



## Rutherford's \$300,000 Kadabra filly tops Day 3

After just three of five sessions, the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale is only \$1 million from surpassing its record for total gross.

Veteran breeder Harry Rutherford of Ontario has raised and sold a lot of nice yearlings in his 82 years, but he had never sold one for \$300,000 prior to Thursday night when he topped the third session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Rutherford sold his Kadabra filly out of Glide By named Up And Ready to a group of fellow Ontarians that includes Marvin Katz, Al Libfeld and, possibly, Sam Goldband.

"For the yearling, that's certainly top drawer for me. I can't wait to get back to the hotel and call Joey," Rutherford said,



beaming, referring to his partner Diane Ingham.

After Katz and Co. outbid Determination's Luc Blais to top Day 3, Katz crossed the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion to congratulate Rutherford on the sale. Just two days earlier, it was the reverse when Rutherford congratulated Katz on breeding the \$1.1 million full-brother to Greenshoe named Maverick that set the record for the most expensive standardbred yearlings ever sold.

"I saw him after his horse sold and congratulated him because that was some feat, I'll tell you, \$1.1 (million)," Rutherford said. "I was just so glad that I was here to see it and be a part of it, you might say. That's unbelievable and then, later on, another one sells for a million."

"It's been terrific and there's more with the racing we'll do over the weekend. It's been great. We love it down here," Katz said.

The outdoor walking ring was busy Thursday.

He said the chief attraction to Up And Ready was her pedigree.

"It's a great pedigree. It's a pedigree that we really placed a lot of value on," Katz said. "It's a family that we'd like to build off further, back to Maven... and we just felt like it was an excellent opportunity to add to that family."

Rutherford agreed that Up And Ready has a strong pedigree, but even he couldn't peg her as the best of the six fillies he brought to Lexington to sell.

"This is coming from a breeder, but honestly, they were the nicest group of fillies I've had," Rutherford said. "I said to

everybody, 'We've got six very nice fillies, but we don't have a headliner."

He does now.

"I think we're down to eight broodmares now," Rutherford said. "We retired one and another one we're just not going to breed her anymore, so we're down to eight. I would like to get a nice, high-quality broodmare that we could breed to one of the new stallions coming on... but before I left, (Joey said), 'Now, Harry, you're not bringing anything home."

Heading into tonight's fourth of five sessions, the sale is just \$1 million off the all-time record for gross.

"We represent a lot of small breeders and here's a perfect example of Harry Rutherford from Ontario," said Preferred's David Reid. "He's been a long-time customer of ours. Some years he comes down here and we don't have the best of luck for him, so to see him and his operation, his whole crew back home, sell one for \$300,000... that's pretty impressive."

In all, 173 yearlings went through the ring Thursday. The session gross was \$7,656,000 and the average was \$44,254, which is up 5.8 per cent from the \$41,704 fetched on day three in 2018. The gross was up 13.3 per cent from the \$6,756,000 fetched on day three last year.

Just another very good session," said Reid, wearing his sale co-manager's hat. "Similar to last night, credit goes to the auction crew. They kept a really good pace. We got done the last horse through the ring at 11:20. The bidders came right at you again, for the most part. It had good flow, good mix.

"There were maybe a few more Ontario eligibles and New York eligible in there tonight and the crowd was a little different. The sale was very, very good. Obviously, the top buy was a Kadabra filly. They got into a spirited bidding war between Determination and Katz and Libfeld... It's very encouraging to see a sign like that, competitive bidding for a top filly with a female family."

#### **Harness Racing Update**

Through three sessions, the 2019 sale has grossed \$38,930,000 for 465 yearlings sold and produced an average of \$83,720 that is up 7.3 per cent from the three-day average of \$78,002 from a record 2018 sale. The gross is up 16.9 per cent from the 2018 three-day gross of \$33,307,000.

"The gross is within a million, after three sessions, of the total sale last year," Reid said of the 2018 auction which grossed \$39,770,000.

"I think we're going to be ahead, but it ties into everything. We can't do it without the breeders and we've been saying it all along, like a broken record, it's a deep catalogue with a lot of new sires to choose from. There's a lot of diversification between pacers and trotters, first-crop sires and the existing sires that are just very successful.

"The consumer hasn't had this much product to choose from in a long time."

The fourth session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale will feature 171 yearlings. It begins tonight at 7 p.m. at Fasig-Tipton. For more information about the sale, please visit: http://www.lexingtonselected.com.







#### Lexington has been incredible; thoughts on Walner and the sport's first, two, million-dollar yearlings

**Tidbits**: Greatness was on display all week at the Red Mile but the 3-year-olds in various divisions of the Bluegrass took my breath away. It wasn't so much the speed but the way in which some of the sophomores crushed the competition. It started with my filly favorite When Dovescry, then my favorite colt Greenshoe and ended up with another stunning colt Bettors Wish owned by my dear friends of Fair Island farm — Art Zubrod and Leah Cheverie. Greenshoe did turn in a sub-1:50 performance, but he was forced to do it on his own as the fractions were just honest and although the temperature was cooperative the wind was not. There is no question in my mind that he could break the world record under perfect conditions. Both When Dovescry and Greenshoe trotted last halves near :54 and last quarters in :26 under wraps.

I am fully aware how desperately the area needs rain I just hope we are spared the trauma of a deluge Sunday on Futurity Day, it should be a fabulous day at the races, don't miss it if you have the opportunity.

The food in the clubhouse is excellent. The first week was a simple regular menu, but this week will be a Buffet.

By chance I ran into an old friend in Lexington who is a world renowned veterinarian.

He was concerned about the lack of knowledge in our sport regarding drug abuses. His basic reason for the discussion was his belief that the sport as a whole are chasing EPO blood dopers when, in his opinion, there is far more widespread misuse of baking soda.

"I believe the use of Bicarb loading is a far greater problem we face than EPO. I sat in a closed door discussion with a racing commission investigation that brought up this topic. I pulled up a list of the 10 leading trainers (by wins) at the meet and pointed out six that I thought were tubing with baking soda or other alkaline agents. The chief investigator said, 'Your names look very similar to ours.' There are several masking agents being used, most of them have a chlorine or chloride base, which obviously ties the bicarbonate molecule up until it is needed. The numbers of bicarb levels permitted in pre race testing are between 37 and 39.

"In fact, the use of Lasix barely raises the level at all. Therefore many trainers put their horses on Lasix so they can add more baking soda. Virtually all horses normally run a 30 to 32 level of bicarb, so when you add masking agents ie: chlorine, you can easily avoid detection using 6 to 8 ounces. So in essence the only way to stop the cheaters is to lower the bicarb level to 34-35 wether they use Lasix or not.

"Anything between these levels and 37 the trainer should be given a warning and the horse be remanded to a restricted area eight hours before race time. If after detention the number remains high then accept it as normal for that particular horse."

I thanked the doctor for this important advice and I hope that the racing commissions from Maine to California act swiftly to solve what to this writer has become a menace to our sport.

WHAT A HORSE SALE... Months ago, when I first perused the catalogue for the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale of 2019 I said that it was the most power-packed sale I had seen in 60 years in the business. I predicted that there was an excellent chance we would see a \$1 million yearling. I WAS WRONG... There were two of them.

One from Walco Farm (Messrs. Katz and Libfeld) and one from Cane Run farm. Both sons of Muscle Hill and both in this writer's opinion near perfect individuals. Amazing as it is, the story doesn't stop there. Before I go on I would like to congratulate the new owners of the very precious colts. The first one, a brother to the spectacular Greenshoe, sold for \$1.1 million and was hammered down to a group from the Tony Alagna barn that was headed by Brad Grant, and included Crawford Farm and Daniel Plouffe. The second at \$1 million a brother to the great European star Propulsion was hammered down to Britton Medical AB, longtime clients of the Takter Stable. Good luck to all the successful buyers.

Dick Watson asks: I know that you have touted the great ability of Greenshoe for two seasons. When people talk of great trotters they never mention Walner. Do you leave him out of top list in your opinion?

Absolutely not. If you go to the archives of HRU you will see how much I loved the colt and how terrible I felt when his career end so abruptly. Walner was dominant with a ton of ability and may well have been as fast as Greenshoe but he never had the opportunity due to early retirement due to injury.

That said, I truly believe that he will show how great he was when his foals race next year. Everyone I have asked about his first crop (selling next fall) have rave reviews. The colt aside from being great gaited had a wonderful head on his shoulders. With all the talent available in the trotting ranks today he will be another force to contend with.

Paula Arnold asks: Were you surprised at the auction results from the first session from the Kentucky Selected Yearling Sale? Did you ever think that the could be a standardbred Yearling sell for \$1 million?

Obviously you are not an HRU regular. I have predicted that the Perfect Storm had arrived and this will be the year to see that barrier cracked. Take note that the parity in the standardbred and thoroughbred sports has grown closer as time goes by.

Years ago, a thoroughbred sold for \$16 million at a 2-year-old in training sale and there were many multiple million dollar sales. They had stallions stand for \$500,000 that cost fortunes to buy. Northern Dancer, by the way, stood for \$1 million at one time and at age 21 there was a \$40 million offer on the table that was turned down. I am proud to say we now have had two million-dollar yearlings and a \$14 million stallion (Greenshoe) who just happens to be a full brother to Maverick, the colt that just sold for \$1.1 million.

We have come a long way. Back in the '80s and '90s runners were syndicated for high seven figures while a top standardbred would be valued near \$4 million. Now we have just seen Greenshoe syndicated for \$14 million.

In reality, our stallions have increased 300 per cent at the same time the top of the thoroughbred stallion prices have gone down significantly. It will be a very interesting year.

To all that have been so supportive I am very thankful. I have met so many of you in Lexington the past few days it has been great. Have a good sale, good racing and have a wonderful weekend.

## The incredible generosity of the Ontario harness racing community

There are countless examples of the province's racetracks and participants giving back to worthy causes.

Wander into an Ontario racetrack during a live program and you will often find yourself in the midst of a community-based fundraiser or awareness campaign. Working with organizations that range from local sports teams to national foundations, each year Ontario racetracks give hundreds of thousands of dollars and countless hours to community causes.

"I think that it makes sense to. I mean we have the venue, we have the people, so why wouldn't we?" said Clinton Raceway's marketing and promotions manager Jessica Carnochan. "And it works for us. We can show them what a great time it is and then they can come back on their own when they aren't necessarily there for the specific fundraiser."

Every one of Clinton Raceway's 15 live race days is a fundraiser for a local group. This summer, the organizations that took advantage of the track's "Day at the Races" fundraising application included the local high school, a variety of minor sports clubs and area non-profits such as the Huron Residential Hospice and Stratford-Perth Humane Society.


"Like any organization, we were always being asked for donations, so we turned that ask into a giveback where we invited those doing the asking to host an event. We'd assist them, and they would in turn bring some new faces to the track, something we all like to see," said Carnochan. "Each season we assist these local organizations in raising between \$2,000 and \$5,000 a week. We couldn't do it



without our loyal race fans; their willingness to support is what makes each week a success. The community of harness racing is so willing to give back, it's heartwarming to see."

In addition to the weekly "Day at the Races" fundraisers, Clinton also plays host to an annual Drivers Charity Challenge for a different organization each year and its biennial Legends Day has raised over \$250,000 for the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation.

At Hiawatha Horse Park on a Saturday night you might not realize that a fundraiser is under way, but every time drivers Garret Rooney, Tyler Borth and Andy Moore won a race this

season their corporate partners made a \$10 donation to a local organization. Rooney's partner was HUB International that donated \$340 to St. Clair Child and Youth Services, Borth was paired with BDO Sarnia, who donated \$280 to the Inn of the Good Shepherd, and Moore's partner Siskinds Law Firm donated \$340 to the Sarnia Arena Revitalization Project.

Other racetracks are also involved in more 'behind the scenes' support of their community, including Grand River Raceway whose parent company, the Grand River Agricultural Society, has contributed funding or Gift-in-Kind support for local initiatives totalling more than \$1.75 million in the last 15 years.

The primary streams of the Grand River Agricultural Society's giving are a scholarship program that supports students residing in Wellington and Perth counties in their pursuit of agricultural studies at the college or university level and grants for organizations or projects dedicated to enhancing rural life.

Also operated by an Agricultural Society, The Raceway at the Western Fair District supports a variety of community-based initiatives, on both live race nights and off days.

On Friday, Oct. 25 the London oval will play host to the 14th annual Harness The Hope night, complete with a Winning Key Contest, 50-50 draw, silent auction and penny auction. The event, spearheaded by Doreen, Kristy and Brandi Dustin, is a fundraiser for the Breast Cancer Society of Canada and the Pink Pearl Foundation (details here).

Harness The Hope started at The Raceway at the Western Fair District when Kristy Dustin was working as the track's marketing manager and her mother Doreen was diagnosed with breast cancer. Since then, the event has expanded to other racetracks and events, even reaching PEI this summer.

The Raceway is currently looking at ways it can support another initiative launched by an employee. Western Fair District security team member Allison DeBlaire's **519Pursuit** offers friendship and practical support to London residents struggling with extreme poverty and homelessness.

"She alone last year — with some help from friends and social media and everything like that —she did a sock campaign for the month of October and she raised 28,000 pairs of socks," said Raceway Manager Greg Gangle. "This year I asked her, I said what's a realistic goal for the 519Pursuit,

and she said we'll get 50,000 no problem."

The night after Harness The Hope in London, the Breeders Crown Charity Challenge will come to a close. Part of the Breeders Crown festivities at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the challenge pairs four top 3-year-old racehorses with a local celebrity and a charity of their choosing and asks fans to vote for their favorite team (vote here).

The winning team will receive the lion's share of one per cent of the June 1 through Oct. 26, 2019 earnings from participating racehorses Warrawee Ubeaut, Woodside Charm, Gimpanzee and Captain Crunch and the \$205,00 raised in Wednesday night's stallion service auction at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. (read more about the challenge here).

While tailored to the Breeders Crown, the challenge is just one aspect of the community-based initiatives Woodbine Mohawk Park staff and fans will participate in this year through Woodbine Cares. On both the North America Cup and Metro Pace nights the Campbellville oval partnered with the Milton District Hospital Foundation, selling 50-50 tickets to support the foundation's fund-raising effort and Woodbine Cares regularly offers grants, in-kind donations and hands-on help to organizations in and around Halton County.

Racetracks are not the only members of Ontario's harness racing community focused on giving back to their community. Many participants give their time, talent and treasure to a wide variety of initiatives, from offering a helping hand to an individual struggling with health care or other expenses right up to the stewardship of national foundations.

At this fall's Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling auction in Harrisburg, PA, breeder Twinbrook Farms will sell a yearling with more going for him than a solid pedigree and a sharp video. When the hammer falls on Twin B Fighter, by Bettors Delight and out of In The Pink, Twinbrook Farms will donate four per cent of his purchase price to Harness The Hope.

"His name is Twin B Fighter, because you have to be a fighter to beat breast cancer," said Twinbrook's Tammy McNiven of the pacing colt, who will sell as Hip Number 13. "Hopefully we'll be able to give them a big check."

Whether bidding on a yearling, purchasing a 50-50 draw ticket or pitching in to plant trees, harness racing participants are making a positive contribution to their



#### Big Oil dead heats with Real Cool Sam in International Stallion

**Real Cool Sam** remains undefeated in nine career starts, but hit the finish line inseparably with 32-1 longshot **Big Oil** in the third of three divisions of the \$276,300 Trixton International Stallion Stakes on Thursday (Oct. 3) at Lexington, KY's Red Mile.

Big Oil sat third to a :27.2 first quarter set by second-choice Gangster Hanover with Capricornus sitting the pocket. Real Cool Sam, sent the 1-2 favorite, raced fourth up the backstretch before driver David Miller slowly edged from the pylons through a :55.3 half.

Real Cool Sam ranged closer to Gangster Hanover circling the final turn, but Capricornus had room to pull from the pocket passing three-quarters in 1:24. Capricornus took a narrow lead through the stretch while Big Oil circumvented Gangster Hanover towards the inside and sprinted towards the front as Real Cool Sam rallied three wide. Real Cool Sam ground past Capricornus in the final strides to hit the finish in tandem with Big Oil, stopping the clock in 1:52.1.

A gelding by Muscle Hill, Real Cool Sam lowered the world record for a 2-year-old trotting gelding of 1:52.3 set by Amigo Volo last week at Red Mile.

"When [the photo] was taking so long, I was hopeful for a dead-heat, but I didn't think we got it," trainer Jim Campbell said after the race. "Today was his ninth start and I didn't want to come out of here with 10 starts and then — the plan is, if everything's okay, to go the Breeders Crown. I didn't want him getting used hard; [it's] been over three weeks since he raced last at Chester. When they hadn't raced like that and you go abuse them too much too soon [then] they don't race the way you want them to. This way it worked out perfectly — Dave gave him a good drive; the way you'd want the colt driven."

#### **Harness Racing Update**

Real Cool Sam, a homebred for Fashion Farms, has earned \$443,063. He paid \$2.20 to win.

Big Oil, a colt by Father Patrick, won his second race from eight starts, earning \$91,605 for owner/breeder Jason and Douglas Allen and co-owner Ron Allen. The 1:52.1 mile lowers the Julie Miller trainee's lifetime mark. Andy Miller piloted the \$16.60 winner.

"Last week we kind of used as a confidence booster for him," said Julie Miller. "I thought Andy raced him real well and we thought today to give him a chance. I'm leaning towards [not sending him to the Breeders Crown]. We may put him away and have a great 3-year-old."

**King Alphonso** wired his competition with a 1:52 mile in the opening division of the Trixton.

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt swept King Alphonso past pylon-starter Beyond Kronos to take the lead into the Tattersalls turn. Even-money favorite Rome Pays Off, rough-gaited at the start, raced last of the seven through a :27.1 opening quarter before angling first over into the backside.

Rome Pays Off marched into a :55.2 half to race at King Alphonso's wheel circling the final turn but began to retreat past three-quarters in 1:24.1. King Alphonso strolled through the stretch with wide strides pursued by pocket-sitter Beyond Kronos in second. It's Academic rolled down the center of the course for third.

A colt by Muscle Hill bred by Order By Stable, King Alphonso won his second race from seven starts, earning \$128,395 for owners Ake Svanstedt, Bender Sweden, Little E LLC and Douglas Sipple. He paid \$6.80 to win.

Taken to the center of the course after trotting a bad step, **Amigo Volo** quickly regained his footing and surged past his competition to equal his then-1:52.3 world record when winning the second division of the Trixton.

Driver Dexter Dunn floated Amigo Volo from post 7 into fourth rounding the first turn while EL Ideal led the field through the first quarter in :26.4. EL Ideal decelerated up the backstretch as Amigo Volo nearly broke into a gallop but kept his stride as Dunn veered the Father Patrick gelding to the center of the track. Past a :55.3 half, Amigo Volo progressed uncovered towards the leader.

"It wasn't his gait — he was sort of running out a touch there," Dunn said after the race. "He was playing around with his head a little bit. It was more like he lost a little bit of concentration there and threw himself off stride. [So I] sort

of moved him out of the way and he just hit his gait straight away."

EL Ideal clung to command as Amigo Volo matched strides passing three-quarters in 1:24. Amigo Volo then lunged to the lead straightening for the finish and strode clear of EL Ideal with Synergy taking third.

"He did it really nicely," Dunn also said. "Those plugs are still in."

Winning his fourth race from eight starts, Amigo Volo has won \$214,696 for owners Pinske Stables and David J. Miller. Carter Pinske conditions the gelding bred by Kentuckiana Farms LLC and Jorgen Jahre Jr. He paid \$3.40 to win.

Each division of the Trixton International Stallion Stakes was sponsored by Deo Volente Farms, where 2014 Hambletonian Winner Trixton stands stud.

"This is truly a special place. It's an honor and a pleasure to be here," said Mike Gulotta, CEO of Deo Volente Farms in the winner's circle after Race 3. "I love the crowd; I love the racing. Together with the sale, it's a perfect venue. It's a place to showcase some great, great horses."

Grand Circuit action resumes at The Red Mile this afternoon (Oct. 4) with four divisions of the \$290,200 Muscle Hill International Stallion Stakes for 2-year-old trotting fillies — sponsored by Southwind Farms — and two divisions of the \$239,000 Arlene Siegel Memorial International Stallion Stakes for 2-year-old pacing fillies — sponsored by Jules Siegel and Fashion Farms. Racing gets underway with first-race post at 1:00 p.m. (EDT).

## Love A Good Story looks to write another winning chapter

Love A Good Story has authored a pretty nice tale this season for trainer Julie Miller and will try to add another winning chapter in today's (Oct. 4) International Stallion Stakes for 2-year-old female trotters at Lexington's Red Mile. The filly, who notched her first Grand Circuit victory last week in a division of the Bluegrass, is the 2-1 morning-line favorite in the first of four International Stallion trot divisions.

So far this year, Love A Good Story has won seven of nine races and finished second once. She was a six-time winner in preliminary rounds of the New York Sire Stakes and her only off-the-board finish came in the series final when she started from post eight at Batavia Downs. She rebounded from that setback with a 1:52.2 triumph in the Bluegrass, clocking the fastest time of the season for a 2-year-old filly trotter.

"She bounced back well," Miller said. "We were hoping she was going to pick it up on the mile track, because she was going to have to, and she responded well. She's got a very nice gait. She's a nicely put-together filly and does it with a lot of ease. If they're not working too hard at their gait, they're able to go faster."

Love A Good Story, by Chapter Seven out of Celebrity Lovin, was purchased for \$90,000 at last fall's Lexington Selected Sale and her family includes Dan Patch Award-winner Self Possessed. She is owned by Pinske Stables, Kentuckiana Racing Stable, and Daniel Plouffe.

The filly is eligible to the Breeders Crown later this month at Woodbine Mohawk Park, but Miller is not planning for anything beyond Friday. Not yet, anyway.

"We take it step by step," Miller said. "I'm sure if we have a good result this week, it's definitely on the table. She's eligible and I hope we're making arrangements to go."

Love A Good Story will start Friday from post No. 1 with Andy Miller in the sulky. Hello Tomorrow, who has finished second in three consecutive races including the Peaceful Way Stakes and a division of the Bluegrass, is the 7-2 second choice from post two. Tim Tetrick will drive for trainer Per Engblom.

In the second International trot division, Ramona Hill is the 2-1 favorite over Shishito at 5-2. Both fillies won Bluegrass splits last week. Andy McCarthy drives Ramona Hill for Tony Alagna; Dexter Dunn gets the ride behind Shishito for Engblom.

Ake Svanstedt trained and driven Common Sense S, another Bluegrass winner, is the 2-1 favorite in the third division while Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stakes champion Sherry Lyns Lady, trained by Jim Campbell and driven by Tetrick, is the 9-5 choice in the fourth.

Red Mile also hosts two divisions of the International

Stallion for 2-year-old female pacers on Friday. In the first, Team Miller sends out The Bethinator for her first stakes try. Last week, she won a late closer at Red Mile in 1:50.1, a time that is the second fastest of the season for a 2-year-old filly pacer.

The Bethinator brings a five-race win streak to the International. She finished second in her career debut before reeling off three victories at Hawthorne Racecourse for trainer Nelson "Spider" Willis and then capturing her bow for the Miller barn at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

"She wasn't eligible (for the Bluegrass) so we put her in that late closer," Julie Miller said. "That was a nice mile and Andy said she was comfortable doing it. We were actually a bit surprised how she did because you never know what they are. We were really happy with that performance. I told the owner if she raced well and won in (1):51 or better, she would get the chance to go with the big girls. So, this is her chance this week."

The Bethinator, by Somebeachsomewhere out of Pleasure Beach, is owned by breeder Megan Rogers Racing Stables. Her family includes Sweet Future, who is the dam of Dan Patch Award-winner Sweet Lou and two-time Breeders Crown champ Bettor Sweet.

"She got sick earlier in the year and they were patient with her," Miller said. "Hopefully all of that is paying off for her. Hopefully she performs well."

The Bethinator is 8-1 on the morning line. Stakes-winner Reflect With Me is the 5-2 favorite for the McCarthy-Alagna duo.

In the second division, Kentucky Sire Stakes champion Gai Waterhouse is the 3-1 favorite for driver Yannick Gingras and trainer Domenico Cecere.

Racing begins at 12:30 p.m. (EDT) Friday with a Hall of Fame Amateur Series event, followed at 1 p.m. by the start of the regular card. For complete entries, click here.
