The result was predictable and awesome for the great colt.



further with our conversation on that subject, but during dinner he told me a great story that I will share with you.

I spent a lot of time in my career racing in Europe and in my travels became very friendly with Wim Paal and his girlfriend Alessandra Baldi. They actually spent a lot of time racing in the U.S. one summer. Interestingly, Alessandra is the sister of Lorenzo Baldi who drove Trustworthy to victory for me in the 1995 edition of the Orsi Mangelli at the San Siro Track in Milan, Italy.

Brian told me that Wim had actually helped him win the International at Yonkers with Cruzado Dela Noche, a longshot, when Wim was driving Ringostarr Treb for the pride of Providence, Rhode Island trainer extraordinaire Jerry Riordan, who was the favorite.

Paal who knew Brian's horse well, offered some valuable information, that he was a one-run horse and that you should save him as long as possible for him to be the most competitive. Brian took the advice and with a giant rush to the wire was the winner in the \$1 million event. As the race developed, Brian saved his horse and came second over in the mile-and-a-quarter race. After the leader, Hambletonian winner Marion Marauder, gave way to Lionel, Sears used the big brush Paal had told him about to go three deep and draw off by a head at 30-1.

Unfortunately, Wim Paal's evening ended too early as Ringostarr made an untimely break in the first turn.

The magic of Lexington was truly overwhelming in 2019. The power of the sale, and the fabulous performances on the Red Mile track combined with the dazzling night life and spectacular weather provided a buzz that was evident throughout the entire two-week event. I would say the average visitor or horseman walked away with an elevated feeling that they haven't had in quite a while.

You likely have read the stories and results way before my column hits your inbox, so I will not bore you with facts and figures. However, I must be a little repetitive by pointing out some major achievements of note that need congratulations.

On the human side, Dexter Dunn set the sport on its ear with two weeks of sheer driving superiority. Ake Svanstedt put on a training and driving show.

On the equine side, there were too many grand efforts to mention them all, but the crushing performances by Greenshoe, Six Pack and McWicked, as well as the gutsy miles put in by Bettor's Wish and Manchego (also a world record) are certainly worth my mention.

I apologize if I offended someone by leaving them out because every day had so many big efforts, but I selected what I deemed to be the greatest.

I have received a bunch of mail lately, probably because of the national political scene, that it would be good for our sport to have whistleblowers. To this writer, if it works in government why can't it work for us? Therefore any whistleblowers with valuable information that can help in

Rob Robinson asks: I understand that you have been advising Lindy farms in regard to yearling purchases. I would be interested if you would tell me if you had any success in buying in Lexington and which horses they purchased on your suggestion?

I thought about throwing this question in the round file (the garbage) because, as many of you are aware, selecting colts is not an easy game. But when I pondered it fully I thought, 'What the hell. It won't be the first time I was laughed at and it certainly won't be the last,' and, to top that, I really like what we bought.

The first two nights were nothing short of impossible unless you had a no-limit bankroll. There were a lot of colts with great pedigrees, conformation and ability and they all brought top dollar. Oddly, the better looking individuals were selling at a premium until the last horse was sold late Saturday night.

FYI Lindy Farm bought two horses on my suggestion. The first on Wednesday night was hip number 375 a Captaintreacherous colt from Pink Terror, her first foal, consigned by Hunterton Farms for Tony Alagna and Stephanie and Myron Bell's Riverview Farm for \$150,000. The second didn't come till a few horses from the end of the sale, hip number 782 a Swan For All filly, the first foal of Cree a Muscle Hill mare consigned by Peninsula farm for \$95,000. Knowing Frank "the elder" Antonacci and his son, Frank M. Antonacci, I didn't list the names as they surely will be changed.

Joel Kravet asks: (I really like this guy. He writes interesting stuff, but every question is like a novel. Joel, please don't get depressed if I make it readable): What do you think is the effect of all the new high-priced stallions? The syndicate owners will enjoy the insider advantages, but outsiders, if they can get in, will be paying very high prices for the breedings. I think this will cause the major stakes to have fewer nominations and therefore lower purses because the average buyer will realize the uphill battle racing Chevys vs. Caddies.

Just for fun, when I grew up there was no chance a Caddie could outsprint a Chevy, but I get your point.

We live in a capitalist society, and all your complaints are basically business as usual. What you are actually saying is that progress is not good. It is true that under these circumstances the insiders have an advantage, but to my knowledge what happens is perfectly normal. With all the \$100,000-plus colts sold two years ago, it looks to me that in the 3-year-old pacing division the \$20,000 Bettors Wish has a commanding lead. This happens all the time. We are selling a dream. There is not much rhyme or reason in the yearling business, and there are few horses at auction in the major sales that on paper are too non-descript to think about not staking. Plus, it is far from an exact science. I see colts sell for \$300,000 that I thought were horrid and have seen colts I

thought worth \$100,000 bring \$30,000. You can't buy the sport, many have tried and all have failed.

As far as the high-priced stallions diminishing the amount of stakes payments, I understand your point but there has been such a monumental infusion of capital into the game that I feel the opposite will result. True, some little guys will opt out but that's the nature of the game.

One more thing to consider: With all the new high-priced stallions, it appears that the average buyer gets a chance to play that game. There are so many top-bred colts that some fall through the cracks. There is only so much money to go around and when you have Walner, Greenshoe, Six Pack, along with Muscle Hill, Cantab Hall, Chapter Seven and Father Patrick, it won't be hard to find a \$50,000 top trotting colt.



Atlanta favored in Yonkers International Trot

Atlanta was made the 3-1 morning-line favorite for Saturday's (Oct. 12) \$1 million Yonkers International Trot at Empire City Casino's Yonkers Raceway after drawing post three for the 41st edition of the invitational for older trotters. A 4-year-old mare, Atlanta will represent the United States in the 10-horse, nine-nation field.

The draw for the race, which will be contested at the distance of 1-1/4 miles around Yonkers' half-mile oval, was held Tuesday (Oct. 8) during a luncheon at Empire City Casino's Good Time Room.

Atlanta, the 2018 Trotter of the Year in the U.S., is one of two stateside representatives in the International Trot and heads to the race off a 1:53 qualifier at Harrah's Philadelphia on Sept. 24. In her previous start, she won the Charlie Hill Memorial on Sept. 7 at Scioto Downs.

For the year, Atlanta has won seven of 11 starts and finished second on three occasions, earning \$658,400. She has won 19 of 35 career races and \$1.79 million. The 4-year-old mare is trained by Ron Burke, driven by Yannick Gingras, and owned by Crawford Farms Racing, Brad Grant, and Howard Taylor.

"At the end, it was (posts) two, three, and five; it didn't matter which one of the three," Gingras said. "Post three is as good a spot you're going to get. We're really happy with where we're starting.

"I feel really good because she trained (at Yonkers) last week and she was so good. She was strong finishing, too, and went a good mile. I wasn't really planning on going super-fast, but she felt good and wanted to buzz through one turn, and she did. I think all systems are go. We've got a good post, a sharp mare, and we'll see what we can do."



Atlanta is one of three mares in the field, with France's **Bahia Quesnot** and Switzerland's **Uza Josselyn**. Bahia Quesnot most recently finished second to Propulsion in the European Trotting Masters championship and earlier this season was second in two Group 1 events, the Oslo Grand Prix and Prix Maharajah. Uza Josselyn also has two Group 1 runner-up finishes this year, in the Prix D'Atlantique and Grand Prix de France.

Bahia Quesnot, who starts from post two, and Uza Josselyn, who leaves from post four, are both 5-1.

The International Trot has been won by a mare 11 times, most recently by Peace Corps in 1991. The International Trot was contested from 1959 through 1995 before being resurrected in 2015.

Guardian Angel AS, to be driven by Tim Tetrick for trainer Anette Lorentzon, drew post nine in the second tier and is the 4-1 second choice on the morning line.

"I'm not very happy with it; we're much better being on the gate, but it is what it is," assistant trainer Anna Lorentzon said. "Timmy has to work the trip out from there.

Guardian Angel AS finished third in his most recent race, the Caesars Trotting Classic on Sept. 20 at Harrah's Hoosier Park. His most recent victory was in the Maple Leaf Trot on Aug. 31 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The 5-year-old stallion, also representing the U.S., has won seven of 12 races this season and earned \$664,634. He is owned by ACL Stuteri AB and Kjell Johansson.

"He feels good. As soon as I shipped him back to New Jersey he's been back to his old self. He's had a really good season, better than we were hoping. So far so good. It would mean a lot (to win the International). There is a lot of prestige in it and we're representing the U.S. It's an honor to do that," Anna said.

There are four returnees from last year's International Trot, including winner **Cruzado Dela Noche**. The 7-year-old stallion, representing Sweden for owner Anders Strom's Courant Inc., is trained by Marcus Melander and will have Brian Sears in the sulky. He will start from post seven.

Other horses back for another try are Canada's **Marion Marauder**, Norway's **Lionel**, and Denmark's **Slide So Easy**.

Marion Marauder is making his third appearance in the race; he finished second in 2017 and fifth in 2018. The 6-year-old stallion, seeking his first win of the year, has captured 20 of 60 lifetime starts and earned \$3.21 million. He is trained by Paula Wellwood, driven by Scott Zeron and owned Wellwood's mother Jean Wellwood and Paula's son, Devin Keeling.

Lionel, a 9-year-old stallion who has earned nearly \$2 million in his career, finished second in last year's race while Slide So Easy finished eighth.

Slide So Easy will start from post one, Marion Marauder from post six, and Lionel from post eight.

Germany's **Norton Commander** and Italy's **Zacon Gio** complete this year's field.

"Of course, it's a strong field," Gingras said, assessing the horses from overseas. "Uza Josselyn is a really strong mare and she's quick. Zacon Gio is unbeaten this year and everybody I've talked to says he's great on a half-mile track. He's a strong horse, as well. Lionel, he's a little handicapped with post eight, but we saw what he could do last year. Bahia Quesnot has been really good in France.

"(Atlanta) is not alone in the race. There are many horses that belong. Of course, we're one of them, but she's going to have to race hard."

Racing begins at 1 p.m. Saturday at Yonkers Raceway. The International Trot is race seven with a 3 p.m. (EDT) approximate post time. The card also includes the \$250,000 Harry Harvey Trot (race eight) and the \$250,000 Dan Rooney Pace (race 11).

Marion Marauder's connections hoping his first win of 2019 will come in the International Trot

As 2016 Triple Crown champion Marion Marauder nears the end of a bumpy, (so far) winless season, trainer Paula Wellwood hopes he finds his form in time to represent Canada well in the \$1 million International Trot on Saturday at Yonkers Raceway.

"We have faith in our horse, for sure," Wellwood said.

Although the 6-year-old son of Muscle Hill—Spellbound Hanover is beloved by everyone who regularly comes in contact with him, this season has been marked by assorted setbacks leading to a 0 for 8 record with two second-place finishes and one third-place showing. His earnings of \$78,525 are relatively meager when compared to his lifetime bankroll of \$3,219,405.

Marion Marauder has been playing catch-up since the spring, when he became entangled in a fence at a farm in New Jersey. He injured a hock and a shoulder, the severity of those injuries only becoming clear over time.

When the trotter was ready to compete, nothing quite went his way. He relies on a solid pace to set up his strong closing kick.



"I think the horse is kind of frustrated," Wellwood said. "But, so far, it hasn't broken his will."

Driver Scott Zeron knows racing is a game of patience, and he has stayed the course.

"It took a little bit to correct a few things that were bugging him. You could see he would get a bit bumpy down the stretch," Zeron said. "But it was never for lack of effort or trying. He still has the will to go out there and win. The times I felt he was on top of his game, I could never find the right trip with him."

In keeping with the way pretty much everything has gone this season, Marion Marauder enters the International having not raced since Sept. 20. He was scratched from his last scheduled start, in an open trot on Sept. 30, when he spiked a slight fever.

"He's part of our family, so we take care of him unbelievably," Wellwood said. "When he's not right, Marauder does not race."

According to Wellwood, the horse is training well for his third International start. He owns second- and fifth-place finishes in the event the previous two years at a half-mile oval that has been to his liking throughout his career. He drew the rail for each of his first two cracks at the International, which was not to his benefit because he lacks quickness away from the gate.

Last year's International turned into quite a misadventure because the talented Zeron found himself on the early lead, a place he definitely did not want to be.

"I would never have predicted being in front by the half," he said. "But it was a matter of a couple of breakers in that first turn. It changed the whole outlook of the race."

The early advantage simply did not fit the way Marauder wants to get the job done.

"He just feels like a horse that when he gets to look at somebody, he wants to go by them. He knows what his job is," Zeron said. "Up front, he can get a little lackadaisical." This year, Marauder drew post six in a field of 10 that is headed by the speedy Atlanta. She and driver Yannick Gingras will leave from post three as the 3-1 morning-line favorite. The 41st International, and fifth since the race was revived after a 20-year hiatus, attracted horses from nine nations.

"Atlanta is the horse to beat," Wellwood said, "but I don't know if she'll get her own way. These European horses race different. You don't get to steal soft fractions. They are usually right on you."

Zeron is optimistic that he will get the strong pace he needs for Marauder to be at his best.

"Every time he goes behind the gate, he's a factor," the driver said. "I just feel the six hole and all, it shouldn't matter. We're going a mile and a quarter. He's been very good at this racetrack. If I could find the right trip, maybe take a few shortcuts, it's a horse race. Anything could work out in our favor and I feel he will give me 100 per cent effort, no matter what."

Wellwood is realistic about Marauder's prospects in the International, which is expected to go off at 3 p.m. on Saturday. "We just hope he represents us well," she said. "Sure, we'd love to win it, but it's a very tough field and we understand that. We never put heavy expectations on him. He's been too good to us."

Whatever happens in the International, the \$6 million Breeders Crown at Woodbine Mohawk Park is scheduled to complete Marauder's season. His future will be evaluated after that.

"I would think, at most, if we continue to race him it would only be for next year and that would be it," Wellwood said. "We won't push him past seven. We wouldn't do that."

Guardian Angel AS and Marion Marauder chase additional Yonkers success in International

Guardian Angel AS and **Marion Marauder** have enjoyed success at Empire City Casino's Yonkers Raceway in the past and each will try to add to his accomplishments Saturday (Oct. 12) in the \$1 million Yonkers International Trot.


Marion Marauder, whose three lifetime wins at The Hilltop include the 2016 Yonkers Trot, is making his third appearance in the International. He finished second in 2017 and fifth in 2018. Guardian Angel AS, who is heading to his first International, has six career victories on the half-mile oval at Yonkers.

Saturday's 41st edition of the International Trot brings together an invitational field of 10 older trotters, including 2018 champion Cruzado Dela Noche (full story here) representing nine nations. Guardian Angel AS, one of two U.S. representatives, is the 4-1 second choice on the morning line

after drawing post nine in the second tier behind the starting gate. Atlanta, the other U.S. rep, is the 3-1 favorite from post three.

Guardian Angel AS has won seven of 12 races this season and earned \$664,634 in purses, which leads all older trotters in North America.

The 5-year-old stallion has won at least one race on every sized racetrack in North America this season, including a



half-mile world-record 1:52 performance at Northfield Park in the Cleveland Trotting Classic, Canadian-record-equaling 1:50.4 effort in the Maple Leaf Trot at seven-eighths Woodbine Mohawk Park, and a track-record 1:51.3 clocking in the Spirit of Massachusetts at five-eighths Plainridge Park.

For his career, Guardian Angel AS has won 23 of 52 starts and \$1.18 million. He is trained by Anette Lorentzon, driven by Tim Tetrick, and owned by ACL Stuteri AB and Kjell Johansson.

Guardian Angel AS will start from the second tier for the second consecutive race, having left from the trailing position in the Caesars Trotting Classic on Sept. 20 at Harrah's Hoosier Park. He finished third.

"I'd rather have my nose on the gate, that way I'd have a fair shot at using his gate speed if I want," Tetrick said. "(Post) 10 would have been better, where I don't get locked in along the rail. But, that's what God gave us, so we just have to work with it.

"Anytime you get to race for a million, it's pretty awesome. Yonkers is a very historic track and I enjoy getting to race here every time I come here."

Marion Marauder has raced six times at Yonkers and finished worse than second only once.

"He's gotten around this track a bunch of times and has done well," said his driver, Scott Zeron. "He's a relentless horse; he tries every time he gets out there. He's had an off year for the way he's been his whole career, so we're just hoping things are going to change. Hopefully I can trip him out and drive him the right way.

"(The foreign horses) are very good. They can stay on the outside and take a lot of air, when a lot of our horses, we've just never taught them that type of system. You can't underestimate any of them."

Atlanta is one of three mares in the International Trot field, with France's **Bahia Quesnot** and Switzerland's **Uza Josselyn**. Bahia Quesnot, who starts from post two, and Uza Josselyn, who leaves from post four, are both 5-1 on the morning line.

In August, Uza Josselyn won the Group 1 Prix Maharajah at Solvalla in Sweden, with Bahia Quesnot finishing second in the championship event for trotting mares. Earlier in the year, Uza Josselyn finished second in the Group 1 Prix de France at a distance roughly equivalent to the 1-1/4 miles for the International. The Prix de France was won by Readly Express, with Bold Eagle third and Dijon (who later won the Elitlopp) fourth.

For her career, the 8-year-old Uza Josselyn has won 32 of 70 races and \$1.41 million.

"She had some very good races in France going against the best horses over the same distance," said Barbara Aebischer, the caretaker of Uza Josselyn and wife of trainer Rene Aebischer. "It's her distance on Saturday, so we hope she does as well as there.

"She always does very well. She always gives her best. She really goes with the heart."

Bahia Quesnot most recently finished second to Propulsion in the Group 2 European Trotting Masters championship. She enters the International off three consecutive second-place efforts, with another Group 2 runner-up finish sandwiched between the Trotting Masters final and Prix Maharajah.

Also an 8-year-old, Bahia Quesnot has won eight of 84 lifetime starts and \$1.01 million. She has finished second on 16 occasions.

"She's been doing really good," said Paola Guelpa, Bahia Quesnot's caretaker and the sister of trainer/driver Junior Guelpa, through a translator. "We got her in training in December last year and we have been working on her morale. She is very happy now and that's probably why she has been doing so well. Hopefully, she will get her big day soon."

The International Trot has been won by a mare 11 times, most recently by Peace Corps in 1991. The International Trot was contested from 1959 through 1995 before being resurrected in 2015.

Italy's **Zacon Gio** enters the International as the field's hottest horse, with 11 consecutive victories. This will be the 4-year-old stallion's first time racing outside of Italy. He has won 20 of 29 career races and \$496,834.

"He's just a really good horse," trainer Holger Ehlert said through a translator. "He's getting better and better and he knows how to do anything. He can wait, he can go on the lead, he can do any tactic.

"I hope he gets a good race. It's not going to be easy because there are a lot of good horses, but my horse is very good too."

Racing begins at 1 p.m. Saturday at Yonkers Raceway. The International Trot is race seven with a 3 p.m. (EDT) approximate post time. The card also includes the \$250,000 Harry Harvey Trot (race eight) and the \$250,000 Dan Rooney Pace (race 11).

Cruzado Dela Noche gunning for back-to-back Yonkers International Trot victories


Entering the 2018 edition of the Yonkers International Trot, Cruzado Dela Noche hadn't started in a pari-mutuel race in four months and hadn't won a major stakes race since capturing the Group 1 Copenhagen Cup in May, 2017. Predictably, bettors dismissed the 6-year-old Muscle Massive son at 30-1 odds in the \$1 million event.

However, off two qualifying wins for trainer Marcus Melander and picking up Brian Sears, Cruzado Dela Noche worked out a brilliant trip in the 1 1/4-mile stakes, tracking Lionel's first-over assault on leader Marion Marauder. With the plugs pulled and the whip on the trotter's tail, Sears angled Cruzado Dela Noche three-wide with five-sixteenths of a mile to trot and joining Marion Marauder and Lionel, made it a three-across battle entering the final turn.

Lionel put away Marion Marauder as he straightened into the lane and with Cruzado Dela Noche losing ground around the fifth bend, Lionel appeared to be on his way to International Trot glory. However, Sears went to the right-handed stick in the stretch and his trotter reengaged. As Lionel reached for the wire, Cruzado Dela Noche lunged, nailing his white-blazened rival in the shadow of the finish post.

One year later, the enormity of Yonkers International Trot victory sticks with Sabine Kagebrandt, managing director of Cruzado Dela Noche's ownership company Stall Courant Ab.

"That brought us so much joy," she said. "That meant a lot to us and it meant a lot to me because that horse brings us so much joy and he's a really good horse and he has a really big heart. That he can take that win and show that he is an



international horse, that's the main thing. He had some wins in big races in other countries, but then he had one in America.

"To win that big race under those conditions, it's not so easy to go that many turns at Yonkers. It's more money than the Prix d'Amérique, so it was a really big win for us and it was a big win for the horse. It means a lot, it's a very big race to win, so we were so happy for that."

Cruzado Dela Noche's Yonkers International Trot victory joined the Copenhagen Cup and Group 1 Grosser Preis Von Deutschland on the trotter's resume, improved his record to 15-for-55, and boosted his earnings to \$1,202,771. It was also the biggest win in Melander's training career, which began in 2014 after he relocated from his native Sweden. The 27-year-old conditioner's rapid rise to the top of the sport goes hand-in-hand with his partnership with Courant.

"We love to be part of that. We're so glad that he can make all that success," Kagebrandt said. "I have known Marcus since he was a child and we have followed his move here to America. I think we were the first big owners that put horses in his stable. It started with one or two horses and then we started with more expensive horses. We have always had a good faith in him. He has that kind of mission like we have, so we feel like it's a good match.

"We have the same view, how he should train and take care of the horses. We are very much involved also, talking about the training and where we should race. Of course, he's the one who's in charge, but he shares that information with us and we feel that we are part of it. That's how we like it. We really love to work with Marcus. That's really beautiful, I think."

Like Melander, Kagebrandt's career is on the rise. Over the past year, Kagebrandt's role at Courant evolved from doing the daily accounting and taking care of horses in the owner's Swedish stable to managing the company's budget and finances, selecting yearlings, and working alongside owner Anders Ström. A far cry from her initial aspirations of becoming a trainer, Kagebrandt appreciates the rarity of occupying such a role in a harness racing stable.

"It's really nice to work with Anders, we work really good together," Kagebrandt said. "I really enjoy it. I travel all around the world to do what I love. I love my job. It's beautiful. This kind of job, there are not so many jobs out there that are like mine."

Following his International Trot win, Cruzado Dela Noche finished sixth in the Breeders Crown Open Trot at Pocono and seventh in the TVG Free For All Trot at the Meadowlands. After a winter break, he returned this May to win the Arthur J. Cutler Memorial at the Swamp. Cruzado Dela Noche topped 11 rivals in the 9-furlong stakes to take the winner's share of the \$175,000 purse.

Although he's placed in another two stakes in six other seasonal starts, Cruzado Dela Noche hasn't found the winner's circle since the Cutler. He often comes from off the pace, but tends to run out of ground going the standard mile distance in America and Canada.

"I think he's been really, really great. He's one year older, but he still gives his best. He gets home really fast every time," Kagebrandt said. "He goes really, really good every time, so we're really happy with him."

Cruzado Dela Noche only failed to earn a check once this season when he finished last of six beaten 14 1/2 lengths in an elimination of the Maple Leaf Trot at Mohawk Aug. 24. Although he made a long first-over move in that start, Cruzado Dela Noche tired in the final 3 furlongs, uncharacteristic of his typically strong final quarters.

"He didn't like the shipping and he was not to be recognized. He wasn't feeling well. He wasn't himself, that's for sure," Kagebrandt said. "After that, he got some medication and he got to rest for two weeks to recover. He's been training at home. Marcus and Mikaela (Melander), they have been really happy with him. He has been strong again and really happy and he's doing his work really good."

After regrouping at Melander's New Egypt, NJ stable, Cruzado Dela Noche prepared to defend his Yonkers International Trot title with a 1:55.2 qualifying win at Harrah's Philadelphia Oct. 1. Racing 10 lengths off the pace in third at the half, Cruzado Dela Noche moved on the outside and kicked away with a :28.4 final panel to score by 4 1/2 lengths.

Returning to represent Sweden in the Yonkers International Trot, Kagebrandt is confident. She feels the added distance is ideal for the 7-year-old trotter.

"He doesn't have that kind of speed like Greenshoe, but he can go another lap," she said. "I'm really hopeful for the International because it's his distance. He's so much better at

longer distances and he's shown that in Europe as well. That's why I'm hopeful because now he finally gets a longer race and that's what he's best at."

Cruzado Dela Noche and Brian Sears drew post seven in this year's International, one slot outside his starting position last year and one slot inside of returning rival and last year's runner up Lionel of Norway. Denmark's Slide So Easy also competed last year and returns; he drew post one.

The new faces in this year's edition are 2018 Hambletonian winner Atlanta, who will represent the United States from post three. Guardian Angel As will also represent the United States and will start from the second tier in post nine. Marion Marauder will make his third appearance in the International representing Canada. European sensations Bahia Quesnot (France, post two), Uza Josselyn (Switzerland, post four), Zacon Gio (Italy, post five), and Norton Commander (Germany, post 10) complete the field.

"It is tougher. They have a really good field. They did last year, but this is tougher than last year, absolutely," Kagebrandt said. "The class of this year's International is really good. It's good for the race, it's good for everybody.

"We have great respect for our opponents. This year, Atlanta and Guardian Angel As should probably be seen as favorites," Kagebrandt said. "Among the Europeans, Uza Josselyn is super quick and Zacon Gio also comes with great reputation. They also have good post positions. We need racing luck to beat those horses for sure. But we have the best driver and a horse with a heart of gold."

Cruzado Dela Noche would join Su Mac Lad (1961, 1963), Roquepine (1967, 1968), Une de Mai (1969, 1971), Delmonica Hanover (1973, 1974), Ideal du Gazeau (1981, 1982, 1983), and Lutin d'Isigny (1984, 1985) as a repeat winner of the International should he prove victorious Saturday afternoon (Oct. 12).

"It would mean a lot, especially with 'Cruzado' because we know he's a really good horse," Kagebrandt said. "It's really hard for him to win races here. When he cannot open from the start, he always gets a bad trip. He really needs this win so people understand that he's a great horse. It's really hard competition, but I'm not worried. I think he'll be in good shape."

The \$1 million Yonkers International Trot is slated for Saturday, October 12 at Yonkers Raceway. The card will also feature a pair of \$250,000 invitationals, the 1 1/4-mile Harry Harvey Trot and 1-mile Dan Rooney Pace. For more information on the event and its participants, click here.

Antonsen and Lionel look to overcome post eight

Goran Antonsen learned a lot during his first trip to the \$1 million Yonkers International Trot last year, and following the draw for this year's race, he wished he didn't need to recall some of the knowledge he gained.

"I learned that post positions seven and eight are really, really bad," Antonsen said with a wry laugh after his **Lionel**, the runner-up to Cruzado Dela Noche in last year's International Trot, received post eight for Saturday's 41st renewal of the invitational for older trotters at Empire City Casino's Yonkers Raceway.

Lionel is 8-1 on the morning line for the International Trot, which brings a 10-horse field representing nine nations to Yonkers Raceway. Atlanta, one of two U.S. representatives, is the 3-1 favorite from post three.

Antonsen owns, trains and drives Lionel, a 9-year-old

stallion who represents Norway. Last year, Lionel and Antonsen started from the second tier's post nine and raced in the outer flow for much of the mile. In fact, Lionel was first over from the half-mile point to the final turn, where he took the lead from Marion Marauder but was unable to hold off Cruzado Dela Noche, losing by a head.

"It was a great experience," Antonsen said. "The driving



culture here is very much different from home. I feel the last experience is important, especially now when we have post position eight, because when you have a bad (post position) you are so dependent on what the others do.

"Even though we drew number eight we are still optimistic. But, of course, it is more difficult."

Lionel has won 25 of 82 career races and just shy of \$2 million. His victories include a handful of Group 1 events overseas, including the 2017 Olympiatravet (Olympic Trot).

Following last year's International Trot, Lionel returned to action in Paris, but was not in best form. He got time to freshen up and Antonsen said the horse is entering this year's International in good shape.

"When he was finished (in Paris) he was very tired,"
Antonsen said. "But he's been very good since July, when he
started to find his top form. Now, he should be as good as
last year."

Despite Lionel's starting spot Saturday, Antonsen is enjoying his return trip to New York.

"But," he said with a grin, "it would be even more fun if we had (post) two."

The connections of Denmark's **Slide So Easy**, also a returnee from last year's International Trot, were on the other end of the spectrum when it came to the draw for Saturday's race. Slide So Easy got post No. 1, which caused his table of supporters to erupt in cheers when it was announced at Tuesday's luncheon in Empire City Casino's Good Time Room.

"It couldn't be better, so we're very happy," said Thomas Clemmensen, who owns the 10-year-old gelding with Soren Christensen.

Slide So Easy arrived in the U.S. earlier than his European counterparts and stabled at Ake Svanstedt's Legend Farm in central New Jersey. Svanstedt will drive Slide So Easy for trainer Flemming Jensen in Saturday's race.

The horse has enjoyed a strong campaign overseas, winning seven of 11 races this year and finishing worse than second only once. His victories include a second consecutive Danmark Mesterskab (Denmark Championship).

For his career, the son of North American stakes-winning stallion Quite Easy has won 39 of 95 starts and \$405,585.

"I think he is a little bit better this year, so hopefully we can have a good race and come out and win," Clemmensen said. "He can open very fast, so if he wants, he can take the lead. I hope that Ake will take position second or third inside and come out at the end of the race."

Asked if that would be his instructions to Svanstedt, Clemmensen responded with a laugh. "I don't do that," he said. "I think Ake knows (what to do)."

A horse representing Germany has never won the International Trot. **Norton Commander** will try to become the first on Saturday.

Owned by Ulrich Mommert, the 5-year-old stallion is trained and driven by Conni Lugauer. He has won three of seven races this year and 12 of 24 lifetime, good for \$146,519. He will start the International Trot from post 10.

In August, Norton Commander finished third in the Group 1 Jubileumspokalen (Jubilee Cup).

"We're very happy with him," caretaker Nick Elving said. "He always gives 110 per cent in every race he does. We actually wanted (post) 10, to be an outsider."

Several weeks ago, Lugauer was asked by writer Brandon Valvo what it would mean to win the International Trot.

"I'm always thinking about victories, but I didn't think about victory in the International Trot," he said. "The question is too big. I don't know."

International Trot faces uncertain future with Yonkers under new management

The \$1 million International Trot faces an uncertain future beyond the 41st renewal on Saturday at Yonkers Raceway.

Ed Domingo, senior vice president and chief financial officer for Empire City Casino and Yonkers Raceway, indicated new owner MGM Resorts is taking a wait-and-see approach to the tradition-rich race.

"We absolutely hope that it works for us," said Domingo.
"There was some early sentiment that we wouldn't have it this year. We want to give it a fair shot, absolutely."

MGM Resorts purchased the casino and racetrack from Tim Rooney for a reported \$850 million in a deal that closed at the end of January. The International began in 1959 at old



Roosevelt Raceway and went into a 20-year hiatus before Rooney, eager to recapture the event's glorious past, revived it in 2015.

According to Joe Faraldo, president of the Standardbred Owners Association of New York, Rooney and former general manager Bob Galterio played integral roles in persuading MGM officials to give the mile-and-a-quarter classic at least this year.

"There was some doubt. I had spoken to Tim Rooney and Bob Galterio and they had said they were urging MGM to go forward with it," Faraldo said. "I think their help in convincing them was important and got us to where we are."

Faraldo said Rooney was so convinced of the value of the International Trot as a means of restoring some cache to Yonkers Raceway that he invested anywhere from \$350,000 to \$500,000 in out-of-pocket expenses to provide first-class accommodations and entertainment and make the race as attractive as possible to horsepeople from Europe.

To help fill the void created by the departure of the aging Rooney, Faraldo said the Standardbred Owners Association of New York is spending approximately \$140,000 to assist MGM with hotel space in New York City, entertainment that includes a cruise around Manhattan and other expenses ranging from giveaway caps to flags.

"Since it is a transitional period for MGM Grand to learn something about the sport, I don't want them to drop the ball during this transitional year," Faraldo said. "I want to let them see what the event is and hope they will have more of a commitment to it in the future."

This year's International Trot attracted representatives from nine nations. The 10-horse field includes defending champion Cruzado Dela Noche, representing Sweden, and Lionel of Norway, who narrowly missed as the runner-up last year.

The United States contingent is comprised of Atlanta and Guardian Angel AS. Atlanta, the top-ranked older trotter in North America, received post three in Tuesday's draw for post positions and was established as the 3-1 favorite. She will be driven by Yannick Gingras. Guardian Angel AS, who will be guided by Tim Tetrick from post nine in the field of 10, is second choice at 4-1.

Post time for the International is set for approximately 3 p.m. The matinee card also features the Harry Harvey Trot and the Dan Rooney Pace, each carrying a \$250,000 purse.

When Faraldo was asked why he views it as important to continue the International, he said, "Every racetrack needs a marquee event. The International Trot is a marquee event not only in the United States or North America, but globally. The people in Europe view this event as the world championship of trotting."

Domingo described racing as "a new industry for us." To help with the transition, Alex Dadoyan, who had been executive director of the Standardbred Owners Association of New York, was hired as director of racing in an announcement made on Sept. 18.

"Alex has a great reputation in the industry as not only a respected businessperson but as someone who understands betting and the betting side of the business," Domingo said.

Dadoyan has enjoyed a good relationship with Pari Mutuel Urbain, which will commingle wagering pools as it simulcasts the International throughout Europe. "That's big because the pools will be bigger," Faraldo said. Larger pools are critical to attracting major players.

While Rooney was somewhat forgiving if the International's bottom line was lacking, MGM Resorts may not be.

"Everything has to come down to whether it makes business sense, right?" Domingo said. "That is the obligation we have to our shareholders. It's the obligation we have to our employees, not only at this facility but the 77,000 employees of MGM Resorts world-wide.

"So everything has to come down to whether it's a good business decision. But, again, we think that there is absolute entertainment value, and we think there is value to the history of racing that this race brings. We're excited to be hosting it for the first time."













International competition runs deep at Yonkers

Since its return four years ago, the Yonkers International Trot has become one of my favorite races of the year. It's one of the few harness races where the excitement of the race continuously lives up to the buildup for it. With 10 of the world's best trotters going a mile and a quarter distance, it presents a unique race dynamic and it's hard to split the contenders in this year's highly-competitive field.

Because of her talent, but also in part due to a greater sense of familiarity, Atlanta is going to wind up as the race favorite. One wild card though with last year's Hambletonian winner is that the International will be the first time she's ever raced on a half-mile track. But even with that unknown, co-owner Howard Taylor says that she takes the turns better than any trotter he's ever owned, and he's cautiously optimistic as the 4-year-old makes her first start in over a month. "The time off was really just to keep her fresh. That was the plan, to point to and try to win this race," said Taylor.

Asked about the condition of Atlanta following an uncharacteristically poor performance in the Joie De Vie at Tioga in August, Taylor revealed noteworthy information. "She almost died, she was in bad shape," he said. "At Tioga, she had severe dehydration and had to go to the hospital. She was in real bad shape and then was off for a couple weeks. But then she recovered, and that's when she was a very good second at Woodbine in her Maple Leaf Trot elimination considering she hadn't done much leading up to that." Since then, Atlanta has seemed back to her old self with a driver in Gingras who's knowledgeable to many of these other horses, he's likely to have Atlanta forwardly placed and well positioned. If she wins, Atlanta would be the first mare since the great Peace Corps to win this race.



After surprising in the International last year at 30-1 odds, defending champ Cruzado Dela Noche might offer odds around that high again. In retrospect, last year's win shouldn't have come as that much of a surprise considering that the horse had raced in stakes competition here in the U.S. early in his career, though I don't think many people realized this time last year how formidable of a trainer Marcus Melander was going to be. This year, Cruzado Dela Noche hasn't often threatened against this group and would be a surprise once again, even with another perfect second over trip.

A horse that I find intriguing is Bahia Quesnot. He's somehow 1 for 16 on the year and just 2 for 28 over the past two years, but he was gaining on Propulsion last out in a Group 2 race in France. He should be well positioned form post 2 and would think that he'll drift up from a 5-1 morning line that seems low.

The unknown in here is Zacon Gio who hasn't lost in nearly a full year, with his last loss coming Oct. 25 of a year ago. Since then, he's won 11 in a row. The knock is that he's never raced outside of Italy, so it's tough to gauge if he's up for the challenge of now going against the world's best trotters. Twister Bi did win this race representing Italy two years ago, but he was far more proven than this one is.

Last year's runner-up, Lionel, is back again after missing by the narrowest of margins in 2018. He looked home free into the stretch that race after overcoming a tough trip, but may have an even tougher go of it this time around from the outside post 8 in a 10 horse field with two trailers.

Guardian Angel As is obviously capable, but the Maple Leaf Trot winner was off his game in his last pair, losing twice as the beaten favorite. In this race, his post 9 will trail the horse from post 1, so he'll be somewhat at the mercy of others and

it didn't work out the last two times he couldn't establish a forward position near the middle point of the race. The horse starting from post 1 is Slide So Easy. He was a longshot in this race last year and raced like it, but looks to enter in better form this time around. Having only missed being first or second in a single start this year, he was second last out to Pastore Bob – the favorite in this race last year but one who was the victim of a break into the first turn.

Picks: Bahia Quesnot, Atlanta, Slide So Easy

In the \$250,000 Harry Harvey Invitational – also 10 horses at a mile and a quarter – Mission Accepted has been having a consistently good 4-year-old season for Ron Burke and owns a 1:50.2 mark from earlier this year at the Meadowlands. He recently was third to Six Pack in a 1:49.2 mile and prior to that was caught in Manchego's monster mile at Dayton and she came back to win next out. Rich And Miserable has to deal with an outside post, but he overcame it last time and beat a couple good ones two back at Pocono. He was actually favored against Mission Accepted a few back but made a break that race. Will Take Charge is always around and will be well positioned once again from his post

4 starting slot. Custom Cantab seems like an underlay as the morning line favorite; likely would play against at that short a price.

Picks: Mission Accepted, Rich and Miserable, Will Take Charge

The Dan Rooney going for another \$250,000 is the big race on the day for pacers. Resembling a more traditional race of just eight horses going a normal mile, McWicked is coming off a 1:47.2 score a week ago at the Red Mile. He hasn't been as consistent as we've seen him in years past, but when he's on he can still be exceptional. Jimmy Freight exits a solid win off cover to pull the 10-1 upset and it would be tough to not see him getting a share starting from the rail. This Is The Plan will try to take an early shot from post 7 and American History would likely need to sweep them all from the outside, it could happen.

The continuing education of Rockie Got Framed

The sophomore gelded pacer will be one of the favorites to win his \$270,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final tonight at Harrah's Hoosier Park, part of 12 championship races featuring total purses exceeding \$2.4 million.

One year ago, Rockie Got Framed failed to accumulate the points necessary to guarantee a spot behind the gate in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final for freshman pacing colts. Tonight, the Jamie Macomber-trained sophomore enters the \$270,000 finale as one of a few favored to win it all. The journey from a winless 2018 campaign to the highly successful 2019 schedule required a lot of patience and education, and it could all pay off in a big way this evening and the weeks that follow.

"For some reason, last year as a 2-year-old he decided that he didn't want to follow horses. There was a switch that went off, because he trained down perfectly," Macomber recalled of her pupil. "He became unmanageable in a hole; he was really hard to race. We felt that if we showed him any daylight at all we were going to ruin him."

A \$50,000 Harrisburg purchase, the Rockin Image—Carousel Frame gelding made 10 starts as a freshman for owners Rocco Ruffolo and Eleven Star Stables. Although 'Rockie' found his speed early, he struggled to convert it into wins. Instead, he would quickly get hot in a hole and try to run over the horse in front of him. During the course of the season, the pacer managed a runner-up performance and two third-place finishes, but the rest of the time, he finished off the board. Macomber could have become discouraged over the plight of her young pacer. Instead, however, she went to work over the winter to address the issue.



"It just took all winter getting him to calm down around other horses and keeping him patient. He knows that he is fast, and he knew last year that he was fast, but he thinks he can carry it for a long, long time. We just had to tell him, 'Hey, you only have a good quarter of a mile. Let's save it," said Macomber. "I spent all winter down in Pompano following horses the right way. Every time I trained him, I locked him in and made him comfortable going really slow miles in uncomfortable situations. I let him sit for miles and miles outside of horses and let him just relax sitting out there. I was just teaching him a lot of patience."

The conditioner noted that the hardest part of executing the plan was finding horses with which to work. Training twice a week at Pompano, she needed the right conditions for her gelding, situations that did not include sending Rockie Got Framed to the lead and cutting the mile.

"They expect you to cut it every once in a while, and I never wanted to be on the front with this colt, not until late in the winter before qualifying," she said. "For months I just said, 'I need to follow,' or 'Could I please train with you today and sit outside of you the whole mile?' People look at you like you are nuts and they want to have a nice horse, too. Luckily, we had some horses in our barn that we could use, and a few times we would get four or five horses together."

After a winter of educating Rockie Got Framed, the Macomber Stable shipped north to Hoosier Park with the hope that the now sophomore would make the grade when returning to competition. He showed promise in winning two qualifiers, but finished fourth in his debut. Driven by Macomber's husband, Ricky, the 3-year-old paced in 1:53.4 with a :26.3 last quarter. The gelding recorded his first seasonal win in his third start, pacing to victory in 1:52.4.

"Last year, he always showed signs of speed. The problem was that all winter I could have taught and taught and it still never worked. He could have gotten into a race behind the gate and done the same thing he did last year," Jamie said. "It was disappointing that he didn't just run off and win the non-winners of one in his first start. You're like, 'Maybe he's not the colt that I thought.' But, it did take some time."

Time has shown that Rockie has rounded into one of the better horses in the division. After earning that first win, the pacer would hit the board in six of his next seven starts, recording two more wins. The Hanover Shoe Farms product raced fourth in the opening leg of Indiana Sires Stakes competition before improving to third in the next round. Rockie Got Framed then reeled off five wins in the next six attempts, four of which came in sires stakes action. The last two triumphs in the streak produced dual 1:49.3 miles to

establish and equal lifetime best performances. Macomber entered her charge in the \$170,000 Jenna's Beach Boy on Sept. 20, and the pacer turned in a 1:49.2 effort, finishing third.

"He showed us his heart a lot that night in the Jenna's Beach Boy. I knew he had some heart. In a way, that was his way of saying, 'I got you mom. I got you, you taught me,' she said. "Now, I'm comfortable coming first up, comfortable coming second over, and I'm comfortable sitting in the two or three hole."

Versatility could prove key tonight when battling a field that includes Tellmeaboutit, a 1:48.4 winner two starts back, and the Melissa Essig-trained duo of Little Rocket Man and Shamwow. Rockie Got Framed enters the final with eight wins in 19 starts, finishing on the board 16 times. He has earned \$189,580. Macomber also sends out Ollie's Z Tam in the sophomore pacing colt final.

"It's crazy, because there are really four top colts in our division that could win (tonight). Alvin Miller's colt could show up with his (1):48 mile again. Jody and Missy's colts have been tough all summer," said Macomber. "We've got the eight hole. You don't want to use that as an excuse, but wouldn't you love to draw inside a little bit? Yeah. We're just going to hope that somebody wants some cover and will let us in hopefully."

Joining Rockie Got Framed and Ollie's Z Tam, the Macomber Stable will send out three other starters in tonight's lucrative finals. Win or lose, should Rockie come out of Friday's race healthy, there is a good chance he will ship to Woodbine and take his shot in the Breeders Crown. Macomber sent out then-sophomore Beckhams Z Tam to a Breeders Crown victory at Hoosier Park in 2017. That year, a Super Final victory eluded their grasp when the colt finished second. Perhaps tonight a victory will propel them north of the border and onto one of the sport's biggest stages.

"I love the way that he has worked himself into being a good horse," she said. "He had just as much patience for me as I did for him."

Harrah's Hoosier Park's championship card will feature 14 races with purses exceeding \$2.4 million. Post time is 6:30 p.m., with the first of 12 championship races kicking off in the night's second contest.



On Super Final night, Saturday, Oct. 12 at Woodbine Mohawk Park, each Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold division has been whittled down to the very best. Post position will matter, and racing luck may play a role, but when it comes down to which horse is crowned champion the deciding factor is often something that is not so easily measured.

"If you could see it and just buy it, the person with the deepest pockets would always have the best horses, but because of that intangible that we cannot see — whether that horse has that drive, desire, that 'It' that we can't see — sometimes it comes down to the athlete," said trainer Rob Fellows, who will send out 3-year-old trotting colt All Wrapped Up in the seventh of the eight Super Final divisions. "You look at some of the horses this year, like obviously the good horse of Nancy Johansson's (Tall Dark Stranger) everybody loved him, everybody saw that 'It' and they paid a lot for him, but the little one (Alicorn) that Chantal (Mitchell) has, everybody overlooked her because of her size, but she had that 'It' in her."

All Wrapped Up will start from Post 7 in the \$225,000 Super Final for Fellows and his co-owners Arpad Szabo of Bradford. ON and Blair Corbeil and Mike McAllister of

Beaumont, AB where the Archangel son will pit his competitive desire against division point leader and Hambletonian champion Forbidden Trade.

In 10 Gold Series starts over the last two years, Forbidden Trade has only been bested twice. The son of Kadabra was the 2-year-old trotting colt Super Final champion and will look to defend his title from Post 9 in the ninth race on Saturday. Trainer Luc Blais will also start a trio of young hopefuls in the 2-year-old trotting colt and gelding Super Final for owner Determination of Montreal, QC. Crossfit Mouse will start from Post 1, division point leader Port Perry gets Post 2 and Threefiftytwo will start from the outside Post 10 in the sixth race.

"It's a long process to bring a horse to the races you know. It's lots of training, lots of work, and you try to build the best way you think," said Blais, adding that Forbidden Trade started to show his potential as a 2-year-old when the training miles started to get serious. "It was easy for him to do that, very easy, we didn't know how good he was going to be, but it was easy. You can feel he's got power, you can feel that, but what he's going to do with that power, you can't feel that."

Blais has won at least one Super Final every year since 2016 and says each one of his provincial champions — Forbidden Trade, On A Sunny Day, Warrawee Roo and Emoticon Hanover — had a different quality that made them successful.

"They are different. They are all different," Blais said. "Every athlete is different, every athlete has got a story and those horses they are very unique. They've got personality and they are very unique, but one thing they've got the same, they are very professional."

Dr. Ian Moore will start three horses in two Super Final divisions on Saturday and he said that a professional, positive attitude might be the biggest early indicator of success.

"The go-ahead attitude, the right attitude, will show fairly early, as well as the wrong attitude," said Dr. Moore. "And sometimes, in my experience with young horses, that doesn't change. If they've got kind of a so-so or poor attitude from the get-go it often follows from there."

Moore will send division point leader Century Farroh out from Post 3 in the 3-year-old pacing colt and gelding Super Final and Denali Seelster and Tattoo Artist from Posts 6 and 7 in the 2-year-old pacing colt and gelding test. Denali Seelster and Tattoo Artist will benefit from the absence of undefeated Tall Dark Stranger in the 2-year-old pacing colt and gelding showdown. Trainer Nancy Johansson opted to skip the Super Final and focus the Metro Pace winner's preparations toward the Oct. 18 Breeders Crown eliminations at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Only five horses have stepped up to face Century Farroh and Meadowlands Pace winner Best In Show in the sophomore pacing colt battle. Century Farroh heads into Race 8 on a streak of eight wins in Ontario Sires Stakes action, three of them at the Grassroots level as a two-year-old, where he was the season-ending champion, and five of them in the Gold Series this season.

"He was just an average 2-year-old, but then at the end of his 2-year-old season he started changing in his body structure and his mental ability and the last four starts he got really good," said Dr. Moore, who conditions Mach Three son Century Farroh for Ratchford Stable NS of North Sydney, NS. "Good horses have a tremendous will and desire and competitive spirit to want to beat everything that's around them. Some horses show that fairly early in training, where other horses may take a little while to mature mentally as well as physically before they'll show you that. It might take a couple races, it might take a whole summer season — as in Century Farroh's case last year — or it could show up very early."

In the case of 2-year-old pacing filly Alicorn, that will and desire emerged in her first lifetime start when she closed in :26.2 to finish second by a nose. Since then the daughter of Bettors Delight has recorded six wins and two more seconds in 10 starts, including three Gold Series wins, two of them in Ontario Sires Stakes record time. She will make a bid for a seventh win from Post 6 in Saturday's second race.

"To me, the thing that kind of sets her apart from another horse is she's just so smart. In a race, for example, you can put her on the front, you can take her back, you can do whatever you want and she's smart," said trainer Chantal Mitchell. "She's got that little bit of character, that little bit of grittiness where she's going to bite, and she's going to kick at you and she's going to push you around, but then when you go to walk her to the paddock or something she walks like a little puppy dog beside you, she's not silly, she doesn't do anything crazy, nothing gets her worked up."

Mitchell trains the division point leader for Windermere Stable of New York, NY and Robert Muscara of Ivyland, PA and said, like many other exceptional racehorses, there is no nonsense to Alicorn when it comes to the business of racing.

"It's like they're born to do it, their brain, their mindset never changes. Any time I've had a good horse, whether it was mine or someone else's, that's usually what it is, they're just automatically professionals and I think that's what sets the good ones apart," said Mitchell. "And I think that's where I put her — she's there to do her business and she doesn't think anything more of it, she does what she has to do and that's it. And when she's racing she wants to win, she wants to do her job and she's happy to do it."

The first of eight provincial champions will be crowned in Saturday's first race, which gets under way at 7:10 pm. The other Super Finals will be featured in Races 2, 3, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10 on the \$1.8 million Woodbine Mohawk Park program. Complete entries for Saturday, Oct. 12 are available at Super Final Entries.

Johansson's JK American Beauty favored in Courageous Lady

These early fall days, Nancy Johansson might be shuttling around North America at a speed that out paces the harness horses that she trains.

Johansson was in Kentucky last weekend to race at the Red Mile and to also take the rubber band off the bankroll at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

She's since returned to her home base in New Jersey, but will be in Toronto this weekend to prepare members of her stable for the upcoming Breeders Crown races at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

And then there's JK American Beauty, a moderate brown 3-year-old filly pacer that Johansson trains and will send postward as the 5-2 morning line favorite to win Saturday's \$120,000 Courageous Lady at Northfield Park

"I can't be there, but I'll be watching on my phone or my computer," said Johansson. "We call JK American Beauty our ATM machine. She always gets a check."

The daughter of American Ideal, a homebred for the 3 Brothers Stable of New York City, has finished no worse that third in 20 of her 26 lifetime

Only four of the placings are victories, none for more than a \$60,000 purse, but Johansson takes the lack of winner's circle visits in stride.

"It's a little frustrating, and yes the seconds and third do pile up, but in the long run, she's been consistent. She always tries and I'm fine with her record."

JK American Beauty drew the No. 5 post position for the Courageous Lady and will be driven by Brett Miller.

Their main foe might be So Awesome, the race's richest entrant with a bankroll of \$446,113. A winner of eight of 23 career starts, she drew the No. 3 and will be driven by Dave Palone, harness racing's all-time winningest driver with 18,953 victories.

The Courageous Lady is the ninth race on the 14-race Northfield Park card that also includes a pair of \$75,000 Ohio Sires Stakes finals and two divisions of "The Pace for the Cure," featuring all female drivers.

As for Johansson, she collected a world record Sunday at the Red Mile when her pupil Manchego won the \$69,500 What the Hill Allerage Farms Mare Trot in 1:49, an all-age

mark. The previous record was 1:49.1, set earlier this year by Atlanta at The Meadowlands.

The night before, Johansson led all buyers at the Lexington standardbred sale, spending \$1,980,000 for eight yearlings for various owners. Her most expensive purchase was \$800,000 for Some Terror, a son of Somebeachsomewhere.

Meadowlands returns to action tonight

After a nine-week hiatus that began at the conclusion of a highly successful Hambletonian Day, live harness racing returns to the Meadowlands tonight (Oct. 11).

During October and November, live action will be conducted on Fridays and Saturdays. December will see Thursdays added to the schedule. All live harness programs will have a post time of 7:15 p.m.

There will be special racing "doubleheaders" during October as Monmouth Park will conduct turf racing on the Meadowlands' grass course. Racing fans can make it a full day at the Big M on Oct. 11, 12, 18, 25 and 26, as the thoroughbreds will be in action with a 12:30 p.m. post before harness racing in the evening.

JUICY STAKES: They'll be plenty of stakes action during the Big M's 2019 Fall Meeting as 2-year-olds will be in action in the Kindergarten Series. Preliminaries are slated for the first three weekends of the meet before four big-money finals – with purses totaling more than \$700,000 – take place on Nov. 2.

The action then heats up even more on Nov. 16, with eliminations for the Goldsmith Maid (2-year-old filly trot), Three Diamonds (2-year-old filly pace), Valley Victory (2-year-old colt trot) and Governor's Cup (2-year-old colt pace) before the biggest night of the fall takes place one week later with the finals for those four events – with purses in excess of \$1.75 million – as well as the finals for four other huge contests, featuring some of the biggest equine stars in the game.

The TVG Mare Trot (for a purse of \$175,000), TVG Mare Pace (\$175,000), TVG Open Trot (\$350,000) and TVG Open Pace (\$350,000) will also be offered on "Fall Final Four" Night on Nov. 23. Racing fans may recall the 2018 TVG Open Pace, which resulted in a dominant 1:48 score by McWicked to lock up Horse of the Year honors.

SUPER SIMULCAST: The stars of every division will be on

display at Woodbine at Mohawk Park as the 2019 Breeders Crown will be contested at Canada's top harness track. All Crown events will be simulcast to the Meadowlands.

Eliminations will take place on Oct. 18 and 19 with the finals slated for Oct. 25 and 26.

FREE POKER FRIDAY: Not only is live racing back, so are "Free Poker Fridays" at the Meadowlands.

For those 21 years of age and older, free Texas Hold'em tournaments will be conducted in the Gallery, hosted by World Free Poker.

Players can pre-register or walk-up. Games begin at 7 p.m.

BET THE NFL, MLB PLAYOFFS: Bet all of the National Football League games as well as the Major League Baseball playoffs at the Big M in the FanDuel Sportsbook.

Sit comfortably and watch all the action in the book or head over to Victory Sports Bar, where there are many places to watch the games while taking advantage of the many available drinking and dining options.

Breeders Crown supplemental and entry box approaching

A little less than a week remains to the deadline for potential supplements to the 3-year-old and older Crown races and for world champion Bold Eagle, the sole invitee to the Breeders Crown Trot, to declare.

Supplemental entries for 3-year-old and open events are due and payable by noon [EDT], Monday, Oct. 14, in the race office of Woodbine Mohawk Park, Campbellville, Ontario, Canada. There are no supplements for the 2-year-old races.

Bold Eagle must also declare by noon on Monday, Oct. 14.

All Breeders Crown eligible horses must declare in by 10:30 a.m. Tuesday, Oct. 15.

Supplemental declaration amounts are as follows:

3-year-old events: \$62,500 (guaranteed purse of \$500,000)

Open trot: \$62,500 (guaranteed purse of \$500,000)

Open pace: \$50,000 (guaranteed purse of \$400,000)

Mare pace: \$31,250 (guaranteed purse of \$250,000)

Mare trot: \$31,250 (guaranteed purse of \$250,000)

The entrance fee is included in the supplemental amount. A minimum of half the amount of the supplemental fee, minus the entrance fee, will be added to the purse. This

one-time supplemental payment makes a horse eligible to all subsequent years' Breeders Crown events under the normal schedule of payments.

Eliminations, if needed, will occur for 2-year-olds on Friday, Oct. 18 with a post time of 7:50 pm. [EDT]

Three-year-old and open eliminations, if needed, will race Saturday, Oct. 19, with a post time of 7:10 p.m. [EDT]

All eliminations will race for a minimum of \$25,000.

Eliminations occur when more than eleven (11), but less than fourteen (14) horses enter. There will be a single elimination to "qualify" only enough horses that can be accommodated by the number of positions in the front tier of the starting gate as follows:

In the open trot, the invited winners of the designated foreign "classic" races that are declared, shall automatically advance to the Final regardless of earnings. If eliminations are required and one or more of the foreign invitees automatically advance to the final, the North American-based horse with the highest seasonal money earnings in that year, as determined below, may likewise automatically advance to the final.

From the other declared horses, those with the least total earnings in the period from Jan. 1 of that year up to time of declaration, will be selected to race in a single elimination field with no more starters than can score in a single tier with no trailers. Money earnings for races outside of Canada will be calculated at the exchange rate as determined by Standardbred Canada.

If there are eliminations, post positions in the final will be determined by an open draw with the exception that elimination winners in an order determined by lot, will draw for post positions number one (#1) through five (#5) in the final. All other finalists, including foreign invitees, will be placed in an open draw for the remaining post positions. Those horse(s) that receive a bye into the final will be in the open draw for post positions in the Final. All horses that start in the Final receive money.

All 2-year-old races will be held Friday, Oct. 25 with an early post time of 7:00 p.m. [EDT].

Three-year-old and open events will race Saturday, Oct. 26, also with an early post of 7:00 p.m. [EDT]

Risi will begin his new job immediately and will spend time at both Tioga Dows and Vernon Downs.

Cooper, the Amish buggy horse, loses for first time in nine starts

The remarkable run of Cooper is over.

The Cinderella Amish buggy horse's eight-race winning streak ended in the eighth race at Northfield Park on Monday (Oct. 7) when his attempt to go wire-to-wire saw him get swallowed up in mid-stretch. Cooper tired to finish sixth in the field of nine, yet was beaten just 1 ¾ lengths.

Longshot Master Mighty stormed down the middle of the track to surge past Cooper and prevail. He was timed the mile in 1:56 4/5 and paid \$27.20 to win.

Cooper, a trotter, failed to win in six starts as a 2-year-old in 2015 and left the racetrack to be a personal horse for an Amish family in Sugarcreek, OH. Earlier this year, when then owner Homer Stutzman realized the Cooper was traveling down the roads of Tuscarawas County at a hectic clip, he turned him over to a friend, harness trainer Firman Troyer.

The conversion from pulling a buggy to pulling a sulky resulted in the run of victories, all at Northfield, stretching from early June until late September.

Five more records in Massachusetts Sire Stakes

The records continued to fall at Plainridge Park after five divisions of 2-year-olds competed in the \$1.8 million Massachusetts Sire Stakes (MASS) on Monday afternoon (Oct. 7). Five more track and/or stake standards were either matched or reset when the action concluded in the second leg of the series.

In the first \$22,450 division for 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings, **R Maddy Blue Chip** (Drew Monti) left from post four and dictated the race. After splits of :27.3, :57 and 1:25.1 he was firmly in control of the race with Mcbeantown (Mitchell Cushing) being the only horse with a legitimate shot after drafting second the whole way. At the top of the stretch Mcbeantown took his best shot but it wasn't enough as Monti high-lined R Maddy Blue Chip down the lane to a 1-1/4 length victory in 1:54.2.

The time was a new lifetime mark for R Maddy Blue Chip (American Ideal—Frontierpan), a new stake record and a new track record for 2-year-old pacing geldings.

It was the first MASS win for R Maddy Blue Chip (\$4.20) who is owned by Thomas and Scott Dillon and trained by Joe Nelson. Blue Chip Bloodstock bred R Maddy Blue Chip.

The \$39,200 division for 2-year-old trotting fillies saw the heavy 1-9 favorite **Without A Warning** (Shawn Gray) out-tussle Pembroke Whisper (Heath Campbell) past the quarter where she cleared and never looked back. She continued on at her own pace, tripping the next two timers in :58 and 1:27.3 without any pursuit to deal with. At the top of the stretch Gray sat chilly as Without A Warning knew what to do and pulled away to a handy 4-1/4 length win in 1:57.3.

The time was a new lifetime mark for Without A Warning (RC Royalty—Concentration) and it tied the stake and track record for 2-year-old trotting fillies.

Without A Warning (\$2.10) is now two for two in MASS action this year and those wins inflated her bankroll to \$117,260 in 2019 for breeder/owner Ray Campbell Jr. George Ducharme trains the winner.

The lone non-betting event was the \$38,500 trot for 2-year-old colts and geldings and **Crazy For Luca** (Jimmy Whittemore) earned a hard fought victory over Life Is A Feast who was coming in on a three-race winning streak.

Double Dealing (Shawn Gray) cut the quarter in :27.4 before Life Is A Feast (Howard Parker) pulled first-over from fourth with Crazy For Luca on his back. Life Is A Feast eventually cleared but still had Crazy For Luca to his outside and pushing hard to the three-quarters. Still 1-1/2 lengths off, Crazy For Luca continued to dig and cut the lead to 1/4 length at the top of the stretch and from there, never gave up down to the wire where he gained a nose advantage and won in 1:57.3.

It was the first lifetime win for Crazy For Luca (Crazed—Teachmehowto Lindy) and the time set a new track record for 2-year-old trotting colts.

Crazy For Luca is owned by Dale Hein, Tessa Roland and Royal Roland and is trained by Marissa Chadbourne. K R Breeding bred Crazy For Luca.

In the \$41,300 pace for 2-year-old fillies, **Odds On Orlando** (Drew Monti) stayed perfect in Massachusetts since shipping in from Lexington.

After pulling from second at the quarter to take the lead from Rojas Blue Chip (Kevin Switzer Jr.), Odds On Orlando took control the race and from there, put on quite a show. After getting to the three-quarters only 1/2 length in front of Bold N Sporty (Mitchell Cushing) and Rojas Blue Chip, Odds On Orlando swelled up at the head of the lane and paced away in a :28.2 final panel to a wrapped-up five length win in 1:56, which was a new lifetime mark.

Odds On Orlando (\$3.60) is owned by Odds On Racing and is trained by Tony Alagna. Lindy Farms of Connecticut bred Odds On Orlando (Captaintreacherous-Lindys Old Lady).

The second \$22,450 division of the 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings returned the biggest surprise of the day after the 45-1 **Kevmarvalous** (Mitchell Cushing) upset the current track record holder Han Solo, who came into the day with a four-race winning streak.

Han Solo (Kevin Switzer Jr.) got away fourth but pulled at the quarter and took the lead from Mister Puzzles (John

Nason) before the half in :56.2. At this point Kevmarvalous was last by 7-1/2 lengths. Han Solo then took the race to the three-quarters while Kevmarvalous was pacing third-over in the breeze before pulling three-deep into the final turn. Han Solo took a three-length lead into the stretch but Cushing was methodically urging Kevmarvalous all the way to the wire and got there first by a nose in 1:56.4.

It was the first lifetime win for Kevmarvalous (\$92.80) who owned by KDK Standardbreds and is trained by Kevin Switzer. KDK Standardbreds also bred Kevmarvalous (Delmarvalous—Shady Sabrina).

The Massachusetts Sire Stakes will resume at Plainridge Park on Sunday (Oct. 20) for the 2-year-olds and Monday (Oct. 21) for the 3-year-olds. All eight finals will be held on Monday (Oct. 28).
