7:37 – When Bella Bellini pulled off cover in the mare trot, the result was never in doubt. The daughter of Bar Hopping has been in and out at times this year (as a bettor I can never figure

her out), but this was surely one of her best efforts. Atlanta, as expected, tried her heart out in her last race on Canadian soil. Farewell to a great one, and kudos to the Burke barn and driver Yannick Gingras for keeping her so good for so long.

8:04 – The mare pace was the race I was looking forward to the most. Superstar Test of Faith looked a little bit vulnerable after her elimination, and it turned out she was, but it wasn't because of a lack of effort. Grace Hill was superb with a two-move front-end tour-de-force in a super-fast 1:48.4.Let's hope the rest of the evening's races are as entertaining as this one.

8:24 – The 3-year-old filly trot, in my view, was the season-ender for a fantastic crop of horses, with Jiggy Jog winning all the chocolates. Unfortunately for the undisputed Queen, Joviality, she picked a bad time to have an off night. This blemish, I hope, doesn't tarnish her wonderful season. This race kicked off the Pick 4 with a pool of over \$100,000, so the bettors seem to be out tonight.

8:54 – The rumors that the front end at Mohawk wasn't holding up well were extinguished as Treacherous Dragon and Niki Hill were one-two in the 3-year-old filly pace. I thought trainer Nancy Takter had the daughter of Captaintreacherous looking as good as a horse can look on the racetrack, and she delivered a gritty effort in 1:49.1. It was a very nice drive by Scotty Zeron.

9:20 – King Of The North absolutely clobbered a nice field of colts in the 3-year-old colt trot. Driver Mark MacDonald put on

a clinic in both the elimination and final, reminding everyone this is a speed game, and he even did it this time from the rail. It's kind of rare in modern racing to have a young trotter be good in his first start at 2, and his Crown start at 3. That, in my view, is credit to both trainer Ray Schnittker and MacDonald, after an up-and-mostly-down year.


The sixth race pick 5 pool was \$218,000, so the bettors continue to respond well to the evening.

9:49 – I guess this year's 3-year-olds have not been quite as exciting as in years past. However, there's always anticipation when two good colts like Pebble Beach and Bythemissal meet. Bythemissal didn't get the best of trips and did take a step or two in the lane, but Todd McCarthy did his best Mark MacDonald impression and bottomed out his foes in a tidy 1:48.1. The speed game continues, Pebble sure likes Canada, and Todd McCarthy is making his mark in the sport.

10:18 – There isn't much to say about the open trot, other than that was easy! Ecurie D made 6-5 look like 1-20. Interest rates are going up, but that was over double your money with less risk than the bank. Greg Reinhart of DRF Harness reported that Ake changed the bridle for this start, and it looks like it worked out pretty well.

The last pick 5 garnered 108,000 in wagering dollars; the crowd keeps firing.

10:43 – Will Allywag Hanover be as good as he was at the Red Mile when he upset Bulldog? That was question of the evening on everyone's mind, and although he tried, and driver Todd McCarthy did everything he could to soften up the Bulldog, the big horse was back. I, like many of you, love watching fantastic racehorses, and what a joy it has been to watch Bulldog Hanover. He delivered a smashing performance, and it was a great way to end a perfect evening. I hope you all enjoyed it as much as I did.

Woodbine Mohawk Park smashes handle record on Crown weekend

With nearly \$9 million in handle over the two nights of Breeders Crown action, Woodbine Mohawk Park obliterated the previous record for wagering for a Breeders Crown held in Canada.

After posting handle of some \$3.9 million on Friday, the total bet on Saturday was just over \$5 million.

Bill McLinchey, Woodbine's director of standardbred racing, told Ken Weingartner that Saturday's total, "exceeded everybody's expectations. I know Woodbine and the Hambletonian Society couldn't be happier with that number. For the total number to end up just under \$9 million for the weekend is great."

McLinchey attributed the successful weekend to, "having Bulldog Hanover. There's a lot of momentum with him. He's got quite a fanbase. Also, just having really competitive races. The finals were quite competitive and there were horses winning from the front and winning from behind."

Breeders in the spotlight during Saturday's Breeders Crown finals

Saturday's (Oct. 29) Breeders Crown finals were marked by many memorable performances. Over the course of the eight championship events, seven winners originated from farms with Crown winners in their history. Multiple horses added championship designations to pedigrees already overflowing with Crown success. How these victories translate on a pedigree page, and the weight they carry going forward, is one reason why they say, "It all comes down to the Breeders Crown."

David McDuffee had visited the Breeders Crown winner's circle multiple times as an owner, but a victory as breeder had eluded him until Bella Bellini broke through last season in the 3-year-old filly trot final. Saturday night at Woodbine Mohawk Park,


the Bar Hopping—Bella Dolce 4-year-old rocketed past the competition and delivered a second trophy to the owner and breeder with a 1:51.1 score in the \$350,000 mare trot final. The dam, also bred by McDuffee, was a Crown finalist in 2008, finishing sixth in the final for sophomore trotting fillies. Now, her most successful foal is on the verge of eclipsing \$2 million in career earnings.

As breeder, McDuffee becomes the first recipient of the Charlie Keller Memorial Award, a \$10,000 bonus to be paid out in each of the next 10 years to the breeder of the mare trot winner.

White Birch Farm statistically ranks among the top breeders in Breeders Crown competition. Saturday night, the Allentown, NJ operation added more hardware as Grace Hill held off a hard-charging Test Of Faith in the \$400,000 mare pace final. The Always B Miki—Western Silk 4-year-old equaled the stakes record, set by Hana Hanover and matched by Kissin In The Sand, with her 1:48.4 effort.

Sold at the Lexington Selected sale for \$75,000 as a yearling, the mare became the sport's newest millionaire with the victory. For her part, Western Silk was a three-time Breeders Crown finalist, winning an elimination at 2 and finishing third as a sophomore. The O'Brien Award-winning dam now has her first champion. It is the eighth trophy for White Birch and fifth champion bred by the farm.

Two races later, White Birch added yet another winner as the royally-bred Treacherous Dragon and driver Scott Zeron captured the \$600,000 final for sophomore pacing fillies in a time of 1:49.1. The Captaintreacherous—My Little Dragon filly, a \$260,000 Lexington purchase, pushed her earnings over the million-dollar mark with the victory.

Treacherous Dragon is out of the Dan Patch, Nova and O'Brien Award-winning mare My Little Dragon, herself a three-time Crown champion. She is sired by Breeders Crown winner Captaintreacherous, and is a half-sister to Crown victor and O'Brien winner Stay Hungry.

The pair of wins moves White Birch past Castleton Farm in total Crown starter earnings with more than \$4.6 million. The farm now ranks fifth in the category.

Jiggy Jog S provided Swedish breeder **Vestmarka AB** its first Crown champion with a stakes, track and Canadian record in the

\$675,000 Crown final for sophomore trotting fillies. Driven by Dexter Dunn, the filly stopped the clock in 1:51.1. The Walner—Hot Mess Hanover 3-year-old, owned by Jorgen Sparredal Inc., became the breeder's first finalist last season, where she raced third in the freshman filly trot final.

On the track, Hot Mess Hanover earned just shy of \$100,000 before being exported overseas. Her first foal is now a millionaire with the victory. The winning time eclipsed Next Level Stuff's 1:52 mark, set at Harrah's Hoosier Park in 2020.

Ray Schnittker earned his first Breeders Crown win as a breeder with Huntsville in 2016. Steve Jones has two finals wins to his credit as breeder of Deweycheatumnhowe (2007) and Well Said (2008). Together, they added their newest winner when King Of The North trotted away from the field in the \$600,000 final for sophomore colts in a stakes, track and Canadian record 1:50.3 display.

The Walner—Check Me Out colt sold for \$190,000 at the 2020 Lexington Selected sale, with Schnittker keeping a piece of the trotter and serving as trainer. Like Treacherous Dragon, King Of The North possesses royal bloodlines on both sides of his pedigree. A Dan Patch Award winner at 2, King Of The North is sired by Crown champion Walner and is out of Crown winner and two-time Dan Patch and O'Brien Award winner Check Me Out.

The winning time fell one-fifth shy of the all-time Canadian trotting record and lowered Jujubee's stakes record, set last year at the Meadowlands.

A **Brittany Farms**-bred finalist reached the winner's circle in the \$675,000 Breeders Crown final for sophomore pacing colts. After annexing the North American Cup earlier this year, Pebble Beach added a Crown victory at Woodbine Mohawk Park, pacing in 1:48.1. The Downbytheseaside—Santa Rosa colt fetched \$85,000 at the Lexington Selected sale.

The Versailles, KY nursery finished Friday evening knotted with Hanover Shoe Farms atop the standings with 29 total finals wins. Pebble Beach broke the tie and raised the mark to 30 trophies and 22 different champions. Brittany Farms-bred starters surpassed \$12 million in earnings over the weekend. San Jose, the colt's Captaintreacherous brother, brought \$300,000 earlier this month at Lexington.

Ecurie D successfully defended his Breeders Crown open trot title with a 1:51 effort Saturday evening. The Infinitif—To Soon


6-year-old captured the \$600,000 final with a stakes recordequaling performance. The win also served as breeder Jean Pierre Dubois' second trophy. He was previously represented by Dr Ronerail, a finalist in 2000 and 2001.

Ecurie D matched the winning times of Market Share (2013) and Commander Crowe (2014) in his successful defense.

Hanover Shoe Farms and Brittany Farms are arguably the two most recognized breeders in the industry. It is only fitting that at the conclusion of this year's Breeders Crown finals, the two farms are tied in finals won to date. With Bulldog Hanover's dominating win in the \$600,000 open pace, Hanover has accumulated 30 trophies. The Keystone State breeder has produced a record 27 Crown champions.

It has been well documented that 'Bulldog' sold for a mere \$28,000 as a yearling at Harrisburg. Now a winner of over \$2.2 million, the Shadow Play—BJs Squall stallion earned the win with a powerful 1:46.4 mile, equaling his track and Canadian record. The time bested Won The West's 1:47 mark, established in the 2009 Breeders Crown final.

Back-to-back Breeders Crowns for mare trot winner Bella Bellini

Harness racing's newest \$2 million dollar winner is the 4-yearold trotting mare **Bella Bellini** who overcame a flat tire before the race to capture the first of eight Breeders Crown finals on Saturday (Oct. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park on a beautiful fall evening.

Eight of the sport's best trotting mares faced the gate in the \$472,500 contest which saw Next Level Stuff and Tim Tetrick lead the parade by the opening quarter in :27. Atlanta, the richest performer in the race with \$3.6 million on her card, came out from third to challenge for Yannick Gingras and was comfortably on top at the :55.3 half.

In the first up position as they hit the 1:24.1 three-quarters was When Dovescry followed by Bella Bellini. As they trotted

for home Dexter Dunn gave Bella Bellini open road and she responded with an impressive victory in 1:51.1.

Atlanta finished a solid second. It was her final career start on Canadian soil as she is to be retired at the end of her 2022 campaign. The 7-year-old Chapter Seven mare won many of the top races during her illustrious career, but a Breeders Crown title eluded her. In a total of six appearances her best finishes were second-place finishes in each of the last two years.


Doug McNair got Refined up for third while When Dovescry held on for fourth for Dave Miller and Next Level Stuff took fifth.

Owned by breeder David McDuffee of Florida, Bella Bellini is trained by Nifty Norman who admitted the flat tire on his mare's race bike before the post parade had him a little rattled.

"We didn't have the spare, which is my responsibility and Dexter gets a little nervous when he doesn't have his own bike," he said.

The setback obviously didn't bother Bella in the least.

"She was picture perfect, just the way you want. She's very special, she's a beautiful animal, so nice to be around, just a really, really nice horse," said Norman who is quite familiar with Bella's family having also trained her dam, the top Kadabra mare Bella Dolce who earned over \$750,000 during her career.



A daughter of Bar Hopping, Bella Bellini was notching her second straight Crown title having won last year as a 3-year-old at The Meadowlands. This was her 19th lifetime win and eighth from 17 tries this year. She has \$925,000 earned in 2022 and just over \$2 million lifetime.

Grace Hill holds off Test Of Faith in Crown mare pace

Driver Doug McNair asserted **Grace Hill** to the fore and used every inch of her speed to keep the furious stretch kick of Test Of Faith at bay to steal the show in the \$540,000 Breeders Crown mare pace on Saturday night (Oct. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Amazing Dream and No Win No Feed battled through a :27.2 first quarter with Grace Hill gapping the pair from third into the backside. Once No Win No Feed abandoned her challenge to sit in the pocket, McNair launched Grace Hill for the front and seized control before a :54.3 half.

So Much More followed Grace Hill's move and raced uncovered into the final turn, pressing the pacesetter. Mikala caught cover to race second over with Test Of Faith, the 2-5 favorite, placed

third over in the sprint to three-quarters, timed in 1:21.3. Grace Hill spun for home still with a barrage at her back of So Much More and soon with Test Of Faith towering down the center. As Test Of Faith hit her best stride, the finish line came in time for Grace Hill, who had a head in front to stop the clock in a lifetime-best 1:48.4. So Much More survived her first-over blitz to take third and Amazing Dream finished fourth.

"We had a pretty good post and I thought a lot of the better ones were to the inside of her," McNair said after the race. "Leaving the gate, there wasn't a whole ton of speed right off the bat. I took advantage of that, but she did all of the work and she deserved to win."

The 1:48.4 mile matches the stakes record first set in 2009 by Hana Hanover, a time when the Breeders Crown final for older pacing mares was contested before the fall. Kissin In The Sand matched that record when she won at Harrah's Hoosier Park in 2020. Grace Hill's victory also gave driver Doug McNair his second Breeders Crown trophy, with his first coming from Stay Hungry in the 2017 2-year-old colt pace.

"It feels great [to win a Breeders Crown]," McNair said. "These trophies are very tough to get for sure. They're tough to get into races and to win them is even tougher, so it's a thrill."

Grace Hill, a 4-year-old Always B Miki mare out of the Western Terror mare Western Silk, also gave trainer Virgil Morgan Jr. his second Breeders Crown trophy to add to his win in the 2008 open pace with Mister Big. Tom Hill owns Grace Hill, who was bred by White Birch Farm, and added a third Breeders Crown trophy to his record. Her Breeders Crown triumph 18th victory to her 45 starts and pushed her bankroll into millionaire status at \$1.174.790.

Off as the third choice, Grace Hill paid \$13.30 to win.

Jiggy Jog S and driver Dexter Dunn waited as long as they could, then moved first-over in the \$675,000 (U.S.) Breeders Crown Championship for 3-year-old trotting fillies on Saturday (Oct. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park. But the difficult journey through the last half hampered the daughter of Walner not at all, as she went on strongly to record a stake, track, and Canadian record of 1:51.1 – and made the discussion about Trotter of the Year become that much more interesting.

Misswalner Fashion went to the front at the race's start, while her stablemate and Oaks winner Fashion Schooner erred right as the gate sprung. Raised By Lindy left strongly from the outside and settled in the two-hole before the :27.1 quarter, and there were no bursts of speed going down the backstretch, as Misswalner Fashion reached the half in a relatively soft :56.1.

Jiggy Jog S, at 2-1, got away third, with 4-5 favorite Joviality S, the top-ranked filly most of the year, right behind her and the talented closer Warrawee Xenia ready to join the flow. That flow started early on the turn, with Jiggy Jog S, Joviality S, and Warrawee Xenia in first-, second-, and third-over position as the field raced mid-far turn towards the 1:24.1 three-quarters.

It was around that point that pacesetter Misswalner Fashion broke and was taken to the infield, with Raised By Lindy (at 53-1) and Jiggy Jog S coming out of the last turn on equal terms. The two covered horses in the outer flow looked well-placed, but with Jiggy Jog S able to come home in :27, neither of those horses could make a great impact. Indeed, it was Raised By Lindy who proved most resilient nearing the wire, staying within a length of the winner to the finish. Joviality S went what she could to be third, only another half-length behind, with 117-1 shot Bare My Soul fourth, three parts of a length ahead of last

year's divisional leader Venerable, who completed the top five by winning a three-way photo.

Driver Dunn, who won eight Breeders Crowns in his first three years of full North American driving (winning Driver of the Year each time), picked up his second Crown win of the evening after Bella Bellini – whom Jiggy Jog S succeeded as the winner of this event.

"(Jiggy Jog S) was so good last week," said Dunn after the race, "I came into the race with a lot of confidence. I knew I had Joviality S on my back on the far turn, but my filly went on strong."

Indeed, Jiggy Jog S was the faster elimination winner last week, beat Joviality S in the Filly Futurity, and won in quicker time in the first Grand Circuit week of Lexington. If the great twosome do not meet again this year, voters will be putting on their thinking caps when the ballots come in December.

Jiggy Jog S is a daughter of super sire Walner (as is Raised By Lindy) out of Hot Mess Hanover. The "S" at the end of her name indicates she was bred in Sweden, by Vestmarka AB 531 91. The sophomore provided trainer Åke Svanstedt with his second Crown win of the weekend (both with trotting fillies after last night's freshman Special Way was crowned).

Jiggy Jog S raised her career bankroll to \$1,132,185 for owner Jorgen Sparredal Inc. with her eighth win in 13 seasonal starts.

Treacherous Dragon terrific in Crown sophomore pacing filly final

Treacherous Dragon found room late and hauled down favourite Niki Hill in the final strides to take the \$810,000 Breeders Crown final for 3-year-old pacing fillies on Saturday (Oct. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

With Scott Zeron at the controls Treacherous Dragon was on top at the quick 26-second opener. Niki Hill, parked from the start from post 10, came calling but Zeron was reluctant to give up the lead too quickly. Dexter Dunn and Niki Hill cleared by the :54.1 half.

Niki Hill, who was making just her fifth sophomore start, paced by the three-quarters in 1:22 but had company all around her down the stretch. In a close finish Zeron threaded the needle to get Treacherous Dragon to the wire first in 1:49.1, a neck in front of a game Niki Hill who won the Breeders Crown final last year at two. Boudoir Hanover was third for Todd McCarthy with the two stablemates from the Nick Gallucci barn, Silver Label and Prohibition Legal, next across.

It was the ninth win in 14 attempts this year for Treacherous Dragon who came into the contest having swept the Jugette last month at Delaware. A daughter of Captaintreacherous from the multiple Breeders Crown winner My Little Dragon, Treacherous Dragon earned millionaire status with the win. Nancy Taker trains for Hot Lead Farm of New Jersey.

"I actually thought she was the filly to beat," Takter said. "She's been super since the Jugette. Since we put her on Lasix she's been a different horse. She's been on the bit and ready to go to work. I thought she had a very big shot tonight.

"She likes to pass horses and it was just a matter of finding room down the stretch and I im happy that Scotty found it, I was getting a little worried there, I didn't think we were going to win. I don't think I've screamed that loud on a race, ever. She's a nice big sized filly, she's going to race next year and hopefully she's got a bright future."

Zeron, a former regular on the WEG circuit, didn't even expect to be competing in this year's Breeders

Crown after suffering breaks in his pelvis and wrist following an accident at the end of July at Pocono.

"Honestly, I didn't even think I'd be here; when I was injured I kind of gave up the dream of making it to this year's Breeders Crown. A couple of people pushed me to do it, Mark MacDonald and Nancy, and I'm happy I did it and obviously it's a great win," said Zeron who just returned to the bike a few weeks ago.

As for the trip, Zeron noted: "I felt great, just to have the opportunity to race late in the mile. Looking on paper I dreamed of following Niki Hill and it came to fruition. I didn't have a lot of room and when I did she's an exceptional filly to sprint up into gear with 100 feet left.

"It's not a bad phone call when they ask you to drive the current Jugette winner."

Saturday's victory was the eighth Breeders Crown final for Takter and second for her in this division with a filly bred by White Birch Farm having won in 2020 with Peaky Sneaky.

King Of The North claims his Crown in sophomore trotting colt final

Off his 28-1 powerhouse performance in the elimination, **King Of The North** followed that effort with total destruction of his competition to win the \$810,000 Breeders Crown 3-year-old colt trot on Saturday night (Oct. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Driver Mark MacDonald hustled King Of The North to the lead to a :26.2 first quarter with World At War Deo in second and Cool Papa Bell third. Though he didn't hit the breaks up the backside and clicked the half in :54.3 as Cool Papa Bell angled to race first over into the final turn.

With King Of The North striking hot on the lead, MacDonald decided to let his charge "go down swinging." He spurted by three-quarters in 1:22.1 and punched the wind out of his competition's sails through the lane to register a 4-1/4-length victory in 1:50.3 and smash the stakes record, as well as the Canadian record he set just last week.

"I did not think I could relive the American Ideal moment again, where I just was asking a horse at the head of the stretch to please not stop. But it happened," MacDonald said after the race.

"The first quarter was a little hotter. When the half popped up, I planned on tapping the breaks to the last turn to try and race Cool Papa Bell, because I didn't like the one behind me. He just felt so good, I thought 'You know what, it's all or nothing now."

King Of The North's 1:50.3 mile crushed the stakes record of 1:51.2 set last year by Jujubee as well as the 1:51.1 Canadian record set by King Of The North in his elimination. The time also beats the all-age record for a trotting male and comes just a fifth of a second off the all-time Canadian trotting record of 1:50.2 set in 2019 by a then 4-year-old Atlanta.

The annihilation of his peers and the Breeders Crown hardware notched an eighth win on King Of The North's 23-race card and propelled him to millionaire status with \$1,234,255 earned for owners Schnittker Ward, Arden Homestead Stable and Nolamura Racing LLC and Steven Arnold. The victory also marked a continued turnaround for the Walner colt, out of former Ray Schnittker star trotting filly Check Me Out, who demonstrated high promise as a 2-year-old which had yet to reach fruition in his sophomore season.

"I didn't know why it wasn't clicking earlier in the year," trainer Ray Schnittker said after the race. "He raced really good in Lexington and in the Canadian Trotting Classic. I kind of thought he was coming [around] but I didn't think he was going to be this good. Now he's showing what I really thought he was."

Mark MacDonald collected his fourth Breeders Crown trophy and his first since winning the 2017 Mare Pace with Pure Country. Ray Schnittker, who bred King Of The North along with Steven Jones, added a fourth Breeders Crown trophy to his resume – his first in this event – and his first since Huntsville won the 2016 2-Year-Old Colt Pace.

King Of The North paid \$12.90 to win.

Pebble Beach skips to impressive score in sophomore pacing colt Crown

Pebble Beach shored up his rock-solid resume with another classic Canadian performance, this time on Saturday (Oct. 29) in the \$911,250 Breeders Crown (presented by the Libfeld/Katz Breeding Partnership) for 3-year-old pacing colts & geldings at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

He didn't go off as the post-time choice, but the son of Downbytheseaside-Santa Rosa was on top when it mattered most, trouncing his nine rivals to the tune of a brilliant 3 ½-length score.

With the win, the bay made it a perfect five-for-five in Canada.

Ponda Warrior, leaving from post eight, crossed over to take the early lead with longshot Greatest Ending also getting away smartly and tucking into second. Todd McCarthy slotted 7-5 Pebble Beach into third with Captain Cowboy in fourth.

Pebble Beach, who took the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup in June, was guided to the front after a quarter in :25.4 and assumed a 1 ½-length lead at the half in :54.1. Bythemissal, at even money, and riding a five-race win streak, was eighth and had his work cut out for him as the field approached the threequarters mark.

Pebble Beach (Todd McCarthy) won the Breeders Crown final for sophomore pacing colts on Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 1:48.1.

Reaching three-quarters in 1:21.2, McCarthy and Pebble Beach looked large and in charge in early stretch, gliding away from their foes with ease down the lane, stopping the teletimer in 1:48.1. I Did It Myway was second, Bythemissal rallied for third and Greatest Ending was fourth.

Pebble Beach paid \$4.90 for the win.

"He does very well up here, he feels happy when I sit behind him, and he shows it when he races as well," said McCarthy. "He was certainly very impressive tonight."

A shoeing change proved to be the perfect fit.

"They're usually better if they have the aluminums on and the last time he raced in Lexington, I raced him with no shoes and he won," said trainer Noel Daley. "He was no more impressive than he'd been, but last week was the most impressive he's been. Just looking for that extra edge, I put the four aluminums on him rather than just the two."

Joe Sbrocco was equally pleased with the outcome for more than one reason.

"Noel and Todd just know this horse and they do such a great job for us," Sbrocco said. "And the other part is the same ownership put the horse in second, I Did It Myway, and I'm a breeder on that one too, so it was so thrilling to have that."

With the victory, Pebble Beach, owned by Patricia Stable, Sbrocco, Country Club Acres and Laexpressfoderadeovolente, is now 8-6-1 from 15 starts on the season.

Overall, the colt, bred by Brittany Farms, is 15-8-3 from 26 engagements.

Known as "Bam Bam" in the barn, Pebble Beach was purchased for \$85,000 at the 2020 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. His second dam is Hall of Fame broodmare Arts Vintage, who produced millionaires Vintage Master and Great Vintage.

Ecurie D DK became the first repeater of the Breeders Crown open trot championship in 19 years on Saturday night (Oct. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, tying the stakes record of 1:51 in winning the \$600,000 event while matching the successive scores of Fool's Goal in 2002-2003.

Trainer Åke Svanstedt, winning his second Crown of the night and third of the weekend, selected Dexter Dunn to handle Ecurie D DK (the "DK" indicates he is Danish-bred; the breeder is Jean Pierre Dubois) as one of four horses he sent out in this Crown. Ecurie D DK had gotten "hot" in the Yonkers International in his last start and tired after setting scalding fractions; the son of Infinitif was much more tractable in his Crown, going right out to the lead ahead of 2021 sophomore Crown winner Jujubee, and set fractions of :27.1,:55.2, and 1:23, at the last pole starting to go clear of his field.

No one was able to get near Ecurie D DK in the stretch, with Jujubee three lengths behind in closest pursuit of the winner at the finish. Jujubee made a break nearing the wire, and after an inquiry he was placed back to fourth, with Amigo Volo (ironically, the 2020 3YO Crown winner, and let go here at 102-1) elevated

from third to second and It's Academic moved up from fourth to third. But they were all trotting for the minor honors behind Ecurie D DK, who gave Dunn his third Crown win of the night, which put him equal with Svanstedt as the only three-time 2022 Crown winners at the time.

Ecurie D DK is owned by Marko Kreivi Stables, Suleyman Yuksel Stables, and Åke Svanstedt Inc. Ecurie D DK was two-for-two when he came to North America last season, and in 2022 he now has two wins, two seconds and a third in six starts (his only off-the-board finish in North America was in the International). The 6-year-old has earned \$966,389 in his eight North American starts, and \$1,356,757 lifetime, as he was 15-for-21 on the Continent. He took his mark of 1:49.1 while setting a world record in his first start of the year, in the Cutler at The Meadowlands on May 21, and his 1:51 mile in the Crown equals the stakes record held by Market Share (2013) and Commander Crowe (2014).


Ecurie D DK was sent off as the 6-5 favorite of this outstanding field, bringing the count of winning favorites to six in the 12 Crowns, with three seconds and two thirds over the weekend.

Bulldog Hanover unleashes record-setting performance in Breeders Crown open pace

Bulldog Hanover blazed his way into the record books with yet another jaw-dropping tour de force, this time in the \$810,000 Breeders Crown open pace, Saturday night (Oct. 29) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

In the curtain-closing event of the 2022 Breeders Crown finals, it was standardbred racing's show-stopping superstar who delivered a primetime performance in front of an appreciative crowd and his proud connections.



After guiding his 10 rivals through an opening quarter in :26, Tattoo Artist yielded the lead to Allywag Hanover, who was then quickly engaged by Bulldog Hanover, the latter striking front then reaching the half in :53.1.

Armed with a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -length advantage after three-quarters in 1:20.3, Dunn called upon the four-year-old son of Shadow Play-BJs Squall for his best and the bay responded by rocketing away from his rivals down the lane en route to a 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ -length score.

The final time of 1:46.4 was a Breeders Crown stakes record and also equalled the track and Canadian record. Tattoo Artist was second, Allywag Hanover third, and Abuckabett Hanover was fourth.

Bulldog Hanover paid \$2.40 for the win.

"He felt great tonight," said Dunn. "The fractions were fast, we had a good helmet, and took him to the backstretch right after

the first quarter and when he merged on there he got to the front, he grabbed a hold of me like he has most of the year. I could feel him [Allywag Hanover] on my helmet there. I know he had to do pretty good tonight to try to get past me. I probably didn't feel the same as I did at Lexington. It's a bit of a shame, but he's an amazing horse."

Arriving at the final off a runner-up finish to Allywag Hanover in the Allerage Farms open on Oct. 9, Bulldog Hanover, in his final start in Canada, put on a stellar show for the crowd on a cool Saturday evening at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

'Bulldog,' who paced the fastest mile ever, 1:45.4, in July, has 27 wins, along with four seconds and a third, from 36 starts and earned in excess of \$2.6 million.

Not bad for a horse who was a \$28,000 purchase at the 2019 Harrisburg Sale as Hip No. 795.

For trainer Jack Darling, who co-owns with Brad Grant, his first

Crown coronation couldn't have come with a more special horse, one who launched his racing life with a series of Ontario Sires Stakes successes in the summer of 2020.

"It's been exciting, but I mean the pressure going into this race for me was excruciating," said Darling. "The fans, I just wanted him to win so badly for the fans. It felt so good when we started to step away. I felt really good about it. I knew he was right back to himself, and I've seen him do it so many times that I'm kind of counting on him."

The horse who has garnered widespread attention from racing fans and media alike will now travel south of the border to conclude his racing season.

And he'll head to the U.S. off a crowning achievement on his home turf.

"It's been just amazing all the way along and every night gets better," said a beaming Brad Grant.



Choosing to paint a bright future

There is a way forward.

When we talk about our industry and discuss how we can improve it and move forward, we have to speak quietly as pessimism and cynicism are at an all-time high in horse racing.

Some people find it easier to talk about what we haven't done as if we can't, and what we still need to as if we won't.

People in that category are present in every industry, and every walk of life.

They are not the builders, or the doers. They are the naysayers. They are the ones constantly telling you, "You know what you need..." when they have no idea what they need themselves. In their eyes, we will never succeed, and if we do, we were just lucky.

To be fair, there is plenty of things we can (and need) to improve in horse racing. I don't think that is lost on anyone.

Many of these issues are also subjective. What I believe we need to improve may not be what you believe we need to improve, and quite frankly neither may be needed at all.

But since this is my column, I'll tell you what I'd like to see happen moving forward in racing.

Firstly, I believe we do need to recognize that it's harder to fill competitive fields now more than ever before, and that weakens our overall product and brand.

To mitigate this, we need to know what is available to race week-to-week in our jurisdictions.

That information needs to be available to both the race secretaries and participants. If we knew what type of horse would get in regularly and what we needed to strengthen our prospective entry boxes, most people would seek out those types of horses.

But the lack of confidence in consistent racing breeds apathy which only fuels arguments in racing, and weakness our sport.

Seven weeks ago, as we entered sale season, we realized like many other barns that we had no way to secure sufficient help in our stables. We took a different approach and decided that we would advertise on a third-party job site.

After two days, we had to close the ad as we had received 253 applications. Many of these people knew very little about horses but wanted very much to work. We hired a hair dresser who used to work on a ranch, two ladies who were saddlehorse people, and we have an interview next week with someone who is a DJ. The common denominator is they love horses and wanted a job.

Our industry has adopted a carnival mentality over the years, and we have descended to a level where there is no growth in our workforce because we don't seek it out.

We need to hire, train and expand. No business can survive without this happening. I encourage my fellow horsemen to train horses and humans if we are to continue to move forward.

We need to hire, train and expand. No business can survive without this happening. I encourage my fellow horsemen to train horses and humans if we are to continue to move forward.

At the very least TheStable.ca should have good music in the barn this winter, and everyone will be well groomed.

We are also constantly talking about horse shortages, and ownership depletion within our sport, but we haven't spoken much about possibly the most serious by-product of these to come: a trainer shortage.

The problem is, most trainers are great people, but don't know how to build and strengthen their own barns. Most struggle with transparency and the majority have no idea about the importance and value of communication with their clients.

I would like to see the stakeholders of this industry move to adopt and fund a uniform fractional ownership hub that can be used to help market and advertise both racing and its participants, highlighting the entertainment value in racing while helping our trainers move to a more open-door policy for new and interested clients all over the world.

You will hear the naysayers tell you that no one wants to be a horse owner. Well, their pessimism won't work here. The Stable. ca is about to cross the threshold of 1,000 clients in 13 countries and we have added well over 40 since September of this year alone.

The reality is that people have and do choose horse ownership as a new and affordable form of entertainment. The experience horse racing offers is rare, exciting, and very attractive to the average person in society. Now more than ever everyday people put a premium on affordable entertainment.

To truly succeed we need to bring new owners into our industry and we have proven that can be done. The only hurdles are to educate our horsepeople as to how to achieve an optimal setting for client interest and procurement.

We need to seek out and grow our workforce in the same manner everyone else does in society.

This begins with understanding that we are not as unique as we think we are when it comes to recruitment and employment. Together, by understanding this will not happen overnight, but it can happen, we should begin to see the paths forward for racing more clearly.

We can begin to have more pragmatic conversations with other stakeholders in other parts of the industry.

I call on all industry stakeholders to begin to invest in this industry's future. Build fractional ownership hubs, cultivate our newest clients and work with our trainers to grow our industry in the soil we have already proven is very fertile.

We have many other dedicated people who can work on other aspects of the industry that simultaneously need attention. One brick at a time we can build a better horse racing industry for those who are here now and soon to come. This will not happen overnight, and there will be plenty more pessimism along the way.

If we all want a future together in an industry we all love, then we need to drown out the negativity, and understand that there is a way forward.

Right on, Righteous Resolve

By the time this piece appears in print, we'll all know the results of the Breeders Crown 2-year-old filly trot from Friday night (Oct. 28). At the time of this writing, Righteous Resolve was the second choice in the overnight odds, and win, lose, or draw, she's a fascinating pedigree study (editor's note: She finished third in the race won by Special Way).

Righteous Resolve is by Resolve, a son of Muscle Hill, and out of Motown Muscle, who won just under \$500,000, by Muscle Mass. It's not my brief to write ads for any stallion here, but Muscle Mass is one of the best trotting sires in our biz today, and he is a perfect example of the belief that a horse's future potential in the stud is best demonstrated by success on the track at two.

Briefly, M.M. was a top stakes colt at 2, winning just a few bucks shy of \$200,000. At 3, he barely eked out \$30,000, and was never even a factor in the same company he could beat on a regular basis at 2.

I'm a firm believer in the omnipresence of 2-year-old brilliance in predicting a stallion's sire potential, and here I'm in the best company possible. The greatest thoroughbred breeder of all time was Federico Tesio, and he went to great lengths to breed his mares to some obscure horses that showed sparks of brilliance at 2.

Under his philosophy, Tesio bred some of the best runners that sport ever saw, including his masterpiece, Ribot. Foaled in 1952, Ribot won all 16 races, including the Arc De Triumph twice. He raced from 5 furlongs to a mile and 7 furlongs in three different countries on all types of track conditions.

Not only did Tesio breed Ribot, he also bred six of the horses that appeared in the first three generations of Ribot's pedigree.

As for his impact on the thoroughbred breed, even someone so removed from the thoroughbred scene as this kid can remember how great his sons like Graustark, Tom Rolfe, and His Majesty were.

But back to Righteous Resolve, who is a great trotter in her own right. She went into the Breeders Crown with a record of 1:53.1 and earnings of \$405,748. Trained by John Bax and driven by Paul MacDonell, Righteous Resolve has won every start, with

only one exception in a secondary race, including all the major stakes in Ontario.

And her pedigree is a beautiful example of how much of a good affect smart inbreeding can have. Righteous Resolve is inbred, 3 by 3 to Muscle Yankee, and she is linebred, 3 by 4 by 4, to the full brothers Valley Victory, and Wall Street Banker. She is also linebred, 4 by 4 to the Hambo winner American Winner.

As a quick review, if the sum of the generations in which the same name appears twice is 6 or less, the horse so bred is defined as *Inbred*.

When the sum of the generations in which the same name appears twice is 7 or 8, the horse so bred is defined as *Linebred*.

If the sum of the generations that has no name that appears twice for 8 or less, the horse so bred is designated as an *Outcross*.

The great majority of today's trotters and pacers are outcrosses. The success of Righteous Resolve shows the synergy that Inbreeding produces. For a definition of synergy, think 2 plus 2 equals 9.

There is a huge opening for judicious inbreeding in the 2023 breeding season. Any breeder, large or small, who has a mare who hasn't yet produced up to expectations, would be well advised to breed her close next time.

I'm not saying you should try for my annual I'm My Own Grandpa Award, given to the horse with the closest inbred pedigree every year. (For those unfamiliar with great country music, I'm My Own Grandpa is 14 verses that show the various marital complications and the children they produce that ultimately result in the narrator's title condition. The song's best version is sung by Willie Nelson.)

What I'd try with my well-bred mare who so far hasn't produced a stakes winner, is a 3 by 3, or better still, 2 by 3 cross. As for picking a sire, if you don't want to or can't afford an established Big Dog, try a young horse who's just entered the stud. Just insist that the horse you breed to, and this is so in every case, was a stakes contender at 2. The key to forecasting any stallion's sire potential is 2-year-old brilliance. What he did on the track thereafter is irrelevant.

Finally, on an interesting but totally unrelated subject, there was an article in a recent *New York Times* lamenting that this year has been disastrous for edible mushrooms. No one knows quite why, but every mushroom lover is praying they make a comeback in '23.

Reading the article, it brought to mind the true story of a condemned man who was asked what he'd like for his last meal.

"Mushrooms," the condemned man replied.

"Okay," the warden said, and then he added, "Just curious, how come mushrooms?"

The prisoner replied, "I always wanted to eat'em, but I was always afraid to cause I thought they might be poisoned."





Juninho Dry wins the Prix Victor Regis by a nose

Sébastien Guarato's 3-year-old Criterium des 3 ans winner **Juninho Dry** (Carat Williams) had to fight hard for the win in the \$120,000 Prix Victor Regis at Vincennes on Saturday (Oct. 29) afternoon. Driver Paul Philippe Ploquin did his job correctly when the race started and Juninho Dry hit the lead without problems.

The 3-year-old Carat Williams son got company from Jack Tonic (left third inside position with a half mile to go) at the back stretch and throughout the last turn and when they turned for home, Juninho Dry seemed beaten by the outside trotter. But, he reluctantly gave up the race and when the wire approached,

Guarato's 3-year-old had fought his way back to a small advantage. Juninho Dry won by a nose in a mile rate of 1:56 over 1.3 miles.

In the \$120,000 Prix Uranie for the 3-year-old fillies, Alexandre Abrivard was successful behind Laurent Claude Abrivard trained **Just Love You** (Love You). Abrivard opted position first over at the back stretch and he could let Just Love You rest behind leader Jamaica Turbo throughout the last turn for later attacking the latter.

Milligan's School (Stefan Melander) has been retired from racing at age 9. He will stand stud in Sweden. Just Love You had the race under control at the home stretch and Abrivard's horse came home in a mile rate of 1:54.4 over 1.3 miles.

MILLIGAN'S SCHOOL RETIRES

Stefan Melander trained and owned Milligan's School (Yankee Glide—Tori Ann) has retired from racing and the 9-year-old American-bred stallion will now work as a stud in Sweden.

Melander bought Milligan's School from Andy and Julie Miller after the horse's 3-year-old season and after a mediocre season as a 4-year-old, he developed to become one of the best older trotters in Europe.

His 5-year-old season contained wins in the \$400,000 Master du Trot and the \$200,000 Sundsvall Open Trot and Milligan's School continued to consolidate his position in the top during the following years.

In 2021, he claimed the trophy in the \$300,000 Åby Stora Pris. In total, Milligan's School has collected five group-1 victories in Europe.

His 136 lifetime starts resulted in 33 wins and \$1,641,975 in earnings.







Monotony antidotes

Let us begin with a quote by Charlotte Bronte, "I feel monotony and death to be almost the same."

The thrill of the yearling sales season is almost over. The luster of young horses racing is fading as the long racing winter looms. After a fantastic year for our sport, we soon face a portion of the year when even the heartiest fan finds familiar trotters and pacers going in endless circles on cold and gloomy days. Even the gamblers feel lethargic. The winter blues can set in.

In the best of times, our racing product, which is so fascinating to those in the tribe, is monotonous to most human beings. In the worst of times, even those in the tribe must admit that a prohibitive favorite driven by a top driver, leaving from a favorable post position romping by nine lengths on a sleet-filled weekday, is neither a fun wager nor a riveting sporting event. We must continue in ways large and small to stir the pot and add more drama and chance to our races.

"Blah, Blah, Blah. How?" you say. Yes, I heard you say it.

Allow two specific proposals to relieve the monotony.

Visiting professional drivers from other states could give the races a new look. Goodness knows we love our familiar drivers. They are amazingly talented, personable, and work hard. After competing against each other for decades, our top-tier drivers are more familiar with each other than blood relatives. Several are blood relatives. Our drivers are not the problem, we know they are great, and we have watched the top twenty drivers about a million times. Ask yourself these questions:

When was the last time you watched a harness race and noticed a driver whose name and colors you did not recognize?

Do you think giving a trio of drivers from Michigan for a week of drives at your favorite racetrack would spice up the week?

If a race program came out and had THREE drivers in each race replacing names you are familiar with in the sulky, would the races be a touch more interesting and unpredictable? The concept is simple, get some new faces in front of the audience, and add a little additional mystery. You can fill in the blanks of who, how many drivers, how often, what horses, what state racetracks, equitable bumping, coordinate scheduled holidays to give regular drivers planned holiday weeks, etc.

Another idea is **the two-slot shuffle**. It goes like this. A minute before the horses step onto the track for the post-parade, there will be a public drawing for two horse numbers in the upcoming race, followed by an announcement of the horses drawn and their corresponding numbers. For example, imagine the numbers drawn are 2 and 8. Those two horses and drivers will retain their number in the program but swap slots behind the starting gate. The clock is ticking for gamblers. Do you want to change your selections for this race?

What are some purposes of such madness?

Interactivity – Gamblers will be on their toes and actively involved in frantic last-minute wagering and re-wagering when faced with a different post position. This last-minute twist forces gamblers and casual players to pay attention and *do* something before the gate swings open.

Emotion – Players will be thrilled or deflated, rescued from a bad post, or condemned to a worse position. Emotion is an excellent ingredient to create more interest.

Agility – Gamblers need to be on their toes and quickly arrange and wager for the new starting positions. Drivers will need to prepare a new game plan.

Drama – The time before the post-parade will find participants anxiously awaiting to see if they are in the two-horse shuffle.

Again, this is the prototype of a flexible, straightforward plan with a thousand iterations.

Now we reach the point of any suggestion where hardcore handicappers, owners, and top drivers who will occasionally be affected or unseated will begin the griping and grieving. The racing connections of the two horse that now has post position eight will be furious. When his favorite driver gets shuffled at the last moment, trainers or wealthy owners will be livid

They may be giving up something with no reward. Or on the other hand, they could view the crazy experiments as attempts to create tiny cracks in the wall of monotony.

Let us close with another quote by Edith Wharton, "Monotony is the mother of deadly sins."


