Party Girl Hill aims to stake claim to Horse of the Year in today's Tattersalls

In bold move by her connections, the undefeated pacing filly is taking on the boys in today's Tattersalls at the Red Mile in an attempt to claim the title as the continent's top horse.

In an uncharacteristic but bold decision, 3-year-old pacing filly Party Girl Hill will be racing this afternoon (Oct. 11) in a division of the \$239,500 Tattersalls at the Red Mile against colts. While the female-versus-male scenario has become somewhat commonplace on the trotting side, it's far rarer for pacers.

Owned and bred by Tom Hill from the United Kingdom and trained by New Zealand native Chris Ryder, Party Girl Hill has made a massive impression since her career debut just four months ago. Coming off recent major stake final wins including the Fan Hanover, PA sire stakes, and the Jugette, she established a new career mark of 1:48 last week when cruising in her division of the Bluegrass for fillies. Unblemished and untouched, her career mark stands at a perfect 12-for-12.

Undefeated filly Party Girl Hill (Dexter Dunn, shown winning at Red Mile on Oct. 4) is taking on the boys today in the Tattersalls Pace in an effort to put her atop the Horse of the Year race.

Party Girl Hill currently sits at #3 in the Hambletonian/Breeders Crown Society Top 10 weekly poll. Ahead of her are only Ramona Hill (1) and Tall Dark Stranger (2). Party Girl Hill has 10 first place votes (three more than Tall Dark Stranger) and a win today in the Tattersalls seems like it would go a long way in top spot consideration not only in the weekly poll, but for eventual Horse of the Year honors.

Describing what went into the decision to race Party Girl

Hill in the 3-year-old Open Tattersalls Pace, trainer Ryder said, "We put a lot of thought into it and obviously to race against the colts you've got to have a lot of confidence. It creates a little pizzazz and something a little bit different and is a chance for her to stamp herself as the number one horse in harness racing. We kind of thought if we didn't take this week, we wouldn't have had any other chance for the rest of the year. Being a mile track we wanted her to take on the best and have a chance to beat them. Between the



owners, myself, and Dexter (Dunn), we really were all on the same page, so it wasn't really a controversial decision; we were quite happy to try it."

For Ryder, taking this kind of a shot with a top Horse of Year contender isn't unprecedented. It was just last November when Ryder's Bettor's Wish as a 3-year-old took on older pacing horses in the TVG final. Having not finished worse than second all last year, including being runner-up in the TVG, a win in that race might have been enough for him to have overtaken Shartin N for the sport's top spot last year.


Trainer Chris Ryder said taking on the boys with Party Girl Hill, "creates a little pizzazz and something a little bit different and is a chance for her to stamp herself as the number one horse in harness racing."

Ryder remains as confident as ever heading into her clash against some of the better sophomore colts.

"I think her chances are great," said Ryder. "They're just as good as any race she's been in here, but we're disappointed that Tall Dark Stranger (who drew into the other Tattersalls division) wasn't in there. That was really the main reason. We were looking forward to racing him and unfortunately didn't get in with him. But she's still in with a good batch."

Ryder said the reason Party Girl Hill didn't make her first career start until her 3-year-old season was because, "as a 2-year-old she was ready to qualify and she got a hairline fracture in her P1 bone in the hind leg and she had to be shut down for the year. But they were very happy with her last year. She had always felt like a top-of-the-line filly. You never know how good, but we always thought she was very good."

Going as race 4, Party Girl Hill has landed the inside starting slot and her two chief rivals will come from the posts right next to her. No Lou Zing starts from post 2 and there's no question that Nancy Takter has gotten this one figured out. After a tripped-out win two back in the PA sires final, he zipped right down the road in a stake at Hoosier for a new career mark of 1:49.2. Gingras gets the drive on No Lou Zing, with Dunn on Party Girl Hill. Capt Midnight has



shown up for almost every major race this year. He yielded to a longshot last week in the Bluegrass before coming back to pass that one but was outsprinted through the lane by Warraee Vital. Sandbetweenmytoes was hard used in that Jug final in his second race that day and that didn't have any real punch last week, though I suppose that could be somewhat forgiven considering the 1:46.4 time of that race. I do think Party Girl Hill will be tested in here either from one of the main contenders or an outsider and still may come out victorious, but in any case the connections deserve praise for taking a chance you don't see too often.

The "other" Tattersalls division is two races prior in race 2, and this race came up loaded. Fellow Horse of Year contender Tall Dark Stranger headlines the race off his traditional narrow margin win last week here. Now 9-for-10 on the year and 17-of-19 for the career, all he does is win. His time wasn't nearly as fast last week as Cattlewash, who tied the all-time 1:46.4 record for a 3-year-olds last week. It'll be fascinating to see how he follows it against the likes of Tall Dark Stranger. Cattlewash was deceptively good in the Little Brown Jug final won by Captain Barbossa and parlayed a dream last week to that record mile. Warrawee Vital looked buried fourth on the rail last week into the stretch but flew once the inside opened. Following up on the inexplicable no-show in the Jug, he responded well last out to first-time Lasix. Captain Kirk blazed the way last out setting up that record mile and did well to hold for second; I'll reluctantly pass on Catch The Fire and Fortify.

In the Kentucky Filly Futurity, Ramona Hill is the third piece of the current Horse of the Year picture and looks to rebound off a shocking loss. In her Bluegrass race last week, she seemed well-rated through three-quarters to 1:24.2, but had little resistance in the end to fend off longshot Ab's Attitudeexpress. She will need to bring her best today to beat this highly-competitive bunch. Next Level Stuff keeps Tetrick over last week's upset winner Ab's Attitudeexpress. Love A Good Story was flying late on the outside last out for Team Miller. It's unfortunate she broke two back in that NYSS final as she was highly regarded earlier in the summer. Sorella was game through the stretch last out to hold off Hypnotic Am who couldn't pass her despite the trip; a longshot was almost able to capitalize off that stretch duel to miss by an inch. Panem tired despite a favorable trip and now has an outside post; is somehow just 1 for 10 on the year. Burke trainee's Sister Sledge and Crucial need to go a step quicker.

I'll go with Back Of The Neck in the \$444,000 Kentucky Futurity. He raced last week for the first time since August, and set a new lifetime mark of 1:51.3. He did also with ease, coming home in :25.4 and looked flawless once Zeron had clearance for him midway through the stretch. He's been even money his last two races but wasn't favored in either of those; don't see that often. Ready For Moni makes his first start since the Canadian Trotting Classic three weeks ago. He made an uncharacteristic break in that race when a couple lengths clear; very hard to tell, though, if the others were closing at the time of the break and he'll have to overcome the second-tier start. Chestnut Hill benefitted in that CTC race when he sprung the 60-1 shocker and then got a rather conservative try last out. He did look to be picking up steam though in that race when he broke. King Alphonso was gaining late last out and just missed second to EL Ideal; gets a big driver change to Tetrick. Beads had been awesome in all starts prior to last week and then just didn't have it in his most recent at 1-5. Amigo Volo may try to take them all the wav.

Looking deep into the rich history of the Kentucky Futurity

The Kentucky Futurity had very color beginnings.

In 1893, a black colt named Oro Wilkes won the inaugural race. In 1894, a chestnut filly named Beuzette was the winner. In 1895, a brown colt named Oakland Baron won, followed by a roan filly named Rose Croix in 1896. In 1897, a bay filly named Thorn won, followed in 1898 by a bay colt Peter The Great. In 1899, chestnut gelding Boralma was the winner, followed by a brown filly named Fereno in 1900.

The inaugural Futurity

The first Kentucky Futurity was contested on Oct. 9, 1893 for a purse of \$11,950. Seven colts and four fillies entered and the winner, Oro Wilkes, was a son of Sable Wilkes that stud for a \$50 stud fee at Cruikston Park Stud Farm in Ontario.

They races five times that day to determine a winner and the times were: 2:14.3/4, 2:14.1/4, 2:25 flat, 2:15.1/4 and 2:17.1/4

Oro Wilkes' summary was 2-2-1-1-1, but he started only eight times in his career, finishing with a record of 5-2-1.

Year 2

The second Kentucky Futurity, held on Oct. 8, 1894 marked the first filly winner, Beuzetta. The purse was \$31,340 that year and nine horses went postward — four of them fillies.

Years 3 and 4

In the third and fourth years, four wins were required to claim the Futurity.

In 1895, Oakland Baron dead-heated in an early heat, but back then that was not considered a win when judges were tasked with having a horse have a "clear victory."


Latrina, the other dead-heat winner, went 6-5-6 in the

other three heats.

In 1896, Myron McHenry, who drove Dan Patch the following decade, won the Kentucky Futurity the same year Dan Patch was foaled. Rose Croix got the best of 10 other opponents and was the first roan to win it.

Other Futurity facts through the years

- Bi Shively was 74 when he won it in 1952 with Sharp Note, who also won the Hambletonian. The Spanish-American war veteran never appeared in a Kentucky Futurity until he was 74 and none after.
- Fillies won eight of the first 13 editions, including four in a row from 1902 through 1905.
- Ralph Baldwin won his first four heats of the Kentucky Futurity starting in 1948, and finished in 1973. He was second in his last three tries (34 10-8-3 overall).
- Billy Haughton never won the final of the Kentucky Futurity as a driver. In 33 Futurity races, his record was 1-6-9 with his only heat win coming with Cold Comfort in 1977. Yet his sons won three finals in a five-year span: Peter won with Quick Pay in 1976 and Doublemint in 1978. Tommy won with Final Score in 1980. The Futurity is the only Triple Crown event in which Billy Haughton did not have a driving win.
 - From 1905-1927, Thomas Murphy posted a record of 51



15-16-5 in the Futurity. Tough to top that driving record in a single Triple Crown event.

- Howard Beissinger won the Triple Crown in 1969 with Lindys Pride at the age of 46 in his debut year in the Kentucky Futurity. But, he never won another heat of the Futurity and ended up with a record of 2-0-2 in 19 starts.
- Stars Pride won the 1950 Kentucky Futurity for a pot of \$54,665. He then sired 10 winners of this race, the most of any sire trotter or pacer in any Triple Crown event. And he did so in a 19-year period from 1958 (Emilys Pride) through 1976 (Ouick Pay).
- Ben White was the first back-to-back winner of the Kentucky Futurity. He won in 1924 with Mr McElwyn and 1925 with Aileen Guy and had a career record of 15-6-2 in 38 Futurity starts.
- Bill O'Donnell debuted in the Futurity with a bang, winning in both 1983 (Power Seat) and 1984 (Fancy Crown).
- Mike Lachance's last two drives in the Kentucky Futurity were both victories 2012 (My MVP) and 2013 (Creatine).

Diary of a tremendous week in Lexington

Oct. 5-1 p.m.

Heading into Day One of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, I find myself thinking back to Oct. 19, 1987. That was the day the stock market collapsed just two weeks before that year's Harrisburg sale. By the time the sale came around, things were not quite as bad as they had been on Oc. 19, but people were still licking their wounds, some to the extent where they were still players but on a much lower scale. Others, such as the biggest buyer at that point in time, Tony Pedone, did not even show up.



I'm writing this before session one at Lexington, as I will be doing before each of the sessions of the sale.

At Harrisburg in 1987, we estimated that the yearling sale was off between 20-25 per cent of what was anticipated because of the crash.

The only comparable situation between then and today was in the aftermath of 9/11. The Lexington sale followed a little more than a week later and the results were not a total disaster, but they were nevertheless pretty bad compared to what was anticipated before that terrible happening.

By the time Harrisburg came around that year, things had improved. The sale was a little bit off, but nowhere as bad as Lexington had been.

As I write this we are entering virgin territory. Day One is stacked.

In my 62 years in this business I have yet to see a session as power packed as this one. Yet even with that fantastic book, we all know what a horror show 2020 has been. Most of us have no idea of what to anticipate.

My expectations for this particular session are pretty good. I think that they will probably be down somewhat, but more in the 10 to 15 per cent rate than in the 20 to 30 that I've heard expressed by some.

(I was close. They were down 16.3 per cent)
Oct. 6 - 8 a.m.

Going into Day One, the word on the street was that the session was much stronger on trotters than it was on pacers. Without having looked at a single yearling, I think I could have told you that. Even Stevie Wonder might have been able to.


The pages for the trotters were the strongest group that I've ever seen in 62 years in the business.

Those for pacers were very good, but in my less-than-humble opinion they didn't come close to the trotters.

The results manifested those expectations, although there were significantly more trotters (68) than there were pacers (50). The trotters out averaged the pacers by an astonishing **50 per cent** (\$151,015 to \$99,360).

I remember back when Mission Brief was purchased by the present ownership group for a reported \$700,000, thinking to myself, "They'll be out after two foals." I was wrong. They are well ahead after two foals! Her yearling topped the sale at \$725,000.

I said then if she were mine I'd breed her to Ready Cash. I thought that a first foal by Ready Cash out of arguably the



fastest (pure speed) trotting filly ever, would generate more worldwide interest than any trotting yearling ever sold.

It's not too late Steve Stewart. Just think that if the stars aligned, what a colt by Ready Cash out of her, could bring? Thinking even beyond that, think if he made it on the racetrack, what its value could be to the breed. None of my business Steve, but it's just a thought.

I thought the first session, especially considering what is happening in today's world was exceptionally strong.

I generally make a guesstimate on each yearling based on their page and in the past those that I have seen. This year I didn't physically see a single yearling. Of the 118 sold last night 57 of them brought more than I thought they would; 51 of them brought less and 10 brought exactly the price I guesstimated them to bring. In most cases I was fairly close. But in 25 to 30 per cent, I was way off.

There were some surprises. American Ideal is a wonderfully successful stallion, but I don't believe that there is a single person in all of harness racing who would have expected him to lead all pacers in average, considering his competition — Somebeachsomewhere, Captaintreacherous, Always B Miki, Sweet Lou, Bettors Delight and New York rival Huntsville.

Although there were some Chapter Sevens that rang the bell, relative to the great stallion he has been, I don't believe he receives the respect due him in the sales ring. I consider him to be only behind Muscle Hill among today's great trotting stallions.

The Walners were out of good mares, from the videos I've seen, they could trot up a storm and from everything I've heard they looked the part. They sold accordingly well.

As for Day Two, I obviously don't expect things to be as good as they were last night, but I believe they have an excellent group selling. Based on their pedigrees, I could find 25 and probably more selling tonight that would not have looked out of place in yesterday's session.


As far as making a prediction, I think they will be down somewhere close to the twenty percent range.

(I was again close. I believe they were down about 18.5 per cent) Oct. 7 - 3:30 a.m.

I thought the sale was all over the place last night. From looking at the results, it was obvious that in addition to pedigree, people appeared to be more focused on individuals, likely videos and the flavor of the moment.

Some observations:

Contrary to what I posted yesterday, people seemed to be



more steady regarding the Chapter Sevens. There was no huge highlighter like the sister to Gimpanzee as would be expected, but there were very few in the lower ranges. The prices on them seemed to be far more consistent than what is in evidence on Monday.

If I were looking for a bargain, I would be searching for a Cantab Hall. With the exception of Hip No. 294, Cold Truth, which was bought by Jules Siegel for \$130,000, every single one of them brought less — in some cases much less — than I would have thought they'd bring.

Cantab Hall will go down as one of the greatest trotting stallions in the history of the sport. Sure, he has a lot more competition (as do all trotting stallions including Muscle Hill), but there is absolutely no reason why he is not capable of siring another Father Patrick.

One thing that can be said about most of the Cantab Halls — they generally get there. They may not all become champions, but their gait, manners and good heads will generally get you at the least a good racehorse, if not a champion.

A perfect example of one that was obviously overlooked was Hip No 163, Snorting Copper, who in the esteemed opinion of The Guru was the nicest and most athletic yearling of the session, yet he ended up bringing \$27,000.

Speaking of The Guru, I thought his money picks for the first two days were excellent, contrary to what has been expressed elsewhere, even better on the second day than the first, when one considers that there were far more yearlings selling on Day Two and that it's likely that those on Day One were probably gone over more stringently than those on any other day.

American Ideal continues to do very well, obviously not to the degree that he did on Monday, but very steady. Just about every stallion including the ones considered to be at the very top had some lows. The market for the American Ideals remained steady.

The top Muscle Hills and Walners still sold very well, but there were some soft spots. I assume the likelihood is that the individuals in some cases were not comparable to the pages or perhaps the possibility that the money available for a top trotting prospect has evaporated somewhat after Monday's bang up session. There is only so much money available at a given range in a given time span for a given product.

On a relative basis, I thought the pacers sold quite well compared to yesterday.

The numbers were 87 pacers sold for \$5,224,000, an

average of \$60,046; 94 trotters sold for \$5,947,000, an average of \$63,266. Fairly close to being even.

Two horse with some highlights, but who's prices I felt were sometimes disappointing were Always B Miki and Father Patrick.

Always B Miki has had a sensational first year. There were some who sold well. There were also some sold last night who will almost certainly turn out to be real bargains. The prices were probably indicative of there being a lack of depth in the marketplace.

The seeming decline in the prices of the Father Patricks was mostly due to, in my opinion, only one word **COMPETITION!** Where formally he reigned supreme in Pennsylvania, there were two new kids on the block, Bar Hopping and Southwind Frank. Each, with relatively small crops, dominated in Pennsylvania this year. On the Grand Circuit, Muscle Hill and Chapter Seven just stand out — at least to these eyes they do.

Father Patrick is still a great stallion, but there's the biggest pie I have ever seen in attractive trotting stallions out there and there are just so many slices of it available.

As for my guesstimates, I think I was a lot closer on most of my guesses. In many instance being less than \$5,000 different than the actual prices that were brought of the 180



yearlings sold last night.

Oct. 8 - 7:30 a.m.

In case you are wondering about the time, yes I did sleep until 7 a.m. I might sleep that late three or four times a year. Last night was one of those nights.

I was watching the sales results and the Vice Presidential debate. I stayed up for both until the bitter end.

I thought that on a relative basis, that this session might have been the strongest of the three that I've seen relative to what was being offered.

Good horses, or those perceived as such, sold very well.

The American Ideals continued to sell very well. In terms of consistency, he, in my opinion has been the best sire, certainly the best pacing sire, in the sale. There have been very few that did not bring a decent price relative to their pedigrees.

I still don't get the relatively poor prices for a good many of the Always B Mikis. This horse has had a sensational first year. By far the best of any new pacing sire. Yet his sales offering have been mixed at best. I don't get it, but there are a lot of things about the business of horse sales, I will never get.

The Muscle Hills and Walners that were deemed acceptable sold very well. But there were more than enough of those that didn't bring near what their pages indicated they should have brought.

The Cantab Halls generally speaking seemed to be devoid of any serious interest. This corner is wagering that several of them will turn out to be great bargains.

The Betting Lines were up and down — mostly down and certainly nowhere near what they brought last year. I believe part of the reason to be that they were tremendously hyped last year, including by yours truly. His numbers are very good, but nowhere near good enough to justify the hype he received. The Bettors Delights get better with a little age and maturity, I certainly expect the same from the Betting Lines.

The Father Patricks continued to not bring the prices that I anticipated they should bring. Pennsylvania sired horses were disappointing in general. Of course, there were no Captains nor SBSWs available.

I thought that in terms of geography, the Pennsylvania breds were quite disappointing; the New York breds did just fine, the few New Jersey breds, exclusive of Muscle Hill and Walner primarily by Trixton sold somewhat below the level I thought they would bring. The Ontario sired horses,



considering the fact that only a fraction of the normal group of Ontario trainers participated at the sale, sold quite well.

The top buyers for the most part continue to remain the same, with the Millers, Andy and Julie at the top. That is likely the way it will end.

Since I don't know for sure, but am just guessing, I believe that there were a large numbers of bid ins. I don't blame the people who did that. Their horses were worth more to them than they would be if they were sold at a loss.

On a personal note, I sure miss not being there. This is my first year in the last 63 that I have missed the trots and/or the sale. I'm nowhere near my buddy Dean Hoffman in seeing consecutive Kentucky Futurities, though. I doubt that I've even seen half of those 63 Futurities, since I've had to get home to help fry my own fish.

Onto the numbers: 86 pacers sold for \$2,799,000, an average of \$34,988; 100 trotters brought \$3,698,000, an average of \$36,988, not too much difference.

On my guesstimates, 71 brought more than anticipated; 97 brought less and 13 brought exactly what I thought they might bring.

Tonight should be more of the same with a lower average expected. But look for things to turn around on Friday.

Oct. 9 - 4:30 a.m.

As the time above will indicate, I am back to my normal, abnormal sleeping habits.

Contrary to what I said yesterday about the previous day's sale being on a relative basis being the single best one in my opinion to that point, in the same manner, last night's session using the same gut feelings, was the worst.

Going through the results, I would say that 70-80 per cent of the yearlings that were sold, were done so on a loss to their owners.

I don't think it's the product, because based on the pedigree pages, it was the strongest Day Four that I believe I've ever seen.

I don't know the reason. They are probably numerous including:



- 1. People ran out of money, at least for that segment of the sale.
- 2. The crowd was down, perhaps indicative of people going home
- 3. The Pennsylvania market was softer than it has been since the introduction of slots revenue for purses and stakes.

The Father Patricks and Cantab Halls continued to sell quite disappointingly. I've brought this up before. There is in my opinion, great value to be found there particularly with these two horses but with Pennsylvania sires in general.

There were two blips, but the American Ideals continued to sell at a fairly good and consistent price level. Probably more so than those by any other sire in the catalog.

The Always B Mikis continued to bring less money than they should have.

There was one Captaintreacherous sold. It didn't sell well. But that was probably a reason it was in Day Four. There were a few surprises in the upper ends, but not too many.

The Trixtons in my opinion sold terribly, considering how well he did in last week's Grand Circuit 2-year-old events here at the Red Mile.

The Ontario market was the only one which I felt was reasonably well, although there were many holes in that. The Resolves were pretty well received.

Overall, 70 pacers sold for \$1,493,000 an average of \$21,329; 90 trotters brought \$2,221,000 and average of \$22,333. Both numbers were close to each other.

In terms of my pre-sale guesstimates, 102 brought less than what I thought they would: 49 brought more and 18 brought exactly what my estimate was.

On a better note, I expect tonight's session to be considerably stronger than that of last evening. The session is greatly composed of very well bred Ohio and Indiana sired yearlings. I would guess the averages to be higher than those of Day Four and close to that of Day Three.

We shall see.

Oct. 10 - 6 a.m.

Before beginning my ramblings, I'd like to extend my sincerest congratulations to my two buddies Randy Manges and David Reid and their staff for putting on a great sale despite encountering numerous difficulties. As has been said before, a few months ago, we had our doubts as to whether there would be any horse sales at all. The team pulled it off in an extraordinary good manner.

The only negative was that so many of the customers and even some of the consignors failed to abide by the mask rules that were in place.

I can understand the reluctance of those in charge to confront the people who were not abiding by the clearly

defined rules. But the fact is that those were the rules and by entering the premises, they agreed to abide by them. There are many out there who might feel that these rules encroached on their rights. That's fine, then don't agree to them, if you are not going to abide.

Folks, we are in the midst of a worldwide disaster. I understand that masks can be uncomfortable. But in this case, the ends satisfy the means. Lives are at stake.

Onto last night's session: As I said yesterday, the was a significant rebirth.

Prices were up, in some cases way up.

The Downbytheseasides sold exceptionally well. All five pacing bred \$100,000 yearlings sold were sired by him. There were others by that horse that also sold well.

The Fear The Dragons also sold well.

I thought that trotters in general and perhaps those by What The Hill were a little lighter than I had expected.

The Swan For Alls sold all over the place as did the few Rockin Images.

Ontario-sired horses also sold quite well with an Archangel colt bringing \$100,000.

All in all, I thought it was a very good session.

Looking at the numbers, 82 pacers brought \$2,660,000, an average of \$32,439; 86 trotters brought \$2,283,000, an average of \$26,547.

As for my own guesstimates for the session, 94 brought less than I thought they might bring; 65 brought less and seven brought the exact price I thought they might bring. I was very close on more than in any other session, but what hurt my guesses was that each one ended in a five or a zero. Anything that didn't end in those numbers was automatically off.

For the entire sale, 369 pacers brought \$17,144,000, and average of \$46,461; 447 trotters brought \$24,408,000, an average of \$54,604.

For the entire sale, 816 yearlings sold for \$1,552,000, an average of \$50,922; the second highest in the sales history — not too bad at all considering all the world's problems in 2020.

Best of luck to everybody who went away with a horse.

Now on to Timonium, which I expect that I will also be reporting from the sidelines.

Though tied for the fourth most 2-year-old wins in North America, 10-time winner Always A Miracle may need divine intervention to qualify for next Friday's \$250,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final.

One of the most consistent freshmen in the state of Indiana is a filly you may not know. Always A Miracle did not spend her summer at Harrah's Hoosier Park, but she is one of North America's leaders with a double-digit win total after a successful fair season. Recently, she added an Indiana Sires Stakes triumph to her credit, winning Wednesday (Oct. 7) in a time of 1:53.2. Unfortunately, she stands to miss out on competing in the Indiana Super Final in less than a week.

"We raced her at the fairs quite a bit and had seven wins in nine starts and two seconds," said owner and co-breeder Bill Huggins. "One of the seconds was by about six inches. I'm really happy with her."

Huggins has a long history with the family, first owning Always A Miracle's dam, Iva Miracle. He owned Iva Miracle's full sister, Valley Electric, also a product of the cross of



Electric Yankee and Incredible Finale mare Fox Valley Godiva. Valley Electric earned just over \$780,000 while accumulating 42 wins in the Hoosier State, with key victories in Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) competition. Iva Miracle never produced the results of her older sibling. She collected a victory on the Indiana fair circuit as a freshman, and finished third in a sires stakes final, but an injury abruptly ended her career.

"She raced in a sires stakes at Shelbyville (Indiana Downs) when they were still racing down there and I think she finished third," Huggins recalled. "After that, she broke a P1 bone in her back ankle and I took her down to Rood and Riddle and they put screws in it, but she never came back. So we made a broodmare out of her. She's not a very big mare, but she has produced."

From 10 foals of racing age, Iva Miracle has produced nine winners, led by Always A Miracle's full sister, It's A Miracle. The Always A Virgin mare earned \$471,627, picking up 38

wins and taking a mark of 1:51. Panda Man, a gelded son of The Panderosa, is the only other six-figure earner from Iva Miracle.

"Nine winners out of 10, which is pretty damn good," Huggins said. "I know a couple of them weren't much. I kept several of them, but we sold several of them too."

Always A Miracle was entrusted to Matt Rheinheimer, and the trainer also handled the driving duties this summer on the fair circuit. After qualifying in late June at Hoosier Park, Rheinheimer and the freshman kicked off the season with a victory at Converse, winning by nearly three lengths. Over the next eight trips behind the starting gate, Always A Miracle registered six victories and finished second in the \$20,000 Governor's Cup championship at the Indiana State Fairgrounds.

Moving to Hoosier Park following the fair season, the filly picked up the services of leading driver Trace Tetrick in her first pari-mutuel attempts, winning both. She stepped up into Indiana's top program and teamed with Ricky Macomber Jr. to produce a lifetime best effort. In her \$40,500 ISS division, the lass won by a length and a half as the third choice, adding her 10th win in 12 seasonal starts while finishing no worse than second. Always A Miracle's seasonal earnings

now stand at \$46,700.

Huggins, now 84, is not able to see his filly race in person, but watches her Hoosier Park starts on RTN. Health issues keep him from the track, but he is savoring every win.

"I'm getting to be an old man. I haven't been to the track in four years. My legs and my eyes are so bad, I can't drive anymore," he said. "It's really been amazing to have one that's doing well. I've enjoyed it."

Despite only making one start in sires stakes, the filly is three points shy of the top 10 leading into the Super Final, slated for Friday (Oct. 16). Always A Miracle could draw into the lucrative \$250,000 event should a filly listed higher in the points opts not to drop in the box.

Huggins may need a miracle, but should his filly draw in, she would contend with the ultra-tough division leader Somethingbeautiful and other talented fillies. Worst-case scenario is that she will compete in the \$25,000 consolation, and for Huggins, that's not bad news in a season that has proven a pleasant surprise.

Very Kronos is very impressive

Six-year-old Ready Cash son Very Kronos (out of Yankee Glide mare Glide About) entered the \$113,000 Swedish Championship for older trotters at Aby racetrack as one of the favorites on Saturday afternoon (Oct. 10). And the talented, but sometimes difficult trotter, showed why trainer Svante Båth always has expressed great words about Very Kronos.

Ahead of the Swedish Championship, Very Kronos had won 18 of 36 starts. Basically, he has won all races where he didn't go off stride.

Saturday's race was, so far, one of the toughest tests Very Kronos has faced and he solved it in impressive style.

Driver Erik Adielsson has been as patient as the trainer and the owner regarding finding the key to the Very Kronos riddle. During the last few months it seems like the horse has matured a lot, allowing Adielsson to send Very Kronos to the lead at an early stage in the 2,640 metre race at Aby.

Heavy rain made the track a bit sloppy just an hour before the race and the high pace in the race should have been too tough for most of the trotters over the distance. But Very Kronos defended himself bravely in the stretch when runner up Milliondollarrhyme attacked on open stretch after a pocket trip and when bronze medalist Cyber Lane made his move three wide in the last turn. Adielsson just concentrated on keeping Very Kronos in the right gait, which never was a problem this day, and when the Ready Cash son reached the wire, the time showed that Very Kronos grabbed the title in a world record performance: 1:55.2 over 1.6 miles.

"We've never really seen the bottom in this horse. He has either won his races or went off stride and now I hope that we can race more continuously, then I truly believe that he can race against and beat the best horses", said Båth after the race.

Very Kronos, the horse with a great reputation, showed his

potential and this was his big breakthrough in the elite races.

In the \$113,000 Swedish Championship for mares, Timo Nurmos' Hevin Boko (Going Kronos), paired with Mika Forss, also impressed a lot. Forss left third over with 1,400 meters remaining and aimed for the lead, where Björn Goop had placed Mellby Free after a quick start from post 8 behind the car. Goop's tactics were clear, to use the open stretch since first choice Conrads Rödluva had to do the heavy job outside the leader during the last kilometer and Mellby Free got her shot even earlier than that. Conrads Rödluva was tired in the last turn, which opened up for Mellby Free and it seemed like Goop was heading towards the victory, but leader Hevin Boko fought strongly in front and held her opponents behind her in a mile rate of 1:56 over 1.3 miles.

Six-year-old Hevin Boko collected her biggest win in her 45th lifetime start and she reached \$450,000 in earnings.

Perfect Sting stays unbeaten with International Stallion Stakes win

Shifting tactics to race off the speed, **Perfect Sting** culled an anxious moment at headstretch with a powerful stretch rally to keep his perfect record while winning the second of three divisions for the \$299,100 Betting Line International Stallion Stake Two-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace — sponsored by the Betting Line Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farm — on Saturday (Oct. 10) at Red Mile.

Summa Cum Laude left for the lead but yielded command to Literl Lad Hanover by a :27.2 opening quarter. Summa Cum Laude soon popped pocket into the backstretch and retook the lead by a :55 half. Meanwhile driver David Miller had



Perfect Sting positioned sixth, and angled the Always B Mike-Shebestingin colt first over into the far turn. He grabbed cover from Bayfield Beach to three-quarters in 1:22.4 but Summa Cum Laude had scooted away to a near-three-length lead.

Taking to the center of the track, Miller uncorked Perfect Sting straightening for the finish. The Joe Holloway trainee accelerated towards Summa Cum Laude with an eighth to go and reeled the leader in within the final strides, scoring the head decision at the beam of a 1:49.4 mile. Caviart Lotus

closed for third with early breaker Abuckabett Hanover rallying for fourth.

"He makes me work," David Miller said of his colt after the race. "He wanted it today — I was real proud of him; he wanted to put his head in front. When I got him off Dexter's back [driving Bayfield Beach] and got him going it looked like Yannick had about four [lengths] on me — and I know how good that horse raced last week. I wasn't sure I was going to track him down. So far he's been racing really hard and getting the job done."

Undefeated in eight starts, Perfect Sting has banked \$304,300 for owner/breeders Brittany Farms LLC and Val D'Or Farms. He paid \$3.40 to win.

Highlandbeachsbest grabbed the front early and never looked back in progress to a 1:50.2 score in the opening division of the Betting Line.

Pirate Hanover pushed for the lead to a :28.1 opening quarter with Highlandbeachsbest positioned second, but driver Tim Tetrick promptly vacated pocket with the Nancy Takter trainee to take the helm heading up the backstretch. By the half in :56.1, Highlandbeachsbest faced mild first-over pressure from Almanac circling the final turn and clipped three-quarters in 1:24. Almanac began to falter into the stretch while Pirate Hanover gave pursuit out of the pocket, making only a slight gain on Highlandbeachsbest to secure second well ahead of Emblaze Hanover in third. Beach Party took fourth.

A homebred for Highland Thoroughbred Farm, Highlandbeachsbest won his third race from 11 starts, earning \$124,002. The Somebeachsomewhere colt paid \$3.40 to win.

Odds-on choice **Southwind Gendry** stormed uncovered for the lead and kept all late challengers at bay to take the final division of the Betting Line in a 1:50 mile.

Positioned fifth to a :27.2 opening quarter, Southwind Gendry stayed put in midpack while Commanding Officer overtook early leader Always A Miki heading to a :54.4 half. Driver Yannick Gingras gave Southwind Gendry his cue moving into the far turn and rolled by a tiring leader after three-quarters in 1:22.3. Southwind Petyr, tracking the favorite's cover, swung off a helmet into the stretch and dug into Southwind Gendry while Always A Miki rallied off a pocket trip up the pylons late. Southwind Gendry kept a neck in front of Southwind Petyr to the finish while Always A Miki settled for third and Lou's Pearlman leapt from last for fourth.

"You can do whatever you want with the horse—he's perfect to drive," Gingras said after the race. "I was hoping to get a covered trip for sure, it's always tough coming first up a long, long way. But he's a game horse; when they come to him, that's when he goes."

Collecting his eighth victory from 10 starts, Southwind Gendry has banked \$409,269 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Phil Collura, Knox Services and J&T Silva-Purnel&Libby. Ron Burke trains the Southwind Farms-bred Always B Miki gelding who paid \$2.60 to win.

Grand Circuit action concludes at Red Mile this afternoon (Oct. 11) with a 12-race card headlined by the \$444,000 125th Kentucky Futurity and the \$255,000 55th Kentucky Filly Futurity. First-race post time is slated for 1:00 p.m. (EDT).

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt sent Flawless Country to the front from post 7 while Gimme Shelter pushed for the pocket from the pylon post and Hello I Love You floated into third. Insta Glam raced headstrong from fourth and soon launched for the lead as the field marched to a :56.3 half.

Insta Glam held command around the final turn, taking the

A Southwind Frank filly bred by Christian Stoltzfus, Flawless Country won her fifth race from eight starts, earning \$323,121 for owners Ake Svanstedt Inc., Wolfgang A Stable Inc. and Borje Nasstrom. She paid \$4.80 to win.

With 7-5 favorite May Karp going on a gallop heading to the half, 9-5 second choice **Beautiful Game** picked up the pieces to win the second split of the International Moni.

May Karp cleared control to a :28 opening quarter but began to gallop into the backstretch, leaving Piper Hanover on the front with Hot As Hill in the pocket and Beltassima in third. Past a :56.4 half, Beltassima pulled first over with Aunt Irene positioned second over and Beautiful Game third over.

Beltassima applied pressure to Piper Hanover by three-quarters in 1:26.1 and continued to dig into the stubborn leader as the backfield fanned out for the stretch drive. Beltassima eventually ground past Piper Hanover to take a narrow lead, but Beautiful Game gathered momentum down the center of the course and powered by rivals in the final strides to win. Piper Hanover held third with Hot As Hill

finishing fourth.

Winning her second race from 10 starts, Beautiful Game has earned \$179,425 for owners Melvin Hartman, David McDuffee and Enzed Racing Stable Inc. Richard "Nifty" Norman trains the Muscle Hill filly bred by Brittany Farms LLC, Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld while David Miller drove the \$5.60 winner.

Anoka Hanover hustled to the lead heading to the half and held firm to the finish, winning the third division of the International Moni in 1:53.2.

Splash Blue Chip grabbed the lead moving to a :29.1 first quarter but faced a shuffle up the backstretch as Gotta Believe popped pocket as Material Girl mounted a bid for the lead. Gotta Believe settled for the pocket as Material Girl cleared before a :57.1 half, but Anoka Hanover ranged uncovered towards the top and became the new leader heading into the final turn.

Adirondack angled first over and made slight gains on Anoka Hanover to three-quarters in 1:25 but began spinning her wheels into the stretch. Once-leader Splash Blue Chip, finding a spot third over, swung to the center of the track and dashed towards Anoka Hanover into the final eighth, but could only manage second. Off the 4-5 favorite, Anoka Hanover scored her sixth win from 10 starts, earning \$215,091 for trainer Noel Daley and co-owners L A Express Table LLC and Caviart Farms. Todd McCarthy drove the Hanover Shoe Farms-bred Donato Hanover filly who paid \$3.60 to win.

Iteration rolled down the center of the track late to nail her competition at the finish and win the final division of the International Moni in 1:53.3.

Presto pushed for the lead but yielded control to 9-5 favorite You Ato Dream by a :29.1 opening quarter. You Ato Dream then accelerated up the backstretch as Mazzarati floated first over from fourth with Iteration in tow past a :56.4 half. The favorite kept the tempo hot while Mazzarati stalled to three quarters in 1:24.4, forcing the backfield to tip wide heading for the finish.

Into the stretch Presto popped pocket to challenge You Ato Dream, who kept the challenger at bay into the eighth pole. Pub Crawl, sitting third the whole mile, swung wide and surged towards the front with Iteration moving to the center of the track with the most momentum. With four horses in a line at the finish, Iteration won the photo over You Ato Dream, with Pub Crawl third and Presto fourth.

Trained by Marcus Melander for owner Courant Inc., Iteration won her fifth race from eight starts, earning \$307,009. Order By Stable bred the Chapter Seven filly while Brian Sears sat in the sulky. She paid \$15.60 to win.

Grand Circuit action concludes at Red Mile this afternoon (Oct. 11) with a 12-race card headlined by the \$444,000 125th Kentucky Futurity and the \$255,000 55th Kentucky Filly Futurity. First-race post time is slated for 1 p.m. (EDT).

Lexington Mixed sale tops \$3 million

The most expensive horse to change hands was Creature Of Habit, a Donato Hanover filly out of Habit's Best purchased by Cane Run Farm and Bluestone Farm for \$350,000 from Diamond Creek.

The Lexington Selected Mixed Sale, held Saturday (Oct. 10) at the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion, grossed \$3,072,000 for 77 offerings. It was the second time a mixed sale has been held in Lexington.

In its inaugural year in 2018, 105 horses/stallion shares were sold, grossing \$4,759,000. A mixed sale was not held in Lexington in 2019.

"I was a little disappointed in the entries," said the sale's co-manager David Reid, "but that being said, I wasn't disappointed in the quality."

Reid said the idea to try to have a mixed sale this year started with the pandemic.

"With all the uncertainty that was going on in the summer, we had the facility and we had the racing and it was suggested that we have a mixed sale," Reid said. "The entries were a little slow and I think that was attributed to the uncertainty at the time. So, when the sales closed for both here and Harrisburg it was the beginning of September. You've got to remember that Yonkers was scheduled to close after the New York Sires Stakes Final and there was a lot of uncertainty about which racetracks were going to be open, so during that time there were a lot of dynamics going on."

"We didn't have that big of a catalogue, only 85 head or something, including stallion shares," Reid said. "(But) the horses that were performing or producing on the top level sold fine. I think maybe the uncertainty of what's going on is making some of the buyers adjust

their plans as well, from the breeding point of view.

"Let's get through the election, let's get through Harrisburg, let's get a vaccine and maybe make people come back to a little bit more normal life, because it's draining on a lot of people. I think it takes a toll and I think it affects people's decisions to manage their equine assets differently that they would have in the past."

Twenty-six racehorses went through the ring, grossing \$1,490,000. Thirty-one broodmares fetched a total of \$806,000 and 13 stallion shares grossed \$723,000 in all. Two yearlings were sold for \$14,000, total.

Hip #993 Marseille, a Muscle Hill colt out of Order By Wish, received the highest bid of \$397,000, but was an RNA that will go back to Diamond Creek Farm.

The highest-priced offering that changed hands Saturday was Hip #981 Creature Of Habit, a 3-year-old daughter of Donato Hanover out of Habit's Best purchased by Cane Run Farm and Bluestone Farm for \$350,000 from Diamond Creek. Creature Of Habit has earned \$94.810 on the track and has a mark of 1:54.2. She is a half-sister to \$1.2 million-winning male Habitat.

"We sold (Creature Of Habit) as a yearling here for \$130,000 and we've just been watching her race the whole time, like a daughter," said Cane Run's Elizabeth Caldwell. "The mare hasn't had a filly since her. She's had a colt this year and she's barren for next year. We really liked this filly.

"Her family has been good to us and it's just a family that we always liked. She's a beautiful individual. She had some talent on the track. She was fast, but not the fastest."

Caldwell said the plan is to breed Creature Of Habit. "We don't know who we'll breed her to yet. We didn't

know we were going to get her. That was going to be my last bid."

Mario Zuanetti of Atlantic Trot Inc. purchased Hip #921 Blue With Envy as an agent for James Wilhite for \$75,000 and Hip #924 Doris Deo for \$50,000 for an Italian owner.

"We've been together since 2006. He has about 10 mares at Kentuckiana Farms, selling yearlings here," Zuanetti said of Wilhite. "This year we had a pretty good year and so we were looking for broodmare prospects or broodmares in foal. We didn't know if we're going to go to Harrisburg or not so we looked to this and we found this mare (Blue With Envy) that we liked in foal to Greenshoe first crop and we just took a chance and bought her.

Doris Deo is in foal to Muscle Hill.

"(Doris Deo will) be exported. For her, she was a good-looking mare, toeing in maybe a little bit more than I'd like, but she's in foal to Muscle Hill and we're exporting her to Italy and there's not too many Muscle Hills there, so that was the idea behind that and we were able to get her," Zuanetti said, adding that he thought the mixed sale was "pretty good.

"Usually when the yearlings are selling good, then it trickles down to a good mixed sale. To me, for what we thought it was going to be four months ago, this is almost a dream."

Preferred Equine led all consignors with \$1,896,000 in sales for 52 offerings.

Reid said the sale company will continue to assess the viability of a mixed sale in Lexington.

"Maybe it's too quick on the heels of (the Lexington yearling sale) and before Harrisburg," he said. "We're going to go back to the drawing board... You always want better results, but we're not totally disappointed."

Designer Specs remains undefeated in \$40,000 Ohio Fair Championship

On Saturday (Oct. 10), MGM Northfield Park hosted host to the Ohio Fair Championships — a series of eight \$40,000 races that celebrates the Buckeye State's rich network of county fair racing.

The highlight of the evening's competitive and exciting racing was the freshman filly trotting division, where **Designer Specs** (Full Count—Avalon Hall) (**full story here**) completed her freshman season a perfect 14-for-14. Those 14 victories tie her as the winningest horse in North America this year with Lazy Day Hanover, First Gunner and Bad Ms Johnson.

Driver Ryan Stahl found the garden spot with Designer Specs, an unusual place for the filly that is typically on the lead, and sat the pocket through times of :27.3, :57.1 and 1:27.1. Stahl tipped the flawless filly in the final quarter and she bested her closed competition by 1/2-length in 1:57.4.

The clocking represents a new lifetime mark for the Full Count filly that is owned by Louise and Jay Weller of Republic, OH. Designer Specs trains under the tutelage of Jay's sister Jayne Weller. The championship elevated her earnings to \$56,664.

Timestorm captured the sophomore colt trotting final in 1:55.1 with driver Ronnie Wrenn Jr. for trainer Kent Hess and owner Ted Boschma. Saturday's victory was his 22nd win in 29 lifetime starts.

Ball Diamond (We Will See-A Diamond In June) and Aaron Merriman came from post-eight to win the 2-year-old filly

pace division in 1:56.1 for trainer Lonnie Graber and owner Dannie Ray Hostetler. The win represents her seventh win in 13 starts.

Checkmate (Broadway Hall-Dance With A Dolly) also overcame a poor post draw to score in the freshman colt trotting final. Hunter Myers drive the colt for owner Donna Jean Anderson and trainer Bryan Weaver. The mile was Checkmate's sixth win in 16 starts and lowered his mark to 1:59.

Feelin Western (Western Terror-Suite Feelin) lowered his mark to 1:53.2 winning the 2-year-old colt pacing final with driver Ronnie Wrenn Jr. It was the Western Terror's son's seventh win in 12 starts. Brian Brown trains the colt for the owning partnership of VIP Internet Stable and Joseph Rotella.

Bad Ms Johnson won the sophomore filly pacing championship in 1:54.2 with trainer/driver Hank Le Van for owner Ricco Johnson. She now has 14 wins this year and is tied for the winningest horse in North America. The win brings her lifetime bankroll to \$79,390.

Electric Ridge received a perfect trip and scored in the 3-year-old filly trot division. Aaron Merriman drove for trainer Chris Beaver, who co-owns with J. Gallagher, Moger-Delia Racing and S. Zeehandelar. The race's 1:56.2 clocking equaled the lifetime mark for the Triumphant Caviar filly that now has earnings of \$90,622.

Rockin Daddy O rocked his competition from post eight at odds of 80-1 in the sophomore pacing final in 1:51.2. Greg Grismore drove for Philippe Belanger who owns the son of Rockin Amadeus with Jeffrey Koesters. His impressive rally was his 10th win in 31 starts and carried his bank account to \$58,294.

We need a hurricane

During our discussion of current events and current politicians, David gave me one of his long-winded theories, "Tragically flawed people are like flames that draw moths. Aristotle believed that the two ingredients that arouse people are pity and fear.Politicians, sports figures, actors, and individuals who have volatility are catnip. They grab audiences, and for psychological reasons, the audience clings to them."

"Sports?" I asked.

He nodded, "A once-in-a-lifetime icon like Bobby Fisher in chess, Lance Armstrong in cycling, or Mike Tyson in boxing, can take a small sport and drag it up the popularity mountain. Not necessarily due to what the person achieved, but because of who they were."

I was quiet for a few seconds, organizing my thoughts. Then I said, "The past few days of lockdown, I've googled the hell out of an interesting character. I never heard of him, but half of England was mesmerized by a flawed piped piper during the seventies and eighties. Magic happened. The effects still linger like smoke from one of his non-stop cigarettes above the green felt tables forty years later."

"That sounds like someone from your mini-addiction, Snooker," he said.

I nodded, "Snooker has a history a lot like harness racing. It's an old game fueled by gambling. Wealthy upper-crust men dragged both games into popularity. Then the sports faded to a hardcore group of supporters until a player exploded interest."

"Who was this piper?"

"A street kid from Belfast with a swagger and wildly unpredictable temperament. He loved racehorses, so he ditched school at 15 and hopped a ferry to England to work at a racing stable. His two years mucking stalls may have been the happiest time of his turbulent life. His lousy work ethic and problems with authority lead him out of one game into another."

"Snooker?"

I nodded, "Alex Higgins was one strange cat, a wild cat, a feral cat, a cool cat. When color television came along, he shoved Snooker into the mainstream. Twenty million people would tune in until the early hours to watch a Snooker Championship – if Hurricane Higgins was playing."

"Was he that talented?"

"Not really. Higgins was a maverick, a showman. He was a player who had a nervous tick and couldn't stand still for more than 5 seconds, but the man had style. In a glacially slow sport, "Hurricane Higgins" featured a fast, attacking style. He played to get the crowd on their feet, and the public adored him for it. He was a good player, but there are always good players. Hurricane had charisma and a furious intensity that captivated the audience."

I out my phone and read a few quotes I had bookmarked,

"Alex 'Hurricane' Higgins transcended sport in a way very few sportsmen ever have. He threw himself into life like a man throwing himself off a cliff without a safety net. No plan. No fear. No shame. And the people could not get enough of him."

I scrolled to another quote,

"Higgins was, for a time, the most loved sportsman in Britain. He was world champion in 1972 and 1982. The decade between made my jaw drop. He was the most charismatic snooker player who ever walked into an arena. He could mesmerize and terrorize. Be acclaimed by millions one moment and thrown out of a pub the next, die in pitiful isolation yet be celebrated by thousands lining the streets in what amounted to a state funeral."

And one more.

"The Hurricane transformed the game from old men in dark halls to dizzy heights in the '80s. Overnight, Higgins changed the sport, bringing it kicking and screaming into the modern age, and without asking, he would tell you himself...'Snooker was bollix before I came along, pure bollix."

David asked, "Didn't you have a driver like that in harness racing who was driving horses around during the same time frame?"

"Yeah, his name was Walter Case. He was controversial, flawed, and talented as hell. But he didn't quite have the magic, and he didn't have his sport on national television every week. Walter Case was of interest inside harness racing, Higgins reached outside of the sport to grab fans who did not know the game, and brought a rock n roll lifestyle almost beyond belief."

"Was he that wild?"

I read another quote.

"The Hurricane brought an air of menace, a threat of violence. He came out to the crowd waving his hat in the air, licking the white ball for luck, always entertaining and controversial."

"Controversial?"

I ran through a mental list, "Threatening to have a rival Irish snooker player shot, frequent fights, gambling, booze, and throwing TVs through windows. Then you have the leaping out of hotel windows, getting stabbed, dealing with a cocaine habit, punching a reporter, and being chased by actor Oliver Reed with an ax in his mansion."

"Not exactly a choir boy?"

I gave him a shrug, "He never forgot horseracing, blowing huge wads of money on races. One time he showed up at a tournament with his face badly bruised and explained it by saying a racehorse kicked him until confessing it happened during a bar fight."

David said, "And the people forgave him and loved him more."

"Yes, and they enjoyed his constant battles with authorities." He headbutted an official, refused to wear the traditional black suit with a bow tie, and threw the dickie bow to the crowd. One of his banishments was from the popular snooker TV show, Pot Black, for urinating into a flowerpot. Authorities hated him, but they needed him. His enemies on the table, he had many, knew he was talking them to places Snooker had never seen."

David chimed in, "Back to where we began. His flaws made him relatable. It's a psychological thing."

"Yeah, but it wasn't just his flaws. Higgins also had humor; he could toss out a wisecrack. And he pulled pranks, once he showed up at one of his many disciplinary hearings with a trolley of champaign for the judges and his accusers."

David smiled, "Did the bribe help?"

"No, he was quilty as usual. But he could tug at your heartstrings. Etched into the British population's memories are a tearful Higgins holding onto his baby girl in one arm with a trophy in his other arm. The year of that championship, he began in a nursing home where he was trying to detox, with no manager or practice time."

He said, "Characters like Higgins, Fischer, and Armstrong often have trouble when the days onstage are finished, and the popularity and notoriety they brought to a sport has faded. They can't carry the ball for too long."

I nodded, "The Hurricane blew out of the top tier of players in the mid-eighties. Amazingly, he lived to sixty-one. Hisfinal years fighting throat cancer and hustling for money to feed his betting habit were not pretty. Still, he remains one of the most iconic figures in the game."

David said, "Chess and bicycle racing fell back after the phenomenons that pulled them into the spotlight retired. What happened to Snooker after the Hurricane era?"

"The game slid down but caught a few breaks. Today, Snooker has scaled back controversial star, Ronnie the Rocket. He can draw a couple of million viewers. However, the big positive is that the game found new fans in Asia, especially China."

He paused and said, "Maybe there are a few lessons here for your sport of harness racing. Find a controversial star, lean on that star, and always look for new territory."

"I nodded again, "Yeah, without those things, harness racing could be bollix, whatever the hell that is."
