The EPA vs. Mark Ford

The trainer responds to a civil lawsuit brought against him by the Environmental Protection Agency accusing him of "poisoning the waters of the United States" at his training center and warns other horsepeople could be under similar scrutiny.

Trainer Mark Ford is being sued by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the United States Department of Justice's Manhattan office for allegedly "poisoning the waters of the United States" at his 76-acre standardbred training center in Wallkill, NY.

Contacted by HRU, Ford said he was reluctant to say too much on the record about the civil lawsuit under the advice of his lawyers.

"Needless to say we're very upset about this situation and have been working diligently to bring it to a conclusion, as we have been for the last five years," Ford said. "Unfortunately we are dealing with the bureaucracy of government agencies and a complex set of circumstances that have been exacerbated with the repeal of the 2015 Waters of the United States (WOTUS) rule."

On Oct. 17, the U.S. Attorney's Office in the Southern District of New York sent out a press release (full press release here) that said, in part, that the EPA had filed a civil lawsuit that day against Ford and his stable "seeking injunctive relief and civil penalties for violations of the Clean Water Act ("CWA") in connection with Defendants' construction and operation of a horse racing training facility in Orange County."

The release quoted U.S. Attorney Geoffrey S. Berman as saying, "The defendants violated the laws protecting our Nation's wetlands and have repeatedly discharged waste from their horse training facility into the waters of the United States. This lawsuit will hold the defendants accountable for violating our environmental laws and require them to remedy the significant damage they have

caused to federal wetlands."

According to the press release, part of the Complaint filed in White Plains, NY federal court alleges Ford, "destroyed existing federal wetlands and rerouted streams in the course of building a horse racing training center... In addition, Defendants have operated a concentrated animal feeding operation without a permit, allowing horse washwater and process wastewater to be discharged into waters of the United States. Defendants also violated the terms of a stormwater construction general permit during construction work at one of the properties from January 2016 to February 2017."

Ford said, "It's important to note that anyone in our business associated with ownership of a horse farm or training center is susceptible to this same type of scrutiny by the Environmental Protection Agency until this case is clarified and resolved. My legal team and I are in the process of doing that right now."

Guesstimating the fair market value of some notable racehorses being sold in Harrisburg

The annual Standardbred Horse Sale Company sale in Harrisburg, PA is the industry's largest, and while predominantly known for its yearling offerings, each year presents opportunities to acquire talent already racing. Specifically focusing on the 2 and 3-year-old racehorses in this column, it's always interesting to try to figure out which promising 2-year-olds have the ability to continue on at 3 and which 3-year-olds have the ability to make it against older horses while having to leave the friendly confines of state restricted races. That, combined with the fact that most fillies are selling to race, but also could serve later as a broodmare prospect, here is my best guess for what a fair market price may be on some of the notable racehorses. It's important to note this is just pure speculation on my part for fun and discussion. Only the auction itself will determine the true market value of the horses in question.

Of all the horses selling this year at the mixed sale taking place over Nov. 7 and 8, perhaps the most intriguing one is **hip 1924 Swandre The Giant**. Originally a \$17,000 yearling at the Hoosier sale, he sold last year for close to seven figures after beginning his career six-for-six. He was an honest

racehorse this year earning \$400,000 with his shining moment coming in the Stanley Dancer at the Meadowlands in 1:51.3. Unable to deliver fully on the lofty private purchase, he'll still have some limited opportunities next year in the Indiana Sire Stakes races as an older trotter and has proven himself to be competitive against open types of competition racing anywhere. Selling as part of an annual Burke reduction, he won't come close to his sales price from last year, though there's enough talent to warrant a serious price. I'd set his value at \$250,000.

In sequential order for the remaining horses, **hip 1331 is Captain Barbosa**. Trained by Tony Alagna, he was a \$70,000 Lexington yearling buy last year. With a mark of 1:51.2 taken in the Bluegrass, his most impressive race came a week later when he finished second in an International Stallion Stake to Tall Dark Stranger. By Captaintreacherous, he's the second foal out of Swinging Beauty and he could be in line to compete on the big stage next year. My take on his value: \$200,000.

Hip 1378 Beads: 2-year-old colt by Archangel was just one-for-seven on the year earning less than \$10,000, but there could be some potential here. He gave it a shot in his Breeders Crown elimination taking them as far as he could and overall was competitive in his other races this year. There's a lot of Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) money he can earn next year as a marginally fast trotter if he stays on the track he's on. He was a \$60,000 yearling buy and that's what I'd keep him at today.

Hip 1396 Alexa Skye: Out of 2011 Sweetheart champion Pirouette Hanover, it's not surprising this one has showed some early hints of talent. She's been a little overmatched most of the year while chasing the likes of Lyon's Sentinel, Alicorn, etc., and had some levels of moderate success at times earing \$46,000. She could easily move forward based from her pedigree and turn into a high performing 3-year-old next year. My take on her value: \$125,000.

Hip 1422 Wine Rack Hanover: A \$45,000 Harrisburg purchase last year as yearling, she had much better manners

later in the season than she had early when being more prone to breaking. She was able to land a check in the Breeders Crown final after being runner-up in her elimination and the Kadabra filly could be heard from next year on the OSS circuit. A winner of close to \$180,000 this year, I predict she may go for \$250,000 next week.

Hip 1441 Quincy Blue Chip: Here's one where the owners are going to make a profit no matter what this Chapter Seven filly goes for. Acquired through an OnGait sale in July for \$225,000, she's already earned \$278,000 since that time. I'll note also that she raced against – and beat – eventual Breeders Crown winner Winndevie earlier this year so there is legitimate talent here. Her mark this year of 1:53.2 was taken at Tioga and may have had a quicker mark had she not been racing a lot of the New York Sires Stakes (NYSS) half-mile tracks. My take on his value: \$150,000.

Hip 1460 Sonnet Grace and Hip 1462 St Somewhere: Grouped together as these two Burke fillies have similar stories. At the end of last year's 2-year-old season, both of these fillies looked they would be major contenders on the 3-year-old stage this year, but that never materialized. For Sonnet Grace, she won last year's Goldsmith Maid and looked good doing so after Burke acquired her, but this year she's only managed one win in 10 starts with that win coming in a time of only 1:55. Similarly, St Somewhere won in a fast

1:50.4 at Lexington last year but could only go in 1:52.1 this year and that was at speed favoring Vernon. Overall, her body of work was better than that of Sonnet Grace, so I'd say as a prospect going forward, St Somewhere would be estimated at \$60,000 with Sonnet Grace at \$40,000.

Hip 1465 Sylph Hanover: A \$75,000 Harrisburg purchase from two years ago, she's been chasing the sport's very best 3-year-old fillies all year long. Last year's PASS champion, she won the Nadia Lobell this year and may have won more often than her two-for-17 record had she not been up against Warrawee Ubeaut and Treacherous Reign most of the year. There's obviously enough talent here to compete in the open mare stakes next year and I estimate that she'll go at Harrisburg for \$150,000.

Hip 1567 Summit In Sight: He wasn't bad this year as a 3-year-old, although he never lived up to his \$300,000 yearling price. One of his better races was when he was second to his Beal elimination to Green Manalishi, but I feel that this would be a tough barn for someone to improve from. My take on his value: \$75,000.

Thoughts on the Breeders Crown, including Mohawk as host, the drive on Greenshoe and more

Tidbits: I totally agree with Jerry Connors' assessment that the 2019 the Breeders Crown will not be a determining factor in the Horse of the Year race. Greenshoe, Bettors Wish and Shartin all raced their hearts out in conditions that were awful to say the least. Bettors Wish got stung and still missed by a hair, Greenshoe had Yannick Gingras make a standstill break in his face and still raced great. On the other hand, Shartin N one race in 55 days and being sick is a good story, but to this writer she is a tired puppy. She did all her work on the front end and has a right to tail off, but is not the caliber of the two colts in my opinion. I am not sure what the future has for us unless the colts race in the TVG later at the Meadowlands. Whatever happens it will be a tough choice and a tie would not upset me. Everyone knows how much I love Greenshoe, but the guts and determination of the little Bettors Delight colt amazes me. Stay tuned...

The 2019 Breeders Crown started out with a bang for team Tony Alagna and Andrew McCarthy and deservedly so, and ended the same way. I lauded the merits of Andy's reinsmanship in last week's Ask The Guru column (full story here) and was like a proud papa throughout the two evening event.

I find it strange that Tony's fillies went off at such ridiculous prices. Both had won major races and their previous average odds were all less than 3-5. It is strange, however, that the morning line maker punished them for outside posts as much as he did because if you have speed it is one of the best tracks I know of to get the top from the outside as the straightaway at the start is as long as exists in the business.

I also had some personal involvement as Reflect With Me was one of my two favorite pacing fillies last fall, the other

being the Kentucky Sires champ Gai Waterhouse.

As for the disqualification, I was privileged to be the last victim of a DQ in the Breeders Crown, my fast trotting filly That Fabulous Face was taken down in 1998 at Colonial Downs for a lapped on break at the wire. It wasn't the last time I saw Mr. Perretti with a bright red face. That would make it 251 races between disqualifications, a pretty good record. Let the boys and girls fight it out.

I will not stick my neck out with an opinion of the DQ as it was an objection from a driver I have the utmost respect for. And since Yannick Gingras announced it was his first objection in 16 years I tend to believe him without reservation.

* * *

I really think the time has come in both the standardbred and thoroughbred industries for single professional opinion to make decisions of this nature as in basketball and football. Local judges are fine for overnight events but when you get to graded stakes the political appointees and unqualified personnel that often occupy these important positions should not wield the power to change the outcome of a major event. Like in pro sports there should be a well-paid consummate professional in a room with a bunch of TV screens to make the final ruling as to disqualification. I also suggest that there should be a phone link to the judges that a trainer can pick up shortly after the conclusion of a race and request an inquiry or make an objection to something he or she found egregious in the running of the race.

I still hate gracious holes in the first turn. Great example would have been Greenshoe. If the hole wasn't open for him he would have been forced to continue to the top and would have won by open lengths. It's easy to be a Monday Morning quarterback.

So many great performances, the Crown was wonderful to watch. Alagna was superb, the Down Under twins Andrew and Dexter were fabulous and I must mention the turnaround, mid-season by Nancy Johansson's great mare Manchego, providing the most earth shattering victory in this year's Crown.

Brian Sears' drive on Bold Eagle when the horse was obviously a handful in the post parade was great and I must shout out to Joe Bongiorno a new star on the horizon for his first Breeders Crown victory on American History.

I would be totally remiss if I didn't congratulate a man that performed an impossible task. How can a trainer in 2019 win

Not to beat a dead horse but TV announcers should do their homework and not be lazy when it comes to great events. There is no reason an owner should come to a Breeders Crown and find that in the post parade the race caller cannot pronounce his name or that of his trainer or his horse. Simply inexcusable. On every program there are at least 25 names in question. If you are not sure, ask. Someone will have the answer especially in these races where there has been national exposure for months.

Lastly, and I am not sure it is possible, when weather is that inclement for a big event (and all tracks are guilty) is there no way to have a presentation in some type of enclosure? It was almost a big price to pay to win a race Saturday night.



Bobby Brady (Kentuckiana Farms) asks: What did you think of the drive on Greenshoe?

First of all, having sat behind horses for over 60 years I would be the last to criticize a driver for anything as I am well aware of what a difficult task it is. Plus, the conditions were deplorable at best.

If Brian Sears had listened to the hype from Yannick Gingras he may well have thought he was in the perfect position. About two hours before the race, Yannick said on TV that he was excited about how good his horse was and that even though Greenshoe is a great horse, anything is possible. That said, falling in behind Yannick at the start looked like the perfect spot. It was sort of a perfect storm for Gimpanzee because with the water coming down in sheets, reaction time was at a standstill and when Don't Let'Em (Yannick's colt) made a standstill break in front of Greenshoe, it eliminated him immediately from any chance to win which the announcer reacted to immediately. As I mentioned above, if the courtesy hole wasn't available to Greenshoe and he was forced to proceed to the top I think the result would have been far more favorable and there would no longer be a discussion about Horse of the Year. But it is what it is and life goes on and decisions will progress in a different order.

Sorry for the very long column, there were a lot of things going on. The Crown is history but there is still great racing to come for your enjoyment and that includes the Breeders' Cup, their version of our great venue at a Santa Anita this weekend. Feeling 'Grand' at Hoosier

Grand Swan puts her four-race win streak on the line tonight in the \$120,000 Crossroads of America Stakes, one of four rich finals at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

LeWayne Miller knows Grand Swan is good. He is still trying to figure out just how good.

Grand Swan brings a four-race win streak to tonight's \$120,000 Crossroads of America Stakes for 3-year-old female trotters at Harrah's Hoosier Park. The filly has won 10 of 13 races overall this season, including the Indiana Sire Stakes championship and divisions of the Pegasus and Circle City stakes.

For her career, she has 18 victories in 25 starts and has finished worse than second only twice. She has earned \$575,900 and is owned by Grand Swan Racing, Go Fast Stable, and Never 2 Late Stable.

"She's done very well for us," said Miller, who co-owns, trains and drives Grand Swan. "She's a big, strong mare. I really don't feel like we've seen the best of her just because she likes to race against someone. She's not one that will draw off and win by five; she waits on other horses to chase her.

"I really don't know how good she is. There were a few times when you thought she was beat, they'd come eye her up, and then she would take off with them."

Grand Swan faces nine foes in the Crossroads of America. The field includes The Ice Dutchess, a multiple Grand Circuit winner coming off a third-place finish in the Breeders Crown, and \$10,000-supplemental entry Pure Chance, who brings her own four-race win streak to tonight's race.

A daughter of stallion Swan For All, Grand Swan is out of the mare Queen Mum. Joe Yoder, who is part of the Grand Swan Racing ownership group, bought Queen Mum in foal with the filly and trained Grand Swan down at age 2 before turning her over to Miller. She won eight of 12 races last season and continued to blossom after turning 3.

"She grew up a lot and matured a lot," Miller said. "Last year I didn't feel comfortable getting locked in or sitting with her for a long time, she just got a little too anxious last year. This year training her down we trained her to help her with that and she really learned from it.

"Her manners (are her best attribute). She's very professional and takes care of herself. In the post parade and scoring down she's nice and relaxed. When you ask her to go, she goes. She does whatever you want to do."

Following the Crossroads of America, Grand Swan is eligible to the Matron Stakes at Dover Downs. The race would take Grand Swan out of Indiana for the first time.

"We're planning on that," Miller said. "Then we'll turn her out and bring her back (next year) and see how she is. We're probably going to stake her to some of the aged races. We want to be careful because it's a tougher transition from 3 to 4, so we'll probably pick our spots."

Friday's card at Harrah's Hoosier Park also includes the \$120,000 USS Indianapolis Memorial for 3-year-old female pacers, \$220,000 Carl Erskine for 3-year-old male trotters, and \$225,000 Monument Circle for 3-year-old male pacers.

Cleangame opened the French winter meeting

The French winter meeting in Paris started on Wednesday afternoon and, as is tradition, the \$100,000 Prix des Cevennes opened the prestigious meeting which contains 90 race cards, 746 races, 104 group races, including 11 Group 1 races at Vincennes racetrack. Four months of spectacular racing is ahead for the harness racing fans in Europe and the kick off on Wednesday afternoon seemed to be some kind of a déja-vu experience from last meeting.

Jean-Michel Bazire had four drives during the first day of racing and the champion driver won three of them, amongst them, the Prix des Cevennes with gelding star Cleangame (Ouragan de Celland).

And Cleangame didn't get anything for free in his chase for his 10th victory in 2019. Bazire was not especially worried when he noted that he and his 7-year-old gelding had to do the first 2.000 meters three wide before the duo reached position outside of leader Bugsy Malone with a half mile to go in the 1.7-mile long race.

Cleangame was totally superior his opponents this day and, without a doubt, this horse belongs among the best trotters in the world. The mile rate over the heavy distance was 1:55.4.

French trotter Bold Eagle (Ready Cash) charmed the racing fans when Breeders Crown was held at Woodbine Mohawk last weekend and Cleangame is at least at the same level as the fresh Breeders Crown winner at this very moment.

And speaking about Bold Eagle, one of his owners, Thomas Bernereau, told French harness racing media Paris-Turf that Bold Eagle most probably will come back to North America next year and try to defend his title in Breeders Crown and even get a shot at the meeting in Lexington during next fall.

Chief Mate (1:50.4) and Ideal Perception (1:51.3) both established lifetime-bests in taking their respective final preliminaries and top the male pace.

Live racing takes place this Friday and Saturday. Post time is 7:15 p.m.

WHHC QUALIFIER: The World Harness Handicapping Championship returns to the Meadowlands on Saturday (Nov. 2), with the first of six qualifiers presented by DerbyWars.com.

Players will have to pay a \$100 total fee (\$50 entry plus a \$50 real-money bankroll) to participate in the competition that requires one to place \$5 win wagers on any 10 Meadowlands races.

Betting over the course of the two days was just over \$6.6 million, despite a Saturday evening that saw rainy weather. "Congratulations to our friends in Canada and the Hambletonian Society for putting on a spectacular event," said Meadowlands' chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. "The races and their TV production was not only well-received on track, but at the Meadowlands and all other simulcast outlets as well."
