Lexington sale continues to be down between 15-18 per cent

After three sessions, the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale is down 18 per cent in average and 15.5 per cent in gross compared to the first three sale sessions of the record-breaking 2019 sale.

LEXINGTON Selected Yearling Sale

The third session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale — held Wednesday (Oct. 7) at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion — continued a three-night trend of being down between 15-18 per cent compared to last year's record-breaking sale (full story here). Though, the gross through the first three nights is almost on par with the 2018 sale.

In all, 180 yearlings went through the ring Wednesday. The session gross was \$6,497,000 down 15 per cent from the 2019 third night gross of \$7,656,000, but only off 3.8 per cent from the 2018 third-session gross of \$6,756,000.

Wednesday's average of \$36,094 was down 18.4 per cent from the 2019 third session average of \$44,245 and down 13.5 per cent from the 2018 average of \$41,704. Wednesday's median was \$30,000.

The session started at 7 p.m. and ended just before midnight.


"I wish the crowd would've been a little bigger, but all in all it was a pretty good," said Randy Manges, who manages the sale with David Reid. "We're still averaging \$68,000 (through three days) and our gross was not as much as last year's gross for the third night, but it's about what it was two years ago, so I'm real pleased with that. Under the conditions,

Frank "The Elder" Antonacci of Lindy Farms (left) and David Reid of Preferred Equine (shown together in 2017) teamed up to sell Wednesday night's session topper – Hip #477 Knockout Lindy a Muscle Hill colt out of Kinda Crazy Lindy that sold for \$172,000 to Ken Jacobs. Lindy Farms bred the colt and Preferred – the sale's leading consignor through three nights – sold it.

I think that's really good."


Online bids on Wednesday through Proxibid totalled \$440,000 in sales, total, for 15 yearlings sold. Online bidders were also the under-bidders on 15 other yearlings.

"The number of people that have used that vehicle to bid, I think that's really been a plus for us," Manges said.

Through three sessions, the 2020 sale has grossed

\$32,905,000 for 479 yearlings sold and produced an average of \$68,695 that is down 18 per cent from the three-day average of \$83,720 from the record 2019 sale. This year's gross is down 15.5 per cent from the 2019 gross of \$38,930,000 and down 1.2 per cent from the 2018 gross of \$33,307,000 through three days.

"We are happy with ours," said Diamond Creek's Adam

Bowden. "From the beginning, we knew it was going to be off and I thought maybe 10 to 15 per cent and it looks like maybe it's a touch more than that. For our consignment, we're meeting and exceeding expectations. From my point of view, we feel confident that we brought the right horses and we've been paid fairly for them."

Bowden said he was looking forward to Friday night's

session.

"We have... three Downbytheseasides on Friday that we're happy about that. We've been around and we may be biased, but we think we've got three of the better ones out there in terms of physical and pedigree. We're going to have a Beach party here on Friday night," Bowden said. "It's sort of like Ohio's Day 1, there's top quality horses in Day 5. I wish they

were spread out across the book, but we're going to make a big party out of it with beer and mixed drinks, so everyone is welcome to come."

The third-session topper was Hip #477 Knockout Lindy, a Muscle Hill colt out of Kinda Crazy Lindy that sold to Ken Jacobs for \$172,000. Knockout Lindy was bred by Lindy Farms of Connecticut and consigned by Preferred Equine.

Hip #392, a Walner colt out of Woman's Will named Play Fiercely sold for \$160,000 to trainer Marcus Melander, agent for Courant Inc. It is the same connections that purchased the topper from opening night — a Walner filly out of Mission Brief named Kadena — for \$725,000. Through three nights, Kadena still tops the sale with two sessions left.

Play Fiercely was bred by Al Libfeld and Marvin Katz, raised at Jimmy Glass' Walco Farms in Kentucky and consigned by Kentuckiana.

"He's a very athletic colt that can get over the ground," Glass said. "The mother we raised as well through our program, a Donato filly that made \$600,000 and she had a really nice foal that's been very quick and athletic in the paddock and I think that's what the buyers saw.

"(The Walners) all could trot and they were received well,

but this guy had a little bit extra athleticism on the end of it. Very nice in the paddock and I think that's what sold it."

Last year, 116 yearlings sold for \$100,000 or more through three sessions. This year, 101 yearlings have reached at least six figures through three days.

Trainer Chris Beaver has spent \$270,000, total, through three days to purchase seven yearlings.

"The first two days I was buying a few horses that I could've gone more on, probably could've gone twice as much as I did on some of those fillies the first two days, but they just sold lower," Beaver said. "I think there's a big gap in the sale between the top, top end and the nice horses just below it.

"I'm trying to fill my barn with nicer horses, but less, you know. I had like 40 2-year-olds this year. To me, that was too many and you're chasing problems a lot. I like to fill the barn with a little bit fewer 2-year-olds, but better quality. Hopefully, better-gaited and easier to train."

Through three sessions, Andy Miller is the sale's leading buyer with \$2,281,000 spent, in total, on 18 yearlings. Nancy Takter is second through three days with \$1,628,000 spent on 14 yearlings, followed by Ake Svanstedt (\$1,482,000 on 12 yearlings) and Burke Racing Stable (\$1,049,000 on 12 yearlings).

Through three days, Preferred also leads the consignor list with total sales of \$7,183,000 for 101 yearlings sold. Kentuckiana is next among consignors with \$5,239,000 in sales, followed by Hunterton with \$4,588,000 in sales.

By average, Concord Stud leads all consignors with three of more yearlings sold with an average of \$124,357 for 14 sold. It is followed by All American Harnessbreds (\$91,333 for nine sold), Hunterton (\$88,231 for 52 sold) and Kentuckiana (\$84,500 for 62 sold).

"I've seen some new people in town today and hopefully we'll see some new ones tomorrow," Manges said. "Then, of course, Friday with the regional horses we're selling I expect a whole other group of people in town. Hopefully, that'll work. And we've got a lot more people that want to sign up on Proxibid as well, so that's good."

The fourth session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale will feature 170 yearlings. It begins tonight at 7 p.m. at Fasig-Tipton. For more information about the sale, please visit: http://www.lexingtonselected.com.

How did he do in Wednesday's third session? Take a look (below).

Reminder, we received The Guru's predictions for the Top 10 horses to be sold, by price, during the second session BEFORE they actually went into the ring — and kept the emails to prove it in case anyone asks.

Here is his Top 10, compared with the actual Top 10:

International Moni and winner of the first Mohawk Million, Venerate. From a daughter of the speedy Vernon Blue Chip dam of at least nine stakes winners. Colt is great in the field.

Actual Rank: 45th at \$50,000

3. Hip #446 FIRE FLOWER— Very talented Chapter Seven filly. Bred a lot like the ill-fated Woodside Charm. She may be small but looked real big flying across the paddock. From the family of Hambletonian winner Victory Dream she has wonderful residual value.

Actual Rank: 100th at \$26,000

4. Hip #422 BUR BON —First foal of a daughter of Elusive Desire, winner of \$1,275,000 and O'Brien Award winner at 2 and 3. This colt is by the hottest European Sire on the planet Googoo Gaagaa. Not only is he a good looking individual few horses this year have shown me the talent he displays in the paddock.

Actual Rank: 6th at \$105,000

5. Hip #417 CALIFORNIA GOLD – First foal of a daughter of \$975,000 winner To Dream On. He is not perfect, but any colt from this family certainly has major upside. What he lacks in beauty he makes up for in talent.

Actual Rank: 4th at \$120,000

6. Hip #393 ALWAYS BE MIKE— Great looking ridgling from a daughter of the great Worldly Beauty. If he wasn't missing some equipment he would have been higher on the list. He is a brother to Odds On Lauderdale p.3, 149.1.

Actual Rank: 122nd at \$20,000

7. Hip #401 TWINKLE IN HEREYE— I am over-looking some minor defects in this lovely Bettors Delight filly because on day three of a sale we find the offspring of a 100% producing mare. Her dam Ashlee's Star has had five previous foals and five winners.

Actual Rank: 82nd at \$32,000

8. Hip #376 U BAKE THE CAKE— First foal of a daughter of the great producer Maple Frosting. She the dam of Chocolatier and Sugar Trader. Talented colt is by Cantab Hall who at nineteen is still producing top stakes winners.

Actual Rank: 67th at \$40,000

9. Hip #368 TRUE BLUE LINDY — Another selection from a 100% producing mare this Always B Miki colt is a man amongst boys. Even though he is the giant economy size he still is quite a good athlete. From the family of Big Jim, he is dual elligible.

Actual Rank: 105th at \$25,000

10. Hip #339 SOUTHWIND DUBA! — First foal of the nearly \$800,000 winning multiple stakes winner UF Dragons Queen . By the hot sire Always B Miki, she looks outstanding in the field.

In summary, yes, there were some predictions that were way off the mark, but nailing three in the Top 10, especially on the third night of the sale is pretty impressive. That The Guru's #1 choice was actually the second-highest yearling sold, is about as good as it gets. Overall, let's say his performance was in the middle between his gangbusters opening night predictions and not great ones in night #2. This one had some huge hits, but also some huge misses. **Grade**: B-

George Millar can't wait to cheer on his three horses in Saturday's OSS Grassroots Championships

George Millar's plans for this Saturday (Oct. 10) are set in stone. By 8:30 pm he will be settled in front of the television in his Stouffville, ON home ready to cheer on Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots Championship starters Cyclone Sister, Bettorbuckleup and Cantstoplying.

"I'm looking forward to Saturday, I'm looking forward to sitting down to watch all the races," said Millar. "To me it's exciting just to have a bunch of homebreds like that — though, Buckle's not a homebred — but having them competing at that level and making it to the Sires Stakes final is great."

Cyclone Sister will start from Post 1 in the 2-year-old pacing filly division, Race 5 on the Championship program, and Millar is hoping the daughter of Shadow Play and Riveting can match or better the third-place result she posted in her Semi-Final last Thursday.

"I'm definitely keeping my fingers crossed. I never count my chickens before they're hatched, but I think she's going to give a good effort," said the owner/breeder. "And I've got a very good trainer, Nick Gallucci, and he really gets his horses prepared and ready and makes sure that they're well rested going into a race like this, so I'm sure that he'll have them ready to give their best effort."

Cantstoplying finished fifth in his Semi-Final from Post 9 and gets the trailing Post 10 in the talent laden 2-year-old pacing colt final. The son of Sunshine Beach and Musical Voyage was a Grassroots division winner at Hiawatha Horse Park in August, but will have his work cut out for him in a division that saw both Semi-Finals clocked in 1:51.4.

"When you look at our Ontario Sires Stakes program right now, it's absolutely amazing how quick we're going, it's practically like watching a mini Grand Circuit," said Millar.

"The 2-year-old pacing colts, both elims went in 1:51 and change. I've been doing this over 40 years and I've never seen that before, just a great quality of horses in pretty well all the divisions."

The senior member of the Millar Farms contingent is Bettorbuckleup, who heads into the 3-year-old pacing colt final off a thrilling Semi-Final victory that saw him make a

late surge in the stretch to collar favorite Mayhem Hanover by a nose in 1:50.4. The Bettors Delight son will start from Post 3 in the \$75,000 final, slated as Race 7.

"His race in the elim, that was probably one of my most exciting races in the past year. I thought for sure we were just going to be second, and then he gave that little extra kick of speed to get that nice horse Mayhem (Hanover) of Gregg McNair's for the win. Wow. I was screaming so loud at my television. It was pretty exciting," said Millar. "I've never seen, that late in a race, where it looks like you're just going to hang on for second and then all of a sudden, where did that burst of speed come from? I think my adrenaline level got so high after that I couldn't get to sleep."

Bettorbuckleup may not be a homebred, but the colt has a special spot in Millar's heart. The 70-year-old is a regular in the colt's jog cart and race bike.

"He's just a nice little colt. He's one of the few that I kept a colt, usually I geld them all by now, but he's always had such a great attitude. I've sat behind him myself quite a bit and he's just a pleasure to drive," said Millar. "I like him. I can still go a good training mile with the horses. I just always say, like I tell Nick and I used to tell Eric (Adams), I say don't give me any hard ones to drive, give me ones that I'm not going to have any problems with. I feel more comfortable with them."

While the hands-on owner/breeder waits until the young horses are well schooled before he steps into the jog cart, he spends plenty of time watching them learn their early lessons and dreaming about their future prospects.

"I'm so excited just watching the babies getting broke right now. That's when you start dreaming again. Well, I'm always dreaming, because you have to be a complete idiot to have a lot of your business with yearlings, because it's a sure way to go broke," said Millar, who was introduced to standardbreds by his father George Millar, Sr. "But it's just that love of horses, it's the love of seeing something you bred, like most of these babies, I've watched them being born."

The Millar Farms team is working with 13 yearlings this fall and the one their owner is spending the most time dreaming about is a Big Jim filly out of Catch A Wish. The filly is a full-sister to \$303,770 winner Fancourt and a half-sister to six others who earned more than \$100,000 in their racing careers.

"You know, all they do is throw me good horses, that whole family, Little Black Book, her daughters, Catch A Wish, they all make money," said Millar, whose father purchased Little Black Book in 1993, the spring of her 5-year-old season. "I tell you, I'm just dreaming about this filly (Prohibition Legal) every

night when I go to bed. My wife thinks it's a disease."

Millar's affliction has seen him amass the largest herd in the history of the farm this year, a herd he is attempting to trim and has promised his wife, Sondra Millar, he will not add to during yearling or mixed sale season.

"This year is the most horses I've ever had. I think at my main farm where we train the horses we've got about 45 or 47, and we've got I think 16 broodmares in foal, and I have about 10 horses down with Scott Blackler, my other contract trainer, in New York at Mark Ford's training centre," he said. "I've sold some this summer, but I've got about six or seven, eight, maybe nine, ten to sell, hopefully in the next month."

In recent years Millar has concentrated on acquiring well-bred fillies in an effort to refresh the farm's bloodlines and produce future Grassroots and Gold Series competitors.

"My wife gave me heck. She called me a chicken because I raced that Cyclone Sister in the Gold a little bit and thought it was little bit too tough, so I decided we had a better chance racing in the Grassroots and she said, 'You should be a lot braver. You should take a chance and keep racing in the Gold," said Millar. "I'd like to race in the Gold again too. Maybe next year. I'm just happy with this year. I'm happy seeing them all in there and you know what, I've been around this long enough, just to see them all race well and do their best and whatever you get, you get. Then they'll get a holiday and I'll get working on the other ones."

The \$600,000 Grassroots Championships take place in Races 2 through 9 on Woodbine Mohawk Park's Saturday, Oct. 10 program, which gets underway at 7 pm. **Programs** and a **live stream** are available on the track's **website**.

The power of decisions paves a path to profits

One of the smartest betting rules is: Make decisions, not selections.

It sounds ridiculous, right? Picking winners is a handicapper's goal. You play the horse you pick to win. The more winners, the more money you make. But handicappers also choose second and third selections; they just do not bet them over a winning pick. They never decide to do that, they never understand that it is more important to decide, not select, which to bet, even though it's a rule that governs smart play.

At this time of the season — with the last week of Red Mile Grand Circuit racing the overture to the Breeders Crown — no advice for bettors is more pivotal for getting the smartest results from your personal handicapping (more about that later, now, about that rule).

Such a rule would be a significant shift in how you handicap and wager, correct? Then ask yourself if you believe joke number one or joke number two:

Joke one:

"How do you stop a runaway horse?"

"I do not know. How do you stop a runaway horse?"

"Bet on it."

Joke two:

"How do you cash on a double-digit winner?"

"I don't know, how do you cash on a double-digit winner?"

"Bet on it."

I dislike jokes that cast horseplayers as hopeless, perpetual losers. It is an insult to the motivations of a horseplayer — to make money topples the common, losing image. After all, there are people making money at the racetrack. I knew some, and they had this much in common — when it came to wagering, they made decisions, not selections. They inspired me.

Nothing proves success like success, so, years ago at a racetrack where I bet as a full-time job, I came upon a race where I had three contenders. One was going off a favorite, another was the public's third choice, and the third was 40-1. I questioned my evaluation of

the 40-1 shot as a contender because I thought him worth far less. I recalled the bettors' rule, so I refused to dismiss the 40-1 shot as a contender and decided to bet on it, even though, by post time, it was going off 50-1. It won and paid \$102.60, so I became a decider, never to pick a winner again.

The rule redefined "longshot" and "value" for my betting purposes, as well as it assisted me in passing races with unlimited risk based upon my price demands. A longshot became the best win price (in my opinion, translated to odds) for one of my contenders. Value was its price about my opinion. It meant that I would lose more races but make more money on my winners in "the long run."

I also learned that decisions, not selections, were especially potent in high-caliber stakes — like the very events coming this week at Red Mile and in a few weeks when the Breeders Crown emerges at Hoosier Park — where the best of the divisions filled each elim and final fields.

Though I continued to play overnight races, the impact of my decisions offered lesser win prices I felt were deserved. In the stakes events, however, I began to excel capturing strong "value" for the kinds of horses the public supported too mildly.

The most recent example of this is Ramona Hill. At 2, she was dismissed in the Breeders Crown Two-Year-Old Filly Trot Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park with odds of approximately 14-1. She was my win-bet decision, paying an astounding \$31.80. Another Ramona Hill decision surfaced in the 2020 Del Miller Final at the Meadowlands, which she won, paying \$18.80.

Decisions like those allowed for making money after subtracting losses from total plays. The process was especially helpful because decisions, not selections, reduced the number of overall races I wagered upon. Indeed, I was like most bettors when picking winners, playing — to coin a phrase from the late, great Dick Mitchell, "anything that moved" in order to toss some kind of profit. If there is any caveat to the claim of making money from decisions, not selections, it is important to note it is the sole product of win betting and a mighty reduction of overall wagers.

Through the 2000s so far, my best decisions in major stakes races resulted in double-digit wins, including (in no particular order) Charley Barley, Artists View, Poof Shes Gone, Broad Bahn, Impressive Kent, Tommi Canu Hear Me, Perfect Spirit (placed first, Hambletonian), Mets Hall and many more.

Yes, of course, there were bad decisions also, losses, but there were also many races passed, more races than I ever passed before (stakes and overnights). Mostly, though, the difference between losing and winning comes down to a simple truth: it does not matter how many tickets you cash, it only matters what the tickets you cash are worth.

Delaware's top 2-year-old pacers and trotters were showcased Wednesday (Oct. 7) in four \$100,000 Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund (DSBF) final events at Harrington Raceway.

Bobby Myers' **Big Al M** (\$3.80, Eddie Davis Jr.) kicked things off with a 2:00.2 win in the final for male trotters. The Anders Bluestone gelding led throughout and was a one-length winner over Altar Call and Blue Devil. Big Al M has won two of four lifetime starts for trainer Eric Davis.

Kim Caulder's Kims Command (\$6.00, Allan Davis) was an

impressive 2:02.4 winner in the filly trotting final. The CR Commando filly assumed control near the opening quarter and never relented in her two-length score over Designers Edge and Amy Wil. It was the John Wilkerson trainee's first career win.

Jo Ann Looney-King's **Stealing Bases** (\$3.40, Victor Kirby) completed a sweep of the pacing filly division with a 1:57.4 triumph in her final for trainer Jim King Jr. Under confident handling from Kirby, the Roddys Bags Again filly gained steadily with a first-over charge and wore down leader Cinders Baby for her third straight win. Uptown Lover finished third.

In the male pacing final, MST Racing and George Teague's **Subban** (\$8.20, Montrell Teague) was a one-length winner over Marvelous Winner and Syndergaard. After favourite Zs Dream made an early break, Subban marched through every call on top despite heavy pressure from Marvelous Winner. The Southwind Lynx colt notched his second career score for trainer Clyde Francis.

Later on the card, Letstrytowgleagain (\$2.60, Teague) had an auspicious local debut with a 1:57.1 maiden win. The Mr Wiggles colt is a full brother to 2015 Horse of the Year and local favorite Wiggle It Jiggleit.

Allan Davis had three wins on the card; Russell Foster and Teague recorded doubles.

Letter to the Editor

I noted with interest in yesterday's *BloodHorse*that the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act's (HISA) nominating committee has selected itself and will next select the board of directors of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority. Under the Senate bill, the Authority will commandeer most of the governmental responsibilities of the state racing commissions.

The bill has not even cleared the Senate, yet "thoroughbred industry stakeholders" are already beginning their takeover of racing regulation. Anyone who hasn't read the proposed

legislation yet, which is pretty much everybody, should do so. Under Section 5(k) and related language in the bill, harness racing will soon be taken over as well.

I am amazed at certain harness racing pundits who have expressed their support for this Jockey-Club-driven (the thoroughbred "stakeholder" above) takeover attempt. Maybe they also have not read the bill. In any event, knowing their intelligence, educational levels, and writings, I would have thought these particular commentators would be among the last to surrender to an authoritarian regime.

The state racing commissions are accountable to our elected officials, and thus to the people. Yesterday's announcement proves beyond any doubt that the self-appointed "Authority" is accountable not to any elected official, but rather to thoroughbred industry stakeholders.

Top fillies firing on all cylinders heading into Super Final

Trotting fillies were in the spotlight at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Tuesday (Oct. 6) as both the 2- and 3-year-olds wrapped up their Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) regular season with a pair of Gold Series divisions.

Fan favorite **Imextraspecial** battled to a neck victory in the first \$105,600 2-year-old trotting filly Gold division, catching pacesetter Dashing Muscle in the last quarter. After pedestrian fractions of :29, :59.4 and 1:29 the fillies sprinted home in :27.4, with Imextraspecial digging in for the 1:56.4 victory. Up And Ready also closed hard for third.

"She raced great tonight. That was a really fast last quarter and she gutted it out first-up," said driver Trevor Henry, who piloted Imextraspecial from Post 2. "As long as she draws good she will have a great shot in the Super Final."

With three wins in three Gold Series appearances Imextraspecial has 150 points and heads into the \$250,000 Super Final sitting second in the division standings. Prior to joining the Gold Series fillies in August, the Muscle Mass daughter also scored two wins in Grassroots action for trainer Paul Walker of Owen Sound and owner Keith Coulter of Mono, ON.

"She had to dig deep tonight to win. We wonder where she gets it from, but we were pretty happy again," said Walker. "It'll be a good final for those fillies. Post position is going to mean a lot, and how the race goes, it's going to be a good race."

The second freshman split featured a nail-biting finish as the three top fillies matched strides through the 1:56.1 finish. After careful inspection of the photograph, pacesetter **Fox Valley Liza** was declared the winner by a short nose ahead of Midnight Miracle and Hawaii, who could not be separated and shared the runner-up spot.

The mile was a personal best for Fox Valley Liza, who also won her Gold Series divisions in the July 12 season opener at

Georgian Downs and the Aug. 19 event at Grand River Raceway. A miscue in the Sept. 21 leg at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the Muscle Mass daughter's second of the season, caused trainer Ben Baillargeon to make a few equipment changes for Tuesday's test.

"We made a few adjustments in her shoeing and we added trotting hopples last week after her last race when she made a break, just try to make her feel a little bit safer, and Sylvain (Filion) said she was great tonight, she was perfect," said Baillargeon. "That's what you want to hear going into the Super Final next week."

Filion and Baillargeon drive and train Fox Valley Liza, respectively, for Anthony Lombardi of Morris, IL, Henshaut Stable of Montgomery, IN and George Golemes of Oak Brook, IL. Tuesday's win boosted Fox Valley Liza's point total to 156 and gives her the top spot in the division standings heading into the Oct. 17 Super Final.

Royalty Deal returned to Ontario Sires Stakes action in the first \$106,400 3-year-old trotting filly division and scored her second Gold Series win in a personal best 1:53.3. Starting from Post 5, driver Louis-Philippe Roy settled Royalty Deal briefly in third as Warrawee Vicky led the field to a :28 quarter. Roy sent Royalty Deal to the front before the :55.4 half and the filly carried on to a 1:24 three-quarters and held off Wine Rack Hanover in the stretch. Susies Lady closed for third.

"She's a big, fast and very nice filly. As long as she behaves I really believe she is one of the best trotting fillies in the OSS," said Roy. "She raced like she is tonight, anyway."

Roy steers Royalty Deal for trainer Clark Beelby and owner Coyote Wynd Farm of Vancouver, BC. The Royalty For Life daughter made just two appearances in the Gold Series this season, winning both. Her 100 points send her into the Super Final ranked fifth in the division. The top 10 point earners will start in the postseason battle.

Trina and driver Robert Shepherd snuck up the inside to claim a 1:55.1 victory in the second sophomore trotting filly split. Leaving sharply from Post 7, Trina led the field to a :27.3 opening quarter and then yielded to fan favorite Massive Flirt. Shadowing Massive Flirt through a :57.3 half and 1:26.4 three-quarters, Shepherd waited patiently for room to open up in the stretch and when it did Trina powered through to a two and one-quarter length win over Magic Cape and LMC Bumble Bee.

"Shep gave her a perfect drive her again. As long as she has a helmet to follow she'll come home good and she got a perfect drive again, and I really appreciate that," said trainer

Blake MacIntosh. "We're very happy with her. She's a nice filly and she's done very well for us. After breaking at Flamboro (Sept. 27), that was my fault, so this makes up for it."

MacIntosh shares ownership of Trina with Stan Klemencic and 30 Plus Stable of Trenton, ON. The Muscle Mass daughter was also a winner in the Aug. 13 Gold leg at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Her only off the board finish was a result of the miscue at Flamboro Downs on Sept. 27 and she heads into the Super Final ranked second in the division with 130 points.

Top colts primed for Gold Series showdown in London Friday

After a sharp training mile with Beaumond Hanover over The Raceway at Western Fair District last week, owner/trainer Jack Darling was looking forward to the 3-year-old pacing colt Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series finale at the London oval on Friday (Oct. 9).

Unfortunately Darling's confidence took a hit when the post position draw was published on Tuesday. Beaumond Hanover landed the outside Post 7 while rival Tattoo Artist got the inside Post 1 in the sole \$155,600 Gold division.

"When you draw the seven like that, with the way things set up, you're pretty well toast," said Darling. "It will be up to Jody (Jamieson) to see what happens behind the gate, but it's not good."

In the first four Gold Series legs Beaumond Hanover scored three wins and one second, getting bested for the first time by Tattoo Artist at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Sept. 18. The son of Sportswriter has only missed the top three once in 11 starts, finishing sixth, less two lengths behind the winner, in his Aug. 22 North America Cup elimination.

In addition to Tattoo Artist, both colts that were victorious over the London half-mile in two-year-old Gold Series action will also start to the left of Beaumond Hanover and driver Jody Jamieson. Beach Blanket Book gets Post 2 and track record holder Denali Seelster will start from Post 5.

"He'll be very tough on the half, because I think he can go just as fast on the half as he can on the big track, pretty close anyways," said Blake MacIntosh, who trains Beach Blanket Book for Hutt Racing Stable of Malvern, PA and Mac And Heim Stables of St. George, ON. "We had thought about taking him to the (Little Brown) Jug and just decided against it because he'd gone four or five weeks in a row between all the stake races. So we just gave him a couple weeks off, gave him a couple easy weeks, and he needed a little tightener for the Gold and so we qualified him at Flamboro."

Beach Blanket Book romped along all by himself in the Oct. 3 qualifier at Flamboro Downs, reaching the wire 27 lengths ahead of the field in 1:54.2. The Sportswriter son sits third in the sophomore pacing colt standings, behind Tattoo Artist and Beaumond Hanover, with 66 points from two seconds and two fourths.

Last October, Beach Blanket Book scored a 1:57.3 victory in his Gold Series division at The Raceway at Western Fair District, dealing Tattoo Artist the only loss he has ever suffered in Ontario Sires Stakes action.

"Last year Denali (Seelster) broke the 10 year old track record for two-year-olds and Tattoo (Artist) actually struggled last year, he was third," said Dr. Ian Moore, who trains both colts. "Hopefully we have some good weather (Friday) and away we go, see what happens."

Like his rivals, division point leader and reigning champion Tattoo Artist took a spin around a half-mile track last week to sharpen his skills for Friday's regular season finale. The colt will be looking to wrap up his sophomore season with a perfect record of five wins in five Gold Series starts.

"I'd taken him to Flamboro and trained him on Thursday (Oct. 1), he trained superb, just to make sure he's okay with the half still, and I just went one trip with him today (Oct. 6) and he just seems as fresh as a daisy still," said Moore. "Sometimes it's hard when you drag them on to three week breaks, I find that difficult sometimes, especially late in the year, but he seems to be taking it in stride no problem."

Frank Cannon of Sanford, FL and Let It Ride Stables Inc. of Boca Raton, FL share ownership of Hes Watching son Tattoo Artist and Ratchford Stable NS of North Sydney, NS own Sunshine Beach colt Denali Seelster.

The colts face off in the last regular season Gold event of their careers in Race 7 on Friday's program, which gets underway at 6:15 pm. Fans can download a program and watch the live stream on The Raceway at Western Fair District website.
