





# London sale tops \$7 million, but down from 2017

At the second annual London Selected Yearling Sale, which concluded Sunday, the average was down 8.1 per cent and the gross was off 6.3 per cent. Karma Seelster topped the second session with a bid of \$127,000 by Gregg McNair.

Last year, the second day of the inaugural London Selected Yearling Sale was the stronger of the two sessions. This year, it was the reverse. Sunday's session at the Metroland Media Agri-Plex facility at the Western Fair District in London, ON was the softer of the two days.

For the entire sale, 312 yearlings combined to gross



\$7,064,800 for an average of \$22,644. The gross was down 6.3 per cent from the \$7,536,000 fetched in 2017 when 306 yearlings sold.

"I don't think you can be disappointed with a gross of \$7 million," said sale manager Ann Straatman.

The average was off 8.1 per cent from the 2017 average of \$24,627, but Straatman pointed out some 30 yearlings sold at the end of the second session were initially scheduled to sell in the London Mixed Sale originally scheduled for Oct. 15, but were added to the yearling sale when the mixed sale was cancelled due to lack of entries.

On Sunday alone, 212 yearlings grossed \$4,194,800, total, for an average of \$19,787. The gross was down 17 per cent from the second session in 2017 when the gross was \$5,051,500. The average is down 24.8 per cent from a year ago when the average on day two was \$26,310.

By comparison, Saturday's opening session saw 100

yearlings gross \$2,870,000, an average of \$28,700. The average was up 31.7 per cent from the opening session average of \$21,793 fetched at the inaugural London Selected Yearling Sale in 2017 in which 114 yearlings were sold. This year's Day One gross was up 15.5 from last year's first-session gross of \$2,484,500.

The difference between this year and last? Straatman said last year horses were sold alphabetically by the dam's name and it just worked out that the first day was stronger than the second. This year, Straatman said she, "graded all of the horses by pedigree and conformation, as all sales managers do, and divided the top 200 scored horses between Day One and Day Two, so there was lots of pedigree on both days."

She further explained that since Saturday's opening session was kept to 100 horses so people could travel some two hours to Woodbine Mohawk Park for Saturday night's Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Final card, the fact that Sunday featured more than double the number of horses sold as compared to Saturday naturally meant Sunday's numbers were likely to be down.

"As a sale manager, you want to try to create momentum in the sale and have some top pedigrees towards the start of the sale and once those are sold then people move on, if they didn't buy them, to their second choice and then those horses have an opportunity to sell for big numbers as well. That was the intention. I know that the sale managers at Lexington and Harrisburg do exactly that, in trying to create momentum in the sale. Even though it's just a two-day (sale here), that was my intention as well," Straatman said.

The top-selling yearling from the opening session held up as the overall sale topper. Bill Donovan of Florida paid \$187,000 for Stonebridge Excel, a daughter of Muscle Mass out of Armbro Vanquish bred and consigned by Stonebridge

Farm of Arva, ON.

The highest-priced yearling on Day Two was Karma Seelster, a Sportswriter filly out of Kiddie Cocktail purchased for \$127,000 by trainer Gregg McNair of Guelph, ON. It was the third highest priced yearling in the sale. Karma Seelster was bred and sold by Seelster Farms of Lucan, ON.

"She was a very nice individual, it's a nice family, being a half sister to Kendall Seelster who is a sub-1:50, multiple-stakes winner. The 2-year-old, Kylie Seelster, has stepped up and was second in the Champlain and has some stake wins as well. It's a nice, current family, sired by Sportswriter, and, as an individual, she was nice," said Seelster's assistant farm manager Walter Parkinson. "Gregg actually trains Kylie Seelster, the half-sister 2-year-old."

McNair was the sale's leading buyer. He spent \$233,000 to buy four yearlings. Preferred Equine Canada, agent, was next with \$205,000 spent on 10 yearlings, followed by Mark Steacy who dropped \$199,000, total, on five yearlings.

Sunday's next highest priced yearling was Perseus Seelster, a Big Jim colt out of Pantecostal that sold to Gestion Mastel Inc. of Cambridge, ON for \$80,000 out of the Seelster consignment.

Seelster Farms was the leading consignor by gross with sales of \$1,928,000 for 52 yearlings sold, an average of \$35,055 that ranked them second behind the average of



\$43,333 achieved by Stonebridge Farm, which was third in gross with \$650,000 in sales from 15 yearlings. Preferred Equine Canada was second in gross with \$1,679,000 in total sales from 91 yearlings (\$18,458 average).

Seelster sold the second, third and fourth highest priced yearlings this year, and 10 of the top 20. It was just off the outstanding sale the farm had a year ago when it grossed \$2,283,988 from 49 yearlings and sold the seven highest-priced yearlings and 12 of the top 15.

"I'm happy," said Seelster farm manager Karen Favacho. "I'm

happy with how it went. I'm happy with where our yearlings are going, especially. I'm happy with the people that supported us and supported us in the past and came back and supported us again, so we must be doing something right."





# Closing the 'personality gap' with patrons builds on an interactive agenda

Racetrack management that supports liberal interaction with their customers won't only keep the "regulars" but will attract new patrons. That's what I was hawking last issue and in this issue I will make more suggestions on how to develop an interactive relationship, hoping that my ideas may somehow inspire members of racetrack administrations to move in the direction that eliminates the huge "personality gap" between them and their patrons.

Before I offer some possible procedures, here is a bit about the personality gap:

When I see how poorly raceway managements view their customers I realize it is not their fault as much as it is their nature. Business management personnel have not been trained in the "business" of betting on horses; they have been educated to run the theater where the audience comes to bet on horses. I do not feel I have to perform an intense modern survey or study through the ages in order to find this needle in a haystack. We can safely say that racetrack staff rarely includes the likes of their patrons. I have known many members of racetrack management and few to none of them ever made a wager on a horse race unless they had a feeling about playing a number — a birth date or an address or some number they hold sacred as their lucky one.

There is an ocean's depth of difference between racetrack employees and racetrack patrons.

Patrons play for pleasure and/or for profit. Some are people who have devoted countless hours to the chores of playing the horses. Some are graduated experts of play. Others are students of various degrees — freshmen, sophomores and juniors. They have little to nothing in common with those who run the joint and that is all right. But it is imperative that patrons are fully acknowledged so they know the management is on their side.

The first and foremost step toward setting up interactive programs is simple: let the public know the personality gap is gone, that management is as devoted to its patrons as its patrons are devoted to the racetrack they run. Advertising and public relations are tools best employed to penetrate the patrons' trust.

Slogans are important. Print scads of them for local distribution (in-house printing is inexpensive these days thanks to the digital gadgets you should already have in your offices). No special designs are necessary; the message in words is what counts. Here are some examples for local and on-line posting, using our usual fictional track name:

"Come bet at Delaney Downs because we're all in this together."

"Delaney serves bettors above all else."

Notice I dropped the "Downs" part of the track name because it conveniently personified the track. You should play with the title of your track so it sounds less like a business and more human. Be creative; make up a nickname for the track, et al.

"Delaney delivers dollars. Bet with us."

Yes, the word "with" because the more customers wager, the more the track makes. Delaney (and your track) is truly a partner and a partner is a friend and a friend wants a friend to do well.

Here is another good move to narrow the personality gap: As we have suggested in past columns, you should gather an in-house and on-line list of emails of people who play the races at your track. Don't wait until you have a "large" list, whatever number you feel is large, go ahead and contact everyone on the list with something special — a personal letter from the management. Keep it casual.

Example:

Dear Bettors,

Delaney welcomes our regulars and welcomes all newcomers to this season's racing programs. As always, we want you to profit from your plays and we are doing everything we know that may help you cash tickets.

Remember, our first and foremost objective is to help bettors win.

... And so on, directing the reader to various exclusive information (see past AA columns for some of these ideas) available on track and on line.

You want to become more like a union leader who is a member of the union and less like an elite, stuffy businessperson figure — the kind patrons on the apron imagine running the joint.

Don't worry, you are not surrendering your business stature, you are strengthening it with the respect you will get from patrons. Realize that such a relationship between management and patron in gaming establishments do not exist. Casino management is nowhere to be found when people are putting their money at risk. No less, there is not a person in a casino that does not deplore "The House," vis a vis, the management.

Pari-mutuel racetracks, though, can behave differently, feel differently and find ways to make patrons understand it is not in their interest to have patrons go broke.

## Warrawee Roo wins Harry Harvey for Determination

Had Warrawee Roo won the Dayton Trotting Derby, he may well have earned an invite to the International Trot. He ran out of racetrack in Ohio. He had no such issues at Yonkers.

Out early from the pole position, Warrawee Roo (Dan Dube, \$10.60) rolled from second-over Saturday afternoon (Oct. 13), winning Yonkers' \$250,000, mile-and-a-quarter Harry Harvey Invitational Trot.

In Secret (George Brennan) made the first lead, giving up the baton to 31-1 Gruden (Tim Tetrick) right after a :28.1 opening quarter-mile. At the back of the 10-horse bus were misbehavers Guardian Angel AS (Matt Kakaley) and Sortie (Trond Smedshammer).

Gruden continued through a 57-second half and 1:27 three-quarters, with Yes Mickey (Jason Bartlett) plugging away first-over. Warrawee Roo was behind that one, with 11-10 favorite Homicide Hunter (Brian Sears) third-over, the World's Fastest Trotter having started in the second tier.

Warrawee Roo then went wide at 1:56 mile marker, hooking Gruden soon after. Top Flight Angel (Andy Miller), the 2017 Yonkers Trot winner, had extricated himself from the cones and wound up behind Warrawee Roo, who disposed of Gruden, then held sway, defeating Top Flight Angel by three-quarters of a length in 2:25.2 for the added distance. Gruden held third, with the lass N F Happenstance (Jack Parker Jr.) and Yes Mickey settling for the minors.

A never-firing Homicide Hunter, In Secret, DW's NY Yank (Yannick Gingras), Guardian Angel AS and Sortie rounded out the order.

## McWicked wins \$250,000 Dan Rooney invitational pace

It wasn't a fair fight.

Odds-on choice McWicked (Brian Sears, \$2.90) dusted his foes Saturday afternoon (Oct. 13), winning Yonkers Raceway's \$250,000 Dan Rooney Invitational Pace.

The race was supposed to be a small-oval slap fight between McWicked — back here for the first time since the 2017 George Morton Levy Memorial Pacing Series—Bit of a Legend N (Jordan Stratton) and locally-debuting Lazarus N. Well, Bit of Legend N couldn't match strides and Lazarus N was scratched-sick, so McWicked was left without a meaningful play date.

Undaunted, he did as he figured to do.

Away third behind Nuclear Dragon (Tim Tetrick) and Mach it So (Jason Bartlett) — the former's early intervals of :27 and :55.3 — McWicked, from post position No. 2, left the cones and threw down a :27.1 third quarter (1:22.4).

He opened four lengths in and out of the final turn before winning be that same margin in 1:50.4. Bit of a Legend N was second-choice/second-best, with Evenin' of Pleasure (Joe Bongiorno) third. Mach it So and Endeavor (Trace Tetrick)

"I figured I'd come first up," Sears said. "I thought he was the best and could get it done that way and it worked out. He's showed up every week and always put out a really great effort.

"He'll do it any way you want and he's all racehorse. He's just a pleasure to be around and a pleasure to drive It was nice to get it done today."

In a span of about 81 minutes, Sears won the million-dollar International Trot with 30-1 Cruzado Dela Noche ("It's awesome. To win the signature race here, you don't get that many opportunities. I think this is the fourth time I've been in it, but to win it, it's quite a thrill.") and this 250-large invite.
