Ariana G primed to deliver Takter's first Yonkers International Trot

Thanks to prodigious talent and a great post position, Katz and Libfeld homebred is hoping to become the ninth mare to win the International.

Jimmy Takter, winner of the Dan Patch Trainer of the Year Award a record six times, has just about done it all during his Hall of Fame career.

Breeders Crown victories? He counts a whopping 33 of them. Hambletonian? Four times. Hambletonian Oaks? Six times. Elitloppet and Prix d'Amerique? The fabulous Moni Maker checked off those from his bucket list in 1998 and 1999, respectively.

Perhaps the only missing piece in his resume involves the

International Trot, and he hopes to fill that void when he sends the great mare Ariana G into the 40th edition of the race on Saturday at Yonkers Raceway.

"I've won basically everything, but I haven't won this one," said Takter, 58. "This is something I want to win."

This is about much more than the \$1 million purse for Takter as he readies his third International starter. Ariana G, the one United States representative, can add to her brilliant career by becoming the ninth mare to win the prestigious contest.

She would join Armbro Flight (Canada, 1966), Roquepine (France, 1967-68), Une de Mai (France, 1969 and 1971), Fresh Yankee (Canada, 1970), Delmonica Hanover (United States, 1973-74), Classical Way (United States, 1980), Kit Lobell (United States, 1989) and Peace Corps (Sweden, 1991).

The International was first contested at old Roosevelt Raceway in 1959. It was not held in 1994 and from 1996 through 2015 before it returned from a 20-year hiatus and was moved to the half-mile oval at Yonkers.

Ariana G has competed at 10 different tracks while sweeping 26 of 37 starts for earnings of \$2,367,709 on behalf of Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, her breeders and owners. This will be her first test at a half-mile track; her adaptability looms as a huge question for some.

But not for her driver, Yannick Gingras. "If anything, it will work in her favor. I don't think it will be a problem at all," he said.

And not for Takter. "I really don't think it's going to be a big issue," he said, adding, "I think she's coming in with the right form. She's very professional and very healthy."

She has banked \$500,052 in going 5 for 11 this season.

Takter worked with her at a half-mile track at Red Mile in Lexington a couple of weeks ago. He liked everything he saw. "She had no problem whatsoever," he said.

The trainer breathed a sigh of relief when the 4-year-old daughter of Muscle Hill out of the Cantab Hall mare Cantab It All drew post 3 in a field of 10. "I think post three gives Yannick a lot of different options," Takter said. She is listed as the third choice in the morning line, at 5-1.

Takter believes Ariana G's versatility may be a huge factor in the mile-and-a-quarter International.

"She can leave from the gate, she can back off the gate," he said. "You can do anything you want with this filly."

Ariana G emerged as the Female Trotter of the Year at 2 and 3. Katz, from Toronto, and Libfeld, from Pickering, ON resisted the temptation to send her to the breeding shed after that. They were having too much fun to stop with what Libfeld has called the "horse of a lifetime."

"It's been just a magical ride," Katz said. "She's been a spectacular performer right from the beginning of her racing career. She continues to perform at the highest levels."

Many trotters can muster a burst of speed. Ariana G can settle into a powerful rhythm and maintain it.

"Jimmy has described her as a Ferrari, and I think that's a very good description," Katz said. "She has tremendous speed and she can carry it for a long distance. She loves to race."

Ariana G has shown before that she can handle the finest male trotters. She comes off an impressive half-length victory against surging Warawee Roo in the Dayton Derby on Sept. 28 in her most recent start. Her time of 1:52.1 set a track record for 4-year-old trotting mares at Dayton Raceway.

Takter oversees approximately 50 horses at his farm in East Windsor, N.J. He describes his prized mare as having a sweet temperament at the barn and a merciless will to win when she goes to the gate.


"She knows what she is supposed to do," he said. "She has everything a great horse is supposed to have."

Maybe, just maybe, she has the makings of Takter's first International champion.

Elitlopp champ Ringostarr Treb looking to add International to resume



Trainer Jerry Riordan exuded confidence before last year's International Trot at Yonkers Raceway, talking the talk and all but certain that his horse would walk the walk.

Italy's Twister Bi lived up to the hype, leaving runner-up Marion Marauder of Canada and the rest of the outclassed field in his wake as he tore through the mile and a quarter in 2:22.1, nearly two seconds faster than the world record set at the same event in 2016.

This time, Riordan's words are chosen more carefully. Any hint of bravado is gone.

Such is the respect he has for what he believes is an older and better Marion Marauder, a deserving 3-1 favorite who drew the rail in a field of 10 for Saturday's contest. Such is the concern he has that Ringostarr Treb, a former \$10,000 claimer who blossomed into the winner of this year's Elitloppet, cannot possibly be at the top of his game.



The 8-year-old son of Classic Photo, who drew post four for driver Wim Paal as Italy's representative, has made only one start since he repelled Propulsion by half a length in the Elitloppet at Solvalla on May 27. He was timed in 1:51, equaling the mark Timoko set the year before, in giving Riordan his first Elitloppet triumph.

That high was quickly followed by disappointment when Ringostarr Treb was sidelined for an extended period by an infection that developed after an injection to his ankle.

"He's probably still got a little rust. I know physically he can do it, but it's not the same as having those race miles in your legs," said Riordan, an expatriate from Rhode Island. "I'm not there with him like he needs to be, but it's the International. We're here and we're thrilled to be invited."

Riordan is bidding to become only the third trainer to record International victories in consecutive years. He warns against dismissing his horse.

"He's going to be a contender. I'm not worried about that," he said. "But he can't possibly be as sharp as he was this spring."

The rise of Ringostarr Treb shows that the seemingly impossible can be possible when horses come into the right hands. When he was a youngster, he showed every sign of being relegated to the game's lowest levels.

Although he made significant gains with maturity, he was anything but top shelf until he was transferred to Riordan's barn last year at the end of May. He made his first smart move by assigning Heli Tarrimaa as the groom. The horse immediately responded to her care and her gentle touch.

"There might be grooms as good as her, but there is nobody better than Heli," Riordan said. "He found a girl who loves him and really knows her work."

The trainer decided that less would be more when it came to the equipment Ringostarr Treb had worn. He instead freed the trotter to do what came naturally.

"He's a horse that doesn't need any equipment. We took everything off of him," Riordan said. "I think he had a few things he didn't need."

The veteran also responded to his new training environment in Halmstad, Sweden.

"It's a super, super good place to train," Riordan said. "Horses always get better when they come there."

Yet another source of improvement came from the decision to have him compete at longer distances at the Hippodrome de Vincennes in France last winter. Ringostarr Treb, who tries hard no matter the circumstances, learned to race off the

pace and apparently benefitted from facing such stiff competition even if he was no threat to win. It was akin to having a talented girl or boy compete in an older age group.

"I think in any sport you can train, train, train. But the only way you get good at the next level is competing at that level," Riordan said.


He noted that Ringostarr Treb returned to Sweden significantly better than when he ventured to France. "I noticed a difference when I brought him home," the trainer said. "He was a better, stronger horse."

The ankle infection limited the veteran to six starts this season. He has won half of them for earnings of \$598,531. He has captured 30 of 86 lifetime starts while banking \$1,579,215 for E.V.A.M. Racing.

Riordan is quick to deflect credit for Ringostarr Treb's emergence. He noted that standardbreds can be unpredictable in their response to different environments and training regimens.

"That is the wonderful thing about the horse business," he said. "You can think you are doing everything right, and then some farmer comes out of the weeds and kicks your butt."

Paal returns to U.S. with International Trot contender Ringostarr Treb

It's been six years since Wim Paal competed in the U.S. and his return will not go unnoticed. Paal, a 58-year-old native of Germany, is back to drive European standout Ringostarr Treb in Saturday's \$1 million Yonkers International Trot at Empire City Casino's Yonkers Raceway.

Ringostarr Treb, the winner of Sweden's prestigious Elitloppet in May, is the 4-1 second choice on the morning line behind Marion Marauder at 3-1. An 8-year-old stallion, Ringostarr Treb, a son of stallion Classic Photo, has won 30 of 86 career races and \$1.57 million. He is trained by New England native Jerry Riordan, who won last year's International Trot with Twister Bi, and will represent Italy for owners E.V.A.M. Racing.



"It's always a big honor to have a horse invited to this kind of race," Paal said. "I think we have a shot. He is a hell of a horse. I'm really happy to be with him. Hopefully he can do good on Saturday.

"We are just proud to be here. This is what makes life. Not only the sport, life. What they do here at Yonkers brings people together. We should do that much more often. It's unique. It's a big thing."

Paal, who has enjoyed a 40-year career as a driver and trainer, is no stranger to the International Trot. He drove Every Way to a sixth-place finish in the 1987 edition of the invitational, which was won by Callit. It was the last year the race, which began in 1959, was held at Roosevelt before moving to Yonkers. The race was discontinued following the 1995 edition, but resurrected in 2015.

In addition to their Elitloppet triumph, Ringostarr Treb and Paal won this year's Group 1 Olympiatravet.

"He's stepped up in class every year," Paal said of Ringostarr Treb. "When he went to Jerry, he stepped up in class again. I must say, the horse is a very smart horse. He can handle every kind of track and can do it either from the lead or with cover. It doesn't make a big difference. If I have cover, and I have a horse that sets the pace where he can come out the last quarter (mile), I think he is best that way."

Paal grew up on a farm near Dusseldorf and started riding ponies at a young age before going into show jumping. At the age of 15, he began working with trotters. He won his first race in 1977.

"I grew up step by step with horses," he said.

After working in Germany, he opened a stable in Italy in 1989. Four years later, he won the Gran Premio Lotteria and Gran Premio Renzo Orlandi with Embassy Lobell and in 1995 he won four Group 2 events in Italy with Toss Out.

Following additional successes in Italy, Paal opened a stable in France in 1999. He moved to the U.S. in 2006, while maintaining stables in Europe, and remained a presence in the States until the middle of 2012. He has operated a stable in Sweden since 2015.

"I enjoy coming back to the United States and New York City," Paal said. "I liked a lot being here. It was a good experience. I'm proud that I tried it because it gives me a good feeling to know how it works in the United States. Now I'm in Sweden and we have pretty good horses."

Capturing Sweden's most renowned race, the Elitlopp, was a thrill for Paal, who competed in the race seven times prior to his victory with Ringostarr Treb.

"For me it meant a lot," Paal said. "You know the best horses in the world are getting an invitation. I could make it thanks to a great horse and thanks to great work that Jerry did. We are proud.

"I'm working three years now in Sweden and it helps a little bit when you win the biggest race in the country where you work," he added.

All of his experiences have Paal feeling like a man half his age.

"I'm 58, but I feel like 30," he said, smiling. "Things are going good right now."

Marion Marauder is favored in Yonkers International Trot

Marion Marauder, who finished second in last year's \$1 million Yonkers International Trot, is the 3-1 morning-line favorite in Saturday's (Oct. 13) 40th edition of the invitational, which will be raced at 1-1/4 miles at Empire City Casino's Yonkers Raceway. The 5-year-old stallion, representing Canada, was made the top choice after getting post No. 1 on Tuesday at the event's draw and press conference at Manhattan's 21 Club.

Scott Zeron will drive Marion Marauder for trainer Paula Wellwood. Marion Marauder has won six of 10 races this year and finished no worse than second in any start. He heads to the International Trot off a win in the Caesars Trotting Classic on Sept. 21 at Hoosier Park. Other victories in 2018

include the John Cashman Memorial and Cleveland Trotting Classic. He was second in the Maple Leaf Trot and Maxie Lee Memorial Invitational.

"It beats the heck out of the seven or eight hole, that's for sure," said Mike Keeling, who shares the training duties on Marion Marauder with his wife, Paula Wellwood, about drawing the rail. "At least we won't be parked.

"He loves three weeks between races and this works out perfectly from his last start. I think he's probably a touch better than he was for the Hoosier race. We're really pleased with him right now. As long as he's in good shape and the race sets up for him, we'll be fine.

"I follow the Europeans a little bit. I know Lionel, I know Ringostarr Treb. The other horses I'm not so familiar with. We'll look at the program pages. We can only do what we can do, it's up to Scott to figure out the rest."



For his career, Marion Marauder has won 20 of 48 races and earned \$3.08 million for owners Jean Wellwood (Paula's mom) and Devin Keeling (Mike and Paula's son). Marion Marauder was the 2016 Trotter of the Year after winning the Trotting Triple Crown and captured another Dan Patch Award in 2017 as best older male trotter.

Marion Marauder has enjoyed success at Yonkers, with three wins and two seconds in five career starts. One of the victories came in the Yonkers Trot on his way to the Triple Crown.

Ariana G, the U.S. representative and lone mare in the field of 10, drew post three and is 5-1 on the morning line. The International Trot has been won by a mare 11 times — two times each by Roquepine and Une de Mai from France and Delmonica Hanover from the United States — most recently by Peace Corps in 1991. The International Trot was contested from 1959 through 1995 before being resurrected in 2015.

A Dan Patch Award divisional champion at ages 2 and 3, the 4-year-old Ariana G has won five of 11 races this year and heads to the International Trot off a win over male rivals in the Dayton Trotting Derby on Sept. 28. Other victories this season include the Hambletonian Maturity and Graduate Series championship. She also won her elimination for the Maple Leaf Trot and finished third in the final.

For her career, Ariana G has won 26 of 37 races and earned \$2.36 million for owners Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld. Yannick Gingras will drive the mare for trainer Jimmy Takter.

"You have to be happy with the draw," said Gingras. "But I think most of the good horses got good spots too. It will be a tactical race, but we can't complain about where we'll start.

"I think she's super sharp. She raced really good in Ohio in her last start. Jimmy skipped Lexington pointing toward this race. I think it was a smart move, no doubt. I think she's got as good a shot as anybody."

Will Take Charge, a second Canadian representative as a late replacement for the Netherlands' Dreammoko, drew post seven and is 6-1. The Jeff Gillis-trained 5-year-old gelding, who will have Tim Tetrick in the sulky, has won nine of 21 races this year, including the Crawford Farms Open Trot and Maxie Lee Memorial, for owner Mac Nichol. For his career, he has won 21 of 71 starts and \$848,116.

Elitloppet winner Ringostarr Treb, one of two horses representing Italy, leads the international contingent. The 8-year-old stallion is trained by New England native Jerry Riordan, who conditioned last year's International Trot champion Twister Bi. Ringostarr Treb, who has won 30 of 86 career races and \$1.57 million, will start from post four with driver Wilhelm "Wim" Paal and is 4-1. The stallion is owned by E.V.A.M. Racing.

"I'm very happy about the post," Paal said. "It keeps me a little bit out of the traffic in the first turn. I can choose my

own race. I think there are four or five horses that have a good shot in this race — Marion Marauder, Up And Quick, Ariana G. For me, Lionel is a horse you should not underestimate because he shows his best at a mile-and-a-quarter and he is a classy horse.

"I think the small track gives a big opportunity to the four (inside) horses. They are all good horses and were lucky in the draw."

Up And Quick, who won the 2015 Prix d'Amerique, drew post two and is 10-1 with top Yonkers driver Jason Bartlett in the sulky for trainer Antoine Lherete. The 10-year-old stallion, representing France, has won 16 of 74 career races and \$2.81 million. He is owned by Ecurie Quick Star.

Lionel, representing Norway, drew post nine in the second tier and is 10-1 with owner Goran Antonsen set to drive. The 8-year-old stallion, trained by Daniel Reden, won his Elitloppet elimination and finished fifth in the final. He has won 23 of 69 races and \$1.67 million.

The remaining International Trot participants are Italy's Arazi Boko, Sweden's Cruzado Dela Noche and Pastore Bob, and Denmark's Slide So Easy.

Racing begins at 1 p.m. Saturday. The International Trot is race No. 8 on the card and scheduled for 3:40 p.m.

Gillis and Nichol relishing chance of a lifetime with talented Will Take Charge in the International

Trainer Jeff Gillis and owner Mac Nichol can only hope they were right in what they wished for. They wanted so badly for Will Take Charge to secure a place in the \$1 million International Trot at Yonkers Raceway as Canada's representative that they bypassed more lucrative opportunities to race him in a \$44,000 open handicap there on Sept. 15.

The 5-year-old Kadabra—Celebrity Angel gelding did his part from post seven, the farthest outside position due to a scratch. He took command early and held off an onrushing Gruden by a nose in 1:53.2. That matched the record for an older gelded trotter set by Quick Deal in 2013. He fell one-fifth of a second shy of equaling the fastest mile ever trotted at Yonkers.

Still, when invitations were announced, Gillis and Nichol found themselves on the outside looking in. Since track officials wanted as many nations represented as possible, Canada's lone entry would be the more accomplished Marion Marauder, last year's runner-up.

Steve Starr, the racing secretary at Yonkers, asked them to consider the \$250,000 Harry Harvey Invitational Trot. He also assured them they would be given every consideration if a horse dropped out.

Gillis and Nichol were working a sale at Lexington when Starr called with the news they had only dared to hope for. Dreammoko, who was to be the flag bearer for the Netherlands, was said to be ill and would not be journeying to New York.

"We were both shocked and surprised," Nichol said. "It was a good surprise because we didn't think we were going to be in that particular race."

Nichol, 64, from Burlington, ON, has been involved with harness racing for more than two and a half decades, enjoying success primarily with pacers. He said of competing in the prestigious International, "It's once in a lifetime for most of us."

Will Take Charge has won nine of his 21 starts this year with five runner-up finishes and one third in banking \$417,215. He is 21 of 71 lifetime with earnings of \$848,116.

He will again benefit from the services of Tim Tetrick, his regular driver. They will leave from post 7 and are listed at 6-1 in the morning line. Rail-sitting Marion Marauder is the 3-1 favorite.

It will be a question of which Will Take Charge shows up on Saturday.

"If he's not on top of his game, he's not going to beat that field," Gillis said. "But when he is at his best, I feel he can compete with

anybody. There are a few trips he's gone where he has been very, very good and I would have liked to face anybody that day."

Will Take Charge distinguished himself in the Aug. 4 John Cashman Memorial at the Meadowlands. He missed by a neck to Marion Marauder. The filly Hannelore Hanover, defending Horse of the Year, came in third.

Recent results, though, have not been as encouraging. He made a break and finished a distant eighth to fellow International competitor Ariana G, a superb mare, in the Dayton Trotting Derby on Sept. 28. He went to the front – his preferred style – but was no match for Homicide Hunter in the Allerage Farms Open Trot at Red Mile in Lexington last Saturday. Homicide Hunter recorded the fastest trotting mile in history, lighting up the teletimer in 1:48.4.

Gillis acknowledged the need for improvement but said, "I believe in the horse. He's gone some big trips."

He noted the depth of talent in the 40th edition of the race and said, "I don't think any horse is going to beat that field without some racing luck and without being on top of their game."

One encouraging aspect for the connections is that Will Take Charge clearly demonstrated an affinity for the half-mile configuration at Yonkers. The ability to handle the turns – the treacherous first turn, in particular – looms as a huge question for some participants.

"He's very competitive and he does love the Yonkers track," said Nichol. "He seems to get around those turns real good. It's going to be an exciting day, that's for sure."

A day he waited a lifetime for.

Drivers to study for International test

North American drivers participating in Saturday's (Oct. 13) \$1 million Yonkers International Trot face several challenges as they prepare for the event, most notably learning about their rivals — and in some cases their own horse — in addition to contemplating the best path to victory in a 10-horse field going 1-1/4 miles.

"My deal is to know the competition the best I can and make decisions as it plays out," said Brian Sears, who is driving in the International Trot for the third time since its renewal in 2015 at Empire City Casino's Yonkers Raceway. Sears will be behind Cruzado Dela Noche, starting from post six, on Saturday.

"My job is to learn some of these horses, which is what makes this race so difficult to win. You don't really know the competition as well as you'd like. As the race unfolds, you'll see things happen and you try to make decisions to put your horse in the best spot. But I think you have to be aggressive. You have to be as aggressive as you can get away with."

Winners of the three most recent International Trots each accomplished the feat in different ways — one of which no longer exists.

In 2015, Norway's Papagayo E got a ground-saving trip behind leader Creatine and used the passing lane to earn the victory. The passing lane has since been eliminated at Yonkers. In 2016, U.S. representative Resolve led virtually from start to finish en route to his triumph. Last year, Italy's Twister Bi raced on the outside and methodically chased down leader Resolve before powering away to win by 5-1/2 lengths.

Marion Marauder, who is the 3-1 morning-line favorite in Saturday's race, finished second last year. He started from post No. 1 and got away in seventh place around the first turn. He will start again from post one on Saturday.

"When I had the rail last year it was a learning experience," said Scott Zeron, who drives Marion Marauder. "I pushed him off the wings enough to get him well situated, but I had to have a lot of luck on my side as well with not being able to pull the right line and go to the outer flow.

"It could end up like that again this year, but I know I have a horse that's capable of winning this race. I let him leave at his own comfort. It will be playing it by ear when I go off the wings. We'll see two steps off the gate where I'm going to get situated. Hopefully I have an opportunity to race him."

Trotting races at the distance of 1-1/4 miles are nothing new at Yonkers and looking back at 37 such races on Sundays in July to September shows horses that were no worse than third at the half-mile point won nearly 84 percent of the time. Horses that led at the half won 18 times while horses that were second won seven and horses third won six.

Posts one and six produced the most winners, with seven each, followed by post five with six.

"It's a benefit," Zeron said about the extra experience of racing 1-1/4 miles at Yonkers. "The difference with this race compared to a regular Sunday is having 10 horses that all can win. There are no longshots. These are the best of the best."

Jason Bartlett, who has won seven driving titles at Yonkers including the past four, is making his first appearance in the International Trot. He will drive France's Up And Quick, who counts the 2015 Prix d'Amerique among five career Group 1 wins in Europe. Up And Quick will start from post two.

"I thought the draw was very good," Bartlett said. "It gives me options. I don't really know the horse, but I'll do a little homework on him and go from there. I've talked to Bjorn Goop who drove him three starts ago. I'll watch some replays on him. That's all I can really do. I'll get a feel for him going into the turn when I score him down and that's it.

"I think the biggest part I've got to learn is a little bit about the competition, each horse in the race. It's the best trotters in the world, the best drivers; you can't really go in with a game plan.

"For me, it's my first time in this race. Winning it would be very special to me being that it's my home track. I'm just thankful to have the opportunity. It's going to be an interesting race."

Sears will be driving Sweden's Cruzado Dela Noche for the first time. Cruzado Dela Noche raced in the U.S. at ages 2 and 3, winning a division of the International Stallion Stakes and finishing third in the Peter Haughton Memorial. In Europe, his victories include the Group 1 Copenhagen Cup.

"I just hope that he's on his toes and puts up a good race," Sears said. "(To win) would be a feather in your cap. It's one of the biggest races and it's very hard to get done. To be able to accomplish that would be quite a victory, no doubt."

Yannick Gingras, with Ariana G, and Tim Tetrick, with Will Take Charge, are both making their second appearances in the International Trot and enter with horses they drive regularly. It will be the first time on a half-mile track for Ariana G, a two-time Dan Patch Award-winner who is the lone mare in the race.

"She's very square gaited, she's two fingers to drive, so I don't see (the half) being any problem at all," Gingras said. "I think if anything it will work in her favor. She's got it all, honestly. She's got the speed, you can stop-and-go anytime you want, and she's great gaited. I keep saying about her being great gaited, I hope I don't jinx her.

"She's just so smart. Maybe that's her best attribute. I think I've got as good a shot as anybody."

London Calling

Organizers of the London Selected Yearling Sale, to be held Saturday and Sunday at the Metroland Media Agri-Plex at the Western Fair District in London, ON are hoping to top last year's terrific inaugural sale.

A year after the London Selected Yearling Sale exceeded expectations in its inaugural auction, sale manager Ann Straatman is hoping for even bigger results from this year's sale to be held Saturday and Sunday (Oct. 13-14) at the Metroland Media Agri-Plex facility at the Western Fair District in London, ON.

"If I were comparing catalogues? Absolutely," Straatman said when asked if it's possible for this year's sale to surpass the 2017 auction that grossed \$7,536,000 for 306 yearlings sold, producing an average of \$24,627. "We've got a great catalogue this year, a lot of top horses. I think that there are a lot of those top prices catalogued here this weekend."

Straatman said she would be thrilled to even equal last year's numbers.

"It was a fantastic sale," she said.

This year, 324 yearlings are scheduled to be sold over two days. Both sale sessions begin at noon.

Straatman, who is also the reproduction manager of

Seelster Farms in Lucan ON, said there is something for everyone in this year's sale.

"There is every pedigree, every size, every gait of horse for the buyers... and not just Ontario, I'm hoping for a North American audience, but certainly there's something for everyone here.

She said the fact the London sale comes a week after a Lexington Selected Yearling Sale that smashed records for gross with nearly \$40 million in sales is important, especially for London's predominantly Canadian buyers.

"I know a lot of Ontario buyers were in Lexington as well and if they weren't able to get the yearlings they wanted there, I'm hoping this is their next stop for their yearling purchases," she said, adding that a low Canadian dollar may have had some Canadian buyers saving their money for the London sale rather than pay an exchange-driven premium on yearlings in Kentucky. "I think that is a huge advantage for us this year."

As for the state of the industry in Ontario, Straatman said she's heard "nothing but positive" from fellow breeders and buyers.

"Putting on my Seelster hat, I know we've had a lot of traffic to the farm every day. In talking with other consignors I know it's been very similar. I think there's a lot of interest and I think with a record sale in Lexington that momentum,

I'm hoping, will carry over here," Straatman said.

Ontario-sired horses that make up the bulk of the London sale are still in high demand. At the Lexington Selected Sale, 128 progeny of Ontario stallions fetched \$5,089,000 combined and averaged \$39,758. The gross was up over \$500,000 from the Ontario-sired yearlings that sold in Lexington in 2017. This year, progeny of Bettor's Delight, who stands at Winbak Canada, were especially popular in Lexington. Twenty-one Bettor's Delight yearlings grossed \$1,472,000, total, and averaged \$70,095. Kadabra, who stands at Tara Hills Stud in Port Perry, ON, grossed the second most of the Ontario sires with \$1,275,000 total for 30 sold, an average of \$42,500.

The London sale is the result of a partnership between the Forest City Yearling Sale and Standardbred Canada's Canadian Yearling Sale that started in 2017.

"Standardbred Canada are great partners. They understand the business. There are some new people, (CEO) Dan Gall and (chief financial officer) Chris Ferraz and they are learning the sale business as we go along," Straatman said.

"Standardbred Canada has done a great job with the Yearling Expo in the lobby and they are also doing some seminars this year again," Straatman said. "Pedigrees, conformation. They have what's called Ownership 101. So there are things geared towards the new yearling owner, someone who is interested in learning more from the experts. I think that's going to be a great addition as well. It is sponsored again by Ontario Racing."

Saturday's opening session comes the same day as Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Final Night at Woodbine Mohawk Park in which eight \$225,000 Super Finals equal \$1.8 million in purses. Though Woodbine Mohawk Park is a nearly two-hour drive from the London sale, Straatman promises to get buyers on the road in plenty of time by starting the sale at noon and selling just 100 yearlings on Saturday. She points to last year's strong sale, which was also held on Super Final weekend, as an indication it didn't hurt sale numbers.

"I understand that it's a Catch-22, that those that are participating find it amazingly hectic to attend a sale then go to the Super Final with their charges, but I'm hoping we see the increased audience we got last year – quite a few

more people that we don't normally see that are here in town for Super Final weekend and hopefully participating in the sale." Straatman said.

Seelster Farms was last year's leading consignor by average (\$46,612), sold the seven highest-priced yearlings and 12 of the top 15 and grossed \$2,283,988 from 49 yearlings sold.

Straatman said it's too tough to predict which of the farm's yearlings will sell best, but, "similar to the whole sale, Seelster has something for everyone. I'm happy with our first foals this year. We have three first-crop sires in Wheeling N Dealin and Prestidigitator and Thinking Out Loud and we're excited for those horses for sure."

Coming out of retirement, battling the cheaters, big stars in the same heat and following the thoroughbreds' maiden model

Tidbits — What a week in Lexington! After 10 days of frightful weather, the rain stopped, the sun came out, the track was lightning fast and the SPEED was abounding. It was a fever pitch, the crowds were huge and the exciting racing carried over to the sale ring where the numbers were mind blowing.

This was my 55th consecutive visit to this mystical town and I never remember a week like we just witnessed on the track or in the sales pavilion. I remember many individual accomplishments both in fast races and high-priced colts but nothing that could compare to the happenings we have just been apart of. Almost \$50 million in sales and a myriad of world records capped a breathtaking stop on the Grand Circuit tour. I feel bad for the event planners at Pocono Downs for the Breeders Crown races. The Red Mile will be a tough act to follow.

There are way too many individual achievements to be sending out accolades to all involved, however there is one that requires attention. Congratulations to Andy McCarthy for his prominent showing on the big stage, he is a talented and humble young star that truly shined all meet. Last time I looked, he was tied for leading driver and I don't know the final count. Whether he won or not was irrelevant, as he made his presence on the track evident through the two-week meet.

Paul Richardson asks: The cheaters or the trainers that push the envelope are killing the sport as well as hurting the honest trainers. Some of the suspects have even taken hold in the Grand Circuit recently. Do you have any suggestions how we can remedy this sad situation?

I have many solutions, however their legality may be

suspect. Red Mile is a private entity and can make up their own guidelines as to exclusion. The detention barns are a waste of time and money. To me EPO, a common and powerful performance enhancer, is nearly undetectable and for the most part would be discovered through out of competition testing. In other words, you would have to be very unlucky to be caught. The pros have "shaking" or "drenching" down to a science although mistakes have been made.

Exclusion should be made on a temporary basis. For example John Doe will not be allowed to participate in the Red Mile meeting in 2019 because he has had six positive tests in the past three years and thus we deem him an improper addition to our training community. However, if John Doe races his stable in 2019 without any further serious infractions he will be welcomed back in 2020. Legal, I am not sure. I do know it would work. If you study positive tests you will find that many of these "usual suspects" not only have drug infractions but many minor infractions that show me an utter disregard for the rule of law in our sport. Some have as many as 10 pages of infractions where the average would be 3/4 of a page.

My favorite way to rid the sport of cheaters is to eliminate claiming races. Ninety percent of the money made by those that are on the fringe is made through the claiming game. Although I realize it's a pipe dream and almost impossible to implement, if all claiming races were conditioned we could basically create havoc with the drug lords. For example \$25,000 claiming (horses winning their previous race in this class not eligible). Also no horse winning in a class may drop below that price for a period of 30 days.

Now people will say, this can hurt the innocents, we need a trade off. You will survive a little discomfort to clean up the sport.

I realize how impractical all this is and cannot really be passed on by the powers that be, but the suggestions may be modified or rearranged in some order by racetrack management to launch an attack on the guilty parties. If Woodbine Mohawk can create a plan surely we can try in the U.S.

We will never rid the sport of drugs. But the harder we make it on the offenders, the more chance an honest trainer has of making a living.

Gerrit Troisi asks: Is there anything that could bring you out of retirement?

Great question. I retired after cutting back because of some health issues that thankfully are in the rear window. I

basically lost my client base because they wanted a young hungry trainer instead of an old hungry trainer.

In 2016-17, I trained some horses for Bob Key and with one exception they were very slow. Jimmy (Takter) asked me one morning at the Meadowlands after qualifying a colt for me, "Why are you training a horse like that?" I knew that day that the writing was on the wall, this is not what I needed to do with my life.

After spending the last three weeks in the mystical world of the Red Mile, my answer would be an emphatic yes. That's the good news, the bad news is that to return I would have some caveats that may eliminate me from going forward.

I could not train for new people in the business. I love training horses, but it's too late in my life to train owners. Basically, if established owners would give me a handful of top colts and fillies, I would return. I really have no desire to attempt creating miracles at this stage of my life.

Billy Owens asks: How is it possible that the race office at the Red Mile let Manchego, Atlanta, and Plunge Blue Chip be entered in the same division of the Filly Kentucky Futurity?

I am sorry Billy but you can't blame it on the race office. Rules to prevent this kind of aberration must be written in the conditions of the stake itself and has nothing to do with policy or rules of the racetrack. Years ago, the Hambletonian society added some new rules to there stake that included dividing top money earners, the Meadowlands followed suit by adding that condition to the Meadowlands Pace.

I am certain that no rule as that exists in the stake conditions of the Kentucky Futurities or the situation of which you speak would not have existed. I am glad you bring this up as I can appeal to the powers that be to create an addenda to the existing conditions of the races to include the provision of splitting highest money earners in the future.

Billy Bigler asks: Why does the standardbred condition sheet offer so much money to claiming horses and the thoroughbred book offer so much more money to maidens?

I really don't know why but I will tell you that to me it's ass backwards. It's seems the thoroughbred tracks support the breeder far more than we do. It makes no sense to me that a runner can race in a maiden race for as much as \$130,000 and our top would be \$13,000. That divergence is insane. What's wrong with this picture: Owner #1 buys a colt for \$100,000 he then pays training bills for eight months and also makes stake payments and can pocket \$6,000 when he wins a maiden race. Owner # 2 claims a horse for \$12,000 and can pocket \$6,000 if he wins the next week, one week's

training bills and no stakes payments. On the other hand, a thoroughbred owner can pay \$100,000 for a colt and get back half his investment when he wins a maiden. To me this scenario makes no sense. I am fully aware we don't have the money for \$100,000 maiden races, but we could race for \$25,000 and increase the interest in the yearling market. A transition like this would even improve the numbers at the great sale we all witnessed in Kentucky last week. It would have little impact on the top of the market but it would bolster the prices on the middle and lower end of the market.

Thanks to all my readers for the positive comments that I received in Kentucky. I truly appreciate them. I did get some negative feedback due to my lack of ability as a handicapper. HRU has a plethora of capable writers on the staff therefore I will try my best to eliminate any further attempts at selecting winners for you. Have a wonderful week.

Roy hoping to land his first Super Final win Saturday

Ontario Sires Stakes - Super Final Preview

Two years ago, Louis-Philippe Roy watched the Super Finals on television, having made just four starts in the 2016 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program. On Saturday, Oct. 13, when the very best in the province once again gather at Woodbine Mohawk Park for the \$1.8 million season finale, the reinsman has a starter in all eight races and will be looking to secure his first Lampman Cup title as the program's leading driver.

"What I find special is that I got a drive in all eight races and all eight horses are from different trainers," said Roy. "I think it kind of proves how much support I had from all the trainers here in Ontario through the year."

After a breakout season in 2016 that saw him top the driving ranks at both Rideau Carleton Raceway and Hippodrome Trois-Rivieres and garner the Future Star title at the O'Brien Awards, Roy made the move to the Woodbine Entertainment Group circuit. The move not only served as a rocket-launcher for the Mont-Joli, QC native's career — he would finish 2017 as one of the top three drivers in all of Canada — it gave him the opportunity to drive a wide variety of young horses for the first time since he climbed into a race bike as an 18-year-old on the Quebec Fair Circuit.

"Last year, I got a lot of experience because, especially the 2-year-olds, when you start driving them early in the season it's quite different than the older horse," explained the now 28-year-old. "So I think last year I got a lot of experience and this year I kind of proved that I adjust my driving style to whatever horses, and whatever are the needs for the horses, especially for their development."

Last season, Roy finished in the top 10 among OSS drivers, appearing in 120 races and driving 21 winners, 11 second-place finishers and 13 third-place finishers to earnings of \$777,308. With that experience under his belt, Roy made a serious commitment to the program in 2018, even giving up his spot in the National Driving Championship to steer 3-year-old pacing filly Shower Play in a Sept. 25 Gold Series event, and that dedication has paid off. Heading into Saturday's season finale the reinsman has

made 150 OSS starts and produced 33 wins, 20 seconds, 15 thirds and earnings of \$1,313,507. He sits atop the Lampman Cup race with 372 points, 21 points ahead of two-time winner Trevor Henry and 23 ahead of five-time winner and reigning champion Sylvain Filion.

Among Roy's Super Final mounts are three division point leaders, freshman pacing filly Better Single, 2-year-old trotting filly HP Titania Runner and 3-year-old pacing colt Jimmy Freight, and six of the eight head into Saturday night's test off wins in their most recent Gold Series start.

"I will be disappointed if I don't win one Super Final this weekend because I think I've got a lot of good chances, maybe not big favorites, but a lot of horses that can do it," said Roy, who recently purchased a townhouse in Guelph, Ontario. "So I sure hope to get my first Super Final win on Saturday."

Jimmy Freight was the heavy favorite in all four of his Gold Series starts this season and that is unlikely to change in spite of the colt's outside post. Roy will steer the Sportswriter son from Post 9 for trainer Richard Moreau and owner Adriano Sorella and is hoping the division leader can maintain his flawless record in OSS action.

"I would have liked for sure to be inside of Backstreet Shadow because Yannick (Gingras) raced him on the front I think the four times he drove him," said Roy of Jimmy Freight's stablemate, who will start from Post 5. "Jimmy can do it from wherever, he doesn't really mind, but it sure is a little more work going from the Post 9 and trying to figure a trip."

In addition to Backstreet Shadow and Gingras, Roy expects The Downtown Bus and driver Tim Tetrick to be tough from Post 4. The driver also anticipates that the \$225,000 contest, slated as Race 10 on Saturday's program, will serve as an impressive closing act for the 2018 OSS season.

"Jimmy Freight, like a few months ago, was, I would say, the king of the division and you couldn't expect almost anybody to beat him," said Roy. "But the way The Downtown Bus and Backstreet Shadow have been racing lately I think is going to give us a good show for the last race."

Roy also expects the 2-year-old pacing colts and trotting colts to serve up an exciting show for fans. With the favorites in both divisions drawing advantageously, the talented youngsters will be free to show off the full range of their skills.

"Stag Party (Post 1), Bronx Seelster (Post 5), Bettors Wish (Post 6), they all drew good positions," said Roy of the freshman pacing colt contest, where he will steer Bettors Delight son Keystone Concrete from Post 3 for trainer Rob Fellows, his wife Yolanda Fellows and her co-owners Arpad Szabo and Blair Corbeil.

"Dream Nation, the whole year, has been very good and especially lately, the last two starts. He keeps improving a

little bit, but I also know it's a good class of 2-year-old trotters this year that they have in Ontario," said the driver of his two-year-old trotting colt mount, who will start from Post 4. "And the two other ones that I think are two of the best, Forbidden Trade (Post 2) and Okeanos (Post 5), they both drew good too. All of us three drew good, so I think it's going to be a good race."

Roy steers Archangel gelding Dream Nation for trainer Jacques Dupont and owners Les Ecuries Dorleans Inc. of Repentigny, Ecurie CSL of Sorel-Tracy, Gestion C. Levesque 2005inc of St-Hyacinthe and Marc Camirand of Montreal.

Dupont and the owners of 2-year-old trotting filly HP Titania Runner (Post 5, Race 6), Claude Hamel and Michel Damphousse, are people that gave Roy opportunities to drive stakes horses when he was still developing his skills on the Quebec Fair Circuit, so a Super Final win with either of those horses would be especially meaningful for the driver.

"They've been with me for a longer part; I've been racing for them in Quebec in stakes races," said the reinsman. "All the times you win with, like I would say smaller connections, it makes it a little more, not more exciting, but more rewarding."

Roy's other shots at Super Final glory will come with 3-year-old trotting filly Collateral Beauty from Post 7 in Race 2, 3-year-old trotting gelding Barney Mac from Post 7 in the seventh race, and 3-year-old pacing filly Big Thong from Post 2 in Race 9. Roy had expected to drive Fan Hanover and Simcoe Stake champion Shower Play in the sophomore pacing filly final, but her connections chose not to enter when she did not train as well as expected earlier this week.

"Rene (Dion) called me on Tuesday morning when it was time to put her in and said he wasn't going to put her in because she wasn't exactly how he expected her to be," said Roy. "He didn't want to take any chances. He wanted to make sure she was 100 per cent before they race her again."

In spite of the filly's absence from his roster of mounts, Roy is hopeful that he will be able to strike 'Driving a Super Final Champion' off his bucket list on Saturday.

Woodbine Mohawk Park's Saturday, Oct. 13 program gets under way at 7:10 pm and the eight \$225,000 Super Finals will go postward in Races 2, 3 and 5 through 10.

Stage is set for tonight's Indiana Sires Stakes Super Finals at Hoosier Park

The 2018 Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) program will culminate at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino tonight with the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Finals. The star-studded 14-race card will showcase the best trotters and pacers in the state of Indiana and provide an exciting conclusion to the 2018 Indiana stakes season.

With purses in excess of \$2 million, the Super Finals will be the richest night offered in the Indiana Sires Stakes program this season featuring eight \$220,000 finals. The 2-and 3-year-olds competing in the Super Finals have accumulated points throughout the season, based on performance in the previous \$75,000 finals, and the top point earners have earned the right to seek glory in the \$220,000 finals. Complimenting the program will be four divisions for the aged competitors, each carrying a purse of \$50,000.

The \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Finals will start in the third race on the program with a field of 10 2-year-old pacing fillies. Divisional leader Glorious Virgin and Hoosier Park's leading driver Trace Tetrick have been enlisted as the 8-5 morning line choice and will start from post five. The daughter of Always A Virgin-Bound For Glory is trained by Shane Bowermaster and has won seven of 10 starts while bankrolling \$185,250 this season.

Driver Yannick Gingras will venture back to Hoosier Park to steer the 4-5 morning line choice, Swandre The Giant, from post eight in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final for 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings. Now trained by Jimmy Takter, Swandre The Giant remains undefeated in stakes action at Hoosier Park this season and is currently riding a two-race win streak. Swandre The Giant will be one of seven drives on the program for Gingras who is currently the second leading driver in the country based on wins.

The \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final for 3-year-old trotting colts will feature an exciting match-up between rookie, divisional leader, Katkin American and the 2017 Breeders Crown Champion, Fiftydallarbill. Fiftydallarbill will play the role of morning line favorite and will start from the coveted rail position with Trace Tetrick in the bike. Katkin American will start from post five with regular pilot James Yoder in the sulky.

The sophomore pacing sensation Always A Prince will put his five-race winning streak on the line facing nine other

rivals in the \$220,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings. Trained by Tyler George and driven by Trace Tetrick, the son of Always A Virgin-Glorious Princess has won 16 of 19 starts this season and will start from the trailing post position ten as the 4-5 morning line choice.

In addition to all of the exciting races on the track, there will be a multitude of activities for racing fans to enjoy off the track. Hoosier Park and the Indiana Standardbred Association (ISA) have once again partnered to offer numerous giveaways and live entertainment throughout the evening.

A \$5,000 Indiana Sires Stakes handicapping contest will be offered for racing fans on-track with a top prize of \$2,500. Registration for the handicapping contest is free but limited to the first 300 guests. Registration will begin at 2:00 p.m.

The first race will line-up behind the gate at 6:30 p.m. Tonight's stakes filled card is part of Hoosier Park's 2018 Championship Meet, which features a \$5 million stakes schedule. The 12-week championship stretch, which kicked off on Aug. 10 with the \$325,000 Dan Patch Stakes, will offer an unparalleled series of high caliber stakes races. Meadowlands applies for 68 live dates for 2019, SBOANJ reacts strongly

On Thursday, The Meadowlands Racetrack released the following statement that was quickly followed up with a statement by the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOANJ).

Meadowlands release:

The Meadowlands will apply for 68 live racing dates for the 2019 season by the Oct. 15 request for dates deadline of the NJ Racing Commission.

The main factor in forcing us to reduce dates is the failure to obtain a purse subsidy that would enable us to compete with the Pennsylvania tracks when they open in late March. By reducing dates, we believe it would help to be able to attract enough horses to race during that period and we are quite certain that without the subsidy racing more than 68 days would be impossible. The thoroughbreds have also advised us that they would like to race in the fall and they have the legal right to do that, but we believe that if we were able to get the subsidy, which is split between the standardbreds and thoroughbreds, we might be able to work out a schedule that would be beneficial to both breeds.

This will unfortunately force The Meadowlands to drop the fall stakes program. The Fall Final Four and possibly the TVG Championships will have to be relocated or cancelled along with The Kindergarten series.

The purse account deficit is another issue as without any subsidy the funds available limiting the daily average to approximately \$110,000 which is not enough to attract enough horses to fill Meadowlands cards when the PA tracks open. Fewer dates will permit an increase as we attempt to field races that will be attractive to the horseplayers.

As it stands with Monmouth racing in the fall and the purse revenue status quo, the schedule will be Friday and Saturday from Jan. 4 through Hambletonian Day August 3 then Thursday - Saturday the last two weeks of December.

We hope in the next few weeks that the legislature will act on the purse subsidy legislation in which case we would revisit this with the expectation that we could increase the race dates including a modified fall schedule.

SBOANJ release from president Mark Ford:

"Contrary to our ongoing dialogue with the Meadowlands, we were not given any notice and were as much surprised as anyone to read their release indicating that they were putting in for a 68-day meet with a significant reduction of added-money events.

We found this particularly disappointing in that we have been working very hard with various legislators and did feel that we had made progress in getting some assistance from the state.

That said, a 68 day meet at the Meadowlands in 2019, which does violate their contract with the SBOA regarding a minimum amount of days, is clearly unacceptable and we will address that immediately."





Red Mile plays host to harness racing's fastest day

I've believed over the past few years that the 2014 Sun Stakes night at Pocono Downs was the fastest card in harness racing history. Not necessarily in terms of the quality of horses racing that night, although it was certainly loaded with top quality stock, but because of the weather and track conditions that allowed extraordinarily fast times to be produced race after race. After the exhibition put on at the Red Mile last weekend, that Pocono night has been eclipsed as racing's fastest card.

The highlight from that late June card at Pocono four years ago was the 1:49 mile trotted by Sebastian K, smashing the all-time previous trot mark. Up until that time, no trotter had even broken 1:50 on a two-turn track. And that was just the start.

On that night, world records fell with each passing race. In addition to Sebastian K's mile, Sweet Lou paced the fastest mile ever on a five-eight's mile track in 1:47. Similarly, Father Patrick put up the fastest ever mile for a 3-year-old trotter for a track that size. There is also a direct link between that Pocono card and last Saturday's card from the Red Mile, and that connection is through the horse, McWicked.

McWicked won the Hempt as a 3-year-old in 1:47.3 which at the time was a record for 3-year-old pacers on a five-eight's mile track. 73 races had passed between that 2014 mile from McWicked and his 1:46.2 clocking last Saturday in the Allerage Farms and in that period his fastest win time was 1:48.2, taken during the Mohawk Gold Cup in 2017.

The point being that when horses are able to break a certain time barrier once every number of years – and then every other horse on the card does the same – there is something else at play other than the horses themselves. This couldn't have been made any clearer than the recent October 6 card at the Red Mile, a card that smashed every

harness racing norm.

The first race was that was a non-descript late closer series carrying an \$11,000 purse, where 3-year-old trotting filly Impinktoo went wire to wire in 1:49:4 with a last quarter of :26.3. The 1:49.4 clocking was good for a tie of the fastest trot mile ever by a 3-year-old filly, and the sixth fastest mile ever trotted regardless of age or gender. From 24 prior career races, the fastest mile from Impinktoo was a 1:54 win taken just the prior week. The 1:49.4 win was over a 20-length improvement.

Business would only pick up from there. In the next race, 3-year-old pacing filly Double A Mint pounced from a two-hole trip to win in a 1:47.3 blowout. It was the first win of the year for the filly who with a previous mark of 1:52.4 as a 2-year-old, came into the race showing race times consistently in the 1:50-1:52 range. In winning her Tattersalls division, she became the second fastest filly of all time, only behind Shebestingin. From there, the list goes on and on.

There were five International Stallion Stake divisions that day for 2-year-old colt pacers, and the winning times from those races were 1:49.3 (Workin Ona Mystery), 1:49.2 (Captain Trevor), 1:49.1 (No Mas Amor), another 1:49.1 (Captain Crunch), and a "slow" time of 1:50.3 (Mangogh). In the case of No Mas Armor, the 1:49.1 was a maiden breaking win for a horse that went off at odds of 114-1 after pacing all his previous races in let's call it 1:52-1:53-ish. When we add in the 1:48.3 mile by 2-year-old filly Warrawee Ubeaut from the day before, the top 20 fastest two-year-old pacers in the history of the sport has five new editions over the course of a day.

These times while suddenly commonplace, are still mind boggling. I'm sure these are all very fine 2-year-olds, but to put these times in perspective even Captaintreacherous only went 1:49.2 as a freshman while his sire Somebeachsomewhere posted a 2-year-old best of 1:49.3.

Perhaps the best example from the card to drive home this card being the fastest ever was from a trotting mare named The Erm. A 4-year-old who was 1 for 17 on the year with a career mark of 1:54.3 through 43 lifetime starts, she bottomed out her late-closing series foes with a romp in 1:50.3. She was race timed at the Red Mile the prior week in 1:55, and is now tied in the record books at 1:50.3 with the likes of Daylon Miracle, Sevruga, Uncle Peter, Will Take Charge, Market Share, Mystical Sunshine and Obrigado.

Of course, the record that will make the day stand out in history was Homicide Hunter trotting in 1:48.4. To break the record from Sebastian K may have once seemed implausible

unless it was by a one-for-the-ages type of trotter, but it doesn't appear to be that much of a stretch when considering 3-year-old trotting fillies are going in 1:49.

Suspect that maybe there was a teletimer malfunction and that the times were consistently off all day, I went back and hand timed each race from that day. In every case, the race time was proven essentially to be accurate.

When abnormally fast times became consistent at Pocono a few years back there were calls to remeasure the track, thinking that it must have been a few yards shorter than a complete mile. This couldn't have been the case at the Red Mile either as race times from the two days leading up to Saturday's card were fast but didn't seem to be completely unreasonable.

The times produced at the Red Mile on Saturday and to a slightly lesser extent on Sunday weren't the result of anything other than favorable environment conditions and track conditions that have been notorious in always making the Red Mile the fastest track in the sport.

The card that saw these performances and records should be considered the fastest day in the sports history. Even with the rate that records come and go these days, this was a day that will not be replicated for some time.

Favorites dominate second leg of Mass Sire Stakes

There were no real surprises in the \$162,300 second leg of the Massachusetts Sire Stakes (MASS) for 3-year-olds at Plainridge Park on Tuesday afternoon (Oct. 9) as all five first leg winners repeated; four of them heavy favorites and four of them in runaway fashion. Driver Shawn Gray had a huge afternoon, leading all other reinsmen by winning three of the five series races.

After settling the field to the quarter, Gray grabbed leather and went :30.1 and :29.3 the next two panels. As the race approached the top of the lane it was a two horse breakaway with Kinda Lucky Lindy pulling the pocket with dead-aim on Hashtagmadeyalook. With Merton driving hard, Kinda Lucky Lindy was making up ground with every stride. But Hashtagmadeyalook held sway under a line drive from Gray and won by a neck in 1:56.4.

Hashtagmadeyalook has now banked \$71,615 on the strength of five wins this year.

Setting fractions of :28.2, :58 and 1:26.4, Ithinkthatsmine had a five-length lead at the top of the stretch as Gray already had her wrapped up at that point. However heading towards the wire she still pulled away more to win by six in 1:56.3.

It was the eighth win of the year for Ithinkthatsmine, who now has earned \$92,080 in 2018. The win also gave trainer George Ducharme a training double in MASS races on Tuesday.

As the race progressed, the field remained in single-file order past the half and to the three quarters in 1:25.2. Raging with pace at that point, Gray pulled Delco Dusty halfway into the final bend and the mare responded to the move. Delco Dusty opened up a three-length lead at the top of the lane and paced away to an easy six-length victory in 1:55.3.

It was the third win of the year for Delco Dusty; all three coming in her last three starts.

But just as that timer was tripped, Cushing had I'm A Clown out and rolling once again to retake the lead and this time it was for good. After cruising past the half and hitting the three quarters in 1:24.4, I'm A Clown switched into glide and he was gone. On top by three in the turn, by eight at the head of the lane and by 12 at the wire, I'm A Clown annihilated the field for a second straight week, winning in 1:53.3.

The winning time was a new lifetime mark for I'm A Clown who certainly looks like he's in season's best form right now.

After taking the field to the half in :56.4 with Twelve (Eddie Davis Jr.) sitting on his back, Pembroke Pharoah faced a challenge from Beantown Elijah (Jimmy Whittemore) who pulled first-over and tried to apply more pressure going up the back stretch. With the field close at the three quarter pole, Campbell let Pembroke Pharoah out a notch and his charge responded well. He opened up a three-length lead around the last turn and then pulled away down the lane with Campbell as a passenger to win in 1:54.4.

It was the third win in a row and eighth of the year for Pembroke Pharoah who now has collected \$61,661 in purses this season.

There is a break in the MASS action next week. The series will resume on Monday (Oct. 22) when the 2-year-olds reconvene and on Tuesday (Oct. 23) when the 3-year-olds get back together. The finals for both age groups will be held on Tuesday (Oct. 30).

Simpson stakes for sophomore fillies at Philly

Over \$190,000 in stakes purses were on the line as 3-year-old fillies of both gaits each contested three division of John Simpson Sr. series stakes action on Wednesday afternoon at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Trotters were first to the track on the Wednesday card, and the Lucky Chucky filly **Lucky Ava** was first to the finish line, posting splits of :27.3, :56.4, and 1:26.2 en route to a 1¾ length wire-to-wire victory in a lifetime best of 1:55.1. Trainer/driver Åke Svanstedt, straight off a monumental Sunday at Lexington, was in the sulky for Åke Svanstedt Inc., Little E LLC, and the Van Camp Trotting Corporation, whose trotter has now won \$382,264.

Driver Scott Zeron tucked the Chapter Seven filly **Lima Novelty** fourth early, then saw that become a 3-tuck as a rival broke, and was content to chase longshot Winbak Noelle, who set good fractions of :27.1 and :55.4. Lima Novelty moved down the backstretch, got to the lead by the 1:24.4 3/4s, then went on strongly through the stretch to have a 2½ length advantage at the end of a 1:54.1 mile. Linda Toscano trains the winner of \$278,964 for owner Ken Jacobs.

Zeron and Toscano came right back to take the final trot division with another daughter of Chapter Seven, **Repentance**, who crossed the wire 2 1/4 lengths to the good in 1:54.4. Once again first-over proved the winning route, as Hey Judy Judy, second choice to the victress, set fractions of :28.1, :57.2, and 1:26.1, but could not hold on against the winner the last 1/8 and faded. The winner, who lost a three-race win streak with an "untimely break" in her NYSS final (but what's "a timely break," anyway?), started a new winning streak while raising her bankroll to \$247,327 for Diamond Creek Racing.

On the sidewheeling side, **Scuola Hanover** looked the part of a 1-5 favorite, moving after a :26.2 opener to command, putting up middle numbers of :55.1 and 1:22.4, and then staying clear by 2¼ lengths at the end of a mile in a lifetime best of 1:50.4, which was only 3/5 of a second off Put On A Show's 2010 divisional standard for Philly. David Miller handled sulky chores behind the daughter of A Rocknroll Dance, who now has a bankroll of \$207,298 for trainer Andrew Stafford, co-owner with Arthur Stafford and Thomas Ireland.

The American Ideal filly **Solitary**, right back on the track after winning at Freehold on Saturday, was out most of a :25.4 quarter for driver Brett Miller before getting the lead in her section. Aldine Hanover, who forced that rough quarter, came back to take command and went middle splits of :54.4 and 1:22.4, with Solitary waiting in the two-hole and favored E Dees Well Said swinging wide into the lane. Through the stretch the battle was inside (Solitary) and outside (E Dees Well Said), with Solitary taking a neck decision while reducing her mark to 1:51.2. The winner went 17 starts in 2018 before getting to the winners circle, but now she has won three of her last four for trainer Nick Surick and the partnership of William Daggett Jr., Lawrence Vukovic, and the J L Benson Stables Inc. while raising her bank account to \$199,097.

In the final pacing cut, **Alexis Faith** got a tick closer to the local track record than did Scuola Hanover, as she lowered her mark to 1:50.3 while looking like a 1-20 shot should. Driver David Miller, taking two of the three pacing stakes divisions on the afternoon, kept her fourth in a five-horse field until the 5/8, then charged up raw and came a :54.2 back half with the filly to be 3¼ lengths clear on the money. Speaking of money, Alexis Faith gave both her sire American Ideal and her dam Cannae Cammie a new \$500,000 credit as she pushed her earnings lifetime to \$502,001 for trainer Casie Coleman and the ownership quartet of West Wins Stable, Jim Fielding, J. Robert Darrow, and Kevin McKinlay.

NY Gaming Commission implements enhanced security protocols for International Trot

The New York State Gaming Commission has announced the implementation of enhanced security and drug testing protocols for the Yonkers International Trot. In addition to enhanced security measures, the protocols require out of competition testing of all horses participating. The process will be coordinated and supervised by Dr. Scott E. Palmer, the Gaming Commission's Equine Medical Director and Daniel Haughney, the Gaming Commission's Director of Investigations.

The protocols will provide additional safeguards to protect the integrity of the sport and the welfare of the horses. In 2015, the Commission implemented the security and drug testing measures for thoroughbred Grade 1 races with purses of at least \$1 million. In addition to fostering transparency and accountability in high-profile races, the measures ensure compliance among horsepersons and veterinarians who travel to New York from across the world to compete.

The security protocols in effect for the Yonkers International Trot include the following:

- Horses racing in the Yonkers International Trot must be on the grounds by 1 p.m. on Friday, October 12, 2018. The horses will be subject to a continuous 24-hour dedicated watch by security personnel leading to post time. During a dedicated watch, a security guard or Gaming Commission investigator will keep the horses under constant surveillance. Anyone (i.e., veterinarians) entering a stall or otherwise having physical contact with a horse under watch will be directly observed by an investigator.
- Unless exempted by the Presiding Judge, no horse entered in the Yonkers International Trot may be treated after 1 p.m. on Oct. 12, unless a Commission security person is present. Security personnel will monitor all treatments performed by veterinarians. All syringes and containers for administered medication will be retained by the Commission for possible testing.
- The Commission is taking out-of-competition blood samples from participating horses well in advance of the race and sending them to the New York State Equine Drug Testing and Research Program at Morrisville State College for immediate testing. The Commission will coordinate with other jurisdictions to obtain out-of-competition samples from horses that are not stabled in New York.
- No harness bags or containers will be allowed in the paddock.

Indiana revamps Sire Stakes for '19

With the 2018 race meet starting to wrap up at Hoosier Park Racing and Casino, the Indiana Standardbred Breed Development Advisory Committee, Indiana Standardbred Advisory Board and interested horsemen met on Oct. 10 to look ahead to 2019.

At the top of everyone's list for 2019 was to look at the signature Indiana Sires Stakes program and how to make improvements to this already lucrative series. Attendees discussed the current structure and agreed it was no longer meeting the needs of program participants.

After much discussion, the Breed Development Advisory Committee approved a modification to the structure of the Indiana Sires Stakes program for 2019. Members of the Standardbred Advisory Board present also supported this modification. The new structure will be included in the Breed Development's annual recommendation to the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, and will feature:

- Six legs for 2-Year-Olds leading up to a \$250,000 Super Final
- Eight legs for 3-Year-Olds leading up to a \$250,000 Super Final
- Super Final participants finishing 6th through 10th will receive a \$4,000 purse payout each for earning their way into the Super Finals.

The revamped Sire Stakes program is estimated to pay out \$8.5 million in purses during 2019, in comparison to \$7.8 million distributed during 2018. When combined with additional opportunities for Indiana Sired and/or Bred horses, such as Late Closers, Indiana Sired Overnights, Fair Stakes and the Mini Series, the 2019 Standardbred Breed Development Program will offer more than \$13.6 million in purses and incentives for program participants.

"At the end of the day, this has a lot of upside," says horseman and committee member Joe Putnam.

"The board knew that something needed to change to help our breeders and horsemen participating in the Indiana Sire Stakes program," says Jessica Barnes, director of racing and breed development for the Indiana Horse Racing Commission. "The discussion was very helpful, and we appreciated hearing from the horsemen in attendance. We are excited to see how these proposed changes will help the program continue to flourish in the coming years."

The 2018 edition of the Indiana Sire Stakes Super Finals night commences tonight at Hoosier Park Racing and Casino, with the state's top bred standardbreds competing for more than \$2 million in purses.
