Chris and Nicola Ryder: harness racing's power couple

Harness racing can thank Nicola Ryder for bringing her husband, Chris, to the United States where he has thrived as a trainer with Hall of Fame credentials.

TALES FROM THE CURMUDGEON with Murray Brown

If there is a finer couple in all of harness racing than Chris and Nicola Ryder, I have yet to meet them. Chris is a well-known and extremely successful horse trainer with Hall of Fame credentials.

What very few people realize — and what I just recently found out — is that if not for Nicola, its' quite possible that North American harness racing might not have benefitted from Chris' achievements here.

Chris and Nicola arrived on these shores from their native New Zealand in 1989, not because Chris was going to pursue his livelihood as a trainer and at that time also a driver of harness horses, but rather because Nicola, a certified accountant, had been transferred to the United States by Ernst & Young one of the world's big four accounting firms.

Actually Chris arrived, not with the intention of being a trainer/driver, but rather wanting to be an agent in the sale and purchase of horses.

He had been here before for several short periods where

he was involved in the sale of Down Under racehorses.

He describes life as a horse agent as being much easier than being a trainer. When selling horses you are not much more than a conduit in a transaction.

You arrange for a buyer and seller, collect your commission and then it's off to the next horse.

You don't have to worry about the health of your horses, the help showing up, dealing with owners, stakes payments and getting your bills paid.

Unfortunately, it turned out that there was not enough business to sustain life as an agent.

Chris was nowhere near a novice when it came to training horses. His father had been a successful horse trainer and horse dealer in New Zealand, meaning Chris has been around horses all of his life.

Adapting to being a trainer was virtually a gimme.

"He who doesn't work goes hungry," Chris said.

Chris, like many successful people, describes himself as being a lucky guy.

The couple's original plan called for them to be in the U.S. for two years, which then stretched to five years and they now are both citizens and permanent residents of the United States.

Among his first clients was Sampson Street Stable, AKA Lou Domiano.

His first real good horse that he trained for Domiano and Matt Meizinger was Sealed N Delivered who became Two-year-old Pacing Colt of the Year.

That same horse was responsible for Chris' greatest disappointment in the business. He had jogged in his Meadowlands Pace elimination winning it in 1.50.

In the final, he went off at 6-5 as the overwhelming favorite. He finished last in a race that went two seconds slower than the elimination had.

The horse had choked in the first turn. Such are the perils of horse racing.



Chris' best day ever occurred just two weeks ago on the last day of the Grand Circuit meeting at Lexington on Sunday, Oct. 11.

Over an off track, Bettor's Wish annihilated the best free-for-allers in the country in winning the Allerage Farms Open Pace. Also, Party Girl Hill remained undefeated while crushing the boys in winning her Tattersalls Pace division.

Because of his quiet and generally unassuming nature, Chris is sometimes inclined to glide under people's radar. But from the beginning he has been a force with which to be reckoned.

Chris, your best racing day ever was two Sundays ago when Bettors Wish and Party Girl Hill both put on magnificent shows. It will never happen, but which one would win if they were in to race together?

"I think he'd probably beat her, but not by much, if in fact





he would. The jump between 3 and 4 would give him a huge edge."

Chris you have been inordinately successful with horses that haven't cost a great deal or who at a given point in time might not have been thought to have a superlative pedigree. Most of your success has been achieved through purchasing yearlings and making good and sometimes great horses out of them. What do you look for in a yearling?

"Of course, I want them to be correct, but there are certain what I deem to be minor faults that I can put up with. I like an athletic horse. They don't have to be big, but I want them to appear strong and well proportioned. I like a horse to appear alert. I don't want a dullard. I am not one for seeing horses turned out in the paddock. On the other hand, I am big on watching videos. I guess many trainers put a great deal of credence into seeing them in a paddock. That probably helps the first or second time a yearling has been turned out. But after they have been turned out numerous times they get tired of it and often do not perform to their best. I realize that videos can be edited, but you cannot make a bad going horse go well. One of the reasons I like videos is when they are taken, it is usually fairly early in the time that they have been in. Logic tells me that they are at their most athletic phase at that time."



You mentioned that you can put up with some minor faults what are they?

"Size is one thing. A yearling is just a baby. They are going to grow. Of course, I don't want a peanut. But I have no problem with one who many would consider to be slightly small, especially if it isn't an early foal and is otherwise okay.

"I can put up with offset knees and sickle or straight hocks providing they are not so in the extreme.

"I once was given a small Presidential Ball filly with quite offset knees to train because the owner felt that she wouldn't bring much in a sale. She turned out to be Cathedra Dot Com."

Certainly from my experience and from what I've seen and heard you are considered one of those guys who is extremely patient and can get along with virtually anybody. I assume that you train your horses in the same manner. You've had some owners who some might consider to be difficult, yetyou've managed to keep them for longer than most have.

"I can get along with most people. As long as they are fair. I've been asked how I managed to get along with and kept Norman Smiley and Richard Young for as long as I did. I considered them both to be excellent owners. They wanted a fair shake and that is what I gave them. I still consider both of them to be my friends."

Let's talk about some of your best horses.

Bettors Wish - "He's just a wonderful horse. I still don't really understand how I got him as reasonably priced as I did. Some people say he is small. But he is no smaller than Betting Line or even Bettors Delight himself. He had a very good video and the price was right. He's all heart and all class. He just keeps on giving."

Party Girl Hill - "Her owner describes her as a Gift from God. I think that's a good description. She's just amazing. She's the best filly I, or possibly anyone, has ever had. That's saying a lot because I've been blessed with more than my fair share of good fillies."

Mystical Sunshine - "She turned out to be much better than we ever dreamed she would become. We bought her as a 2-year-old from the Harrisburg sale for Alvin Jacobson. She was as honest a trotter as you will find. She ended up winning two Breeders Crowns for us."

Put On A Show - "She was extremely fast, but a little tricky to train. She might have done better, but she was prone to tying up. We were actually lucky to get her. Richard Young was primarily focused on an Artsplace filly. Put On A Show was his second choice. The Artsplace filly sold first and ended up bringing \$120,000 and Richard was the under

bidder on her. Put On A Show sold a little later and Richard bought her for \$75,000."

I Luv The Nitelife - "She was a wonderful filly, Tough as Nails. She never lost a race once she made the top. Timmy Tetrick did a wonderful job with her."

Sealed N Delivered - "A big surprise. Nobody, least of all me, expected him to turn out as good as he became. He had high, high speed. He was the 2-year-old of his year. He unfortunately had a disappointing 3-year-old season."

McArdle - "A beautiful horse. I thought he was the nicest yearling Perretti had that year. But he was by Falcon Seelster and I guess that turned some people off. Norman Smiley bought him for a bargain \$32,000. He was a real warrior on the racetrack. It seemed he always drew bad. He won the Haughton out of the 10 hole."

Cathedra Dot Com - "She wasn't sold as a yearling because she was small, had bench knees and was by Presidential Ball. Here's an interesting tidbit. Both she and Bunny Lake each won over a million dollars at 3 the same year."

Art Major - "I had him at 2 and he just kept tying up. I couldn't do much good with him. Bill Robinson got him at 3 and trained him every day and he became a top horse."

Chris, You were the first person to use Dexter Dunn regularly and I understand that to a great degree you and Nicola were responsible for him being here.

"To a small degree I suppose we were. Dexter had been over here in the World Drivers Championship and liked what he saw. We built a friendship with him and knew from seeing him drive and hearing of his exploits in New Zealand that he would be able to handle himself on any racetrack anywhere. Nicola helped him with an immigration lawyer and the paperwork necessary to get him able to stay here. When he first came over, he stayed with us for awhile. I started using him immediately. The association has benefitted both of us."

Okay, Chris, I've had enough of you. I'm going to spend some time with the person responsible for a good part of your success, your wife Nicola.

Nicola, You are the reason that Chris is here. You've helped him and continue to do so with the business aspect, but you also have been personally involved in the harness business. You've worked at Perretti Farms for the last 12 years and still are there as the farm manager. How did this come about?

"Our two boys, Patrick and Samuel, had grown up and I no longer needed to be at home to care for them. I was looking for something to do. At the same time, Perretti Farms was looking for a bookkeeper. With my experience in accounting I felt I was qualified and applied and was hired."

Chris told me an interesting story of how that came about.

"Well, I had previously worked in New York and was used to making more money than what they were offering. I told Mr. Perretti that I would take the job only if the salary was 50 per cent more than what they were offering. Bill said, 'This girl has spunk. I like that. Pay her what she is asking."

You mentioned your boys, tell us about them.

"Patrick is 26 and Samuel is 24. They were both born in America. Patrick is married to Nadia and they just recently bought a home in Colorado Springs. Before going out there, he decided that he would like to spend a season on the road working with the horses with his dad. What a great season he chose! He's been on the road with Party Girl Hill and has

enjoyed every minute of her fantastic season. Samuel is living in Lakeland, Florida where he is working at Merrill Lynch."

Unlike the wives of many trainers, you are almost always a presence at horse sales with Chris.

"I've come to really love the horses, but Chris does all the work at the sales. My job, if I have one, is to help keep him organized and try keep him focused on the ones that he and perhaps more importantly, his owners want him to look at."

You've been at Perretti farms all this time making sure that it continues to be well maintained as Bill and Cindy wish it to be. It's my understanding that it has been sold.

"The sale is not quite completed yet, but it's fairly likely that it will be sold in the very near future."

I'll end, as I began this column. There are no nicer people in this entire business than Chris and Nicola Ryder. If you make their acquaintance, you will undoubtedly be enhanced by the experience.

2020 YEARLING SALE

Hoosier Classic Yearling Sale grosses more than \$6.91 million; average up 6.5 per cent


Uncertainty has marked much of horse racing in 2020, and has filtered into the sales arena. Leading into the Hoosier Classic Yearling Sale at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, consignors were uncertain as to what Indiana-sired trotters and pacers would bring in the marketplace. Saturday afternoon (Sept. 24), at the conclusion of the two-day session, it was clear that despite the pandemic, money was still available to spend on top-quality babies. Last year, the Hoosier Classic sale made history in selling a pair of trotters for \$175,000 apiece. This year, JK's Speed, a colt from the second crop of JK Endofanera eclipsed that standard in the opening session, purchased by Nancy Takter for 3 Brothers Stable for \$240,000. She also bought another colt from the sire, Royal JK, for \$115,000. Victory Hill Farm consigned both colts and stands JK Endofanera for 3 Brothers Stable, who owns and campaigned the double millionaire.

"We thought they were our two nicest colts. Our expectations were nothing like what they brought," said a surprised Maria King, who owns Victory Hill with her husband, Jeff. "The JK's have raced very well. We're very excited about that. When you breed three years ahead of time, you have no way of knowing what will be in demand. If the JK's didn't race well, they wouldn't have attracted the attention.

"With the way this year has been, I'm just so grateful that we've been able to keep racing and sell horses and continue on. I think that's great that we can stay where we were last year or be a little better."

Offspring of JK Endofanera and trotting stallion Swan For All led the way during a two-day sale that produced a 6.5 per cent increase in average over 2019 levels. A total of 360 yearlings passed through the ring, grossing just over \$6.91 million and averaging \$19,202. Last year Hoosier Classic Sale Company LLC sold 358 yearlings for a gross of \$6.45 million and average of \$18,028. This year's average still trails numbers from 2017 (\$19,527) and 2018 (\$19,449) when the median reached \$15,000, up from the \$12,000 achieved this

weekend.

"I am amazed at the resilience of horsemen as they continue to forge ahead and stay focused on brighter days ahead," said sale manager Steve Cross. "I'm very optimistic about the Indiana program as Grand Circuit owners continue to buy into the program."

A group of 48 sired by JK Endofanera sold Friday and Saturday, bringing a gross of nearly \$1.34 million and

averaging \$27,900. Spurred by the success of his first crop, auctioneers hammered down two dozen colts for an average of \$38,021, while another 24 fillies averaged \$17,779. The sale topper, cataloged as Hip #116, is out of 100 per cent producing Always A Virgin mare Safta Perry. The colt is a brother to Rockin Speed, a gelded son of Rockin Image with a mark of 1:49.1 and earnings exceeding \$280,000. Royal JK, Hip #105 in the catalog, is a brother to Little Rocket Man, now co-owner of the all-age track record at Harrah's Hoosier Park and winner of \$288,530. Besides the pair of six-figure colts, the sire produced four other yearlings that brought \$50.000 or more.

Swan For All yearlings are always in high demand, and the trend continued this weekend with two bringing six figures. Happy Space, part of the Wilt Standardbred consignment as Hip #150, fetched \$112,000, sold to S & R Racing Stable. The filly is the first foal from a Muscles Yankee mare that is a sister to Somebody To Love, a winner of more than \$600,000 in her career. Bo DeLong purchased Swan Captain, cataloged as Hip #184, for a \$100,000 final bid. The colt is a brother to Father Patrick filly Shishito (\$297,383) and Warrior One (\$191,526). Cumulatively, 47 Swan For All progeny passed through the sale ring, grossing \$1.32 million and averaging \$28,085, with colts averaging less than \$1,000 more than the fillies.

The first crop of Dover Dan was well received by buyers Friday and Saturday. A total of 42 offspring from the trotter were auctioned for an average slightly under \$20,000. A quartet garnered bids of \$50,000 or more led by Hip #81, Ponda Gonzalez. Consigned by Pond A Acres, the colt is a brother to Indiana Sires Stakes final winner Ooh La Lala, and the dam, Dandelion Dust, is a sister to millionaire Hez Striking and Tady Strikes Again. Tom Pollack made the final bid for \$65,000.

Lady Bellatrix, a sister to Kaks Rockin (\$69,939) and freshman JK She's Gordjus (\$52,242) led a group of eight sired by Odds On Equuleus. Bluebird Meadows consigned the filly, purchased by Brian Brown for \$50,000. First crop sire Luck Be Withyou was represented by 41 babies sold for an average of \$10,097. Fox Valley Monaco, a colt consigned by Walker Standardbreds topped the group with a \$30,000 final bid. Benita Simmons signed the ticket.

DeLong spent the most of any buyer over the course of two days. The Clinton, WI resident signed a dozen slips totaling \$460,000. Pollack purchased seven yearlings. He fell short in an attempt to land the sale topper, but went to \$82,000 on Shared By Me, a JK Endofanera colt consigned by Victory Hill that topped the second session. All told, his purchases amounted to \$392,000.

Fifteen unexpected Breeders Crown moments through the years

1. If someone told you a horse had 28 wins in a career in which he also broke stride 27 times, you probably never would have guessed that horse is the single richest Breeders Crown performer ever. Fools Goal earned \$900,000 in Crown competition.

2. In 1991, nine horses over 30-1 hit the board in Breeders Crown finals:

Lou Macs Review — second in the Mare Trot at 41-1.

L Dees Trish — second in the Mare Pace at 33-1.

Ultra Jet — third in the Older Pace at 31-1.

Herschel Walker — third in the 2-year-old male trot at 38-1.

Bertha Lobell — second in the freshman female trot at 67-1.

Wee Caitlin — third in the 2yoft at 72-1.

Twelve Speed — first in the sophomore female trot at 65-1.

A Treat — second in the 3yoft at 49-1.

Gift Box — third in the sophomore male trot at 53-1.

3. Bettors Delight and Muscle Hill — sires of this year's Meadowlands Pace, North America Cup, Hambletonian and

Hambletonian Oaks winners — both are Breeders Crown winners themselves, as well as top sires, of course, Yet, neither has produced a Horse of the Year, yet.

- 4. Paul MacDonnell debuted in the Breeders Crown with a bang in 1990 winning with Bays Fella, paying \$140.60. Dan Dube debuted in the Crown in 1999 with Shore By Five winning and returning a healthy \$108.20. Dans' second Crown drive resulted in a fifth-place check at 74-1 that year. Why would that have any significance? The horse's name was Western Ideal.
- 5. Talk about out-racing your odds. In 2000, the sport's winningest driver, Dave Palone, had four Breeders Crown drives and posted the following results:

Panything Goes was fifth in the 3YOFP at odds of 70.15-1 No Pain No Gain was third in the 2YOFT at odds of 54.15-1 Ameripan Gigolo was last in the 2YOCP at odds of 57.55-1 On Line Service was third in the 3YOCT at odds of 49.25-1 THE ALL-TIME WINNINGEST DRIVER!


- 6. Blazin Britches won the 2017 Breeders Crown at Hoosier Park. She was the only Crown final winner not to get any money in his/her elimination, finishing seventh. She also started just once at 2 with no money there, either. Party Girl Hill will attempt to become the first Horse of the Year who did not race at 2.
- 7. Since 1985, take a look at this odd quirk the one that works very well in the favor of Tall Dark Stranger concerning the Breeders Crown and HOY:

1985 - Nihilator - Breeders Crown winner 3YOCP, HOY

1990 — Beach Towel — Breeders Crown winner 3YOCP, HOY

1995 — Jennas Beach Boy — Breeders Crown winner 3YOCP, HOY runner-up

2000 - Gallo Blue Chip - Breeders Crown winner 3YOCP,

2005 — Rocknroll Hanover — Breeders Crown winner 3YOCP, HOY

2010 — Rock Ns Roll Heaven — Breeders Crown winner 3 YOCP, HOY

8. Six of 36 Hambletonian winners have won the Breeders Crown at 3 also (16 per cent). That's a touch lower now that Ramona Hill has withdrawn.

9. Seven of 12 Crowns in 2015 went to a driver OVER 50 — John Campbell 60, Jimmy Takter 55, David Miller 50, who won five

In 2019, seven of 12 drivers who won a Breeders Crown were 33 or younger: Andrew McCarthy 33 won four, Dexter Dunn 30 won two and Joe Bongiorno 26 won one.

10. This really was Miller Time!

Four different drivers named Miller won the 2YOFP Breeders Crown in a five-year span:

2012 - Andy Miller - Somewhereovrarainbow

2013 - David Miller - Uffizi Hanover

2015 - Brett Miller - Pure Country

2016 - Marcus Miller - Someomensomewhere

11. In 1998, Walter Case, Jr. and David Miller combined for 1,810 wins as the top two dash-winning drivers in the country. Neither had a single Breeders Crown drive that year.

- 12. Brian Sears finished third with Midori Hanover for trainer Dave Smith in the 1998 Breeders Crown in his Crown debut, but then did not drive until 2003 in the series five years!
- 13. Thirty-nine different drivers drove in the 2001 Breeders Crown series. None were named Trevor Ritchie, who won three Breeders Crowns in 2000.
- 14. David Miller, Brian Sears and Ron Pierce were all 35 when they won their very first Breeders Crown.
- 15. Genuine Comfort finishing second at 46-1 was Jimmy Takter's first time on the board in a Breeders Crown final in the 1980s. Gleam in 1993 his first winner as a driver.

Breaking down the Breeders Crown elimination numbers

What did we learn from the Crown elims in preparation for next weekend's rich finals? Plenty.

It took exactly one Breeders Crown elimination on Saturday to show that when handicapping for the Breeders Crown championships next weekend, you better have two "mindsets" – a "Friday night mindset" and a "Saturday night mindset."

The temperature descended from the upper 60s near post time to just below 50 by the end of Friday night (Oct. 23) and the first round of eliminations. The winds were strong – according to the Internet, they averaged 15 mph, gusting to 25+. And it rained. Steadily, resulting in an off track and miserable conditions. (Hoosier's timing was unlucky, as on Thursday night they set two track records and had four miles in 1:49 or better.)

Saturday (Oct. 24) started off at 50 degrees, and was scheduled to descend to near 40 by the end of the night. So it was cooler a bit, but the wind forecast was only 7-10 mph, and in early races the flags did not seem to be standing out

as stiffly as during the night before. And there was no rain. A night much more conducive to speed.

As they used to say about top driver Alfred "Bucky" Day in New England, "What a difference A. Day makes!"

There was no second quarter during Friday night's Crown elims, straight into the howling wind and rain, that went faster than :28.4. (And that was from a 2-year-old trotter.) There was no third quarter faster than :27.4 (by a 2-year-old pacing filly).

Cattlewash went wire-to-wire in the first Crown elim of Saturday – with fractions of :26, :54.1, 1:20.3, 1:47.2. Second quarter in :28.1. Third quarter in :26.2 (1 2/5 seconds faster than any Friday third split). The end quarters were very good, not as extreme, but no strong tailwind. And the 1:47.2 equaled the all-age Hoosier record of Sweet Lou, Lather Up, and Little Red Man, who set their marks as older stock.

(Admittedly, **Tall Dark Stranger**, who made his patented move to the lead down the backstretch, was in a mile which had splits of :25.4, :28.4, :28.3, and :25.4. But if you were racing a horse who attracted \$21,768 of a \$24,578 show pool, you wouldn't be too anxious to go up against him, would you? And **Shartin N** went :27.3 in the third quarter, and was caught by the megasharp **Kissin In The Sand** only very late.)

On Friday night only one horse went wire-to-wire, the impressive 2-year-old trotting colt and Mohawk Million winner **Venerate**, who came home in :27.1 to win in 1:52.2, the only track record on that wet and windy night, and demolishing it by 1 3/5 seconds at that! (You may not want to give up on **Captain Corey** just yet: it was only his second race in 49 days, and he threw a boot in the stretch – he could well be better for his final, and he'll need to be if Venerate trots back to that mile).

Only two other horses on that night were on the lead at the half, and they were completing backstretch brushes – the heavy 2PC favorites **Southwind Gendry** and **Perfect Sting**. In fact, until the last overnight race of the night, no other horse who was on the lead at the three-quarters went on to win, either.

Cattlewash went in race five on Saturday – and his WTW win meant there would be more gate-to-wire winners on Saturday than there were all of Friday.

Favorites won four times in Friday's 15 races. The victory with **Bettor's Wish** in race seven was the fifth favorite to win Saturday – the night ended with the chalk taking 10 races, in one fewer race. And all of those winning favorites were either pacesetters or first-over.

Final proof of the effect Friday's weather had on the racing – how many races do you remember seeing that had TWO quarters under :26 AND a :30.4 quarter? Look up **Party Girl Hill's** charts. Wind-aided vs. wind-hindered. Give extra points to those who did well going against the rough weather.

* * *

Post four has a slight advantage over post five in the Hoosier seasonal statistics, with one and six tied next in line. Post nine's percentage is less than half of post four's percentage – and the trailing post 10's ratio isn't much above post nine's.

Which made Friday night's post position stats somewhat confusing in an analysis of post five. Fifteen races including overnights – zero wins, one second, zero thirds. One night can always be a fluke, of course. Post five didn't win in the first 12 Hoosier races on Saturday, either – but the 28thtime was a charm, as Amigo Volo set a track record of 1:51.2 for sophomore geldings in his Crown elimination, and missed the overall track trot mark by a tick.

* * *

On Friday night, admission to the winner's circle in the Crown elimination races was VERY tight. Tim Tetrick won four elims, David Miller won three, Dexter Dunn and Yannick Gingras won twice and Andy Miller won once. In fact, in the three overnights that rounded out the Friday card, the winning drivers were David Miller, Gingras, and Dunn.

And stop me if you've heard this before: Breeders Crown elim-winning drivers Saturday were Dunn (twice), Gingras, David Miller, and Tim Tetrick. Dunn won four on Saturday and seven in two nights; Tetrick and David Miller won five overall; and Gingras four.

* * *

There are going to be a lot of tough driver decisions to be made before next week, at least based on the post draws after these division's two eliminations:

2PF: Gingras, Matt Kakaley, David Miller and Tim Tetrick all qualified a horse in both eliminations.

2PC: Again, Gingras and Tim Tetrick have two "early calls" here.

2TC: David Miller qualified a horse in each elimination.

2TF: No doubles, although there are two Millers (Andy and David), two Tetricks (Tim and Trace), and two Yoders (James and Verlin).

3PF: Dexter Dunn, Gingras, and Tim Tetrick advanced one from each elim.

3TF: Dunn, Brian Sears, and Tim Tetrick got both their drives into next week.

* * *

It's pretty well known that most of my work is in and with Pennsylvania horses. That having been said, did you notice that 15 of the 17 Breeders Crown elimination winners were Pennsylvania-sired, including all five Saturday? (I counted twice – I hope that's right.)

* *)

Who was impressive? The horses that were supposed to be impressive, I guess is the best answer: the 1-2-3-5-6-7-9 horses in the Top Ten all raced, and all won; Shartin N, #8, was a good second. The baby trotter, Venerate, caught the eye, but let's see what price he is next week. (He's post five; Captain Corey is post seven.) Other than that – I'm just providing the context here. One of the best satisfactions in life is NOT cashing a ticket, but cashing a ticket where YOU made the correct picks.

* * *

Hall of Famer Dave Magee, now presiding judge at Hoosier, did a great job on the microphone explaining judges' decisions.

When Somethingbeautiful broke nearing the wire in a 2PF elim, Magee explained the reasons why the horse was not placed: not lapped-on, was tried to be brought back on gait, caused no interference. Later, when Cuatro De Julio ran on the lead in a 2TC elim, Magee said the primary reasons the horse was placed was his not being tried to be brought back on gait, and the extended break rule – even pointing where in the program that the extended break rule was printed! (The "extended break" rule is to me the best explanation, better than a "failure to lose [sufficient] ground," which is nebulously gray — of course the horse lost ground if on the lead while breaking and was fifth under the wire, and "sufficient" is a tough judgment; better the clear "continuous break" rule. But Dave has driven 11,869 more winners than I have, so maybe his word is a little better.











Perfect Sting, Southwind Gendry dominate in Breeders Crown 2YOCP elims

Perfect Sting remained perfect on the season with an authoritative performance in the second of two \$25,000 eliminations for the Breeders Crown juvenile pacing colt and gelding division on Friday night (Oct. 23) at Harrah's Hoosier Park. **Southwind Gendry** continued his successful stakes winning streak as well, capturing the first \$25,000 elimination to notch his seventh straight win.

Perfect Sting, the royally-bred son of champions Always B Miki and Shebestingin, scored effortlessly in 1:50.4, leaving pocket-sitting rival Summa Cum Laude four lengths behind at the wire.

foe proved powerless to keep contact with Perfect Sting — who effortlessly expanded his lead to 3-3/4 lengths with a :26.1 final quarter over a rain-soaked surface rated sloppy.

The biggest battle was for the place spot, as Always A Miki cleared road trouble in mid-stretch and just missed catching Summa Cum Laude for second. Abuckabett Hanover and driver Andy McCarthy made a furious rally and was lapped on that pair, but settled for fourth. Early leader Bayfield Beach claimed the final qualifying berth.

Owned and bred by Brittany Farms (George Segal) and Val D'Or Farms (Martin Granoff), Perfect Sting has won all nine of his career starts.

Southwind Gendry continued his successful stakes winning streak in capturing the first \$25,000 elimination.

Yannick Gingras guided the gelding from the first crop of Always B Miki and out of Gambler's Passion to an impressive 1:51 victory.

Indiana Sires Stakes champion J K Going West and driver LeWayne Miller pushed the early tempo, clearing the lead ahead of Captains Place in a :27 first quarter while Gingras got away in third position with the 2-5 favorite Southwind Gendry. Coming off the bend, Southwind Gendry made a methodical move up the backstretch to gain control while hardly stressed through a :56.4 first half.

Gingras didn't allow an outer flow to develop as he picked up the pace with Southwind Gendry, making others work through three quarters in 1:25.1. It was essentially a one-horse race from there, as the Ron Burke trainee hit high gear and powered through a wind-aided :25.4 final quarter to complete the mile in 1:51.

Caviart Lotus and driver Tim Tetrick rallied late for the place spot, three lengths back, with early leader J K Going West along for third. Literl Lad Hanover and Captains Place completed the top five to qualify for the final.

It was the ninth victory in 11 starts this year — and the

Venerate produced a wire-to-wire domination of the field in the second \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination for 2-year-old colt and gelding trotters on Friday (Oct. 23) at Harrah's Hoosier Park, leading all the way with ease to win in 1:52.2 — a track record for freshman trotters.





As the horses headed to the wire, Maesteraemon began to close on the outside while Beads sought to challenge on the inside, but Amigo Volo maintained his advantage to the line under minimal urging.

Beads remained in second, three-quarters of a length behind at the finish, Maesteraemon was third and Back Of The Neck (Åke Svenstedt) came from well back to be fourth. Hillexotic (Andy Miller) earned the last position in the final.

Trained by Richard "Nifty" Norman, the son of Father Patrick and Margarita Momma is owned by Pinske Stables and David J. Miller. He was bred by Kentuckiana Farms and Jorgen Jahre Jr.

Amigo Volo (Dexter Dunn) set a track record of 1:51.2 in the second elimination.

Amigo Volo, last year's Breeders Crown winner for his age, sex and gait, now has a record of 25-13-3-2 and has earned more than \$1.2 million. He paid \$3.20 to win.

When asked about his improvement since a fourth-place finish in this year's Hambletonian, Dunn had a positive response.

"He was great in the Hambo," he said. "He just didn't have a lot of luck. He's done very well since that race. He was very good again tonight and worked hard all the way to the finish."

The draw for the \$500,000 final, scheduled for Saturday (Oct. 31), will be held on Monday.

Red-hot Cullipher sweeps Big M's Fall Harvest

The Jeff Cullipher barn has been on fire of late at The Meadowlands, and the track's leading trainer kept on rolling Friday night (Oct. 23), taking both Fall Harvest Series Finals on the card.

Skyway Kon Man may not have gone the best of trips, but he was up to the task, taking the final for trotters who were non-winners of \$4,500 in their last five starts. Last week, the 4-year-old gelded son of Conway Hall—Keystone Sadie exploded off cover to win going away in 1:55.3 as the even-money choice, which led players to send him off as the 3-5 favorite.

After leaving the gate from post six in the 10-horse field, driver Simon Allard settled Skyway Kon Man into the four-hole. Allard vacated the rail just after the half, but was unable to flush cover, leaving him first-over for the final seven-sixteenths.

'Kon Man' kept chipping away at pesky leader Levitation's edge, and with about a sixteenth-of-a-mile to go, grabbed the lead before holding off the fast-closing Godspell Hall by a head in 1:54.1. Levitation finished third.

Skyway Kon Man returned \$3.40 to win, and now has seven victories from 36 lifetime starts and earnings of just over \$130,000.

But Cullipher, who won three races on Oct. 10 before winning two more on both Oct. 16 and 17, would record his fourth consecutive training double before the night was out.

Chiplosive, a 4-year-old gelded son of Explosive Matter—Brooke Blue Chip, destroyed eight overmatched foes in the Fall Harvest Final for trotters who were non-winners of \$2,500 by 3 lengths in 1:52.4, a time that lowered his previous lifetime best by a full second.

Driver George Napolitano Jr. guided Chiplosive to his second straight Big M score with some aggressive handling, making the lead from post nine by traveling parked past the quarter before securing the top at the half in :56.2.

From there it was easy gravy as Chiplosive opened up on the field by 5 lengths at the head of the stretch before cruising to a 3-length score over Piercewave Hanover. Broadway Bruiser was third.

As the 2-5 favorite, Chiplosive paid \$2.80 to win, and now has eight career wins from 35 attempts, good for a bankroll of just over \$118,000.

A LITTLE MORE: After a second straight 20-cent Pick-6 went unhit, a carryover of over \$13,000 led Big M

management to guarantee a \$25,000 pot for Saturday night. Free past performances are available at playmeadowlands.com. ... When the Mark Silva-trained and driven Dramatic Point scored in the fifth race (helping to insure the big Pick-6 pool for Saturday) at odds of 46-1, huge 10-cent Pentafecta (\$12,626) and \$2 Trifecta (\$19,303) payoffs were the result. The top five numbers in the official order of finish were 7-9-8-10-6... Napolitano and Corey Callahan topped the driver colony with three wins apiece... Seven favorites scored on the 13-race program, making it 23 chalks out of the last 39 Big M races (59 per cent)... All-source handle totaled \$1,896,248... Racing resumes Saturday at 7:15 p.m.

Miller Time in Simpson stakes Friday at Philly

It was Miller Time during the John Simpson Sr. stakes action for freshman colts on Friday afternoon (Oct. 23) at Harrah's Philadelphia, as driver Marcus Miller had a victory in both the trotting and pacing events (in the trot for trainer/aunt Julie), while David Miller took the other trot before heading off to Breeders Crown competition at Hoosier Park.

The events were the \$111,600 Super Bowl, raced as noted in two divisions, and the \$110,000 Bret Hanover, which went in three splits. The Millers' sweep in the Super Bowl came with odds-on favorites; the first to succeed were David and the Cantab Hall–Jolie De Vie gelding Jack Fire, making the lead off turn one and going on to victory in taking a new mark of 1:56. The Pennsylvania Sire Stakes consolation winner defeated the Fair Sire Stakes champion Top Me Off by three-quarters of a length to make him a success in half of his ten starts and an earner of \$127,359 for trainer Nifty Norman and the ownership of Pinske Stables and Curly Tall Curly Small.

The second trot was an "Illinois Millers" affair, with Marcus moving **Sunny Crockett** to the top at about the same spot Jack Fire took command, and the pair withstanding pocket-sitter Flemsteen by three-quarters of a length in 1:56.2. The Julie Miller trainee, a colt by Father Patrick–Moonlight In Miami, now has six wins in eleven trips

to the gate and a bankroll of \$110,229 for Willow Oak Ranch and Andy Miller Stable Inc.

Marcus Miller's win on the pace was behind the fastest of the three winners, the Somebeachsomewhere–Swinging Beauty gelding **Whichwaytothebeach**, who got command at the quarter and stayed strong to the finish, coming his back half in :54.4 to complete a 1:51.2 package. Bettor Of The West, who made the winner work for the early lead, came back at him from the pocket but fell three-quarters of a length shy as Whichwaytothebeach, a heavy favorite, is now 4-for-8 with \$117,708 in earnings for trainer Roland Mallar and owners Alan Johnston and John Craig.

A second siring credit came to Somebeachsomewhere as his altered son out of History Repeats, **His Beats Hanover**, continued his development for trainer Tom and owner John Cancelliere by breaking his maiden in 1:53. A sharp closer in his last two races, today he raced from the pocket for George Napolitano Jr. and went by favored Cyrus Peak by a half length.

The Captaintreacherous—Fancy Filly colt **Captain Fancy** posted his third straight victory despite having to pace his last half raw in :55, drawing off to a 2½ length victory over Mysweetboymax while earning a new speed badge of 1:52.2. Daniel Dube had the sulky duty for trainer Bill MacKenzie and owners Vincent Ali Jr., Alma Iafelice, and Ted Gewertz.

Marcus Miller, Todd McCarthy, and George Napolitano Jr. all had driving triples on the Friday Philly card.

Jacobs hopes Wyatt J is a MASS champion

Ken Jacobs has never had a horse compete in the Massachusetts Sire Stakes (MASS). But when the man who has competed the likes of Heston Blue Chip (American Ideal—Shot Togo Bluechip \$1.78 million), Kenneth J (Bettors Delight—Advantest \$1.56 million), He's Gorgeous (Art Major—So Ravishing \$743,844) and Walner (Chapter Seven—Random Destiny \$567,652) finally does comes to town, it's no surprise he has the favorite in the glamour division of the \$720,000 Massachusetts Sire Stake finals at Plainridge Park on Monday (Oct. 26).

Wyatt J (American Ideal—Think Pink) is the heavy morning line favorite in the 3-year-old male pacing division. He was a \$245,000 yearling purchase at Lexington in 2018, the highest price paid for any American Ideal yearling that year. And although his stature in the ring is what ultimately made Jacobs decide to buy him, it was also the reason he didn't meet his early expectations until this year.

"I liked him going in; he was such a beautiful big horse, I had to have him. I usually don't go for big horses because I like a more medium size because we race on a half a lot in New York. But he was just gorgeous looking. As it turned out he was too big for his age and he had to grow into it," said Jacobs of Wyatt J.

"As a 2-year-old he wasn't mature at all. He was so big I didn't want to hurt him. He did race decent at Vernon but that's a big track and I didn't want to put him on the smaller tracks so we shut him down and let him grow into his body. And he's done a pretty good job of that."

His first two starts at three were 1:49 miles at Tioga and Vernon Downs against the top 3-year-old male pacers in New York and he acquitted himself pretty well. But Jacobs said he wasn't ready for that out of the gate and he decided to take him to Yonkers and get him brave in the non-winners classes and look past stakes in New York and forward to Massachusetts.

"I sent him to Linda (Toscano) and that move worked out well for us. He kept winning races and kept getting better with each start. And he has just kept getting braver every week. They know when they're winning and they swell up, and that's what he's doing. And we want to keep that going for one more week," said Jacobs.

Since moving to Yonkers, Wyatt J has won four straight races there before moving to Plainridge Park where he is now three-for-three in MASS competition. He has also set a new stake record of 1:51.3 for a 3-year-old pacing geldings in the process.

Jacobs has never been to Plainridge Park, but plans to attend the finals this Monday. He said he has been impressed with the Sire Stake program and likes what he has experienced firsthand this year. So much so he has already purchased another Massachusetts eligible yearling at Lexington named Knockout Lindy (Muscle Hill—Kinda Crazy Lindy) who was the sales topper for the third session and sold for \$175,000.

It's interesting to note that Knockout Lindy's dam, Kinda Crazy Lindy, is a sister to Big Man Ev (Chapter Seven – Possessed By Lindy 1:53.3, \$231,921) who was the

3-year-old MASS trotting colt champion in 2017 and holds the stake and track record at Plainridge of 1:53.3 for 3-year-old trotting colts.

Eight divisions of the \$720,000 Massachusetts Sire Stake finals will take place at Plainridge Park on Monday (Oct. 26) with post time at 2 p.m.

A cooperative effort is great to see in these situations."

Live harness racing at Oak Grove Racing will resume on Nov. 2 and take place on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays through Nov. 11, Nov. 15 and 16, and the rescheduled dates of Nov. 21-23 with a 12:30 p.m. post time.

Rescuing standardbreds harder without freeze brands

Dear fellow standardbred horsemen/horsewomen,

There is something happening that is very much going to put the lives of many standardbreds in jeopardy when they are done racing and no one seems to care. I think the standardbred community needs to pay attention to this, as this is going to be no less than truly horrifying.

Getting rid of freeze brands, is going to make it extremely hard for rescuers to identify the many unfortunate standardbreds who sadly find themselves in kill pens at grade horse sales and with dealers. The mandating of microchips is fine. However, these horses really need a mandated freeze brand also. While all horses in a kill pen surely need help, there are people that specifically try to locate and help the wonderful standardbreds that gave so much to us. Things are much better than they were several decades ago and many people seek out standardbreds for their many positive traits.

Some say that the rescuers can get a reader and scan their neck. Seriously, how realistic is it to think that someone can get into and crawl around a kill pen lot to go scanning the necks on all the horses in there?! First, the owner of the kill pen may not allow it. Most do not allow people to take photos or video and throw you out if you are caught doing so.

Then, truly it is just not realistic, besides being incredibly dangerous, for someone to be in scanning the necks on a bunch of loose horses in a pen that they do not know. Should that very labor intensive and dangerous feat be accomplished, the standardbreds then need to be marked to differentiate them from all the other similar looking, often bay, horses in there - OR - they could have an easily visible freeze brand on their neck. Otherwise they are just another brown horse.

But, the USTA by saying that freeze brands are now

optional, doesn't care. I have written to the USTA twice – no response. They are truly dropping the ball on this. Surely they care about the horses that have given us so much. Or do they? How about the thousands of horses in Full Circle. Their freeze brand is a lifeline for them at a time when they are hanging by a thread. The people that enroll a horse in Full Circle are sometimes desperate to find them. The lack of a freeze brand removes their only chance.

You know that wonderful baby that you bred, raised, and raced but somehow eventually lost track of – he's much more likely to die a miserable death, get a bolt put through his head, due to no one finding him in a kill pen now. Same for many past wonderful champions, solid raceway performers, or those wonderful, once loved Standardbreds that didn't race for one reason or another. At one time they were all loved, yet no one cares enough about their lives to mandate a stamp on their neck that may very well help them get out of dire straits. Really? This is just not o.k.

As we all know, racing has a pretty bad name in the press nowadays, with many tracks closing and very poor attendance. Better aftercare of the horses, surely would help the public hold the sport in a better light. Yet, not freeze branding is most likely going to have lots more of our beloved race horses ending up slaughtered. You would think our organization would want to help prevent this even if to even preserve their own future. Note what happened to Greyhound dog racing due to all the bad press about it.

Microchips may be a step forward and I do not doubt their positive aspects but failing to mandate a freeze brand ALSO makes the USTA's own Full Circle program useless going forward and removes the only chance these horses may have when their lives hang in the balance. Why do you have Full Circle if you're going to remove their primary means of identification in critical situations?

USTA's Mike Tanner responds

Dear Leena.

Thank you for sharing your feelings regarding microchipping, which we do take seriously. Microchips were approved at the 2018 annual meeting of the USTA board of directors, and first implemented with the foal crop of 2019. While recognizing the concerns that you raise, the board concluded that using microchips as the means of standardbred identification is less invasive and painful to the horse, allows for internal temperature monitoring by caretakers, aligns with the standards employed by other

American breeds (most notably the thoroughbreds) and around the racing world, and provides the best, most accurate way to identify standardbreds. Every week, our Member Services team fields calls from folks trying to identify freeze brand tattoo numbers that are either obscured or have been deliberately obfuscated. In almost every case, these requests involve horses that are older and have long left the racetrack.

I recognize that no system of identification, microchips included, is perfect. Moreover, as someone who has visited the auctions to see what goes on there and, along with my wife, owns and cares for a retired standardbred racehorse, I share your feelings about the need to prioritize aftercare for our equine athletes when their days of competition have ended. The Association remains committed to working with accredited rescue groups and concerned individuals to assist in the identification of standardbreds in need, and to help get chip readers into the hands of those who will use them in these efforts.

One last thing. I asked my team to search for any emails that you previously had sent us, and came up only with request for a sample copy of Hoof Beats in June 2014. Is that part of the unanswered correspondence to which you refer in your document, and would you be able to send to my attention the other letter(s)? My apologies for any that may have gone unanswered.

Leena Terrill responds to Tanner

Hi Mr. Tanner,

Thank you for the response. Perhaps I was not clear. I have no objection to microchips. What I think is a big mistake by the USTA is the elimination of freeze brands. I understand you get phone calls for help figuring them out, but I bet that's a low single digit percentage of the hundreds of thousands of freeze brands applied. I have seen with my own eyes, hundreds and maybe thousands, of standardbreds whose freeze brands are clear and easily readable and because they have a freeze brand, can be picked out of crowded pens full of horses, selling by the pound or "as is."

There are many groups and individuals who regularly seek out standardbreds in those settings, at a time when all they have to keep them from certain death is their freeze brand. Otherwise they are just another bay horse.

The USTA developed the Full Circle program and thousands of your members have enrolled horses in it

because they want to know if that horse ever needs help. Full Circle depends on identification of the horse in order to work. Yet, you are deliberately removing the only visible identification of that horse. That brand, five letters/numbers on the neck, 100 per cent means they are a standardbred – no other breed uses that. You can use microchips AND use a freeze brand. It doesn't have to be one or another. Why not do that? It provides a second means of identification when people start trying to dig out chips, just like they cut out tattoos. Why would you stop doing something – freeze branding – that is recognized and used to get horses out of the slaughter pipeline and into new jobs? Why would you take away the only chance these horses have when they are in the worst possible situation? It keeps good people who want to help them from being able to do that.

Again, this is not about microchips. This is about making your very own program for members and their horses – Full Circle – useless for horses without freeze brands. Please reconsider and use both means of identification.
