

history.

I have been doing the sale thing for almost 60 years and last year's Lexington sale was by far the best sale I have ever attended. In fact, the only one that compares in my impaired memory was the Tattersalls when Abercrombie had his initial crop go to market. That said, I think it's unfortunate to attempt to make any numbers comparison between this year and last year. When comparing figures with other recent sales the numbers appear down 4% which is more realistic to me.

I am writing this column on Thursday as it's my deadline, but I will prognosticate that Thursday's 4th session will be lower still and Friday with the stacking of Indiana and Ohio breds will be a jump back up again.

My first endeavor at predicting top yearlings was on the money night one. I fell flat on my face on night two, and was revived with a minor comeback in day three. However, I will point out that my top five numbers on Tuesday were all purchased by some of the finest trainers in the business — Steve Elliott bought my top choice and the remaining four were bought by Chris Ryder, Ake Svanstedt and two by Nancy Takter. Let's take a closer look a year from now to determine who was on the money.

I will suggest, with no afternoon racing, selling 180 horses a night would work far better with an earlier beginning to the sessions.

Back to the tedious undertaking of the top ten daily selections.

My yearling selection and appraisals are a business to me and I spend a lot of time in the process and take the responsibility maybe too seriously. When my editor suggested The Top 10 list I went along not realizing how

conflicted my mind would be on horses that I thought should be top sellers and horses that would actually be best sellers. My mistake was I listed too many of what I thought were the best, not taking into consideration that the big money European and Canadian buyers had a taste in horses often different from mine.

Another major mistake I made was not considering the amazing popularity of American Ideal. A marginal one out sells a marginal Muscle Hill. Another surprise is the falling from grace of Father Patrick — sire of the fastest horse I ever saw in Greenshoe — in such a short time. It reminds me of Baltic Speed back 10 years before the turn of the century.

An interesting example of what a bad night I had Tuesday. I loved a filly and a colt at Concord Farm on my visit there in early September. Monkey Queen, the sister to Gimpanzee and a Cantab Hall colt with far less pedigree. Lindy Farms bought the filly, but didn't bid on the colt. Although they liked his pedigree, they felt he didn't fit their program through no fault of his own.


The filly brought \$450,000, the colt #153 Snorting Copper \$27,000. Nancy Takter signed for the colt so he will have the best chance to prove me right or wrong.

If I have heard it once I have heard it 100 times. I was talking to a young trainer today who previously told me how much he liked a particular colt. I inquired how he could pass on him at a price I deemed one third of his value.

"I was afraid to bid because he was selling so cheaply," was his reply.

I will say it one more time, going to a sale unprepared is like going to a sword fight without a sword. If you do your homework there is never a moment when you are unsure about raising your hand.

I got a lot of negative feedback on my trashing of the Florida governor (full story here). I reiterate it had nothing to do with politics as all the emails stated.

Just pause a moment and reflect what is going on in the entire country. Places that are obeying the CDC guidelines have little virus problems compared to the Alpha male areas that refuse to wear masks and social distance.

The bottom line is the restaurant owners themselves have erred on the side of reason and refused to open to 100 per cent capacity.

Matt Wilford asks: I have been a fan for years. I have finally reached a point that I am thinking about buying a horse or two. What advice do you have for someone that wants to become a horse owner? How do I find a good trainer?

There are many good trainers out there. Some will provide you with fun, some with a severe head ache. COMMUNICATION is the key to any owner/ trainer relationship.

The first step is to ask your friends that own horses about their trainer. Have they had some financial success? Is the trainer easy to speak with? Does he or she keep them informed of the horse's condition and up-coming races?

This is not an easy task and you should invest some serious time in the decision.

My suggestion is to start with one horse and buy a horse that is racing. Instant gratification is great to start out. The yearling game is wonderful, but one needs plenty of money and lots of patience. All forms of horse ownership are wonderful keep your expectations low and dreams high and you will love the ride.

That said, I expect that out of 30 there will be some that may be found not guilty but I cannot imagine in my wildest dreams what kind of grounds they would have to sue Jeff.

Alexander Bishop asks: Do you think Ramona Hill will beat the boys again in the Kentucky Futurity?

I spoke to Tony Alagna last night at the sale and he said that since she scoped poorly her last start he was leaning into venturing into the filly division instead. To this writer, on a given day that division could be as tough. It's getting late in the season and for 2020 the year that a virus caused the start of stakes racing to be moved up about six weeks one wouldn't think there would be as may banged up tired horses as there are. However, fast miles and the fast training methods of the day have taken their toll.

Ramona Hill will be odds on in the filly division, but if she is not nearly 100 per cent recovered from her sickness there are a few speedy ladies out there that can upset her.

As for the colts, there are 14 entered and by virtue of earnings only 12 will race with two also eligibles. To me it becomes a two-horse battle. Ready For Moni comes of a sore performance in Canada where he made a break and Back of the Neck comes off an impressive win in the Bluegrass.

Nancy Takter told me that she trained Ready For Moni a half in :54 and said with a smile, "I think he is ready."

If both come with there A game there is no question that Ready For Moni is the faster of the two colts. There are others in there that have flashes but don't compare in class to the aforementioned pair.


Sunday at the Red Mile is Futurity Day and as "The Voice" would say "Be there."

Perfect filly Designer Specs a fashionable choice for Weller family

The 2-year-old trotting filly — undefeated in all 13 of her starts on the Ohio fair circuit — will go to the post in Saturday's \$40,000 Ohio Fairs Championship Final at Northfield Park as the second winningest horse in North America.

It was last autumn's Buckeye Classic Yearling Sale when a trotting filly was led into the auction ring at the Springfield, OH venue. She was not what the Weller family was looking for.

Equine shopping on a budget, Jay Weller, his wife Louise, and Jay's sister, Jayne, were frustrated after one after another of their catalog choices attracted bids out of their reach.

"We went after Full Count colts, but they were all bringing \$30,000 to \$50,000," said Jayne. "My brother didn't want a filly but that's what he ended up with."

That filly, Designer Specs, has won all 13 of her freshman starts (and \$36,664) on Ohio's extensive county fair circuit this year and looks to cap a perfect season in Saturday's \$40,000 Ohio Fairs Championship Final at Northfield Park.


She'll go to the post as the second winningest horse in North America, just one victory behind Lazy Day Hanover and First Gunner.

The Ohio Fairs Championship is a series of eight races, each with the same \$40,000 purse, that celebrates the Buckeye States rich network of county fair racing

By the time Designer Specs got to the Delaware Country Fairgrounds, the Wellers put Ryan Stahl in the bike.

The reason the Wellers have a daughter of Full Count in the barn is because Weller's wife kept raising her hand in the auctioneer's direction despite her husband's protest.

"He wouldn't even have her if it wasn't for his wife," said Jayne. "Jay wanted to stop at \$10,000. She kept saying, 'bid, bid, bid.' He said no, because it was a filly, but Louise kept going. There was no second-guessing on the way home. Jay is kind of quiet."

The Wellers got Designer Specs for \$13,000. Jayne said it's the most her brother has ever paid for a horse at auction.

True to his nature, Jay has remained a man of few words during Designer Specs' unbeaten run over 13 different racetracks.

"All he says when he gets out of the bike is, 'Well, she won another one," said Jayne.

The Wellers are members of what is the first family of harness racing in Republic, OH, a village of just 549 in Seneca County in the northwest part of the state. Their mother, June, was horsewoman and a racing pioneer, the first and only female to compete in the Little Brown Juq.

June drove Dad's Time in the 1972 Jug and was unplaced behind champion Strike Out.

June's son and daughter were born and raised in Ohio and are shining examples of the grassroots tradition that is the harness racing lifestyle in the Midwest.

When asked if her brother would be available for this story, Jayne said, "He probably won't be calling you back. We're busy farming and training the horses."

Jay, she said, was "hauling hay, today," and that a typical day for them is to train in the morning and then farm in the afternoon, producing a crop of beans and wheat on the family's nearly 200 acres of farmland.

"I've got the home farm (134 acres) and he's about 1 ½ miles away from me on the other farm (45 acres)," said Jayne. "This has always been a family deal, because mom and dad raced horses. We race together, farm together, and pretty much live together."

Jayne trains Designer Specs and Jay, until recently, has driven her.

"He got off and gave the mount to Ryan (Stahl) because we were going to Delaware (for a Jug Week start) and because we made the final at Northfield. My brother drives mostly at the fairs, not at the raceways. And Ryan also lives just down the road."

Designer Specs began her career on June 24 with a half-length score at the Putnam County Fair in Ottawa. The result was more impressive than it looks on paper.

"She got run into behind the gate, right before the start," said Jayne. "It turned her sideways and all but knocked Jay out of the bike. She came to a pert near stop and he got her going again. She must have made up 20 lengths."

Designer Specs had another close call five days later, scoring by a head at Marion in an effort Jayne said was her "just learning how to win."

She followed up with a comfortable score at Bucyrus on July 23 before enjoying home track advantage at the Seneca County Fair on July 28, drawing off to win by 8 ½ lengths.

"Nothing memorable there," said Jayne. "Just her going about her business."

Designer Specs got to trot over a finely groomed raceway surface when she went to the post at Northfield Park on July 31, home to the Summit County Fair.

She loved the experience, rallying to win by 2 3/4 lengths in a lifetime mark of 2:00.

"We knew she could trot, but we were surprised she went that fast," said Jayne.

Designer Specs kept on rolling, posting victories at six additional fairs by a combined 26 lengths. But what came next was Secretariat-like. Racing under the lights at the Fulton County Fair in Wauseon, she powered away to win by 26 ¼ lengths.

"Some guy parked her to the quarter that night," said Jayne. "But when you let go of her, she goes about her business. She loves to trot. The rest couldn't go with her."

Designer Specs registered her fastest mile in her most recent start at Delaware on Sept. 21, clocked in 1:58.3.

"We thought if she trotted back in two minutes, that would be good enough," said Jayne.

She shrugs off any thoughts of pressure that comes with training an undefeated filly about to race for the biggest purse of her career.

"We don't feel any of it," she said. "I've seen world champions get beat. If she gets beat, that's horse racing. I've seen Bret Hanover and Niatross lose."

Saturday's Fairs Championship mile is Designer Specs final start of the year.

"She's done after this one," said Jayne. "As for next year, maybe the Ohio Sires. It's up to Jay."

Or, could the Wellers' phone ring with offers for Designer Specs?

"Nope, never had one," said Jayne. "Nobody has called after she started winning. That way we don't have to worry about selling her."

The \$995,000 Italian Derby for 3-year-olds is on the race card in Rome on Sunday, Oct. 11 and dominant trainer Alessandro Gocciadoro has played his cards well ahead of the big day.

Twenty-eight horses are participating in the Derby and the \$297,000 Oaks in total. Gocciadoro trains 11 of them.

Six trotters from Gocciadoro's barn are in the big race and he has some really great shots to win, even if Holger Ehlert-trained Barbaresco Grif (Conway Hall) can be tough to beat. Gocciadoro himself will steer Bepi Bi (Donato Hanover).

Fourteen trotters will battle over 2,100 meters in the Italian Derby, which is considered as one of the most prestigious races there is in Europe.
















LEXINGTON Selected Yearling Sale

After four nights in Lexington, average on par with 2018, gross ahead of 2017

Yes, the pandemic sale is down 20 per cent in gross and average compared to a record 2019 sale, but look closer and the four-day average of \$56,495 is on par with 2018 and the cumulative sale gross of more than \$36.6 million is ahead of 2017.

The Lexington Selected Yearling Sale is down 20 per cent after Thursday's fourth session, but when you consider the 2019 sale was off the charts, the 2020 sale is being held during a pandemic, the cumulative average is on par with 2018 and this year's gross through four nights is actually ahead of 2017, 2016 and 2015, the numbers are impressive.

"I think the sale is good and we're just very lucky to actually have a sale," said Randy Manges, who manages the sale with David Reid.

Through four sessions, the sale is averaging \$56,495. That's down 18 per cent from the 2019 average through four sessions of \$68,738, but down just 0.3 per cent from the four-day average of \$56,652 in 2018.

"The thing we have to keep reminding ourselves is that last year's sale was one for the record books," Reid said. "At the end of (tonight's) session, we'll have to go back to 2018, 2017 and it will measure up to being a very good sale, in light of the pandemic."

"I think the sale is good and we're just very lucky to actually have a sale," said co-manager Randy Manges.

Manges said the four-day average of \$54,495 is "a little more encouraging," and was excited about the prospects for tonight's final session which features regional horses from Ohio, Indiana and Kentucky.

"There's a large number of horses that would've sold last night... I think the regional sale will be good," Manges said.

Thursday's session grossed \$3,704,000 for 169 yearlings sold to make the four-day cumulative sale gross \$36,609,000. That's down by 20 per cent over 2019's complete sale gross of \$45,511,000, down 8 per cent from the 2018 gross of \$39,770,000, but up 0.5 per cent from the 2017 gross of \$36,410,000. The gross was \$29,031,000 in 2015 and \$32,262,000 in 2016.

"You just have to keep pinching yourself and remember where we were at the beginning of the year, where we were in the summer and where we are now," Reid said. "We're \$36 million or \$37 million in gross sales. People take that number lightly, but I think that's a very important number to keep the trade going in the business and having a marketplace."

The sale average on Thursday alone was \$21,917, down 20 per cent from the fourth-session average of \$27,268 in 2019, down 5.8 per cent from the 2018 fourth-day average of \$23,258 and down 26 per cent from the 2017 fourth-session average of \$29,629.

"The deeper you get into the market and the quality of the horses, it's becoming a little more challenging, I think," Reid said. "That being said, every session we get through is one more positive for the sale."

Online bidders through Proxibid, purchased 23 yearlings on Thursday for a total of \$428,000. Through four days, online bidders have accounted for \$1.9 million in sales.

"This was an unusual year due to Coronavirus and all the different things that we had to do. Proxibid helped because it was difficult for people to travel and some people refused to travel, but it was good," Manges said.

The median for the fourth session was \$20,000 and is \$37,000 through four sale days.

The session was much faster than previous nights and concluded just after 11 p.m.

No horses hit \$100,000 or more in Thursday's session, meaning the total of \$100,000+ yearlings through four sessions remains at 101, which compares to 121 through four nights in 2019 and 124 through four nights in 2018.

Hip #623 On Cloud Seven (c, Chapter Seven—Dream Baby Dream) technically topped the session, but was an RNA for Kentuckiana at \$75,000.

The highest-priced yearling that changed hands was Hip #637 Fight Song, a Kadabra colt out of Fortunes Of Fables sold by Cane Run Farm, agent, to David Anderson and John Fielding of Ontario for \$72,000.

That yearling was followed by two that sold for \$65,000 each: Hip #556 Bethereinaprosecco (f, Bar

Hopping—Thankful Reward) that sold to JB Racing of Freehold out of Kentuckiana's consignment and Hip #577 Unity In One (c, Cantab Hall—Southwind Adele) that sold to Jenny Melander, agent, by Hunterton, agent.

"The video was a nice video," Melander said. "I went to look at the horse and it was a very good-looking horse. The breeding with the Muscle Hill as the grandfather, I thought was really nice to have. The horse itself is a great individual and it looks like more of a Muscle Hill than a Cantab, really."

Melander said the COVID-19 pandemic has forced her to buy fewer yearlings this year.

"I'll be at this sale, then also at the Black Book sale. That's about it for me. This year, we're not going to have as many babies due to Corona," Melander said. "A lot of my owners are smaller owners with small businesses. As they are struggling, there's just not enough money to go for the yearlings. We're looking forward to having more racehorses than yearlings next year and just hope that we can recover after that and get back more into a yearling game.

"I'm glad that we at least got a couple of yearlings tonight and we're hopeful we'll get a few more."

Reid's Preferred Equine still holds a wide lead over other consignors with \$7,844,000 in total sales from 132 yearlings. Kentuckiana is next with \$5,669,000 and Hunterton is third

with \$5,190,000.

"I think it's been a very, very strong sale for what we're selling," said Hunterton's Steve Stewart. "To me, you can't look at averages a lot of times, you have to look at what's selling. So, if you're selling something that you think is worth \$20,000 and it brings \$35,000, well maybe that's not a great average, but it's a whole lot more than you anticipated. It's kind of like having a racehorse that finished third and everybody else is picking you to finish seventh, so it feels like a big win. It's kind of like that, in a way.

"We sold one for \$4,000 (Thursday) and that's what he was worth. He might have been worth a little more... but we also sold the highest-price horse in the sale (Hip #89 Kadena — \$725,000) and we probably sold the cheapest one, but we do that every year. It doesn't bother me. A lot of people worry about their averages... It's not like we attempt to sell a cheap horse, but we're not worried. Horses need to be sold and some are better than others."

By average, with three or more sold, Concord Stud with an average of \$124,357 for 14 sold. It is followed by All American Harnessbreds (\$91,333 for nine sold), Blue Chip Farms LLC (\$77,273 for 11 sold) and Brittany Farms LLC (\$74,933 for 15 sold).

Through four sessions, Andy Miller is the sale's leading buyer with \$2,293,000 spent, in total, on 19 yearlings. Nancy Takter is second through three days with \$1,628,000 spent on 14 yearlings, followed by Ake Svanstedt (\$1,482,000 on 12 yearlings) and Burke Racing Stable (\$1,068,000 on 13 yearlings).

Tonight's fifth and final session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale will feature 170 yearlings. It begins tonight at 7 p.m. at Fasig-Tipton.

"From a sales company point of view, I think after (tonight's) session we're really going to take a deep breath and be thankful for the week that we had and that's a shout out to everybody – to the buyers, to the sellers, to the crew, to the auction staff, office staff. It's not an easy thing to do, to pull an auction together with adding different features and

2. Hip #531 GUINNESS — A Muscle Mass colt first foal from the family of Dr Ronerail. He can fly in the paddock and has dual eligibility in Ontario and New Jersey. Makes for interesting opportunities depending on scheduling.

She not only ravaged her home state but won some Grand Circuit races to boot. At 2, she won both the American National and the Hanover filly. Also dual eligible NJ and Ky.

Actual Rank: 150th at \$10,000

6. Hip #618 ARCH RULER — Second foal of Females Rule a sister to \$1,295,000 winning Mets Hall second in both the Hambletonian and the Breeders Crown. From the immediate family of Muscle Hill this colt should have been a Monday offering.

Actual Rank: 13th at \$42,000

7. Hip #559 LINDYS CHIQUITA — The final bid here will have an exceptional opportunity as this filly has a great talent and wonderful young deep pedigree. She Is Massachusetts eligible on top of that. Almost every one of the mares previous 6 foals have been stakes winners and one of her daughters has a top 2-year-old winner in 2020.

Actual Rank: 101st at \$15,000

8. Hip #600 LUCKY LIMERICK — Bar Hopping sister to the \$440,000 international winning Evaluate. This talented fillies dam is a sister to the fabulous Wesgate Crown a winner of \$2,600,000. Plenty of residual value here.

Actual Rank: 43rd at \$28,000

9. Hip #577 UNITY IN ONE — Talented Cantab colt is only the second foal of a Muscle Hill mare who's first foal is a stakes winner and has been stakes placed on numerous occasions. Also Pa and Ky elligible

10. Hip #581 JOEY GALLO DEO — Muscle Mass colt from one of the finest families in the game. Add to that I LOVE HIS NAME.

The Brett Pelling-trained Art Major filly will contend against Cavairt Audrey — the Nancy Takter-trained Somebeachsomewhere filly exiting a 1:52.2 win in the \$341,250 Shes A Great Lady Stakes — as well as Notorious Pink — the Shes A Great Lady runner-up conditioned by Tony Alagna. David Miller will have the reins on Test Of Faith while Yannick Gingras drives Caviart Audrey from post 5 and Tim Tetrick steers Notorious Pink from post 2.

Kentucky Sires Stakes champ Blue Diamond Eyes will try to rebound off a second-place finish in the Bluegrass last week when she starts from post 5 in the second division of the Arlene Siegel Memorial. David Miller again has the assignment behind the Ron Burke-trained Captaintreacherous filly who suffered defeat last week to Fire Start Hanover, who starts from post 2 for trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman and driver Dexter Dunn.

Today's card also features three divisions for the \$258,800 Six Pack International Stallion Stake Two-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Trot, sponsored by the Six Pack Syndicate and Deo Volente Farms.

Venerate leads the opening division from post 3 as he returns to the site of his Kentucky Sires Stakes crush after sliding to victory in the inaugural edition of the Mohawk Million. Andy Miller will drive the Love You colt — listed as the 7-5 morning-line favorite — for trainer Julie Miller against Ake Svanstedt trainee Southwind Tyrion, the William Wellwood Memorial runner-up who rallied with a :26.3 final quarter last week to finish third in the Bluegrass.

Pennsylvania Sires Stakes runner-up In Range will also try to bounce back off a sixth-place effort as the odds-on choice in the Bluegrass.

Making just his fourth start, aptly-named Svanstedt trainee



Delayed Hanover heads into the second division of the Six Pack off a 1:53.4 victory in the Bluegrass last week — trotting a final quarter in :26.3. Svanstedt will again have the reins from post 6 and neighbors hometown favorite Cuatro De Julio, the Trixton colt trained by Marie Ortolan Bar and driven by Al Eferstein.

The final split of the Six Pack pins Peter Haughton winner Zenith Stride against Moonstone S, runner-up in the Haughton and entering this race off a third-place rally in the Bluegrass. Brian Sears opts to drive the Mark Harder-trained Muscle Hill colt off a sixth-place finish over the Lexington oval last week and will start from post 2. David Miller nabs the drive on the Marcus Melander-trained Muscle Hill colt who starts from post 1.

A total of five Grand Circuit events will go on the 11-race card. First-race post time is slated for 1:00 p.m. (EDT).

The Always B Miki—Shebestingin colt Perfect Sting strides the Saturday (Oct. 10) Grand Circuit competition at Red Mile with a perfect record to keep intact.

Unbeaten in seven starts, the Joe Holloway prodigy fought gamely to win in Bluegrass action last week, holding off Summa Cum Laude by a half-length in a 1:50 mile. The pair meets again in the second of three divisions for the \$299,100 Betting Line International Stallion Stake Two-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace — sponsored by the Betting Line Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farm. David Miller will drive Perfect Sting from post 7 while Summa Cum Laude starts from post 5.

Also joining the match up are Abuckabett Hanover, looking to rebound after finishing sixth as the 1-5 favorite in the \$540,000 Metro Pace, and Bayfield Beach, who finished second in the Metro Pace.

Metro Pace elimination winner Highlandbeachsbest competes in the opening division of the Betting Line following a second-place finish in the Bluegrass. The Nancy Takter-trained Somebeachsomewhere colt starts from post 3 with Tim Tetrick in the bike against Almanac, who scored a victory in the \$50,000 Kentucky Commonwealth Final three weeks ago. Todd McCarthy drives that Brian Brown-trained A Rocknroll Dance colt from post 5.

A pair of Bluegrass victors converge in the final Betting Line split. Southwind Gendry — an Always B Miki gelding — starts from post 6 as the 9-5 morning-line choice off a five-race win streak including a 1:50.2 victory over the Lexington oval last week. His stablemate, the Sweet Lou colt Lou's Pearlman, draws post 8 following a 1:49.1 swoop with Matt Kakaley in the bike. Between the two starts the Somebeachsomewhere colt Exploit, the 35-1 winner in the Metro Pace, for trainer Tony Alagna and driver Andrew McCarthy.

Freshmen trotting fillies share the spotlight with four divisions of the \$304,000 International Moni International Stallion Stake — sponsored by the International Moni Syndicate & Hanover Shoe Farm.

Insta Glam exits the Mohawk Million with a fourth-place finish and now starts from post 6 in the opening division of

the International Moni. The Nancy Takter-trained Father Patrick filly caught many eyes earlier in the year leading into the Jim Doherty Memorial, but a break as the 2-5 favorite in the elimination struck her out of the final. Yannick Gingras has the reins of the filly regaining her stride against Hello I Love You, the Tony Alagna-trained Trixton filly who won in Bluegrass action last week.

Beautiful Game finished second to Hello I Love You as the 6-5 favorite and will try to hit the finish first in the second split of the International Moni. The Richard "Nifty" Norman trainee has held the honor of bridesmaid in six of her last nine starts with her lone homerun coming in a prelim of the Kentucky Sires Stakes in August. David Miller drives the Muscle Hill filly from post 3 as the 3-1 second choice on the morning line, with Lucas Wallin trainee May Karp earning morning-line favoritism with an 8-5 listing from post 4.

Anoka Hanover will aim to parlay her Bluegrass victory into the third division of the International Moni. The Noel Daley-trained Donato Hanover filly rolled off cover in the stretch to land on the line first in a 1:54 mile and now starts as the 7-5 morning-line choice. Todd McCarthy has the reins from post 3, directly outside of Julie Miller trainee Gotta Believe — a three-time starter with Andy Miller in the bike as she leaps into the Grand Circuit off a 1:53.1 win last week.

Presto pounced on You Ato Dream to win the Bluegrass last week, but the Jeff Gregory-trained Donato Hanover filly will get a shot at redemption in the final division of the International Moni. Gregory rolled You Ato Dream to the lead last week but grew leg weary off quick fractions, giving way by a head in the stretch as Presto capitalized off a pocket trip. Presto will start inside of You Ato Dream from post 2 with trainer Ake Svanstedt in control of the Trixton filly. Bluegrass winner and Bar Hopping filly Pub Crawl also competes in the final division, drawing post 6 for trainer Julie Miller and driver Andy Miller.

The Saturday card features a total 11 races, seven of which being Grand Circuit contests. Racing gets underway with first-race post slated for 1 p.m. (EDT).

Macho Martini bounces back with fourth Gold win

Macho Martini returned to the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) winner's circle on Thursday (Oct. 8) at Flamboro Downs with an effortless 1:58.1 score in the lone \$157,200 2-year-old trotting colt Gold Series division.

"I was actually a little bit concerned. I've never gone with him over a half. Luc's (Blais) got a tight half-mile turn on his training track at the farm and he was confident, but I just didn't know," said driver Bob McClure. "Two-year-old trotters are a little tough to get around those tracks and then you throw in the rail, that's one of the last spots I would have wanted with him, but he never missed a beat, just one-two-three-four. We just got away safe, and sat in the hole, and moved when they moved and he did the rest."

From Post 1 McClure settled the fan favorite in second, sitting behind Sweet Soul David as that trotter led the field of nine to a :29 quarter. Macho Martini continued to track Sweet Soul David through the :59.1 half and when McClure tipped him to the outside heading by the 1:29 three-quarters the pair were in no rush to get around the pacesetter. As the leaders squared up in the stretch McClure asked Macho Martini for a bigger gear and the colt easily opened up a one and one-quarter length margin on his peers. Master Grand slipped up the passing lane to be second and Sweet Soul David stayed game for third.

"He's quite the professional," said McClure. "And I would say that he's as fresh as he was when he started the year, which is typical of Luc Blais horses. They're as good at the end as they are at the start. He's very good at managing them that way."

Luc Blais trains Macho Martini for Determination of Montreal, QC. Thursday's win was the colt's fourth in Gold Series action and his eighth in 10 lifetime starts. The only blemish on the Muscle Mass son's OSS record came in the Sept. 19 Gold leg at Woodbine Mohawk Park when he made a break in the stretch after another colt made a break and veered into his path.

"I was worried when he made the break. You always worry

they will jump on their legs and hurt themselves you know, but we're lucky, he came back very well. He looks good tonight," said Blais. "That's a good feeling."

With 200 points, Macho Martini leads the 2-year-old trotting colts into the Oct. 17 Super Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The top 10 point earners will compete in the \$250,000 season finale and Blais said the colt's performance in that event will determine whether his freshman campaign comes to a close or carries on for a few more starts.

"We're going to see after that, how is he after that. He'll have almost 11, 12 races this year. It's lots of races for a 2-year-old," said the trainer. "It just depends how he feels. We don't decide, he decides if he wants to race again."

Fives are fabulous for Big M faithful

Fives have been wild of late at The Meadowlands, as some of the biggest payouts have come in a pair of low-minimum bets at the mile oval.

The 10-cent Pentafecta, which requires one to correctly select the first five finishers in a given race, replaced the 20-cent based "jackpot" version, and has returned great dividends to players, as has the 20-cent Pick-5. Both wagers now give bettors two chances every night to make a score.

Last weekend's (Oct. 2-3) Pentafectas left winning players with big smiles. On Friday, the race five return was \$736 before race 13 saw bettors walk away with \$507, despite the race being won by the 8-5 favorite.

Saturday's fifth race came back a whopping \$2,799 before the 13th capped the weekend with a payoff of \$991. The average payout for the wager with the low 15 percent takeout was \$1,258 for a miniscule 10-cent investment.

Friday's Early 20-cent Pick-5 (races one through five) brought the weekend's biggest payoff, as one sharp handicapper raked the pool, cashing in for \$35,516. The odds of the horses during the sequence were 5-2,11-1,11-1,3-1 and 7-1. Given how wide tickets can be "spread" with the low 20-cent minimum, that was a handsome payoff to be sure. The second Pick-5 is offered every night on races nine through 13.

"Value is so important in the racing industry," said Big M chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. "And you need liquidity in the pools to help

create that value. The Saturday Pentafecta paid out at odds of almost 28,000-1. The Friday Pick-5 paid out at more than 177,000-1. That's incredible value, and at The Meadowlands or any other racetrack, fair value will always draw horseplayers."

The drivers in the GSY (Gural Settlemoir Yarock) Series may not include names that are as famous as those that sit at or near the top of the Big M standings, but that did not stop the public from betting those races with vigor.

The first race Friday night saw a total handle of \$231,871, good for the highest pool of the night at the track as well as the entire country, before \$177,887 was pushed through the windows in the third race, meaning that the members of the driving club saw over \$400,000 in action on their races.

At the end of the weekend, total handle on the 26 Meadowlands dashes was just short of \$5 million.

"The Meadowlands low 15 per cent takeouts and competitive mile-track racing," said Settlemoir. "Create pools that tantalize players around the world with something that most other tracks cannot offer."

PROLIFIC PILOTS: With most of the Big M's top drivers out of town at Lexington's Red Mile, a pair of reinsmen who do good work elsewhere had a great time on their trip to East Rutherford.

Pocono Downs regular Simon Allard led the way last weekend with five victories, while Victor Kirby, who drives on the Delaware circuit, scored four times, all on Friday night.

RED MILE FINALE: Racing at Lexington, KY's famed Red Mile concludes this weekend, with three cards of top-flight stakes action to be contested today, Saturday and Sunday, with a 1 p.m. post time.

The Big M's own Dave Brower will handle post-race interviews and will partner up with the sport's popular jack-of-all-trades and leader of the #senditin army, Gabe Prewitt, for analysis of the races. Prewitt also serves as track announcer. For everything Red Mile, check out Prewitt on Twitter at @gabe_prewitt.

Second Bruiser proving trainer right with Grassroots success

When 2-year-old pacing gelding Second Bruiser steps in behind the starting gate in Saturday's \$75,000 Grassroots Championship at Woodbine Mohawk Park, he will be looking to make good on a prediction owner/trainer Vernon Cochrane made eight months ago.

"I said from the very start, like the first month I had him, I was like this is the best horse you've ever had in your life," said Cochrane of that late winter conversation with the gelding's owner/breeder Stefan Piekos of Palgrave, ON. "Until they actually prove it on the racetrack then you kind of wonder, like 'I've heard this before', but he's shown natural ability from the start. There was never anything that could train with him or even come close to him. He's always been like a three or four year old against babies. His last start, James (MacDonald) came in and said to me, 'He's a man against boys' and that's pretty much what it comes down to."

In their Oct. 1 Grassroots Semi-Final driver James MacDonald and Second Bruiser romped to a five and one-quarter length victory in 1:51.4. It was the gelding's third straight win in Grassroots competition and his third time halting the Woodbine Mohawk Park clock at 1:51.4. MacDonald will steer the Believeinbruiser son from Post 8 in Saturday's ninth race and his connections are hoping the gelding can wrap up his brief season on a successful note.

"He's just had so many health issues through the year that it was a struggle to get him there and we're just happy to salvage what we've salvaged out of the year. He's going to be shut down after Saturday and that will be it," said Cochrane. "We're going to stake him up to a lot more next year. He was

never paid into anything as a yearling. I mean he was a homebred and obviously the breeder wasn't expecting that kind of animal from him."

Win, lose or draw on Saturday, Second Bruiser has already proven that Cochrane's early season prediction was correct and given the partners something to look forward to in 2021.

Trainer Thierry Vandenplas started looking forward to Saturday night's 3-year-old trotting colt championship when Ripped And Ready sailed home a four and one-quarter length winner in his Oct. 2 Semi-Final, touring the Woodbine Mohawk Park oval in a personal best 1:55.1.

"He kind of impressed me a little bit last Friday. I think now Jody (Jamieson) starts to know him pretty well and we had a little bit more luck this time," said Vandenplas. "It's going to be tough, because you've got a lot of good horses that maybe didn't have a nice trip last week and everybody is going to fight hard Saturday."

The Semi-Final win was Ripped And Ready's third in Grassroots action this season. In 10 sophomore starts the Muscle Mass son has only missed the top three on one occasion, finishing fourth from Post 9 in the Sept. 10 Grassroots leg at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Jody Jamieson will make his sixth appearance in Ripped And Ready's race bike on Saturday, lining up at Post 5, alongside reigning division champion Lovedbythemasses, who gets Post 4 in the sixth race.

Vandenplas trains Ripped And Ready for owner/breeder Dr. Ruth Irving of Russell, ON and said neither the trip to the racetrack nor the post are cause for concern with the colt.

"I think when it's a nice and big track like Mohawk, the track is so nice and you've got so much time to make your move, I'm not worried about the position," said Brinston, ON resident Vandenplas. "He travels well, that's not a big problem for him. He's a nice horse to work with, calm and everything. As soon as he hits the trailer he knows he's going to go for business so he gets a little bit more anxious, but as soon as he's back from the races he just comes back to his normal life and he's pretty nice to work around."

Owner/breeder George Millar said 3-year-old pacing colt Bettorbuckleup is also a nice horse to work around. The Bettors Delight colt is one of the horses the 70 year old Millar regularly jogs and trains over the track at his Stouffville, ON farm.

"I've trained Buckle probably more than anybody has trained him, I like him," said Millar, who entrusts the majority of the colt's care to trainer Nick Gallucci. "There's nothing you can't help but like about him, he's just a nice little colt."

Bettorbuckleup may be easy going to work around, but he displayed killer instincts in the Oct. 2 Semi-Final, getting up in the final strides to catch favorite Mayhem Hanover by a nose in 1:50.4. The thrill of watching the colt make a

final-stride surge to win had Millar replaying the race until the wee hours.

"That was probably one of my most exciting races in the past year," said Millar. "I was still all excited and watching the replay for another hour and a half. I think I got to bed about one o'clock."

Bettorbuckleup and driver James MacDonald will make their bid for a second straight win from Post 3 on Saturday. Rivals Mayhem Hanover, the reigning division champion, National Sport, the other Semi-Final winner, and The Wild Card, the division point leader, will be lined up to his right at Posts 6, 7, and 8 in the seventh race.

In addition to Bettorbuckleup, Millar will also be watching homebreds Cyclone Sister and Cantstoplying compete in the 2-year-old pacing filly and pacing colt championships. Shadow Play daughter Cyclone Sister gets Post 1 in the fifth race while Sunshine Beach gelding Cantstoplying will start from the trailing Post 10 in the ninth.

"You never know how things are going to work out," said Millar. "To me it's exciting just to have a bunch of homebreds like that — Buckle's not a homebred — but having them competing at that level and making it to the Sires Stakes Final is great."

The Grassroots Championships go postward in Races 2 through 9 on Saturday's program. The evening's first race rolls in behind the starting gate at 7 pm. Fans can **download a program** and watch the **live stream** on Woodbine Mohawk Park's **website**.
