Ohioans in the Dayton stakes spotlight

On Saturday, Hollywood Dayton Raceway plays host to Dayton Derbies and Ohio Sires Stakes consolations, \$1.1 million is up for grabs.

Hollywood Dayton Raceway opened for its eighth season last Friday (Sept. 24), but they waited eight nights to celebrate with a \$1,184,000 card set for Saturday (Oct. 2). Headlining the 14-race menu are a trio of \$175,000 Dayton Derbies and Ohio Sire Stake Consolation events.

The 'locals' best shot for a win will be in the \$175,000 Dayton Derby for older male pacers.

The trainer/driver combo of Christi and Dan Noble will send Ocean Rock (3-1) out as the second morning line choice.

Sandra Burnett of nearby Xenia, OH, owns and bred the 4-year-old gelded son on Rockin Amadeus, who has earned \$817,622 lifetime.

Ocean Rock has amassed a three-race win streak that included the \$182,000 Hoosier Park Pacing Derby (Sept. 24), the \$135,000 Jim Ewart Memorial (Sept. 11) and the \$85,000 Ohio Sire Stakes Final (Sept. 4), that latter two at Eldorado Scioto Downs.

"He came out of the Hoosier Derby extremely sharp," said Christi Noble. "We expect another strong performance Saturday. He's really rounded into top form at the right time."

Trainer Todd Luther will send out a pair for his brother, Greg Luther's Black Magic Racing: Catch The Fire (Scott Zeron) and Chief Mate (Trevor Smith).

Catch The Fire has turned his attention solely to racing after pulling double-duty – breeding and racing – for the first portion of the year.

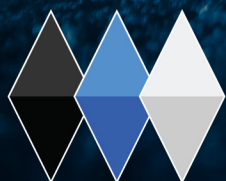

"Catch The Fire is in good form, I'm really happy with last week's race with having the 10 hole I thought he raced super into a somewhat slow half coming first up," said Todd Luther. "Scotty (Zeron) has options of what to do when gate folds with speed on the inside and outside this is a great field of horses. I know Fire will give 110 per cent as he always does and expect him to be right there at the wire. We are using derby for a prep for Lexington."

Chief Mate, who was a \$220,000 purchase at the 2021 Tattersalls Winter Mixed Sale, has picked up just under \$100,000 on the season for the Reynoldsburg, OH based owner. Chief will get the ultimate equipment change.

"He's been a little off his game with fighting some sickness issues," said Luther. "Greg and I decided to geld him after his last start and he has been training great. With a little time off, I look for him to be back to his old self this week."

The final Ohio-based contender is Gold Digger King (David Miller). Linda Van Camp owns the five-year-old Pet Rock gelding. Scott Mogan trains the lifetime earner of \$418,237, who has made 61 of 62 career starts in the Buckeye state.

The Dayton Trotting Derby will feature the 2019 Hambletonian winner, Forbidden Trade (Bob McClure), the three-time Breeders Crown champion Manchego (Dexter Dunn) and the current Ms. Versatility Final queen When Dovescry (David Miller).

Forbidden Trade, a winner of half of his 40 career starts, comes into the 'Derby' off two solid performances – a win in the \$210,000 Caesars Trotting Classic at Hoosier Park (Sept. 25) and a second-place finish in the \$436,800 Maple Leaf Trot at

Woodbine Mohawk Park (Sept. 4).

Trainer Nancy Takter will send out a trio to challenge, including Manchego, Ready For Moni (Andrew McCarthy) and Sorella (Yannick Gingras).

The 6-year-old Muscle Hill mare Manchego spent most of the summer as the top ranked horse in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll until a couple of poor performances and breaks in stride in the Armbro Flight (Sept. 17) and the Maple Leaf Trot.

Manchego had a winning qualifying effort in 1:53.2 on Sept. 24 at The Red Mile.

The hottest horse in the older mare trot division may be When Dovescry. The Brett Pelling trainee has a three-race win streak which includes the \$116,000 Ms. Versatility Final at Delaware (Sept. 23) and the \$184,070 Armbro Flight.

Lyons Sentinel is the overwhelming favorite in the Distaff Derby. The 4-year-old daughter of Captaintreacherous has won six straight and was recently tapped as the top horse currently in North America. She has earned \$1.7 million lifetime for Three Lyons racing.

The Derby undercard will feature eight \$75,000 Ohio Sires Stakes Consolation races for Ohio-bred horses divided by age, sex and gait.

The 2-year-old filly trot will feature three fillies that are coming into the consolation final in great form.

Reichers Caviar (David Miller) and I'll Annie Up (Chris Page) each won divisions of the \$124,000 (div) Ohio Breeders Championship in their last start (Sept. 22) at the Delaware County Fair.

King hopes Lyons Sentinel continue to roar

In 2019, trainer Jim King Jr. saw his pacing mare Shartin N spend every week ranked No. 1 in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll on her way to being named the Dan Patch Award's Horse of the Year.

On Tuesday (Sept. 28), Lyons Sentinel, another pacing mare from King's training stable, took over the No. 1 ranking in this season's Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll. It took her 19 weeks to ascend to the top, but it was no less exciting when King heard the news.

A 4-year-old mare, Lyons Sentinel has won six consecutive races — and seven of her past eight — as she prepares for Saturday's \$175,000 Dayton Distaff Derby at Hollywood Gaming Dayton Raceway, where she is the 6-5 morning-line favorite. For the season, she has won eight of 14 starts, hit the board a total of 11 times, and earned \$517,183.

"As of right now, she's stepping up to the plate," said King, who trains Lyons Sentinel for owner Threelyonsracing. "She's moved into a spot where we had another one, and that's quite a spot, I'll tell ya. Wow. It's hard to believe what a feeling it is, and to think it could happen twice."

Lyons Sentinel was a Dan Patch Award winner as a 2-year-old in 2019, when she won nine of 14 races, never finished off the board, and led her age group in purses with \$801,809.

Last year, she finished no worse than second in 11 of 14 starts, winning three. Of her five runner-up finishes on the Grand Circuit, three were to Party Girl Hill, an unraced 2-year-old who captured 15 of 16 races at 3 and was the division's Dan Patch Award honoree.

Party Girl Hill was retired in the spring because of an injury and

bred to Tall Dark Stranger.

"Last year, Lyons Sentinel ran into an exceptional filly, Party Girl Hill," King said. "Lyons Sentinel was an exceptional 2-year-old and if you take Party Girl Hill out of the picture, she would have been an exceptional 3-year-old. For (Party Girl Hill) to show up made all the difference in her year from 2 to 3.

"I know the 4-year-old year is a tough campaign — boy or girl, trotter or pacer. It can be a real tough transition. But Lyons Sentinel has got what it takes. She's stepped up now and been able to go with the big girls."

Lyons Sentinel heads to the Dayton Distaff Derby off a 1:49.2 win in the Milton Stakes, where she defeated Rocknificent by 1-1/2 lengths. Rocknificent is the 3-1 second choice Saturday. She has finished second to Lyons Sentinel in four consecutive Grand Circuit finals, with the Milton preceded by the Roses Are Red, Lady Liberty, and Clara Barton.

"Her winning attitude is everything," King said about Lyons Sentinel, who is a daughter of Captaintreacherous out of Tutu Hanover. "When she gets to the wire, she is generally going as fast as she is at any part of the mile. That makes it tough on everybody else if they've been used, or even the fresh ones trying to run her down.

"She doesn't have to have the perfect trip. She would much rather run them down coming out of the pocket, but she can kind of make her trip."

For her career, Lyons Sentinel has won 20 of 42 races, missed

the top three only six times, and earned \$1.75 million. Following Saturday's race, the mare will bypass the Allerage Farms Mare Pace on Oct. 10 and prep for the Breeders Crown and TVG Series final. Lyons Sentinel is a two-time Breeders Crown runner-up, losing the races by a combined total of just more than a quarter-length.

"We're setting our sights on that," King said. "We're hoping to get the Breeders Crown and TVG. She's always been ready to go when the time comes."

King's stable also includes a blossoming Three Lyons racing 2-year-old female pacer, Lyons Serenity. That filly has seven wins — six in a row — and a second in eight races. She competes Friday in a division of the Bluegrass Stakes at Lexington's Red Mile.

Lyons Serenity won the Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stakes in her most recent outing, which followed victories in a division of the Keystone Classic and the final of the Pennsylvania Stallion Series. The daughter of Sweet Lou — Southwind Serenity, a \$35,000 buy under the name Southwind Sprout at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, has earned \$181,842.

"She had a fairly easy schedule in that she did the Stallion Stakes instead of (Pennsylvania) Sire Stakes," King said. "We felt she could have been competitive in the Sire Stakes, and I don't think anybody would dispute that, but at the end of the year she is pretty pleased with herself. She's had to race every time, but at the same time, she was in where it was well within her capabilities.

"She's a really nice filly. We're really setting the stage for her for next year, hopefully. She will need to mature to do the right thing next year. She's not quite top-top quality. She could race with the top ones, but she couldn't dominate in there. We're hoping she matures some. She's got plenty of size, now she's just got to make that more of an athlete's body and carry the determination she's shown so far with her."

Saturday's card at Dayton also includes the Dayton Trotting Derby and Dayton Pacing Derby.

The Trotting Derby features a Hambletonian winner, 5-2 favorite Forbidden Trade, and three Hambletonian Oaks winners in When Doves Cry (3-1), Manchego (7-2), and Sorella (12-1) plus two additional millionaires in Ready For Moni (9-2) and Guardian Angel As (6-1).

This Is The Plan, the richest older pacer in the sport with \$724,044 in purses, is the 5-2 favorite in the Pacing Derby. Ocean Rock, coming into the race off wins in the Hoosier Park Pacing Derby and Jim Ewart Memorial, is 3-1 followed by multiple Grand Circuit winner Catch The Fire at 7-2.

Saulsbrook Olympia gives Brian Lee a first in Ontario Sires Stakes action

Trainer Brian Lee will make his Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) post-season debut tonight (Oct. 1) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, sending

Saulsbrook Olympia behind the gate in the first \$20,000 3-year-old pacing filly Grassroots Semi-Final.

The Big Jim–Racino Star daughter heads into the Semi-Final showdown off a personal best 1:51.4 clocking in the Sept. 17 Grassroots leg at Woodbine Mohawk Park, where she finished in a dead heat for the win with Cyclone Sister. She and regular reinsman Brett MacDonald will line up at Post 5 and Lee expects another consistent effort from the youngster.

“She gets around any size track, she’s very good gaited, she steers well. She is a trip horse and if you can keep her covered up and let her get some room turning for home, she usually does kick home pretty good for you,” said the Orangeville, ON resident.

“When Dexter (Dunn) drove her last week (Sept. 17), I told him that she didn’t scope good after her last start (Sept. 10) and I treated her, and I said, ‘She is a trip mare, but if you can keep her covered up she’ll give a hell of a kick for home.’ So after the race — everything kind of worked out just how you would sort of map one out — he just laughed and said, ‘Geez, you weren’t kidding, has she ever got a kick for home.’”

record of one win, two seconds, one fourth and one seventh, which gave her 95 points and sole ownership of eighth spot in the division standings. She started her sophomore campaign with a four-race win streak that culminated with a victory in the July 4 Kin Pace Final at Clinton Raceway.

Lee has grown fond of the young pacer, but admits it took him a while to figure her out when she arrived from trainer Mike Armstrong's barn in April.

"I always wear a hood on her, because she'll be a little excitable jogging, but when you'd turn her and go a mile she'd kind of just drop the bit, so I really didn't know what to think of her right off the bat," Lee said. "Then one day I wanted to go a fast mile and I said, 'Well, I'll take the ear hood off her', and I went without the ear hood and my god she was a different filly all together. She latched right onto the bit and she trained a nice mile, and from that day forward I kind of liked her."

Lee trains the filly for breeder Allan McNeil and his father Bill McNeil's Saulsbrook Stables Inc. of Windsor, NS and Edward Gorc of Sudbury, ON, just the latest in a group of owners that have made the horseman's nearly four-decade-long career an enjoyable one.

"That's one thing I will say, over the years, I have had great owners, just great people to deal with," said Lee, who has also trained horses for Bill Andrew and John MacPhail of Calgary, AB, Frank Brundle of East Garafraxa and Mary Christopher of Acton, ON. "I've just met a lot of good people in this business. I just can't say enough about how people, if anything goes wrong with anybody in this business, they're always the first to step up and help. You just don't find a lot of places that are like that."

Born in England and raised in Orangeville, Lee was introduced to harness racing at the old Orangeville Raceway by Len and Ron Hutton. He spent a number of years working for Bill Cass, was introduced to the joys of training in Florida by Keith Waples and lured back into the business after a brief detour by Jeff Ginn.

"Just before I went to Florida I actually got out of the business for about a year and a half and I worked in a factory that started up in Orangeville, it was called Johnson Controls, it made car seats for Chrysler," said Lee. "They had a shutdown at Chrysler, and Jeff Ginn, he asked me to come work for him when we were in one of our shutdowns, and that's how I got back into the horses again."

After working for a few winters with Jim Ritchie in Florida, Lee was sent back to Ontario with a couple of horses while Ritchie headed to The Meadowlands. Lee moved into First Line Training Centre, just northeast of Guelph, in the spring of 1995 and has been there ever since. Over the past 26 years he has worked with countless horses, old, young, conditioned and claimer, but there are a few that stand out.

"I haven't had any great horses, but I've had a lot of nice horses," said Lee. "Going back to the Bill Cass days there was a horse I kind of remember fondly, Gonna Be Happy (Most Happy Fella-Brenda Blue Chip). Since I've been on my own, a horse called One Eighty (late Lobell-Spinaway) was one of my favorites and another one called Chevron Hanover (Astreos-Cheyenna Mae). More recently I had a nice old horse called Par Intended (No Pan Intended-Parapanalia) that I liked a lot, and I kind of have a little fondness for this Saulsbrook Olympia and this Lenis (Il Sogno Dream-Windsong Chance) trotter that I have too, they're kind of nice little horses."

Lee currently has three horses in training, Saulsbrook Olympia, 2-year-old trotting colt Lenis for Leonard and Mary Christopher, and 4-year-old pacing mare Saulsbrook Ocean (Westwardho Hanover-Shark Reef) for Edward Gorc. Lenis made his debut on Sept. 28 at Woodbine Mohawk Park and impressed his trainer with a late closing effort for driver Chris Christoforou.

"He actually raced very well, I was very happy with him," said Lee. "He ended up finishing fourth and trotted his own last quarter in :27.1, so I was just thrilled with him."

The colt fits the conditions for the Harvest Series at Woodbine Mohawk Park this fall and so long as he stays happy and healthy, Lee expects he will race in that event and then enjoy a winter break. Saulsbrook Olympia will also be headed for a well-earned vacation when the Grassroots season comes to a close.

Lee has no plans to visit the yearling sales this fall, content with work with the horses currently in residence in his barn.

"I don't really like to keep any more than five. Like I said, I like to do it myself and if I can keep four or five, that keeps me happy," said Lee, who has clearly found a recipe for success that works for him and his pupils.

On this date 41 years ago, Niatross posted a stunning 1:49.1 time trial at The Red Mile

Niatross was scheduled to time trial the week prior, but at the last moment, in front of 6,000 fans, Clint cancelled and reset the date for Wednesday, Oct. 1, 1980.

There were 231 time trials scheduled and Niatross was #59. He was to go after the seventh race on the nine-race card.

Time trial #85 on the list was none other than Margies Melody, who won in 1:55.4 to beat 1:58.4. You might remember she and Niatross were paired and they produced none other than Nihilator.

Galbraith had a couple of trotters he time trialed before Niatross – Easy Kash after the second and Robert after the third.

Earlier on the card, a two-horse non-betting race won by Overkill in 1:54.4 took place.

Niatross was out to beat not only his own mark of 1:52.4, but the eight-year-old time trial record set over the very same oval by Steady Star – who just so happened to be the most represented stallion on that day's race card. He also had five in to time trial – including the first, Uplift, and the last, The Booger Lady.

There were four Horse of the Year sires on that day's card – Bye Bye Byrd, Albatross, Speedy Scot and Nevele Pride

Toy Poodle won for the 14th time at age 3 – in a new lifetime mark of 1:53.4 – as the fastest time of the day on the race card. James Michael of Bucyrus, OH owned the sophomore daughter of Most Happy Fella who improved to 22 14-4-1 \$184G on the season for Billy Herman.

Oscar Bowden, 71, was the oldest participant-winning one of the two divisions of the "Gentlemen's Driving Club" events.

The card featured total purses of \$25,070.

Some other notables who either did time trial that week or were scheduled to were:

Classical Way #204 – she did go to the 3/4s in 1:24.3 but unfortunately broke in mid-stretch. She was that year's Trotter of the year.

The program listed 231 of the scheduled time trials (although there were add-ons). Twenty-six of those were to be handled by none other than Joe O'Brien, the master of the time trial. Remember he was 63 then.

Before we look at the Niatross TT, The Booger Lady went 1:57 after race 1; Faith Almahurst 1:55.4 after the first; 1:59 flat for Easy Kasy and Clint Galbraith after the second; Robert 2:00.1 after the third also for Clint; Desert King 1:57.3 after the fourth; Keystone Mohawk after the fifth for Billy Haughton in 1:56.4; Justin Passing and Doug Arthur in 1:53.2 after the 6th, as well as Striking Force after race 6 as well in 1:54.1.

Then... Niatross

His splits were: :27.3, :54.3, 1:21.4, 1:49.1

It was eight years to the day of Steady Star's prior mark of 1:52 flat. Many forget that it was the very next day in 1971 that Albatross – Niatross' sire – won the Tattersalls in 1:54.4 twice, despite starting from the 12 post in the opener and in the second heat starting slowly from the rail and encountering a parade of leaves flying into his face turning for home. He was the first ever sub-1:55 race-winning 3-year-old and he did it twice.

As for Niatross, after his time trial it would be 10 days to his next race, the Messenger, when he went to Roosevelt and completed the Triple Crown.

Niatross would then go to the Meadowlands (Oct. 16) with thoroughbred Spectacular Bid to be showcased for the crowd. Both were Horses of the year, although Spectacular Bid's season was done. Niatross' was not.

Niatross' son, Nihilator, would be the first to go sub-1:50 in a race (1:49.3) five years later and Matts Scooter would be the first to better 1:49 with a 1:48.2 Red Mile time trial in the fall of 1988.

Some numbers in the Mohawk Million card aftermath

Steve Stewart may already have his Mohawk Million slot for 2022 having bred the first two winners – Venerate and Venerable.

Dial 9-11? No need. Venerable and Monte Miki overcame those posts, respectively, to win the two richest races on the card.

Twenty-one years ago, David Miller won the first Breeders Crown Trot to go for \$1 Million (with Magician).

All three winners of Saturday's three biggest races at Mohawk departed, and remain, undefeated – Niki Hill, Venerable and Monte Miki.

Never in any prior trotting million-dollar race had the two oldest drivers finish 1-2, but that happened when Miller, 56, was first and Paul MacDonell, 57, was second.

As for Mohawk Million winner Venerable, who is a perfect eight-for-eight, a 2-year-old trotting filly has never been named Horse of the Year.

Snow White's 2007 earnings record for all 2-year-old trotters (\$1,252,646) may be in jeopardy. That year, Snow White was third in the HOY balloting: Donato Hanover (157), Deweycheatumnhowe (13) and Snow White (11). The closest 2-year-old trotting filly since in HOY balloting was Manchego, who was third in 2017.

Impact of slanted start gate at Woodbine Mohawk is inconclusive so far

When racing resumed at Woodbine Mohawk Park in June following its latest pause due to government-imposed restrictions, the track did so with the adaptation of a new starting gate. More

specifically, what's known as a slanted, or staggered starting gate.

The motivating factors behind the slanted starting gate were two-fold. One, the new starting gate would allow for all horses to be on the gate in a 10-horse field, a change from prior where the horse in post-10 would start as a trailer in the second tier. The other reason specific to the slanted start, was to attempt to level the chances of those horses starting from the outside posts.

Designed and built by Ohio-based Mike Woebkenberg, the slanted starting gate extends nine feet between the first starting slot on the gate and the 10th. Beginning from the first to the second slot, each increment is one foot apart and extends to the 10th spot on the gate.

From June 11 through the super month of racing in September (can we start calling it Super September?) that just concluded at Woodbine Mohawk, what do the actual numbers bear out? I went into this exercise with the assumption that the outside posts would show clear improvements and gains in winning since each post is beginning with at least a one-foot advantage from prior (or multiple feet if horses directly inside aren't leaving), but the findings were more mixed.

On the weekend of June 11-12, things certainly were off and running. Those two nights each saw multiple post-10 horses win, some at huge prices. Even after the first two weeks through June 25, post 10 was winning on the pace at an astounding 19.4 per cent! From there, however, the numbers would come back to reality.

Specific to the pacing statistics where there were more races in the data set than on the trot, between last November through this April where a traditional starting gate was used and post 10 was a second-tier trailer, posts 1 through 4 produced similar results, all winning at 10-11 per cent. Posts 5 and 6 were the standouts, winning at 15 and 17 per cent, respectively. Going out further, the win percentages decreased to where the outside post 9 posted a winning clip of 8.5 per cent.

Still on the pacing side and now looking at results with the slanted starting gate used June through September, post 1 won at just 8 per cent, down from 10.5 per cent prior. Posts 2 through 6 posted results comparable enough to prior starting gate, though posts 7 and 8 were where more noticeable gains were seen. Post 7 saw a 2 per cent gain in win rate and post 8 increased from 7.9 per cent to 10.4 per cent. Post 9 won only at 4.7 per cent with the new gate presumably due to lower quality horses with that post in a smaller data sample, though post 10 won at 8.1 per cent, essentially the same as what the outside post 9 produced with the prior gate.

Findings on the trot side are similar. Post 1 actually shows

an increase in win percentage from prior, though posts 2 and 3 show sharp declines. Those declines were offset by large increases in the win percentages between posts 4 and 6. The rest of the posts aren't as reliable to measure due to the fewer full fields on the trot, on top of fewer trot races than pacing races to start with.

So, what's to make of all these numbers and percentages?

For starters, the changes aren't particularly dramatic overall, but they do point to a trend one might expect where post 1 is the most adversely affected post by the slanted gate, starting anywhere from one to nine feet behind the rest of the competition. To make better sense of what's happening in practical terms, I turned to a WEG resident expert who wished to remain anonymous to get his take.

Not surprised by what the numbers show, he said, "The inside has to hustle to get away into an early striking spot, and many are being buried sixth or worse. The outside still has to hustle too, and it seems like they give cover to the 5, 6 and 7 horses that would not be leaving without seeing some possible cover or hole created by the movement.

"My favorite post is 6 right now. With a little effort you get away fourth or fifth, which used to be what the inside three horses would benefit from the mid-gate leavers. Some people won't play trotters from the rail and now it's worse."

He also notes that many superfectas are populated 4 through 8, and surmises that the slanted gate has eliminated any favorability of drawing the rail and at the same time only helping the outside posts minimally.

If you believe the statistics or agree with the observations, what are some of the reasons for only the subtle changes? Perhaps part of that is because of the relatively long straight away until the first turn on the 7/8th mile track configuration is that there's still plenty of time for horses to sort themselves out as they normally would. And most opening quarters still seem right on par with what they were before, suggesting that there's not an all-out effort to outspurt others off the gate; at least no more-so than prior.

Of course, the gate itself is just one component of a race, and both driver and horse are responsible for their parts too. In addition to building the gate, Woebkenberg also is the starter for an estimated 3,800 races a year between pari-mutuel races and fairs, including the Little Brown Jug. Woebkenberg says, "I personally believe that the starter is a partner with every horse and every driver at the start. I believe there are more races won and lost behind the gate than are ever won at the finish line."

Cousins Mike and Jim Lisa of Lisa Photo have been shooting at The Meadowlands for 23 and 22 years, respectively. But growing up, these Jersey boys didn't picture that this was their future.

"I was always into art, drawing, painting," said Mike. "Photography came later. In grammar school, they'd always ask, 'What do you want to be?' and my thing was a football player and an artist."

"I always took pictures since I was a pretty young kid, but I did it for fun, I never thought about doing it professionally," said Jim.

Mike, 65, found his way to The Meadowlands through his older brother, James, who worked at the track for Bill Denver's Equi-Photo. In 1999, the brothers became the track photographers at The Big M and formed Lisa Photo.

The first time Mike shot in the winner's circle without his brother, it left quite an impression on him.

"I'm standing there and the race is starting and it was Luc Ouellette in the 10 hole and all of a sudden his horse jumps the rail, flips and lands right at my feet," said Mike. "I was like, 'Oh my God! Is this what I'm in for?'"

Only a few months into their new gig, Mike's brother moved to Florida to become the track photographer at Calder Race

Course and since Lisa Photo is a family business, in 2000, Mike recruited his cousin Jim, 60, to fill the void.

"Jim is a great photographer," said Mike. "I don't have to worry about anything with Jim."

For big events, Mike's son Jason is also part of their team.

"Usually, I'm on the line," said Jim. "Mike is usually around in the winner's circle and Jason is usually up from me getting what we call the angle."

Since there's always so much to shoot on a big day or night, when available, they also have their friend Mike Lizzi help out.

"I met Mike and Jim while shooting the 2008 Breeders Crown for *Horseman & Fair World*," said Lizzi. "This was right after I became the Yonkers Raceway photographer. The Meadowlands was not my home track, but they made me feel right at home. They are both great photographers outside of the track as well. But at the track, they are the best at what they do."

Hambletonian Day is definitely one of the busiest on their calendar, but over the years, the Lisas – both lifelong residents of the Garden State – have been kind enough to share their vast knowledge with college students from the Clyde Hirt Journalism Workshop.

Amanda Johncola, a student at La Salle University at the time, was one of the lucky few to be mentored by the Lisas.

"Mike Lisa was great to me from the beginning," said Johncola. "He was incredibly kind and gave me advice to improve my photography. His trust in me also increased my confidence in the skill. When I worked with him, during the Hambletonian in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, the whole family was welcoming and helpful and eased any stress I had of shooting a live sporting event and also shooting horse racing for the very first time. Jim was also helpful when it came to where to stand in the winner's circle on Hambo Day. I've missed working with the Lisas the last two years, but I'm looking forward to the next opportunity I have to work with them."

During the height of the pandemic in 2020, several neighboring tracks furloughed or laid off their photographers, but that

was not the case with the Lisas. Meadowlands chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir had been a track photographer in his native Ohio for Conrad Photo and he understood the value of that position.

"I think the track photographer is important because if an owner, trainer, driver or groom wants a picture, they'll be able to get that picture and have that memory," said Settlemoir. "The other part of it as well, is that it adds to the whole atmosphere of the horse coming back to the winner's circle and having their picture taken. And Mike provides the pictures that Dave Little sends out in his recap at the end of the night and those pictures are able to be used on the different trade sites."

For as long as they've been doing this, the Lisas have not allowed themselves to become stagnant or complacent.

"I'm nervous every Hambo Day and my wife is like, 'You've been doing this for 20 years and you always get a good shot,'" said Mike. "But the night before I'm like I just hope I get that shot. For Hambo, I used to always shoot from the infield just to have that different angle, but now everybody's doing it."

"You're always learning," said Jim. "You always try to go to different places and see how it works out. If it doesn't work out that time, maybe the conditions will be right that another night it may work. A lot of times you try things dozens of times and then things will line up. You can't really force things."

The Lisas don't look at what they do as a job. For them it's fun, and surprisingly they enjoy it most during bad weather.

"If it's raining, I'll be out there more," said Jim.

"Someone asked me, 'Don't you hate shooting in the rain or the snow?'" said Mike. "Absolutely not. That makes for something special to happen."

Jim doesn't have a favorite photo because he's very critical and always thinks it could be better, which he believes is a good trait. He has never entered anything for the George Smallsreed Awards for excellence in harness racing photography, even though people tell him that he should.

Mike has a few photo favorites, including one of then Giants wide receiver Odell Beckham Jr. making a famous one-handed grab. He rarely enters the Smallsreed competition, but he did win in 2013 for a shot of David Miller in the snow.

Looking through a lens isn't the only thing that the Lisa boys excel at.

Following the attack on the Twin Towers in 2001, Jim joined the Erskine Lakes Volunteer Fire Company and was there for 13 years. He also spent 20 years with the New Jersey Forest Fire Service. He's fought fires in his home state and after the Hambletonian would travel out west with his New Jersey crew to several states, including California, Washington and Montana.



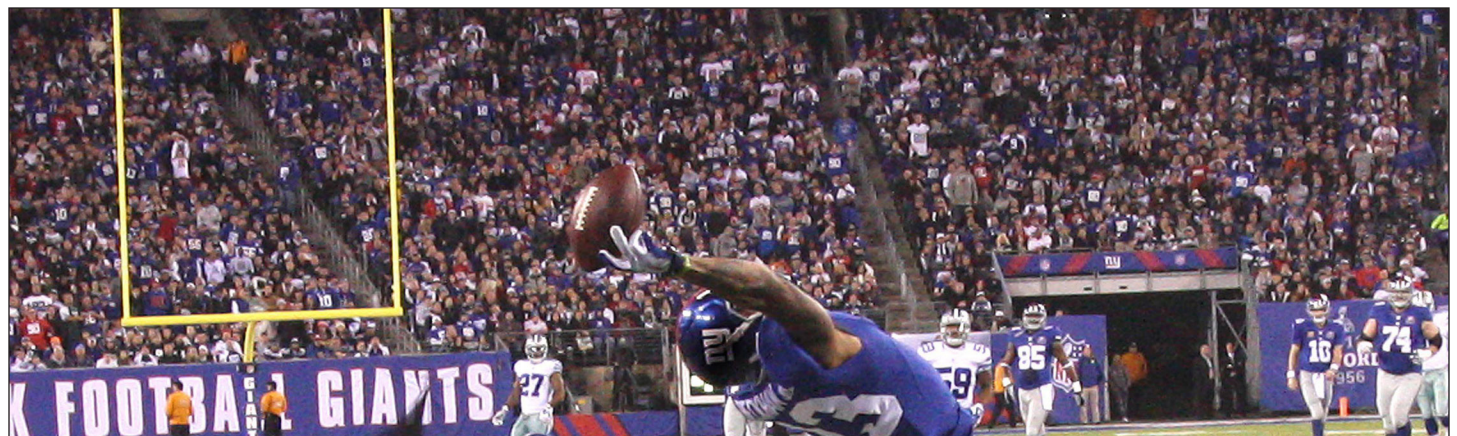

After injuring his hip at 12, Mike's dream of playing football vanished, but that didn't stop him from being on the field at MetLife Stadium. For almost 10 years, he has been one of the sideline photographers for the New York Football Giants.

He's also the drummer in a local band called "The Past Masters", which have played at The Meadowlands during charity events organized by Mike.

Mike lost his mother to breast cancer in the '90s and when his wife Annette was also diagnosed with it in 2009, Mike organized the Lisa Photo "Stride For The Cure Race", which took place annually from 2010 to 2014.

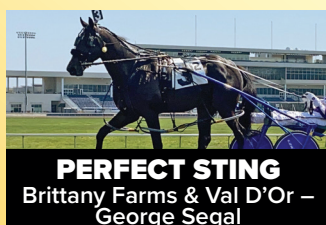

American-bred filly Aldebaran Revani is McPherson's shooting star

Duncan McPherson thinks his filly is capable of going to the gate in Down Under's biggest trotting race the Great Southern Star, a race he helped create.

Passionate trotting man Duncan McPherson is daring to dream Aldebaran Revani.

That 7-month-old filly he first spotted at Millstream Farm's New Jersey property back in late 2017 and later bought at the Harrisburg sale is now one of the fastest and most exciting trotters Down Under.

Aldebaran Revani, a daughter of Donato Hanover out of the well-performed Cantab Hall mare Coffeecake Hanover, has blazed her way to five successive wins (from just six Aussie) starts, including a 1:53.9 mile win at Menangle at her most recent race on Sept. 18.

Conservative in his comments until now, McPherson, the man behind the huge Aldebaran Park trotting operation and one

of Australia's real crusaders for the trotting gait, admitted the biggest trotting race in this part of the world, the Great Southern Star, was now on the table.

"I'm pretty excited. She flies the gate, she's doing things under her own steam and she's got gears... very, very high speed," he said.

"She left the gate from out wide (barrier nine) in :26.5 the other night and that's with (driver) Jack (Callaghan) easing back off her in the last bit of the opening quarter. She could break :26 I reckon.

"She's only had 16 starts, 10 of those in the U.S., and she's five of her six here (Menangle). She's the fastest trotter in Australia this year.

"All of this while she's still becoming an Australian horse. She's still half American. Her coat's not right yet, she's still acclimating. She only got here last December."

McPherson said he would leave the race planning to trainers



Luke and Belinda McCarthy, but feature sprint races like the Group 1 Aldebaran Park Maori Mile at Bendigo in January and the Great Southern Star (a heat and final series on the same night) in February looked ideal if Aldebaran Revani keeps progressing.

"There's another couple of mile races at Menangle for her in October and it's really about getting her more experience now, we know the speed and talent are there," he said.

The pathway to buying Aldebaran Revani came when McPherson, Jim Connelly and trainer Chris Lang bought a trotter by Chocolatier they called Kyvalley Blur back in 2009. He proved hugely successful, winning 30 races and \$A611,790 in Australia.

But the Kyvalley Blur project also built McPherson's relationship with Millstream Farm and trainer Jonas Czernyson.

"A few of us have been in lots of horses together since and Jonas is our trainer. We'd get back over two or three times a year to see them race and that's when I saw this filly," McPherson said.

"You've got to be half silly to go to the other side of the world to buy a seven-month-old filly, race her in America and then bring her back to the other side of the world to race, but so far, so good."

Aldebaran Revani didn't race at 2 and her 10 starts at 3 netted two wins and three placings, but she was very headstrong – she still seems to be – and wanted to do things her way.

"Jonas really liked her, always said the speed and potential was there, and my plan, a dream really, was to bring her down here after her 3-year-old season, which we did last December," McPherson said.

"She had four months of jogging and acclimatisation at Aldebaran Park where Belinda and Danny Thackeray did a great job with her, then I rang Luke and Belinda (McCarthy) to ask if they'd train here. Andy (McCarthy, Luke's brother) had driven her in the U.S., plus Luke and Belinda are great trainers and Menangle was the place for her to race because of the mile racing.

"On what she's done so far, I'm sure she's got a 1:52 in her and anything beyond that, time will tell.

"Given how far she's come so quickly and the fact she's sound as a bell and doesn't race in any gear, who knows what the next couple of years might hold for her."

But for now, the ultimate would be having a runner in the Great Southern Star, a race which McPherson helped create, absolutely loves and is lost for words at the prospect of having a runner in.

"Oh, wow! That would be beyond comprehension. You know how much that race means to me," he said.

These two horses proved to be better than the rest and leader Gio Cash had no problem in defending himself from the outside challenger.

The mile rate of 1:57.3 equals the previous Swedish record for 2-year-old colts and geldings bred outside of Sweden and most of all this triumph stated that German breeding stands strong at the moment.



Kentucky champion Double Deceiver eyes Grand Circuit in today's Bluegrass

After winning the Kentucky Championship Series final 10 days ago, Double Deceiver is preparing to try the Grand Circuit for the first time when he meets six foes in a division of today's (Oct. 1) Bluegrass Stakes for 2-year-old male trotters at Lexington's Red Mile.

Purchased for \$17,000 at last fall's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, the Carter Pinske-trained gelding is in the fourth of five Bluegrass divisions. For the season, Double Deceiver has won four of seven races, finished second twice, and earned \$200,290 for owners Pinske Stables and Makenna Lynn Pinske.

"He wasn't exactly easy to get to this point, but he's been a treat," Carter Pinske said. "Our work is paying off, in the barn and on the track. I think the best thing for him was being able to get him to Kentucky and get a routine and keep his routine the same. Every day, he's got a little bit more personality, is a little more mature. He has blossomed."

Double Deceiver's first two starts came at Harrah's Philadelphia, but since then he's been in Lexington, where he raced in four preliminary rounds of the Kentucky Championship Series, posting two wins and a second. He went off stride behind the gate in his start prior to the final, a miscue Pinske attributed to an equipment change.

"That was my fault," Pinske said. "He wears a fly screen because he's a horse that looks around a lot. It was a minor equipment change, and it was a good time to try it. He was in the final for the Kentucky Sire Stakes, so I decided to try him without it, and it backfired."

He added with a laugh, "It was put back on the next time he went a training mile."

Double Deceiver is a son of Cantab Hall out of Sarcy. His half-sister Dutiful won twice last year on the Kentucky Sire Stakes circuit and last week finished third in a division of the Buckette Stakes at the Delaware County Fair in Ohio. His family also includes Peace A Pie, the dam of Dan Patch Award-winner Pizza Dolce (grandam of this year's Hambletonian Oaks winner Bella Bellini), and O'Brien Award-winner Southwind Allaire.

"We got a bit lucky there," Pinske said about Double Deceiver's yearling sale price. "Everybody was excited about the new sires that came through. He paddled a little bit in his video, but not to the point where I was worried about it. I think we just hit a soft spot in the sale and got lucky."

Pinske said Double Deceiver's best qualities are his ability to accelerate quickly and his desire.

"He's a real small horse, but he's got a turn of foot just as good as anything I've sat behind," Pinske said. "He's got a good attitude on the track now, so if he's sitting in the pocket and you pull the right line and ask him to go, he's zero to a hundred right now. As soon as you're ready for him, he's ready to respond."

Today, Double Deceiver faces a field that includes Grand Circuit stakes winner Letsdoit S, who most recently was third in the

William Wellwood Memorial, Kentucky Commonwealth Series final runner-up Golden Wall As, and Ohio Sire Stakes preliminary-round winner Up Blueberry Hill.

"I think we'll get a good read this week where everybody stands in the Grand Circuit-type stuff," Pinske said. "It's always a big leap. Everybody is spread out (in the Bluegrass divisions). Some people landed in tougher spots, some landed in softer spots, but I think you'll get a feel for the group as a whole."

Following the Bluegrass, Double Deceiver is eligible to the International Stallion, Breeders Crown, and Matron. Pinske is in no rush to look ahead.

"We're taking it one race at a time," he said. "With a \$17,000 horse, I guess everything is icing on the cake from here."

In today's remaining Bluegrass divisions for the trotters, the first group includes Grand Circuit winners Periculum and B A Superhero as well as Majestic J, who won two preliminary rounds of the New Jersey Sire Stakes and was third in the final.

The second division features Grand Circuit winners Temporal Hanover and Villain, plus Ohio Sire Stakes final runner-up Rose Run Xtra, Kentucky Championship Series runner-up Rebuff, and Kentucky Commonwealth Series winner Branded By Lindy.

Group three includes three winners on the Grand Circuit – Testing, Global Pandemic, and Ken's Walner as well as Ohio Next Generation champ Chulo and multiple state-bred stakes winner Keg Stand.

Three of the top-five finishers in August's Peter Haughton Memorial are in the final division, with runner-up Classic Hill, third-place Fast As The Wind, and fifth-place Looks Like Moni.

In addition to the races for the trotters, there are two divisions of the Bluegrass for 2-year-old female pacers.

The second division features undefeated Ohio Triple Crown winner Sea Silk and Kentucky Championship Series final winner Dont Fence Me In. The other includes once-beaten Lyons Serenity, who is coming off a victory in the Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stakes last week.

Elizabeth “Betty” Hunter Stewart dead at 100

Elizabeth “Betty” Hunter Stewart, 100, the matriarch of a family of horsemen, died peacefully Sept. 29, 2021, at her home in Lexington, KY.

Born in Minnesota, she moved to Lexington with her family and attended the University of Kentucky, where she met her future husband, Tom Stewart. The couple settled in Lexington and started a family and in 1961 moved to the new Gainesway subdivision in Lexington, the site of the former Gainesway Farm. Mrs. Stewart was well known to many families in the Gainesway neighborhood because of her organization of the annual Fourth of July parade for children, which grew and continued for many years.

One of the Stewarts’ neighbors was horseman and fellow Catholic Joe Taylor. Taylor was the manager of Gainesway Farm and a lover of the standardbred breed of horse, and that began the Stewart family’s immersion into the harness racing world.

The Stewarts’ sons, Tom Jr., John, Bob, Steve and Mike, all gravitated to careers in standardbred racing and breeding. Tom Jr., who died in 1995, served as farm manager at Stoner Creek Stud in Paris, KY, during the years when Meadow Skipper was the sport’s top pacing sire; John operated Brentwood Farm in central Kentucky; Bob became a trainer; Steve founded Hunterton Farm; and Mike is a veterinarian and treats standardbreds.

Mrs. Stewart was an active volunteer in the Lexington area, especially as a Master Gardener. In the 1950s, she hosted a local TV show called “The Magic Garden Lady.” In later years, she was involved as a volunteer at the Arboretum, the State Botanical Garden at the University of Kentucky. She enjoyed being outside and mowed her lawn and used her weed-eater to trim until she was in her mid-90s.

Mrs. Stewart is survived by sons, John, Bob (Lynda), Steve (Cindy) and Mike (Lisa); daughter, Sue Ellen Fosson (Dr. Abe Fosson); nine grandchildren; and several great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband; and son, Tom Jr.

A graveside service will be held Tuesday (Oct. 5). A Celebration of Life will take place later in October.

Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame 2021 Immortals announced

In July, the Immortals Nominating Committee of the Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame announced that the trustees of the Museum had unanimously endorsed the election of **Aime Choquette, Sterling Elliott, William Mulligan and Chip Noble** as harness racing Immortals. On Sunday, July 3, 2022, these individuals will be inducted into the Hall of Immortals during ceremonies held under the tent on the Museum lawn.

Aime Choquette (1914-2017) worked for 50 years as second trainer for Delvin Miller. During that time he helped train world champions Dancer Hanover, Tarport Hap, Meadow Skipper, Tyler B and many other top racehorses. In 1991, Choquette was awarded the United States Harness Writers Association’s Dick Baker Second Trainer Award. In 1998, the Florida Chapter of USHWA honored Choquette as the first recipient of the Delvin Miller Award and in 2010 inducted him into the Florida Harness Racing Hall of Fame. In 2014, honoring his 100th birthday, the Keystone Chapter of USHWA presented Choquette with their most prestigious honor, the Mary Lib Miller Award.

The ingenuity of inventor **Sterling Elliott (1852-1922)** had far-reaching impact on a diversity of arenas, including the world of harness racing. Elliott adapted the technology he had developed for bicycles into the sulkies used for harness racing. As a result, the application of this technology in 1894 shattered harness racing’s previously existing world-record times and established a new standard in harness racing for its era and beyond. In 1895, with the Sterling Elliott low-wheeled pneumatic-tired sulky, Budd Doble drove world champion trotting mare Nancy Hanks against her own record time, and lowered it by more than seven seconds.

William “Bill” Mulligan (1930-2017) William G. “Bill” Mulligan had a 43-year career with Ingersoll-Rand Co., reaching the office of executive vice president. In 1965, he founded Pennsylvania’s Marion Farms, a prominent breeding and boarding facility of standardbred racehorses such as Party Party 4,1:54.3 (\$190,144), Spellbound Hanover 3,1:54.3 (\$962,395) and 2016 Triple Crown winner Marion Marauder 7,1:50.2 (\$3,392,609). Mulligan owned nearly 300 horses in his career and was the breeder of more than 200. Mulligan participated in amateur driving, receiving the 2003 Amateur Driver of the Year Award from the Monticello-Goshen Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association. He was on the board of trustees of the Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame in later years and was instrumental in the financial planning of the institution. He was elected trustee emeritus in 2014. The culmination of Bill’s racing interests came with the award for 2016 Pennsylvania Breeder of the Year by the Harness Writers Association.

In 46 years of driving **Sam “Chip” Noble (1953-2014)** won 5,105 races in nearly 25,000 drives for a win percentage of 20 per

cent. His horses earned nearly \$30 million. For many years he was the winningest driver at the Delaware County Fair until being surpassed by the likes of John Campbell and David Miller. In 1993 and 1998, he won the award for being top conditioner of the Ohio Sires Stake program, becoming the first to win the title twice. Some of his top performers were Nobleland Sam p,3,1:53 (\$451,417), Concussion p.4.1:54.1 (\$780,362) and Deal Direct p,2,1:51.4 (\$298,312). Noble served as one of harness racing's great ambassadors, and was chosen to represent the United States in the World Driving Championship in 2001 and 2003. He worked closely with various journalist and track media. At the time of his death Sam Noble III was a director of the United States Trotting Association, the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association and the Little Brown Jug Society.

The Harness Racing Museum & Hall of Fame is located at 240 Main Street in Goshen, NY and is open Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Admission is \$10 for adults, \$5 for children 4-12. The Meadows Standardbred Owners Association (MSOA) is raffling off a Pennsbury jog cart and a UFO race bike to benefit drivers Chris Shaw and James Dodson, who were injured in a race mishap Tuesday (Sept. 28) at The Meadows.

According to a Facebook post by Shaw's wife, Ashley Brown, he suffered multiple fractures, a broken nose and carotid artery trauma. Brown, a registered nurse as well as a Meadows-based trainer, wrote that Shaw has complete use of all extremities and is neurologically "sharp as a tack." He remained hospitalized Wednesday.

Dodson was on his feet seconds after the accident, but tests at a local hospital revealed a broken collarbone.

"I had an adrenaline rush but felt pain back in the paddock," Dodson said. "I guess I didn't bounce well off the track."

He said he'll meet with a physician to determine a course of treatment and timetable for his return.

The mishap occurred in the third race when Susy Finn, piloted by Dodson, took a bad step entering the final turn and fell to the track. Willie The Filly, with Shaw aboard, could not avoid the fallen horse and also fell, flipping Shaw from the bike.

Dodson reported that Susy Finn is scraped but otherwise okay.

When Willie The Filly was loose on the track, she was caught by Rothfuss, the track's outrider and parade marshal who, by an almost unbelievable coincidence, owns the filly with her husband, Jim Rothfuss. She said that was the first time she'd been called upon to catch one of her own stable's horses after an accident.

"When I got closer to her, I saw the orange and blue shadow roll and knew she was ours," she said. "I'm very robotic when that stuff happens. I can shut out my emotions and not freak out."

She indicated the filly required stitches in three places but will be fine.

You Will Be Queen gives Tyler Jones his first OSS Gold win

You Will Be Queen scored her first win of 2021 and driver Tyler Jones got his first-ever Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series win in the last regular season event on the 3-year-old trotting filly calendar Tuesday night (Sept. 28) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The pair started from Post 6 in the field of seven top trotting fillies and Jones chose to float off the gate and settle in sixth behind last year's Super Final champion Dashing Muscle. Dicentra controlled the tempo, ringing up a :27.4 quarter, and heading for the :57.4 half driver James MacDonald edged Dashing Muscle into the outer lane, waiting for a wind break from one of the favorites in front of him. Jones kept You Will Be Queen on MacDonald's helmet and when driver Doug McNair tipped Up And Ready out from third the two fillies were quick to close the gap.

Up And Ready started to challenge Dicentra past the 1:26.4 three-quarters and once the field squared up in the stretch MacDonald and Jones moved their fillies into an open lane. Both trotters took aim on the leaders, but it was You Will Be Queen who found the biggest gear and swept by her peers to a three-quarter length win in a personal best 1:54.4. Favorite Up And Ready finished second and Dashing Muscle was third in the \$156,400 contest. ([replay here: You Will Be Queen](#))

"When the cover moved she followed the helmet good, and going around the last turn I thought, 'Man she's doing everything that we need to, she's tight on James's helmet and she's going good.' We waited for the stretch, and James tipped off the first-over cover, and I tipped off of his back and pulled the plugs, and

she started trotting. Halfway down the lane I went by James and I was like, 'No way, no way,' and she just kept going and kept going and then I went by Doug and I was like, 'We got it,' and I couldn't believe it," said Jones. "When I was halfway down the stretch and I knew I was going to win, it was a big rush of adrenaline. It was unbelievable. I almost fell down when I got off (the race bike)."

The 27-year-old Waterdown, ON resident engineered the win for his father, trainer Dustin Jones of Waterdown, who shares ownership of the Royalty For Life filly with Hebert Horses Inc. of Montreal, QC. The younger Jones had driven You Will Be Queen in both of her pre-season qualifiers and in a July 26 overnight event at Woodbine Mohawk Park, but Tuesday was the first time he had climbed into her race bike for a stake event.

"That was sort of the plan. I was going to get to drive maybe in the overnights and for the Sires Stakes it would be a regular WEG (Woodbine Mohawk Park) driver or, like the Elegance last week (Sept. 18), an American driver, which for me, starting out my first year back in Ontario, I was happy with that plan,"

said Tyler. "We thought we had her really good last week so we tried Yannick (Gingras) and it just didn't work out, and then I got my shot."

Tyler made his debut in the Ontario driving colony in 2016, and in recent years had been combining a part-time driving career at Rideau Carleton Raceway in Ottawa and Hippodrome 3R in Trois-Rivieres, QC with a full-time career as a case worker in youth protection services in Sherbrooke, QC. This spring, he made the decision to focus on harness racing full-time and returned to Ontario, where he works full-time in his father's stable while building his driving career.

Tuesday's win was his first in the 2021 OSS program, but Jones has amassed a record of 27 wins, 51 seconds and 30 thirds through 272 starts this summer, steering his mounts to earnings of \$201,621. The win bumped You Will Be Queen from sixth to fourth in the three-year-old trotting filly standings with 92 points and she will head into the Oct. 16 Super Final with confidence from Tuesday's victory and the support of a new regular driver.

"My dad sort of confirmed it there after the race that I would get the Super Final drive, so that's a bonus," said Jones. "But it was a bonus tonight, we were just hoping for a cheque and she got the win, which was unbelievable really."

Imextraspécial leads the 3-year-old trotting fillies into the Super Final with 183 points, followed by HP Mama B and Up And Ready. The top 10 point earners will compete in the \$225,000 season finale on Oct. 16 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

\$2 million in new stakes in New Jersey

The Meadowlands, in conjunction with the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey, is announcing over \$2 million in new stakes opportunities for New Jersey sired 2 & 3 year-olds in 2022.

The "New Jersey Classics" will offer colt and filly divisions for all races and be raced in an elimination and final format for 2 & 3 year-old trotters and 2 year old pacers with an "A" and "B" division offered for all.

Tentatively scheduled for September, 2022, the trots will both have a final purse estimated at \$300,000 for the A division and \$100,000 for the B division while the 2YO pacers will go for \$150,000 in the A and \$75,000 in the B. Nominating and sustaining payments will be required and are being estimated.

The source of funding of the added money for these stakes is from the additional revenue generated from sports betting at FanDuel at The Meadowlands in 2021 that is allocated for purses in 2022.

"We believe that with the New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) racing for purses increased by 20 per cent next year, including these new races, will allow trainers to race for large purses over fewer races in a shorter span of time in New Jersey and not have to endure the time and expense of traveling," said Meadowlands president Jeff Gural. "The truth is there are so many races for good money now starting in July that the toll is becoming too great on the 2-year-olds for them to last until October and November for Red Mile Grand Circuit, Breeders Crown and the Fall Final Four."

Dancin Dragon is a 6-year-old Dragon Again gelding trained by Ed Hart for the ownership group of Randy Bendis and Pollack Racing LLC. Dancin Dragon is now a 30-time winner from 97 lifetime appearances, and he pushed his bankroll to \$405,652. He returned \$18.60 to win as the 8-1 second choice and was atop a \$36.60 exacta and a \$273.50 trifecta.

A pocket trip also worked for **Bill Haley N** (Scott Zeron) in the third split. 3-5 favorite Mach Doro A (Dan Dube) was in command at the 27.3 quarter, 56.4 half, and 1:24.3 three-quarters, but Bill Haley N went on the attack just after three-quarters and was able to go by Mach Doro A in the stretch on his way to a 1 1/4 length decision in 1:52.1. A 4-1 offering, Bill Haley N paid \$10.40 to win and keyed a \$30.20 exacta and a \$64.50 trifecta.

The last grouping saw **Pretty Handsome** (Joe Bongiorno) click off panels of 27.2, 56.3, and 1:24, but he was under siege by a first-over Bettor Memories (George Brennan) before they got to three-quarters. Pretty Handsome and Bettor Memories continued to duel around the last turn and into the lane, but Bettor Memories stayed game on the rim and got the better of Pretty Handsome by three-parts of a length in a 1:52.3 mile. Buddy Hill (Matt Kakaley) was the third-place finisher.

Sophomore fillies contest Liberty Bell stakes at Philly

Harrah's Philadelphia welcomed 3-year-old fillies going in \$30,000 divisions of the Liberty Bell stakes series on Thursday (Sept. 30), two sections for trotters and three for pacers, and only one favorite lived up to the crowd's backing in the five divisions, where in contrast there were two good-paying longshot winners.

The one chalk that came through did so by the smallest possible margin, with the Cantab Hall filly **Evening Stroll** attacking pacesetter Dazzling Reign much of the backstretch and the length of the stretch, just earning the decision in the shadow of the wire over the pacesetter in 1:54.4. Tim Tetrick, who led all drivers on the day with four successes, handled the six-time seasonal winner for trainer Jim Campbell and owners Tony Holmes and Walter Zent.

The other trot featured the longest-priced stakes winner of the day, the Donato Hanover filly **Kommin On Strong** (\$72.00), who also won by the largest margin in any of the five stakes, 1¾ lengths. Scott Zeron kept the filly away from breakers and duels in last, then found a clear path up the inside for her and she lived up to her name, trotting past everybody in 1:56, a lifetime best. Dean Collins trains the winner for the partnership of D & G Racing Stable, Arnold Witkin, and Claude Gendreau Stable Inc.

Lighting up the tote board on the pacing side was **Shezafreaklikeme**, who paced raw in :27 down the backside to reach contention, then worked by the favored pacesetter So Miki Hanover to win by a half-length while lowering her mark over five seconds to 1:51. The \$29.00 surprise package, a daughter of Sweet Lou, was driven by Todd McCarthy for trainer Stacy Chiodo and her Chiodo Racing LLC.

Also successful in 1:51 was the Captaintreacherous filly **High Minded**, who also benefited from Todd McCarthy's handling. Coming off a third in the final in the Kentucky program's championship, High Minded moved to command early, then held a three-quarter length advantage over pocketsitting Chase Lounge at the finish. Linda Toscano trains the winner of \$206,237 for Camelot Stable Inc., Fred Wallace, The Bay's Stable LLC, and Steve Stewart.

Todd's brother Andrew McCarthy drove the other pacing winner,

the Always B Miki miss **So Irresistible**, who took a new mark of 1:51.1. Despite having to pace her back half in :54.2 uncovered, the sturdy miss got the job done by 1¼ lengths over Wicked Ways for trainer Bruce Saunders and owners Charles and Julie Nash.

Liberty Bell series stakes action will conclude for the year today (Oct. 1), with sophomore colts on both gaits going behind the gate. The one coming in with the biggest reputation will be the well-bred Whichwaytothebeach, coming off his fantastic 2-3 performance in the Little Brown Jug. Cushing - Gibbs sweep Maine 3YO Pace stakes at Cumberland

Driver Ron Cushing and trainer Heidi Gibbs swept both of the Maine Standardbred Breeders Stakes for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings at the First Tracks Cumberland Fair on Tuesday (Sept. 28).

In the opener Cushing made a bold, three-wide move down the backstretch with **Edelman** to prevail by a close head in 1:58.2 over pacesetter Hollywood Skeeter and Nick Graffam. Trained by Heidi Gibbs for Kevin Sywyk and Ron Cusing, the son of Western Maverick now has four wins on the season. Wagering favorite American Maverick (Andy Harrington) finished third. Edelman paid \$12.40 to win and was also bred by Ron Cushing.

Confident with his charge and his post position, Cushing came right back in race four to wire the field in 1:58 with **A Sweet Bidda Luck**. Trained by Heidi Gibbs for owner Scott McKenzie, the son of Western Maverick was bred by Lynn-Marie Plouffe and picked up his fifth victory of the year.

Whatawinwillie (Andy Harrington) finished second; Lord Magnetic (Matt Athearn) was third. A Sweet Bidda Luck paid \$3.60 to win.

The fastest race of the day was won by **Airspinder** win 1:55.4 and driver Drew Campbell. Fond of the First Tracks Cumberland surface, the son of No Spin Zone earned his 10th victory of the season, his third at the historic Southern Maine oval. Trained by Chris Lefebvre for Michelle Lefebvre and Brian Aaskov, Airspinder paid \$3.80 to win.

For top reinsman Campbell, it was his fourth victory of the day. Racing resumes at First Tracks Cumberland for our winter meeting, beginning Nov. 3 and racing through Dec. 31, 2021. Post time 11 a.m.

Jamieson and Lee hoping their charges are in peak condition tonight

Tonight (Oct. 1) the top 3-year-old Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots horses will square off in eight \$20,000 Grassroots Semi-Finals at Woodbine Mohawk Park, and trainers Carl Jamieson and Brian Lee are hoping their horses can advance out of the Ontario Sires Stakes program's toughest divisions.

Jamieson will send No Plan Intended out from Post 7 in the first three-year-old pacing colt Semi-Final, while Lee's Saulsbrook Olympia takes on the best three-year-old pacing fillies from Post 5 in their first showdown.

No Plan Intended wrapped up the Grassroots regular season at the top of the pacing colt point standings with two wins, two seconds and one fifth for a total of 155 points. Puslinch, ON resident Jamieson bred and owns the gelding in partnership with Brian Paquet of Quebec, QC, and the Hall of Fame horseman expects another consistent performance from the Up The Credit son tonight.

"He's a real game horse and he tries hard. And he can go pretty good too, so I think he's got a good shot in there," said Jamieson. "His best quality is that he's a good racehorse, he always finishes well. Doesn't matter what kind of race it is, he always finishes well."

Jamieson has won a handful of Grassroots Championships over the years and said one of the biggest challenges in taking a horse from the start of the Ontario Sires Stakes season into the Championship winner's circle is keeping them healthy as the weather changes and temperatures start to fluctuate.

"Have them healthy is the main thing to do, that's the hardest part," said Jamieson. "Some of my horses have been fighting allergies and flu, or whatever, for the last three, four weeks."

Lee agreed with Jamieson's assessment, noting that Saulsbrook Olympia regularly battles allergies and hit an especially rough stretch in September.

"She's been a little bit of a problem that way, but she was on some antibiotics between the two starts there (Sept. 10 and 17). I think it just helped clean her up a bit more. She seemed a lot better last time, but I am just hoping she can stay healthy for the next two weeks," said Orangeville, ON resident Lee. "You do so much for them and you can still have troubles."

The Big Jim daughter recorded one win, two seconds, one fourth and one seventh in Grassroots action, finishing in eighth spot in the standings with 95 points. The victory came in the Sept. 17 leg where she recorded a personal best 1:51.4 in a dead heat for the win with last year's Grassroots champion Cyclone Sister. Cyclone Sister will start to Saulsbrook Olympia's right, at Post 9 tonight.

"She's kind of a trip horse and she likes to chase horses. I always

say she likes a target, so I think she can, hopefully, get a nice covered up trip and hopefully she'll kick for home like she did last time and qualify for the Finals. That's what we're looking for anyways," said Lee of Saulsbrook Olympia, who also captured the 2021 Kin Pace Final at Clinton Raceway in early July. "She's a good-gaited filly, she's got high speed. Like I said, she's a trip horse, but if you can keep her covered up she's got a hell of a kick to her, if she's healthy."

Lee trains the filly for breeder Allan McNeil and his father Bill McNeil's Saulsbrook Stables Inc. of Windsor, NS and Edward Gorc of Sudbury, ON. Regular reinsman Brett MacDonald will be back in the race bike and the Freelon, ON resident will be looking for his first win in the Ontario Sires Stakes post season.

The 3-year-old trotting filly Semi-Finals will open tonight's program in Races 1 and 3, followed by the 3-year-old pacing fillies in Races 4 and 5. The sophomore trotting colts square off in Races 7 and 10 and the 3-year-old pacing colts close things out in Races 9 and 12. The top five finishers in each contest will advance to their respective \$60,000 Grassroots Championship at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday, Oct. 9.

Freshmen flood Bluegrass Saturday in Lexington

Saturday's (Oct. 2) stake slate at Red Mile is stacked with freshmen contests spanned through five divisions of the \$390,000 Norman Woolworth Memorial Bluegrass 2-Year-Old Filly Pace and three splits of the \$330,000 Stay Hungry Bluegrass 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace.

The trotting fillies begin the afternoon's stakes action with trainer Nancy Takter's burgeoning star Mon Cheval starting from post 1 as the even-money favorite on the morning line. A daughter of Father Patrick from champion mare Shake It Cerry, Mon Cheval ships to Lexington off a runner-up finish from an overland trip in the \$253,000 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes final at The Meadows on Sept. 3. Dexter Dunn stays with Mon Cheval after qualifying her a week ago over The Red Mile in 1:57.2.

Division two of the Norman Woolworth lures Date Night and her unbeaten record onto the Grand Circuit off a sweep of the Kentucky Commonwealth Series. The Julie Miller trainee lands post 3 with Andy Miller in the bike as she faces seven foes including Delilah Hanover, who enters off an eighth-place finish in the Peaceful Way final. Richard "Nifty" Norman conditions Delilah Hanover as she tries to rebound in rein to Todd McCarthy from post 8.

Raised By Lindy fronts the third division as the 7-5 choice off a second-place finish in the \$200,000 Kentuckiana at Harrah's Hoosier Park last week. Yannick Gingras remains with the Domenico Cecere trainee, who won over this track on Sept. 6 in a maiden event with a time of 1:55.3, from post 3. The outermost post in the seven-horse contest went to Fashion Schooner, a regally bred and precocious pupil from the Jim Campbell barn making her second start off a fast-closing debut in the Kindergarten Series. Tim Tetrick pilots the daughter of Walner out of 2009 Hambletonian Oaks winner Broadway Schooner.

Campbell and Tetrick team in the following Woolworth division with 3-2 choice Misswalner Fashion from post 6. This Walner filly has three wins from four starts, all coming in New Jersey. She treks west off a 1:54.1 open-length victory in the Kindergarten Series and starts inside of Tony Alagna trainee Valentina Blu, who finished third in the Mohawk Million. Andrew McCarthy steers that Chapter Seven filly from post 8.

Another even-money morning-line choice starts in the last Woolworth division in Lilbitalexis, a Richard "Nifty" Norman trainee whose only loss came when she broke stride at the start of the \$40,000 Garden State Trot. Otherwise, the Walner filly has five wins to her credit – her most recent being a 1:52.2 stroll in a Kindergarten prelim at The Meadowlands. Dexter Dunn has the drive from post 4 as she faces the likes of Brickhouse Babe, runner-up at 94-1 in the Jim Doherty Memorial, and Peyton Hanover, who finished third in the \$309,680 Peaceful Way Stakes.

The Stay Hungry gets underway early in the card as the afternoon's third race with a pair of unbeaten records at risk. One is from Brian Brown's pupil Gulf Shores, entering this event as the 7-5 morning-line choice undefeated from six starts. The Ohio Sires Stakes champ pins his unblemished card against that of Loukes Perry, who enters on a one-race winning streak. Ronnie Wrenn Jr. sticks with Gulf Shores out of post 7 while Yannick Gingras picks up Loukes Perry from post 3 after Wrenn had steered that Burke trainee to a 1:53.2 victory at The Meadows.

Pebble Beach leads the second division of the Stay Hungry off a 1:48.4 score in the \$250,000 Kentucky Championship Series final. Todd McCarthy stays with the Noel Daley trainee as he scores from post 3, which is right to the outside of the Championship runner-up River Ness. Six Feet Apart will step up in class with this contest, having won the companion \$50,000 Kentucky Commonwealth Series final in 1:50.4. Tim Tetrick picks up that drive from trainer Brian Brown and starts from post 7. The stacked contest also includes Tim Twaddle trainee Fourever Boy, shipping south from a third-place finish in the \$650,960 Metro Pace final. Mike Wilder has the drive from post 8.

The final division of the Stay Hungry attracts the Sweet Lou half-brother to Captaintreacherous JM's Finaltreasure, entering from

a 1:53.4 victory in the Renaissance Pace at Freehold. Yannick Gingras reunites with the Ron Burke trainee as the 9-5 morning-line choice from post 6 while also matching up against Wearinmysixshooter, runner-up in the \$650,960 Metro Pace. Dexter Dunn has the assignment behind that Nancy Takter trainee from post 4.

Each division of the Norman Woolworth Bluegrass 2-Year-Old Filly Pace is sponsored by Arden Homestead Stable, Elbridge & Peter Gerry, Stoner Manor & Menhammar Stuteri AB, Jorgen Jahre Jr., William DeVan, Lawrence DeVan and LST Stables.
