Bargain Baby exceeding Yoder family's expectations

Cheyenne Yoder's first yearling pick is an inexpensive trotting filly named May Baby born on Yoder's birthday that has already exceeded her purchase price by more than \$110,000 in just six starts.

May Baby initially hated Cheyenne Yoder, the woman that picked her out of last year's Hoosier Classic yearling sale for \$8,500.

Picking out horses at the fall yearling sales can be somewhat of an art form. Every horseman has their own method for evaluating babies and selecting horses that they hope will make it to the races. James Yoder and his wife, Cheyenne, picked trotting filly May Baby out of last year's Hoosier Classic sale using what could be viewed as a slightly unorthodox process. Their gamble has paid off handsomely, though, as the Guccio lass has won five of six starts and

earned \$123,240 to date competing in Indiana Sires Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

"It was the first sale I wanted to pick something out," said Cheyenne. "She was the last one in the book and she was a Guccio. I asked James, 'Can I have a little bit of an allowance?' I wanted to try."

James added that Cheyenne picked May Baby out, "because the filly was born on her birthday. Before she picked her, I had noticed her. She had a decent video and a decent family. I just liked the way she held herself in the video. She looked fairly clean gaited, but it's so hard to tell."

The couple budgeted \$6,000 in hopes of buying the filly, foaled May 13, 2017 and cataloged as Hip 374 from the Oakwood Farms consignment, the last yearling to pass through the ring. The dam, Credit Winner mare Free Wheeling, had produced a pair of six-figure earners, but Guccio's first two crops had not met expectations, so the appetite for the Yankee Glide stallion's progeny was waning. May Baby was also a smaller filly, even smaller than they had expected when viewing her in person. Despite that, Yoder, 25, and his wife, 23, found themselves bidding beyond what they had hoped to spend.

"We set a budget, we've gone over, it doesn't seem like the other guy is going to stop, and he looked at me and we went one more time," Cheyenne said. "It got quiet, and I thought, 'I

think we did it.”

May Baby was hammered down for \$8,500, and James Yoder signed the ticket. Cheyenne had her filly, but back home in Bell, FL, the relationship got off to a rocky start. The trotter quickly took to her trainer, but for Cheyenne, it was a different experience.

“This winter we brought her home and she wanted no part

of me. I brought home my filly, and I wanted to be the one to get her ready and send her out, and she hated me. I wasn’t allowed in the stall, she would rear up and strike. She didn’t want any part of that,” she said. “At that point, I remember stepping back and just saying, ‘Listen, she doesn’t like me.’”

May Baby also posed challenges on the track. As they trained her down over the winter, the filly turned out to be

anything but a model pupil. Some of the characteristics she continues to display today.

“The first two or three months we struggled with her a lot. She showed a lot of trot, but she wouldn’t trot until she was going about a 45-second quarter, then she would finally hit the trot,” said James. “Once she hit the trot and she was going fast enough, she was fine. Until then, she would just pace, gallop and play around. And she’s still kind of the same way.”

Her demeanor would change once they headed to Indiana for the Harrah’s Hoosier Park meet. The filly is now friendly with anyone that pays her any attention. While she is still playful on the track, when it comes to racing, she is all business. Consider her first time behind the starting gate at Hoosier Park. The filly made a break at the three-quarter pole as the starter guided a field of four to the start, but Yoder was able to get her back on task and wire the field, winning by four and one-quarter lengths in 1:59.3, trotting a last quarter in :27.4.

“At that point we thought he might be something special,” James said.

Making five starts in Indiana Sires Stakes, May Baby has racked up four trips to the winner’s circle. What is most remarkable is not that she is winning, but how she is winning. In the first leg, her second career start, she took command from post five and received every call, distancing the field by seven lengths at the wire, kicking home in :26.4 and stopping the clock in 1:57.1. The second leg was another gate-to-wire victory, this time by two lengths in a time of 1:55.4.

May Baby made it three straight on Aug. 20, this time drawing the second tier with the rail horse breaking stride before the start. Yoder steered the filly through a mile where she was off the pylons most of the time, but managed to clear the field by three and one-quarter lengths, tripping the timer in 1:56.1. In the midst of the streak, May Baby raced through an issue with an abscess.

“The third lifetime start, two days prior to it she tried to blow an abscess. I came in two days out and she couldn’t walk in the stall. She was on three legs. I got her out, and Sunday night I put a window bar on her to take pressure off. I went out and jogged her on Monday and thought maybe she can race tomorrow,” said James. “I came back in and I had to change the other side because it was completely different, she had aluminum with a pad on it. I put a full swedge bar on that. She hates bars, I’ve tried them and she just hates them. The day of the race, I took her out and she jogged good. She ended up racing that night and she won in 1:55.4. At the time I thought, ‘Wow, she’s got a big heart.’”


The shoeing would catch up to the filly, however, in the fourth leg of sires stakes. May Baby had gotten by without

her aluminum and pad configuration due to soft and muddy track conditions in each start. The surface was fast on Aug. 27, and the filly made a break before the start as the track stung her feet. Seventh at the quarter, the freshman rebounded to salvage a third-place finish. That night James found relief in knowing his charge had the resilience to fight through challenging conditions.

Back to the comfort of her aluminum shoes, May Baby responded Sept. 10, establishing a lifetime best 1:54.4 clocking while winning by five and one-half lengths to take a fifth leg of sires stakes action. One last round remains, slated for Tuesday, Oct. 1, before the lucrative Super Final. May Baby has drawn into the \$63,500 first division, assigned post five in the six-filly field. This spring, James and Cheyenne decided to make the trotter eligible to the Breeders Crown, more for next year when the event returns to Hoosier Park. If the filly finishes her Indiana program strong, they could take a shot with her yet this fall. Whether or not they take the gamble in Canada, this bargain purchase has changed their lives.

“She has exceeded our expectations,” said Cheyenne. “I’m just taking it day by day.”

Meridian passage

Fourth-generation horseman Blake Andrew of Meridian Farms fame is renewing the family standardbred tradition with a boutique trotting breeding operation he built from the ground up in upstate New York.

In early September, Bill Andrew announced that his Meridian Farms West would be sending one final crop of yearlings through the Alberta Standardbred Horse Association (ASHA) sales ring in 2020. The High River, AB standardbred nursery is in the midst of selling off broodmares and cutting back on stallions, although Andrew is still standing stallions in PEI and Alberta, as well as racing horses in the Maritimes.

This news seemed to mark the end of an era, particularly after a previous announcement that Meridian Farms East

would cease operations. The decision came after the December, 2018 passing of 70-year-old horseman Brian Andrew. Bill Andrew's brother oversaw day-to-day operations at the Milton, PEI farm, which brings its last group of yearlings to the Atlantic Classic Sale on Oct. 11. (The two pacers and three trotters are consigned under the Estate of Brian Andrew).

On the surface, the scaling back at Meridian East and West looked like the end of an era. But in a remote part of upstate New York, at geographic coordinates of 44.9864° North, 73.4465° West, the familiar name is experiencing a small-scale revival.

Blake Andrew owns and operates Meridian Trot, located in Champlain, NY. The path that led him to establish a boutique breeding operation is a lifelong road, originating in his own bloodline. "My dad, Brian, was running Meridian Farm PEI, so I grew up a fourth-generation horseperson," he told HRU. "I was very involved in PEI for quite some time, and grew up around the farm as well. (Then) I went off and I became a college professor, as did my wife, who I met in Montreal."

Working in Montreal, Blake and wife Allison were far from the nearest racetrack, and far from able to afford raising racehorses on expensive land near the city. "We lived there for quite a few years," said Blake. "I was teaching at Concordia

University, but we would spend our summers in PEI. I would race (family horses) and help with the breeding farm as well. It was always kind of in the back of my mind to have my own place and try racing or breeding or both.”

In 2014, Blake and Allison, who is a U.S. citizen, decided to pursue that dream. “So we started looking on (the American) side of the border, because horse racing in New York is pretty strong,” Blake said. “You have to breed in New York to be eligible to the NYSS, so it all made sense.”

Not everyone would want to build a standardbred breeding farm from the ground up, but that’s exactly what Andrew did. “I wouldn’t recommend it, but we found a vacant parcel of 50 acres and said, ‘Okay, let’s start from scratch,’” he said, chuckling at his own naïve enthusiasm. “We were really happy with the piece of land, and I went, ‘Okay, this isn’t going to be too hard.’ But it took a while. We built the house, built the barn, pastures, water, run-in shed...” He was still teaching full-time in Montreal at the time, but tackled the construction solo.

It took five years for Blake Andrew’s dream to reach fruition. “(We started) in 2014, and my first yearlings are in the sales now,” he said with pride. “I started really small, to give them the full attention they need, while I was still building things. At this point, I’m pretty close to being done building, thankfully, and now the question is whether I’ll scale up a little bit or keep it small.”

The venture is a radical departure from Blake’s former job, teaching political science and statistics for the social sciences at Concordia University. “I use a little bit of that background,” he said. “I think a lot about breeding analytics, and I care a lot about pedigree matching and that kind of thing.” His wife still teaches at Université du Québec à Montréal, because Meridian Trot is right along the Quebec-New York border, making her commute manageable.

Andrew has chosen to focus exclusively on trotters. “I have a lot of experience with both sides, but trotters have always been my favorite, and I just figured if you’re going to be a small-scale breeder, you’ll want to specialize a bit,” he said. “The trotting has more international possibilities, and it’s really strong in New York State.”


The first Meridian Trot yearling to step into the sales ring was Honey Trap, who brought \$10,500 as Hip #40 at the Morrisville Yearling Sale on Sept. 15. “She is out of a mare that my dad and I raced in Prince Edward Island, and then eventually moved here: Honeymoonisover (2, 2:02.3h, 3, 1:58.3s; \$132,552). So there’s kind of a sentimental side to her as well,” said Blake. The firstborn foal of the 2013 PEI Standardbred Horse Association’s Trotting Mare of the Year was purchased by Chris Lawton, of Vernon, NY.

While disappointed that sire Lucky Chucky has unfairly “had a tough go” in building a reputation at stud, Andrew said he is satisfied with Honey Trap’s selling price, and more than satisfied with the filly’s conformation, gait, and attitude. “I think and I hope that she will make the races — everything I saw from her suggests she will, and I’m looking forward to seeing her next year, somewhere nearby.”

The nearest track to Champlain, NY is Saratoga Harness, which is over two hours away, but the Meridian Trot founder said his family will be “on the lookout” for Honey Trap whenever she races. “I have a couple of young daughters — I have a 6-year-old (Joyce) and a 2-year-old (Leta) — and both of them were a little sad to see Honey Trap go. We tried to explain to them: That’s how this operation works. There will be new ones.”

Blake is also sending his first two Harrisburg yearlings to the Pennsylvania sale this fall, consigned by David Reid’s Preferred Equine Marketing, as was Honey Trap. Hip #864 is a New York-eligible filly by Lucky Chucky out of the unraced Yankee Glide mare Female Drama.

“Sheriff Callie was named by Joyce because Sheriff Callie is a Disney character. Google it, and you will see an animated series that she loves,” Blake said with a laugh, before turning to the serious business of pedigree. “I thought a lot about that cross, the cross is what I wanted with that particular mare.” Female Drama’s son by Trixton, No Drama Please (2,1:54.3; BT1:52; \$152,926), was recently fourth behind

winner Gimpanzee and place-finisher Forbidden Trade in the Yonkers Trot.

The third Meridian Trot yearling is Hip #791 at Harrisburg, PA-eligible Lights Out Alice. “My feeling is she’ll be the one people look at the most, based on the page, but also she’s a really nice individual as well. She’s long and all trot in the field. She’s clean-legged,” said her breeder. “It’s a family that I’ve had my eye on for a number of years. One of my favourite families.” The filly is by Muscle Massive and out of the Credit Winner mare Betweenwopillows (3,1:59.3f; BT1:59; \$33,361), who has one previous foal, Cantab Hall filly Stuck Inthe Middle (2,Q2:04.3f; \$5,040).

Betweenwopillows is a full sister to a horse who was important to Brian Andrew and Meridian East. “I had been following that mare for maybe six or seven years,” said Blake. “She was a broodmare in foal to Muscle Massive, at Harrisburg, about three years ago, and I got her. She happens to be a full sister to Neal (2,1:54.4; \$290,072), who was a great racehorse on his own; he was injured and ended up going to Meridian PEI to become a stallion there, so I had a lot of experience with him directly. He also came back to race a little more. The family is really deep and includes the dam of Phaetosive (2,1:53.1; 3,1:51; \$895,277) (and a) good 3-year-old called Explosivebreakaway (2,1:57.4f; 3,1:54.2f-19).”

Prior to Brian Andrew’s untimely passing, Meridian East had made history, raising and selling the highest-priced trotting yearling ever sold in the Maritimes. Credit Winner colt Mack Truck (2, 2:08h; \$8,347) drew a top bid of \$26,000 at last year’s Atlantic Classic Sale in Crapaud, PEI. Not much by Harrisburg, Lexington, or London standards, but a significant price in a region with limited racing for trotters. He was purchased by Donna Van Meer of Bowmanville, ON, and is a stakes winner this season in PEI.

Mack Truck’s dam Mad Over U Hanover is one of the four trotting broodmares Blake and his sister, Ontario-based trainer Rachel Andrew, is currently handling as part of their late father’s estate. The others are Lyrical Lindy (4,1:59.3f; \$46,672), Apeachtoremember (7,1:55.1f; \$289,735), and Tymal Maroma, who Blake called “one of the top two or three trot broodmares in the Maritimes.” Bill Andrew purchased Tymal Maroma as a 2-year-old, and the Angus Hall mare helped Meridian East rebuild the trotting breed on Canada’s East Coast. Her first foal, Tyne Valley (3,2:00.3h; \$52,894), was the top-priced Atlantic Classic trot yearling back in 2014, selling for \$10,000. In 2016, her colt Ticked broke the record price for a Maritime-bred trotting yearling when he sold for \$12,000.

“Meridian East” is conspicuously absent from the 2019 Atlantic Classic sale catalogue, replaced by “Estate of Brian Andrew” as consignor of the farm’s last five yearlings. The sale preparations have not been easy for Blake or Rachel

Andrew. “It was really sudden, what happened with dad. Initially, we thought, ‘Well, let’s disperse it all, and be done with it,’” said Blake. Then he and his sister decided to complete their late father’s work, in a manner respectful to the legacy of Meridian Farms. “We are seeing the cycle through. The foals that (Brian) foaled, we are putting them through the sale. The mares that were in foal, we foaled them out and have a few weanlings around, so we’ll move them. Then the mares will find either homes with us or somewhere else.”

While Meridian Trot is unaffiliated with Bill Andrew’s Meridian West, Blake Andrew said his Cam Fella Award-winning uncle’s advice has proved prescient in starting his own upstate New York farm. “He, and dad for that matter, were both: ‘Go and try it, but it’s going to be tough.’ And it has been tough, but they’ve been very supportive.”

Now 40 years of age, Blake envisioned the future differently when he began Meridian Trot in 2014. “I always expected that dad would wind things down there (in PEI) slowly, and I maybe I could have coerced him into coming and helping me, but that’s not going to happen.” Instead, the self-reliant young standardbred breeder is counting on his first group of yearlings to carry the Meridian name and quality forward.

Blake Andrew will be at Harrisburg, watching in the background as the Preferred Equine team introduces Lights Out Alice and Sheriff Callie to prospective buyers. “I’m hoping that people will take a look, and at least a few of them will really like them,” he said. “I feel like they’re competitive, and they’ll probably make it and hopefully do well.”

In geography, a “meridian” is defined as a line of longitude. “Meridian” shares a similar definition in harness racing circles: The contributions of the Andrew family line, with a longevity spanning four generations and counting.

Elver Hanover sets 1:48.3 world record in Bluegrass

by Nicholas Barnsdale for Red Mile

Elver Hanover stayed unbeaten, winning the \$80,950 first division of the \$324,800 Stay Hungry Bluegrass Two-Year-Old Colt Pace – sponsored by the Stay Hungry Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms – with a world-record 1:48.3 effort on Saturday (Sept. 28) at Red Mile.

Odds-on favorite Catch The Fire led through a quarter in :27, half in :54 and three-quarters in 1:21.2 before Elver Hanover popped the pocket on the final turn and swept by to win by two-and-three-quarter lengths. Put To Right tipped three wide off of the winner's cover as the field entered the stretch and passed Catch The Fire for second.

"(Elver Hanover) felt really, really good in the hole," winning driver Yannick Gingras said after the race, "and (Catch The Fire) put up some hot fractions so I was content to sit there. When I called on him up the stretch, he was still full of pace."

The son of Yankee Cruiser, bred by Hanover Shoe Farms, is now eight-for-eight for trainer Ron Burke and his racing stable, as well as the partnership group of Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky, Jason Melillo, J & T Silva and Purnel & Libby. The victory today brings the gelding's earnings above \$325,000. He equaled the world record for a pacing 2-year-old, set by stablemate Warrawee Ubeaut last year, and set a new mark for a 2-year-old male.

A win ticket returned \$6.20.

Captain Barbosa took the \$80,950 second division by a one-length margin.

A Positive Hanover went forward early and grabbed the lead as they hit the quarter in :28.1. Captain Barbosa then brushed past on the backside and led every remaining step,

hitting the half in :56.3, three-quarters in 1:24.4 and crossing the line in 1:51.2 under mild urging from driver Andrew McCarthy. Opportune Hanover slid up the pylons from the backfield and snatched second from A Positive Hanover. Seeyou At Thebeach, sent the 1-5 favorite, broke stride while moving into the outer flow at the five-eighths and finished last.

“Early in the (year) he was balking at the gate a little bit, and he was out of position, and I had the same trouble with him,” McCarthy said after the race. “But he’s getting smarter about that and I can get him a little more forwardly-placed now. He definitely wants to go to work and do his job; I think it’s more the fact that he’s getting into the race a little bit now that he’s getting off the gate better.”

The Tony Alagna trainee adds a second win from 10 starts to his tally, and has now earned more than \$90,000 for owners Alagnafrankinthegym Stables and Robert J. The Steiner Stock Farm-bred colt paid \$15.30 to win.

Alagna confirmed that the Breeders Crown is a possibility for the colt.

“We’ll race him back next week in the Grand Circuit and see how he is,” Alagna said after the race. “If he seems okay, and we’re still going forward based on what else we’re going to take to Canada, we’ll take (him into) consideration for the Breeders Crown.”

Cattlewash won in the \$80,950 third division after taking command in the second quarter and gliding home.

Esai Hanover floated off the gate and hit the top through the first fraction in :27.1, but soon yielded command to Cattlewash. Driver Yannick Gingras managed the tempo from there, bringing the group of eight to the half in :55.1, three-quarters in 1:23.1 and finished the job in 1:50.3. Manticore came second over as the backfield got moving in the third split and rallied for second, two lengths adrift of the victor. Fortify also came past tired foes, finishing third. Father Nuno challenged first-over into the final turn but did not bother the eventual winner.

Cattlewash’s earnings now total just under \$150,000 with his fourth win from eight outings for owner-breeder William Donovan and gave the Burke-Gingras team two wins on the day. He paid \$7.40 to win.

In the \$81,950 fourth division, **Roll With JR** fended off late challenger Team Best in a wire-to-wire win.

Driver Doug McNair sent the colt to the front in a :27 opening clip and was unhurried to a :55.3 half. He then repelled a first-up bid from favorite Chief Mate through three-quarters in 1:23.2 and battled to the wire for a 1:50.4 lifetime-best victory. Team Best sat in the pocket for most of the mile and had his go in the lane, finishing second behind

a half-length. Tell Them Lou charged from the backfield late and finished third.

“(The horses) relax, and the track is second-to-none,” winning trainer Jeff Cullipher said of the track after the race. “This is a really big colt, and he was able to stretch out a little bit here.”

He co-owns the \$15,000 yearling purchase with Tom Pollack. The son of Roll With Joe has now amassed more than \$140,000 in earnings and won three of his nine races. The colt bred by Robert Brady, Rebecca Brady, Kenneth Jackson and Lisa Jackson paid \$10.00 to win.

Cullipher recalled giving Pollack free reign on making the purchase.

“I was eating a sandwich and I looked up and he was buying the horse,” he said.

Grand Circuit action resumes at Red Mile today (Sept. 29) with seven total Bluegrass dashes. The sophomore pacing colts compete in three divisions of the \$267,400 Captaintreacherous Bluegrass Stakes while the three-year-old trotting colts race in two divisions of the \$192,200 International Moni Bluegrass Stakes and the three-year-old trotting fillies race in two divisions of the \$218,000 Bar Hopping Bluegrass Stakes. Racing gets underway with first-race post at 1:00 p.m. (EDT).

Treacherous Reign soars to Bluegrass score

Treacherous Reign overpowered her competition in the \$163,100 American Ideal Bluegrass Stakes, sponsored by Brittany Stallion Management, on Saturday (Sept. 28) at Red Mile as she ground a first-over trip to win by a length.

Beautyonthbeach was sent forward from post 6, but 4-5 favorite Tall Drink Hanover quickly swooped by just after a :26.2 opening quarter. She maintained the lead to the half in :54.1 and three-quarters in 1:22.1 but could do little to resist Treacherous Reign as the field of 11 turned for home. Driver Dexter Dunn kept the Tony Alagna trainee to task down the lane and held off Beautyonthbeach to stop the clock in 1:49.4. Queen Of The Pride had late pace and moved up for third. Tall Drink Hanover, who Alagna also trains, faded and finished seventh.

“A lot of people forget that she did win the Fan Hanover, defeating Warrawee Ubeaut,” Alagna said after the race. “Of course, Warrawee Ubeaut has gotten better over the course of the year, but this is a very nice filly in her own right. The other filly got used pretty good — Tall Drink Hanover — to get to the front, but she definitely didn’t look like she was on her game today. Not to take anything away from this filly; she came first over the hard way at the half and got the job done.”

The \$50,000 Lexington Select collected her 11th win from 26 starts, and she has now earned more than \$680,000 for Alagna Racing, Big Al’s Stables, Let It Ride Stables, and Dana L. The daughter of Captaintreacherous, bred by White Birch Farm, paid \$12.20 to win.

Pinske sweeps frosh Bluegrass filly pace at Red Mile

After winning in his Grand Circuit debut, 24-year-old trainer Carter Pinske sent both winners in the \$280,500 Artspeak Bluegrass Stakes – sponsored by the Artspeak Syndicate and Winbak Farms – on the Friday (Sept. 27) card at Lexington, KY's Red Mile.

Marloe Hanover made her way to the top early and withstood the backfield's late rally to take the \$139,750 opening Bluegrass division in a lifetime-best 1:50.4.

Driver David Miller brushed the Pinske trainee to the front past a :27.4 first quarter while Shouldabeenatd raced second. Beyond Ecstasy, the 6-5 favorite, angled first over from fourth heading to a :56 half and progressed towards the pacesetter while carrying Lady Lou on cover rounding the final turn. Beyond Ecstasy stalled passing three-quarters in 1:24 and retreated through the stretch as Marloe Hanover sprinted for the finish. Shouldabeenatd gave chase to secure second while Lady Lou kicked off cover for third.

Winning her second race from seven starts, Marloe Hanover has earned \$124,279 for owners Pinske Stables, David Hoese and Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky. The Hanover Shoe Farms-bred filly paid \$12.40 to win.

Sitting behind dueling favorites around the final turn, driver Dexter Dunn pulled **Annabelle Hanover** from the pylons and darted past 8-5 favorites Baby Your The Best and Gai Waterhouse to take the second Bluegrass division.

Gai Waterhouse took command from Annabelle Hanover moving to a :27.4 opening quarter but soon bore a first-over challenge from Baby Your The Best heading up the backstretch. Baby Your The Best crossed over to control after a :55.3 half, leaving Love For Sail uncovered and Blood Red gapping from second over rounding the final turn. Annabelle Hanover wove through the two-wide gap passing three-quarters in 1:23.1 and surged by Baby Your The Best through the stretch to win drawing away in a 1:50.2 mile. Gai Waterhouse settled for third.

“(She’s) just a real gamey-looking filly,” trainer Carter Pinske said after the race. “Just the right size, right build; (it’s) what we look for in a Somebeach. There’s a pretty big story behind this horse – it’s about one of the craziest breaking stories ever... just to have her here is awesome. It took until about February until she was broke good. I just have to say thanks to Erv Miller and everybody down in Florida that helped get her to the track, let alone here.”

Owned by Pinske Stables, Lawrence Means and Curly Tall Curly Small, Annabelle Hanover – bred by Hanover Shoe Farms – broke her maiden in her sixth start, collecting \$115,233. The Somebeachsomewhere filly paid \$7.20 to win.

Ramona Hill remains unbeaten with Bluegrass win

Sent off as the 1-5 favorite, **Ramona Hill** sat second through the mile before tipping from the pocket and striding to a 1:52.4 victory under a hand drive in the final of four divisions for the \$330,000 Norman Woolworth Memorial Bluegrass Stakes on Friday (Sept. 27).

Panem pushed for the front moving to a :28 opening quarter with Ramona Hill floating into the pocket. Madame Sherry sat third up the backstretch as the field raced single file towards a :55.4 half. Ramona Hill then edged from the pocket passing three-quarters in 1:24.4 and lunged to the lead through the stretch as Madame Sherry gave chase in second and Panem settled for third.

"We trained the mare, Lock Down Lindy, and this filly had a very similar frame to Lock Down Lindy, but she was an end-of-May foal so she was very immature at the sale but had a great look to her," trainer Tony Alagna said after the race on purchasing Ramona Hill for \$70,000 at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale last fall. "Knowing how fast the mare was, I thought I'd take a shot at that number."

"I didn't stake her to the (Jim) Doherty at the Meadowlands because she was a late foal and I told the partnership that I think this filly's special, but I don't want to push her early because I want to make sure we have a great 3-year-old. That's what we've done by design and so far she's paying us off."

Co-owned by breeder Crawford Farms with Brad Grant, Robert LeBlanc and In The Gym Partners, Ramona Hill has won in all four of her starts, earning \$66,000. Andrew McCarthy drove the \$2.40 winner.

Shishito took the lead early and strode to a 1:53 victory in the opening division of the Bluegrass filly trot.

Dune Hill dashed to the front moving to a :28 first quarter before yielding command to even-money favorite Shishito moving to the backside. Second betting choice Senorita Rita angled first over from fifth passing a :56 half and ranged towards the pacesetter nearing three-quarters in 1:24.3. Senorita Rita continued to dig into Shishito through the stretch but could only manage second while Dune Hill gave pursuit from third.

Bred by Diamond Creek Farm LLC and owned by Black Horse Racing and John Fielding, Shishito won her fourth race from eight starts, earning \$222,776. Dexter Dunn drove the \$4.00 winner for trainer Per Engblom.

Common Sense S handed 1-2 favorite Sister Sledge her first loss when wining the second Bluegrass split.

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt snagged the pocket with

Common Sense S while Hello Tomorrow led the field to a :28.1 first quarter. Sister Sledge slid first over from fourth passing a :56.2 half and drew alongside Hello Tomorrow approaching three-quarters in 1:25.2. Hello Tomorrow kept Sister Sledge at bay through the lane but drifted from the pylons enough to create a seam for Common Sense S to shoot through late in the mile to win in 1:53.3. Sister Sledge settled for third.

"I bought her in Sweden on a sale," Svanstedt said after the race. "It was because I trained her mother and grandmother and they were very successful — they made around a half- to two-million Swedish kronas. (Coming from the small tracks), it's good for them to come here and stretch out here on the big track."

Co-owned by Ake Svanstedt Inc. with S R F Stable, Common Sense S won her fifth race from nine starts, earning \$122,600. The Menhammar Stuteri Ab-bred Trixton filly paid \$12.20 to win.

Love A Good Story surged past 3-5 favorite Ms Savannah Belle late in the stretch to take the third Bluegrass split.

In control through a :28.1 first quarter, Love A Good Story settled for the pocket past a :55.4 half after Ms Savannah Belle pushed first over for the front nearing the final turn. Seventimesalady floated first over approaching three-quarters in 1:26 but forced Love A Good Story to pop pocket heading for the top of the stretch. Seventimesalady lost ground and gave chase as Love A Good Story and Ms Savannah Belle matched strides towards the finish, with the favorite giving way in the final sixteenth to the Julie Miller-trained Chapter Seven filly in a 1:52.2 mile.

Winning her seventh race from nine starts, Love A Good Story — bred by Celebrity Farms — has earned \$216,187 for owners Pinske Stables, Kentuckiana Racing Stable and Daniel Plouffe. Andy Miller piloted the \$17.80 winner.

Sophomore stars flood Sunday Bluegrass card

The nation's top 3-year-olds compete this afternoon (Sept. 29) at Lexington, KY's Red Mile, which features three Bluegrass divisions for sophomore pacing colts and two splits for both 3-year-old trotting colts and fillies.

North America Cup winner Captain Crunch fronts the opening division of the \$267,400 Captaintreacherous Bluegrass Stakes, sponsored by the Captaintreacherous Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms. The millionaire Captaintreacherous colt looks to rebound off a fourth-place finish in the \$253,000 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes Championship. Scott Zeron steers the Nancy Johansson trainee from post 5 for owners 3 Brothers Stables, Christina Takter, Rojan Stables and Caviart Farms.

Messenger Stakes champ American Mercury tops the second Bluegrass colt pace division off a third-place effort in the \$384,000 second heat of the Little Brown Jug. With over \$500,000 earned for owners Crawford Farms Racing, Northfork Racing Stable, Chuck Pompey and Scott Bice, the American Ideal gelding trained by Chris Oakes races from post 3 in rein to Tyler Buter.

Bettor's Wish, another millionaire, starts from post 6 in the third division. The Chris Ryder-trained son of Bettor's Delight failed to qualify for the Little Brown Jug after finishing second in the Messenger Stakes. He rebounded two weeks later with a three-length 1:48.1 victory in the \$250,000 Kentucky Sires Stakes Final. Regular pilot Dexter Dunn sits in the bike for owners Chris Ryder, Bell Racing, Fair Island Farm and Bettors Wish Partners.

Hambletonian Oaks favorite and runner-up Millies Possession will rematch Oaks winner When Dovescry in the first of two divisions for the \$218,000 Bar Hopping Bluegrass Stakes, sponsored by the Bar Hopping Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms.

Nearing \$500,000 in earnings, Millies Possession has one loss from 11 starts, which came when chasing When Dovescry in a 1:50.2 mile on the first Saturday in August. She returned to the races to cap a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes sweep with a 1:53.4 mile in the \$253,000 championship. Jim Campbell conditions the daughter of Possess The Will for owner-breeder Fashion Farms LLC. Dexter Dunn sits in the sulky.

Kentucky



When Dovescry returned to the track one month after winning the Hambletonian Oaks, taking a \$63,772 Simcoe Stakes division going wire to wire in 1:54.4. She raced first over as the odds-on favorite in the \$282,000 Eleganimage final but faltered to third. Simon Allard will drive the Muscle Hill filly from post 6 for trainer and brother Rene Allard, who conditions the winner of \$641,976 for owners Go Fast Stable, Yves Sarrazin, Kapildeo Singh and Lawrence Dumain.

Evident Beauty leads the second Bar Hopping division off back-to-back Grand Circuit victories. Winning the Eleganimage final from off the speed, the Trixton filly shipped south to Hoosier Park, where she won as the 1-2 favorite in the \$135,000 Moni Maker Trot. Richard "Nifty" Norman trains the winner of \$735,398 for owners Melvin Hartman, Little E LLC and R A W Equine Inc. David Miller will drive from post 3.

The first division of the \$192,200 International Moni Bluegrass Stakes — sponsored by the International Moni Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms — features Marcus Melander's star Greenshoe, who would become a millionaire with a victory in the \$96,100 opening split. The Father Patrick colt has won his three starts following a runner-up finish in the \$1 million Hambletonian; his most recent victory being a 1:50.3 effort in the \$250,000 Kentucky Sires Stakes final. Greenshoe races for owners Courant Inc., Hans Backe, Lars Granqvist and Morten Langli, and will have Brian Sears in the bike from post 3.

Melander's other trotting star, Green Manalishi S, starts from post 6 in the second split of the International Moni. The Muscle Hill colt, owned by Courant Inc., surpassed \$1 million in earnings with a 1:52.4 victory in the \$453,750 Canadian Trotting Classic final. Tim Tetrick will guide Green Manalishi S from post 6 as he competes against Pilot Discretion, the Tony Alagna-trained Muscle Hill colt who finished second in the Canadian Trotting Classic. Andrew McCarthy drives Pilot Discretion from post 8 for owners Robert Leblanc, David Anderson and John Fodera.

The 10-race card Sunday at The Red Mile opens with three late-closing events, two on the pace and one on the trot. Racing gets underway with first-race post at 1:00 p.m. (EDT).

It was a speed show at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Friday night (Sept. 27) as all eight of the freshman Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots Semi-Final winners equalled or bettered their personal best times.

The 2-year-old pacing colts set the standard in the first \$20,000 Semi-Final as seven of the 10 starters fired off the gate. Tabloid Writer won the early sprint, reaching the quarter in :26.3, but his tenure on the lead was brief as fan favorite **Day Delight** swept past heading into the backstretch. Day Delight sailed on to a :54.2 half and a 1:22.2 three-quarters and hung on for a one and one-half length victory in 1:52. My Land finished second, Poseidon Seelster was third, Usurper fourth and National Sports rounded out the qualifiers for next Saturday's Grassroots Championship.

"When we got to the quick half and the quick three-quarters I thought, 'Oh dear,' but he raced good," said co-owner Bill Manes. "He's a good horse, he's a good colt. Hopefully he'll be good again next week."

Manes shares ownership of Day Delight with Lloyd Stone of Portland, 10462217 Canada Inc. of Gloucester, ON and Wayne MacRae of Fall River, NS. Victory Puddy trains the son of Bettors Delight and driver Jonathan Drury engineered the Semi-Final victory, the colt's third of the season.

Division point leader **Quick Tour** took the other pacing colt Semi-Final with an impressive effort from the outside Post 10, holding off fan favorite Mayhem Hanover for a three-quarter length victory in 1:51.2. Delightful Terror finished third, Bettorbuckleup was fourth and Lous Delight closed hard to grab the last spot in the final.

"Once again he was just impressive," said driver Louis-Philippe Roy. "I was a little worried when I saw the half in :54.4 pop up, but when another horse came to his wheel he just never wanted to let him go by."

Roy piloted Quick Tour to the win for trainer Mark Horner of St. Marys and his partner R A W Equine of Burlington, ON. The win was the Mach Three gelding's fourth of the season.

Moana brought the party to the winner's circle in the first

trotting filly Semi-Final. The Muscle Mass daughter came from off the pace to secure a one and a-half length victory in 1:57 and was joined by some 70 delighted members of fractional ownership group Landmark 12 of Lansdowne and their partners 1187422 Ontario Inc. of Ottawa, ON and Hudson Standardbred Stable Inc. of Hudson, QC.

"She raced very good. She took advantage of others making mistakes and was able to capitalize," said trainer Shawn Steacy. "Her best quality is her gait, she wants to trot. She should be very involved in the final."

James MacDonald piloted Moana to her third win, besting Credits Celebrity, Canadian Titan, Scorched Romance and Need An Alibi.

Need An Alibi's stablemate in the John Bax stable took the other trotting filly Semi-Final. Fan favorite **Zebbs Flur** and driver Stephen Byron hit the wire one length ahead of Mybella Angel in 1:57.4. Warrawee Vulcan, Zakarina and Ready To Deal were well back of the leaders in third, fourth and fifth.

"With that first turn, when horses are running in front of her and beside her, if she was going to self-destruct that would have been the time," said Bax, describing the early breaks by Peppas Angel and Craving You directly in front and to the right of Zebbs Flur. "She wants to race, she wants to win now, so that's all good."

Bax Stable of Campbellville, Don Allensen of Wyoming and Goin To The Show Stable of Peterborough, ON share ownership of the Muscle Mass filly, who has now won her last three starts.

Awesomedabra also delivered an impressive effort from Post 10 to capture the first trotting colt Semi-Final. The



Kadabra colt and driver Jody Jamieson split horses in the stretch and got a neck in front of fan favorite I Got The Looks at the 1:57.3 finish. Remember Titans was third, Aussie Lover fourth and Kenogami Coco was fifth.

"I couldn't even tell where he was around the last turn. I thought he was third over and I couldn't see him and then I saw Jody coming up the rail and I'm thinking 'Oh god that's just...,'" said owner/trainer Gary Lance. "I was just hoping to make the final."

Lance shares ownership of three-time winner Awesomedabra with Keith Mullins of Fenelon Falls, ON.

Division point leader **Lovedbythemasses** dominated the second trotting colt Semi-Final, sailing under the wire five lengths ahead of his peers in 1:56. Magic Bob, Secrets Justice, Enduring Strength and Youboozeyoulose claimed the other four spots in next week's championship.

"He's got really good manners and he's really nice to drive, so just get him out of there clean and give him a chance and that's what happened tonight," said driver Mike Saftic. "He just sat outside that horse (pacesetter Magic Bob) and trotted home strong."

Saftic drives the Muscle Mass son, now a four-time winner, for trainer Edward Peconi of Peterborough and his co-owners Nicholas Peconi of Lakefield, ON and Wade Peconi of Stanchel, PEI.

The pacing fillies wrapped up freshman Semi-Final night with sharp efforts from **Queso Relleno** and **Mach My Kiss**.

Queso Relleno sat outside pacesetter Need Ur Opinion and then powered down the stretch to a one-length victory in 1:53.3. Landry Seelster finished second, favorite Coqui Coqui was third, Even Louder fourth and Preeminence was fifth.

"We were satisfied with that. I think she's a very nice filly," said trainer Blake MacIntosh, who shares ownership of Queso Relleno with Sue Vernon Smith of Oakville, ON, Hutt Racing

Stable of Malvern, PA and The Flanagan Sisters of Dublin, Ireland. "I'm very confident in the filly and I think she should be pretty good (next week)."

Jody Jamieson picked up his second win of the night with Betterthancheddar daughter Queso Relleno, who now has three wins on her resume.

Coqui Coqui's stablemate Mach My Kiss and driver Doug McNair opted for a front end strategy and cruised home one and one-half lengths ahead of favorite Kat in 1:53.1. Siochan was third, Queso Relleno's stablemate Sunshine Hall was fourth and Coco Beach De Vie grabbed the very last spot in next weekend's championships.

"Coqui Coqui I've always thought was a better mare," said trainer Rob Fellows of his Grassroots Championship entry. "I think if they raced against each other ten times it would probably be very close to them both beating each other five times."

Rockwood resident Yolanda Fellows shares ownership of Mach My Kiss with Erna Corbeil of Beaumont, AB. The Mach Three filly now has four wins under her belt through nine starts.

Lugauer realizing dreams with Norton Commander in Yonkers International

What would it mean to you to win the International Trot? Conni Lugauer pondered the question in silence for some time Saturday morning (Sept. 21), hours before his trainee Alegria B won the Breeders Crown Mares at Trabrennbahn Mariendorf in Berlin, Germany. Finally, Lugauer conceded.

"This is a really good question," he said. "I'm always thinking about victories, but I didn't think about victory in the International Trot. The question is too big. I don't know."

Come Oct. 12, Lugauer may be in a better position to answer the question. The German-born trainer will send Norton Commander to represent his homeland in the \$1 million Yonkers International Trot. Although Lugauer hoped to secure an invitation to Yonkers' premier race for trotters for months, his aspirations seemed crushed as the initial list of 10 probables didn't include Norton Commander. However, after the defection of Sobel Conway Sept. 18, Norton Commander's invitation arrived.

"It was my opinion to put him in the race because he's now arrived at the top. He's been racing this year against good competition and he almost beat them quite often. It was my plan to get him into this race, actually," Lugauer said. "We are proud of course and happy because we are a stable who wants to race in the big races. It's impressive to race in America. It's the next step in my vision. We are really proud about it."

"First of all, the history. It's one of the most famous international races in the world that we have. If you look at the winners of this race, they are mostly really famous racehorses. It's the biggest point, I think," Lugauer said. "It's always nice for the European horses to race in America. And the last point is the prize money."

A native of Regensburg, Bavaria, Lugauer grew up in a harness racing family. His father, Johann, was a successful trainer and Lugauer became fascinated by the horses at a young age. At age 16, Lugauer drove his first winner and two years later in 1992, he became a professional trainer. He

moved his stable to Sweden in 2004 and has been there since.

Lugauer's stable is now about 90 horses strong and in the midst of its best year to date. Lugauer has trained winners of 108 races from 397 races so far this season, good for 12.9 million Swedish Krona. In addition to Norton Commander and Alegria B, his stars include Ferrari Sisu, who finished second in the Group 1 Swedish Travderby.

"This year is our best year in my career. We have some quite good horses," Lugauer said. "I feel extremely confident and it's a lot of fun at the moment."

Owned by Ulrich Mommert, Norton Commander came to Lugauer as an unraced 2-year-old. The tall chestnut sported white socks that reached his knees and a blaze that began just below his forelock and widened down his face to fully engulf his nose.

"First of all, he's a really beautiful horse," Lugauer said. "He sticks out in the field because of the nice color and he's a big one. He has the white socks and he has the really long legs. I felt quite early this horse had the future before him."

Norton Commander qualified at Lugauer's Jägersro base Sept. 1, 2017 and won eight of his first 12 races from Sept. 11, 2017 through Sept. 19, 2018. After Norton Commander won a class 1 trial for 3-year-olds worth 125,000kr Dec. 26, Lugauer knew big things were ahead.

Norton Commander is 3-for-7 in 2019. His first win this year came in a class 1 trial at Åby on the Olympiatravet undercard. Norton Commander next raced at Solvalla Elitloppet weekend, taking the class 1 final over 2,140 meters on the Saturday card. Norton Commander ran his win streak to three when taking a 45,000€ trot at Vincennes in a



1:10.9 kilometer rating for the 2,100 meters.

Although Norton Commander enters the Yonkers International Trot off three straight losses, the 5-year-old hasn't missed by much. Lugauer tried the Gift Kronos son in Group 1 company for the first time in the Jubileumspokalen at Solvalla Aug. 14.

Norton Commander started from the inside post and Lugauer kept the trotter three back along the pylons throughout the 2,140-meter race while favorite Who's Who tracked cover to his outside. Up the backstretch the final time, rival Vincero' Gar pulled the pocket and Norton Commander followed the move, shifting to the outside.

The cover took Norton Commander to the top of the stretch, where he dived back inside for a clear path. However, he couldn't outkick Who's Who and Milliondollarrhyme, who each stormed down the center of the track to take the top two spots, respectively. Norton Commander finished third a half-length behind Who's Who.

"He was racing against the best 5-year-old horses in Europe in the Jubileumspokalen," Lugauer said. "He was third and he was a little unlucky because I (kept him inside) for quite a long time in the race and didn't come out early enough. He won at Vincennes in a time of 10.9 over 2,100 meters quite easily, so he has now arrived at the top."

Lugauer thinks racing at Yonkers will suit Norton Commander. While many trotters are faster without shoes, the trainer feels Norton Commander is just as fast with them, which plays to his favor on the Hilltop oval. In addition, Lugauer thinks the race flow will work to Norton Commander's advantage.

"He doesn't have to go without shoes and I think at Yonkers, it's better you go with shoes, so that's a little plus for him. We are really looking forward to it, because I don't think those horses will be running away from him," he said.

"I think also the racing system in America, how they drive the races, is also a plus for my horse because he likes a strong tempo and he's also really strong in the end, so if he gets a good post, I'm almost sure he'll do a good race and get some money."

Although confident in his training and in his horse, Lugauer respects the competition Norton Commander will face in the 1 1/4-mile Yonkers International Trot. His nine

rivals will include defending champion Cruzado Dela Noche (Sweden) and 2018 Hambletonian winner Atlanta (U.S.). Guardian Angel AS will also represent the U.S. and Marion Marauder will race for Canada. The other European invaders are Bahia Quesnot (France), Lionel (Norway), Zacon Gio (Italy), Slide So Easy (Denmark), and Uza Josselyn.

"Atlanta and those horses, they are really famous and really fast," Lugauer said. "I'm really interested in how my horse handles those horses. But the European horses are also quite fast and maybe a little stronger for the distance."

Like most of the European connections, Lugauer's main concern is the mandatory quarantine faced by the foreign horses. The European contingent for the International will be stabled at Yonkers for the week leading up to the International Oct. 12 and will spend most of the time in their stalls, with exceptions made for training and grazing in the track's infield.

"The quarantine, in my opinion, is the biggest challenge," Lugauer said. "I don't know how he'll handle that because he's normally out in the field a lot. That won't be happening for 10 days before the race, so I don't know how he'll handle that, but normally, he's quite uncomplicated, so I trust in him. I think he'll manage it."

Although Lugauer won't be in New York to see Norton Commander race in the Yonkers International firsthand, the trotter will be in good hands. Lugauer's 25-year-old son, Marc Elias, will drive in the International as Lugauer must take the lines behind trainee Campo Bahia in the Group 1 Grand Prix de l'UET at Helsinki the same day. Elias has driven Norton Commander in four of the trotter's 12 wins. Lugauer is optimistic.

"It's a dream come true because this is one point in my career that I want to do, race in America. This is extremely big for us, but now we will see what happens."

The \$1 million Yonkers International Trot is slated for Saturday, Oct. 12 at Yonkers Raceway. The card will also feature a pair of \$250,000 invitationals, the 1 1/4-mile Harry Harvey Trot and 1-mile Dan Rooney Pace. For more information on the event and its participants, [click here](#).

Breeders Crown divisions enjoy purse hikes; 2-year-old events raised to \$600,000

The Hambletonian Society, which owns and administers the \$6 million Breeders Crown series, will raise the purses on seven of the 12 divisions of the Breeders Crown championship races to be held at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Oct. 25 and 26.

"In recent years the Breeders Crown program has enjoyed support on all fronts – from breeders, owners, trainers and stallion nominators, and we always strive to keep our purse levels high while maintaining the future stability of the program," said John Campbell, president of the Hambletonian Society.

"It's important to give owners return on their stake payments, particularly for the 2-year-old divisions, as quickly as possible."

For the fifth straight year, the 2-year-old Breeders Crown events will be raised to \$600,000, making them among the richest offered for the age group in North America.

An additional \$50,000 will be added to each of the mare events and \$100,000 to the open pace. The Breeders Crown Mare Trot and Pace will now race for \$300,000 each and the Breeders Crown Pace for \$500,000. The Crown Trot and all four sophomore divisions remain at \$500,000.

The Society has a mission statement incumbent on supporting and promoting the breeding of standardbred horses, and raising 2-year-old purses shows provides immediate benefit to breeders, owners and yearling buyers.

The 2019 Breeders Crown will take place over two nights in October, with the host track of Woodbine Mohawk Park creating a festive weekend of events surrounding the races. The parent group, Woodbine Entertainment Group, has played host to more Breeders Crowns from 1984 to the present than any other entity, with one at Greenwood, 91 at Woodbine and 64 at Mohawk.

Eliminations for 2-year-old races will be held Friday, Oct. 18, while 3-year-old and older eliminations will race Saturday, Oct. 19.

The freshmen Breeders Crown finals take place Friday, Oct. 25 and the eight three-year-old and up events are set for Saturday, Oct. 26

AGCO allocates frozen funds to purses

In January 2010, the Director of the Ontario Racing Commission (ORC) ordered a freeze on all funds, purse accounts and money related to a number of licensees, including the Bulletproof stable, who were determined not to be acting in accordance with the law, or with integrity, honesty or in the public interest. The decision on the disposition of those funds was subject to a series of hearings, claims and orders since that time, which are now concluded.

In 2016, the ORC merged into the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO). The AGCO regulates the horse racing industry in accordance with the principles of honesty, integrity, and in the public interest.

After careful consideration of this matter, the Registrar determined that the fairest and most transparent approach to the distribution of these funds is to ensure that 100 per cent of the funds are used for the industry.

Given the passage of time since the funds were first frozen and the number of races and participants involved, the Registrar determined that allocating the funds to future standardbred purses is the best way of ensuring the funds are used to benefit the industry as a whole.

Alan Leavitt suggestion for tackling the blood doping problem

No question Ronnie Gurfein is right that blood doping is the worst problem facing our sport today ([full story here](#)).

The most prevalent form of blood doping is the use of EPO, although I am quick to concede that there may well be more advanced forms now available and in use. The testing methods now in use are totally inadequate to catch anyone because they can only detect the presence of blood doping within very narrow windows of time once the stuff is administered. Since EPO etc., can be given weeks out, and the window for detection by present day testing methods is no more than 36 hours, the bad guys have an unbeatable advantage.

But life, in general, and harness racing in particular, are identical to my favorite sport, wrestling, in that for every move there is a counter move, if you only know it. Here I think people like Ray Schnittker, David Meirs and Sam Beegle will know exactly what I'm talking about. All three of them were great on the mat in their day, and probably still would be today, if challenged.

The solution to the problem of blood doping is a good snitch network. Once you have someone on the inside, it's easy to pinpoint the exact time to send in a technician with a needle and syringe, and you've got all the evidence you need to convict. Most states have draconian penalties, like five-year or more suspensions, that will put the evil doers out of action for good.

It isn't hard to create a snitch network. One way is to send in an undercover agent who is already an adequate groom or second trainer. A few months at a major training center where a suspect or two has his headquarters, and he'll have all the information any commission will need. Anyone who has spent time on the track knows that there are no secrets.

Alternatively, one could quietly spread the word that there's a \$5,000 reward, to be given to anyone who comes forward in total confidence with the necessary information for a successful bust.

I suspect there will be some reluctance to endorse a plan that includes the word “snitch,” but the fact is, however, that the key to solving many different forms of crimes is an undercover informant.

The people who are destroying our sport with their use of blood doping deserve a lot worse than being snitched on.

At the New York Sire Stakes Night of Champions at Batavia, all four 2- and 3-year-old trotting final events were won by Chapter Seven's offspring including the hugely talented filly Hypnotic AM. If you wish to compete on the trotting side in the New York sire stakes and also win on the grand circuit, you need a Chapter Seven who is now starting to get bred to much better mares as he keeps producing. Who wouldn't want to own another Atlanta, Hypnotic AM, Walner, Woodside Charm, or Gimpanzee?
