Jablonsky says Hanover primed and ready for start of today's Standardbred Horse Sale

The 80th annual sale kicks off today at noon at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg, PA.

Hanover Shoe Farms has been the sport's leading breeder every year since records have been kept.

After more than two years of work to get to this day, Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky said she can't wait for the first yearling to walk into the sales ring at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg, PA shortly after noon today for the opening session of the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's 80th annual yearling sale.

"I get very excited once Monday starts," said Jablonsky, the much-respected farm manager of Hanover Shoe Farms which owns and operates the sale and has been the sport's leading breeder every year since breeding records have been kept. "If Monday starts off good and they start rolling, I'll be feeling really good, but by Wednesday I'm so tired and then I'm looking at broodmares (selling during the Mixed Sale). We go home and we leave and I don't really have time to reflect (on the success of Hanover's sale). My biggest satisfaction in this

business comes from seeing them on the racetrack.”

Jablonsky was reluctant to name too many yearlings, lest she leave out some notable Hanover performers from 2018, but did mention, “Emoticon (Hanover), two Breeders Crowns in a row; Dorsoduro (Hanover), he’s so game, even at Hoosier the other night; Captain Trevor, Tall Drink (Hanover), she’s a very good filly. I’m proud of them all. I’m the proudest of (stallion) Captaintreacherous. We’re so blessed to have him step in and kind of take – I don’t even want to say ‘take over’ because when I said nobody will fill (Somebeachsomewhere’s) shoes I meant that – but to take

up the slack.

“(Captaintreacherous) reminds me of Beach, he’s very much like him. He’s the closest you could have to Beach without it being Beach, I think. He’s been the biggest blessing of 2018 for us, just having him.

“I was so devastated by (Somebeachsomewhere’s death)... Besides losing a relative, it’s the single worst thing that’s ever happened to me, losing that horse.”

Jablonsky said it’s too tough to handicap which Hanover yearling will sell for the most money, but she said her

favorite colt is hip 60 named In Reality Hanover. It is a Captaintreacherous full brother to 2-year-old Captain Trevor, a winner of 6 of 9 starts and more than \$130,000 with a mark of 1:49.2.

"I just think there's a little something special about (In Reality Hanover)... he just gives me an air that he's special as an athlete," Jablonsky said.

When it comes to yearlings that have special personalities, Jablonsky said one of her favorites from this year's crop was a Yankee Crusier colt named Elver Hanover that sold in Ohio for \$50,000.

"I just thought was one of the coolest yearlings we ever raised. He was so quiet around the barn, so mellow; you could really do anything to him. Better than an aged horse. You could bounce a ball off him," Jablonsky said.

"The Burke Brigade bought him. I said, 'If there's a piece of this colt, he's very special... I would like to own him.' I don't fall in love with them easily, but whenever I walked in the barn, he was always the first one I went over to. Mark Weaver texted me at 11 that night and said, 'I can get you in for 10 if you want.' I said, 'I want' so I'm in on him."

Hanover will sell some 230 yearlings over the next three days. Raising and preparing that many yearlings for a sale is not for the shiftless.

"It is a lot of work. It has been the last three-to-four weeks, that's when it's the most intense. So, I'm counting video week and then the three weeks after that of showing, you don't really have a life. You breathe, eat, sleep, just getting these yearlings here. It's your whole life, you don't do anything else, you don't think about anything else. Our guys are working 12-hour days," said Jablonsky, who figures her time investment is even greater. "If you count all of the responding to inquiries and planning and all the administrative work, not just the time I'm physically spending with the yearlings, the only time I'm not doing it is when I'm sleeping. That's the truth."

While she said hopes they all sell well, go to great homes and get an opportunity to be racehorses, her first priority is making sure all horses and humans make it through the sale safely.

"I don't want anything bad to happen – no disasters. I just want to sell them. It's two years of work to get to this point."

Reid hoping second chance for Beach yearling will pay dividends

A late scratch from the Lexington sale, the colt will sell at the end of today's opening session at the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA.

David Reid said it's difficult to handicap which of Preferred Equine Marketing's 80 yearlings will sell for the most money, but he's rooting for one that will be the last one in the ring this afternoon at the Standardbred Horse Sale Company's 80th annual yearling sale at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg, PA.

Hip 173, a Somebeachsomewhere colt out of My Little Delight (the dam is a half-sister to Stay Hungry who won the first two legs of the pacing Triple Crown) named Betterthanthebeach was originally thought to be one of Preferred's star yearlings from its consignment at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, but just before he was set to sell, there was a problem.

"An hour-and-a-half or two hours before the sale he just had a little hiccup, where he just had a little minor issue that

was just bad timing so we left him in Lexington,” Reid said. “So, we re-videoed him and just left him (in Lexington) to prepare to come up here. He shipped up here and he’s in good shape. He’s selling as the last horse on Monday, as a supplemental entry.”

“He shipped in Friday morning and we’ve been showing him every day. He’s obviously a very good-looking individual and we expect good things from him.”

Also near to Reid’s heart is hip 145 Queentrix, a Trixton half-sister to The Ice Dutchess, a 2-year-old that shared the billing as the sale-topper at last year’s Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling sale thanks to a bid of \$320,000 by John Floren. The Ice Dutchess, a daughter of Muscle Hill, has earned nearly \$425,000 in her rookie season on the track, including a victory in the final of the Peaceful Way at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

“The pedigree is just very live, because not only you have the Ice Dutchess, but Tactical Landing is from the same family and Mission Brief... so we’re excited to sell her as well,” Reid said of Queentrix.

On a more somber note, Reid said he is hoping the 12 yearlings he is selling for White Birch Farms will sell well as a tribute to the farm manager Steve Williams who died of a heart attack two weeks ago at age 60. It’s the latest in a string of tragedies for the farm that bred Captaintreacherous, Bee A Magician and many other champions.

“We’ve been selling horses for White Birch for a long time. Since the death of Michael (Parisi), I’ve been working with the estate and, you know, it’s just another chapter in their story because you really can’t believe it. First Marie, then Joe, then Michael Parisi dying unexpectedly young, then Steve has been with them 13 or 14 years... It’s unfathomable to think that one operation would have gone through four deaths.

“That being said, people that know White Birch was always uniquely run, uniquely managed and the people were unique in their own ways, but yet everything seemed to get done at a high level. They had a great year... as the breeder of Captain, to have all the Captains come out and be so good. They had a terrific sale in Kentucky.”

Preferred Equine will sell some 80 yearlings and more than 300 horses in Thursday and Friday’s mixed sale sessions – about 420 horses in all.

“Obviously, you need a good staff and I have a loyal staff that have been with me a long time. It’s a good core. Obviously, we couldn’t do it without them and we run an efficient operation and have a good flow for the consignors...

shipping in on a timely basis to show the horses to the prospective customers and clients here,” Reid said.

“We started showing (Saturday) afternoon and we had a good show day... It’s challenging when you have the changeover on Wednesday to get ready for Thursday, Friday... It’s a busy night. Then, I think we’re selling 59 mares or something on Thursday and then some weanlings and yearlings on Thursday as well, then Friday it’s the racehorses and fabulous fillies.”

As for the mood of buyers coming into the sale, Reid said it hasn’t changed a lot from recent years.

“I think it’s really on par. I really don’t feel anything different. There’s been no Jersey announcement (about possible state funding), which everyone was kind of hoping for (before the sale started). That doesn’t look like that’s going to be the case. Then we’ve got the election coming up on Tuesday and I think that’s weighing on some minds. The stock market has been a little volatile lately.”

That said, the Preferred consignment was busy with lookers all Sunday afternoon leading Reid to believe his horses will sell well and the sale will be strong.

Egloff bullish on Vieux Carre's trotting yearlings

Dr. John Egloff said he's selling some of the nicest trotters his Vieux Carre Farms of Gettysburg, PA has ever had at the Standardbred Horse Sale Company's yearling auction which starts today at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg, PA.

"They are Explosive Matters and Donato Hanovers. I've got a couple of really nice Sebastian Ks, first crop of horses. We don't have Muscle Hills and Cantabs, which if you're really going to ring the bell, they are going to ring, but we've got really nice individuals. I've got the nicest bunch of Explosive Matters I've ever had," said Egloff, who is selling 66 yearlings this year, up from about 40-50 in previous years.

Egloff said he is selling three out of Sebastian K's first crop.

"The one mare I have is a half sister to Marian Marauder, which is a famous small family. The mare has had a couple of really small ones. I bred her to Sebastian K trying to get some size and I did. He's a nice, average-sized horse and he stands great. He's a lovely horse. There's speed in the pedigree. If we got one with a decent size, I think he'll be alright.

"It remains to be seen how well people are going to accept Sebastian K, as an absolute outcross. My other two Sebastian Ks are big. I have one out of an SJs Caviar mare that's a big, gorgeous colt. Anyway, we'll see, but I've certainly got the nicest bunch of Explosive Matters I've ever had."

Egloff pointed to the farm's unofficial Hall of Fame of photos hanging with his consignment featuring horses raised at his farm. The list includes Always B Miki, Total Truth, Pine Chip, Shark Gesture, Somwheroवरainbow, Im A Fool, Always A Virgin and many more.

"As you can see from the pictures on the wall of the horses that we've raised that have won a million bucks, we know there's a good one in here somewhere, and it's just a matter of picking him out," Egloff said, adding it was a thrill to be the one who raised the all-time world record holder bred by Joe Hurley of Delaware.

"Joe Hurley bred Always A Virgin, (Always B Miki's) sire, who was born and raised on our farm. He also bred Artstopper, his mother, who was born there. That's like a hat trick. How many times does someone breed the sire, the dam and the horse? We raise his horses. We take care of his horses."

Mullen says there's no way he'll top last year's gangbuster's sale, but he's going to give it a shot

Mark Mullen is realistic when he says there's no way he's going to top the results of the 2017 Standardbred Horse Sales Company's auction in which his Fair Winds Farm of New Jersey was the leading consignor, by a wide margin, with his 19 yearlings averaging \$92,000 apiece.

"That was, what do you call it, a seminal year, or whatever those words are. It was the best year ever," Mullen said.

Last year, Fair Winds consigned the third and fourth highest priced yearlings sold – Summit In Sight, a Muscle Hill colt out of Bluff that fetched \$300,000 and Personal Paradise, a Muscle Hill filly out of Armbro Déjà Vu that brought \$265,000.

Fair Winds will sell 28 yearlings at this year's sale that gets underway today. Mullen said the ones the yearling inspectors keep looking at have given him an idea which ones should sell the best.

"There are four or five that people really like," he said.

Mullen's favorite is more sentimental. He has a soft spot for hip 320, Devine Equine, an Andover Hall filly out of Marla Bar.

"We bred her and we had the mother. The mother (Marlene Lobell) was a Joie De Vie sister to Mack Lobell that my dad bought when Mack was two and racing. I don't remember what he paid, \$17,000, I don't remember. I had left the sale. I pointed out the horse to him and I left the sale. He bought the horse. When the horse got back to the farm, she was a trainwreck. She stood every which way, each leg pointed in a different direction. I said, 'Oh my God, what did we do?'"

"I couldn't say a word. We just bred her, never trained her, never put a harness on her. Just bred her and she's been wonderful. We kept this Marla Bar out of her, by Malabar Man. She was standing over there and I said, 'We better keep an eye on this filly.' She was a lovely filly, but she wasn't getting a whole lot of attention. We ended up keeping her and Trond Smedshammer trained her. She was a lovely racehorse and she's been a pretty nice broodmare and the family just keeps hanging in there."

As for the overall vibe, Mullen said he's sensing optimism heading into the sale.

"Everybody is optimistic. Everybody is asking what's happening in Jersey (with a possible state funding plan) and I'm optimistic about that. I just don't know when it's going to

happen, but I think it will. I think by the end of the year, with any luck, we'll have some good news," he said.

Bob Boni stopped to watch hip 447, a Credit Winner filly out of Vida De Vie named Zita De Vie, get some serious looks Sunday afternoon at his Northwood Bloodstock consignment.

"The one that happens to be out right now is a beautiful filly," he said. "She's a sister to Winndevie, that's a filly trained by Trond Smedshammer that's made \$200,000 this year and has the distinction of being one of those that the only time she got beat was by (undefeated Breeders Crown champion) Woodside Charm. We sold the sister last year for \$45,000 and this filly is very similar, maybe a little more leg to her, but a nice filly."

Boni, who is selling 71 yearlings and another 225 mixed horses, said he is offering a couple of nice Father Patrick yearlings and is particularly taken with hip 2, a Sweet Lou colt out of Before The Poison called Lou's Sweetrevenge.

"He's a good colt, very correct, moves well. Ironically or mistakenly, he's listed as a chestnut, but he's a bay. So don't look for the chestnut. He's called chestnut because he has a light mane and tail, but he's a bay," Boni said.

As for picking out some others destined to top the

Northwood consignment, Boni said that would be up to the buyers. As it is, even his own opinion of his yearlings changed the more ties he saw them on the inspection floor at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex.

"When you get to see them here on the floor, you get to like them a little more or a little less," he said as a steady stream of lookers were eying up several of his consignment's horses.

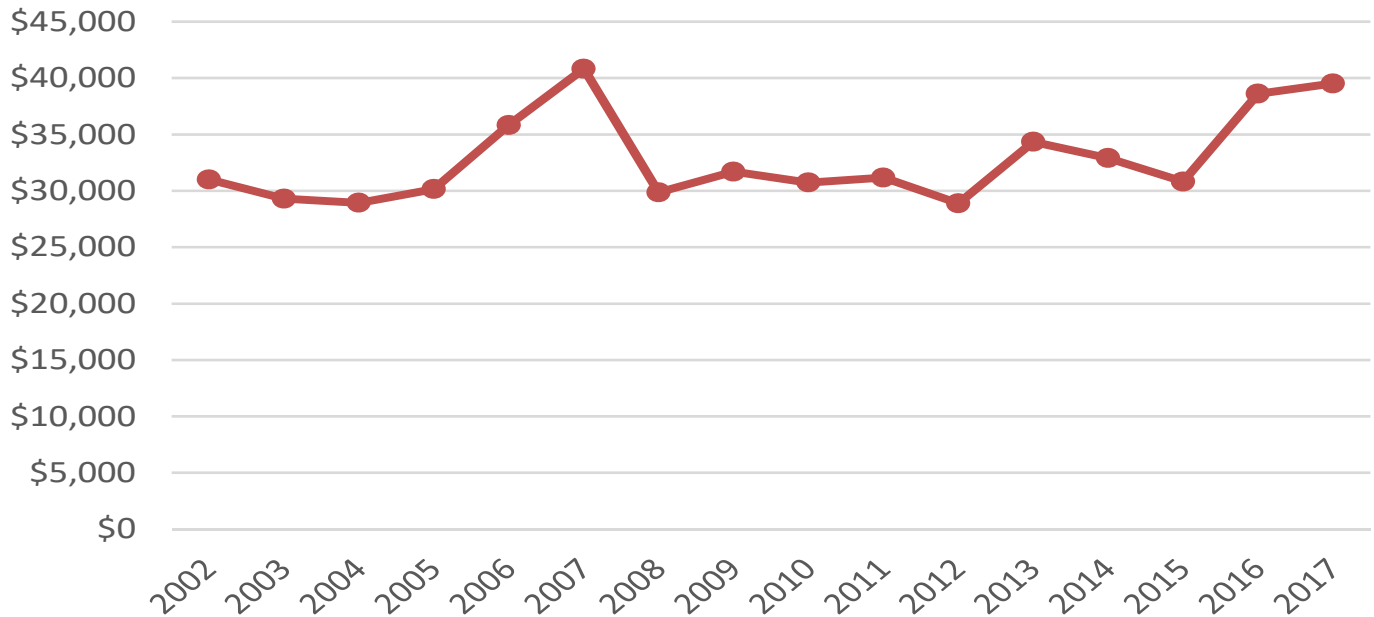

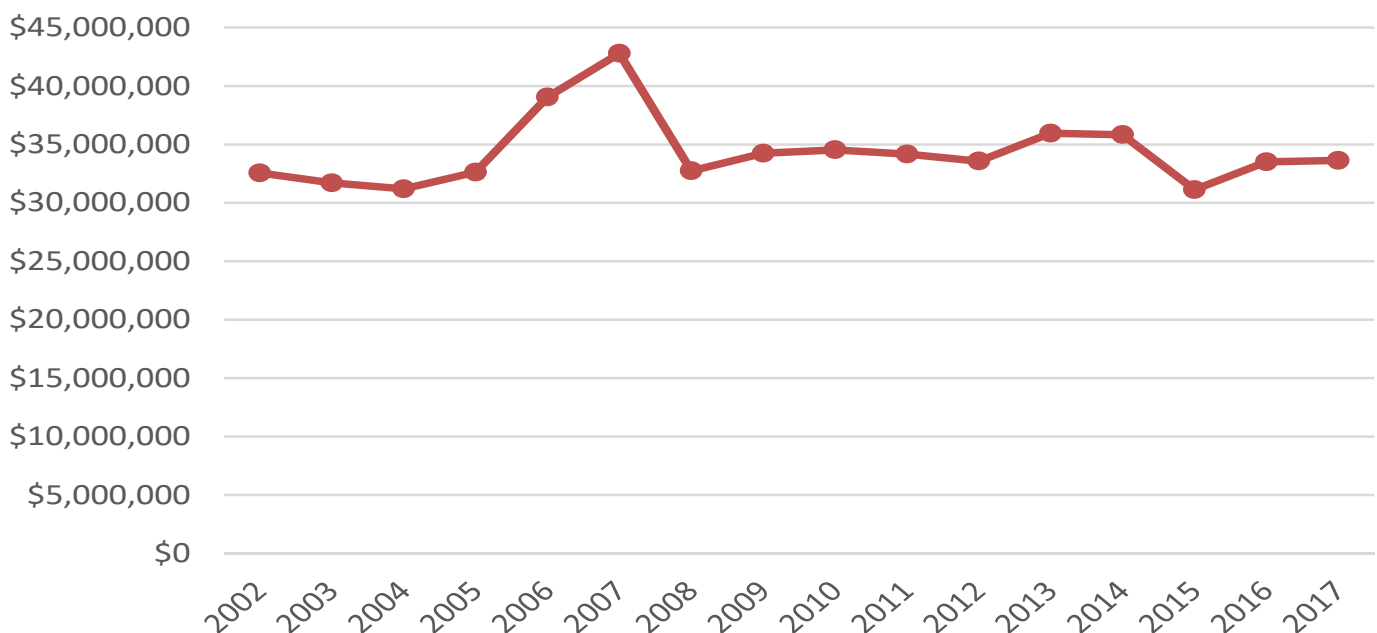

Yearling Sale - Average



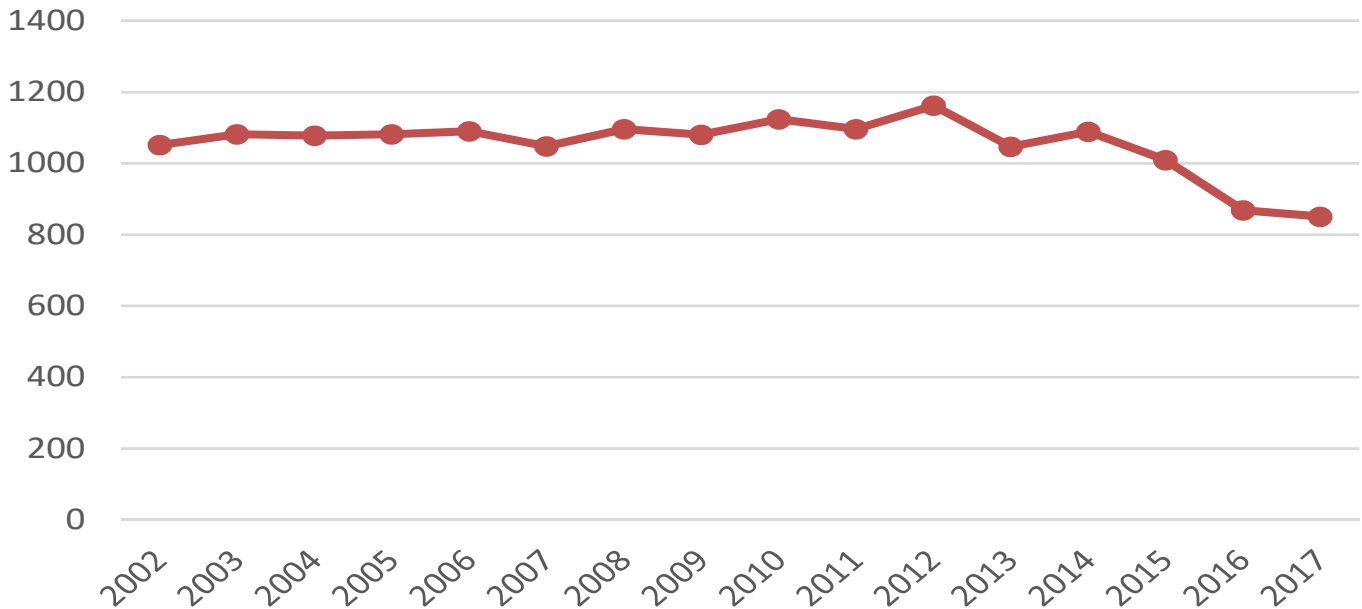
Yearling Sale - Gross

When horse defines athlete

Somebeachsomewhere inducted to Nova Scotia Sport Hall of Fame.

When Somebeachsomewhere was posthumously inducted to the Nova Scotia Sport Hall of Fame Friday night (Nov. 2), it was a breakthrough of sorts: The late world champion became the first and only equine athlete to be so recognized.

Trainer and Schooner Stable partner Brent MacGrath accepted a plaque on his horse's behalf, also fielding questions about what the late pacer meant to him and the harness racing industry. The Truro, NS businessman told the sizable Halifax Convention Centre audience that he missed Somebeachsomewhere "terribly," particularly since the Hanover Shoe Farms stallion had been such a robust animal prior to developing cancer late last year. (The Mach Three son was humanely euthanized January 14, 2018.)

For all the outstanding pacer's racing accomplishments and success at stud, his induction to the Hall of Fame was not without controversy. Selection committee chair Mark Smith confirmed that several voters initially opposed Somebeachsomewhere (p, 2, 1:49.3s; 3, 1:46.4m; \$ 3,221,299 US) being a candidate. "It's a first for us — it's something that's an anomaly in most halls of fame," Smith told HRU. "I think some of our folks struggled a bit initially about whether or not to put a horse into the Hall of Fame, when it's always been humans."

Making Somebeachsomewhere relatable as an athlete was essential to break the stalemate among the 14 voters, who represented a demographically-diverse swath of the Nova Scotian sports community. The discussion of whether to include the racehorse took longer than any other, occupying much of a four-hour meeting.

"As we talked about it around the table, we started to draw some correlations between the accomplishments of that horse and if you compared it to a Sidney Crosby. If you compared (Beach) to one of the top 15 athletes in the province, that horse would be in the top 15," explained Smith. "So when we started to make those correlations, people started to see it was a 'one-time only'... a very special animal that accomplished some significant things. I think that's what people could get behind."

Smith and Sport Hall of Fame president/CEO Bruce Rainnie both highlighted the uniqueness of an equine inductee, each independently suggesting that Somebeachsomewhere might be the only horse who would ever qualify for inclusion.

Horseman Dale Pinkney attended the induction ceremony

with wife Jackie, two of around 20 Truro, NS racing fans who braved stormy weather and a bus trip to Halifax for the occasion. He told HRU that it sounded as if there would be no future consideration of equine inductees, even though trotting legend Fresh Yankee and former world champion Rumpus Hanover would definitely warrant discussion. "They should keep an open mind," advised the nephew of Nova Scotia and Canadian Hall of Fame trainer/driver Dave Pinkney.

Can a racehorse be an athlete? For Dale Pinkney, the answer was clear: "The (Nova Scotia) community was mentioned a lot for all these sports (at induction ceremony), but (Somebeachsomewhere) brought people together. People love winners and follow greatness."

MacGrath had also heard about the difficulty convincing several Hall of Fame voters that a horse is sometimes more than just a horse. "He's worthy, I believe, but being the first at anything is tough, so it seems fitting that 'Beach' would be the first equine athlete that would be inducted. It's certainly special," he told HRU.

MacGrath also addressed one voter's complaint that after admitting a famous horse, the Hall could find itself compelled to debate the merits of putting inanimate objects like the Bluenose, a renowned racing schooner, on the ballot. "Obviously a boat is a boat, and a horse is a living, breathing thing that's a competitor," he noted. "There is no question whether he's an athlete or not. Everyone has the right to question who belongs in the Sport Hall of Fame for Nova Scotia, but he was a great athlete — no question."

It's not the first time Somebeachsomewhere has been the poster boy for exceptional horses in sport: In 2008, a popular petition attempted to make him eligible for the Lou Marsh Award, honoring Canada's top athlete of the year. (To date, no horse has been named a Lou Marsh winner).

Mark Smith himself supported the Nova Scotian-owned and trained pacer's inclusion in the provincial Sport Hall of Fame, and clarified that the precedent-setting nature of Somebeachsomewhere's induction is not an arbitrary ban on consideration of future equine nominees.

"It could happen again, but of course it would be that exceptional circumstance of which we consider this horse to be," said the selection committee chair. "We checked with a number of halls of fame across the country to see what protocol was, and a number of them have those special types of circumstances, so it's not so much a policy as much as we know the ability is there, on a per-issue basis, to be able to consider [another horse for induction]."

There is no gambling-related or other stigma associated with harness racing inductees; the Nova Scotia Sport Hall of Fame already includes several trainer/drivers. "It's merit-driven," said Smith. There is no preference given to sports based on current popularity, either: "It doesn't matter to us. It's about the significance of the accomplishment, how it ranks on a national level, international level; the contribution the athlete's made to the province."

There was no better illustration of Somebeachsomewhere's credibility as an athlete than when MacGrath told the ceremony audience about how his horse reacted to losing the 2008 Meadowlands Pace, his sole lifetime defeat. MacGrath checked in with trainer Carl Conte, who fed the colt the morning after the race: "I know (Somebeachsomewhere) knew he lost. He's an athlete. He knew he got beat — there's no question... Of course I'm calling first thing, to see if 'Beach' was okay, and (Conte) said he didn't know if (Somebeachsomewhere) was going to eat him or the feed."

Some audience members laughed as MacGrath described the colt's evident frustration after the Meadowlands Pace, and laughed again as emcee Bruce Rainnie joked about Somebeachsomewhere's accomplishments at stud, conveying the impression that many in the downtown Halifax crowd found the former subject incomprehensible and the latter simply awkward. It was a vivid illustration of the induction's broader implications: Until they witness an event like Somebeachsomewhere's official recognition, people outside of the racing industry are unlikely to view a horse as more than a vehicle for human athletes.

Selection committee members individually ranked this year's top 10 Sport Hall of Fame finalists from #1 to #10; Somebeachsomewhere was either first or last on each voter's list. "There was nothing in the middle. People either bought in or they could not buy in" to accepting him as an athlete, observed Rainnie.

As MacGrath looked back on how the Schooner Stable's

\$40,000 yearling became arguably the greatest Standardbred of all time, he recalled turning down an offer of \$750,000 from the Muscara family, passed along right after the colt's debut at Grand River Raceway. "It wasn't really clicking with us that he was going to make \$3.5-million (Cdn.), and \$160,000 every time he went to the gate," said the lifelong horseman. The offer was rejected because the ownership group members didn't need the money, and because they wanted what money can't buy: a shot at greatness, with a horse who left little doubt.
