All things considered, it was a very strong opening night


The opening session of the 2020 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale was down 16.3 per cent in both average and gross compared to a year ago, which is understandable when selling horses in a pandemic and comparing numbers to the most successful sale in the company's history. Still, the numbers prove Monday was the second best opening night in the sale's history.

LEXINGTON Selected Yearling Sale

Monday's opening session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion in Lexington, KY was down 16.3 per cent in both average and gross compared to 2019's opening session. Yet, considering the COVID-19 pandemic, and the fact that 2019 was the most successful sale in the company's history, makes the two sessions difficult to compare.

"In light of everything, I don't think you can compare to last year," said David Reid, who manages the sale with Randy Manges. "History was made selling two million-dollar horses, but besides that we sold another one for \$800,000. Also, the last three years down here, it's been record after record after record, so you've really got to peel back and see where we are compared to maybe two or three years ago. That being said, the crowd was definitely a little less, but I think that the makeup of the buyers, from the trainers point of view and the owners that could come here tonight, it was a very good

representation of the industry."

Still, Monday's average of \$129,127 and gross of \$15,237,000, while both down from the average of \$154,288 and \$18,206,000 from a year ago, both exceeded the 2018 average of \$126,471 and the 2018 gross of \$12,900,000.

That means Monday's session, despite the pandemic, was the second best opening night in sale history.

"I was really pleased with the numbers tonight," Manges said. "I thought we would be down, but I was thinking we would probably be down anyway if we didn't have two

million-dollar horses sell. We had so many big numbers last year."

In 2017, the opening night average was \$114,344 and the gross was \$10,634,000.

Monday's median price was \$100,000. The median was \$110,000 in 2019, \$120,000 in 2018 and \$100,000 in 2017.

This year and last, 118 yearlings were sold on opening night.

That any yearlings were sold this year at Lexington is a major accomplishment, Reid said.

"It was a beautiful sight to see people come to Lexington and attend a live sale. It's been bantered back and forth all since the springtime, 'How are you going to have a live sale? What are you going to do?' and I think the staff of the sales company and the staff of the auction crew, the staff of the consignments and the breeders... deserve a lot of credit. It's not easy for anybody, but to be able to hold the venue tonight, as we did — before I see any numbers — it felt healthy enough under the current environment and I think it's something we can build from."

Reid said he thought the, "Internet bidding platform worked very well and I would assume it's going to be more popular as the week goes on."

Manges said adjusting to online bidding was a bit of a challenge.

"We did it in Ohio, but with a different company," Manges



said. "It was kind of new for us to do this. We didn't expect to have the number of people that signed up for online bidding that signed up. We added an additional 60 tonight after the sale started."

Reid said he thinks in-person sale work best, "but we had to adjust to the marketplace and instituted the online and phone bidding and the expanded area around here. I think there's more positives than negative. It sets the tone for the week and I think, operationally, it's a credit to our staff and a credit to the whole team around the facility and the auction crew. I thought tonight was very well-handled in spite of everything and I'm actually quite proud of the whole organization.

Leading buyer Nancy Takter said, "the average horse maybe brought a little less than they normally would have, but the high-end horses, they brought what they were supposed to bring. Those ownership groups had their trainers and the trainers were qualified to buy and bid on those horses."

Takter purchased eight yearlings on opening night, spending \$1,292,000, total. She spent slightly more than Andy Miller, who spent \$1,270,000, total, to buy four yearlings.

The session topper was Kadena (Hip #89), a daughter of first-crop sire Walner that is the second foal out of the scintillating mare Mission Brief. Kadena was bred by the Mission Brief Stable, consigned by Hunterton Farm of Paris, KY and sold for \$725,000 to trainer Marcus Melander. Mission Brief's first foal, a Father Patrick-sired filly named Adirondack, sold for \$400,000 at last year's Lexington sale to Diamond Creek Racing.

Melander purchased Kadena for Anders Ström's Courant, Inc. and said he really liked the filly when he first saw her at Hunterton in June.

"Then, the second time at the farm, I still liked her and I told Anders that she was the best horse in the sale, in my opinion. Of course, I hadn't seen all of them at that point... but we both thought she was the best-looking horse and she has a great gait, a good video... just several things that we're

Melander said he thought she would sell closer to \$600,000.

"I had Anders on the phone and we could've gone a little bit higher, but it was close," Melander said. "I wanted to show that we were very serious about her. Like I said, it was our top pick and we're happy to get her."

Steve Stewart of Hunterton Farm said he predicted a year ago that Kadena would top the 2020 sale.

"I told Dave Reid a year ago," Stewart said. "He was (inspecting) yearlings a year ago and I said, 'I want to go show you next year's sale topper.' She was that nice when she was born, just a real classy filly all the way around.

"We had high expectations, but with COVID-19 and everything, you can't assume anything. It could've been \$400,000, \$450,000, \$500,000... but there was a tremendous amount of interest, obviously. To get those prices like that, what has to happen is that you have to have the page, but then you also have to have the individual and it doesn't happen very often. Very rarely, and it happened with her. She's a very special filly."

Melander told the USTA's Ken Weingartner that he thought opening night was, "very strong in my opinion. I thought you could find something you really liked for a bargain, but it was tough, which is very good. We bid on a couple horses that we didn't get but I'm very happy with what we got. I can't complain."

The second-highest-priced yearling sold Monday was Hip #64 Bonanza, a Muscle Hill—Designed To Be half-brother to

Greenshoe that sold for \$600,000 to Takter, agent. Last year, Bonanza's Farther Patrick-sired brother, Maverick, became the sport's first million-dollar yearling sold at auction when he was purchased for \$1.1 million. All three colts — Greenshoe, Maverick and Bonanza — were bred by Al Libfeld and Marvin Katz and consigned by Kentuckiana Farms.

"He's a really nice individual, great pedigree," Takter said. "I know that he's been raised right... (He's a) Muscle Hill and


the mare has already produced one world champion out of Father Patrick. Like I've said earlier today, Maverick is a good horse. Personally, I think Tony (Alagna) is going to figure him out and he'll be fine in the end. The way they've raved about the horse training down, I'm sure he's going to be a good horse. And this one being a Muscle Hill, we just couldn't pass on him."

Takter said Bud Hatfield and Brixton Medical were the primary buyers of Bonanza.

Fresh off his win in the inaugural \$1 million Mohawk Million with Venerate on Sept. 26 at Woodbine Mohawk Park, part-owner Andy Miller quickly reinvested buying two yearlings for \$400,000 apiece three hips apart, both consigned by Kentuckiana Farms.

"That helps a little bit. Winning the Mohawk Million, words can't really describe that," Miller said. "Obviously, it's not all our money here, we have owners, but it always helps to have a couple bucks."

Miller signed the ticket for Hip #37 Knights Guard, a Muscle Hill colt out of Stubborn Belle and Hip #40 Trunk Bay, a Muscle Hill colt out of Sunshine Delight.

Knights Guard was bred by Al Libfeld and is a full-brother to \$300,000+ winning filly Ms Savannah Belle.

Trunk Bay was bred by James Wilhite, Jr. of Lexington and is the first foal out of Sunshine Delight, a Credit Winner mare that earned \$354.847 on the track.

Miller said he liked "everything" about the pair.

"We looked at them, we got them out, I walked them. We really loved them when we looked at them," Miller said. "Then we walked them and turned them out in the paddock and they really moved nice, so we loved pretty much everything about them.

"We haven't trained a lot out of these families, but we've raced against them."

In all, 60 yearlings sold for \$100,000 or more, including 20 that were sold for \$200,000 or higher and nine at \$300,000 or more. The number of six-figure yearlings was down eight from 2019 when 68 exceeded \$100,000, 21 surpassed \$200,000 and nine fetched \$300,000 or more.

In 2018, 64 yearlings sold for \$100,000 or more, including 17 over \$200,000 and five over \$300,000.

Hunterton Sales Agency, Inc. was the leading consignor by gross, as it was on opening night in 2019. This year, Hunterton grossed \$2,939,000 for 18 yearlings sold, followed by Preferred Equine at \$2,620,000 for 20 sold, Kentuckiana at \$2,615,000 for 12 sold and Lexington newcomers Concord Stud Farm at \$1,577,000 for nine sold.

On opening night in 2019, Hunterton sold28 yearlings for a total gross of \$4,162,000, an average of \$148,643.

Kentuckiana led all consignors by average on Monday with an average of \$217,917, followed by Northwood Bloodstock at \$195,000 for two yearlings sold, Concord at \$175,222 and Hunterton at \$163,278.

The sale session ended on a high note when Preferred sold two Captaintreacherous pacing fillies for \$260,000 and \$375,000. Hip #123 Treacherous Dragon, out of My Little Dragon, was purchased for \$260,000 by trainer Brett Pelling. Hip #124 Lightnier, out of Mythical, went to David Menary, agent, for \$375,000.

Manges said overall numbers help build momentum for the entire sale.

"I think it's always good to have a strong first night," Manges said. "People talk about it and readjust and if they're going to get what they want they're going to have to step up because there are buyers out there that will buy."

Among his many talents, our resident Guru is particularly skilled at the high-priced yearling game. So much so, we like to think of him more of a Soothsayer in this regard. So, we asked whether we could put him to the test at this year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale by having him rank the Top 10 yearlings to be sold at each session. Being a Soothsayer, he saw the request coming before we even asked, of course, and readily agreed to put his yearling prediction talents on the line.



Since this is a challenging year, breeders worked many years to get their horses to this sale and yearling markets are delicate things, we were reluctant to publish his predictions on the Top 10 horses to be sold BEFORE they actually went into the ring, lest they influence said market. So, we asked The Guru to send us his top 10 list before each night's auction started — and kept the emails to prove it in case anyone asks. The bonus of showing you his predictions after the horses sold is it allows us to give instant feedback on just how The Guru did in his yearling handicapping.

1. Hip #64 BONANZA— A Muscle Hill brother to the phenomenal Greenshoe and the disappointing Maverick. He will not bring \$1 million, but will be a very appealing prospect with a pedigree second to none. To top that off, he is a talented and fabulous individual.

Actual Rank: 2nd at \$600,000

2. Hip #89 KADENA— Name recognition alone elevates this filly to the top of the sale. Who wouldn't want a daughter of the great Mission Brief in their broodmare band? The change in sires is a plus as is the fact she is a lovely individual.

Actual Rank: 1st at \$725,000

3. Hip #62 MONKEY QUEEN— A full sister to one of the top trotters of all time, Gimpanzee, and his 2-year-old brother Iteration who is approaching \$300,000 in his freshman year. This is a no lose situation.

Actual Rank: 3rd at \$450,000

4. Hip #107 ULYSES KEMP— Second foal, the first Venerate is a 2-year-old with almost \$700,000 on his card as of this writing and a record of 1:51.4. After Venerate won the KYSS Final and the Mohawk Million the owners have plenty of bullets for the brother.

Actual Rank: 41st at \$140,000

5. Hip #3 CAPTAIN COOK – The best looking pacer in the sale. Under the second dam American Ideal under the third dam (Delinquent Account) the great Life Sign. Need I say more?

Actual Rank: 55th at \$100,000

Actual Rank: 14th at \$200,000


8. Hip #65 GHETTO FOR LIFE— The full brother to \$500,000 winner Marseille. This great looking colt is out of a Cantab Hall sister to Cash Hall and is what some may consider the golden cross in trotting.

In summary, The Guru did some pretty damn impressive yearling handicapping. He, basically, nailed the top three — with just the top two reversed — landed half of his 10 picks in the actual Top 10, two more were knocking on the door of the Top 10 and every one of his picks sold for \$100,000 or more. Okay, so his fourth, fifth and eighth-ranked yearlings didn't rank as highly as he thought they would, but that's a minor quibble. Time will tell who the real winner of those ones — and all of them, actually — will be.

Brady Jenson making his mark at Minnesota's Running Aces

Brady Jenson can recall those moments, some of them vividly, when he was in the college classroom, meticulously studying his notes, jotting down names and dates. Throughout the semester, as the professor made his way through the lectures, students listened attentively, making sure they gathered all of the information they could ahead for upcoming tests and exams.

The young man from Iowa was also busy, albeit in a much different way from his contemporaries.

Although he can't say with 100 per cent certainty, Jenson is pretty sure he was the only one looking at purchasing standardbreds during those classes.

"I went to DMACC, which is the Des Moines Area Community College in Iowa," said Jenson, whose family has deep roots in horse racing. "I just went for a general degree. I had no idea what I wanted to do. I went with the hope of finding out what I wanted to do. I realized that when I was sitting in class every day, thinking about horses, and looking at onGait [a website dedicated to buying and selling horses] on my phone and computer. That gave me the sign that college wasn't what I wanted to be doing. I wanted to be in racing."

Jenson decided to take a year off from the collegiate life, an opportunity, as he saw it, to take time to ponder his future.

Ultimately, he felt compelled to head back to school and pursue a two-year degree.

That plan, however, took a turn when he stumbled upon an ad on Facebook during one of his classes.

"The first year after high school, I went straight to college. Then I did full of year of horse racing. That fall, I decided to go back to school and see about getting my two-year degree.

Well, I dropped out that semester, my second year of college, after being away from it for a year. That winter, I went to Florida to work for [high profile trainer] Erv Miller."

The Sunshine State experience finally provided Jenson with the clarity he'd been searching for.

He's been in the horse racing industry ever since that soiourn to the southern U.S.

"That was a fun time, just seeing how the operation works, working with the babies and the 3-year-olds. I groomed six horses for Erv and at that time, I was 20. I learned a lot from

being there. All it took was seeing that ad when I was in school, calling Erv the next day, and getting the job. I went to Florida around Christmas and came back when the stable moved back up north. I headed to Running Aces [a racetrack, hotel and casino, in Columbus, MN] and I've been in racing ever since."

In 2015, Jenson drove in 95 races, winning five, along with 22 seconds and 19 thirds. He recorded five seconds and a pair of thirds in 23 training starts.

Although he went winless in the race bike the following year, he notched nine wins as a trainer.

It was in 2017 when he started to make headway and heads turn.

On July 2 of that year, the third generation horseman, then 21, piloted his own trainee, Mac Anover, to victory in a \$3,500 maiden pace at Running Aces.

The triumph marked the first lifetime pari-mutuel win for both horse and reinsman. Although he had several training/driving scores on the fair circuit, this was a milestone moment he can recall as though it were yesterday.

"He was a McArdle and we bought the mare in-foal, and Mac Anover was the baby we got. He was training down his 3-year-old year when I was in Florida working for Erv. My brother, mother and father were training the horse down. He never raced as a 2-year-old and he was really well-bred. We thought he had potential, but he just wasn't putting it together in the spring. It was disappointing. I came home and my brother and I started training him together with a horse I raced today [Sept. 30], Marktentwentyseven, who was bred by my brother Brandon and is owned by my Larry.

"Eventually, Mac Anover caught on. That first win, I drifted him out in the stretch and we won by almost two lengths. It was a great feeling. Everybody threw water buckets on me for that... one guy missed me and hit the horse with the water, and he almost got away from us. But he didn't. That win was a big memory for me."

Thankfully, it's not the only one for the driver/trainer.

Another highlight came with a horse that had the odds stacked him, both literally and figuratively.

"I think the biggest highlight – I have to go back to Marktentwentyseven," said Jenson, of the Minnesota-bred pacing son of Upfront Brad. "In his 3-year-old year, him and another horse of ours, Too Much Too Quick, they were an owner entry in a Minnesota-bred final [Sept. 16, 2017]. Nick Roland was driving Too Much Too Quick. We went off at 15-1, so we were longshots. Some of the favorites got in a battle

up-front early. I was driving Marktentwentyseven. We weren't picked to get any of it, but we tipped three-wide and four-wide at the top of the stretch, and I won it. Too Much Too Quick was second. I'll never forget that race. My family owned both horses. That was probably the most meaningful race I'll ever win. We won another championship that night too."

At 24, there are still plenty of chances to add to his list of achievements.

Knowing that he's found his calling in life makes the pursuit of those accomplishments much more enticing.

"Both of my parents' parents were in the sport, and my parents met doing this. We all grew up – we always have 20-something horses in training – in the sport. It's all I've ever known."

When he's not watching sports – he and his father are fans of the NFL's Pittsburgh Steelers – or playing video games, Jenson, ironically enough, is still in the role of student, faithfully doing his homework, studying for hours each day, taking what he's learned to earn top marks for his efforts.

"I love what I do. I wouldn't change it for anything. Sometimes, it takes a little while to figure out what you want to do. That was the case for me. I'm grateful that I was able to find it. I knew I'd finally discover where I'd be the happiest."

Twin B Fighter and Bettor Sun score in Gold season finale

Ontario's top 2-year-old pacing colts wrapped up their Gold Series regular season on Sunday (Oct. 4) over a rain-soaked Flamboro Downs oval.

The first \$104,800 Gold Series division saw **Twin B Fighter** get his first win of the season for driver Ed Hensley and trainer Ashleigh Hensley of Dundas, ON. Starting from Post 4 in the six-horse field, Twin B Fighter got away third and watched No Better Joy roll through fractions of :29,:59 and 1:27.1 over a surface rated two seconds slower than normal. Heading by the three-quarters Ed Hensley tipped Twin B Fighter to the outside and the colt matched strides with No Better Joy around the last turn before pulling away to a two and one-quarter length victory in 1:56.3.

Candy Trader and Socrates Blue Chip were elevated to second and third when Flash Cube, who crossed the wire second, was moved back to fourth for a pylon violation. No Better Joy finished fifth and race favorite Bulldog Hanover was a distant sixth after making an early break in stride.

"We didn't race him in the Battle Of Waterloo just because we didn't know if he'd get around the half the best, but he was good tonight," said Ashleigh Hensley. "It was really exciting, because he's an underdog and we knew he had the ability, he just had to get everything all together."

Hensley trains Twin B Fighter for Burke Racing Stable LLC of Fredericktown, PA, Phillip Collura of Mountain Top, PA, J And T Silva – Purnel & Libby of Delray Beach, FL and W. J. Donovan of Monument Beach, MA. The Bettors Delight son, whose breeder Twinbrook Farms donated four per cent of his \$140,000 yearling purchase price to the Harness The Hope fundraiser, learned his early lessons from trainer Ron Burke before shipping into the Hensley barn for his Ontario Sires

Stakes campaign.

"We were really lucky to get these 2-year-olds for the summer," said Hensley. "He's perfect, he does nothing wrong, you wouldn't even know he's a stud. You couldn't really ask for a better colt."

The win gives Twin B Fighter 93 points and sole ownership of fifth spot in the division standings.

The second \$105,600 Gold Series division saw fan favorite **Bettor Sun** leave smartly from Post 5 and sit briefly behind Magnum Moon before taking control heading by the :27.3 quarter. Bettor Sun carried on to a :58.2 half, fended off a challenge from division point leader Desperate Man heading for the 1:26.3 three-quarters and then pulled away to a two length victory in 1:54.3. Desperate Man finished second and Ucanttouchthis was four more lengths back in third.

"I thought it was the toughest division. There were three or four in our division that I thought looked pretty strong, but there's a couple of them that aren't as handy as him, gait wise, in the turns and stuff so that helped him," said driver Doug McNair. "He raced great. He's been racing good, he was fifth in the Metro (Sept. 26)."

Sunday's win was Bettor Sun's first in Gold Series action. The Sunshine Beach colt swept his elimination and the final of the Battle Of Waterloo at Grand River Raceway in early August, but he had settled for a pair of seconds and one fourth in his three Gold Series starts. The win boosted Bettor Sun's point total to 108 and moved him into second spot in the division standings. The top 10 point earners will square off for \$250,000 in the Oct. 17 Super Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"It's a decent group. There are a few of them, especially on a bigger track, that have got a shot to win the Super Final, but I've definitely got one of the best ones," said McNair. "I don't think I'd trade him for any of the other ones really. He's as good as the rest of them, I think."

The driver's father, Gregg McNair, owns and trains Bettor Sun in partnership with breeder Willow Oak Ranch of Rogersville, TN.

Purameri cracks track and stake marks Monday at Plainridge

Records continued to fall in the 2020 edition of the Massachusetts Sire Stakes (MASS) as the 2-year-olds hit the track for their second leg of the series. Monday's (Oct. 5) action was highlighted by pacing filly **Purameri** (American Ideal—J K Pure Pearl) who lit it up in her \$29,000 division.

So Amazing (Bruce Ranger) took a quick early lead before Rightfully Mine (Jason Bartlett) claimed that position at the quarter and then skated to the half in :57.1. At that point, post time favorite Suzie Blue Chip (Shawn Gray) pulled first-over and advanced towards the leader heading towards the three-quarters where Purameri (Nick Graffam) joined the fray, one out and one back.

Positions remained unchanged around the last turn and into the stretch where Suzie Blue Chip finally got the lead. But Purameri tipped off her cover and started tracking her down. She drew even with the leader in deep stretch and then just edged in front at the beam to win by a head in 1:52.4 at 30-1.

The time was a new track and MASS stake record for 2-year-old pacing fillies and a new lifetime mark for Purameri.

Purameri (\$68.60) is owned by the Purple Haze Stables and is trained by Jessica Okusko. 3 Brothers Stable and Camelot Stable bred the winner.

The male pacers split into two \$14,000 divisions with a record tying effort by **Call Me Maverick** (Western Maverick—Briefly) occurring in the first.

Call Me Maverick (Mike Stevenson) and Maui (Shawn Gray) played give-and-go with the lead with the latter taking control by the quarter. Maui hit the half in :56.4 and the three-quarters in 1:26.1 with Call Me Maverick following right behind. When they reached the top of the stretch, Stevenson tipped Call Me Maverick and he incrementally gained ground on Maui all the way to the wire where he got a neck in front to win in 1:54, which was a new lifetime mark and tied the track and MASS stake record for 2-year-old pacing geldings.

It was the sixth win in a row for Call Me Maverick (\$3.40) who is owned and bred by the Upland Farm and trained by Alison Hynes.

The second division went to Bumpah Stickah (Roll With

Joe—Caila Fra) who gave up an early lead at the three-eighths to trip-out behind Mullinax (Jason Bartlett) until the top of the stretch. There, Bumpah Stickah tipped and out-paced Mullinax to the wire where he won by a head in 1:54.1, which was a new lifetime mark for the winner.

Bumpah Stickah (\$15.60) is owned by David Thibault, Paul Vacca, Ed Nowak Jr. and Jim Hardy. Frederick Hertrich III is the breeder.

The two trotting divisions saw one favorite jog and another get upset.

The colts and geldings went for \$28,000 and **Beantown Madness** (Conway Hall—Armbro Archer) performed and expected.

Going off at 1-9, Beantown Madness (Shawn Gray) took early control and never relinquished it. He cut relatively soft quarters of :29.2, :59.4 and 1:29.3 before turning for home and hitting the gas in a :28 final panel to win by three lengths in 1:57.3.

Beantown Madness (\$2.10) now has six wins in only eight lifetime starts for owner/breeder Michael Goldberg and trainer George Ducharme.

Just like he did the day before, Ducharme also won the \$29,000 filly division with **Royal Envy** (R C Royalty—Temper Of Will) who put on quite a show in the lane.

Me Too Baby (Matty Athearn) led the field to the half in a soft 1:00.1 when Moni For Lindy (Drew Monti) drew alongside past the five-eighths pole. From there the two trotters stepped in tandem all the way around the final bend and opened up five lengths on the field. Just past the seven-eighths pole Moni For Lindy took the lead and looked like a winner. But Royal Envy (Shawn Gray) who was fifth and five lengths off, uncorked a furious stretch drive that saw her trot home in :28.4 to catch Moni For Lindy by a nose in 1:58, which was a new personal best.

It was the second straight MASS victory for Royal Envy (\$11.60) who is owned and bred by Al Ross and Ray Campbell Jr.

The Massachusetts Sire Stakes take a break next week and resume on Sunday (Oct. 18) and Monday (Oct. 19). The finals follow one week later on Monday (Oct. 26) at Plainridge Park when all eight divisions will compete for an estimated \$750,000 in purses.

Racing resumes at Plainridge Park on Thursday (Oct. 8) with post time at 2 p.m.

Wyatt J smashes stake record again at Plainridge

It was round two for the 3-year-olds of both gaits and genders in the Massachusetts Sire Stakes (MASS) at Plainridge Park on Sunday afternoon (Oct. 4) and **Wyatt J** shone the brightest for the second week in a row in the \$28,000 division for pacing colts and geldings.

Teamed with driver Jason Bartlett for the first time, the heavily bet Wyatt J (American Ideal-Think Pink) left sharply and cut the quarter in :26.1 and from there called the shots for the rest of the mile. With little pressure to deal with, Wyatt J hit the half in :56, the three-quarters in 1:24.1 and then started to open up around the last turn. With the race well in hand, Bartlett line drove Wyatt J to the wire in 1:51.3 on top by 2-3/4 lengths.

The time broke the MASS stake record for 3-year-old pacing geldings and was a new lifetime mark for the winner; both marks were set by Wyatt J just last week.

It was also the sixth win in a row for Wyatt J (\$2.10) who is owned by Ken Jacobs and trained by Linda Toscano. Lindy Farms of Connecticut bred the winner.

The filly pacers went for \$28,500 and **Ry's Red Rocket** (Sunshine Beach—Mo Molly Blue Chip) bounced back from a narrow defeat last week.

Opening up a two length lead by the quarter, Ry's Red Rocket (Matty Athearn) paced alone until the five-eighths when I Am Wonder Woman (Jason Bartlett) and She's A Fireball (Ron Cushing) rolled up the rim and Sara Tancredi (Nick Graffam) who was tripping out, started some pressure that would continue to the wire. The two outside horses fanned wide of the leader at the top of the lane while Sara Tancredi advanced along the pylons. With four horses across the track within a length of each other, Ry's Red Rocket continued to dig in and eventually hung on to a neck advantage in 1:54.2.

It was the fifth win of the year for Ry's Red Rocket (\$4.60) who is owned and bred by Linwood Higgins and is trained by Gretchen Athearn.

The two trot divisions were owned by trainer George Ducharme and owner Ray Campbell Jr. who won both.

The colts and geldings went for \$28,500 and Double Dealing (RC Royalty—Heather Spur) got his second consecutive stake win.

Dazzling Lindy (Mitchell Cushing) led the race to the half before Double Dealing (Shawn Gray) pulled the pocket past the half and took control before the five-eighths. From there Double Dealing opened up a gapped lead and pulled away to a two-length margin of victory in 1:56.4.

Double Dealing (\$2.60) registered his sixth win of 2020.

The \$27,500 filly trot was a non-betting event and was a runaway win for **Without A Warning** (RC

Royalty—Concentration) who was not challenged at all.

Without A Warning (Jason Bartlett) went right to the front and after posting quarters of :28.3, :58.4 and 1:27, hit the top of the stretch up by three lengths and jogged to the wire in front by 2-1/2 lengths in 1:55.

Without A Warning scored her fourth win of the year and now has \$166,912 in earnings this year.

Nvrfearlloydishere dominates his Virginia Breeders Championship division

Nvrfearlloydishere dominated the \$46,800 Virginia Breeders 3-Year-Old Colt Pace Saturday (Oct. 3) at Shenandoah Downs as eight divisional titles were contested on a picture-perfect fall afternoon in Woodstock. A total of \$363,575 in combined purse monies was awarded.

The 3-year-old Rusty's All In gelding won his eighth in a row and competed in the final much like he did in the prep a week earlier when he wired the field. Eddie Davis Jr. drove Nvrfearlloydishere in the eight-horse gathering and at the three-quarters mark, already had a seven-length cushion. The Arlene Cameron trainee hit that fraction in 1:24.1, opened up by ten at the top of the stretch and crossed twelve lengths ahead of runner-up K J Michael in 1:52.4. The finishing time established a new life mark for the winner and was just three-fifths of a second off the track record time set by John's Dream in 2016.

Nvrfearlloydishere is owned/bred by Pam Wagner and has won 14 of his 18 lifetime starts. During his current winning streak, the dynamic pacer has led at every quarter fraction.

He swept the recent Maryland Sire Stake series at Ocean Downs and completed his Shenandoah prep in 1:56.4.

The Cameron and Wagner trainer-owner duo connected three other times in Breeders races Saturday. **Madisonsallin** went gate-to-wire in the \$45,575 2-Year-Old Filly Pace while **Trents A Lock** prevailed in the \$45,675 2-Year-Old Colt Trot and **Cate's A Keeper** took honors in the \$43,800 3-Year-Old Filly Trot.

Madisonsallin, fresh off an eight-length win in her prep a week earlier, got to the front ahead of stablemate Kelseys For Real and maintained a 1 1/2 length lead twice around the oval. The Rusty's All In filly crossed in 1:57.2, over two seconds faster than the prior Saturday's 1:59.3. Eddie Davis Jr. drove in the winning effort.

Trents A Lock went outside of front stepping stablemate K J Wallace at the half, powered to the front shortly after and never looked back en route to a 2:04.1 victory in his freshmen title bout. The consistent Lockkeeper gelding won his third straight and in six life starts, has finished second or better in each. John Wagner was in the sulky. K J Wallace, co-owned by Wagner with Dr. Scott Woogen, was the runner-up.

Eddie Davis kept Cate's A Keeper in the pocket behind stablemate K J Deb through the top of the stretch, surged past the filly midway through final straightaway and captured championship honors in her title clash. A daughter of Lockkeeper as well, Cate's A Keeper finished in 1:58.3, 3 1/2 lengths over K J Deb. She won for the ninth time and pushed her bankroll to \$107,873.

Caviart Skipper kicked off Breeders action Saturday with the most exciting finish of the eight, beating Harveys All In by a nose in the \$46,925 2-Year-Old Colt Pace. Tyler Shehan directed the winning effort in 1:57.3 while the runner-up cut initial panels in :29.1, :59.2 and 1:28.3. Fourth through the half, Caviart Skipper improved before the third fraction then met up with Harveys All In for a great stretch duel. Marna Shehan trains the winner for the Caviart Farms of Vienna.

Hillbilly Kisses went off stride at the start of the \$43,400 3-Year-Old Filly Pace but rebounded in time to get her picture taken. After the early break, reinsman Frank Milby guided Amanda Jackson's trainee into striking position turning for home, but was still fourth. She rallied late and passed Breeze Away B — who went off stride — Fire Me Up and runner-up Caviart Caroline to win by one length in 1:56.4. The victor is owned by Hillbilly Haven Farms in Burkeville. Hillbilly Kissesfinished second in the prep to Breeze Away B, who had won nine of 15 coming into the final.

2019 2-Year-Old Colt Trot Champion **Air Time** shook off bridesmaid status as a 3-year-old and got to the winners circle, wiring a field that included stablemates Chauffer and Riddle Me This. The 1:59.2 effort was authored by Art Stafford for trainer Carlo Poliseno and owner Jane Dunavant of Kenbridge, who got first place share of a \$45,300 purse. The Dusty Winner gelding won his fourth straight race ,crossing 1 1/2 lengths in front of Arthur Lisi's Rocky Bomber. Dunavant's Chauffer, last year's champ, took third.

Pride of Windswept captured the \$45,300 2-Year-Old Filly Trot quite easily as four of the six participants broke stride and were distanced at the finish. The Shaun Callahan trainee won the Maryland Sire Stake final in her most prior start and was never challenged Saturday. The Charlie De Vie filly crossed in 2:03 with Frank Milby in the bike. The winner, now 4-for-5 in her young career, is owned by John & Sarah Swart of Oakton. Debbie Warnick's Armed Senorita finished second and Arthur Hauser's Ollie El was third.

A slate of Virginia Breeders Aged Stakes will highlight this Saturday's card (Oct. 10) at Shenandoah. Two more weekends remain in the current fall season. Post time on Friday is 2 p.m. and Saturday's first post is at 1:00 p.m.

The fastest pacing mile of the year was the 1:54.1 effort of BIPBOPNALLIE at Bloomsburg, just two-fifths short of MIDWAY ISLAND's 1:53.4 all-time fair standard, also at Bloomsburg.

There were 16 divisional track records set this year, including six miles that equaled or bettered the all-time standard for that gait at that track. Freshman pacing filly TIAMOGONEDANCIN and MANHATTANUP NO ICE set track records at two different ovals.

There were 48 miles in 2:00 or better throughout the season. A pair of three-year-old pacers led the list with five such miles: gelding BIPBOPNALLIE and filly GINGER TREE CAREY.
