Ron Waples - a rich lifetime of being consumed by horses

Two weeks after profiling Keith Waples, we put the spotlight on another legendary Waples — his cousin, Ronnie.

What does one do after writing a column on the man who is one of the most influential horsemen of all time - the living legend Keith Waples (full story here)?

One attempts to write one on a man carrying the same name who in terms of statistics and statistics only has even more on his resume than his cousin Keith — that being Ron Waples.

Like Keith, Ronnie Waples is a member of both the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame (1986) and the Harness Racing Living Hall of Fame at Goshen (1993).

He has driven the winners of 6,923 races and \$74,379,689 and trained the winners of 2,205 races and \$3,984,278. Keep in mind, though, that these statistics are far from inclusive, since he was actively training and driving well before they began keeping these numbers.

He has driven the winners of just about every classic event in both Canada and the United States.

He began as a farm boy in the small town of Ebenezer, ON. The town consisted of the Waples Farm at the top of the hill, three Feagan farms beneath it and a church.

He wanted to get out of town. He did so primarily to escape an unhappy home life. In retrospect, the rift was between his father and him because his father worked with and was primary interested in machinery. Ronnie was consumed by horses. He loved everything about them. His father considered them a waste of time.

But Ronnie soon discovered what he was born to do — become a horseman. Not only a horseman, but a horseman both trainer and driver who was among the greatest to don a set of colors and carry a whip.

At 15, he left home. He describes himself as basically an unmotivated kid who was a bit of a screw up. He hated school and wasn't happy at home. He really wasn't sure where he was going and what he wanted to do.

He ended up staying a few days with a friend Jack Turner who worked at a local post office. Jack asked him, "Why are you here and what are you going to do?"

"I'm here because I left home and I'm going to go see my cousins Keith and Murray in Coldwater and see if I can get a job with them working with the horses."

Keith asked him if it was alright with his parents. Ron said that he didn't know, but that he had told them that he was leaving. Keith then checked with them and got the okay and gave young Ronnie a job.

He started as a groom, became a second trainer and was often sent out to drive some of the horses.

Although he was treated well by Keith, there was no such thing then as a driver making money from driving an occasional winner or more.

Keith often asked Ronnie him how much a purse was. His stock answer most of the time was, "I don't know."

"When I started to catch drive as a professional I sure learned, because the five per cent of whatever the purse was going to be my bread and butter."

He worked for Keith and Murray for 10 years.

"Everything I've accomplished in the horse business

derived from working with them."

"Keith was only a teacher in the sense that if you watched him and duplicated the things that he did with his horses, there was no way you couldn't learn."

At the age of 25, Ronnie decided to go out on his own.

For the next 10 years or so, he concentrated on racehorses with essentially very little interest in yearlings.

His first good horse was Caroldon's Knight who carried his small stable for a few years.

When asked about the reasons for his incredible success. he ranks them as follows:

- 1. Working for Keith and Murray for 10 years.
- 2. A group of great and loyal owners.
- 3. The luck of being associated with wonderful horses.
- 4. A group of great caretakers and trainers.

"I've been an incredibly lucky guy ever since I entered the business. I've had a lot of great owners, the best of which was man named Joe Panaro. He was an owner in my stable for 35 years. To Joe, I could do no wrong. Anything I said or recommend was great with him. I went to Harrisburg once with a budget of \$150,000. I ended up spending \$260,000. I told Joe about it and it was fine with him. One of the horses was Alba Time who we gave \$100,000 for. He wasn't worth anywhere near what we paid for him and we ended up selling him for \$20,000. That was okay with Joe. He said, 'We at least got something for him.' The other horse we bought was JDs Buck for \$160,000 and we ended up making \$1.6 million with him.

Ronnie, you are one of the greatest drivers of all time. How did that come about?

"I think that top drivers are born not made. You have to have some sort of innate talent or touch with horses. I believe I had some of that. But I think I learned most from watching other great drivers. Of course, Keith was number one. I was also a huge Herve Filion fan. Of course, Herve loved Keith and his driving style was reminiscent of Keith's, but there were some differences.

"I've known John Campbell ever since we were both kids. I knew his father and grandfather. John was a natural and a great student and asset to the game. There are many who might say he was the greatest ever. The numbers certainly say so.

"Bill O'Donnell was as cool in the bike as anybody whoever sat behind a horse. We are still great friends and we and our wives enjoy spending time together.

"Among today's drivers there are more outstanding ones


Hall of Famer Ron Waples (at Clinton Raceway's Legends Day in 2017) said, "I've been an incredibly lucky guy ever since I entered the business."

than at a given point of time that there probably have ever been. My number one choice would likely be my buddy David Miller. But there are others — Gingras, Sears, the two Down Under guys McCarthy and Dunn are having phenomenal seasons, Tetrick, Scotty Zeron, Joey Bongiorno appears to have a good future ahead of him. Up here, Doug McNair and Louis-Philippe Roy have good hands, good judgment and are able to make one go."

So, let's talk about horses. Who is your favorite?

"I suppose it would be the last one I won a race with. I've been privileged to drive so many great horses at one time or another, some that I've been personally involved with, others just as a 'catch up driver' as Mr. Simpson would call us. But seriously, I suppose when push came to shove it would have to be **Ralph Hanover**. After all, I won the Triple Crown with him. He was the perfect racehorse. You could do anything with him — leave, come from behind, sit in a hole, anything. Most importantly, I guess I owned a good piece of him. When he won, there were multiple checks coming into my bank account."

Sugarcane Hanover - "Just a wonderful horse who had a great foot of speed. He could do anything, but he was at his best coming out of a hole. When you said go to him you



better make sure that you didn't fall out of your seat, his rate of acceleration was that fast. He could accelerate faster than any other horse I've ever driven and that includes pacers. As Joe Biden would say, "here's the story" on Sugarcane Hanover. I had a bit of a row with John Simpson who owned him because of something he had said about me the previous year. At Harrisburg, I confronted him, not in any way nastily, but I told him exactly how I felt. I told him that I wouldn't be buying any Hanover yearlings because of what he had said. That was that. The next year, can you imagine? His son Jim put me up behind Sugarcane and most of his better horses. I asked Jim beforehand if his father knew about that. He said not only did he know, but he strongly approved of it. Of course, that was the end of my feud with John Simpson and Hanover Shoe Farms."

No Sex Please - "A wholly terrific trotter that is rarely talked about today. He was trained by my son Ron, Jr. Many thrills and big wins with him. I can't recall him ever going a bad race. Ron, Jr. took him and me to Sweden to race in the Elitlopp there. What a great time we had."

Park Avenue Joe - "The Hambletonian in which he and Probe dead heated was the first time I had ever driven him. John Campbell previously had, but he had opted off of PAJ because he was driving Peace Corps, the overwhelming favorite in the race. Coming around the last turn at The Meadowlands I was on top while Probe was stretched out outside of me. I was so confident that Joe would draw away from Probe. But Probe kept coming and coming. He eventually caught me, but he never went by."

Prakas - "Bill O'Donnell had a full schedule of stakes drives elsewhere, so he asked me to drive him in the Gold Cup at Vernon. But he made himself perfectly clear. This was the first and last time he would let me drive him. The next week he was in the Hambletonian, which he won. He was perfect."

Devil's Advocate - "She wasn't close to being one of the greatest horses I've ever driven, but she was a project. Jack Darling had her and she was a renegade. She was just awful. I was helping Jack out, this taking place 15 years after I had stopped driving and five years after being a trainer. Jack asked me to try straightening her out and see what I could do. I quickly realized there were two things I could do, either fight with her in which case she would probably win or try to get along with her. If the latter worked, we would both win. Jack had washed his hands with her. She was to become,

figuratively, my horse. After many hours of work trying to sweeten her up, I got her to at least stay on the racetrack without running off. She began to show enough manners and ability to be able to qualify. I asked Jack who he was going to put down to drive her. He responded, 'You of course, she's your horse.' I told him no. I hadn't driven competitively in 15 years and trained in five. 'The doesn't matter,' Jack said. 'I want you to drive her.' So I did and she did well. We went through the same scenario when she was in to race for money. But there was one major stipulation on my part. The first time I drove her badly, I was to be fired. Thankfully that didn't happen and she went on to win over \$100,000. One of my fondest memories ever, was when she won an Ontario Sires Stakes at Mohawk. There's a balcony over the paddock where the drivers gathered to watch the races. When she won the OSS there, as I was driving her off the track, there were all the drivers on that balcony clapping for me as though I had just won the Hambletonian. If I said that didn't bring tears to my eyes, I would be lying.

"Other wonderful horses that I've been privileged to have driven include Peace Corps, On The Road Again, Cams Card Shark, Huggie Hanover, Presidential Ball and of course Fake Left, who I picked up and won the Little Brown Jug with only



because Mickey McNichol had been hurt in a previous Race.

Let's talk about some of the owners, trainers and characters that you've had dealings with.

Bill Robinson - "It was a real pleasure to drive for Bill. His horses were always ready, rigged up properly and winning was the motive."

Bob McIntosh - "Pretty much the same as with Bill Robinson. His horses were always ready and fit."

Billy Haughton - "WRH epitomized class. Here's a couple of Bill Haughton stories for you. I was flying to Ottawa for the ice races on the Rideau Canal. My son, Randy, then quite young, asked if he could come along. I, of course, said sure. He asked who else would be there. I racked off some names and said that Billy Haughton would also be there. He didn't believe me. 'There's no way that Mr. Haughton with a stable of almost 200 horses in sunny Florida would come to Ottawa in sub-zero temperatures to drive a few cheap horses.' Sure enough, when we got there, there was the one and only WRH. Randy was starstruck. He couldn't believe it Billy Haughton had come to Ottawa in the dead of winter to drive. 'What about me?' I asked. 'You are alright,' he said, 'but you aren't Billy Haughton.'

"Here's another one, Randy and his mom Josephine were leaving Mohawk one night. On a bench outside WRH and Joe O'Brien were talking. Randy's mom told Randy to approach them and get their autographs. Of course they were willing. They got to talking and Randy told Billy that he was my son and that he was going to be a driver one day. WRH reached into his pocket and gave Randy something. He came back and showed his mom a stopwatch that Billy had given him. 'You can't take that,' Josephine said. 'It's too valuable. You've got to give it back. I'll go with you.' When they went back Billy wouldn't take it back. 'This young man is going to be a driver,' he said. 'If he is going to drive horses, he needs to




have a stopwatch.'

Richard Dinner and Norm Keyes - "They were known as 'The Blind Man and the Fat Christian.' Richard, because he was pretty much blind and Norm because he occupied a senior position in his church. They were partners of mine on many of the best horses I trained and drove. They were so much fun. Two great guys. Here's a funny story: Richard had met Fred Grant. He spoke of him to me. He described him as 'a succulent little morsel.' I don't know how Dick would know, he couldn't see."

Murray Brown - "You probably never knew this. But I considered you to be my good luck charm. Most of the success I've had came from horses that I bought at Harrisburg, both from the yearling and the mixed sales. Each year, as soon as I arrived at the Farm Show building, I'd come to your office to say hello. When I left, I made sure to come to say goodbye."

John Hayes - "The Senator gave me my first chance to drive a very good horse with the greatest competition. I saw him at Greenwood one day and he asked me what I was doing that Saturday. I said nothing that I know of yet. He said, 'Good, I put you down to drive Keystone Pat for me in the JFA at Roosevelt, get yourself a plane ticket to New York.' It was my



first chance in the big time. I was awestruck being among all the great drivers who I had idolized. I got lucky and won the race. The Senator thought so little of his chances that he wasn't even there.

"In the same manner that he was good to me, he could also get angry. I remember one time I was driving at Windsor Raceway. The drivers, among them Greg Wright and Ray Remmen were circulating a petition requiring racetracks to deduct the drivers five per cent to be paid directly to them. The reason was that a lot of drivers were just not getting paid for work that they did. I strongly believe that everyone should be compensated for the work they do. Even though I wasn't racing there, I agreed to sign. The Senator sought me out and asked me whether I had signed the petition. I answered that of course I had. "If that's the case, you aren't driving any more for me," he said."

Clint Hodgins - "Different than the rough, tough guy he is sometimes portrayed as being. Kind and helpful to anybody who needed it. Obviously, one of the greatest horsemen ever."

Ron Southall - "Oh, you mean Grumpy. He's a good friend. He has been in charge of Southern Oaks Training Center ever since its inception as the Simpson Training center. A good guy who does a good job. I wouldn't want his job though. Horsemen are horsemen. Some want the track harder. Some want it softer. Nobody is the same. In the words of Paul Simon though, 'You can't please everybody, so you've got to please yourself."

If you had someone to drive one for you with a horse going for a million dollars, who would you pick?

"I suppose that saying that, I'd go for my son Randy, after that I'd probably opt for David Miller. There are several others out there that wouldn't hurt my feelings if I got them. However, I don't believe all drivers are meant to drive big horses in big money races. In the same way, I think I'd sooner sometimes have the overnight driver drive one for me than the great Grand Circuit driver. In somewhat the same manner not all drivers are meant for all horses, nor are all horses meant for all drivers."

What does Ron Waples' regular day consist of?

"I get up, have breakfast and then my dog and I go for a long walk. I manage to keep busy. Occasionally, I am asked to ride for someone. I usually say yes, but I admit to being concerned. I cannot handle a horse near as well as I used to.

As soon as I realized that, I stopped driving. I'm probably close to the time when I need to stop riding as well. I couldn't live with myself if I got someone or some horse injured. Believe it or not, I also do the laundry. I talk a lot to friends. Billy O and I are pretty tight. We and our wives get together for dinner as often as we are able to. I still follow the horses, especially the young ones, quite closely."

You had a bit of a health scare last year.

"When I had a colonoscopy they found a cancerous polyp just inside the lining of my colon. They operated and removed it. It was nothing. I feel fine. I'll have another colonoscopy this Fall."

What about the future for Ronnie Waples?

"(My wife) Liz and I generally take our travel vehicle down to Southern Oaks where we park it and stay for the winter. Liz goes to work for the Pinskes. I mostly loaf and cause trouble. I sometimes help out riding for someone who might need some help. We make a campfire each night and hang out and have a beer or two with friends.

"We always stop in Nashville where my daughter Megan is studying to become a doctor nearby. We usually spend a couple of days with her there. "I have some concern about how we are going to do it this year though. The customs authorities both in the U.S. and Canada are not on the same page. The way it appears now they are not allowing Canadians to enter the U.S. by motor vehicle unless you are lucky enough to hit the right agent and he lets you go through.

"The left hand with both countries has no idea what the right is doing.

"On the other hand, we can easily enter the States if we choose to fly. It makes no sense.

"I suppose that if worse comes to worst we can fly to someplace in New York and have the vehicle shipped there and we can pick it up and proceed south.

"We generally stay through April and then repeat the process all over again."

Perfect Sting perfect in seven

At the site of his sire's and dam's world-record miles, the Always B Miki—Shebestingin colt **Perfect Sting** remained undefeated with a 1:50 performance in the third of three divisions for the \$359,300 Stay Hungry Bluegrass 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace — presented by the Stay Hungry Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms — on Saturday (Oct. 3) at Red Mile.

Away third to a :27.4 first quarter, Perfect Sting swooped to the front and grabbed the lead from Summa Cum Laude before a :55.1 half. Always A Miki raced third and angled first



over as Straight Talk advanced uncovered to the far turn. Perfect Sting kept Always A Miki at bay to three-quarters in 1:23.3 and easily turned away that challenger into the stretch.

Summa Cum Laude stuck to the pylons and gave pursuit to Perfect Sting as the pair paced clear of the competition. Perfect Sting drifted off the pylons as Summa Cum Laude

sprinted a straight course to the inside, but the Joe Holloway trainee dug in and held off the late challenger to win in 1:50. Always A Miki finished third with Pirate Hanover taking fourth.

"I said back in about March or April — he's got the potential to be the best horse I've ever had, and I think he is," said Holloway, who conditioned both the winner's sire and dam. "Nobody was this advanced at 2. Always B Miki wasn't this advanced, Jenna's Beach Boy wasn't. I was 38 years old when I had Jenna and I thought they'd come along all the time. I now realize they don't come around that often. He's getting there, and he's still learning. He dug in, came [home] in :26.2... does what he has to do."

Victorious in seven starts, Perfect Sting has accrued \$254,450 for owners and breeders Brittany Farms LLC and Val D'Or Farms. David Miller drove the \$2.10 winner.

A :52.4 half set by One Eight Hundred poised 8-5 favorite **Lou's Pearlman** for a stretch-drive burst, as the Sweet Lou-Lucy's Pearl colt scored in the opening division of the Stay Hungry in 1:49.1 — a fifth of a second off the world record.

One Eight Hundred led a four-horse charge into the first turn. Fulsome landed in the pocket with Literl Lad Hanover third and Commanding Officer fourth to a :26 first quarter. Lou's Pearlman raced fifth into the backstretch while One Eight Hundred chugged towards the half but quickly backed through the field to three-quarters in 1:21.3.

Commanding Officer angled off the pylons as the pace slowed into the stretch and rushed to the lead. Lou's Pearlman advanced in tow before angling off cover and sliding by Commanding Officer. Literl Lad Hanover, finding room after the field bunched at headstretch, ripped down the center of the course to finish second behind his stablemate. Commanding Officer finished third with Captains Place taking fourth.

"That was a dream trip for sure," winning driver Matt
Kakaley said after the race. "We thought he was something
special right away [but] he got a little sick—had a little
problem here and there. He didn't finish the PA Sires [Stakes]
the way we hoped [fourth in Championship], but he's
bounced back and Ronnie [Burke]'s done a good job getting
him back to the way he was at the beginning of the year."

Collecting his fifth win from nine starts, Lou's Pearlman grew his bankroll to \$191,318 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Elizabeth Novak and Howard Taylor. The homebred paid \$5.20 to win.



Fire Start Hanover fired from the pocket at the top of the stretch and strode in hand to a 1:50.4 victory in the second division of the Artspeak.

Clearing command by a :28.2 opening quarter, Fire Start Hanover yielded the lead moving up the backside to 7-5 favorite Blue Diamond Eyes, who crossed over to the top past a :56.1 half. Making Waves angled first over rolling to the final turn and gained ground on Blue Diamond Eyes to three-quarters in 1:23.4, but Fire Start Hanover had enough room at the top of the stretch to peer out of her seat. The Richard "Nifty" Norman trainee powered to the lead entering the final eighth and strolled to the finish under wraps over Blue Diamond Eyes. Dancinginthedark M looped to the top through slow fractions and accelerated under minimal encouragement to a 1:52.2 victory in the first division of the \$316,300 Muscle Hill Bluegrass 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Trot — sponsored by Southwind Farms — on Friday (Oct. 2) at Red Mile.

Cuatro De Julio cleared control to the first turn with Magical Muscle Man securing the pocket and Dacinginthedark M floating into third. By the first quarter in :28.3, Cuatro De Julio kept the tempo tepid heading to a :57.1 half, prompting driver Tim Tetrick to slide Dancinginthedark M off the pylons and towards the lead.

Dancinginthedark M cruised around the final turn to three-quarters in 1:25.2 as Cuatro De Julio readied to pull pocket for the stretch drive. However Cuatro De Julio stalled through the stretch as Dancinginthedark M strode to the finish in hand. Southwind Tyrion ripped down the center of

the course to take third with 8-5 favorite Arnold N Dicky settling for fourth.

"He's always had tons of ability," Tetrick said after the race. "His mind will once in awhile take over his gait and he kind of overtries to trot himself and he'll make a mistake. But today we sent him in pretty good, but he was starting to get aggressive and we had to make a move. We've been trying to teach him to race the right way. I was just trying to let him have a good day over this beautiful dirt and hopefully he likes it, and next time he'll come back and remember that and be happier for it."

Bred and owned by Menhammar Stuteri Ab, Dancinginthedark M collected his third win from six starts, earning \$91,961. Marcus Melander trains the Readly Express—Leila colt who paid \$7.80 to win.

With 1-5 favorite In Range out of contention through slow fractions, **Take All Comers** ranged first over to nail Fly Light at the finish of a 1:52.3 mile in the second division of the Muscle Hill.

Johan Palema powered to the front with stablemate Fly Light settling into a loose pocket. Take All Comers sat third to a :28 first quarter with Moonstone US racing fourth and the favorite In Range fifth.

Lined single file to a :56.3 half, Johan Palema continued unchallenged to the far turn as Take All Comers edged first over with Moonstone US and In Range in tow to three-quarters. Johan

Palema clipped three-quarters in 1:25 but shortened stride in the stretch. Fly Light lunged from the pocket to contest for the lead while Take All Comers continued to press for the lead to the outside. The pair sprinted to the finish but Take All Comers put a head in front and kept Fly Light at bay to break his maiden in his seventh start. Moonstone US finished third while his stablemate, In Range, finished sixth.

"My theory is, especially with trotters... if they're messing up because they've got other things on their mind, you're better off gelding them if you want them to win here in Kentucky and in October," trainer Jim Campbell said after the race of the freshly-gelded son of Creatine out of Nantab. "And this colt... he was like that. He wasn't a mean horse, but he was a big horse and just had other things on his mind and as soon as we gelded him it just turned a corner for him.

"He's been a colt – like Dave Miller said before he got on him – he said 'I'm looking forward to racing him today.' Dave only drove him one time [at The Meadows]. He's a horse that's big but has speed, and I think the five-eighths tracks just kind of hindered him a little bit. We got a chance to see what he can do on a big track today."

Earning \$121,982 for owner Runthetable Stables, who bred the gelding with Chelsea Batelli, Take All Comers paid

\$40.80 to win.

Delayed Hanover took command, yielded for the pocket then retook command to maintain a firm lead through the stretch and finish of a 1:53.4 mile in the final Muscle Hill division.

Sweeping to the lead from post 3, Delayed Hanover let Jack Fire clear the top past a :28.1 opening quarter. Sonofamistery raced third into the backstretch and started to pull off the pylons, but lost stride in tight quarters as Delayed Hanover vacated pocket and circled to the lead. From there, trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt controlled the tempo to a :57.2 half and to three-quarters in 1:27.1 before speeding the Southwind Frank—Don't Wait Up colt to the finish to cap the mile with a :26.3 final quarter. Jack Fire held second while Locatelli took third and Swingforthefences finished fourth.

"He trained as good as the best horses in the whole spring," Svanstedt said after the race. "I expect a lot out of this horse. Southwind Frank can be a good stud. He had a good pedigree and was a very good horse. This horse is a good-looking horse also."

Owned by Mellby Gard Inc. and Ake Svanstedt Inc., Delayed Hanover won his first race from three starts, earning \$60,800. The Hanover Shoe Farms-bred colt, who began his career late due to sustaining an injury in the paddock earlier this year, paid \$5.20 to win.

Ramona Hill leads today's sophomore Bluegrass blitz

Hambletonian winner Ramona Hill leads the Alagna Armada's charge this afternoon (Oct. 4) at Red Mile, where the champion filly will race in the final of a total 12 divisions of Bluegrass Stakes.

Ramona Hill, conditioned by Red Mile's leading trainer Tony Alagna, will start from post 7 in the third of three divisions of the \$209,600 Bar Hopping Bluegrass 3-Year-Old Filly Trot, sponsored by the Bar Hopping Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farm. The Muscle Hill—Lock Down Lindy filly enters the race the 8-5 morning line favorite and on a six-race win streak with 12 wins overall from 14 starts and \$1.3 million banked. Regular pilot Andrew McCarthy will have the reins as she competes against Pennsylvania Sires Stakes champion Crucial, who starts from post 5 for trainer Ron Burke and driver David Miller.

The opening division of the Bar Hopping sees Nancy Takter trainee Panem finally shake away from the top fillies of the



division. Finishing third in the Hambletonian Oaks, the Father Patrick filly has since taken residency at the Lexington oval competing in Kentucky Sires Stakes and finishing second in the \$250,000 final. Dexter Dunn will steer the three-time winner with over \$300,000 earned from post 3 against Sans Defaut, who enters off a win in the \$83,800 Old Oaken Bucket, and New York Sires Stakes star Love A Good Story.

Hambletonian Oaks champ Sorella returns stateside in the second Bar Hopping division following a third-place finish in the \$266,000 Elegantimage at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Yannick Gingras drives the Muscle Hill filly for trainer Takter as she matches up with Elegantimage runner-up Sister Sledge — starting from post 7 for trainer Ron Burke and driver Tim Tetrick — and Oaks runner-up Hypnotic AM — starting from post 5 for trainer Marcus Melander and driver

Brian Sears.

Alagna sends Captain Kirk in the opening Bluegrass Stakes division on the day, the first of three splits for the \$203,800 Captaintreacherous 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace—sponsored by the Captaintreacherous Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms. Sired by the star Alagna pupil and the stake's namesake, Captain Kirk enters off a third-place finish to Tall Dark Stranger in the \$250,000 Kentucky Sires Stakes Final. Joe Bongiorno drives the only horse to beat Tall Dark Stranger this year from post 4 against Little Brown Jug-heat winner Sandbetweenmytoes and Jug runner-up Cattlewash.

Capt Midnight later goes for Alagna in the second Captaintreacherous division. Another sired by Captaintreacherous, Capt Midnight nears \$500,000 in earnings after finishing third in the first heat of the Little Brown Jug, but then scratching from the final. Andrew McCarthy will drive from post 1 against world champion and Ohio Sires Stakes star Elver Hanover, Grand Circuit-upstart Warrawee Vital and Kentucky Sires Stakes runner-up Fortify.

Tall Dark Stranger leads the final division of the Captaintreacherous as the 3-2 morning line favorite. The millionaire son of Bettors Delight has only lost twice in 18 starts and accrued \$1.7 million in earnings from wins including in the Meadowlands Pace, Cane Pace and North America Cup. Yannick Gingras drives the colt from post 1 for trainer Takter as they face Captain Barbossa, starting from post 6 for trainer Alagna fresh off a win in the Little Brown Jug.

Per Engblom trainee Beads looks to continue his trail of improvement in the first of three divisions for the \$211,700 Greenshoe Bluegrass 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Trot, sponsored by the Greenshoe Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms. The Archangel colt was aimed earlier in the year for the Hambletonian but failed to make the final. Once adding Lasix on Hambletonian Day, the Archangel colt has yet to lose and will carry a five-race win streak into Sunday with Brian Sears at the helm from post 5.

Pennsylvania Sires Stakes champ Amigo Volo returns to the site of his coming-out in the second Greenshoe division. Last year, the Father Patrick gelding shipped to Lexington and won his division of Bluegrass by seven lengths and the next week, despite making a break in the race, won in a division of International Stallion Stakes. The Richard "Nifty" Norman trainee parlayed those performances into a win in the Breeders Crown and has since also finished fourth from post 10 in the Hambletonian and won the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes Championship. Dunn drives the near millionaire from post 7.



Reflect With Me, a daughter of Captaintreacherous, enters the 2-1 morning line favorite off a second-place finish in the \$250,000 Kentucky Sires Stakes Final to Baby Your The Best — who starts from post 1. Andrew McCarthy again drives the filly while her stablemate, New York Sires Stakes champ Hen Party, starts from post 3 with Tetrick in the sulky.


Sail By steps up into Grand Circuit company for trainer Alagna in the second American Ideal division off a 1:50.4 romp in the Kentucky Commonwealth Final. Andrew McCarthy will drive the Captaintreacherous filly from post 8 as she competes against the likely favorite in the race Party Girl Hill, who enters undefeated in 11 starts and off a victory in the Jugette. Dunn drives the 2-1 morning line choice for trainer Chris Ryder.

Runner-up to Party Girl Hill in the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes Championship, JK First Lady will start from post 2 in the final division of the American Ideal. The Takter trainee, out of former pupil JK Shesalady, enters off a 1:49.1 victory in an overnight race at the Meadowlands in the middle of September. Yannick Gingras drives the Western Ideal filly against a field including Alagna trainee Lady Lou from post 5, Jugette runner-up New Year from post 6 and Linda Toscano trainee Rocknificent from post 7.

The stakes-laden 15-race card gets underway with first-race post time slated for 1 p.m. (EDT).

A salute to the late Bill Galvin: one of the nicest men I – and many others – ever met


"Bill Galvin died."

That wasn't a message I was expecting to read when my phone buzzed last Saturday, and I saw that one of my colleagues in the harness writers fraternity contacting me. It froze me. It can't be, I thought. I just spoke to him at Grand River Raceway just a couple of weeks ago. That night, as always, Bill was cheerful and in good spirits and happy that his 3-year-old pacing filly Shes A Sassy Beach had finished a game third in an Ontario Sires Stakes Gold race.

It just can't be, I kept thinking. Bill was healthy. But it was true, and it didn't take long for social media to start buzzing with tributes to a Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Famer whose energy and passion for promoting harness racing belied his 89 years. Melissa Keith, the colleague that informed me of Bill's passing, worked closely with him on several projects and remembered his tireless efforts to promote the sport he loved.

Anything that helped advance the sport and animals he loved was fair game for Bill, who said in an e-mail a couple of weeks back how happy he was to see Nathan Bain and Nick Barnsdale competing in a public handicapping contest at Leamington Raceway. He also praised the #MiamiMadness promotion that saw Manitoba fair track announcer Trey Colbeck and friends get pari-mutuel support rolling for a record-breaking closing day 2020 handle. Bill was proud of his filly, Shes a Sassy Beach, but he found winners everywhere. And why not? He set the bar high, for the rest of us.

Galvin was very close to Woodbine Mohawk Park



Announcer Ken Middleton, who bred and co-owned Shes A Sassy Beach with him. Middleton posted this tribute to his friend on Facebook:

I lost one of my best friends today. Thanks to everyone for the calls, the texts, the emails and the messages. They are greatly appreciated. It's been a tough day, especially since I just saw him a few days ago and spoke on the phone with him yesterday. Anyone that had the pleasure of meeting Bill Galvin during their travels generally had the same thing to say about him. He was funny, charming, polite, hard-working, sincere, respectful, dedicated, intelligent, generous and he had an incredible passion for harness racing. Bill was one of my dad's best friends, and over the course of the last decade or so Bill and I forged an incredible friendship, as well. I'll be forever grateful for all of the great advice he shared with me, and I'm just as grateful for all the ways he never hesitated to help me. One sage piece of advice he offered me — and I'll share it with you in case you want to take it to heart - was to never keep score when it comes to what you do for your friends. Help them whenever you can and be happy to do it. Enjoy the great satisfaction that is the by-product of helping someone in need. Bill made it his duty to help whoever he could whenever he could. I lost a great friend and racing has lost a great friend in Bill Galvin, too. Until we meet again my friend. RIP, Bill.

The Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame also posted a lengthy tribute to the native of Arnprior, ON on their Facebook page. There were several replies of condolences including this one from JoAnn Kennedy:

Bill will be missed at the Chaplaincy BBQ'S held at the patio behind the kitchen on the Woodbine backstretch. Bill was always in attendance. He had such a strong love of horses and racing as well as for the well-being of the grooms and hot walkers. He was a staunch supporter of the Racetrack Chaplaincy for both thoroughbred and standardbred.

Jean Posthuma had similar sentiments to express:

I had the pleasure of working side by side with Bill Gavin as he helped and worked endless hours to raise funding with The Mohawk Racetrack Chaplaincy. Bill Gavin was a great supporter and helped Grooms in any way he could.

Galvin was known as a big promoter of youth in the

industry and one of his ideas, the Youth Literary Derby, was a huge hit getting young people involved in the sport through prose. Tennille Hobbins, mother of one of the winners of the writing contest, paid tribute to Galvin's continuous involvement with youth:

We are very sad to hear this news. Bill came into our lives a few years ago. Our daughter Avery was one of the winners from the Youth Literary Derby in 2018. Bill's writing contest opened many doors to some really amazing experiences and connections in the horse world. We loved visiting various tracks and seeing a different side of the horse industry, than the jumping/dressage world we are used to. Thanks to Bill, Avery also was featured in TROT magazine.

Bill was very fond and proud of Avery and would check in every few months to see how she was doing (especially her riding, competitions and her writing). He left a giant mark on the horse industry and will be sadly missed by all who knew him.

Galvin, who, until his passing was an active member of the Canadian Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association had this excellent piece written on his life in advance of his induction into the Canadian Hall of Fame in 2014 (full story here).

For me, the one shining memory that I will always have about Bill is that he is the nicest person I have ever met in the industry and perhaps in my entire life, period. Anyone who knows me well understands that hyperbole isn't my thing. There is no exaggeration here. Bill was always smiling, always cheerful and always wanted to know how you were doing. The last time I spoke with him at Grand River the first words out of his mouth were praise for my son Nicholas' media work. "He's a real go-getter," Galvin beamed. "A sure thing!" After I left the track it wasn't long before I got a message from Bill. "Is your next piece going to be titled: "From the Tarmac"? he asked, not expecting a response. That was Bill; always encouraging, always promoting and always positive. I and many others will miss him greatly but hold onto the fond memories of the nicest man anyone would ever meet.

But the big trophy was caught in Finland in the \$288,000 Kriterium for 3-year-olds in Tampere, where Sahara Jaeburn (Ready Cash) made a stunning first over performance that resulted in a new stakes record.

Jorma Kontio sat behind Nurmos' trotter and placed Sahara Jaeburn outside of leader Magical Princess shortly after start. Positioned first over when the distance is 1.6 miles is a tough assignment for a pretty inexperienced 3-year-old horse, but Nurmos is well known for putting great strength in his trotters and Sahara Jaeburn showed morale and will over the home stretch.

The mile rate of 1:58.3 is a new stakes record and the duo Kontio/Nurmos collected their third win together in the race. Ann-Dorra finished second ahead of leader Magical Princess.



September 30 marked the 25th anniversary of Jennas Beach Boy's 1:48.4 world record for sophomores at the Red Mile — this after missing the entire summer due to a P1 Break. It lowered Nihilator's mark set 10 years and one month earlier at the Meadowlands (1:49.3).

Joe Holloway trained Jennas Beach Boy for Linda and Lee DeVisser and William Fahy drove the son of first crop sire Beach Towel. The very next year he would lower the all age mark to 1:47.3. His sophomore mark lasted exactly five years before P B Bullville won in 1:48 on Sept. 30, 2000.

All Hanover M. Pace?

In hindsight, we may need to refer to the 2020 Meadowlands Pace as the Hanover Meadowlands Pace. Winner Tall Dark Stranger will stand at the famed Pennsylvania farm, as will runner-up Papi Rob Hanover. Who was third? Allywag Hanover.

Father-son Jug dominance

Somebeachsomewhere and his son, Captaintreacherous, together sired 17 of the 25 entered in this year's Jug/Jugette, won both finals and went 1-2 in the Jug finale. SBSW had nine and Captain eight.

Déjà vu between the 2014 and 2020 Jug

Six years ago, the Jug winner was Limelight Beach who won twice on the same day after being winless on the year (0-12). This year, Captain Barbossa (12 0-5-1) was the only winless sophomore in the field this year going into the final.

Million dollar freshmen

Andrew McCarthy teamed with Julie Miller to win the first ever Mohawk Million with Venerate, a 2-year-old trotting colt by Love You. Care to guess when the last freshman trotting colt won a million-dollar race? McCarthy was not yet born. It came in 1985 when Express Ride and George Sholty won the Peter Haughton final, which went for seven figures in both 1984 and 1985 with Another Miracle winning the first one with Mickey McNichol.

Alagna double

Tony Alagna is now only the second trainer to ever win his first Jug and Hambletonian in the very same year. In 1950, Del Miller did it first with Dudley Hanover and Lusty Song, respectively. Coincidentally, Miller also did so with a filly in the Hambletonian and a colt in the Jug.

Steve Stewart's huge night

Steve Stewart is the breeder or co-breeder of both feature winners last Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park — Venerate and Exploit in the Mohawk Million and the Metro, respectively.

Andrew-John-Tim

Andrew McCarthy joins Tim Tetrick (2012) and John Campbell (1995) as the only three drivers to sweep all the million-dollar races on the sports menu for an calendar year. In 1995, Campbell won with Tagliabue in the Hambletonian and Davids Pass in both the NA Cup and the Meadowlands Pace.

In 2012, Tetrick won with Captaintreacherous in the \$1,010,000 Metro, then Market Share in the \$1,500,000 Hambletonian and \$1,030,000 Canadian Trotting Classic.

This year, McCarthy won with Ramona Hill in the \$1,000,000 Hambletonian and Venerate in the \$1,000,000 Mohawk Million.

French connection

Three of the six horses on the board in this year's million-dollar races were sired by French sires Ready Cash and Love You — Ready For Moni and Back Of The Neck second and third, respectively in the Hambletonian and Venerate the winner of the Mohawk Million.













Trainer Jo Ann Looney King

The first thing that comes to my mind when I think about this issue's featured Superstar is the idiom, "The apple doesn't fall far from the tree."

I'm talking about Jo Ann Looney King — one of harness racing's top female trainers. Like her daughter, Heather Vitale, Jo Ann's smiling face is often featured in harness racing news.

The bubbly blond beauties are both renowned in our sport; Jo Ann for her many accomplishments in training superstar equines and daughter, Heather, a "firework" correspondent and television journalist for standardbred horse racing.

Jo Ann has another daughter, Susan Looney, who is also instrumental in the sport for in 1983, when she was 16 years old, Susan was the youngest driver to win at the Meadowlands with One For All.

It is a family affair and has been since World War II ended. That is when Jo Ann's father returned to the U.S. and met and wed his future wife (Jo Ann's mother).

Living a humble life, the family set up house in a modest trailer in Wilmington, DE.

"In the mid 50's, when I was around 10 years old, my parents went to the bank to withdraw their life savings," Jo Ann said. "Their life savings came to \$350, which was not much money even for that time. After withdrawing the money they went to the Harrisburg sale to hopefully purchase a racehorse. Being an only child I went with my parents everywhere, so I accompanied them to my very first horse sale — the first of many.

"I sat there and watched one beautiful horse after another walk onto the stand, and of course I wanted each and every one. Unfortunately, the horses went for much more money than my parents had to spend. I was discouraged we would go home empty handed when towards the end of the sale a horse named Reggy Scott appeared and the last bid was \$350 — made by my father.

"Whether it was 'beginner's luck' or fate, Reggy Scott went

on to be an open pacer and his portrait still hangs in our barn today.

"That was the beginning for me, my family and the start of our family business. I couldn't wait to go to the barn after school and on weekends.

"Delaware gets downright frigid in the winter so mom would get the wool horse blankets and wrap me in them to keep me warm as I jogged the horses on the track."

Jo Ann was one of the lucky ones who married not only her best friend, but partner. If you're involved in harness racing it's difficult if one person is in the business and the other isn't, for you're pretty much married to it having to spend most of your waking hours at the barn and racetrack.

"My husband, Jim, (King) and I have been together for almost 40 years. From day one, my parents and my two daughters accepted him as their son and father.

"We have worked together almost every day and somehow it works for us. Although I'm at the barn every day, Jim does the physical training, but of course I put my two cents in on how the horse can be helped.

"I'm not easy and often complain to my drivers when my horses don't race well. Even when I'm at home watching on television, I'll call Jimmy and tell him if I think the horse's head is too low or high and if I think the hobbles don't look

right.

"We keep between 50 to 55 horses in our stable. Some we own ourselves, and others we train for owners. As for the ones we own, I enjoy buying horses.

"Luckily for me, if I see a horse I like and want to buy him I don't have to ask my husbands permission — I just go and buy it — that is, as long as the money is there.

"Jim always says the same thing, 'You buy them and I'll train them,' which leads me to Shartin N.

"Rich Pollucci sent me a picture of this mare that was very plain: black legs and white hind foot. So what was so special? She was built like a tank — had a massive rear end and I had to have a piece of her.

"Jimmy wasn't so sure because it was a lot of money. He asked if I had seen her racing videos and I said 'no' but I just had a good feeling about her. I insisted and refused to take no for an answer.

"So here we are after watching our parents put a lifetime in the business as we did.... and here comes Shartin N out of the blue. Like it was just supposed to be all along.

"Thank you, God, for I could never describe what she has meant to me and what she has given us. Every time Shartin races I wear my mom's heart necklace and my dad's ring for luck. I know they are along with us on this journey — and that makes it even better."

The Kings have another partner on several horses they own — including Shartin N — top driver Tim Tetrick.

"We met Tim when he came to Delaware from Illinois to race, before his exit to the Meadowlands. I'm a person who watches people — especially drivers — and I can tell you who gives you the best bang for your buck on the track and Tim fills that bill, for he's always thinking.

"We've owned horses together since 2011 and it's been a good thing for us. I honestly don't know anyone who can do on the track what Tim does and we feel blessed that he drives for us."

Jo Ann said she doesn't have any specific ideas about how the sport can evolve.

"There are a lot of people out there with good ideas, so, as Oprah would say, 'Here's what I know for sure...' For the most part horsepeople are good. I try to be happy for other people's success and I'm grateful when people are happy for mine.

"I believe in karma and I believe in God. If you cheat and lie, it comes back to you.

"I've been on top and I've been on the bottom. Top is more fun, but bottom makes you appreciate it more.

"I've lived the greatest life and have the greatest family. I have a wonderful husband and children, great horses, mind-blowing memories, good friends and this wonderful horse business to thank for most of it. And if I had to do it over again — I wouldn't change a thing."

John Fielding: "I think the future is going to be very bright for horse racing in Ontario"

Although John Fielding remains modest in speaking of his time on the board at Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG), the contributions he made are quite the opposite.

One of horse racing's most passionate supporters, Fielding, who owned his first standardbred at the age of 16, recently announced he was stepping down from the board he served on for 16 years.

"I think any good board needs fresh ideas, fresh faces and younger ideas," said Fielding, who retired as director and chair of the Standardbred Racing Committee. "I thought it was a good time to give someone else a kick at the can."

Throughout his time on the WEG board, Fielding, one of the highest profile and successful names in harness racing, a two-time owner of the year, whose star standardbred pupils include Father Patrick and 2018 Hambletonian Oaks winner, \$2.2 million earner, Manchego, worked in concert with other board members to navigate the industry through difficult periods.

Most notable of all, Fielding recalled the 2012 cancellation

of the Slots At Racetrack Program (SARP), that plunged horse racing in Ontario into peril.

While plenty of questions surrounded the future of the sport, Fielding felt confident the sport wouldn't simply survive, but would one day thrive.

Coming up with the right answers was hardly an easy task, but the board, Fielding included, worked diligently to find them.

"After the SARP cancellation, making our way through that was a real challenge," said Fielding. "It was a challenging time for the horsepeople and everyone connected to the industry because we were all caught so off-guard. The rebuilding to healthiness I think has been a great feat for everyone on the board and for Woodbine, and its management team as a whole. It's been a long road, but I think we're really on the right path now. I thought we'd get to where we are today. There was enough clout in the industry and I thought the industry was strong enough to come together and do the right thing to get to the place where we're at now."

Jim Lawson, CEO of WEG, (who shared a story about how his family and the Fieldings share a connection dating back to WWI, see below) has high praise for Fielding's many contributions on the WEG board, and to racing itself.

"From my perspective, at the end of the day, what Woodbine is all about is horse racing," said Lawson, chair of the Thoroughbred Racing Committee on the WEG Board, and a member of the Standardbred Racing Committee. "When you have strong, passionate horsepeople on the board, it really helps with the mandate because it brings back into focus that horse racing is what we are. That can manifest itself in a couple of ways. All of the opportunities and different things we look at – we have to be mindful that it's horse racing owners, breeders, and wagering customers that we need to serve. We have this wonderful set of real estate assets and other things we can be pursuing, but at the end of the day, when you have a strong horseperson on your board – as a CEO, I certainly didn't need the reminder – it sure helps when you have people like John who are focused on racing."

Lawson also noted Fielding's ability to approach issues in racing with a fair and open mind, someone capable of seeing varying perspectives through a unique lens.

"John wore both hats, being a standardbred owner and being on the board," said Lawson. "He could be objective about things. He could give an objective answer wearing both hats. I truly appreciate that. I've come out of a thoroughbred background - everyone knows that - and I always remind myself to wear both hats. John naturally wears both hats, which is a great foundation for me looking at things. One critical move was moving the standardbreds out to Mohawk permanently. Everyone looked at me a little cross-eyed when I first mentioned it. Immediately the question came up, 'So, Jim, you're doing all of this real estate development at Woodbine and you're ultimately going to generate proceeds. Hopefully, as CEO, you're not going to produce all these proceeds for thoroughbreds, are you?'I don't think that way. Anything we make on real estate is to the benefit of our business, which means both breeds. Having John there as a person who could easily and naturally wear two hats was important for me, someone that I could consult with. Occasionally, as you might expect, conflicts come up between different races, different nights, events, expenditures... it was good to have John as a sounding board. He was kind of my go-to guy when I needed consultation. He knew horse racing. He wore those two hats well. That was important."

For Fielding, it was important to play his part in seeing horse racing thrive in Ontario.

It was a hallmark of his time on the board, and it remains one to this day.

His personal horse racing road to success was forged well before his time on the WEG board.

Growing up in Toronto, he rode the streetcar with his brother to Greenwood Raceway where their passion for the sport first began. Introduced to harness racing by his father, Fielding rose up the ranks to become one of its most celebrated owners. He has over 20 Breeders Crown titles to his name, and has also enjoyed success with thoroughbreds. In the late '90s, Fielding met standardbred and thoroughbred breeder Fred Hertrich III at a standardbred sale at Woodbine. They recorded their first win as breeders in the 2017 Thoroughbred World Championships when 'TDN Rising Star' Rushing Fall won the Grade 1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

Just the type of person – and horseperson – tailor-made to sit on the WEG board.

"John led the Standardbred Committee for years and he did that in a very balanced way," said Lawson. "Even as chair of the committee, he knew he had a larger fiduciary duty. I think that stands out for me, the manner in which he led that Standardbred Committee. He never forgot that he had a larger responsibility to the corporation, and I admired him for that.

"Secondly, much like [accomplished Thoroughbred trainer] Mark Casse – I'll throw that out there – they're great ambassadors for the Woodbine brand, internationally, and in particular, North America. John is very much in the mix, given the level of his investment in both breeds. Thirdly, I'm reminded of the recent Mohawk Million. He stepped up and bought a slot himself, but he was, in no small way, in that ambassador role, letting people know about the race. He encouraged people to buy slots. We need to thank him for his involvement in the Mohawk Million, too."

Fielding, founder of Array Marketing, a leading global provider of retail merchandising solutions, is thankful himself, appreciative of his time on the board and for the friendships he made because of that role.

"I've met some wonderful, wonderful people and made some fantastic friendships that will last the rest of my life. I'm proud of what we've accomplished thus far. I'm proud to have been associated with it, and I'm proud of both breeds. We still have a ways to go, but we're on real level footing



now. It's been a pleasure working with the different chairs I have, including Jim Lawson, and the different management teams. I think the management team we have now is the strongest I've ever seen it. It's a great team and I think we're in good hands."

While he'll be dedicating more time to his business interests and family, one thing that won't change is Fielding's enduring bond with horse racing.

"I'm so busy with my business interests that you have to try juggle your life around this business. I'm involved in horse racing quite extensively, in both breeds, but that, in addition to all of the other business interests I have, you kind of run short of time when you want family time, and other things. You have to simplify things the older you get.

"But this sport, it gets into your blood and it got into my blood at a very young age. I always dreamt of being involved in the industry, both thoroughbreds and standardbreds. I was a huge fan of E.P. Taylor, and I think the board and everyone involved in horse racing could always look at him as the key figure, the one who bought all the land where we are at Woodbine today. He had the vision. The job of the board is to be the custodian of that property and those wishes. And I think we've done a very good of that. Horse racing is alive and well."

Another big reason why Fielding believes the board, and industry, is in good hands.

"As we move into the next phase of trying to make horse racing fully self-sustainable, I think we're doing all the right moves. I think the future is going to be very bright for horse racing in Ontario."

Thanks, in no small part, to the efforts of John Fielding. From Jim Lawson:

"My great uncle, who my dad [Mel] was named after, went to war in World War I, and died on the battlefield right near the end of the war. Ultimately, what was recovered was his diary, and then after that, some letters, when my dad did some family tree searching. It turned out that my great uncle had been corresponding and had intended to marry a woman named Grace Fielding. That wasn't her maiden name, but that was John's grandmother. When my dad found out that his great uncle who he was named after – my dad and I visited his gravesite in France and followed his battle route form his diary – he tracked down Grace Fielding who was in a nursing home in Hagersville [ON]. Starting around 1985, my dad started visiting Grace and talking with her. She had saved those letters from my great uncle from Word War I in the battlefields.

"Early on, the Fielding family became aware of this man – who was in the horse racing business – that was visiting their mother and grandmother. Around that time, John was becoming a big investor in horse racing. When my dad had some good horses like Eternal Search and Let's Go Blue, John's grandmother was cutting out clippings from the newspaper and sending them to John. We have this family connection going back to then.

"Going back 35-40 years, I found out that John was a huge fan of racing through this unusual connection between the Lawsons and the Fieldings, a story that dates back to World War I. I knew about John and John knew my dad. He approached my dad back in the 1980s.

I was asked to join the board of Woodbine and John was already on the board. I had heard about him, and when I walked into the first board meeting, he gave me a hug. He said, 'I know you! We should have been relatives.' Then we both recounted the stories of my great uncle and his grandmother.



He was inducted into the Ohio State Fair Hall of Fame in 1993 for his many years of photography work for the fair.

Mr. Conrad is survived by his wife of 34 years, Carmen; children, Bradley (Colleen), Jeffrey (Mindy), Cathy (David) Ferguson, and Andi Engle (Mike Colon); grandchildren, Kelsey, Karissa, Tess, Henry, Joey, Emily (Sam), Sara (Daniel), and Hannah; great-grandchildren, Piper, Hollis, and Willow; sister, Robin (Jim) Zahumensky; and many cousins, nieces and nephews. As the yearling auction sales season gets underway in Lexington next week, the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund, which sponsors the New York Sire Stakes program, assures breeders and buyers that we are fully preparing for a solid stakes season in 2021.

"The purse account that has been accumulating since July is now growing more quickly as the casinos at the seven racetracks in the state have resumed operations. While the COVID-19 shutdown impacted purses in 2020, the New York Sire Stakes still distributed more than \$10.2 million. We plan to use the 2020 program as a starting point for the program in 2021, and we will make adjustments as needed depending on the money that is available. We are optimistic that purses will be near 2020 levels, barring another unforeseen circumstance.

Sophomores wage fierce battles in Grassroots Semi-Finals

Seventy-eight of Ontario's top 3-year-old trotters and pacers converged on Woodbine Mohawk Park on Friday (Oct. 2) for eight \$20,000 Grassroots Semi-Finals and the battles for a berth in next weekend's Championship saw five of the eight contests decided by one-half length or less.

Three-year-old pacing filly Semi-Finals

The sophomore pacing fillies opened and closed the program in Races 1 and 11, and both Semi-Finals were a fight from start to finish.

The first split saw the field turn for home separated by just three lengths and it was **Lyons Tilt Hanover** who kicked home hardest to claim a one and one-half length win in 1:52.2. Need Ur Opinion and Bettorthanbobbi also closed hard to be second and third, leaving fan favorite Mia Culpa to settle for fourth. Kat rounded out the qualifiers for the Oct. 10 Grassroots Championship.

Anthony Beaton of Waterdown trains Lyons Tilt Hanover for Threelyonsracing of Brantford, ON and said the stalking style has been working for the Bettors Delight daughter and driver J Harris since the filly arrived in his barn in early August.

"When I first got her it looked like she kind of closed good and that first overnight race we raced (Aug. 18) I just told J, I

said, 'Listen I'm not sure what we've got here and she's been off for about 40 days, let's just take this like a qualifier and let her pace home and see what she's got," said Beaton. "She almost got up to win that night and raced super and that's kind of the way we've been using her, stalking the horses and letting her pace home, and it seems to working for her."

Lightly-rated **Smiling Dialing** swept from last to first in the second pacing filly showdown, sneaking up the inside to get a short nose in front of division point leader Mach My Kiss at the 1:52.3 finish. Free Flyin Ticket and Odds On Vero Beach were less than one length back in third and fourth, while fan favorite Mary Kat was two lengths back in fifth.

"The trip worked out pretty good," said trainer Rod Boyd, who handed the lines over to Jonathan Drury for the first time on Friday. "I think if JD had drove her before he probably would have put her on the outside. She definitely can fly home, so next week I think he'll put her on the outside, give her some clear sailing, let her rock home. She's definitely got potential. She's so small, but she's got a big heart and big kick to her."

Cambridge resident Boyd trains Smiling Dialing, a Thinking Out Loud half-sister to last year's three-year-old pacing filly Grassroots champion So Much More, for 1187422 Ontario Inc. of Ottawa, ON.

Three-year-old trotting filly Semi-Finals

In the first trotting filly Semi-Final, **Moana** and driver James MacDonald snuck up the inside to get a head in front of fan favorite Sonadora Deo at the 1:56.3 finish. Yen was third, No Angel Here fourth and Noblesse Duharas fifth.

"She's got such quick speed, she doesn't need a whole lot of room to pop through there and as soon as it opened up she just took right off," said Guelph, ON resident MacDonald, who fired the filly out of Post 8. "She can get herself spotted with her gate speed, and then if you don't abuse her too bad she'll give you another little kick. She's just a nice little horse."

Shawn Steacy of Brantford trains Muscle Mass daughter Moana for Landmark 12 Racing Stable of Lansdowne, 1187422 Ontario Inc. of Ottawa, ON and Hudson Standardbred Stable Inc. of Hudson, QC.

Division point leader **Profound Paragon** rebounded from her miscue in the Sept. 21 Grassroots leg with a personal best 1:55.2 in the second trotting filly split. Fifth through the first half of the mile, driver Jean Bernard "Bert" Renaud sent Profound Paragon after the lead at the halfway marker and the pair was matching strides with pacesetter Highland Foxytrotr by the three-quarters. Fan favorite Th Present tried to reel in Profound Paragon in the stretch, but could not get past the leader's saddle pad. HP Starlette finished third, Chelseas Magic was fourth and She Must Be Magic fifth.

"I thought she was beat with a very nice horse on her back,

but she fought to the wire. Now we'll hope for a little better draw next week," said trainer Julie Walker, who sent profound Paragon out from Post 8 and stablemate Yen from Post 9.

Carlisle, ON resident Walker shares ownership of Profound Paragon with breeder Steven Titus of Manalapan, NJ. Friday's win was the Muscle Mass daughter's eleventh in 15 sophomore starts.

Three-year-old trotting colt Semi-Finals

Ripped And Ready got to control the tempo in the first trotting colt Semi-Final and the Muscle Mass son romped home to a four and one-half length victory in a personal best 1:55.1. Fan favorite and division point leader Mikey Mass closed hard for second, pocket-sitter Blue Cupertino was third, Kenogami Coco was fourth and Fit Bitt rounded out the top five.

"He's a really nice colt who hasn't had the racing luck he's needed, but still won plenty of races," said driver Jody Jamieson. "He was on cruise tonight and hopefully will be as good next Saturday."

Moffat resident Jamieson engineered the colt's fifth sophomore win for trainer Thierry Vandenplas of Brinston and owner/breeder Dr. Ruth Irving of Russell, ON. In 10 starts this season Ripped And Ready has only missed the top three on one occasion.

Reigning Grassroots champion **Lovedbythemasses** romped to a seven-length victory in the second trotting colt Semi-Final. After getting away mid-pack, driver Mike Saftic sent the fan favorite to the front at the halfway marker and Lovedbythemasses powered away to a 1:54.1 win. Ongoing Royalty, Lexus Markus, Charmbo Prince and Awesomedabra also qualified for the Grassroots Championship.

"I was a little worried going into it, I didn't know what kind of traffic was going to be in that race with some leavers on the outside, but the way it turned out it was absolutely perfect. He landed good and one of the favorites (Life Is A Feast) unfortunately run in front of me, but when I set sail up the backside it was clear sailing. Once he got to the front he just swelled up," said Saftic. "He's not the best leaver, so sometimes you get a little more traffic than you'd like in front of him, but today it worked out. Hopefully it works out next week, and that will be a good year for him."

Campbellville resident Saftic drives Lovedbythemasses for trainer Edward Peconi of Peterborough and his co-owners Nicholas Peconi of Lakefield, ON and Wade Peconi of Stanchel, PEI.

Three-year-old pacing colt Semi-Finals

When Mayhem Hanover's mind wandered briefly on the way to the wire in the first pacing colt Semi-Final, **Bettorbuckleup** pounced on the chance to reel in the fan favorite in the final strides, scoring a nose victory in 1:50.4.

Two-year-old Grassroots champion Mayhem Hanover settled for second, Sports Obsession was third, Captivate Hanover closed hard for fourth and YS Mathis was fifth.

"They don't make them like him very often. He's just a tiny little guy, but he's got tons of class," said driver James MacDonald. "He was all out and then the other one (Mayhem Hanover) come back to him just a hair, and as soon as he saw him coming back he just took right off again. He's just a little horse, huge heart and huge desire to win. He's fun to drive, that's for sure.

MacDonald steers Bettorbuckleup for trainer Nick Gallucci and owner Millar Farms of Stouffville, ON. The Bettors Delight colt has not finished worse than third since July 11.

National Sport won the charge to the wire in the second pacing colt Semi-Final, getting a neck in front of Sundown Kid and pacesetter Poseidon Seelster at the 1:51.2 finish. Fan favorite and division point leader The Wild Card was fourth and Twin B Frenchtoast was fifth.

"I knew him from last year, I always liked him, but he had sickness issues last year," said driver Louis-Philippe Roy, who returned to the gelding's race bike for the first time this season on Friday. "He raced good tonight, he never gave up. There were some nice colts in the other division, hopefully he can do as good against them in the final."

Guelph resident Roy engineered National Sport's second win of the season for trainer Jared Bako and owner 1362313 Ontario Ltd. of Windsor, ON.

"It's only I think the second time she's raced at Mohawk this year, it's been a lot of B tracks for them, so it's good to have some confidence on this turf and hopefully she carries it into next week."

Guelph resident MacDonald piloted Tipsy In Dixie to her third win for trainer Harry Poulton of Milton and fractional ownership group **TheStable.ca** Tipsy In Dixie of Guelph, ON.

HP Mama B took the second trotting filly Semi-Final with a strong move to the front at the halfway marker. Once she had command, the fan favorite cruised home to a one and one-quarter length victory in 1:57.3. Mag N Lady finished second, Doing It All was third, division point leader Top Of The Bar was fourth and A Blue Blood earned the final spot in the Oct. 10 Grassroots Championship.

Milton resident Sylvain Filion piloted HP Mama B to her second straight victory for trainer/breeder Ben Baillargeon of Guelph and owners Guylaine Picard of Guelph, ON and Celine Paquin of Ayers Cliff, QC.

Two-year-old Trotting Colt Semi-Finals

Division point leader and fan favorite **Four Wheelin** was a confident 1:58.2 winner in the first trotting colt showdown, stretching his win streak over the Woodbine Mohawk Park oval to three. Driver Louis-Philippe Roy piloted the Wheeling N Dealin son to the front-end victory, besting Lifelong Wish, Tymal Chrome, Kilauea and Rosies War Bonds.

"It's easy to win a Semi-Final when you have the best one in the race," said Guelph, ON resident Roy. "Winning the Final is different, that said I really like his chances going into the finals. He did it easy again tonight."

Marcel Barrieau of Cambridge, ON trains and co-owns Four Wheelin with Gestion Mastel Inc. of Longueil, OC.

Fan favorite **Highland Mowgli** cruised along on the front to a 1:57.2 personal best in the second trotting colt Semi-Final, two and one-half lengths ahead of Warrawee Windsor. Arch Hall was third, Insanity fourth and Greg fifth.

"That's my first time driving him, so obviously the first impression is good," said Rockwood, ON resident Bob McClure. "And I've got to say, what a nice little horse. He's kind of fine gaited, not an athletic build to him, but just puts his head in front of him and wants to be a racehorse, and I love that in horses. They've done a really good job and he's had a great year. No doubt it's not going to change anything even if he doesn't win the final, but I'd say he'd be hard to beat next week."

Guelph resident Amanda Fine trains Highland Mowgli for her co-owner, and the Archangel colt's breeder, Highland Thoroughbred Farm of Inglewood, ON. Thursday's win was Highland Mowgli's second straight.

Two-year-old Pacing Filly Semi-Finals

Amini delivered the first upset of the night in the first pacing filly Semi-Final. The Sportswriter daughter and driver Sylvain Filion left smartly from Post 4 and reached the quarter in :28, then yielded to Shiatzu Seelster, who led the field to a :57.3 half and 1:27.2 three-quarters. Finding room late in the stretch, Amini kicked into high gear and paced under the wire a one-half length winner in a personal best 1:55.1. Fan favorite Chiefs Dream Girl was second, Cyclone Sister third, Come On Sun fourth and Shiatzu Seelster fifth.

Filion engineered the filly's third Grassroots win for trainer Richard Moreau of Puslinch and owners Tess Waxman of Ridgeville and David Morgan of Hamilton, ON.

Nightlife Seelste rcaptured the second pacing filly Semi-Final with a 1:54.1 effort that saw her leave well from Post 6 and reach the front soon after the :27 quarter put up by Sportsfire. Soon after the :56.1 half Nightlife Seelster was overtaken, first by Sweet Pink and then Celia Bayama, who led the field to a 1:24.3 three-quarters. In the stretch Nightlife Seelster was able to sneak up the inside and sprint home to a one and one-quarter length win over division point leader CL Sportsextreme, Ourlittlemiracle, Siri Blue Chip and favorite Celia Bayama.

"She's finally getting back to where she's supposed to be. I thought when I first won the Grassroots (Aug. 14) with her that she'd never see a Grassroots again. I thought she'd go to the Golds and carry on from there," said driver Bob McClure. "I tried to cover her up tonight, that didn't work, but when she got room late she did exactly what she was supposed to and went on through. She's definitely going the right direction at the right time."

Shawn Steacy of Brantford, ON trains the Sunshine Beach daughter for Hudson Standardbred Stable Inc. of Hudson, Conrad Leber of Montreal, QC and Bertrand Gilhespy Stable of Edmonton, AB.

Two-year-old Pacing Colt Semi-Finals:

Second Bruiser extended his win streak to three with a commanding five and one-quarter length score in the first

pacing colt battle. The fan favorite and driver James MacDonald stopped the teletimer at 1:51.4. Big Bang Bang finished second, Saratoga Blue Chip was third, Mustang Beach fourth and Adrenaline Rush was fifth.

"He's just a big powerhouse. He's just a big, brown, winning machine right now. Just try not to fall off; easier said than done for me," said MacDonald, who was nursing some stiffness after being ejected from the race bike during Tuesday's eighth race. "It makes my job pretty easy."

The Believeinbruiser son is trained by Vernon Cochrane of Fergus for his co-owner, and the gelding's breeder, Stefan Piekos of Palgrave, ON. Second Bruiser is a perfect three-for-three in Grassroots action, with all three miles clocked in 1:51.4.

Take Control won the sprint to the wire in the second pacing colt Semi-Final. After stalking division point leader Stonebridge Rex through fractions of :27.3, :56.2 and 1:24.1, driver Louis-Philippe Roy hit the accelerator in the stretch and Take Control powered home for a one-half length victory in a personal best 1:51.4. Stonebridge Rex finished second and favorite Proline was third. No Plan Intended and Cantstoplying completed the top five.

"He's a real nice 2-year-old," said Roy. "He had some bad luck during the summer with bad posts, but every time I asked him, he responded well."

The win was the second straight and the third of the season for Control The Moment son Take Control, who is owned by trainer Dan Lagace of Cambridge and Ben Mudry of Toronto, ON.

Wednesday's opener

The Raceway at Western Fair District gets set to kick off its exciting fall meet on Wednesday, Oct. 7 and will do so with a number of changes that include a new schedule, enhanced safety protocols and a change to the wagering menu.

The new Fall schedule will feature live racing taking each Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 6:15 p.m. through Dec. 31. The traditional Friday post time of 6:55 p.m. has also been changed to 6:15 p.m. to create more consistency across the schedule. The first card of the meet will feature 12 races with full fields.

Following consultation with the Public Health Unit, the decision was made to open the Top Of The Fair only to patrons during live racing. Dining will be available all three race days, featuring a Pub Style menu and will be limited to 150 patrons to ensure physical distancing is in place. All other areas of the grandstand will remain closed and The Raceway will remain closed for simulcasting.

Reservations for Top of the Fair will be required for each race night and face masks are mandatory. Customers will be pre-screened before entering the facility. Reservations will be granted on a first come first serve basis. To make a reservations please visit here. Reservations can be made only online at this time.

Wagering and restroom facilities will be made available.

The opening weekend of live racing will feature the glamour boys of the Ontario Sires Stakes on Friday, Oct. 9. Superstars Tattoo Artist and Beamond Hanover are expected to compete on the half mile oval. It will be their final stop of the season prior to the lucrative OSS Super Finals which take place on Oct. 17 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The caretakers — the people who look after the magnificent horses that race night in and night out — will also be recognized on Oc. 9 as part of the National Caretakers initiative that has been happening at racetracks across the country this season. The Raceway will offer a choice of swag for the groom of each winning horse and COSA is offering one \$100 HPI card per groom per race to be randomly drawn.

Lucien Bombardier Pace today at H3R.

This afternoon (Oct. 4) seven 2-year-old harness racing pacing fillies will battle it out at the Hippodrome 3R in the annual Lucien Bombardier Stakes, going for a purse of \$33,800.

One of the "pioneers" of horse racing in Canada, but especially Quebec, Lucien Bombardier devoted his entire life to the industry. Born and raised near Bedford, QC, Bombardier retired in 1992 after 16 years on the board of directors of the Canadian Standardbred Horse Society.

The following year, at age 86, Bombardier became the first honorary director of the CSHS. His appointment by the board of directors in January 1993 was in recognition of achievement and contribution to the Society and the Standardbred industry.

Bombardier was also honored in 1985 when he was recognized for his life-long devotion to the industry when he was the recipient of the Society's General Achievement Award for his excellence, leadership and contribution to the breeding industry and by his election into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame the following year.

Bombardier started training and driving harness horses at agricultural fair meetings in Quebec at an early age. In the early 1940s he left a business career to open a large racing stable at Richelieu Park in Montreal and in 1953 he accepted an executive position with Blue Bonnets which then became the Hippodrome de Montreal.

During 25 years in racetrack management he played a role in developing many changes and innovations that helped make harness racing a major sport industry and earned him an enviable reputation on both sides of the border. He also served as a director of Harness Tracks of America and the Canadian Trotting Association.

At age 68 Bombardier retired from Blue Bonnets and embarked upon a new career when he became an executive with Angus Farms in Bedford, QC, one of the province's most successful breeding establishments. Bombardier died in 1995 and was honored each year at Hippodrome de Montreal with the running of the Lucien Bombardier Stakes for 2-year-old pacing fillies.

With sponsorship from Standardbred Canada and the Quebec Jockey Club, the Hippodrome 3R revived the stakes race in 2011.

The seventh race Sunday is the Lucien Bombardier Pace and the morning line favorite is the Shadow Play filly, Game Of Shadows, who starts from post four for driver Louis-Philippe Roy. Roy is also a co-owner of the filly with 1876472 Ontario, Inc.

Chantal Mitchell trains Game Of Shadows, who earlier this season took her lifetime mark of 1:53.2 at Mohawk Park. This will be her first start ever at H3R. Roy will be driving in most of the races at H3R Sunday.

Second choice in the race is the Control The Moment daughter, Platine Alpha, who starts from the rail for driver Pascal Berube. She was third last week in the \$55,000 Future Stars Series Final, timed in 1:56.2. Platine Alpha is trained by Sylvain Tremblay and is owned and bred by Tremblay's Alpha Stable of Metabechouan.

Other contenders in the Lucien Bombardier Stakes include Ibiza Panic (post 6), return winner Shanghaibluebeach (post 5) and SOS Northernbeauty (post 2).

Faraldo takes exception to The Guru

I have been a fan of The Trotting Guru ever since I first knew him at Monticello during his pre Guru years. I have a lot of respect for him but with this statement, from his Thursday column (full story here) I take exception:

Now as I write this, the SOA of New York has joined the march against the bill. Their objections are ridiculous. We won't have to pay \$50 a start, we will have to sit down and make different ground rules for our sport, but everyone is taking the situation at face value instead of discussing compromise.

I do not know who "the everyone is" that is wrongly taking the situation at face value. It is there in black and white in the proposed legislation and there is meaning to the words.

On the factual side, the USTA has logged over three years of meetings and "sit downs" lobbying for the "ground rules" that suit our sport. In addition, 100 hours have been put in "discussing compromise" and the calculation of the initial "nearly \$50 per start," added to the \$19.90 currently in place in NYS, which is based upon a study done by the USTA on the per start default assessment in the Act.

I have heard much criticism of the USTA's work but not one concrete suggestion about what should be in the bill from anyone. The USTA on the other hand has advocated for the different treatment for our breed, medication rules that suit the ethical treatment of our horses by honest and competent harness veterinarians, self-funding by our industry for spending and much more needed policing within our industry, and for the continuation of the use of the therapeutic medication Lasix as an aid to combating EIPH.

Uniform rules that apply to our performance model, are achievable, and we continue to advocate for that for our sport. A need which is significantly different from the thoroughbred elite who sculpted this bill and have refused any compromise not suiting their agenda.
