Breeders Crown is unkind to favorites, though some clarity provided in year-end honors

I can't envision a scenario in any remaining races where Party Girl Hill could, nor should, overtake Tall Dark Stranger for Horse of the Year.



Over the past couple of years, the Breeders Crown has become a sort of graveyard for favorites. Last year, the Horse of Year leading contenders Shartin N, Greenshoe and Bettor's Wish all lost. This year, the number 1 and 2 ranked horses in the current Hambletonian/Breeders Crown Society poll again went down too. And in the case of #1 ranked Tall Dark Stranger, his 3-year-old colt pace Crown was won by a horse that paid \$409; the highest paying horse in Breeders Crown history. So, what is the fallout and implications for year-end honors?

Even though Tall Dark Stranger lost – because it was coupled with the loss of Party Girl Hill in the 3-year-old filly pace – as of this moment he should be Horse of the Year. He's been sensational in every major race this year and it would have taken a perfect campaign from Party Girl Hill to overthrow him in the top spot. Even though she beat the 3-year-old colts in the Tattersalls Pace two races back and despite she was valiant in defeat on Saturday, I can't envision a scenario in any remaining races where she could, nor should, overtake Tall Dark Stranger.

Say what you want about the passing lane at Hoosier, but race after race produced horses coming from everywhere in the stretch.

It got Party Girl Hill, and a few races afterwards it got Tall Dark Stranger. Both horses dug in for all they were worth after moving to the lead through comparably quick fractions but couldn't prevail in the end.

In the case of Tall Dark Stranger, it looked like he was going to be passed by about five different challengers in the stretch and in the shadow of the wire looked like he miraculously fought all of them off, just as he somehow always does. It took a 203-1 shot who came from out of the clouds on the far outside to snap him, and if anything, that race only adds to the lure of Tall Dark Stranger. Because of the nature of that race, he may actually add to his lead in the next poll. It was a similar story for Party Girl Hill who was stung by eventual race winner Peaky Sneaky when brushing to the lead, only to be passed late by that well-meant rival as well as Lyons Sentinel. She too shouldn't be punished for a race of that quality and I'd expect her to remain in the #2 spot, but it doesn't seem anymore that there's a viable path to #1. Also, I didn't forget about Ramona Hill. She obviously gets a ton of credit as a Hambletonian-winning filly, but she lost a couple towards the end of the year and even with Breeders Crown losses by other rivals, those top two should still rate higher.

Within the individual divisions where the Breeders Crown results could provide some added intrigue, let's start with the 2-year-old's.

From Friday's quarter of freshmen crowns, Lady Chaos won the Breeders Crown for trotting fillies and that should nail down her claim to the division. In a division with no clear standouts, she danced most of the big dances. Runner-up in the Peaceful Way also won the KYSS finals and then swept the Breeders Crown elimination and final; is deserving to get the nod.

For the frosh colt trotters, Venerate could only manage a third-place finish in the Breeders Crown off a tough trip but he's probably still done enough to garner divisional honors. It would have potentially been close between him and Southwind Tyrion had that horse not scratched out of the Breeders Crown, but Venerate, the KYSS champion, also won the inaugural Mohawk Million in addition to pinning the first career defeat to Captain Corey in his Breeders Crown elimination. It would be hard to see Venerate not winning.

Perfect Sting should be unanimous on the 2-year-old colt pacing side, but things were made a little more interesting with the young filly pacers. Conventional wisdom is that Test Of Faith already had this division locked up prior to the Breeders Crown and my guess is that she probably still does win it. But the resume for Breeders Crown winner Fire Start Hanover suddenly doesn't look much different. Not staked to the Breeders Crown, the NYSS champ won the Kentuckiana, Bluegrass and International Stallion Stake; the latter in a near world record time. But Fire Start Hanover, despite not having the look of a star at first, ended the season on a tear. She too won the Bluegrass, International Stallion Stake and after a fluky Breeders Crown elimination, she came back to win the final. Depending how much weight you put into a Breeders Crown win, I'd think Fire Start Hanover deserves serious consideration.

For the 3-year-old colt trotters, Amigo Volo did just enough to hang on in the Breeders Crown and in the process clinched that division. I thought last year that an outside chance for divisional honors could have been made for him when he won the Breeders Crown then too. He didn't get it then, but this year's PASS, Kentucky Futurity and repeat Breeders Crown champion will get it now. He's been the best sophomore trotting colt the second half of the season.

All other 3-year-old divisions are foregone conclusions as no matter what happens between now and year end, Ramona Hill, Party Girl Hill and Tall Dark Stranger will all take those remaining age-restricted divisions.

In the older divisions, Shartin N looked like she was going to put a brief scare into Kissin In The Sand as it was Tetrick up the inside again (Next Level Stuff), but Kissin In The Sand was able to keep Shartin N at bay and she'll earn the honor as older pacing mare in a change of the guard. With his Breeders Crown win, as of this moment Gimpanzee would win out over Atlanta for older trotter and may very well vault up to #3 when the new weekly poll comes out.







Another year, same story: Crown likely won't determine Horse of the Year honors

"That 'crunching' sound you are

hearing is the sound of people taking any preconceptions they had about Horse of "... no, wait, I already wrote that one last year (full story here).

When Yannick Gingras upset Party Girl Hill with Peaky Sneaky, it occurred to me that he might have cleared his own path to year-end honors, if Tall Dark Stranger, aka Captain Courageous, could get home.

Instead, a \$409.80 shot – he WAS the longest shot on the board, \$162 to win out of a \$40,360 win pool – Sandbetweenmytoes, with Scott Zeron, edged him out, and Horse of the Year is still up for grabs.

TDS' deserved reputation for seemingly fighting off every challenger he saw come to him served him extremely well against the determined stretch charge of Cattlewash alongside and others in the cavalry charging at him. But it was the challenger he likely couldn't see – the one who was closer to the hot dog stand in the grandstand at the finish than he was to the pylons – who knocked him off. (Real hard-luck story: Captain Barbossa, who was beaten three-quarters of a length, and finished sixth – at least he got the \$5,000, one per cent of the purse, which went to all the starters).

Great credit to both Party Girl Hill and Tall Dark Stranger, who lost by two necks and one neck, respectively. And Breeders Crowns don't give a favorite any easy time – Party Girl Hall's fractions were :54 out and :55 back, and even more dramatically, :52.3 out and :56 back in the Tall Dark Stranger race.

I was really impressed by Peaky Sneaky's resilience last week, and again tonight. As for Sandbetweenmytoes, the six people who still talk to me will confirm that I said going to the Jug that if there is a longshot, it might be this gelding. He paid \$16.20 in his Jug elimination – and of course a little more here. He got roughed up in the Jug final and was favored over Cattlewash in the 1:46.4 Lexington race, so he wasn't exactly Swiss cheese, and he showed no holes tonight.

The top two, both 3-year-old pacers, were really good, but



they didn't win. So the year-end honors discussion likely will continue.

And since it all may not come down to the Breeders Crown (sorry again, John and Moira – you and Hoosier put on a great show), here's what open races are available through Thanksgiving:

THU 11-5 – DD, 2YO Matrons, all four divisions, approx. \$175G

FRI 11-6 – HoP, 3YO C-G Pace (Mon. Circle) and Open (Erskine) trot, \$200G; 3f trot and pace, 100G

SAT 11-7 — M, 2YO Kindergarten Finals, all four divisions, \$250G

THU 11-12 – DD, 3YO Matrons, all four divisions, approx. \$200G

SUN 11-15 - RcR, Potomac Inv., \$100G

WED 11-18 & WED 11-25 – DD, 3YO Open Progress Pace elims. and final, final \$300G

SAT 11-21 — M, 2YO Final Four, all four divisions, \$450G; TVG Open trot and pace Final, \$350G; TVG Female trot and pace Final, \$175G

TVG eligibility: Preference to top nine in preliminaries having started in three preliminaries. Then a 10th (or more, depending on number of entries) can be added – the winners of the following races in preference: Crown 3YO final; Crown older final; Hambletonian/M Pace or Hambletonian Oaks/M Shalee; (for Opens) Crown mare final; Futurity/Tattersalls or Filly Futurity/Garnsey; N Am Cup / Fan Hanover. (This is just a brief summary; see the rules for a complete explanation.)

A paragraph about each of the other Crowning events:

Gimpanzee wasn't even the best horse in his division within the Marcus Melander barn by common thought the previous two years, Greenshoe was the "lead horse." So all Gimpanzee did was win the Breeders Crown at 2 and 3. Saturday, he added a third Crown by brushing to the lead nearing the half and trotting strongly. (Atlanta had to come first-over, and may have been a step off her best. And what a difference in the fractions from the race before it: :56.4-:54.4, vs. :52.3-:56.) This seems like it might have been a big step towards Trotter of the Year honors, depending on his schedule (and that of others; see above.)

Kissin In The Sand had Shartin N right on her back and with aim, yet she proved tough enough to pace home in :26.3 into the stiff wind to keep the Dunn/Takter wheel rolling and likely get her the nod for the divisional title. She picked a fine time to peak – the Crown was her sixth win in a row, and her 1:48.4 tied the 2009 stakes record of Hana Hanover, and lowered the Hoosier mare mark (no separate 4YO mark) of Carol's Z Tam by a fifth.

Manchego is only the seventh horse to win as many as three Breeders Crowns; Peace Crops won four to lead all horses. Manchego is the first Crown champion to win at 2, 4, and 5. The victory also brought breeder Brittany Farms to a 27-27 tie for Crown championships with long-time friendly rival Hanover Shoe Farms.

Century Farroh, who may not have won too many races but has been as consistent as anyone among the FFA pacers, worked out a pocket trip and edged by the gritty Bettor's Wish, who had to go first-over and who may have had the best overall year, to post a gutty win. This gang should for the most part turn up for TVG action. And a shoutout to all our Nova Scotia friends for this horse's success!

A 3-year-old trotting filly who had won three of her last four starts, including an elimination race, had Tim Tetrick and Jim Campbell behind her, and she goes off at 8-1? That's Next Level Stuff, who can add Breeders Crown champion to her laurels. Her time of 1:52 was not only a Breeders Crown record, but it also marked the fourth time this year that that divisional track record had been broken at Hoosier.

Amigo Volo was life-and-death in the sophomore colt trot, but he won his Crown – just as he did in 2019. He was the second Crown winner of the weekend for Nifty Norman, and his seventh lifetime, giving him a toehold in the top ten trainers in the Crown's history. The Pinske family were also in on his other winner, Fire Start Hanover.

Four drivers won 16 of the 17 Crown eliminations: Dexter Dunn, Yannick Gingras, David Miller, and Tim Tetrick (Andy Miller was the other). They produced three, Miller two and Dunn one, of the five winners in Friday's four finals (remember the dead-heat?). And it looked like The Fearsome Foursome would dominate again Saturday, with Dunn taking three of the first five, and Gingras and Tetrick the other two.

Then Scott Zeron and his horse's few backers crashed the party, and Brian Sears (who was also a Friday winner, along with Bob McClure) won with Gimpanzee. Miller "restored normalcy" in taking the last race, the Open pace, with Century Farroh – with Dunn-Tetrick-Gingras 2-3-4, ending things "full circle."

According to our records, compiled as always on deadline, Dunn drove the winners of \$1,056,000; Miller, \$1,020,540; Gingras, \$816,320; and Tetrick, \$797,000.

The winning trainers' circle was even tighter on Saturday, with Nancy Takter taking three, Jim Campbell winning two, and Nifty Norman (who also won one Friday) also triumphing. Last year's Trainer of the Year, Marcus Melander, along with Dr. Ian Moore, who is a delightful guest at most any party, took the last two races. By our figures, Nancy Takter's horses earned \$1,022,000. She'd probably gladly give you 20 per cent if you could have made the Hoosier stretch about 30 feet shorter.

• * *

In playing host to all 12 Breeders Crown championships this weekend for the second time, Hoosier has now played host to 24 Crown championships, putting it sixth on the all-time Crown championship host list. The five ahead are: The Meadowlands (91), Woodbine (87), Mohawk (64), Pompano (49), and Pocono (36).

Thirty-one tracks have played host to at least one Breeders Crown championship event – and I was pleased to note that all 31 were on my personal "Tracks Collected" list. I was not pleased to note that 14 were on the "No Longer Hosting Harness" list – and I had been to Crowns at half of them.

Number of Breeders Crown championships after that disqualification before there was the first dead-heat to win: 11.

Both were in the 2-year-old colt pace.

(And Perfect Sting had already done the dead-heat for win thing, as noted by my HRU colleague Keith McCalmont, three months and two days earlier in his career debut at Pocono).

In case you were wondering, Perfect Sting and Summa Cum Laude both earned \$217,500 of the \$600,000 purse for their dead-heat victory. And if you wondering how a winner got 36.25 per cent of the purse:

In the Breeders Crown finals, the purses are divided this way: one per cent is set aside for the non-first five In this \$600,000 race, \$30,000 would be devoted to those finishers. Then the winner is guaranteed 50 per cent of the original purse, so that's \$300,000, leaving \$270,000 to be divided. This money is divided \$135,000 (22.5 per cent of the original purse), \$64,800 (10.8 per cent), \$43,200 (7.2 per cent), and \$27,000 (4.5 per cent), which is 90 per cent of the normal distribution, because of the one percenters taking up "5 per cent" and the guaranteed 50 per cent to the winner besides them taking up another "5 per cent."

You take the win money (\$300,000, 50 per cent) and the place money (\$135,000, 22.5 per cent), divide the total by two, and get \$217,500 (36.25 per cent). See me after class for the different ways things are done in The Meadowlands' and some of Hoosier's own stakes events.

Pennsylvania-sired horses led the way again Saturday, with five of the night's Crown champions. Ontario produced two – including sweeping the first three spots in the Open Pace – and New York one. All five winners on Friday were PA-sired.

From 1996 until 2004, the Breeders Crown Open Trot was where the sport's top mares would chase divisional glory. Dan Patch 1996 Trotting Mare of the Year C R Kay Suzie and 1998 Horse of the Year Moni Maker defeated mixed-sex fields to capture their Crowns when this was the only option for older distaff trotters. Hannelore Hanover, 2016 Open Mare Trot Crown champion, was divisional Dan Patch winner that year, but it took the 2017 Open Trot title to push her over the top as overall Dan Patch/O'Brien Horse of the Year.

The 2019 Breeders Crown at Woodbine Mohawk Park saw Atlanta finish third to Bold Eagle in the Open, while Manchego set an all-time distaff final record of 1:51s flat for the Open Mare Trot. When last year's Dan Patch Award winners were announced, Trotting Mare of the Year was the closest decision among voters: Atlanta over Manchego, 74-72. It did not all come down to the Breeders Crown, but seemingly which Crown each exceptional mare pursued.

This year, the top mares were again entered in separate Breeders Crown divisions, neither of which called for eliminations. And while Atlanta prepped for the Open Trot final with her Oct.11 Allerage Farms Open Trot victory at Red Mile, holding off Crystal Fashion in 1:50 over a surface optimistically rated "good", Manchego finished second to Gimpanzee in a Harrah's Hoosier Park invitational Oct. 24, closing in a sizzling :25.1. Although her most recent victory was back on July 26 in Plainridge Park's \$250,000 Spirit of Massachusetts free-for-all, #7 Manchego would enter the 2020 Open Mare Trot as 8-5 morning line favourite. The fastest-ever trotter in a race over a half-mile track, #5 Plunge Blue Chip, was her closest competition, at 9-5 odds. When Ake Svanstedt's world champion toured the Delaware County Fair oval in 1:51.3 Sept. 24, she won the \$87,500 Miss Versatility final over a steppy-gaited Manchego (who was fifth) and earned a layoff until the Breeders Crown.

Halloween night, Manchego (Dexter Dunn) left the masquerade of vulnerability behind and returned to her familiar winning ways. Sent off at 4-5, the two-time Crown champion was briefly fourth outside of #1 Weslynn Quest (Scott Zeron), as #6 Felicity Shagwell S (Andy Miller) swiftly moved to the front, followed by stablemate Plunge Blue Chip (Ake Svanstedt). It was a perfect start for all except #4 When Dovescry (David Miller), who broke stride leaving. Felicity Shagwell S set the pace to the :27.3 opening quarter with a single-file procession of mares behind her, a length-and-a-half ahead of Plunge Blue Chip. Manchego had settled into fourth along

the pylons. At the :56 flat half, the Swedish import was still in charge, but with the long shadow of Dunn's mare advancing first over out of fourth. When Dovescry had also caught the field and was back in the game from eighth. Felicity Shagwell S held on gamely through the 1:24.2 three-quarters, but her fate was sealed: Third-place Weslynn Quest jumped in the last turn, and Plunge Blue Chip was flushed out from the pocket by Manchego, setting up for a battle of the world champions.

It was a short-lived bout, with a knockout punch delivered by the 2017/2019 champ. Manchego turned on the late jets in the stretch, trotting home in 27 seconds with Dunn nearly horizontal in the sulky. She opened up by three-and-a-quarter lengths over Plunge Blue Chip at the wire in the 1:52 performance; When Dovescry closed for show, and #3 Pat Matters (Andrew McCarthy) got up for fourth. A short-lived inquiry on a possible breaking violation by When Dovescry was overturned by judges; she had stayed flat-gaited after the early miscue.

The first Breeders Crown event of the card was Dunn's third win of the night, and Manchego's fifth victory in 12 seasonal starts, adding her share of the \$300,000 purse to her \$289,451 in seasonal earnings. Asked whether he was satisfied with how his mare was

positioned early in the race, the reigning Dan Patch Driver of the Year had nothing but admiration for Manchego's effort and 2020 campaign: "Yeah, I was. She's an amazing animal. She's an amazing horse. She went 'off' halfway through the season here, but [trainer Nancy Takter did] a great job to get her back relaxing. [Manchego] got home so good last week here, sitting back coming off cover, so I got in a handy position and the fractions were solid enough, too. She really did it easy. It was a good performance tonight." He added that Plunge Blue Chip's exit from the pocket had actually improved, rather than hindered, Manchego's chances: "Well, actually it worked out good because I got on his helmet for a while and he sort of led me into the stretch. So once she [Manchego] moved off Ake's helmet, she really exploded." Dunn had also reined the freshly-minted 2020 Breeders Crown champ to her 2019 title at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Post-race, beaming owner Barry Guariglia of Black Horse Racing, Lebanon, NJ shared Dunn's appraisal of the 5-year-old star: "I said to [trainer] Nancy [Takter] in the winner's circle, 'It sure never gets old.' She's an awesome mare and it's been a great ride."

The Breeders Crown win was the final, devastating move in an endgame that had spanned a most unusual season. "After the last couple of weeks, the way she's been able to rate, she just kind of sat there patiently," said Guariglia, likening the predatory Manchego to "a tuna on a piece of bait" when it counted: "Once they turned for home, she just pounced." While mares of her pedigree and resume have often already become valuable broodmares by age five, Manchego has instead produced a different kind of thrill for her owner and fans, perhaps a more necessary kind of thrill in the trying year of COVID-19. "I think it's just great," said Guariglia. "I own a few horses and I've owned them for a lot of years and to get something like this, it truly makes it worth the journey."

Muscle Hill daughter Manchego sold under original name "Whispering Hills" at the 2016 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, bringing \$120,000. Bred by Brittany Farms LLC of Versailles, KY, the 2017 Breeders Crown Two-Year-Old Filly Trot winner joins Emoticon Hanover, Buck I St Pat, Mystical Sunshine, and Grades Singing as the latest back-to-back Mare Trot champion. She is the third foal of Cantab Hall mare Secret Magic (3, 1:54.4f; \$198,260), a Hanover Shoe Farms broodmare. Secret Magic has seven registered offspring to date, although her foals of 2017 and 2018 passed away before they could race. The mare's 2020 yearling Stilton Hanover, a full-brother to big cheese Manchego, is Hip #20 in the upcoming Timonium Black Book Sale.

Scott Farber scores emotional win with Next Level Stuff in honor of his late father

When Next Level Stuff snuck up the passing lane for the second straight week and claimed the \$500,000 3-year-old trotting filly Breeders Crown Final, Scott Farber was overcome with emotion.

It was the Montvale, NJ resident's first Breeders Crown win and his first appearance at the season ending showdown since cheering Run The Table home to a second-place finish in the 1987 three-year-old pacing colt final alongside his late father Sandy Farber. In honor of his father, who passed away in 2004, the owner/breeder named his operation Runthetable Stables and has been chasing a second Breeders Crown for 33 years.

"My stable is named after my father, who I loved with all my heart. He was my best friend in the entire world and I just miss him so much," said a tearful Farber from the winner's circle. "I hope I made him proud tonight. And I'm so proud of this horse and so proud of being a small part of the Campbell family, who is the greatest family, in my opinion, in harness racing.

"With no disrespect to any trainers that are out there, Jim Campbell is the best. I'm telling you, he's the best. That's just how I feel."

Campbell's patience and care were critical to landing Next Level Stuff and Farber in the winner's circle on Saturday night, along with a second-straight flawless steer from driver Tim Tetrick.

Starting from Post 1, Tetrick hustled Next Level Stuff away from the Hoosier Park starting gate and was happy to yield to fan favorites Sorella and Yannick Gingras heading by the :27.2 opening quarter. Sorella and Gingras gave way to Hypnotic AM and Brian Sears before the :55.2 and Hypnotic AM carried on to a 1:23.4 three-quarters with Sorella and Next Level Stuff jammed up behind her and Love A Good Story mounting a moderate challenge in the outer lane. When the fillies squared up in the stretch Sorella tipped right, Next Level Stuff went left and for the second straight week Next Level Stuff had the biggest late kick, pulling away

to a one and one-quarter length victory in a track and stakes record 1:52.

Sorella survived a brief inquiry to be second and Ab`sattitudexpress with Andrew McCarthy aboard closed well to be second. Pacesetter Hypnotic AM was fourth.

The 1:52 clocking bettered the 1:52.2 record set by Shake It Cerry in the 2014 Crown at The Meadowlands.

"She raced really good. In her last three starts she's been coming into top form," said Tetrick. "Last week she got home in :26 and-a-piece and raced well, and tonight we got kind of the same trip. With the long stretch here, we had plenty of time to get through there.

"Jim and the crew have done a great job with her. She's definitely exceeded expectations, that's for sure."

Hot-headed as a freshman, Next Level Stuff made breaks in her first three lifetime starts before going gate-to-wire in a division of The Stallion Series. The daughter of Sebastian K and Cantab Hall mare Nantab would string together five more wins in her freshman campaign as Tetrick and Campbell worked to broaden her repertoire from paces-setting to pocket-sitting. Her biggest win as a two-year-old came in the Nov. 7 Matron Stakes at Dover Downs.

This season the filly kicked things off with three straight wins, two in overnight action and the third in the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS), displaying far greater versatility. She bookended a disappointing fifth in the Hambletonian Oaks with second-by-a-nose results in the Tompkins-Geers and a PASS split. Second in another PASS division and fourth in the Championship, Next Level Stuff returned to the winner's circle in her Sept. 25 Liberty Bell split at Harrah's Philadelphia and followed that up with a personal best 1:51.3 triumph her Oct. 4 Bluegrass division at The Red Mile. A fourth in the Oct. 11 Kentucky Filly Futurity was Next Level Stuff's final prep before last weekend's Breeders Crown elimination.

"She matured a lot mentally from her two-year-old to her three-year-old year. She trained back real good and she was much more versatile to race. You could race her anyway you wanted to race her and that was the biggest difference this year," said Jim Campbell. "She did tail off on us right around the Hambletonian Oaks. She had about three starts right in there where she wasn't as sharp. She really came to life down in Lexington. She was really good there both weeks. Then she came back here and, both weeks in a row, she finished it off for us."

Her Breeders Crown triumph gives Next Level Stuff a

record of 13 wins and three seconds in 23 career starts for earnings of \$646,816, but more importantly it gives Farber a memory he will treasure for a lifetime.

"There's just no way that I'm going to be able to put this into words. I can talk forever, but at this point, I just think I need to say one thing – this is the first time I've been involved in a Breeders Crown since I was with John and Jim with Run The Table and I'm just so proud to be a part of it. Harrah's has done a great, great job entertaining this thing, and we won," said Farber. "It's something you're always fighting to get back to and here I am tonight."

"I think winning a Breeders Crown tops almost any race, with the exception of the Hambletonian or the Oaks," added Campbell. "It's a thrill and I'm especially happy for Scott. We've had some bad years and he's hung in there, so I'm happy for Scott and his family."

The Breeders Crown 3-year-old filly pace was expected to be the final jewel in an undefeated season for Party Girl Hill.

Instead it turned into a celebration for a different female, co-owner Judith Taylor.

Peaky Sneaky, co-owned by Judith, her son Howard and Order By Stable, sat the pocket behind 1-5 favorite Party Girl Hill and in deep stretch came through on the inside to garner the victory in a stakes record 1:49.

"I was told that there was one horse that [Peaky Sneaky] could not beat, the one that's won every race," said Judith. "I expected her to race well and finish second because I was told [Party Girl Hill] could not be beaten and indeed she wasn't until tonight."

In the winner's circle following the victory by the daughter of Bettor's Delight-World Of Rock, Taylor's son Howard talked about why winning this race might matter a little more to him.

"Higher than it probably should because this is my mom's horse," said Howard. "She owns it with me and she's never had a really good horse before. She was going to come out and she had some doubts with everything that's going around in the world, so she cancelled at the last minute. So, shout out to my mom. Shout out to Stefan [Balazi, Order By Stable), my partner and I couldn't be happier.



Peaky Sneaky (Yannick Gingras) ducked inside in deep stretch to upset previously unbeaten Party Girl Hill and set a 1:49 stakes record in the process.

"Party Girl Hill is a great horse, there's no doubt about it, but I thought if anybody had a shot to beat her, we would and I thought the trip would come out just like it did where we were in a dual and then just take a shot up the rail."

Judith had her ticket and a cab scheduled to pick her up at her Pennsylvania home at 6 a.m. on Halloween but ended up having second thoughts.

"It actually wasn't COVID-19 that kept me from going," Judith said. "Last night and early this morning I just did not feel well."

She went on to say that it was a long trip where she had to change planes and then drive an hour to a hotel near the track.

"So, I thought this is not a good idea," Judith said. "And it probably wouldn't have been but of course now I'm heartbroken. And my son is telling me about the champagne and all the celebrating afterwards."

I'm fine now. I guess that's why the horse won to cheer me up. I just still can't believe it. I'm pinching myself." Peaky Sneaky (7-1), driven by Yannick Gingras, paid \$16.20 notching her sixth victory of the year.

"For sure, Party Girl Hill is a tremendous filly, probably one of the best fillies ever," said Gingras. "I have all the respect in the world for her, but I had all the confidence in the world in mine as well, so it was a great race and luckily we came out on top."

As for Party Girl Hill, her driver Dexter Dunn said, "she raced great. She probably just wasn't on top of her game slightly, but still raced great and had a great year. It's disappointing not to finish it off with a Crown, but she still raced really good."

Party Girl Hill's trainer, Chris Ryder, said, "She went a good race. Obviously, we were looking to win it, the whole world thought we would. She was strong to the half and more than strong at the three-quarter pole, but we got beat. It happens. It's a bad night to have it happen, but they all get beat sooner or later. Honestly, as a trainer, you know it's going to happen, you just pray it doesn't.

"I was pretty happy with her this week, everything went right. I think we'll race her in the Matron. She scoped clean. I haven't had much time to talk to Dexter. He didn't have much to tell me after the race. She only got beat half-a-length, right? It's tough."

The Taylors felt the loss by Party Girl Hill could only help Tall Dark Stranger who is co-owned by Howard.

Tall Dark Stranger and Party Girl Hill are currently ranked one and two, respectively, in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown Top 10 Poll.

But Tall Dark Stranger also lost his Crown race so the battle for Horse of the Year continues.

Amigo Volo guts out second Crown victory, leaving Carter Pinske in awe

Like father, like son.

Saturday night proved to be twice as nice for Amigo Volo, who took all the spoils in the \$500,000 Breeders Crown for 3-year-old male trotters, and with it, joined some impressive company in the record books.

Amigo Volo is now one of four male trotters this century to have won Crown trophies at ages 2 and 3: Gimpanzee, 2018-2019; his sire Father Patrick, 2013-2014; and Muscle Hill, 2008-2009.

Amigo Volo's most recent Crown coronation was yet another trotting tour de force for the talented sophomore star owned by Pinske Stables and David Miller, and trained by Richard "Nifty" Norman.

But it didn't come easily.

The bay, who fashions a few white hairs on his forehead, might have had some more sprout up after his Saturday night (Oct. 31) at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

Sent off as the 2-5 favorite, Amigo Volo, with Dexter Dunn at the controls, was placed in the driver's seat just before the half-mile mark.

As the field of 10 rounded the turn for home, Ready For Moni came calling to his outside, ratcheting up the pressure on the leader. When Ready For Moni began to fade mid-way down the lane, 27-1 Play Trix on Me found a seam along the inside and took dead aim at Amigo Volo.

At the wire, Amigo Volo held on for the victory over Play Trix One Me, eking out a nose triumph. Chestnut Hill, also trained by Norman, was third. The final time was 1:53.

"He's obviously been very good as a juvenile, then again this year," said Dunn. "He's so versatile, you can really get him out of the gate and put him in a hole and move or whatever you want to do. So, he just held on, but he did what he's been doing all year, just putting in great runs."

The gritty performance, on the heels of a head-turning elimination score in 1:51.2 – the fastest mile ever by a 3-year-old trotter at Hoosier Park and one-fifth of a second off the track's overall record – resulted in the 14thvictory in

26 starts for the gelding.

"It's awesome," said Dunn. "I picked him up later in the year as a 2-year-old last year. He was my first Breeders Crown winner (in North America), so he's been a special horse to me. He was on top of his game at 2 here and at 3 now, too. He's pretty easy on himself. He's a pretty relaxed horse."

A \$42,000 purchase (Hip #194) at the 2018 Lexington Select Sale, Amigo Volo has been money in the bank for his connections, having now surpassed \$1.5 million in career earnings.

He took the Kentucky Futurity on Oct. 11 at Red Mile and followed it up with his aforementioned Crown elimination win. Since mid-August, he has won six of seven races and finished second in the other.

The current streak is sweet redemption after Amigo Volo, who set world records for 2-year-old geldings on a five-eighths-mile track (1:52.4) and mile track (1:52.3), finished fourth in the Hambletonian on Aug. 8 at the Meadowlands.

This year, he's won eight of 14 races.

the Breeders Crown and just to have a horse in it is incredible."

When asked for a word to best describe his top-notch trotter, Pinske came up with a most appropriate one, especially considering tonight's performance.

"Guts."

Pinske heaped on more praise soon after.

"He's a tough horse to get tired and he's a tough horse to run down. He just grinds. He just grinds as hard as he can go."

Norman also earned high marks from Pinske.

While the veteran conditioner might downplay his impact on Amigo Volo's success story, others are happy to speak of Norman's abilities.

"Nifty won't take the credit, but he's one of the biggest reasons that the Pinskes are still racing horses. When my grandpa wasn't able to do it, and even before that, he would take horses in his barn in places that we couldn't be and things like that. He's the reason that we kept a couple of yearlings every year because we could always bank on the fact that he'd take them and do well with them."

Amigo Volo, bred by Kentuckiana Farms LLC and Jorgen Jahre Jr., would be an ideal example of that.

And even though it wasn't a trot in the park on Saturday evening, the second-year standout showed it doesn't always need to be about glitz and glamor.

Sometimes, it takes old-school grit to graduate into the record books.

"The horse has just a tremendous heart. He loves what he does and he always finds a way to win."

Kissin In The Sand finally gets her Crown

Marvin Katz and Hatfield Stables' Kissin In The Sand, trained by Nancy Takter, made her third finals appearance a winning one with a powerful performance in Saturday's (Oct. 31) \$300,000 Breeders Crown open mare pace at Harrah's Hoosier Park. In victory, Kissin In The Sand was the rare favorite to live up to her backing on a wild night in Anderson, Indiana.

The 5-year-old Somebeachsomewhere – Kiss Me Kate mare was making her third straight attempt in a Breeders Crown final. In 2018, she finished second from post 9 as a result of taking a bye to the finals when longshot Percy Bluechip post the upset in the 3-year-old filly pacers division on a sloppy track at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono. Last year, Kissin In The Sand settled for third after leaving from the outside post 7 at Woodbine Mohawk Park in a race won by Caviart Ally over Shartin N.

Takter left nothing to chance this year opting to race in last week's elimination in order to secure a better post for this evening. Ironically, Kissin In The Sand was forced to overcome post 9 in her elimination to top reigning Horse of the Year Shartin N.

Kissin In The Sand set out to secure her first Breeders Crown from the comfort of post 3 in rein to Dexter Dunn. A talented field of former Breeders Crown champs included 3-year-old filly winner Warrawee Ubeaut, last year's Mare Pace winner Caviart Ally; and 2018 Mare Pace winner Shartin N.

Warrawee Ubeaut fired off the gate with Rockin Nola attempting to maintain inside position before Tim Tetrick decided enough was enough and allowed Shartin N to take command from post 6 through an opening quarter-mile in :26.4.

The lead was short lived however as Dunn gave Kissin In The Sand her cue and she found the front in :54.2 with ease. Warrawee Ubeaut tipped out to make her bid into the final turn and ranged up outside the 2-5 mutuel favorite with Tetrick waiting patiently for room along the pylons as three-quarters passed in 1:22.1

Kissin In The Sand continued to find more, easily dispatching Warrawee Ubeaut and pacing comfortably clear of the inside rush from Shartin N. She stopped the clock in 1:48.4, equaling the stakes record set by Hana Hanover in 2009.

Dunn said that while the inside draw was important, in her current form the mare may have been unstoppable regardless while securing her seventh win of the season.

"The way she's been lately, I would've been confident whatever she drew, but obviously when she draws three it makes the job a little easier," said Dunn. "There was a little action early and we made our move. Like I said, she's just been vicious lately and she showed that again tonight with a strong run."

Dunn is now undefeated in four starts in rein to Kissin In The Sand.



The third time was the charm for Kissin In The Sand (Dexter Dunn), she won the \$300,000 Breeders Crown open mare pace in 1:48.4.

"I only got on this mare in the last six weeks probably, but she's been extremely powerful for half the season," said Dunn.

The Dunn-Kissin In The Sand winners ledger includes a victory over Shartin N in the \$175,000 Dayton Distaff Derby



on Oct. 3 in 1:49, a Hollywood Dayton track record for older pacing mares; and followed one week later with a score in the Allerage Farms Fillies and Mare Open Pace in 1:48, good for a track record at the Red Mile for a mare pacer.

After the Allerage score, Takter declared, "She's probably my favorite, like ever, out of all the horses I've ever been associated with."

Bud Hatfield of Hatfield Stables was full of praise for the talented trainer, noting that her father Jimmy Takter's record of 34 finals wins could be in jeopardy. Thirty-nine-year-old Nancy entered this year's event with four Breeders Crown trophies to her credit.

"Nancy Takter has got a lot of wonderful horses, but I think this is one of her favorites," said Hatfield. "She's done a great job with this horse and we're so thankful for that. This horse has won six in a row.

"Her dad's in trouble, you know, she's coming for his records."

Hatfield echoed Dunn's sentiments that Takter's decision to enter Kissin In The Sand in the elimination to race for a better post position was a winning move.

"You know, Nancy did the right thing when she decided to not take the bye in the eliminations and race the horse," said Hatfield. "That way, we were afforded the three-hole and I think that made a big difference in the Final."

An emotional Hatfield savored his winning moment in the aftermath of the long-awaited Breeders Crown victory for the older mare.

"It's a very special feeling," said Hatfield. "We love this horse and she is such a wonderful animal. I can't be any happier than I am right now."

Bred by Christina Takter, John Fielding, R A W Equine and Concord Stud Farm, Kissin In The Sand paid \$2.80 to win.

Wild finish, big upset as Sandbetweenmytoes edges Tall Dark Stranger by a neck

Over the past 36 years, the Breeders Crown has featured some of the most memorable races the sport has ever seen. Thanks to one of the wildest finishes and a record pay-out, this year's edition of the 3-year-old colt pace may move to the top of that list.

As the field of 10 was sent on their way, Cattlewash (David Miller) and Warrawee Vital (Tim Tetrick) were hustled off the gates wings and Cattlewash passed the quarter-mile pole in :25.3.

The heavy bettor's choice, Tall Dark Stranger (Yannick Gingras) popped out of the three hole and took the lead before the half mile in :52.3.

The top positions remained unchanged as the field passed the three-quarters in 1:20.3. It was at that point all 10 entries seemed to have a legitimate shot at Tall Dark Stranger and the field started to fan out down the long Harrah's Hoosier Park home stretch.

Scott Zeron had the eventual winner Sandbetweenmytoes in ninth as they turned for home and used a :26.2 last quarter to get the final call in a six-horse photo finish in 1:48.3.

Tall Dark Stranger was second by a neck, and thanks to his stablemate's upset win over previously undefeated Party Girl Hill and his own gutsy performance, he may have put the "Horse of the Year" race out of reach. The division leader won 11 of 12 starts coming into the \$500,000 Breeders Crown Final.

Cattlewash (beaten ¼ length) edged Save Me A Dance (Andrew McCarthy) and No Lou Zing (Dexter Dunn) for third. The LittleBrown Jug champion, Captain Barbossa (Joe Bongiorno) was sixth, only three-quarters of a length from the leader.

While Sandbetweenmytoes' connections were confident in

their chances, the betting public was not. They sent the gelding off at odds of 203-1. The win price of \$409.80 shattered the Crown record established by Kadealia (\$152) in the sophomore filly trot in 2008.

"Given the circumstances, getting away ninth with the speed that they had... even with all that, I had to fan him out really wide, so he was pretty game to do what he did," said Zeron.

"There's no doubt it was a long enough stretch, that's for sure, but it just seems that every horse that's been sitting second or third, it's really hard to make up that ground with these types of horses – they are not coming back to you, so it was pretty exciting from where I was to get up."

Zeron, who hoisted the Breeders Crown trophy for the third time, wasn't sure he got up in time.

"I couldn't see across (the track), it was probably exciting

for everyone with eight horses lined up right across the wire, but I'm happy he came out on top."

Trainer Jim Campbell was even less sure he won.

"I wasn't confident until they flashed his number up because I watched one angle and I thought maybe we had a shot, then I saw another angle and I thought, 'Oh, no way.' Watching the race live, I couldn't tell, and there were a few other people in the race standing beside me and they didn't know either, so it was tight."

"Last week (in a fifth place finish in the elimination), Scotty got off the bike and said, 'I know the video doesn't show it, but this is the best that this horse has ever raced for me.' He paced home in :25.3," said Campbell. "I took a lot from what Scotty said. He was happy with the way he paced home."

"He had a good week and, before the race, Scotty and I talked it over and from where we were at we just had to hope for a hot pace up front. We got it and Sandbetweenmytoes took advantage of it," added Campbell, who has trained six Breeders Crown champs including Next Level Stuff (3-year-old filly trot) earlier in the evening.

Sandbetweenmytoes is owned and bred by Jules Siegel's Fashion Farm. Siegel now owns six of the 12-inch tall crystal trophies.

The pacer's sire, Somebeachsomewhere (2008 three-year-old colt pace), and dam, Galleria (1998 three-year-old filly pace), were also Breeders Crown champions.

"(Sandbetweenmytoes) did what his mother did when she was a 3-year-old. She won a Breeders Crown and I know Jules is sitting at home very proud of Galleria," said Campbell.

With the \$250,000 first place check, the gelding increased his career earnings to \$516,532. He won for the seventh time in 16 seasonal starts.

Gimpanzee takes third straight Breeders Crown final for the Melander stable

In the \$500,000 Breeders Crown Open Trot, the best of the older-trotting division, including mare Atlanta, continued to yield to Gimpanzee as the Marcus Melander-trained and Brian Sears-driven bulldozer won in 1:51.3 on Saturday (Oct. 31) at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

It was the third straight Breeders Crown championship for Gimpanzee (Chapter Seven–Steamy Windows) – he won his Breeders Crown division final at 2, 3 and on this night, at 4.

Last year, Gimpanzee was the co-star of Melander's trotting triptych. He was the New York Sires Stakes champ at 3, unbeaten in that series, and came into the Hambletonian against his two barn mates, Greenshoe and Green Manalishi S. Although Gimpanzee raced big in the August classic, finishing third off a tough outside trip, he still lost to

Greenshoe and beat Green Manlishi.

Melander lost the Breeders Crown sophomore colt trot final with his top charge, Greenshoe because Gimpanzee won. It was a mild omen for his 4-year-old campaign, which has brought him his eighth win and 25th lifetime.

Melander won the bidding for Gimpanzee as a yearling and at 2, while the colt ravaged the New York Sires Stakes program, Melander said before the Hambletonian that he thought Gimpanzee was the best of the big three.

"He's an amazing horse," Melander said, "and he means a lot to me."

Melander's prophecy was correct, since neither Greenshoe nor Green Manalishi S came back at 4.

In the Oct. 31 Open Trot, Gimpanzee left along with outsider Crystal Fashion. The latter, a 22-1 shot, did not have a chance to lead past a :27.3 first quarter because Brian Sears tipped out of the second spot and cruised by the leader to take the field through a :56.4 half, a 1:24.1 three-quarters and was never touched by Sears as Atlanta and attempted to get him on the outside but Crystal Fashion pushed hard late on the rail but could only beat Atlanta to get second. Majestic Player A took the fourth spot.

Gimpanzee paid \$4.00 to win.

"I don't really know what Brian had planned," Melander said about pre-race strategy. "I think Gimpanzee is a little better chasing horses, but they went a little softer here on the back side. He's hard to catch, though, once he is on the lead."

Gimpanzee's successive Breeders Crown wins took place at three different tracks. At 2, he won in 1:54.4 at Pocono Downs and a 3 he won in 1:52.3 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Melander said he could not truly put into words his exuberance concerning the trotter's Breeders Crown feat over the years. "He's been with us since the start," Melander said, "since we bought him at the Harrisburg sale, and it's just amazing what a journey it's been for us. It's very tough to win these Breeders Crown races. I've had some good shots this weekend and [Gimpanzee] is our first win. I'm very happy, having done this with Gimpanzee. Taking his third Breeders Crown, just shows how good of a horse he is."

Sears loves this mount, and remember, he was the driver for Melander's top sophomore Greenshoe.

"The horse is so easy to drive," Sear said. "He knows his job and exactly what he's supposed to do. He's got every manner you could ask for in a horse, just a great example of a standardbred with personality and disposition. They don't come along quite as nice as him very often, that's for sure.

Gimpanzee was runner-up to Greenshoe for Dan Patch honors in 2019. Greenshoe was named best 3-year-old male trotter and Trotter of the Year. Yet, both trotters earned more than \$1 million while Melander became the second trainer in harness racing history to have two million-dollar-earning trotters in the same division in the same season, a feat only otherwise performed by Jimmy Takter.

Melander was voted Trainer of the Year in 2019 by the U.S. Harness Writers Association. He remains the youngest trainer to receive the award. His stable in 2019 won 86 races and \$5.36 million in purses, ranking him fourth for earnings in North America.

In 2014, the Melanders moved from Stockholm to New Egypt, NJ, to develop a career in the U.S. Melander's younger brother, Mattias, is an assistant with training and drives occasionally. Their sister, Mikaela, is a caretaker.

Melander is the nephew of Stefan Melander, trainer and driver of 2001 Hambletonian champ Scarlet Knight.

It was Century Farroh's fourth win of the year in his 15th start for trainer Dr. Ian Moore and owner Ratchford Stable of Nova Scotia. Hall of Fame driver David Miller noted that the addition of Lasix for Century Farroh's start last week in an invitational race appeared to turn his form in the right direction.

"I wasn't really happy with the draw," he said. "He had been racing just fair and they added Lasix to him and he was better his last start. So, I took a shot and left, hopefully to get away as close as I could and when I landed in the two-hole, I was pretty happy. He didn't feel like he was loaded with pace, but I got him in the passing lane and got his earplugs out and he actually took off and got there."

Miller captured his second Breeders Crown win of the weekend after guiding Lady Chaos to victory in the 2-year-old filly trot on Friday night. Century Farroh gave Moore his first career Breeders Crown victory.

Saturday's Breeders Crown win was also Century Farroh's third victory in his fifth lifetime start at Hoosier Park. Along with the Breeders Crown victory and the win in the Dan Patch earlier this year, Century Farroh had captured the \$170,000 Jenna's Beach Boy at Hoosier Park as a 3-year-old in 2019.

"He likes them trips, you know?" Miller said. "He won the Hoosier Cup with a similar trip and he really likes going up the inside. They did a great job with him."

Century Farroh was last season's O'Brien Award winner as the top 3-year-old Pacing Colt in Canada, and a win in the Breeders Crown likely has him on track for further O'Brien Award honors this season. He now sports a career record of 20 wins from 41 starts, and he crossed \$1 million in career

earnings with his victory in the Breeders Crown. He was bred in Ontario by Century Spring Farms, and sold for \$17,000 as a yearling at the London Selected Yearling Sale in 2017. To further the Ontario story, Ontario-sired horses finished first, second and third in the Open Pace when Backstreet Shadow finished third.

Bettor's Wish, meanwhile, suffered his second consecutive narrow Breeders Crown defeat after he was also upset in last season's Breeders Crown 3-year-old colts and geldings pacing final by Dancin Lou at Woodbine Mohawk Park in the midst of his remarkable campaign in which the former won 13 of his 19 starts and was second in his other six races.

Bettor's Wish's trainer, Chris Ryder, said he felt the outside draw factored into his pacer's defeat.

"It's a bit disappointing," he said. "I was disappointed with no eliminations, so I showed up for the overnight and then I still get the outside, something's not right. I don't want to sound like sour grapes, but I said that during the week. It's not my fault there's no elims. We all know the nine-hole is beat. How'd the nine-hole do tonight all night? The horse raced well, he never disgraces himself. He raced good, good people had the two-hole trip."

My Dream Stable for the top 30 yearlings selling at Timonium

In my HRU column diaryzing (my made up word) each day of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale three weeks ago, I made it a special point to mention that one of the areas of the greatest value in evidence at the sale was with very few exceptions, the very reasonable prices that the yearlings by Cantab Hall brought.

I mentioned that despite the significantly increased competition, Cantab Hall was still a great sire who's offspring are still able to comport themselves extremely well and compete on the world's stage.

He will go down in history as one of the greatest trotting sires ever.

On Friday night at Hoosier Park, the old boy proved me prescient, with first, his filly Lady Chaos and then his colt On A Streak sweeping the 2-year-old Breeders Crown trotting events.

I'm guessing that their tremendous success might motivate buyers at Timonium, MD this week to look at his yearlings with more confidence than they did in Lexington.

Just for the heck of it, I decided to put together my Dream Stable of 2-year-olds of 2021.

I am limiting myself to 30 yearlings all taken from Day One at Timonium.

The rules, which are all mine, are thusly arranged.

1. Equal representation of trotters and pacers.

2. No more than three yearlings by any one sire.

3. An attempt to get most of the major sires stakes regions represented.

4. I have not seen any of the yearlings in person, but I have watched the videos on all of them.

5. My intent is to follow all of them throughout the forthcoming 2-year-old season and then to tally up how I have done at the end of next season.

SUMMARY

There are six stallions, Always B Miki, Captaintreacherous, Chapter Seven, Muscle Hill, Somebeachsomewhere and Walner who have the maximum of three yearlings.

Bettors Delight and Kadabra have two each, while Bar Hopping, Betting Line, Cantab Hall, Father Patrick, Fear The Dragon, Huntsville, Kadabra, Sweet Lou and Trixton have one each.

With pacers there were far more colts (12) that caught my fancy than there were fillies (3). The opposite was the case with trotters as there are far more fillies (9) on my list than there are colts (6).

If I were young and independently wealthy, I would buy all the trotting fillies. Regardless of how well they did on the racetrack, I feel I would have the makings of a superlative broodmare band. I believe that a wealthy, reasonably young person would make money over the long haul if he or she bought all these fillies. I am neither, so that lets me out.

I hope to keep track of all these yearlings and report periodically on their progress or lack of same.

Liz Schaut - "Jack of all Trades"

They say a multi-talented person is a 'Jack of all Trades.' A woman named Liz Schaut, born in 1960 in Innisfail, AB, must be one of those people for she has certainly done it all.

Although her parents were not into racing horses, her grandmother's uncle was. His name was Benjamin Franklin (Ben) White, and he is a legendary hero in the sport of harness racing. With a name like that he was born to make an indelible mark in whatever he did — and Ben White did just that.

With a racing career that lasted over 60 years his memorable wins are many. He won his first Hambletonian in 1933 with Mary Reynolds and in 1936 won the Hambletonian with his fastest trotter, a mare named Rosalind, in a time of 1:56.3. This was 84 years ago.

But that wasn't quite enough for White for he won the prestigious trotting event again in 1942 with The Ambassador, and the following year with Volo Song.

"My dad's father was a blacksmith in Ontario and my mother's grandfather raced high-wheeled sulkies in England," said Liz.

"I got into the business when I was 18 years old when I went to work for trainer Eddie Stewart at Stampede Park in Calgary, Alberta.

"My brother Jim Thomson (who played professional hockey with Wayne Gretzky and the L.A. Kings) played hockey with Stewart's sons. When Eddie found out Jim's sister (me) loved horses, the rest was history.

"I started driving in ladies races back in Alberta and trained, ran my own stable, and bred horses for over 20 years. I stood two commercial stallions and usually had 15-20 mares to foal out."

Schaut is an innovator who always looks for ways to improve the sport and safety of horses.

"One thing I'm very proud of is that I started "Groom of the Year" in Alberta. Grooms deserve all the credit for they devote their entire life to a horse that is not his/her own – but treat it as if it were

"I also co-founded 'Performance Standardbreds'--- one of the oldest re-homing groups for standardbred racehorses in Alberta. I have personally helped hundreds of racehorses that could no longer compete find new, loving forever homes. I will never turn my back on any horse."

Besides being an advocate of horses, Schaut's talents are many. She was once an outrider that rode a retired pacer at Edmonton Northlands.Besides outriding, the pair barrel-raced, jumped and cattle penned.

Schaut also rode cows and started The Miss Rodeo Airdrie Pageant.

"In 1981, I was a contestant in the Miss Rodeo America Pageant representing Canada as 'Miss Rodeo Alberta. Something else I'm proud of," she said.

"As far as my favorite all-time horse, it is difficult to say for each and every one was special; but if I had to pick one I suppose it would be Dude's Leaving Town. He was the first horse I foaled, broke, trained and raced for owner Ed James of Aurora, Ontario (SSG Stable)."

James owns the remarkable horse McWicked, the richest pacing stallion in harness racing history that raced for seven years and earned \$5.1 million. McWicked is now standing stud in Canada.

"It was such an honor to train for Ed – one of the nicest men in the sport – for he trusted me to race and campaign Dude, who won 24 of his 44 starts and banked \$540,000."

During his campaign Dude broke track records and was named 'Horse of the Year' in Alberta.

After moving to the United States, Schaut met and married horseman Rick Schaut.

"Rick and I bought a farm outside of Anderson, IN, which we owned and operated for five years. We trained and bred mares, and at the time it was so gratifying and fun, but after five years we decided to sell the farm and move to Florida where the winters were much better.

"We weren't getting younger and running a farm is hard enough, but the Indiana winters, like those in Alberta, can be brutal."

That brings us to the present day where Liz and Rick run the tack shop at Sunshine Meadows Equestrian Village in South Florida.

"In Alberta, I had a couple tack shops I operated for 27 years, so I had previous experience. One day, Scott Miller from Sunshine Meadows approached us about opening a tack shop on the grounds there. We took the plunge and

opened 'Sunshine and Horses Stable Supplies.'

Sunshine Meadows is a training center for harness horses with big names such as Tony Alagna, Casie Coleman, Rick Zeron, Peter Wrenn, Frank M. Antonacci, Fred Grant, and many others that winter train there, but there are also equestrian stables who also benefit from Schaut's tack shop.

"At Sunshine and Horse Supplies we carry both racing and riding supplies and if we don't have it, I'll get it," said Liz.

"Presently I don't own any horses of my own, but I'm hoping to get myself a yearling someday again. My husband and his sister, Trish Soulsby, co-own a wonderful trotting filly named ATC Queenie, who Rick trains in the winter at Sunshine.

"The tack shop keeps me quite busy and I enjoy engaging and interacting with the customers from all walks of life. We are blessed for we live in Paradise and are doing exactly what we love to do, so I don't consider it a job. We wake up every day and watch the beautiful horses jog on the track.

"What more could a girl want."

High Flying

I handed a script to my pal and said, "Show this brilliant concept to your cronies and lawyers in Silicon Valley. If they design the app and make a billion dollars, remember it came from Trey."

HIGH Flying

ACT I

SCENE ONE

(RICK and MIKE are in their late twenties. They sit in seats 8A and 8C of Delta Flight 807. The young men do not know each other. Both are wearing masks; the middle seat is vacant. RICK pecks at his iPad. MIKE leans slightly towards RICK and asks,

MIKE

What are you playing?

RICK

I'm gambling. I log in and play in my free time. It's real-time, real money, and a real sport - horse racing. MIKE

(Points at the screen)

I saw that kind of racing once, with the carts.

RICK

Harness racing, it's fun. Sometimes I gamble seriously. Today, I'm killing time playing Race Triplet. It's a simple way to bet on real races.

MIKE

No kidding.

RICK

Want to see a game?

MIKE

Sure.

RICK

(RICK tilts his screen slightly towards MIKE, taps a button on the screen, and points to a list of racetracks)

Players begin by highlighting a racetrack and clicking on the name. I'll click on the Meadowlands. It's a track in New Jersey. See how my screen reads,

Meadowlands, Race Triplet,

Races 4-5-6.

Race 4 begins in THREE minutes.

Click one horseshoe icon to select your random number.



MIKE

So, it's just a random selection? Any number can be behind any horseshoe?

RICK

Yes, purely random. When a player clicks on a horseshoe, the horseshoe will dissolve into a number, and they have the same number for all three legs. Here, watch. I get my number by when I double-click one of these horseshoes.

(RICK taps the third horseshoe from the right, and the horseshoe morphs into a large yellow flashing number 6) MIKE

I see. So now you have horse number 6 for the next three races. What does it cost you? How much can you win? RICK

\$5 per play. The first race goes off in a minute. The countdown clock is at the top. If number 6 wins, I will win \$25. If any other horse wins the race, I lose my \$5. Let's watch and see how I do.

(RICK and MIKE watch the Livestream broadcast of the horse race. The number 6 horse wins! Mike and Rick exchange air high fives.)

MIKE

Now what?

RICK

Here is where skill enters the game. If you win the first level, the first race, you have a decision to make. You can cash out or let it ride. I have two options at this point. I can reinvest my \$25 in winnings or click on the cash out button. If I cash out, \$25 gets added to my account.

MIKE

What happens if you reinvest?

RICK

If I let the \$25 ride on the next race and if horse number 6 wins, my earnings rise to \$250. This decision-making is essential for legal reasons; it keeps the wager as a game of skill.

MIKE

What are you going to do?

RICK

I usually let it ride on the second level. Most people who are not horse experts play level two, to the second race. Players who understand horseracing and handicapping make more reasoned decisions. Should I believe the number 6 horse does not have a prayer; I might cash out. It's a statistical thing.

MIKE

Backup, let me see if I have this correct. If the number 6 horse win the next race, a race that begins in nine minutes, you win \$250?

RICK

Yes, and while we were talking, I logged on to a few sites and did some quick research. The six in the upcoming race is one of the top choices. Plus, get this, the name of the number six horse is HIGH FLYING. That might be a good omen. I'm playing.

(RICK and MIKE excitedly watch the horses warm up. Rick explains some of the details of horse racing like post position and racing strategy. The race goes off! Mike and Rick find themselves cheering aloud for HIGH FLYING, who wins by several lengths.

MIKE

Dude, you just won \$250, now what are you gonna do?

What are your choices? Did you ever get this far before? How much can you win if you play the next round? RICK

Whoa, whoa, slow down. Let me answer one question at a time. I'll start in reverse order.

If I let my wager go to level three, in gambling, that's called "letting it ride." If horse number 6 wins again, I will win \$2,000.

And yes, I have reached this point several other times. I

have let it ride and lost. I cashed out other times because the horse in the last leg was a longshot – longshots rarely win, and I would have lost everything.

MIKE (excited)

What does horse number 6 look like in the third race? Is it worth the bet?

RICk

Let's see (he taps around his computer screen). Horse number 6 is listed at 6-1. To serious horse gamblers that means they believe the horse has a realistic chance.
