Lexington sets session record with gross sales of almost \$6 million

Also, Preferred Equine set a new sale benchmark for consignor earnings with more than \$11.5 million in sales through the first four days.

On Thursday, Preferred Equine smashed the alltime record for gross sales by a consignor at the Lexington sale, topping \$11.5 million with one sale session left to go.

Through the first four sessions, the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale is in striking distance of setting a new record for average with one final session on tap tonight (Oct. 4) at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion.

Through four days, 771 yearlings have grossed \$61,041,000 to average \$79,171 per horse sold. The average is down 3.6 per cent from the record average through the first four sessions of \$80,795 set in 2022. This year's cumulative gross is also the second best total through the first four days, behind only the \$63,458,000 set at this point in 2023. It's important to note that 44 fewer horses have been sold this year by this point compared to the first four sessions in 2023.

However, Thursday's (Oct. 3) session alone was a record-breaker. The session saw 208 yearlings go through the sales ring to gross \$5,869,000 for an average of \$28,216 per horse. The median was \$22,000 and one horse sold for \$100,000 or more. The gross was an all-time record for a fourth session. The average was the second-best ever behind the \$30,159 reached in 2022.

"[Thursday] was exceptionally strong, in my opinion, especially year-over-year after last year," said sale co-manager David

Reid. "[Wednesday] was a little flat over last year, but maybe there's some reason that the horses flip-flopped last year to this year, but [Thursday] was very energetic.

"The auctioneers did a great job, there was a great pace in there today. We had several new faces around here today and you could see it on the sheets for the buyers. That's always refreshing. Rhythm is an important part of the auction and I thought the boys did a great job today and the bidders did a great job coming back. It was a great session today."

It was also a great session for Reid's Preferred Equine. The sales agency established a new Lexington sale record for consignor gross sales and there's still one more session to go. So far, Preferred has grossed \$11,546,000 for 136 yearlings sold to average \$84,897 through the first four sessions. Preferred previously set the consignor gross record in 2022 with total sales of \$11,261,000 for 145 sold.

"That's something to be really proud of," Reid said. "We couldn't do it without the horses. As I said all week long, it's really a

tribute to the breeders, especially for Preferred because we have the most diverse consignment from a representation point of view of any consignment.

"I just think it's great to lead by example, but to see all the farms buying into the prepping and the matings and the mares and thinks like that... it takes a lot of effort on a lot of levels, to get the kind of success that you're seeing and I'm just happy that it's happening for them.

"It's an important stepping stone for the industry, just being able to churn the money – from the purse money and back into the yearling sales. Come this fall, there will be a lot of trade on the mares and matings, so it's an important week for the industry and we've fulfilled what we were expecting so far and to close it up tomorrow night."

Preferred also led all consignors in gross sales for Thursday's session alone with \$1,306,000 earned for 37 yearlings.

Kentuckiana Farms also had a great fourth session with sales of \$928,000 for 34 sold. Through four sessions, Kentuckiana

(\$8,831,000) has a slight edge over Hunterton (\$8,384,000) in gross sales.

By average, Hanover Shoe Farms still leads despite selling only on the first two days. Hanover averaged \$216,308 per yearling. All American Harnessbreds is second with an average of \$170,000 for six sold. Cameo Hills is third with an average of \$127,429 for 28 sold.

THE GOOSE PRINCESS TOPS DAY 4

Topping the fourth session was the lone six-figure purchase, Hip #759 The Goose Princess, a Muscle Mass filly out of Golden Goose purchased by Determination for \$120,000 out of the Preferred consignment.

Spring Haven Farm sold one of the two yearlings that sold for \$90,000 on Thursday when Hip #632 Over Bet, a Bettors Delight colt out of Sadayo Hanover was purchased by trainer Tony Beaton.

"We've had a very good sale," said Spring Haven's Senena Esty. "We've gotten dinged a bit for the dual-eligibility situation. Most of ours are raised in Ohio. We have our own farm, so we take a little bit of a hit there. That's one area where we've been trying to really watch to see if it's worth sending some of your mares down. The costs are a lot different in Ohio and, again,

Josh Green, farm manager of Spring Station, said he was pleased with how the farm's yearlings have sold in only their second year selling in Lexington.

we own our own farm. So, is it an advantage to have your horse... pay the extra board, pay everything, not have your costs?"

Esty said she was looking forward to tonight's (Oct. 4) final session featuring mostly Midwest horses.

"We're very strong with Indiana, especially our Swan For Alls, so please come and see us," Esty said. "If you want a Swan For All, you've got to come here.

"We have a really nice Catch The Fire... we have several good Ontario-bred McWickeds to offer. We have a good Rockin Image, an Indiana bred, so we're excited. We're very strong in Indiana and Ontario."



Freshly-minted Hall of Famer Bob Boni of Northwood Bloodstock said the Lexington sale seems to be immune from most economic conditions and that speaks to the strength of the catalog.

"It's a good horse sale, it's really always a good horse sale," Boni said. "The only thing that affects our market, to me, is some out-of-the-business — and not economic — disaster, be it 9/11 or COVID, the stock market crash of '08. Even then, I don't think it affected [the Lexington sale] as much as Harrisburg. In a funny way, it seems like it's sort of insulated from what else goes on in the world. It doesn't seem to affect the guys from buying a good horse that can afford to buy a good horse. The bidding is stronger every year. The good horses always sell well."

Boni said Northwood "didn't have a lot of power" this year in Lexington, but he was pleased to have sold Hip #70 Bay On The Beach, an Always B Miki colt out of Beach Gal for \$250,000 on Day 1 to Michael Gagnon.

"That colt is beautiful, as nice a pacing colt as I've had in a very, very long time," Boni said. "There was a lot of interest in him."

Spring Station's Josh Green and Sasha Moczulski said they were happy with their second year selling horses in Lexington.



"All things considered, for this being our second year, I think we've done really well," Moczulski said. "This is a great sale to sell our yearlings at and to have as many as we did sell the first night and as many throughout the sale, that was a great feat.

"We started out with 12 last year and we had 33 this year. Our sale will increase next year, so, all things considered, I'm really happy with the way things are going."

have a bit of a sprinkle of Indiana eligibles and then you have some good individuals where maybe the pedigrees have gotten a little older from other jurisdictions, so we're really coming into [Friday] night thinking there's no reason it won't be a good session. We have the individuals to back it up and that's the important thing to drive this market.

"We're stronger this year from Downbytheseaside in my point of view. The other sires out there have had respectable years, in my opinion. The trotting side, you're going to throw in the Ready For Monis, there's a fair amount of them tomorrow. Then, we've got some In Ranges and I think both of them are going to be received well and that's on top of the sires that have been leading the way out there."

Green said, "Very pleased. It's been a good week. We made a lot of contacts. The biggest thing I'm excited for is all of the quality trainers that have purchased our horses and help support the mares that we have. We always evaluate at the end of the season about where we feel we need to upgrade. I do feel that in the pipeline each year we should keep having just a better quality consignment."

Through the first four sessions, the team of Andrew Harris and Bill Pollock still lead the buyers' standings with \$5,115,000 spent, total, to take home 15 yearlings — all purchased in the first two sessions. Nancy Takter is second with total purchases of \$2,597,000 for 23 yearlings, followed by Tony Alagna (\$2,254,000 for 27 yearlings) and Ake Svanstedt (\$2,127,000 for 12).



I had earlier called my good friend MLB commissioner Rob Manfred to ask if he could move the Tigers game to a 7 p.m. start, and was disappointed when he told me that I should instead ask Red Mile VP of operations Gabe Prewitt to move the race card to an evening post.

I had plenty of time to kill before the Futurity post draw so I made my way up to the old paddock. Pat Dellavecchia had texted me earlier this week about making the hike up to see him and Tricia Adams, so this was a chance to do so. Tricia was there when I arrived brushing down Sweetie Hill, a 2-year-old trotting filly who races Saturday afternoon with Pat Curtin driving.

Trish and I talked for about 20 minutes before Pat D came back from the track. We talked about a pair of horses they have in to go on Saturday, including the 2-year-old colt trotter Gimme Fifty in an overnight. After several qualifiers where Gimme Fifty couldn't stay focused and made a break, he finally stayed flat last time out in a Sept. 30 qualifiers with the addition of trotting hopples. Scott Zeron will drive and I'll have my fingers crossed that Gimme Fifty gives a nice effort.

Both trotters are owned by John Barnard, and as I was leaving, the stable manager arrived. I received a nice parting gift of a shirt before I made my way back to The Deck to wait for the Futurity and Filly Futurity draw. As I left, I had a chance to wave hello to Phil Knox, who is also stabled there.

Nick Salvi and Vicki Gingras were together so I joined them on the couch. The USTA's Wendy Ross arrived with her dog, Stella. Putting together The Deck in preparation for the draws for the two trotting classics were Ross' co-workers Kyle Creditt and Rich Johnston.

Hosting the show that was broadcast on the USTA's Facebook page were Emily Ratcliff, Jessica Otten and Bob Heyden. The Filly Futurity was up first and the horses came out of the box in alphabetical order. Post positions were random though, with 3-1 morning-line favorite Date Night Hanover landing post 9.

Hambletonian favorite Karl drew the trailing post 11. Karl was installed the 6-5 morning-line favorite, with Highland Kismet the second choice at 3-1. After the draw I walked over to Karl's driver, Yannick Gingras, to ask about drawing the second tier, and he told me that he was OK with it and it was much better than the outside post 10.

A request was sent to Yannick and trainer Nancy Takter for an on-air interview. Things became exciting as Yannick and Nancy did the rock, paper, scissors thing to decide who would do the interview. It was best two-out-of-three, and after they split the first two duels, the tension became palpable for the third heat. Yannick won that battle and was almost as happy as when he won this year's Hambletonian with Karl, which sent Nancy to the podium for a chat with Bob Heyden.

Speaking of Yannick, he told me that he was extremely lucky last Saturday night when he made the drive in the rain from Lexington to Hollywood Dayton for their stakes-laden card. Yannick told me that he was nearing the exit when his car hydroplaned on the extremely wet road. Yannick said somehow, he managed to avoid squarely hitting the huge wall alongside the exit. He admitted he was a bit rattled from the incident, and the car emerged largely unscathed except for one tire that must've brushed the wall.

I'll have a sale update for you tomorrow, and I'm sure I'll be reporting that it's been a great week for my sponsors, Hunterton Farm/Hunterton Sales Agency. Also, that gas prices continue to drop into the low \$2.70s.

Waiting for the shoes to drop

Years ago, a trainer told me, "We are in the gambling business." That may be true, but we are also in the business of racing horses to win.

I will freely admit that I have not been gambling consistently for quite a while. But just because I haven't placed a \$200 win bet recently doesn't mean that I can't relate to the frustration that one feels when they are unaware of late equipment changes.

There has been a lot of back and forth on social media since Dean Towers' column, "Reporting of equipment changes needs a major reboot," ran last week in HRU. No surprise, the gamblers and horsepeople see the situation a little differently.

Towers suggested that trainers share their intentions as "Possible No Shoes" on the equipment change list that's sent out before race 1, and, if indeed the shoes are pulled, it would need to be shared by the track with all interested parties, including on social media and their in-house show.

On X (formerly known as Twitter), as well as on Facebook, some gamblers said they would prefer an equipment change deadline prior to the first race, after which no modifications would be made. This cut off was not chosen arbitrarily since the Pick-5 at The Meadowlands starts in race 1.

Several gamblers also shared online that if they knew a trainer was pulling shoes, they would include that horse in their multi-leg wagers, even if they probably wouldn't have solely based on past performances.

HRU reached out to several Meadowlands trainers — Tony Alagna, Ron Burke, Noel Daley, Nifty Norman, Sarah Svanstedt, Nancy Takter, and Linda Toscano — and simply asked, "If you are planning to pull shoes, would you always know you were going to do it before the start of the card?"

"With me, I prefer to see the track," Burke said. "The later, the better. Trainer responsibility goes both ways and mine is to do the best by the horse."

Toscano said, "It's always a thought but you're never sure until after warm-ups."

Warming up their horses seemed to be a common deciding factor for trainers when it comes to equipment changes, especially when pulling shoes.

"A lot depends on warm-up and track conditions," Daley said. "If we were allowed to advise after warm-up, that's perfect."

Alagna said, "Generally, it will depend on the track surface after we warm up. That is generally when I will decide to pull shoes with certainty."

Norman agreed that the track surface is a factor, but then went one step further.

"It's definitely a decision you can't make until you've seen the state of the track and maybe even warm the horse up," Norman said. "In my opinion, pulling the shoes probably backfires as often as it is successful."

Since the situation that sparked Towers to write his column happened at Woodbine Mohawk Park, I also asked trainer Blair Burgess the same question.

Burgess has pulled shoes in the past and shared a story about doing so a while back at The Meadowlands.

"Its reputation may exceed the value somewhat," Burgess said. "I trained one for [Ake] Svandstedt, 10 or 12 years ago, and raced in a stake at The Big M. He came to drive and wanted the shoes off after warm-up. He rolled the horse on the front end and made a break in the stretch. Some trotters may miss the weight up front or get foot-sore as the race gets near end. But Svandstedt really loves it. Maybe more than even other Swedes."

It was also mentioned on social media that tracks in Europe are always good and allow for pulling shoes, but that track surfaces in the U.S. are very inconsistent.

Born in Sweden, Takter said most trainers probably know if they're leaning towards pulling shoes.



"Well, I would say you have an idea that you're going to do it because the horse cannot be newly shod when you pull the shoes or you will make the horse's feet bleed, so you have to have a little preparation before you do it," Takter said.

When it comes to the aforementioned Pick-5, no matter how cooperative the trainers may want to be with sharing information, it would be hard for them to be definitive about changes when the horses in the fifth race probably wouldn't warm up until after the first.

Sarah Svanstedt shared what her experiences were in her native country.

"In Sweden, there was a sheet in the paddock area where the trainer could mark 'barefoot' one hour prior to the race the horse was in," Sarah said. "It was always possible to change back to shoes-on if the track was not in good condition.

"You need to get a chance to warm up on the track before a 100 per cent decision can be made."

In Pathway on the USTA website under the "facility summary rulings report," since 2019, The Meadowlands has only had four offenders — two each in 2021 and 2022 — for failure to report equipment change. In fact, in the last 20 years at The Big M, there were only a total of eight offenders; the four

mentioned and two each in 2009 and 2010. It is unclear if any of these were for pulling shoes because the report does not have any details. However, this does not mean that more late equipment changes didn't happen, just that no one was penalized.


As with anything starting from scratch, it would seem that there will be growing pains as tracks attempt to find a way to keep both their customers and their horsepeople happy.

Asking trainers to sign a sheet with their early intentions upon entering the paddock doesn't seem to be too outrageous, but following up closer to race time may need to be examined a little more.

Since many times trainers have horses in multiple races, it might be best for the track to take responsibility and have someone in the paddock to ask the trainers between warm-ups what their plans are and then share that info.

One hundred per cent adherence may not be a shoo-in, but at least it's a start.

"The Commissions need to find a compromise fair to trainers and bettors," Burgess said. "Possibly on all equipment changes, not just shoes. We have to be trainers. Conditions and horses change in time as a race card runs. I like Dean Towers'

Grand River wraps up record-setting 2024

Fresh off a record-setting 2023 meet, expectations were even higher ahead of Grand River Raceway's inaugural season as a five-eighths-mile track.

And boy, did they deliver.

The Elora, ON oval concluded its 48-race date 2024 program on Monday (Sept. 30), recording new benchmarks across the board.

"It was an awesome night," said raceway manager Jenna MacDonell. "The weather was beautiful, so we had lots of people out, especially for a Monday night, and we ended up having a great handle. It was just under \$400,000, which is also a little unusual for a Monday night, but it was great to see.

"I don't want the race season to be over yet. I could race all year round and be happy."

Judging by her team's performance this season, it's easy to understand why.

Overall handle settled at a new record high of \$13,933,212 — good for an increase of nearly \$50,000 year-over-year.

Although modest, the continued handle climb follows a drastic increase that saw the track's total wagering output surge 29 per cent from 2022 to 2023.

On-track betting also rose by approximately 3 per cent in 2024, according to MacDonell.

"Our goal this year was to maintain that momentum and keep trending upwards, and we were able to do that," she said.

Grand River's showrunner credited the leaps in on-track wagering to a strong atmospheric element created by a series of lively patio parties held throughout the racing season.

"A lot of these would be corporate parties, agricultural groups or different groups in the surrounding area coming to the track, and a lot of the attendees are first timers," MacDonell said. "Our objective was to bring those people in, so they could see what we're all about and retain them as customers.

"The team did a great job this year. There were about 3,000 seats booked over the course of the year for patio parties. And the

beautiful thing about these events is they run rain or shine because we can move the party inside if need be."

Comfortable weather also proved to be a significant boon for Grand River during the final push in September.

"This last month we were gunning to make sure that we were up handle-wise," MacDonell said. "The month of September was fantastic. The weather was incredible. We had so many beautiful nights here, which is rare this time of year."

Even on the gloomier days, Grand River continued to shine.

A revamped racing surface ensured the new track was equipped to withstand heavy rainfall, and as a result, led to zero weather-related cancellations.

"In previous years, if we got a lot of rain, we would have issues with the track washing out," she said. "This year, we had some serious rain at different points in the season, and the track held up beautifully.

"That was something people were particularly excited about, because in the past, with the drainage and the way that it was, if we had a really rainy day, you knew there was a good chance that we were going to have to cancel."

With the added peace of mind from a stable and safe surface, drivers were able to focus exclusively on beating each other to the wire.

That free-flowing competitiveness paired perfectly with a larger track, as MacDonell's preseason hope for more movement in the mile was answered.

"There was quite a bit of action, and it was easier to move," she said. "It didn't matter so much what post position you were at. With the old track, it used to be if you had the 7- or 8-hole, you're thinking 'oh no.'

"From what I saw and the feedback that I got, it was less so that way this year - you still had a shot if you were on the outside. That's what we hoped for."

Speed numbers also ticked up on what several horse people described to MacDonell as a "pretty fast track."

A slew of track records soon followed, including a new overall track record.

On Sept. 27, 11-1 hopeful Betthebeach crossed the finish line in 1:50.3 to sneak past the previous mark set by Ideal Perception (1:50.4) on Jun. 17.

Grand River also saw its first sub-1:50-mile in a qualifying event on Sept. 4, when a 6-year-old pacer by the name of Saulsbrook Victor qualified in 1:49.1.

Such strong figures quickly quelled any initial fears regarding the starting position, which some horse people worried might be too tight. of rain, we would have issues with the track washing out. But as MacDonell noted, any concerns were laid to rest after night one.

"People were worried about where that start line was — when they come off the gate, they're essentially right into the turn — but the feedback we got was that the turns were so nice and sweeping that it wasn't really an issue," she said.

"That was something we were worried about, and it ended up not being a non-issue."

While the track itself held up its end of the bargain, Grand River, like countless other horse racing venues across North America, grappled at times with a limited horse population.

"There were some nights where there were eight races or smaller fields," MacDonell said. "As far as the betting public and the horseplayers, they want those full fields. That was something that we did struggle with a little bit, and I know many other tracks struggle with that as well, but it was a very successful meet overall."

Even so, the venue at 7445 Wellington County Rd still managed to produce record handle numbers yet again.

Therefore, it was no surprise that attendance numbers remained healthy, and particularly on Grand River's signature days.

This year's Battle of Waterloo, which was claimed by Stonebridge Wizard, came together exactly as MacDonell envisioned.

Well, besides the scorching heat.

"It was a great day," she said. "It was hot, but it was great to see so many industry members come out. We had a bumping patio party with the whole Winbak [Farms] crew being in town. They support that event and the track so much, and we truly appreciate it. I was tired by the end of it, and hot, but it was a really successful day. I can't wait till next year."

The track also hosted its third annual Harness the Hope breast cancer research fundraiser on Aug. 30.

What is an extraordinary event for so many, holds a special meaning for the Grand River family.

"Katie Giddy, our VP of operations is a breast cancer survivor, and it's a night that's near and dear to our hearts around here," MacDonell said.

"We had a giant pink patio party, which was sold out. We ended up raising \$25,000 for Harness the Hope. It was amazing to see the community support."

Rounding things out on MacDonell's list of highlights was Weiner Dog Night, and not just because she has one herself.

Nearly 3,000 people attended the event.

But that wasn't all that stood out to MacDonell.

"One of the things that surprised me about that day is that the team had almost warned me, as soon as the dog races are done, you'll see a lot of people head out," MacDonell said. "But it was a beautiful night, and there were just fabulous vibes on the tarmac, and the people stuck around right until the very end.

"I'm hoping that those types of events continue to bring in new customers, show us where they are, and make coming to the racetrack not so scary. We really do try to promote Grand River's family atmosphere, and I hope they felt it that night, and were able to come again."

For MacDonell, who grew up watching her father, the legendary Paul MacDonell, steer horse after horse to the winner's circle, sharing her love for the sport with fans new and old is what drives her to keep elevating the Grand River experience for everyone that walks onto the premises.

"I know what a great sport it is, and I want other people to know," she said. "It's such a great team here. I know the industry loves coming here, and I can see why. The people here, they're the same ones that have been here year-after-year. They're friendly and inviting and welcoming, and our [creative] team does their best to put on these great events, and they do a wonderful job.

"I'm just happy to be a part of it."





Jackpot for Hagoort at Jägersro

Two division finals of the \$100,000 Breeders Course for 2-year-old trotters were held at Jägersro racetrack on Wednesday (Oct. 2) night and in the fillies' event, Dutch trainer Paul Hagoort seized the top-three positions.

Robin Bakker, Hagoort's regular driver, sat behind **Gourmet d'Arc** (Six Pack) and after a quick first quarter, Bakker could slow the pace down, which resulted in a very safe win in 1:59.

Hagoort's Greta Jet held for second place after a trip as second on the inside and third stablemate Phoebe Boko captured the bronze medal.

Dutch trainers totally dominated Breeders Course on Wednesday night. Erwin Bot let Örjan Kihlström drive **Pele Boko** (Readly Express), who was the bettors first choice in the final for colts and geldings, and when Pele Boko held the opponents on his outside from the start, the drama was over. A quick start, slow second part of the race and stretch speed resulted in a safe win in 1:59.4 for the favorite. Ghirardelli was the runner-up ahead of Grantorino Font.

GerritsRecyclingGroup in Netherlands, a big investor in the harness racing business in Europe, could look back at a pretty nice evening in Malmö as both winners of the Breeders Course are connected to them.

UPSET IN FRENCH COUNTRYSIDE

Well-merited trotters Hohneck, Just A Gigolo, Hokkaido Jiel and Gu d'Heripre were called to the French northern countryside when the \$115,000 Grand Prix Anjou-Maine was held on Wednesday (Oct. 2) afternoon, but the 2,875 meter-long event culminated in an upset win by an 8-year-old gelding, trained by Laurent-Claude Abrivard.


Favorite Ino du Lupin, who dominated in his category at Vincennes the previous winter, left position in third, fourth over, a mile into the race and in the last turn, Ino du Lupin seemed to have disarmed leader Hymne du Gers. And Ino du Lupin looked to sail away to victory in the stretch, but

his gait began to fail the closer he got to the wire and shortly before the finish he made a break. **Gendreen** (Boccador de Simm) attacked outside of Ino du Lupin in the stretch and the ground saving trip proved to be valuable in the end. Gendreen got the advantage of the race when Ino du Lupin went off-stride and he held quick finisher Inexess Bleu a length behind at the wire. Hohneck, who started with a 25-meter disadvantage, finished strongly in third.

Gendreen won in a mile rate of 1:55.1 over 1.7 miles.

Karl draws post 11 in Kentucky Futurity

Hambletonian winner Karl drew post 11 in the second tier for Sunday's (Oct. 6) 132nd Kentucky Futurity for 3-year-old trotters at The Red Mile and was made the 6-5 morning-line favorite for trainer Nancy Takter and driver Yannick Gingras.

Karl has won nine of 11 races this season and earned \$977,839. For his career, the son of Tactical Landing — Avalicious has won 18 of 21 starts and banked \$2.01 million.

Takter captured last year's Kentucky Futurity with Tactical Approach. The most recent trainer to win the Futurity in consecutive years was Takter's father, Jimmy, who accomplished the feat with Pinkman in 2015 and Nuncio in 2014. Gingras drove Pinkman.

"[The draw] looks good to me," Nancy said. "It's better than 10, 9, or 8, I think, so I'm happy with 11.

"I trained him this morning and I was really happy with him. He trained super. He's going to be ready to go on Sunday.

"This is a really nice group of horses here. There are 10 really solid competitors, so you need a little racing luck, and things

have to go your way. But like I said, my horse is coming into the race in great shape, so I'm really happy with him."

Hambletonian runner-up Highland Kismet is the 3-1 second choice in the 11-horse Futurity field. He will start from post 3 for trainer Mark Etsell.

The Kentucky Futurity is the third jewel in the Trotting Triple Crown. The first, the Yonkers Trot, was won by Sir Pinocchio. Karl won the second, the Hambletonian.

Sunday's Red Mile card also features the 59th Kentucky Filly Futurity for 3-year-old female trotters. Date Night Hanover, trained by Marcus Melander, enters the race with four wins and a second in her past five starts and was made the 3-1 morning-line favorite. She will leave from post 10 in the field of 11.


Hambletonian Oaks winner Warrawee Michelle is the 4-1 second choice, leaving from post 7 for trainer Ake Svanstedt.

Papi Grad leads today's International Stallion Stakes

Fresh from her authoritative winner's circle return in the Bluegrass Stakes, Papi Grad looks to potentially wrap the bow on her freshman campaign when starting in the second of three divisions for the \$245,800 International Stallion Stakes (ISS), for 2-year-old pacing fillies, today (Oct. 4) at The Red Mile.

Papi Grad lands post 4 in the seven-filly field, which will hit the track for race 6 on today's card. Listed at 7-5 on the morning line, Papi Grad enters the affair in a potential rematch with Looksgoodinloulou, whom the Steve Carter trainee easily repelled during a far-turn assault to win in 1:51. Dexter Dunn sticks with the daughter of Papi Rob Hanover who may hit the bench following today's race per co-owner Jay Mossbarger, who said after her most recent win, "We've got one more start left here and we're probably going to shut her down. We've had enough starts for her this year."

A pair of Bluegrass winners meet in the opening division of the ISS filly pace with 7-5 morning line favorite Rodeo Drive Deo drawing post 7 and 2-1 second choice Unreasonable landing post 4. Rodeo Drive Deo, a Ron Burke-trained daughter of Captaintreacherous, comes into this race off a second-over pounce to a 1:51 win as the 6-5 favorite while Unreasonable enters from a similar closing effort in 1:51 as the 1-5 chalk. David Miller will drive Rodeo Drive Deo while Scott Zeron stays with Unreasonable, a filly by Huntsville, for trainer Erv Miller.

Division three of the ISS filly pace features Rose, one of only two fillies to beat Papi Grad this season. Rose, winner of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes final, draws post 1 off a 1:50.3 victory in the \$100,000 Kentucky Commonwealth final on Sept. 16. Yannick Gingras drives the Burke-trained filly by Sweet Lou in an octet that includes a Canadian invader in Mark Steacy's Captaintreacherous filly Cant See Me, who draws post 8 off a third-place effort in the \$393,680 She's A Great Lady final on Sept. 21. Bob McClure has the drive.

Today's card also has four divisions for the \$320,000 ISS for 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings beginning in race 4. A stacked first division has two winners from last week's Bluegrass with Tactical Dynasty, posting a 1:54.3 front-stepping effort, starting from post 1 and Blank, inheriting a 1:54.4 win through disqualification, from post 7. Gingras drives Tactical Dynasty for trainer Burke and Dunn pilots Blank for conditioner Marcus Melander.

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt has the favorite in the second ISS colt trot with Happy Jack B from post 1. The even-money morning-line choice comes off a pillar-to-post 1:54.1 effort to win his Bluegrass division last week. The Chapter Seven colt faces eight other rivals in the contest that includes Richard "Nifty" Norman trainee Yannick G Kemp, a colt by Walner who faltered as the odds-on choice and finished ninth in the Kentucky Commonwealth final over two weeks ago. Peter Wrenn will drive Yannick G Kemp from post 7.

Pennsylvania Sire Stakes champion Meshuggah will try to build from a third-place finish in the Mohawk Million in the third split for the ISS colt trotters. Zeron steers the colt by Greenshoe from post 1 as the 5-2 morning-line choice against a bunch that features another Svanstedt-trained and Bluegrass winner in Gap Kronos S. Svanstedt will drive the Face Time Bourbon colt from post 8.

Super Chapter will try to get back on track in the final ISS colt trot as the 6-5 morning line favorite. Dunn drives the Melander-trained son of Chapter Seven after he scratched sick from last week's Bluegrass division won by the still undefeated Maximus Mearas S, who lands post 8 in this division. Super Chapter, winner of the \$400,000 Kentucky Championship Series final, races from post 4 against Maximus Mearas S, who starts from post 8 with Zeron in the bike for trainer Lucas Wallin.

The first division of the ISS filly pace is "The Margareta Wallenius-Kleberg Memorial" and is sponsored by Arden Homestead Stable, E. T. Gerry, Jr., Peter Gerry, Stoner Manor Inc., Menhammar Stuteri AB, Jorgen Jahre Jr., LST Stable, Lawrence DeVan and William DeVan. The second division is "The Bob McIntosh Memorial" sponsored by the Perfect Sting Syndicate, Brittany Farms and Val D'or Farms. Division three is "The Arlene Siegel Memorial" sponsored by Jules Siegel and Fashion Farms.

Division one of the ISS colt trot is named "The Six Pack" sponsored by the Six Pack Syndicate and Deo Volente Farms. The second division is "The Muscle Hill" sponsored by Southwind Farms, division three is "The Walner" sponsored by the Walner Syndicate and division four is "The Tactical Landing" sponsored by Hickory Lane Farm and the Tactical Landing Syndicate.

Today's card features 14 races on the program. First-race post time at The Red Mile is 1 p.m. (EDT).



Steady 'Elan' pleases Pollack

Elan Hanover might not be flashy, but that is perfectly fine with co-owner Tom Pollack.

A 2-year-old trotting colt, Elan Hanover has finished no worse than third in all nine of his career races heading into today's International Stallion Stakes at Lexington's Red Mile. The son of Bar Hopping—Expect A Lot is the 3-1 morning-line favorite in the first of four \$80,000 divisions for the freshman male trotters.

Elan Hanover, purchased by Pollack and trainer Jeff Cullipher in July after three starts for George Ducharme, has posted two wins, six seconds, and a third this year. Half of his runner-up finishes have come by a neck or less, including in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship on Sept. 5 at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows. He has earned \$181,706 overall, with \$157,145 coming since the sale.

"Would I like to flip-flop the seconds and the firsts? Absolutely," Pollack said. "But he's done nothing wrong. He hasn't had any clunkers. It's tough racing. He got snapped at the wire a few times by sprinters. He's a big, strong, goodgaited horse; not a sleek sprinter.

"He's professional, does his work, nothing flashy. He's just consistent, shows up every start. I'll take that all day long over a horse that might be a little faster, but a little more unstable. At this level, seconds aren't bad. If you can keep hitting the board, you're doing all right. You picked a pretty good one."

Pollack and Cullipher became interested in Elan Hanover after seeing the colt race in a division of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes at The Meadows on July 12. (Their colt Father TJ was competing in a different division that day.) Elan Hanover finished second by a head to Meshuggah, the same horse that caught him nearing the wire of the series final.

"George owned him himself," Pollack said. "We heard that George might sell him, so we pursued it and put a deal together. Hopefully, it was a good deal for George, since he owned him himself, and certainly it's been a good deal for us because the horse has been super. George has been

following the horse and rooting for us. He's a good guy to do business with."

Elan Hanover has impressed Pollack enough that the owner purchased one of the colt's family members, Princess Tara, for \$45,000 during Tuesday's second session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Princess Tara is a daughter of stallion Gimpanzee out of the mare Pantera, who is a half-sister to Elan Hanover. The family also includes Kentucky Futurity winner My MVP and Hambletonian Oaks winner Must Be Victory, plus Grand Circuit winner and Kentucky Sire Stakes champion Top Expectations.

"We liked [Elan Hanover] that much that we went to the well again for next year," Pollack said.

Today, Elan Hanover will leave from post 5 in a field of nine in his International Stallion Stakes division. Todd McCarthy will be in the sulky. He enters the race off a second-place finish in a division of the Bluegrass Stakes last week.

If all goes well, Pollack said the Breeders Crown later this month at The Meadowlands would be next.

"George paid him in, so we'll put up the starting fee and give him a shot," Pollack said. "He's definitely earned a trip to New Jersey if he races like he's been. The big track at Lexington and The Meadowlands doesn't hurt him because he's big and strong. That's a good thing.

"We're excited. Sometimes these things work out, and sometimes they don't. This one is in the working out column, so that's always good."

The favorites in the remaining International Stallion Stakes divisions for the trotters are Happy Jack B, Meshuggah, and Super Chapter.

Ake Svanstedt trains and drives Happy Jack B, who is coming off a win in a division of the Bluegrass Stakes last week and is even-money on the morning line.

Meshuggah and Super Chapter are both from the stable of trainer Marcus Melander. Meshuggah, driven by Scott Zeron, is making his first appearance since a third-place finish in the Mohawk Million on Sept. 21 and is 5-2. Super Chapter, with driver Dexter Dunn, is making his first start since winning the Kentucky Sire Stakes Championship Series final on Sept. 15 at The Red Mile. He is 6-5.

Today's Red Mile card also features three divisions of the International Stallion Stakes for 2-year-old female pacers.

Two \$70,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes Standardbred Development Fund finals were held at Freehold Raceway on Thursday (Oct. 3). Both were for 3-year-old trotters.

The final for fillies took place in race 6. Johnathan Ahle and **Southwind Banshee** had post position 3. They settled in fourth in the first turn. They were content there until the field reached the half and Ahle decided it was time to make the trek to the front. He pulled to the first-over position and the pair worked their way to the front.

By the time they reached the three-quarter pole in 1:26.1, they trailed the leader, Eloise, by just a half-length. Eloise, the 8-5 second choice, didn't give in easily. She continued battling into the stretch, but then faded as they approached the wire. Southwind Banshee continued on to win in 1:55.2, just two-fifths of a second shy of the track record that she set back on Sept. 12.

At 3-2 odds, a win bet paid \$5. Jacquie Ingrassia trains the Muscle Hill daughter for Arden Homestead Stable.

In the final for colts and geldings, **Seven Reps** and Austin Siegelman got lucky with the draw and left from post 1. After winning the Garden State Trot and the first leg of the NJSS in his last two starts, the bettors bet the Ron Burke trainee down to 2-5 odds.

It was no surprise then to see Seven Reps cruise around the track for a wire-to-wire win in 1:55.1. This was the third win in a row and fifth lifetime for the son of Muscle Hill.

Siegelman scored a driving double on the eight-race card. Racing resumes with more NJSS action and \$70,000 finals today (Oct. 4) and Saturday (Oct. 5) starting at 12:30 p.m.





Danger extends streak to six in Indiana Sire Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Sensational sophomore trotting filly **Danger** extended her season win streak to six as trainer Robert Taylor swept the eighth and final round of Indiana Sire Stakes for 3-year-old trotting fillies on Wednesday (Oct. 2) at Harrah's Hoosier Park. The 13-race card are featured a pair of Sire Stakes divisions for 2-year-old pacing fillies in their leg six finale prior to the \$250,000 Super Finals on Friday (Oct. 11).

Danger was sent away as the 1-20 favorite in the \$48,500 first division for trotting fillies with driver Kevin Lambright guiding the 3-year-old rookie against five foes. Leaving from post 4, Danger had to work hard to get to the front early, trotting to the outside of Social Chatter (Pete Wrenn) through a quick opening quarter of :26.4. Once clear, Danger kept rolling on the front to the half in :55.4 before trotting two lengths clear at three-quarters in 1:24.2. In the stretch, Danger kept Social Chatter at arm's length, crossing the wire 1¼-lengths clear in a lifetime best 1:53.1. Skyway Paige (LeWayne Miller) finished third, $4\frac{3}{4}$ lengths back of the leader.

The Robert Taylor trained daughter of Swan For All—Chim Swift has won nine of 10 on the season, banking \$147,271. Bred by Steve Stewart and Chris Beaver, Danger is owned by Anthony Lombardi and George Golemes.

Agent Of Fortune utilized similar tactics as her stablemate in the very next race, scoring in gate-to-wire fashion in the \$48,000 second division. With Taylor doing the driving, Agent Of Fortune quickly grabbed command through an opening quarter of :28.2. The 2-1 second-choice reached the half alone on the lead in :58.1 before Agent Of Fortune accelerated to a two-length lead at three-quarters in 1:26.4. Sprinting home in :27.3, Agent Of Fortune reached the line 2½-lengths clear of favored Hail Broadway (Jordan Ross) in 1:54.2. Star Pilot (Trace Tetrick) rallied for show.

Agent Of Fortune has won half of her 14 outings in 2024, sporting seasonal earnings of \$181,116 for owners Taylor Racing and Bert Paddock. The daughter of Dover Dan—Posterity was bred by Black Creek Farm and has now earned over a quarter-million dollars lifetime.

Earlier on the card, sentimental favorite **Tarshish** scored a minor 6-1 upset victory in the \$67,000 first division of Indiana Sire Stakes for rookie pacing fillies just over a week after her late owner Samuel Samples passed away.

Driver Brandon Bates put Tarshish on the engine from post 4, leading the field of six to the quarter pole in :27.3. The 1-5 favorite, Brookview Fancy (Joey Putnam), who entered the night riding a five-race win streak, took command on the backstretch on the way to the half in :56.3. Brookview Fancy looked to give the field the slip on the final turn, opening up by two lengths over Tarshish at three-quarters in 1:25. The advantage quickly dissipated in the lane as Brookview Fancy came under fire from all angles in the lane. Tarshish got the head start to her inside, squirting through to the front to cross the wire first by 1½ lengths in a career best of 1:53. Vel Cinderella (Kyle Wilfong) emerged atop a five-horse photo for place, with Infatuation (John De Long) finishing third.

The victory was the second in eight outings this season for the Walter Haynes, Jr. trainee. The daughter of Luck Be Withyou—The Party's Rockin was bred by Luckiana Farms and has earned \$84,725.

The \$67,500 second division for pacing fillies returned to form with **Can'ttouchthese** delivering a convincing victory as the 1-5 favorite. Driver De Long got Can'ttouchthese away in fourth early while Wunderkindbluechip (Ross) cut the quarter in :27.3. The field of seven remained single-file to the half in :56.1 before De Long tipped Can'ttouchthese first-over from fourth, moving to the leader's wheel on the final turn at three-quarters in 1:25.1. Can'ttouchthese maintained her momentum into the lane, quickly powering clear before coasting to the wire 1½-lengths clear of 63-1 shot Princess In Pink (Miller) in 1:52.2. JK Pearl Stone (Wrenn) closed for the third position.

Trained by Roger Welch, Can'ttouchthese was bred by owners William De Long, Patrick De Long and Douglas Riccolo. With five wins in seven outings, the daughter of JK Endofanera—Can't Touch This boosted her bankroll to \$130,370.

Don and Dave Wiest's **Perfect Suprise** (\$15,Art Stafford,Jr.) was a 2:01.1 winner in the first colt and gelding division. The Dave Wiest trainee reeled in pacesetter I'm Not George late for his first career win. Burly finished third. Perfect Suprise, an E L Platinum gelding was making his sixth career start. Stafford,Jr. had three wins on the program.

In the second filly division, the biggest upset to date this season in DSBF action occurred as Linda MacDonald's **Buttoncandy** (\$146.60, Stafford, Jr.) was a 2:05.2 winner over Holly Lou and Take It Easy. Buttoncandy, trained by Joseph MacDonald, is sired by E L Platinum.

In overnight action, Dylan Davis and Howard Taylor's **Naked Cowboy** (\$2.40, Corey Callahan) broke the track record for 3-year-old trotters (1:55.1.). In one of three wins for Callahan, the Tactical Landing gelding was full of trot on the front for trainer/co-owner Davis in his Harrington debut. The prior track record (1:55.4) was set by I Like My Boss in 2014.

LITTLE MISS PEYTON, GIVENS STAR TUESDAY AT HARRINGTON RACEWAY

Donna Messick's **Little Miss Peyton** (\$2.10, Corey Callahan) was a dominant 1:56.2 winner and the fastest of a trio of 2-year-old Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund (DSBF) filly pacing divisional winners Tuesday (Oct. 1) at Harrington Raceway.

The Papa Ray-sired filly was an open-length winner over Sweet Samsara and Mimosa On The Key. Trained by Les Givens, it was her third win in six career starts and one of four wins on the card for Givens.

George and Tina Dennis and The Wiz Kids Stable's **Im Won Last Wiser** (\$4.80, Montrell Teague) prevailed in the second split with a 1:58.3 triumph over Valentina Station and Tilted Crown. The Badlands Hanover filly surged first over on the final turn and wore down Valentina Station late for her first career win for trainer Joe Columbo.

The final DSBF split went to Jo Ann Looney-King's **Immaculate Inning** (\$9, Ross Wolfenden) in 1:58.3 for trainer Jim King, Jr. over Bella Artiste and Mornin Merle. The Roddy's Bags Again filly picked up her first career win.

PRIMO MASCHIO REMAINS UNBEATEN WITH DSBF ELIM SWEEP

Forrest Bartlett's **Primo Maschio** (\$2.10, Trae Porter) completed a sweep of his 2-year-old Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund (DSBF) \$20,000 divisions Monday (Sept. 30) at Harrington Raceway in 1:55.4 to remain unbeaten.

The Kevin Lare-trainee and Badlands Hanover gelding was an easy winner on the front end and has won all seven career starts. Lew Not Lou was second with Strange Brew third.

The second DSBF split also went to the favorite, as George and Tina Dennis' **Won Last Call** (\$2.10, Montrell Teague) overcame an early miscue to prevail in 1:57.4 over Shore Not Beach and Badlands Boogie. The Badlands Hanover gelding, recorded his second career win for trainer Joe Columbo, who is just two wins away from 1,000 in his career. It was one of three driving wins on the card for Teague. 
