This weekend, trainer Jay Hochstetler and partners Finkelberg Racing LLC and South Of The Tracks Rac Inc. will be living the dream when they send out Ponda Warrior in a Breeders Crown elimination for sophomore pacing colts. The son of Rockin Image—Sweetnsinful enters Saturday's (Oct. 22) eighth race, the first of two \$25,000 divisions, fresh off a 1:49.2 score in the \$250,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final on Friday (Oct. 14) at Harrah's Hoosier Park. A finish of fifth or better will advance the pacer to next week's \$675,000 final.

"This is the dream. This is why I wanted to do this. If I wanted to just go make money, I'd go find some job that was a lot less stressful than this," said the conditioner and co-owner. "The reason we do this is because we want to experience the highs. The highs of going to the Breeders Crown is almost as high as you can get; the only thing higher is winning it."

Hochstetler ships north to Woodbine Mohawk Park with a colt he had hoped to point to the Crown last season. As a freshman, Ponda Warrior won a pair of Indiana Sires Stakes divisions and

finished second in two more. Unfortunately, the pacer finished last in the Super Final and the connections decided otherwise.

"I was going to take him at 2 until he kind of got roughed up in the final and didn't finish very well. We said, 'Well, let's shut him down and make sure he's good for next year," he said. "I kind of always had it on the schedule this year and then he had a bad month."


The path to a Super Final victory, let alone the Breeders Crown, was a challenge to navigate for the 29-year-old horseman and his pupil. The 3-year-old impressed early, finishing first or second in each of his first six seasonal starts, including a sires stakes divisional win. Shipping to Northfield for the Milstein, Ponda Warrior managed a sixth (1:50.3) in a race Bythemissal dominated with a 1:48.4 effort.

"He started out on fire and he put in a couple consistent efforts after that. For a little while, JK Victory had his number for a bit, but he was still racing well," Hochstetler said. "I took him to Northfield and he got a really tough trip there. He raced great, but he got a tough trip."

Returning to Indiana, Ponda Warrior paced second in an Indiana Sires Stakes contest for regular driver Jimmy Whittemore, before struggling through races where he finished fifth, seventh and sixth.

"After that he drew bad one time, then he was sick for one start, so he didn't race very good. He made a little break behind the gate that we still don't know why he did that. So we just kind of had unfortunate circumstances for about a month there," said Hochstetler.

It was not the way any horseman would want to enter the program's biggest night. Drawing post eight in the field of 10, the connections enlisted Dexter Dunn to pilot Ponda Warrior in the Super Final. When the gate folded on the night's 14th race, Dunn found a position along the rail in fifth through a :53.1 opening half. He pulled the 10-1 third choice from the pylons shortly after and advanced to second to challenge favored Soaring Now out of the last turn before bolting clear of the field to win by more than three lengths. The victory was the biggest to date for Hochstetler, and punched Ponda Warrior's ticket to the Breeders Crown.

"He came to the final and I thought he was as good and healthy and as sound as I could have possibly made him, and it worked out perfect. He finally showed what I thought he was the whole year," Hochstetler said. "Before the final we said that if he wins or puts in a monstrous second-place effort, we'll go. Low and behold, that's what we got. We got a really solid win that made it a no brainer."

Hochstetler, the son of Connie and Homer Hochstetler, and grandson of Hall of Famer Doug Ackerman, gets his first crack at the Breeders Crown with a horse to which he has a special connection. Ponda Warrior is the second foal from American Ideal mare Sweetnsinful, a pacer that the trainer and his father conditioned in New York. The mare won 15 times in 57 career starts and earned nearly \$400,000 on the track.

"She was the hardest-trying horse I had ever dealt with in my life. She had every excuse to not race well, or not even race, because she had so many physical issues. She would just go to the gate and it was like nothing else mattered," Hochstetler said, comparing the colt and his dam. "He doesn't have those issues that she did, but he's super easy to drive like she was. You could leave the gate a thousand or you could take back to last, he lets you do whatever you want, so did she. He likes to win, obviously, and so did she."

Bred by Pond-A-Acres, Hochstetler purchased the colt for

\$37,000 out of the 2020 Hoosier Classic Sale. Now a winner of \$355,600, Ponda Warrior has drawn the outside post in his Crown elimination, an eight-horse field. Scott Zeron is listed to drive.

"Nobody wants the eight hole. Obviously, you want to be as inside as you can. But it's only an eight-horse field. We just need to beat a couple to get into the final. If he races like he did last week, I think he'll be fine. It will work itself out. If he's good enough, he'll get there," Hochstetler said.

Breeders Crown to provide clarity in freshman and sophomore divisions

It's not often you can make the argument that the Breeders Crown can impact divisional considerations for every single 2- and 3-year-old division, but that is the case this year. Even for horses that have remained comfortably atop their divisions through much of the year and will control their own destiny heading into the Breeders Crown eliminations, things can change quickly over the next two weeks.

2-YEAR-OLD MALE PACER

The two most accomplished, thus far, in this division are Stockade Seelster and Save America, and both drew post 10's in their respective eliminations. Stockade Seelster bounced back from his lone anomaly loss in his Metro elimination to beat Save America off a pocket trip in the Metro final. He's yet to leave Canada and looking at his remaining schedule won't do so. Both an O'Brien and Dan Patch award hang in the balance.

Save America shows two tough losses in a row entering the Breeders Crown, but prior to that stormed through signature events north of the border including the Nassagaweya, Champlain and a Metro elimination. You'd have to think that if either he or Stockade Seelster were to win the Crown, they'd be in the driver seat for year-end honors.

Combustion burst onto the scene recently with a 1:49.3 win at Lexington in his International Stallion Stakes division. It will be interesting to see if he can keep it going for Pelling. Both he and Save America are nominated for stakes following the Breeders Crown, including the Governor's Cup and Matron. Like

Combustion, Confederate also enters off a super-fast mile at Lexington. Tip Top Cat warrants a note as a recent big money purchase; makes first start for Burke. Mamba makes his first start in his Crown elimination following his upset over Save America.

2-YEAR-OLD FEMALE PACER

With Twin B Joe Fresh (1:48.4) shut down for the season following another stellar win in the International Stallion Stakes, Sylvia Hanover could be in control of her own destiny in the Breeders

Crown. Sylvia Hanover enters the Breeders Crown with a 6-for-7 record including wins in her last five,

most recently sweeping the elimination and

final of the She's A Great Lady. She's currently ranked a couple of notches below Twin B Joe Fresh in the current Hambletonian/Breeders Crown top 10 poll, but that could change with a Breeders Crown win.

Strong Poison sports a 1:49.3 mark taken from a KY Championship Series race five back, and all her recent second-place finishes have come only at the hands of Twin B Joe Fresh. She seems capable of giving Sylvia Hanover a run for her money and is also staked to the Three Diamonds to close out the year if



additional consideration is later needed. Charleston sports an impressive 7-5-2-0 record and will get another shot at Sylvia.

2-YEAR-OLD MALE TROTTER

Oh Well was ultra-impressive in winning the Mohawk Million and looks to now parlay that into two straight wins in Canada after an impressive summer at the Meadowlands. A Breeders Crown win would further solidify his top status. Kilmister elected to take a bye into the final having won the Peter Haughton earlier this season and he too would be able to stake claim to the division's top billing with a win. Wellwood-winner Winners Bet also rates a shot; and this trio of horses are all eligible to the Valley Victory in November should there be any unsettled business.

2-YEAR-OLD FEMALE TROTTER

Righteous Resolve has been all the rave in these parts for much of the season, and she'll get a chance to cap off a dream freshman season next week, having elected a bye to her Breeders Crown final. Having set a Champlain stakes record in September, she elected to sit out the Mohawk Million, a race she likely would have been favored in against colts.

Instagram Model is the other filly who elected a bye and will bring a 5-for-6 record into the Crown final. Trainer Stoebe was quoted earlier this year as saying that the two main targets this year for Instagram Model was the Jim Doherty Memorial (mission accomplished) and the Breeders Crown; a win in the latter could make things interesting. Not to be overlooked, Special Way also enters the Breeders Crown with five wins a row, the most recent a win the International Stallion Stakes and has beaten fellow Crown entrant Walner Payton three times in row; greatly flattered when that rival came back to crush foes next out in the Bluegrass.

3-YEAR-OLD MALE PACER

With Beach Glass out of the Breeders Crown following surgery to repair a trapped epiglottis following his fourth-place finish in the Bluegrass, it leaves Bythemissal in the driver's seat of the division. A winner of the Adios, Milstein, the Little Brown Jug as well runner-up in the Hempt (Beach Glass), a Breeders Crown as a supplement win would cap off quite a journey that started not too long ago. With it would come not only divisional honors, but potentially a shot at Bulldog Hanover in the TVG Pace. Not without a shot in his own right, Pebble Beach finally found his way back to the winner's circle in the Tattersalls Pace following five straight second-place finishes prior. It seems like ages ago at this point, but he kicked off the 3-year-old major stakes season with a win in the Pepsi North America Cup. Between those two signature races as well as a

Breeders Crown win would be a worthy resume for Dan Patch award consideration. Bythemissal and Pebble Beach are also both Matron-eligible.

3-YEAR-OLD FEMALE PACER

It's hard to believe, but despite missing almost the entire season, last year's 2-year-old champion Niki Hill suddenly leads the way once again amongst the sophomore pacing fillies. Returning in September after being sidelined since an injury in May from just one seasonal start at that time, she came back to win convincingly in the Bluegrass and Glen Garnsey Memorial races at the Red Mile over the same fillies that have highlighted the division to date. Even in limited starts, a win in the Breeders Crown would make her worthy of a repeat Dan Patch winner.

Max Contract was third to Niki Hill last out in the Glen Garnsey and she went on a tear earlier this season when she won the Mistletoe Shalee, Tompkins-Geers and the Shady Daisy consecutively; has come a long way this season and she'd warrant strong consideration if she could pull off the Breeders Crown upset. Boudoir Hanover leads this group in seasonal earnings and her highlight is a 1:48.3 win in the Nadia Lobell; main rival to Niki. Just as she did last year, the Ohio-bred Sea Silk has had another strong year.

3-YEAR-OLD MALE TROTTER

This has been one of the wider open divisions throughout the year, but Rebuff did himself a tremendous service last out when he stormed down the lane to win the Kentucky Futurity and in the process returned to his best early season form. Unfortunately, due to recent sickness he won't have a chance to defend his Breeders Crown win from last year, but he may currently be the one to knock off at the top of the division, even while missing this year's event. Between the Futurity, a division of the Dancer, a Hambletonian elimination win and a national season's mark of 1:49.3, he would probably win the division's Dan Patch if voting were today. Who stands to move ahead if they win the Breeders Crown? That would be Cool Papa Bell. He's since proved that his Hambletonian heroics were not a fluke, and he was closing in similar fashion to Rebuff in the Futurity. He's also won the NYSS Final (again at double digit odds), the Langley at Hoosier and while there's no moral victories, he made up a ton of ground in the Beal after breaking early. A Crown win to go along with the Hambletonian may be good enough.

best 3-year-old trotter, period. Another Breeders Crown win just as she did last year would obviously solidify her worthy standing, but a couple others are on her heels.

Jiggy Jog drew into the other elimination, away from Joviality. Provided they meet up in the final – and if Jiggy Jog were to win – she'd have a case to leapfrog Joviality. These two just met up in the Filly Futurity where Jiggy Jog used the tactical advantage to get the jump on Joviality and keep her at bay; she also beat her in their Hambletonian elimination. In turn, Joviality has beaten her too, and it ups the ante for their looming showdown in the Breeders Crown. I'll admit, with those two fillies battling it out with the colts at times, Fashion Schooner has seemed totally overlooked despite being nearly perfect this year. She's taken a different route by racing almost exclusively at the Meadowlands for much of the summer, but the Hambletonian Oaks champion did beat Jiggy Jog when they met up in the NJ Classic in September. She'd be just as deserving as any for the Dan Patch if she were to win the Breeders Crown.

3-YEAR-OLD FEMALE TROTTER

Joviality has reigned supreme for much of the year as not only being regarded as the best filly in this division, but being the

38 Crown facts for its 38th year

In honor of the 38th year for the Breeders Crown, let's take a look at 38 Crown facts, with emphasis on last year's event.

- **1.** Always B Miki had three freshmen division winners in his first two crops Perfect Sting, Monte Miki and Niki Hill.
- **2.** Jujubee supplemented in the 3YOCT and won the richest ever Crown purse for that division (\$650,000).
- **3.** Eight of 12 Breeders Crown races were decided by a neck or less. This marked the first time that eight photos were required in the Crown finals in any year.
- **4.** From 2014-2019 in the Breeders Crown, 72 races were held and just seven (9 per cent) were decided by a photo.
- **5.** Only Tim Tetrick hit the board in 2021 in the Breeders Crown with a better than 100-1 shot. In Range was third at 117.60-1.
- **6.** Photo King? Brian Brown was on the shorter end of the famous 2015 Jug nose with Lost For Words to Wiggle It Jiggleit. Last year, he got beat another nose in the Crown to Monte Miki with Gulf Shores in the 2YOCP.
- **7.** Art Major, the only sire in the 21st century with two Horse of the Year credits (2014 and 2021), himself won the Breeders Crown twice (2002-2003). His daughter, and last year's 3YOFP Crown champ Test Of Faith, will look to win this year's older mare pace.
- **8.** This year marks 12 years since the all-in-one-night format was first tried at Pocono.
- **9.** "Hall" sires. Nineteen trotting Breeders Crowns have been won by a "Hall" horse sired by either Cantab Hall (8), Andover Hall (4), Angus Hall (3), Conway Hall (2) or Broadway Hall (2).
- **10.** Canada has played host to 159 Breeders Crown races. New Jersey alone has had 127, with 104 at the Meadowlands 104. Thirty-one tracks have played host at least one.

- **11.** If you are wagering on the 3YOCT division, consider that five of the last six winners had a sire who also won this same division. Father Patrick with Amigo Volo in 2020, Chapter Seven in 2019 with Gimpanzee, and Muscle Hill three times in the last half dozen years with Tactical Landing (2018), What The Hill (2017) and Bar Hopping (2017).
- **12.** There have been 442 Breeders Crown races and 501 Triple Crown races in history. In the year 2033 they will catch up and be even.
- **13.** Moving Pictures came into focus only at the top of the stretch in 2007 in the older pacing mare division for Casie Coleman and Mark MacDonald. It was a rare last-to-

first sweep in a Breeders Crown event. When will we see it again?

- **14.** Atlanta had a Breeders Crown breakthrough in 2022. Winning it again would be a great way to go out.
- **15.** John Campbell's 31-year first-to-last Breeders Crown reign (1984-2015) won't be challenged for some time. He's got a decade on the runner-up David Miller (2000-2021).
- **16.** This is the 20th anniversary of Fools Goal's win in the richest Crown race ever held (\$1,075,000).
- **17.** Arch Madness and Fools Goal are the only two at \$800G and a tick more in Breeders Crown earnings in series history.
- **18.** The 1984 to present Trotter of the Year has won the Breeders Crown the same year 22 of 38 times. The number is 23 for 38 on the pacing side.
- **19.** In the 2021 3YOFP Breeders Crown final, the top four across the wire had the outside four posts: Test Of Faith-Scarlett Hanover-Free Start Hanover and Blue Diamond Eyes. Posts 8, 10, 9 and 7, respectively.
- **20.** Scott Zeron missed 70 days this year due to injury, but is back. Last year, he had a 68-1 shot finish second in the older trot with Back Of The Neck. The year before, he had a \$409 Breeders Crown winner at Hoosier Park the al;-time highest win price.
- **21.** Bill Weaver's name will appear on the 2YOCT Trophy from now on. His Valley Victory at age 2 won the Breeders Crown in 1988 and completely changed the trotting breed.
- **22.** Charlie Keller has added \$10,000 to the mare trot Crown winners take as of this year. The man whose farm bred Fresh Yankee, the 1970 HOY and first North American bred to surpass \$1 million lifetime.
- **23.** Too bad we never saw these in the Breeders Crown past the age of 2: Broadway Hall, Dream Of Joy, Western Shooter, Valley Victory, Walner and Monte Miki.
- **24.** Not all stars shine in the Crown as sires. Presidential Ball was 15 0-4-0, Real Artist 20 0-5-2, American Winner 13 0-2-1, Donerail 28 0-5-3 and S Js Caviar 17 0-2-0.

- 25. Fifty-eight horses have won multiple Breeders Crowns.
- **26.** Joe O'Brien died the week before the Breeders Crown debuted in the fall of 1984.
- **27.** No family squabble here. In 1991, Rose Guida was 2-for-2 in the Crown. Her husband Lou Guida was 3-for-3 in 1993.
- **28.** The 1985 Mohawk debut of the Breeders Crown had a handle of \$1,424,255, attendance of 10,054, on Oct. 25.
- **29.** The fastest fractions in the Breeders Crown have not been lowered in 18 years mainly because of the summertime weather when Crown events were often held at the Meadowlands: :25.1 Mini Me 2003 third, :52.1 Royal Mattjesty DH2 2004 and 1:19.3 Royal Mattjesty again in 2004 DH2.
- **30.** On the trotting side, the record fractions are: :26 H P Paque sixth 2003, :54.3 Intimidate eighth 2013 and Silver Springs the same half 2004 seventh and 1:22.1 Intimidate eighth 2013.
- **31.** Nine of 12 favorites in the 2021 Breeders Crown were odds on, less than even money. Five won.
- **32.** This is the 20th anniversary year of Linda Toscano's Molly Can Do It's win the mare pace in 2002. It was Toscano's seventh try in the Breeders Crown and her prior best finish was second in 1995 with Giant Mermaid.
- **33.** Stienam in 1985 was Buddy Gilmour's lone Breeders Crown win. In 1992, Winkys Goal won the 2YOFT and that was Cat Manzi's lone Breeders Crown win.
- **34.** Popcorn Penny, who did not race at 2, was a supplement to the 2000 3YOFP for Team Anderson. Twenty-year-old Ryan Anderson remains the youngest to win a Breeders Crown race, edging Musical Dreamer on the wire.

Ryder sends four into tonight's Crown eliminations

Chris Ryder knows he will have at least one Breeders
Crown finalist — returning champion Niki Hill in the event
for 3-year-old female pacers, which did not require eliminations
— and will look to add four more horses to his total in tonight's
(Oct. 21) elims for 2-year-olds at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Ryder, who has trained five Breeders Crown winners in his career, will send out three well-regarded hopefuls in female trotter Walner Payton (3-1 on the morning line), male pacer Handlelikeaporsche (3-1), and female pacer Proud Mary (6-1) plus a "sleeper" in male pacer Goldin Greatness (15-1).

All eliminations for 2-year-olds will be contested tonight (Oct. 21) at Mohawk, with the action beginning at 7 p.m. (EDT). Breeders Crown elims for horses ages 3 and up will be held Saturday, also starting at 7.

Walner Payton heads to her elimination off a career-best 1:52.2 win in a division of the International Stallion Stakes at

Lexington's Red Mile on Oct. 8. Her time was the third fastest of the season by a 2-year-old trotter and second among fillies.

For the year, Walner Payton has three wins, four seconds and a third in 10 starts. She won the New Jersey Sire Stakes championship in July and finished second to Special Way in the Kentucky Championship Series final in September. The loss was one of four consecutive runner-up finishes behind Special Way in Lexington.

"She's as honest as the day is long," Ryder said about Walner Payton, who has earned \$368,650 this season. "She's a pretty good filly. Special Way kept drawing inside of us and we just couldn't get her. But it's all good."

Walner Payton, by Walner out of Lonely Lady, was purchased under the name Singeth With Joy for \$510,000 at last fall's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Owner Ken Jacobs renamed the filly after a great-granddaughter.

"They get excited when they see her race," Jacobs said. "We're just having fun. She's a nice little filly."

Walner Payton and driver Dexter Dunn will start tonight's single \$25,000 elimination for 2-year-old female trotters from post three. Special Way, trained and driven by Ake Svanstedt, is the 7-5 morning-line favorite, leaving from post five. The top-eight finishers will join bye recipients Instagram Model and Righteous Resolve in the final.



All finals for 2-year-olds will be Oct. 28 at Mohawk and have a purse of \$600,000.

Handlelikeaporsche competes in the second of two \$25,000 eliminations for male pacers. The son of Lazarus N—The Signature has finished no worse than second in six career starts, winning three. He heads to his elim off back-to-back Grand Circuit victories at the Red Mile and will start tonight from post six with Dunn in the sulky.

"Dexter likes him; he has a lot of good things to say about him," said Ryder, who owns the colt with William Ezzo, Robert Mondillo, and Barry Spak. "He's an easy keeper, has got good speed, and his racing manners are pretty good. He always gets himself in the race. There is nothing not to like about him."

Handlelikeaporsche, who finished second in both the New Jersey Sire Stakes championship and New Jersey Classic Series 'A' final, was purchased for \$100,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale. He has earned \$228,850.

Metro Pace and Ontario Sire Stakes champ Stockade Seelster is the 5-2 favorite in Handlelikeaporsche's elimination. He will start from post 10 with Jody Jamieson driving for trainer Ian Moore.

The 5-2 favorite in the first elim is Kentucky Championship Series winner Confederate, who will leave from post six with Tim Tetrick at the lines for trainer Brian Brown. Ryder's Goldin Greatness starts from post nine with Dunn driving.

Goldin Greatness has a win in the Kindergarten Classic Series in eight starts this season. The son of Huntsville—Bet On

Hill finished third in his most recent outing, a division of the International Stallion. Goldin Greatness was fifth on the inside, got shuffled back to eighth at three-quarters, and found room in the stretch with a four-wide move to miss by 1-1/4 lengths. His: 26 last quarter was bettered by only one horse on the day's 10-race card.

"That's my sleeper," Ryder said. "That's all I'm going to say."

Goldin Greatness was purchased for \$80,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale and is owned by Ryder, Ezzo, Evan Katz, and Joe Sbrocco & JAF Racing.

Proud Mary, a daughter of Sweet Lou-Tug River Princess, races in the first of two \$25,000 eliminations for female pacers. She was a two-time winner on the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes circuit and finished third in the final. She last raced on Sept. 24, finishing fifth in the She's A Great Lady at Mohawk.

"I don't think it's a negative," Ryder said of her respite. "She trained super. We'll hope for the best."

Tim Tetrick will drive Proud Mary, starting from post one, for owner/breeders Let It Ride Stables and Bottom Line Racing. The filly has hit the board in six of eight races and earned \$133,154 this year.

She's A Great Lady winner Sylvia Hanover is the 7-5 favorite in the elim, starting from post four. Bob McClure will be in the sulky for trainer Shawn Steacy. Grand Circuit winner Strong Poison is the 9-5 favorite in the other elim, with Yannick Gingras driving from post eight for trainer Ron Burke.

When The Meadowlands returns with live harness racing on Nov. 4, people will be spottin' Otten a lot more.

Jessica Otten, 25, has been promoted from Meadowlands' marketing coordinator/on air personality to TV host and Fox Sports show host.

"There's nothing more that I like to do than promote from within," said Big M chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "To listen to Dave Brower and what he had to say about her – and Dave Little as well – and the other people around her, I think that this is a natural next step for Jessica.

"And I thought about the chemistry between her and Dave [Little] and I think that it will be a success. Everything takes a little bit of time, but overall, I think that Jessica and Dave will match really well on the desk. That's a lot of what TV is, it's the chemistry of the people that are on the desk and in the field. And I think that Jessica did a wonderful job when she was on the desk and Dave does a great job and I'm looking forward to seeing their chemistry together."

Otten's new title is well deserved considering how hard she has worked and successful she has been since arriving at The Meadowlands in late 2018. In fact, the U.S. Harness Writers



Association honored her for fine work with the 2021 Barasch Breakthrough award, but it's not lost on her that the timing of her promotion is connected to sadness.

"Something horrible happened for this to happen and it's hard for me to grasp that," said Otten of the untimely passing of Big M TV host Brower. "When we weren't racing, I still talked to him once or twice a week and when we were racing, we were exchanging emails and phone calls and text messages. He wasn't only a mentor; he was a very good friend. He was like family. He always checked on me.

"When I moved to the east coast, I moved by myself. I didn't really know anybody other than who I worked with, aside from a couple of horsemen. And he really took me under his wing when I moved here to make sure I was okay."

Everyone in The Meadowlands family is still **mourning the loss** of Brower, 53, who died only two weeks ago.

"It's never easy when you lose somebody like Dave. Not only as a friend and colleague but as a person that was obviously so well loved in the industry and was so very talented at what he did on air," said Settlemoir. "He worked his passion and that was horse racing and TV."

Otten was in Lexington shooting features for the Fox Breeders Crown shows when she heard about Brower, who was also in Lexington at the time of his death from natural causes.

"When I was at the Red Mile having to fill in for him, I think that was the hardest part," said Otten, who did the pregame show and onset interviews in Brower's stead. "Sitting there doing what he was supposed to be doing, not because he wasn't there because he didn't feel good, but because he was never coming back.

"I have no idea how I kept my composure in Lexington. I think the first day I was still numb. I was on the phone with my mom and I said I can't do this. And she said 'Yes you can. Dave wouldn't want anybody else.' It was weird, but I know he's proud of me."

According to Little, what made he and Brower the top team in the business was that they had different strengths and knew how to bring out the best in each other.

"In time, I believe it will be the same with Jessica," said Little. "Just like Dave, but maybe even more so, she knows a lot about the horse and its equipment, which is not my strength.

"Going in, I didn't know what the "Dave and Dave" show would be, but I felt it would be good. I feel the exact same way about my partnership with Jessica. She is knowledgeable, professional and I'm excited for what this new show will become."

All agree that the first shows could be difficult when Brower's absence will be fully felt.

"The only thing I've been thinking about is how are we all supposed to go back to work and act like everything is, okay?" said Otten, who expects tears to be shed on both opening night and at Brower's Celebration of Life service on Nov. 12. "It's not. I'm sure it's going to be tough. It'll be kind of taking me back to February when my grandma passed away.

"I'll do my damnedest to make him proud sitting in his chair but I never want people to think that I'm there to replace him."

London Classic Yearling Sale concludes with record average and an incredible gross of \$6.6 million

The average of \$35,682 was almost as notable as a gross that was \$350,000 higher than the last in-person sale in London despite 105 fewer horses being sold.

The inaugural London Classic Yearling Sale was a smash by most measures, but this figure stands out: the gross of \$6,637,000 was higher than the most recent in-person London sale gross of \$6,285,000 in 2019 — even with 105 *fewer* horses being sold this year.

"I'm just really elated with the numbers that we had and I am kind of surprised that they were as strong as they were," said first-year sale manager Greg Blanchard.

The two-day sale concluded Wednesday (Oct. 19) at the Western Fair Agriplex in London, ON.

Prior to this year, the auction was called the London Selected Yearling Sale and it was operated by a consortium of Ontario breeders. The new incarnation is owned and operated by the Western Fair Association. The London Virtual Yearling Sale was online only in both 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This year's sale grossed \$6,637,000 for 186 yearlings. The average of \$35,682 is a record going back to 2017 when the sale debuted as the London Selected Yearling Sale. This year's average is up 65 per cent from \$21,598 in 2019, up 58 per cent from \$22,644 in 2018 and up 45 per cent from \$24,627 in 2017.

"The only real comparatives that we had were the last in-person sales in 2018 and 2019. Again, I was confident coming in, but it was nice to see that that confidence was justified," Blanchard said.

"I think we were really able to capitalize on the return of an in-person sale. After two years of not being able to host one in person, and now returning here – as a new sales company — with that absence, I think there was a natural excitement. I think people really supported us... I really want to thank everyone for the support, from our team to the consignors to the buyers, of course. It was a success, to say the least, so I couldn't be happier."

Even in comparison to the last two years when the sale was online only, this year's auction was up 20 per cent from the 2021 average of \$29,842 and up 10 per cent from the 2020 virtual average of \$32,480.

Seelster farm manager Karen Favacho with Hip 162 Sonar Seelster, an Alarm Detector filly out of Simone Hall that sold for \$50,000. Seelster led all consignors in gross (\$1,963,035) and average (\$53,055) for 37 yearlings sold.

Gross is difficult to compare to recent years due to fluctuating numbers of horses selling. This year, 186 yearlings sold compared to 146 a year ago and 102 in 2020. Comparing to the last three in-person auctions in London in 2019, 2018 and 2019, this year's number of yearlings was down by 105, 126 and 120, respectively.

"The field, the crowd, the results, the pulse, the gross... for the first live sale since the pandemic, I think it was very successful," said Preferred Equine's David Reid, who sold the most yearlings (51) over two days. "From a Preferred point of view, I thought the sale was very good. I think most of my customers were all satisfied with the sale. I thought the sale was well-attended and I thought it was a very healthy marketplace over the two days.

"People were happy to attend a live auction. I thought the audience was terrific and I think the marketplace was extremely fair."

Preferred was the second leading consignor by gross (\$1,397,196). Seelster Farms topped the list with total sales of \$1,963,035 for 37 yearlings sold. Seelster's average of \$53,055

was also the highest for consignors followed by Century Spring Farm (\$41,273), Erinwood Equine Inc. (\$39,211) and Dean and Ashley Wilson (\$36,286), who were the third leading consignors by gross (\$1,270,010).

"Part of the feedback that I got over the two days was about the atmosphere," Blanchard said. "People really enjoyed it and they thought there was a lot of buzz in the air. That was fantastic and it was as much of a great social gathering as it was a horse sale. That's kind of what we were going for. We want to create a sale that people want to attend in person every year and to enjoy the venue and enjoy seeing all their colleagues in the industry and being able to enjoy the city of London at the same time. It was nice to get that feedback, as well as seeing the performance of the sale itself."

The change this year to a Tuesday-Wednesday sale rather than the traditional weekend sale sessions, likely helped drive business, Blanchard said.

"I'd like to think so, because that was our intent. I felt that there was a better opportunity for people to take a couple of days and come down with a weekday format versus the traditional weekend format. Traditionally, the Saturday would land on Super Final night, so you had a lot of people leaving later in that session to get to Mohawk, whether it be owners, trainers, drivers.

"I think we saw more of those people sticking around and staying for both days, which is what we wanted. I felt like having the sale after the Super Final was great because you've got the Super Finals fresh in everyone's mind and you've got key updates to certain yearlings coming in and, frankly, you've got some owners that have a little bit more money in their pocket to spend. I really felt like that would work well and I think it did."

Eight yearlings were sold for \$100,000 or more — six on Tuesday and two more on Wednesday.

On Wednesday, the session-topper was **Hip 118 Masstercraft**, a Muscle Mass colt out of Pretty Crafty purchased by Steve Colvin of Hanover, ON from the Dean and Ashley Wilson consignment for \$110,000.

Hip 104 Northern Looker, a Muscle Mass colt out of Shestheonetowatch, sold for \$105,000 to Charalambos Christoforou from the Erinwood Equine consignment.

The five highest-priced yearlings for the sale all sold on day one:

Topping the sale was **Hip 38 Heist Seelster**, a Resolve colt out of Hollywood Beauty that sold for \$165,000 to Gestion Zane of Laval, QC from the Seelster Farms consignment. Seelster also sold the second-highest yearling of the day — **Hip 73 Liege Seelster**, a Bettors Delight colt out of Los Angeles that was purchased by Mac Nichol of Burlington, ON for \$125,000.

Dean and Ashley Wilson consigned the next two highest-priced yearlings. **Hip 77 Munchie Muscles**, a Muscle Mass colt out of Lady Bling, sold for \$122,000 to Gregg McNair of Guelph. Anthony Haughan, agent, from Cambridge bought **Hip 69 Muscone**, a Muscle Mass filly out of Jangone for \$110,000.





Buyers reported they were happy about the return of an in-person auction this year. The COVID-19 pandemic forced the sale online only in 2020 and 2021.

Hip 84 Salem Seelster, a Muscle Mass filly out of Speak Of The Devil, also sold for \$110,000. She was purchased by Determination Stable of Montreal from the Seelster consignment.

The final six-figure yearling was **Hip 96 Century Komodo**, a Bettors Delight colt out of Michelons Filly purchased by Scott McEneny of Waterdown, ON from Century Springs Farm for \$100,000.

Five of the eight highest-priced yearlings sold were offspring of Muscle Mass, who was second among stallions in average at \$66,368 for 18 sold. Resolve was the leading sire by average at \$73,600 for five sold. Bettors Delight was the leading pacing stallion, average \$49,765 for 17 sold.

Trotting colts were in the highest demand. By gender and gait, the sale broke down as follows:

Trotting colts: \$52,310 for 31 sold Trotting fillies: \$39,444 for 28 Pacing colts: \$33,114 for 71 Pacing fillies: \$29,035 for 57

"Something I was really happy with was the production, the live-stream production," Blanchard said of the feed produced by Curtis MacDonald's Cujo Entertainment. "Curtis, I work closely with him (on COSA-TV broadcasts) so I was fully confident that he could do something excellent for us and I'm really happy with what he delivered."

As for what he learned in his first year running a horse sale, Blanchard said it wasn't one big thing, it was many small things.

"I think what I learned most was just how much goes into putting on a sale and the months and months of preparation with all the different steps, the different timelines that you have to hit. So, it was a daunting task and I probably didn't know what I was getting myself into, to be honest. But again, I had tremendous support. I know (previous sale manager) Ann Straatman and her team were fantastic to help us and passing along information that they knew would be helpful to us and being there from time to time when we needed to consult them and get some help on things," Blanchard said.

"Also, the support of the consignors along the way. A lot of them understood that it was a new sales company, but they were happy that we were stepping up to take it on and really were quite supportive all the way leading up to the sale and during the sale. So, to see them all do well was really rewarding for us as well."

Blanchard said the sale is a good fit with the Western Fair Association's other offerings.

"We're an Agricultural Society and we have strong ties to the horse racing industry in operating the racetrack, so it was nice to be able to step in and conduct the yearling sale in what, we feel, is the nicest facility anywhere in Canada... The fact that it fit our mandate, and the fact that it supports an industry that we're so closely aligned with, we just thought that it made sense and we're committed to doing it for a long time."

The buzz is deafening already for next year's inaugural \$2.1 million TAB Eureka

The world's richest harness race has made its mark, 11 months before it's held for the first time.

The \$A2.1 million TAB Eureka – Australia's first harness slot race – will be contest at Club Menangle in Sydney on Sept. 2, next year.

But the hype and anticipation is already huge.

The TAB Eureka was developed by Harness Racing Australian CEO Andrew Kelly, who had the unwavering and vital support of the HRA executive. That support was critical through strong early criticism.

Kelly and his executive are now living the dream mantra they planted when the race was first mooted.

"This is not a one-off big event, the success of the TAB Eureka will be built around being talked about 24 hours a day, seven days a week and 365 days a year," Kelly has said from day one.

He's not one to boast, but no doubt Kelly is already sitting back and taking a moment to say, "We've nailed it so far."

What happened to stamp the Eureka so far out from its inaugural edition?

Where do we start?

A few weeks back, the 10 inaugural slot holders were decided and announced, and they had to stump-up \$A300,000 – that's \$100,000 a year for the first three years to secure their slot.

HRA was oversubscribed with applications for slots and had to cull to land on the final 10.

Vitally, they represent every harness racing state in Australia – another mantra of Kelly and the success of the race.

Just as importantly, the slot holders represent such a diverse cross-section of industry participants – owners, breeders, sponsors, participants.





That is a pleasant surprise when you consider there seemed to be almost as many against the Eureka concept as there were for it when it was first touted. The main beef was how a significant part of the funding came from a stallion levy. Some vocal breeders exploded.

But the storm has subsided and the reasoning for the race and the broader, bigger picture upsides become clearer.

Let's focus on one major thing. One of the key factors behind the success of Australia's globally huge thoroughbred racing industry is how "we" make our own stallions. Victory in races like the Caulfield Guineas, Coolmore Stud Classic, along with more recent additions like the Everest and Golden Rose can increase the value of a colt by 10-fold or more.

Sure, international stallions play a big role, but more and more it's the "domestic" stallions who run the show Down Under.

It's a very different story in Aussie harness racing (and NZ for that matter) where the top 16 – yes 16 – stallions on the current leading stallions list are from the northern hemisphere.

That is unsustainable.

In the Aussie thoroughbred world, an army of big spenders go to the yearling sale trying to buy a colt with a view to making a stallion.

As the stallion premiership table shows, that's not an option in Aussie harness, but the Eureka will help turn that around.

Leviathan Aussie owner-breeders Rob Watson, of Soho Standardbreds, went very publicly against many of his breeding brethren and was outspoken in his support for the Eureka way back when it was first mooted. He put his money where his mouth is and bought a slot.

"How could you not be part of this?" he said. "It's the best and most exciting thing to happen in the game here in my time in it.

"I've been screaming out for innovation, for efforts to make the sport great again, to build a race we all want to be part of and want to win. It's taken a long time, but it's here. The Eureka is that race.

"I jumped at the chance to grab a slot. Now I've got three years of doing the form and trading to try and get the right horse to run in my slot and for massive prize money. It's fantastic."

But Watson also sees the stallion-making argument.

"Hell yes. That's huge. In fact, without it, what future do we have? We can't keep sending all the money we work hard to make as an industry overseas to the stallion owners," he said.

"We simply must make some of our own stallions and some of the top ones, too. "We've planted the seed in the past couple of years with Soho Tribeca, Ride High, Poster Boy and the list goes on... They're getting their chance to be success stories at stallions, but the Eureka can become our stallion-making race."

You see, that's why Kelly and HRA restricted the Eureka to only Australian-bred 3- and 4-year-old pacers.

It didn't please everybody, but the mandate is clear... build and promote the Aussie breeding industry. Give people a reason to go to the standardbred yearlings sales and try to buy a future stallion – like they do in the thoroughbreds.

But there are more layers to why the TAB Eureka has already made its mark and in a big way.

Two of the most exciting young pacers in the land have had their entire racing campaigns over the next year built around trying to win the Eureka.

Leap To Fame is the hottest pacing property in Australia. He became the first pacer since Captain Joy back in 2009 to win the big three Derbys – NSW, Queensland and Victoria – when he romped home and smashed the clock in the recent Group 1 Victoria Derby.

His billionaire owner Kevin Seymour immediately changed plans after the race.

"Now we change everything to focus on the Eureka," he said. "We're going to bypass the Breeders Crown and only go to the Breeders Challenge then spell him.

"We won't bring him back for the Chariots Of Fire or Miracle Mile early next year. Instead, he'll have longer out and we will bring him back for the Queensland Winter Carnival and then go down (to Sydney) for the Eureka. It's THE race we want to win next year."

Top Victorian trainer Andy Gath has a similar approach with his young gun, Catch A Wave.

"We sat down a couple of weeks back and looked ahead to the Eureka and then worked our way back from there as far as what races to set him for and how to shape his next 12 months," he said.

"We're missing the Breeders Crown as well. He'll come back for the Vicbred series over Xmas/New Year, then we'll take him to Sydney for the Chariots Of Fire.

"The main reason for going to the Chariots is to give him a trip away and some racing experience around Menangle because that's where the Eureka will be run."

As a kid, you would always look forward to Christmas. As an Aussie harness fan, the TAB Eureka is now the sport's Christmas.







Cinema standardbred: a plot to promote the sport of harness racing - Part 6

Alternative Actions (AA) continues its series developed to offer the solution that has the best chance to change the nature of the film industry's ambivalence towards harness racing and perhaps inspire someone to pioneer a project that could be the most successful promotional tool standardbred racing ever utilized.

The process of "re-imagining" a classic tale for the purposes of a screenplay is not academic; in fact, it spews creative opportunities, leaving the author with countless possibilities. Even though the process is ruled by a premise, the execution does not insist using the original's particulars.

My example of re-imagining Mary Shelley's "Frankenstein" with a harness racing "atmosphere" sounds silly at first, but beyond my loyalty to the premise ("vanity leads to self-destruction"), I won't be held accountable for my re-imagined decisions. Nor will the intended setting be a plant, per se. The harness-racing element and the other elements of strong storytelling are the author's to devise.

And so the process begins:

I decide to incorporate specific elements of Mary's tale to benefit my screenplay, though it won't take place in 1800s' Great Britain; the time is the present. As in the book, my main character is a male and narrates the story. To start, his adult voice-over monologues are heard over a series of scenes from his youth, where he lives on in a large home situated in a rich, ideal rustic in New York State (my choice). His wealthy parents strongly encourage him to have a future worthy of his heritage and so he feels entitled to such a life.

It is a good setup so far and already I have done a lot of work on my screenplay. Look what I know by trusting my source and my re-imagining. The main character is a male; he is the narrator; early scenes provide exposition (relevant background explanations) about social status and parental influences from where his vanity develops.

Sound familiar? Duh, it's "Frankenstein."

As an important benefit of this process, consider a great accomplishment: The re-imagining process eliminates the academic torture of working on an "outline." In my experiences, no greater burden is placed upon an author than to be strapped with the weight of writing an outline. I still curse writing teachers for making "the outline" an obligation--and it was that way before I became aware of the re-imagining tools. Believe me, your reimagined source is enough. An outline robs the author of magnificent experiences like creating characters that — due to the premise and source's inspiration — do not betray their literary roles in action or dialogue.

Wait, you may be saying, what about harness racing and Frankenstein? There's the setting; remember where the narrator



grows up? The New York countryside, like on a kind of spread where people breed animals, more specifically for our purposes, horses. The possibilities are exorbitant. For your play, pick a place, any place, as I did. But where exactly? It's time to name a place.

This is one more reason I adore writing fiction. You could name characters and places to make your play richer. Take the assignment of naming people, places and things by having them reflect knowledge of your source. You must be clever, though, else it cheapens your material.

Here is how I found a name for my untitled screenplay, now in progress:

Shelley wrote the novel in Switzerland, where a lot of it takes place. But I won't call the setting Switzerland. Instead, my source research helps me create a brilliant name, derived from the Old Norse word "swedan," meaning "to burn." Lightning burns; lightning is God's property, which was stolen in Shelley's re-imagining of the Prometheus story. Thus, I call my rural setting Sweburn, NY.

Following through, I discover the Greek equal to the name Prometheus is Dionysius, so my main character's first name becomes Dion. And how about I make that the family name and his given name Percy (Mary's poet husband's name) or Pierce (as in Ron). You get the idea.

A generic audience does not read the screenplay of a film and won't pick up on the depth of our name creating game but trust me: take whatever time it takes you to do it this way. The results subconsciously strengthen the story and professional script readers may catch on, which only helps the integrity of the play, and makes the writer's work impressive.

The process so far, in my opinion, mocks the academic approach; writing a screenplay goes from being a tedious chore to a delightful recreation that is challenging, demanding creative input.

The process ensues in the next part of the series when we create "dynamic characters" and situations and present how harness racing can work for any re-imagined screenplay.

Dan Noble surpasses \$50 million milestone

Driver Dan Noble not only scored a triple on Thursday's (Oct. 19) racing program but further reached a major career milestone at Hollywood Gaming at Dayton Raceway. On his first mount of the night, Noble surpassed \$50 million in career earnings.

Noble came into the card only needing \$431 to reach the milestone. With his first drive of the night in race two, Noble guided Iwokeuplikethis to a fourth-place finish and secured the achievement. Iwokeuplikethis, a 3-year-old filly by Pet Rock, is trained by Kim Dailey.

Noble's driving career began in 1996 with a single matinee start. His first purse win came in 1999 aboard Dr Elbon at his hometown fair in Xenia, Ohio. Dr Elbon, a gelded son of Nobleland Sam, was trained by Noble's father.

Noble's harness racing career was destined from the beginning. Both his grandfather, Sam Noble Jr., and his father, Hall of Famer Sam "Chip" Noble III were successful drivers. Their passion passed onto Dan and his sister, Meredith, who once frequented the ladies' driving series. The Noble family has since produced four generations of harness drivers with Dan's 19-year-old son, Koltin, also following in their footsteps.

Today, Noble is currently the leading dash winningest driver at Dayton Raceway. Boasting a .271 Universal Driver Rating (UDRS), Noble is listed among the top drivers in North America by both wins and earnings.

Throughout his career, the 39-year-old has driven 37,874 starts with 6,823 wins, 5,329 second-place finishes and 4,580 third-place finishes. His best year to date was 2018 when he bankrolled \$5,284,322 in seasonal earnings. In 2011, Noble also tallied 773 victories and maintained a 415 UDRS to earn the North American dash champion title.
