Cruzado Dela Noche scores 30-1 upset in Yonkers International

But will the 40th edition of the International be its last now that the Rooney family has sold the track to MGM Resorts?

Sweden's Cruzado Dela Noche (Brian Sears wearing the colors of Anders Strom's Courant A B) edged Norwegian trotter Lionel in Saturday's \$1 million Yonkers International Trot.

As one era ended, perhaps it was only fitting that an ambitious young trainer watched a dream come true when Sweden's Cruzado Dela Noche pulled a stunning upset in the 40th International Trot on Saturday at Yonkers Raceway.

Timothy Rooney, who purchased Yonkers Raceway in 1972, presided over the International for the final time as new owner MGM Resorts prepares to take over the tradition-rich half-mile track in 2019. The International, which started at old Roosevelt Raceway in 1959, holds such a special place in Rooney's heart that he restored the once-prestigious race in 2015 after it had not been contested for 20 years.

While MGM is contractually committed to continuing racing, Rooney, 81, acknowledged that the \$1 million International faces an uncertain future.

"I just hope that somebody there likes horses," he said of MGM Resorts.

Marcus Melander, 26, must hope so, too. For now, he is content in knowing that he and his uncle, Stefan, combined to do an

outstanding training job in preparing Cruzado Dela Noche for a last-gasp head victory against Norway's Lionel at the daunting odds of 30-1. France's Up And Quick took third. Ariana G, the lone mare in the field of 10, was fourth

Stefan worked extensively with the 6-year-old son of Muscle Massive before shipping him to the United States in late June to take dead aim at the International. The horse completed his required time in quarantine and arrived at Marcus' farm in New Egypt, NJ, at the start of August.

Marcus knew what to do from there. He had known from a tender age that his career would be in racing.

"I started to drive the small ponies when I was seven or eight," he said. "So, I've been doing this my entire life."

He quit school when he was 15 to take a head-first plunge into the sport, including an invaluable one-year stint with Hall of Fame trainer Jimmy Takter. Between his uncle and Takter, he learned that there are no shortcuts. Nothing replaces invaluable time spent on the track.

"We train our horses a lot. You can't just go out there for 15 or 20 minutes and think that is enough," Melander said. "When we go out for a workout, it takes over an hour. I want my horses to be well-prepared when they race."

Cruzado Dela Noche was prepared just enough for the mile-and-a-quarter International – even if it did not look that way on paper. Although he had won two qualifiers at Pocono Downs on Sept. 12 and Sept. 26, he had not actually raced since a distant fifth-place finish on June 10.

"We did not know if he was 100 per cent in form," said Melander, "but we got a good trip."

That trip came courtesy of Brian Sears, who has a strong working relationship with Anders Strom, the winning owner.

"Anders has been real good to me throughout our relationship," Sears said. "We had talked about my driving the horse early on, so I was kind of committed to him."

Sears said he studied replays of past races to be as prepared as possible. He liked everything he saw.


"He doesn't have great speed," he said, "but he keeps coming. He can take a lot of the racetrack two wide."

Sears, keenly aware of the layoff, knew he needed to conserve as much energy as possible. He also knew he needed everything to go his way.

It did.

When Elitloppet winner Ringostarr Treb, leaving from post four, broke stride entering the first turn and Pastore Bob did the same from post five, favored Marion Marauder of Canada and his driver, Scott Zeron, soon found themselves in an early lead. Neither was happy to be there.

Zeron said of the misfortune that befell Ringostarr Treb and Pastore Bob, "It changed the whole evolution of the race. It forced

my hand to put mine on the lead, and I think my horse is a much better chaser. I was disappointed in the way it unfolded."

At that point, the only question for Sears involved whether his horse would be short on stamina as he launched what proved to be a bold and decisive three-wide move. "He definitely could have been (short)," the driver acknowledged, "but because he doesn't race real aggressive early, he kind of saves himself. He knows how to finish and that's the type of horse I like. They know where the wire is and what they are trying to accomplish."

Victory was accomplished in 2:24.3. Sweden gained its sixth International triumph to rank third, trailing the United States (14) and France (12).

Goran Antsonsen, driving Lionel from post nine, was full of confidence when his 8-year-old took over the lead from a withering Marion Marauder, last year's runner-up who came in fifth.

"I was almost 100 per cent sure of victory in the final third (of the race)," he said.

As brutal as the loss was, Antonsen was hardly discouraged. "I'm very, very proud," he said. "He was fantastic."

As he prepares to leave a track that has been so much a part of his life and that of his famous family, Rooney expressed hope that the International's revival will not be fleeting.

"If they get behind this thing," he said of MGM Resorts, "they will make it bigger and better than anybody could. They are tremendous marketing people."

Then the aging Rooney left the winner's circle in the fading afternoon light and disappeared into the crowd, knowing he had presented the International trophy for the final time as proud owner of Yonkers Raceway.


Indiana stars shine on Champions Night at Hoosier

Verlin Yoder was the star of the night with three Super Final victories.

The stars of the Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) program converged on Hoosier Park Racing & Casino Friday (Oct. 12) for the track's annual Super Night program. Over the course of the 14-race card, trotters and pacers battled for over \$2 million in purses and year-end honors in the state. On a night when rain and cold conditions leveled the playing field, the leaders turning for home had a difficult time reaching the winner's circle.

Trainer Verlin Yoder was the big winner on the program, collecting three sires stakes finals. He was one of the few that turned a front-end trip into a winning effort, picking up a victory with **Kissessforall** in the \$220,000 Super Final for 2-year-old filly trotters. Starting from post five, Yoder sent the favorite to the front and clicked off fractions of :28.1, :59.3 and 1:29.2 on a surface that started fast and turned sloppy. Turning for home, the Swan For All—Deliteful Debbie lass cruised home in :28.2 to win by five and one-half lengths in 1:57.4. Measuredperfection followed in second and



Kota's Swan raced third.

"When I got to the half I was licking my chops," Yoder said of the trip and the fractions. "She usually comes home pretty good."

The filly, owned by Yoder in partnership with Eleven Star Stables, added her fifth win from 12 seasonal starts. Bred by Alvin R. Fry and sold for \$14,000 at the Hoosier Classic sale, Kissessforall improved her seasonal earnings to \$194,300.

Yoder's biggest score came in the \$220,000 Super Final for freshman trotting colts. Steering It's A Herbie from post two in the ninth race on the program, Yoder handed Swandre The Giant his first defeat in Indiana Sires Stakes action, trotting to a 1:56.1 victory. When the gate folded, the trainer sent his charge to the lead from post three and posted a :28 first panel. Swandre The Giant and Yannick Gingras moved from fourth on the backstretch, but had to move three wide around a stalled Airman Kelly to reach the front. Following the leader into the stretch, It's A Herbie overtook the favorite and hit the wire three parts of a length ahead of his rival.

"I can't race that horse into the stretch, I had to race him the whole mile," Yoder said of the strategy employed with his colt against Swandre The Giant. "I was expecting him to come to me in the last turn. He came a little earlier than I had hoped."

The Here Comes Herbie—Psychic Image colt was bred by David Schmucker Jr. and purchased by Yoder for \$22,000 last fall. Collecting his third triumph in 12 attempts, It's A Herbie's earnings now stand at \$242,000.

Churita's bid to add yet another \$70,000 Super Final victory to her resume was foiled Friday night by Yoder and his second choice, **Compelling**. The veteran placed his Swan For All—First Lady Two 4-year-old in perfect position in the last turn, and in the stretch, the trotter headed the leader and favorite before reaching the wire half a length in front, stopping the clock in 1:54.2. Churita and Trace Tetrick settled for second while Diamond Dagger and Ricky Macomber Jr. finished third. Bred by Lavon Miller, Compelling earned her fifth win in 14 starts, and her seasonal bankroll is now \$91,690.

Yoder looked to add a fourth win on the program but had to settle for second best as Breeders Crown champion **Fiftydallarbill** and Trace Tetrick put away Katkin American in the \$220,000 Super Final for sophomore trotting colts. The William Crone trainee took advantage of a pocket trip before springing to a one-length victory, trotting the mile in 1:54.2.

Owned by John Barnard, Fiftydallarbill picked up his eighth victory of 2018. The son of Swan For All-CR Dixie Chick, bred by John L. Miller, boosted his earnings for the year to \$360,998. The colt's career earnings stand at \$819,948.

Besides Yoder's hat trick, the feel-good story of the night came in the \$220,000 Super Final for sophomore pacing

fillies when 11-1 **It's Time For Fun** crashed the party with a 1:54 upset over favored Voom Or Bang. The victory was a family affair as the Skydancer Hanover—Irwin's Character filly was bred by Lynn Wilfong, trained by his son, Brett, and driven to victory by grandson, Kyle. Friends and family filled the winner's circle to celebrate.

"This filly has a tremendous last eighth if you don't have to show her a ton of air," Brett Wilfong said of his filly. "When I saw him slide out second or third over, I thought, 'Oh boy."

Making her 19 start of the year, It's Time For Fun settled in third along the rail through a :56.3 opening half. Kyle Wilfong would move the filly into the outer flow, third over as the field raced into the turn. Moving wide in the stretch, It's Time For Fun paced home in :28.2 to finish a length in front. It was the sixth win of the year, moving her earnings to \$199.040.

Always A Prince, one of the best stories of the Indiana Sires Stakes season, closed out the \$220,000 final for sophomore pacing colts with his 17th win in 20 starts. Trained by Tyler George for Carl and Melanie Atley, the Always A Virgin—Glorious Princess gelding was unfazed by lining up in the second tier. Driven by Tetrick, Always A Prince raced



fourth early on before Hoosier Park's leading driver sent him to the lead, reaching the half in :56.1. The favorite would carry a three-length lead into the stretch and cross the wire ahead by just over two lengths. Shnitzledosomethin and David Miller finished second followed by Just N Ace and Gingras.

Unraced at two, Always A Prince has banked \$379,500 for his connections. Bred by Emerald Highlands Farm, he was a \$30,000 purchase at the Buckeye Classic Yearling Sale in 2016.

Custom Cantab was much the best throughout the Indiana Sires Stakes campaign, and she finished in style, capturing the \$220,000 final for sophomore trotting fillies in a 1:55.1 performance. The Mr Cantab—Custom Model mare, driven by Peter Wrenn, held off a closing Black Mamba As and Todd Warren late in the mile to win by a quarter length. Red Rose Swan and LeWayne Miller finished third. The trotter is owned by trainer Chris Beaver in partnership with Donald Robinson and RBH Ventures Inc.

A \$6,000 yearling purchase, Custom Cantab earned her 10th win in 13 trips behind the gate. She has earned \$555,036 over the last two seasons, \$340,550 of that coming in 2018. The mare was bred by Hoosier Standardbred Farm and Fair Meadow Farm.

Rockin Nola, at odds of 8-1, sprung the upset in the \$220,000 Super Final for freshman pacing fillies. Guided by LeWayne Miller, the Rockin Image—Gottogetoutmore filly dashed a :26.4 last quarter to win by less than a length, covering the mile in 1:53. Queen Lagertha and Lady Capulet followed in second and third.

"She had talent right from the get go. We've been plugging away and she's raced good. We've had to have a little luck to get to this point, but she's had talent all along," trainer Joe Putnam said. "We've been getting closer and closer each week. She's been a finisher every week, so it kind of played into our hands a little bit."

Trained by Joe Putnam, the filly notched her fourth win in 10 outings. Putnam owns the 2-year-old in partnership with Suttons Bay Racing and Novi Trot LLC. Bred by Mahlon Lambright and sold for \$15,000 at the Hoosier Classic sale, Rockin Nola now sports earnings of \$141,850.

Freshman **Egomania** and driver John DeLong used cover to their advantage and sprinted home to collect the \$220,000 Super Final for pacing colts. The son of Always A Virgin—Has An Attitude kicked home in :28.1 to secure a one and

one-quarter length victory in the night's 10th race, tripping the timer in 1:53. Always A Vavoom, 12-1, and Outloud rounded out the trifecta.

Bred by Brittany Farms, Egomania is trained by Shane Bowermaster for Brian Brown. The colt, now a winner in five of 11 seasonal starts, is owned by Country Club Acres, Joe Sbrocco, Richard Lombardo and John Fodera. The victory pushed Egomania's earnings to \$213,100.


Trotting stalwart **Bridge To Jesse's** added yet another Super Final victory to his lengthy list of credentials. Trained by Roger Welch and driven by DeLong, the Jailhouse Jesse—Bridge to Nowhere 5-year-old annexed the \$50,000 final for aged stallions and geldings, completing the circuit in 1:54.3. Closing out the mile with a :27.3 last quarter, Bridge To Jesse's finished four lengths ahead of Bluebird Reverend, with Milford's Z Tam trotting third.

"When we put him behind the gate, we know he's going to be there. He does everything we ask of him," said Bo DeLong, one of the gelding's owners. "He's good on a track like this. He got a good trip. John drove him perfect and didn't get excited."

Owned by Welch, DeLong, Pat DeLong and Ray DeLong, Bridge To Jesse's won for the sixth time in 19 starts. The victory was the 34th in 67 career starts. Bred by Michael and Randy Wilt, the gelding now possesses career earnings of \$793,055.

Always Giggling left her connections in good spirits after claiming the \$70,000 final for older pacing mares. Brett Miller steered the Always A Virgin—Giggles The Clown 4-year-old to a 1:52.2 score, one length better than E R Hilary. Nick Surick trains the mare, owned by Cornerstone Stock Farm, Phil Wiley and J L Benson Stables Inc. The victory was the mare's fifth of the season.

Tookadiveoffdipper and Tetrick took command in the stretch to win the \$50,000 final for stallion and gelding pacers Friday night, holding off 62-1 Ideal Ace by a length in a time of 1:51.1. Sent off as third choice in the contest, the Always A Virgin—Onceinabluemoon 4-year-old racked up his sixth win of 2018. Trained by Virgin Morgan Jr., the gelding is owned by Jane Cross, Mark Cross, James Hepp and Mike Brink.





Indiana makes changes to breeder development program

Indiana's Standardbred Breed Development program closed the books on another successful sires stakes campaign Friday, capped by an action-packed Super Night program. Two days prior, however, members of the Indiana Standardbred Breed Development Advisory Committee and Indiana Standardbred Advisory Board met at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino and approved program changes meant to address the concerns of horsemen. The revised program will result in \$700,000 more being pumped into Indiana Sires Stakes, with estimated purses for 2019 reaching \$8.5 million. The full breed development program will offer more than \$13.6 million in purses and incentives next season.

"Change can either be good or bad. I think this is something that has a lot of support in the industry, and will breathe some new life into the program," said Jessica Barnes, director of racing and breed development for the Indiana Horse Racing Commission. "It's going to give horsemen additional opportunities to race in other events and other races, if they choose, without reducing the amount of money available in the sires stakes. I'm excited to see what the impact will be."

In the current state, horses competing in Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) battled in five rounds of eliminations and finals, accumulating points in hopes of securing a place in the Super Final. A horse, freshman or sophomore, committed to the program through all five rounds made up to 10 starts before the Super Final in just ISS action alone. The schedule made it difficult to take advantage of opportunities outside the program.

Beginning in 2019, freshman trotters and pacers will forego five rounds of eliminations and finals in favor of six legs leading up to the Super Final, trimming up to four races from the schedule and providing a chance to race in other stakes. Three year olds will see eight rounds of competition, reducing two starts from the schedule.

"Committee members felt like when they were really looking at the program the 2-year-olds were getting a lot of starts and some of those horses weren't coming back as well as they should. They wanted to lessen the need to race those 2-year-olds so hard. Everybody there felt like eight legs was a good number for 3-year-olds. It would still give them opportunities to compete in other stakes races, other events," said Barnes. "The Indiana-sired horses have gotten to the point where they are competitive in a lot of other places. We wanted trainers to be able to maximize the earning potential of those horses, not only through sires stakes, but also stakes in Indiana and outside of Indiana."

Any healthy program adjusts to meet the demands of the

time, and committee members realized change was needed to keep it moving in the right direction. Another significant change comes in the structure of the legs and the purses. In the past, breed development funded eliminations using a cap per round and estimating the number of divisions based on entries from previous years. That method resulted in \$200,000 in eliminations purses going unpaid when some categories did not see entries on par with the past. Going forward there will be no eliminations, and a set amount will be allocated for each leg in addition to nomination and entry fees. That total amount will then be split by the number of divisions. This will guarantee that all money budgeted is paid.

"If you look at the year 2014, we had 134 divisions and 1,210 entries in our eliminations. By 2018, this past year, we had 96 divisions and 834 entries. There was a decline in the number of entries, the total money that we allocated wasn't being paid out, and I really think the breed development committee and the advisory board sees this industry as a partnership all the way from the racetracks to breeders, trainers, owners and the people operating the sales," Barnes said. "I think our program has become tougher, more competitive than it has been in the past. With that said, if we continued the program the way that it is currently structured, I think we would see less and less money being paid out. Therefore, the committee felt like it had to make some adjustments."

Barnes provided some sample figures based on 2018 statistics. Legs for 3-year-olds going only one division would offer purses of \$87,968. Two divisions would result in a per race purse of \$48,960 and three divisions would each compete for somewhere in the \$35,000 range. Applying 2018 numbers to the freshman program, a single division would offer a purse of \$122,500, two divisions would see \$66,250 per event and three divisions would compete for purses of \$44,833 each.

Another change coming out of the meeting was a 25 per cent bump of the Super Final purse to \$250,000. Horses that finish sixth through tenth will continue to receive \$4,000 for earning their way into the race.

While the changes will need to be approved by the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, announcing the revised program in advance of next week's Hoosier Classic sale means buyers know the structure of the program prior to investing. Hoosier Classic sale manager Steve Cross said that benefits all involved.

"That's the key. You cannot make changes like that after a sale. Buyers have to know what they are racing for," he said. "I'm not sure what to expect, but I think the announced changes will help. I think doing nothing would have hurt us more."

Double for Muscle Hill in European Derby

The \$463,000 Grand Prix de l'U.E.T. for 4-year-olds were held at Vincennes racetrack in Paris, France on Friday night and the evening ended with first victory for the year for Timo Nurmos' Muscle Hill son Villaiam.

Villiam won the Swedish Kriterium in world record performance 2017 and the 4-year-old was the first choice, by many, to win the Derby in Sweden this year. But Villiam disappeared in the elimination for that race and in the qualification for European Derby, he was not at his best, finishing third behind Chianti and Dream Night Palema.

From number 8 behind the gate, driver Jorma Kontio had no other options but to take it slow from start with Villiam and the duo found a position deep down in the field of 12 horses. With 5/8ths of a mile to go, Kontio followed French hope Eridan three wide, but short thereafter Villiam was given order to attack fourth wide and the son of Muscle Hill accelerated quickly at the back stretch.

Favorite Who's Who was parked outside leader Chianti and Villiam landed outside the leading duo in the last turn. When the field reached the home stretch, Villiam got control of the race and he even struggled to keep Muscle Hill mare Mellby Free behind him in the finish.

The expectations were big before the season, but Villiam hadn't showed that he belongs in the top among the 4-year-olds in Europe, until now.

"This is a very good horse and most certainly one for the Prix d'Amérique in the future," Kontio said.

Trainer Timo Nurmos has had a great year, especially in France, so far. His Readly Express (Ready Cash) won Prix d'Amérique in January and Jämtlands Stora Pris in Östersund in June. Nurmos has also collected victories in Finnish Derby with Hachiko de Veluwe and Swedish Kriterium with Inti Boko.

Villiam reached the wire at mile rate 1:54,4 over 1.3 miles.

Villiam replay

Strong performance by Face Time Bourbon

Sébastien Guarato trained Face Time Bourbon (Ready Cash) had to work hard for the victory in the \$116,000 European Championship for 3-year-olds at Vincennes racetrack on Friday night.

Björn Goop drove the son of Ready Cash and from post position 7 behind the gate, there were factors that could cause trouble along the way in the 1.3 miles long race. And the first 5/8ths of a mile was tough for Face Time Bourbon. Three wide in chase for position without cover outside the leader should normally have got the 3-year-old trotter exposed in the end of the race, but instead of losing power, he sprinted home to a comfortable win in mile rate 1:56,2.

Holy Water (Pastor Stephen) got the silver medal after a trip behind the leader and Fric du Chene (Nobody du Chene) was placed third.

Wire to wire for Dijon

The \$116,000 European Championship for 5-year-olds became a quite uneventful happening since French Dijon (Ganymede) early hit the lead and was allowed to keep the pace down.

Mile rate 1:59 was enough to win this race at Vincennes and Orlando Jet (Orlando Vici) was locked in behind horses as second while Django Riff (Ready Cash) held as third from position outside the leader.

Swedish championship

Björn Goop returned to Sweden and Åby racetrack for the \$115,000 Swedish Championship on Saturday afternoon were he was entrusted behind Timo Nurmos' Prix d'Amérique winner Readly Express (Ready Cash).

From post position 12 behind the gate, Goop found third over before he left three wide after a quarter of a mile. Leader Cyber Lane and driver Christoffer Eriksson kindly let Readly Express reach front position, from where the son of Ready Cash controlled the race every meter thereafter.

"Readly Express is a horse that means a lot for me since we won Prix d'Amérique together in January. I still think about that moment at least once a day and I suppose this is the best horse that I've driven in my career," said Goop after the victory in mile rate 1:55.4 over 1.7 miles.

Cyber Lane (Raja Mirchi) held strong to second place while Racing Mange (Orlando Vici) finished strongly for third place.

Goop turned 42 this day and he has had spectacular days on the tracks in Europe the last week. Beside the big wins in France and Sweden, he also passed his father Olle Goop regarding being the most winning driver in Sweden. Björn Goop has visited the winner's circle more than 6,750 times. Kontio, born in Finland and with Swedish licence, is still the most winning driver in the northern countries in Europe with more than 10.500 victories.

In Swedish Championship for mares (\$111,500) the talented 5-year-old Cash Crowe (Ready Cash) showed that she is one of the best mares in Europe. Christoffer Eriksson found the lead with Petri Puros trotter and the last 5/8ths of a mile went really fast, which made it hard for the chasers deep down in the field.

Dear Friend (Orlando Vici) tried to capture Cash Crowe via open stretch, but never got seriously close to the winner. In Toto Sund (Ken Warkentin) finished quickly from fourth over and took bronze medal. Cash Crowe came home in mile rate 1:55.1 over 1.3 miles.

"This is the kind of horse that you want to drive and today she was just perfect. We could keep the pace down midway, but I'm pretty sure that she would have won in the same easy way if I had chosen a tactic with higher pace," said driver Christoffer Eriksson after the victory.

Opening session of London sale Excels thanks to \$187,000 bid

Stonebridge Excel tops Day 1 of the London Selected Yearling Sale with a bid of \$187,000 by Bill Donovan from a session that was up 31.7 per cent in average and 15.5 per cent in gross from a year ago.

It took just a few minutes in the auction ring for Stonebridge Excel to soar to a bid of \$187,000 Saturday afternoon at the London Selected Yearling Sale, but for Dr. Cal Stiller it was the culmination of many years to produce that individual and a quarter century in the business to get to the point of having the sale topper for the opening session of Canada's premier standardbred sale.

"To breed and hope that there's a filly that you want to keep or a colt that is flawless, it doesn't come all at once. You got through a number before you reach that ideal individual," said Stiller, who operates Stonebridge Farm of Arva, ON with his wife, Angie.

"Unfortunately, Angie isn't here today, but the excitement really goes back to our shared excitement. You have a broodmare and you choose a sire and you watch that individual grow. It is exciting. It's been exciting for 25 years for us," Stiller said.

William Donovan of Florida purchased Stonebridge Excel, a daughter of Muscle Mass out of Armbro Vanquish, and word is she will be trained by Rick Zeron, the conditioner behind

Hambletonian-winning filly Atlanta.

"I think she's everything. She just checked all the boxes off," Stiller said. "She really has a flawless conformation, very athletic. She had a great video. She couldn't be by a better Canadian sire than Muscle Mass and she has great depth – that mare just continues to put out extraordinary individuals.

"The residual value of her as a broodmare is pretty considerable and I have to say that it's with some sorrow that I don't see her come back to our own broodmare band, but that's the way it is."

Stonebridge Excel — who has a number of talented older siblings, including Manofmanymissions, a winner of more than \$1.2 million — was the highlight of a strong opening session of the sale held at the Metroland Media Agri-Plex facility at the Western Fair District in London, ON.

The first session saw 100 yearlings gross \$2,870,000, an average of \$28,700. The average is up 31.7 per cent from the opening session average of \$21,793 fetched at the inaugural London Selected Yearling Sale in 2017 in which 114 yearlings were sold. This year's gross is up 15.5 from last year's first-session gross of \$2,484,500 and average \$21,793.

The second and final session of the London sale begins today at noon. Some 230 yearlings are scheduled to be sold, including a handful at the end that were originally slated to sell in the London Selected Mixed Sale that was cancelled due to lack of entries.

"I'd be thrilled if we continue with an average of \$28,700 for Sunday. I don't think we will, just because we have some

extra horses added at the end, but, boy, it was a great start. Great start," said sale manager Ann Straatman, who is also the reproduction manager for Seelster Farms of Lucan, ON. Seelster was the leading consignor by gross on day one with total sales of \$796,000 for 19 yearlings sold, including the top-priced pacer, He's Watching—Shadow Of Mymind colt Shelton Seelster that brought \$130,000 from trainer Dave Menary, the man that campaigned He's Watching.

"I was interested in the He's Watchings and I thought he was as good as any colt in the sale and definitely the best He's Watching," Menary said. "The colt made a good impression on me at the farm. I liked him in the paddock at the farm and he had a good video. I was happy with the way he vetted out, so I have no complaints. I'd like to bring him home for less, but very happy coming home with him and hopefully I'm happy this time next year... It's not who wins at the sale, it's who wins at the track.

"I thought he really shined in this sale, as an individual and pedigree-wise. So, we went a little over our budget, maybe 10 per cent over our budget. We said 'last time' about four times. I didn't get in until about \$60,000 and the bidding went quick, but it was going slow at the end. I thought the

underbidder was ready to surrender. We'll cry over the initial number, not the little extra if things don't work out."

Shelton Seelster was Menary's only purchase Saturday.

"I put all my eggs in that basket today. I took a pretty good run at the Bettors Delight filly right after him, but near the end I started to do the math," he said.

Seelster Farms' assistant farm manager Walter Parkinson said Shelton Seelster was a "nice individual" from the start, "sort of this big, strapping, good-looking colt all along and just came along nicely this yearling season. He was the colt that most people wanted to see... It was a busy year for people coming to the farm and he was definitely on everyone's pacing lists."

Though Seelster led all consignors in gross sales, Stonebridge led in average with \$73,200 for five sold. It was the second year of having one major Canadian sale that combined the old Forest City Yearling Sale and Standardbred Canada's Canadian Yearling Sale.

"I think this is a good platform, in terms of having a single platform for Canada, so that's really a benefit," Stiller said. "It's a nice facility, people come, and there's a good feeling in

the crowd. There's a lot of serious lookers. I had three people come today to the consignment who have never owned a standardbred before and two of them bought. To me, that's a positive thing."

Donovan was the opening session's second leading buyer with his lone purchase of Stonebridge Excel, but Millar Farms topped everyone with a total spend of \$192,000 on two yearlings — Bettors Delight—Farouche Hanover colt Bettorbuckleup from Twinbrook Limited, agent, for \$85,000 and Bettors Delight—Shakai Hanover filly Shiraz Seelster from Seelster Farms for \$107,000.

Straatman said the sale was designed to be as equal as possible in talent on both days, but she's hoping combining the sale with Saturday night's Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Finals at Woodbine Mohawk Park may generate some cash flow for buyers to use in today' session.

"Keep it up, everyone. Come back (Sunday) with your winnings from (Mohawk) and let's keep the ball rolling," she said. "There's still lots more to come."



Completing the field were Cult Icon, Wisdom Tree, Strong Opinion, Bad Girls Rule, Aims Whisper, Kitty Kitty Hawk and Dragon Lady Art.

Baron Remy (Yankee Cruiser—Riley Character—Shady Character) now has eight wins in 24 lifetime starts. Saturday's victory increased her career bankroll to \$465,010. She returned \$4.00 to win.

Trio of Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final wins seals Lampman Cup for driver Roy

Louis-Philippe Roy won his first Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Final at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday and then won two more to lay emphatic claim to the Lampman Cup title as the leading driver in the OSS program.

A joyful group met the 28-year-old in the winner's circle after his first victory, as he guided 2-year-old trotting filly **HP Titania Runner** to a narrow 1:57.4 score over Champagne Jane and favorite Presto Change O.

"Those owners are maybe not the first ones, but among the first people that got me stake drives in Quebec," said Roy of owner/breeders Claude Hamel of Ayer's Cliff and Michel Damphousse of Louiseville, QC. "So, the fact that they put confidence in me and now they are kind of rewarded with that win, I am happy for them."

Woodbine Mohawk Park fans sent the division point leader off as the second choice from Post 5 and HP Titania Runner charged from seventh to first in the last quarter to secure

the championship. The E L Titan—Canaco Runner daughter wrapped up her freshman season with a record of four wins in eight starts and earnings of \$248,650.

While his first victory paid tribute to the past, Roy's second Super Final win had him looking toward the future. The reinsman teamed up with **Keystone Concrete** (Bettors Delight—Keystone Caitlyn) to deliver a giant-slaying upset in the 2-year-old pacing colt and gelding division, laying down a :26.3 final quarter to collar Bettors Wish and Metro Pace winner Stag Party in 1:52. All three colts are by sire Bettors Delight.

"For a while I was saying to myself, 'I will be third' and I would have been happy with a third, but then I seen Stag Party get a little tired so I said, 'I will probably get there for second,' but that horse —sometimes horses they'll fight until the last one to pass, they'll just get to their head and kind of hang on a little bit, but this one he just kept going and he even went by the last horse," said Roy. "He's a really nice horse. I can't wait, if I have the opportunity, to drive him again at three."

Roy drove Keystone Concrete to his fifth win in seven starts for trainer Rob Fellows of Rockwood, his wife Yolanda Fellows, and her co-owners Arpad Szabo of Bradford, ON and Blair Corbeil of Beaumont, AB. The win boosted the colt's earnings to \$214,850 and Szabo was already looking forward to spending his share.

"Maybe I can buy some more yearlings now because I am going to the sale tomorrow to spend the money I made. It's

not going to stay in my pocket very long," said Szabo with a laugh, adding that Keystone Concrete had been something of a Cinderella story for his owners. "I never thought he was going to make it this far. He started in the Grassroots and he wound up in the Gold, and win the Gold, and beat a horse like Stag Party."

Roy's third Super Final victory was the perfect end to his 2018 Ontario Sires Stakes season, coming with 3-year-old pacing colt **Jimmy Freight**, who took him to open stake races across North America this summer. On Saturday night, the pair battled harder than they had all season in the provincial program, using a late kick to nab stablemate and pacesetter Backstreet Shadow in the stretch for a one-half length victory in 1:50.2. St Lads Neptune was awarded third-place when The Downtown Bus was placed back to fifth for causing interference.

"I knew I was going to float, I didn't want to rush him to go in the lead," said Roy of his strategy from Post 9. "Last start he raced really good, and the start before he got, I think, a little bit tired of racing on the front, and I really wanted not to end the season that way, like end it on a good note. He's been so much dominant in the Ontario Sires Stakes this year that I think he deserved that win."

The soon-to-be Guelph resident drives Jimmy Freight for trainer Richard Moreau of Puslinch and owner Adriano Sorella. The Sportswriter—Allamerican Summer son went undefeated through the Gold Series this season, winning four legs and the Super Final. His sophomore record stands at

nine wins, four seconds and three thirds in 17 starts for earnings of \$691,239.

Three-year-old trotting colt point leader Run Director also wrapped up his season with a Super Final victory and owners Tom and Elizabeth Rankin of St. Catharines, ON were delighted to be joined in the winner's circle by the colt's namesake, Rankin Cancer Run director Mary Ann Edwards.

"He emailed me one day and said, 'Would you mind if I named a male horse after you?'" recalled Edwards. "So it was an honor to be here tonight for this and this man is unbelievable, it's unbelievable what he does in our community."

"She keeps saying karma, you know you'll get repaid back, so I named the horse after her and he's done nothing but win," said Tom Rankin, who was certain the colt was going to finish second at the head of the stretch.

After a breather behind pacesetter Stormont Ventnor around the final turn, Run Director and driver Sylvain Filion powered down the stretch to a one and one-half length victory in 1:54.2 Stormont Ventnor settled for second and Jula Downton was well back in third. Guelph resident Ben Baillargeon conditions the Kadabra—Keep The Spirit colt for the Rankins.

Three-year-old pacing filly **Percy Bluechip** repeated as Super Final champion, going gate-to-wire in 1:52 for driver Yannick Gingras. Kendall Seelster and Quints Dream finished one length back in second and third.

"I wanted to race her on the front, I really did," said Gingras

The New Jersey-based reinsman drove Percy Bluechip to the win for trainer Ron Burke and owners Burke Racing Stable LLC of Fredericktown, PA, Weaver Bruscemi LLC of Canonsburg, PA, Purnel And Libby LLC of Delray Beach, FL and Donald Emond of Taunton, MA.

Gingras picked up a second Super Final victory with

2-year-old pacing filly **Summer Charm**, who scored a 1:52.3 upset over division point leader Better Single and Quebec Blue Chip. Dave Menary trains the Bettors Delight—Love Of Art daughter for Thomas Dillon of Anson, ME.

Kadabra—Soutain Hanover daughter **Smoke And Mirrors** kicked off the \$1.8 million night with a 1:55.3 victory in the three-year-old trotting filly division, hitting the wire two and three-quarter lengths ahead of Superlative and Illusioneesta. Trevor Henry crafted the win for trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman and owners Melvin Hartman of Ottawa, David McDuffee of Delray Beach, FL and Little E LLC of New York, NY.

Forbidden Trade claimed the 2-year-old trotting colt and gelding crown with a 1:56.2 triumph over Southwind Avenger and Only For Justice. Bob McClure drove the Kadabra—Pure Ivory colt to the win for trainer Luc Blais and owner Determination of Montreal.

"When you got a season like that you want to win the final," said Blais, who trained the colt to a division leading four regular season victories. "That's a lot of pressure believe me, but it is an amazing feeling."


He sighed, "You're probably right. They're in the wrong place, in the wrong era. I hope they have more of a business plan that a love of rare books and enthusiasm."


He tapped his index finger on the red Harness Racing Guide for 1913 and said, "Most people don't realize that the year this book was published, old book collecting and rare

The Meadowlands returned from summer vacation with fall-like temperatures and eight divisions of the Kindergarten Classic for 2-year-olds Friday night.

Two teams stood out on a clear evening that saw temperatures in the mid-50s as Team Orange Crush (driver Andy and trainer Julie Miller) and the pairing of driver Tim Tetrick and trainer Linda Toscano each won two Kindergarten events on the program.

The Millers scored with a pair of trotters: In race four with colt No Drama Please (Trixton—Female Drama) in 1:54.3, who now has four wins in 11 starts after returning \$12.20 to her backers. Filly American Kronos (Donato Hanover—Glide About) won the sixth race in 1:57.1, upping her lifetime

record to five wins in six starts. She paid \$3.40 as the odds-on choice.

Tetrick and new Hall of Famer Toscano scored in the opener with filly pacer Alkippe (Sweet Lou—Capelo Rose), who stopped the clock in 1:53.4, paid \$4.40 as the post-time choice and upped her record to three wins in nine starts, with seven on-the-board finishes. Trotting filly Sister's Promise (Father Patrick—Amourato) won for the third time in seven tries in race five, scoring in 1:55.4 and returning \$5.40 as the second choice in the betting.

A LITTLE MORE: Andy Miller finished the night with four winners on the 10-race card after scoring five times earlier in the day at Freehold Raceway, giving him nine trips to the winner's circle over the course of his doubleheader. ... All-source wagering on the Big M card totaled \$1,569,887.

Youth Literary Derby crowns winners

October 6 was 'graduation day' for a quartet of young Ontario students as they stepped up to the podium at Woodbine Mohawk Park to receive accolades and prizes to receive accolades and prizes for their literary accomplishments in the \$2,000 Youth Literary Derby, sponsored by St. Catharines, ON horseman and construction magnate Tom Rankin.

The Youth Literary Derby, a province-wide juried, horse-themed contest designed to encourage literacy skills, challenged students' abilities to capture in prose, or verse, their impressions and perceptions of their up-close encounters with some of the 1,400 young standardbred foals born in Ontario in 2018.

The program offered categories for both poems and essays, with prizes divided among the top three finishers in each category. The same amounts are donated to the entrant's school, or library if the student is home schooled. The Youth Literary Derby attracted submissions from 46 Ontario communities.

October 6 proved to be a day to remember for the enthusiastic and talented young 12-year-old wordsmiths that were introduced to big time horse racing, and the people who make it all happen at Woodbine Racetrack and Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Following a tour of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame at Woodbine where they learned of the 250-year history of the sport and racing's greats that are enthroned there, they posed for photos with some of Canada's outstanding female race riders.

One of the highlights of the afternoon included time with Hall of Fame jockey Sandy Hawley, who gave each of the four winners personal instructions on how to correctly ride a horse. This was done on an equicisor (synthetic horse) in the jockey's room. The quartet also spent meaningful time with the announcer, with the stewards, and viewing the horses up close and personal in the Woodbine paddock.

The evening festivities got under way in a private suite overlooking the track and paddock at Woodbine Mohawk Park, and the four students were introduced to key representatives of the University of Guelph, Standardbred Canada, Ontario Equestrian Federation and the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

The award presentations, by Rankin, then followed.

"The contest is great for education in terms of encouraging literacy and the arts," Rankin said. "Giving kids the chance to be creative and who knows, there might be a budding poet, or writer."

As for the harness racing industry, Rankin thinks the Youth Literary Derby is an ideal way for introducing the sport to a wider audience.

The Derby award winners received a hefty bonus with free donated tuition for Horse Behaviour and Safety courses from the University of Guelph.

Maria Achilleos, a 12-year-old student at St. John Catholic French Immersion School in London Ontario carried off first prize in the Poetry Category; 12-year-old Kyla Civiero, a grade seven student at Our Lady of Mount Pleasant School in Carlisle, ON earned second prize, and Marilyn Schmidt, a 12-year-old student at the Amish Parochial School in Elmwood, Ontario took third prize.

First Prize in the Essay Category went to Andrew Kuepfer, a 12-year-old student who attends the Amish Parochial School in Elmwood, Ontario. Avery Kirkpatrick an11-year-old student at St. Joseph Catholic Elementary School in Bowmanville took home Second prize, and Allie Kucman, a student at the Peace Bridge Public School in Fort Erie walked away with third prize.

Both Andrew Kuepfer and Marilyn Schmidt, both award winners from the Amish community, did not attend the festivities.

The evening followed with the fourth race named in their honor, interviews on in-house television and visits to the announcers booth and judges stand, and cheering for their designated choices down close to the finish line. Unfortunately the students could not visit the horses and drivers in the Mohawk paddock. Youth under 16 years of age are not permitted in the Mohawk Paddock.

Young Avery Kirkpatrick, who was runner up in the Essay Category, summed up her thoughts on a day she will long remember. "I went to the races and met so many wonderful people who will inspire me for the rest of my life. Learning so much history on Standardbred and Thoroughbred racing was so much fun thanks to Ms. Rainey and the Hall of Fame. Spending time behind the scenes with female jockeys, and Sandy Hawley, hanging out with Robert Geller and seeing the horses was absolutely phenomenal. Meeting people who love and care about this industry was special. This was an opportunity of an lifetime to share my passion of horses and writing with other kids of my age."

"My favorite part of the day was watching the Standardbred racing at Mohawk and taking a picture with the winner", said Kyla Civiero, who was runner-up in the Poetry Category.

"My favorite part of the day was meeting the horses, especially one named Will Take Charge. – he was so calm and let me pet him and feed him mints out of my hand." Maria took home the gold. She was the winner of the Poetry Category.

Death by a thousands cuts

Great letter by HRU reader Jerry White in the October 7 edition (full story here). Hard to imagine the young people he encountered returning for more harness racing after they encountered all the little cuts (lies about post time, deception about odds, display errors on monitors) in such a short time. There are other little cuts bringing down the game. It is the abundance of bet types available on each race. The story is as old as the hills. Try to do something for everyone - and everyone loses. So often you are betting wrong. To wit: 1) You hit the exacta, but your other horses may finish third and/or fourth and you would have made so much more betting tris and supers. 2) You bet tris and/or supers and you miss the last position, when you could have made a nice score betting exactas. 3) You blow three consecutive exactas — but, ohmigod, look how big the pick-3 paid. 4) Don't tell me you forgot to make a win bet on that 10-1 shot you loved!

On many individual races you have the opportunity to bet: Win, Place, Show, Exacta, Trifecta, Superfecta, Pentafecta, Rolling Doubles, Rolling Pick-3. Then there are the pick-4, pick-5, pick-6, etc. There are literally TENS OF MILLIONS of different ways to bet your money, which all but guarantees that you did not make the best possible bet based on your handicapping analysis.

I am a fan of the so-called HORIZONTAL bets. That is, I believe it is easier to select potential winners then it is to figure what longshot will follow the winner home for second — especially in this day and age when COURTESY TUCKS makes trip handicapping very difficult. But multi-race wagers are churn killers. Some players will bet their entire bankroll on the pick-4. I know horizontal bettors who sit on their hands race after race as races are going off because all of their money is invested in "wait and see."

The number of betting opportunities MUST BE obliterated on each race. Naturally, which ever bets are removed, there will be plenty of "take away MY favorite bet and I'll never come back" just as there is the contingent of bettors who claim they won't bet if you start accurately portraying the correct minutes to post. In the real world we call these tough decisions. Like the song says:

Did you ever have to finally decide? And say yes to one and let the other one ride? here's so many changes and tears you must hide.

DID YOU EVER HAVE TO FINALLY DECIDE!

Yes, you must finally decide — if you ever hope to survive.

Responding to Goulazian's letter

I'm not sure what's in the water (inside joke PG), or perhaps the maple syrup, in Vermont, but the "thesis" stated in Pete Goulazian's letter is absurd. According to his "expert" at Dartmouth's Tuck School of Business, the odds of Manchego, Atlanta and Plunge Blue Chip drawing into the same division (of two splits of the filly Kentucky Futurity) are 700-1. This is absurd.

Three horses drawing into two divisions can **only** occur 4 ways:

DIVISION 1 DIVISION 2

0.3

1 2

2 1

30

No matter how you slice it, these are the ONLY four ways they can be split. As you can see, in half of the possibilities (2 of 4) there are two in 1 division, and only one in the other. In the other half (2 of 4), all 3 are all in the same race.

There will always be <u>at least</u> two in one race.

So the odds, regardless of if there are 8 horses per division (or 88), are EVEN.

Think of it this way: once horse A is drawn into her division (say the first one), the other two horses (B and C) can only be split two ways: both in same division (3-0), or split divisions(2-1).

If the first two (A and B) are drawn together, there only two options for horse C (same, 3-0; or split, 2-1)... again, even money.

In both cases, 50-50.

So the true odds are 1-1.

There will always be at least two in one race. And it makes sense that the third horse can either complete the trifecta, or race solo. Again, only two options, or even money.

I think the model may be figuring the odds that the three have post 1-2-3 in the same division. I will check with my son (an actuarial science/statistics major at UConn) to see what the odds are for that situation. That's above my pay grade.

In closing, I would like to see the "simulated model" and a copy of the diploma, if possible!

How Red Mile could be even better

The Red Mile certainly provided two weeks of great Grand Circuit action. Their entire team has much to be proud of. On TV we heard luminaries like Jeff Gural, Michelle Crawford and Tim Tetrick praise Red Mile racing as "historical" and the "highlight of the year." The late Sam McKee often said the same thing. However, I would like to make a few constructive suggestions to make the experience even better for racing fans and gamblers who are not lucky enough to be on site:

- 1. Can we somehow get some HD equipment for those special two weeks and not send out a 1975 quality picture, or at least get Trakus?
- 2. Can we go back to the old saddlecloth with one large number, not one smaller number for the race and another just twice the size for the horse's number? NYRA uses huge numbers, and the Meadowlands thankfully still uses separate saddlecloths for warm-ups. They do that for a reason: so the fans can see better. To not do so appears bush league.
- 3. Gabe does an excellent job with his race calls and Nick has a unique and pleasant mode of conducting post-race interviews. It is an insult to the interviewer, to the person being interviewed, and to the fans to switch from the video of the interview to a race replay video. Think about it: we are getting an interview with no picture and a race replay without sound. That violates every precept of TV Journalism 101. What's the rush? The most successful meets in the American racing industry, think Saratoga and Del Mar, have plenty of time between races. In my last conversation with Sam McKee, he agreed with me that the interview video should not be marginalized and that many harness tracks, including the Red Mile, WEG and the Meadowlands, need a few minutes more between races.
- 4. Someone has to start thinking from the fan/bettor perspective: Scott Zeron, my favorite driver, states to HRU in his elimination heat he "kind of let Plunge Blue Chip get up to me" and "didn't want to go to the well" with Atlanta. The money bet on the elims is real, right? Then in post-race comments in HRU we hear from Rick Zeron and Ake Svanstedt how they each credit winning their two respective finals with Atlanta and Six Pack to going barefoot, or pulling the horse's shoes. The trainers' strategy proved brilliant, but

how about Mr. Twobuck? We've heard such trainer comments after a few other big races this year. If many tracks have a video crawler that announces that a certain horse is going to wear a different headpole or that his hobbles are going to be let out an inch, I think it is scandalous that the change to "going barefoot" is not announced in advance to the betting public. It makes harness racing look like an insider's game.

I sincerely hope that a few executives at The Red Mile will carefully consider my constructive suggestions.

Restrict 2-year-old races

How can we even think what we do now helps our industry together be self-sustaining? I strongly believe we should restrict the number of races a 2-year-old can race. Sure tracks will put up enormous purses for a 2-year-olds, but if we restrict the number of starts then it's up to the owners and trainers to diligently map out the horses early career. Nothing is possible without the horse and we constantly because of greed or bragging rights go against what is physically possible for a young horse that every day is the unknown to them. This is where I have a huge problem with the industry and this is where I think is the root of the introduction of drugs in horse racing really is. Owners spend big money on yearlings that are well bred and they want a return on that investment so somewhere in that a 2-year-old season they realize that maybe they have nothing more than a race horse and they decide they need to squeeze the lemon dry because of the big purses and then the drugs become the norm and the horse more than likely has not had a chance to make that next step to maturity. We should remember, this is horse racing, not trainer, driver, or owner racing. Without the horse we have no industry. We have to be diligent in preserving a great industry.

Just checked the percentage of winning favorites at a number of harness tracks. We have a wagering product that is impossible to bet. Northfield leads the way with 49 per cent winning favorite result. Numerous other tracks are 40 percent plus. All of these make it difficult to place a 200-500 win wager without destroying the odds to ridiculous returns. I have no answer but at this rate, we are doomed. It seems to be a problem that so far is being completely ignored. Personally I have begun a transition to thoroughbreds as it is possible to make large win wagers WITHOUT significantly affecting the odds. Food for thought - a trend that makes it impossible to survive. — *Walter J. Andrasi / Middleburg Heights, OH*
