

# Reading the economic and industry tea leaves heading into the Lexington sale

Industry experts opine about global financial conditions and the state of the horse business as the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale is set to begin on Tuesday night.

Despite the world still being in the grips of the COVID-19 pandemic, industry insiders that are experts in finance believe conditions are ripe for another strong edition of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

"I think financially, believe it or not, everything is on an unbelievably good keel," Blue Chip Farms owner Tom Grossman said of the financial markets. "I think the market has already accepted that there's going to be some inflation, which is good in a way... not necessarily good for the breeding business, but I think the market has digested a lot of the potential normalization or 'bad news' on the margin. The truth is, the ugly truth and the long-term problem, is that those with disposable income have never been wealthier.

"Now, that's going to lead to social problems for our children... (but) there's no doubt that people with disposable income

going into this have never been better off. Interest rates are still extremely low.

"I'm constantly shocked about how little people talk about the tax advantages of buying horses. I saw something on Facebook the other day where they said, 'Oh, in the '80s when there were great tax breaks for horses...' The tax advantages for buying and racing horses right now are tremendous with the depreciation laws the way they are. That makes it a very skewed risk-reward return for someone with disposable income to buy horses. I've had several people that are not dedicated horsepeople, you know, more on the tax angle than anything else, say 'Yeah, that's a good risk-reward bet."

Winbak Farms owner Joe Thomson is the founder and president of Pacer Financial. He said not only are interest rates low and "money is cheap" he believes there's pent up demand to spend

disposable income on luxury goods such as horses.

"I think you'll see a lot of buying and selling. It seems like people have been caged up a bit with this whole COVID thing and they just want to have more positive vibes and take advantage of it... There's a lot of people that want to buy cars and I think the same thing is going to apply to the horse business," Thomson said.

"I don't see bad things in the horse business and I think this is going to be a good sale."

Thomson said he monitors the stock market daily and said it has seen exponential growth in a short period of time, despite the pandemic.

"If you go back to four or five years ago, the market was 18.5 and now it's up to 34. So, as long as you had a boat to float, you were in pretty good shape," Thomson said. "It continues to do well, but there's so many things going on and so much uncertainty that there's a bit of a lack of confidence. There's still a tonne of cash sitting on the sideline. We've had our best year we've ever had (at Pacer Financial)... and we've really just been in our own ETFs (Exchange Traded Funds) since 2015 or so. This is our best year ever.

"We have been confident enough that our company has gone from hardly any employees to we're up to about 115 people here and we've got people all over the country. We've got 40-some ETFs that we market and it just seems like if you're targeted with the right strategy in particular markets, or for particular people, everybody seems to be going in a little bit different directions, you can do very well.

"I think the horse business is sort of like that. There's a lot of money out there and provided that you've got the things that they think they can do well with, then you'll do okay."

Brittany Farms' Art Zubrod said a stronger Canadian dollar also bodes well for this year's sale.

"The Canadian dollar is up so much that I think we're going to get somewhat of a boost out of that," Zubrod said. "I think it's going to be a good sale. I don't know about the European mix, I get conflicting reports saying so-and-so isn't coming and 'if he's not coming, he's not buying' and stuff like that. We just have to wait and see.

"Overall, I see people pretty enthused up there about the business still. You don't see many people crying about it."

The old adage that great yearling prospects will always sell well seemed to bear out for the 2020 Lexington sale, which was staged during the height of the pandemic before vaccines were available and great uncertainty reigned. Just a year after selling two million-dollar yearlings in 2019 — a high the 2020 sale was unlikely to top even if there had not been a pandemic — last year's auction still recorded the second-highest gross (\$41,552,000) in sale history and its fourth best average (\$50,922).

'I'm optimistic," Michelle Crawford said of this year's sale. "I think even though it's going to be a challenge for some people to get here from abroad, I think people are making their way here. I think people are ready to buy horses. I think they are excited. There's always that trepidation with COVID out there still, but I also think that the industry is strong right now, the racing programs are strong and people are going to want to buy. I think there's a good ROI (Return On Investment) on purchasing yearlings and being able to race them for decent purses. I know we are working on the New York program hard. I know that Jeff Gural is going to raise purses in New Jersey.

'I really think, at the end of the day, we're going to have a strong sale."

Thomson has long pointed out that there is more purse money available than ever and that pot appears to be still growing in most jurisdictions.

"Ohio is doing well. Kentucky added a \$11 million (for 2022)," Thomson said. "Think about all those Sires Stakes programs, what people racing for in Canada. New York has got a lot of money as



well and people are complaining that they cut down on some of the different races, but they are still racing for a ton of money."

David Reid, co-manager of the Lexington sale, said there's been positive announcements in many jurisdictions and programs such as those in Pennsylvania and New York will have 2021 purses closer to 2019 pre-pandemic numbers than those available in 2020 when casino closures led to decreases in purses in some regions.

"They just made a significant announcement here in Lexington last week, which was well-publicized that the (Kentucky) Sires Stakes and the level below it was going to get a healthy increase. I know that the Jersey Sires Stakes have already announced an increase in their finals and they are working on other enhancements to the New Jersey program and I believe there will be some announcements coming out here shortly. Obviously, Ohio is clipping along in good order. I think your jurisdictions are pretty healthy overall and returning back to a semi-normal racing schedule. The overall purses paid out in 2021 are greater than 2020 and I think it all has a cumulative effect, in one way or another," Reid said. "I don't want to leave out Massachusetts, because they've had an increase in their Sires Stakes and they

are strong up there."

Another bellwether for Lexington is the strength of the thoroughbred sales.


"I just finished Keeneland in September and they sold 4,000 horses and it was as strong at the end as it was at the beginning," said All American's Rob Tribbett. "That's because it's a great time to race standardbreds or thoroughbreds with the purse structures that we have in many jurisdictions. We're not relying on one place, so it's really a great time to race horses.

"Obviously, there's a different buying group of people. This is for some people, obviously, a luxury item, so that corresponds... I think there's an enthusiasm for racing everywhere and that leans to point that the sale should be exciting."

Reid said he follows the thoroughbred market closely, "and they returned to mostly normal and I would expect that we are going to return to mostly normal as well.

"The vibe out of the Saratoga sale in August and the vibe out of the sale here that just concluded was very good. It seemed like there was good depth of the market and good interest at all levels. Translating that into our sale, I see our depth being very, very strong. I don't know what the top end is going to be, but I know we have a lot of offerings for a lot of places, a lot of jurisdictions, that it's going to be exciting for a lot of people."

Grossman said the biggest challenge is the lack of new owners in the business and the lack of competing interests bidding against each other.

"I think it was old man Simpson that said, 'You don't need buyers, you need bidders," Grossman said.

Still, Kentuckiana's Bob Brady said the signs he's seeing also point to the Lexington sale being strong.

"I think the market indicators are looking that way and all the buyers that I've been showing yearlings to are very optimistic about it. I think it's going to be a very strong market," Brady said.

Spring Haven's Senena Esty said she's an eternal optimist but she feels, "better this year about going into the sale than I did last year. I think last year was such uncharted territory with the pandemic. There was just so much fear. Now, with people's understanding and the vaccinations and things of that nature... I feel optimistic about the sale."

Reid said he, "made a comment last year that things were changing on a daily basis and a weekly basis versus a monthly basis. I think we're in fairly good shape as far as the world peace at the present time. The stock market seems to be relatively stable, so I don't think we have to worry about anything this week that we see on the horizon."





# Reid, Manges hoping people will return to Lexington sale after COVID-19 restrictions kept many away in 2020

Despite being staged during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, before vaccines were available, last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale posted its second-highest gross (\$41,552,000) in history and its fourth best average (\$50,922). Still, co-manager David Reid said he is hoping the 2021 auction — which kicks off Tuesday (Oct. 5) and runs through Saturday (Oct. 9) — sees a return to pre-2020 days when more people bid in person again at the Fasig-Tipton Sale Pavilion.

"I'm looking forward to a good week of sales and a good week of racing," Reid said. "I'm looking forward to seeing people in person again."

As a thanks to its customers, this year, for the first time in recent memory, Tuesday's opening session will kick off with a cocktail session from 5-7 p.m.

"It's a sign of appreciation," Reid said. "Enjoy the happy times when we have them and just try to set the night in a good tone and show appreciation for all our customers who are really important to our sale.

"Then, on Wednesday, we're going to start off the afternoon session with the cocktail reception and stallion auction in support of the Breeders Crown Charity Challenge featuring a cocktail hour from 2-3 on that day. So, we've added the opening night cocktail hour and we'll keep the traditional one for the charity auction."

Sale organizers are hoping for the return of the days when Fasig-Tipton was packed during the sale.

As for industry bellwethers heading into the sale, the signs appear positive for a strong auction.


"I follow the thoroughbred market quite closely and they returned to mostly normal and I would expect that we are going to return to mostly normal as well," Reid said. His fellow sale manager, Randy Manges, agreed that strong sales this year, so far, are also a positive barometer for the Lexington sale.

"I'm just excited that all the sales that have taken place so far have been up or good sales, so that's always good going into ours, whether it's thoroughbred or standardbred," Manges said.

For those that can't attend, Reid said the sale will be the same as last year, with procedures in place for online bidding through Proxibid.

"We still have the procedures that we put in last year for people who are unable to attend due to travel and/or health restrictions. We're going to have online bidding available, but we're really looking forward to people coming to the sale live and being in person," Reid said, adding anyone wishing to bid online is strongly encouraged to register (http://www.lexingtonselected.com/year-sale-proxibid.html) before the opening session starts Tuesday at 7 p.m.

Due to some travel restrictions, it's unclear how many Canadians or Europeans will be able to attend the sale. Reid said the online bidding process is effective for anyone that can't come to Fasig-Tipton.



"I think it's helpful for anybody that cannot attend," he said. "I think it's also helpful for people that may attend at the beginning of the week and then they may have to go back to race horses or they have to travel or return to their businesses or whatever. It's going to be available every night, so it's just another tool that's going to be handy for everyone."

Last year, bids made through Proxibid accounted for \$2.5 million in sales for 79 sold, or more than 5 per cent of the total gross.

#### AFTERNOON SALE SESSIONS

New this year will be two afternoon sale sessions. In the past, the sale has been held almost exclusively at night. Tuesday's opening night session will be followed by sessions that start at 3 p.m. on both Wednesday (Oct. 6) and Thursday (Oct. 7). The sale returns to 7 p.m. sessions for both Friday (Oct. 8) and Saturday (Oct. 9) so people can attend the races at Red Mile during the afternoon.

"Even though tradition has it that there be night-time sales, with people wanting to come down for the Lexington experience, on a couple of those nights it did get a little late and just we got some feedback from some buyers and sellers. Randy and myself finally said, 'Let's try it' and go to twilight sessions on a non-racing day... We hope to be done by 8 o'clock or 8:30 and people can go out and have dinner, relax or plan for the next day. They can go out and have more of the Lexington experience."

Manges said one of last year's sessions ran until nearly midnight.

"People have to be back to work at 5 a.m., so it makes for a short night. I think this will help in that area," Manges said. "Also, the buyers like it. People come here and it's an event. When the sale is over they want to go have a couple cocktails and get their feet up and just relax a little bit. They get to do that if they can get out of here before 9 o'clock."

Reid said the sales company was not tempted to change the opening session to an afternoon start time because starting at night gives people all day Monday and Tuesday to inspect horses before the sale starts.

"Plus, there's only 116 selling the first night," Reid said. "So, people coming into town for racing on Saturday and Sunday, they can come out Monday and Tuesday and be prepared before the Tuesday session starts. Then, we roll right into Wednesday and Thursday.

Reid said the afternoon start times does not mean the sales company plans to have horses in the ring longer on those days to drag it out.

"What we did was catalogue 10 or 15 more horses in those sessions, but the pace of the sale is going to remain the same. We don't want to drag it out. The purpose was to end on a good

time and that's going to be our goal," he said.

Last year, 816 yearlings were sold. The median was \$32,000 and 107 yearlings sold for \$100,000 or more.

This year, 852 yearlings are catalogued — 36 more than a year ago — 489 trotters (55 per cent) and 395 pacers.


"We have a really strong catalogue," Manges said.

"The consignor base is the same, except we're welcoming Hanover Shoe Farms back with a consignment this year," Reid said. "I think the sire roster is very strong again, across the board... There's something from a lot of jurisdictions. Most importantly, a lot of the yearlings are dual eligible. In some cases, even triple eligible, meaning New Jersey, Kentucky and Massachusetts, which, like Kentucky, has had an increase to its Sires Stakes program."

Manges said, like Reid, he's looking forward to having more people at the sale this year, even though he doesn't know how much of a bearing it has on the results.

"We had such a great sale last year," Manges said. "As excited as I am about this sale, who knows if you're going to be up or not?"

# Kentucky breeders bullish on announcement of \$11 million of additional money for the KYSS

Last week's announcement that the Kentucky Sires Stakes (KYSS) program will grow by some \$11 million in 2022 to a total pot of about \$17 million was welcome news for Kentucky Harness Association president Bob Brady, the co-owner of Kentuckiana Farms.

"Everybody is excited about the Kentucky program. It was a hell of an announcement. There's just such great things coming for Kentucky. We couldn't be happier about that and it's already elevating us from other programs because, if you look around now, they've just come out with the Jersey Classic, so I think it's just a boost industry-wide. In particular, Kentucky has really made strides the last several years and we're ecstatic with the program moving in the right direction forward," Brady said.

"When you think back for 10 years when we survived only having a couple million in the Sires Stakes, now we're looking at a \$17 million pot and it's just huge.

"It is a fun problem to have of how to write enough races to spend the money."

All that said, Kentucky is now simply catching up to many other jurisdictions that have long had programs featuring as much purse money, or more. Most standardbred jurisdictions now have attractive programs.

Still, for those in Kentucky that have tried to survive on limited funds ever since the standardbred stallion industry collapsed in the state, the news was incredibly welcome.

Diamond Creek vice-president Shaun Laungani said the announcement has "really juiced everybody up" at their Georgetown, KY farm.

"People have come to the farm earlier than ever before. We've probably already done 20 trainer shows at the farm and we're still a week away... It's active and it's all positive," Laungani said.

"It's incredible and I think it might only be the beginning because we've still got the third casino in Corbin that hasn't really kicked in... You could foresee in two years more big increases announced, so like I've been telling everyone, 'Kentucky is where you want to be.'

"We just need to get the Breeders Crown and that would make it complete... and year-round training."

Brady said the hope is also to encourage some stallions to move

back to Kentucky.

"That would be the icing on the cake. We'd really like some stallions to come back, so that's what we are hoping happens out of this. We hope to get our breeding industry back to where it used to be, having the racing circuit back to where it used to be and, you know, making the Midwest kind of a destination point," Brady said.

Brittany Farms' Art Zubrod, a Kentucky native, said he's thrilled to see the revival of the standardbred industry in his home state.

"I'm born and bred here so I'm pretty partial to this state as a place to race horses. In the late '90s, we had basically run out of money for the Sires Stakes. We had no income. We went to our fair program and asked if we could borrow \$300,000 from them," Zubrod said. "In those days, they were supplied by the state and the Department of Agriculture kept them afloat. They turned us down and slowly, but surely we started building things up."

How did the incredible jump in funds happen so quickly? Steve Stewart of Hunterton Farms explains.

"We have all these new racetracks. We've got the new racetrack in Oak Grove that's generating all this money from the slot machines or instant racing," Stewart said. "The Red Mile has them. All the racetracks in Kentucky do. Churchill Downs built a harness track in Oak Grove, which is in western Kentucky. It opened last October and when it opened we didn't know how

much it was going to generate. Ken Jackson said, 'Let's say they bring in a million dollars.' Well, they brought in \$6 million dollars and they are generating \$500,000 a month, just for our program.

"The Red Mile is generating between \$3.5 and \$4 million. We get money from the thoroughbred breeders in Kentucky... you pay a sales tax of six per cent on the stud fees of thoroughbreds and we get 13 per cent of that, which generates another \$2 million.

"So, this money in the pile is getting bigger and bigger, dramatically bigger, in a very short period of time. Not only did the new track open last October, but next June they predict there's another track being built in southern Kentucky that Keenland, the thoroughbred track, is building. They don't know how much it's going to generate and we didn't even put their money into the account for next year."

Last year, Crawford Farms has added a Kentucky farm to its operation. Michelle Crawford said she simply loved the announcement of additional purses for 2021.

"I can't be more excited. I know that farms like Hunterton and Kentuckiana were way out in front of it being in Kentucky, but buying that farm for us last year... we have five Kentucky-eligible this year... but next year – in the belly right now we have 100 in-foal mares that are all Kentucky-eligible. Thirty of those are New York-Kentucky dual eligible.

"I think the premium alone on having something that is dually eligible is going to pay for the farm at some point."

Taking a total industry view, Blue Chip Farm owner Tom Grossman said the Kentucky news is, "certainly a double-edged sword for a lot of people. Net, for the industry, it should be only positive. It swings the competitive balance for stallions and mares, but it layers a lot of new money on top of what everyone else has so, overall for the business, it's going to be great.

"But, putting my sales cap on, people always look at the top number of how much more there is to race for, but they forget how many more Kentucky-breds there are going to be. It's the same thing we've said in New York. The top line money doesn't look glowing like Pennsylvania or Kentucky, but there's so few New York-breds to race against that I think it's a better



risk-return and it's going to become even more so because for sure there's going to be a lot more Kentucky-breds in the future."

As for Grossman's fellow New Yorker, Michelle Crawford, she has fallen more deeply in love with Kentucky.

"The grass is always green. They have amazing grass in Kentucky and then they get to race at The Red Mile. I don't think there's a better recipe. I really don't," she said.

# Should Downbytheseaside still be a fifth-session stallion?

The pros and cons of progeny of the red hot Ohio stallion being included in the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale's regional session.

Lexington Selected Yearling Sale co-manager Randy Manges said there's several good reasons offspring of red-hot Ohio sire Downbytheseaside are all selling in the sale's fifth and final session on Saturday (Oct. 9) rather than the better bred ones appearing earlier in the sale.

Manges said reserving the final session mostly for Midwest horses has proven to be a financial winner for the sale and its consignors and it helps Midwestern horsepeople by confining the region's horses to a single session.

"To me, it helps the sale as well as it helps those people that have bred those horses. I think it's a better deal for them," Manges said. "A lot of the trainers that are in the regional programs... they run a 10 or 15-horse stable. They don't have second trainers and it's hard for them to be gone four or five days. If they know that all of the horses they are interested in are selling on Saturday, then they come in Friday afternoon to look at yearlings and they are on their way Saturday night."

The final night of the 2020 Lexington auction was the most successful final session in the sale's history based on every category. The session, which was made up of mostly Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky-breds, saw 168 yearlings sell for a total gross of \$4,943,000 for an average of \$29,423 and a median of \$20,000. Six yearlings reached \$100,000 or more.

"I think it's worked so well that I don't know why you wouldn't want to be on that day," Manges said. "We have done so well with that regional session at the end of the sale."

Though, the sale does make rare exceptions to sell top Midwestern horses earlier. This year, Hanna Too Hanover, the Indiana-sired full-sister to 2017 Horse of the Year Hannelore Hanover is selling in the first session as **hip 73**. Also, a Creatine full-brother to Jujubee is selling in the third session as **hip 479** (Canterasprings).

"We sold a Manofmanymissions, three or four years ago, out of the dam of Pinkman. Steve Jones sold a sister to Chapter Seven a year or two ago. We make excuses, but usually not on the side of the sire but on the side of the dam," Manges said.

But Northwood Bloodstock's Bob Boni questioned whether Downbytheseaside had not done enough already from his first crop to warrant inclusion in earlier sessions.

"I know it's because Ohio is a regional program, but let me ask you a question, isn't New York a regional program?' Boni asked. "The success that this horse is having... he does not fit the profile of a regional sire. I understood when they were selling McArdles or Always A Virgins later... but what's the difference between New York and Ohio right now?"

Boni said he's selling a "beautiful" Downbytheseaside filly that is a half-sister to 2-year-old pacing colt of the year Boston Red Rocks.

"She's the first Downbytheseaside from the mare and she's a sister to a Breeders Crown winner. That's pretty good. Let's put it this way, if she was an American Ideal, she's a day two or day three, at worst," he said. "(Downbytheseaside) has an undefeated colt and an undefeated filly. I was surprised this year that they didn't handle the Downbytheseasides a little differently."

Boni said, to be fair, while Downbytheseaside has dominated in Ohio, he has yet to produce a Grand Circuit champion, "but there's no reason to believe that he won't."

Blue Chip Farm's Tom Grossman said he heard some Ohio horsepeople took Downbytheseaside being in the last session, "as an affront early on, but then they sold so well that they sort of forgot about their complaints.

"I like it this way. I think a lot of the Midwest, Ohio crowd comes out later in the sale and maybe isn't there for the first day or two and having them all lumped together there, I don't think is a negative at all," Grossman said. "I think the idea is to keep all of the Ohio-breds where people don't have to be there six days to bid on all the Ohio-breds, if they are just looking for an Ohio-bred, which I think makes sense."

All American is selling seven yearlings the first two nights of the sale and then has to wait until the fifth session to sell its Ohiobreds, four of which are Downbytheseasides. Yet, All American's Rob Tribbett said that's still probably the best way to do it.

"I don't think (Downbytheseaside) has been relegated. I think that it does allow you to have all of them in one day," Tribbett said. "There's a reason why all the furniture stores are on one street. I think it allows buyers to go through the mix. There's going to be Seasides that sell for \$200,000 and some that sell for \$20,000. I like the idea of having them all together.

"I understand the argument that he could certainly sell on any day, but I don't think it's a bad idea, especially when we were making the decision (about sale order) and we didn't have all the data yet. I don't think it's a bad thing.

"The rising tide lifts all boats, too, so I think that will help the day as a whole."

# Hanover returns to Lexington for the first time since 2015

The sport's leading breeding farm is selling a select group of 20 yearlings in Lexington that Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky said is "a really a special group of horses."

It's been six years since Hanover Shoe Farms sold some of its yearlings at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. That's understandable since the famed Pennsylvania farm also operates the Standardbred Horse Sales Company that sells its yearlings Nov. 8-10 in Harrisburg, PA.

Hanover's executive vice president Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky said the timing was right for a return to the Lexington sale for the first time since 2015.

"I think for Hanover it's really best to put the product where it can be best received," Jablonsky said. "Yes, there is the very valid reason that Hanover and Standardbred Sales Company are very much intertwined, but you have to make the best business decision for each company separately, I think."

Hanover has brought a select group of 20 yearlings to Lexington.

"We handpicked these 20... it's really a special group of horses, in my opinion. They'd be 20 of the best yearlings that we brought to Harrisburg. That's not to say that we don't have plenty left for Harrisburg, but they are very good horses."

So much so that 15 of Hanover's yearlings are selling on the first night, with the remaining five selling on the second night.

"There's some really high-profile trotters among that group and it kind of makes sense to me to bring them to the people that are most likely to buy them," Jablonsky said. "That's not to say that people aren't going to buy them in Harrisburg, but... it's really no secret that these top-end trotters, these real high-end trotters, they tend to do a little better at Lexington and that's because the people buying them are at Lexington. There's no question that when the people that are spending the money are actually at the sale, they will bid more than if they are just being represented by somebody. They are often there because of the races... Harrisburg has lots of great qualities and lots of good points, but one thing they can never do is offer that whole racing experience. We know that."

The fact Hanover stands so many stallions and has so many mares means it often sells many horses from the same sire at Harrisburg.

"I feel like we compete against ourselves at Harrisburg a little bit," Jablonsky said. "We have so many yearlings and so many by the same sire... if people don't get the first great Captain colt that goes through the ring, it's okay because we'll have another one coming or another one.

"If you take a few out and put them in Lexington and not in



Harrisburg competing with those, it's just supply and demand and kind of evening that out a little bit, I think."

Jablonsky said it was also important to showcase a few of the yearlings it has from the first crops of Hanover stallions — this year led by Stay Hungry and International Moni.

"We have first-class sires and we want to be involved with selling them at the first major auction, so we're taking two beautiful Stay Hungrys, two beautiful International Monis," Jablonsky said. "We want to be involved with the first crop of our stallions selling, in the first sale.

"I think it's very important next year with the Greenshoes that we offer some of them at Lexington, that the first look people get, the first offerings, include the Hanover Greenshoes."

As for highlights from Hanover's Lexington consignment, Jablonsky said, "the star of the show — and it's a very good show, and he's not the star by much — is **hip 32** (**Cypress Hanover**), the full brother to When Dovescry. He's a really nice colt. He's a really nice colt, great conformation, great-looking horse. He's just a really special horse. He's very nice."

Jablonsky said she's also high on **hip 73 Hanna Too Hanover**, the full-sister to 2017 Horse of the Year Hannelore Hanover.

"She's a beautiful filly. She's got a great attitude. She's very reminiscent of Hannelore, maybe a little smaller than she was as a yearling, but she looks very similar to her," Jablonsky said.

"Trotting colts, we have a Walner half-brother to Perfect Spirit, who won the Hambletonian. He's hip 67 (Gates Hanover).

"Pacing filly-wise, we have **hip 24** (**Bellisima Hanover**), a Captain filly out of Bedroomconfessions, whose first foal Boudoir Hanover is doing quite well this year.

"Also, we have an Always B Miki half-sister to Fire Start Hanover (**hip 63 - Falana Hanover**), who is a big, strong filly just like Fire Start was.

"We have a Chapter Seven first foal from a sister to Atlanta (hip 56 - Cecil Hanover).

"Then, along those lines, we have **hip 34** (**Canterbury Hanover**), who is a Chapter Seven first foal from Charmed Life, who was a great race mare.

"Pacing colt-wise, we only have four, but they are all really nice. The Captain colts are very, very handsome. **Hip 40** (**Andy Mac Hanover**) is out of Ameraway and she's a sister to Western Fame. He's very handsome. **Hip 14** (**Cerulean Hanover**) is out of a sister to Artspeak, first foal."

#### **VALUE PICK**

With such a strong lineup, Jablonsky was reluctant to mention one as a value pick, but she said **Hip 199 – Declan Hanover** is an "International Moni first colt from the dam of Darlene (Hanover) and Delilah (Hanover) and he trots beautifully."

"Those two are big standouts, along with hip 61 (Larceny), who is second foal out of Someomensomewhere. It's a Miki colt that checks all the boxes and has an outstanding video. He should sell really well. You could say that hip 66 (Cultured) is very notable, just because it's out of the sister to Heart Of Mine and Acquavella has been a 100 per cent producer, so for a Captaintreacherous filly that's about as hot a pedigree as you can have."

Diamond Creek is selling 19 of its own yearlings and a further 29 an agent for other breeders.

"We've never sold this many horses and we've certainly never sold this may for other people. It's part of the business going forward – breed champions, race champions and also sell champions," Laungani said.

"Client-horse wise, we have two very big storyline horses in hip 116 (Woodside Gearshift), which is the full-brother to Woodside Charm. We are actually partners with Lester Beechy on this horse, which he bred and raised. We do own part of the horse. Pedigree says everything there. 

Thomson said that popular victory gave a boost to his entire operation, especially since Desperate Man was sired by Winbak stallion Shadow Play, the second leading sire in the OSS this year behind another outstanding Winbak horse: Bettors Delight. Winbak bred Bettors Delight and stands him in Ontario on behalf of Blue Chip Farms.

"The other night in the Sires Stakes, (Shadow Plays) were 1-2-3. I think everything in the final there was bred by one of our horses, except one. That was something. We've had a hell of a run in Canada, as far as being number one in the Sires Stakes department," Thomson said.

In terms of Winbak's Lexington consignment of 88 yearlings, Thomson said most are, "good-sized horses this year. There's not a lot of small ones. That includes the Bettors Delights. Usually... you sell a bunch of smaller or medium-sized horses, but these seem like good, rangy horses that should do very well.

"We've got four Chapter Sevens and I like every one of them. They, too, have the size to them. For us, I don't know if it goes for everybody else, but that's unusual."





### Breeder of the Year Brittany Farms more than ready to sell deepest group of yearlings in its history

Art Zubrod said the yearlings two-time reigning Breeder of the Year Brittany Farms is selling in Lexington are more than ready for the sale to begin — perhaps, too ready.

"It's the deepest sale we've had," said Brittany's veteran farm manager. "We've got 25 yearlings and there's not one of them that I wouldn't stand behind or recommend to somebody. Just a really, really good crop this year.

"I'm just wishing that they would've had the sale two weeks ago – they were so ready and now a couple of them are getting cranky on me poking at them and chasing them.

Zubrod then rattled off a number of yearlings he thinks will sell particularly well.

"Pacing colts, we've got a brother to Pebble Beach (hip 258, Cabot Beach). Studio Girl's yearling is hip 341 (Captain Van Gogh) and that's another Captain. Hip 20 (Seashell) is a sister to Blue Diamond Eyes. Hip 159 (Diamondsnpearls) is a real special filly. The Bettors Delight hip 260 (Star So Bright), I like a whole lot.

"On the trotting colts, **Hip 19 (Novel**) is a Father Patrick and he is as handy in the paddock as any horse I've ever raised. By handy, I don't mean he's the fastest I've ever had, but just hardly ever makes a break no matter how hard you chase him. He just goes around the turns and he's a horse that's still liking it. That's always been my test, when a horse has been shown out in the paddock 10, 12, 15 times and he likes it just as much the last time you showed him as the first time. Bettors Wish was like that and that's what make me fall in love with Bettors Wish. He loved going out and showing off for you.

"I have two pacing fillies, **Hip 444 (Freshen Up**) and **612 (Bettors Passion**), and oddly enough they are both Bettors Delights. They've matured extremely well. Number 612 would not have been a 612 if I knew what I know today. She was very immature and didn't seem to be interested in doing anything right, but she's got a great groom here at the farm and she loves going out in the field and showing off.

"Then, the other one, Freshen Up, is the same thing. She's matured so well. She's probably overall the best horse in the paddock. We talk about attitude, gait and speed, she's got all three of those."

#### **VALUE PICK**

As for a value pick, Zubrod said there is an interesting story about **hip 364 Morning Edition**.

"He's a Walner out of Morning Glow. He was destined, if you look at him, to be a \$400,000 yearling. He lost an eye shortly after he was born. He still looks the part. He trots the part in the paddock and most of the... he's getting a lot of x-rays, let's put it that way. That'll tell you how much interest there is in him.

"He's not going to sell for what he should've sold for, but I think he'll still have a nice sale. He could be anything, he's very sharp. I just showed him 10 minutes ago.

"He's a really nice horse. He wasn't spoiled, but he's very friendly, very willing. Whatever you want him to do, he's happy to do it. He doesn't know that he has one eye, because he basically... probably six weeks after he was born he lost it. He had an infection and we thought that we had it coming our way and we were treating him probably five or six times a day, all through the night and everything. Just one day, it basically exploded."

### Concord returns to Lexington on behalf of Stefan Balazsi

A year ago, Concord Stud made its debut at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale on behalf of famed Swedish breeder Stefan Balazsi and topped all consignors by average with \$124,357 per yearling for 14 sold.

This year, Concord is back with seven yearlings, six of which were bred by Balazsi, who has split his 2021 yearlings between Lexington and the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's auction in Harrisburg, PA.

'We definitely tried to split (up the yearlings)," said Concord's Julie Meirs. "It was a discussion. Ultimately, the final decision was (Balazsi's), but he and I spent many hours discussing it and trying to determine who would be best at each sale... We didn't put all of the top horses at one sale versus another."

Meirs said Concord's Lexington consignment is led by **hip 113 Mandrill**, a Chapter Seven filly out of Steamy Windows.

"She's a full sister to Gimpanzee and Iteration. We're very excited about her. She's a nice filly, really well put together. Great attitude on her, so she's something special," Meirs said.

"The next one would be **hip 60 (Remote Commander**), the Chapter Seven colt out of White Cheetah. He's a really nice colt. He's really coming into himself. He's very powerful and very commanding on the floor. We're really happy with how he's grown into himself.

Concord is selling three yearlings from the first crop of Tactical Landing and selected **hip 222 All Colored Cast** to mention. All Colored Cast is the first foal out of Flame Mearas S.

"She's a nice filly from the Lantern Kronos family. There's plenty

of potential there," Meirs said.

"We can't forget about the Captaintreacherous filly we have as well (**Hip 299, Treacherous Penny**). She's not from (Balazsi), but still a great filly. She's a big, powerful, first foal, so we're excited about that pacer."

Concord is set to sell its yearlings in the first two sessions — five on the first night. Compared to Harrisburg, where it will sell 60, Lexington seems like a breeze to Meirs.

"I wouldn't necessarily call it a vacation," Meirs said, laughing, "but it's definitely a different feel going with seven as opposed to 60. When you've got such a powerful group, it's still exciting and there's just as much going into it.

"But, it's true, we're only selling for two days so that definitely makes it easier. It's a splash and dash down in Lexington."

Bob Boni said his Northwood Bloodstock consignment of 34 yearlings for the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale has quality from night one right through the last yearling he is selling, hip 850 on the final night.

"I'm watching video of a beautiful Downbytheseaside filly that is selling number **850** (**Mcseaside**). She's a sister to a 2-year-old pacing colt of the year (Boston Red Rocks) and others. It's a good page and she's a nice, correct filly... She's a legit filly that can go anywhere and certainly has the ability," Boni said.

On opening night, Boni has something no other consignor can offer: A yearling sired by European champion Face Time Bourbon — hip 114 Emira Mil It raised by Cane Run Farm.

"I'm anxious to see her because she looks to be a lovely filly. That's what Elizabeth (Caldwell from Cane Run) has told me. She looks good on video. The video is not a real fast one, but she looks clean, moves nicely. On the floor, she looks nice. And when you have the only one by one sire, that's going to get some attention. I would think it would, as good as (Face Time Bourbon) has been."

Selling on Day 2, Northwood will send out **hip 291 Sweet Phenomena**, a Sweet Lou filly out of Omen Hanover.


"She is a quality filly and a sister to a Breeders Crown winning filly (Someomensomewhere). The dam won over \$1 million and is four for four (with her foals)," Boni said.

"The video of number **23 (Lous Guy**) looks like a very nice colt. Sweet Lou can have top horses and he's a brother to a horse (Always A Miki) that is a very, very good horse."

Finally, Boni highlighted a colt selling in the third session.

"I've got a number of Chapter Sevens that I'm very encouraged by that have pedigree," Boni said. "One of the more interesting ones is number **420** (**Pretty Dame Speedy**). It's the first foal of a Muscle Hill mare."

# Hunterton poised to have another big sale with eight Walners to sell

Steve Stewart of Hunterton Farm said the incredible year Walner is having with his first crop of racehorses should prove to be good karma for Hunterton's prospects at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

"We have eight Walners, so that will bode well no matter what," Stewart said. "The Walners stand out."

Hunterton sold the sale topper in 2020 when Kadena, the Walner filly out of Mission Brief, topped the sale at \$725,000. This year, Stewart said the Walner sister to Mission Brief, **hip 105 Cyberspace**, is one of his top picks from Hunterton's 98-yearling consignment.

Stewart said Cyberspace's dam, Southwind Serena, wouldn't cycle, meaning Cyberspace is a June 18 foal. Stewart points out Mohawk Million winner Venerable — the second straight Mohawk Million winner Hunterton has bred coming on the heels of Venerate in 2020 — is very close to being a June foal.

"All these people say, I wouldn't buy a June foal, well, (Venerable) is a day or two away from being a June foal, so it's remarkable that here she is undefeated and vying for Horse of the Year," Stewart said.

"Southwind Serena is so unique. We struggled and she hasn't had a foal in several years. Her last one was an embryo transfer, but then we've struggled to get a baby and then we get a really nice Walner... Some of it had to do with the fact that Walner is so fertile, so Southwind Serena we struggled to get her in foal the last few years and so Walner is very fertile, so we went to Walner."

Another Hunterton standout sired by Walner is **hip 52 (D'Apper**), the first foal out of Breeders Crown winner D'One.

As for non-Walners, Stewart said, "number **49 (Boudicca)** is an outstanding Father Patrick filly. The other outstanding one is

**Hunterton's Steve and Cindy Stewart.** 

Muscle Mass' brother, number **68 (Anointed**), Graceful Touch's colt. He's really special, too."

Anointed was sired by Tactical Landing, whose first crop of year-lings is selling this year.

"The Tactical Landings are special for us because we've come full circle. We bred him and foaled him and then kept a small piece of him. He sold for \$800,000... we've had some bad luck and we've lost a few Tactical Landings along the way in the first crop, but that happens."

As far as pacers, Stewart highlighted **hip 51 (Echolocation**), a Captaintreacherous filly and **hip 74 Captain Taylor**, a Captaintreacherous colt. Captain Taylor is named for Stewart's son, Taylor Stewart, a captain in the Air Force.

#### **VALUE PICKS**

As for "value" picks, Stewart selected three.

"525 (Cobble) is a really, really nice Cantab Hall filly. She took a very good video. Also, 380 (Velociraptor), another Father Patrick and probably the last one I would put down is 372 (Snowpiercer), the Muscle Mass out of Wheely Quick."





# Alabamajamma, the first colt out of Anndrovette, among Crawford Farms' top yearlings

At the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, Crawford Farms of Syracuse, NY sold the eventual Hambletonian-winning filly Ramona Hill for, what in hindsight appears to be a meagre \$70,000. Michelle Crawford said a full sister to Ramona Hill won't be a yearling until 2022, but she believes the 52 yearlings her farm is selling in Lexington this year are, "a solid group" from the largest consignment it has ever offered.

"I think it's going to be solid because the individuals are very, very nice individuals. It's exciting because you've got the first crop of Tactical Landing, Stay Hungry and, for us personally, Crazy Wow, and they are amazing looking animals... I think across the board our individuals will sell well."

Crawford Farms raced Crazy Wow and stands him at stud at its Kentucky farm.

As far as other yearlings Crawford is selling this year from first-crop sires, they have an impressive Stay Hungry filly selling early during the opening session.

"That individual, she's amazing looking. She's out of All About Kisses (hip 10, Hungry For Kisses). She is a big, strong filly," Crawford said. "Then, also on the first night, there's the first colt out of Anndrovette (hip 79 Alabamajamma). She's had two fillies, Nashville Elgenna was just fifth in the Jug. She's really shown up. The 2-year-old full sister (Hamptons Babe), she's a stakes winner in 1:53.4 over Saratoga... She's two-for-two right now."

Asked who gets the credit for naming Alabamajamma, Crawford laughed.

"That would be me," she said. "It's just the song (the University

of Alabama's Rammer Jammer cheer). Just love it. I have to be honest, I was a little exasperated with the naming game. I did a few right out of the gate and then (Crawford farm manager) Heather (Reese) said, 'I'll take it over' and then by the end of it she said, 'Don't ever ask me to do that again."

The other pacer Crawford said she loves is **hip 205 Captain Q**, a Captaintreacherous colt out of Agent Q.

"He's one that I've watched most, probably, along with Alabamajamma, but they are very different individuals. This guy, I'm not sure he looks like a typical Captain, but, wow, does he go. He's just really, really amazing."

As far as trotters, Crawford mentioned they are selling, "the last Muscle Hill that will be at public auction out of Spellbound Hanover (hip 189, Mystic Muscle), and he's stunning. He went down the chute and I absolutely loved his video. I loved him. He's probably one of the nicest individuals out of the mare and I think he's something special."

Mystic Muscle is a full-brother to 2016 Hambletonian winner Marion Marauder.

Sticking with Hambletonian connections, Crawford is also selling a filly out of Define Royalty, a sister to 2013 Hambletonian winner Royalty For Life, **hip 44 Royalty Tabs**.

"That one out of Define Royalty is drop dead," Crawford said. "You look at her and she's prototype. I mean, she's big, she's beautiful... She's a stunning individual. People that come to see her just stop dead in their tracks. She's actually got a Greenshoe, too, on the ground."

On the final night of the sale, Crawford is selling a What The Hill filly, **hip 762 Cinderellabutnot**, "that has a little attitude... and is one of most stunning, athletic What The Hills I've ever seen."

#### **VALUE PICKS**

As for value picks, Crawford selected a couple sired by Crazy Wow.

"I think our sleepers are out of Whimzical Britt (hip 593, Whimzical Wow) and Naughty Nana (hip 535, Naughty Wowser). I think they could be anything. That's just my personal opinion.

"With us, as far as us standing (Crazy Wow), we wanted to throw him some good mares to give him a shot first year, obviously, so we did give him some good mares. I will tell you, they all look different, but they are all stunning. Some of them are really huge and beautiful. They look just like him... I don't think there's going to be a huge price point on them, but I think people will be interested in them just based on how they look and how they are conformed because I have never seen a more perfect foal that they've thrown out of these mares. Every mare has thrown a really nice foal. Very correct."



# Propulsion's full-brother tops Cane Run's yearlings

Two years ago, Cane Run Farm was part of harness racing history when it sold one of the first two million-dollar yearlings ever at auction. Damien, a Muscle Hill colt out of Danae, sold for exactly \$1 million.

This year, Cane Run is selling Damien and Propulsion's full-brother, **Detroit City (hip 46).** 

"The Danae yearling is very nice (hip 46, Detroit City). He seems to be popular so far. Everything is good there, so we'll see what happens," said Cane Run's Elizabeth Caldwell.

"We have a nice group. They are all solid and it seems like we've had a lot of people out to see them this year. There's a Tactical Landing colt, another Muscle Hill that's nice. A full brother to On A Streak. A nice Always B Miki colt. A Huntsville... across the board, they are all nice individuals with good videos.

"We have a solid group, probably a little stronger pedigrees and individuals than last year."

Caldwell said there are promising signs that it will be another strong sale.



"The three trotting fillies that we are selling opening night, I can't imagine that they won't be well-received... They've all got pedigree and they've all got looks. Different people like different ones, so I can't tell which one is the best, but I think they'll all be well-liked by the buyers."

Cameo Hills is selling 29 yearlings in all. As for pacers, the farm is selling, "the first foal out of Come See The Show (hip 42, Stop The Show). That's a great filly family and it's a beautiful filly, first foal out of the dam and a Sweet Lou filly.

"I've got an American Ideal brother to Captaintreacherous, hip

**9 (Johnny Sack**). This spring I thought, 'Ah, he's okay. He's not great, he's okay' and he's one of those ones that between April and now, it's like 'Oh my God…' he's a beautiful colt.

"There's also a Stay Hungry colt out of Big Mcdeal (hip 27, Hungry Man) that's the same way. He's very correct and nice-looking.

Jones stands Huntsville at Cameo Hills in Montgomery, NY and has been very pleased with that stallion's first crop that are at the races now.

"I'm very happy with where he's at as a stallion. I've got one Huntsville colt that I really like, hip 228 (Karinchak) out of a mare that's the Galleria family. It's a nice page and a beautiful colt. I'm also selling a Huntsville filly opening night out of a daughter of Glowing Report, hip 1 (Wet Your Whistle) and she's as nice looking as any filly that I have in the sale."

#### **VALUE PICK**

As for a value pick, Jones likes one of his Huntsville fillies.

"Probably the filly that moves as well as any of them out in the field — and she's a nice individual, medium-sized — would be hip 311 (At The Hop), a Huntsville filly out of Robin J. That's the first foal of a nice family. I kind of like that filly. That would be the one if I'm looking for a diamond in the rough," Jones said.

"We've got a big update on the one colt, hip 90 (Captain Up). His full brother (Captainryanmichael) in the catalogue says, 'Now two and racing.' Now he's got a 1:51.3 mark... That's a huge update on him." Esty said.

The Captaintreacherous colts Spring Haven is selling for clients are hip 312 Stonebridge Captain and hip 323 Secret Captain.

As for trotters, Esty said she has a pair of really nice Chapter Seven colts.

"One is a black beauty, I mean, he's very fancy with quite a pedigree. This would be **hip 238 (Saint James's)**. Then, we've got one of mine and it's a first foal out of the mare and I'm super excited about him (**hip 470 Party At Seven**).

"We've got a couple of nice Muscle Hill colts, if someone is looking for a Muscle Hill. We've got hip 83 (Railroad Jack) and we raised him for Nick McClelland. That's the first foal out of that mare. The other one would be hip 370 (Muscleonamission). So those are two that we're really proud of."



# Vieux Carre Farms' Mark Egloff sporting an optimistic view

Mark Egloff of Vieux Carre Farms (Gettysburg, PA) is feeling optimistic heading into this year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. He has more than a few reasons to have that rosy outlook.

"We have a nice consignment, including a really nice group of Always B Mikis, Sweet Lous and a Captaintreacherous colt. We're very happy with the horses we have heading into this sale. I have two special ones that I'm very excited about."

Those "special ones" should garner some serious interest.

"Don't Fly Economy (hip 55), is an Always B Miki out of Economy Terror. He's a half-brother to One Eight Hundred, who we sold down here two years ago for a world-record price for a pacer (Hip 114, \$800,000). He's pretty special. He's a little bit rangier and a taller colt, more like the Mikis are, but he's outstanding. I expect him to be well received."

The bay, bred by Chuck Pompey, Howard Taylor and Edwin Gold, isn't the only one Egloff is bullish on.

"I have another who I think is extra-special as well. She's **hip 31, (Sweet Amira)** a Sweet Lou filly out of Bolt of Thunder. I just don't know how to fault her. She's about as nice a yearling that I can remember bringing to a sale. I've been doing it for 40 or 50 years, so she's pretty special."

Egloff has high hopes for the sale, one that he believes will offer a little bit of something for everyone.

"I am optimistic. All the other preliminary sales have seemed to be strong, and I think there is some pent-up demand – that people didn't get out and do as much as they normally do in the horse business last year because of the pandemic. I believe there is some pent-up demand and I hope I'm right. I guess we'll get our answer in a week."

#### **VALUE PICKS**

When it comes to tabbing a diamond-in-the-rough, fly-under-the-radar type, Egloff has a few that come to mind.

The first one, a pacer, is part of family tree that is enjoying some record success, courtesy of a veteran broodmare who has produced several standouts over the years, including 29-time winner Malicious, as well as Beach Body, Ms Malicious, Captain Malicious and Silk Purse.

"I've got a Captaintreacherous colt (hip 107, Gung Ho) out of Silky that I really like. He's a nice colt. That mare is getting older (18) now, but she's just been an amazing mare for us, and the family has heated up big-time here with Sea Silk (Downbytheseaside—Silk Purse) breaking the world record (1:51.2) for 2-year-old filly pacers at Scioto Downs on September 5. And she just ripped them up at The Red Mile recently (1:50.3, on October 1). She's a nice one.

"We also have two other ones to sell out of that family. We have a Sweet Lou colt (hip 178, Silk Road) and an Always B Miki filly (hip 346, Ambushed) out of the same Silky family. Those I expect to get some attention too because Sea Silk has really heated that pedigree up again. So, it was good timing."

Rob Tribbett said All American's Lexington consignment is all about quality over quantity.

"We really make a point for the horses that we bring to this sale to make sure that they have both the pedigree and the physical performance to stand up to the quality of the sale, because we try to sell our horses on the first two nights of the sale, outside of our Ohio horse," Tribbett said.

"We're very strategic about what we bring to the sale, so we're selling four Captaintreacherous over the first two nights and the others are all by other top-notch stallions. We have a Muscle Hill sister to JL Cruze (hip 100, Top Class), a Chapter Seven and a Father Patrick as well."

All American will sell seven of its 12 Lexington yearlings in the first two nights and the remaining five, which are all Ohio-breds, in the fifth session for horses bred in the Midwest.

"I think the Ohio day is a great idea. For us, we like having them all on one day. Obviously, Downbytheseaside specifically has been off to a great start," Tribbett said. "We're shareholders in Downbytheseaside and have been since the beginning. When we're shareholders in a stallion, then we support them throughout their breeding career, even before the horses race. I'm very happy with the group.

"We have one, number **808, Act Fast**. I don't know what everyone else has on that Saturday, but I would be very surprised if he's not one of the very top horses in that day of the sale. He's out of a great family. The third dam is Armbro Nashville, one of our foundation mares. So, that's his great-granddam now. Between the first two dams they've had 18 foals and 16 winners. It's just a great family and he's just a really, really good individual. Even before Seaside was doing what he's done as a stallion, I knew this was a really nice horse. He could easily be a day one horse at the sale. He's on day five just because we put all our Ohio-bred there."

#### **VALUE PICK**

"We have one colt that's **240, Captain Planet**," Tribbett said. "He is a Captain colt, but he's really pretty for a Captain. He's inbred a little bit to Artsplace from just a really great Brittany Farms family. He's one of my favorites. He's really fast and there's just so many good horse that come out of that pedigree. And he's Kentucky-eligible and this is the first year we've had Kentucky-eligibles, too."





# Kentuckiana's Brady predicts it will be a big year for Father Patricks

Kentuckiana Farms co-owner Bob Brady said he's excited to have 12 Walners to sell at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, but he believes offspring of Father Patrick are going to sell well, too.



He looks nothing like the one we sold last year and much more like the good ones in the family like Spider and Union Forces et cetera. He was really smart in the paddock. I'm very happy with that one and he looks like what we've been trying to create out of that mare. I think we finally have it."


#### **VALUE PICK**

Grossman said the last yearling Blue Chip is selling in Lexington — hip 869 Urania Blue Chip, a Downbytheseaside filly — could be a great value pick.

"She was a brilliantly fast, crazy mare... the first foal was a little bit like her, but this one seems to have a really good mind. The video looks good, but he's looked much better in the paddock a few times that I've had clients looking at him. Obviously, Downbytheseaside is hot. I think the video is great, but I know he's much better than that video shows and I know how fast the mare was. I think he's a real sleeper that could be a monster," Grossman said, adding another Blue Chip yearling selling in the fifth session could be special.

"The other one is obvious, it's a Fear The Dragon out of the family of Downbytheseaside that looks the part (hip 797, Umbrage Blue Chip). She's worth quite a bit of money just as a broodmare, but she really looks like a racehorse."

Greenfield is the syndicate manager for first crop sire Tactical Landing, represented by 69 yearlings selling this week. Hickory Lane will offer five from the highly anticipated sire, with a trio that are first foals and at the top of Greenfield's list as the best of the consignment.

"I think number **132** (**Strategic Landing**), the first foal out of Southwind Tesla is a nice, athletic colt that is still growing, but the most athletic. Then we have **number 173** (**Shesundertheradar**), a filly out of Barn Diva that's very fast and very correct. A very good filly; first foal," he said. "Number 304 (Tactical Decision) is a big, good-looking horse. He looks just like his daddy. Those three Tactical Landings are all first foals and all are a little different, but very, very nice, and we're real proud of them."

The syndicate manager is keeping an eye on other Tactical Landing yearlings that will sell this week, and he is excited by what he sees.

"The ones I've seen so far are really nice and their videos really stand out. Anybody who has watched their videos can't help but be impressed. The competition is Walner and Muscle Hill and we'll see if he's up to the challenge," Greenfield said. "I'm excited. He's an extremely fertile stallion for a trotter. He's got a lot of yearlings here, and he will for the next three years because he bred full books every year. He was a special horse and I think people know he's a special horse and I think there's a lot of excitement for him."

Also atop Greenfield's Hickory Lane consignment is a yearling from the second crop of phenomenal first-year sire Downbytheseaside, as well as an offering from Ohio-based sire What The Hill.

"Obviously, one of them in the last day (hip 841 Lioness By The Sea) is a sister to two major winners, Roaring To Go and Queen Of The Pride. In fact, that mare sold the top Downbytheseaside last year, her sister (Sea Lioness), for \$200,000," he said. "We also have a What The Hill filly out of Consolidator (Hip 803 Step N Past Ya). It's a first foal. This mare made over \$500,000, so she's a highlighter too."

A past president of the Ohio Harness Horseman's Association, Greenfield said that Hickory Lane traditionally raises mostly Ohio-bred horses, but with the improvement of the program, there are growing opportunities.

"As you can see the trajectory of the program is going up. With us being in close conjunction to Kentucky, we really have the best of both worlds. The Ohio people can also take their mares down to Kentucky if they want, too. It's not a very long drive for them," he said. "The fact is we've got better sires. We brought in Downbytheseaside, Fear The Dragon and What The Hill all in one year and those were the top 3-year-olds of the year. That was three years ago. It tells you the program is here, it has been established, it's going and it's viable. What I would like to point out is the partnership, working together between the Ohio State Racing Commission and the Ohio Harness Horseman's Association, they have built this program and allowed it to stay financially very solid. We have a very rich program in Ohio."

#### **VALUE PICK**

Greenfield pointed to another Tactical Landing colt as his value pick due to his placement in the sale.

"Probably number **503** (**Night Landing**), the first colt out of Margie. I can see him, being in the third day, that he might be one that would be good value for the money. The mare made \$270,000. She's only had fillies. Her 2-year-old was in the sire stake consolation at Hollywood Dayton (Marge At Large finished third Saturday night). Being the first colt, I think he's a bit of a sleeper."





# Midland Acres proud to support the Ohio program

Dr. John Mossbarger and his family have bred horses in the Buckeye State for half a century. This week, Midland Acres brings to Lexington a consignment of nine yearlings from several different sires. Based on the results of other sales, he anticipates a good showing this week, even if a larger catalog may impact the sale average.

"We're looking forward to this sale. I don't know how the average is going to be because they are selling close to 900 head, which is more than they usually do. Hopefully we aren't flooding the market," he said. "But the sales have been good this year. The Ohio sale was good, and I think this sale will be good."

Mossbarger noted two yearlings that stand out in the consignment, one of which is a sibling to a Hambletonian champion. The other is a Muscle Hill colt that is a brother to Duchess Dynamite, a Muscle Mass filly that sold last year at Lexington for \$30,000.

"The two would be the brother (hip 86 Landing Strip) to Pinkman that won the Hambletonian. He sells Tuesday night along with a Muscle Hill colt (hip 101 Sir Strong) out of a mare named Royal Intrigue. Those are our two highlights. The pedigree is probably the biggest thing and the first crop of Tactical Landing, and of course the premier sire Muscle Hill. It's a second foal out of the mare. Unfortunately the first foal never raced. We sold her down there last year. That will put a little dimple in him."

Midland Acres also will offer fillies by Southwind Frank, Always B Miki, International Moni, All Bets Off and Heston Blue Chip. The consignment includes a Rockin Image colt. The Bloomingburg, Ohio-based breeder's offering isn't stacked with yearlings sired by stallions from other states, and that is by design.

"Our bread and butter is in Ohio. We don't breed that much

outside. It's very difficult to have the broodmare band to compete with Diamond Creek and Brittany. It's tough to compete with them," Mossbarger said. "We're just a family farm and we've been at it 50 years, but we've always catered to Ohio. What we make on the farm is from the horses. We don't have any other revenue coming in to keep the farm going."

Mossbarger, like other consignors, will take note of activities on opening night and the tone it will set for the remainder of the week. But he also focuses on other indicators when determining the strength of the sale.

"Everybody talks about good numbers. That's usually in the eye of the beholder. Will it increase? The total dollars may increase, but the average may not increase because they are selling more horses," he said. "I think it is important to look at the median along with the average. I go more by the median than the average to see how strong the sale is."

#### **VALUE PICK**

"The value pick would be maybe the International Moni out of My Baby's Mama. It's the first crop of International Moni. Hip number **515** (Mommas A Diva). She's not real big, but the mare has done her job," Mossbarger said.







# Peninsula's Carter Duer taking measured approach to Lexington sale

Peninsula Farm's Carter Duer takes a measured approach to the week at Lexington. A veteran of the fall sale, he's seen it all. Offering a consignment of 52 yearlings, he knows he has some high-end prospects as well as horses that could be overlooked in a catalog bursting at the seams with over 900 yearlings. With the covid pandemic forcing some buyers to stay at home last year, Duer believes consignors could see more of the same this year due to travel difficulties.

"I'm not sure that it will be different, to tell you the truth. I'm not sure about the foreign market, how many of them will be here. It's going to be cut back," he said. "A lot of them have problems getting here, and I don't know about the Canadian part of it. I don't think there will be a lot of difference as far as the market over last year."

When evaluating his consignment, Duer selected a handful of yearlings that rise to the top.

"Probably **38** (Bella Ciao; Muscle Hill—Ciao Dolce filly) and **91** (Jazz In Jackson: Muscle Hill—Ms Nightlife colt), maybe **85** (Arrivo Presto; Muscle Hill—Magic Presto colt) and then I've got a full-brother (hip **479** Canterasprings) to Greg Wright's horse (Jujubee). He won the Pennsylvania final and then last week up at Hoosier. They are probably the top ones. Three of them are Muscle Hills. Maybe add number **17** (Save Your Tears). She's a Walner. They're probably the ones that will bring the most money. Whether they are the best ones, I have no idea. They will probably be on the upper end."

Duer believes that Kentucky's recent announcement regarding its lucrative 2022 program will raise the value of Kentucky-eligible horses selling this week. He has several in his consignment that stand to benefit. Some of his best horses, however, are not Kentucky eligible and may be impacted negatively.

"One thing that is different this year is that the Kentucky Sire Stakes program looks so much better, and they added money in the announcement last week," he said. "Anything Kentucky eligible I think will be helped, and anything that is not Kentucky eligible will definitely be hurt."

He also pointed to another announcement, this time from the Meadowlands and SBOANJ, regarding the creation of the "New Jersey Classics" for New Jersey-sired 2- and 3-year-olds, valued at more than \$2 million.

"It helps the New Jersey eligibles. The more money we can race for, the more interest from your owners," Duer said. "It's definitely a lot of money to race for if you've got the horse. But you have to have the horse."

Last year, Peninsula Farm sold 51 yearlings for a gross of \$2.13

million and an average of \$41,784. Duer believes that all indicators, including the success of yearling sales conducted by our Thoroughbred counterparts, point to a good sale.

"The other sales have been good and the thoroughbred sale was good. I don't see any reason why it wouldn't be good," he said.

#### **VALUE PICK**

Duer feels that there are multiple horses in the Peninsula Farm consignment that could fit the category, some based on the success of the sire's offspring this season, while others based on the numbers offered at Lexington.

"I think there are quite a few. I've got a lot of Father Patricks and he's had a bad year. We've got a really good group of Father Patricks. I would think they might be something where there may be a good buyer's market for them," he said. "And you've got the first crop of Tactical Landing. I've got quite a few of them and they are very nice horses. I don't have any bell ringers, but I've got some pretty nice ones."

Peninsula Farm is selling nine by Father Patrick and 10 from the first crop of Tactical Landing.
