# Jacked up about Bulldog Hanover

As Bulldog Hanover is poised to challenge his own world record today at the Red Mile, trainer and part-owner Jack Darling assesses the pacer's place in history.



Today, Jack Darling and Johnny Mallia will send out world record holder Bulldog Hanover at the Red Mile in an attempt to further cement the pacer's legendary status.

If you don't know Jack, you might take this the wrong way.

Ask Jack Darling the obvious question about where his otherworldly pacer ranks among the standardbred immortals and there is no bull about Bulldog Hanover, no hint of bravado from the man that — apart from caretaker Johnny Mallia — knows the 1:45.4 world champion pacer best.

Just the facts, Jack.

"It's a different era. Niatross, how fast did he go? :49.1. Cam Fella was going :52 or :53. So, they really were the best in their era, but I really, truly, believe at this stage, today, (Bulldog Hanover is) the best horse that's ever lived up to now," Darling said quietly, matter-of-factly. "That's nothing against Somebeachsomewhere, but horses are just getting better and better. I really believe that no horse could ever beat him today the way he's racing."

Darling has the statistics on his side.

"Somebody gave me the stat that there's been 15 horses that have paced better than :47, but none of them have done it twice," Darling said. "He's done it five times. He would do it every time, if he had fast tracks. That's how fast he goes.

"A lot of horses can pace a quarter in :25-and-change, but it's the lung capacity to do that maybe four times in a row. Can you go a quarter in :26 four times in a row? This horse gives you

the impression that he could do something like that, because... recently, he hasn't been tired at the wire.


"He has superior constitution. He never gets sick. I don't think he's been sick a day in his life... He doesn't get tired. He's never missed a meal.

"A lot of people say he's the greatest horse they've ever seen.

"Ron Pierce said the other day that he's never seen a horse that could beat him or come close to him."

Pierce's fellow Hall of Famer Ronnie Burke may not go that far, but the trainer certainly is baffled about how to best Bulldog.

"Last week, I said, 'To hell with this kind of laying down for him. We're going to race him," Burke told HRU's Heather Vitale this week. "We sent our horses out of there. And then after the owners were like, 'Well, maybe if we raced this way we could have...' I said, 'Yeah, we would have got beat by four instead of five. You know, he's just better than us right now. We kept him out on the outside. We had him three deep into a cornfield, and he won by six or whatever under grips running off up the backside. Right now, there's not an answer for him. I thought maybe if you stretched him and put them in a bad spot, didn't matter. He could have started from the parking lot he was beating us. I really thought Workin Ona Mystery was going to have a great year this year and he probably would have except for Bulldog Hanover. I mean, he's on a once-in-a-lifetime run right now. I've always said Somebeachsomewhere is the best horse I ever saw. Not close. It's getting close."

#### **Harness Racing Update**

Will the lightning red clay of the Red Mile prove to be the site of harness racing history yet again, this time for Bulldog Hanover and Jack Darling? We'll soon find out.

Could Bulldog Hanover lower his own world record today in the \$153,000 Allerage open pace (Race 11)? Check that. Are Darling and driver Dexter Dunn even trying?

"We're just here to give him a chance. We'd be here no matter what, but it's been on our mind that this is going to be the place if he can go faster," Darling said.

Mallia just wants people to be reasonable. Bulldog Hanover is the first standardbred in history to go faster than 1:46 and he did it by one-fifth-of-a-second.

"There's a lot of pressure on this race," he told HRU's James Platz. "Everybody has these crazy expectations, like he's going to go in :44. I'm like, 'Do you know how fast a horse has to go for :44?' He broke the record by a fifth-of-a-second. They don't go seconds, they go fifths-of-a-second."



### FANS BASE IS GROWING, EMOTIONS ARE BUILDING

As Bulldog Hanover continues to put up scintillating mile after mile, Darling has felt the emotions build — both for himself and harness racing fans.

"With Bulldog, it's an emotional thing. So many people come up to me and congratulate me and talk about Bulldog. Their

admiration for that horse is so sincere and the look on their faces and in their eyes, it's so genuine and it's really touching. It's pretty special," Darling said.

In Dayton last weekend, Darling said there was a "constant stream of people" coming to the paddock to see the horse.

"They were just fans from Ohio and they just wanted to see that horse and wanted to ask questions about him, get their pictures taken with him. They just wanted to touch him. It was so genuine," he said.

This week in Lexington, it's been about the media, so far. On Wednesday, mere hours before Darling found out he will be inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame, he and Bulldog feted the USTA team.

"We were bombarded. Wendy Ross was there all morning. They did a heck of a show. We were out jogging and she was on the jogger. DeWayne Minor, he was jogging beside me and she's taking pictures and we've got the mics on and talking. Then, there were three photographers from USTA standing there. They took so many pictures.

almost brings a tear to your eye. He's so special. He's like a rockstar. He's so classy and you can just feel it and see it.

"They had a drone going around today, too. That wasn't bothering him. At one point, it came down really close and it scared the hell out of the horse beside him, but Bulldog just looked at it. I thought he was going to try to knock it out of the sky."


Thursday morning, a slew of harness racing paparazzi arrived at the Red Mile to record Darling training Bulldog Hanover.

"It's all for him," Ann said of Jack, who counters that Ann is Bulldog's biggest fan.

"She gets emotional, too," he said.

Today, the Darlings' two young grandchildren — 6 and 6 months — will be at the Red Mile to see if the horse the 6-year-old calls "Bullgone Hanover" can make more history with just a few starts left before he becomes a full-time stallion at Seelster Farms in Lucan, ON.

After today's race, Bulldog Hanover will race in the Breeders Crown at the end of October at his home track Woodbine Mohawk Park, then have a break and close it all out in the TVG at The Meadowlands where he set his 1:45.4 world record on July 16.

"Apparently, there's some kind of an invitation race at Rosecroft the week before TVG, so that's a possibility because he's going to need a race before that," Darling said. "There's also a \$600,000 race at Yonkers the week before Breeders Crown, but I'm not going to take him to that. He could go on a half, but he would need some practice. Just to take him there and hit those turns as fast as he goes, I couldn't take a chance."

When Bulldog Hanover does start for the final time, Darling said it will be a tough and sad day.

"The plan is to retire him and it's pretty hard not to, but the door is never closed until it's closed," he said.

It's not about the money at this point, the trainer said. After all, this year Bulldog Hanover bred his first crop of mares before returning to the track. He could do that again if it could be worked out with his syndicate.

"It's a shame for a horse like that to not be racing. If he could continue on like he's doing now, you'd be leaving that on the table. And the fans love it, they come out to watch him... so there is that small part of me..."

Darling pauses. He's hedging "just a sliver, maybe two per cent" because he's just like the rest of us.

He doesn't want to see the ride come to an end.

## Is Bulldog Hanover the best ever?

When a "best ever" poll in any sport is released, a common theme emerges – the effect of recency. The 'now' player or coach, or horse, always seems to top the list, as the accomplishments of those before him or her fade from memory.

Reading the industry chatter about Bulldog Hanover, I see a little of this phenomenon and it does gives me pause, but as I dig deeper and deeper, this feels a whole lot different.

Please allow me to share why.

"Time only counts in jail" is a phrase we hear often in harness racing to discount the speed of an animal, but it ignores a simple fact: A horse that stops the clock faster than the others wins the race. And Bulldog does that better than any horse in memory. His times, internal fractions and the way he does it is pure magic.

Bulldog won the Haughton in 1:45.4, but he did it from the seven post, hung to a :26.1 first panel, then forging to the lead with a :26.4 second quarter. He backed off the third quarter to :27.1 and then restarted his engine, coming home in :25.1 under no urging to win as easily as any horse can. Almost all of his races go something just like that.

There's something in handicapping called even energy distribution, which means, generally, even fractions yield the best results for a horse. The horses the energy types are talking about clearly aren't named Bulldog Hanover.

We can often be tricked with a horse by the competition they face. This is seen some years in the age restricted divisions, where a precocious colt or filly can win all the chocolates, but when they turn 4 or 5, they have to prove their mettle and fail.

Bulldog Hanover might be toying with his competition, but he isn't beating up on slow horses.

Allywag Hanover is a 1:46 pacer who can't seem to get close. Abuckabett Hanover came his back half twice in 51 seconds





with last quarters of :24.4 against Bulldog and could not finish in the same area code. Tattoo Artist is probably the sharpest and most talented horse in North America not named Bulldog Hanover. He got within a length, with Dex impersonating a statue in front of him. This horse's competition has been fantastic, and he's made them all look ordinary.

I believe how a horse wins off adversity is always a solid benchmark to judge just how good they are.

We all likely remember watching Somebeachsomewhere in the Messenger at Yonkers in a driving rainstorm. The Beach was saddled with the six post against the Jug winner, world record holder, and top racehorse Shadow Play. Beach took the absolute worst of it parked most of the mile, was slipping and sliding on the greasy surface he surely didn't like, and never once looked like a winner. Until he won.

I thought about The Beach's Messenger while watching Bulldog's tremendous performance in the Dayton Derby last week. It was a windy night, he was on a new surface at five-eighths that some think isn't his best, and he was surely not reaching the lead easily from his outside post. In the end, Dexter put a nice drive on the colt (what else is new) and he looked to be a winner at the top of the lane, but how he won we weren't expecting. He simply exploded, again making these very nice free-for-all horses look like they don't breathe the same air, and giving us all a thrill; one we won't forget any time soon.



# Power-packed cavalcade to close Lexington Grand Circuit meet today

by Ray Cotolo for Red Mile

World-class harness racing will be on display at Red Mile today (Oct. 9) as the Grand Circuit concludes its annual residency with several stakes events culminating to the meet's finale: the Kentucky Futurity.

This year's Kentucky Futurity, going as Race 12 on the afternoon, lures an overflow field of 12 for a purse of \$430,000. Conditioner Marcus Melander dispatches a powerful pair in Hambletonian runner-up Temporal Hanover and Periculum, the latter of whom scored a 1:50.3 victory in hand at the Red Mile last week. Mattias Melander now steers Temporal Hanover when he leaves from post 5 while Brian Sears sticks with Periculum out of post 3.

A strong contingent challenge the Melander charge, including Hambletonian winner Cool Papa Bell, who enters off a 1:53.1 stroll in the \$90,000 Phil Langley at Harrah's Hoosier Park. The first-, second- and third-place finishers from the Canadian Trotting Classic will also lay siege to the red clay with Slay (starting from post 2), Pretender (post 8) and Fast As The Wind (post 10), respectively, hitting the track. Meanwhile, Branded By Lindy (post 6) will try to regain his groove from winning the Kentucky Championship final after breaking stride in the Canadian Trotting Classic, and Ake Svanstedt will attempt to spring another surprise following a slight upset in the Bluegrass with Justice (post 11).

Race 10 pins the sport's top sophomore trotting fillies against other sophomore trotting fillies for the first time in this second half of stakes season. Joviality S (post 12) and Jiggy Jog S (post 8) both took stabs against the boys in the Hambletonian, finishing second and fourth respectively, but have returned to competition against their peers with dominance. Jiggy Jog S enters off a 1:50.1 performance in the Bluegrass while Joviality S will have to overcome the second tier off a 1:50.4 win in the Bluegrass. Dexter Dunn drives Jiggy Jog S for trainer Ake Svanstedt and Brian Sears pilots Joviality S for Marcus Melander.

Underneath the dynamic filly duo races Raised By Lindy (post 11), who enters off a 1:52.1 victory in the Elegantimage at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Kentucky Championship winner Date Night (post 2) and runner-up Selfie Queen (post 9) also compete along with Marcus Melander trainee Peyton Hanover (post

3), who won a Bluegrass split in 1:51.2. And though Hambletonian Oaks winner Fashion Schooner is absent, her stablemate Misswalner Fashion (post 10) will carry the torch from the outermost post in the overflow contest off a second-place finish in the \$115,000 Moni Maker at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

Once he sparked the public's imagination with his sizzling July into the record book at The Meadowlands, Bulldog Hanover's appearance at the Red Mile has become one of the more anticipated dates on the calendar.

He will step onto the track in Race 11, scoring from post 5, in the \$153,000 Allerage Farms open pace – a race that cemented the speed of Always B Miki in 2016 when he clicked the timer in 1:46. Dexter Dunn drives the Jack Darling trainee in the race against history. The field also includes defending Allerage champ Allywag Hanover (post 1), who enters off back-to-back second-place finishes to Bulldog Hanover.

Earlier in the card, world champion trotting mare has a race against time in the \$57,000 Allerage Farms fillies and mares trot, carded as Race 3. With only a handful of starts remaining in her racing career, the Ron Burke-trained triple millionaire starts from post 1 in rein to Yannick Gingras against her regular chief rivals When Dovescry (post 5) and Next Level Stuff (post 2). Sorella (post 4), the 2020 Hambletonian Oaks winner, and near half-million-dollar earner Weslynn Quest (post 3) complete the field.

Only four mares dare to challenge reigning U.S. Horse of the Year Test Of Faith in the \$73,000 Allerage fillies and mares pace, slated as Race 6. David Miller drives the double millionaire for trainer Brett Pelling from post 3.

Jujubee returns to the site of his greatest achievement in the \$149,000 Allerage Farms Trot, going as Race 7. Andrew McCarthy stays with the Greg Wright Jr. trainee as he makes his fourth



start of the year following a late beginning to the season. He starts from post 4 off a third-place finish to Maple Leaf Trot champ Back Of The Neck in the \$250,000 Dayton Trotting Derby. The field also includes Red Mile speed freak Cuatro De Julio (post 2) and millionaire It's Academic (post 6).

Race 4 gathers the pacing glamour boys for the \$363,500 Tattersalls Pace. I Did It Myway puts a five-race win streak on the line from post 3 with Andrew McCarthy retaining driving duties for trainer Tony Alagna. Those threatening his streak include Brian Brown's tough-luck Night Hawk (post 1), Little Brown Jug runner-up Fourever Boy (post 2), North America Cup champ Pebble Beach (post 7) and Bluegrass division winner All About The Hunt (post 8).

The pacing filly counterpart, the Glen Garnsey Memorial, goes as Race 8. Niki Hill will attempt to continue demonstrating her rank over the division after landing her first stakes win of the year with a 1:49 mile in the Bluegrass. Dexter Dunn drives the Chris Ryder trainee from post 4 as she faces her stiffest contest yet against a field including Shady Daisy winner Max Contract (post 1), Ohio Sires Stakes champ Sea Silk (post 5) and Kentucky Championship winner Boudoir Hanover (post 11).

First-race post time for the season finale is 1 p.m. (EDT).

#### Combustion fires in 1:49.3 International Stallion Stake burner

A :52 front half teed **Combustion** up for an off-the-pace swing to the lead in the stretch that successfully landed him in front at the finish of a 1:49.3 mile in the third of three divisions of the \$299,100 Tall Dark Stranger International Stallion Stakes, for freshman pacing colts and geldings, on Saturday afternoon (Oct. 8) at The Red Mile.

Bamboozler bore responsibility for the race's early speed. Launching from post 9, he snapped consecutive :26 quarters to string the field by over 14 lengths to the half. That vicious pacesetter soon gasped on the afterburners as the backfield loomed into action coming to three-quarters in 1:20.2. Ammo fired the first shot from three wide to take the lead in the stretch with Combustion on his back. The Brett Pelling trainee continued to dig into Ammo through the stretch and wore down the late leader to snag victory by a half-length. Admiral Hill gave pursuit behind the top pair to finish third and Gung Ho took fourth.

"I thought it set up really well," co-owner Shaun Laungani, of Diamond Creek Racing, said after the race. "I turned to Marcus Johansson our racing manager and asked, 'Do we need cover?' and he said "Nope.' But we got it even still. The setup couldn't have worked out even better."

Combustion collected his fifth win from six starts to deposit into an account now worth \$113,350 for owners Diamond Creek Racing, Thomas and Scott Dillon and Cooper Silva Stables. Todd McCarthy piloted the Captaintreacherous colt who returned \$7.16 to win.

**Handlelikeaporsche** waited on nobody as the 1-9 favorite and paced down the road to a 1:50.1 victory in the first division of the Tall Dark Stranger.

Driver Dexter Dunn pushed the pedal on the Chris Ryder-trained son of Lazarus N to lead his peers after a :27.4 first quarter. On cruise control through a :56.2 half, Handlelikeaporsche began peeling from the field to three-quarters in 1:24 and received only reminders from Dunn in the stretch while chased home by Surfside Beach, beaten 1-3/4 lengths. Ken Hanover closed for third and Command finished fourth.

"It's tough when you're 1-9... it makes the trainer a little nervous," Ryder said after the race. "Dexter was happy with him, so we got the job done."

Ryder co-owns Handlelikeaporsche with William Ezzo, Robert Mondillo and Barry Spak. The colt scored his third win from six starts and has now earned \$228,850. He paid \$2.14 to win.

A lane opened mid-stretch for pocket-sitting **Mamba** to charge through and swish a 1:51 buzzer beater by a head at odds of 27-1.

Ervin Hanover left from post 8 to lead with Mamba following suit alongside to land in the pocket before a :28 first quarter.

Save America, the 1-9 favorite, raced sixth despite the pace remaining soft through a :56.3 half. By that point, Save America pulled from the pylons and glided along the rim to apply minor pressure to Ervin Hanover as he accelerated to three-quarters in 1:24.1. Save America remained relentless to the outside and forged by as Ervin Hanover drifted through the stretch, but that left a gap wide enough for Mamba's fresh legs to spurt through and grab the lead in time to deny Save America. Goldin Greatness zoomed to the outside to take third and Ervin Hanover held fourth.

"[We've had this horse] three weeks [and he's improving] each and every start," trainer Travis Alexander said after the race of Mamba, whom he recently purchase online for \$62,000 through Preferred Equine. "He's a nice horse just needed the time. [I] loved the trip, Joey [Bongiorno] drove him well. I told him to be aggressive. We liked the colt and we made some changes when we bought him and they worked."

Paying \$56.40 to win, Mamba recorded his second win from 11 starts and has now earned \$123,430 for owners M Spacc Stables, Fiddler's Creek Stables LLC, D'Elegance Stable Ix and T L P Stable. Joe Bongiorno piloted the Sweet Lou gelding.

Each division of the Tall Dark Stranger International Stallion Stakes was presented by the Tall Dark Stranger Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farm.

Mommamia Volo hit the beam in time to keep closing Quick Stop at bay by a neck while If The Shoe Fits took third and Pure Hope S finished fourth.

"This week, I was pretty confident she'd bounce back pretty good," trainer Carter Pinske said after the race, in regard to her break in stride in an overnight race last week. 




"The Buckstone dispersal was the one that spurred us to put the sale back on the calendar. We were alerted back in July. I knew there was going to be a mixture of broodmares, racehorses and weanlings and that was the cornerstone of it and then we gathered some other entries from Peninsula and Crawford and some other consignments. Then, we got some racehorses," sale co-manager David Reid.

"Overall, I thought it went quite well. The sale gross was \$2.7 million and that was relatively close to the last time we had it here. I thought the top-end broodmares held up very well. The racehorses sold very well at the end, there. I think it's just a sign of the times that commercially viable product is in desire and the stuff that's a little trickier is a little harder to get moved. That was evident tonight, but, overall I was very satisfied with the sale."

Topping the sale was **Hip 939 Unica Donna IT**, a Donato Hanover mare out of Hangone purchased by Hunterton's Cindy Stewart for \$250,000 from the Preferred Equine consignment.

Stewart also purchased **Hip 924 Avalonia**, a Muscles Yankee mare out of Ava Marion from Preferred for \$110,000.

Stewart was the leading buyer, signing for five horses and spending \$459,000.

Swedish bloodstock agent purchased Hip 977 Lindys Lullaby, a Cantab Hall mare out of Nashville Lindy, for \$80,000.

Forty-one broodmares were sold for \$1,500,000, an average of \$36,585, The median was \$25,000.

Four stallion shares grossed \$167,000 total for an average of \$41,750. The median was \$63,500.

A Muscle Hill share sold for \$75,000 to Euro Stall SE of Berlin, OH from Preferred.

Among racehorses, 19 sold for \$626,000, an average of \$32,947. The median was \$27,000.

The top racehorse sold was **Hip 957 My Nay Nay** a Captaintreacherous mare out of Well Sweet Flashy purchased for \$75,000 by Thaddeus Wier of Aurora, NY from Preferred.

**Hip 923, a stallion share in Lazarus N** in support of St. Mary School in Paris, KY raised \$24,000. It was purchased by Flagger Stable of Ft. Edward, NY.

#### PREFERED LED CONSIGNORS

Preferred Equine consigned most of the horses / stallion shares. They gross \$2,138,000 for 53 sold, an average of \$40,340.

Peninsula Farm grossed \$268,000 for 11. Crawford Farms grossed \$180,000 for eight sold.

Will the mixed sale return next year?

"As long as it gets support," Reid said. "The biggest thing is the support. Obviously, as everyone knows, (Preferred has) launched an online portal. I'm still a big fan of the live sale or like tonight where you've got the best of both worlds – you can so the horses live and be able to bid online.

Hip 923, a stallion share in Lazarus N in support of St. Mary School in Paris, KY raised \$24,000. It was purchased by Flagger Stable of Ft. Edward, NY.

"Obviously, people are becoming accustomed to selling online at their calendar date, on their schedule, and I think the added flexibility does give the online platform an advantage. That being said, I still believe there should be live sales conducted and I think there will be live sales conducted and I think it's important for the marketplace to have live sales because 100 per cent of the marketplace is not accustomed to buying online right now.

"As long as I'm in a management position, I'm always going to schedule live sales. I think live sales are important for the industry."

#### **ONLINE BIDDING**

Ten horses / stallion shares were sold online via Proxibid for a gross of \$276,000. There were 13 active bidders and 100 total bids placed. Online bidders were the underbidders on eight horses.





## Flexing a little Motown Muscle

As someone who always tries to fish where the fish are, in this case it means taking a hard look at the top 3-year-old trotting colt and the leading 2-year-old trotting filly in the lucrative Ontario Sires Stakes program.

That means, respectively, the 3-year-old gelding Duly Resolved 3,1:54 1/5 (\$654,120), and the 2-year-old filly Righteous Resolve 2, 1:53 1/5 (\$324,748). The similarities between the two are striking. They're both by the same sire, Resolve, they're both out of the same mare, Motown Muscle, and they're both trained by Jon Bax. In other words, full siblings.

Motown Muscle, the dam of Duly Resolved and Righteous Resolve, has already stamped herself as a great producer from only her first four foals with those two, plus the mare Bright Eyes M with a record at 3 of 1:53 and earnings of \$239,589.

M² has an interesting pedigree, starting with her sire, Muscle Mass. He is a living proof that a stallion's 2-year-old racing season is the best foreshadowing of his future potential as a sire.

Muscle Mass was a top stakes colt at 2, winning just under \$200,000. At 3 he couldn't beat Old Shep, barely eking out

\$30,000. Today, he is one of the best trotting sires in North America.

Muscle Mass has a full brother, Muscle Massive, who was no hell at 2, but won our biggest dance, the Hambletonian at 3. Let me hasten to say Muscle Massive is a good sire himself, but he's now on his second farm.

So that you don't regard me as a Lonely Only when it comes to pronouncements about 2-year-old brilliance being essential to future success in the stud, the greatest thoroughbred breeder of all time, Federico Tesio, felt the same way.

Perhaps the single most important aspect of Tesio's breeding program was his ability to track down obscure runners who were brilliant at 2, and from them breeding European champions. Tesio's masterpiece was the superhorse, Ribot, not only unbeaten, but unheaded in his racing career.

Here, a personal note RE: Ribot. He came to stand in America on a two-year-lease to Darby Dan Farm, owned by John Galbreath, owner of the Pittsburg Pirates, among quite a number of other possessions. Darby Dan was managed by Olin Gentry, and in my early days he and I became friends.

Ribot was supposed to return to Italy at the end of his second U.S. breeding season, but that never happened. Galbreath desperately wanted to keep Ribot. He concocted a story that since he came to the United States, he had become such a wild horse that if he were ever loaded on a plane, he would go crazy and have to be put down before he brought the plane down.

The supporting evidence for this claim was a picture of Robot on his hind legs, striking out wildly with his front legs, his eyes with a wild gleam that owed a little to nature and a lot to a retouching job by Tony Leonard, probably the greatest equine photographer of all time.

One day when I had dropped by Darby Dan, my friend Olin Gentry took me out to Ribot's paddock. There was a big tree in the middle of it, and Ribot was standing on his hind legs, happily eating leaves off the tree.

"That's how we got that picture," Gentry told me. "Thank goodness that horse liked the taste of those leaves."

Back from Memory Lane, and on to Motown Muscle's extended pedigree:

It's an interesting pedigree, indeed, and finally one that bear's out this kid's belief in the value of judicious close breeding.

Motown Muscle is by Muscle Mass, who's by Muscle Yankee, and he by Valley Victory. Her dam is Bankers Jackpot, by Wall Street Banker, and a full brother to Valley Victory, so M<sup>2</sup> is 2 by 3 to two full siblings, which makes her Inbred.

As a gentle reminder, if the sum of the two generations in which the same name appears is six or less, that is properly defined as *Inbreeding*. In the case of M<sup>2</sup>, the sum of the two generations in which Valley Victory and his full brother, Wall Street Banker, appears is five. Obviously the potency of such a close cross is self-evident in M<sup>2</sup>'s dynamite production.

For good measure, Motown Muscle is also 3 by 4 to Speedy Crown, and when the sum of the two generations in which the same name appears is seven or eight, that is the definition of *Line Breeding*.

When no name appears twice for a total of eight generations, or less, that horse so bred is defined as an *Outcross*.

The great majority of today's trotters and pacers are Outcrosses. The potential for explosive production is clear when one sees the top racehorses an Inbred mare like Motown Muscle has produced.

Parenthetically, a quick "Hello" to my good friend Bob Brady, who told me he has finally absorbed my definitions. So now there's at least two of us.

Booking season has already started, and I have to wonder if there will be any Inbreeding planned. Not that they're asking my advice, but some of the big outfits always have some mares that haven't yet produced up to expectations. They would be prime candidates for judicious Inbreeding. There'd be nothing to lose, and it could get a potentially good mare on her way to finally paying her way, and then some.

Finally, in my distant youth I trained and showed my father's saddle horses. My hero then, and remains so still today, was Earl Teater.

He trained the saddle horses for Francis Dodge Van Lennep's Castleton Farm, under the *nom de course* of Dodge Stables. His masterpiece was the six times world champion five-gaited stallion, Wing Commander.

When I got old enough to hang at the edge of the small crowd that was always around Earl, I hung on every word he said. And finally I graduated to the point that I actually could carry on a conversation with him, although I always made sure that he did most of the talking.

Teater had a dry, rasping voice, and one time we walked out of Madison Square Garden together early in the morning, to go together for breakfast.

"Taxi!" Earl rasped as we hit the street, and I think a dozen cabs must have squealed to a stop.


It all came back to me one day at the Lexington sale this week. Someone asked me how old Constance Hall was, and suddenly it was 60 years ago, and I was asking Teater how old Belle of the Dell was.

And just as the answer I got all those years ago, I plagiarized Teater, and answered in the deepest voice I could come up with;

"She's old enough to sleep by herself!"







# Andrew Cohen's passion for horses was stoked in Montreal

Andrew Cohen and yours truly share a lot of interests and history. To wit, we were both born and raised in Montreal, a city to which both of us still feel a great affinity, even though it has been decades since we've left. We had no history with horses until we became involved with them. We both came from non-equine backgrounds. We each began our interest in harness racing and primarily its horses through family involvement

 Andrew through his father, Eddie Cohen, and myself through my oldest brother Sam. But this story is about Andrew Cohen, not Murray Brown.

# Tell us a little about yourself. You've now been involved in the sport for about 50 years, with a break of about 25 years as a young adult.

"As you've said, I'm from Montreal. I started going to the races at Blue Bonnets, which wasn't more than a 10-minute drive from our home. My parents went all the time and my dad would take me to the track on Sunday afternoons and to the backstretch every Saturday and Sunday morning. I loved it. My dad became involved because his accountant at the time told him buying horses would have tax benefits. Problem was, the first few horses my dad bought were cheap overnight horses. They all made a little money. So he kept buying those kind. We had horses trained by Denis Normandin, Onil Patry and Pierre Desjardins, but the first trainer I remember well was Peter Litwin, who was a really great guy with whom I am still in touch. He lives in Florida. Peter bought us Wanague, who was a really nice conditioned pacer, and Silvern Hanover, a classy trotter. My dad eventually wanted to get into the yearling game and so we connected with Duncan MacTavish, the son of Hall of Famer Del MacTavish.



to me. My own older sister died seven years ago. I consider Linda and her husband Brad McNinch to be two cherished friends. I rarely get to see them since I live so far away from where they train and race. Reuniting with them in Lexington and Harrisburg is like a family reunion to me... "It was in Duncan's stable that I really grew to love horses and harness racing. There were so many characters along the backstretch of Blue Bonnets those days and I cannot possibly remember them all. I met Freddie Grant, Herbie Liverman, Gilles Gendron, Michel Lachance, Marcel Dostie, Daniel Jean and Benoit Cote through Duncan. I got to go to Saratoga with my dad and his partner Connie Leber to watch a race in 1978, an experience I will treasure forever. We had some decent yearlings toward the end of the 1970s, including Painter Lobell, who Peter Litwin had picked out, and Caravelle Sam, who Duncan bought in Lexington. Sadly, the best horse my dad owned with Duncan was Safe Arrival, a horse that Duncan bought from Castleton Farms. He ended up earning over \$450,000 and taking a record of 1.54.1 but by that time we had moved from Montreal to Colorado so my dad didn't get the full benefits of that partnership."

## Living in Denver, were you still able to be involved with your horses?

"The short answer is no. I was 13 years old when we moved and there was really no way to follow harness racing from that far away. We read the *Harness Horse* magazine and the *Horsemen and Fair World* magazines, which I was privileged to write for decades later. I grew up, went to Boston for college and law school, and began my career as a lawyer and journalist at CBS News. In 2005, as I neared age 40, I realized I needed a good, old-fashioned vice. I didn't play golf or enjoy wine, cars or travel. I am not a foodie. By that time, my dad was getting ill. So I reached back out to Duncan, with whom I had stayed close through the years. I asked him for advice on how to get back into the game. He told me to call Mike Lachance, our old family friend. Michel and his son Martin helped me pick out a few horses in 2005.

"By 2006 we were back in the game with a nice filly named Wild Ride Hanover and Share The Delight, a colt the Lachances picked out for us in 2006 at Lexington. My best friend, Lorne Polger, whose family also had moved from Montreal to Colorado, was my partner (and still is) and we were, as you could say, off to the races. Share The Delight was a blessing and a curse. He was really fast, finishing third to Somebeachsomewhere and Art Official in the 2008 Meadowlands Pace, a race many people consider one of the greatest ever. We thought: this game is easy. You pick out a yearling for \$50,000. It makes \$500,000! We now know how hard it is to repeat that scenario. But he was the best horse my dad ever owned and he got to see him race just weeks before he died."

# You've been with Linda Toscano since 2007. That's a pretty long time to be involved with a single trainer in this business.

"I love Linda. Everyone loves Linda. She's like an older sister to me. My own older sister died seven years ago. I consider Linda and her husband Brad McNinch to be two cherished friends. I rarely get to see them since I live so far away from where they train and race. Reuniting with them in Lexington and Harrisburg is like a family reunion to me. That's a good way to think of her stable and her owners. Most of us are good friends. Even though we may not be in partnership on a particular horse. We still root for each other all the time. Brad and Linda always put the horse first. Brad's horsemanship is totally underrated. He is an excellent trainer as well."

#### How many horses are you involved with?

"Right now I have parts of eight racehorses and seven broodmares. Mostly pacers but a few trotters. We race at 2 and 3 and then either sell them or turn them into broodmares."

# You mention broodmares. How long have you been involved in the breeding business.

"I love that part of the business, probably more than the racing. We have mares at Cindy and Steve Stewart's gorgeous Hunterton Farm in Paris, Kentucky, and two with Mark Mullen, who does great work at Fair Winds Farm in New Jersey. I learn something about the sport every single time I talk to Steve. He and Cindy and Mark raise a wonderful horse. My partners would pick the racing over the breeding but I am the opposite. I'd love to end up with a small, sharp broodmare band and go from there."

# Do you have a method or game plan when it comes to buying yearlings?

"I like to be involved with the process. I study the catalogues online and then when they come in print. I'll mark off the pedigrees that appeal to me and then let Linda and Brad handle the evaluations on conformation. Once in a while I'll travel to Kentucky or New Jersey or New York to look at yearlings before the sale. Mostly I just see them when they come to Fasig-Tipton or Harrisburg. We never have an unlimited budget so, like most everyone else, we are trying to find value or zig when others are zagging. I am a big fan of the programs in Kentucky and Ontario so this year we tried to shoot for dual-eligibles. By the way, harness racing needs more folks like Trevor Ritchie, who judges conformation of all the horses for Brittany Farm. I would encourage honest trainers and drivers who are good at doing that to consider offering their services each summer/fall. They'd make good money."

# Do you have any favorite breeders with whom you like to deal?

"I love to deal with Hunterton, naturally, and we've purchased a few good horses over the years from other farms. It's getting harder and harder to buy horses at public auctions. So many breeders keep their best horses to race against you. That explains why some prominent owners now are working more on keeping their nice mares and are racing homebreds. I hope we can do more of that in the years to come. I wish breeders and consigners culled fewer of their horses. I don't have to tell you, Murray, that there's a lot that goes on behind the scenes at these sales that owners never know about."

# How about preferences — colts or fillies, trotters or pacers?

"Fillies, I guess. Linda loves her fillies. But I want to win some of the classics before I die, So I am always looking for a good colt... I always like to try at least one trotter each year."

# You've recently been quite vocal about the United States Trotting Association and the manner in which it is managed. Would you care to elaborate?

"The staff and employees of the USTA do a wonderful job. The website is invaluable. The 'members services' folks who make it run are excellent, willing and capable people. I cannot remember a situation where I didn't come away from contact with them not satisfied with how it went. We are lucky to have a breed registry that services its members in that way. In that sense, it's a well-run organization.

"The USTA's leadership, on the other hand, is a disaster. The Board of Directors is way too large and totally unaccountable to its members. I can't remember the last time my representative asked me (or any other members) for guidance on the contentious issues the USTA faces and the bylaws are, what, 100 times longer than the U.S. Constitution? The USTA makes it way too hard for members to run for office or for directors to be removed from office. The best example of this is a recent one. Everyone in harness racing, including Russell Williams and Joe Faraldo, know that there is great disagreement over the new federal racing integrity law, HISA. Everyone knows this because last year about 300 of the most prominent people in the sport declared their opposition to the way Williams and Faraldo were handling the HISA situation. So what did the USTA just do? Did it reach out to members to ask for opinions? No. Did it encourage an honest debate about HISA? No. Did it seek compromise? No. Instead, USTA members got more anti-HISA propaganda and the USTA just doubled down on a losing bet. Without asking its members first it just approved another \$500,000 in legal fees to continue to fight a losing lawsuit against the federal law.

"There was no membership vote on approving such an expense. I don't even think there was a board of directors' vote. Instead, the Executive Committee, during Jug Week, quickly endorsed the expense. It's a bad move as a legal matter. Don't directors have fiduciary duties to members? It presents terrible optics as a matter of politics, saying to the world: 'Hey, we are the breed that doesn't want to change the status quo to better catch the cheaters which we all know are in our sport.' But it's also a terrible decision as a practical matter because by suing the HISA entity the USTA now is precluded from negotiating with HISA officials to try to gain concessions from federal regulators.

"Williams and Faraldo are leading the USTA over a cliff and the USTA's board seems unwilling to stop them. Hopefully, the rest of us will figure out a way to jump off the wagon in time to fix HISA so that it works for harness racing in the years to come. If we don't we'll lose purse subsidies and racing as we know it will end in many places."

# Young stars shine in Victoria Cup

The future of Aussie harness looks bright after the young stars shone brightly at the huge Victoria Cup meeting on Saturday (Oct. 8) at Melton.

Victoria Cup has become Australia's best race card with four Group 1 races and a stack of other highlights, and it certainly delivered last Saturday night.

**Rock N Roll Doo's** dominant, even arrogant, win in the main race itself – the Group 1 Victoria Cup – grabbed top billing.

Only special horses can park outside the leader and win with the style and dominance Rock N Roll Doo did. It moved his likeable trainer/driver Mick Stanley to declare him "very special" and lock in a rare and exciting trip to New Zealand to chase that country's iconic Group 1 NZ Cup in Christchurch on November 8.

Rock N Roll Doo is booked on a flight to New Zealand Thursday along with defending NZ Cup winner Copy That, who finished a luckless fourth in the Victoria Cup.

Since My Lightning Blue won the 1987 NZ Cup, the only other Australian-trained winner of the race was Arden Rooney in 2015 for trailblazing female trainer-driver Kerryn Manning.

"He's going and now you can see why we've been so keen to go for a while," Rock N Roll Doo's owner Brendan James said.

"He's such a great stayer, we think it's a race that will really suit him."

The NZ Cup is a gruelling 3200m race from a standing-start in front of a packed crowd of at least 25,000 in Christchurch.

It's something Stanley cannot wait to be part of.

"It's one of the great races and race days. To think we're going to be there and be a real winning chance is so exciting," he said.

"I think this horse is quite special. We've loved him since day one, but he's been a bit goofy and raw and needed time.

"It's all coming together mentally for him now. He's won his past three, two of them in big races without the (ear) plugs being pulled and running right through the line.

"He hit the line so well the other night. He certainly wasn't all out, he had more to give and that's pretty amazing when you consider he did all the work outside the leader."

Simply, Rock N Roll Doo is the horse Stanley has been dreaming of and will likely be the horse who keeps him harness racing after years of seriously pondering a switch across to thoroughbred racing.

"I did more than think about it. I applied for a stable foreman job with a gallops trainer and didn't get it," Stanley said.

"We've got a big farm and I've got two kids to support. There were times we were down to 10 horses in work and it just wasn't sustainable."

Stanley's wife, Gen, has long held a thoroughbred training licence and together they now train a mix of thoroughbreds and standardbreds.

"The mix is about 65/35 harness to gallopers," Stanley said. "We've played around with tried (thoroughbred) horses so far, but we've bought some young ones and we've giving them a try.

"I've done all the paperwork for my (thoroughbred) licence and will get it at some stage, too."

For now, though, Team Stanley will keep riding the Rock N Roll Doo express for all its worth.

"You haven't seen the best of him. He's just starting to come into his own," Stanley said.

"It was great to win the Victoria Cup, but it's also another stepping-stone.

"We're looking at the NZ Cup the same way. Can he win it? Yes, and we'd love to. But it's also going to help make him as a horse, the trip away, the different experience.

"He's only four and we hope he's got another two or three years at the top level."

The Inter Dominion is the most famous race Down Under, but it may not be on Rock N Roll Doo's agenda this year.

"We haven't made a final decision, but it's unlikely he'll run," Stanley said. "It's less than three weeks after the NZ Cup and it's a big ask to get him to and from NZ and then give him the four runs in a fortnight which the Inter Dominion is," Stanley said.

The Inter Dominion comprises three compulsory rounds of qualifying heats into a final.

"The plan has always been to go Victoria Cup, New Zealand and then give him a break before the Hunter Cup (February 4)," Stanley said.

The other young star to make a statement on Victoria Cup night was Queensland's Leap To Fame in the Group 1 Victoria Derby.

The Grant Dixon-trained son of Bettors Delight dominated the classic and became the first pacer since Captain Joy in 2009 to win Australia's three major Derbys – Victoria, Queensland and NSW – for 3-year-olds.

Leap To Fame worked to the lead soon after the start and Dixon backed his strength, cutting him loose through some blistering

midrace sectional times to break the hearts of his rivals.

His 1:54.4 mile rate for the long 2,760m trip was just 1.2sec outside the all-aged track record set by former open-class star Tiger Tara winning the 2019 Hunter Cup.

"We love him to bits. He's the best horse we've had. We hope to take him all the way," Dixon said.

"He just ticks all the boxes ... great manners, great speed and great strength."

Leap To Fame now heads to next month's Breeders Crown at Melton.

Another highlight of Victoria Cup night was the clash of glamour 4-year-old mares and stablemates Ladies In Red and Tough Tilly.

In something of an upset, Tough Tilly did what no other horse has done and beat Ladies In Red for the third time. The career head-to-head between the pair now sits at 6-3 in Ladies In Red's favour.

Tough Tilly's races for awareness and fundraising for EB Research and her driver, Kate Gath, is heading to New York next month to run the marathon to raise funds for the cause.

"She's such a special mare to me and to be part of the whole EB thing is such a thrill," Gath said. "She had the draw tonight and I knew when I got across to the front without doing too much work that she'd be very hard to rundown.

"Ladies In Red is a champion, but this mare isn't far behind her and she's shown a few times now when things go her way, she's good enough to beat her."

#### LOCHINVAR ART HAS LANDED

Former champion Down Under pacer Lochinvar Art has arrived at his new home.

The former Victoria and Hunter Cup winner landed in Chicago on Oct. 5 and then arrived at Shane and Lauren Tritton's upstate New York stables on Sunday.

"It's so exciting to have him here now," Shane Tritton said. "He's come at a great time, nice and early. We can give him a break and bring him up our way because he doesn't have to be right at his top until late March."

Lochinvar Art was sent to Team Tritton to continue his racing career after having a minor bleed in his last race at Melton last month.

At his top, he was the best pacer Down Under.

## Jessica Hallett – writer, photographer and horsewoman

Harness racing desperately needs fresh young blood to help keep the sport alive — a dedicated, enthusiastic, and enterprising new generation to regenerate what, at one time, was the fastest-growing sport in America.

I remember the days when you needed a reservation to dine in the upscale clubhouses at Roosevelt, Brandywine and Pompano Park.

Sadly, every year another harness track closes its doors. Attendance and handle is rolling down a spiral tube due to the opening of casinos. Accusations of cheating and chicanery in the sport of silks and sulkies cast a pall over the industry.

But luckily, there is hope, for there are some young people who

have grown up in the business who refuse to step aside and watch our sport dissipate. One of them is Jessica Hallett.

Harness racing and horses have run through Hallett's blood since she was born. Her maternal grandfather, Bruce Aldrich, Sr., was involved in the business as a trainer/driver for 59 years — right up until the day he died. (The day before his death Aldrich had two winners at Monticello)

Linda Aldrich, Bruce's wife, helped her husband run their stable for 30 years as a trainer and groom, until she died in 2001.

Hallett's mother, Michelle, was also born into the sport and has been in the business for almost 52 years as a trainer, owner, and groom.

John Hallett (Jessica's dad) started going to the track at the age of six in Saint John, NB. When John was older, he began working under trainer/driver Wally Hennessey learning the trade. Currently, John trains and owns a stable of 10 horses racing at Tioga Downs.

So it is no surprise that John and Michelle's daughter, Jessica, is actively involved. Although she doesn't own any horses of her own, she said she has mentally adopted all the horses in the stable and one day would like to become a licensed owner — just another title to add to her long list.

"I help with the grooming and paddocking," Jessica said. "As a kid my job was to handle the water buckets and feed tubs, along with my brother, Jonathan (not currently involved in harness racing.) I've always helped with setting up and taking down barns between Florida and New York.

"I mostly act as the runner in the paddock; getting horses off the track after the race, strip and bathe them, wash the equipment, and cool them out in between my other jobs.

"My other jobs include white tagging and blood testing after each race for Tioga Downs, washing the bikes after the races, taking pictures, and now, drawing program sketches of horses on the track."

And if that wasn't enough, this ambitious, talented young woman recently began writing for several racing publications.

"I started writing for *Harnesslink* in 2017. I wrote several articles for them between 2017 and 2021 — topics ranging from trainers, drivers, grooms and horses, to current events like the pandemic.

"From 2018 to 2020, I worked as a USTA Youth Delegate where my biggest events involved working at the Hambletonian in public relations and media.

"At the Hambletonian in 2019, I wrote several short stories about various topics I photographed — one being a contestant in the hat contest who was a long-time race fan.

"In 2018, my story about the mass shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida was published in several locations including, *Hoof Beats*, *Harnesslink*, Standardbred Canada and Harnessracing.com.

"The story was rewarded honorable mention in the feature-writing category of the USHWA 2018 John Hervey Awards for excellence in harness racing journalism.

"My second publication in *Hoof Beats* was an article on the long-time relationship between my dad and Wally Hennessey.

"I currently work for Standardbred Canada. My job involves a mix of my own writing, editing, coding, photo editing, and publishing.

My article "From Pompano to Tioga and Back During the Pandemic" received honorable mention in the USHWA 2021 John Hervey Awards for excellence in harness racing journalism."

Her greatest memories in the sport are too many to mention, but Hallett says she has been blessed.

"People in the business come from all walks o life. They bring their stories and experiences and it's hard not to learn from each one. It's the same with the horses. I remember every horse our family had, their names, personalities and quirks.

"Each horse had their own nickname and their own individual attributes that made them who they were; such as a horse that was about to train but decided to take his shoe off and hold it in his mouth," Jessica said, laughing.

"And another one who ate corn on the cob while laying down with the cob between his front hooves – like a person

"And I've made my own wonderful memories, like becoming track photographer at Pompano Park and going to the National Standardbred Horse Show winning a national title.

"Also, writing for *Hoof Beats* and Standardbred Canada, to starting my own art business through harness racing."

Along with her busy schedule, Jessica graduated a pre-medical honors student in May 2021, double majoring in biology and behavioral neuroscience with four minors. She's not only a pretty face and an avid horsewoman, but she's one smart cookie.

With what was once her home – Pompano Park – closing its doors this year, the Hallett family will re-locate their stable to Saratoga to start a new chapter in their lives.

"The closing of Pompano Park has been devastating to all affected. It is all I've ever known in my life. It was where my parents started their own stable, and although a major chapter of our lives has closed, we are trying to be optimistic.

"Pompano Park was doomed to this fate from a ball that started rolling long ago. If track announcer Gabe Prewitt couldn't stop that ball with all he had done through promoting, social media, betting engagements and more, I don't believe anything or anyone could have stopped it."

## A simple twist of fate

If your great-grandfather did not dally in the tavern for one more pint, he would not have crossed paths with the freckled lass from the fish cannery who would become your great-grandmother. If the automobile skidded one foot to the right, the train to Sheboygan broke down, or the flood did not happen, everything would be different. Ripples from long ago alter our voyages through life.

How people grew to enjoy the relatively small but highly addictive world of trotters and pacers is interesting. The most common answers are that racing is a family tradition or someone they knew had a few horses. Another standard answer is, "I spent great nights at the track with my buddies and eventually bought a small share of a cheap claimer."

Folks with unusual entries intrigue me because I am unsure how I stumbled into this sport. Perhaps the seed was planted when I was 9 or 10 years old. My parents did not have any interest in horse racing. They were city folks through and through. But my mother's parents, who immigrated from England, enjoyed horse racing. For a few years, grandma and grandpa felt the local harness racetrack, Northfield Park, was a fine place for babysitting a pair of hyper young lads like my brother and me.

As kids, we did not understand or care about the races. We enjoyed the lively atmosphere, the open spaces, and pressing our noses against the chain link apron fence. The horses appeared massive and loud as they clopped past. Each time a horse happened to relieve itself in front of our wide eyes, we went into a frenzy and shook the fence like prisoners in a jailbreak.

I can still see my grandparents sitting in green chairs on the second deck of the grandstands. Pap, short for pappa, was a small, wiry chap with a tidy head of white hair, a short-sleeved shirt, and dark pants, always with his nose in the race program. My grandma was sitting next to him in her floral cotton dress, black leather purse on her lap with both hands folded over as if one of the men marching up the stairs to the betting windows might snatch it away.

My memories of my grandparents are fleeting. The smell of unfiltered Camel cigarettes and rosewater, visiting them in their impossibly small project home, Pap, sitting at the table and listening to a baseball game on the radio, Grandma's dark times, when she mysteriously stayed in her tiny bedroom for weeks.

If we spoke of meaningful things, and I doubt it, I do not remember

much besides, "A cuppa' tea and a bit of toast, bloody this, bloody that, and that both Teddy Roosevelt and FDR were top drawers."

After they passed, the memories grew faint.

A few years ago, the genealogy bug bit me. I began to research both sides of my family tree. The grandparents I am referring to produced eight children, a hardy lot, some living for nearly a century. Like many families, the stories are complex, sad, and shocking. Research never goes deep enough to answer why they made the decisions they did or what it would have been like to look over their shoulders or into their eyes.

One story in my research made me gasp.

My grandfather departed on the ocean liner Aquitania from Southampton, England, on September 13, 1919. The destination was Ellis Island, NY. According to the ship manifest, he was 34 years and three months old (born May 19, 1885), 5' 3" tall, with grey hair and blue eyes, and was born at Ashton-on-Mersey. He paid for his passage and the passage of his extended family, who at this time consisted of a pregnant wife, four children, and a mother-in-law. He had \$50.

My ancestors were working poor. In England, all seven family members of my grandparents' family lived in a crowded row house at the close of The First World War. My grandfather listed his work on one census form as a "factory worker" and another as a "velvet checker."

How they got to America, why they decided to immigrate, and where they found the money to pay the fare were mysteries I hoped to solve. I came close. As happens in genealogy, there were conflicting stories set down on paper from two great aunts on how the family found enough money to afford passage to America.

One account is that one daughter found a bag of money by a gas meter. Gas meters lit their houses. When the house lights began to dim, people would need to run outside to insert coins in a box to keep them going.

The other account insists that my grandfather, always an enthusiastic horse player, won a "big gob" of money one day at the horseraces.

I believe the latter, even going so far as to attempt to search for race results from England in the summer of 1919. Also, the coins in the meter collection bag would not seem sufficient to cover the cost of a slew of transatlantic tickets. But the people are gone, and the trail is faint.

Whichever story is true. The family unexpectedly found the money. One of the children, my eldest aunt, recalled the day they left home in Manchester over a century ago, "On one side of the canal was a factory and on the other side was a railroad. The people in the factory came out and lined the banks to wave goodbye. We were off to America."

A simple twist of fate, likely the nose of a racing horse straining for the finish line over a century ago, made all the difference.
