Joe Thomson: tent collapse at Timonium could have been much worse

The owner of Winbak Farms was caught under the collapsing tent along with the farm's publicity director Elizabeth Cheesman, who suffered minor injuries. Fortunately, thanks to the quick action of many, no other people or horses were reportedly hurt.

Joe Thomson said the collapse of a huge tent in 30 mph winds Monday morning (Nov. 2) at Standardbred Horse Sales Company's temporary home at the Maryland State Fairgrounds could have been much worse had not been for the quick action of a large number of people.

Thomson, the Hall of Fame owner of Winbak Farms, was unhurt when the tent collapsed on him and Winbak's publicity director Elizabeth Cheesman, who wasn't quite as lucky. Thomson said Cheesman was taken to hospital, but was expected to be okay.

"I think she was the only one that had to go to the hospital. She's had some back problems, but I think she's okay," Thomson said. "Liz and I were the only ones left in our part of the tent. All the other guys escaped very quickly. I should've run out of the tent, but I ran sideways to get away from this pole that was coming down and then I went down with the tent.

"It was kind of scary. You're standing in the middle of it and, all of a sudden, it's coming at you, this big ball."

The tent — which collapsed in wind speeds classified as a moderate gale — housed some 120 horses from consignments for Winbak, Bob Boni's Northwood Bloodstock and Delaware Valley University.

Fortunately, no horses were injured.

"You wouldn't believe how many people showed up to get those horses out of there. And it wasn't waiting a half hour, either, it was really quick. They had to make sure that people weren't going to get electrocuted or the horses weren't going to get electrocuted, but



after that you had people standing on chairs, on boxes to hold the tent up so the horses could come out from underneath it," Thomson said. "It was dangerous because part of the tent hadn't fallen down, so you had these big, giant poles. It's kind of like a circus tent, how big they are. They had these big poles that had fallen over and half fallen into the stalls and so forth.

"The horses didn't panic as badly as I thought they would.

"Delaware Valley, I think they only had a half dozen or so horses. We had 55 or 60 and I think Bob had 50 or so... 2020 has been one for challenges."

Thomson said the quick action on the part of many is another indication of the character and resiliency of the industry.

"The people working, and certainly our workers, they were champs," Thomson said. "They put it all together. In fact, they had a big pile of manure in the back of the barn and, where we went, there wasn't any horses there, so they physically, by hand, moved that whole pile. They moved a mountain (to accommodate the horses)."

With that excitement over, Thomson said the sale will march on just as the industry has through the pandemic.

"I think we finally have come around to online bidding. It's filled the void during COVID-19, which will keep more people away than anything else. In fact, that's why this sale is at this venue because the (regular home, the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex), they were putting a lot of restrictions on it and I don't even know if

they would have allowed it to go in there at this time," Thomson said.

As for Winbak's consignment, Thomson said, "it's a good cross-section, a little bit of everything, so hopefully we'll do okay.

"This is the last sale of the year and we always consider Harrisburg one of our better sales and we bring a lot of good horses here. We've got some Bettors Delights here and they are going to be really good... We've got American Ideals that are really good and I like them all. We've got some Archangels from Canada, Cantab Halls. All of a sudden everyone's onto the new stallions, but he just won some of the big races out there at the Breeders Crown.

"I'm a bit optimistic about it, but I'm always overly optimistic about things. It is the last sale and they have provided the online ability to purchase as well. Baltimore is a pretty easy place to get into and out of, so I think we'll have a pretty decent crowd and the horses are going to be good.


"I think our horses are ready and the people are ready, even though we've had a few challenges. We'll overcome that and we'll be ready to show and sell horses."





Spears: Timonium the right location to hold safe SHSC sale

Standardbred Horse Sales Company's mega-auction — normally held in Harrisburg, PA — kicks off today at noon at the Maryland State Fairgrounds.

How will the Harrisburg sale be different in the COVID-19 era? First off, it's not in Harrisburg, or even in Pennsylvania, for that matter. In fact, Standardbred Horse Sales Company's (SHSC) mega-auction, long colloquially referred to as "The Harrisburg Sale," will be held at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium, MD for the first time in its 82-year history. The first of three yearling sessions kicks off today (Nov 3) at noon. The two-day mixed sale starts Friday.

The move was necessitated by the pandemic when the all-indoor, long-time home of the sale, the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex, opted to remain closed to the auction. Sale president and CEO Dr. Pete Spears said the move to the Maryland State Fairgrounds has proven to be

the right location given the need for social distancing.

"I think a very important part of our COVID-19 protection plan is the fact that our attendees can spend almost their entire sale experience outside, if they choose to do so," Spears said. "We have shed row stalls in the existing barns and have a number of tents for the rest. Everything is very well ventilated and all of that can be considered an outdoor activity and,



therefore, minimizing the risk of COVID-19 exposure.

"We do have a capacity-restricted sales pavilion, but we also have a large tent immediately adjacent to the sales pavilion where people can sit and bid with bid spotters if they don't want to go inside.

"We also have a side door to the cashier's office, such that we can take care of settlements right there at the door with the attendee standing outside.

"So I think with our attention to social distancing and mandatory masking and the opportunity to remain in an outside environment, I think we're doing everything possible to make the sale as safe as we can for everyone."

Spears said the guidelines were established by the Maryland Department of Health and will be enforced by the fairgrounds' security team.

On the horse front, Spears said he believes the sale will follow the mostly positive trends of other major sales held in 2020. The one downside at SHSC is the yearling sale is down about 30 horses from its original pre-pandemic lineup.

"We lost 30 yearlings in the very few days that passed by between when we announced we weren't going to Harrisburg and when we came down here to Timonium, and 16 of those 30 were first-day horses," Spears said. "I haven't really looked at all of those horses, most of which went to Lexington, but I know that nine of them averaged \$175,000 in Lexington. So those would've been transactions that likely would've enhanced our first-day results and we're not going to have them.

"But we have plenty of good horses. Hanover has all of theirs and I'm sure Dr. J (Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky) has told you what a nice bunch of trotting fillies and other stars that they have. But, you don't lose 10 per cent of your first-day horses, and a large number of them would've been high-end horses, and not have it show up in your revenue figures."

Despite all the challenges COVID-19 has posed, Spears said the new venue, "in general, will be fun. There's a lot of new things to see. To the extent that dining is possible, there's new restaurants to try. There are a lot of nice hotels here and I think it will be kind of a refreshing break from Harrisburg, frankly."

And the good news for a sale that will have a huge outdoor component is the weather report for this week is favorable.

"I hear that the weather is supposed to become very mild during the week, so that's good news," Spears said.

Jablonsky bullish on Hanover consignment and the resiliency of the industry

Hanover Shoe Farms' consignment at Standardbred Horse Sales Company's (SHSC) auction in Timonium, MD is as loaded with talent as ever, but Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky, the farm's executive vice-president and syndicate manager, said Hanover is particularly deep in the trotting filly department this year, which includes a filly that is "about as impressive a package as you can get."

"I think the best one in our consignment is number (hip #) 86 (Delilah Hanover), a Muscle Hill out of Danielle Hanover. She's just beautiful, great conformation, great in the paddock... There's no holes," Jablonsky said. "I've had several people say that she's the nicest trotting filly that they've seen this year, so we're very excited and hopeful for her."

Danielle Hanover is a Cantab Hall-sired half-sister to 2007 Horse of the Year Donato Hanover.

"We have another Muscle Hill filly, number 9 (Peyton Hanover), again out of a Cantab mare," Jablonsky said. "We have two Bar Hopping fillies that I think are tremendous, Hip 23 (Stowe Hanover), she's only the second foal from the dam of Snowstorm Hanover. She's a gorgeous filly. And then Hip 155 is a beautiful Bar Hopping filly (Mimi Ocean Hanover). She's a great-gaited filly.

"It doesn't always happen that your best-looking horses have the best pedigrees, but that's what we have. Trotting filly-wise it's extraordinary. If you're looking for a trotting filly, we have choices galore. I mean, 86 is a standout, but right below her all of them are great."

Hanover is selling 237 yearlings this year. In the pacing colt department, Jablonsky said her favorite is Hip #93 Energetic Hanover, a Captaintreacherous out of Eloquent Grace.

"I think he's just beautiful. He's a great moving colt and he's got that wow factor when you look at him. He's just got presence. I really like him.

"And then the brother to Papi Rob Hanover, number 5 (Pompeo Hanover), he's a really nice-looking colt. And the full brother to Filibuster Hanover (Hip #101 Frozen Hanover). That would be the only full brother that Filibuster will have

and he's a very, very nice colt."

Frozen Hanover is from the final crop of the late, great Somebeachsomewhere and was conceived with frozen semen.

"Also, there's kind of a sleeper pacing colt and it's the very first horse selling on the second day, Hip 160 (Nautical Hanover), a Captaintreacherous colt out of a Western Ideal mare. He's a great-looking colt.... I think he's really nice," Jablonsky said.

"Pacing filly-wise, I think we have a real standout in Hip 65 (Boudoir Hanover), the first foal out of Bedroomconfessions and it's a Captain filly and what better filly sire is there out there right now than Captaintreacherous? His fillies just dominate things. She's a big, beautiful filly. A very, very classy filly. She's a real standout if you're looking for a high-end pacing filly.

"Other pacing fillies, Hip 148 (Marlys Hanover), another

Captain filly out of a mare that's done really good things."

In the trotting colt department, Jablonsky highlighted Hannelore Hanover's half-brother, H O Y Hanover (Hip #119) by first-crop sire Walner.

"He's a beautiful colt but he's not a typical Walner. He's a little bit more refined, with a little bit less size to him than what I've seen of Walners," Jablonsky said.

"Then we have the full brother to Manchego, Hip 20 (Stilton Hanover). We have two beautiful Father Patricks, 84 (Dustin Hanover) and 113 (Gonna B Hanover). We have a beautiful Bar Hopping at 51 (Whiskey Hanover).

"And a colt that just for some reason grabs me... he's out of an older mare, but he's E L Titan and New York-bred at Hip 134 (Lets Go Hanover). I just like him. Since he was a baby, I have liked him.

"For our Canadian customers, I think Hip 81 (Creed Hanover) is a really beautiful Kadabra colt."

As for selling in a different facility this year, Jablonsky said there was a lot to like about the Maryland State Fairgrounds.

"The horses are in permanent stalls and they really seem to like that and there's a lot of room for showing. In this year, with the threat of COVID-19, people are spread out, people are in the fresh air. I'm sure a less people are going to go home sick than from the regular Harrisburg," she said. "The sales pavilion itself is quite nice. It's an amphitheater-style with nice seats. It's sort of a toned-down, miniature Fasig-Tipton. That's what it reminds me of. Quite nice.

"I was just telling someone, if we were sitting here and it was September and it was 70 degrees and sunny, this would be the absolute best place besides Lexington that you could be.

"It's weather-dependent. That's the advantage that Harrisburg has. People complain about Harrisburg and it does have its negatives – the horses are in temporary stalls, the horse are standing on concrete for a week, which I anticipate a lot less swollen legs and injuries because the horses are in their stalls. But the one thing about Harrisburg is that it's indoors and it's not weather-dependent and I think it's easy to navigate."

Jablonsky said she expects the SHSC sale is, "going to mirror Lexington. The good horses are going to sell as well and there's going to be bargains to be had in the lower echelons of yearlings. The mid-to-lower is going to hold up as well as it sometimes does. Having said that, when you're

consigning 237 yearlings, what you hope for is that the high-end horses and the middle-high-end horses, maybe top 50-60 per cent of your horses sell well enough in a year like this that they prop up the bottom. It's your gross, it's not any individual horse. You can't get hung up on your \$300,000 horse or your \$3,000 horse. At the end of the day, you've got to go home and see what your total sales were.

"It's not going to be 2019. People would be foolish if they think it's going to be 2019 with the results, but it's not going to be the disaster that it could've been.

"I'm really just hoping that everyone gets through the week safely and we just have a good week here. I just really want to reach out and applaud the industry for being so resilient. We've had so many come through the fairgrounds and they are complying with the masks and social distancing and they are just enthusiastic to buy horses. It really makes me proud to be in this business because we haven't let what a sorry state the world is in get us down. We still love great horses and we still want to buy great horses. Everyone is so enthusiastic and it makes me happy."



End of an era: The last 12 Somebeachsomewhere yearlings set to sell in Timonium

Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky didn't think she would be emotional selling the very last crop of yearlings from the late, great stallion Somebeachsomewhere, but now that the week is here she said she is somewhat melancholy.

Jablonsky, the executive vice-president and syndicate manager at Hanover Shoe Farms that stood Somebeachsomewhere for his entire stud career, believes The Beach is one of the greatest pacing stallion of all time.

"This weekend just proves it. He won four of the six Breeders Crowns for pacers. I mean, if that's not dominant, I don't know what is," Jablonsky said. "There's no doubt in my mind if he would've lived to have a full career that he would've gone down as the greatest pacing stallion that ever lived. Adios, Meadow Skipper, whoever you want to say, I firmly believe that if he would've bred mares until he was 22, 24, he would've just been the greatest pacing stallion that ever lived.

"People that want to buy a Somebeachsomewhere yearling, this is the last chance. I can promise people, there's not going to be any tricks up our sleeve. This is it. In the northern hemisphere, you can only breed mares (with frozen semen) the year (the stallion) dies, so these are the last 12.

"We did quite well. I think we only had 117 straws of frozen semen, so we did fantastic to get 12."

Jablonsky was quick to rebuke critics that have said such things as, "I wouldn't have bred these 12 mares to Somebeachsomewhere." What people don't realize is that he died in January and the mares were booked already. We didn't know we had these straws – we didn't think we had straws and I got an email out of the blue from our company that freezes the semen that said, 'Did you know we have these straws?'"

Jablonsky said the star of Somebeachsomewhere's last crop at Hanover is Hip #101 Frozen Hanover, a full-brother to Filibuster Hanover.

"I would say there are four outstanding ones. The full brother to Filibuster is outstanding," Jablonsky said.

"Hip 48 is named William Hanover and he's the first foal out of a sister to J K Willpower. He's a big, strong colt and (Somebeachsomewhere's trainer and part-owner) Brent MacGrath assured me that he acts just like Beach did as a young horse.

"And the two fillies, Marloe's sister, Hip 150, Mexican Hanover and Hip 122, Ipanema Hanover. They are fabulous fillies."

Apart from being an outstanding horse, Somebeachsomewhere was also a personal favorite of Jablonsky's.

"It's a terrible loss," she said.

Jablonsky said she expects to be emotional when the last Somebeachsomewhere (Hip #427 Lido Hanover) goes through the ring late on Wednesday (Nov. 4).

"He's a little on the small side, so he's not going to be selling for what those other four sell for, but I think it's emotional. I'm glad that we have quite a few Beach mares at home. (His son)
Captaintreacherous has done a tremendous job trying to fill his spot and it's really nice to have Captain. Captain you can tell is Beach's son, but he's got a lot of Artsplace in him with his demeanor and his looks.

"It's really nice to have Papi (Rob Hanover joining the Hanover stallion ranks), because Papi, to me, is Beach through and through. He looks like him and he's a wonderful, wonderful horse to be around. It's nice to have the two of them now. Actually, three because Stay Hungry is a Beach, too. We have three sons, so things could be worse for us. We could've lost him and not had 15 or 16 mares by him and three stallions, but we do have them."











Preferred set to sell the last crop of White Birch yearlings, among many more for a long list of clients

David Reid said he's excited about a strong Preferred Equine yearling consignment selling at Standardbred Horse Sales Company's (SHSC) auction in Timonium, MD, but he's especially proud to be selling the last yearlings produced by White Birch Farm.

Reid and his late partner Geoff Stein have sold horses for the Parisi family that ran White Birch Farm for nearly three decades.

"It's a relationship that we're very proud of, both from a longevity point of view... obviously going back to Joe Parisi and then his son, Michael," Reid said. "Pound-for-pound the number of champions that White Birch produced was an amazing feat. It makes you proud to be able to represent a farm like that."

With Joe, Michael and long-time farm manager Steve Williams now all dead, the decision was made to sell the equine holdings.

"Obviously, you wish they could stay around forever, but it's just the course of nature that things change and we'll move forward. We're just thankful for the opportunity to represent them for 25-30 years," Reid said.

"White Birch has some nice Captaintreacherous fillies to offer. They also have the half-brother to Donna Soprano [Hip 54, No More Trix]," Reid said.

As for the rest of his consignment — which includes a number of smaller, high-quality breeders like White Birch — Reid said it was a very typical selection of Preferred horses.

"We have something for everyone," Reid said. "We represent a lot of different breeders, big and small.

"We have trotting colts by Muscle Hill and Cantab. Trotting fillies we have Chapter Seven and some nice first-crop sires. We have a good variety of regional sires and Grand Circuit sires.

"On the pacing side, it's the same way. We have some nice Captains, first crop of Huntsville, a really nice Downbytheseaside... We're excited to offer the group this week.

"Peaky Sneaky came out of our Harrisburg consignment. Donna Soprano came out of our Harrisburg consignment. We've had multiple Sires Stakes champions."

Reid said he doesn't believe selling in Timonium for the first time will have a major impact on the bottom line.

"People find the good horses. It's just a matter of what the depth of the market is going to be and until we get through the week it's kind of an unknown," he said. "The facility is fine. From a buyer's perspective, it just takes a little bit of adjustment to any new situation, but I would say that they are handling it relatively well. I think everything is going as well as it can under the circumstances... It's hard for me to get a gauge because it's all new here. 2020 has been a something that changes on a weekly basis, if not a daily basis, so Harrisburg has been in everyone's groove for a long time and if you take somebody out of their element it's always challenging. We're going to have some challenges here this week, but we're going to manage the best we can and get it behind us.

"Am I as confident going into this year as in years past? I would probably say 'no'. That being said, I do have faith in the marketplace and I think people will plan accordingly and, at the end of the week, I hope it's a good week for all of us."

Spring Haven hopes to springboard off a terrific Lexington sale into even better results at Timonium

Senena Esty and her Spring Haven Farm consignment at Standardbred Horse Sales Company's (SHSC) 2020 sales facility in Timonium, MD had to shut down operations for a few hours Monday (Nov. 2) for the best possible reason: to be a good neighbor.

Spring Haven's consignment is near where part of a large tent collapsed over Winbak Farms' consignment.

"We wanted to help Winbak. Their horses were trapped," Esty said, adding it's fortunate no horses were injured. "I think everybody has regrouped quite well. In the spirit of 'we're all in this together,' it puts it into a whole new light. You know, you make good friends over the years and you just really want to help. What doesn't kill us makes us stronger."

Coming off a tremendous sale in Lexington in which Spring Haven grossed \$1,865,000 for 51 yearlings sold (an average of \$36,569), the farm is selling roughly 60 yearlings in Timonium.

"We've got some serious Chapter Sevens selling (today, Nov. 3) that we're pretty high on. We've got Hip 34 (Sevendollarbill) and 76 (Sevencarrotgold). They are two real top colts, both by Chapter Seven," Esty said. "We've got a really nice Muscle Hill filly, Hip 18 (Sabrina Hill). Then we've got Hip 99 (Sea Witness) and he's a Downbytheseaside and, of course, there's a lot of excitement over that horse. We sold a Seaside filly for \$200,000 in Lexington.

"We've got a Walner, a real pretty filly at Hip 133 (The Grey Queen). Lastly, for (today, Nov. 3), we have Hip 137 (Raising Hill) and it's a What The Hill. He's a big, strong, good-looking horse. All the What The Hills that I've sold, he's really stamping them – just big and strong. Just a good hind quarter and pretty smart animals, too."

Esty said she's thrilled Spring Haven is located in Ohio, one of harness racing's boom locations in recent years.

"I don't know about all the clichés, but we paid our dues and stuck in it when a lot of farms went out of business and closed. We've had to change some things and adapt and breed out of state and now it's just so nice to be able to run across to the neighbors and pick up semen and breed in the state of Ohio," Esty said. "We've got a really strong program that I'm really proud of. We've got the county fairs, we've got 66 country fairs, we've got the stallion series, we've got the sires stakes, so we can pretty much check every box as far as where people have racing opportunities."

As for having to adapt to a new sales facility this year, Esty said it won't be a problem for her crew.

"One thing about it, we've sold at a number of sales so we pretty much pride ourselves in just going into a new place and just being able to figure it out. I'm really proud of my crew and they've handled it well," Esty said. "(Timonium) has its own new set of challenges. Fortunately, we weren't in the tent that collapsed. We were right beside it. Ours is still standing, but all the craziness is next door here.

"On a positive note, they are calling for beautiful weather the next three days. So we have something to look forward to. I'm optimistic and I'm proud of my consignment and we're going to do our best to get them all into good hands. That's very important."











Grossman: Our sport is based on reality... it has steak and not sizzle

Blue Chip Farm owner Tom Grossman said 2020 has really shown him that the harness racing industry is beyond resilient. Solid yearling sales in a variety of regions have proven there's a strong business case to be made for owning standardbreds.

"It really shows that our sport is based on reality," Grossman said. "First, we're down but still excellent. The thoroughbreds have struggled a lot more than us, certainly on a year-to-year comparison. It goes to the fact that this sport has steak and not sizzle and you can have a very legitimate chance of making money at buying yearlings. Despite all of the obvious things about politics and everything, people are continuing to invest, which is very encouraging.

"I've always said about harness racing, it doesn't have the movie star appeal of some of the others, but at the end of the day it's a business and so all that really changes are the purses, which are down a little obviously with some race cancellations. Theoretically, those should be normalizing next year. I don't have a crystal ball, but it certainly seems that way.

"So the money we race for is down only a respectable percentage and the yearling sales should have been the same, but sentiment plays a big role in it. We've shown that the group of people that have stayed with this business are resilient and it can be profitable. I don't want to jinx us, because the next three days means a lot, but so far... even just people's attitude walking around the sale everybody is like, 'Okay, we'll get through this. We'll figure it out together.' It's very encouraging to me."

Considering breeders invest thousands of dollars over many years to get their horses to market, yearling sales are critical to their operations. Grossman said earlier in 2020 he was concerned how his farm's horses would sell, but as the year went on and most of the major sales posted positive results, the COVID-19 pandemic considered, he became more positive about how his yearlings would sell at Standardbred Horse Sales Company's (SHSC) auction in Timonium, MD that begins today (Nov. 3).

"We did a lot of scenarios based on some really conservative assumptions and there's still three more days to go and an election in between, but I'm very happy relative to where I thought we could be," he said.

Grossman said the likely star of the Blue Chip consignment is Hip #91 Threepointbluechip, a Walner colt out of Dunk The Donato.

"She had a 2-year-old and an older horse finish in the money at the Breeders Crown, which for a trotter is quite amazing. Plunge

Blue Chip was second in the Older Mare Trot," Grossman said. "The yearling looks the part. He's as exciting of a yearling as we've sold in a very long time.

"Also, number 47 (Tallntan Blue Chip) is a really nice Bettors Delight colt out of a very hot family with Warrawee Sunshine is the dam. He's the prototypical Bettors Delight colt. When you pull him out, there's absolutely nothing wrong with him, but nothing is, like, wow. He's got Bettors Delight's attitude, he knows he's the man, nothing phases him, he marches right on.

"I am obviously biased, but I'm very, very positive on E L Titan. I don't think people realize how small his books have been for what he's done. I think he had 30 last year and came up with some good horses.

"I have a colt, Hip 440 (Tactile Blue Chip), out of a mare Glowngold. I don't think it's going to be a giant number, but it's the kind of horse I'd be buying if I was a yearling buyer.

"I'd also say 633 (Triumphantbluechip) is a Roll With Joe, who had a much better year last year starting to get the better mares. That's out of a mare, Bathsheba, and her sister (Fire Start Hanover) just won the Breeders Crown. I've always liked (the yearling) growing up, he has a very good disposition.

"Other than the headliners, which is more thoroughbred-like, these are horses that I really believe you can buy and have a very realistic expectation of having a profitable investment."

As for the new sales facility, Grossman said, "it's a very healthy place for the horses. There's obviously great ventilation... I think the horses are going to leave here happier than Harrisburg, for sure, and the horses always come first for us. And the people will be healthier. It's just a happier environment as well. The surrounding area seems to have a lot more going on, in terms of easy places to get the crew fed and all of that.

"I'm generally happy and really happy with people's attitudes. My team for sure, but people in general have been flexible, understanding and seem to be in a positive mood. I'm very relieved and happy."



Hoosier Park's second turn as Breeders Crown host track was tremendous despite COVID-19 restrictions

The Indiana track put on a heck of a show despite having to limit fan attendance to just 600 due to the pandemic.

Three years ago, Harrah's Hoosier Park played host to the Breeders Crown, rolling out the red carpet to harness racing's best over the course of two spectacular nights. After a weekend deemed an incredible success, Hoosier Park and Indiana's racing stakeholders showed that they could step up and meet the challenge of hosting an event of this magnitude. The track offered pageantry and polish befitting the year-end championships, and in doing so, made an

argument for inclusion in a rotation of Breeders Crown host sites.

Last weekend offered Hoosier Park the chance to show that it was more than a one-trick pony. Again, the track, Caesars Entertainment, and so many involved in Hoosier harness racing answered the call. By all accounts, it was a tremendous two nights of racing. The total two-night handle of \$4,297,864 was up 12 per cent from the 2017 Crown weekend at Hoosier that saw total wagering of \$3,837,869.

Each race offered great storylines leading up to the championships, and the action on the track provided equally stirring moments and emotions that will make up Breeders Crown lore long after this season comes to a close. Improbable winners. Disappointing defeats. Never before seen outcomes and payouts. Breeders Crown and Hoosier Park records set each night. The Hambletonian Society, led by president and CEO John Campbell, could not have asked for any more.

"Their planning, preparation and implementation is just exceptional. I feel very fortunate we have them as partners. I just can't stress enough, they've made the best of a situation that nobody could have ever imagined," said Campbell.

Despite being limited to a crowd of just under 600 due to COVID-19, the handle for Breeders Crown weekend at Harrah's Hoosier Park was up 12 per cent over the first time the track played host to the Crown in 2017.

Harness Racing Update

Hoosier Park was tasked with facilitating an event that showcased harness racing in the best light possible. The management and staff did just that, all while being handcuffed by the COVID-19 pandemic. For their part, Caesars Entertainment and Hoosier Park management did not focus on what could have been. The sad reality is that Anderson, IN played host to a world championship event... and yet, it could not advertise the assemblage of the sport's top trotting and pacing talent. In 2017, an estimated crowd of 5,000 turned out on Saturday night to endure snow flurries and witness history. Last Saturday, the Hoosier Park apron was mostly vacant throughout the evening for the ticket-only event. According to Rick Moore, vice president and general manager of racing at Hoosier Park, the track executed a plan that called for a maximum capacity of just under 600, and they did so by focusing on taking care of owners and sponsors, those that invest heavily in the industry, first and foremost.

"At the end of the day, I truly believe we came up with the right decision. The right decision may not be the one that some people wanted us to come up with, because we're not reaching out to the masses," he explained. "We decided this go-around was going to be for our owners, our sponsors, some VIPS, and if we had some tables left over, we would sell those. We really wanted to take care of the owners and sponsors. We thought that was really, really important."

This year's Kentucky Derby and Breeders' Cup will be contested without fans. Moore feels fortunate that some were able to witness the Breeders Crown in person, even if the number was small. The focus was doing so with safety in mind. Moreover, for the masses that could not attend in person, Hoosier Park offered the racing live on its YouTube channel. According to the track's audiovisual department, the Friday night feed attracted 7,800 guests throughout the program, while Saturday's card saw 13,000 guests, with a peak viewing audience of 1,300 users at one time. Fans could not attend the races at Hoosier Park; instead, the track brought the product to them — and, remember, the YouTube numbers do not account for audiences watching via other platforms such as RTN, TwinSpires and HorsePlayer Interactive in Canada.

"We abided by the plan that was agreed to and worked on by Harrah's Hoosier Park, the Indiana Standardbred Association, the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, and ultimately signed off on by the governor's office. We made sure that we stayed in the boundaries of that plan," Moore said. "That means a maximum, and I know this number better than I know my name, 597 people. Everything was built around that plan. We had to do this event in a very safe and healthy manner. I'm really proud that we were able to do everything within the boundaries of that plan."

Moore and Campbell said that a great amount of discussion and planning went into this year's Breeders Crown, more so than in a "normal" year, due to the uncertainty presented by the pandemic. The state shut down Hoosier Park for three months early in the year, and the two groups established some deadlines to serve as guideposts to determine if the track would be prepared to host the event. What was never discussed, however, was moving the event away from Hoosier Park.

"Actually, I think we should be very fortunate as an industry that we have a partner like Hoosier that was willing to put on the Breeders Crown under these trying circumstances. Yes, we only have 600 people. That's disappointing compared to what we had here in 2017 and what we expected pre-COVID. However, there have been a lot of sporting events with no fans, a lot of horse racing events with no fans. The Indy 500, they didn't have fans. So, we do have some fans," Campbell said. "The show on the track, I'm very happy with that. You're disappointed that we're in this situation, but I think Hoosier, in cooperation with the Breeders Crown staff, has made the best of a situation where we weren't even sure we would have a Breeders Crown back in May."

Like so many events in 2020, the Breeders Crown had a different look and feel, even if the product on the track proved the constant. Hoosier Park set handle records each night with very little actually bet on track. That's a positive. I have spent many years attending races at Hoosier Park. I can remember when fire marshals turned customers away when the facility reached capacity, as well as the large turnouts for the festivities surrounding the Dan Patch each year. It was eerie not hearing a throng of fans cheering as the horses thundered down the stretch. Even a half-filled clubhouse seemed odd. I would have loved to see the crowd's reaction to Friday's thrilling dead heat followed by longshot
Sandbetweenmytoes upsetting Tall Dark Stranger Saturday night. It would have been electric. Nevertheless, I'll settle for the fact that the Breeders Crown was held in my back yard for a second time, and look forward to Hoosier Park hosting for a third.

"They've indicated they would like to come back in three years. We certainly do," said Campbell. "I see this partnership going on and thriving."

Three years from now cannot get here soon enough.





Shes A Sassy Beach, Hawaii sweep Harvest Series

The Harvest Series for Ontario-sired 2-year-old fillies concluded Monday (Nov. 2) with a pair of finals at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

A field of nine squared off in the \$46,000 final for pacing fillies, while a compact group of six clashed in the \$45,400 final for trotting fillies.

Ken Middleton trainee **Shes A Sassy Beach** and driver Sylvain Filion came out on top in the pacing fillies final to complete a series sweep (replay here)

Shes A Sassy Beach blasted off the wings of the gate into a strong headwind and was parked around the first turn as she pushed to the top, clearing to command just after a :27.1 opener. Dabarndawgswatchin, who was also searching for a series sweep, came after the lead in the second-quarter from fourth, touching down on the lead at the half in :55.4.

The 6-5 co-favorites raced one-two around the final turn with Dabarndawgswatchin reaching the three-quarter pole in 1:24.3.

In the stretch, Shes A Sassy Beach angled to the outside

and powered by to score a victory of two lengths in 1:55.2. Trouble Brewing rallied for second, while Dabarndawqswatchin was third. Shes Got It All was fourth.

Shes A Sassy Beach vaults her career numbers up to four wins and \$65,683 earned. The Sunshine Beach filly is co-owned and bred by Mohawk Park track announcer Middleton and the late Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame member Bill Galvin.

A \$2 win ticket on Shes A Sassy Beach returned \$4.60.

A clear standout, **Hawaii** took care of business with a 1:59.2 score at odds of 1-9 for driver Trevor Henry and trainer Rick Zeron (**replay here**). The daughter of Justice Hall floated away casually, making the front entering the backstretch, and posted fractions of :59.2 and 1:29 before a :30.2 final-quarter into a stiff headwind.

Fuzzy Angel, who led early, sat the two-hole and finished a length and a half back in second. Tealicious was third, while A Blue Blood was fourth.

Owned by Rick Zeron Stables, Hawaii's sweep of the Harvest Series improves her rookie numbers to three wins and \$76,325 earned in nine starts. Her second leg victory of 1:56.4 is her current career mark.

Hawaii paid \$2.30 to win.

The Harvest Series was open to Ontario sired 2-year-old fillies who were non-winners of \$30,000 in 2020 as of Sept. 30, 2020.

Live racing at Woodbine Mohawk Park resumes Thursday evening. The \$48,100 and \$45,100 finals for 2-year-old colts headline an 11-race card. Post time is 7 p.m.
