbred signals.

"I do agree with Jeff, I think our European market will see an uptick because of the afternoon," said John Campbell, president and chief executive officer of the Hambletonian Society. "The afternoon on the domestic market is really unknown. As with any race card, it doesn't matter where you are, it's about fitting your signal and races in the right slots in between the major signals whether that be night or afternoon. And we're going to make every effort to do that."

The Meadowlands has previously played host to 91 Breeders Crown Finals and ranks behind only Woodbine Racetrack, which has hosted 95. The Big M will move to the top of the list by the end of October with 103 and since Woodbine no longer contests standardbred racing, The Meadowlands will hold a sizeable lead on the next track on the list, Mohawk Raceway, now known as Woodbine Mohawk Park, with 56.

"Charlie Keller III started back, I want to say, in 2015 probably, saying since we had interest, we should try to get a three-year rotation because we take three years' worth of payments and when you're paying in a yearling or a 2-year-old, you sort of would like to know what you're paying into," said Moira Fanning, director of publicity/chief operating officer for the Hambletonian Society.

Starting in 2017, the three-year rotation was Hoosier Park, Pocono Downs and Woodbine Mohawk Park, and then back to Hoosier in 2020. Even though The Meadowlands, which had played host to the Crown in 2014 and 2016, was not part of that initial rotation, they were always considered in the mix.

"You can't talk about being at the top tracks in North America and not include The Meadowlands in that rotation every couple of years," said Fanning.

The Breeders Crown plans to announce its 2022 venue sometime in October.



Cullipher supplements Lovedbythemasses to Caesars Trotting Classic

The race is part of a stakes-rich card tonight at Harrah's Hoosier Park featuring more than \$1.4 million in purses.

Harrah's Hoosier Park will play host to a packed Grand Circuit card tonight (Sept. 24). Over the course of the 15-race program, more than \$1.4 million in purses will be up for grabs. The evening's races are headlined by the \$210,000 Caesars Trotting Classic, an event that began as the Centaur Trotting Classic, and is now in its ninth edition. Trainer Jeff Cullipher will send out his first Caesars Trotting Classic starter in Lovedbythemasses, 10-1 on the morning line and drawing post nine. The horse was supplemented for a fee of \$20,000.

"We supplemented to the race; we put up the \$20,000," said Cullipher. "The race is extremely tough. We don't know how he'll stack up against the good horses here, but we're going to take a shot. Sometimes you've got to take big risks."

Cullipher, who has collected multiple Hoosier Park training titles and is currently locked in a battle with Erv Miller atop the standings this year, hopes to have a good showing this weekend in Indiana and north of the border. Lovedbythemasses was purchased by the Middletown, IN resident and his partner, Tom Pollack, in early January. In 23 seasonal starts, the 4-year-old Muscle Mass—Incredibility gelding has logged seven wins and four third-place finishes, banking \$134,280. Lovedbythemasses took his seasonal and career mark of 1:50.2 winning the Vincennes in August.

"He's turned out to be a pretty class horse. I think he's legit," said Cullipher. "If we knew this horse would turn out to be what he is, we would have nominated him to this race."

Tim Tetrick will guide the 4-year-old against the likes of Majestic Player A, Lindy The Great, Guardian Angel As, Sermon, Ready For Moni, It's Academic, Forbidden Trade and Oney Hall. Lindy The Great, fresh off his Maple Leaf Trot score, has been installed as the 5-2 morning line favorite and will start from post two with Andy Miller at the lines.

Cullipher and Pollack, have fared well in and outside the Hoosier State in September. Last Sunday, they scored a Kentucky Championship Series final with sophomore Goldie's Legacy. The Always A Virgin-sired product captured the \$250,000 event in



a time of 1:49, holding off Komodo Beach by a neck at the Red Mile. With two wins in the opening rounds of Indiana Sires Stakes action, Goldie's Legacy currently ranks sixth in points and could add another championship in the mid-October Super Final at Hoosier Park.

The partnership also picked up a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes final in early September with one of their newer acquisitions, True Blue Lindy. The Always B Miki—Think Pink gelding captured the \$254,000 final for freshman colts by a neck in a time of 1:52.1 as the favorite. True Blue Lindy will make his third start for Cullipher in Saturday's (Sept. 25) \$824,000 Metro Stake.

The freshman sports a record of 5-2-0 in seven starts, three of those wins coming at Woodbine Mohawk Park before his sale. True Blue Lindy has drawn post eight, with Tetrick listed to drive. Cullipher and Pollack will be on hand Saturday night to cheer for their entry.

"We're flying up Saturday morning. We're very excited," Cullipher said. "We really bought this colt more for next year, but he's turning out to be pretty good this year. It's not every day that you can buy a (1):51 2-year-old."

The owner and trainer said that normally they stay away from racing in Canada due to what is involved with crossing the border. For this colt, also eligible to the Breeders Crown, they made an exception.

"This is why we take the chance. We think we have one of the top horses in the race," Cullipher said. "That's the great thing about having Tom as a partner. He's not scared of anything and I'd like to give it a whirl."

Regardless of this weekend's outcome, the partnership is gaining a reputation for taking necessary risks and putting horses in big races. Perhaps their efforts will be rewarded sooner rather than later.

The Caesars Trotting Classic headlines Hoosier Park's tonight's card, but the program boasts seven other top stakes races attracting Grand Circuit-caliber talent. The \$200,000 Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stake for freshman filly trotters has attracted a field of six. New Jersey Sire Stakes final winner Joviality S is the 3-5 morning line favorite. R Desirable Lady, thrice a runner-up in Indiana Sires Stakes action, is the 7-2 second choice.

A field of eight freshmen will contest the \$200,000 Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stake for pacing fillies. Lyons Serenity, a winner in six of seven seasonal starts, is the 5-2 favorite for Jim King Jr. The Ron Burke-trained Cape Cod Hanover, starting from the outside post, is 3-1. Burke also sends out Dragon Lady (4-1) and No Foolin (20-1). Cullipher's Always Gonna B You, a 1:51.2 Indiana Sires Stakes winner, is 9-2 and will start from post three.

The \$182,000 Harrah's Hoosier Park Pacing Derby features several free-for-all pacers that battled last month at the Anderson oval in the Dan Patch Stakes. Catch The Fire, who split horses late to capture the Dan Patch in August, has been installed as the 7-2 favorite. He will start from the second tier in post 10. This Is The Plan will look to make it three straight for Burke after winning the 2019 and 2020 editions. He lines up in post six as the 4-1 second choice. Local interests Tellmeaboutit and Little Rocket Man, second and fourth in the Dan Patch, have drawn posts seven and nine, respectively.

The speedy Fulfullnmydestiny leads a field of eight freshman colt pacers — six of the Indiana-sired two-year-olds — in the \$120,000 Elevation. Trained and driven by James Yoder for Brett Boyd Racing, the son of Tellitlikeitis brings a 7-4-2-0 record into his first Grand Circuit test. A 1:49.2 winner in his last start, Fulfullnmydestiny starts from post six as the 4-5 favorite. Ponda Warrior, another top Indiana Sires Stakes colt, starts to

his outside for Jay Hochstetler. Brandon Bates will drive.

Iteration, the 5-2 morning line selection trained by Marcus Melander, leads a group of seven sophomore trotting fillies in the \$115,000 Moni Maker. The Chapter Seven—Steamy Windows filly tops the field with \$429,483 in seasonal earnings. She will be driven by Brian Sears. Swift Swanda, a winner in seven of 10 starts, is 3-1, and Darlene Hanover, a 1:51.4 winner, is 7-2 for trainer Brett Bittle.

First post for Hoosier Park's Caesars Trotting Classic program is 6:30 p.m.





Fox Valley Gemini looks to extend his Night of Champions legacy to five years at Hawthorne

Saturday's stakes card features over \$1 million in purses.

Can Fox Valley Gemini extend his unprecedented Night of Champions winning streak to five consecutive years or will He'zzz A Wise Guy make it three years in a row?

That's one of the many story lines for the main event in Illinois racing scheduled for Saturday night (Sept. 25) at Hawthorne Racecourse.

Both pacers will be competing in the \$64,000 Robert S. Molaro Memorial for older males, one of 11 Illinois-bred championship races on a program that offers an aggregate pot of \$1,009,500.

Fox Valley Gemini, a 6-year-old gelding owned by Jim Ballinger, trained by Terry Leonard and driven by his son, Casey Leonard, will be in quest of his third victory in a row in the Molaro after capturing the Robert F. Carey Memorial for 3-year-old colts and geldings in 2018 and the Incredible Finale for 2-year-old males in 2017.

Last year, Fox Valley Gemini went into the Molaro with a four-race winning streak, but this year he has finished second in his last four starts following a victory at the State Fair in Springfield on Aug. 14.

"He's had a good year (five firsts and eight seconds in 15 starts) but lately he's had a bad case of seconditis," Casey said.

"He'zz A Wise Guy is awfully tough; I'm glad we drew inside of him. We going to give it our best shot."

The 4-year-old He'zzz A Wise Guy drew the No. 7 starting slot, while Fox Valley Gemini drew No. 6 in the field of eight.

Like Fox Valley Gemini, He'zzz A Wise Guy is a son of Yankee Skyscraper and he too won the Incredible Finale at age 2 and the Carey Memorial at 3 (en route to being crowned Illinois Horse of the Year).

He is owned by Triple Zzz Stable and trained by his breeder, John Filomeno (in partnership with Joann Filomeno). At the reins will be Kyle Wilfong, who is second to Leonard in the Hawthorne driver standings.

In winning his Molaro elimination race by 2 3/4 lengths over



Fox Valley Gemini, He'zzz A Wise Guy led all the way. That triumph gave him a 2021 composite consisting of 8 wins, 3 places and 6 shows in 19 starts for earnings of \$95,650.

The previous week He'zzz A Wise Guy finished an out-of-character and inexplicable sixth in an open pace at Hawthorne.

"He just wasn't himself," Wilfong said, "(but) in his last start he was ready to rock. I'd have to assume he's ready to rock again."

Although it pits the two marquee horses, the purse for the Molaro is the smallest of the night.

The richest race is the \$138,000 Incredible Finale. This one looks like a duel involving Fox Valley Ozzy and Get E Up.

Casey Leonard drives Fox Valley Ozzy for owners Steven A McMacKin and David Lee Samuelson and trainer Gary Rath, while Get E Up is co-owned by driver/trainer Kyle Husted (in partnership with David J. Brigham and John Schwartz).

Get E Up won three in a row at the State Fairs at Springfield and DuQuoin before finishing second, 1 ½ lengths back of Fox Valley Ozzy in their elimination. It was Fox Valley Ozzy's third victory in a row following a pair of losses by a neck inflicted by Get E Up at Springfield.

"He has been great," Leonard raved in critiquing a 2-year-old campaign that has seen Fox Valley Ozzy record seven triumphs and two places in nine races. "Gary has done a great job of training him. Since Day 1 he has been racing like an older horse and he has never been sharper.

"His post position (No. 8) isn't great but I think he has enough speed to overcome it.

"Kyle's horse (Get E Up, starting from post 6) is right there with him—they've been 1-2 in their division all year and it'll kind of depend on the trip."

Get E Up's past performance sheet shows four firsts, two seconds and a third in seven starts.

Trainer Steve Searle will have Leonard in the sulky when he sends out Loulita in her attempt to become a Night of Champions winner for the second time in as many years. After taking the Fox Valley Flan for 2-year-old filly trotters last year, Loulita now is competing in the \$68,500 Beulah Dygert Memorial for 3-year-old fillies.

To accomplish that feat it appears that Loulita will have to

get the best of Breeze at Sunset, who has won seven of her 13 starts for trainer Erv Miller and driver Atlee Bender.

Loulita's 15-race record of seven victories, five seconds and a third compares favorably and in their elimination she stalked Breeze at Sunset throughout the second half of the race in coming within a neck.

"Later this year we were getting caught out front quite a bit so we kind of rethought our strategy and last time she finished with a lot of trot," Leonard said of Loulita.

"Erv and Atlee have done a nice job with Breeze At Sunset and that's the filly to beat. But she didn't draw very well (outside in a field of seven) and hopefully we can get a good trip (from the No. 3 slot)."

Wilfong, Willis and Annas Lucky Star look like the winning combination in the \$68,500 Plesac Trot for 3-year-olds and up of both sexes.

The 7-year-old mare has a 97-race lifetime record of 47 wins, 16 places and 5 shows and a bankroll of \$469,402 for owner/

breeder Danny Graham.

"Anything you want to do with her she's capable of doing," Wilfong said. "I can always depend on her. I've been lucky enough to drive her from her 2-year-old year. I'm grateful to be along for the ride. I can always depend on her. Anything you want her to do she's capable of doing."

Annas Lucky Star is one of four mares competing against six makes,

"She's not afraid to race against the boys," Wilfong said, citing her past success.

Exhibit A is her elimination race in which she led all the way in prevailing by 3/4ths of a length.

Numbered among Saturday's male adversaries is defending champion Lousraptor. The 5-year-old gelding--bred and owned by Flacco Family Farms, trained by Searle and driven by Juan Franco--will be trying to snap out of a slump that has seen him finish out of the mutuel money in his last three outings and he will have to overcome the No. 10 starting slot.

Bootsy Bombay, upset winner of last year's Incredible Tillie for 2-year-old filly pacers, finds herself in a similar situation in the \$76,000 Plum Peachy for 3-year-old fillies. She is winless in 11 starts and has finished second only once for owner James Greer and trainer Nick Prather. In last year's race Bootsy Bombay was driven by Travis Seekman but now Husted is her regular reinsman.

Although she will have to overcome the No. 9 post position in a field of 10, Hart's Heart looks like the miss with the most class in the race. In her last four races at Springfield, DuQuoin and Hawthorne, she boasts three wins and a second.

The elimination was the most impressive of those outings for trainer Mike Brink and owner/breeders Donna Crebs and Judy Conzo—crushing the competition she won by 5 lengths with Wilfong in the sulky.

"She's been tough all year," Wilfong said. "She has done it on the front end and she can come from the back. The 9-hole (in a 10-horse race) doesn't concern me. I truly believe she is the best horse in the class."

A pair of 2020 champions can be found in the \$66,400 Tony Maurello Memorial for aged mares—defending champion Allbeastnobeauty and Plum Peachy heroine Fox Valley Exploit.

The 4-year-old Fox Valley Exploit has three triumphs and a nose loss to show for her last five starts for Husted, her driver/trainer/co-owner (with David Brigham), while the 6-year-old Allbeastnobeauty emerged from a mild slump to lead all the way in winning her elimination for driver/trainer Todd Warren and owners Brookside Stables and Keith Ravis

Another 2020 champion is Fistfullofdollars, winner of the Kadabra for 2-year-old colt and gelding trotters. He will try for an encore in the \$97,500 Erwin Dygert Memorial for 3-year-old males but the odds appear to be stacked sky-high against him. A third is his best effort in 13 starts this year and he will have to overcome the outside post position in the 10-horse race.

Sumbodygetdisfool has been a workaholic on the fair circuit and his 24-race past performance sheet shows 9 wins, 5 places and 4 shows and \$62,769 for owner Laquinton Shavers and trainer Roshun Trigg. At Hawthorne this month, with Todd Warren in the bike, the gelding rebounded from a fourth place finish to impressively win his Erwin Dygert elimination race.

In the \$79,000 Robert F. Carey Jr. Memorial for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers, Casey and Terry Leonard appear to have the best horse in Ideal Big Guy. He has vital statistics of 4 victories, 1 second and 4 thirds in 12 races this year and his bankroll of \$58,780 is by far the biggest in the 10-horse test.

"We bought him as a yearling with a group of our owners," recalled Casey. "We knew that year was kind of an all-time low in numbers (of Illinois yearlings) so we tried to find one that we liked. He has turned out to be a pretty decent horse. I think if he can win this he can lock up divisional honors."

The \$120,500 Fox Valley Flan Trot is the second richest race on the card and Funky Wiggle is the most precocious member of the 2-year-old freshman filly class. With Wilfong doing the driving, she flaunts 7 wins and 3 places in 11 races for owner Dr. Patrick Graham and trainer Curt Grummel and she boasts a five-race winning streak.

"She definitely has been on her A game the whole time," Wilfong said. "Curt has done a great job. He handed the lines over to me and all I had to do was put her in the right spot.

"The last time she got beat (second by a 4-length margin at Springfield in mid-August) the track was very wet and, on top of that, the race was delayed. It was a case of take care of your horse and do what you have to do to make sure she comes back okay."

The \$114,000 Kadabra for 2-year-old colt and gelding trotters also has a standout—his name is Fox Valley Cairo and his 10-race record reads 6 triumphs, 2 seconds and 1 third for earnings of \$69,643.

Since mid-August he has gone to the winner's circles at Springfield, DuQuoin and Hawthorne three times and placed once.

Rollnroz has the most victories (11 in 18 starts) and has earned the most money (\$60,348) among the 10 contestants in the \$117,000 Incredible Tillie for 2-year-old filly pacers but most of his races for owners Eric and Rosalind James, trainer Trigg and driver Archie Buford have come on the fair circuit.

Lightly-raced Apple Valley (three firsts and a second in six outings) has the tools to be the sleeper, according to Wilfong.

"I thought she was one of the best fillies in the state the first couple times I qualified her," said the driver. "She had tremendous potential. Then (in August when she finished fifth and sixth after being sent off the favorite both times) I don't know what happened. Maybe she just needed the time off.

"Last week (in returning to action in her elimination at Hawthorne) she showed up in a really big way (coming from far back to win by a length). Her last quarter was very impressive. She definitely has a fighting chance (in the Kadabra)."

Owner Michael Perrin and trainer James Molitor are hoping that Apple Valley lives up to Wilfong's expectations.



Purses raised on six Breeders Crown events

The Hambletonian Society, which owns and administers the \$6.6 million Breeders Crown series, will raise purses on six of the 12 divisions of the Breeders Crown championship races to held at The Meadowlands on Friday, Oct. 29 and Saturday, Oct. 30.

A Breeders Crown title remains one of the most sought-after in harness racing, as indicated by the year-end Dan Patch awards, where Breeders Crown winners dominate divisional championships and Horse of the Year honors.

"The Breeders Crown program is funded from many segments of the industry — breeders, owners, horsemen and stallion nominators to name a few, and the ability to raise the purses based on participation illustrates the commitment and popularity of the Breeders Crown series," said John Campbell, president of the Hambletonian Society.

"Our host tracks and nominators held strong through the pandemic and continuing and maintaining stability for those who support stakes events remains the Society's number one priority."

All sophomore classes will go up by \$100,000 to \$600,000, as will the Breeders Crown Open Pace and Open Trot. The Breeders Crown Mare Trot and Pace will remain at \$300,000 each.

For the sixth straight year the 2-year-old Breeders Crown events will race for \$600,000, making them among the richest offered for that age group in North America.

The Society's mission statement since 1926 has focused on supporting and promoting the breeding of Standardbred horses. Keeping two-year-old purses at a high level benefits breeders and helps owners with a timely return on their investments.

The 2021 Breeders Crown, presented by Libfeld-Katz Breeding Partnership will take place on the final two weekends in October at the host track of The Meadowlands. The Rutherford, NJ premier one-mile track will complete 103 Breeders Crown events in 2021, the most events held by a single racetrack.

Eliminations for 2-year-old races will be held Friday, Oct. 22, while 3-year-old and older eliminations will race Saturday, Oct. 23.

The freshmen Breeders Crown finals take place Friday, Oct. 29 and the eight three-year-old and up events are set for Saturday, Oct. 30.

P L Opportunity and I Da Princess sparkle in spite of rain

They may have had to travel over a sloppy track, but 3-year-old trotting fillies **P L Opportunity** and **z** still managed to look impressive as they wrapped up their Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots regular season at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Tuesday (Sept. 21).

P L Opportunity kicked off the Grassroots action on the rain-soaked oval, lining up at Post 6 in the first \$22,500 division with driver Trevor Henry at the controls. The pair eased away from the starting gate and settled in fifth as Tealicious led the field to a :28.1 quarter, swinging into the outer lane heading for the :57.2 half. Within hailing distance of the pacesetter by the 1:25.4 three-quarters, P L Opportunity continued to advance down the stretch, collaring Tealicious in the final strides of the 1:54.3 mile. Favorite Rubys Are Nice finished three lengths back in third. (**replay here:** P L Opportunity)

"I was really happy with her, because with three weeks off there I thought she might be a little bit short, but she showed a gutsy effort," said owner/trainer Matt Dupuis of Rockwood, ON, who had opted not to race the filly since her third-place finish in the Aug. 30 Grassroots event. "The last time she raced she wasn't trotting very good so I had to do a few changes on her there, and Trev (Henry) said she was trotting really good tonight. He fits really good with her. He keeps her nice and quiet. He's doing an awesome job, Trev. He's driving her like he owns her."

The win was P L Opportunity's second in Grassroots action and bumped her up to fourth spot in the three-year-old trotting filly standings with 112 points. Dupuis will spend the next nine days preparing the Kadabra daughter for the Oct. 1 Semi-Finals, which will feature the top 20 point earners.

"I just train her lightly, that's all I do. I don't do much with her, try to just keep her happy and healthy and fresh," said the owner/ trainer. "They are getting tired this time of year, that's why I didn't race her for three weeks there, trying to keep her fresh for the Semi-Finals. That's what I was more worried about."

Driver Jody Jamieson opted for a similar trip from Post 6 in the second division, but favorite I Da Princess had the benefit of following Pixies Lady as they advanced on pacesetter Midnight Miracle. Sliding into an open lane in the stretch, I Da Princess steadily reeled in Midnight Miracle, getting a neck in front at the 1:56 finish. Edgewater completed the top three, four and one-half lengths behind the leaders. (**replay here:** I Da Princess)

"She's just a sweetheart to drive and she's been strong since hitting the Grassroots," said Jamieson, who drives I Da Princess for trainer William McClure of Brampton and his co-owner John McClure of Georgetown, ON.

I Da Princess has logged two wins, one second and one fifth in Grassroots action for a point tally of 130 and sole ownership of third spot in the standings. The Il Sogno Dream daughter heads into the post season riding a four-race win streak.

The top 20 point earners will now be looking for a top five finish in the Oct. 1 Semi-Finals in order to advance to the Grassroots Championships at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Oct. 9.

Clockwork Orange quickest in Grassroots season finale

Stormy skies greeted the two-year-old trotting fillies as they gathered at Flamboro Downs for their last regular season Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots contest on Tuesday (Sept. 21), but the weather did not put a damper on their performances.

Clockwork Orange delivered the sharpest effort in the last \$21,450 division, over a track that had been downgraded from 'fast' to 'good' and rated one second slower than normal. Starting from Post 2, driver Paul Mackenzie put the fan favorite on the front and Clockwork Orange reeled off fractions of :29.1, :59 and 1:29.4 on her way to a 1:58.3 victory. Muscle Up The Gold crossed the wire eight lengths behind the winner and Her Grace K was two more lengths back in third.

"After she won the division of the Pure Ivory (July 22) she sort of got off her game a bit and we couldn't figure out what it was. Finally we pulled a T4 (thyroid test) on her and her T4 was on the ground, so we started treating her with thyroid powder and it looks like it's probably bounced her back to where she was," said trainer Blake MacIntosh of St. George, who co-owns the filly with 30 Plus Stable of Trenton, ON. "She just had no energy and that explains why, because she had a low thyroid. So we're hoping that this keeps her going and she can go in the right direction and get back to where she was at the beginning of the season."

Tuesday's win was Clockwork Orange's first since July 22. After a second in the July 13 Grassroots season opener and her win in the Pure Ivory Series, MacIntosh tried the Resolve daughter in the Gold Series for two legs, where she finished second and fifth, before dropping her back down to the Grassroots for the Sept. 13 event, where she finished third. One win, one second and one third in Grassroots action put Clockwork Orange in fifth spot in the two-year-old trotting filly standings with 87 points and will see her advance to the Sept. 30 Semi-Final at

Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Portofino opened the Grassroots regular season finale with a front-end victory from Post 5 that saw her trot under the wire in 1:59.4, four and three-quarter lengths ahead of Complete Life. Trade Secret was two more lengths back in third.

Paul MacDonell piloted the fan favorite to her first lifetime win for trainer Ken Sucee and owner 2790884 Ontario Inc. of Oshawa. Tuesday's win was the Wheeling N Dealin daughter's first in three starts and boosted her Grassroots record to one win and one second for a total of 75 points and a share of seventh spot in the division point standings.

Moneyworth took over top spot in the standings with her second straight Grassroots win in the second division. After easing away from Post 4, driver Scott Young sent the public's second choice up the outer lane and she reeled in pacesetter Global News and drew away in the stretch to a four and one-half length victory in 1:59.3. Global News stayed game for second, holding off Angelonia. Favorite Lovin Julie made an early break and finished fifth.

"She's kind of coming into her own right now, perfect timing with the Semi's coming up," said Paul Reid, who trains the filly for Brian Kleinberg of Madison, NJ. "First up from the half on and still trotted a good mile and Scotty said she was in hand, so that was nice to hear."

With two wins, one fourth and one seventh, Moneyworth finishes up the season with 110 points. The Encore Encore daughter will be joined in the Semi-Finals by stablemate Her Grace K, whose third-place result behind Clockwork Orange bumped her into the top 20.

The top 20 point earners will compete in Semi-Final action on Sept. 30, with the top five finishers from each Semi-Final advancing to the Oct. 9 Grassroots Championships at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

fierce rally from Spooky Punk for a narrow win. Canoe Trip was third. Trained by Nick Callahan, it was the 2nd career win for Wolfpack Russ.

LG's Reed O Wen (\$2.40, Jim Morand) won his third straight race in the second DSBF split in 2:02.3 for owner Nanticoke Racing and trainer Les Givens. The Anders Bluestone gelding was a front end winner over Rivers and Snow Burst.

Just four starters lined behind up the gate in the first female division, in which Art Stafford and Art Stafford Jr.'s **Just Pump It** (\$3.40, Stafford Jr.) prevailed over Larimar and Lady Bluestone in 2:04.2. It was the 1st career start for the winner, who is a daughter of CR Commando for co-owner/trainer/driver Stafford Jr.

Andrew Glassmeyer's **Franky Doyle** (\$4, Pat Berry) won the remaining filly division in 2:05 over Our Last Penny and Giant Arbirtration. The Glidemaster filly won in her first career start for trainer/owner Glassmeyer.

Six additional states weigh in against Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act

The State of Ohio, joined by the States of Alaska, Arkansas, Idaho, Mississippi, and Nebraska requested leave yesterday to file an amicus brief supporting the effort to persuade the federal court in Lexington, KY to strike down the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) as unconstitutional.

The six amicus states join the States of Oklahoma, West Virginia, and Louisiana, which are already plaintiffs in the case, along with the United States Trotting Association, several state racing commissions, the Oklahoma Quarter Horse Racing Association, several Native American-owned race tracks, and Hanover Shoe Farms, Inc.

In the amicus brief, the States explain that the private corporation that HISA sets up to regulate the racing industry amounts to a private club having governmental powers. It is settled law that the Constitution forbids Congress to set up a private entity to exercise governmental power over the States and the people in them. Accordingly, the States argue, the Court should declare HISA unconstitutional.

"The Congressional Research Service tried to explain these constitutional problems to HISA's legislative sponsors as long

ago as 2015," said USTA president Russell Williams. "The USTA lobbied intensively against HISA and its predecessor bills since then, trying to point out why unconstitutional legislation simply compounds the problems that it was meant to address. But members of the House and Senate went ahead anyway, at the urging of their wealthy racing sponsors, heedless of the constitutional defects now being litigated. Legislation instigated by an elite sliver of an industry should be approached with caution, not slipped into the middle of a 5,500-page, must-pass appropriation measure as HISA was."

"A private entity should have no more power over state functions than the AAA, another private entity, has over issuing, suspending, or revoking motor vehicle driver's licenses," said Joe Faraldo, chairman of the USTA Board of Directors. "Unfortunately, overreaching by private entities is a recurrent problem and the courts have had to deal with it before."

Faraldo quoted the New York Court of Appeals from a case decided in 1951:

We are told that benefits of great worth to the maintenance of proper control over race meetings and to the improvement of the breed of horses have been derived from action by The Jockey Club. Even assuming that fact we are mindful that "nothing is more certain than that beneficent aims, however great or well directed, can never serve in lieu of constitutional power."

"This litigation could take years to reach its conclusion, but we are prepared to stay the course," said Williams. "When the courts have consigned HISA to the scrap heap of unconstitutional legislation, we have a better plan to offer. "We are ready with draft legislation that would be constitutional, would better protect the welfare of the horse than HISA, and would not impose HISA's heavy costs that threaten to diminish racing to the status of a hobby.

"Our Racehorse Health and Safety Act originated with veterinarians and is therefore grounded in equine medical science. Racing regulators and racing participants from all the racing breeds have contributed to it. It would have federal oversight under the Compact Clause of the U.S. Constitution, but the States would administer it. It is open to public and congressional debate plus input from all participants in racing, something that was never the case with HISA," concluded Williams.
