Incredible Crown accomplishments

A look at some of the best trainer and driver achievements in Breeders Crown history.

Let's take a deeper look at some of the incredible driver and trainer achievements in Breeders Crown history. First, the trainers:

- There have been four trainers that have earned more than \$1 million in a single Breeders Crown year. They are: Jimmy Takter (four times), Ron Burke (3), Tony Alagna (1) and Nancy Takter (1).
- In 2014, Ron Burke set the record for Crown starts in a single year: 26 2-4-4, \$1,354,500. Burke also has the second highest total with 20 in 2020 and a record of 1-0-6 that year.
- Bulldog Hanover's trainer Jack Darling has not won a Breeders Crown, He is 0-for-12.
- Scott McEneny won the 2YOCP Breeders Crown in 2000 with Bettors Delight. In 2019, Nancy Takter won the 2019 2YOCP Breeders Crown with Tall Dark Stranger. Both McEneny and Takter wound up third that year in Crown earnings.
- Oh brother! Two brothers landed in the top 10 in the 1997 Breeders Crown series. Alan Riegle was fifth and Bruce Riegle eighth. Both won their only Crown start that year. Alan with Take Flight 2YOFP and Bruce with Stienams Place 3YOFP.



- The three busiest trainers in 2021 were a combined 1-for-33. Nifty Norman was 1-for-10, Burke was 0-for-10 and Alagna was 0-for-13.
- Gary Machiz is the only trainer to lead in money at the end of a year in the Breeders Crown with just one starter —1999 Tyberwood (\$420,860).
- Leading money-winning trainers in the Breeders Crown series came from the following countries: USA (17), Sweden (11), Canada (5), Norway (3) and New Zealand (2)
- Marcus Melander at four years currently holds the longest active streak in winning a Breeders Crown.
- Burke is 11 finals short of tying Jimmy Takter's all-time mark of 197.

Harness Racing Update

- Brett Pelling can tie Chuck Sylvester for fourth place if he can win his 13th Crown in 2022.
- Joe Holloway if he wins a Crown, can be the quickest to double digit Crown wins lifetime. His record is: 44 9-5-7. Bob McIntosh holds the record with 48 starts to reach double digit wins.

DRIVERS

- The three best Crown single seasons by earnings were turned in by: John Campbell (2001), \$1,684,292, Brian Sears (2005), \$1,647,026 and Tim Tetrick (2012) \$1,627,400.
- Campbell (1989-1993) and Sears (2005-2009) are the only two drivers to lead five straight Crown seasons.
- David Miller's 2015 season of five driving wins in the Breeders Crown is the all-time best. But, his earnings total that year is only 19th best all-time among single seasons: \$1,123,575.
- In 2013, top five money-winning drivers in North America won all 12 Crowns at Pocono: Ron Pierce 11 3-3-0, Tetrick 11 3-0-3, Yannick Gingras 11 3-1-1, David Miller 9 2-2-1 and Sears 9 1-1-1.
- Dexter Dunn and Andy McCarthy have been the Crown leaders the last three seasons with a combined 59 13-5-7. McCarthy's.650 UDRS in 2019 is the all-time best in the Breeders Crown and he's the only driver to win four Crowns in any year with fewer than eight drives (7). Dunn has led the past two years. Todd McCarthy was 7 0-0-1 in 2021 in his debut year. (third with Allywag Hanover at 2-5 in the open pace).

- Right place, right time. In 2011, during the snowstorm that kept many drivers from getting to Woodbine, Dave Palone was the top money-winning driver at 9 2-2-0, \$916,250.
- Three times a driver has landed in the top 5 in money at the end of a Breeders Crown year with just one drive. Jeff Mallet in 1984, Herve Filion in 1985 and Tom Harmer and Clint Galbraith in 1987. Yet, 35 years later, it has not happened again.
- Jimmy Morrill, Jr. has a quiet Crown bio of 45 3-5-4, but he did drive the fastest ever Crown winner, Won The West who stopped the clock in 1:47 in 2009.
- These seven drivers raced just once in the Breeders Crown but wound up in the winner's circle: Giampaolo Minnucci (Varenne in 2001), Jeff Mallet (Dragons Lair in 1984), Dan Noble (Ocean Rock in 2021), Italo Tamborino (Incredible Abe in 1994), Ted Jacobs (Eager Seelster in 1994), Kelly Sheppard (Swing Back in 1993) and Orjan Kihlstrom (Commander Crowe in 2014).
- Fourteen times a driver has made the top five in Crown earnings without winning a race, but only John Campbell has led at year's end doing so 1999 11 0-3-2, \$761,161.
- Only Dunn (.383) and Gingras (.309) are over .300 among the top 20 drivers by Crown earnings.



Freddie Hudson literally was raised in the shadow of what numerous people believe to have been harness racing's greatest track, Roosevelt Raceway. To quote Freddie, "Roosevelt wasn't only a racetrack, it was a way of life. Everybody knew everyone else. We raced against one another. We socialized among ourselves. Unfortunately that all has been lost with loss of the backstretches at most of today's racetracks."

You've been around horses all of your life. Tell me about it.



WILLIAM HUDSON — Born July 14, 1915 in Salisbury Md. Lives in Paulsboro, N. J. Widely regarded as on of America's leading catch drivers. First drove at Yon kers Raceway in 1951 and has been a regular West chester driver ever since. Mounts won \$93,942 in 1961 \$145,940 in '60.

Hudson's medium-sized stable won 21 races at Yon kers last year. In 1958, Hudson achieved signal success at Yonkers with the Adios trotter, Jackie Eden, which he rejuvenated and drove into the winner's circle eight times.

Some fast Hudson winners have been Mayor Joe, Nat's Son, Miss Abbestone, Muzzy, Poplar Perry, and Spunky Hanover among others.

"I guess that I have been one of the lucky ones. I was able to take part in what most people consider the two greatest eras in the history of our sport. I grew up when Roosevelt Raceway was the greatest harness track in all the world. I often think about what could have been. By that I mean if those four demons had not seized control of Roosevelt and in my opinion purposely ran it into ruination in order to be able to be able to gain personally by selling it for real estate development. That era was followed by the opening of The Meadowlands and for its first 20 years or so being the greatest harness track on God's great earth. All the great horses, the greatest stables, the

greatest drivers came there. There was never a track quite like it. I doubt that there ever again will be one comparable."

Freddie Hudson on sweet memories of Roosevelt and harness racing's troubled future

When asked to name the first of the catch drivers, most people with knowledge of the subject would likely name the diminutive Hughie Bell.

At about the same time as Bell, there was another excellent driver whose name was Billy Hudson. Those two, together with Jimmy Jordan, were the three whose names would usually pop up on the far-from-frequent times when trainers would entrust their horses to men who did not also train them. The thought then was that in order to drive a horse one would need to also "know" it. Today it is not infrequent that when a driver first sits behind a horse it is the very first time he has had anything to do with said steed. Of course, it may be likely that he has perhaps discussed the horse with its trainer, but usually not much beyond that. Back then, it would have been unheard of for the driver to not have warmed the horse up prior to the race. Moreover, he would know its trainer and likely know the horse and its habits. That was the era in which Freddie Hudson, Billy's son grew up.

Let's begin with Roosevelt. What are some of your remembrances?

"It was a racetrack like no other. It was beautiful and incredibly well run. George Morton Levy invented nighttime harness racing and is called the father of modern-day harness racing. Just about all the great horses and horsemen would compete on what I considered to be its hallowed grounds. It wasn't only a racetrack in the sense that most people today might look upon — that is a place to come to and bet on horses. It was more than that, much more. It was a great place to come to socialize and to see and be seen. There were few places on Long Island more glamorous than having dinner at its glamorous Cloud Casino on a Saturday evening. Through the '50s and '60s my dad was regarded as one of the sport's top catch drivers and had one of the largest and most successful stables on the grounds. Then on an October night in 1963 it all came crashing down. There was a horrible barn fire in our stable. Dad was training 21 horses, 15 of them perished in the fire. It was the type of situation that takes forever, if ever, from which to recover. My dad was able to build his stable back up, but he never acquired the same class of stock that was lost in the fire.

"Throughout my youth I worked around the stables I did an apprenticeship with Joe O'Brien and George Phalen. It was a rare weekend or school holiday when I wasn't there. During the summers when I was in my mid-teens my dad would send me up to Monticello with five or six head that needed education. During the Superfecta Trial I took 12 horses up to Monticello Raceway for Billy Mitchele and I did pretty well with them. I left Mitchele and took a one-horse stable to Roosevelt Raceway. The horse was owned by Tony Basillio the owner of the Mimmo's Italian Restaurant that was directly across the street from Roosevelt. While on the track one day I am chatting with Del Insko and in that conversation he hired me as a trainer, and I then had my one horse stable join his. I worked for Del for four years from 1974 to 1977. It was there that I met Joe and Vinnie Barbera, owners in Del's stable and, incidentally, uncles of Dr. J. Bridgette Jablonsky the vice president and manager of Hanover Shoe Farms. I am still friends with them to this day. Incidentally, after I left Del and had my own stable, Joe's son Sammy, now a world-renowned cardiologist, came to work for me as a groom and assistant trainer. He was the very best groom I've ever known.

"I often look back on those Roosevelt days and think of what could have been. If not for those opportunist villains, I visualize Roosevelt as becoming the most successful racino in the world. You know what they say about ifs, buts and maybes. I will add that my childhood friends from Roosevelt Raceway, Billy Haughton and CeCe Levy, are still friends today."

Then you moved across the river to The Meadowlands?

"When The Meadowlands opened in 1976, Del sent me over there with 33 head. Including a couple for Stan Banks and Daryl Busse. We then hired my dad as a second trainer and second driver. When the Meadowlands first opened, several of the New York stables split their stables and set up satellite operations in New Jersey. It wasn't unusual for the best drivers to maintain a presence in both places. There were also some who would

send just one or a very few of their horses to me to, in effect, babysit. I remember one evening where I had three horses from three separate stables to race in one race. They finished 1-2-3."

From The Meadowlands what transpired?

"After I left Del I established my own stable training horses for Dave and Ruth Goldstein, the Barberas and I had all of the Nammsor horses. Some point along the way I started wintering in Pinehurst and Sam Fava started sending me his babies (about 10 or 12 a year) where I would break and prep them for their racing careers."

Who were the greatest drivers that you've seen through the years?

"There were so many. From Hughie Bell to Del, Buddy, Herve, Carmine, Chappy, to the present where guys like Brian Sears, Timmy Tetrick, David Miller, Yannick Gingras, George Brennan, and of course the Down Under invasion of Dexter Dunn and the McCarthy brothers. I'm sure I've left out some, perhaps many. To them I apologize."

What is it that keeps you occupied these days?

"I run a weekly podcast where myself, Bob Marks and Trade Martin interview horse racing personages in numerous areas of horsedom. I am the CEO of the U.S Harness Racing Alumni. In DC we lobby on multiple bills including HISA, The Safe Act, Sports Betting and several other equine related bills. I also publish a monthly periodical which I hope covers all areas of interest relating to horses. I am an advisor to several owners; I am assisting Greg Peck with the management of his stable and I am a spokesperson for the Standardbred Retirement Foundation. We, along with Jeff Gural, John Campbell, Steve Stewart, Andy Cohen, Jason Settlemoir, Gordon Banks and Linda Toscano, act as the bridge between our sport and HISA."



66 (Roosevelt) was a racetrack like no other. It was beautiful and incredibly well run. George Morton Levy invented nighttime harness racing and is called the father of modern-day harness racing. Just about all the great horses and horsemen would compete on what I considered to be its hallowed grounds. It wasn't only a racetrack in the sense that most people today might look upon — that is a place to come to and bet on horses. It was more than that, much more, It was a great place to come to socialize and to see and be seen. There were few places on Long Island more glamorous than having dinner at its glamorous Cloud Casino on a Saturday evening

You brought up HISA. What about it?

"As its presently constituted it isn't perfect, but it is very much needed. As it moves along, it will gradually grow to the point where it confronts many of our sports problems. Unfortunately, our sport's governing body, the USTA, have chosen, instead of working together with them to iron out our differences, to instead, bring suit against them, thus precluding the possibility of the two organizations working together with common goals of cleaning up our sport from the druggists and of placing

more emphasis on the care and welfare of our horses. I am hearing through my sources here in Washington that another round of arrests are not far away. These would have happened sooner if not for COVID and its aftereffects. As the FBI has stated, this investigation has never been closed. It is an on-going investigation. As stated above, we communicate with HISA and try to work in the best interests of our sport."

The best horses you've seen?

"Trotters: Muscle Hill. We will never know how great he might have become if he wasn't retired after his 3-year-old season. Forget that he was never pushed as fast as he could go. Everything he did was accomplished with relative ease.

"Pacers: Niatross. My idea of what a great racehorse is. He took on all comers at all tracks at all times."

What do you see as harness racing's greatest problems?

"Four main ones:

- "1. Nobody knows who we are. I've sat in on numerous equine organization meetings. Very few people know that we even exist. It's pretty difficult to get improvements when people have no idea of what they are improving.
- "2. Drugs, drugs and drugs. We have found that drug testing just doesn't work. The chemists are ahead of the testing, often way ahead. It's pretty difficult to test for drugs which you don't know exist. The FBI has found that the best way to get rid of some of the miscreants is to follow them and pick up the threads of their evil deeds. The recent arrests have close to 100 per cent conviction rates. That was accomplished with not a single one based on the results of drug testing.
- "3. The absence of youth participation in the sport. The entity that solves this will earn the everlasting gratitude of all involved in this wonderful sport.
- "4. The leadership of our sport has to drastically change the status quo. We have to show the outside public that we are against the drugging of our horses, abusing them and then discarding them. Anyone who does so needs to be run out of the sport."

Dr. Jennifer Stowe Veterinarian

As a little girl growing up in a small town in Michigan, Dr. Jennifer Stowe was always obsessed with horses. Spending as much time in the barn so she could be around the majestic animal, her parents indulged their daughter with riding lessons in hopes she would tire of it and grow out of the "horse phase" that a lot of little girls go through — but Stowe never did.

"It was when I was in high school that I decided to pursue a career as a veterinarian. I always was fascinated with medicine and science, so it just made sense to pursue that pathway," Stowe said. "After graduating from high school, Jen attended Michigan State University: both undergraduate and veterinary school.

"After graduating I did a year-long internship at Mid-Atlantic Equine in New Jersey, before making the move to Lexington, Kentucky.

"I began working for Dr. John Cummins nine years ago, splitting my time between Lexington, Kentucky in the summer months and work at the South Florida training centers in the winter."

Choosing to focus mostly on standardbreds, Stowe has had the pleasure to work on some of the sports most famous athletes, such as McWicked, When Dovescry, Stay Hungry, Atlanta, Captain Corey, and Betting Line.

"Probably one of my most absolute favorites is Ramona Hill. She is just a classy filly full of heart," Stowe said.

Although being a veterinarian could be extremely fulfilling, there are times when it can be heart wrenching — like when you have to put one down.

"I think the hardest thing I have had to do as a veterinarian is euthanizing one that has broke down. Thankfully, this is extremely rare, but nonetheless, it never gets any easier.

"Standardbreds are athletes in a demanding sport. I think general soreness is the most common ailment I see — due to the fact the horse trains and races quite frequently — much more so than with thoroughbreds, who race less frequently.

"The times standardbreds are going today are unreal. There are many that go sub-1.50 - a time that was rarely seen in the past.

"I think the breeding is producing faster young horses. They are much more refined than the 'jugheads' of old. I believe only time will tell if these young fast horses that are being produced will race as long as their predecessors did.

"I've also worked on racing thoroughbreds and my opinion on the difference between the two breeds is thoroughbreds are much more fragile compared to our standardbreds. A little soreness our standardbreds may have, most of them can deal with, but with a thoroughbred it could cause a catastrophic breakdown.

"Today, there are many more horses racing while they are either breeding mares or mares are racing in foal, than ever before."

Her opinion on this subject:

"On the mare side, I don't think racing a mare while she is in foal is in any way harmful or beneficial. I don't recommend breeding stallions while racing, as I do believe it can affect their attitude.

"As far as gelding yearlings versus keeping them intact, I believe the majority of these colts will not be breeding stallions, so keeping a young horse a stallion on the off chance he will become a superstar has never made much sense to me. A good stallion will be a wonderful gelding. I think it's an easier life to be a gelding."

With the future of our sport in question, Stowe thinks Kentucky is in great shape.

"In Kentucky, harness racing is booming. The purses are great and the racing has never been better. Horse racing is a big business in Kentucky. It always was and always will be. It has a very strong following in the community with continued support from the public and private sectors and the future looks bright.

"With mind blowing performances that are seen today — such as the great Bulldog Hanover's — Although I have not yet had the pleasure to work on this phenomenon, I think that freaks of nature such as the Bulldog are born, not made."

Veterinarians are so important in the sport of horse racing and today there are more female vets than ever before. These superstars have to be able to deal with the downs, as well as the many ups they encounter on a daily basis.

In Stowe's case, she competes in show jumping with her warmblood gelding, Gordo, and also breeds Gordon setters. When you see her at the barn you'll most likely see her loyal sidekick, Moose /aka "The Boss," who supervises all veterinary care, and competes in bird dog field trials.







After the storm

Introducing a goat into the stall of a high-strung racehorse can have a calming effect on the horse. In days of yore, dastardly racing competitors would sneak into the horse stall and remove the goat before a big race in hopes of upsetting the horse's performance. Ergo, the phrases, we got your goat or getting one's goat.

Having a harness racing footprint in Florida was a comforting goat. Sadly, our goat is gone, leaving us upset and unnerved. At every step of the harness racing cycle – selection of a stallion, insemination of a broodmare, pregnancy, birth of a foal, training, stakes racing, selling, purchasing, and wagering, we have a moment where we ask ourselves, what if the storms arrive in my backyard? What happens if the sport is no longer feasible? Do we wave goodbye? Will there be a semblance of racing with wealthy harness racing hobbyists?

Many of us in our sport harbor dreams of self-sufficiency. Now that Florida is a non-racing state, my fevered mind believes Florida is open for national experimentation. Aided and abetted by other non-racing southeastern states, Florida may offer the best path to lay the framework for a different future.

The question is simple: without pari-mutuel gambling, could a model be conceived that would entice people to breed, buy, and race in what is, at present, a non-gambling environment? Would participants in this brave new racing world accept racing for what will primarily be their own money and, hopefully, state subsidies from agriculture and tourism to supplement the purse structure?

At this point, many of you will believe that harness horse racing is impossible without gambling money and casino dependency. You may be correct.

Still, somehow, someway, no matter the political and economic future, there will remain a stubborn core of people with resources who find great joy in the challenge of raising a racehorse and the sight of a young trotter rounding the final turn. These diehards will need a refuge if storms sweep away the game as we know it. Building such a shelter will be challenging, but we have intelligent, inventive, and constructive members in our ranks.

Foresight on a national scale, never a great attribute of harness horse racing, should be attempted. Everyone who loves the game could assist in ways big and small in a project for our future.

Consider these preliminary thoughts as an insurance policy, a summer home, a fun project, or simply a supplement to the regular racing season for hardcore owners who loathe the long winters. Just as wealthy people keep winter condos in Florida or have a boat waiting in the Gulf of Mexico, passionate players in harness racing could have a horse or two down south to visit and race.

Without financial crutches, a Florida racing project will be challenging. The money will be less, the initial programs will be modest, and who knows where the road will lead? But we will need places to follow our equine dreams. Beating this drum segues into a loose blueprint. The gist of the idea is to create a Florida stake racing program.

The twist for this suggestion is to push everything in this new state racing program back a few months to avoid conflict with other state programs and take advantage of the weather. What about bringing in three or four stallions for a Florida breeding season beginning in June?

The experimenters/operators/dreamers could limit the first crop to a single gait and try to create an original pool of at least 100 foals. Opening the breeding program to other southeastern states might be helpful. Raise a crop for an eventual yearling sale in January or February, followed by a winter racing season the following November, December, January and February.

The new program would have a minimum of six guaranteed races (five legs and a final) and consolation races. It would offer palatable purses and perhaps stakes racing as a 4yo. Make the pitch fun and fiscally tempting.

This proposal has a bit of an "If you build it, they will come" vibe. The question is, of course, who would build and spearhead such a Florida venture? The answer is unknown, but the breeding industry leaders in our sport tend to contain several forward thinkers, and some of our sharpest minds reside in Florida. We may have members looking for innovative projects and new business models.

Do you believe a state stakes program in Florida, a program that does not conflict with our current programs, is viable? Do you think resurrecting racing in one of our most populous states is worthwhile? Do you imagine a shelter from the storm is of value? Would having an existing stake program in Florida help with future legislation? Do you believe running towards a windmill like Don Quixote is more exhilarating than keeping your head down and hoping for the best?

I am just asking. Well, maybe, nudging and hoping we get our Florida goat back.





Hoosier Classic Yearling Sale sets records for gross and average

The two-day sale concluded Saturday in Indiana with a gross of more than \$9 million and an average of \$22,633.

Several new records were established during the recently-concluded Hoosier Classic Yearling Sale, held Friday (Oct. 21) and Saturday (Oct. 22) at the Indiana State Fairgrounds. The event, which features some of the top Indiana-sired pacers and trotters, surpassed \$9 million in gross sales for the first time.

Over the course of the two sessions, 399 babies were sold for an average of \$22,633, up 5.5 per cent from a year ago, is also a record. A total of eight yearlings topped six figures, twice the number in 2021, with Helpisontheway colt Ponda Marshall topping the first session, and the sale, consigned by Pond-A-Acres and sold for \$170,000 to Ohioan Greg Luther.

Friday's session finished just shy of \$5 million, and the session average of \$23,963 signaled a new record, up nearly four per cent over 2021. Saturday's session eclipsed \$4 million for the first time in the sale's history, and the \$21,186 average jumped more than 7.5 percent over last year.

"One thing that was refreshing was to see the smaller operations hit home runs. It's just great to see the smiles on their faces. It made their year," said sale manager Steve Cross.

The home runs came in the form of six-figure and high five-figure buys spread across multiple consignments. The number of yearlings bringing \$50,000 and up nearly doubled from last year, 44 in total this year compared to 25 in 2021.

Two babies from Rollin Acres brought considerable interest and bids on the first day. Swan On Broadway, a first foal Swan For All colt consigned as Hip 146, sold to Tom Pollack for \$105,000. Helpem Dance, a Helpisontheway colt that is the first living foal from a sister to Indiana champion Satin Dancer, brought \$72,000. Jamie Macomber signed the ticket.

Helpisontheway colt Ponda Marshall topped the sale with a bid of \$170,000 by Ohioan Greg Luther. The colt was consigned by Pond-A-Acres.

Mystical Oz Park, a colt out of the Sportsmaster mare Mystical Victress, topped the second session at \$168,000. He was purchased by Jeff Fought.

Hoosier Classic sale. Knepp, who bred his first mare 20 years ago, said it is the Montgomery, Ind.-based farm's policy to continually upgrade the broodmare band, which numbers 20. They also have other mares with Steve Stewart's Hunterton Farm.

"I think it's a good policy to try to add a good mare or two each year. You can breed your mare and they can do okay, but sometimes you can have three or four foals and you get to the point where you have to cull one out," he explained.

Oakwood sold 11 babies for \$459,000, good for an average of \$41,727.

Many Hoosier Classic consignors have upgraded their broodmares in recent years. This year's catalog featured first foals or first live foals from nearly a quarter of the broodmares represented. There were also many second foals cataloged.

"It gets better every year. The guys are continually upgrading their mares. We're seeing better broodmares, better raised yearlings, it's just good for everybody," said Victory Hill Farm's Jeff King.

When Cruisersfoxyjudy entered the sale ring, breeders Devon Knepp and Devon Beechy hoped there would be significant interest. Eight days earlier the filly's full brother, Buzzsaw Russ, captured the \$250,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Super Final for freshman pacing colts. As the bidding pushed the number on the board past \$80,000, emotions began to kick in as they observed in amazement. The filly, consigned by David Wayne Yoder, sold for \$100,000, purchased by Indiana horseman Doug Rideout.

"There were definitely some tears," said Beechy.

The dam, Up Front Cruiser, also had a rough start to her broodmare career, unable to get in foal the first year and losing a foal in January of her second season. Then Buzzsaw Russ arrived, selling last year for \$52,000. The partners were more than pleased then, making Saturday overwhelming.

"There were good 2-year-olds this year. Ours wins the final and we have a full sister. It's just overwhelming," said Beechy. "For a small guy, that's what everybody is trying to do, sell a yearling for a nice price and everybody wants to win the final."

"We've never had that many people come and look. We keep working to improve our conditioning every year and, of course, keep trying to improve our breed every year. We've been doing it 15 years and we've never sold a yearling for over \$25,000," said Roman Stoll, who partnered with Dave Wagler to form Rollin Acres. "For all the small breeders out there, hang in there, because you're going to get your day in the sun."

The score with Helpem Dance was particularly gratifying. After being unable to get Serenas Serenade in foal her first season, she delivered a Swan For All baby that was consigned to last year's Hoosier Classic but died in July 2021.

"It's been a long road. Five years since we bought the mare and we finally got the gold," Stoll said.

Rollin Acres sold eight yearlings for \$302,500, including another Helpisontheway colt that brought \$53,000 on Saturday.

Sires with successful progeny on the racetrack produced strong numbers in the marketplace. Oakwood Farms was another consignor that benefited from buyers' interest in what is hot on the track. Swan Aleah (Hip 178), a first foal Swan For All-Grammy Winner filly, was hammered down for \$100,000 to S&R Racing Stables of Fishers, Ind. DC Flash, a Muscle Massive colt that was an agent yearling consigned as Hip 6, set the tone early, bringing \$90,000.

"You try to get some good mares and cross them right. Obviously, when you breed a mare, you're shooting down the road three years, so it can change on you," said Oakwood Farm's Harvey Knepp.

Oakwood sold Swan For All colt Swan Captain, recently a third-place Super Final finisher, for \$100,000 at the 2020

"I hope everybody has that experience. It's exciting," added Devon Knepp.

Rocco Ruffolo did not purchase the sale topper, but he comes to the Hoosier Classic each year searching for the yearlings that will deliver in his pursuit of the next Super Final victory. Ruffolo, Doug Overhiser and trainer Erv Miller were very active over both days, buying several yearlings to compete next summer in Indiana's lucrative program. The Chicagoan signed eight slips, ranging from \$100,000 for colt Summer Is The Best, to \$11,000 for filly Rock N Brook.

"I want to win a blanket," he said. "I have two sires stakes champions. I owned Rockin Tony in 2017. In Kentucky in 2011 I had a 2-year-old champion, T B Beach Girl. I need one more. It's hard. Indiana is hard."

Ruffolo's purchases totalled \$466,000, and he said he will partner on several with Overhiser and Rick Howles. For his part, Overhiser also helped fill Miller's barn with a new crop of trotters and pacers. The owner signed 13 slips totalling \$561,000.

"The buyers showed their hand early and it was quickly evident what they were looking for," said Cross. "As expected, they were bullish on Tellitlikeitis and Helpisontheway."

Offspring of Helpisontheway, whose first crop made a big splash in Indiana this season, were in high demand. The son of Chapter Seven sired two of the top three yearlings sold at the Hoosier Classic. A total of 29 babies passed through the ring, selling for a gross of over \$1.2 million and averaging \$42,603. Swan For All, the perennial leading trotting sire in Indiana, continued to

sell well, with 51 bringing just shy of \$1.8 million, good for a \$35,167 average.

Tellitlikeitis led all pacing sires with 45 babies selling over the two days for a \$1.55 million gross and \$34,578 average. Mystical Oz Park, a colt out of the Sportsmaster mare Mystical Victress, topped the second session at \$168,000. He was purchased by Jeff Fought.

"You can't really fault him. He's a flawless looking colt. For a pacing video, he's got the best pacing video in the sale, hands down," said Fought. "I was really hoping to buy a Tellitlikeitis. He's obviously had a great year. The 2-year-old crop, it's the best mares he's bred."

King and his wife, Maria, operate Victory Hill Farm, which stands Tellitlikeitis. Victory Hill sold Mystical Oz Park and JK Endofanera colt Summer Is The Best, both six-figure yearlings. In total, the farm sold 21 horses for \$956,000, producing a \$45,524 average.

"The good horses sold very well. We had more \$100,000 horses than last year. That's really good for this program," King commented. "What really helped the sale is that the majority of yearlings at the sale were from sires that raced well this year. That really helped."

Confederate and Handlelikeaporsche take 2-year-old pacing colt Crown elims

Two rookie pacing colts, **Confederate** and **Handlelikeaporsche**, made their first Canadian starts winning ones in two \$33,750 Breeders Crown eliminations Friday (Oct. 21) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

One race after his aunt, Charleston, captured her Breeders Crown elimination, Confederate also visited the winner's circle following the first split for 2-year-old pacing colts.

The first division was reduced by one with the scratch of Sounds Good. Ervin Hanover was the swiftest afoot early from post eight and he was covered up by favourite Confederate at the :27.3 first

quarter. With Tim Tetrick at the controls, Confederate tripped the halfway timer in :56.2 and was by the third quarter in 1:23.4.

Down the stretch, several colts attempted to challenge but Confederate held strong and was at the wire in 1:50.2. Ervin Hanover took second with Ammo third. Christchurch and Act Fast captured the other spots into next weekend's final.

It was the fifth straight victory for the son of Sweet Lou owned by breeder Diamond Creek Racing and new partner Crossover Racing. Brian Brown trains Confederate, who improved to 5-0-1 in six starts for just over \$300,000 banked.

"My horse is way better at following but the way it shook out I just went ahead and took control. If one of the bettor horses had come I would have followed them. This is a good tightener for him, he hadn't raced since the (KY) Sires Stakes final in Lexington (Sept. 18). Brian had him ready, he was really sharp tonight. He's ready to go. I expect him to get through the week healthy. Systems all go, I think he's a hot horse right now," said Tetrick.

There was much talk prior to the race that this was the colt's first start on Lasix which Tetrick noted: "They're doing the right thing giving him Lasix to treat him. For me, the horse is very sharp, it didn't seem to affect him at all, first start Lasix, he paced home really strong."

Confederate is the first foal of Geothermal, a half-sister to Diamond Creek's Charleston as well as another of their star pacing mares, Pure Country, a winner of more than \$2 million in her career and a Breeders Crown champion during her rookie season in 2015 at Woodbine Racetrack.

The second elimination saw Metro and Ontario Sires Stakes champion Stockade Seelster float out from post 10 to grab the lead for Jody Jamieson just past the opening quarter in :27.2. He paced by the half in :56.2 and the three-quarters in 1:24.

Dexter Dunn and Handlelikeaporsche, who sat fifth through the early going and came first up just by the half and advanced steadily in the outer lane, paced hard on the outside to go by the leader to win in 1:51.4. Doug McNair had Huntinthelastdolar flying late to take second while Stockade Seelster held for third. Combustion and Tip Top Cat also advanced to the final.

"He really gives 100 per cent when he's on the track. Tonight he felt great. You can do whatever you want with him, he's a true professional," said Dunn.

"Every race he's raced well, he got a little better down in Kentucky. Dexter was thrilled with him tonight, so was I, I thought he raced really good. My horse made his own race coming first over against a very good horse, I'm just thrilled with him," said trainer Chris Ryder.

A son of Lazarus N, Handlelikeaporsche is co-owned by Ryder, William Ezzo, Robert Mondillo and Barry Spak. The colt improved his summary to 4-3-0 in just seven starts with \$245,000 on his card. He is the first foal of a half-sister to millionaire Vegas Vacation.

Sylvia Hanover and Charleston take Crown 2yofp eliminations

The first- and second-place finishers in the Shes A Great Lady last month at Woodbine Mohawk Park are set to spar again over the Campbellville oval after **Sylvia Hanover** and **Charleston** took their respective \$33,750 eliminations for the Breeders Crown 2-year-old filly pace on Friday night (Oct. 21).

Driver Bob McClure moved Sylvia Hanover out of fourth for the lead after a :26.3 first quarter set by Hungry For Love. McClure kept the reins high and the whip in the air through a :56.3 half as McSeaside swept three wide from the back and began a blitz on the lead to the final turn.

McSeaside cleared Sylvia Hanover into the final turn with Horizontal moving first over from fourth and gaining towards the pacesetter nearing three-quarters. By the third panel in 1:24.2, McSeaside staved the outside challenge of Horizontal all through the stretch,

but McClure had ample room to swing off the pegs and to the center of the track with Sylvia Hanover for a final-sixteenth lunge to victory by a length in a 1:51.4 mile. McSeaside held second from Horizontal, with Light And Tight and Proud Mary rounding those advancing to the final next week.

"I kind of let Dexter [Dunn] go," Bob McClure said after the race. "He was coming really hard, and [Sylvia Hanover's] been front-ended a lot. I didn't mind following that one, I figured [she] was going to keep going. And a short field – I was pretty confident we'd get out eventually. I didn't mind the way it worked out there, but she's pretty professional. She's not like most 2-year-olds."

Winning her seventh race from eight starts, Sylvia Hanover has now banked \$498,300 for owner Hudson Standardbred Stable Inc. The Hanover Shoe Farms-bred daughter of Always B Miki, from the Artiscape mare Shyaway, has been part of a record-setting campaign for the Steacy training operation, which is having its first season with over \$2 million in earnings.

"We've had a really good year," said Mark Steacy, father of Sylvia Hanover's trainer Shawn Steacy. "Hopefully with a win next week, it will make it really impressive. We all work hard at it, and when you do that it usually comes together.

Of Sylvia Hanover, Mark Steacy also said "There's no end to her. She always seems to give you that little extra. The biggest worry part with her is she gets a little lazy from time to time. And my concern going into this race was [that] it was four weeks from race to race. She schooled a couple times, but it's not the same as racing."

Sylvia Hanover paid \$2.90 to win.

Charleston, second to Sylvia Hanover in the Shes A Great Lady, posted the faster mile of the two eliminations when she outdueled Strong Poison in the stretch to a 1:50.4 victory.

Strong Poison set an uncontested tempo of :27.4, :56.1 and 1:23.4 with Zanatta drafting from the pocket and Charleston waiting in third. Driver Dexter Dunn pulled Charleston from the pegs midway

around the final turn and marched towards Strong Poison, who battled to the inside all through the stretch. The pair scooted well clear of the rest as Charleston kept a neck in front of Strong Poison to the finish. Bellisima Hanover finished well back in third with Zanatta and Sweet Amira rounding the finalists.

"She felt great," Dexter Dunn said after the race. "She's been progressing really, really well this year. [We've] sort of aimed at this for a long time. [She had] a nice qualifier after the break and a real nice performance tonight. It was a big mile. We got away in a pretty handy spot, but we had to work for it late in the stretch. [Sylvia Hanover] was obviously great again tonight. She's an amazing filly herself, so we'll look forward to another battle with her."

Brett Pelling trains Charleston, a Diamond Creek Farm homebred daughter of Downbytheseaside from the Western Hanover mare Western Montana. She collected her sixth victory from eight starts and deposited to her account now worth \$186,350. She paid \$3.40 to win.

Special filly wins lone Crown elimination for 2-year-old trotting fillies

Special Way extended her winning streak to six with an impressive victory in the lone \$33,750 Breeders Crown elimination for 2-year-old trotting fillies on Friday (Oct. 21) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The top eight finishers from tonight's elim will be joined by the two talented trotters who received byes into the final. Righteous Resolve, the only Ontario-sired filly in the mix, earned the bye as the highest money earner of the group with well over a half a million on her card from nine starts to date. The Chapter Seven daughter Instagram Model garnered the other spot direct to the final as the winner of the Jim Doherty Memorial final.

As the race got underway, it was Secret Volo taking early control for Brian Sears from post eight but they were covered up by Mambacita at the tepid opening quarter in :29. She led the rookies by the easy :58.1 half and just past that point favourite Special Way popped out of third and was at the leader's wheel at the 1:26.2 third panel.

With trainer Ake Svanstedt at the lines, Special Way trotted on by Mambacita and opened

up down the stretch to win by three in 1:54.1. Walner Payton got up for second for Dexter Dunn while Mambacita, with Yannick Gingras up for the first time, held for third.

Also qualifying for the final, in order, were Silly Me Hanover, Secret Volo, Life Itself, Blonde Bombshell and Tactical Planner.

A daughter of Walner (who had six offspring in this elimination), Special Way is a homebred of Brittany Farms of Kentucky and Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld of Toronto and Pickering, ON. Friday's win puts her bankroll just over \$400,000 from six wins and a second in eight trips behind the gate so far in her debut season.

This was Special Way's first start on Canadian soil having contested all of her previous races at the Meadowlands and The Red Mile. She came into tonight's contest off a victory in the Bluegrass Stake in a life best 1:52, after which co-owner Brittany Farm's George Segal said she might be the best trotting filly he's owned which is high praise indeed.

There is history in this event in Special Way's family as her third dam, Honorable Daughter, won the Breeders Crown final for freshman trotting fillies in 2008 at the Meadowlands with John Campbell up for trainer Larry Remmen.




Gaines Hanover and Celebrity Bambino score in Crown eliminations for 2-year-old trotting colts

With much of the field settled in behind him Gaines Hanover and Roy hit the half in :56.2 and kept a lively clip going through the third quarter in 1:24.3. When rival Gates Hanover pulled on the turn and miscued Gaines Hanover sprinted clear away from his rivals leaving the battle for minor honors and a position in next week's rich final.

The Gruffalo won the battle for the place spot late as Osceola and driver Doug McNair rallied impressively along the pylons to secure the third spot.

Winners Bet finished fourth guaranteeing a spot in the lucrative final with Spitfire Oversees finishing fifth and reaching the final with the higher earnings of the two fifth-place elimination finishers.

The complexion of the race changed early when Crantini broke behind the gate, but Kierkegaard K and Ake Svanstedt left with purpose to take control into the opening bend. Celebrity Bambino and Gingras marched forward to get control at the quarter in :28.1.

Celebrity Bambino returned \$17.40 to win.

"He was my favorite colt training down," said Gingras of Celebrity Bambino in the winner's circle. "All credit to Ronnie (Burke). The colt got sick, and Ronnie gave him time to recover."

Tim Tetrick had Fashion Schooner by the half in

:56.3 and the three quarters in 1:23.4. He tried to open up a few lengths on the competition but it wasn't enough to hold off favourite Jiggy Jog

S and Dexter Dunn who were first at the wire reached in 1:51.2. Fashion Schooner held for second. Also qualifying for next week's final were Raised By Lindy, Bare My Soul and Venerable.

King Of The North added to an account now worth \$829,255 with his seventh victory from 22 starts. The Walner colt, from the Donato Hanover mare Check Me Out, races for owners Schnittker War, Arden Homestead Stable, Nolamaura Racing LLC and Steven Arnold. Steve Jones and Ray Schnittker bred the colt who paid \$59.20 to win.

A lane opened at the pylons for ground-saving Double Deceiver to dash through and outsprint Slay to the finish of a 1:52.4 mile in the first elimination.

World At War Deo darted from the outermost post in the octet to lead the field by a :28.1 first quarter before Temporal Hanover swept to the front up the backside. Temporal Hanover then coasted around the final turn as Golden Wall As pushed uncovered along the rim with Slay in tow and Double Deceiver sticking to the cones in the rear of the field.

Past three-quarters in 1:25.1, the field swarmed Temporal Hanover as he drifted and soon retreated through the pack. Golden Wall As surged to a narrow lead in mid-stretch until

Double Deceiver accelerated through the gap developed at the pylons for a near-last to first blitz in the stretch. Slay slung off Golden Wall As's cover to give chase but only gave pursuit to take second in a 1:52.4 mile, beaten a head. I don't know if it was the Lasix that made the difference but tonight, that was even better than he was earlier in the year. He was really sharp during the week here, literally kicking his shoes off in the paddock. So, I'm glad he just finished it off and showed that he's back to form."





After some tough recent results at the Red Mile, Pebble Beach was back on track and back in the winner's circle.

"You know, it was disappointing all the time," said Daley. "I just knew he was better than that."

A son of Downbytheseaside, Pebble Beach posted his 14th win in 25 starts this season and has now amassed over \$1.4 million in lifetime earnings for owners Patricia Stable, Joe Sbrocco, Country Club Acres and LAExpressFoderaDeoVolente.

Bred by Brittany Farm, the bay colt was an \$85,000 purchase at the 2020 Lexington Select Sale as Hip No. 710.

Bythemissal continued his dream season with a strong effort in the second elimination.

It was second choice on the tote board I Did It Myway who overtook Greatest Ending for the lead into the first turn, with Bythemissal sitting third and Mad Max Hanover in fourth, as the pacesetter brought the field to the opening quarter in :27.2.

Chris Page, in rein to Bythemissal, was on the march soon after, and the duo struck front, 1 ½ lengths ahead of I Did It Myway after a half reached in :54.4.

The pair were still one-two after three-quarters in 1:23 and began to pull away from their foes down the lane. I Did It My Way looked to reel in his rival in the late going, but Bythemissal wouldn't be denied, going on to post a three-quarter length score in 1:49.1. Greatest Ending, Mad Max Hanover and Captain

Cowboy also earned a spot in next Saturday's final.

"I'm always a little apprehensive, who's on the outside, but the horse felt really good," said Page. "Kind of got a nice third-quarter breather, so I knew he'd have a pretty good punch coming home."

It was yet another polished performance from this year's Little Brown Jug victor, trained by Ron Burke, who co-owns with Eric Good, Rich Lombardo Racing and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. The Downbytheseaside-Dismissal gelding became the first Ohiobred Jug champion since 1988 winner BJ Scoot.

Now, the bay who won his only two-year-old start, banking \$3,000 for the victory, will have the opportunity to add another piece of serious standardbred hardware to his connections' trophy case.

Bythemissal will also carry a five-race win streak into next Saturday's showdown with Pebble Beach and eight other rivals.

"Who would've thought that from there [Little Brown Jug], I would be here talking to you for the Breeders Crown," Page told Mark McKelvie after the race. "To win the Jug, that was definitely the top of my bucket list, and this is up there near the top, so we've got to finish next week."

With the win, Bythemissal, who paid \$3.50 for the win, is now 13-2-0 from 15 starts.

Bred by Stephen Dey, the gelding was a \$135,000 purchase (Hip No. 794) at the 2020 Lexington Select Sale.

Bulldog Hanover preps for Crown with 1:51.2 qualifier

A quartet of Breeders Crown finalists took to the track Friday morning (Oct. 21) at Woodbine Mohawk Park for qualifying action.

World champion Bulldog Hanover turned in a 1:51.2 qualifying mile in preparation for next Saturday's Breeders Crown open pace. Dexter Dunn came into town early to guide the Jack Darling trainee.

Facing three rivals, Bulldog Hanover paced out to the lead and posted fractions of :28.4, :56.4 and 1:24.3 before storming home in :26.4. The nearest rival to 'Bulldog' finished 29 lengths back.

"He looked awesome. I've never seen him look any better," said Darling. "Dexter couldn't get him pulled up after the wire. He went a full lap after (the qualifier) and he still had trouble on the backside. So, he's as good as he could be going into the final.

The 4-year-old Bulldog Hanover will be entering the Breeders Crown off a rare defeat. The Darling trainee was upset by Allywag Hanover in the Allerage at The Red Mile on October 29. The star pacers are set for a rematch on Oct. 29 and are part of an 11-horse field for the Breeders Crown open pace.

"I was looking to get a race. I was actually hoping there would be elims, and I would have raced him in the open too, but nothing filled," said Darling. "He just likes to mix it up a little, and have some fun. He loves to race. I'm glad I brought him. It was a good tightener for him. He's in good shape."

The Breeders Crown open pace will be drawn at a special press conference and dinner on Tuesday (Oct. 25) at Country Heritage Park.

Star 3-year-old pacing fillies Treacherous Dragon and Niki Hill finished one-two in another qualifier on Friday morning.

Niki Hill did the road work, cutting out fractions of :29.3,:58.1 and 1:25.2, while Treacherous Dragon sat on her back. In the stretch, Treacherous Dragon and driver Scott Zeron were able to reach up and edge Niki Hill and driver Dunn by a neck in 1:52.1.

Trained by Nancy Takter, Treacherous Dragon has won eight of 13 starts this season including the Fan Hanover in mid-June at Mohawk Park. The daughter of Captaintreacherous was

making her first appearance Friday since winning the Jugette on September 21.

The Chris Ryder trained Niki Hill has had a roller coaster of a season. The Always B Miki filly was sidelined through most of the summer, but returned in September in fine form by posting back-to-back Grand Circuit wins at The Red Mile.

Sporting a record of two for four this season, Niki Hill will be looking for a second Crown title after capturing last year's Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace.

Double millionaire Forbidden Trade tuned up for the Breeders Crown open trot with a 1:54.4 qualifying victory. The Luc Blais trainee and driver Bob McClure went coast-to-coast on the front, posting fractions of :29, :57.2 and 1:26.1 before a well in hand :28.3 last quarter.

The 6-year-old Forbidden Trade has won four of 15 starts this season to increase his career numbers to 25 wins. The 2019 Hambletonian champion will be hoping third times a charm after having little luck in two previous Crown appearances.

The draw for the Breeders Crown open trot will be part of Tuesday's press conference and dinner.

- Rocket Russell, 3-year-old Downbytheseaside gelding, Dean Glispie, 1:54, \$4.20.
- Dontforgetmaster, 7-year-old son by Dontyouforgetit, Deborah Swartz, 1:55.4, \$4.00.

Off-the-pace tactics work in Simpson stakes

It was an unusual Friday afternoon (Oct. 21) at Harrah's Philadelphia, as most of the feature races, including the two divisions of the \$93,200 Razzle Hanover, the John Simpson Sr. Memorial stake for 2-year-old pacing fillies, were taken by horses coming from well off the pace on the normally speed-favoring track.

The Always B Miki–Emily Car filly **Extreme Z Tam** was reserved along the inside in the first Razzle Hanover/Simpson division by trainer/driver Pat Lachance, then came closing strongly up the open stretch, pacing her own last quarter in :27 to catch the pacesetter favorite Ginger Tree Coco by a neck. The winning time of 1:53.3 was perforce a lifetime race mark since it was the first purse victory for Extreme Z Tam, who is owned by Lachance, M & M Harness Racing LLC, and Royal Flush Stable LLC.

Also winning a purse race for the first time in her career was the Sweet Lou-Luvthebeachlife miss **Illuvloucy**, who was still last at head stretch, but who made up four lengths in the stretch for driver Corey Callahan to catch the first-over favorite Falana Hanover by half a length in 1:54.1. Travis Alexander conditions the filly for M Spacc Stables, Fiddler's Creek Stables LLC, D'Elegance Stable IX and T L P Stable.

Meanwhile, trainer Noel Daley and driver Andrew McCarthy combined to win two of three divisions of the \$104,100 Super Bowl, the John Simpson Sr. Memorial stake for 2-year-old trotting colts on Thursday afternoon (Oct. 20) at Harrah's Philadelphia.

One of their winners was the Chapter Seven–Lass A Rope colt **Volume Eight**, who missed the divisional Philly record by only a tick with his 1:54.3 front-end effort. The big favorite, coming off a Lexington Grand Circuit win and four of six lifetime, was extended by pocket-sitter Father Stosh, but he remained a half-length to the good at the wire for the partnership of Daley, Joe

Sbrocco, LA Express & JAF Racing, and Mario Mazza while just missing the standard put in by Once In A Lifetime in winning his Sire Stakes championship on Sept. 4.

McCarthy/Daley also clicked in the Super Bowl/Simpson with **Squared Away**, the Cantab Hall–K Squared Hanover colt who sat in the pocket most of the way, pulled out going to the far turn, and went on to be a handy 2¾ length winner while reducing his mark to 1:55.3. Squared Away has now won three straight starts for Morrison Racing Stables.

The other Simpson section produced a "toteboard bomber" as **Met Your Request**, a gelding by Met's Hall-Quest Blue Chip, tailed the cover of 2-5 favorite Kimmeridgian through the last half, then went wide and just caught that rival by a neck while taking a new mark of 1:56 and paying \$67.40 to win. Tyler Miller drove the three-time winner for trainer/mother Julie and the ownership of Andy Miller Stable Inc. and Mr. Caroll Hoffman.
