It took just 15 yearlings for fireworks to go off during the opening session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale on Monday (Sept. 30) at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion.

Ken Jacobs paid \$925,000 for the first foal out of 2020 Hambletonian winner Ramona Hill. The Walner filly, named Rani Hanover, was sold by Hanover Shoe Farms.

"She's just a gorgeous filly, and her mom was a gorgeous filly," Jacobs said. "She won the Hambletonian and more than \$1 million and that's hard for a filly to do. When I look for a horse, I look for a hole – and when you don't find a hole, then she's high on my list.

"I thought I could get her for \$650,000, to be honest with you, but there was a breeder that wanted the filly for breeding. He ran me up the last \$300,000. I know who he is and I know why

he wanted her, but I'm going to race her. I don't breed. I still own Walner, so I want people to go to Walner and I've got the stud fee very high, so I'm just helping my sire."

It was the third highest-priced yearling ever sold at the Lexington sale following Maverick (\$1.1 million) and Damien (\$1 million), both sold in 2019.

Nine horses later, Jacobs also paid \$345,000 for Enbolden, a Walner colt out of Pleasing Lady sold by Hunterton.

"I'm done," Jacobs said. "Now I can relax."

Trainer Tony Alagna, who conditioned Ramona Hill, will train Rani Hanover.

"Ken Jacobs stepped out and bought Ramona Hill's first foal, so that was fantastic to be able to train her first offspring," said Alagna, who bought seven yearlings for a total of \$1,347,000.


On Monday, 117 yearlings went through the ring, grossing \$22,294,000, averaging \$190,547 and posting a median of \$150,000. Seventy-six yearlings sold for \$100,000 for more.

It was an all-time record for average and the second best gross in sale history.

The gross was up 0.8 per cent from last year's Day 1 session of \$22,220,000 (with five fewer horses sold than last year) and down 2.9 per cent from the all-time record of \$23,067,000 set in 2022. This year's average was up 4.6 per cent from 2023's \$183,000 and up 1.2 per cent from the all-time record of \$189,078 set in 2022.

Both the median and number of yearlings selling for \$100,000 or more were down from a year ago. This year's median was down 11.8 per cent from the record \$170,000 in 2023. During last year's opening session, 97 sold for \$100,000 or more, compared to 76 this year.

"It was an outstanding night, a night of records, and we're very pleased our consignors brought an outstanding set of horses and the bidders responded with enthusiasm," said sale co-manager Bruce Brinkerhoff. "The buzz was electric and there was a good feel to the crowd and it turned out to be great night."

Brinkerhoff's co-manager David Redi said: "Overall, it was a great night, obviously. Trotters were very much in demand and they definitely dominated the gross a little bit, even though we had a lot of pacers.

"It was vibrant, there's no doubt about that, and it was a great way to start the week.

"We sold fewer horses and the average is up a little bit and the gross is a little bit above last year... Most of it or all of it is going to be attributed to the trotters – the top four sire averages were trotters. 'Captain' came in with the top pacer, but we've been saying it for a long time now, it's a byproduct of our breeders and the reinvestment in the game and the sales results speak for themselves from a production point of view."

HARRIS AND POLLOCK SPEND OVER \$3.6 MILLION

Trainer Andrew Harris, acting as an agent for Bill Pollock, was the leading buyer with 10 purchased for \$3,675,000, including the second- and third-highest yearling sold — Hip #83 Going Viral, a Chapter Seven filly out of Check Out Trixie, a full-sister to Instagram Model, sold for \$650,000 and Hip #106 Ice Fall, a Walner colt out of Ice Attraction sold for \$625,000.

"We're going a little more filly strong this year, a little residual value on those ones," Harris said. "If you get a colt, everyone chases that colt dream, but if they don't hit, it's a hard climb back up. With the fillies, I feel like we can get out on a lot of these fillies. We're still paying premium prices for them, but, at the same time, we're buying the pages that they are going to have residual value at that price."

Last year, Harris and Pollock were the second-leading buyers in Lexington, purchasing 10 yearlings for \$3,550,000. They went even higher on Day 1 alone this year.

"We made some mistakes last year, for sure," Harris said. "This year, I didn't pick one pacer. I hired Casie Coleman to help me

with picking pacers and I told her, 'You pick the pacers.' We talked to Bill [Pollock] and Bruce [Areman] and they were more than inclined to jump on that because my pacing colts sucked last year. I was not happy with any of my pacing colts. I love my pacing fillies, but I didn't like any of my pacing colts - they just didn't turn out as 2-year-olds. I'm hoping as 3-year-olds they turn out, but I was disappointed in the horse selection, so hopefully this year they step up and we'll have a little more luck as 3-year-olds

with them. We're going to let Casie pick these ones this year and see how it works."

CAMEO HILLS: BEST SALE EVER

Cameo Hills sold Going Viral, as well as two \$400,000 yearlings - Hip #52 The Wow Chapter, a Chapter Seven colt out of Violet Stride purchased by Lucas Wallin Hip #58 Kickan, a Walner filly out of You Ato Dream purchased by David McDuffee.



"It's the best sale I've ever had," said Cameo Hills' Steve Jones, who was the second-leading consignor by average with \$288,571 for seven sold."I told Dave Reid, the sales manager, 'I think we'll have the best sale we've ever had on opening night' and we have. "This is tremendous. We've got nice horses left to sell. I don't think anything, obviously, will approach the numbers we got tonight, but the sale is great. I had nice individuals by the right sires. People were asking me if I was concerned that they weren't dual-eligible and I said I am absolutely not concerned at

all. I said, 'That's a great marketing tool for the people in Kentucky and it's great additional money for the people racing horses, but ultimately what these people are looking for is the best horse and I think I'm bringing some great individuals and some great pedigrees and they'll sell well' and they did."

Ice Fall was sold by Preferred Equine, the session's second-leading consignor with gross sales of \$3,092,000 for 14 sold. Hunterton led the opening session with gross sales of \$4,567,000 for 21 sold.

Hanover Shoe Farms led all consignors in average at \$400,000 for four sold.

"I didn't expect \$925,000, but other than that, I thought the sale would be the way it's gone," said Steve Stewart of Hunterton. "I think the people investing in the broodmares are being rewarded – the Cameo Hills and a bunch of others. Good sells good.

"It's just very encouraging to be in a business that's very healthy. I'm a little weird in the fact that I'm a breeder and I worry how much they sell for, I really do. I think when it gets so high that it can be discouraging and it's just a lot of money to get back, so you want everybody to be successful and it gets more difficult for everybody to be successful... but the mare prices are going up, too, exponentially, obviously, and they should. I don't worry, but it's a concern."

ESTABLISHED SIRES DOMINATE

Veteran stallions dominated the proceedings.

Walner offspring grossed \$6,277,000 for 27 sold, followed by Chapter Seven (\$4,125,000 for 19), Muscle Hill (\$2,172,000 for 11) and Gimpanzee (\$1,947,000 for nine). The leading pacing sire was Captaintreacherous with gross sales of \$1,660,000 for nine sold. He was followed by first-crop sire Perfect Sting, who had sales of \$1,545,000 for seven sold.


Today's (Oct. 1) session begins at 1 p.m., followed by 1 p.m. sessions on Wednesday and Thursday and a final Friday session that starts at 7 p.m.

"Generally, you start off with a good session and you hope that it carries through the rest of the week and we're optimistic that we've got a good set of horses for people to buy and it will carry on," said Brinkerhoff.

It is an approach that has continued to guide Rash in every facet of her life.

"I have always been a person who has never shied away from challenges – it's something that I have always had in me," she said.

Just like her love of horses.

Rash had an early introduction to them and quickly developed a fondness for all breeds.





Every time I am at the racetrack or in the barn, I have fun. For me, a bad day at the track is better than a good day anywhere else.

"I started going to the racetrack as a child and that's when I fell in love with horses," she said. "I started with riding horses when I got older. I was probably 12 or 13 when I started going to the local auctions. I would go there, get some young horses and break them to saddle."

For a time, Rash would sell one type of horsepower to purchase another.

"I would break those horses to saddle, sell them and buy myself a dirt bike," she said with a laugh. "But I always loved the ones who were challenging – they were my favorites. It was always rewarding when you were able to teach them, work with them, and then feel that sense of accomplishment when you achieved your goals with them."

Eventually, over time, Rash learned something about herself, specifically, what the future held for her in terms of a career.

"When I would go to the track with my father, I would realize more and more that I would likely end up in the harness racing industry at some point – it's what I wanted to do," she said.

The road to that dream did not come without its challenges.

"I had two young kids at the time, and for a time, I lost touch with my dream," Rash said. "I had a couple of riding horses and an off-track standardbred, and someone I knew told me they had a mare, and that if I wanted to get into the business, we could go in as partners.

"Three weeks later, I started as an owner. I just jumped right in."

Challenge accepted.

"Honestly, it was intimidating, at first," Rash said. "It's a huge learning curve, getting to know the ins and outs, the equipment – so you need to be committed to learning."

Ownership quickly led to other aspirations.

"I wanted to learn as much as I could, so the idea of becoming a trainer happened quickly," she said. "The trainers I was working under when I was an owner helped me with so much. I learned to jog, learned about the equipment – for two years, I immersed myself into all things racing and learning the business.

"People would tell me that I should get my trainer's license, but it took a while before I felt confident to do it."

Rash was happy she did.

"I filled out the application," she said. "There were a hundredsome questions, but I studied a lot. I felt confident when I wrote it."

On Sept. 9, Rash was the listed trainer when ZS Dream, a horse she owned, went postward at Harrington Raceway.

"His hind end had been bothering him a bit, he had a rib out of place – he was in a field when another horse kicked him," she said. "I thought to myself, 'What a great time to get my trainer's license."

While it was not a storybook finish – the 6-year-old pacer finished seventh – Rash felt a sense of pride in having accomplished her goal of joining the training ranks.

One week later, again at Harrington, ZS Dream finished sixth.

There were signs that the night of Sept. 16, this time at Rosecroft Raceway, could be a memorable one for Rash.

The racing stars seemed to align for ZS Dream, driver Russell Foster, and for a hopeful, yet nervous trainer.

"He has a tougher time with the turns at Harrington, but he raced well at Rosecroft, so we thought it could be a good situation for him," Rash said.

Facing eight rivals in the first race, the veteran gelding had a favorable post, favoritism on the board and a fortuitous start to the curtain-raising dash.

ZS Dream was a length on top after an opening panel in :27 and pushed that advantage to 1½ lengths through a half in :56.

The gelding was still comfortably in control at the three-quarter pole in 1:24.4.

Rash, in the paddock, watching the race on television, suddenly felt the urge to look away.

"The whole time, I was telling myself, 'It will be what it will be," she said. "I'm usually very quiet and don't say much. Then I'm watching them cut the mile and I am sweating.

"I had a groom there helping me and I told her that I was going to close my eyes and that she could tell me if he stops."

ZS Dream didn't stop.

At the wire, he was a 31/2-length winner in a time of 1:54.4.

"I said I wasn't going to watch, but I did watch," Rash said. "I saw him coming down the stretch and... I started yelling a little bit, I think. I looked around and everyone else started joining me.

"We got on the golf cart to go out to the track and when I got there, Russell was smiling ear-to-ear. He knew how much I wanted to win this race with him and this horse. I told him, 'Russell, I think I am going to cry'. He said, 'You do that. You deserve it."

And so, she did.

"Happy, happy tears," Rash said. "He's a complicated horse, but he races his heart out."

Just the kind of horse tailor-made for his trainer.

The experience prompted Rash, who has been a real estate agent for 12 years, to sell her house and buy a farm.

"I'm pulling back from the real estate world to give as much attention as I can to the farm," Rash said. "Here I am with my broodmare, one horse, and plenty of stalls. I have some neighbors in the business, so they brought a couple of their horses over. I also have some boarders who use the stalls, so it's keeping me occupied until I can build my racing stock."

Whatever number of pacers and trotters she welcomes into her stable, Rash won't shy away from the hurdles that inevitably come with a bigger operation.

In fact, it is exactly what she is looking for.

"I am optimistic, but I know there are always challenges and setbacks," she said. "Some days, I don't know how I am going to get through it. My dad would always tell me, 'If having a good life was easy, everyone would have one.' It is always rewarding when you have to work harder to achieve what you want."

Rash certainly would know that feeling.

It is what always keeps her coming back for more.

"Every time I am at the racetrack or in the barn, I have fun," she said. "For me, a bad day at the track is better than a good day anywhere else."









Both mares were driven by Dexter Dunn, who swept the night's four major stakes, adding the \$250,000 Dayton Trotting Derby with Logan Park and the \$250,000 Dayton Pacing Derby with Abuckabett Hanover. Dunn won six races total on the card.

Twin B Joe Fresh, ranked No. 1 in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll, went to the lead at the start of the Dayton Distaff and posted fractions of :26.3, :54.2, and 1:21 on her way to her ninth-consecutive win of the season. Sylvia Hanover finished second and Always B Naughty was third.

Trained by Chris Ryder, the 4-year-old Twin B Joe Fresh has nine victories and a second in 10 starts this season. For her career, the daughter of Roll With Joe–Fresh Breeze has won 28 of 37 races and earned \$2.06 million.

Twin B Joe Fresh is owned by Ryder, Dunn, Peter Trebotica, and Barry Spak. She was bred by Brittany Farms.

In the Dayton Oaks, Dunn methodically guided Jiggy Jog S to the front as Call Me Goo and M-M's Dream were part of a three-horse battle with Pioneer As for the lead in the opening quarter, which Call Me Goo reached in :27.1 by a nose over M-M's Dream.

The Ake Svanstedt-trained Jiggy Jog S, though, was in front soon thereafter and never looked back, reaching the half in :55.1 and three-quarters in 1:23.3. Call Me Goo finished second and M-M's Dream was third.

Unbeaten in six races this season, Jiggy Jog S has won 24 of 41 career starts and earned \$3.1 million. The 5-yearold mare became the 16th trotter in history to exceed \$3 million in North American purses with Saturday's victory. She is ranked No. 2 in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll.

Jiggy Jog S is owned by Ake Svanstedt Inc., Steve Stewart, John Lengacher, and Hickory Hollow Stables. The daughter of Walner—Hot Mess Hanover was bred by Vestmarka AB.

Dunn continued his winning ways in the Dayton Trotting Derby, driving Logan Park to victory by 1¼ lengths over Hillexotic in 1:52.3. It's Academic was fourth-placed-third after Asteroid was dropped from third to seventh for interference in the opening quarter.

Logan Park got a pocket trip as Chapercraz led the way for the first three-quarters of the mile while under pressure much of the way from a first-over Southwind Tyrion. On the final turn, Southwind Tyrion began to drop back, and Dunn moved Logan Park to the outside and to the lead heading into the stretch. Trained by Robert Fellows, Logan Park won for the ninth time in 14 races this season and 33rd time in 78 career starts. He has earned \$1.27 million. The 6-year-old son of Archangel—Rite Outa The Park is owned by Outofthepark Stable, Reg Higgs, and Arpad Szabo. He was bred by Reg Higgs and Donna Higgs.

Dunn wrapped up his evening by piloting **Abuckabett Hanover** to a neck victory over Little Rocket Man in 1:49.3 in the Dayton Pacing Derby. Muskateer Hanover finished third.

Abuckabett Hanover led to the opening quarter in :26.2 from post 1 before giving up the top spot to Little Rocket Man, who started from post 8. Little Rocket Man remained in front to the half in :54.2 and three-quarters in 1:22.1, but was being challenged by Muskateer Hanover, who had made a sustained first-over bid to draw even on the final turn.

As the field turned for home, Dunn moved Abuckabett Hanover into the passing lane and was able to get by Little Rocket Man in the final strides.

Abuckabett Hanover, a 6-year-old trained by Andrew Harris, has won five of 10 races this season and 20 of 69 lifetime, earning \$1.78 million. The son of Betting Line—All Tucked Up is owned by William Pollock, Bruce Areman, and Harris. He was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms.

2024 Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots championships complete

It was a big night for owner Determination, trainer Luc Blais and driver Louis-Philippe Roy as Woodbine Mohawk Park hosted the eight \$75,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots Finals on Saturday (Sept. 28).

As a trio, they teamed up for three Grassroots victories on the evening with Roy adding another to win half of the eight Grassroots finals. In addition, Roy surpassed the \$50 million mark in career earnings during the card with a fifth-place finish aboard Tito N Cheddar in the evening's sixth race.

Here's how Saturday's stakes action unfolded.

After rallying off cover to a 13-1 upset in her final Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots preliminary event at Grand River Raceway 12 days ago, **Tellers Choice** took the short route to victory in the \$75,000 OSS Grassroots final for 2-year-old trotting fillies on a rain-soaked Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Tellers Choice floated forward at the race's outset and settled in fourth through a :27.1 opening quarter before driver Roy angled her out to take aim at early pace-setter Ibelieveinangels (Travis Cullen) up the backstretch. After clearing the lead at the completion of a :57.3 first half, Tellers Choice kept the tempo backed down while uncontested through a :30 third sectional.

After straightening up for home, Tellers Choice powered clear of her nine rivals in the final eighth and won by the better part of five lengths in a lifetime best 1:56.1. Ibelieveinangels finished an isolated second; Rich Girl (Tyler Borth) narrowly held third over Wings Of Green (Trevor Henry) after enjoying a 3-hole ride.

"I felt like every time she moved to a different track, she wasn't trotting as well," said Roy, referring to breaks Tellers Choice made at Hiawatha Horse Park and Hanover Raceway in earlier stakes engagements. "When she comes here, she's a different filly. She's easy to drive here. I did pretty much what I wanted with her.

"On the first turn, I thought I was going to lose her, but the more the mile went, the more comfortable she was. She showed again that when everything is alright with her, she's a good Grassroots filly." Blais trains Tellers Choice, a daughter of The Bank—Tosca, who has now won three of nine career starts and banked \$59,950 for Determination.

Sent off the 3-5 favorite, Tellers Choice paid \$3.30 to win.

Pick Me Up Hanover put in a purposeful performance in the \$75,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots final for 2-year-old pacing fillies.

The bay daughter of Bettors Delight—Plaudit Hanover arrived at her championship tilt off a fourth, albeit less than two lengths behind the winner, in her previous start on Sept. 17.

On this night, Pick Me Up Hanover picked up the pace and put forth a top-shelf effort.

Saddlebags (Henry) crossed over from post 9 to make the front into the first turn, while Odds On Fiat Money (Sylvain Filion), who suffered broken equipment just before the start, moved into second, followed by Dee (Borth), Tricky Wicky (Jody Jamieson) and Pick Me Up Hanover.

After an opening panel in :26.4 carved out by Saddlebags, there was action galore ahead of the half as Dee rocketed to the front, only to be overtaken by Tricky Wicky. James MacDonald, driving Pick Me Up Hanover for the first time, then took over the proceedings just ahead of a half in :56.3.

Still on top through three-quarters in 1:24.4, Pick Me Up Hanover braced for the challenges to come, including a hard-charging Stellrmanipulation (Roy), who announced her arrival in the early stretch.

The pair continued to battle down the lane as Pick Me Up Hanover, who temporarily lost the lead, came back on to record a $1^{1/2}$ -length triumph in a time of 1:53.3.

"I just tried to get away as good as I could," said MacDonald of his rail post. "I had to push out a little bit and see if I could land a good spot. The way the race unfolded, it just worked out. I didn't think front end was going to be the way to go, but sometimes you've got to call an audible behind the gate or in the first turn and that's just how it worked tonight."

Trained by Jeff Byron for owners David Byron and Craig Wallwin, Pick Me Up Hanover is now 6-0-0 from eight starts.

"She looks like a gutsy little filly," said MacDonald. "It's that time of the year – the money is down, and you've got to put them in play. Tonight, I drove her hard, but she responded well and hung in tough."

Purchased for the modest sum of \$3,000 at the 2023 Harrisburg Yearling Sale, the Hanover Shoe Farms-bred miss now has more than \$75,000 in purse earnings for her connections.

Sent off as the 6-5 choice, Pick Me Up Hanover, who made her first three starts at Tioga Downs, paid \$4.50 for her Grassroots win.

Wendell Blue Chip and driver Doug McNair weaved a great second-over trip to win the \$75,000 Grassroots final for rookie trotting colts.

The time for the mile was a lifetime-best 1:57.3. The track condition was downgraded to "good" just before the 10 youngsters took to trotting.

First Class Rule (Todd Ratchford) left the gate fastest as favorite Pierre In Paris (Henry) and longshot Mr Pasadena (Paul MacDonell) hurried for second and third positions, respectively. Cousin Halifax (Roy) broke stride in that first turn and was eliminated. The field lined up for a first quarter in :27.4.

On top, First Class Rule gave foes a 31-second breather as he rolled easily to a :58.4 half, where The Bear A Cuda (MacDonald) galloped out of contention.

Speeding first over to challenge came 32-1 shot Alimony Mike (Tyler Jones) while Pierre In Paris took valuable cover behind the longshot and McNair's Wendell Blue Chip sat in the second tier.

McNair said after the race, "I wasn't in a big hurry to move [to the front]." His patience was a plus as the field hit three-quarters in 1:29.

Into the stretch, the field widened and McNair had the most trot available to beat Pierre In Paris by almost a length. Alimony Mike picked up the show money and outsider Hay Dad (Henry) took the fourth spot.

A son of Green Manalishi S out of the Andover Hall mare Aurova Hanover, Wendell Blue Chip raised his first-season earnings to \$112,500 with the win.Jared Bako trains the gelding owned by Blue Chip Bloodstock and Daniel Zuker.

"I had no game plan," McNair said. "Last week he was not the best but here I got him in a good spot."

Regarding recent breaks in the freshman season McNair added: "He's getting better as the year goes on."

Wendell Blue Chip paid \$9.90 to win.

Crack Shot was the popular victor of the \$75,000 Grassroots final for freshman pacing colts with an impressive clocking of 1:52.1.

Leaving the gate, the Bettors Delight colt and driver McNair settled into fourth heading into the first turn, but by the halfmile marker had advanced to overtake early leader Blue Bar (Cullen). With eventual runner-up Sauble Wilson (Henry) and Blue Bar advancing on either side, Crack Shot powered home in :27 to capture his fourth rookie win. The race favorite returned \$5.30 to backers.

"I didn't know how he was going to race," said McNair. "I thought Trevor [Henry, driving Sauble Wilson] had the best horse in there other than ours, but we had a better position on them early and when I heard them coming in the first turn, I figured I had to give him a shot on the front and it worked out."

Purchased as a yearling for \$205,000 at the Lexington Select Sale by trainer Gregg McNair and co-owners Frank Brundle, Dale Hunter and George Kerr, Crack Shot won his first two earlysummer starts in the OSS Grassroots Series but struggled in his next pair of efforts. Trainer McNair cited a change of scenery and diligent veterinary care in Lexington as the reason for his turn-around, as illustrated by a solid qualifying start over The Red Mile and a winning return a week later — his most recent start — at Woodbine Mohawk Park in a career best of 1:52.

"He raced so great last week," said co-owner Brundle of that return. "And to see him race great again tonight in this mud – we're just so happy with him."

"It's fantastic, I love it," a jubilant Brundle added, speaking about the Ontario Sires Stakes program. "I just love this business, it's amazing."

Referring to the new opportunity for Grassroots champions to enter their divisional Super Final if the field doesn't fill with the Gold Series top point-earners, McNair said Crack Shot could look to add to his \$66,500 bankroll in the Oct. 12 Super Final.

"He's a cocky little bugger, if you watch him strut around out there," said McNair. "But other than that, he's a versatile colt. He can race from the lead or race from off the pace, so we're looking forward to racing him in the Super Final."

Love Those Legs had a nightmare trip, but still managed to get a dream result in the \$75,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots final for 3-year-old trotting fillies.

After enduring traffic trouble into the first turn and a lessthan-ideal journey along the backstretch, it would have been understandable if Love Those Legs and driver Roy threw in the towel.

Instead, they found a way to get the job done against the odds and with plenty of determination.

Mass Cara (Trevor Henry) marched to the front early with Flirty Dancer (Jones), Her Currency (Jamieson) and Mass Money (Travis Henry) sitting second, third and fourth, respectively. Love Those Legs, from post 8, got tangled up in a traffic near the back of the pack, a scenario that forced Roy to make a split-second decision as to his next move.

After Mass Cara took the field through an opening quarter in :27.3, Roy decided to set his sights on the lead and did so, going from ninth to first a few strides before the half in :58.2. Mass Cara was second, Flirty Dancer third and mutuel choice Valentine Bluechip (McNair), who also had a rough early go, sat fourth.

Love Those Legs had a leg-up on Valentine Bluechip after threequarters in 1:27.1, but with a quarter mile to go, needed to find another gear to hold on.

After Valentine Bluechip, who came into the final on a two-race win streak, began to drift out, Love Those Legs remained resolute and held off Flirty Dancer by 1¾ lengths for the game victory. Valentine Bluechip was third and Mass Cara finished fourth. The final time was 1:55.3.

Roy lauded the grit and gumption of the Luc Blais trainee.

"My filly, she is not a fan of the front," Roy said. "She is a little

better chasing. That was what I was trying first. I'm pretty sure that Dougie's [driver, McNair] filly is the same, so he was trying to trip her too. Going into the first turn, I was in trouble, but I knew he was in trouble, too.

"Luc had her impressively good tonight. I know she has been showing better and better every week, but I wasn't expecting that huge of an effort."

An effort that had Roy beaming.

"She just kind of got on the bit better and better," he said. "She felt really good when she opened up a little bit in the stretch. I didn't pull the plugs – she felt really strong still at the wire. It was just impressive how she raced tonight."

After going winless in seven starts in 2023, the daughter of Kadabra—Legzy, owned by Determination, is 4-3-0 from 14 starts this year, and 4-4-1 from 21 lifetime engagements.

Saturday night's win, the biggest of her career, pushed her career earnings into six-figure territory. She paid \$17.30 for the signature score.

Bred by Windsong Stable, Love Those Legs was a \$110,000 purchase at the 2022 Harrisburg Yearling Sale.

Collusion Hanover soared around the oval from beginning to end for a rousing victory in the \$75,000 Grassroots final for 3-year-old filly pacers.

The time for the mile was 1:50.1 on the good-rated track.

From the moment she left the gate, Collusion Hanover, the overwhelming 1-9 public choice, was in total control of the other nine fillies. Driver Roy steered her with ease around the first turn and floated around the first turn. The duo produced a fiery :26 first quarter. The public's second choice, How Much (McNair), took third with Pasta Delight (MacDonald) in second.

In full flight heading for the :54.3 half, McNair urged his charge to take on Collusion Hanover. McNair pulled the pocket to create a duel between the two public choices. They rumbled along in tandem; a duo noses apart with a score of lengths between Pasta Delight, who led the rest of the field, including Ann (Borth), who broke off the gate and galloped out of contention.

The dueling pair scorched three quarters in 1:21.4. That was too much for How Much as Pasta Delight stepped lively late to earn best-of-the-rest finisher to Collusion Hanover's four-length win. How Much held on for third.

"We were going good fractions," said Roy, who was not surprised with the result. "It was a two-filly race and I was confident from the start and in the duel. She made my job look easy."

Blais trains Collusion Hanover and Roy said the trainer's horses "were getting better" as the season ensued.

Collusion Hanover is a daughter of Bettors Delight out of the Somebeachsomewhere mare Covfefe. She has now earned \$172,469 after this Grassroots final, which was her fifth win of the season and seventh in her career.

Determination owns the filly, who will likely come back in the OSS Super Final.

It may have taken him a while to put it all together, but **Grambling Hall** did so with gusto when it mattered most.

Unraced at 2, the now-sophomore trotting colt forced his eight more experienced rivals to follow along Saturday night with a dominant win in his \$75,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots final.

Taking command of the field at the three-eighths, Grambling Hall trotted to his third career win in a new best of 1:54.1 with Roy – his fourth Ontario Sires Stakes victory on Saturday's card. Jack N Abs (Tre Henry) was the runner-up by a length with Nzuri (Jamieson) rounding out the top three.

The son of Muscle Mass paid \$8.30 for the win.

Trainer Chantal Mitchell co-owns the colt - now a winner of \$62,660 in his career - with the estate of prominent breeder Alan Leavitt, who passed away earlier this year.

"Grambling Hall is a very young horse. He was born June 29 [2021]," said Mitchell. "He was small last year and he had no focus at all. I was fortunate that Mr. Leavitt allowed me to be patient with him. I told him we just have to wait on him. He has a nice gait; he has a nice way of going but he's just not focused at all. And even coming back this spring, he wouldn't focus until July and then he figured out, 'OK I can do this'. And so here we are.

"It's unfortunate that Mr. Leavitt is not here to see this win because he was very patient and very passionate about this horse. He told me to do whatever you want to do, just take your time. So, it's bittersweet to win, because I wish he could have seen him here, tonight. He never did get to see him race or qualify but I know he would have made him proud because he always had faith in him."

After coming up just short of The Vicar in the regular-season finale, Pollack Racing LLC's **Century Komodo** stood his ground for a career-best 1:50 win in the \$75,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots final for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings to close out Saturday's stakes action.

McNair left with Century Komodo from the middle of the gate, but the pair were looped by Do Better (Filion) and a parked McPleasant (MacDonald) on the sprint to the first turn, ultimately settling into fourth through a :26.4 as 44-1 longshot Lakers Bank (Tre Henry) controlled the early terms.

Just as McPleasant strode clear to the lead upon reaching the backstretch, McNair gave Century Komodo the green light, and he brushed to the fore at the :55.2 midway stage, only for his rival to be in hot pursuit.

Entering the far turn, Century Komodo faced immediate pressure from The Vicar and driver Roy, who dueled to a half-length lead at the 1:22.1 three-quarters sectional. Undeterred, Century Komodo dug in turning for home, reclaimed the lead at the eighth pole, and won by a driven three-quarters-of-a-length. The Vicar finished second as the even-money choice, Chalk Hanover (Jamieson) was a one-paced third after sitting secondover behind the dueling favorites.

"That one of Louis' has been racing great," said McNair." I thought I had him last week [in their Sept. 16 Grassroots preliminary at Woodbine]. I just didn't have enough room to get up the inside. I thought last start was his best race in probably five or six starts. I was hoping it would carry into tonight, and it did."

Century Komodo, a Bettors Delight—Michelons Filly gelding whom Anthony Beaton trains, has won six of 14 races this season and banked \$118,720 in his career.

He paid \$5.40 to win as the 8-5 second choice.

MCNAIR GETS GRASSROOTS GRAND SLAM ON CONSOLATION NIGHT

Driver Doug McNair made his first of many visits to the winner's circle on Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots Consolation Night with a homebred winner for his father, multiple Johnston Cupwinning trainer and this season's current point leader Gregg McNair.

The first of eight \$25,000 consolations on Friday (Sept. 27) at Woodbine Mohawk Park was for the 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings with favorite Captain Suzuki rallying from mid-pack to catch the front-striding Stonebridge Praise in the stretch and hold off the upset-minded Nickel And Dime in a three-across finish. The McNair trainee prevailed in a head decision to break his maiden in 1:58.4.

The son of Muscle Mass out of Lillian Mare has picked up cheques in all nine of his career starts, including a pair of third-place finishes earlier this month after dropping from the Gold Series to Grassroots competition. The gelding's Guelph, ON, conditioner shares ownership with Dean Lockhart of Collingwood, ON.

Doug went on to pick up three more consolation victories during a five-win Friday night. He completed a sweep of the male trots with trainer Shane Arsenault's recently acquired sophomore gelding **Northernchancellor** (Muscle Mass—Honor Grad), who prevailed between foes by a half-length in a careerbest 1:57.1 mile, and then scored again in another close finish with Millar Farms' homebred 2-year-old pacing filly **Sugar Pie Honey** (Bettors Delight—Kloof Street) taking a new mark of 1:53.4 for trainer Nick Gallucci.

Doug also came out a winner in the evening's last consolation for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings with trainer David Brown's homebred **Why Wouldn't Ya** (Bettors Delight—P L Hurricane) in a dead heat with driver Travis Cullen's homebred **Bet The BB** (All Bets Off—Sayitall BB). The winning time of 1:51.3 was

a new lifetime mark for the pair. Brown shares ownership of Why Wouldnt Ya with Gary Sunderland. Bet The BB is trained by Cullen's mother Jodie.

Bet The BB's younger Big Jim brother **Belmont Blazer** was a consolation winner as well for the Cullens with a 3¾-length triumph in a new lifetime mark of 1:53.3.

Driver Trevor Henry also doubled up in the consolations, sweeping the filly trots with 2-year-old **Green Glider** (Green Manalishi S–Magical Glider) and 3-year-old **Billie Jean Queen** (Royalty For Life–South Bay).

Green Glider built up a six-length lead by the top of the stretch and cruised home a 1:57.1 winner, knocking a tick off her lifetime mark, for trainer Scott McEneny and owner Andrea Lea Racingstables Inc.

A recent newcomer to the Lindsey Kerr stable, Billie Jeans Queen was a wire-to-wire winner, scoring by 3½ lengths in a careerbest clocking of 1:55.3. Kerr co-owns with Marc Adams, Mark Manherz and Todd Kerr.

The consolation for 3-year-old filly pacers was won by Dale Towle's homebred **Fancy Lettering** (Stag Party–Goldies Bad Girl), who led all the way in a career-best 1:51.2 mile with Louis-Philippe Roy driving for trainer Chantal Mitchell.

Track records fall in final leg of Ohio Sires Stakes action

Despite two days of rain, the track at Hollywood Dayton Raceway was fast and produced five track records as freshman pacers and trotters wrapped up the final leg of the Ohio Sires Stakes. Eight divisions carried a purse of \$65,000.

Stablemates swept both divisions for filly pacers and colt pacers setting track records in each race.

Odds On Hialeah and Odds On Chesapeake were the filly pace winners, while Rick Wink and Sippinonsearoc won in the colt pace.

In the first division for filly pacers, Odds On Hialeah won her fourth leg in Sires Stakes action going wire-to-wire to win in a track record 1:52.1. Dexter Dunn took the Lather Up filly to the front and cruised to a five-length victory. It was the sixth win in seven starts for Odds On Hialeah who raised her earnings to \$174,750.

Prolific Fire (Austin Hanners) was second with Gorgeous Package (Anthony MacDonald) third.

Odds On Hialeah's track record did not stand for long. In the second division, Odds On Chesapeake rallied down the stretch to win by a neck, lowering the track record to 1:51.4. The daughter of Downbytheseaside sat third through the first half before making her move up the backstretch. Around the final turn, Dunn moved Odds On Chesapeake wide, reeled in Skywalker Sea, and then held off a hard-charging The Word Is Out.

It was the fourth win in eight starts for Odds On Chesapeake. She has earned \$82,700 this year.

The Word Is Out (Chris Page) held on for second with Odds On Collateral (Peter Wrenn) third.

Both horses are trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr. Odds On Hialeah is owned by Let It Ride Stables and Odds On Racing, while Odds On Racing owns Odds on Chesapeake.

In the first division of freshman colt pacers, Rick Wink stayed perfect on the year winning for the eighth time as he set a new track record for 2-year-old pacing colts.

Off the gate, Page took the Bit Of A Legend N colt to the lead, but Extra Suds with Miller took over with a :27.1 opening quarter. Rick Wink retook the lead and never looked back cruising to a three-length victory in 1:52.

Extra Suds finished second with Downbythewater (Chris Lems) third.

Rick Wink has earned \$239,750 this year and can capture the Ohio Triple Crown with a win on Super Night on Oct. 12 at MGM Northfield Park.

Rick Wink's track record lasted longer than Odds On Hialeah's record. It was 12 races before Sippinonsearoc broke his stablemate's record.

Starting from the far outside ninth post position, Sippinonsearoc with Page fired off the gate and grabbed the lead which he never relinquished on the way to a three-length win in 1:51.2, lowering the track record.

Lather Up Athens (Hank LeVan) was second while Ridin The Waves (Lems) was third.

It is the fifth win in eight starts for the son of Downbytheseaside who raised his earnings to \$258,500.

Rick Wink and Sippinonsearoc are trained by Ron Burke. Burke Racing Stable, RAS Racing, Knox Services, and J&T Silva – Purnell & Libby own Rick Wink, while Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, RAS Racing, and Knox Services own Sippinonsearoc.



On the trotting side, one track record was set as **Lt Loverboy** dominated the first division of colt trotters winning in 1:56.2. Directly out of the gate, Brett Miller urged 3-5 favorite Lt Loverboy to the front and never looked back. The gelded son of Long Tom easily coasted to fractions in 28.3, :57.4, and 1:26.4, winning by six lengths.

Scrappys Love (Mike Wilder) was second with Battle Hill (Lems) in third.

Lt Loverboy has won five of nine this season. Four of those victories were scored in the OSS. With \$154,855 in the bank, Lt Loverboy has hit the board in each lifetime start under Daren Harvey's conditioning. He is owned by Wayne Mast, Jr. and Callam Racing.

Owners Wayne Mast, Jr. and Callam Racing scored again as **Oso Fast** went wire-to-wire in the second division. Despite leaving from the eighth post position, Oso Fast demanded control of the field. Guided by David Miller, the gelded son of Coraggioso posted fractions in :28.2, :58.4, and 1:28 before tripping the wire in 1:58.3.

In a blanket finish, Stud Muffin T (Trevor Smith) was second while Hilltop Sonar (Page) was third.

Oso Fast has won two legs of the Ohio Sires Stakes. The victory upped his earnings to \$92,225. Scott Cox trains Oso Fast.

Mocha Hill and Page took the first division of filly trotters in 1:57.2. Mocha Hill showed no hesitation when leaving from the sixth post position. The daughter of What The Hill cleared the front while coming out of the first turn. With no challengers, Mocha Hill set fractions in :28.4, :58.4, and 1:28.1 before stopping the clock with lengths to spare.

Aunt Laura (Miller) finished second with Mia Sangria (Dan Noble) third.

The victory marked the fourth OSS win for Mocha Hill. The Ron Burke trainee has hit the board in seven of eight starts, earning \$184,742 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Hatfield Stables, Weaver Bruscemi, and Knox Services.

In the second filly division, **Dream Something** scored in 1:58.2. Tyler Smith gave the daughter of Uncle Peter the perfect pocket trip behind favorite Rose Run Allison (Page). Dream Something stayed patient as fractions came in :28.2, :57.4, and 1:27.4. Dream Something snuck into the passing lane and dug deep to win in her final strides.

Rose Run Allision held on for second while Brink Street (Yannick Gingras) finished third.

With three Sires Stakes victories under her belt, Dream Something has earned \$150,383 this season. Miles Wollam trains and co-owns Dream Something alongside Julie Ann Sweet and Dale Sweet.

The Ohio Sires Stakes Scarlet and Gray Championships are scheduled for Oct. 12 at MGM Northfield Park.



SBOANJ files complaint against Freehold Raceway

The Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOANJ) filed a complaint against FR Park Racing LP and PlayUp Interactive Inc. on Friday evening (Sept. 27) in the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey.

The complaint primarily asserts that FR Park Racing breached its contractual obligations to the SBOANJ concerning the general operations of Freehold Raceway as well as the sharing of sports wagering revenues generated through the Raceway. FR Park Racing has been evading its responsibilities under an agreement with the SBOANJ to maintain the Raceway, provide a safe condition for patrons and racing participants, and to make necessary repairs. FR Park Racing and its sports wagering partner, PlayUp Interactive, also owe the SBOANJ hundreds of thousands of dollars from sports betting as required by a revenue sharing agreement.

Rather than live up to its commitments, FR Park Racing first closed its sports betting operations and transferred its online presence to another entity to avoid any future sport wagering revenue sharing with the SBOANJ. It then announced the closure of the Raceway one week after Governor Murphy signed legislation providing Freehold Raceway with a \$1.6 million annual purse subsidy for the next five years, and even though the SBOANJ members made significant investments on racing in calendar year 2025.

The SBOANJ tried to resolve these issues without litigation, but to no avail. The standardbred industry has been and continues to be harmed by FR Park Racing's broken promises and failures, and the SBOANJ will fight in the courts to hold FR Park Racing and PlayUp Interactive accountable.

Additionally, the SBOANJ's leadership is committed to finding an alternative venue to conduct races in 2025 that would otherwise have been held at Freehold Raceway prior to the closure announcement. Discussions are ongoing with various entities to mitigate the harms caused by FR Park Racing.

Timeisonmyside eases Jug frustration with Keystone Classic win

Still disappointed by his sickness scratch from the Little Brown Jug, **Timeisonmyside** took out his frustration on his rivals in Saturday's (Sept. 28) Keystone Classic at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows, rolling to an easy 3½-length victory. **Solid Character** captured the other division in the stake for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers.

The Jug scratch hurt even more because Timeisonmyside already had drawn the rail for his elimination. But Tim Twaddle, who trains the Captain Crunch—Macharoundtheclock gelding for TheStable Timeisonmyside Group, said the decision to scratch didn't require much soul-searching.

"He came up sick," Twaddle said. "He didn't eat his breakfast, and we didn't want to risk going there, shipping him there early and then potentially racing him two heats. As badly as we wanted to go, it would certainly have hurt the horse. It's tough to get over, though his win today helps."

In the Keystone Classic, Timeisonmyside quarter-poled to the top for Aaron Merriman and triumphed in 1:49.3, matching his career best, with Captain Fear Not and Dream Bird second and third, respectively. Twaddle indicated Timeisonmyside, who lifted his lifetime earnings to \$263,130, will be pointed to the Breeders Crown.

Solid Character gave the cold shoulder to Rush In when that one tried to overtake him at the quarter, forcing Rush In to retreat to the pylons. That decision by Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. proved wise, as Solid Character cruised to a two-length win over Rush In in 1:49.2, a lifetime mark. De La Hoya Hanover finished third.

Wrenn declined to characterize his quarter-pole denial as "hardball."

"I thought it was kind of a two-horse race," Wrenn said. "I just wanted to control the pace."

Ron Burke conditions the Sweet Lou-Riley Character gelding for Burke Racing Stable, Robert Jackson, Timothy Sullivan and Tom Wilson.

Next week, The Meadows kicks off its Fall/Winter live schedule, which features racing each Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, first post 12:45 p.m. each day. The exception is the card on Friday (Oct. 11), which is highlighted by the Pennsylvania Fairs championships. First post that day is 5:10 p.m.

Dave Palone collected five wins on the 13-race card, giving him 11 over the last two programs.
