Captaintreacherous, American Jewel highlight big night for connections

LEXINGTON, Ky. - The exciting young pacer Captaintreacherous (Somebeachsomewhere) contributed to a big evening for his connections with a popular victory in his division of the Bluegrass Series event for two-year-old pacing colts and geldings Saturday night at the Red Mile.

It was the sixth victory in a row for Captaintreacherous, who had not competed in a pari-mutuel race since Sept. 1.

The colt, from the first crop of Somebeachsomewhere, was piloted by regular driver Tim Tetrick, who won three Grand Circuit events on the evening, including a division of the event for three-year-old pacing fillies with top filly American Jewel (American Ideal). Trainer Tony Alagna sent out two winners on the card, while co-owner Brittany Farms owned, solely or in partnership, three winners.

Captaintreacherous was relaxed in the early going, settling in fifth down the backstretch as longshot My One Tru Desire took the field through opening fractions of :27.4, :56.4 and 1:24.2. The colt kicked clear to lead by two lengths exiting the turn, looking to pull the upset. But Captaintreacherous, in the clear on the outside, wore the leader down in the stretch to win handily, stopping the clock in 1:51.3 for the mile.

"I talked to Tim after the race, and I said, 'I think that's the biggest race he's ever run,'" Alagna said. "We've always talked about his key is his ability to relax. ... He's just always showed us he had a little extra something, and he's such a smart colt. ... It's a great characteristic in a horse his age." Good Day Mate edged out Hail The Taxi for second, with My One Tru Desire fading to fourth

Captaintreacherous has now won six of seven career starts, with his only loss coming by a neck in his career debut.

Two other divisional winners were driven by Ron Pierce, as Dovuto Hanover (Dragon Again), trained by Ryan Maxwell, and Fool Me Once (Art Major), trained by Mark Austin, both came away with victories. Twilight Bonfire (The Panderosa), trained by Danny Collins, won another division to give driver John Campbell his fourth winner on the night.

Rockin Amadeus (Rockroll Hanover), driven by Yannick Gingras for trainer Jimmy Takter, was declared the winner via disqualification in his division. Odds On Equuleus, who crossed the line first, was disqualified and placed seventh for interference that caused several horses to break stride entering the far turn.

Takter teamed up with the red-hot Tetrick for another victory as, one year after her career almost ended with an injury at the Red Mile, top filly American Jewel coasted to a victory in her division of the Bluegrass Series event for three-year-old pacing fillies.

The filly suffered a fracture to a right hind sesamoid last fall, ending her season. Following surgery and recovery, she was able to return to competition this year.

American Jewel was already leading when Sarandon Blue Chip broke stride on the far turn, bothering several horses. A three-horse breakaway survived the mishap, as American Jewel, Destiny's Chance and Rockaround Sue came into the stretch well clear of the rest of the field. American Jewel quickly strutted clear and pulled away in the lane under almost no urging, finishing in 1:50.1.

American Jewel had lost four of her previous five, and was coming off a fourth in the Jugette Final last time out, her only unplaced effort in 12 starts this season.

"It feels great (to see her bounce back," owner George Segal of Brittany Farms, which also bred the filly, said. "You can't win every race. There are a lot of good fillies out there. Delaware's a hard place to win."

The filly has now won 14 of 21 career starts, pushing her earnings past \$1.5 million.

In the event's other division, Shelliscape (Artiscape) avenged her loss to Darena Hanover in the Jugette Final, besting that rival and the rest of a classy field.

Darena Hanover led at the half mile marker, but New York Stallion Series final winner Romantic Moment, who was bidding for her fifth consecutive win, began to inch up around the far turn. The filly took the lead once straightened away into the stretch. But Shelliscape, relaxed early, came flying down the center of the track with a sustained bid, wearing Romantic Moment down in the final yards for the victory in a personal-best 1:49.1.

Behind the top two came Lightning Paige and Ramalama; Darena Hanover faded to fifth.

Shelliscape, a New York Stallion Series division winner earlier in the year for trainer Robert McIntosh, won an elimination heat of the Jugette by 6 1/4 lengths on Sept. 19 at Delaware, but ultimately finished third to Darena Hanover in the final.

The filly's Bluegrass Series win on Saturday gave her eight wins from 27 career starts, pushing her earnings past \$400,000.

Thinking Out Loud, Mel Mara shine at Red Mile

LEXINGTON, Ky. - Thinking Out Loud (Ponder) rebounded from an unplaced effort in the Little Brown Jug in his prior outing, roaring down the stretch to win a division of the Winbak Farms Bluegrass Series for three-year-old pacing colts and geldings Saturday night at the Red Mile.

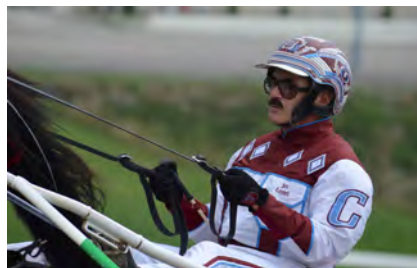
The colt capped a huge night for driver John Campbell and trainer Robert McIntosh.

Campbell piloted four winners, including three in Grand Circuit events. In addition to Thinking Out Loud, he drove Shelliscape to win a division of the Bluegrass Series event for three-year-old pacing fillies, and Twilight Bonfire to win a division of the event for two-year-old pacing colts. McIntosh - who also co-bred and co-owns Thinking Out Loud - trained

all but one of Campbell's winners, including Shelliscape. The duo would have recorded another Grand Circuit victory on the evening, but Odds On Equuleus was disqualified from the win in his division of the event for two-year-old pacing colts.

Thinking Out Loud was content to sit in third early as Pet Rock controlled the tempo through comfortable early fractions of :28.2 and :57.1 Campbell angled Thinking Out Loud out for room entering the far turn and the colt edged up to put some pressure on the leader through three quarters in 1:25.3.

Thinking Out Loud made his bid for the lead nearing the top of the stretch and easily put away the pacemaker. The colt unleashed a furious kick down the lane to secure the victory, stopping the clock in 1:51.

"He's got a tremendous kick, when he's in position," Campbell said of his colt's flying final half-mile.

Bettor's Edge, who was third in the Little Brown Jug, wore down Pet Rock to edge him for the place.

Thinking Out Loud won the \$1.5 million Pepsi North America

Cup in stakes record time (1:47.4) in June, and later finished second to Bolt The Duer in the Kentucky Stallion Series final in July. The colt finished fourth in his elimination heat of the Little Brown Jug - which was won by the race's eventual champion, Michael's Power - then was fourth in the final.

Thinking Out Loud, who is out of the Camluck mare Los Angeles, became a millionaire with his ninth victory from 20 career starts.

The night's other division of the event for three-year-old pacing males was won by Mel Mara (Lis Mara), who helped fuel a big night for driver Tim Tetrick, trainer Tony Alagna and co-owner Brittany Farms.

Kentucky Stallion Series final winner Bolt The Duer, who came in off a runner-up effort in an elimination heat of the Little Brown Jug, led through opening fractions of :27.2 and :56.2. Mel Mara began edging up on the leader down the backstretch, and poked a head in front on the turn through six furlongs in 1:23.3.

Mel Mara fought off Bolt The Duer in upper stretch and strutted clear in the final stages, opening up to finish the mile in 1:49.4.

"They weren't going much (up front) at all," Tetrick said. "I just pulled my colt and gave him a shot. ... I just asked for speed and he gave it to me."

Sweet Lou and Bettor's Edge, second and third in the Little Brown Jug final, passed a fading Bolt The Duer to

round out the trifecta.

Mel Mara, who won for the first time since taking an Ontario Stallion Series division in July, now has five wins from 19 career starts.

"They've always had high hopes for this horse," Tetrick said. "They've always thought he had a lot of ability, and he just never really put everything together."

The colt was bred by John Carver, who co-owns the colt with Brittany Farms and Riverview Farms.

Tetrick won three Grand Circuit events on the evening, as he also took a division of the event for three-year-old pacing fillies with American Jewel and a division of the event for two-year-old pacing males with Captaintreacherous. All three are owned, solely or in part, by Brittany Farms. Alagna trains both Mel Mara and Captaintreacherous.

"I would have liked to see (Check Me Out) born a different year," Jonas Czernyson, Maven's trainer, said. "Unfortunately, she wasn't so we have to do the best we can with the situation. It's nice for the public. Everybody knows both horses. You have the Check Me Out

fans and you have the Maven fans. That's fun. But I am in this to make money and if Check Me Out weren't around things would be easier for us. Put it this way: I don't want to race her because I don't want to go full out all the time, but I am not afraid of racing against her."

Maven hasn't had a great September. After losing to check Me Out in the Pa. Champions, she finished second in the Bucketette as the 3-10 choice.

"I never get disappointed with this horse because she races her heart out," Czernyson said. "She gives all she has every time."

Trainer Ray Schnittker has already announced that Check Me Out will compete in only the first heat of the Kentucky Filly Futurity, which is next on the schedule after the Bluegrass. Schnittker is no fan of heat racing. When asked if Maven was going to go in more than the first heat

Check Me Out and Maven Face Off Again

What is one of the best rivalries in harness racing will resume today at The Red Mile as **Check Me Out** (Donato Hanover) and **Maven** (Glidemaster) will meet in a \$70,700 Bluegrass series race. It's the 11th race on the card and it should be the highlight on the last day of the first week of Grand Circuit racing at the historic Lexington track.

Check Me Out, a leading contender for Horse of the Year, has lost just twice this year, when she broke in the Hambletonian Oaks and when Maven beat her in a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes race at the Meadows. Since then, Check Me Out has beaten her rival in the Elegantimage, by a mere nose, and in a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championship event.

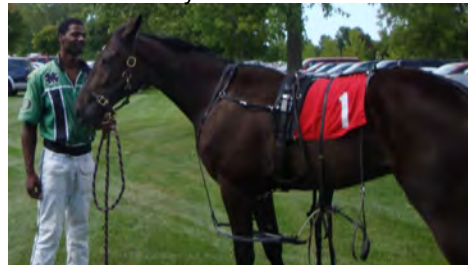
Win Missy B (Conway Hall), still another outstanding 3-year-old filly trotter, heads Race 4, also a Bluegrass race. As the 3-5 favorite, she broke stride last time out in the Night of Champions race for New York bred at Yonkers and finished last. Ron Pierce will drive, taking over for Brian Sears.

.Another race sure to attract attention today is one of the cheapest on the card. Race 10, a \$7,500 Open, has attracted **Chapter Seven** (Windsong's Legacy), the leader in his division, and **Arch Madness** (Balanced Image), who usually shows up in six-figure races and has made more than \$3.6 million.

From Mississippi to the Winner's Circle in Illinois By Neil Milbert

They began coming from Mississippi to the Illinois county fairs with their pacers and their trotters sometime in the mid-1990s. Through the good and lean years they have kept coming back. Illinois has become the home away from home for the "Mississippians", a cadre of African American drivers and trainers out of the Magnolia State.

Some of them—the most notable being Jamaica Patton, Jerome Daniels and Ronnie Gillespie—ventured to the pari-mutuel tracks in addition to the county fairs and the State Fairs at DuQuoin and Springfield and now drive and train in Illinois year-around.

year and his father, Freddie Patton, Sr., shared leading owner honors with Mara Lea Jeffers. The Pattons' Sherry's Band is one of North America's leading 2-year-old filly trotters in the races-won category.

In the fall of 2011, during Balmoral Park's Super Night extravaganza, Jamaica Patton drove Maplegrove Shaelyn to an upset victory in the \$103,000 Lady Ann Reed for 3-year-old filly trotters. In August, Gillespie trained and drove the winner of the \$54,000 Plesac Stakes at Balmoral, Show Stopin Monkey. Six weeks earlier, he won the \$123,000 Maywood Pace with NJ's Big Deal

Freddie Patton, Sr., Willie Jones and Charles Holmes were the pioneers in the migration to Illinois by outstanding black horsemen from the area around Jackson, Miss.

"They started coming between 15 and 20 years ago," recalled 48-year-old Freddie Patton, Jr. "When my dad came I followed along. I brought two Mississippi-breds. The

second year dad was working a job so I tagged along with Charles Holmes.

"Dad was the initial one who started buying Illinois-breds and drawing attention to the Illinois fairs. Jerome Williams is my brother and Jamaica is my nephew. I helped them get started.

"I'm kind of a homebody and like to stay close to Dad here in Clinton (Miss.) during the rest of the year but every spring I make the seven-hour trip to Illinois and base in DuQuoin. During the summer I'll make drives of from six to eight hours round-trip to race at different fairs two or three times a week. I do all the driving and all the horse driving.

"I've bought into Illinois. I love it. The (relatively meager) purse money is just a blessing. It pays for the gas to race the horses."

Eliot "Doc" Narotsky, the racing secretary at Balmoral and Maywood Park and the State Fairs, and Brad Dye, a presiding judge on the county fair circuit, believe the Mississippians make a significant contribution to the Illinois racing, particularly on the grass roots level.

"They've gone to the sales and gradually improved their stock by getting better pedigreed horses," Dye said.

"They're excellent horsemen. Their horses are ready to race when they get here and they go from fair to fair, picking their spots. In recent years our horse population in Illinois has been relatively low--we need those guys."

While Freddie, Sr. and Freddie, Jr. use DuQuoin in the southwest part of the state as their headquarters, Williams, Jamaica Patton and Gillespie are based at the State Fairgrounds at Springfield in central Illinois.

"I've basically been driving and training in Illinois all my (adult) life," said the 29-year-old Williams. "My dad raced here so I followed. I hired on with a guy and eventually stayed. I made the move here nine years ago to help a guy train and I've been here ever since. I've got 15 horses and own five of them by myself.

"I drive but there's nothing like training. I like the trotters best because you have to use more of your head to get them going. I race mainly at the fairs in northern Illinois, somewhere between 10 and 15 a summer.

"It's good to have a bigger brother like Freddie that I can look up to. He's at the top. His trainer percentage at the fairs probably was around 45% winners and his driving percentage probably was 40%."

Jamaica Patton followed his great uncle and uncles to the Illinois county fair circuit in 1997 and "it took off from there." Now, he focuses mainly on racing at the State Fairs and at Balmoral, which is a three-hour drive from Springfield.

"I only went to about four or five county fairs this year, not as many as I normally did in previous years," Jamaica said.

In addition to doing catch-driving for several owners, he works for trainer Nick Giberson and helps his friend, Joe Mullins, the owner-trainer of Maplegrove Shaelyn, the filly who gave Jamaica Patton the biggest victory of his driving career on Super Night in 2011.

"I got to know Jamaica when he was training at Springfield," Mullins said. "I always thought he had a great deal of talent and was a very nice gentleman."

Freddie Patton, Sr. and Freddie Jr., and fellow driver-trainers Rashon Triggs and Curtis Rice headed the contingent of Mississippians who returned home after the County Fair racing season ended in September.

"We've got a barn atop a hill and, believe it or not, a little track no bigger than a quarter mile down here in Clinton," said Freddie, Jr. "My dad had lung cancer, which has affected his speaking ability, but he still is very hands-on in helping me get the horses broken and legged up.

"In Philadelphia, Miss. they hold a county fair and have a solid five days of racing but I haven't been to that fair for about 15 years because I've been coming to Illinois. What we have here is what we call back-of-the-yard racing. All winter long we meet up on the weekends, we get the grill out and the beer out and we go at it. Anybody can call anybody out and any time is good.

"I raced approximately 16-18 horses at the fairs this summer. In the past I've been up to maybe 20. We're breaking eight Illinois-bred babies. I also have one Ontario-bred and one Indiana-bred we bought out of the Illini Sale at Springfield.

"I sell to a lot of people; agents from out East will call me. A lot of the horses I broke and trained are racing at Yonkers and the Meadowlands."

This letter is not meant to debate the merits of stakes that require horses to run two or three times to determine a winner. Owners and trainers opposed to such races can simply avoid entering. Those who do enter should be required to race under the set conditions. If a horse is scratched after the first heat (without injury or illness diagnosed by the vet), there should be penalties. Forfeit the stakes payments and entry fees? Lose first heat purse money? Suspensions for actions not in the best interests of racing?

At the very least, rules should be changed to allow a horse that missed qualifying for the next heat to get in as a replacement for the scratched horse. Tracks, sponsors and state racing regulators need to address this issue now. Bob Absher

Once again, another trainer has made it clear that their horse will go one heat and scratch out of a multi-heat race. First it was Bolt The Duer (trainer Peter Foley) in the Little Brown Jug, this time it is Ray Schnittker deciding Check Me Out is going to race in the first heat of the Kentucky Filly Futurity and then scratch out.

As trainer of Check Me Out, Schnittker feels based on his own prior experiences it would hurt his filly to race two heats. Quite honestly, whether you agree with Schnittker or not doesn't matter, as the trainer if he feels racing two heats is too much for his filly, you need to respect his decision. But if Ray Schnittker feels strongly about this, he should keep his filly in the barn or find a different race for his horse.

The Little Brown Jug, Kentucky Futurity, Filly Futurity, and starting no later than 2014, the Hambletonian are multi-heat races. When you nominate and/or make sustaining payments you make these payments knowing the format of the race; racing multiple heats if you are fortunate enough to advance to the next heat. There really is no secret to this. To make the payments to a race and then claim you are not going to race in a second heat because it will be too tough on your horse doesn't hold water. Don't make the payments if you don't want to race multiple heats and if you have made payments all along and then decide your horse has had too tough a campaign to go two heats at a particular point in the season, don't drop the horse in the box and save the declaration fee.

What is perhaps most bewildering about this 'One and Out' phenomenon is the acceptance of the sponsors of these races of this behavior. Here you have a horse where the trainer has no intention of racing twice in one day earning a spot in the second heat scratching out, thereby denying a horse whose ownership and trainer had every attention of complying with the race conditions a start in the second heat. Yet, the horse is allowed to scratch out with whatever purse money earned without any penalty. It is time for racing to take a stand against this type of behavior and make it known if you enter, you are going to race what you agreed to when you made your stakes payments or incur a stiff penalty.

There are two ways race sponsors can address this.

I am a fan of both thoroughbred and harness racing and, to me, the greatest asset the standardbred has is its toughness. I hate seeing these thoroughbreds that run only five times a year and always seem to have two months off in between races. That the harness horse can race every week and twice in a day if necessary is, to me, their greatest asset. So I hate to see harness trainers start to talk about how their horses can't handle heats. If that's true then it's a sad statement about the breed. If harness racing ever gets to a point where their horses become "soft" then the game will be much worse off. Heats should be here to stay. Brenda Zimmerman.

On the heels of Bolt The Duer's planned "one heat and out" at the Little Brown Jug, this contagious strategy has spread to The Red Mile and Check Me Out's connections. Entering multi-heat races with no intention of going another heat is bad for racing. Can you imagine an NFL team qualifying for the Super Bowl and pulling out? That would never happen and should be unacceptable in racing.

Either revert to a best in summary method of earning purse money with an added provision if you do not race in all heats you are eligible to, you are disqualified for purposes of purse money; double the declaration/starting fee where half the fee is refunded if the horse races in all heats they are eligible for. Of course, accommodations should be made for horses which are scratched as a result of injury or sickness which was not present prior to the first heat by the state veterinarian. If a race sponsor is unwilling to tighten up these conditions to prevent 'One and Out', I would suggest they need to change the conditions of their race so it is raced as a single dash or in eliminations.
