McWicked scores 1:46.2 jaw-dropper over late-charging Lazarus N



Catapulting off cover, McWicked rushed to the lead into the stretch and maintained control over Lazarus N lunging late to take the \$179,000 Mister Big Allerage Farms Open Pace, sponsored by Muscara Standardbreds, in 1:46.2 on Saturday, Oct. 6 at Red Mile.

Driver Brian Sears placed McWicked in fourth as Takter-trainee Western Fame flew to the front and posted a :26.1 opening quarter as stablemate Lazarus N parked about seven lengths from the lead in sixth. Western Fame soon yielded for the pocket when

Heaven Rocks A, parked from third, brushed for command and posted a :52.1 half.

Heaven Rocks A continued on the lead rounding the final turn while Filibuster Hanover, shuffled to third, flushed first over and supplied cover to McWicked second over and Lazarus N third over. Filibuster Hanover rolled to the lead past three-quarters in 1:19.1 as Sears revved McWicked three wide.

Lazarus N gave chase to McWicked in the stretch with about three lengths to recoup entering the eighths pole. The New Zealand-import hit his best strides nearing the wire but still finished a length shy of his rival in second. Filibuster Hanover held third from Rockin Ron rallying into fourth.

A seven-year-old stallion by McArdle out of the Western Ideal mare Western Sahara, McWicked, owned by S S G Stables, won his eighth race from 15 starts and his 30th from 89 overall, accruing \$3,375,376 in earnings. Casie Coleman conditions the \$5.00 winner.

Kissin In The Sand slides to 1:47.4 victory in Garnsey **Memorial**

Double A Mint wins the other division in 1:47.3.

Sent off the 1-5 favorite. **Kissin In The Sand** sat pocket to Youaremycandygirl, intent to cut the mile, and popped pocket past the pacesetter to take the second of two divisions for the \$225,000 Glen Garnsey Memorial, sponsored by Diamond Creek Farms, in 1:47.4 on Saturday, Oct. 6 at Red Mile.

Youaremycandygirl cleared the front heading into the first turn with Kissin In The Sand securing the pocket and Baron Remy floating into third. Scott Zeron pulled Kissin In The Sand off the rail past the :27.2 opening quarter in an attempt to brush to the lead but Youaremycandygirl accelerated and forced the favorite into the two hole heading to a :53.4 half.

The speed continued into the final turn as Youaremycandygirl paced to three-quarters in 1:20.3. Kissin In The Sand tipped wide of the leader entering the stretch and drew alongside into the final sixteenth before edging to victory. Youaremycandygirl settled for second while Baron Remy finished third and Alexa's Power fourth.

Winning her 10th race in 14 starts this season and her 17th in 28 overall, Kissin In The Sand (Somebeachsomewhere – Kiss Me Kate), owned by Marvin Katz and Hatfield Stables, has compiled \$967,670 in earnings. The Nancy Johansson trainee paid \$2.40 to win.

Drafting the swift tempo-setter, **Double A Mint** pounced from the pocket into the stretch and charged to the wire an open-length winner in 1:47.3 to take the first split of the Glen Garnsey.

The Ron Burke-trained filly by Bettor's Delight—Double Creme dashed to the lead heading into the first turn with Wisdom Tree rolling wide into contention. Wisdom Tree, the 1-2 favorite, cleared control prior to the :27.2 opening quarter and paced uncontested through a :54.2 half.

Wisdom Tree continued to speed on the front rounding the

far turn with Double A Mint tracking from the pocket and the rest of the field chasing single file in behind. Past three-quarters in 1:21.1, Gingras pulled Double A Mint off the rail. slid by Wisdom Tree entering the eighth pole and widened her lead to the line. Wisdom Tree held second from I'm Trigger Happy in third and Mcvenus fourth.





No Mas Amor motors to 114-1 upset in ISS colt pace

The Ron Burke-trained Sweet Lou—No More Loving colt No Mas Amor capitalized off a covered trip as he vaulted to the front in the stretch to upset at 114-1 with a 1:49.1 mile in the third of five divisions for the \$312,000 Captaintreacherous International Stallion Stakes (ISS) Two-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace, sponsored by the Captaintreacherous Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms, on Saturday, Oct. 6 at Red Mile.

Leaving from post one, **No Mas Amor** got away fifth as Air Force Hanover, roughly gaited into the first turn, pushed for command before settling into fourth. Artie's Ideal claimed control to the quarter with Captain Ahab in the pocket and De Los Cielos Deo ranging first over towards the lead through a :26.4 opening quarter until going onto a brief gallop into the backstretch. De Los Cielos Deo recovered and rushed to the front before facing pressure from Captain Ahab pulling first over into a :54.2 half.



Captain Ahab took the lead moving into the far turn. Air Force Hanover, catching cover second over, marched uncovered with No Mas Amor in tow through three-quarters in 1:22.1. Captain Ahab gave way to Air Force Hanover heading into the stretch while No Mas Amor fanned off cover and readied his bid towards the center of the track. No Mas Amor shot to the front nearing the wire with Air Force Hanover holding second from Yacht Week roaring into third. Captain Ahab, lengths away, fought for fourth.

Returning \$230.80 to win, No Mas Amor broke his maiden in his eighth start career, earning \$61,056 for owner Kenneth Jacobs. Matt Kakaley sat in the sulky.

Workin Ona Mystery remained undefeated in five starts with a 1:49.3 on-the-front performance in the first ISS division.

Stablemate Rock Candy left for the lead from the center as Workin Ona Mystery anxiously roared towards the top from the outside. Past the quarter in :27, Workin Ona Mystery settled onto the lead as Rock Candy stalked from the pocket through a :54.3 half.

Calming the pace to three-quarters, Workin Ona Mystery withstood minor first-over pressure from Can't Beach That through a 1:23 clip and kicked into the stretch moving away from Rock Candy giving pursuit from second. World On Edge, rallying from off cover, took third with Lyons Johnnyjnr, off a rail trip, fourth.

A colt by Captaintreacherous—Dragon's Tale, Workin Ona Mystery passed the \$100,000 earnings plateau for owners James Stambaugh, Alan Keith, Milton Leeman and Wingfield Brothers. Tim Tetrick piloted the Brian Brown trainee and paid \$2.20 to win.

Captain Trevor stalked quick fractions and charged home off cover to take the second ISS split in 1:49.2.

Love Me Some Lou moved for the lead with Smooth Lou firing from post eight into second and Blood Money floating into third. Past the quarter in :27.1, Love Me Some Lou backed into the pocket as Blood Money brushed to the lead into the backstretch tracked by 4-5 favorite Semi Tough. Blood Money cleared command before a :54.4 half, leaving Semi Tough first over.

Semi Tough circled to the lead rounding the final turn and endured pressure from Smooth Lou left uncovered into second. Blood Money paced in the pocket third past three-quarters in 1:22.1 and bolted towards the front once

room opened into the stretch. Blood Money led the way heading to the line before Captain Trevor, widest on the track, swept by his competition and kicked away for the win. Blood Money finished second ahead of Smooth Lou third and Semi Tough fourth.

Owned by Brittany Farms LLC, Marvin Katz, Brad Grant and Captain Trevor Racing, Captain Trevor won his fifth race from seven starts, earning \$113,404. Tony Alagna trains the Captaintreacherous—It Was Fascination colt and Andrew McCarthy sat behind the \$14.80 winner.

Captain Crunch scooted through the pylons to catch pacesetter Sugar Factory and win in 1:49.1 in the fourth ISS division.

Captain Victorious swooped to the top from post eight with Captain Crunch taking the pocket. Sugar Factory, positioned fourth, edged first over past a :26.3 opening quarter and brushed to command just after a :54.4 half.

Proof, the 3-5 favorite, angled off the cones from fourth heading into the final turn and advanced uncovered towards the tempo-setter nearing three-quarters. By that station in 1:22, Sugar Factory turned away Proof into the stretch while Captain Crunch snuck through the pylons and American Mercury, from second over, rallied towards the center of the

track. Captain Crunch stuck a neck in front heading to the wire and maintained the advantage through the wire while Sugar Factory held second from Proof in third and American Mercury fourth.

Winning his fourth race in six starts, Captain Crunch (Captaintreacherous—Sweet Paprika) competes for 3 Brothers Stables, Christina Takter, Rojan Stables and Caviart Farms, earning \$85,946 in the process. Scott Zeron drove the Nancy Johansson trainee and paid \$10.80 to win.

Mangogh sat off a contested pace, looped off cover and inched past 7-5 favorite Covered Bridge to take the fifth ISS split in 1:50.3.

Jack Nation led the field into the first turn as Covered Bridge gradually advanced wide of Waterway taking the pocket. Waterway moved to track Covered Bridge past a :28.1 opening quarter and edged three wide into the backstretch, clearing command heading to the half in :55.

Covered Bridge remained parked as Jack Nation kept chase in the pocket moving into the final turn. Waterway lost the lead by three-quarters in 1:22.3 as Covered Bridge brushed to control into the stretch. Loutenant, from third over, angled towards the center of the course and Mangogh, from fourth over, even wider in pursuit of Covered Bridge. Mangogh came quickest and overtook Covered Bridge in the final strides to win, leaving Loutenant in third while Price Hanover, from second over, finished fourth.

Trained by Bruce Saunders, Mangogh won his fourth race from 10 starts, earning \$117,980 for owners M&L Of Delaware LLC and M&M Harness Racing LLC. Tim Tetrick drove the colt by Western Ideal and paid \$6.00 to win.

Grand Circuit action at The Red Mile continues today with the 53rd Kentucky Filly Futurity, sponsored by the Father Patrick Syndicate and Diamond Creek Farm, and the 126th Kentucky Futurity, sponsored by Hunterton Farms, Stoner Manor Inc. and Menhammer Stuteri Ab, headlining the card.

Racing gets underway for the 13-race card with first-race post slated for 1:00 p.m. (EDT).



Crawfords bask in Homicide Hunter's 1:48.4 world record

A dozen years after their first date at the Lexington sale, Michelle and Albert Crawford stand astride the world thanks to their trotter Homicide Hunter.

Saturday night, nearly 12 years to the day after Michelle and Albert Crawford had their first date at this exact location — at this very same horse sale — the couple was standing beside the outdoor walking ring at Fasig-Tipton gobsmacked about all Crawford Farms had accomplished in those dozen years. Just a few short hours earlier, their beloved 6-year-old gelded trotter Homicide Hunter set the fastest trotting mile in the history of harness racing with an epic 1:48.4 performance at Red Mile in the \$145,000 Allerage Trot, sponsored by Jeff and Paula Gural.

"It feels surreal, it's numbing. We all went and had drinks afterwards downtown. We couldn't process. My phone was going off and every time it was a different picture of him, it's just like 'Oh my God, it's real. He did that," Michelle said.

Homicide Hunter's 1:48.4 mile lowered the all-time trotting mark previously set by Hannelore Hanover, who beat the boys in the Allerage Farms Trot last year with a 1:49.2 mile. The time also lowers the record for gelding trotters of 1:49.4, set by Jl Cruze at the Meadowlands in 2015.

The monster mile comes as part of a monster year for Crawford Farms, who earlier bought into the ownership



group of sophomore trotting filly Atlanta, who went on to win the Hambletonian.

"It's just the most insane feeling – to win the Hambo with a filly and then have your trotter, that you love so dearly, hold the world record," Michelle said of Homicide Hunter. "This is my guy, since he was three. There's just something about him, he's just special. I worry about him a lot. He's high maintenance in the sense that he likes to be turned out. He's very finicky and was in the detention barn since yesterday."

Homicide Hunter's trainer, Chris Oakes, pulled the gelding's shoes for the forgiving red clay — "That's the only place Chris does it," Albert said — and the trotter responded.

Off the gate, Guardian Angel As took the lead from Pinkman firing at the rail while Lindy The Great floated for position into third. Lindy The Great brushed to the lead by the quarter in :26.2 as Will Take Charge, away fourth, angled off the rail and began his move for the lead, clearing before a :53.2 half.

Will Take Charge faced first-over pressure from Guardian Angel As around the far turn with Pinkman positioned second over and Homicide Hunter, with Brian Sears at the reins, third over. Guardian Angel As inched to the lead past three-quarters in 1:22 and fought for command into the eighth pole. However Homicide Hunter, poised from his setup, accelerated past the field with ease and trotted to the wire going away from Guardian Angel As holding second. Pinkman finished third while Lindy The Great weaved into fourth.

"When he fanned out, I was like 'he can do this, he's got this', but I was waiting for Brian 'C'mon, Brian, c'mon', but he's so ultra patient with the horses and he's always cool as a cucumber," Michelle said. "Brian said when he came off that turn he was just swelling up huge. He just had to give him clearance and let him go. He said, 'I really never used him

that hard. He won by three and he was good."

It was the eighth win in 13 starts for the son of Mr Cantab out of Like A Prayer mare Evening Prayer and Homicide Hunter's 38th victory in 75 career starts. He surpassed \$1.4 million in earnings with the win that returned \$5.20.

"I bet him pretty good, because I thought he could win and I was, like, 'Wow, he's going off 2 or 3-1," Albert said.

For Michelle, the bet she cashed on the world record performance had more to do with having acquired Homicide Hunter's dam, Evening Prayer, for the Crawford Farms broodmare band.

"I think it means that the value of his mother just increased for our broodmare band," she said, smiling.

As for Homicide Hunter, Michelle credited Oakes for the horse's performance.

"Chris has done an amazing job with Homicide. He treats this horse like gold. He gives him everything he needs for his routine, to make him better. If there is ever a question, we do what's right for the horse first and we wouldn't race him and put him in harm's way. He's very sound and very pure-gaited," Michelle said, adding, "I'm not even going to steal all of the limelight on this. Al and I do everything together. We live, eat and breathe it. We go through mares together. We go to our races and he's super fixed on looking at the schedules and trying to maximize where the horses are racing. There's just nothing that we don't do together."

Albert said being both a breeding farm and a racing operation hasn't always been easy, but it's in his blood.

"I grew up in the business and we love to race, so we want to bring product to the market because we love the farm and the babies and everything else, but it can get tricky at times. So, is this good for the farm? I don't know," Albert said, adding that his phone blew up with congratulatory messages after Homicide Hunter's world record performance.

"I've been in the business since I was five years old. My father started a farm back in '67 and I was born in '62. I've been in this business for a long time and, as a family, we didn't have horses like this. We raced in New York and we raced Precious Fellas, Most Happy Fellas... we went for the deal, wherever the deal was. He passed away 10 years ago and he would've loved this."

"His mom is on social media," Michelle added, "so she saw it before we were able to talk and she was really excited for us, too."

A dozen years after Michelle and Albert had their first date at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, they were basking in the glory of one of the greatest moments in Crawford Farms history.

When Homicide Hunter left the winner's circle earlier in the day, he received a warm ovation from the Red Mile crowd. That's when Michelle's tears began to flow.

"I was talking to Nick (Salvi) and when (Homicide Hunter) left the winner's circle, the crowd just started clapping. It shook me up, it choked me up because that's my horse," Michelle said. "It's the perfect storm. This is the pinnacle of





our sport, in Lexington, and this is the showcase for everybody internationally, and to have something like this happen is just... there are no words. I was so choked up."

Michelle Crawford – Crawford Farms

One of the biggest names in harness racing today as far as supporting the industry and striving to make it better is Crawford Farms owned and operated by Michelle and Albert Crawford. They are the sponsors of The Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace, The Crawford Farms Trot, the Hambletonian, Little Brown Jug, Breeders Crown and Tattersalls Pace.

Michelle Crawford is on the board for the Standardbred Transition Alliance (STA), the aftercare start-up organized by the U.S. Trotting Association and Wanda Polisseni's new retirement facility. Michelle is also vice-president of the



Harness Horse Breeders of New York.

Al and Michelle also operate Crawford Racing LLC, but this column is about the women in harness racing, so sorry Al, Michelle is the superstar here, though I admire you for the



fact on your very first date, instead of a movie or dinner you took Michelle to the Lexington Sale to look at horses.

Originally founded by Jim and Patricia Crawford, the farm was passed on to Al and Michelle after Jim's death.

The husband-and-wife team runs several businesses together but the farm is the dearest to Michelle's heart.

"We currently have over 200 horses on the farm: at least 140 mares and unborn foals, 46 yearlings, 40 weanlings, approximately 50 racehorses, 35 retirees and rescues, four donkeys, one mule, five minis and a few dogs. But who's counting?" Michelle said, laughing. "We are one big, happy family."

How the heck do they keep a close eye on that many four-legged family members? Michelle gives credit to her loyal employees.

"I have to give so much credit to my amazing farm manager, Heather Reese. She has been instrumental in every aspect of the farm," Michelle said. "I also have a great staff on the ops side and the office that keep me organized as we are moving in many directions. The first half of the year we are foaling and breeding which we get a lot of assistance from our vet, Michael Miller, with the mares and babies."

"I am always looking at improving the broodmare stock. We have worked hard to develop a blue-blooded line up. I believe if a mare is older, I would rather retire her then send her to an auction and worry about where she ends up."

What does Michelle look for when purchasing a yearling or finding the right cross of a stallion for one of her broodmares?

"Al and I do a lot of the mate matching together," she said.
"I do all the research on the yearlings, look at the pedigrees and videos until I narrow it down to what I like. It's a process! I am no expert but feel like we have done a good job for what we have been blessed with as far as the racehorses go. The yearling game is a tough one. You can have the pedigree but they still have to beat the odds and make it to the races."

Michelle admits she falls in love with every horse in her care.

"One of the hardest things is not to fall in love with the animal if you are involved day-to-day working with these wonderful athletes. I never feel good about letting any horse leave my farm because I get so attached to all of them and worry about where they will end up."

Michelle said her pet project is almost complete.

"It is the most amazing place near my home, called Lavender Love and Ponies. It is a beautiful restored old barn that I have put so much thought and love into. It's a place for photography shoots and lavender fields that many of our retirees and rescues call their forever home.

"The fields behind the barn are filled with my ex-racehorses, rescues from slaughter, minis and retired broodmares. Soon we will be kicking our grand opening with a charity event for David's Refuge, and hopefully many more corporate and charity events. Hopefully it will draw attention as a solution for aftercare of a racehorse or broodmare".

If there is such a thing as an afterlife, I want to come back as a horse that lives at Crawford Farms. It is truly a paradise and horse haven.

"I sometimes wish I had more 'hands' on time with my horses, but at this point in my life my 'hands on' is with my retirees and rescues. I leave the real work to the real women," she said.

Lexington Selected Sale sets record for gross, nearly tops \$40 million

The Lexington Selected Yearling Sale concluded Saturday with a new high-water mark for gross, but the average and median slipped slightly from a year ago.

The 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, which concluded Saturday, smashed the record for gross with nearly \$40 million in sales, but co-manager Randy Manges said the numbers, both good and bad, are slightly deceiving.

"The gross was a record, but, of course, we sold more horses this year," Manges said.

For the complete sale, 702 yearlings grossed \$39,770,000. The gross surpassed last year's record gross of \$36,410,000 by 9.2 per cent. Prior to 2017, the previous record for the sale's gross was set in 2007 which had total sales of

\$35,648,962 when 791 yearlings were sold.

"Overall, for the whole week, to be up to nearly a \$40 million yearling sale is really good for breeders," said sale co-manager David Reid.

This year's complete sale average of \$56,652 was down 3.2 per cent over the record of \$58,537 set in 2017.

"We sold 80 more horses this year, which always changes your averages a bit," Manges said. "The more horses you sell, usually the average drops.

"We're slightly down from last year but we had such a great sale last year and we had another great sale this year. It's a wash.

"Of course, gross is the big thing for me. Averages, ups and downs, don't do a lot for me. I like the gross and it looks pretty damn good to me.

"One of the big things that I take into consideration for the sale is the fact that this year we had a couple of new sires, but they weren't really the high-profile sires like they were

last year. Last year, we had two outstanding pacing sires (Captaintreacherous and Sweet Lou) and two top trotting sires (Father Patrick and Trixton). All four of those horses had good years, but there's always the excitement of the first-year sires. In my opinion, that had a lot to do with it. We just didn't have a lot of a new product to give. Artspeak, it was his first year, but we didn't have that many. I think that factors in."

The number of yearlings that sold for \$100,000 or more was 124, up 20.4 per cent from the record of 103 set in 2017 and up 61 per cent from the next highest mark of 77 set in 2016.

The median of \$35,000 was down 16.7 per cent from the previous record of \$42,000 set last year.

In the final session, 116 yearlings grossed \$2,765,000 in total. The session average of \$23,836 was down 11.4 per cent from the 2017 final session average of \$26,908 and up 14.4 per cent over the 2016 final session average of \$20,841.

While the final two sessions were both down from a year

ago, the first two nights were "crazy off the charts," Manges said.

Saturday's session saw four more horses surpass \$100,000 — though one was a buy-back listed as Reserve Not Achieved (RNA).

Saturday's session-topper was Coventry Hall, a Cash Hall colt out of Canland Hall that brought a bid of \$210,000 from Keld Gregersen of Denmark. The colt was bred and sold by Walnut Hall Ltd, which took home the next highest priced yearling, RNA Oxford Hall, an E L Titan colt out of On With The Show, that reached \$145,000 before the bidding stopped.

Jodi Schillaci of Macedonia, OH tied for the third highest priced yearling sold Saturday, a McArdle colt out of Fancy Creek Funny named Ridicule Blue Chip bred by Blue Chip Farms and sold by Northwood Bloodstock Agency, Inc. that fetched \$100,000.

Also selling for \$100,000 was Queen Paige, a Muscle Yankee filly out of Commando Queen purchased by Lina Alm,

agent for SRF Stable of Sweden from the Winbak Farm consignment.

Reid's Preferred Equine led all consignors with more than \$8.88 million in total sales from 140 yearlings. Hunterton Sales Agency was next with nearly \$5.7 million and Kentuckiana Farms was third with more than \$5 million in sales.

"That is outstanding," Reid said. "You get down here in the sale scene and you just get wrapped up in it between the sales and the racing and everything that's going on, trying to monitor everything and you kind of lose sight of what you're actually achieving, but it's a credit to all of Preferred Equine's clients.

"Several of them are leading breeders of the sport and without the participation of the White Birch Farms, the

Southwind Farms, the Deo Volente Farms, the Crawford Farms, the Lindy Farms et cetera, our success wouldn't be possible. We represent several small breeders and it's just been really an outstanding week for our stakes graduates, winning at The Red Mile, including Warrawee Farms. Warrawee Ubeaut setting a world record. It's been exciting and gratifying to be able to represent these breeders. To have a successful sale for the majority of them helps them to run their operations and keeps them going. We need healthy breeders to have the business go around."

By average, with three or more sold, Peninsula Farm Inc. led with \$113,850 for 20 horses sold, followed by Walnut Hall Ltd. (\$97,600, five sold), All American Harnessbreds (\$84,375, eight sold) and Vieux Carre Farms (\$83,143,14 sold).

The top four buyers remained unchanged from the previous night. Burke Racing Stable topped all buyers, spending \$1,216,000, total, on 13 yearlings, followed by Ken Jacobs (\$1,192,000 for six yearlings), Bryan Montgomery, agent (\$995,000 for six) and Dana Parham (\$840,000 for six).

Stallions Muscle Hill and Somebeachsomewhere continued to top the sire list as in previous years. Muscle Hill averaged \$121,000 with 48 sold. Somebeachsomewhere is second on the list (for stallions with three or more offspring sold) with an average of \$106,269 for 26 sold. Father Patrick was third with an average of \$87,208 for 48 sold, followed by Chapter Seven (\$86,963) for 27 sold and Captaintreacherous averaged \$86,931 for 58 sold.



Barnard gambles by supplementing Fiftydallarbill to today's Kentucky Futurity

The owner of the Indiana-bred trotter wrote the \$62,000 check because he thought the horse deserved a chance to again show how he stacked up against Grand Circuit competition.

John Barnard spends his days handling investments in the stock market. So when it comes to the racing business, the Miami resident is not averse to risk. That is why he chose to point his trotter, Breeders Crown 2-year-old champion Fiftydallarbill, to this afternoon's Kentucky Futurity, paying the \$62,000 supplement to enter the contest. Call it a gamble or calculated risk, Barnard wants to pit his Indiana-sired champion against the best at Red Mile.

"If you look at what I've done in putting him in this race, I guess I'm gambling, because everybody would say it's safer to stay in Indiana," the owner said. "I think this horse is good enough that he deserves a chance to show what he's got. You don't get a lot of chances with horses to do this."

The Swan For All—CR Dixie Chick sophomore currently sits atop his Indiana Sires Stakes division. He could have competed last week in a \$75,000 final, the last before next Friday's \$220,000 Super Final at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. Barnard, however, decided to deviate from the plan established earlier this year. With aspirations for a return to the Breeders Crown, the owner saw an opportunity, and he had the confidence in his horse to write the check.

"I just felt the horse deserved a chance coming down here. He's not going to have the opportunity until the Breeders Crown to race again against all the other good horses," he said. "I just figured it's close enough I didn't have to ship him that far. It's worth giving him the opportunity."

The reality is that the 2018 campaign has been one of hard luck for Fiftydallarbill when it comes to racing on the bigger stages. That is hard to say for a horse that has won seven of 12 seasonal starts and earned close to \$240,000. When Barnard mapped out the season, however, he had hoped for better results outside the Hoosier State. In the \$266,000 Goodtimes final, the trotter had to go three-wide when his cover, Hat Trick Habit, broke stride. Ceding considerable distance to the leaders turning for home, Fiftydallarbill would also make a break and finish well out of contention.

Returning to U.S. soil in the Earl Beal Jr. Memorial eliminations, the sophomore was plagued again by back luck. Third over on the backstretch, the Bill Crone-trained trotter nearly came to a stop when a first-up Alarm Detector broke stride. Fiftydallarbill would rally to finish fourth for Brett Miller, nosed out of a chance to advance to the final. In the \$75,000 consolation, the colt would win as the post-time favorite, circling The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono in a lifetime best 1:52.1.

Prior to his most recent start, an ISS elimination at Hoosier, Fiftydallarbill again shipped to Woodbine Mohawk Park for the \$665,000 Canadian Trotting Classic. He would trot third in the race despite a tough trip where his cover, You Know You Do, made a break in front of him. The colt would power home in :26.4 to hit the board. He hasn't received any favors when it comes to the post draw, either. In the Goodtimes final and his Beal elimination, Fiftydallarbill lined up in post seven. In the Canadian Trotting Classic, he was saddled with post eight.

"He has raced really well, but hasn't had the wins to show for it. He's been run into, he's been interfered with in a couple of races where he raced really well and was able to catch up. The last time he raced in Canada he was covered, and then the cover broke in front of him and hurt him," Barnard said. "I know how good this horse is. I want to give other people a chance to see what he's capable of."

The owner does not consider himself superstitious, but when it comes to this trotter, he almost made a change

before the colt ever made a start. Gamblers consider \$50 bills to be bad luck. Barnard was keenly aware of that fact when he purchased Fiftydallarbill for \$16,000 out of the Hoosier Classic sale in 2016.

"Any gambler will tell you, \$50 bills are unlucky. Gamblers never carry them. I almost changed this horse's name from Fiftydallarbill because I thought it was unlucky," he said. "It's also unlucky to change the name of a horse sometimes, too. Every horse that I've ever changed a name, they haven't done very well for me."

He kept the name and watched last season as the colt won seven of 17 starts, capturing two Indiana Sires Stakes finals and becoming eligible to the Super Final. However, on that night in mid-October, Fiftydallarbill, a narrow second choice in the race, made a break at the start from post 10. Dead last in the field, he would rally to finish fourth that night. Just as he is taking a shot in the Kentucky Futurity, Barnard hedged his bets on the Breeders Crown last fall.

"He really hadn't been trained to follow another horse to the gate. That was our mistake. That was not the horse's fault. We should have probably thought about that," he said. "He got up to the gate and had nowhere to go and didn't know what to do, and ended up breaking because of it. But he was also able to come back and race like a monster in that race, which showed me so much. He probably showed me more than if he had won."

Fiftydallarbill would go on to win the \$600,000 Breeders Crown for freshman trotting colts by a length and a quarter. Barnard took the risk, and Fiftydallarbill's richly rewarded his connections. He looks to repeat that again in the Kentucky Futurity. His colt has drawn into the second of two \$93,000 eliminations, starting from the outside in post six. The trotter has to beat one horse to make it into the final.

"I don't think any particular horse has an advantage in the way this is laid out. When you only have six horses in a field, post position, I think, it not as significant. The good horses, hopefully, have a chance to show they are the best," Barnard said. "I think this is a format that gives him a chance to race against the best and see how it plays out. We are racing against some tough horses. Our competition is really tough."

The owner knows the safe play would have been to stay in Indiana. Nevertheless, he sees Fiftydallarbill as a special horse, and he wants to give the trotter a chance to prove it. He has pushed his chips to the center of the table, taking a

calculated risk that the reward will be there. The racing world will find out Sunday afternoon if Fiftydallarbill gets the racing luck that has eluded him on the Grand Circuit this season.

"You have to have a lot of things in your favor. They are not machines, and there is a lot of timing in this, getting your horse right at the right time of year. No one cares if a horse was great back in May if he's sick in October, because you can't prove it in the big races," Barnard said. "He's an exceptional horse. God willing he stays healthy, we're going to keep going with him one race at a time, and try to take him to his potential."

Race 7, \$11,000 2YO Late Closer N/W 2

BOMBAY HANOVER made his first start last weekend since August and looked like an entirely brand new horse. The Ohio-bred Western Vintage gelding was cautiously handled early in that race but stormed home late to win going away in 1:51:3 at odds of nearly 13-1. Zeron back aboard once again and if anything he should be stronger in making his second start back; no reason to go against.

ESCAPETOTHEBEACH was hard used in last week's edition of this race and tired late as a result of the trip. He faced a series of pretty tough foes in PASS action throughout the summer; speed should be coming again. REIGN OF THRONES closed in :26:1 last out while making just his second lifetime start and his first start in over a month; figures to have a say in this. CAPTAIN MCKEE was a non-threatening fourth last out as the 8-5 favorite and prior to that broke his maiden against lesser by open lengths; one of five Tony Alagna horses in this field of 11.

Race 8, \$225,000 Tattersalls 3YO Pace

COURTLY CHOICE was game winner in the Little Brown Jug, after made a recovery after breaking in his elimination and then doing it the hard way in the final. He's fired in nearly every one of his past dozen starts and the bigger sized ovals have suited him well this year; looks to keep the dream season going for him and his connections. STAY HUNGRY came back to win his division of the Bluegrass following his correct but unfortunate disqualification in his Jug

elimination. He's been surging over the past couple of months and McNair may stick with the same closing strategy that worked for him last week. THINKBIG DREAMBIG picked up a 1:48:2 mark last out following a number of near misses. Overall he's been racing better than his record would suggest and is capable of repeating if things go his way. AMERICAN HISTORY had a tough trip last out but is another that could easily win with the right setup; many of these in here aren't separated by much. HAYDEN HANOVER is capable of early speed from the outside.

Race 9, \$93,000 Kentucky Futurity Elimination Trot

All but one of the six horses from this race will return for the Futurity final, as will be the same case for race 10. CRYSTAL FASHION makes his first start since winning the Canadian Trotting Classic on Sept. 15 and this looks to be a good showdown between him and #6. He earned that win in the CTC when he overcame post 10 and then wore down and overpowered leader Met's Hall. He's been a model of consistency all year and looks to add another notch to his building resume. TACTICAL LANDING exits a career best mile and has gone from erratic to reliable for trainer and driver Jimmy Takter; there shouldn't be much opposition to him getting near the front despite the outside post. EUROBOND lands the rail and was able to beat TACTICAL LANDING two back in the KYSS final; certainly a mid-priced possibility. YOU KNOW YOU DO wasn't bad last week from post 9; still waiting for him to pop.

Race 10, \$93,000 Kentucky Futurity Elimination Trot

METS HALL is another that enters today off a new lifetime mark and he remains razor sharp ever since Hambletonian Day. His second place two back was no disgrace and we all know speed is his game; needs to beat a key rival in #1. SIX PACK makes his first start outside of New York since that ill-fated Hambo elimination and I'm sure Svanstedt will be looking for some redemption. He would have been able to beat these easily earlier in the summer but things look more competitive now. FIFTYDALLARBILL is an obvious contender but he could be coming from last and winning the elimination might not be the highest priority. ZEPHYR KRONOS is a nice colt but hasn't been able to been able to beat the likes of #'s 1 or 3 yet this year; would be somewhat of a surprise.

Sixth time for Korvenoja

Finnish top trainer Tuomas Korvenoja won the Kriterium in his home country for the sixth time on Saturday afternoon.

His 3-year-old weapon this time is named Lewis Ale (Andover Hall) and this talented trotter came to the Kriterium (\$259,000) with five wins in six attempts. Lewis Ale was the third choice in the race, which tells something about the quality of the 3-year-olds in Finland this year.

Timo Nurmos trained Marrakesh (5-for-5 before the Kriterium) and Graceful Swamp (13 wins of 14 starts this year prior to the Kriterium) were both serious candidates for the victory according to the bettors, but with all the facts on hand, Lewis Ale is probably the best horse in the crop, which he showed at Tampere racetrack.

Tuomas Korvenoja early found the lead behind his Andover Hall son and the most critical point happened in the first turn, when the duo was seriously challenged for the front position, but Korvenoja put the trust in his horse and Lewis Ale solved the situation and kept the lead.

Next drama was when Marrakesh attacked three wide and landed outside leader with 1 2/8ths of a mile to go. At the same time, Graceful Swamp made a break in second over and his chances to win the Kriterium disappeared.

Marrakesh struggled to keep up the pace with the leader from outside position, but when the field turned for home stretch, Lewis Ale put in the next gear and left his opponents for the victory in mile rate 1:59.3 over 1.7 miles.

Tuomas Korvenoja has been in the top among the Finnish

trainers for many years and his first victory in the Kriterium came 1994, with Venice Beach (Friendly Face).

Bosses Lady (The Bosses Lady) and Mr Big Star (Igor Font) took the places behind the winner.

Lewis Ale replay

Will Who's Who repeat Maharajah's feat?

Swedish Derby winner Who's Who (Maharajah) will face European competition when the final of Grand Prix de l'U.E.T. (European Derby) is scheduled at Vincennes racetrack in Paris on Friday Oct. 12.

Who's Who won his elimination comfortably at Solvalla last weekend and \$230,200 awaits the winner on Friday in Paris.

Maharajah managed to win two Derby titles the same year in 2009 and his son Who's Who will be one of the favorites from post five behind the gate.

Pete Sok: from Chopped champion to racetrack chef

The man behind the Funky Monkey at The Track on 2 in Alberta is elevating racetrack cuisine.

An "appetizing wagering menu" can mean large fields offering horseplayers lots of value. At The Track on 2, it also means snacks and meals from Chef Pete (Sophear) Sok's kitchen. Four years ago, the Red Deer, AB resident won season three of The Food Network's popular cooking competition, Chopped Canada. In September, his Funky Monkey restaurant debuted at The Track on 2 in rural Lacombe, AB.

From the start, experienced restaurant owner and chef Sok wanted to bring a unique take on familiar comfort food to Track on 2 patrons. "For a lot of people who are in racing, they told me the food is very basic buffet, hotdogs and hamburgers — concessions food," he said. "Some of the horsemen and drivers are used to basic high-volume food. Low quality, cheap and easy. I totally understand why (track restaurants) do that, but we turn into an independently operating restaurant when there's no racing."

When Canada's newest racetrack opened under the ownership of Kurt and Kyla Belich and Ross Morrison in September, the Le Cordon Bleu-trained chef du cuisine wanted to become a part of the business.

"I came in part-time," explained Sok. "Initially I was just going to help them start up and work the race days. I got along with the owners. They gave me a good feeling and I said, 'Maybe I can offer you my full-time, because I think you're gonna need me more than just race days."

His personal experience of racing was limited to time spent with his wife's grandfather, retired Alberta quarter horse racehorse breeder Alex Link. Sok saw sophisticated grandstand dining room meals served to affluent clientele at major stakes events, but he didn't consider the model scalable to The Track on 2, and wasn't sure if local overnight racing or simulcast wagering crowds even wanted it.

"There's a 'fancy' sort of dinners that happen on certain occasions, like the Queen's Plate. I was like, 'Oh yeah, I love that sort of food, but I don't think I can do it for 500 people," he said. Harness racing bettors and fans were typically hungry for something less fussy: "I gathered it was 'hand food', or fair food. We just made it a little more culinary-adventurous."

The Funky Monkey menu, launched the first week of

October, features Asian dishes (curry bowls, pad thais) and traditional favorites side-by-side. On a non-racing Thursday at lunch hour, tables on the main floor of The Track on 2 filled with a diverse mix of patrons. A group of young women ordered food and drinks, then turned to the large windows to watch horses training.

Sok's kitchen broke its own opening day sales record on Sunday, Sept. 30. The track's simulcast signal was unavailable because of off-site technical problems, so all revenue brought in that day came from on-track wagering and food and beverage sales. The Funky Monkey was slammed with orders as the small two-level grandstand filled to near-capacity.

"We had tickets hitting the floor — as people in the kitchen call it, 'in the weeds'. Where the (orders) go, they were piling up and hitting the floor. That's when you say you're 'in the weeds."

Sok and staff filled over 100 orders that six-race afternoon, each order representing a table with up to eight customers. "We ran out of burgers — Alberta beef, locally made by our own butcher," he said. The butcher had to deliver more that

afternoon to keep pace with demand. Was the chef overwhelmed? Not at all, laughed Sok: "I'm ready for that to happen again."

While adventurous, the Funky Monkey menu doesn't approach the dizzying challenges of preparing the three-course dinner that won Chopped Canada's \$10,000 top prize. Pete and younger brother Dany both qualified for the show and were flown into Toronto at 4 am to compete in a top-secret professional kitchen. "Six or eight knives, you're allowed to bring; you check in your phones, and it was high security," he recalled. "If you had to go to the washroom, they escorted you."

Pete's winning dishes had to incorporate Skittles in the appetizer, peppermint patties in the main course, and edible nasturitum flowers in the dessert. He said it was the latter — a mini pear potpie with saffron-vodka cream and a nasturitum side salad — which decided his fate: "I knew that that dish was the perfect dish."

A gambler himself, he likes to chat with racetrack regulars, developing different ways to elevate racetrack food from the realm of grotesque examples he's heard about. "Something that looks like beef from yesterday's meal. It's in a crock pot and there's a spoon. A hotdog floating in hotdog soup. I guess there's really not a standard," he observed. "Maybe we'll be the track that kind of pushes the envelope a little bit."

His Triple Crown poutine (topped with house-made gravy,

caramelized onions, mushrooms and bacon) is a winner with the OTB crowd; so are house-made foot-long corn dogs and truffle parmesan fries (served with garlic aioli). The menu's more exotic fare prompted several horseplayers to tell Sok they were pleasantly surprised "to see spicy cauliflower bites or firecracker shrimp rolls or crispy shrimp wontons at a racetrack."

Sok said while he's a little frightened of horses, he likes learning about harness racing and stepping outside of his kitchen to take in the action: "On the sideline, I watch them — it's nice." He added he is optimistic about The Track on 2, Alberta's only "B" harness venue, which looks to host an expanded live racing season in 2019, after 10 race dates this preliminary season: "I plan to be here and watch this place grow. I want to be here when the capacity is at the max and we can't let any more people in."

And racetrack chefs, this part's for you — Sok said he would love to take part in a culinary showdown against his counterparts from other tracks' restaurants, if an organization were to offer one, perhaps as a charity fundraiser. "I'm in! I love competition!" he said, laughing. The challenge of helping develop a rural Alberta harness racing destination is just one more facet of Sok's appetite for adventure. "I'm a pretty funky monkey myself," he said with a grin.

Great coverage of the Lexington Sale and the race meet at the Red Mile. Thank you.

I do however have a problem with the way several tracks are now dealing with stake races. The same track operators that constantly cry out for a level playing field in dealing with drug use and trainer practices are less than honest or fair with race draws.

Case in point.... Sixteen entries and two elim fields for the Kentucky Filly Futurity have Atlanta,

Manchego and Plunge BC in the same division. Fair?

I asked a friend teaching at Dartmouth's Tuck Business School to evaluate probabilities in the likelihood of that happening with 16 entries. A simulation model they developed resulted in odds of over 700-1 in that possibility. That seems significant to me.

Additionally, some of these same tracks are handicapping race draws with assigned post positions. I assured the Manchego team we would draw post 9, 10 or 11 in the recent Moni Maker Stake at Hoosier. She had the 10. Honest, open draw? I doubt it.

So, either way, the track operators have a different way of creating their own version of a level playing field. One that serves their own self interest in maximizing handle.

Fair? No way!

Follow Hong Kong's lead on vets

Many people have spoken out about how horse racing is finished as a viable form of entertainment. There are more than likely a few in the sport who probably share this point of view, maybe more than less. And I feel those who we elect as leaders of our horsemen's associations, agricultural ministers and racetrack operators have not really put forth any hard thought to how the industry can better its self. When I read what their thoughts or plans are to better the industry it just is the same old and used rhetoric like a hamster inside a wheel, and round and round it goes. I would like to see something along the lines of what is happening in Hong Kong. First equine vetting or healthcare would be controlled by the government. Every practicing vet could make application to the government for approval to practice on the racetrack grounds or at the trainers' stables. Set fees would be set by the government and paid by them. This would create a documented file of each racehorse racing and when any new drug is administered could help connect the dots to why some trainers are winning more than their share and if anything other than what is documented shows up in tests could indicate possible masking techniques. This should eliminate also rising costs in vet work because of some not paying their bills. The vet is responsible in informing the authorities all treatments prior to entry and that would be final disclosure. Anything other than what the vet has indicated would mean a hold of all connected including the horse, and purse money. In other words, no entries would be accepted by the trainer or owner and the horse would be suspended until there is a resolution. The three-strike rule should be brought in with monetary fines and after the third strike both trainer and owner would receive lifetime suspensions. Let the owner and trainer fight it out in court and not be a burden to horse racing. Now there would be a cost to all this and this could be worked out. All horses for each race would be subjected to an entry fee and starting fee and the average vet bill per month for each horse would be deducted from the available purse for that race. Both the entry and starting fees and the average vet fees per starter would them be combined and withheld for the season. If at the end of each season what was charged and deducted from the purse account per race resulted in a loss or a surplus a correction could be put in place for the next season. This would be the industry doing something to better it's self and make it self sustaining while reducing costs from a system that isn't working.

Enlightening experience with new fans

When I go to the track alone, I often eavesdrop on conversations. I thought you would find this one particularly interesting. There were two young college types who were trying to understand what they saw on the tote board as the post parade began. At the end of the parade, the announcer said, "Less than a minute to post." One guy said to the other,

"I guess it's too late to make a bet now." At that point I told them that they still had a few minutes to bet. He asked why then did the minutes to post on the board say zero and the announcer said we had less than a minute? I told them that they just say that to get people to wager early. They asked me if I was going to bet and I said, "Yes and right now." They followed me to the window where I put \$10 to win on #2 who was 5-2 at the moment. As I was leaving the window they asked what I had done and what to say to the ticket seller in order to bet \$2 to win on #2. So they made that bet and looked up at a TV that showed #2 was going to pay \$7.40. We stayed near that monitor with the race about to begin. They immediately noticed the numbers of the horses displayed at the bottom of the screen. They were 8 1 2 3. But that was not correct. #8 never did actually get the lead but tucked in third, so the screen should have read 1, 2, 8, 3. They asked why the screen listed #8 in front, and I just told them that it was simply an error. I also told them that those placements were not updated in real time, a term they completely understood. In this case, the order was not updated until the field was past the half mile pole. As it turns out, beginners luck had prevailed and our #2 won the race. But much to their surprise, the win price turned out to be \$5.40 and not the \$7.40 they had expected. Of course I had to explain the concept of "late money" changing the odds. At that point, the expression on his face seemed to change along with the tone of his voice. He said, "So let me get this straight. When the tote board says zeros minutes to post, that's not true. When the announcer says 'less than one minute to post, that's not true. The position numbers posted during the race are often incorrect. When the tote board says \$7.40, it might be only \$5.40. So how do I know that the track didn't just lower the price so they would make more money?" I explained how there are multiple levels of computer controls to avoid such a thing, but I'm not sure he was totally convinced.

So once again I ask harness racing to wake up and stop saying things that are not true. Nobody believes that big zeros on the board, get real. Nobody believes there is less than a minute after the post parade in which to bet, so stop saying it. You can delay between the post parade and the start of a race as much as you want, but stop saying things that are just wrong. If today's potential new bettors question your integrity, they are not likely to return.
