Dr. Patty Hogan's dreams have come true at new location

On Tuesday, her new vet clinic at her Pheasant Hill Farm in New Jersey will be the site of the Breeders Crown final draws for the male sophomore pacing and trotting divisions.


Dr. Patty Hogan is one of, if not *the* best, veterinary surgeons. She also is one of the nicest people in the horse racing industry. She fits the bill of not only beautiful on the outside, but just as beautiful on the inside.

Hogan has not only saved many horses' lives (both thoroughbred and standardbred), but has miraculously managed to help future champions (such as Always B Miki) go on and resume their racing careers after seriously injuring themselves.

Hogan's dream was to buy a beautiful farm where she could not only breed and raise horses, but also operate her lucrative equine facility.

"I had been fortunate enough to lease clinic space and barns and paddocks at neighboring Fair Winds Farm for 14 years, but as my practice continued to grow and Fair Winds downsized, we were running into issues with having enough room to handle our patient population. In 2020, I hired another surgeon, Dr. Alex Curtiss, who has really excelled here, so the need for more room was essential," Hogan said.

"It was actually my husband, Eddie (Lohmeyer), who came up with the idea that we should look into purchasing the 305-acre

"Initially, I thought he was being absurd because of the size and scope of the project and the amount of money required.

"However, once I looked at the farm I knew this was exactly the dream farm I always wanted. It was absolutely perfect.

"From a business point, in reality I was actually paying more in rent at Fair Winds then my mortgage, feed, and labor costs would be at the new farm, so it ended up making better financial sense.

"Aside from the obvious financial commitments, it was a big personal leap for both of us. It meant retirement for Eddie from training horses — selling our house in Florida, as well as our farm in Cream Ridge — and moving everything over to the new property.

"That's a huge transition for anyone, for moving is not easy — at any age.

"It certainly was a huge lifestyle change, especially for my husband, for he had spent 50 years training harness horses and winter trained in Florida developing horses. But Eddie is a man who has never stopped learning and accomplishing things in life and this was just another challenge for him to put his talents to.

"He has really done an incredible job throughout this entire project — from its inception to its completion — and he makes one hell of a farm manager."

Now called Pheasant Hill Farm, the old Perretti Farms was once the home to many champion horses. At one time it was the largest horse farm in New Jersey, specializing in the breeding

and racing of standardbred horses.

The farm is located on State Rd. 526, in the heart of New Jersey's famed horse country in Cream Ridge and was founded in the late 1980s by noted automobile dealer and restauranteur, William J. Perretti. After the death of Perretti, all the horses were dispersed and the farm went on the market.

Superstars Muscles Yankee, Malabar Man, Presidential Ball, Matts Scooter, McArdle and Rocknroll Heaven were just some of the champion stallions that stood on the farm.

The offspring of these great sires have produced some of harness racing's strongest lines.

On the property next to the main barn is an Olympic size indoor dressage arena where Hogan has installed her new clinic.

"We took the 13,000 sq. ft. indoor riding rink and converted that into a seamless examination area and surgical facility. I now have a stall space for 100 horses."

Talking about her new purchase, Hogan lights up like a Christmas tree.

"There is no way to adequately describe how beautiful and thoughtfully planned out this farm is. You have to see it and experience it yourself to understand how very special it is.

"Mr. Perretti did everything first class when building it — whether it was the design and structure of the barns, the layout of the paddocks, or the extensive underground watering system. Whatever he did, he never cut a single corner here. Even the quality of every piece of material chosen — down to each screw



used – is quite impressive.

"The beauty of the farm is just breathtaking. The feeling you get as you make your way down the long driveway and enter into the rolling hills of Kentucky is magical.

"The pastures are pristine. There are 12 miles of fencing and dense woods. We have large pastures for our own Standardbred broodmares and retired horses. There are 17 two to three-acre paddocks for client lay-ups and we are even growing some of our own hay on the front 40 acres.

"We have a real boutique business of providing surgical services to a large Thoroughbred racehorse population, and many of



those horses stay for 60 to 90 days.

"Therefore, all our turnouts are a minimum of 30 days, and most stay for 60 to 90 days. We try to keep them fairly fit physical condition so that when they return to race training they are in excellent shape and can easily resume an athletic routine.

"The fields here range from a round pen, up to a three-acre sloping paddock, so the horses get plenty of exercise, and I think our clients are very pleased with what they get back.

"At the clinic we offer orthopedic surgery; soft tissue surgery, management of orthopedic infections, laser surgery, endoscopy, gastroscopy and more. Our post-operative rehabilitation program is tailored individually for each patient and we treat each patient with the best care with personalized diet and exercise program."

Pheasant Hill Farm will undoubtedly carry on the history that began with Perretti Farms for our wonderful athletes who deserve the best care.

Hogan is also very much into rehabilitating and re-placing horses when their racing careers are over. She is certainly one of the sport's biggest superstars and we are blessed to have her.

Lilbitalexis, Raised By Lindy win Crown rookie filly trot elims; Venerable breaks stride

Lilbitalexis and Dexter Dunn made the most of a pocket trip on their way to capturing the first of two \$25,000 eliminations for the Breeders Crown 2-year-old filly trot at The Meadowlands on Friday night (Oct. 22). The victory saved the day for trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman, whose previously undefeated Venerable broke stride in the contest and finished last.

Selfie Queen and driver Scott Zeron marched out sharply to the front into the first turn, forcing Dunn to take the two-hole behind the leader with Lilbitalexis well before the :27.4 first quarter. Venerable, the Mohawk Million winner, had taken a tuck early, but was in no hurry to move as Selfie Queen cut the half in :56.2 unchallenged.

David Miller put Venerable in gear past the half and the filly made up ground quickly, eventually flushing Lilbitalexis from the pocket as the field neared the three-quarters. Lilbitalexis engaged Selfie Queen on even terms past three-quarters in 1:25.1, but Venerable faltered and took herself out of the



race turning into the homestretch. Dunn had no issues with Lilbitalexis, and the Walner-sired lass trotted smoothly past Selfie Queen for a 1-3/4-length victory in 1:53.3. Selfie Queen held second easily with Jaya Bae closing solidly between horses late to hit the board in third. Brickhouse Babe and Ebbies Lady, fourth and fifth respectively, completed the qualifiers for next week's \$600,000 final from this elimination.

Pinske Stables and David Hoese own Lilbitalexis, who won for the seventh time in her freshman season.

"When you ask her to go, she's got high speed," said Dunn of Lilbitalexis, who paid \$5.60 as the second choice.

Form held up better in the second \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination, when **Raised By Lindy** got the job done as the even-money favorite for driver Yannick Gingras and trainer Domenico Cecere.

Joviality S, the 6-5 second choice, left hard for command with Brian Sears in the bike and parked Raised By Lindy through a soft :29 opening guarter before allowing her to pass. Once in control, Raised By Lindy and Gingras strolled around the track, cutting middle half fractions of :58.3 and 1:27.4. The third quarter got the attention of Todd McCarthy, as he sped Delilah Hanover from the back with high velocity before then having to edge wider when Joviality S pulled the pocket to challenge the winner on even terms late on the final bend. Gingras called on Raised By Lindy under pressure, and the daughter of Walner, bred and owned by Lindy Farms of Connecticut, finished her mile impressively, sprinting home in :27 flat to win by 1-1/2 lengths and complete the mile in 1:54.4 for her third consecutive victory. Joviality S held firmly late for second ahead of Jiggy Joq S. Delilah Hanover and Valentina Blu completed the finalists from this division.

Raised By Lindy paid \$4.20 in winning for the fifth time in nine career starts.

By virtue of their elimination wins, Lilbitalexis and Raised By Lindy drew for posts 1-5 before the remainder of the field took part in an open draw.

Six Feet Apart scores tight upset in Crown elimination

Fast fractions perpetuated by 1-5 favorite Beach Glass laid the groundwork for **Six Feet Apart** to steadily reel in the heated pacesetter, with the Brian Brown trainee nailing the Canadian invader in the final strides of the second of three \$25,000 eliminations for the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace on Friday (Oct. 22) at The Meadowlands.

Birthday bolted to the point as True Blue Lindy scooted up the pylons to secure the pocket moving to a :26.4 first quarter. Beach Glass raced third to the backstretch, but soon came off the pegs to brush for the lead. Birthday begrudgingly yielded control to Beach Glass while still managing to string the new pacesetter out to a :54.4 half.

Six Feet Apart raced fourth to the final turn, where driver David Miller angled the Sweet Lou colt first-over and made gradual gains into three-quarters in 1:22.3. Beach Glass turned for home holding a one-length lead that diminished past the eighth pole as Six Feet Apart loomed closer to the leg-weary leader. Six Feet Apart powered to the front late to cross the beam a half-length better than Beach Glass in a 1:50.2 mile. I Did It Myway finished third, another five lengths behind, and True Blue Lindy took fourth.

"I was real happy with his effort," David Miller said after the race. "I thought Tim Tetrick might come right there at the half. We were first-over and I didn't know how he would hold up. Halfway through the stretch, he kept coming. He's the type of horse that just goes what he has to. He can go a bit more, I believe."

Metro Pace champ **Monte Miki** seized the lead midway up the backside and withstood first-over pressure from 3-5 favorite Hammering Hank to take the first Breeders Crown elimination in 1:50.4.

Gentle Giant dashed for the top and cleared to the cones before a :27 first quarter with Market Based sitting in the pocket. Monte Miki landed in third to the backstretch and stayed briefly in that spot until driver Scott Zeron swept the Mark Evers trainee to the point approaching a :55.3 half.

Hammering Hank got underway to the final turn and marched uncovered towards the pacesetter to three-quarters, where he nabbed a narrow lead while clicking by the beam in 1:24.1. Monte Miki battled back to the inside at the bottom of the turn and surged back to the top through the straightaway to put away Hammering Hank by a half-length. The pair scooted clear of Gentle Giant in third, with Market Based taking fourth.

"When you stand beside him, he's a gorgeous horse, beautiful stature," Zeron said after the race. "If anything, he's a little immature. 

Domenico Cecere trainee **Branded By Lindy** bolted clear of his competition to post the quickest victory of the three \$25,000 eliminations for the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Trot on Friday (Oct. 22) at The Meadowlands, stopping the clock in 1:53.

Yannick Gingras guided the 3-5 favorite with a sweeping move to lead, cutting a :57.2 half and three-quarters in 1:25.1 en route to a 2-3/4-length score over fast-charging Double Deceiver. Fast As The Wind took third.

King Of The North followed Periculum on the outside in pursuit, but to no avail. Global Pandemic was quick off the gate, but broke before the first quarter and did not recover while the others could not make any ground once Branded By Lindy got going.

Branded By Lindy, a son of Chapter Seven and The Lindy Label bred and owned by Lindy Farms of Connecticut, paid \$3.00 to win. The colt raised his 2021 earnings to \$165,550.

Gingras said, "He's gotten better and better every week. This race was as easy as it looked. I just wanted to make sure we won the elimination. I thought he was the best, and he showed it."

David Miller used **Testing Testing** twice in the mile to win the first \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination for 2-year-old male trotters in a lifetime mark of 1:53.4.

Testing Testing made an early move to get the top, but settled behind S I P and a charging Temporal Hanover, who took the top over S I P in a :27.2 first panel. Temporal Hanover commanded a :56 half with S I P behind him until Miller took Testing Testing first-over and gained ground with Letsdoit S getting live cover. Testing Testing won the challenge for the lead in a 1:24.3 three-quarter split. From there, Testing Testing rolled easily to a 1-1/4-length win. The late-closing Majestic J trotted by Letsdoit S to nab second with Temporal Hanover third.

George Ducharme trains Testing Testing, and the colt's fourth win brings his earnings to \$43,025 for owners William Donovan, Purnel & Libby, Joseph Rocco and Jim Winske. Warrawee Farm bred the son of Walner and Sound Check, who paid \$7.00.

"He was a nice colt all winter," Ducharme said, "I was high on him. The owners were gracious enough to let me do right by the horse." Ducharme said drawing for posts one through five in the \$600,000 final "certainly helps."

In the second \$25,000 elimination, 2-1 favorite **Rebuff** and Tim Tetrick held off late closers to win in 1:53.4. Rebuff relaxed in fourth off the gate with World At War Deo giving up the lead to Duly Resolved at the :28.2 first quarter. The field went in single file to the :57.1 half when Slay aimed at the leader, forcing a duel at 1:26 three-quarters.

Duly Resolved held sway until mid-stretch before Gigondas took advantage of the duel and swept forward off cover. Rebuff, however, was fastest of all, coasting by the trio to win by 2-1/4 lengths. On the far outside Cool Papa Bell soared, taking the show spot from Duly Resolved late.

The single \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination for juvenile pacing fillies started with two undefeated fillies as favorites, but it was 23-1 shot **Queen Of Success**, who literally split those two in the late stages, to surprise at the finish line for Andy McCarthy in a 1:50.3 mile.

McCarthy used Queen Of Success' gate speed to full advantage, putting her on the front in the early going before yielding to the previously unbeaten Sea Silk and driver Chris Page past the :27.3 opening quarter. Page and Sea Silk were able to back down the pace significantly, hitting the half in :56 flat while waiting for competition. Dexter Dunn, driving the other previously unbeaten filly, Niki Hill, waited until past the half to get on the move. Niki Hill advanced towards the leader, but Sea Silk cruised a third quarter in :27.3, making it difficult for the entire outer tier to gain contention.

In the homestretch, Sea Silk held firmly, but McCarthy was able to angle off the pylons with Queen Of Success as Niki Hill bore out slightly, allowing clearance. Queen Of Success quickly asserted herself to drive by Sea Silk and held Niki Hill three-quarters of a length at bay in a :27 flat final quarter.

Queen Of Success, a daughter of Captaintreacherous and Cashaway, won for the fifth time in eight starts this year for trainer Tony Alagna and owners Alagna Racing LLC, Caviart Farms and Robert LeBlanc.

Niki Hill finished second with Sea Silk third. Gotthegreenlight, Treacherous Dragon, Boudoir Hanover, Captain Cowgirl and Galleria Hanover finished fourth through eighth, respectively, and also advance to next Friday's (Oct. 29) \$600,000 Breeders

Hambletonian Oaks winner **Bella Bellini** won her \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination for 3-year-old trotting fillies on Saturday afternoon (Oct. 23) at The Meadowlands — but **Altar**, the winner of the other elimination, went over a second faster.

Now 9-for-16 for the season but coming off two close second-place finishes, Bella Bellini was sent off as the 3-5 favorite from post seven in a field of 10, and driver Dexter Dunn got her in sixth as the three horses to her outside all blasted away. Herculisa bypassed the three-hole to the :27.4 quarter and went by Adirondack; You Ato Dream was soon on the attack and made

the lead near the half in :56. Bella Bellini moved outside entering the far turn behind the cover of Donna Soprano, but when that one came up flat, she had to tip three-deep at the 1:24.4 three-quarters. The daughter of Bar Hopping was powerful through the lane, chewing up ground to the lead with ease, and went on to win by 1-1/4 lengths in 1:52.4.

Herculisa put in a big rebounding mile from a break in the Filly Futurity to take second; 124-1 shot Chablis, one of the outside leavers, came through for third, ahead of You Ato Dream and Shirley Goodness.

Bella Bellini is owned by breeder David McDuffee; she is out of the top mare Bella Dolce, a daughter of Pizza Dolce, whom McDuffee also raced with great success.

Trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman continued his fantastic season, and he won this Crown division in 2013 with Horse of the Year Bee A Magician. While he wasn't thrilled with Bella Bellini's cover, he indicated that "she only needs a little cover to set up her late move."

Altar, who was sent off as the 6-5 favorite in this elimination after two stakes wins at Lexington, left from post seven in the field of nine and eyed the three-hole as pacesetter Amazone Duharas approached the :27.1 quarter. But Yannick Gingras bypassed the tuck and sent her to the lead nearing mid-back-stretch, passing the half in :55.4. The victorious daughter of

champion racehorse and sire Muscle Hill sped things up to a 1:23.2 three-quarters, then still was strong in a :28 quarter to complete a 1:51.2 mile 3-3/4 lengths ahead – and three-fifths of a second faster than the Championship record for this division set by Next Level Stuff last year.

Iteration and Splash Blue Chip, who sat third and fourth much of the mile, angled out for room in upper stretch and closed for second and third, respectively; Anoka Hanover, out the mile from an outer post, did well for fourth, with Amazone Duharas lasting for the last qualifying spot.

Altar ran her record to six for 11 this year, with the homebred's life-time earnings going to \$219,373, with another \$325,000 possibly awaiting another seven days hence. Gingras has won this division of the Breeders Crown three times, while "trainer Takter" has also worn this Crown three times – Altar's trainer Nancy hopes to set out on the road to match her father Jimmy's triple in this classification.

By virtue of their elimination wins, Atlanta, Altar and Bella Bellini drew for post positions between one and five before the rest of their respective fields took part in open draws for the remaining posts.

Millionaire **Perfect Sting** and near-millionaire **Charlie May** put together strong performances to leave their competition behind and win the \$25,000 eliminations for the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace on Saturday (Oct. 23) at The Meadowlands.

Charlie May charged first-over into the final turn to blitz leader Southwind Gendry and scoot clear to a 1:49.1 win in the second of the two eliminations.

Heart Of Chewbacca hustled to the point with Water Sports Teen settling into second to a :26.4 first quarter. Southwind Gendry raced third to the backstretch before angling off the pylons and circling stablemate Heart Of Chewbacca to lead into a :54.4 half.

Driver Brett Miller sat fourth with Charlie May to the final turn, but soon launched the McArdle gelding towards the top as Southwind Gendry attempted to slow the tempo to three-quarters, timed in 1:22.3. Charlie May grabbed the front off the corner and stayed firm on the lead while Southwind Gendry cut into his deficit to the inside to secure second, beaten by three-quarters of a length. Rockyroad Hanover ripped off cover from third over to finish third with Heart Of Chewbacca and Water Sports Teen holding fourth and fifth, respectively, to make the \$600,000 final.

"We were real excited today," owner Don Tiger said after the race. "Glad to come back here, thankful for the opportunity. The horse raced great, Brett said he was super. He is one of those

horses that when he clears and he doesn't hear anybody he slows down a bit. But he was super today, had a lot of pace left.

"He definitely loves a target. You could see it today pulling first-up. Southwind Gendry is a nice animal and he engaged him and went right by. He's a beast and we are really looking forward to the Perfect Sting showdown next weekend. The best part about it is I can't draw the nine-hole."

Conditioned by Steve Carter, Charlie May collected his ninth victory from 18 starts this season and his 16th from 27 overall, earning \$950,652. Don Tiger's homebred paid \$3.60 to win.

Starting from the pylon post, driver David Miller pushed for position with Perfect Sting to race third to a :26.2 first quarter set by Chase H Hanover. Miller slid Perfect Sting off the pegs to the backstretch and overtook Chase H Hanover to commandeer the field before a :55 half. The Joe Holloway pupil remained headstrong to the final turn, gaining separation on Chase H Hanover to three-quarters in 1:22.3 and widening his lead through the stretch. He stayed to task in a straightaway sprint to stop the clock in 1:49.2 and finish three lengths better than Chase H Hanover.

Abuckabett Hanover ground first over through the mile to take third, holding off a late charge from Southwind Petyr kicking off his cover in fourth. I'll Drink To That rounded the finalists in fifth.

"It was but this was different from what it has been of late," trainer Joe Holloway said after the race. "He got home well today. He paced through the wire strong today – I was happy to see that. I don't think he gets the respect he deserves. Last year certainly he did. But this year he has danced every dance and been there at the wire but he probably lost a few he should have won. He has been the most consistent of the 3-year-olds."

Perfect Sting, a colt from a family of Holloway graduates in sire Always B Miki and dam Shebestingin, won his sixth race from 15 starts this season and his 16th from 25 in his career. The homebred for Brittany Farms LLC and Val D'Or Farms has banked \$1,508,147 and returned \$2.40 to win.

The post-position draws for the 3-Year-Old Colt Trot and 3-Year-Old Colt Pace will take place Tuesday at Hogan Equine at Pheasant Hill Farm in Dr. Patty Hogan's veterinary clinic in Cream Ridge, NJ. The draw will be shown live at 2 p.m. both on The Meadowlands' Facebook page and YouTube channel.

Driver Yannick Gingras fired the 6-year-old Somebeachsomewhere gelding off the car but took a spot in fourth while Warrawee Vital clicked the first quarter in :27 with Cattlewash in the pocket. Nicholas Beach brushed for the lead out of third approaching a :55.1 half, and maintained his speed to the final turn as Cattlewash started to float off the pegs.

By three-quarters in 1:22.3, Nicholas Beach held a shrinking lead as Cattlewash laid pursuit to the pacesetter heading for home. This Is The Plan stalked Cattlewash's attack before Gingras moved to strike into the eighth pole. With each stride, This Is The Plan bore down on Cattlewash and, with enough momentum, got by at the line in a 1:49.3 mile. "[Cattlewash is] a nice horse too. This Is The Plan is sharp, still. People think he may be a little on the backside, but Allywag is just so sharp," Gingras said after the race. "Today, without Allywag in there, he took advantage of it. [All] credit goes to the Burke Brigade. They do a great job of keeping horses, not only for a year, but able to come back year after year."

This Is The Plan scored his sixth victory from 22 starts this season and his 20th win from 91 starts in his career, earning \$2,553,469. Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby and Lawrence Karr own the \$19.40 winner.

Atlanta stands tall in Crown Mare Trot elim

World champion **Atlanta**, in search of her first career Breeders Crown victory, secured an inside position for next Saturday's (Oct. 30) \$300,000 Mare Trot final with a powerful 1:52.1 victory in the lone \$25,000 divisional elimination, held Saturday afternoon (Oct. 23) at The Meadowlands.

Atlanta, the 2018 Hambletonian champion, won for the 31st time in her storied career, holding her ground amid a bevy of late challengers by a determined three-quarter-length margin.

Leaving from the pole position, regular pilot Yannick Gingras had Atlanta away smoothly, yielding just to the speedy early sprint of Felicityshagwell S into the first turn. After Felicityshagwell S and Åke Svanstedt led the way through the opening quarter of :27.3, Gingras moved Atlanta on the backstretch ahead of When Dovescry to get the front end. Atlanta waltzed to the half in :56.4 as When Dovescry and her driver, David Miller, accepted the first-over grind through the final half mile.

Atlanta cruised to three-quarters in 1:24.3 with When Dovescry on her flank and Felicityshagwell S positioned behind her in the pocket. She then hit high gear in the homestretch, leaving those two battling for minor spoils. A:27.3 final quarter secured victory for the 6-year-old daughter of Chapter Seven, whom Ron Burke trains.

Atlanta, sent off as the 2-5 choice in the field of 10, returned \$2.80 to win. When Dovescry held bravely for second, with Refined closing sharply late for third. Following the top three into next week's final were Felicityshagwell S, Ramona Hill,

"She wasn't nearly on her game today," said Gingras following the victory. "But she's a champion."

Flower Dust wins in Denmark

In Denmark, 4-year-old **Flower Dust** (Love You) claimed the \$61,000 Grand Circle 4-year-old Championat for Bent Svendsen. Flower Dust came to the lead with a lap to go in Billund and then the excitement was over. Flower Dust cruised to safe win in mile rate 1:57.2 over 1.2 miles.

A conversation with Anthony MacDonald: The man behind TheStable.ca

Over 900 owners from 13 countries. If that was the only contribution that Anthony MacDonald and his wife Amy's entity, The Stable. ca, have made to harness racing, it would be quite significant.

One thinks that it would be safe to presume that upwards of half those wouldn't be owners and probably wouldn't be involved in our sport if not for their participation in The Stable.

Anthony goes further and says that a significant number of them had never even seen a harness race before embarking on the trip of ownership. He is quick to point out that he does not consider it in any way to be an investment.

"You invest to hopefully make money. If you buy into a horse in The Stable, you are doing so to be entertained, to be part of something that can bring thrills, pleasure and enjoyment to your life. If you get lucky, there is a chance, albeit usually a small one, that you can make some money. However, from my experience with people who have bought pieces of horses in The Stable and made money, more often than not, they have taken that money and spent it on the purchase of more horses in The Stable. As we who have been in the horse business know, it can be quite addicting."

The stable now numbers in the area of 100 horses. Once the Indiana and Harrisburg Sales are concluded, there will probably be 110 or slightly more. Approximately two thirds will likely be coming 2-year-olds.

In 2019, Anthony and Amy MacDonald were awarded the Cam Fella Award by Standardbred Canada for extreme effort and dedication to Canadian harness racing.

It has been a long, sometimes, but rarely, arduous road that has led Anthony and his wife Amy to managing the largest number of group owned racing harness horses in the sport.

Let's start at the beginning. Most people would think that you come from a harness racing background.

"I would say yes and no — mostly no. My dad, Fred, was a college professor in Prince Edward Island where the family lived.

"In PEI it seems that most everyone has some sort of affiliation to harness racing. They own a horse, know someone who owns or are directly involved with horses. My dad always owned a horse or two. My mom Gail was a track photographer. We were always exposed to horses, but were not necessarily involved with them. There are six of us, all boys, of the six, four of us ended up making horses our full time vocation."

Let's talk about your brothers in order of age.

"Lloyd — He had a horse racing show when he was younger. He didn't ever race but was interested in racing. He was always very

handy and capable. He was never very far from a screwdriver and is always up to date in the latest form of technology. He is very much like Curtis. Curtis would probably say that he and Lloyd have learned a great deal from each other. He has a business in Ottawa where he practices his craft.

"Bobby — He is not a blood brother, but he is everything but. All of us look upon him as being one of us. He is a blacksmith and a darn good one.

"Anthony — The black sheep of the family. Not really. But I would say that of the three of us that ultimately became trainer/drivers, probably the one with the least natural talent. If there is something that all of the PEI MacDonald brothers possess, it is drive and passion for the horses and the sport. I can't say that I have more of those attributes than Mark and James, but I can say with absolute certainty that they don't have any more than me.

"Mark — A great driver and a person possessed of more true grit than anybody I know. Mark was the first to leave the nest of PEI and went to work for Mike MacDonald at Windsor Raceway. He began driving sporadically and his natural talent caught the eye of Bob McIntosh. Bob began using him to drive for his powerful stable and Mark quickly became the leading driver at Windsor and shortly throughout Ontario. Most drivers have hit the ground and have occasionally been banged up, but it has happened to Mark more than anybody I know. Not only has he been banged up a lot, but terribly so. I remember one accident where every bone in his face was broken. I went to visit him in the hospital and literally did not recognize him. That was the first bad spill, but there were others. Each time he was able to get off the ground and come back swinging. Mark is unique in that he is incredibly adaptable. He can drive anywhere and with any kind of horse.

"Curtis — He, along with Lloyd, are the technology savants of our family. They are both incredible in that area. I use Curtis as a videographer for our horses in training. He also developed a system for using drones to capture the horses in action. His work is varied and includes being used by racetracks to improve and modify their systems.

"James — One might think that with his older brothers so active in the sport, James would have been involved from the very beginning. The opposite was the case. He never showed much interest in the horses until he was 20 or so. Through his teenage years he did what most teenagers do, he went to school and screwed around. He eventually realized that he had to do something with his life so he came to work for me. I was tough on him. Actually all of my brothers have always been tough and very competitive with each other.

"If one were looking for the definition of what is a natural as far as drivers are concerned, then James personifies it. He has incredibly soft hands and an extraordinary soft touch with horses. As he began driving, he followed Mark's lead. He rose through the ranks to where he is now arguably the top driver in Ontario. He is certainly in any such conversation. He drove a bit in the States against the best in New Jersey and Pennsylvania this summer and proved that he could drive anywhere."

Let's speak more specifically about you as a trainer/driver.

"I would say that I've paid my dues. I am neither the best, nor the worst horseman ever. I followed Mark to Windsor Raceway where I also worked for Mike MacDonald. I then went to Montreal where I worked for a good horseman named Jean Beaulieu. Mike MacDonald had come to Montreal from Windsor, so I went back to work for him. Mike was a great teacher and a great horsemen. He was also tough. He threw compliments around as though they were manhole covers. If he gave you a compliment, it was a certainty that you earned it. He started using me to drive some of his horses. I took that to mean that I at least could do an okay job.

"I then started my own stable, I first began in Ottawa and got my driving start in Belleville, then I went to Windsor where I had a small stable and worked for Jack Darling. I then moved to Mohawk where I headquartered for some time.

"I was getting by, winning my share of races, doing okay and surviving. Then came 2012 and the Liberal government announcement that they were pulling out of the SARP (Slots At Racetracks Program) agreement and were going to stop helping racing in Ontario in any way, shape or form. I, as well as most of the horsepeople in Ontario were crushed. We held rallies and did pretty much everything that we felt we could do to help change the way the tide towards horse racing was turning."

You then decided to enter politics. How did that go?

"It was an adventure. I ran as the Progressive Conservative candidate in Guelph. Looking back, I can see that I probably didn't stand a chance. I still managed to finish second. I was running against a well-established foe (the sitting education minister) who had represented the district for a long time. Through my campaign, I visited every single household in the constituency, I would guess at least 12,000 homes. Guelph is within an hour's drive of four functioning racetracks, yet it seemed that hardly anybody that I spoke with even knew that we or harness racing existed. Although I probably didn't realize it at the time, therein was probably where the genesis for The Stable began. We of course lost the election and I had to go back to work training and driving horses. I realized that something had to change. I was



getting by, but just that. I had to do something different. I came up with the idea for The Stable. Through my visits to people when I was running for election there were two main things I learned about our sport: (1) Virtually no one knew of our existence. (2) Those few that did, were certain that they could not afford to become involved even if they were interested in doing so."

So, you asked yourself, how do we fix that problem?

"I'd be lying if I said that the concept of The Stable was entirely for the truly altruistic purpose of benefitting harness racing. I would also, if not primarily, be helping myself. I didn't have many owners. Moreover, I didn't know many people who could afford to buy and maintain a whole or several horses. I thought though that I could find many people who might be able to buy small parts of horses. I decided to concentrate on yearlings. We would try to buy the dream and hopefully have fun trying to do it. We could begin with the young horse and all of us would hopefully grow with developing that baby. From the very beginning I made it clear that this wasn't going to be an investment made to make money. It wasn't an investment in the accepted sense at all. Buying a piece of a horse would be a means to having fun and enjoyment. If by some quirk of fate, we made some money, that would be great. From the very beginning I felt that good communication would be the key to the venture's success."

You now have the dream, what did you do?

"Communicate. I let people know what we were planning to do primarily through social media. I got in touch with several breeders offering to work with them on yearlings that they felt they couldn't get fair value for. The response from the public was better than anticipated. We developed some software which would enable both us and our partners to know where we stood from a financial standpoint at any given point in time. I started going to the yearling sales looking for value. I was spending money that I already had in hand or which had been pledged to the program. I was probably playing a dangerous game, but thankfully it all worked out well and those that said they were coming in, did. So did a few breeders who liked the concept and supported it.

"Our first year, we had 30 horses in training and maybe 85 clients who owned them with us. We had a fairly good year at the races. Throughout the time leading up to the racing aspect of the venture, we regularly kept in touch with our partners through email, video transmissions and welcomed everybody to come see them train. I considered it a huge success We have continued doing so, adding various bells and whistles periodically such as overhead videos taken by drones. People just love it. We have lost some partners as any business would, but their time spent with us has drawn many back in. We have also thankfully gained more along the way."

So, you get a catalog from a sale, what do you do next?

"I try to attend as many sales as I possibly can. I concentrate on the pedigrees of those that interest me. I look at them and then set a value to those that I'd potentially bid on. My primary goal when buying is value. You can find just as much value in a high priced horse as you can in a cheaper one. I've found that speaking in general terms its usually easier to sell shares in a higher priced horse than it is in a cheaper one. This becomes more the case as we achieve greater success on the racetrack.

"Success on the track certainly helps with stable interest but the experience you get in being a part of the group itself is the ultimate reason for our high retention rates. It isn't necessarily from winning races. Thankfully each year has improved over the preceding one."

You mentioned that this year was your most difficult one from a practical standpoint.

"Indeed it was. We found ourselves in a very difficult situation. Ontario racing was for all intents and purposes shut down. I had to make a decision and had to make it quickly. Thankfully, we were in the position where our portfolio of horses was diversified, with roughly one tenth of them bring Ontario sired. We had quite a few Ohio and Pennsylvania breds with some New Jersey and New York sired ones as well. Amy and I decided that we had to get out of Dodge. We packed up the three kids, took both cars and made our way to Ohio. Amy said, 'We have no place to live.' 'We'll stay in a hotel until we get somewhere more permanent," I responded. We did that for three weeks. If you think that five people living in one room for any length of time is fun, I've got news for you, it isn't. We finally rented a home. Even though we are now back in Ontario we still have a lease through April on a home in Macedonia, OH.

"We set up Ohio as our home base. We raced there a lot. If we were racing elsewhere, we made plans to ship the horses to someone who we knew and trusted in the new locale. The bottom line was that we ended up having our most successful year ever on the racetrack. The kids, who we were most worried about, adapted extremely well. We raced a lot at the Ohio fairs and the entire family ended up having so much fun. When things got better in Ontario we came back and are here now."

It's yearling time again. You already have 47 and are planning on maybe having a total of 60. What's your schedule from now until the end of Harrisburg?

"I do about two to three hours of videos to our clients each

week. All of our partners have access to it on YouTube. We are always available, day and night to anybody that wants to communicate with either Amy or me, or both of us. The preferred method is probably email, but texting, telephone or any other means are also options. I still believe that communication is and should remain our biggest asset. I'll be in Indiana the latter part of this week while Amy will be at The Meadowlands with Threepointbluechip hopefully securing a place in the Breeders Crown finals, the following week (editor's note: he finished fourth in one of three eliminations, with James MacDonald driving, and is an also eligible for the final). He is somewhat special to us because he was our first six-figure yearling. I look at him as being somewhat emblematic of our entrance to the big time. After Harrisburg, we gather the troops and begin the dreams sequence one more time."

What is your preference trotters or pacers?

"Undoubtedly trotters. For these main reasons: I like a good horse, but there is something about a good trotter that is so appealing. If you have one that has a modicum of ability and stays on the trot, chances are that you will do fine with it. With pacers, you may think that you have one that is really good because he or she might be able to pace in 1:52. Then you will find one, or even a dozen, who will beat you going faster. I would quess that about 70 per cent of those we buy will be trotters."

In what geographical areas do you prefer to race?

"People generally like the areas where they have the most success. In our case that would probably mean Ohio. We've also done well in Pennsylvania, Ontario and Indiana. I'm not crazy about New York and New Jersey. It's very far to travel. The competition is very tough and New York in particular is such a big place. It really is tough to operate there and everywhere else."

Let's close off with your family.

"My wife Amy and our three kids Ava (10), Oliver (8) and Adeline (3) are the greatest thing that I could have ever envisioned. The ability to be with and spend a great deal of time with them has been by far the best thing to come out of this COVID disaster for me."

Thanks to Dot Schmidt and heroes of the past

I've received two fascinating emails from Ms. Dot Schmidt, in Australia. Ms. Schmidt has a far deeper knowledge of equine genetics in general, and standardbred pedigrees in particular, than I have, or does anyone else whom I know.

Ms. Schmidt points out the many problems that can come with inbreeding. There are two areas that can spell trouble. The first one is the sudden accentuation of visible physical flaws, such as a tendency for feet to turn out or turn in suddenly becoming a major, unfixable problem. Another example is bad feet, which in the inbred generation can mean chronic soreness.

The second area of perhaps even greater concern is the activation of a previously latent gene. That can mean a suddenly compromised immune system, with potentially fatal results. And another problem that inbreeding can create is a loss of fertility, especially in the male horse. It is a fact that inbreeding has caused a loss of heterozygosity (the variability factor) in the American trotter, which manifests itself in a loss of fertility in certain otherwise highly respected trotting stallions.

All of the examples cited here simply reaffirm the necessity to breed closely only with outstanding individuals, both conformation wise and with outstanding racetrack performance, i.e. superior speed. But with all these provisos granted, let me give you an example of the good results inbreeding can achieve.

One must start with this kid's definition of inbreeding. I call it inbreeding when the sum of the generations in which the same horse's name appears twice is six or less. That brings me to my first great horse, Noble Victory.

Noble Victory retired at the end of his 4-year-old season as the fastest racing trotter of all time. He went into the stud at five, at Lana Lobell Farms, and from his first crop of two-year-olds had two 2 minute performers.

To put this into perspective, this was the first time any standardbred sire, trotter or pacer, had two 2 minute horses from his first crop. For the record, the first pacer to hit that jackpot was Race Time. who stood at Castleton farm.

Noble Victory was sired by Victory Song, also a Castleton sire, who was by Volomite. His dam was Emily's Pride, by Star's Pride, and his grandsire was also Volomite. Thus, Noble Victory was 2×4 to Volomite, which adds up to six, which makes him inbred to Volomite.

I hasten to say that I don't recommend deliberately going closer than six just for the sake of doing so. The closer one breeds, the greater the chance that a flaw will be magnified rather than a desirable quality. The exception here occurs when you have two exceptional individuals, and the chances are their good qualities will prevail.

Going back to Noble Victory, he was the first standardbred to be sold for a million dollars when I syndicated him in 1965. That only happened because he lost the Hambletonian earlier that year, when he was the heavy favorite. A handshake deal had been made between Ken Owen, who owned Noble, and Walnut Hall Farm, to syndicate the horse for a million dollars, contingent upon him winning the big race.

As it happened, there were torrential rains that week at Du Quoin, and the clay track was a quagmire. Noble couldn't handle the heavy going, although his stablemate, Egyptian Candor, got through it slick as an eel and carried the day.

As an aside, Stanley Dancer drove Noble, as always, and he gave the winning drive on Egyptian Candor to his good friend, Del Cameron. This was before white driving pants became *de rigueur*, and before the race Dancer gave Cameron a pair of bright blue driving pants. After Cameron won the Hambletonian, in his new blue pants, Dancer insisted that Cameron didn't take that pair of pants off for the next three weeks.

Ms. Schmidt also picked up on my mention of CR Kay Suzie, and how much of her success was a reflection of Carl Allen's training prowess. I'm not sure how many horsepeople today realize the debt of gratitude we all own Allen for his invention of the trotting hobbles.

Allen was a truly Compleat Horseman, to plagiarize Isaac Walton's title of The Compleat Angler. He was not only a top trainer and driver, but he also was a competent blacksmith. It was while getting his tools and shoe irons ready to plate one of his trotters that he had an epiphany.

He suddenly realized that if he could design hobbles for his trotter's front legs and attach them to a spring on the front of his racing bike, he could shoe his horse with front shoes that were six ounces lighter than the ones he and everybody else used.

It's hard to understand today what a revolutionary step forward trotting hobbles were. Suddenly the betting public could bet on pari-mutuel trotting races, where for almost a century they hung back, because of the unpredictable breaks the trotters were prone to make.

Today, the trotting breed is truer than it's ever been, but yet there are still plenty of good trotters that wear hobbles. Not only do

they give the public the confidence they need to put their hard earned money down, but they let the drivers be more aggressive now that they don't have to keep them pulled together as they used to, even in the stretch drive.

This is all due to Carl Allen, who I'm proud to say was a good friend of mine. And the same is true for Rod Allen, whose first name supplies the "R" that always follows Carl's "C". A great family of great horsemen.

Speaking of great horsemen, I've several times pointed out how Ake Svanstedt is in a class by himself. In an age of specialization, Svanstedt trains at the highest level and drives just as well. And no one plays the game as deftly as he does, starting three and four horse entries in the biggest stakes, and picking up big purse checks with them even when they don't win.

But here in Kentucky we have our own version of Ake Svanstedt, a horseman who is both a top trainer and an equally good driver. That's Randy Jerrell, a modest man from the Kentucky boondocks who comes up with good horses every year that he makes on his one third mile track and then drives them just as well as any big name driver.

Somehow these days I find my thoughts returning to the long ago time when I was a very small part of the show horse world. In those days, two of the most successful horsemen were Tom Moore, who was a thin reed, well over six feet, and Garland Bradshaw, who on his tip toes was my height.

And here a quick digression regarding Tom's wife of the day, Donna. It was legend that she had actually taken several shots with her revolver at Tom for his suspected marital missteps.

I had known Donna back in my show horse days, so when I moved to Kentucky we renewed our friendship. Which led me to ask Donna what the truth was of the shooting legend.

"I went to that gal's apartment," she told me, "And there in the closet was Tom's second best pair of shoes. So I shot up her T.V. to let her know I'd been there."

Anyway, there was a futurity class at the Junior League show here in Lexington, and it devolved down to two yearlings, one of them Tom's, and the other Garland's, and the judge had them lined up side-by-side.

As the judge was going back and forth between the two colts, out of the side of his mouth, Garland said, "That long, tall boy don't need the money, judge, but I sure do."

There have been times down through the years when I've wanted to tell an imagined judge, "Them long, tall boys don't need the money, judge, but I sure do."

Views of points and pals

While driving to a farm in the Pennsylvania countryside to look at one of the yearlings on my Harrisburg list, he asked, "You always ask why I don't dive into the harness racing pool; let me turn the question around, why do you get involved every year?" I chirped, "To get rich."

"That's absurd. You would get rich quicker playing the accordion in a rap group. You lose money, but you keep trying. Why?"

"This sport is for dreaming. You gotta have dreams.

"To dream the impossible dream

To fight the unbeatable foe

To bear the unbearable sorrow

To run where the brave dare not go."

He winced, "Who does that? What sort of person breaks into show tunes driving a car?"

"The sort of person who buys yearlings. We are a very eclectic group."

"Seriously, you spend time and money on this hobby when you could spend on thousands of other preoccupations. Why this one? What's the pull?"

"I can think of a couple."

"Don't go into a money song and dance."

"Nah, the outside chance of making money is a carrot, but not a big enough carrot for even a person like me." I pondered his question for a few seconds and said, "Having a partner on the same wavelength is a biggie. We talk almost every day. Trey would not be in the sport as a solo act. I can tell you that with 100 per cent certainty."

"A cohort in foolhardiness is not a ringing endorsement."

"A cohort, coconspirator, or co-idiot makes the game more interesting. We find that picking a very good yearling from the annual crop is a tremendous challenge. We enjoy deluding each other that we know what we are doing. We have the sales, the bidding, and the early training. In good seasons, we have the racing to enjoy. Whether the horses are good or not so good, every year is a blast when you can share the ride. Some year we will hit the jackpot."

"Okay, I will cede that point. The RIGHT person to share a passion or hobby with can make almost anything fun."

"Absolutely. We have someone to push back against with our sales selections and our racing decisions. Lately, we each made a top ten list of reasonably priced purchases from various yearling sales catalogs. We may or may not buy one from our possible lists, but we keep the lists until the following year. Then it is a lot of fun looking back and seeing who had the better list, and we can boast or moan about our selections."

"That's rather a peculiar pastime."

"It's fun."

"A pal to play with, that's one reason. Give me another."

I thought for a second and then said, "Points."

"Points?"

"Yeah, when you race a horse in a stakes program, you need to pick a level where you think your horse can race competitively. Once you choose the level, you need to race in several legs of a series where your horse attempts to accumulate points by finishing one through five in the various legs. The goal is to accumulate enough points to get into a final or a consolation race. No matter what level, from Sires Stakes to the Fair Circuit, I can't tell you how much we enjoy plotting the course of a horse."

"I don't get this. You enter your horse at a certain level and show up to race four times?"

I shook my index finger, "NO, it is so much more. Owners and trainers target these stakes races. You might change levels because you might find a consolation race a better target than the finals. Call me crazy, but I love the intrique."

"You are crazy, but intrique is good."

"This dynamic of having a series of races with a final makes owners focus on more than their horse. Suddenly, all the other horses, and all their performances, MEAN something. For me, this sort of competition opens the sport. It's kind of like a pennant race. Sure, your team needs to win, but the results of the others in your league are also important. It's sort of hard to explain until you have participated, but this part of racing is fascinating to us, especially when we have a pretty nice racehorse."

He nodded. "And each year is a new crop of competing horses."

"Yeah, and although I don't do overnight racing, when I notice the racetracks run a miniseries for aged horses, or a claiming derby with legs and a final, this sometimes shakes me out of my winter wagering hibernation. I wager money during the series because my approach is slightly different than a single race. Don't ask me why, but it is."

He said, "Points and pals, did not expect those reasons for your participation."

"I'm unpredictable, and by the way, my partner and I are still gonna get rich."

Always B Laughlin just misses world record in Simpson win

Always B Laughin and Easy To Please waged a fierce war through the stretch drive of a division of the Hardie Hanover, the John Simpson Sr. stake for th3ree-year-old pacing fillies, and when the limestone settled on Thursday afternoon (Oct. 21) at Harrah's Philadelphia, the Always B Miki filly Always B Laughin had a neck up at the end of a 1:48.4 mile. That time tied the divisional track record set by Party Girl Hill last year, and was only a fifth of a second off the divisional world record, set by Kiss Me Onthebeach at Pocono in 2016.

Always B Laughin flew away from the gate; Easy To Please was looped early and settled in the two-hole before the :26.1 quarter, but then moved in front of the stands to the lead before a hot :54.1 half. Favored Melania came uncovered down the back-stretch but flattened before the 1:21.2 three-quarters; Always B Laughin vacated the pocket under Todd McCarthy's direction at headstretch, and though Easy To Please fought gamely, Always B Laughin had stronger steps late in taking a new mark.

The new recordholder had been having a decent early career, with earnings close to \$60,000, when she was purchased by Ohioan James Morris at the end of September, and has been unstoppable since: first a 1:49.4 win in a Dayton (OH) overnight for Team Noble, and then this mile after coming east and going under the care of Antonia Storer.

In their recent Championship section of the Kentucky program, High Minded and So Irresistible traded 1-2 finishes in the first two prelims, and then in the third prelim and final they traded 3-4 end placings. So it was no surprise that they hooked up again as they came north for a Hardie Hanover stakes showdown, and **High Minded** gave driver Todd McCarthy an event double and became the only Liberty Bell – Simpson series double winner among the fillies with a mile in 1:51.

The victorious Captaintreacherous filly used the pole to advantage and set fractions of :26.3, :55.3, and 1:23.1. So Irresistible and Todd's brother Andrew had to come on the grind and made life tough for the favored winner, but High Minded prevailed by a neck for trainer Linda Toscano, whose Camelot Stable shares ownership in the winner of \$231,987 with Fred Wallace, The Bay's Stable LLC, and Steve Stewart.

So Miki Hanover has now won four of her last five starts after the daughter of Always B Miki went the uncovered route but still paced by leader (:26.3, :54.4, and 1:22.1) Chase Lounge in setting a new mark of 1:50.1. Corey Callahan guided the in-form filly, who won by a half-length, for trainer Jake Leamon and owners Michael Cimaglio, William Salmeri, and Charles Elliott.

In the faster division of the Simpson Stakes for this group's trotters, known as the Elma, the Donato Hanover miss **Melania** rewrote her lifetime record to 1:53.3 by rallying out of the pocket for a three-quarter length victory over favored Hot As Hill. A Hopeful Prayer had parked the winner to a :27.1 opener before yielding, and Melania in turn relinquished command to trail Hot As Hill through mid-splits of :55.4 and 1:24.4. Melania proved the stronger of the top two late in winning for trainer/driver Åke Svanstedt and owner Dr. Patty Hogan.

In the other Elma cut, the Bar Hopping filly **Pub Crawl** made the lead quickly from the outside post six, recorded fractions of :28.1,:57.2, and 1:25.4, then powered off to win by three lengths in 1:54. A winner of \$395,075 in her career including several Grand Circuit events, Pub Crawl was driven by Andy Miller for trainer/wife Julie and the ownership of Marvin & Lynn Katz, Al Libfeld, and Sam Goldband.

There was \$201,200 worth of John Simpson Sr. stakes series action for sophomore colts on Friday afternoon (Oct. 22) at Harrah's Philadelphia – the Albatross stake for pacers and the Ayres stake for trotters.

The five horses from these groups who won divisions of their Liberty Bell stakes earlier in the fall were all in to go on Friday, in separate divisions.

None of them had raced since their Liberty Bell triumphs on Oct. 1 – an absence of 21 days.

All five of them went off at 3-1 or less – three of them were odds-on favorites.

All five of them lost. And every Simpson division was won by a horse who had raced since Oct. 1.

Starting with the pacers in the Albatross, the American Ideal gelding **Town Gossip** won the swiftest of the three divisions, going down the road with fractions of :27, :55.1, and 1:21.4, then responded to driver Joe Bongiorno's urging to finish out

with a new mark of 1:49.3, 2½ lengths ahead of Always A Miki; Liberty Bell winner South Beach Star was fourth. Town Gossip, coming off a 1:51.4 win at Yonkers on October 12, is trained by Jenn Bongiorno for owner Robert Weinstein, and now has earnings of \$424,919.

The next pacing division saw LB winner Whichwaytothebeach, 2-3 in the Jug and triumphant locally, having to settle for third behind the Captaintreacherous colt **Red Right Hand**, who dropped his lifetime best a tick to 1:50. Dexter Dunn had this colt, a 1:50.1 winner here on October 15, on the lead past the :27.1 quarter, then put up mid-splits of :54.3 and 1:21.3 before holding off His Beats Hanover by 1½ lengths. Trainer Nancy Takter and her ownership partner JAF Racing LLC are in the group behind the improving three-year-old with Christina Taker, Joe Sbrocco, and R A W Equine Inc.

Adios winner Hellabalou tried his luck in the third Bret Hanover division, but having to go uncovered in a race with fractions of :26.1,:55.4, and 1:23 set by Bettor Of The West took just enough out of him that pocket-sitter **Toronto** got up the inside late to defeat the favorite by three-quarters of a length in 1:50. A sharp 1:49.1 winner in a recent overnight, the winning altered son of Always B Miki (out of the well-remembered mare See You At Peelers) was driven by Marcus Miller for trainer Robert Cleary and Royal Wire Products Inc.

The Ayres trotting stakes could prove no more a springboard for repeat local stakes winners. Sunny Crockett got a good trip behind the Muscle Hill colt **Mon Amour**, who put up early fractions of :27.3 and :57.1, then came home in :56.1 to complete the 1:53.2 package, with Sunny Crockett five lengths back. Mon Amour, fifth in the Kentucky Futurity, has amassed earnings of \$202,850; he is trained and was driven by Åke Svanstedt for the long-time partners Al Libfeld, Marvin and Lynn Katz, and Sam Goldband.

Next to try his luck was Capstone, but he chose to sit the pocket behind stablemate Lepanto cutting fractions of :27.4, :57, and 1:25.3, and when that one faded he was badly shuffled and eventually broke. Taking advantage was the Credit Winner gelding **Dee's Red Delicious**, coming off a creditable finish from post eight against older horses at Pocono, and he grinded to the lead and won in 1:54.4. The winner of \$323,670 was driven by Matt Kakaley for trainer Travis Alexander and owner Joseph Martinelli Sr.

The third Ayres division had no Liberty Bell–winning horses, but it did have a recently-raced winner in the Bar Hopping colt **Arnold N Dicky**, a 1:53.1 winner here on Oct. 8. Victor Kirby sent this talented trotter frontward and to the lead past a :27.3 quarter, and after middle fractions of :56 and 1:24 he finished out in

1:52.4, only 3/5 of a second shy of the local divisional standard set by Googoo Gaagaa. Trainer Chuck Sylvester co-owns the \$212,683 career earner with Amy Stoltzfus and Linda Goldman.

Ducharme starting 10 in the \$800,000 MASS finals at Plainridge Park

The \$2.24 million Massachusetts Sire Stakes (MASS) program wraps up its 2021 season at Plainridge Park on Monday (Oct. 25) when eight races valued at \$100,000 each will be contested and one local trainer will have a major presence once again.

George Ducharme is a native of Walpole, MA who started his career at Foxboro Park. Aside from winning the \$1 million Hambletonian with Royalty For Life in 2013 and racing regularly on the Grand Circuit, Ducharme has continued to compete in Massachusetts on a regular basis and has been a major participant in that sire stake program for years.

This year Ducharme has 10 starters competing in six of the eight divisions including some eye-catching first-year performers who appear to have a bright future.

Wallet (Walner—Touch Of Moni) is a 2-year-old trotting colt that is three-for-three in MASS action this year. This lightly raced colt who is from the first crop of Walner has improved dramatically over the past three weeks, taking three consecutive lifetime marks and setting a new track record of 1:57.2 for his age, sex and gait.

"Wallet has turned into the horse I always thought he could be as he had a lot of trouble at first. A lot of his problems were growing issues. He wasn't lame, he was achy because he was growing and he seems to have leveled out and come along at the right time. He went a record mile last week but I think he has more in him and we'll see this week," said Ducharme.

Another freshman star is Wonderwall Lindy (Walner–Lindy'sleadinglady) who has two wins and a second in stake action and who also just took a new lifetime mark of 1:56.1 that set a new Plainridge track and MASS record for 2-year-old trotting fillies.

"Wonderwall Lindy has come along well. She started out a little head-strong but she seems to be finally maturing and mentally putting it together. She has enough physical ability, it was the mental part that was bugging us early. She raced in the Kindergarten series at the Meadowlands earlier this year where she picked up a couple checks, but she has really come into her own in this series. The fillies she's in against are a good honest group, there are three or four legitimate horses in there who could win this race," said Ducharme.

"I also have Tenesee Lindy (Muscle Hill—Nashville Lindy) in that race and she performed very well last week. She had a lot of trot under the wire and had nowhere to go so I was very happy with her effort. She's coming into this race as good as the other ones but I think it's just a matter of trip, as to who wins."

Ducharme also has a pacing pair of full sisters in 3-year-old So Amazing and 2-year-old So Flo, who both bring a lot of speed and a lot of attitude. They are by So Surreal out of Teddy Ballgirl and are at the top of their respective divisions.

"So Amazing has been very good for two years now but this is a wide open field with about five horses who could win it all because there is not one real standout. And they know each other well because they have competed against each other in the New York Sire Stakes all year too. So Amazing was very good last week racing from off the pace but she likes the front and she drew the rail this week so that favors her to be positioned well. Plus she's had a good week of work," said Ducharme.

So Amazing held the MASS record of 1:53.2 for 3-year-old pacing fillies after the first week of competition, but it has since been broken two more times by this uber-competitive group of fillies.

"So Flo has a lot of talent but ever since the day we broke her, she's a severe kicker in the bike or a jog cart. But when she keeps her mind on her business she has excellent speed. The second leg of this series she tried to kick Frank (Affrunti, her driver) out of the bike in the second turn and when she landed back pacing, ended up finishing second anyway. The key to her is if she behaves herself," said Ducharme.

Ducharme is also starting 2-year-old trotting colt With A Warning (Credit Winner—Concentration), 3-year-old trotting colts Beantown Madness (Conway Hall—Armbro Archer) and Royally Raised (RC Royalty—Prospect) and 3-year-old trotting fillies Royal Orchard (RC Royalty—Easy Glider) and Royal Envy (RC Royalty—Temper Of Will),

Ducharme currently has 997 career training wins, only three away from the 1,000 win milestone and it's a good bet that he could achieve that goal in his home state at Plainridge Park in stake action on Monday.

Two of the eight finals are non-betting races and will be held before the regular card at 1:30 p.m. and 1:45 p.m. Post time for the pari-mutuel program is 2 p.m.

More thoughts on the struggling business

I decided to broach the subject again, prompted by a discussion on Facebook about new sulkies causing more favorites to win, causing less people to gamble on the sport. Yes, this has merit, BUT these are tweaks made to a successful or somewhat successful product. Our product is far from successful.

Those who attend racing are broken into basically three types; Loyalist, \$2/fun bettors and gamblers.

Harness loyalists, those that go just to bet harness, are not enough to keep harness racing going. I don't think anyone can argue that. There just aren't enough guys who go regularly anymore.

\$2 bettors are \$2 dollar bettors. They come for fun, watch the pretty bay, have a beer and a hotdog. They do not generate enough money and they will never become \$100 bettors.

GAMBLERS, \$100 to \$1,000 a night bettor, that's your target! That's who was lost since the '80s.

In my opinion the focus should be on WHY gamblers quit betting on harness and WHERE did they go.

We keep using 70s-80s as the benchmark. Times have changed since then. There is MORE competition. That's one of the "WHYs" they left.

WHERE? Casinos, sports betting, poker, etc. Gamblers are now

treated to fast paced games. More action, less dead time. It's easy to go into a casino and pull a handle every 10 seconds, or get dealt cards every five minutes or roll dice every two-to-three minutes. Yes, even sports betting has more action. You bet at the beginning of the game and then you watch the action. Take football, there are plays every 30 seconds. That's ACTION every 30 seconds on your bet. You can even make bets DURING the game... more action! It keeps you engaged. Gamblers want action!

What do we have? 10 or 15 minutes between races? Who the hell knows how much time it really is since we now post drag and just make the bettor wait even longer! BORING!

And I get that racing has changed. More front-end winners, more short prices, more short fields, etc. I've been betting harness for 48 years. I've seen it. But those are NOT the main reasons people left or why we can't attract new people. It's that the competition is more attractive.

I played poker occasionally and I run into harness guys from the 80-90s and when I say, "don't see you there anymore", their response is, "This is more fun. More action."

The other WHY is the integrity of the sport. The competition offers an "honest" bet. Way too easy to cheat in racing than what the competition offers. We desperately need to fix that image! In my opinion, that's the biggest reason they won't come back.

I wish I had the "end all" answer, but I don't. I can tell you, we must clean up the sport, prove that it's on the up and up. Provide new types of betting that cause excitement. I don't know... maybe a Pick 3 that consists of two races and a sports bet. Maybe a race exacta. Winner at the half and the race winner. Maybe the time of the race parlayed with the winner. There are sports apps that calculate odds for anything... Let's tap into that. I don't know... something different.

It's time to progress. Move forward. Going back to the 1980's bike. The 2:00 minute mile. Just so we can go down to 25 per cent favorites? Which may raise the win prices from \$3.60 to \$7.20 or even \$12.00? I don't think that's going to bring enough gamblers through your doors to make you a thriving business again.
