The Pinske Stables won both the Futurity and the Filly Futurity on Sunday at Red Mile, while driver Dexter Dunn won the Futurity, drove pacing filly Party Girl Hill to a win in the Tattersalls and won both the Allerage open and mare paces with Bettors Wish and Kissin In The Sand.



It was the day of days for Pinske Stables and driver Dexter Dunn at Lexington's Red Mile on Sunday (Oct. 11). The Pinske Stable won both the 128th edition of the \$440,000 Kentucky Futurity and the 55th edition of the \$255,000 Kentucky Filly Futurity (see story pg 4) as co-owners of Amigo Volo and Love A Good Story, respectively. Dunn drove Amigo Volo to victory, kept 3-year-old pacing filly Party Girl Hill undefeated with a victory over the boys in her \$239,500 Tattersalls division and won both the \$150,000 Allerage open pace with Bettor's Wish and the \$72,000 Allerage mare pace with Kissin In The Sand (see story pg 8).

Carter Pinske said he was at a loss for words after 4-1 Amigo Volo, a gelded trotter his family owns with David J. Miller of Florida, won the Futurity in 1:51, finishing two lengths better than EL Ideal.

A year ago in Lexington, Amigo Volo was key to a coming out part for 25-year-old Pinske, winning twice at Red Mile, including a 1:52.3 world record.

"I remember last year here I said to myself, 'Well, never going to have another day like that' and now, to do this, it's just incredible," Pinske said. "It has put me right at a loss of words."

The victory pushed Amigo Volo past \$1 million in earnings. The Father Patrick—Margarita Momma gelding has won six races from 12 starts this season and 12 from 24 overall, banking \$1,206,369.

"That's the first millionaire I think we've had since Yankee Cruiser and that was in 2003," Pinske said.

Richard "Nifty" Norman trains Amigo Volo, who was bred by Kentuckiana Farms LLC and Jorgen Jahre Jr. and sold for \$42,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Last week, Amigo Volo finished second to Back Of The Neck

on Oct. 4 in their Bluegrass division at Red Mile.

"He was really good here last week — he was probably just a little bit short," Dunn said of Amigo Volo. "Nifty knew he was going to be better today and he was. Last year he used to shake his head bad and it cost him a couple of times. He didn't have as good of form when he came back as a 3-year-old — he was a bit average. We were probably looking after him a little too much — he just likes to race. You get off the gate hard, that's when he gets excited and puts in good performances."

Ready For Moni, the 2-1 second choice, lagged from his second-tier starting spot off the gate while Amigo Volo

pushed for position to the inside. Beads, launching from post 10, swept to the lead before a :27 opening quarter while Amigo Volo settled into second with EL Ideal third and 4-5 favorite Back Of The Neck fourth.

Back Of The Neck made his move after the leader passing a :54.2 half and drew closer to the pacesetter into the final turn. Moving towards three-quarters in 1:22.3 Back Of The Neck broke stride, giving Amigo Volo room to tip out of the pocket straightening for the finish. Beads began to gallop while EL Ideal chased Amigo Volo through the stretch, settling for second. Third Shift ripped from the backfield to take third while Chestnut Hill weaved through traffic for fourth.

"I did attempt to go [for the lead]," Dunn said. "I came out for a little bit when we hit the back straight, but Beads was a little aggressive and took off so I ducked back into the two-hole there. Back Of The Neck came up outside of us around the last turn, and I was sort of 50-50 [on] whether I'd come out or stay in. And he ran, so that was probably a lucky trip in the last turn to get out, but the horse did a great job."

Amigo Volo is now 6-1-2 in 12 starts in 2020, good for earnings of \$593,823. He won his Pennsylvania Sires Stakes Championship and was fourth in both the Hambletonian and the Stanley Dancer.

"He's been excellent this year," Pinske said. "He may have started just a little soft and I blame that mostly on COVID-19. He had an extra month of training and the horse has kind of showed his whole life that he's not really a fan of training. He loves to race. When we were in the Hambo that's the best he's been and that was his seventh start in seven weeks. This year and last year he was like that."

The 128th Kentucky Futurity was sponsored by Hunterton Farms, Stoner Manor Inc. and Menhammer Stuteri Ab.

Love A Good Story shocks in 55th Kentucky Filly Futurity

The trotting filly overcame traffic trouble to win the Filly Futurity at odds of 27-1 for Andy and Julie Miller, the Pinske family, Kentuckiana Racing Stable and Daniel Plouffe.

Love A Good Story wrote one heck of a yarn Sunday (Oct. 11) at Red Mile, winning the 55th edition of the \$255,000 Kentucky Filly Futurity at odds of 27-1.

The daughter of Chapter Seven—Celebrity Lovin was driven to victory by Andy Miller for trainer Julie Miller and owners Pinske Stable, Kentuckiana Racing Stable and Daniel Plouffe. Pinske Stables also won the \$440,000 Kentucky Futurity with Amigo Volo.

Love A Good Story survived first-turn traffic trouble and marched with the outer flow before uncorking a furious stretch drive to win in 1:51.2 in a tight finish over Hypnotic AM and Sorella, both finishing three-quarters of a length behind the winner. Next Level Stuff finished fourth.

Andy Miller said he thought the race was setting up well for Love A Good Story at the top of the stretch, "but I didn't know how much finish a couple of the others had, but I knew (she) still had quite a bit of go."

Carried three wide into the first turn, Love A Good Story eventually landed two wide to a :27 first quarter set by Panem. Hypnotic AM pushed from post 10 for the lead but yielded for the pocket as Sorella marched for the front up the backstretch. Once Sorella, cleared, 3-5 favorite Ramona Hill ranged uncovered towards the top but soon lost stride approaching a :54 half.

Sister Sledge carried the outer tier to the final turn with Crucial second over and Love A Good Story third over. Sorella continued to lead by three-quarters in 1:23.1 while Sister Sledge lost ground, Hypnotic AM pulled out of the pocket and Love A Good Story swung to the center of the track. Hypnotic AM dug into Sorella to take a slight lead into the eighth pole but Love A Good Story came charging past the dueling leaders in the final yards.

"When (Ramona Hill) made the break, it changed the whole outlook of the race," Andy said.

Ramona Hill, trained by Tony Alagna, won the Hambletonian against the boys in August, but had a less-than-memorable fortnight in Lexington.

"That's horse racing," Alagna said. "Sometimes good, sometimes bad. I don't know that she gets over this track as good as I'd like. Last year, even when she won, she wasn't her best. But, we took a shot and it didn't work out so we'll

regroup for the Breeders Crown.

Returning \$56.60 to win, Love A Good Story nabbed her sixth win from 10 starts this season and her 13thfrom 20 overall, earning \$671,634. The filly, bred by Celebrity Farms of New York, was purchased for \$90,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

The victory proved to be a special celebration for the Miller family and the Pinske family that have been friends for decades.

"We've been family friends forever, since way back," said Carter Pinske, nephew of the late trainer Brian Pinske.

"My uncle, that passed away, was good friends with Julie and Andy and we've always had the same taste in horses and kind of a similar style," Pinske said. "When my grandpa (Tim) wasn't able to go to the east coast anymore, we started sending horses to (the Millers) and we've always had a great connection that way and we've always had luck with them."

Andy said the Pinskes, "are great family friends. I knew Brian years ago and it's just awesome (to win this with them)."

Pinkse said Love A Good Story is, "just a solid, solid filly. She's overcome a few issues that she had down in Florida...

Party Girl Hill beats the boys, Tall Dark Stranger epic again

The two sophomore pacers both made strong arguments for the Horse of the Year title while winning their respective Tattersalls divisions in equal times of 1:47.2.

Pacing filly **Party Girl Hill** defeated the boys in the first of two \$239,500 divisions of the Crawford Farms Tattersalls Pace on Sunday (Oct. 11) at Red Mile in 1:47.2 and then, two races later, **Tall Dark Stranger** equalled that mile in the other Tattersalls division.

Party Girl Hill trained by Chris Ryder and driven by Dexter Dunn for owner/breeder Tom Hill of the UK, remained perfect through 13 career starts with the victory.

"It's a little surreal. What she does on the track is just what she is. She's ridiculous, just phenomenal," Ryder said. "Before we raced her we knew we had a very good horse, but to imagine she'd do what she's doing is unbelievable."

Ryder said the accomplishment of a pacing filly beating the boys at 3 was astonishing.

"I've waited 30 years since a filly beat the boys, so she's comparable to (Little Brown Jug-winning filly) Fan Hanover," Ryder said. "Who else would you compare her to?"

As for whether the victory elevates Party Girl Hill in the Horse of the Year race, the trainer said, "All we can do is race her and win. Really, that's up to everybody else. I'm not a

voter, I train the horse and that's all I can do, but she should be right there. She's unbeaten. The fillies don't get the same accolades for some reason, but she might change that a little bit."

Dunn said Party Girl Hill is a very special filly.

"She's awesome. She's got such a long stride and I'm surprised when the half came so quick, because I didn't feel like we're going, but she just does it so easy," Dunn said.

No Lou Zing led the field by the opening quarter in :27 with Party Girl Hill sitting in the pocket. Into the backstretch, Dunn pulled Party Girl Hill wide into the backstretch to circle to the lead and eventually cleared No Lou Zing through an accelerated pace to a :53.4 half.

From there the Captaintreacherous—Look Cheap filly gained separation from her rivals, hitting three-quarters in

1:21. No Lou Zing and Capt Midnight began to roll into the stretch and cut into Party Girl Hill's buffer, but Party Girl Hill kept the late foes at bay to win by a length. No Lou Zing finished second with Capt Midnight third and Save Me A Dance well behind in fourth.

"Today was the day because it was a mile and we didn't have much to lose," Ryder said after the race on his decision

to move Party Girl Hill into open company. "Now we can go against the fillies in the Breeders Crown and just stay with the fillies. It was the last chance we had — we thought she could do it."

Party Girl Hill has accrued \$736,620 lifetime. Off the 2-5 favorite, she returned \$2.80 to win.

Meanwhile, Tall Dark Stranger (Bettor's Delight—Precocious

Beauty) continued to show he's at the top of the sophomore pacing colts' division with his Tattersalls victory orchestrated by Yannick Gingras.

"He's just unbelievable. I think if it would've set up for him, he could have gone even faster. On a fast track today, I think he could've probably challenged Always B Miki's record," said Tall Dark Stranger's trainer Nancy Takter. The Red Mile oval was rated "good" on Sunday after morning showers.

"He just gets the job done. I don't know what to say. He's a beautiful horse, he's great-gaited, he's gritty and he just wins.

"It's actually a really nice group of 3-year-olds this year so obviously nothing's going to be given to him for free."

Cattlewash crossed to the lead from post 9 before the first turn while Tall Dark Stranger pushed towards the front passing a :27.1 opening quarter. Into the backside Tall Dark Stranger strode uncontested by a :54.1 half and maintained his speed to three-quarters in 1:21.1 as Warrawee Vital ranged first over from third. Warrawee Vital inched closer to Tall Dark Stranger in the stretch but began to bear inside while giving pursuit to the 3-5 favorite, settling for second while Catch The Fire shook loose from a pylon trip for third and Captain Kirk closed for fourth.


Gingras said he was a little disappointed the track was off. He would have liked Tall Dark Stranger to have had a shot at a world record on the Red Mile's famed clay surface.

"It's disappointing a little bit, but it is what it is. He's got a 1:47.1 mark, which is pretty darn good and I know for sure that he could go :46, but he's just not going to have that chance now," Gingras said. "He was pacing as strong to the wire as any other point in the race. If I rolled him along at the half, he probably does it today anyway, but I've got to worry about winning races first more than records."

Winning his 10th race from 11 starts this season and his 18th from 20 overall, Tall Dark Stranger has amassed \$1,895,195 for owners Crawford Farms Racing, Marvin Katz, Caviart Farms and Howard Taylor. James Avritt, Sr. bred the \$3.20 winner who sold for \$330,000 at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Bettor's Wish, Kissin In The Sand score track records in Allerage

Bettor's Wish grabbed the lead early and refused to let it go, winning the \$150,000 Odds On Racing Allerage Open Pace — sponsored by Dana Parham and Best Bet Stables — in a track-record time on Sunday (Oct. 11) at The Red Mile.

On the move by a :27.3 opening quarter, Bettor's Wish took the lead from This Is The Plan moving up the backstretch while early leader Century Farroh was shuffled to third. Century Farroh then pulled and blitzed the pacesetter to a :54.4 half but could not clear the lead. Bettor's Wish kept Century Farroh parked to three-quarters in 1:22 and

accelerated into the stretch with just This Is The Plan in contention. Into the eighth pole This Is The Plan took a shot at Bettor's Wish, but the 4-year-old Bettor's Delight—Lifetime Star stallion rebuffed the challenge to hit the finish first in 1:48 — a track record for 4-year-old pacing stallions. Backstreet Shadow closed for third with Brassy Hanover finishing fourth.

"That's the best he's felt this year by a mile," Dunn said.
"Dave (Miller driving Century Farroh) came at him going past the half and (Bettors Wish) got really going on the bit and it was just amazing. Today was the best he's been this year and did it pretty easy, too, so it was great."

"I'm going to miss him like you wouldn't believe," Ryder said. "I was here when he arrived from New Jersey and when he came off the truck it was like seeing one of my kids. It was so beautiful to see him.

"I've had him for about three years and I'm super attached to him, but he's going to a great place."

Co-owner Art Zubrod of Fair Island Farms is the farm

manager of Brittany Farms that bred the pacer. He fondly remembers Bettors Wish as a baby.

"Usually the first time you show them in the paddock is the best they ever are, but the great ones get better," Zubrod said. "He got better every time. He was as good today as he's ever been. I really think this was the best he's ever been today."

Kissin In The Sand also scored in track-record time, winning the \$72,000 Harness Racing Update Allerage Fillies & Mares Open Pace in 1:48.

Taking command past a :27.2 opening quarter, Kissin In The Sand held the helm to a :54.4 half and grew her advantage circling the final turn. Pocket-sitter Caviart Ally gave chase in second to three-quarters in 1:21.3 as Kissin In the Sand

widened her lead into the stretch and to the finish. Treacherous Reign rallied down the center of the track for second while Caviart Ally held third and Warrawee Ubeaut settled for fourth.

But the favorite grew leg weary into the final turn as Atlanta popped pocket to three-quarters in 1:23 and quickly put away her rival into the stretch. Gimpanzee continued to falter while Crystal Fashion rallied towards the leader late but settled for second. Majestic Player A closed for third with Lindy The Great finishing fourth.

"I thought on paper it was a two-horse race," said driver Yannick Gingras after the race on his decision to leave with Atlanta. "Me and Ronnie [Burke] were actually on the same page — we talked just before going onto the track. I just

A five-year-old mare by Chapter Seven—Hemi Blue Chip, Atlanta won her fifth race from 10 starts this season and her 25th from 49 overall, earning \$2,524,453 for owners Crawford Farms Racing, Brad Grant and Howard Taylor. Order By Stable bred the Ron Burke trainee who paid \$4.00 to win.

"She's just a great horse and so sharp right now," Burke said.

Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots stars shine at Woodbine Mohawk Park

Woodbine Mohawk Park showcased Ontario's top Grassroots competitors on Saturday night (Oct. 10) and the division stars were shining bright as six of the eight \$75,000 championships were captured by favorites, including defending champions **Lovedbythemasses** and **Mayhem Hanover**.



In the 3-year-old trotting colt showdown, Lovedbythemasses and driver Mike Saftic took control heading for the half and never needed to look back, sailing home to a one and one-half length victory in 1:53.4. Semi-Final winner Ripped And Ready was second and division point leader Mikey Mass trotted into third.

"He was real good last week and he was good today, good and strong. He's probably at the top of his game right now," said Saftic. "All night long they were coming off the pace, the front end wasn't holding very good, but I kind of landed about the four-hole and coming up the backside I didn't want to let them get too cheap of a half and be first over so I brushed to the front. He was good."

Saftic steers Lovedbythemasses for trainer Ed Peconi of Peterborough and his co-owners Nicholas Peconi of Lakefield, ON and Wade Peconi of Stanchel, PEI. The win was the Muscle Mass—Incredibility gelding's fourth in Grassroots action this season and the ninth of his career.

One race later 3-year-old pacing colt Mayhem Hanover defended his Grassroots title, sprinting home off a first-over

trip to deliver a commanding two and one-half length win in a personal best 1:50. Bettorbuckleup, who caught Mayhem Hanover in the Semi-Final, finished second and Poseidon Seelster was third.

"He raced great tonight. He couldn't have raced any better," said driver Doug McNair. "Last week, it's kind of my own fault, I started him up real early and he just got picked off late. He should have never got beat last week I didn't think. The drive didn't look much better tonight, but he just kind of idled his way up to the lead. I didn't make him pace as fast as he can until the top of the stretch and he paced right to the wire."

Gregg McNair trains Mayhem Hanover for Scott and Clay Horner of Toronto, ON, who also watched the Sportswriter—Musicale Hanover son try his hand against the Gold and Grand Circuit horses this summer before returning to the Grassroots program.

Division point leaders **Four Wheelin** and **Profound Paragon** also capped off their impressive Grassroots seasons with a championship title.

Two-year-old trotting colt Four Wheelin kicked off the evening with a two-length score in a personal best 1:56.4. In rein to Louis-Philippe Roy the Wheeling N Dealin—Under The Pines son got away fourth as Lifelong Wish sprinted out to a :27.2 quarter and then swept to the lead heading for the

:57.3 half. The fan favorite did not face a challenge through the 1:26.2 three-quarters and pulled away to a two length victory over Warrawee Windsor and Tymal Chrome.

"I expected it to be a two-horse race pretty much," said Roy, who was concerned about the other Semi-Final winner Highland Mowgli and driver Bob McClure. "At first I wasn't really happy because the horse I had to beat was sitting on my back, but when (Mike) Saftic (with Lifelong Wish) slowed, I was able to re-move and get mine in a better position and get Bob's horse in a bad position. The last three starts I never used him. He did it all by himself and was never tired so I knew he had a little more left in the tank."

Saturday's win was Four Wheelin's fifth in five Grassroots starts. Trainer Marcel Barrieau of Cambridge, ON and Gestion Mastel Inc. of Longueil, QC share ownership of the talented youngster, who boosted his career earnings to \$101,002.

Like many of her peers, 3-year-old trotting filly Profound Paragon used a come-from-behind trip to score her fifth Grassroots win, and her twelfth of the season, in 1:55.4. Sonadora Deo finished one length behind the fan favorite and Chelseas Magic was third.

"She's been amazing," said trainer Julie Walker. "There's not too many horses that win that many races, when you consider the overnights and Grassroots, and at every race

track in Ontario, so it's been fun."

Walker shares ownership of Profound Paragon with breeder Steven Titus of Manalapan, NJ and Jean Bernard "Bert" Renaud has driven the Muscle Mass—Fox Valley Sommer daughter through her successful sophomore season.

Second Bruiser capped off a perfect Grassroots season with a championship title in the 2-year-old pacing colt showdown. The Believeinbruiser—Dear Vicky son and driver James MacDonald took command heading for the half and never faced a serious challenge, cruising home one and one-quarter length winners in 1:51.4. Proline finished second and Semi-Final winner Take Control was third.

"It was awesome," said trainer Vernon Cochrane. "I was a little bit worried about the front end. He'd never got to the front that early before and he's always trained better off a helmet, he likes to chase them home, but a good horse can do it any way, right."

Cochrane shares ownership of Second Bruiser with breeder Stefan Piekos of Palgrave, ON. The gelding made four appearances in the Grassroots program, two regular season legs, the Semi-Final and final, and won all three in identical clockings of 1:51.4.

Fan favorite **HP Mama B** also rewarded her backers in the 2-year-old trotting filly championship. In rein to Sylvain Filion HP Mama B powered from sixth to first in the final quarter, trotting under the wire one length ahead of Doing It All and division point leader Top Of The Bar in 1:57.3.

"That mare raced good. I am a happy man. When they win it's always nice," said trainer Ben Baillargeon who also bred the filly. "I got rid of the broodmare, and I even sold half of that one when she was a year old and I gave the rest of it to my wife, so she's happy. I haven't seen a dime of what that mare made so far. I don't think I'll see a penny out of that, but that's okay, my wife will put it to good use probably."

Baillargeon's wife Guylaine Picard of Guelph shares ownership of HP Mama B with Celine Paquin of Ayers Cliff, QC. The win boosted the Royalty For Life—Winters Jewel daughter's career earnings to \$76,087.

Louis-Philippe Roy was back in the winner's circle after the 3-year-old pacing filly showdown, guiding **Mia Culpa** to victory from Post 10. The Shadow Play—Mia Seelster daughter sprinted home to a three-quarter length victory in

a personal best 1:51.4. Semi-Final winner Lyons Tilt Hanover and Free Flyin Ticket also closed hard to be second and third.

"Jean Tourigny did a good job making her peak at the right time. She's as good now as she was two months ago. She's not tired and I was really happy with the trip I got with her," said Roy. "I raced her a few times on the front, but she's not really that type of horse."

Jean Tourigny trains Mia Culpa for Roland Trudel of Becancour, Michel Damphousse of Louiseville and Guy Lavoie of Terrebonne, QC. The win was the filly's fifth of the season and just her second in Ontario Sires Stakes action.

Jonathan Drury and 2-year-old pacing filly **Cyclone Sister** opted to follow in the footsteps of the fillies that preceded them, getting away sixth from Post 1 and advancing toward pacesetter Ourlittlemiracle through fractions of :28.2, :57.1 and 1:24.4. Rolling out three-wide at the three-quarters, Cyclone Sister kicked home to a one and one-half length win in a personal best 1:53.2. Fan favorite Chiefs Dream Girl was second and Semi-Final winner Amini was third.

"She raced great. Jonathan gave her a perfect trip. The first four or five starts she always kicked home really well and I was kind of hoping she could have that kick one more start and she did," said owner/breeder George Millar of Stouffville, ON. "I'm thrilled. I was just saying to my wife (Sondra), we were so close to selling the mare in foal with Cyclone Sister, I'm kind of glad there was no buyers and I ended up keeping her."

Nick Gallucci trains Cyclone Sister, who started her career with two wins at the Grassroots level and then took two runs at the Gold Series fillies before returning to the Grassroots program. Saturday's boosted the Shadow Play—Riveting daughter's earnings to \$99,682.

Terry Holton Youth Award winner Conley Newberry would love a career as a driver

Sometimes, it truly is worth the wait. Conley Newberry certainly knows all about that.

Just two days after he had opened all of his Christmas gifts, spent a memorable holiday with his friends and family, the teenager from Beavercreek, OH (the second-largest suburb of Dayton) had yet another reason to celebrate over the holidays in 2019.

On Dec. 27, the Ohio Harness Horseman's Association (OHHA) announced Newberry as the recipient of the Terry Holton Youth Award, named after the 2005 inductee into the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame, and a winner of over 1,700 races in his career.

"He is knowledgeable and dependable working in the stable and is very interested in the future of harness racing," Constance Polhamus said of Newberry.

Newberry, who worked for trainer Mike Polhamus' outfit in Troy, OH, is still taken aback by the honor.

"It was really... it's tough to find the right words. It's nice that people thought that much of me to nominate me and to vote for me. It was unexpected. To hear nice words from other people, rather than just trying to convince yourself of them – that meant a lot to me."

The Holton Award is given to a youth between the ages of 13 and 19 who has actively participated in harness racing during 2019 as a driver, trainer, groom, breeder, race office/publicity assistant, track maintenance crew or has provided outstanding service to harness racing.

Newberry, who started in the horse racing business at the age of 12, can check off a few of those boxes.

He worked with his father, driver/trainer Matt Newberry, and quickly graduated from doing odd jobs around the stable

to cleaning stalls, harnessing horses and jogging horses.

"When I was in grade eight or nine, somewhere around that time, my father got cancer, so he couldn't really tend to the horses. So, my uncle [driver/trainer John Newberry, the person who encouraged Conley to drive], I started work with him a lot, working in the barn, and that's when I really fell in love with the sport and taking me to where I am now. I've fallen in love it even more since then. The best part of this all for me is driving, for sure."

Last year, the now 18-year-old Newberry obtained his fair qualifying license, competed at seven fairs and picked up his first win.

The milestone victory came at Wapakoneta Park, a half-mile Ohio oval, on July 31, 2019.

Teaming with Catch Jesse, a son of Jailhouse Jesse (IN), the young driver and the veteran trotter went off as the 4-5 favorites.

Over a track listed as "good," the pair crossed the wire 3 ¾-lengths ahead of their nearest rivals.

It was the 17th career victory for the well-travelled trotter, who has 149 starts to his name for owner and breeder Herschel Lincoln of West Milton, OH.

"When I had my first win, I had the best horse in the race by far," said Newberry. "Catch Jesse was a :56 trotter back in his day, and we didn't race him all year. We just got him ready for me to drive at the fairs. He could trot around 2:02, 2:03,

maybe 2:01 on a good fair track. We ended up in a race where the other horses just couldn't beat him. I could have fallen off and he still would have won."

Newberry added, with a laugh, "I was told if I didn't win I wasn't allowed to sit behind another horse."

He's still in the race bike and he's still dreaming big.

"I'd love to be a catch driver, that would just be a dream come true. I'd say the two people I look up to most when it comes to driving would be Chris Page and Tim Tetrick. Those are my two favorites."

Sharing the same racetrack as his idols is still a ways away, but Newberry is committed to staying patient and staying the course, eager to educate immerse himself in the sport, heighten his skills, and remain open to helpful advice.

He believes all of it will help take him to where he wants to be.

"'You can't get too high and you can't get too low.' That's what my dad told me. My dad told me you have to take things as they come and remain positive and even-keeled. You learn pretty early that you need that to be successful."

Just as Newberry did during the days when he was competing with another bike, more specifically, the world of BMX Racing.

An accomplished rider – a Google search yields several impressive results both in state and national events – Newberry enjoyed his time competing around the U.S. He's looking to add some horse racing hardware to complement his impressive BMX trophy case.

"I don't race any more, but I ride a lot of freestyle with my friends still. I really enjoyed my time riding and there are definitely some similarities between BMX and driving a horse. In both, you're in close quarters. I've only driven in two races that weren't at the fairs, and you realize just how in tight you are, just like it is with BMX racing. That's definitely the way it is with bikes, so I think that's helped me a lot in driving – being calm and comfortable when there isn't much room on either side of you. With both, you just need to react to each situation as they come. You have to be ready to make a decision in a split second."

It's one of many aspects of harness racing Newberry, who points to trainer Ken Hurst as a big supporter, continues to dedicate his time to.

"I really love everything about this sport. I know I have to work hard in order to achieve my dreams, and I am dedicated to doing that. It makes me happy every day I get to be around the horses. I'll just keep learning and reminding myself of what I want to achieve."

Bleff Dipa wins the \$995,000 Italian Derby

Fourteen 3-year-olds bred in Italy gathered around the track of Capannelle in Rome on Sunday afternoon (Oct. 11) and what looked like to be a Alessandro Gocciadoro show ended with a win for German-born trainer Holger Ehlert and his weapon Bleff Dipa (Mister J.P.).

Örjan Kihlström sent Gocciadoro-trained Bubble Effe to the front and the duo held that position almost all the way, but in a tight finish, Bubble Effe ended up as fourth.

Instead of a Gocciadoro demonstration in the Derby, Holger Ehlert's Bleff Dipa, starting from post 14, swept to victory in mile rate 1:58.1 over 1.3 miles.

Bleff Dipa is owned by the French Harness Racing Society's general, Jean Pierre Barjon, who also owned Bleff Dipa's father Mister J.P.

Mister J.P. was a talented trotter in Björn Goop's barn and he won nine consecutive starts from the debut and was first choice in the \$850,000 Kriterium as a 3-year-old. He finished third in that race and lost for the first time in his career.

Barjon's interest for the sport paid off great when Bleff Dipa captured the trophy in the Italian Derby and it was tight between the medalists. Both runner up Blackflash Bar and third placed Bepi Bi came home in 1:58.1.

Italian top driver Roberto Vecchione, known in America as winner of The International Trot at Yonkers 2019 with Zacon Gio. sat behind the winner.

Gocciadoro was lucky in the \$297,000 Oaks del Trotto for fillies. Andrea Guzzinatti was entrusted behind Betta Zack (Rotary OK) and the duo hit the lead after the first quarter. When in front, Betta Zack was outstanding in a 1:56.4. mile.

Bonneville Gifont finished second ahead of Belen Hall Fas.

Betta Zack has eight wins in ten attempts so far in her

First Blood in \$150,000 Danish Kriterium

The best 3-year-olds in Denmark battled over 1.6 miles at Charlottenlund racetrack in Copenhagen on Sunday afternoon (Oct. 11).

Champion driver Birger Jörgensen sent Morten Juul's First Blood to the front and let first choice Fossa take over the lead after a quarter of a mile. When first over trotter Fetlock Joint got tired in the last turn, everything worked perfectly for First Blood, who easily sprinted to safe win in mile rate 2:01.4.

Leader Fossa finished second and Felix third.

In the \$60,000 Kriterium for mares, Fascination (Maharajah) claimed the trophy after a trip in front for driver Jeppe Juel. Norwegian Frode Hamre trains the younger sister to Ecurie D. who is, already now, as a 4-year-old, is one of the most interesting trotters there are in Europe.
