Lexington sale posts second highest gross in its history

Despite being staged during a pandemic, the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale concluded Friday with a gross of \$41,552,000, just the second time it has surpassed \$40 million in its history.

The 2020 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale concluded Friday night (Oct. 9) with the second highest gross and fourth best average in its history, despite being conducted during a pandemic. 
Kadena, a Walner filly out of Mission Brief, was the sale topper. She sold for \$725,000 to trainer Marcus Melander on opening night out of the Hunterton consignment.

Friday's session, which was made up of mostly Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky-breds, saw 168 yearlings sell for a total gross of \$4,943,000 for an average of \$29,423 and a median of \$20,000. Six yearlings reached \$100,000 or more.

"Tonight, it was just a whole different feel," said Spring

Haven's Senena Esty. "The vibe, the excitement... You know, us Ohio people, we get excited. There was a lot of people and the whoopin' and hollerin', I haven't seen that down here in ages. I thought it was fantastic."

Through five nights, 816 yearlings were sold,

grossing\$41,552,000 for an average of \$50,922. The median was \$32,000 and 107 yearlings sold for \$100,000 or more.

Only the gross in 2019 (\$46,480,000) was higher. Only the averages in 2019 (\$60,997), 2017 (\$58,537) and 2018 (\$56,652) were higher.

The 2019 sale set records for gross and average. About the only stat that was down in 2019 was the number of yearlings sold for \$100,000 or more (121 in 2019 compared to 124 in 2018)

The 2019 sale will be best remembered for its off-the-charts opening session in which not one, but two, yearlings sold for \$1 million or more. The full-brother to Greenshoe sold for \$1.1 million and the full-brother to Propulsion sold for \$1 million.

The 2020 sale will be remembered for triumphing over a number of major challenges, the biggest one being a global pandemic.

"I'm thrilled," said Randy Manges, who manages the sale with David Reid. "We averaged \$56,000 last year and \$50,000 this year. We could've averaged \$50,000 without COVID-19, so I'm very pleased with the sale and really pleased with tonight.

"The crowd was good, too. To me, that was so good to see. You walked out there and there was a buzz, especially after one would bring \$100,000. We had the Steve Elliotts, the Brian Browns, of course, they buy a lot of the higher ones, too, but those guys being here, staying after five days of sales and being here for the last session, that's very good."


Reid said, "The energy here in the building was as good, if not better, than it was all week. We saw a lot of new faces come into town... and from Randy and my point of view to structure a session like tonight just adds appreciation for the marketplace because they delivered.


"It was just a really good night to end the week on and put the 2020 yearling sale in the books.

"To pull this off, in light of everything, I know we talked about the pandemic, but we really didn't talk about the stakes being cancelled, the purses for certain Sires Stakes programs being diminished and the racetracks being closed for a period of time... the gross dollars for purses were down significantly. That was my biggest concern coming in, personally, and how would that affect the overall marketplace. Now we've concluded the five nights, we've sold more horses this year and the gross is \$41.5 million, which would be the second-highest grossing sale ever done here for us. That's really satisfying."

Esty said, "everyone was on pins and needles" coming into







the sale, "At least we were, just not knowing the protocol, if people were going to come, or if they were scared... just the whole thing with what's going on in the world, so we just felt very blessed that there was a sale, number one, and just very thankful that we were able to come here and sell our horses. We had a very good sale the first couple of nights and then not so much, here and there the next couple nights... it was kind of pick and choose. It was a bit of a roller coaster ride,

to be honest, but we made up for it tonight and we're very happy.

"I think it just goes to prove that Ohio, we're finally stepping into the limelight. We're showing that we have a good, solid program. We have so many different avenues that we can race — Sires Stakes, Stallion Series, county fair races, which is the heart of it all."

The four highest-priced yearlings sold on Friday were all

sired by Ohio's Downbytheseaside.

"We've been doing this regional program on the last day for about five years and it's always worked out well for us," Manges said. "We sold one for \$300,000 a couple years ago and one for \$200,000 tonight. We sold several for over \$100,000 and always, over the last three years I think, the highest priced on the last night was either an Ohio or Indiana-bred."

The session topper was Hip #836 Sea Lionness, a Downbytheseaside filly out of Lionness Hanover purchased by Greg Luther of Ohio and consigned by Spring Haven Farm, agent. Luther also purchased Hip #721 Noa Blu, a Downbytheseaside filly out of Catharsis, that was sold by Crawford Farms.

"She's a gorgeous filly," Luther said of Sea Lionnees. "She stands well, she's perfect conformation. Spring Haven raised her, which is one of the most respectable farms in Ohio. Gorgeous filly, she really stood out. I had my vet look at her and he looked at nine horses for me and he said 'she's the standout.'

Esty said, "We didn't expect \$200,000, but we definitely knew she was our consignment sale-topper, without a doubt. She was a beautiful, beautiful filly. Hickory Lane Farm in Findley raised her and they did a superb job."

Luther said Noa Blu's video was amazing.


"She had a really good video, looked strong. I felt that she definitely had the pedigree she needs. I thought she'd go for \$50,000 or \$60,000, but I was going to buy her no matter what she sold for."

At the Lexington sale, Luther spent \$583,000 to buy seven yearlings.

"I'm actually doing what we call 'the million-dollar experiment,' so I'm investing a million dollars in horse, in yearlings, this year. I've been in the business for 30 years and my dream has always been to win the Little Brown Jug or Jugette, one or the other," Luther said. "My brother trains for me, Todd Luther, and we're right there in Ohio and Delaware has always been the home track.

"We've bought four or five horses for six figures this year, trying to win that big race. That's on my bucket list."

The other Downbytheseasides that were in the top four were: Hip #794 Bythemissal, a Downbytheseaside colt out of Dismissal, was purchased by Josh Green, agent for Eric Good of Delaware out of the Preferred Equine consignment for \$135,000 and Hip #730 Coastal Front, a Downbytheseaside colt out of She's Poison, was sold for \$115,000 to Don Robinson, agent, out of Winbak Farm's consignment.

"I'm really excited about Downbytheseaside," Luther said.
"I'm putting a lot of faith in Downbytheseaside this year, but those horses look amazing. I'm really excited to invest back in the business and try to get into a position where we can play with the big guys."

This is the first year the sale offered online bidding through Proxibid andbids made through the online portal accounted for \$2.5 million in sales for 79 sold.

"I think it was a savior for this sale, this year," Manges said. "We used it in Ohio as well – we arranged for that before we knew about COVID-19... I don't know how the thoroughbred people feel about it, but I think it was a savior for us."

Reid's Preferred Equine led all consignors with \$8,153,000 in sales for 144 yearlings sold. In 2019, Preferred set a personal record for gross sales with \$9,731,000 for 137 yearlings sold.

This year, Preferred was followed by Hunterton (\$6,094,000 for 108 yearlings), Kentuckiana (\$5,999,000 for 96 yearlings) and Winbak Farm (\$2,589,000 for 93 yearlings).

Concord Stud led all consignors in average with \$124,357 for 14 sold. Blue Chip Farms was second in average (\$73,000 for 12 yearlings sold), followed by Brittany Farms LLC (\$72,611 for 18 sold).

Andy Miller was the top buyer with \$2,293,000 spent, in total, on 19 yearlings. Nancy Takter was second with \$1,628,000 spent on 14 yearlings, followed by Ake Svanstedt (\$1,482,000 on 12 yearlings) and Burke Racing Stable (\$1,163,000 on 15 yearlings).

Muscle Hill led all stallions in gross sales (\$6,493,000) and average (\$132,510) with three or more sold. First-crop sire Walner was second in gross (\$4,852,000). The leading pacer by money and average was Captaintreacherous (\$2,853,000 and \$98,379).

"We've got to thank the buyers, got to thank the breeders, the men and women that travelled here and bid on horses...we just can't thank them enough and wish them nothing but the best. Hopefully, they get a champion that can be on the cover of the catalogue one day," Reid said.



LEXINGTON Selected Yearling Sale

Proxibid online bidding proves successful and is here to stay at Lexington sale

The 2020 edition of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale turned out to be unprecedented, and not because of record prices. Never before had buyers avoided the Bluegrass State in early October. Instead, the pandemic forced many to stay home, and the sale company responded by utilizing technology to break down barriers and enable bidders. Unsure of how buyers would embrace the Proxibid platform, the returns confirmed it was a worthwhile venture.

Sale co-manager David Reid explained that he first looked into the technology in early January, long before COVID-19 appeared in the United States. He was investigating online bidding to use in the future. The research turned out to be a blessing in disguise.

"As far as embracing change, we were looking at it beforehand, but the pandemic accelerated it," Reid said. "Luckily, we had that dialogue, and I was able to see online providers for other sales like Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland. Luckily for us, we had the right provider."

Prior to selecting Proxibid as vendor, there was apprehension, but Reid said the quality of the technology put those concerns to rest. Through the first four sessions, more than 100 bidders representing the United States, Canada, Sweden, Norway, Italy and Germany have been approved using the same stringent standards used by those on-site that wish to purchase a horse. The statistics over the course of the first four nights reinforce the value of the technology. A group of 17 bidders were active on 21 different horses on opening night, with four purchased and eight listed as runners-up. The next night 49 horses received at least one online bid from a pool of 25 active bidders, and 17 underbidders came from the Proxibid platform. On nights three and four, 32 active participants placed bids on 59 and 54 different yearlings respectively, with 38 sold virtually and 24 others falling a bid short. On the fifth and final night, 23 yearlings were sold online for \$609,000 in total.

For the entire sale, online bids accounted for \$2.5 million


in sales for 79 sold.

"I'm a big believer in the pace of a sale. It didn't slow down the pace of the sale at all. The response time of the software was extraordinary," said Reid. "As a sales manager, you want your customers in the house. From a sales company point of view, it couldn't have gone any better. The attention agent excellent. He was really an extension of the action crew."

Doug Paul, a long-time Lexington participant, used the Proxibid platform this year instead of traveling to Kentucky. He purchased five yearlings totaling \$249,000.

"I've probably been to Lexington for 30 straight years and it's the first we've missed," he said. "We had Abe Stoltzfus and Larry Rathbone look at our horses anyhow, so they were down there looking at the horses. I normally look at them with them, but I was not able to do that. They went and looked and told us what they liked and we bid accordingly. Without that, without the online bidding, I definitely wouldn't have spent as much."

Paul said that one disadvantage to bidding online is that if you are working with partners, you have to do your homework ahead of the sessions instead of making quick decisions while a yearling is in the ring, or as you get a feel for how horses are selling during the session.

"If you're bidding online, you have to discuss all that before the sale. You might go a little bit higher. That lack of interaction sort of hurt the prices somewhat," he said. "Considering the circumstances, I think the sale company should be happy, the buyers should be happy. I think it worked out great."

Dana Parham was another owner that participated in the Lexington sale virtually. He purchased five babies from his home for \$423,000, including the session topper on day two. In his opinion, the platform worked great, but it was no replacement for participating in person. He compared the experience to the differences in playing poker live and online.

"When you're playing online poker, you can't see what the other players are doing, whether they hesitate, what kind of cadence there is, mannerisms. When I'm live at the sale, I've got the attention of the auctioneer, and any horse I'm bidding on, he's not going to bring that hammer down until I shake it off because I'm one of the guys there that can move a horse many thousands higher. Online they don't know who in the hell I am," Parham said. "Many times I can't see who I'm bidding against. Like in live poker, I know who I'm in the hand with as opposed to online I'm against Larry67824. Online, once a horse got past my number, I just go on with it. Live, I may have given it another bid knowing I'm one bid away. If anything, I didn't bid as much as I might have live."

Parham said that while Proxibid technology allowed him to participate this week, the missing human element of attending live and being near the ring was lost.

"That's not the software's fault or the technology's fault. I like to play the game and this takes a lot of options away. I can't speed up the bidding, I can't slow it down. I can't jump to the number I want. All kinds of things I like to do live," he said.

Reid said that online bidding at the Lexington Selected sale is here to stay, and that he is already thinking of ways to improve for next year.

"I would say it's definitely part of the future. I don't want it to replace what we have because what we have is a great venue, a first-class facility and first-class horses, and two weeks of great racing. Just for that alone we want everybody to be able to participate," he said. "The Internet does bring the world together and makes it a small place. It brings the world to us. After tonight's session we'll be able to look at the numbers and see where we're at, but it's definitely been a contributing factor to our success, there's no doubt about that."



You have to hand it to him, The Guru knows his yearlings. Consider that on the final night of the Lexington sale four of his Top 5 picks actually landed in the Top 10 and the fifth ended up at #11. That the other five finished up the track doesn't matter. This was a tough assignment and The Guru nailed it.

When he filed his final picks, The Guru's only comment was, "This idea was very challenging to say the least. Although some of my selections were way off the money mark I am reassured in my findings due to the fact that the best trainers took them home. So let's let time and performance be the final judge and we will return to the list this time next year to see how I truly did."

Reminder, we received The Guru's predictions for the Top 10 horses to be sold, by price, during the second session BEFORE they actually went into the ring — and kept the emails to prove it in case anyone asks.

2. Hip #731 CLARIDGE HALL— Out of a sister to the phenomenal CR Kay Susie this great looking Cash Hall colt is quick on his feet and is dual Eligibility in Kentucky and Ohio which makes him a fine prospect.

Actual Rank: 11th at \$75,000

3. Hip #728 PORT PENELOPE -This is a very big, very fast great looking Swan For All filly. From a good filly Grand Circuit family that includes major stakes winners NY Starlet, and My Starlet.

Actual Rank: 7th at \$87,000

4. Hip #858 SWANNA BEE— Only the second foal of the dam this lass comes from another of my favorite filly families. She has the looks and talent to be a good one. Her immediate family includes Breeders Crown winner Musical Victory and American National winner Musical Mystery.

Actual Rank: 8th at \$87,000

5. Hip #710 PEBBLE BEACH— The first foal of a sister to the great Vintage Master winner of \$2,100,000. I rarely watch pacing videos but the pedigree caught my eye and he can fly in the paddock, and gets high marks on the floor as well.

Actual Rank: 9th at \$85,000

7. Hip #685 KING KACTUS –This colt is a brother to the late year sensation Beads winner of \$250,000 in just a few starts this year and recording a 1:51.2 mile in the process. He is from the immediate family of Almost an Angel a nearly \$1,000,000 winner.

8. Hip #718 ANGIE'S VALENTINE— This filly does not fit the category of perfect conformation. There are some minor issues. However, she can trot like hell in the paddock and she is a sister to Hayek, an almost \$200,000 winner that has Ontario Gold in his resume.

Gural: We need to sit down with the thoroughbreds over HISA

I don't think there is any question that the thoroughbreds have taken control of the HISA (Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act) legislation. However, in my opinion the decision by the USTA not to participate with them and instead oppose the legislation is why we are in this unfortunate position. Having said that, I am 100 per cent certain that we could get the changes we require if we agree to sit down at the table after the legislation passes. There are few things that I know for certain that are not debatable:

- 1. No one thinks the current system works.
- 2. Over the next year we are likely to see more standardbred trainers and veterinarians plead guilty to the crimes they are charged with and in return for lighter sentences provide valuable information to the feds so we can expect more arrests.
- 3. It is inconceivable that the state racing commissions are going to want to have two separate methods of regulating horse racing. The thoroughbreds regulated by the Feds and harness regulated by the state. That will never happen and over time all of the states will opt in with or without our input.
- 4. The cost to oppose this legislation on constitutional grounds is in the millions of dollars and is something we simply cannot afford. Even the \$425,000 we have already budgeted is a waste of money.
- 5. The optics for our industry of opposing the legislation while participants are pleading guilty and others are being arrested could not be worse. We have all seen in the past when the Olympics had a problem they solved it, when baseball had a problem they solved it and when bicycle racing had a problem they solved it. The thoroughbreds also seem to want to solve it. To be honest, I hate to say this but maybe the truth is as an industry we don't want to solve it and maybe that is why we have chosen the course we are on.


At this point, we should see if the legislation is going to pass in the senate and if it does we should come up with a plan to sit down with the thoroughbreds and USADA and solve the problems that (USTA president) Russell (Williams) has raised. It is not rocket science; it is all solvable and we do have a problem.

USTA director David Siegel: A standardbred supporter's practical view of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act of 2020

There has been much publicity about the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act of 2020 (HISA). As a United States Trotting Association (USTA) director and active participant in the racing side of the business as an owner and a driver, and also as an executive in a business that touches upon both Standardbred and Thoroughbred racing, I have paid close attention to the long-term efforts by both breed organizations to get uniform rules and uniform enforcement along with the creation of disincentives for participants to cheat.

In sum, all of these efforts have failed. Focusing on harness racing, my true passion, anyone who does not believe that the industry is experiencing rampant cheating is living in a



dream world. Cheating occurs at a variety of levels, but I will focus on cheating that involves medication, which affects all facets of the business.

HISA has been passed by the House of Representatives in a unanimous (voice) vote, and it is extremely likely it will have a similar outcome in the Senate. No matter where we as harness racing supporters stand on the legislation, it is time to accept it, look at its potential benefits, and work hard to get as much representation as possible and as loud a voice as possible for our standardbreds. Recent letters by Russell Williams and Joe Faraldo, the USTA's president and chairman, respectively, were not very cordial with regard to their thoroughbred counterparts. They threw some pretty sharp daggers, perhaps some deserved, but for sure not all. With regard to comments about coming to the table, I know first-hand that at least on one occasion, it was the USTA that put forth ultimatums in order to even sit down.

Nevertheless, all of that is water under the bridge at this point, as are the monies spent by the USTA to fight the bill. In business, we call these sunk costs and fretting whether or not it made sense to spend the money will bear no fruit. What makes sense is to look at life under the legislation and to extend an olive branch to its supporters and try to reap the benefits of the bill, even though it might fall short of a utopian situation for harness racing.

I personally know a number of the key figures involved. I have nothing but respect for the skills and intellect of Joe Faraldo and Russell Williams. I also know that Jim Gagliano (president and chief operating officer of The Jockey Club) is a very reasonable man. And while I don't personally know Meadowlands racetrack owner Jeff Gural, I do believe that he is genuinely interested in bringing better integrity to our game. I also know with 100 per cent certainty that all four of

these men have this in common – so things start with much common ground. And while the USTA clearly lost the "war" over the legislation, I do not believe that the supporters have any inclination to stick it to the USTA. In fact, I believe quite the contrary; they would support different rules for breeds that have profound differences in how they race. But to get to that point, the USTA must make the proper overtures to work together now within the confines of the legislation.

Medication (and other abuse-related) reform is badly needed in our game. Cheating abounds in harness racing, a great deal of that falling within the spectrum of medication abuse. Most state racing commissions have done a terrible job in weeding out cheaters and horse abusers. I base that on what I have seen with my own eyes and countless written accounts of cheaters being allowed to continue to participate. And the failure is not just at the level of the commissions, but also at the track level, where known paper trainers or "beards" abound and other violations take place, where asserting private property rights, even with due process, could be exercised to exorcise the problems. But most tracks choose to look the other way. This goes on at nearly every harness track in the country.

Therefore, I urge Russell Williams and Joe Faraldo to reconsider their position and lead the membership in a pivoted direction given likely enactment of this legislation. There is still time to sit down with the key supporters of the bill, before or after its passage and influence its direction with regard to standardbred racing. I further ask that they put aside any personal issues with others that may be on the opposite side of this debate and view this with the great practicality and professionalism that I know both are capable of, no matter how they might perceive various supporters to behave – in other words, take the highest road. I encourage them to rethink the cost-benefit of any further spending in opposition to the bill before or after its inevitable passage and embrace the possible positive outcomes the bill could mean for harness racing. Furthermore, I encourage them to do their best to exert whatever influence they might have so that our standardbreds can get the most favorable treatment possible if our breed ever becomes subject to this legislation.

Green Manalishi to stand at Tara Hills in 2021

Courant and David Heffering have come to an agreement to stand Green Manalishi (Muscle Hill) as a stallion at Heffering's Tara Hills Stud beginning in the 2021 season for a living foal fee of \$7,500 CAD.

Green Manalishi was the first horse since Father Patrick to win the Wellwood Memorial and Canadian Trotting Classic in consecutive seasons.

"Green Manalishi is a spectacular looking individual, with pedigree and racing lines to match his abilities," Heffering said. "We feel Green Manalishi will make a great addition to our already stellar line of stallions at Tara Hills.

"When Sabine Kagebrant reached out to me to arrange a visit to the farm on behalf of Courant, I was excited about the prospect to acquire a stallion from such a successful racing stable. Agent Robert Lindstrom eventually suggested



that Green Manalishi could be a great addition for the Tara Hills stallion roster. I couldn't agree more, and I would like to thank Courant for putting their support behind Tara Hills as well as the Ontario racing and Stakes program, which I believe is the best in North America.

Trained by 2019 Trainer of the Year Marcus Melander, Green Manalishi won 11 races in 23 starts in North America, amassed \$1,157,395, and took a mark of 1:50.3, winning an elimination for the \$1 million Hambletonian.

Green Manalishi exhibited top level talent early, winning two of his first three baby races at The Meadowlands in 1:57 and 1:56.3, then won his first two career starts before

finishing second in his elimination and final of the \$422,350 Peter Haughton Memorial.

The trotter's freshman season highlights also included dominant victories in his elimination and \$308,000 final of the William Wellwood Memorial at Woodbine Mohawk Park with miles of 1:54.4 and 1:53.4. He followed up with another easy win in a division of the \$85,000 Bluegrass at The Red Mile in 1:56.1. In addition, Green Manalishi finished second in a division of the International Stallion Stake, plus his elimination and \$600,000 final of the Breeders Crown. In 2018, Green Manalishi had five wins and five seconds in 10 starts, with earnings of \$510,557, third on the money list in his division.


Green Manalishi continued to blossom as a 3-year-old, winning his first start out of the box in an elimination for the Earl Beal, Jr. Memorial at Pocono Downs in 1:52.1 before finishing third in the \$500,000 final. Next, at The Meadowlands, he was second in a \$153,000 division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial, then romped in a \$50,400 division of the Tompkins Geers in 1:52.4.

He took his mark of 1:50.3 pulling a 9-1 upset from post eight in a \$70,000 elimination for the \$1 million Hambletonian and finished fifth in the final. Following a second in the \$330,000 Dr. Harry M. Zweig Memorial at Vernon Downs, Green Manalishi won a \$130,877 division of the Simcoe in 1:53 at Woodbine Mohawk Park, before going wire-to-wire in the \$453,750 Canadian Trotting Classic.

Green Manalishi is by the incomparable Muscle Hill, 2009 Horse of the Year, and the sport's #1 trotting sire in 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020. From seven crops of racing age, Muscle Hill is the sire of 10 millionaires, led by Triple Crown Champion Marion Marauder. Muscle Hill sired his third Hambletonian winner in 2020, the filly Ramona Hill, and his fifth consecutive Hambletonian Oaks winner, Sorella.

The trotter is out of the Enjoy Lavec mare Naga Morich S. His second dam, Dame Lavec, produced Raja Mirchi, a Group 1 race winner who enjoyed success in Europe and is an Elite Stallion in Sweden, which contributed to Courant owner Anders Strö m's interest in Green Manalishi, who was a 3,000,000 SEK (\$450,000 CAD, \$340,000 USD) yearling on the Kolgjini Sale 2018.

Southwind Tyrion strides to world record

Ake Svanstedt trainee **Southwind Tyrion** strolled to the front from the pylon post and sped to a 1:51.1 victory, beating Walner's record of 1:51.4 in the first of three divisions for the \$258,800 Six Pack International Stallion Stake Two-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Trot — sponsored by the Six Pack Syndicate and Deo Volente Farms — on Friday (Oct. 9) at The Red Mile.

Svanstedt sent the Muscle Hill colt to the top while In Range secured the pocket and 4-5 favorite Venerate floated off the car into third. By the quarter in :27.4, Southwind Tyrion continued unchallenged to a :55.1 but faced pressure into the far turn as Venerate marched first over from third. But Venerate broke stride by three-quarters in 1:23.2, leaving Southwind Tyrion to his own devices through the stretch. In Range kept in contention but gave pursuit from second with Cricket Fashion finishing third.

"My plan was to sit behind Venerate," said Svanstedt after the race, "but I pushed [Southwind Tyrion] a little when



Tetrick [driving In Range] was coming and then he was a little grabby, so he was too fast for Venerate to come. He felt good the whole mile."

Owned by S R F Stable, Knutsson Trotting, Brittany Farms & Riverview Racing, Southwind Tyrion won his fifth race from seven starts, earning \$280,797. Southwind Farms LLC bred the \$4.40 winner.

Jean Pierre Dubois' grandson Louis Badron landed the drive on local startup **Cuatro De Julio** and kept all challengers at bay, taking the second division of the Six Pack in 1:51.3.

Badron blasted Cuatro De Julio for the lead from post 5 and took the field by the quarter in :27.4 with Johan Palema sitting second and Delayed Hanover third. The field continued single file by a :55 half but began to tighten into the final turn as Cuatro De Julio trotted to three-quarters in 1:23.4.

Harness Racing Update

Delayed Hanover ranged first over towards the tempo setter heading for the stretch drive and dug into the Trixton colt's lead while drifting through the stretch. Cuatro De Julio responded to the challenge and held strong on the lead to the finish, nabbing his ninth win from 13 starts. Delayed Hanover settled for second with Jack Fire closing for third and Swingforthefences finishing fourth.

"I got off a plane to drive this horse today," Badron said after the race. "[Marie Otolan Bar] just told me to 'do your best' and she did great work with the horse. He's so fast... he's so fast."

Bred by Dream With Me Stable and owned by D Farm LLC, Cuatro De Julio has accrued \$129,275 in earnings. Marie Ortolan Bar trains the \$6.20 winner.

With three horses going on a gallop early in the mile, **Zenith Stride** inherited a pocket trip and popped to a 1:53.2 victory in the final division of the Six Pack.

Unwritten Chapter broke at the start as Locatelli left for the lead along with Moonstone S to the pylons, but Fly Light landed in the pocket after Moonstone S went on a gallop circling the first turn. Locatelli led to the quarter in :27.3 and broke loose on the lead before breaking stride moving up the backstretch. Fly Light overtook control to a :55.3 half with Zenith Stride positioned second.

By three-quarters in 1:25, Fly Light held a diminishing lead into the stretch. Zenith Stride angled from the pocket and took aim at the leader, going by into the eighth pole chased by Sevenshadesofgrey splitting horses late but managing only to give chase for second. Magical Muscle Man took third while Fly Light faltered to fourth.

"I think [he's just had] practice," said trainer Mark Harder, talking about the colt's improvement through the season. "Even training down as a young horse in the winter he'd do goofy things. On his day he'd do things great and trot nice—he'd always trot nice. We did some bloodwork [after last week] and we did find something that we could do to help him health wise. I don't know if he was 100 percent today, but he was better."

Collecting his second win from eight starts, Zenith Stride has banked \$204,825 for owners Emilio & Maria Rosati. Brian Sears drove the Fair Winds Farm Inc.-bred Muscle Hill colt who paid \$12.40 to win.

Grand Circuit action resumes at Red Mile today (Oct. 10) with seven divisions of International Stallion Stakes — three for the \$299,100 Betting Line Two-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace and four for the \$304,000 International Moni Two-Year-Old Filly Trot. Racing gets underway at 1 p.m. (EDT).





Test Of Faith follows through in International Stallion Stake

New York star **Test Of Faith** rolled to her seventh-straight victory when winning the opening division of the \$262,000 Arlene Siegel Memorial International Stallion Stake Two-Year-Old Filly Pace, sponsored by Jules Siegel and Fashion Farms.

Sent off as the 1-5 favorite, driver David Miller moved Test Of Faith for the front from post 7, clearing command from Marsala Hanover past a :27.2 opening quarter. The Art Major filly maintained her speed up the backstretch, clipping the half in :54.1 as Lady Midnight committed first over moving to the final turn. Caviart Audrey tracked cover to three-quarters in 1:22.2 and fanned three wide into the stretch, but Test Of Faith already got a jump. Spinning for the finish, Miller kept Test Of Faith straight and sped to a 1:48.4 victory chased by Notorious Pink, who shook loose from a shuffled trip to take



second. Marsala Hanover snagged third while Caviart Audrey settled for fourth.

"She's always been perfect — if you had 20 horses like her you wouldn't have much of a job to do," Pelling said after the race. "She's surprised me. We've always really liked her, but that's going to another level, what she's done the last three weeks. Jimmy Marohn [Jr.] did a great job with her and he always came back and said 'Man, I can't wait to pop those plugs and ask her to step."

Just a tick off the world record, Test Of Faith now has eight victories from nine starts and \$500,000 earned for owners Melvin Segal, Kentuckiana Racing Stable and Eddie Gran. The

With a breather to three-quarters in 1:24, Fire Start Hanover straightened for a sprint to the finish. The Richard "Nifty" Norman-trained daughter of Somebeachsomewhere held firm to the finish of a 1:50.3 mile with Blue Diamond Eyes shaking loose and splitting horses late to take second. JK

Alwaysbalady rallied for third with Thebeachiscalling finishing fourth.

"I was very nervous [watching her race], but we really have fun coming down here," co-owner David Hoese said after the race. "This [filly is the best I've owned] by far."

Winning six races from nine starts, Fire Start Hanover has earned \$211,336 for owners Pinske Stables, David Hoese and Lawrence Means. She paid \$3.60 to win.

Kentucky Futurity, Kentucky Filly Futurity both draw 12

The Red Mile's marquee events have drawn 12-horse single dashes for the Grand Circuit's curtain call Sunday (Oct. 11).

A dozen colts spar in the 128thKentucky Futurity, sponsored by Hunterton Farms, Stoner Manor Inc. and Menhammer Stuteri Ab and carrying a purse of \$444,000. Hambletonian runner-up Ready For Moni lands in the second-tier for driver Yannick Gingras following a defeat in the \$425,600 Canadian Trotting Classic Final. Post 11 positions the Nancy Takter-trained Ready Cash colt behind Amigo Volo, the Richard "Nifty" Norman-trained Father Patrick gelding who made his Grand Circuit "coming out" last season at Lexington but enters off a loss to Back Of The Neck in the Bluegrass. Back Of The Neck, third in the Hambletonian, starts from post 4 with Scott Zeron in the bike. The Futurity goes as Race 9 on the card.

Ramona Hill will try to rebound in the event preceding — the 55thKentucky Filly Futurity, presented by the Father Patrick Syndicate and Diamond Creek Farm, carrying a purse of \$255,000. The Hambletonian winner suffered her second defeat of the season when Ab'sattitudexpress, who starts from post 12 Sunday, nailed the Tony Alagna trainee at the finish. Alagna later confirmed the Muscle Hill filly scoped sick after the race and will look to protect her spot atop the division from post 3 with Andrew McCarthy in the bike.

Hambletonian Oaks winner Sorella starts alongside Ramona Hill from post 4 for trainer Nancy Takter and driver Yannick Gingras with Sister Sledge, the other filly who took aim in the Hambletonian, starting from post 5 for trainer Ron Burke and driver Matt Kakaley. Hypnotic AM — the Marcus Melander-trained Chapter Seven filly who lost as the favorite in the Oaks, will have to overcome post 10 with Brian Sears in the bike.

Tall Dark Stranger leads a nine-horse charge into the first division of the \$479,000 Crawford Farms Tattersalls Pace, sponsored by Michelle and Albert Crawford. The Bettor's Delight colt, trained by Nancy Takter and with over \$1 million banked this season, scored a 1:48.3 victory last week in the Bluegrass. Yannick Gingras will pilot the divisional leader against Warrawee Vital, off a 1:47.1 victory in the Bluegrass, and Cattlewash, off a 1:46.4 victory in the Bluegrass.

On the Futurity undercard, Party Girl Hill — following 12-straight wins from 12 starts — tries her hands at open company in the second division of the Crawford Farms Tattersalls Pace. The Chris Ryder-trained Captaintreacherous filly enters off a 1:48 plugs-in performance in the Bluegrass last week. She meets No Lou Zing, the Nancy Takter-trained Sweet Lou gelding entering off a victory in the \$100,000 Jenna's Beach Boy, and Capt Midnight, the Tony Alagna-trained Captaintreacherous colt who finished second in a 1:47.1 mile in the Bluegrass.

Without Party Girl Hill, 14 fillies compete in two divisions of the \$250,000 Glen Garnsey Memorial, sponsored by the Sweet Lou Syndicate and Diamond Creek Farms. Division one gathers Lyons Sentinel, the Jim King Jr.-trained Captaintreacherous filly who flew to a second-place finish behind Party Girl Hill last week, and JK First Lady, the Nancy Takter-trained Western Ideal filly off a 1:49.2 score in the Bluegrass, among five others. Kentucky Sires Stakes champ Baby Your The Best also starts in the first division along with last year's Breeders Crown winner Reflect With Me.

Harness Racing Update

Peaky Sneaky powers into the second split of the Glen Garnsey Memorial off a 1:49.1 stroll in the Bluegrass. The Nancy Takter-trained Bettor's Delight filly starts from post 6 with Yannick Gingras in the bike against two fillies who finished behind JK First Lady last week — Rocknificent, starting from post 2 for trainer Linda Toscano and driver Scott Zeron, and New Year, starting from post 3 for trainer Chris Ryder and driver Dexter Dunn.

A full field congregates for the \$150,000 Odds On Racing Allerage Open Pace, sponsored by Dana Parham and Best Bet Stables. Bettor's Wish ships into Lexington off 1:49 victory in the \$176,500 and scores from post 7 for trainer Chris Ryder and driver Dexter Dunn. Trainer Ron Burke sends his free-for-all barrage, composing nearly half of the field. Backstreet Shadow starts from post 6 off a traffic trip in the Dayton Pacing Derby while Canadian Pacing Derby winner Dorsoduro Hanover starts from post 8. This Is The Plan, winner of the Hoosier Park Pacing Derby and entering off a fourth-place effort at Dayton, starts from post 9 with Filibuster Hanover securing the inside-most spot from post 1.

Atlanta continues to roll in open company heading into the \$148,500 Allerage Farms Open Trot, sponsored by Jeff and Paula

Gural and Allerage Farms. The five-year-old Chapter Seven mare, with over \$2.4 million earned, enters off a 1:51 blowout in the Dayton Trotting Derby and draws post 3 for trainer Ron Burke and driver Yannick Gingras. She matches up against Gimpanzee, who downed the world champion mare in the \$150,000 Caesars Trotting Classic at Hoosier Park two weeks ago. Brian Sears drives that Marcus Melander-trained four-year-old by Chapter Seven from post 5.

Grand Circuit action wraps with the \$72,000 Harness Racing Update Allerage Fillies and Mares Open Pace. Kissin In The Sand strides into the event as the 3-2 morning-line choice off three-consecutive wins including victories in the \$161,250 Milton Stakes and in the \$175,000 Dayton Distaff Derby. Dexter Dunn drives the Nancy Takter-trained five-year-old by Somebeachsomewhere from post 5 against Caviart Ally, the Brett Pelling-trained six-year-old mare by Bettor's Delight who has finished third in her last three starts as she regains her groove. Andrew McCarthy will have the drive from post 6.

Kentucky Futurity Day at The Red Mile features a total 12 races on the afternoon. The card is slated to get underway with first-race post at 1 p.m. (EDT).

Daley, Gregory seek ISS triumphs with Anoka Hanover and You Ato Dream

Trainers Noel Daley and Jeff Gregory each co-own a horse competing today (Oct. 10) at Red Mile, where Daley's Anoka Hanover is the favorite in the third of four International Stallion Stakes divisions for 2-year-old female trotters and Gregory's You Ato Dream is the choice in the fourth. The two combined have finished worse than second only four times in 17 starts.

Anoka Hanover heads to her race today off a half-length win over May Karp in 1:54 in a division of last week's Bluegrass Stakes. The daughter of Donato Hanover-Aunt Mel has won five of nine races and \$177,216 this season for owners Daley, L.A. Express Stable, and Caviart Farms. She is 7-5 on the morning line and will have Todd McCarthy in the



sulky.

"They have their days, all of them, but she's got a good head on her for a trotting filly," Daley said. "From day one, she was always sort of a powerful filly, and nice enough gaited. I have half a dozen trotting fillies and the others were sort of better gaited than her, but she's got a very good attitude about everything. That's probably her biggest attribute, she's smart. She's just a nice filly."

Daley purchased Anoka Hanover for \$35,000 at last year's Standardbred Horse Sale. Anoka Hanover was the fifth foal out of stakes winner Aunt Mel. Her previous four all made money at the races, but Anoka Hanover is the first to exceed

\$45,000. Daley bought the filly on the recommendation of long-time collaborator Martti Ala-Seppala.

"He's done it a bunch of times for me, picked out well-bred ones where the mares, for whatever reason, haven't hit yet and I can usually get them at a bit of value," Daley said. "That's what he did there. This was the right one. He's a big help."

Anoka Hanover is not eligible to the Breeders Crown, but still has the Kindergarten Classic Series and Goldsmith Maid on her schedule. She has won back-to-back starts, both from sixth place at three-quarters, following a third-place finish behind Flawless Country and You Ato Dream in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship.

"I was pleased with her," Daley said. "I think that sort of suits her. She's reasonably versatile but I think chasing them down is probably her game.

"She can be a little aggressive, a little on the muscle in her races. I knew she would be better here (at Red Mile). She can get on a line on the smaller tracks and here it's a nice big wide track. It's a bit kinder track on the feet and she is able to get much better traction here."

You Ato Dream enters her start today off a second-place finish to Presto in 1:53 in their Bluegrass division. The margin of defeat was a head, the third time this year she was beaten by a neck or less.

"She's had a lot of tough beats, it's been almost cruel," Gregory said, managing a laugh. "She's not good in the photos."

For the season, You Ato Dream has one win and six seconds in eight starts. She has earned \$197,856. She is 2-1 on the morning line for the International Stallion, with Gregory driving.

Gregory bought the daughter of Donato Hanover-Dream Child under the name Carolina Bi for \$45,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Sale.

"She's been a nice horse for us," Gregory said. "The first couple days on the track she was a little moody. She was a little tough. But after that, she was really nice and trained down very easy. She gave you the feeling like you always had 15 seconds in the bank, it was not a lot of work for her.

"She's really good gaited. For a decent sized filly, she doesn't hit the track hard. She's very light on her feet, really athletic."

Last week, You Ato Dream took the lead prior to a :54.4 half, with :27.1 second quarter.

"I haven't left with her very much," Gregory said. "As you could see last week, once I get her rolling, she's a little hard to settle down. I couldn't get her to back off the second quarter at all. I'm sure it probably cost me the race. The first few starts, I never left with her because I didn't want to take a chance getting her hot.

"I just kind of have to do what she wanted to do without fighting her too much. You plan out a race in your head and sometimes you can't do it that way because her manners might not be a hundred percent perfect. She's not a push-button horse. But she doesn't quit. She's had a couple of rough trips, she's been first over a couple times, she's been on the front a couple times, but she doesn't give up."

Gregory owns You Ato Dream with Bill Richardson, George Romanoff, and Martin Garey. She is eligible to the Breeders Crown, Matron Stakes, and Goldsmith Maid.

"We're just going week by week," Gregory said. "If she's fresh and she's racing good and she's competitive, we're probably going to keep trying. If she shows any signs of getting tired, or the year is getting too long, we're going to pull the plug and get her ready for her 3-year-old season. I'm just going to let her tell us when it's time to quit.

"It's pretty fun. It's the same group of guys I've had horses with for years. They're all really enjoying her. It's not about the money, it's the thrill of having a nice horse at this point in their lives. They're thrilled to have a horse like this and be competitive in some bigger races. That means more to them than anything.

"When you start out with four babies, it's nice to come up with one like this. She's been fun for all of us. She's a sweetheart. She's very friendly; she doesn't have a mean bone in her body. She's enjoyable to be around every day."

The favorites in the remaining International Stallion Stakes for trotting fillies are Insta Glam, who is 2-1 in the first division, and May Karp, who is 8-5 in the second.

There also are three divisions of International Stallion Stakes for 2-year-old male pacers today. The favorites are Almanac (2-1) in the first, Perfect Sting (9-5) in the second, and Southwind Gendry (9-5) in the third. Perfect Sting is unbeaten in seven races this year and Southwind Gendry is on a five-race win streak.

Threefiftytwo and Pemberton wrap up Gold season with wins

Just hours after winning a Gold Series division with 2-year-old trotting colt Macho Martini, driver Bob McClure and trainer Luc Blais were back in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) winner's circle on Thursday (Oct. 8) evening with the colt's 3-year-old stablemate **Threefiftytwo**.

Lining up at Post 5 in the first of two \$104,800 Gold Series divisions at Woodbine Mohawk Park, McClure fired Threefiftytwo away from the starting gate but opted to tuck in behind Hayek and Sylvain Filion, who had the same idea from Post 4. Hayek led the field of six through fractions of :27.2, :57.3 and 1:26.2 with Threefiftytwo sitting patiently in the pocket. In the stretch McClure showed the fan favorite an open lane and Threefiftytwo sprinted home to a three and one-half length win in 1:54.

"Threefiftytwo has been a bit of a problem horse all year for Luc. He never seemed to be able to put it together when it counted, so it's nice that tonight he finally showed his ability in a Gold event," said McClure. "He's sharp right now and hopefully he'll be really good next week."

The win was Threefiftytwo's first in four Gold Series starts this season. The Royalty For Life son had recorded one third and two fifths heading into Thursday's regular season finale. The win boosts his point total to 72 and sees him head into the Oct. 17 Super Final ranked fifth in the division standings.

Blais trains Threefiftytwo, whose only other win this season came in mid-July, for Determination of Montreal, QC.

In the second division heavy favorite **Pemberton** romped along on the front end to a four length victory in 1:53.2. Driver Trevor Henry sent the Wheeling N Dealin son to the front from Post 4 and Pemberton put up fractions of :28.4, :58 and 1:26 on his way to the effortless win. Babidibou



tracked Pemberton throughout the mile to finish second and Port Perry closed hard for third.

"He's been sharp all week, ever since the last race (Sept. 28) for some reason. He's been great all week, he was great warming up. I didn't want to say anything to Trevor because I didn't want to jinx him, I just sent him out the same as I always do, but I was thinking in the back of my mind that he was maybe going to go a good race," said trainer Paul Walker. "I kind of felt the track was a bit dead tonight, but it suited him anyway, and it was nice to know that if he has to he can race in front and do the same."

The win was Pemberton's third in Gold Series action and his seventh of the season. With 162 points the gelding will lead the three-year-old trotters into the \$250,000 Super Final, which will feature the top 10 point earners.

"If I can just keep him like that for another week we'll in good shape," said Walker. "He's been a great little horse this year and he doesn't seem to be letting up yet anyways, so if we can get one more race out of him that will be great."

Walker trains Pemberton for his wife Brenda Walker of Owen Sound and daughter Christine Walker of Tara, ON. Mother and daughter also bred the trotter, who boosted his earnings to \$238,684 and his record to seven wins and one third in nine starts with Thursday's victory.

Sophomore pacers secure spots in ISS Super Finals

With victories from **Genie Rockwell** and **Grace Rocks** for the fillies and **Odds On Osiris** and **Clever Character** or the geldings, each winner went off as the post time favorite.

The first event saw Genie Rockwell rebounding in stakes action in 1:51.3. James Yoder guided his trainee to the winner's circle for the fourth time out of 11 starts for her sophomore season.

When the gate opened and the field fought for early position, Genie Rockwell settled into a spot mid-pack in fourth. She followed the leaders through opening fractions of :26.3 and :54.1. Passing the halfway mark, Genie Rockwell made a move on the leaders, reaching the second spot at the third quarter in 1:23.

As the field reached the stretch, it became a cavalry charge to the wire. Through the pack, Genie Rockwell surged ahead of her competitors on the grandstand side, reaching the wire two lengths in front. Rock It Out with Brandon Bates rallied late in the lane from sixth to second while Odds On Madison held on for third. Genie Rockwell paid \$3.00 to win at the betting windows.

"That was her first win being first over," Yoder noted. "There was early speed in the race and once Trace took the lead, I wanted to give her a breather in the pocket before making a move. She definitely showed her class tonight."

Notching lifetime win number six out of 20, Genie Rockwell now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$124,545 for owner Marlin Fry. The daughter of Always A Virgin-Norma Rockwell was bred by Glen Hershberger and Marlin Lehman.



The second filly to have a photo taken in the winner's circle was the Britney Dillon trainee Grace Rocks. Grace Rocks overcame her competitors in near gate-to-wire fashion with a commanding lead on the field.

Grace Rocks spent the :26.2 first quarter of the race waiting in third for driver Joey Putnam to give her the green light to make a move. Before the half in :54.1, she moved outside and secured just over a length lead on the pack. She continued to hold the lead through the third quarter in 1:23.

As the field turned for home, Grace Rocks began to bolster her lead, leaving her competitors to battle for minor spoils. Handily crossing the wire in 1:50:0, Grace Rocks finished three lengths to the good. She was followed by Mystical Carrie with Trace Tetrick, who staged a late rally from last to second while Somebodyslilly with Michael Oosting held her mid-pack spot to finish third. Grace Rocks paid \$3.60 to win.

Grace Rocks now holds a win record of 18-9-2-2 and a lifetime bankroll of \$232,310. The daughter of Rockin Image-Cosmic Grace is owned by Howard Taylor. The filly was bred by Victory Hill Farms.

The first round of stakes action for the colts brought Odds On Osiris to the winner's circle for back-to-back stakes wins. Peter Wrenn drove the gelding to record a new lifetime mark of 1:49:3.

As the wings of the gate opened, Odds On Osiris found a comfortable spot in fifth, remaining in that position through the opening quarter of :27:2. While Caribbean Escape with John DeLong made a move for the lead following Sawyer's Desire with Trace Tetrick, it was Caribbean Escape that clocked the half in :55:0, followed by Sawyer's Desire and the now attacking Odds On Osiris.

Having acquired the lead at the third quarter in 1:22, Odds On Osiris began to further distance himself from the field in the stretch. When he crossed with wire, he was three lengths in front, paying \$2.80 to win. Sawyer's Desire dug in for second while Caribbean Escape held on for third.

Odds On Osiris, the son of Rockin Image-Antigua Hanover, now holds a \$593,675 lifetime bankroll with a 18-11-3-2 record. The Melanie Wrenn trainee was bred by Merlie Schwartz. Odds On Osiris is owned by Odds On Racing.

The final stakes favorite to grab a win was Ron Burke trainee Clever Character. The gelding earned his second win from 12 starts in 2020, boosting his lifetime bankroll to \$240.965.

While Island Of The Sea with Michael Oosting grabbed the early lead and held it through the first quarter in :27.2, Clever Character with Sam Widger grabbed a spot mid-pack, getting

ready to make his move. By the half in :55.2, Clever Character was out and on the attack and was matching strides with the leader at the third station in 1:22.4.

Turning for home, Clever Character wrestled the lead away from Island Of The Sea and paced strong to the wire. Clever Character stopped the timer in 1:50.2, equaling his lifetime mark. Frankiepark got up for second while Crook Boyzz with Brandon Bates staged a late rally from the back of the pack to claim third. Clever Character paid \$4.60 to win for his betting backers.

Clever Character has now earned eight wins out of 21 starts for owners Burke Racing Stable & Weaver Bruscemi, Frank Baldachino and Larry Karr. The son of Tellitlikeitis-Ruby Delight was bred by Freedom Hill Farms.

Each of the evening's divisional winners successfully earned a spot to compete in the Indiana Sires Stakes Super Finals slated for Friday (Oct. 16) at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. With purses over the \$2 million dollar mark, the annual Hoosier Champions Night will provide an exciting conclusion to the 2020 Indiana Sires Stakes season.

Tattoo Artist scores Gold win number five in London

Sent off as the heavy favorite in Friday's (Oct. 9) \$155,600 3-year-old pacing colt Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series division, **Tattoo Artist**rewarded The Raceway at Western Fair District fans with a two-length victory in 1:53.2.

Driver Bob McClure hustled Tattoo Artist away from Post 1, but Sylvain Filion had a heavier foot on the accelerator from Post 4 and Rhythm In Motion won the battle for early control, taking the field to a :26.1 opening quarter. After firing away from Post 7 and advancing up the outside, Beaumond Hanover dropped in behind Rhythm In Motion as the colts advanced around the second turn, so heading for the :54.4 half McClure sent Tattoo Artist after the leader. Filion kept the pedal to the metal on Rhythm In Motion however, so McClure dropped Tattoo Artist into the pocket before the 1:23 three-quarters and waited until the colts were coming off the final turn to re-move. Tattoo Artist reeled in Rhythm In Motion, as did Beaumond Hanover, who got up for second. The pacesetter stayed game for third.

"I said to many people before the race, one of the last spots I would have wanted was the rail or the eight-hole," said McClure. "You don't want the rail when you're the favorite. You want to be the last one to the lead and at London, it's

such a tight track, you can get caught very flat footed leaving the gate from the rail, which all the drivers know, so I knew there would be a couple blasting from the outside.

"I could have left Jody out there to be parked but then I'd have been in a hole the rest of the race and I didn't want that, so I figured the only way to give my horse a fair shot was to drop Jody and take my chances first up and luckily it worked out. I got to tuck into the two-hole for a little while and braven up and take another run and my horse showed a lot of grit and class. He raced an awesome trip today and I was very proud of him."

The win gives Tattoo Artist a perfect five-for-five record in sophomore Gold Series action. The last time the reigning division champion was bested in Ontario Sires Stakes action was over The Raceway at Western Fair District oval in a Gold event last October. Eight days later he won the two-year-old pacing colt Super Final.

"He struggled here last year, but I was pretty confident (tonight)," said trainer Dr. Ian Moore, who also started seventh-place finisher Denali Seelster. "I did snug his hopples up a hole, and I did the other horse too, which I don't think it hurt him any and probably steadied him a little bit. Anyway, we're pleased with the result, and hopefully he'll be a little better for next week now too."

Moore and caretaker Giselle Loder will now shift their focus to having Tattoo Artist in peak form for the Oct. 17 Super Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The top 10 point earners will compete in the \$250,000 postseason showdown.

"I'll jog him, probably Thursday will be a training mile, and it won't be too heavy for him," said Cambridge, ON resident Moore. "We're looking forward to next week; we've got five in the Finals, him, Denali, the two fillies (Andra Day and Alumni Seelster) and Lawless Shadow."

In addition to his Gold Series success, Tattoo Artist has also had a successful season in open stake competition for owners Frank Cannon of Sanford, FL and Let It Ride Stables Inc. of Boca Raton, FL. The Hes Watching colt captured his Simcoe Stakes division and finished second in the \$1 million North America Cup. Through 11 sophomore starts Tattoo Artist has tallied eight wins and one second for earnings of \$610.073.
