# Opportunities abound in Lexington, even during a pandemic

Preferred's David Reid, Winbak's Joe Thomson, Diamond Creek's Adam Bowden and Hunterton's Steve Stewart assess the market heading into tonight's opening session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

# LEXINGTON Selected Yearling Sale

In a year dominated by dark clouds, it's always good to get a dose of optimism from **Winbak Farms' Joe Thomson**. Even in the midst of a global pandemic, Thomson did not disappoint when asked to assess the state of the harness racing industry heading into tonight's opening session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

"The optimistic part is that the purses are still there, the racetracks are still open enough to accommodate the horses,

so if you're in this business you can pretty well be assured that's going to be going on next year," Thomson said. "And we're hoping that they'll open up the casinos and they'll be able to supplement some of the purses and so forth. That money could dry up, but right now, I think some of the racetracks are being conservative because they don't have the casinos, but, as time goes by, we'll be able to deal with treating the virus and hopefully the vaccines will come within the next three or four months.



Tonight is the opening session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale at Fasig-Tipton.

"All of those things are optimistic and, when you're buying yearlings, you're not buying them to race next month, you're not buying them to race in January, you're buying them to race in the summer of next year so I would think if you have a perspective that's probably a better opportunity right now. If you have a good racehorse right now, it's kind of hard to get them in unless they are in some stakes, so from the buyers' perspective, I think the yearling is a pretty good play because you're nine or 10 months away from doing anything. I think that's an optimistic way to look at it. I don't see us going away. Of all bad things, there are good things that come out of it. I think one of the things is that we'll perfect these online sales and phone sales."

David Reid, who manages the Lexington sale with Randy Manges, said he's reluctant to give a prediction how this year's sale will fare, especially coming off the record-breaking sale of 2019 (full story here).

"Everyone wants to be a predictor and I've never been in the predicting business, per se," Reid said. "The marketplace will take care of itself. I do believe that we have a quality group of yearlings to sell again this year. Every jurisdiction

has gone through a bit of an adjustment period this year, whether it be racetracks closed temporarily, stakes races cancelled, Sires Stakes amended... wherever you race, you've had to deal with some adversity and, coming into the sales season, I'm sure there's going to be some adversity that the breeders are going to have to deal with as a result, but I can't really pinpoint where that's going to happen.

"It seems like the interest has been good. It will be interesting to see the depth of the market."

**Steve Stewart of Hunterton Farms** said this year's sale will provide some opportunities for buyers.

"I think it's an opportunity for people because we have to assume that the prices aren't going to be as high as they

have been for the last couple of years and the money is still there to race for... it's a great opportunity for people," Stewart said.

"I'm very sympathetic to the buyers in terms of what these yearlings cost because I think some breeders forget about training bills and stake payments and they are, like, 'Well, we've paid this much and this much...so we should get this much.' That's not exactly the way it works. I think that the yearling prices are going to be more reasonable, because some of the prices... I don't think they were so high (previous years) that you couldn't make money with them, but it was more difficult. It will be easier to buy this year than last year and I don't like the word 'down' because then it sounds like it's a big negative. In my opinion, I would use the word 'reasonable."

Adam Bowden of Diamond Creek said he is, "probably more bullish than most. We went up to the Ohio sale pretty confident that we were going to get paid well for the horses that we brought there and that sale was up 18 or 17 per cent. The Goshen sale was off by, what, a few hundred dollars? I doubt we're going to see million-dollar yearlings



(at Lexington), but I would expect the middle, the six-figure mark in the \$100,000 to \$300,000 will continue to be strong.

"I don't think it will be as bad as we maybe thought a month or two ago. I was thinking (down) 25 or 30 per cent a month ago and I'm probably more like 10 per cent now.

"(Last year) we had four or more of \$700,000 or more. I don't think we'll see that, but still think there's plenty of quality, pedigree and physical, from what we've seen so far. The good horses should bring good money. Racing has come back pretty well and people are starting to make money with the racehorses in the last couple of months, hopefully they'll put it right back into yearlings."

But getting to this point hasn't been easy for breeders or sale organizers.

"Obviously, the spring was challenging as far as our inspections were concerned, but Randy, myself and our sales team they hung tough and we were able to do our process," Reid said.

"Our catalogue is increased by a number of head this year, probably largely due to the Ohio sires. Our Friday night

session, I think is a dynamite session. With Downbytheseasides, Fear The Dragons and What The Hills and others, I'm really looking forward to closing out on a big night on the Friday night for the yearling sale and then we're going to have our Mixed Sale here on Saturday."

New this year will be augmented bidding options, including via the Internet. Though, Reid said the key is also doing a live auction.

"I think it's very important from the sales company point of view to have a live, in-person sale," Reid said. "We, obviously, are going to offer online bidding this year, which is going to be provided by a third-party vendor, so I'm excited to see how that works. Obviously, there will also be phone bidding because we do know that unfortunately, geographically, some international travellers are not able to get here... some Canadian buyers may opt not to come... To think that we're going to have the same population here this year as we had in the past, that's probably not realistic."

Thomson said the horse industry can learn a lot from those that sell cattle online.

Winbak's Joe Thomson (right, with the farm's Garret Bell and Elizabeth Cheesman) said yearling buyers are really making investments for next summer when the world may be back to normal.

"They sell a lot more cattle than they do horses in this country and I think we're catching on from them in the Internet sales. It's starting to be a big item and if you're into large equipment sale, they do it all the time. Ritchie Bros. has been doing it for a long time, they auction tonnes of equipment and if you've ever been to their sales, they'll have an auction ring going and walking along auctioning things off, but at the same time they have people on the phones and people doing Internet and it's been going on for a long time," Thomson said. "For us, I don't think we've done as good

a job as some of the other industries in making an allowance for Internet sales."

Thomson said the bottom line is that, "people that want to buy horses are going to figure out how to get it done."

As for other changes for 2020, Reid said there's some physical differences at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion and yearling videos now show much more than they ever did.

"The sales grounds at Fasig-Tipton, we're lucky enough to follow a thoroughbred sale here they had in early September.

We watched what they did – they run a first-class facility here. They have a couple of extra tents around here for gathering for people, so social distancing won't be a problem," Reid said. "There will be a slightly limited crowd in the sales arena, but there's going to be alternate places to bid from. From that point of view, I think the customer is going to feel very comfortable coming to the Lexington sale

this year.

"The other thing is, early on, we reached out to companies that do the videos and we encouraged them, when we started to toss the ball around, about doing these walking videos in addition to the paddock videos. I've heard very good things on that. Depending on your skill set and what you're used to, some people are very happy with them. Some

people still prefer to have them in the paddock, some live or some rely on the paddock video, but the buyer has got more information in 2020 than they've had in any years past. I would say that the walking video is a feature that's going to be around with us at future sales and it's a nice added tool," Reid said.

#### Walner and other first-crop sires

Also new this year will be a number of first-crop sires such as Walner, Huntsville, Downbytheseaide, Fear The Dragon and What The Hill.

Apart from his duties as the co-manager of the sale, Reid also operates Preferred Equine, the sport's largest bloodstock agency.

"Speaking as the syndicate manager of Walner, we're excited about the first crop of Walner," Reid said. "I've heard great things from other consignors and I know we have a very strong group of Walners ourselves (selling through

Preferred). It's unfortunate that we're selling a first crop of a champion like Walner in a pandemic year, but we can't change the calendar and I think the buyers will be happy with what they see. I just hope they sell and go into great hands and he can go out and prove himself next year, but, in the sales ring, I think he's going to hold up very well from his individuals.

"Chapter Seven has just continued to do great things and Walner being the first son of Chapter Seven just adds a lot of excitement. It was a very good syndicate and the breeders were very supportive and there's a lot of them in the sale... a lot of the syndicate members do breed and sell in Kentucky."

Reid said he's very pleased with yearlings he's selling by other first-crop sires.

"I'm very happy with my own first-crop sires,
Downbytheseaside, Huntsvilles ... I'm very happy with them,"
he said. "And the What The Hills. We sold What The Hill as a
yearling, so it's always interesting to sell his offspring, the
same as Captaintreacherous. We sold Captaintreacherous as
a yearling and to sell offerings by him is really enjoyable. We
also sold Walner."

Stewart said he's high on the Huntsvilles, so far.

"We don't have very many to sell and we probably have a couple more at Harrisburg, but they are probably as nice of a first-crop sires as you'll see. I think they are extremely nice," he said.

Bowden said he has high hopes for Downbytheseaside.

"Downbytheseaside is a horse that we owned while he was racing and stood in Ohio with Sugar Valley. He was always a horse that we loved and was hoping he'd produce the kind of quality that we've seen so far," Bowden said. "We took the first group to Ohio a couple of weeks ago and we were blown away with the response that we got from the public and I expect the same to be true down here. We have three exceptionally nice horses.

"We barely advertised him for the first three years and he's got full books and there's a lot to be happy with. The horses all look the same, which I always think is a good thing. They look like Beaches, which we're never going to complain if we have a group of horses that look like Somebeachsomewhere. I think you saw that with the Ohio people, they bought them in full force up there and I expect the same to be true here.

"The only unfortunate part with the Downbytheseasides is

that the Lexington sale is sort of treating them like second-class citizens in putting them only on Day 5.

"They've treated Ohio and Indiana as second-class citizens for a number of years, where New York, to me, is just as regional. And for a horse like Huntsville to be spread out throughout the book, Downbytheseaside was as good as Huntsville and I think it's a little unfair that you have to wait until Day 5 to see the quality that he puts forth."

#### Somebeachsomewhere - end of an era

On the other side of the spectrum from first-crop sires is the fact this year marks the last group of Somebeachsomewhere yearlings to sell.

"We're lucky to have a few of them, actually," Reid said.
"That's definitely the end of an era. The foals we have now were obviously conceived by frozen semen and there was a limited amount of that, so I'm happy to have a couple to represent.

"He had a great impact. You see it in his stallions right now, you're going to have Papi Rob Hanover going to Hanover Shoe Farms and Stay Hungry is already there, so there's definitely an impact, there's no doubt about that."

#### Preferred's consignment

In 2019, Preferred Equine led all Lexington consignors in gross sales with \$9,731,000 earned, the most the company has ever grossed at the sale.

Two years ago, Preferred sold both Ramona Hill and Ready For Moni, the pair that finished first and second, respectively, in this year's Hambletonian.

"Preferred is in a very good spot, year after year, because we're able to represent many of the sport's breeders, large and small. That's the beauty about Preferred. We have a cross-section of representation jurisdictionally — breeding farms, sizes, sire power, the maternal lines — that really puts us in a good position and the results speak for themselves," Reid said.

"We look forward coming into our sale and we really think about the density that comes out of our consignment, that's really a credit to our breeders and we're just fortunate enough to represent them, to market them and try to get them sold as best as possible. That's what we continue to strive to do every year and we look forward to the sale this year despite it being a year that's full of confusion."

Reid said he is proud to represent a number of quality, smaller breeders such as Talbot Creek, Glengate and Warrawee in Ontario and Deo Volente in New Jersey.

"A farm like Talbot Creek, they reinvest... they are not a large breeder, per se, but they're a quality breeder and for a few years they increased the quality of their mares. They are selling a Muscle Mass filly from the immediate family of Gimpanzee. [Hip 249 – Danika].

"Then you have long-time breeders, Lindy Farms, that followed up International Moni with Ready For Moni. There's a lot of yearlings from that maternal line and others that they have a very strong group.

"Southwind Farms, long-time client of Preferred Equine, we sold Southwind Gentry last year and he's the real deal for the Burke Brigade, and Southwind Tyrion ... so all these nurseries, they always produce."

#### Last call for White Birch

This year also marks the last crop of yearlings to be sold by White Birch Farms, which has ceased operations after the deaths of members of the Parisi family. Reid said the fact it is the end of an era is sad for himself and the entire Preferred team.

"They are a storied breeder and it's a great legacy and I'm sorry to see it come to an end. On the other hand, it's been a time coming and we were honored to represent them for all these years. It's just the final chapter of it and it's a little sad," Reid said.


#### First call for Fair Winds

Starting a fresh chapter with Preferred is Fair Winds Farm of New Jersey. This year will mark the first time Fair Winds will sell some of its yearlings in Lexington.

"They sold maybe a few (in Lexington) that they had in partnerships with other partners, but this will be the first time selling the Fair Winds brand," Reid said. "They contacted me in the early springtime and started to put some feelers out. They wanted to diversify a little bit and we're fortunate enough to represent them. Again, they are a top breeder, they are a proven breeder with proven success and we're honored to represent them and we hope to have satisfying results for them."

#### **Diamond Creek depth**

Over at Diamond Creek, Bowden said he excited about his

consignment's depth.

"This is one of the best years, the best group overall from top to bottom, as I'm sure everybody says," Bowden said. "Last year we kind of struggled having a bunch of quality and this year we have a little bit of everything. It's nice.

"Obviously, the Day 1 horses we liked from the beginning, but there's even horses on Day 3 that we think are as good or better as the horses on Day 1, especially athlete-wise.

"Hip 364 [Totality] may be the best horse that we've ever had in the paddock, as an athlete. She's done everything right from day one. She's not perfect and, yes, pedigree might say that she belongs on Day 3, but pound for pound she goes as well as anything we've ever had. She's a highlight later on in the sale, for sure."

#### **Hunterton selling Mission Brief's filly**

Stewart said he is predicting big prices for a couple of trotting fillies Hunterton is selling.

"Obviously, Mission Brief's filly is a special filly [Kadena, Hip 89]. People are saying, 'What's she going to sell for?' and I know both of those fillies are probably top of the market, but what is that price, I don't know," Stewart said. "I might have been a little closer last year, but Jolene's filly last year was about \$600,000, which was a record for a trotting filly of all time."

Stewart said he is also excited about Hip 7, Venerable, a Walner filly out of Jolene Jolene.

"Oh yeah, that's a special filly," he said. "What the top of the market is this year remains to be seen."

Stewart also highlighted a couple of trotting colts he's selling, "Hip 17 [Strategic Command] and Hip 69 [Flying Formation]... one is a Muscle Hill out of Satin Pillows and the other is a Walner colt out of Batoutahill.

"I would say, on the pacing colt side, Hip 10 [American Frontier], we've got a lot of early numbers. That's a brother to Sportswriter and to the dam of Tall Dark Stranger.

"On the pacing filly side, there's several nice ones, but probably *the* nicest one is number 57 [Kissinyougoodbye], another first cropper, Huntsville out of Yagonnakissmeornot.

"Those would be the stars of the show, but there's a lot of other bright ones also, that's for sure."

Stewart said it helps to enter the sale coming off one of his best racing nights in the business.

"I would say for a breeder, I don't think anybody had a better breeding day than we did last Saturday winning the million-dollar race (the inaugural Mohawk Million with Venerate) and the Metro (with Exploit), all in the same night," Stewart said. "I don't think too many breeders have been able to do that. A breeder might have won the Hambletonian and the Hambletonian Oaks, but the Oaks does not go for what the Metro went for. I'll let someone else look up the statistic, but I'll say that Hunterton probably did as well as you could possibly do in one night.

"Then, to toot our horn, they had eight Sires Stakes championships for Kentucky breds on the Sunday before and we won five of them. So, we're having a very good year. We didn't win the Hambletonian like we did last year, but we've won a whole lot of other ones. We sold Tall Dark Stranger and he's just about won everything and we raised Party Girl Hill, she was never sold because Tom Hill kept her. So, we raised her. There's a whole lot of top, top horses that come from us, let's put it that way."

Those are just the kind of stories leaving consignors optimistic about this year's sale.


"It's an exciting week," Reid said. "There's going to be a lot of horses change hands, with a lot of people coming in and coming out. We look forward to a long week, but hopefully a successful week and a good week.

"We just hope that we have a week that's satisfying enough to please everybody, keep commerce going in the industry... There's going to be champions sold out of this sale, there is every year. We hope the buyers find a way to find them in the safest way possible, the most comfortable way possible and, more importantly, whatever they feel is the best way to achieve that based on their individual needs."

Thomson started with an optimistic view and that's where we'll end, too.

"Winbak is selling more in Lexington than we've ever sold. In fact, we're selling about as many in any yearling select sale that we've ever sold. If I'm not optimistic... I don't know what I should be doing," he said, laughing.

## And through it all, Lexington is still here

When the COVID-19 pandemic started, there were doubts whether the sale would go ahead. Flash forward seven months and Rob Tribbett from All American, Mark Egloff of Vieux Carre Farms and Bob Boni of Northwood Bloodstock believe the industry will be as resilient as always.

Lexington will be ready.

That's the consensus of many already on the grounds at the Fasig-Tipton Sales Pavilion in an area not buzzing with

the same energy as it would a non-pandemic year.


COVID-19 caused racing to shut down in March and little foresight existed at that point to even conjure if events such as the Lexington Sale would occur.

"We're used to dealing with issues," said **Rob Tribbett**, general manager of **All American Harnessbreds**. "As breeders, there's always obstacles so we just have to keep going to the next day, to the next day, but I'm glad we have an opportunity to be here."

Mark Egloff of Vieux Carre Farms also was not discouraged by the sudden shift in the world. "You have to be an optimist to be in this business in the first place," he said. "March was way too early for us to get too crazy with thinking that we're going to have to do things a totally different way. In March we were still optimistic that the sale would happen and as of right now it looks like we were right."

Northwood Bloodstock's **Bob Boni** worried earlier in the year that the Lexington Sale would fail. But "as time has gone on I think people have [made] adjustments," he said. "They've kind of figured out what to do. And those that want to buy horses they'll find them... the right money always finds the right horses.

"We have a resilient market and we are a business still with a lot of working people; people who work for a living. And if they're businesses are doing well — guess what—they'll buy horses. At this juncture it's nice to know

that Jersey is going to have (state subsidy) money again next year, I think it's nice to know that you're going to have the casinos up and going, so all of those tracks are going to have money. I mean these horses are racing for pretty good money right now."

Coming into October, the world enters the seventh month of the pandemic. Though, since the first wave, several facets of North American life have met at the corner of new and normal. Lexington will allow buyers on the ground so long as they abide by standard social-distancing protocol. But this year, many are also given the option to participate remotely with low-latency, no-lag bidding, which will be the ideal option for those unable to make the trek to the Bluegrass.

However the electricity to Lexington has always in part come from the commingling of Grand Circuit racing with high-quality yearlings. Egloff, like many, feels it's a tough energy to replicate.

"There's no substituting the excitement of a live auction when everybody's there, and they've been to the races that day and got excited the stakes winners — [their] brothers and sisters... it feeds on itself. But hopefully its good enough. It's a year for creativity and people trying to do things a different way. And some businesses are more easily adaptable to that sort of thing than others. I think high-end horse sales — that personal touch and inspection is still going to be a pretty important part of it."



Along with the increased inclusion of virtual attendees, many consignors have placed focus on their digital platforms. Yearling videos are made available on the **Lexington Selected Sale's website** along with confirmation videos for those unable to visit the horses in person.

"Nothing beats the environment of having people in the same room in an electric environment," said Tribbett. "But the buyers that buy at the higher levels — they're sophisticated people and have really good teams in place that they're going to get the information they need. And they know how to value a horse."

#### All American's yearlings

Tribbett noted the high interest in yearlings from the first crop of world champion Walner, of which his consignment features two. All American also will have yearlings selling on the fifth day — a peculiarity for Tribbett — with Ohio-bred progeny from the first crops of Fear The Dragon and Downbytheseaside.

"I think those stallions [are] as good as any stallion; they could stand anywhere in the country and they stand in Ohio. And I think that's really exciting for not just Ohio buyers but for Grand Circuit buyers, so that they can buy a horse that has eligibility in that state. But those horses can really go in the Metro or in the Meadowlands Pace."

In the first day of the sale, Tribbett will send to the ring the colt he likes the most: a Cantab Hall brother to world champion JL Cruze named Top Rank (Hip 61).

"JL Cruze is as tough of a horse as we've seen in a long time. And this guy is, to me, a picture of what a horse should be," Tribbett said. "I'm very excited to sell him with his breeding and what he looks like."

#### Vieux Carre has a lot of "nice pacing colts"

Egloff, who last year sold the Somebeacahsomewhere - Economy Terror colt One Eight Hundred for \$800,000, has another colt from the broodmare by world champion Sweet Lou leading a lot of "nice pacing colts" for Vieux Carre Farms.

"The other categories I pretty much know who the nicest one is there," said Egloff, whose consignment is selling 20 yearlings through the five sessions. "Trotting colts it'd be [Hip] 49 - a Muscle

Hill colt out of Viva Las Lindy who's exceptional. Pacing fillies — I've got a real nice Captaintreacherous filly, [Hip] 79, who's exceptional. As far as the trotting fillies... I'll tell you, I've got a beautiful Donato Hanover filly selling later in the sale, [Hip] 610. She's probably my favorite as far as an individual in our consignment. That's later in the sale... we'll see how she does."

#### Northwood selling Always B Miki's full-brother

Northwood Bloodstock will send 21 yearlings through the sale. Fronting the consignment is Maximus Miki (Hip 70) — a full-brother to Always A Miki.

"We sold Always A Miki last year — he brought \$40,000 — and he was a very nice colt," Boni said. "The knock on him if there was [one]: he was small. This one here is almost an identical individual but you'd call him a big colt. The fact that he's the same type of horse but just bigger and stronger... he's pretty impressive. Knowing what I know about the brother from last year, he's just the same version... but we just went from a point guard to a power forward; from a half back to a tight end."

Boni also sends the yearling following Maximus Miki — Behindblueyes (Hip 71), a half-sister to Sister Sledge by Southwind Frank.

"She's a lovely filly. Very correct, very likeable filly, and I've been impressed with the Southwind Franks. He's got a very small first crop, and we've seen three sons of Muscle Hill: him, Bar Hopping and Trixton — they've all shown they can get the job done."

Northwood also features two yearlings from the first crop of Huntsville, among them Up The Hand (Hip 196)—the first foal out of the American Ideal mare Upper Hand.

"He's a very handsome horse; good sized horse — up off the ground, good head and eye," Boni said. "This is the first Huntsville I've had a chance to take a look at as a yearling and he's a good colt."

#### Breeders predicting good things for first-crop sires Walner and Huntsville

Bob Brady of Kentuckiana Farm, Art Zubrod of Brittany Farms, Steve Jones of Cameo Hills and Senena Esty of Spring Haven Farm foresee good things ahead for a deep group of talented yearlings.


It's time to shine for the colts and fillies of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Ready for their moments at the Fasig-Tipton Sales Pavilion tonight through Friday (with a mixed sale session on Saturday), the blue-blooded youngsters are the class of 2020. Pandemic or not, their breeders and consignors foresee good things ahead for a group highlighted by the first crops of Walner and Huntsville.

Spring Haven Farm is selling 52 colts and fillies. Owner Senena Esty singled out the first foal of Yankee Glide mare Mounds: "I am so in love with the #121 colt, Seven Mounds. He's a Chapter Seven, and he's probably one of the nicest trotters that I've ever raised, very comparable to another colt we raised, Fourth Dimension."

**Bob Brady**, manager of **Kentuckiana Farm**, sent the sport's first-ever million-dollar yearling through this very sales ring in 2019. Brady said that it's difficult to single out a few must-see horses from the 97 (after two outs) consigned by

Kentuckiana this time around: "We have a very good consignment, from top to bottom. As outstanding as last year's crop was, this year's probably has more depth to it," Brady said.

He's also very aware that all eyes are on a perfectly-named day one trotting colt, hip #64. "Obviously, I'm very high on the half-brother to Greenshoe," Brady said. "Bonanza's a super colt: very athletic, got a great head. He's what everyone is looking for at a yearling sale. He's got size and conformation, a ton of pedigree, so we're very happy to have him in our consignment. He's just exceptional."

Bonanza is the Muscle Hill half-brother to Maverick, who topped the 2019 sale with a record-breaking \$1.1 million final bid from Brad Grant and partners. All three sons of Designed To Be were bred by the Al Libfeld and Marvin Katz Partnership — Canada's 2019 Armstrong Brothers Breeder of the Year — and sold by Kentuckiana as agent.

"We have several more Muscle Hills, but I'm also excited about the first crop of Walners," said Brady. "As a group, they're very nice. They have a lot of size, leg, conformation, and they're really very easy horses to work with." Asked to single out another highly-anticipated yearling, the farm manager noted hip #37 Knights Guard, a Katz/Libfeld colt by

Muscle Hill out of Stubborn Belle. The full brother to Ms Savannah Belle (2,1:52.4; \$239,618) is a "very, very powerful colt with a tremendous amount of quick speed," said Brady. "He can shift gears whenever he wants to and just seems to keep going faster, when I turn him out. He has exceptional speed." He's also the full brother to Really Fast, who brought

\$700,000 at last year's Lexington sale.

On the pacing side, Brady said colts #93 Outwit Outrun (Captaintreacherous - Deception) and #108 Colby Jack (Always B Miki-Katie Said) were attracting attention. But a trend was clear: "Right now, what's hot is the top-end trotters, both the colts and the fillies. They're all getting lots of looks. Not just one horse; it's the real high-end trotters that are getting the most attention."

#### Brittany focusing on quality, not quantity

Art Zubrod, general manager of Brittany Farms LLC, said that with just 20 yearlings consigned this year, buyers can look at them all. "It's the smallest that we've sold since the mid-'80s, something like that. We've been in reduction mode," Zubrod said, adding that this gradual downsizing long predated COVID-19.

Quantity is offset by quality.

"I've got quite a few really nice trotting yearlings this year," he said. "If I had to pick one, it would be hip #47, Local Honey, by Chapter Seven out of Honey Honey — just a spectacular colt. I've got three Walner trotting colts and they're all very, very nice; a couple of Muscle Hills; a Father Patrick; I've got a very loaded consignment this year."


Hip #3 Captain Cook (Captaintreacherous—Fresh Look)

leads the Brittany pacers. "He probably improved more than any other yearling that we consigned, from the time we brought him in, in late July, until now. He's improved every day, basically, maturing," said Zubrod, also noting a filly by the same sire. "Hip #303, Queen of Success, out of Cashaway. That mare has got several 'Captains', but this is the first one that's acted like they want to be a real racehorse. She's very impressive in the paddock."


#### Jones excited about Huntsville

Steve Jones owns and operates Cameo Hills Farm, which consigned 32 colts and fillies to the Lexington sale. "We're excited to sell the first crop of Huntsville, because we stand the horse, so we're sort of partial to him and I've got several nice Huntsvilles to sell," Jones told HRU. "Specifically, fillies out of Big Mcdeal [Hip #288 Max Contract] and Divine Caroline [Hip #86 Just Divine], and a colt out of Happy Hannah [Hip # 239 Pop the Cork]."

Cameo Hills is sending out a trotting yearling who is already turning heads: "We're selling the first colt from Check Me Out [3,1:51.2; \$1,903,795), a Walner colt," said Jones, calling hip #59 King of the North "an outstanding individual" bred by Ray Schnittker. "He's very correct and racy-looking. He's one of the best horses that we videoed this year, if not the best." Another royally-bred trotting colt, hip #95 Klau

(Muscle Hill—Bonnie Lou), is out of the sale, due to injury. "I waited until the day our truck was leaving to make a decision on him," said Jones. "He's not a hundred per cent sound yet, but he's the first foal out of a nice mare, so hopefully down the road I can figure out something, sell him privately, maybe."

#### Senena Esty brimming with enthusiasm

Spring Haven Farm owner Senena Esty is brimming with enthusiasm for both her own yearlings and those of other breeders for whom she is agent. There are 52 colts and fillies consigned by Spring Haven, which is based in Ohio. When asked about the roster of the ones Spring Haven bred, Esty singled out the first foal of Yankee Glide mare Mounds: "I am so in love with the #121 colt, Seven Mounds. He's a Chapter Seven, and he's probably one of the nicest trotters that I've ever raised, very comparable to another colt we raised, Fourth Dimension." She said the farm's hilly terrain helped develop the powerful hindquarters of her beautifully-made "pick of the litter."

Among pacers, hip #9 stands out. "I really am high on our Captaintreacherous colt Poetic Captain," said Esty, who is selling the son of Western Ideal mare Poetic Lady for breeder Doug Millard of Woodstock, ON. "I think he's just conformationally-perfect... We sold Somebeachsomewhere

for my sister back when he was a yearling, so we can see a lot of resemblance as far as the character of this Captain colt. He's really laid back, but he looks very racy."

The Spring Haven consignment represents the work of multiple breeders, some of whom like to attend the sale and show their own yearlings. "We have a pretty tight group of Ohio folks we sell for and with, so it makes for a lot of fun too. We're all friends. They all come together under our umbrella, and we feel so fortunate for that," said Esty, who is also grateful for the Ontario connections she represents at Lexington, including Millard and Stonebridge Farm.

There is a sense of cautious optimism among the four consignors, each of whom mentioned that the 2020 sale is in the historic shadow of last year's epic event, which featured not only million-dollar-milestone-shattering Maverick, but also the sport's second seven-figure yearling, Damien. Esty looked at the recent Ohio sale as a bellwether for 2020: "It was one of the earlier sales, and we all said a lot of prayers about how it might turn out. It was a really good sale; I believe it was up 17 per cent from the previous year. So I'm optimistic, and I think that with these tools that you mentioned, the online bidding, it will be as good as in years past. Maybe not as good as last year, that is tough to beat, but I think it's going to be a strong sale."

New York-based Jones shared that perspective. "We just came from the sale at Goshen that was a regional sale, but that was well-attended and the average of the sale was the exact same as it was last year," he said. "This is a different dynamic down here. There's a lot of horses in the book, so I would think the tail end of the sale would be affected, maybe some other parts as well. But I think if you've got well-bred fillies in particular, with a lot of pedigree, I don't think there's going to be any problem at all there. People are probably coming down here hoping they can steal them, but I think that is unlikely to happen." He's confident that virtual participation will lead to "more people who are comfortable buying a horse from their living room."

Brittany's Zubrod said he will assess the value of the sale's new virtual aspect after the final horse has left the ring. He expects a decline from the sky-high prices of 2019, in part because of international travel difficulties during the pandemic. "We're definitely going to see an effect, but I'm confident going in that we're going to be okay." Live bidding from outside the USA serves a purpose, but he added that "there's something to be said for being at the sale and seeing the horse. The owners — the potential owners, the bidders — fall in love with one. I don't think you can fall in love with one over the Internet."

Kentuckiana's Brady said that interest in buying young standardbreds had held up this year, despite COVID-19 concerns: "I think that we're making the best of the situation that we're given. There's a lot of buyers here, a lot of horses. We started in the middle of the summer, showing horses from August on, and people came to the farm. We had lots of visitors."

A growing comfort with online shopping has been an unintended side-effect of coronavirus restrictions on travel and public gatherings. Brady said the Lexington sale will likely reap the benefit of technological improvements that have paved the way for virtual transactions, allowing a safe and profitable experience for consignors and buyers alike. "I think the market's going to be fine," he said. "We've shown a lot of horses, a lot of people are looking at them, and they aren't looking for bargains, they're looking to buy horses, and they want to buy something good. I think the top end is going to be really strong, and I think that just tends to filter down. You know, things have been picking up in the economy, and I think people realize that you have to buy this year to race next year, so I think we're going to be okay."



# LEXINGTON Selected Yearling Sale

#### The view from Blue Chip, Cane Run and Anvil and Lace

Beth Yontz, Tom Grossman and Elizabeth Caldwell tout their Lexington consignments and give their thoughts on selling horses during a pandemic.

Although the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale will have a different look and feel to it this year, a stable of strong prospects has three consignors hoping for strong results.

While the effects of COVID-19 have presented a myriad of challenges to this year's annual yearling sale, to be held starting tonight (Oct. 5) through Oct. 9 (with a mixed sale on Oct. 10) at Fasig-Tipton's sales pavilion in Lexington, KY, prospective buyers will have ample opportunity to add young talents to their barn.

**Anvil and Lace Farm**, located in central Kentucky, is owned and operated by Doug (who is also a farrier) and **Beth Yontz** (who grew up in racing).

The operation, which preps and consigns at all major sales, is no stranger to success. In 2014, Anvil and Lace sold the highest priced Sportswriter filly, Dancin In the Nude. In 2019, Anvil and Lace graduate Dancin Lou won the Breeders Crown 3-year-old colt pace.

Beth, breeder of multiple award winner Dancin Yankee, once again has some exciting yearlings for this year's sale in her consignment role.

"I have Southwind Tyrion's full-brother, Eden Onthehill (Hip 183), and I think that speaks for itself. He's very attractive, obviously. Great video... but he's good to be around as well. He's the whole package. Some of them have one, but not the other – he's a cool cat. He kind of walks with a bounce, like, 'I know what I am.' He's a very confident colt, but not studdy or mean at all."

There's also another Yontz speaks highly of, a horse that has significant personal meaning.

"I'm partial to Dancin Lou's full-brother, Dancin Sancho (Hip 247), just because he's mine. That family speaks for itself. The mare is a 100 per cent producer of racehorses at two. No, the filly didn't get a mark, but she went to Florida, had something, was sent home and had a month off. So, she was

a month behind and we shut her down after a few starts. Being an Always B Miki, she's kind of big and growthy, so hopefully she'll come back and be a good 3-year-old. That's really the only one that didn't have a mark at 2 on the mare's whole page. This yearling, some people might think he's a little small – and he is if you compare him to the Captains and the Somebeaches – but his family, that's what they are. Lou wasn't a tall colt, but I think at this stage, this colt might



have a little more height. He's bigger than Dancin In the Nude ever was. He's right where he's supposed to be."

Yontz also mentioned a three-quarter brother (Hip 522) to Dune Hill.

"I don't how he's going to sell, being an EL Titan. If he were a Muscle Hill in the way he looks... I actually had Dune Hill as a yearling before she went to Ron Burke to be trained, and I had the first foal of the mare to Credit Winner, Unleash The Titan, as a yearling. They were put together not as big as this colt – I'm not saying he's too big – but they were just very small. This colt is a good-looking, strapping colt. But I don't think he's going to get as much as he should because he's an E L Titan."

Like everyone else connected with the sale, it's taken long hours and hard work to get the yearlings to this point.

"I went to Ohio and I saw how things were handled there. We should be happy that we're having this sale, as a consignor and seller. As buyers and trainers, be happy that you have a place to purchase new and upcoming horses. There have been challenges along the way, including if the Canadian buyers would come down. Randy [co-sale manager, Manges] told me, 'If they want the horse, they'll find it.' I think that stands true with not just the people here, but also the Canadian buyers. I'm a little nervous, yes. It's sale time and I'm nervous no matter what. But I think we'll be okay. Nothing will compare with last year, but I think the sale will be good. When I was in Ohio, there was enthusiasm, and I think at the end of the day, that's what we all need."

#### Grossman excited about Walner and Huntsville

**Tom Grossman**, owner of one of the top standardbred outfits in the sport, the Wallkill, NY-based **Blue Chip Farms**, has some possible blue-chip youngsters likely to garner a fair share of serious looks at the sale.

Blue Chip showcases 700 acres, home to six barns with 122 stalls and 18 sheds and currently stands, or manages, nine of the highest-ranking standardbred stallions in North America, Australia and New Zealand. Harness racing heavyweights Bettor's Delight, Rock N Roll Heaven, Credit Winner, and Roll With Joe call Blue Chip home.

Grossman, who took over the reins of Blue Chip in 2001, said he is hopeful the Lexington Sale yields more standardbred standouts.

Offspring of Walner has Grossman, and others, talking.

The 2016 Dan Patch 2-year-old trotting colt of the year, and 2016 Breeders Crown Champion compiled earnings of \$567,652. The son of Chapter Seven debuted his stallion

career at Southwind Farms with a stud fee of \$20,000.

"I think like a lot of people, Walner is very exciting," said Grossman. "We have a beautiful Walner (Hip 44) I also have a Walner brother to Plunge Blue Chip selling in Harrisburg. Both Walners, to me, look enough like Chapter Seven to get you excited, but at least the three or four that I've been around – we've raised a couple for clients – are very forward, and have big personalities. Conformationally, he looks like he's going to have that Chapter Seven front end that's so game changing. Very excited for him."

As is Grossman of world champion and 2016 Dan Patch award winner, Huntsville, who was retired in 2017 and eventually made his way to the breeding shed.

"In terms of first-crop sires, the Huntsvilles (Hip 492) all very much look the part to me. It wouldn't be a dark horse necessarily, but all, to me, are very

Somebeachsomewhere-looking horses, which is nothing but a compliment. Without getting political, there's a lot of debate going on between Always B Miki, and Betting Line, but I still very much believe in Betting Line. We have a couple (Hip 137 and Hip 467) of really nice ones to sell. If they don't sell well because of a couple bad breaks in his first crop, I wouldn't be afraid to buy one, that's for sure."

Grossman said he is happy with his sale band.

"To be fair, we bring a pretty select group of yearlings to Kentucky that we love pedigree-wise and conformation-wise. I think that physically and conditionally, my group has turned out better than they ever have, across the board. Obviously, there are always a couple of exceptions here and there. In terms of general health and muscle tone, this group has been very mature and strong, physically, when they came in from the yearling fields, more so than any year I can remember. I would say the pedigrees are what they are, but physically, this our best group."

He said he's cautiously optimistic that the sale will be a successful one.

"Clearly, an objective look at the first few yearlings sales is no doom at all. We're comparing things to a world record year last year, but I thought Goshen was a very solid sale. The middle at Goshen was really good. Everything I heard from Ohio and the numbers certainly looked positive. The amount of views – I'm involved with onGait – they're getting for their yearling sales is very high. I'm one of those plan-for-the-worst, hope-for-the-best people. So far, I think it's better than what we've feared. Having all those online bidders and a wider audience that don't necessarily feel at a disadvantage not being there, I think it is an offset for the middle of the market, which is where breeders live and die. Selling a big one helps a lot. But when your average goes from \$45,000 to \$55,000 for 80 yearlings, that's a lot of money."

#### Cane Run selling Walner's brother

**Elizabeth Caldwell** knows the standardbred industry inside and out.

Born in Kentucky, her grandparents, Fredrick and Frances Dodge Van Lennep, owned the legendary Castleton Farms in Kentucky, home to numerous champions. The Van Lenneps also inaugurated Pompano Park Racetrack, the initial Winter Capital of Harness Racing in the early 1960s.

Her mother, Fredericka V. Caldwell is the owner of Cane Run Farm located in Georgetown, KY. Elizabeth and her brother, Danny, run the 210-acre farm. Cane Run was a standardbred nursery in 1982. The first group of race fillies included Guiding Beam, Heather's Feather, as well as Nan Hanover, dam of Nan's Catch, the dam of the international

star Moni Maker.

These days, about 70 horses (mares, foals, yearlings, layups and retirees) live on the farm. Some belong to the Caldwells and others are boarded for clients.

"We have a few nice horses. We have the half-brother to Walner selling this year. He's Hip 12, Tetrick Wania. He's pretty nice. We also have a nice Father Patrick colt, Hip 51, Weslynn Crown – both of them are on the first night of the sale. We have a first foal out of Temple Ruins... she's a multiple stakes winner. We have a Muscle Hilly filly (Hip 170) who is on the second night also. We have a nice group. It's not like last year's group, I think, with the exception of the half-brother to Walner and Father Patrick colts."

Caldwell is also impressed with a pair of other yearlings, both of whom might initially fly under the radar of potential purchasers.

"We have two colts selling a little later in the week, both trotters. One is a Kadabra (Hip 637), and the other one is a Cantab Hall (Hip 516). They're both pretty nice. The Cantab, he's pretty popular when people see him. Maybe, at first glance at the page, she's had a few foals and maybe something needs to happen, but he's pretty athletic, big and strong."

Like other consignors, the worldwide pandemic has prompted new ways at tackling the sale.

Although she's not quite certain what to expect in terms of how the sale will play out, Caldwell sees ample opportunities for those looking to buy.

"When everything happened, the shutdown and all of that, with no racing, that was pretty scary. We were thinking if people aren't racing, why are they going to buy horses in the fall. Are we even going to have a sale? Thank goodness everything opened back up. At least we're moving along. We were concerned people weren't going to come to the sale or to the farm to see the yearlings, but we've had quite a bit of foot traffic out here, more so than I would have expected. I don't know how it's going to go, so we're just trying to do our best to get the information on the horses out there. We have a solid group and I'm pleased with all of them. It's just depends on what people want and what they're willing to spend."

Yearling sales are full of optimism – from the buyers looking for the next champion to the consigners that look to build on their farm's legacy.

While the 2020 yearling sales will have some unknowns due to COVID-19, **Crawford Farms** and **Concord Stud Farm** believe it being another successful sale.

Michelle and Al Crawford will be sending 54 yearlings through the Fasig-Tipton Sales Pavilion sales ring, including eight on the opening night.

"On the opening night, I am excited about every single one of them honestly," said Michelle Crawford. "We are really excited about the first colt out of Blue Beach (Beach Vibes – Hip #39). He's super special."

Beach Vibes is a bay son of American Ideal whose second dam is the Hall of Famer Rainbow Blue.

The Crawfords are also excited about their Chapter Seven yearlings and the first crop of Huntsville.

"Huntsville has those Somebeach traits and Huntsville is a big boy himself, a beautiful individual. Our Huntsvilles are probably as good looking a yearling as we have ever produced," said Al Crawford.

Crawford Farm will send three Huntsvilles out on the

opening night – Bounty Hunter (Hip #56), Foxhunt (Hip #67) and All About The Hunt (Hip #78).

All three colts are first foals. Bounty Hunter is out of Stonebridge Sundae (1:52.1; \$115,998) and Foxhunt is out of Wrangler Magic (1:50.2; \$897,021). All About The Hunt is out of All About Kisses (1:50.4; \$520,503).

"(All About The Hunt) is probably one of the best looking, pound for pound, drop dead gorgeous. He's probably the number one athlete when we shot the yearling tapes," said Al

An American Ideal filly that is also drawing the buyer's attention is Hamptons Babe (Hip #105).

She is the second foal out the world champion mare, Anndrovette (1:48; \$3,544,930).

"She's stunning too," added Michelle.

On the trotting side, the Crawfords are also excited about Pure Wow (Hip #91 – by Father Patrick out of No Pan No Gain).

"She is fabulous," said Al. "She has had a lot of compliments. Several have said she could be our sale topper.

She is Crazy Wow's half-sister. She's a gorgeous individual. She's big and strong and absolutely flies."

Despite what happens over the next few nights, the Crawfords may be one of a few folks not looking forward to seeing 2020 end.

Crawford Farm co-owns and bred the Hambletonian champion Ramona Hill, co-owns Sorella, the Hambletonian Oaks winner and the sophomore pacing star, Tall Dark Stranger.

"We went from COVID to no racing to a huge recession. It was painful in May and June, for the whole industry, including us," said Al.

"We have broken all of our records in terms of earnings from our racing stock. To have the Hambo, the Oaks, the Meadowlands Pace, the Cane Pace and North America Cup all won in the same year is unbelievable."

### Concord new to selling in Lexington

A new consignment at this year's sale will be the 13 trotters and a pacer offered by David Meirs III's Concord Stud Farm.

It will the first time the Cream Ridge, NJ nursery will sell at the Lexington Select Sale.

"We had a couple of owners that wanted to sell their yearlings in Lexington this year. That's the long and short of it," said Meirs. "They wanted to try a different place to sell their yearlings. You can't beat the atmosphere in Lexington that is for sure."

Concord Stud Farm will sell nine trotters on the opening night – four Muscle Hills, three Chapter Sevens and a pair of Cantab Halls.

"We sure hope to have a very nice opening night," said Meirs.

Headlining the ennead will be Monkey Queen (Hip #62). The Chapter Seven-Steamy Windows filly is the full sister to Gimpanzee.

"I would think she would be one of them at the top."

Meirs is also high on is the sixth foal of Order By Wish, this one by Muscle Hill. Ghetto For Life (Hip #65) is a full sister to Marseille (1:51.4; \$516,791) and Rome Pays Off (1:52.3; \$402,934).

Meirs said he also thinks there could be plenty of bargains available in this year's sale.

"I think there are several sleepers in the group. That is why buyers and the agents come look for those sleepers. Last week we had Chuck Sylvester's colt (Arnold N Dicky a \$17,000 purchase in the 2019 sale) set a world record at Delaware."

### Peninsula selling Maven's baby

Carter Duer's Peninsula Farms from nearby Georgetown, KY is a long-time fixture at the Lexington sale.

Last year, Peninsula Farms sold 43 yearlings for a \$62,837

average. They will be selling 53 yearlings (46 trotters and 7 pacers) this year, including six during tonight's opening session.

Peninsula Farms' offerings include Pretender (Hip #114), who is by Muscle Hill out of the world champion Maven.

In 2018, Peninsula topped the Lexington sale when it sold Chestnut Hill for \$410,000. The son of Muscle Hill out of Poof She's Gone recently won the Canadian Trotting Classic.

### Thoughts on online bidding

Do the consignors have any concerns with the COVID-19 economy or the new online bidding process?

"I am excited about online bidding, considering the situation. Both of the previous sales (Ohio and Goshen), I heard that online bidding was an important part of those sales and their success," said Meirs.

"I think this sale is going to be firm. Kudos to all of the breeding farms for all of the videos, the 360 degree views and the vet reports. It's giving the buyers a huge look at the yearlings without having to be there (in person). Most people have a trainer, an agent or another owner that they use to get one last look at the consignment," said Al Crawford. "The New York breds should sell well, the Ohio breds are selling well. Pennsylvania is still in good shape. New Jersey looks like it is firm and Kentucky looks like it's okay."

"Al and I went to the thoroughbred sale at Fasig-Tipton to get a feel. People showed up," said Michelle Crawford.



# Cattlewash equals 1:46.4 world record in Bluegrass

**Cattlewash** equalled the 1:46.4 3-year-old world record set by his sire Somebeachsomewhere and later matched by He's Watching on Sunday (Oct. 4) at Red Mile in the first of three divisions for the \$203,800 Captaintreacherous Bluegrass Three-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace — sponsored by the Captaintreacherous Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms—on.

Captain Kirk set a quick pace with Cattlewash stalking second, but once driver David Miller pulled the Ron Burke trainee from the pocket he lifted flight and sprinted to the world record.

With Captain Kirk clearing Cattlewash by a :27 first quarter, Captain Kirk continued to roll up the backstretch towards a :53.3 half and around the far turn to three-quarters in 1:20.3. Cattlewash revved out of the pocket spinning for the finish and swept past Captain Kirk with extended strides as Miller kept the reins high in the final-quarter sprint. The Somebeachsomewhere colt stopped the clock to match his sire's world record while winning by open lengths over Captain Kirk. Save Me A Dance closed for third with Sandbetweenmytoes fourth.

Shaving nearly four seconds off his lifetime best, Cattlewash scored his third victory from 10 starts this season and his seventh from 23 overall, earning \$551,502 for owner/breeder W.J. Donovan. He paid \$5.60 to win.

Game to the finish once again, **Tall Dark Stranger** withstood a late challenge from pocket-popper Captain Barbossa to pad his resume with a 1:48.3 victory in the final division.

Unhurried from the pylon post to a :26.3 first quarter, driver

Yannick Gingras angled Tall Dark Stranger off the pylons to brush for the lead moving into the backstretch. Early leader Captain Barbossa yielded for the pocket approaching a :55 half and remained in tow behind the Bettors Delight colt to three-quarters in 1:22.2.

Spinning into the stretch, Captain Barbossa pulled for the attack and pressed Tall Dark Stranger for the lead into the final eighth. But Tall Dark Stranger fought back to the inside and edged away from Captain Barbossa to the finish to score his 17thvictory from 19 starts. The Greek Freak finished third with Seriously Hanover fourth.

"He makes it a little hard on my heart, really," said Gingras after the race of the colt's continual gutsiness. "I knew he was going to put up — and every time I've called on him he's always been there. He just makes anxious moments once in awhile, but he always [shows] up. Top of the stretch I called on him, and halfway through the stretch I knew [Captain Barbossa] wasn't going to go by me. I knew mine was fighting; he was still in front — usually they're by me at that point and he comes back and beat them. But this time I held them at bay."

Amassing \$1,775,445 in earnings for owners Crawford Farms Racing, Marvin Katz, Caviart Farms and Howard Taylor, Tall Dark Stranger now has nine wins from 10 starts this year. Nancy Takter trains the James Avritt Sr.-bred colt who paid

By the quarter in :28, Peaky Sneaky led Baby Your The Best, Hen Party and Reflect With Me in a single-file stroll to a :56 half. Hen Party edged first over into the far turn but advanced through a quickening pace to three-quarters in 1:23.3 and began to falter into the stretch. Baby Your The Best gave pursuit to Peaky Sneaky from the pocket but settled for second three-and-three-quarter lengths behind. Reflect With Me rallied for third while stablemate Hen Party held fourth.

"I've kind of been waiting for her to get the chance to win

EL Ideal crossed to the cones and parked It's Academic by a :27.1 first quarter before letting the Uncle Peter colt clear command, but soon circled from second to the top heading to a :54.4 half.



### Horse agent Pat Waldo dead at 79

The standardbred world has lost a legendary horseman. Patrick Waldo died on Saturday (Oct. 3) at the age of 79. He died at his home in Pennsylvania after a long battle with declining health. He was surrounded by his family, his wife Charlyn, son, Jeffrey, daughter Patricia and her husband Dan, and his grandchildren Lia and Dominick.

"One of the things he did in his adult life is go to yearling sales. It's ironic how somebody like that would die when they would normally show up at a sale," said Preferred Equine's David Reid. "Pat was unique. Pat was the first guy I worked for in 1983. He had a little bit of a gruff personality, but he was a good man and talented. He had an eye for a horse. He was a long-time employ of Phil Tully's, as well. He was around horses all his life and had a good opinion and a respected eye."

Among many talented horses Waldo picked out were 2012 Hambletonian winner Market Share and top stallion Chapter Seven for owner Richard Gutnick.

After winning the Hambletonian, Linda Toscano, who trained both horses, told Dave Briggs for *The Canadian Sportsman*, "(Waldo) picks a horse on his movement," Toscano said.

Which explains how he came to love two sons of relatively unheralded sires in back- to-back years. Market Share's pedigree is so unconventional it falls among just the one per cent of standardbreds that do not trace their lineage back to the namesake of trotting's greatest race — Hambletonian 10.

"I didn't make it out to Kentucky that year," Gutnick said, recalling the year Waldo was touting Market Share. "I said, 'A Revenue S? You want me to buy a Revenue S, are you crazy?' He said, 'Yeah, he can flat out fly.' I said to him, 'Go ahead and buy him.' That's how I got him."

Chapter Seven and Market Share earned more than \$5.7 million combined.

Waldo's family would like to thank all who called and visited during his illness. May God bless everyone for your thoughtfulness and prayers.
