Wowza! Lexington sale crushes it with records galore

The Lexington Selected Yearling Sale concluded Saturday with records for gross, average, median and number of six-figure yearlings sold – and topped the previous best gross by more than \$10 million. In all, the sale set 18 sales records, including surpassing \$5 million for the first time in a final session.

The 2021 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale concluded Saturday night (Oct. 9) **setting 18 records, including new standards for gross (\$56,692,500), average (\$65,692), median (\$44,000) and number of yearlings sold for \$100,000 or more (159).**

The gross exceeded the previous record (\$46,480,000 in 2019) by some \$10 million or 22 per cent.

Each of the **five** sessions set a new record for gross sales.

The sale also set the following records:

First session gross: \$18,540,000

First session average: \$161,217

First session 100,000+: 69





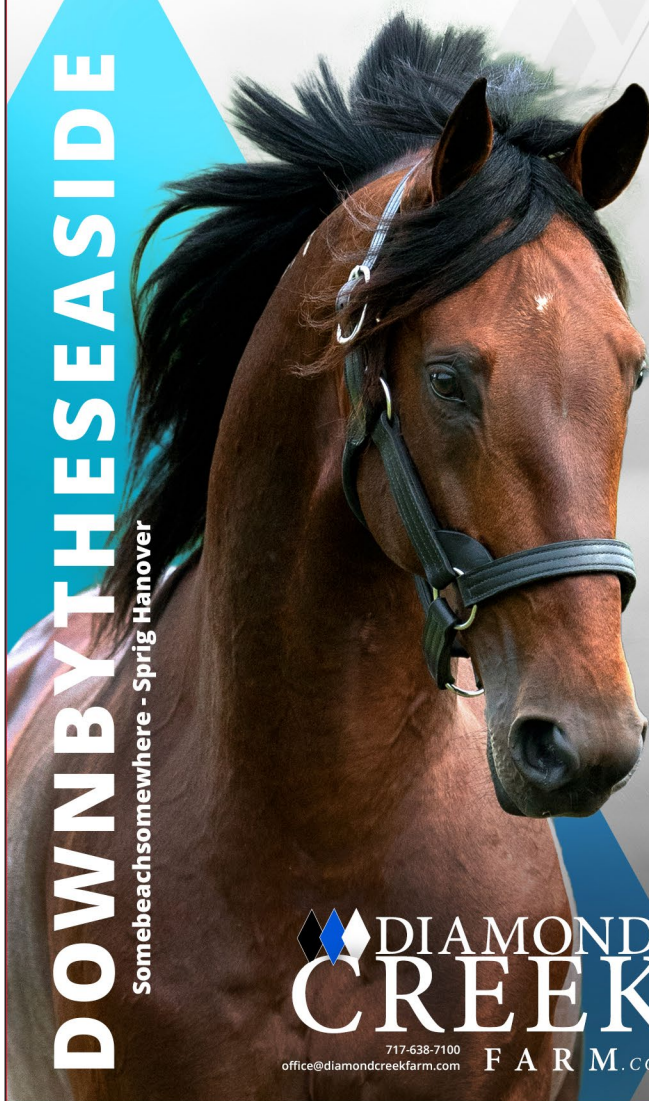

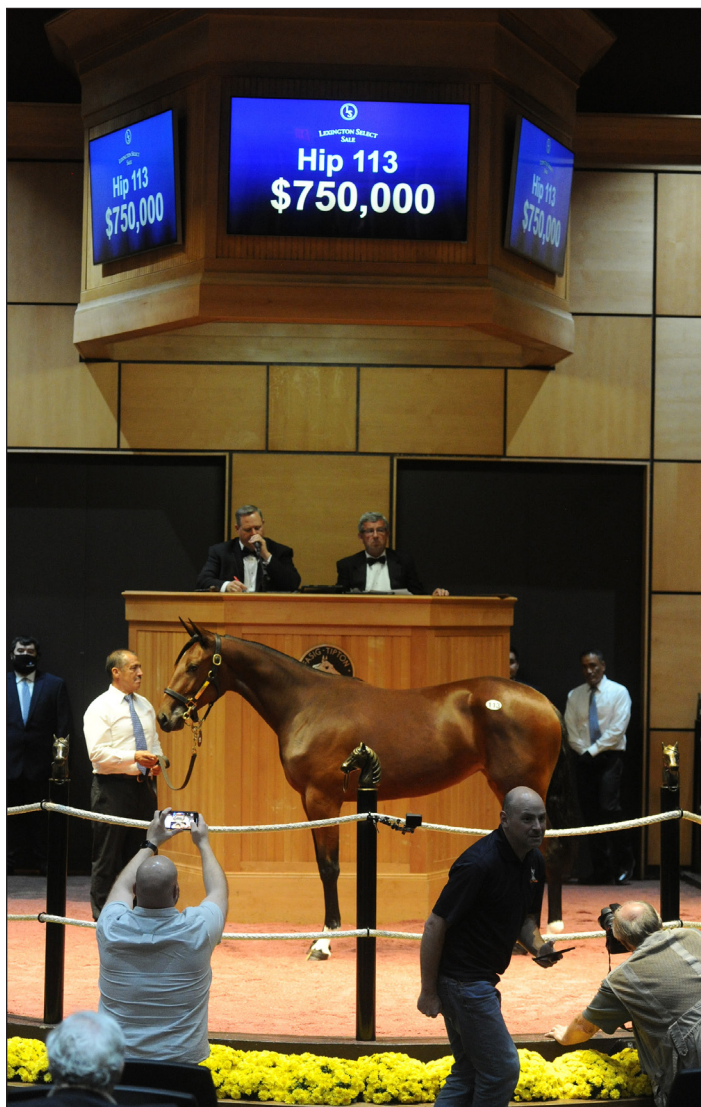

Randy Manages, who manages the sale with David Reid, was philosophical about the results.

"This is my 29th sale. Of course, when I came to work here it was Kentucky Standardbred. When we merged the two sale companies, several years ago, I think that really helped everybody," Manges said. "Obviously, we have some great farms in this area and that's helped. Our breeders, they have always improved their broodmare bands, which helps us. I'm a big believer that the consignors have built the sale over the years. It's probably been the last five years that it's just progressed. When good things happen in the industry, it just seems to help us. We've really grown. We have a great group of people that come to the sale and participate in the sale. The last couple of years with COVID and everything, you would think that would hurt us, but with online bidding it was a big savior last year and it really

stepped up this year also.”

Saturday’s session, which was made up of mostly Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky-breds, saw 148 yearlings sell for a total gross of \$5,285,500 for an average of \$35,713 and a median of \$28,500. Seven yearlings reached \$100,000 or more.

“It was very strong from top to bottom,” Manges said. “In fact, I was hoping we would progress the way it progressed and it worked out for us. There were a lot of guys that came in for our last two days and stayed. We had a good crowd right up until the last horse sold tonight, which is a very positive thing for the industry. I think it will carry through for the rest of the year. I think Harrisburg will have a good sale and some of the regional sales that have not taken place yet will feed off the good sale we’ve had. We seem to feed off – when all the sales are good, we seem to do even better.

“The Ohio Jug sale was good, the Goshen sale was good, the Canadian sale was good and they’ve got a virtual sale in Canada in a couple of weeks and I anticipate it will be good. I’m just happy for the industry. It’s a positive for the industry.”

Reid said he was delighted with the results.

“We averaged \$35,000 tonight. That’s a record for the last night of the sale. It was up 20 per cent on the average from last year and 50 per cent over two years ago,” Reid said. “It’s just a phenomenal way to end the night.”

Manges added, “The one good thing about this sale, in particular,

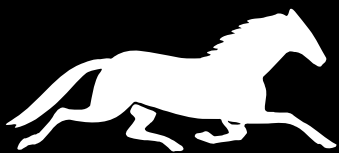

Downbytheseaside colt out of Tookaloo Hanover purchased for \$230,000 by Diamond Creek Farm from Reid's Preferred Equine consignment.

"For us, he was the best colt in the sale and we've made so much money with Seaside so far that we wanted to come here and buy what we thought was the best one. I'm happy to do that," said Bowden.

Reid said the colt was bred and raised by Dr. Steve Dey from Heritage Farms in New Jersey.

"They've been around a long time. They sold a Downbytheseaside down here last year quite well. They are a small, boutique type of breeder. We brought three or four yearlings down here to pick the big spots and I'm very happy for their success. To see them come down here and maybe take a chance on my suggestion, then to sell the sales topper is awesome."

Diamond Creek stands Downbytheseaside in Ohio at Sugar Valley Farm. Bowden said the success of the stallion at this year's sale was expected.

"I don't want to be cocky, but it was sort of expected that they were going to do well. Sea Silk winning last week, Pebble Beach, the sale in Ohio... I'm just thrilled. The horse has done it all and we're riding the wave," Bowden said.

Twenty-three Downbytheseasides were sold Saturday, grossing \$1,789,000 for an average of \$77,783.

"The top seven yearlings sold tonight were Downbytheseasides

and they were all over \$100,000. I just think that it's great to see a young sire get off to a start like that," Reid said.

Hunterton's Steve Stewart said it was the right decision to sell all the Downbytheseasides on the final night.

"They wrote about whether they should have the Seasides sell earlier and absolutely not. You had Hannelore Hanover's

full-sister (sell earlier) and that's fine. But I think the crowd was bigger tonight than it's been all week almost. It's a different crowd, which is important, but I don't think there was hardly any of them that we were disappointed in all the way through. It was very rewarding," Stewart said.

BURKE TOPS SATURDAY BUYERS

Ron Burke led all buyers on Saturday, spending \$652,000 to buy nine yearlings, including three of the seven that sold for \$100,000 or more – **hip 854 Boardwalk Jack**, a Downbytheseaside colt out of Restive Hanover for \$130,000 from Winbak; **hip 808 Act Fast**, a Downbytheseaside colt out Act Like A Diva for \$125,000 from All American and **hip 761 Queen Of The South**, a Downbytheseaside filly out of Vaquera Deo for \$100,000 from Preferred Equine.

Burke said the attraction was the Ohio program.

"We didn't get enough bought at the previous sale and we need a strong bunch to race as much as we like to race in Ohio, so it's

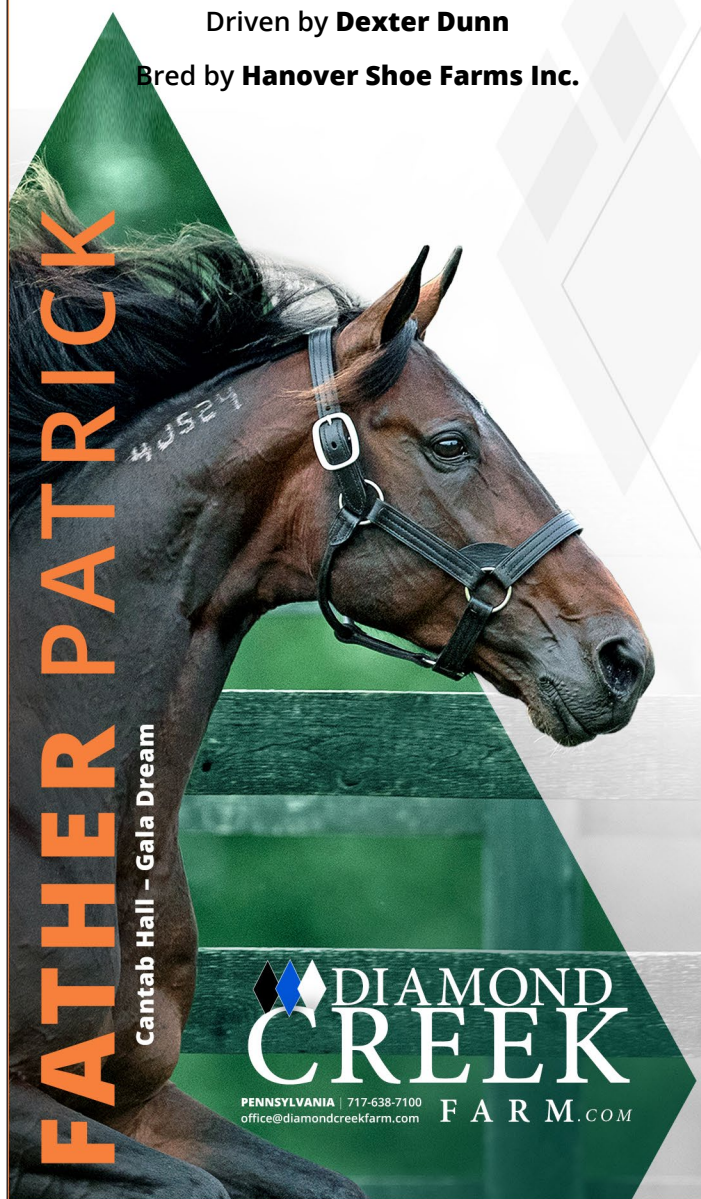

good for us to only ship a couple of hours a day to either of our farms. We've got the best young driver there and Chris (Page) does a great job educating them... it's really been successful, so there was no way we weren't going back," Burke said.

As for Downbytheseaside in particular, Burke said having one race on the Grand Circuit is possible, "but the biggest thing is that we want to race in Ohio. The program is great and it's set up that there's plenty of races between the Sires Stakes, the state fair, the breeder's championship... there's plenty and you don't need to worry about racing anywhere else."

LUTHER'S MILLION-DOLLAR EXPERIMENT EXPANDS

Keeping it in Ohio, HRU also checked in with owner Greg Luther who last year launched his "million dollar experiment." Luther said the experiment continues, but will be a little different in 2022.

"We had a great year so far this year, still some big races coming up. We've brought in a little over \$2 million in purses, so that's been fun and we've won some big races," Luther said. "Obviously, Catch The Fire has been the star so we've had fun there and we're starting to get into the breeding business as well. We're buying a bunch of babies and I've got pretty close to 30 2-year-olds so far. The Harrisburg sale is still coming up and I'll buy a bunch of broodmares, too, that we can breed to Catch The Fire.

"We're Ohio, born and bred, ourselves so we're trying to get as many Ohio-breds as we can... and, heck, they are starting to take the big stage, too. They are winning some Grand Circuit races."

Overall, Luther said he's purchased horses from Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and New York, "so I better buy some more trucks and trailers.

"It's been a lot of fun and obviously we're going in pretty big. We've probably put another \$2 million in so far this year, trying to hit the big time.

"I'm just trying to convince everyone to keep building barns for us, so we have enough space to store these things - I'm at 70 head now. I own 69-and-a-half of those. I only have half of Catch The Fire. That horse, he's got so much fight in him and I'm hoping that goes on to his babies as well. So, we're really going to go big on breeding him."

PREFERRED LEADS CONSIGNORS

Reid's Preferred Equine led all consignors with \$8,128,000 in sales for 134 yearlings sold. In 2019, Preferred set a personal record for gross sales with \$9,731,000 for 137 yearlings sold.

This year, Preferred was followed by Hunterton (\$7,863,000 for 97 yearlings), Kentuckiana (\$6,668,000 for 101 yearlings) and Diamond Creek (\$3,610,000 for 47 yearlings).

"For Preferred Equine, I think we're the leading consignor again,

but that's just a number," Reid said. "The service to our clients and the service to the industry. We pride ourselves on making a professional presentation and hope it pays dividends for everybody. We hope our customers are satisfied and, more importantly, we appreciate their trust in us to sell their horses for them."

Stewart said, "Hunterton Farm and our partners are being rewarded for us believing in the business for the last 10 years. When people were seeing Perretti going out of business and Yankeeland going out of business and so many others... Armstrong Brothers. A lot of people thought, 'Oh, boy, those people must know something.'

"I always say that the breeder takes the biggest risk of anybody, because what we do now, we get paid three years from now. You're really projecting success. It's like the wine business where you're projecting future profits. The people buying horses might get money back in nine months and that's a big difference."

Concord Stud led all consignors in average with \$186,429 for seven sold. Hanover Shoe Farms was second in average (\$155,100 for 20 yearlings sold), followed by Brittany Farms LLC (\$115,542 for 24 sold).

TAKTER TOPS BUYERS, ALAGNA SECOND

Nancy Takter was the top buyer with \$2,907,000 spent, in total, on 12 yearlings. Tony Alagna was second with \$2,725,000 spent on 26 yearlings, followed by Steve Heimbecker (\$2,342,000 on 19 yearlings) and Burke Racing Stable (\$2,019,000 on 24 yearlings).

WALNER IS KING

Walner led all stallions in gross sales (\$7,718,000) and average (\$160,792) with three or more sold. The leading pacer by money and average was Captaintreacherous (\$6,652,000 and \$133,040).

INTERNATIONAL IMPACT

Canadians accounted for \$9,437,500 in sales or 16.6 per cent of the total. Europeans purchased \$1,645,000 worth of yearlings or 2.9 per cent of the total, with Sweden strongly leading the way (\$1,230,000).

"Now, as we always conclude, we just want these horses to go on and perform on the racetrack," Reid said. "The Lexington sale has done that year after year. They give you Classic winners, Triple Crown winners, Hambletonian winners, Breeders Crown winners. We pride ourselves in selling winners and that's basically the success of our sale."

Sparkling Championship day at Åby

The stars were out in Sweden as Calgary Games, Extreme, Very Kronos, Ivensong and Honey Mearas won major stakes.

An impressive race card was offered at Åby racetrack on Saturday (Oct. 9) afternoon and some of the best horses in Europe showed up on the Swedish west coast.

The biggest stake race, the \$465,000 UET Grand Prix for 4-year-olds, became a one-horse show signed by Timo Nurmos' undefeated Derby winner **Calgary Games** (Ready Express) and driver Jorma Kontio. When toughest opponent San Moteur disappeared as he went off stride when the car accelerated, the road toward the lead was open for Calgary Games.

Kontio noted that San Moteur was gone and aimed for the lead, which he reached at an early stage and when an undefeated Derby winner is in front, nothing much happens in a race and the excitement never really materialized. Calgary Games was outstanding this day and Jorma Kontio just sat calmly behind his horse over the stretch as Calgary Games won in a mile rate

"Calgary Games had a lot of power to use when we hit the wire and I started to let him run a little bit faster the last quarter of the race," said Kontio.

French trotter Hironnelle Sibey finished second after a pocket trip and Mister Hercules reached the bronze medal from third position on the inside.

Winner Calgary Games will now travel to Menhammar Stuteri where he starts his work as a stud. Menhammar recently bought a part of the horse and it's not hundred per cent certain that Calgary Games will continue his racing career after this season.

Harness racing fans need a star like Calgary Games and we all hope that he comes back at the tracks 2022.

Upset in European Championship for 5-year-olds

Elitloppet winner Don Fanucci Zet (Hard Livin) wasn't even first choice when the \$115,000 European Championship for 5-year-olds was held. Jerry Riordan's Aetos Kronos (Bold Eagle) came into the race off an impressive win in the \$230,000 Jubileumspokalen at Solvalla in August, a race where Don Fanucci Zet finished second and the big talk ahead of Saturday's race was about the meeting between the two big 5-year-old stars.

From post 6 (Aetos Kronos) and 7 (Don Fanucci Zet) they both opened quickly, but the first quarter cost them as Aetos Kronos

Aetos Kronos in front, Extreme in the pocket and Don Fanucci Zet as third on the inside, that was the conditions as the field turned for home and other horses had tried attacks in the last turn. Aetos Kronos seemed to cruise to another big win, but Danish bred Extreme wanted to challenge for real and Juul's horse passed the leader ahead of the wire. Aetos Kronos was second and Don Fanucci Zet finished well as third.

Denmark needs a big star in harness racing and Extreme is probably the horse that will put the country in the major races again. Juul is a true master in the game and he can look back at several big wins throughout his long career, but he has most certainly never had a faster and more interesting horse than Extreme. Big congrats to him and the entire harness racing nation.

Extreme won in mile rate 1:54.4 over 1.3 miles.

Ivensong tops sophomore European Championship

French driver David Thomain acted with big frigidity when he steered Philippe Allare's 3-year-old Ready Cash filly **Ivensong** in \$115,000 European Championship for 3-year-olds. Thomain hit the pocket position behind leader Red Lady Express and trusted that his horse would be on the toes when open stretch appeared at Åby.

And Thomain's feelings proved to be correct. Ivensong didn't quite understand the signal of attack at the top of the stretch, but the closer she got to the wire, the faster she trotted and just before the finish line Ivensong disarmed leader Red Lady Express.

First over runner Aquarius Face held strongly as third and winner Ivensong came home in mile rate 1:57 over 1.3 miles.

All in all, Thomain did everything right and it was especially nice to see the French guest's calm act in the bike, even if it was a close call in the end.

"Ivensong has raced very well in France and today we tried to race her without shoes. I know she's a fast trotter and Ivensong did it well since she got a little bit fired up during the race," said Thomain.

Very Kronos tops

Title defender **Very Kronos** (Ready Cash) was first choice in the \$115,000 Swedish Championship for older trotters despite a 10 post over 1.6 miles and driver Erik Adielsson solved the task pretty smoothly, even if Very Kronos was very eager when the field gathered behind the car, seconds ahead of the start.

Adielsson sent Very Kronos to position first over and controlled leader Milliondollarrhyme at the back stretch. Second over running Upstate Face attacked in the last turn, but Very Kronos is tough to surpass and Svante Båth's 7-year-old trotter took a safe win in mile rate 1:56 over 1.6 miles. Upstate Face and Diamanten finished behind the winner and this was the last start of the season for Very Kronos.

"It's a relief when he crosses the wire since you never know exactly how he will act in races. The plan is to check him up ahead of a sire career and then we'll see what happens next year," said Båth.

Honey Mearas

In the \$115,000 Championship for mares, Daniel Redén tried his 4-year-old dominant **Honey Mearas** (who has won Stochampionatet and Derbystoet for 4-year-olds this season) among older, more merited ladies and the Ready Express daughter proved to be better than her opponents.

Örjan Kihlström took it safe from the start while Mily hit the lead in something that looked more like a high speed flight for trainer Robert Bergh. Honey Mearas took over the lead when the field hit the back stretch for the first time and when in

front, Kihlström lowered the pace considerably ahead of the last kilometer. And when attacks began before the last turn, Honey Mearas showed that she wouldn't be easy to pass. The race's single 4-year-old trotter played with the challengers over the stretch and she came home in 1:56.2 over 1.3 miles.

Dixie Brick finished second ahead of Mellby Free.

Mindyourvalue W.F. takes Racing Under Saddle

In \$57,500 Racing Under Saddle Championship, French superstar Eric Raffin was offered a ride on Robert Bergh's **Mindyourvalue W.F.** (Hövding Lavec) and as heavy favorite, Raffin made no mistakes. Mindyourvalue W.F. got order of a serious attack at the back stretch and the advantage the duo had in the last turn was too much for heroic chaser and runner up Polycrates Face.

Mindyourvalue W.F. came home in strong mile rate 1:55.3 over 1.3 miles.

Gocciadoro dominates high-staked Derby in Italy

The \$925,000 Italian Derby for 3-year-olds is scheduled in Rome today (Oct. 10) and Italy's outstanding trainer Alessandro Gocciadoro trains five trotters in the 12-horse field.

Gocciadoro has Cash Maker (Donato Hanover), Corazon Bar (Oropuro Bar), Colibri' Jet (Ready Express), Cronos degli Dei (Ready Cash) and Catman di Celle (Bold Eagle) in the prestigious race and has opted Colibri' Jet as his drive.

She has earned her shot against the sport's best older trotting mares and the lone 3-year-old in here may be able to handle it. In her first race since career rival Manchego retired, ATLANTA is a tough call. She wasn't at her best in two starts in Canada, hasn't raced in about three weeks, and now has to go off-Lasix. WHEN DOVESCRY has been a model of consistency all year and fended off all the boys last out in the Dayton Derby except for a good one that got the trip. HYPNOTIC AM gets the rail and gets Sears back.

Picks: Altar, When Dovescry, Hypnotic Am

Race 5 — Glen Garnsey Memorial

In a group of fillies that have gotten to know each other very well this year, GRACE HILL remains sharp. She had her winning streak derailed last out on having to wait for room to the inside against a rival that already had the jump; may very well offer a similar 5-1 price as she did last out. TEST OF FAITH rebounded from her runner-up finish in the Jugette with a win here last out. It did come though off a perfect second-over trip and now has to deal with an outside post; likely play-against. FIRE START HANOVER was used hard throughout and was still trying against many of these same rivals last out; the move inside is big. BLUE DIAMOND EYES gave way late after being pressed here last out. Her miles two and three back catch the eye, though she'll need her very best to win this.

He did trip out that race but a repeat isn't out of the question. There isn't much known on Sweden import ECURIE D DK, but he has to be respected for Svanstedt based off that lone qualifier with a :26.3 final quarter; could be any kind. FORBIDDEN TRADE is always a threat, just depends on what price he offers. IT'S ACADEMIC will show speed but I don't think he can beat these; very similar profile of READY FOR MONI.

Race 8 – Allerage Farms Open Pace

If you saw the Dayton Derby, you'd be hard pressed to go against OCEAN ROCK. Speaking of form, I know that ALLYWAG HANOVER has emerged as the clear leader in this division and is another that keeps getting better but having to race without Lasix now plus post 10 does give reason to play against. Of course, if he's as good as he was in the Mohawk Gold Cup then none of that may matter. NICHOLAS BEACH was dismissed at high odds last out which was a surprise as he continues to show up in every race except the Harrington one from post 8. He didn't have clearance until late at Dayton last out and he can certainly win with a trip. CATCH THE WIRE could only muster a weak first-over try last out but it was a quick half that he went into; he's better than that. THIS IS THE PLAN was left in the wake of OCEAN ROCK last out.

DRAMA ACT had no shot last out in the Dayton Distaff and will have every opportunity to make a truer showing of herself today if good enough. PEAKY SNEAKY was a runner-up to Lyon's Sentinel two back and fellow Takter-trainee JK FIRST LADY draws the outside in tough to figure form.

CUATRO DE JULIO was ultra-game in defeat last out in the fast mile at the hands of #1, nothing wrong at all with his last two tries at the Red Mile and is a contender. JUJUBEE was a pocket rocket to beat DANCINGINTHEDARK M on Hambletonian Day and has remained in raging form since. One of two \$75,000 supplements to the race, he'll be close to the front as always. AHUNDREDDOLLARBILL is the other supplement and I suppose we can toss that last race in the slop but I still think he'll need his very best to go with the top ones. FLY LIGHT and MON AMOUR were a couple of Svanstedt bombs that won here on the same day last weekend. Today, Svanstedt is on DELAYED HANOVER and he's a wildcard making his first start in over a month; is capable and will offer a huge price. AMBASSADOR HANOVER hasn't been as sharp since the Hambletonian but does get Zeron back. JOHAN PALEMA wasn't particularly inspiring as the even money favorite last out.

World champion Herculisa looks to continue winning ways in Filly Futurity

After passing a test last week in the Bluegrass Stakes, Ohio Sire Stakes champion **Herculisa** will try to prove her strength against 11 rivals in today's (Oct. 10) \$351,000 Kentucky Filly Futurity for 3-year-old female trotters at Red Mile.

Herculisa brings a three-race win streak to the Filly Futurity and is only a second-place finish from seeing that streak stand at seven. Last week, she competed on the Grand Circuit for the first time and posted a 1:53.1 triumph, beating Contested Hanover by 3-1/4 lengths over a sloppy surface at Red Mile. Only one of the remaining four Bluegrass divisions, two for the fillies and two for the boys, was won with a faster time.

As a result of her performance, owner Steve Finkelstein of Jesmeral Stable paid \$50,000 to supplement Herculisa to the Filly Futurity. This afternoon, she will start from post one with Brett Miller driving for trainer Virgil Morgan Jr. She is the 5-2 morning-line second choice behind Hambletonian Oaks champ Bella Bellini at 2-1.

"We wanted to see how she raced in the Bluegrass, and she passed the test," Morgan said. "Steve Finkelstein is a great guy, a good owner and good for the business, and he thought she deserved a shot to race in the Futurity."

"She showed she's competitive. She didn't really trip out last week, she did the work. Brett drove her really good. They forced, let everybody settle, and then made a move at three-eighths and she did the work from there."

Herculisa is a daughter of My MVP, who won the 2012 Kentucky Futurity, out of Herculotte Hanover. Last year, she won five of six races, with her only loss coming when she went off stride in the Ohio Sire Stakes championship.

"She just got a little claustrophobic around the last turn, a little crowded," Morgan said. "She just needed some room and didn't get it and lost her composure for a brief moment. Unfortunately, it cost her. It was just an unfortunate trip. She's much more mature now. She was a little eager, a little antsy last year. Sometimes, she wanted to go from second gear to fifth gear like right now. She's much more seasoned now."

This year, Herculisa captured the Ohio Sire Stakes championship with the fastest mile in history for a 3-year-old on a half-mile track, 1:52.3 at Northfield Park. For the year, she has won seven of 10 races and pushed her career earnings to \$439,595.

"She's really tactical, and she has a real quick turn of speed," Morgan said. "She's won on the front end with some nice miles, and she's won from off the pace with some nice miles. So, I think her strongest assets right now are her attitude and her versatility."

"I've been blessed to have some really nice trotters, and some really nice trotting fillies, throughout my career. She definitely ranks up there with them."

The Kentucky Filly Futurity is race 10 on today's stakes-heavy card at Red Mile. The final race on the 12-race card is the \$561,000 Kentucky Futurity for 3-year-old trotters. Jujubee is the 3-1 morning-line favorite in the Futurity.

Early Action ground uncovered for the top and powered to the finish with ease to down his competition in the first division of three divisions for the \$278,900 Tall Dark Stranger International Stallion Stakes for 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings on Saturday (Oct. 9) at Red Mile.

Gulf Shores, the even-money second choice, grabbed the lead to a :28 first quarter while driver Brian Sears settled **Early Action** into fourth, where he stayed until angling off the pegs past a :55.2 half. To the far turn, the Huntsville gelding ranged to within a length of Gulf Shores to three-quarters in 1:23 and swiftly

slid by the pacesetter off the corner, striding to a two-length victory in 1:50. Birthday rallied from third over to take second with Market Based snagging third from a photo with Gulf Shores.

"The two efforts here, and when he had raced in the Kindergarten, I was impressed," trainer Joe Holloway said after the race. "That night, I started counting the number of starts to make sure we don't get too many for next year. Once he took command, I knew it was over. David Miller had said it, he said, 'The colt likes to win.' He felt bad for picking off – he had a good one for Ron Burke – but he said 'Your colt likes to win.' That's a big thing when they like to do that."

Winning his seventh race from nine starts, **Early Action** has banked \$170,558 for owners Val D'Or Farms and Ted Gewertz. Brian Sears piloted the \$3.40 winner.

Pebble Beach powered off cover to take the lead just before the finish and win the second split of the Tall Dark Stranger.

Driver Todd McCarthy floated **Pebble Beach** to race sixth while Fourever Boy clicked the first quarter in :28.1. Seaside Way pulled first over from fourth and catalyzed the pace up the backside to a :55.4 half before folding his bid midway around the final turn. Risenshine Seaside rushed three wide to challenge Fourever Boy to three-quarters in 1:23.3 with Caviart Camden and **Pebble Beach** swinging to the center of the course coming for home.

Fouever Boy dug to the lead through most of the straightaway, though Pebble Beach motored with the most momentum and edged to a length win in 1:50.4 over Caviart Camden, with Fouever Boy settling for third and Velocity Chaps taking fourth.

"Noel [Daley] decided that a half-mile track was not his liking," co-owner Joe Sbrocco said after the race. "So he took him out and took him down here, and Noel knows his business. He's a great trainer. [Todd McCarthy] decided that we were going to hold him off the pace a little bit and he did a great job with it. Scared the heck out of all of his, but he came home pretty good."

Daley trains Pebble Beach for owners Patricia Stables, Joe Sbrocco, Country Club Acres and LA Express & JAF Stables. The Downbytheseaside colt collected his sixth victory from nine starts, accruing \$283,950 in earnings. He paid \$3 to win.

Captain Cowboy cruised around his rivals through the lane to land an 11-1 upset in the last division of the Tall Dark Stranger.

Loukes Perry pushed for the front to a :29 first quarter with Nautical Hanover yielding for the pocket into the backstretch. Monte Miki moved first over out of fourth by a :56.1 half with Six Feet Apart in tow second over and Captain Cowboy third over. He progressed to match strides with Loukes Perry past three-quarters in 1:25 but faced no match for the fresh legs in behind.

Six Feet Apart swept to the lead coming to the eighth pole as

Captain Cowboy gathered himself to the center of the track and soon darted by under minimal encouragement from driver Dexter Dunn. The Captaintreacherous colt rolled to a two-length victory in 1:51.2 over Six Feet Apart, with Monte Miki giving chase from third and Nautical Hanover taking fourth.

"I was lucky to pick the drive up, obviously," Dunn said after the race. "There was actually lots of confidence in the camp – he didn't get much luck last week and was full of pace. And going to three-quarters, I was pretty confident, too."

Returning \$25.40 to win, Captain Cowboy scored his fifth victory from eight starts, earning \$109,705 for trainer Ake Svanstedt through his Ake Svanstedt Inc. along with co-owner Little E LLC.

Each division of the Tall Dark Stranger International Stallion Stakes was sponsored by the Tall Dark Stranger Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms.

Miller positioned Date Night in sixth to a :28.2 first quarter as Misswalner Fashion brushed to the lead into the backside with Cash Infusion settling for the pocket. Misswalner Fashion continued unchallenged to a :55.2 half and slowed the tempo into the final turn as Andy Miller pulled Date Night off the pegs and rushed first over. By three-quarters in 1:23.4, Date Night put away Misswalner Fashion and coasted to the finish to win by a length over fast-closing Adore Me. Cash Infusion finished third and Danznqueen Hanover closed from second over for fourth.

"[Marvin Katz] said, 'I've got a filly that's well bred. I don't know how good she is, but she's got a lot of pedigree behind her. Take her and see what you guys can do with her,'" Andy Miller said after the race of the Marvin Katz and Sam Goldband homebred, whom the duo bought back for \$20,000 as a yearling. "She loves

a target, and when she's around the last turn she just digs in and wants to beat horses. That was kind of the game plan all along [to stay at The Red Mile]. She was a little immature early and got a little sick, so we just brought her along slowly and targeted The Red Mile."

From her seven starts, Date Night has earned \$143,325. The Julie Miller trainee paid \$2.80 to win.

Selfie Queen gave pursuit from third with Shestheluckyone rallying well behind to take fourth.

A homebred for Lindy Farms of Connecticut, Raised By Lindy won her fourth race from eight starts, banking \$147,743. She paid \$5 to win.

Joviality S cruised first over to an easy 1:53 victory in the third division of the International Moni.

Ebbies Lady led the field by the quarter in :29 with Mon Cheval sitting second and Joviality S positioned third. Through a :57.2 half, Delilah Hanover pulled first over from fifth and flushed Joviality S, the 1-5 favorite, off the pylons into the final turn. Ranging towards Ebbies Lady through three-quarters in 1:25.4, Joviality S overtook the pacesetter through the lane and strode to a 1-1/4-length win over Delilah Hanover. Ebbies Lady held third and Mon Cheval took fourth.

Trained by Marcus Melander for owner Courant Inc., Joviality S has won seven races from nine starts and earned \$363,748. The Chapter Seven filly paid \$2.60 to win.

Palermo Hanover pulled another upset after breaking her maiden at 39-1 in the Bluegrass last week, this time again firing home to land a 23-1 shock in the final division of the International Moni.

The Father Patrick filly raced last of the nine to a :27.3 first quarter set by Brickhouse Babe, who took the top from Eternal Lee into the backstretch. Brickhouse Babe rolled on the point to a :56.1 half with the outer tier developing and soon securing a helm from Peyton Hanover to the final turn.

Peyton Hanover made minor gains but got cover as Eternal Lee popped pocket by three-quarters in 1:25.1. The front brigade spun for home leg weary while the covered horses came calling, with Jiggy Jog S forging to the lead from third over coming into the eighth pole. But driver Dexter Dunn had loads of trot with Palermo Hanover, who was swung widest of the charge for home and flew to the lead to score a length win over Jiggy

Jog S. A Perfect Helen closed for third and Mrs Taylor weaved through horses to take fourth.

"She's got the breeding – all her siblings have been better at 3 – and she's been fine the whole time," trainer Noel Daley said after the race. "We really didn't think she was quite up to this grade, but she was marginal even bringing out, just trying to get a little bit of black tar maybe running second or third. [She's] surprised the hell out of us two weeks in a row."

Paying \$48.80 to win, Palermo Hanover has now won two races from nine starts and earned \$107,633 for co-owner Noel Daley along with partners Lenny Zelin and The Gandolfo Stables.

Gurfein tribute

After the second race on Saturday, horsepeople gathered into a horseshoe formation in front of the grandstands for a memorial ceremony honoring the late champion trainer Ron Gurfein, who passed away at the age of 80 in May. The memorial included a moment of silence for the Hall of Fame trainer, a winner of three Hambletonians among many other accolades through a long and colorful training career.

Racing resumes at Red Mile this afternoon (Oct. 10) for the closing card of the Grand Circuit meeting. The 129th edition of the Kentucky Futurity headlines and caps the 12-race card, which also includes the \$351,000 Kentucky Filly Futurity, \$500,000 Tattersalls Pace, \$207,000 Glen Garnsey Memorial and dashes of the Allera Farms for each division of aged standardbred. First-race post time is 1 p.m. (EDT).

Legendary thoroughbred horse agent Donato Lanni had his start with standardbreds

Many, more than likely most, harness racing people have never heard of Donato Lanni.

To most thoroughbred people, certainly those that frequent horse sales, he approaches legendary status when it comes to buying horses of which almost all are yearlings and 2-year-olds in training. At the recently-concluded Keeneland Sale he purchased over 60 yearlings for his various clients which include many prominent owners and trainers.

Among his clients is the often-in-the-news Bob Baffert. Lanni is a dear friend and fervent supporter of Baffert.

Lanni is one of the best known horse agents in the thoroughbred game. During the course of a year, he will purchase in excess of 100 horses, virtually all of them for high profile owners and trainers.

His tale begins in Montreal where his father Giuseppe had standardbreds. His dad was in the construction business and raced a few horses on the side. Building held no interest for young Donato, but horses certainly did.

Donato, as did many youngsters of the era, started going to the

races with his dad. He was immediately enthralled.

He was smitten by the racetrack, racing, horses and its people, at the time, all of them of the standardbred variety.

His life's passion was to make horses his vocation.

Of course, he knew of thoroughbreds and was always fascinated by the thought of the Kentucky Derby and various other classic events. He began following the Kentucky Derby, the Breeders' Cups and all the top events. He devoured everything he could read about the thoroughbreds.

But it was harness racing with which all his learning years were involved.

The first person he groomed for was Onil Patry in Montreal.

Among others that he worked for were Andre Lachance and Robbie McKenzie.

When he worked for Andre Lachance, he actually drove in a few qualifying races.

One summer, Donato took care of a horse by the name of Garland Lobell. Little did he realize or even dream that this son of ABC Freight was destined to change the breed through his three great sons Andover Hall, Angus Hall, Conway Hall and their sibling sister Emilie Cas El.

One branch through Conway Hall produced Hambletonian winner Windsongs Legacy, who, even though he was tragically short lived, sired Chapter Seven, already a great sire, who is responsible for this year's siring sensation Walner.

"When I took care of him, Garland Lobell was just a nice trotter. Nobody, I'm sure, not even Pierre Levesque who stood him at stud at his Angus Farms, could ever even have dreamed that he could possibly have had such a profound influence on the breed."

But I stray. This story is about Donato Lanni, not Garland Lobell.

His father's wishes were that he get a good education and then maybe join him in his construction business. Young Donato much preferred being around the horses than either of the other two.

He lived in Beaconsfield, a suburb of Montreal

Trainer/driver Duncan MacTavish lived nearby. On his way to work, MacTavish would often give Donato a ride to Blue Bonnets.

Donato would often spend his time watching the horses train from the floor above the track kitchen at Blue Bonnets.

Moe Graif, a legendary horsemen's bookkeeper had an office on that floor. Graif was also a good friend of Donato's dad Giuseppe. He knew of Giuseppe Lanni's aversion to having his son "waste" his time watching horses train at the expense of his education. But Graif kept it a secret in order to let the young man have a chance at doing what he felt he was born to become.

"Uncle Moe," as the Brown family and others came to know him, was one who was a friend of the young and always one who lent a helping hand to those who might need one. In this case, Moe kept Donato's visits to the upper floor between himself and the young man.



Donato had firmly decided that his future lay in horse racing, preferably thoroughbred racing, which he then knew very little about. It is on that thread that the first of two conversations at the Fasig Tipton sales facility began.

Donato, all of your background was in harness racing, yet you decided that you eventually wanted to be with the thoroughbreds. Why?

"I just felt that the thoroughbreds had more potential and offered more opportunity. There were more of them and they were spread over the world, far more than were the trotters and pacers. Just about everybody had heard about the Kentucky Derby. Very few knew what the Hambletonian was. But don't get me wrong. I didn't care all that much at the time. To be involved with horses, with the best of any breed was the great desire."

At a young age you decided that Kentucky was the horse capitol of the world and that if there was a future for you in the business, Kentucky would be a good starting point.

"It was 1996. I had just graduated from Concordia University in Montreal. They were offering a summer program which would enable my being able to get a temporary visa to work in the states. I took advantage of it and came down. I had no job. Really no background or references that would do me any good in this new venue.

"But I was young and just decided to wing it. After a while I ran out of money and I had to pitch a tent at the Kentucky Horse Park and lived there for some time.

"I got a job working at Castleton Farms. John Cashman hired me

and I became a yearling foreman. I loved working at Castleton and John treated me wonderfully. But being in Lexington and around so many of the world's great thoroughbreds and thoroughbred farms, I had been bitten by that particular bug.

"After our yearling crop at Castleton had been sold. I told Cashman I wanted to get into the thoroughbred business. Walmac International was then one of, if not the most prominent of stud farms. They, Gainesway and Spendthrift each stood about 15 stallions, many of the best ones in the entire world. Walmac was run by the legendary John TL Jones. If there was one person most responsible for any success that I had to that time it was Johnny Jones. I probably learned more from and being around him than I did from pretty much anybody else before. Among the stallions we stood were Nureyev, Miswaki and Alleged. But they weren't the ones that needed selling. They sold themselves. I was on the phone all the time hustling to get bookings to some of the others.

"Johnny Jones was also a noted bloodstock agent. It was from him that I initially learned my craft. He sold and bought horses. Eventually, so did I. While I was at Walmac, Johnny sponsored me on my first route towards becoming an American citizen.

"John Gaines who started the Breeders' Cup races said that without Johnny Jones help in bringing the industry together, the Breeders' Cup would never have evolved. There are some who think that if the Breeders' Cup had never come to pass, that the Hambletonian Society would not have followed suit and established the Breeders Crown. It's really something how our two sports often interact, considering how John Gaines came from a renowned standardbred background.

"After Johnny stepped aside from Walmac, I went to work for John Sikura at Hill N Dale Farm. He was one of the most astute horse traders ever. There was absolutely nothing about selling or buying horses with which John Sikura did not possess expertise. After 20 years at Hill N Dale, with the blessing of John and with the urging of a fella by the name of Bob Baffert, I decided to go on my own.

"Before I go any further, I need to say that Bob just may be the greatest horseman to have ever inhabited this planet. I won't say much more than that. From my experience with him, he is the finest, kindest and most knowing horseman that I know. He taught me how to both look at and understand a horse."

From your experience what is the difference between thoroughbred and standardbred trainers?

"The differences are vast. In terms of time and physically spending time with the horse is concerned, the harness guys probably spend more time with it. They generally play a big part in choosing it at a sale. They break it. They bring it to the point where it's ready to race. They physically train it while it's racing and have done so the entire career of the horse.

"It can be very different with the thoroughbreds. Various trainers use different methods. Only some of the trainers come to the major yearling sales. The majority do not come or only make brief cameo appearances.

"It's guys like me, together with the owners and veterinarians who generally do the yearling picking and decide how the money gets spent. Bobby Frankel who many consider to have been the greatest trainer ever, rarely attended a horse sale. Sometimes the trainer might not get to see his pupils until they are ready to race. With others, they are with their horses from the onset. There are all sorts of specialists in this game that you don't find in harness racing — people who scout out the horses throughout their growth until they reach the sale as yearlings, people who specialize in buying weanlings and growing them to resell as yearlings, people who look at them at the sales, those who buy them; those who break them, the pinhookers who buy them for resale in twos in training sales and maybe a couple that I've left off.

"Depending on the trainer and his or her methods, he or she determines any specialties for which the horse might be best suited and where and when it should be raced. If they race often, they might race once a month. As you know the harness guys might race every week."

How about the horses? How do they differ?

"They are bred to be different and they are. Speaking in generalities, and of course there are variants among the generalities, the thoroughbred is generally less even tempered and perhaps less adaptable. Because of the nature of how they hit the ground, they are probably more susceptible to injury or unsoundness. Again, with exceptions the trotter or pacer is usually better keeled. Their bone structure is more forgiving. The thoroughbreds are faster and for the most part they have reached their highest speeds and that index has somewhat leveled off. Standardbreds do not quite yet seem to have reached theirs yet, but they will. It seems that they go slightly faster each year. However, for the most part, they only go one distance on one type of surface. This allows those breeding and training them to point only at a singular area in which they will be raced. With the thoroughbreds it's a different ballgame with all sorts of potentially different goals."

You have several friends and acquaintances among the harness racing folk.

"Yes, indeed. Most of them are also and have been involved with thoroughbreds. Among them are the Antonacci family, David Reid, David Anderson, Steve Heimbecker, Daniel Plouffe, Robert Leblanc, Clay Horner and John Fielding. All of them are good people. As I am doing today, I attend the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale each year where I am able to renew acquaintances."

Are you happy doing what you do? Do you see perhaps changing, maybe to training or adding any other areas to which you are involved?

"I consider myself to be one of the luckiest of people. I have a fantastic wife Elizabeth and two wonderful daughters Rebecca and Mariabella. Both girls love horses and show them. There are no absolutes in this life of ours. You never know for sure what the future might bring.

"As for now, I'm pretty happy doing what I do. I've been fortunate enough to have chosen several champions for my clients including the greats Arrogate, Authentic and Gamine.

"I'm looking forward to the Breeders' Cup races where four of the horses I chose for clients — Pinehurst, Gracie Adler, War Like Goddess and Private Mission — will be racing. War Like Goddess is kind of a special story, since we bought her for only \$30,000.

"Any day that you are around horses has to be a day well on its way towards being a good one. For me that applies to most days, because I'd guess that I look at somewhere about 20,000 horses a year."

The Curmudgeon gets a puzzle solved by one of the sport's true geniuses.

Those who have followed me here on HRU, on social media and in person, know that for years I've mentioned a puzzle to which I've never been able to find the answer — that is until I encountered the great John Campbell at the recent charity stallion auction cocktail hour at Fasig Tipton.

"You know Murray, I've got the answer to your question," Campbell said.

The question he was referencing was why have so many stallions who were tremendously successful from their first crop of yearlings in the sales ring have then had their second crop not sell as well, despite the tremendous success they achieved on the racetrack.

To this dope, logic would have suggested that because the first crop raced so well that the second and subsequent crops would sell better. They rarely have.

"It's quite simple," Campbell said. "With the first crop everybody was all in. Everybody who bought an Artsplace or Western Hanover (the two stallions I mention most often fitting this description) was to varying degrees high on them. Sure there were some, maybe many who raced well and produced good results for their connections. However, there were some, maybe more, who didn't race to the purchasers' expectations. That is the case with virtually all stallions.

"All of their progeny do not perform well. Some, maybe a good number of them, do not. Many of the connections of those were out of the marketplace for them the next year because of the lack of success they had with them. It's quite simple actually. You have fewer bidders because of those disappointed the second year than the first where everybody who bought one was bullish on their chances. Fewer bidders generally makes for lower prices."

Allie Skowyra – trainer / breeder / caretaker

Luckily, for a young girl who loved horses, Allie Skowyra's family's farm was located next to a standardbred facility in Binghamton, NY.

When Skowyra was 9, her mother brought her to a farm and introduced her to what would become her passion and life career.

"Although my family wasn't involved in harness racing, I was hooked the day I laid my eyes on a horse. Ironically, I'm presently back on my childhood farm where it all began for me. Guess you could say, I've come full circle," Skowyra said.

"As an adolescent I groomed horses, and today I run a broodmare operation which is my major focus. In the off season, I also work for Rob and Patti Harmon (Harmon Racing) of Mildford, PA.

"My barn duties vary, depending on if it's on or off-season; but during working season I feed, water, clean stalls, turn the mares in and out, meet with the vet, ultrasound, breed and foal.

"Along with that comes regular trips to the feed store and getting bales of hay.

"During off season when I work for Harmon Racing I'm a caretaker in the barn; mucking stalls, cleaning buckets, harnessing, bathing and putting away the horses.

"Race days include paddocking given the day we can race, anywhere from one to six horses, give or take."

In 2021 Skowyra was the caretaker for SHECOULDBEGOOD N, who raced at Tioga Downs.

"I was the caretaker for the mare during the meet. However, the trainer who deserves all the credit is in fact, Patti Harmon.

"With any large operation it takes a village and great team to make this happen, and I wasn't the only one who cared for SHECOULDBEGOOD N. Rodney Freese was actively involved in her care, too."

Skowyra is the ever-ready battery that seems to have unending energy, for besides her career, she is also a wife and mother of two young boys.

Although Skowyra's husband, Joe, is a trainer at Tioga Downs, the couple keep their businesses separate in terms of racing and breeding.

"Currently, Joe has a stable of 15 horses — an assortment of aged and homebreds. I breed and raise the horses and when they are ready for training, should they not be sold, they will go to my husband.

"He certainly helps here on the farm, but broodmares and foaling is not his passion.

"My boys — Parker who is 3, and Jackson, 20 months — spend a great deal of time in the barn, alternating between mom and dad.

"My parents who are retired also help with the boys when we have long days or are racing.

"My boys are total animal lovers. They love farm life and being in the barn, making the juggle of parent life and working long hours that much easier on us.

"As parents, we want the best for our kids, ultimately. Would I like to see them do something easier that requires less hours and gives them more flexibility as they get older? Yes, of course.

"But my parents supported my dreams and aspirations, and we will do the same. Education is first and then they can do anything they want."

Allie said her favorite all-time horse was McKenzie's Star.

"My favorite would be MCKENZIE'S STAR. She is by far one of the toughest mares I've ever had the privilege of owning and training. She's always been a bit quirky in her ways, but was an absolute beast on the track. She loved to race, and gave me thrills every time she hit the track. She is now retired and the matriarch of my broodmare band.

"The best horse I ever trained would be GOLDEN RECEIVER. I had him at the tail end of his racing career, and was blessed to have been with him when he won his last race at Vernon Downs where he was racing for charities at that point. He is now happily retired."

Today, Allie and Joe have three homebreds. They are 2-year-olds. Two were stopped to develop and the third is getting ready to qualify.

"After having my boys, I don't winter train. I stay home and focus on my children and broodmares, since I have mares foaling at this point. On occasion, I will go on the road for my husband, or the Harmons, but I try to focus mainly on the farm and kids.

"I love yearlings and prepping them, but this is when I lean to my husband for the training. Yearlings require a great deal of time and patience and at this stage of my life I don't have the time to be able to do so. I like to raise and hand them off. It's wonderful to see new trainers and caretakers take these athletes to new levels."

As if Allie doesn't have enough to do in her very busy life, she is also actively involved as an active supporter in the afterlife care of standardbreds.

"I've made it my goal to help where I can finding these wonderful animals who have given so much to us, into a loving, forever home.

"I do have a couple of warhorse retirees here on the farm that touched my life in certain ways to have earned happy retirements.

"I also try to help place horses when they need a new home after their career racing is over, or even save a horse that's in a bad spot. My goal is to help save or place at least one horse per year."

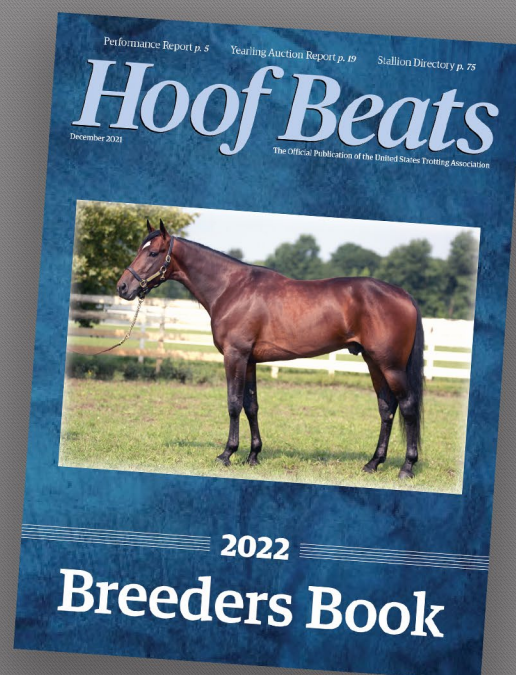

Merriman wins five PA Fairs titles, but has to share the spotlight

Aaron Merriman captured five of the eight Pennsylvania Fairs championships — each worth \$25,000 — Friday (Oct. 8) at The Meadows, but he had to share the spotlight with someone who has never had so much as a single drive.

That would be 11-year-old Dylan Daugherty, an aspiring track announcer who not only called the action of one championship, but he also got an owner's win in another final with Father Son.

The young man owns Father Son, a 2-year-old Father Patrick-All In The Muscles gelding trotter, with his grandmother, Susan Daugherty, while his grandfather, William Daugherty, Jr. trains the horse.

In the championship, Father Son seized the lead from post 6 and fought off several challenges — including one from his stablemate, Cussin N Fussin — to score in a career-best 1:57.3. Cussin N Fussin was second, 2 lengths back, with the first-over Moneymatters Devie third.

Young Dylan called races at three fairs this summer and was calm and professional after his owner's win, noting that another horse from his granddad's stable, Shayna Rosa also captured a championship.

"I'd say this was an amazing night in harness racing, especially with Shayna winning," he said. "It was a good night for the Daughertys."

In the other championships:

3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pace — Seth Hanover

The stretch drive as called by Dylan Daugherty was exciting, as the pocket-sitting Seth Hanover outkicked the front-ending Terry A Hanover to down him by 1-1/4 lengths in 1:52 for Brady Brown and trainer Mitchell York, who owns with David Brickell. Allieverdreamedof finished third.

"These two raced against each other all summer and were finishing first and second," York said. "He likes to come on the end of it."

York indicated he expects to sell Seth Hanover to make room for babies.

3-Year-Old Filly Trot — Margaretville

This may have been Merriman's most improbable victory, as Margaretville had been plagued by breaks and a loser in 33 of her 35 previous career outings. But the daughter of Bar Hopping-Cream Pie wasn't wasting away Friday. She moved three-wide through the final turn to spring the 15-1 upset in 1:55.3, a lifetime mark. Fire Up was second, beaten 3 lengths, with Misty Kristy third.

"She had to stay trotting, and I thought she'd be okay," said Dana Kahrig, who conditions Margaretville for Kahrig Racing Stable and Cache Is King LLC. "We changed her daily routine hoping that she would be good. I think that'll be it for her until next season."

2-Year-Old Filly Pace — Bettor Strait N Up

She had to duel for the early lead, But Bettor Strait N Up was untouchable once there, scoring by 3 lengths for Merriman in 1:55.1, yet another career best. Gottaluvit Hanover and Bet She Can Fly rounded out the ticket.

"I opened her up this week so she could see horses coming at her, and apparently she really likes that. She responded when she could see them," said Linda Schadel, who trains the daughter of Betting Line-Strait N Great and owns with Tony Schadel. "She'll be turned out and have a couple months off."

2-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pace — Captain T Hanover

Roger Hammer, long-time "King of the Fairs" In Pennsylvania, is known for his aggressive driving style, and the joke was that when Merriman zipped to the top with the Captaintreacherous-Temptation Hanover gelding and kept the pedal to the metal, he was following the King's instructions. Merriman laughingly dismissed that, indicating it was his familiarity with the youngster that dictated his strategy.

"I drove him a couple times earlier this year," Merriman said. "He seems to take himself up at the end; I think it's immaturity rather than fatigue, so I wanted to get some separation from the field."

The game plan worked perfectly, as Captain T Hanover bested Buchannon Hanover by 1-1/2 lengths in 1:55. Myartblongstorock completed the ticket.

2-Year-Old Filly Trot — Shayna Rosa

As young Dylan Daugherty noted, his granddad's horse, Shayna Rosa, took the title, perhaps thanks to some rigging changes the trainer made to help her finish better.

"We opened her blind bridle up and plugged her ears," the elder Daugherty said. "She was a lot quieter tonight."

Shayna Rosa showed no signs of stopping, shooting the Lightning Lane for Dave Palone and triumphing in 1:57.1, fastest win of her career. Early leader Till Im Gone was second, 2 lengths in arrears, while Dallas Bi rallied for show.

Susan Daugherty, who owns the daughter of Cantab Hall—Celebrity Sweedie, got her second championship on the evening.

3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Trot — Killer Instinct

Merriman was three wide early with Killer Instinct but wasn't worried that the Southwind Frank-Wheely Quick gelding would flatten out late.

"These horses are pretty seasoned," he said. "Even the 2-year-olds have probably seen it all at the fairs already, and this is a 3-year-old. He fought and did what he had to do."

Killer Instinct persevered and scored in 1:56.1 for trainer Andy Rickert and owners Corey Hendricks and Melanie O'Donnell. Mr Jeff and Tricky Dick completed the ticket.

3-Year-Old Filly Pace — Tonianne

Andy Miller envisioned a routine quarter-pole move to the point for Tonianne, but when he tried it, things got a little complicated.

"A horse got grabby and wouldn't stay in the hole, so it ended up being a little longer move than I would have liked," Miller said. "But we still got to the front before the half, and it was clear sailing from there."

The daughter of Somebeachsomewhere—Table Talk was much the best, prevailing in 1:52.4 — matching her career best — 2 lengths better than Sweet Baby Kaylee, with Tiamogonedancen third.

Todd Schadel trains the winner for Andy Miller Stable and Louis Willinger, but Miller indicated she's ticketed for the Harrisburg sale.

Live racing at The Meadows resumes Tuesday (Oct. 12) when the program features a \$23,973.43 carryover in the final-race Super Hi-5. First post is 12:45 p.m.

Typically the large volume players can manipulate the pools by placing their wagers as close to "off" as possible. This method allows them to conceal their wagers from the public. The public are the dupes who get run over in an unfair game.

Anyway, what this does is prevent high volume betting syndicates

and high volume single players from "betting the bell."

And with the 30 to 45 second lag between the moment the gate begins to roll to "off" gives time for tote systems to chew on the data and have time to catch up.

One other thing. I dispute the context of the article regarding the NYRA rule. The writer stated the win pools were down 12 per cent.

That may be true, but given the fact that the 2021 Saratoga meet set an all-time record for handle. That tells me the money that would have gone to the win pools, was wagered in other pools.

There are solutions. But those are stuck in the politics of the game.

My guess is there is a fear among track managements that if large volume bettors who view parimutuel pools as their exclusive playground will suddenly remove their business and wager on other things.

Bunk. These people have invested tons of money and time developing their wagering systems and programs. I find it unlikely they will abandon horse racing.
