Sig Saaer wins 132nd Kentucky Futurity

Sig Sauer plowed forward off a tumultuous tempo and persevered through a weary charge in the stretch to win the \$500,000 132nd Kentucky Futurity – sponsored by Hunterton Farms, Stoner Manor Inc. and Menhammar Stuteri AB – in 1:49.3 on Sunday (Oct. 6) at The Red Mile.

Leaving from post 8, driver Andy McCarthy sent Sig Sauer forward and floated back to race fifth – ahead of Karl (driven by Yannick Gingras) leaving from the second tier – while Highland Kismet (Bob McClure) charged to the lead in a :26.3 first quarter. Tony Adams S (Dexter Dunn) followed to sweep forward to lead the field up the backside and stayed on the muscle to clock a half in :52.4, spurring McClure immediately to pop the pocket.

"I figured it was going to be a rough trip," Andy McCarthy said. "We had a bad post so I knew it was going to be a rough trip. In my head, plan A was to get in front of Bobby [McClure and Highland Kismet] at the start, if I could get him off the gate fast enough, and then move to the front and maybe follow Highland Kismet, because I thought he was sitting on a very big mile today.

"Plans change... I didn't quite get him out of there on as good a foot as I'd like. I was lucky enough to jump in for about an eighth-of-a-mile to just get him back in the gear that I wanted. Then, once the pace slowed down, I moved and he was like a freight train then."

Sig Sauer ranged forward to the half to race third and caught brief cover from Highland Kismet moving for the final turn. Highland Kismet easily circled Tony Adams S, but Sig Sauer continued advancing on the rim and pushed forward to the lead after three-quarters in 1:21. Sig Sauer disposed of a tired Highland Kismet and opened a 21/2-length cushion on his competitors in the stretch. Karl levelled off from his parked trip as did Mr Bluebird (Ake Svanstedt), but Amazing Catch ripped onto the scene through traffic and in the last eighth to challenge Sig Sauer late. Andy McCarthy pulled the plugs and asked Sig Sauer for just enough to keep Amazing Catch at bay by three-quarters-of-a-length at the line. Bella's Muscle Hill (David Miller), at 130-1, rallied from near last for third with Mr Bluebird taking fourth and Karl settling for fifth.

"Yeah, I was kind of just talking to him," said Andy of encouraging Sig Sauer in the stretch. "He still had the earplugs in and I was just talking to him, saying 'Come on,

we're good, we're good. Keep going on'. He was fine, then once Amazing Catch started coming at me, I kicked the ear plugs out and he went again. He wasn't done, he was just switching off a little bit.

Winning this race with trainer Noel Daley made it more special for Andy.

"Noel's been my man since 2007 – I lived in his house and he took care of me," Andy said. "He got the ball rolling for me in the U.S. so it's just super and very emotional to do it with Noel.

Andy won his second Kentucky Futurity, having won his first in 2021 with Jujubee in a 1:49.3 mile.

Daley trains Sig Sauer, a 3-year-old colt by Muscle Hill, for owners Patricia Stable, Joe Sbrocco, JAF Racing, Allister Stables and Caviart Farms. Daley also won his second Kentucky Futurity, having first won with Mr Muscleman back in 2003.


When asked about watching the race unfold, Daley said: "Well, I knew we were going to go forward. We

had to take a shot. We've never taken the shoes off before... actually, we took the shoes off to warm him up to make sure.

"Whenever he is good, I know he's good... I mean, I don't want to sound too high, but whenever he's on his game, I said I wouldn't swap him for anybody... He was good, but we drew where we drew and that was going to be the issue. You don't know who is leaving and who's not. It's been a front-end track all day, so there were a bunch of horses that could have left inside me.

"I asked Andy what he thought and he said, 'Well, we've got to give it a shot.' Basically, just closed our eyes for the first quarter just to see where he was going to end up. Even after the recall there, when they jogged back, I just looked at Andy and he smiled at me... so it was, 'Okay, he's not worried about him."

Sig Sauer won his eighth race from 13 starts and has now earned \$849,312. He paid \$21.18 to win.

In the \$50,000 Kentucky Futurity consolation, **Vic Zelenskyy** (Dunn) romped to an 8¾-length victory in 1:50.1. Marcus Melander trains the Greenshoe colt, out of world champion Mission Brief, for owners S R F Stable and Holly Lane Stud East Ltd. He paid \$2.90 to win.





Mirage Hanover crushes, McCrunch prevails in Tattersalls

Mirage Hanover posted a blowout victory while **McCrunch** rallied in time to grab the win in their respective divisions of the \$422,000 Tattersalls Pace, sponsored by Cameo Hills Farm, on Sunday (Oct. 6) at The Red Mile.

Mirage Hanover, sent off as the 4-5 favorite, bolted from a pocket ride and scurried away to a 1:46.3 victory in the first division of the Tattersalls Pace.

Driver Dexter Dunn sent Mirage Hanover forward and landed on the pylons into the turn, but yielded command to Legendary Hanover (driven by James MacDonald) as he shuffled out of post 7 to lead the field by a :26.1 first quarter. Legendary Hanover coasted up the backstretch uncontested to a :53.4 half, but started feeling pressure around the final turn with Better Is Nice (Andy McCarthy) plugging forward on the rim and Mirage Hanover antsy to move from the pocket. Dunn fed Mirage Hanover racetrack off three-quarters in 1:20.2 and darted by Legendary Hanover in the stretch. Mirage Hanover pulled clear of his competition through the lane to cross the beam 3½-lengths better than Better Is Nice chasing in second. Captain's Quarters (Yannick Gingras) finished third and Number Cruncher (Scott Zeron) closed from last for fourth.

"Oh, super mile and such a nice horse," said Dunn of Mirage Hanover in the Tattersalls. "We got a good trip there, but, man, he was really good and straight. Just a beautiful horse to drive and he gives you an easy ride.

"He's such an honest, classy horse; two back-to-back performances in the Jug and was great today. We had to use him a little bit early, but we got the right helmet after that. The pace was pretty hot and he was travelling so good coming off the last turn that, when I pulled him, he really went down great."

Jake Leamon trains Mirage Hanover, a colt by Bettor's Delight, for owner Marvin Rounick.

"They had a pretty good tailwind, so I thought maybe :47 but, with the tailwind, I think that kind of helped them home," Leamon said of the fast clocking. "He was strong and looked strong out there. You wonder without the Lasix and everything, you don't know, but then he just started powering away from them and I thought, 'Okay, we're good.' I thought the horse coming on the outside might have had a shot at him. They went to the half pretty good.

"He's pretty much staked to everything, it's just a matter of where we want to aim him for. I guess the next step will be the Breeders Crown and see how that goes."

Mirage Hanover won his eighth race from 24 starts, has now earned \$570,093 and paid \$3.82 to win.

McCrunch (A. McCarthy) emerged from a first-turn shuffle to strike the winning blow at the end of a 1:48.2 mile in the second Tattersalls division.

Leaving from the pylon post, McCrunch moved forward but found himself fourth as 4-5 favorite Women Layer (Todd McCarthy) took the lead from Boston Rocks (Tim Tetrick) to a :27.1 first quarter with Nuclear (Dunn) on the move to the outside. Nuclear then grabbed the helm from Women Layer on the backside and clocked a :54 half while Tetrick

"It was a perfect drive by Andrew [in the Tattersalls]. He gets the credit for that, for sure. He raced really well and Andrew said he had plenty of pace left finishing, so we're happy with that. He just had to stay after him a little bit because the horse was coming off the rail with fresh legs, but I'm really happy with him today.

"I don't know, we're really going to have to evaluate and see how he comes out of the race. We got a little lucky because we

waited and then committed to moving first over with Boston Rocks into the final turn. McCrunch perched onto the cover and loomed three wide spinning off three-quarters in 1:21.4 to mount a challenge against Nuclear in the stretch drive. McCrunch gathered steam to the center of the track and surged forward while holding off Women Layer skimming the pylons to win by 11/4 lengths with Nuclear left in third. Captain Luke (Scott Zeron) rallied from last for fourth.

"He raced awesome," said A. McCarthy of McCrunch. "He's been pretty good. I kind of picked up the drive there a couple of months ago and just tried to teach him to race off the helmet. The trip worked out today and he finished it off."


After winning with McCrunch, co-owner Joe Sbrocco said, "It's so much fun, especially for my partners - that's what makes it so much fun. Johnny Fodera [co-owner] couldn't make it [today], but I got him on the phone – he didn't know what to say; he was screaming at me that we won."

Sbrocco shares ownership of McCrunch, a colt by Captain Crunch, with 3 Brothers Stables, Caviart Farms and JAF Racing LLC. Nancy Takter trains the winner of seven races from 17 starts and \$241,684 in purses who paid \$10.70 to win.

Takter talked briefly about McCrunch not getting to the races until he was 3, how good he was in the Tattersalls, and the rest of the year.

"Yeah, it's hard when they don't race at 2, especially in a top level for 3-year-olds because, I mean, they obviously go so fast every week and then you're trying to teach a horse how to race," Takter said. "He was actually turned out really early. He was turned out in June, so he really missed his entire 2-year-old year, so I'm really happy with how he's performed this year.

Driver Todd McCarthy hustled **R Melina** forward, refused to relinquish the lead despite swift fractions and successfully bottomed the well on her peers to claim the \$301,550 59th Kentucky Filly Futurity – sponsored by Crawford Farms – in a 1:50.1 mile on Sunday (Oct. 6) at The Red Mile.

R Melina built speed off the wings and protected an outside lane in a five-filly skirmish through the first turn. Miss I La (driven by Joe Bongiorno) got to the lead but R Melina swooped forward and took over control after a :26.4 first quarter with Warrawee Michelle (Ake Svanstedt) tracking her move before getting caught uncovered on the rim. Warrawee Michelle pressed forward up the backside while R Melina held her ground to the cones to keep her rival parked through a half clocked in :53.2, at which point Warrawee Michelle hit the ropes and began a retreat.

Buy A Round (Andy McCarthy) swung three wide from third over with Date Night Hanover (Dexter Dunn) catching her tow to get around her tiring cover while R Melina stayed on the muscle through the final turn. By three-quarters in 1:22, R Melina engaged with Buy A Round into the stretch and turned

away her rival with ease. Date Night Hanover also levelled off from her parked mile, leaving Miss I La the closest but non-threatening pursuer in second. R Melina stayed straight and strong through the heat of battle to clench gold in a lifetime-best 1:50.1, finishing three lengths better than Miss I La. Sambuca Hanover (David Miller) emerged from a groundsaving trip for third and Buy A Round faded to fourth.

"It was kind of one of those races where you have a rough idea of where you'd like to get away or what you'd like to happen, but as soon as you put a horse off the second row in them races, it just seems to turn into pretty action-packed races," said Todd McCarthy of what he thought going into the race and what transpired. "I knew if I wasn't aggressive enough early, that it would be quite easy to get shuffled back and buried on the rail. I didn't want to let that happen. I figured I had a good draw and I didn't want to be in a spot... you know, if I had to be first up or something like that, I'd rather be cutting the mile and doing it that way."


Todd said he thought about just letting Svanstedt, driving Warrawee Michelle, go.

"My filly was pretty aggressive at the time and Ake's was kind of laboring a little bit getting there," Todd said. "I had a peek back over my shoulder and there was a line of them behind him, so... the way his horse looked at the time, I thought it was best if I could stay in front and control the pace at that time. I just didn't want to risk getting shuffled through the field there. It didn't feel like a good option for me.

With now back-to-back wins in the Filly Futurity, Todd said he knew what to expect heading for home and that the draw helped.

"I had a bit of a look there and I could sort of see a few of the better ones in there got placed quite a bit back, so I knew they had a lot of ground to make up," Todd said. "Up until the top of the stretch there, I hadn't really let her go. I just kind of felt like I had it under wraps, so when I asked her to sprint, she gave me a good kick and I was pretty confident. She's such a hardy little filly that I thought once she kicked away it was going to be hard for them to catch her, because she just keeps drawing."

Trainer John Butenschoen could not have been happier for how R Melina performed today and for everyone connected with her.

"It's just awesome," Butenschoen said. "We've been unlucky with post positions a little bit. She's gotten to the top a lot rougher, not as fast, but a lot rougher to get there. Today, she was good. She was really good. We made a few changes; we took her shoes off. We thought if we were going to try something, this was the track to try it on. The track was good and I think out of the 11 horses, nine of them raced barefoot today. I think that's kind of a testament to the breed and how we're going – that these things are pretty natural. In Europe, they do it a lot with the older horses, but these younger ones are coming to their gait and staying sound. It's kind of exciting when you can do that and have them respond.

"Todd made the right call. If he stays in, Ake gets to the front and what happens is we'll get run back down the rail and she'll probably race good and be second, third or fourth, but you try to win races and that's what he did – he tried to win it and he did.

Butenschoen said getting this win for R Melina's owners – M And L Of Delaware LLC and Alabama Harness Associates LLC – made it particularly special.

"Oh, it's just wonderful," Butenschoen said. "M And L Of Delaware; Doug is the son and Roz is still alive – Doug's father and Roz's husband Ralph passed away a while back, but it was through them back in 1989 that they gave some little, unknown farm boy from Illinois a chance to train some horses for them and it's been a relationship now that's been 35 years. They befriended Jim and Rita and bought some horses, and it was really neat to see them, with the amount of money here this last couple of years that Jim and Rita have put into it, get to have some really exciting fun... and they are validating, hopefully, what they are doing in the mares and stuff they are breeding."

A filly by Chapter Seven, R Melina won her eighth race from 14 starts this season and her 15th from 26 starts in her career, good for \$1,012,612 for owners M&L of Delaware LLC and Alabama Harness Associates LLC. She paid \$12 to win.

In the \$25,000 Kentucky Filly Futurity consolation, **Spy Coast** (Yannick Gingras) circled to the lead after the quarter and rolled home a 314-length winner as the 9-5 favorite to clock a 1:50.3 mile. Ron Burke trains the Walner filly for owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Phillip Collura and Elizabeth Jones. She paid \$5.96 to win.



Bythemissal lasts, Sylvia Hanover notches track record in Allerage

Bythemissal secured the lead from post 10 and maintained command to the finish, while **Sylvia Hanover** lowered the track record for older pacing mares in their respective divisions of the Allerage Farms Pace on Sunday (Oct. 6) at The Red Mile.

Once reaching the lead, Bythemissal cruised and then withstood a furious rally from Abuckabett Hanover to win the \$159,000 Allerage Open Pace, sponsored by Jeff and Paula Gural, in 1:47.2.

Driver Yannick Gingras launched Bythemissal from the outermost post and reached the lead after a :26.2 first quarter to pocket Rocknroll Runa A (driven by Todd McCarthy), who soon broke stride heading onto the backstretch. Bythemissal rolled on a loose lead with Muskateer Hanover (Tony Hall) tightening from the pocket to a :53.4 half and stayed on cruise control through the final turn while Little Rocket Man (David Miller) led the two-wide tier first over. Bythemissal clocked by three-quarters in 1:21.1 and accelerated for home as Abuckabett Hanover (Dexter Dunn) sprung from his second-over position after the leader. Abuckabett Hanover kept digging at Bythemissal through the final eighth but Bythemissal responded to urging and to the challenge to hold onto the win by a head. Muskateer Hanover gave chase in third and Admiral Hill (Matt Kakaley) rallied for fourth.

"It's been a tough year with him," trainer Ron Burke said of Bythemissal, who won his first race of the season in his fifth start and in his third start since a near three-month layoff. "Things went wrong that I never saw coming, but thank God the owners are all so good about it [saying] 'Take your time.' This horse is going to be here for the next three or four years, so we just took our time and hope to finish strong now."

When asked what it was like to be back in the winner's circle with Bythemissal, Gingras said, "It's great, he's had a tough year but when he came back, he came back sound. He felt good and in Indiana last week, he raced good. I knew he was ready, but no doubt going to the Breeders Crown – not that I need a confidence boost, but I definitely have even more confidence in him."

Bythemissal, a 5-year-old gelding by Downbytheseaside, won his 26th race from 38 starts and added to a bankroll now worth



Sylvia Hanover took a while to get rolling, but once driver Bob McClure put her in play, she stormed over the clay to register a track-record 1:47.3 win in the \$65,500 Catch The Fire Allerage Farms Mare Pace, sponsored by Sugar Valley Farms.

McClure settled into fourth with Sylvia Hanover as Zanatta (Dunn) shot from post 6 to the lead into a :26.2 first quarter. Always B Naughty (Gingras) moved off the pylons from third to grab the lead heading to the backstretch while McClure took his time edging Sylvia Hanover off the pylons. Once on the outside, Sylvia Hanover lunged forward, collared Always B Naughty after a :53.4 half and steamrolled through the final turn to clock three-quarters in 1:21.1. Sylvia Hanover wandered off the cones in the straight but McClure raised the reins and kept his charge focused all through the lane to cross the line 2³/₄-lengths better than Always B Naughty. Beach Cowgirl (McCarthy) took third off a third-over trip and Zanatta finished fourth.

After the race, McClure was unaware that Sylvia Hanover had set a track record.

"That's surprising at [1]:47.3, but she definitely had something in the tank," McClure said. "She's pretty good at just doing what she has to do. If horses come at her in the stretch, she'll get going again. We didn't take anything too much out of her, so we'll be able to enter her to the Breeders Crown now.





Sylvia Hanover (Bob McClure) after winning her Allerage final in 1:47.3.







"Yeah, well, you're up against a monster in Twin B Joe Fresh," he said. "We were fortunate to dodge her this week. Last year, they chased us all year and this year we're chasing them all year. They deserve it, she's a great horse."

The lifetime-best 1:47.3 mile by Sylvia Hanover bests the previous track record for a 4-year-old pacing mare of 1:48 set by Rocknificent back in 2021 and comes just three-fifths of a second short of Test Of Faith's world record set in 2022 at The Meadowlands.

Shawn Steacy, who shares the training of Sylvia Hanover with his father Mark Steacy, also addressed Sylvia's record this year and what's next for her.

"Yeah, she's been great," Shawn said. "When you get into the 4-year-old and 5-year-old year, they are all great, so it's hard to be a dominant figure all the time. I don't think she's thrown, maybe, one bad race all year – all her life, basically. Sometimes you win, sometimes you lose. She's a uniquely special horse and she's just in a year with another uniquely special horse, too.

"The plan is to go over to New Jersey after this, collect and get ready for the Breeders Crown. Then, probably the TVG or whatever it's called on FanDuel, but that's 'to be determined' after.

"Then, a 5-year-old campaign is thought about, but nothing has been decided yet. It's still vague, the information, but we're still deciding things as we go. We don't want to cheapen her in any way, because she's been so special to us.

Shawn said he has given thought to the fact that these could be Sylvia's final races as well as the possibility of facing Twin B Joe Fresh in the Crown.

"It's always in the back of your mind, but we've been going all year and you want to win everything, but we really want to win that Breeders Crown," he said. "That's what it's been all about, all year long. You know, winning what you can, but being right on point for that one. So, we've got two, probably three, weeks to figure that out.

"If we can bring our horse to the top-level, A game, then we can go with it. So, it's just a matter of who is going to have their day at that point."

A daughter of Always B Miki, Sylvia Hanover won just her second race from 14 starts this season but collected her 20th victory from 36 starts in her career, good for \$1,748,495 in earnings for owner Hudson Standardbred Stable Inc. She paid \$2.92 to win.



Hillexotic (driven by Austin Hanners) burst through from the pylon post to take the lead and carve a :26.2 first quarter. Hanners attempted to grab a breather up the backside, but the tempo remained hot past a :54.2 half. Rocket Deo jetted to a pillar-to-post victory in the first division of the Glen Garnsey Memorial, timed in 1:48.3.





I popped over to see Nick Salvi in his box, taking a seat next door with Doug McIntosh. Nick introduced me to John Rallis, who I had yet to meet. John left after a few minutes, noting that he was going to make the hike upstairs to see Gabe Prewitt.

I was wandering around again and saw my former Horseman And Fair World co-worker Lynne Myers, who was with her husband Mike. Dr. Katie Flynn was also there. And then Ex-Boss Kathy arrived so it was like a mini-Horseman reunion between me, Kathy, Lynne and Katie. As I was heading out, I saw Bryan and Lella Montgomery, so I went over to see how Lella was feeling as she was under the weather Friday and didn't make it to the track.

As noted in the headline, this is my last column for 2024. Actually, when the meet started, I was set on making this my final column ever. Upon the suggestion of Ex-Boss Kathy in





A pair of stunners took center stage from the three divisions of the \$300,900 International Stallion Stakes for 2-year-old pacing colts on geldings on Saturday (Oct. 5) at The Red Mile: first with **D A Love Boat** shocking in a photo and last with **Fallout** scorching the track in a blowout win.

With fast fractions laid and a strained favorite on the lead, D A Love Boat mounted a far-turn assault on 1-9 chalk Louprint that proved a successful gambit in the final strides of the first ISS division for pacing colts.

Driver Yannick Gingras activated D A Love Boat off the wings of the gate and crossed to the top before yielding command to

Strangerinthenight (driven by David Miller) as he swooped from post 9 to the lead through am :27.2 first quarter. Thirsty Thursday (Matt Kakaley) then lunged out of third to challenge for the lead, at which point Louprint (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) made his move off the pegs to try for the front. All the while, D A Love Boat found himself shuffled to fourth while Louprint cleared command after a :54.1 half.

Louprint slowed the tempo slightly through the final turn, prompting Gingras to send D A Love Boat forward on the rim. D A Love Boat loomed to match strides with Louprint past three-quarters in 1:22 and engaged in a stretch-long battle that Louprint valiantly fought. Despite staying game along the pylons, Louprint failed to wade through D A Love Boat's final surge over the line to miss a nose decision to the 26-1 shot in a 1:48.4 mile. Boomerang (Dexter Dunn) gave chase off a ground-saving trip for third, another six lengths behind, and Strangerinthenight took fourth.

"To be honest, I am as surprised as anybody," winning trainer Jack Darling said. "He's been a nice colt, just has always had bad posts and things didn't work out. But he sure came through today."

Darling owns D A Love Boat through his Jack Darling Stables Ltd. The Captain Crunch colt collected his second win from six starts and has now earned \$71,589. He paid \$54.84 to win.

Metro Pace winner Fallout (Tim Tetrick) decimated his competition in the closing ISS split for pacing colts, romping to a 1:48.4 victory to deliver on a 1-9 promise.

Tetrick made his move for the lead with Fallout after a :26.4 first quarter and swooped to overtake Ayeaye Captain Deo (Andy McCarthy) midway up the backstretch. He tripped the half in :54.2 and steadily opened his advantage while speeding through the final turn to clock three-quarters in 1:21.2. Fallout's foes floundered in the stretch as Tetrick kept his charge to task while all alone and rolling over the line a 10½-length winner. Tom Horn (Miller) grabbed second, Delray Beach (Gingras) closed from last for third and Odds On No Limit (James MacDonald) finished fourth.

"He's a pretty cool horse, man," Tetrick said after the race. "He gets over the ground real easy, likes his work and he's a lot of fun to sit behind. And he looks like [Captaintreacherous], feels like him and works his ears the same. He's just like his daddy."

Fallout, a colt by Captaintreacherous, won his fourth race from nine starts and has now earned \$486,750 for owners Robert LeBlanc, Pryde Stables Inc. and Caviart Farms. Tony Alagna trains the colt who paid \$2.24 to win.

After the favorite faltered in the first ISS division, **American Son** (Dexter Dunn) delivered as the 1-2 choice in the second ISS split, timed in 1:49.4.

Dunn nestled American Son to the pylons as TH Colby (Gingras) pushed for the lead and soon sat a pocket to Banderas (MacDonald) through a :27.4 first quarter. Once the scramble settled, Dunn sent American Son off the pegs and to the lead before a :54.3 half and cruised through the final turn to clock three-quarters in 1:22.3. American Son drifted from the pylons as he sprinted for home and only faced a stout challenge in the last eighth from No Trespassing (Scott Zeron) springing from second over, but the public choice held firm to the finish to win by a neck. No Trespassing took second with Banderas finishing third and World Beater (Todd McCarthy) giving chase in fourth.

"I'm pretty high on this colt," trainer Chris Ryder said. "He hasn't won the last couple of starts, but he got there today and he's going to have a big future."

American Son, an American Ideal colt competing for owner Henderson Farms, collected his fourth win from seven starts and has now earned \$175,150. He paid \$3.18 to win.

Divisions 1 and 3 of the ISS colt pace were named "The Tall Dark Stranger" sponsored by the Tall Dark Stranger Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms. The middle division was named "The Summa Cum Laude" sponsored by Midland Acres.

SOUND JUDGEMENT SWIFTEST IN INTERNATIONAL STALLION STAKE UPSET

Sound Judgement scored a 39-1 blow on 4-5 favorite Deja Blu in the closing strides to win the second of five divisions for the \$342,000 International Stallion Stakes (ISS) for 2-year-old trotting fillies on Saturday (Oct. 5) at The Red Mile.

Driver T. McCarthy motored Sound Judgement towards the lead and cut a :28.2 first quarter as Deja Blu (driven by Gingras) loomed to the outside and moved for the lead. Deja Blu coasted to a :56.1 half and remained under a snug hold through the final turn to clock threequarters in 1:24.2. Sound Judgement pulled outside for the stretch drive and intensified pressure on Deja Blu as the two scurried well clear of the competition into the final eighth. Deja Blu kept fighting but grew weary in the final strides while Sound Judgement held her momentum and slid by to a head victory at the beam in 1:52. What A Bid Hanover (Ake Svanstedt) closed for third and R Charm (Zeron) finished fourth after mounting a mild first-over bid in the final turn.

"She raced good from the beginning at Oak Grove," trainer Jim Oscarsson said after the race. "She came up here, got a little sick and raced a little bad. But after we fixed her



up a little bit, she trained good, so I thought she should be in the race."

A daughter of Muscle Hill, Sound Judgement won her second race from eight starts and has now earned \$69,100 for owner Blomberg Stable Inc. She paid \$81.58 to win.

Champagne Problems (Dunn) gallivanted over the track as the 1-5 chalk to win the first division of the ISS filly trot in 1:53.

Leaving from the pylon post, Champagne Problems seized the lead to a :28.1 first quarter and faced nary an anxious moment through the mile. She sped up the backside to a :55.3 half and snagged a breather to three-quarters in 1:24.1 before spurting away from her competition in the stretch. Champagne Problems crossed the beam 3¼-lengths better than Santa Caterina (Svanstedt) closing for second with Ms Prada (Miller) rallying for third, another four lengths behind, and Royal Mission (Zeron) fading off a pocket trip for fourth.

"She's having a great season," Dunn said after the race. "She hasn't done much wrong this whole prep and has been putting in good performances."

Winning her fifth race from eight starts, Champagne Problems has now banked \$361,704 for owners Rojan Stables, Family Business, Patrick Hoopes and Caviart Farms. Nancy Takter trains the Tactical Landing filly who paid \$2.66 to win.

R Dutchess (Jody Jamieson) made a bold brush to the lead up the backside and held strong through a swift middle half to win the third division of the ISS filly trot in 1:52.1.

Luna Lovegood (Dunn), the even-money favorite, cleared the lead moving through a :28 first quarter while Jamieson settled R Dutchess into fourth. Though the tempo quickened up the backside, Jamieson angled R Dutchess off the pegs and fired forward to take the lead just after a :55.1 half. Jamieson stayed on the pedal xabolted from last to take third and Delaney Hanover (T. McCarthy) finished evenly in fourth.

"I was a little nervous, but we trained her the other day with R Melina and they were fighting all the way down the stretch," trainer John Butenschoen said after the race. "I thought 'If she can fight off that little girl; we know what type of horse she is.' I was pretty confident she was gutty and it worked out."

Leased by M&L of Delaware LLC, R Dutchess won her third race from eight starts and has now earned \$104,319. The Father Patrick filly paid \$10.66 to win.

T. McCarthy planted **Aperfect Annie** on the point and held firm to the finish of a 1:53 mile to win the fourth division of the ISS filly trot.

Aperfect Annie marched forward on the rim to take the lead after a :28.2 first quarter and strolled up the backside to a :56.3 half. Voguish (A. McCarthy) pulled first over from

fourth and advanced to challenge Aperfect Annie through the final turn, but folded in her bid after three-quarters in 1:25.1. Aperfect Annie stayed to task through the lane to register a simple length win over 4-5 favorite Pink Chou Chou (Gingras), who sat a pocket trip and gave futile pursuit in second. Sonmar Pond (Zeron) rallied from third over for third and Divine Thing (Tetrick) took fourth off a second-over trip.

"She's been a pretty solid filly all year," trainer Carter Pinske said after the race. "She likes The Red Mile, and when you can win on Grand Circuit week it's always a bonus. Props to the filly; she's a real nice filly. I was a bit worried with missing a week – we haven't had much work into her. But she shows up every time she goes behind the car."

A filly by Googoo Gaagaa, Aperfect Annie won her third race from eight starts and has now earned \$337,200 for owners Pinske Stables, Melvin Hartman and Andray Farm. She paid \$7.50 to win.

Spicy Nice (A. McCarthy) catapulted to the lead in a soft third quarter to scoot away with ample cushion and win the closing ISS division for trotting fillies in 1:53.

Country Victory (Gingras) took the lead to a :27.3 first quarter but yielded control up the backside to even-money choice Lady Landia (Svanstedt), who led the field by the half in :55.4. Lady Landia slowed through the final turn, providing A. McCarthy the opportunity to shoot forward from fifth with Spicy Nice and recoup nearly five lengths on the move to three-quarters in 1:25.1. Spicy Nice easily rolled to the lead and away to a 3¾-length victory as Lady Landia tried to accelerate off the bottom corner but only held second. Caviart Ivy (Niko Karna) closed for third, another four lengths behind, and Country Victory faded to fourth.

"[The hopples] probably gave her a little bit of confidence," A. McCarthy said after the race. "She started the year out really well. She's a very nice filly, I just think she's going to make a great 3-year-old."

Nancy Takter trains Spicy Nice, a filly by Tactical Landing, for owners Morrison Racing Stables and John Fielding. The filly won her second race from eight starts and has now earned \$119,300. She paid \$8.24 to win.

Division 1 of the ISS filly trot was named "The Norman Woolworth Memorial" and division 4 "The Margareta Wallenius-Kleberg Memorial," both sponsored by Arden Homestead Stable, E. T. Gerry, Jr., Peter Gerry, Stoner Manor Inc., Menhammar Stuteri AB, Jorgen Jahre, Jr., LST Stable, Lawrence DeVan and William DeVan. The second division was named "The Chapter Seven" sponsored by Blue Chip Farms while divisions 3 and 5 were named "The International Moni" sponsored by the International Moni Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms.





"We tend to forget how lucky we are"

Megan Walker on the powerful appeal of Mohawk's free "sulky rides."

The opportunity to share a special "View From Woodbine Mohawk Park" came to a seasonal conclusion on Saturday (Sept. 28). That's when the Campbellville, ON track offered the last of its free sulky (actually, jog cart) rides for the 2024 meet.

Megan Walker is Mohawk's senior manager of standardbred racing operations. She told HRU about how the rides got rolling this year.

"The first sulky rides took place in May on Fireworks and Family Fun Night [May 18]," Walker said. "Typically, after this event we wait until the weather is nicer and offer rides every Saturday. This year we started on June 22."

Mohawk railbirds would have seen the introductory sulky rides taking place between races this summer into early fall. Walker said they were not just for kids; in fact, there was a lower, not an upper, age limit. "Rides are available for anyone 10 years and older," she said. "It is a mix of both kids and adults, probably about 60 per cent kids and about 40 per cent adults."

The concept is not new. But for every racegoer who gets the chance to sit behind a pacer for the first time, it's a new experience that may deepen their interest in harness racing.

"The rides are something we have offered for nine, maybe 10 years at Mohawk," Walker said. "I believe Hands On Horses previously traveled and provided the opportunity at other Ontario racetracks."

The Hands On Horses program was founded in 1999 as an initiative of the Ontario Harness Horse Association (OHHA). Equipped with four standardbreds and double-seated jog carts, the program traveled across Ontario to provide "Wanna Drive?" events for many years.

Harness Racing Update



Melissa Keith Sulky Rides at Mohawk have been popular all summer.

While the Hands On Horses program was no longer active as of Sept. 2020, in an interview at that time, OHHA general manager Brian Tropea described the impact of offering free jog cart rides to the general public: "It all starts with the live experience, and that was where the Hands On Horses program was so valuable, I believe, because we gave people an experience they won't forget... I carried 1-year-old kids around the racetrack, and I had 95-year-old men and women on the cart. What we did is we created a lifetime memory, similar to someone who's a hockey fan being allowed to go and skate on the ice with the Maple Leafs."

With rural Ontario communities increasingly populated by seniors (who make up 24.4 per cent of rural Ontario residents as of 2021, in contrast to 17.3 per cent of urban Ontario residents), there are fewer young people getting to know harness horses directly in their hometown. According to the 2021 Ontario Census, the percentage of youth living in rural Ontario declined by 1.6 per cent between 2016 and 2021.



The rides have cropped up in various formats over the years at Mohawk. On Aug. 4, 2018, families could arrive before the live card to sign their kids up for "Drive With Us." In 2023, Ontario racing fans 18 and older could enter a draw to win one of six chances for a sulky ride during the June 17 North America Cup card.

Walker said local horsepeople helped make the rides a success again this year.

"It is a fan favorite and always in high demand," she said. "Even in the rain, fans still want to get out on the track. Many drivers have taken fans out for the sulky rides over the years, including Mohawk regulars. This year, some of the drivers included Carter Gimblett, Braiden Reibeling, Nate Harding, Chris Rogers, Jamie Hart, Emma Christoforou, and Debi O'Brien-Moran."

Not every track has the essential infrastructure and assistants to host jog cart rides.

"We use a two-seater jog cart," Walker said. "One is owned by COSA [Central Ontario Standardbred Association] and the other by OSAS [Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society]. COSA is a big supporter and sponsor of this program."

She added that the participating horses are retired standardbred racehorses.

"It is always an OSAS ambassador horse," she said. "Last year, it was Stonebridge Scout [p, 8, 1:55.2f; \$166,803], and this year, Reverend Hanover [p, 3, 1:48.3s; \$450,034]."

Walker called the OSAS ambassadors "amazing" animals with the ability to reach a broad fan base.

"One of the best things about this sport is the horses... [Mohawk outrider and OSAS administrator] Joanne Colville helps organize the horses and the drivers, and our guest experience team does a great job taking care of the guests," she said.

"Being able to provide this type of experience is something that is unforgettable for most," Walker said. "It is a great way to make new fans, and word about the experience spreads fast. It is always bringing in new guests to try it out... Our hope is to continue to be able to provide the rides in the years ahead."

Free jog cart rides might seem like a small piece of harness racing's ongoing marketing puzzle. As horses become less accessible to the general public, however, such opportunities take on heightened importance. In Megan Walker's words, "We tend to forget how lucky we are."

Leap To Fame, Just Believe headline special Saturday at Melton

Down Under's top pacer and trotter will be featured on card with six Group 1 races.

Leap To Fame will headline the best Down Under night of harness in recent years at Melton Saturday (Oct. 12).

Anywhere Leap To Fame goes he is the rock star, but the presence of champion trotter Just Believe and six Group 1 races across the night promises to make the night something special. Along with the \$300,000 Victoria Cup, Saturday night's card features the \$200,000 Victoria Derby, \$150,000 Victoria Oaks, \$150,000 Queen of the Pacific (open-class mares), \$75,000 Bill Collins Trotters' Sprint and the \$75,000 Victoria Trotters' Oaks. More on them soon.

Back to Leap To Fame, who posted his 43rd win from just 54 starts when he cruised to victory in his final "warm-up" race, the \$50,000 Smoken Up Sprint at Melton last night (Oct. 5).

Already a winner of over \$3.2 million, Leap To Fame will be trying to add to comparisons with the all-time greats of Down Under pacing when he starts a hot favorite in the \$300,000 Group 1 Victoria Cup.

Of the greats, only Preux Chevalier has won the "big four" of Australian harness racing – Inter Dominion, Miracle Mile, Hunter Cup and Victoria Cup. He did so way back in 1984-85.

Even megastars like Popular Alm, Blacks A Fake and Lazarus only won three of the four.

Leap To Fame won the Brisbane Inter Dominion last December, added the Hunter Cup in February and then the Miracle Mile in March.

He is a raging hot \$1.50 (for a \$1 bet) favorite to add the Victoria Cup.



As has been the case so often over the past 18 months, Leap To Fame's biggest danger will be trainer Jason Grimson.

Grimson will have at least three and maybe as many as five of Leap To Fame's 11 rivals.

Leading his charge is the mighty stayer, Swayzee. He famously beat Leap To Fame in last year's Group 1 Blacks A Fake in Brisbane and hasn't been disgraced chasing him home in their three clashes since.

Simply, to have any chance of beating Leap To Fame this time, Swayzee will need to draw better and work around to take the lead.

Grimson's other definite starters are emerging pair Major Moth and District Attorney, who finished one-two in the Group 2 Kilmore Cup on Sept. 27.

Grimson also expects Nerano, who won well at Menangle last night, to make the cut, while stablemate Curly James comes into contention after finishing third to Leap To Fame in the Smoken Up last night.

The other class factors of the Victoria Cup are multiple Group 1 winners Catch A Wave and Better Eclipse on their best form and if they got the right trip.

It's far from the richest race of the night, but the clash of the night will be between Down Under's two best trotters, Just Believe and Callmethebreeze, in the Bill Collins Trotters' Sprint.

Just Believe is the undisputed "King" and one of the greatest trotters this part of the world has seen.

But Callmethebreeze has already beaten him once in a major race – the Group 1 Great Southern Star back in February – and looks right at the top of his game for this clash.

Callmethebreeze, a French-bred multiple European Group 1 winner before being sold Down Under, changed stables during a recent spell and is unbeaten in three starts for new trainer Andy Gath.

Just Believe's co-trainer and driver Greg Sugars concedes the 1,720-meter distance of this clash suits Callmethebreeze.

"I think it favors him more than us," Sugars said. "Just Believe can run the same sort of splits in longer races as he does in sprints, which separates him from the rest.

"In the shorter races, there's more trotters who can hold their speed and it levels things up a bit.

"In saying that, Jess [Tubbs, trainer] and I don't think we've ever had the old boy better. His work at home has been better than ever."

Sugars oozed respect for Callmethebreeze.

"We'll need to bring our A-game and for nothing to go wrong because we know how good he [Callmethebreeze] is," he said.

"You think he'd keep improving the longer he races down here and that's how it looks."

Gath summed up the clash best: "Just Believe is an absolute champion, but we've probably got one of the very few trotters who can beat him if things go our way."

Bring it on.

They won't be the only trotters stirring interest Saturday night.

The unbeaten, untapped and ridiculously exciting Keayang Zahara will be chasing her ninth win from as many starts in the Victoria Trotters' Oaks. It should be a walk in the park.

Judging by the times she can go and ease of her wins, many are already saying she's world class. And as good as any young trotting filly Australia has seen.

The girls will also take center stage in another two of the Group 1 features, the Queen Of The Pacific and the Victoria (pacing) Oaks.

Outstanding former Kiwi mare Aardies Express has already won Australia's top mares' race, the Ladyship Mile, in May and will be favorite to add the next biggest, the Queen Of The Pacific.

She's trained by Jason Grimson, who also trains two of her major rivals in Tay Tay and Illavabubbles.

The Oaks will have a strong New Zealand flavor after the easy qualifying heat wins of Coastal Babe and Aardie B Miki at Melton last night.

Coastal Babe is trained in NZ by Steven Reid and "on loan" to top Victorian trainer Emma Stewart for this series, while former Kiwi filly Aardie B Miki has won four of her six runs – including the Group 1 Queensland Oaks – since moving to Queensland trainer Chantal Turpin.

Aardie B Miki and Aardies Express are raced by the Canadianbased Mike Tanev, who enjoyed a monstrous 24 hours after his other star, Aardiebytheseaside, won easily at Gloucester Park in Perth last Friday night.

Then there is the time-honored class, the Victoria Derby. It's a bit like the Little Brown Jug of Australia for status.

Last night's qualifiers were dominated by Emma Stewart, who snared the trifecta (first three home) in both heats.

Bay Of Biscay, who finished second against the 4-year-olds in last month's \$2.1 million TAB Eureka, was surprisingly beaten in his Derby heat, but still looks the testing material for the final.

It's going to be one heck of a night's racing.





The unbearable lightness of being a harness-racing driver, Part 3

As a journalist I found most harness racing drivers available to talk about their profession. I always brought to such a conversation the respect I have for the dangerous work they do; as well as I took their sides against unfounded popular opinion (see Part 2 above). Cat Manzi was among the top 10 that I interviewed for publication.

I was born around five months after Catello Manzi in the same state. I knew of him because I bet on him and against him when he was a regular on the New York and New Jersey circuit. In the early 2000s a set of circumstances conspired so we could talk on the record about his profession.

Working for YouBet when it was arguably the first ADW (Advance-Deposit Wagering) horse-race betting platform on the internet was a steady gig for me. I lived with a wife and family in rural Pennsylvania where my home was my office. The convenience gave me time to be thorough about handicapping harness for YouBet, keep my thoroughbred column at American Turf Monthly and continue writing comedy and fiction; all of which added cash to a well-paying position as YouBet's initial harness racing editor.

YouBet hired a few harness drivers as promoters-in-the-field; high-profile. Their on-line presence was aimed at creating new fans for ADW cash flow. This is what put me in contact with Catello Manzi. He was at a peak. In 2005 he became the oldest harness driver (55) to lead North America in victories as well as five-digits in earnings.

What follows is the transcript of the interview Manzi gave YouBet. I concentrated on honest race-driving tactics with the aim of shedding bad-performer images to prospective fans before crabby veteran harness bettors and myths of corruption branded drivers crooked.

ME: When does a driver place emphasis on strategy as opposed to the pure speed of a pacer or trotter?

MANZI: You figure the strategy as you go. The horse has to show you what you can do with it. Most of the time I look at the program before I go out. I read the race lines. I go over a few scenarios in my head. Then when I am out there, I try to stay focused on them. Sometimes one of the scenarios happens and other times I have to adjust to what else is happening because a horse might go on the track and act different than usual.

ME: You're racing over and over against the same drivers. Aren't you acquainted with what they do more than a bettor?

MANZI: Some bettors can have just as good an idea of what drivers will do as I do. But any good driver tries not to fall into a pattern. As soon as they know you're onto something they do, it can change. Drivers are pretty loose with styles but no one can expect them to do this or that.

ME: A driver told us that every driver's perfect trip would be to go to the front and lead all the others to the wire. But there must be other perfect trips. What others do you like? Especially if you have a horse that is not a good leaver?

MANZI: First of all, there are some horses better without the cover; they work their way up themselves; even without going two or three wide. I'm old fashioned; there's nothing wrong with a good second [catbird seat] trip.

ME: So, there are certain horses you don't feel are threatened by not having cover?

MANZI: Yes. And a driver gets to know them. If you get to drive them a couple of times you find out if they like that so you don't rush them.

ME: Then there are times when first over could be a perfect trip?

MANZI: Yes, especially when another horse goes for the lead and shouldn't be there. If I drive a horse against that and I'm in the 2-hole, I stay there until I move [first over] on him.

ME: How do you keep going when you find your horse uncovered?

MANZI: There's not much you can do. The only option is to conserve the horse's energy. Maybe back off a little. It doesn't mean the race is over. I've won in that position.

ME: But bettors are quick to feel a driver who tried to conserve a horse's energy is slowing down on purpose.

MANZI: Yeah.

ME: I always think that's unfair. There's no way any race observer can understand what's really going on out there like a driver can.

MANZI: Probably not. They should understand drivers are responsible to [connections] for making money. In the back of my mind, I think I do what's best for them in a race. We're supposed to be doing the best we can [with the horses we drive].

Nobles sweep Buckeye Stallion Series finals

The 2024 Buckeye Stallion Series wrapped up on Saturday (Oct. 5) at Hollywood Dayton Raceway with eight \$75,000 finals. Not only was a track record equaled, but Dan Noble drove four to victory while trainer Christi Noble claimed three of the Stallion Series title winners.

D. Noble's first victory came aboard **Tommy Count** in the freshmen colt trot division. The son of Long Tom raced from the back of the pack after leaving from the eighth post position. At 9-1, Tommy Count trailed the field as quarters came in :28.2, :57.2, and 1:26.3. D. Noble urged the colt three-wide in the last turn. Answering the call, Tommy Count rallied home in a new lifetime mark of 1:56.4.

Vandy Lane (Chris Lems) was second and Sweet Harmony (Ronnie Gillespie) finished third.

The victory marked the second lifetime win for Tommy Count, who has earned \$54,060 this season. Gillespie trains Tommy Count for Anthony Miller. Wayne Weaver bred Tommy Count.

In the division for 3-year-old filly pacers, **Calypso Pearl** went wire-to-wire in 1:50.3. D. Noble put the daughter of Fear The Dragon on top and never looked back. As the 1-5 favorite, Calypso Pearl set fractions in :27.1, :55.2, and blazed to a three-quarters in 1:22.1. After taking the pocket trip, Fearless Ginger (Austin Hanners) challenged Calypso Pearl at the top of the stretch but was no match for Calypso Pearl who won by a nose and lowered her lifetime mark. Genetic Edge (Chris Page) was third.

Calypso Pearl has won six of 16 this season. Despite not starting as a 2-year-old, she has bankrolled \$181,475 under C. Noble's conditioning. Sandra Burnett owns and bred Calypso Pearl.

D. Noble guided **Tom Swifty** to victory in the next division for sophomore colt trotters. Tom Swifty got away fourth but immediately followed cover heading to the :27.3 opening quarter. The Long Tom gelding quickly found himself first-up and did not see the rail as fractions came in :56.1 and 1:24.4. Showing his grit, 6-5 favorite Tom Swifty dug in every step of the way to win in a new lifetime mark of 1:54.4.

Beaueastel (Peter Wrenn) held on for second with When I'm Gone As (Tony Hall) was third.

The C. Noble trainee notched his 11th seasonal win and upped his earnings to \$132,650. Tom Swifty is owned by breeder Sandra Burnett and Norman Rae Racing. The Noble husband and wife duo won the BSS final for 3-year-old colt trotters in 2023 as well.

Legendary Noble overcame the eighth post position to give D. Noble his fourth series victory in the sophomore colt pace division. The gelded son of Bit Of A Legend N briefly let the dust settle before rolling to challenge the leader at the :26.3 opening quarter. Once on top, 8-1 Legendary Noble posted fractions in :55.1 and 1:23. before stopping the clock in 1:51.2.

Twenty Five (Page) was second and High On The Hill (Cameron McCown) rounded out the trifecta.

Legendary Noble has hit the board in 15 of 19 tries this season. With six victories, he has bankrolled \$82,672 for Norman Rae Racing. C. Noble trains Legendary Noble, a homebred by Carol Jean Noble.

My Hare Legend equaled the divisional track record for freshman filly pacers in 1:51.4. Eric Goodell placed the daughter of Bit Of A Legend N in the pocket and stayed patient as fractions were set in :26., :55.3, and 1:23.1. The 8-5 favorite, My Hare Legend, made her move in the final turn and easily gained control of the field, winning by five lengths in a new lifetime mark.

Pink Jammies (Hunter Myers) finished second with Gorgeous Package (Anthony MacDonald) third.

My Hare Legend has won half of her eight lifetime starts. The Logan Ebersole trainee has earned \$71,450 for Ronald Rust. Schare Adams bred My Hare Legend.

Travel Nurse and Brett Miller took the freshman filly trot division in 1:56.3. Travel Nurse got away fourth along the rail and stayed put as fractions came in :27.3, :57.4, and 1:27. The Enterprise filly found racing room in the final turn and slipped into the passing lane. Digging in through her last stride, Travel Nurse tripped the wire in a new lifetime mark.

Bye Bye Girl (Page) was second while Bb's Kanson Lady (Kayne Kauffman) held on for third.

Trained by Virgil Morgan, Jr., Travel Nurse has earned \$75,120 in three lifetime victories. Joyce McClelland owns and co-bred Travel Nurse alongside Richard McClelland.

The two-year-old pacing colt division went to **Twin B High Tide** in a new lifetime mark of 1:52.1. Guided by Hanners, the son of Downbytheseaside settled in fourth and stayed patient as the opening fraction was posted in :26.4. Heading to the :55.4 half-mile marker, 1-5 favorite Twin B High Tide followed cover. The colt then kicked it into gear and flew three-wide on the backside. There was no catching Twin B High Tide as the three-quarters came in 1:23.1. Twin B High Tide won with three lengths to spare.


The Onyx Dragon (Justin Irvine) finished second and Go Jim Dandy (Myers) was third.

Twin B High Tide has won four of eight lifetime starts to earn \$84,595. Alicia Hanners trains for Hanners Racing and was bred by Twinbrook Limited.

Justasiam As won the 3-year-old filly trot division in 1:56.1. Hall piloted the daughter of Lionhunter from the rail post position. The filly found herself first-up while marching past the opening quarter in :28.1. As the 1-5 favorite, Justasiam As inched toward the leader while heading to the :58.3 half and three quarters in 1:27.2. Coming out of the final turn, Justasiam As easily pulled away to win by a length.

Tammie Sue (Lems) was second while Lady Almas (Miller) rallied for third.

Justasiam As won the BSS final last year as a 2-year-old. Now as a sophomore, she has hit the board eight times in 13 seasonal starts. She has notched four wins and \$102,810 under trainer Anette Lorentzon. ACL Stuteri AB owns and bred Justasiam As.





Sabonis, Lets Go Endofaera extend streaks in Indiana Sire Stakes

Sophomore standouts **Sabonis** and **Lets Go Endofaera** were as advertised in Indiana Sire Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park on Friday (Oct. 4). In the eighth and final leg of Sire Stakes for both the sophomore pacing colts and fillies, Sabonis extended his streak to 13 on the year in the first division for pacing colts, while Lets Go Endofaera clinched her seventh consecutive victory in the second split for fillies.

The 1-20 favorite in his \$50,500 division, Sabonis and regular pilot Joey Putnam left from post 5 in the field of eight. The 43-1 shot Noblesville (Brandon Bates) rocketed to the front from post 8 entering the first turn, with Sabonis settling in fifth through a first quarter of :26.1. M-M-s Bud (Jay Cross) worked around Noblesville on the backstretch, leading the field to the halfway point in :55.1. Sabonis flushed the cover of Packedwithluck (Trace Tetrick) who started the outer flow, charging into second with M-M-s Bud continuing to lead to three-quarters in 1:23. Perfectly positioned second-over, Sabonis surged off cover at the top of the lane, pacing home in :26.3 with the plugs still in to power to victory by 1¼ lengths in 1:50.1. Noblesville rallied up the passing lane for place, M-M-s Bud held for show.

A winner in 16 of 17 on the season, Sabonis is trained by Aaron Stutzman for owner Pat Miller. Sporting earnings of \$471,000 this season, Sabonis has not tasted defeat since May 3 of this year as he looks to the \$250,000 Indiana Sire Stakes Super Final on Friday (Oct. 11) as part of Hoosier Champions Night.

Lets Go Endofaera left little suspense regarding her win streak, scoring in front-end fashion in her \$49,500 Sire Stakes division for pacing fillies.

The bettors' choice at 1-20, Lets Go Endofaera and driver John De Long landed in the pocket on the first turn, sitting behind Flirtin Fanera (Ricky Macomber, Jr.) through a quarter of :27.1. Lets Go Endofaera forfeited the pocket to move to the lead on the backstretch, backing the pace down considerably to the half in :57.4. Galley's Image (Bates) tipped from third on the final turn, spotting Lets Go Endofaera 1½ lengths at the three-quarter pole in 1:26.2. The sprint for home commenced with Galley's Image in hot pursuit of the favorite, but Lets Go Endofaera was not to be caught, pacing home in :25.3 to reach the wire three-parts-of-a-length in front in 1:52. Lyin' Eyes (Putnam) closed for third.

The divisional champion last year at 2, Lets Go Endofaera has backed up her star 2-year-old campaign by winning nine of 10 in 2024 for trainer Tabby De Long. Jesse De Long bred and co-owns the daughter of JK Endofaera—Let's Go Higher along with John and William De Long. Having earned \$292,140 on the season, Lets Go Endofaera enters next week's Super Final just shy of \$600,000 in career earnings.

De Long homebreds swept the 3-year-old filly pace as **Teelatini** sizzled to a career best effort with driver Tetrick a race prior in the \$49,500 first division.

Teelatini got away third early with Defining Moment (Bates) jumping out to an early lead to cut the quarter in :27. Tetrick moved the 2-5 favorite to the lead on the backstretch, assuming command before reaching the half in :55.2. Teelatini looked to give the field the slip on the final turn, opening up by 2½ lengths at three-quarters in 1:23. The lead widened to 4½ lengths midway through the lane before Jada Caroline (Marvin Luna) staged a late rally to close the gap, but not before Teelatini crossed the wire 1½-lengths clear in 1:49.4. All JK (De Long) would round out the trifecta.

Since joining leading trainer Tyler George's barn in September, Teelatini has won two of three, with her lone defeat being a runner-up finish to Lets Go Endofaera in the \$75,000 Carl Becker Memorial. Bred by owners William and Patrick De Long, Teelatini has won four of 12 in her 3-year-old campaign with earnings of \$129,306. The victory was the 10th of the career for the daughter of Rockin Image—Nightcap who went just over \$400,000 in lifetime earnings following the victory.

Tetrick snagged a \$50,500 division for pacing colts as well, surging late up the pylons with **Martz Telly** at 6-1 to pull the mild upset.

Play Action Pass (Oosting) hustled to the lead at 11-1 through a hot opening quarter of :26.1 while Martz Telly got away fourth in the field of eight. Play Action Pass had things his way to the half in :55 before leading to three-quarters in 1:23 with Martz Telly shuffled and pinned to the cones in fifth. Turning for home, the race appeared to be between Play Action Pass and Dale Yea (Luna) who popped the pocket and set his sights on the leader, before Martz Telly found a seam up the passing lane to make it a three-horse battle. Surging home in :25.3, Martz Telly timed his move just right, nosing out Dale Yea for the victory in 1:49.3, with Play Action Pass just a head back in third.

The victory took nearly two full seconds off of his career mark as Martz Telly notched his second win of 2024 in 12 outings. Trained by Ron Burke, Martz Telly has made \$56,400 on the season and now over a quarter million in his career for owners Burke Racing Stable, Knox Services, Frank Baldachino and Weaver Bruscemi.

In other Sire Stakes action on the card, **Walkin On Sunshine** and trainer/driver converted a pocket trip to take the \$20,000 prep of older pacing mares in 1:50.1, while **Flagman** tracked down Ponda Jet in 1:52 to take the \$20,000 prep for older trotting males with trainer/driver Rick Plano.

PA champ Papi's Rocket sparkles in Keystone Classic; Wrenn wins five

Pennsylvania champion **Papi's Rocket** converted a pocket trip to a sharp 1:50.4 victory in Friday's (Oct. 4) Keystone Classic at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows. **Wedlock Blue Chip** captured the other division of the \$82,700 stake for freshman colt and gelding pacers.

Papi's Rocket let Dreamboat Hanover do the dirty work up front before overtaking him in mid-stretch. But winning driver Ronnie Wrenn, Jr. indicated at that point, Dreamboat Hanover wasn't his principal concern.

"I was a little nervous leaving the 2-hole early because I thought I might be giving a shot to Railroad Station in the passing lane," Wrenn said. "But I thought it was my time to move. He's not real big, but he gives 100 per cent every time."

The son of Papi Rob Hanover—Real Touch remained in charge, downing Railroad Station by a half-length, with Steamboat Springs a rallying third. Ron Burke trains Papi's Rocket, who vaulted over \$200,000 in career earnings, for Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, Knox Services and Slaughter Racing Stable. Burke sent out eight of Friday's 16 Keystone Classic starters.
