Average down 23 per cent from 2019, but still fourth highest in nearly two decades

Despite selling during a pandemic, Standardbred Horse Sales Company's 2020 auction in Timonium, MD concluded Saturday with the combined average of \$34,769, ranking it as the fourth highest in the last 19 years.

Standardbred Horse Sales Company's (SHSC) five-day auction at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium, MD concluded Saturday afternoon (Nov. 7) with a combined yearling and mixed sale average of \$34,750 down 23 per cent from the 2019 auction in Harrisburg, PA, but higher than the average all 15 years from 2002 through 2016. That said, the gross of \$42,360,000 was the lowest in at least 19 years. Modern electronic records go back to 2002.

After the yearling sale concluded Thursday (Nov. 5) with a

gross that failed to reach \$30 million for the first time since 2002, the mixed sale concluded with a gross of \$12,844,000 that was also its lowest total over that same time span.

The combined gross is down \$25,373,000 (37 per cent) from the 2019 auction in Harrisburg, PA when SHSC recorded a record average of \$45,209 and a gross of \$67.5 million that was the second highest in its long history behind only the \$70,228,377 grossed in 2007 (a year in which 541 more horses/stallion shares were sold than in 2019).

This year's combined median was \$29,000, down from

\$25,000 in 2019.

The number of horses/stallion shares sold was down 277 to 1,219 in 2020, which is also the lowest number sold since 2002. A sharply lower number of horses/stallion shares sold had an impact on the gross, as did the COVID-19 pandemic and a change of venue to Timonium from the sale's long-standing home in Harrisburg at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show Complex, an entirely indoor facility shuttered by the state during the pandemic.

"There were so many people that couldn't come and so

many people that wanted to come and I believe there were a lot of folks who were reluctant to participate as much or perhaps even at all, simply because they couldn't get here to look at the animals," said sale president and CEO Pete Spears.

"I think Harrisburg is a facility that is very tough to equal. Everything is under one roof. It's very conveniently located, it doesn't require tents, it's free from the elements. I hope we'll be able to return (to Harrisburg in 2021), but, if not, we're very grateful to have Timonium as an alternative."

As for the two-day mixed sale, specifically, 446 horses/stallion shares were sold, which is the lowest total, by far, since 2002 and is off 217 from 2019. The mixed sale average of \$28,798 is lower than each of the last five years, but higher than all 13 years between 2002 and 2014.

"A \$28,000 average for the mixed sale is very much in line with most recent years' mixed sale average," said Spears.

The median was \$18,000, down from \$22,000 in 2019.

But, it is important not to write too much into year-to-year comparisons of mixed sale numbers. The numbers provided are just intended to give a snapshot of each year and how the business numbers fared against previous years. Mixed sales are only as strong as the horses entered. Some years there are major farm dispersals, such as in 2019 when White Birch Farm dispersed its remaining breeding stock and added a \$4.5 million boost to sale totals. This year, there were no

major dispersals at the SHSC sale.

"I think we get over-analytical sometimes with things that are really apples to peaches," Spears said. "Last year itself was an amazingly high aberration, so I think (this year's) mixed sale is largely interpreted as a return to a normal average year and the gross was down because we had so many fewer horses. Nothing very complicated."

The results could have been better, of course, but Spears said the first priority was getting the horses sold in the best way possible considering the challenges.

"I'm just grateful that we were able to meet our commitment to our consignors to actually hold a live sale and help them get their horses sold and help them raise the capital to get back in the game next year and hopefully this crazy virus stuff will be resolved enough that we can resume reasonably normal lives again," Spears said.

"(Operations manager) Dale Welk and our operations people had tremendous challenges, first the massive rain and then the gale force winds and collapsed tent and a very spread out plan for all of the horses... all the new wiring and electronics that had to be put out.

"My office staff had to deal with a brand new online bidding system. We sold about 135 horses online, all of which took a tremendous amount of extra time to be able to coordinate not only during the registration process, but to

make sure there were people available to come and settle for the horses and pick them up and ship them. That was our staff that put in all of that extra time to make that happen, so I think they did a fabulous job."

Saturday's session was topped by Hip #1817, trotting mare Sister Sledge (Father Patrick—Behindclosedoors) who fetched \$265,000 from Swedish bloodstock agent Robert Lindstrom out of the Preferred Equine consignment. Lindstrom purchased the mare for the Swedish connections that campaigned Propulsion.

Lindstrom was the day's biggest buyer (\$487,000, total, spent on six purchases) and Preferred was the day's leading consignor by gross (\$3,170,000).

Northwood Bloodstock sold the next two highest priced racehorses on the day — Hip #1400 Philly Hanover, a

Captaintreacherous filly out of Paris Hanover, sold for \$225,000 to Joe Parisi. Hip #1370 Love Muffin, an Andover Hall filly out of Pine Yankee, sold for \$200,000 to Steve Stewart of Hunterton Farms.

Preferred was the leading consignor for the mixed sale (with \$5,078,000 in gross sales) and the second leading consignor for the combined yearling and mixed sale \$8,821,000 for 260 horses/stallion shares sold). Hanover Shoe Farms led all consignors for the combined sale with \$12,091,000 in gross sales for 257 horses sold.

The combined sale's top buyer remained Serge Godin's Determination Stable of Montreal. Determination spent \$1,559,000, total, to acquire 12 yearlings. Burke Racing Stable LLC was next with \$975,000 spent to acquire 18 horses. Lindstrom was a close third with \$967,000, total, spent to buy 13 horses.

Despite COVID-19 travel challenges, Canadians buyers still made up about 20 per cent of the sale with \$8,199,000 spent on 216 horses/stallion shares. Europeans made up 4.2 per cent of the gross sales. As for specific states, New Jersey (\$8,508,000, 162) residents outbid those from Pennsylvania (\$6,231,000, 234), New York (\$3,879,000, 130), Florida (\$3,415,000, 59) and Ohio (\$2,918,000, 122).

Hanover explains why it didn't buy any mares in Timonium

Most years at Standardbred Horse Sales Company's (SHSC) auction, Hanover Shoe Farms takes some of the proceeds from selling yearlings and restocks by making broodmare purchases during the mixed sale. After all, it is the perfect place for the sport's leading breeder to both buy and sell. It owns and operates the SHSC sale.

This year, Hanover, which grossed over \$12 million during the yearling sale — four times more than its next closest competitor — was conspicuous for not buying any mares during the mixed sale.

It had nothing to do with the COVID-19 pandemic, explained Hanover's executive vice-president and syndicate manager Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky.

"Hanover Shoe Farms is committed now, more than ever, to acquiring the best broodmare prospects available in our quest to strengthen our already exceptional broodmare band," Jablonsky said. "In 2020, we were able to make several significant purchases privately."

Deep thoughts on the Timonium Standardbred Horse Sales Company auction

I'm of two separate emotions about this year's Standardbred Horse Sales Company sale.

The first is of incredible melancholy. It will be the first sale I've missed since 1962 — that's 58 consecutive years.

I know I should not be there, but it still strains at my heart.

Oh the memories! Some of them bad, most of them great.

By this time next year, all of the terrible mess that has been 2020 will have passed and the sale will be back in Harrisburg. Let's hope so.

Relative to Lexington, there are many reasons why this sale was disappointing — most of them caused by an act of God, otherwise known as COVID-19.

Shall I count the ways.

1. The catalog was down both in quality and in numbers — in my opinion, substantially so. They were missing several long-time consignors some of whom split their consignments. Others, such as Jeff Gural, chose to sell all of his yearlings at Lexington instead of splitting them up.

Let's start with Day One. Of most note were the omissions of nine yearlings bred by Order By Stables which fled to Lexington because of the movement of the sale from Harrisburg to Timonium. These nine yearlings alone averaged over \$175,000 in Lexington.

2. The change in venue. Most people fear change. That, in my opinion, applies doubly to horsepeople. The switch from weatherproof Harrisburg to open air Timonium, was beyond the control of the sales company. They made the best of a bad situation. But Mother Nature dealt them a whammy. The Sunday and Monday leading up to the sale, traditionally the two days when most of the yearlings are shown, were plagued by extreme winds. So much so, that one of the huge tents housing a great number of yearlings collapsed. Much of that occurrence has been covered elsewhere. Suffice to say that it was a near miracle that all horses and people escaped this possible catastrophe without damage. The horse

community came together in avoiding what otherwise might have been a calamity.

3. Throughout the sale's 82-year existence, the vast majority of them have coincided with Election Day. I doubt that it had ever previously affected the success or lack of it of the event. But, 2020 was different for two main reasons. The first is the general nature of this year's election. It not only created a great divide among Americans, but the sale also started on Election Day itself, where in the past it had begun on the day preceding it. This was for a very good reason, allowing the folks who had been at Hoosier Park over the weekend an extra day to get there and to inspect yearlings. The second reason was the threat of possible violence erupting. Businesses throughout the country were boarding up and numerous people felt there would be rioting, looting and other possible dangers lurking. I know of several people who for this very reason alone did not attend. Our demographic is skewed towards the elderly and many did not want to be exposed to this possible threat.

The counter argument could be made that these same people could have bid and bought from the safety of their home or office using the internet or telephone. Quite a few in fact did.

But there is a great deal to be said for the ability to see and touch the horses upon which you might be bidding. There is also something to be said about the "Mano a Mano" nature of the competition at a horse sale. This causes people to exceed the limits which they had previously established. It's much easier to restrain oneself sitting behind a computer than it is from the hustle and bustle of the live sale.

To paraphrase my good friend Dave McDuffee, a major purchaser at this sale, "I've bought an untold number of yearlings at horse sales for many, many years. Of all the yearlings I've bought, I don't think I've ever bought a single one for less than or at the price that I'd established for it."

4. The difficulty of foreigners, especially Canadians, to get through the borders and to the sale. More than any other sale, this is the one that has been regarded as 'home" for numerous Canadians. This year, only a negligible number of those usually in attendance were there. Many Canadians and I am told some Europeans tried to attend, but were turned back at the borders.

For some CRAZY and unknown reason, Canadians were fine if they chose to travel by plane. If they were coming by car, it was a totally different story. Some were able to get by the borders.

Others were turned back, sometimes even at the same border and even by the same agent.

I don't know of a single European buyer who was not already domiciled in the United States, who came over.

The sale usually draws a large contingent from the United Kingdom and Ireland who traditionally have helped the middle and lower segments of the pacing market. They were nowhere to be seen. The absence of members of the Hill and Mounds families was especially noticeable. Scandinavian owners were also noticeable by

their absence.

Let's get down to the sale itself.

THE GOOD

• The top of the market was very good, perhaps even excellent.

The sale's leading consignor, behemoth Hanover Shoe Farms, appeared to have an excellent sale. I'll paraphrase the person who I believe to be behind a great part of the success that the Farms has enjoyed for more than the last decade, Dr Bridgette Jablonsky: "The first day was spotty. But the bottom line was excellent. The excellent prices realized at the top more than made up for those that didn't do as well. Some of the latter probably weren't Day One yearlings. They would likely have done better on Day Two. Day Two was fantastic. Believe it or not, the average for Day Two was even greater than that for Day Two last year, which was our best ever."

Hanover has an advantage of course, the chief being that they are by far the sport's leading breeder. This year, the earnings produced by the Farms are fairly close to an unprecedented DOUBLE that of the next leading breeder.

• The fact that the sale went on at all despite numerous obstacles faced in doing so.

THE BAD

• I'll begin this by quoting Blue Chip Farms owner Tom Grossman from a post he made on Facebook on Thursday: "It's very hard to explain the abject pain involved in investing, money and blood, sweat and tears in breeding, raising and prepping a yearling(for sale). Then watching an employee, who cares deeply, walk back from the ring after selling(it) for much less than expected(sometimes less than) the stud fee."

My response: "Tommy, I've been there too many times. After even a good sale I'd get down in the dumps for a few days, because all the yearlings that I spent every single day with for two months were gone — cold turkey. But at least they had sold well and I looked forward to following their training progress. With a bad sale (thankfully there were not too many of those), I'd go into deep depression that might last as much as a few weeks. I knew it was crazy to do so. But I'd blame myself, asking, 'What could I have done to have made the sale better? I truly believe that it affected me and some of the other employees at the Farms, maybe even more than it affected the owners."

• With the exception of Hanover, most of the other consignors, especially, but maybe all of the smaller breeders had poor sales. It really hurts me to see this happening.

There are many reasons for it, the chief being the over saturation of a saturated marketplace.

Costs keep rising, yet purses for young horses, especially 2-year-olds, have declined.

The small owner, acting alone, has a very difficult chance in the yearling game.

He or she has few options. They are: Against all odds and all

chances of making money, try to go it alone; get in as a part owner in the numerous partnership groups available (my choice); get in the overnight or claiming game (not for me); get out of the business altogether. At 79, I'm still around.

• We are breeding about the same number of horses, but they are better, resulting in the small pie being split thinner.

Racing ownership is not for the faint of heart, especially the yearling end of it, yet speaking for myself, that's the only route I would even think of following.

- Stallions stay in favor or quickly go out. The top is quite thin. The middle might even be a little thinner. The bottom is terrible. Once a stallion falls out of favor, for all intents and purposes, he has the steepest of roads to overcome before he makes it back. Very few do. This relates to yearling prices. The hot stallion, the small breeder went to when he went to breed his mare, has often turned ice cold when he is selling the yearling produced by that mating.
- With a few exceptions, stud fees need to be lowered to adjust to the needs of the breeders and the buying public. There were more than a few instances where yearlings sold for prices below the stud fee, often well below the stud fee. Most farms have wisely chosen not to announce their 2021 season fees. I'm not a breeder, but I certainly hope for their sakes and the well-being of their customers that they consider this in pricing their horses.
- Syndication prices are too high in the risk/reward ratio, relative to stud fees and yearling prices.. Simply put, they are out of sync with the yearling prices, with a few exceptions that these yearlings can be expected to bring. I guess that I am far too old school in my thinking. I believe that stallions should earn their high stud fees. Of course, I'm probably influenced by the fact that I was at Hanover when outstanding horses such as Super Bowl, Albatross and Western Hanover started off at fees of \$5,000, \$5,000 and \$4,000. They earned their way to the top. Horses starting off at fees over \$15,000, if even that high, don't make a whole lot of sense to me. But I suppose if I was hanged for being sensible, they would be hanging an innocent man.

I've purposely tried to leave out names of most breeders or horses for fear of offending some. However I believe those who I am referencing know or should know who they are.

Tyler Miller scores first career training victory

The 24-year-old won Tuesday at Harrah's Hoosier Park with Skyway Rockatop.

Two years ago, Tyler Miller was a regular competitor on the northern Indiana pony racing circuit with an eye on harness racing. Tuesday (Nov. 3), the 24-year-old sent out his first winner at Harrah's Hoosier Park. Skyway Rockatop, a freshman from the first crop of JK Endofanera, paced to a 1:55.4 score for Miller, who co-owns the pacer with M & M Racing. The victory came in Miller's fifth start as Skyway Rockatop's conditioner.

"It was great. I don't know, I can't really describe it," said Miller, who lives in Shipshewana, IN. "There was a lot of work involved. I bought the yearling last year at this time. It's been a year in the making I guess. It's just a great feeling. To see that horse go across the wire first, that was unbelievable."

Miller had dabbled in the breeding side of the business, but dipped his toe in racing last season with Passionate Deo, a Captaintreacherous filly that he purchased at the end of her freshman campaign and sent to top Hoosier Park trainer Jamie Macomber. As a 3-year-old, she won five starts and earned nearly \$40,000 in 2019 for the owner. He reinvested some of the proceeds at last fall's Hoosier Classic Yearling Sale, purchasing Skyway Rockatop for \$10,000. Miller trained down the filly over the winter and sent her to Macomber to race at Hoosier Park. In six starts, the pacer registered two fifth-place efforts and earned \$700.

"It's just hard when you have a horse like Skyway Rockatop because she was a 2-year-old non-winners of one to be claimed," Macomber said. "She trained super, but it's just so hard to pay a training bill on a horse like that when you can train them yourself. He asked if he could bring her home so that he could work with her and learn."

Miller brought Skyway Rockatop home and began training his charge.

"We weren't sure what kind of 2-year-old she would be. We always thought she would be a good 3-year-old, so that remains to be seen," Miller said. "To get a win out of her, that's mission accomplished for her 2-year-old year."

The victory did not come immediately. In her first time out for Miller, Skyway Rockatop finished ninth. However, a week later she hit the board for the first time, finishing third before being elevated to second by judges. In her last three starts, the filly has hit the board each time for driver Andy Shetler, with the latest effort producing a maiden-breaking victory.

"I think it's awesome, especially at this time in our industry," said Macomber. "He's young; he's very enthusiastic. He loves it. He has everything our sport needs."

Miller is quick to credit Macomber for her work with the filly, now possessing purse earnings of \$7,510.

"Jamie did all the hard work for us. She had her rolling pretty good, and I just stepped in at the right time. I give Jamie the credit," he said.

The young horseman works a full-time job at R.H. Yoder Woodworking in Shipshewana while also jogging a trio of babies and shipping and racing Skyway Rockatop at Hoosier Park. He hopes the three yearlings in training will make it to the races in 2021, so he plans to focus more on racing. He wants to move to more of a part-time status next year at R.H. Yoder in order to pursue harness racing to a greater degree, including competing at the fairs next summer. One of his yearlings is Michigan bred, and the trainer hopes to explore the program to the north.

"I'm at the barn all the time now. I got here a little before seven this morning and I'm still here working (at 4 p.m.). I don't mind it one bit," he said, laughing. "Winning makes it way easier. It gives you something to look forward to when you have a shot."

Miller is in the process of selling his breeding interests, which includes ownership of two broodmares and half of a third. He is keeping one JK Endofanera baby that he bred, one of the trio he is now training. The horseman would like to follow pony racers like LeWayne Miller and Alex Udell that have moved to standardbreds and carved out successful niches. This summer, Miller traveled with Udell to Indiana fair circuit races, where the veteran showed him the ropes and taught him a lot about the business.

"Right now I'm just having a little fun with it. If it goes well, I don't know where it could lead. It could lead to bigger things down the road," the trainer stated. "If I could make a living doing this; that would be Plan A. That would be awesome. We'll just have to see how it goes."











Takter/Dunn team take two stakes on final night of Grand Circuit racing at Harrah's Hoosier Park

Just one week after playing host to the 37th edition of the Breeders Crown, Grand Circuit racing action was back in the spotlight at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Friday (Nov. 6) as some of the sport's brightest stars ventured back to Hoosier Park for the final night of Grand Circuit racing this season. The evening's 13-race card was highlighted by the \$160,000 Monument Circle Pace for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings, the \$140,000 Carl Erskine Trot for 3-year-old colt trotters, the \$100,000 Crossroads of America for

3-year-old filly trotters and the \$100,000 USS Indianapolis Memorial for 3-year-old pacing fillies.

Trainer Nancy Takter teamed up with driver Dexter Dunn to capture two winners on the evening's program as the duo first found the winner's circle with **JK First Lady** in the \$100,000 USS Indianapolis Memorial. JK First Lady was able to overcome a first-over trip to wear down her stablemate and the heavily-favored Breeders Crown champion Peaky Sneaky and Yannick Gingras to get the victory in 1:49.1. The 1:49.1 victory equaled her lifetime mark.

"She has such a beautiful gait, she makes it look easy," Takter said of her filly. "She's definitely fresh which helps a lot at this point in the season."

JK First Lady has now won five of 13 outs this season while pushing her lifetime bankroll to \$695,731. The homebred daughter of Western Ideal—Jk She'salady is owned by the 3 Brothers Stables.

Takter and Dunn were back in the winner's circle in the very next stakes race on the program, the \$100,000 Crossroads of America for 3-year-old trotting fillies after a

decisive victory from **Spoiled Princess**. Sent off as the 6-5 favorite, Spoiled Princess rallied off cover and was able to hold off a late surge from May Baby and James Yoder to get the win by a length and a half in 1:52.2.

"Last week (in the Breeders Crown final) she lost a bit of her momentum in the last turn," Takter said. "We made some equipment adjustments this week and she was much better. She's definitely in great shape and came to me in great shape but she's been particularly sharp these past couple weeks."

The daughter of Trixton—Fashion Spooner recorded her sixth win from 14 seasonal starts. Owned by Black Horse Racing and Christina Takter, Spoiled Princess has now amassed \$226,136 in lifetime purse earnings.

After a narrow miss in the \$500,000 Breeders Crown final for 3-year-old trotting colts last week, **Play Trix On Me** and driver Joe Bongiorno were out for a redemption victory and got it in the \$140,000 Carl Erskine Trot in 1:53.

Using similar tactics as his previous two efforts at Hoosier Park, Bongiorno sent Play Trix On Me away from the gate for position. Play Trix On Me reached the front through the opening panel in :26.4 before yielding the lead to Ready For Moni and Yannick Gingras. Ready For Moni lead the field through splits of :56 and 1:25.1 and when the field turned for home, the race appeared to be wide open. Play Trix On Me found late racing room up the inside and utilized a :27.2 closing quarter to the get the win over It's Academic and Chris Page.

"It feels so good to be in the winner's circle after last week," Bongiorno said after the victory. "I don't normally feel torn up after a race but I was still feeling torn about that one even two days later. He raced so well. He's confident and has great gate speed, but it just wasn't enough.

"I got so lucky picking up the drive on this horse. I remember looking at his lines and thinking 'He's been good all year, he just hasn't gotten lucky for a win.' He got that tonight and raced really, really well again for me."

Trained by Linda Toscano, Play Trix On Me is owned by Renee Spahr. The son of Trixton—Lima Playmate recorded his fourth win of the season from 14 outs. Play Trix On Me now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$242,971.

In the final stakes race of the evening, world champion and co-track record holder **Cattlewash** was back in the Hoosier Park winner's circle after an authoritative score in the \$160,000 Monument Circle Pace for 3-year-old pacing colts and geldings. With regular pilot David Miller in the bike, Cattlewash utilized his customary front-running tactics to

win by two lengths and stop the timer in 1:48.3.

Tattoo Artist and Joe Bongiorno set the hot early tempo of :25.4 before Miller gave Cattlewash the green light down the backside. Cattlewash rattled off fractions of :54.1 and 1:21.4 before pacing home in :26.4 to get the victory over stablemate Elver Hanover and driver Chris Page. Catch The Fire and Mike Wilder rallied well late to round out the trifecta. Sent off as the 3-5 favorite, Cattlewash returned \$3.40 for the victory.

"The trip worked out well for us tonight," Miller said in the winner's circle. "He definitely races his best race on the front — he's very game on the lead. He got a little bit of a late start this season but he has really come around lately and going two heats in the Jug was the best thing for him. He was as strong tonight as he has been all year."

Trained by Ron Burke, the son of Somebeachsomewhere—Road Bet was bred and is owned by W J Donovan. Cattlewash has now won 5 of 14 seasonal starts while earning \$709,977 lifetime.

Live racing will move to a Thursday, Friday, Saturday schedule for the final two weeks of the 2020 live racing meet which will conclude on Nov. 21. For more information on the upcoming live racing schedule, please visit www.harrahshoosierpark.com.

Dee's Red Delicious, Anoka Hanover nab Kindergarten trotting finals

Leading a tightening bunch after leader Jack Fire, **Dee's Red Delicious** emerged victorious in the \$207,570 Kindergarten Classic for 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings on Saturday (Nov. 6) at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Driver Corey Callahan floated Dee's Red Delicious into fourth to a :28 first quarter as 3-5 favorite Lindsymusclemania broke into a gallop entering the backstretch. Straightening to the backside, Jack Fire circled to the top out of third and posted a :57.4 half while Callahan gave Dee's Red Delicious his cue.

Into the far turn, Dee's Red Delicious loomed closer with Peter Haughton champ Zenith Stride in tow to three-quarters in 1:26.2. Jack Fire clung to command as the charge closed in, with Zenith Stride angling three wide, Royson's Punch trying to squeak up the pylons and Bee Forever lodged between horses. But Dee's Red Delicious kept the compact late threats to his back and slid to a three-quarter length victory over Jack Fire. Bee Forever finished third in the 1:54.3 mile while Zenith Stride took fourth.

"He's really been kind of the perfect horse," trainer Bruce Saunders said of Dee's Red Delicious, whose poised to compete in the Valley Victory on Nov. 21. "When he got beat it wasn't his fault, it was my fault and maybe Corey's fault. Last week we were stunned that he was so flat—he had some respiratory issues that fortunately we were able to get cleared up."

Owned by Joseph Martinelli Sr., Dee's Red Delicious scored his sixth win from 12 starts, banking \$460,861. The Credit Winner—Apple Plush gelding paid \$15.40 to win.

While Insta Glam fast-stepped her way through the early portions of the mile, **Anoka Hanover** readied her attack, and the 4-5 choice successfully reeled in the tiring pacesetter for driver Todd McCarthy to win the \$252,340 Kindergarten Classic for two-year-old trotting fillies.

McCarthy landed Anoka Hanover in fifth while Insta Glam ground to the lead by a :27.2 opening quarter. Insta Glam continued on an uncontested lead to a :55.4 half as Anoka Hanover edged wide off the pylons with Mazzarati on her back.

Anoka Hanover made gains first over into the final turn, but caught cover to three-quarters when Wet My Whistle angled off the cones from third. Insta Glam meanwhile expanded her lead by the three-quarters in 1:24.1 but grew leg weary into the stretch. McCarthy took aim with Anoka Hanover to the center of the track and slid to a one-and-a-quarter length victory with ease while stopping the clock in a lifetime-best 1:52.3. Insta Glam held second with Mazzarati finishing third and Hot As Hill fourth.

"She's always been very clever, very easy going on herself, not nervous at all," trainer Noel Daley said of Anoka Hanover, whose next start will come in the Goldsmith Maid on Nov. 21. "It's easy to work with a trotting filly when they've got the brains. She's not the prettiest going thing, but she just had the guts."

A Donato Hanover—Aunt Mel filly owned by Daley along with L A Express Stable LLC and Caviart Farms, Anoka Hanover collected her ninth victory from 13 starts to push her bankroll to \$379,461. She paid \$3.60 to win.

Summa Cum Laude, Fire Start Hanover score in Kindergarten pacing finals

Saturday (Nov. 7), a week after **Summa Cum Laude** and Perfect Sting recorded the first dead-heat Breeders Crown win, Yannick Gingras steered the former to a 1:50.2 win in the \$204,050 Kindergarten Classic for freshman pacing colts and geldings at The Meadowlands.

Soaring to first off the gate was Shakespeare, followed by Captain Sleeze, with the Ron Burke-trained Summa Cum Laude in fourth behind Ilderton AM after leaving from the 10 hole. Shakespeare cut the first quarter in :26.4.

Summa Cum Laude took to the outside and smoothly passed Shakespeare. With the lead, he was entirely in charge pacing to a 1:23.3 three-quarters. Simon Says Hanover came first over to make his bid but Shakespeare was still strong and still after the leader, while Always B Sweet came into the stretch picture.

Without urging, Gingras drove Summa Cum Laude across the wire to a lifetime- best-equaling score by one-and-a-quarter lengths.

"I just tried to get him in play," Gingras said after the race. "I wasn't going to take back to last, so I was able to get away fourth and from there I saw what the pace was going to be, though it didn't matter, because he can race any which what way. I had a ton of pace still when finishing."

Ontario sired fillies were in the spotlight Saturday night (Nov. 7) at Woodbine Mohawk Park for the eliminations of the SBOA Stakes.

A total of four \$25,000 elimination races, two for pacers and two for trotters, were part of Saturday's 12-race card. The top-five finishers in each elimination advanced to next week's finals.

P L Notsonice had an adventurous journey to a 1:55.2 score in the first split for trotting fillies. The Joseph Skowyra trainee and driver Jonathan Drury were briefly four-wide in the second-quarter, eventually settling down on the lead at the half in :57.1. The early-battle did not lead to any in the back-half, as P L Notsonice cruised by three-quarters in 1:26 and trotted home in :29.2 to win by a length and three-quarters.

Princesspartypants grabbed second, while Sonadora Deo and Shape Shifter rallied for third and fourth. The fifth-place finisher was Lmc Bumble Bee.

A daughter of Kadabra, P L Notsonice is now five for 13 this season after going winless in seven starts as a rookie. Her seasonal earnings now jump to \$97,759 and career earnings over \$150,000 for owners Prince Less Acres and Renaldo Morales III.

P L Notsonice paid \$9.70 to win.

Susies Lady took command in the second-quarter and trotted off to a 4 ½ length score in 1:55.1. Jody Jamieson steered the Susie Kerwood trainee to fourth win in 14 starts this season, trotting a :28.1 final-quarter to secure the comfortable victory.

Chelseas Magic finished second, while Jula Shes Magic, also from the Kerwood barn, was third. Modern Mass and Yen completed the top-five.

Susies Lady has now banked over \$125,000 this season and sports career numbers of eight wins and \$161,100 for owners M And L of Delaware LLC and Kerwood. She paid \$4.20 to win.

On the pacing side, **Karma Seelster** converted off a two-hole trip in the first elimination for driver Doug McNair and trainer Gregg McNair. The daughter of Sportswriter followed Rose Run Vantage into the lane and muscled by with a :28.2 final-quarter to win in 1:51.1.

Lauras Love rallied from sixth to finish second, beat three-quarters of a length, while Rose Run Vantage was third. Betalady and Sound Idea rounded out the top-five.



Karma Seelster had just one win on the season entering Saturday, but was pushing \$200,000 in seasonal earnings. The McNair trainees second win of the campaign is her sixth career victory and increases her earnings to \$460,516 for owners Eileen & Keith Waples and Karen Hauver.

A \$2 win ticket on Karma Seelster returned \$5.80.

Rose Run Victory unleashed a vicious :26.3 final-quarter to rally from seventh and last to win the second elimination in a career best 1:52 for driver Ed Hensley. The Ashleigh Hensley trainee made up nearly seven lengths in the lane to surpass Beach Sports, who cut the mile, and prevail by a length and three-quarters.

Alicorn finished third, while Queso Relleno and Preeminence also advanced to the final.

A daughter of Shadow Play, Rose Run Victory recently entered the Hensley barn after being purchased by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi and Phillip Collura. The sophomore pacing filly is now two for two since the barn change and has increased her seasonal numbers to three wins and \$44,470 earned in 16 starts.

Rose Run Victory paid \$7.60 to win.

The SBOA finals will take place next Saturday (Nov. 14). The pacing final will go for a purse of \$138,518 and the trotting final for \$141,518. The post positions for each final were drawn following Saturday's eliminations.

Before the French/American war's final conflict of 2020, my pal David and I needed to reload his supply of beer. As I backed out of his driveway, David slapped his passenger-side dashboard and groaned, "How did I get into this mess?"

"Let this be a lesson. Never invite a high-maintenance French woman that you just met on a cruise for a visit on the cusp of a pandemic. That's simple dating 101."

"She thrives on confrontation."

I nodded, "Monique does seem a tad argumentative."

"A tad, did you hear her? She rattles off a string of expensive French wines that we are supposed to find in a *StopNGo* in rural Ohio."

We planned to sit on socially-distanced chairs in his living room and watch a program of harness races streamed onto his flatscreen. Monique would offer additional comparisons between harness racing in America and France. When we returned without a bottle of Chateau de snob, she heaved a theatrical sigh.

I warmed up by asking her a simple question, "Make any plans to return to Paris?"

She arched a lovely, un-plucked eyebrow, "Am I an imposition?"

"Not for me. I'm squirreled up in by double-wide 20 minutes from here." I followed up with, "Were you ever married?"

"Twice — first to an art thief, then to a prominent trotting horse trainer. And you?"

"Twice — a schoolteacher and a she-devil."

She didn't bite on she-devil, which irked me because I

rehearsed a spontaneous reply.

Before I could ask her a follow-up question, the bugle sounded from the flat screen. A string of trotters paraded onto the track.

Right away, she started, "In France, ugly trotting hobbles are forbidden."

I pounced, "Forbidden? Do you want to know what I say? Forbidden fruit is good on waffles."

She gave a half-smile, "I don't believe anyone normal would say that, but I must admit Trey would enjoy a French cafe. Our humor often mocks people. We often rely on wordplay, puns, irony, and sarcasm."

"Sarcasm is one of the many services that are part of the Trey package."

She got back on track, "Breaking rules for trotting horses are strict and quite complex in France. More than 15 strides will disqualify a horse."

"Then they need to requalify?

"Non, we do not have qualifiers in France. We do not race non-competitive horses."

"I'd be out of luck. My specialty is wagering on non-competitive trotting horses. Hey, what was the name of the famous racetrack in France?"

"The most renowned trotting racecourse in Europe is Hippodrome de Vincennes, on Paris's eastern side."

"Is that close to an airport?" I asked.

"Why?" she inquired.

"Just asking. I watched a few races from Europe on my laptop during the quarantine. They do some weird racing stuff over there. Race day is quite the circus."

She jutted her chin at the flatscreen and said, "American circuses are boring. The Cirque du Soleil is marvelous. And races from America are quite boring, always the same start, always the same direction, always the same distance. American racing is, as you say, groundhog day with harness horses."

"Did you say another direction?"

"Oui. Vincennes races counter-clockwise like North America. However, many races are clockwise in France and Europe."

"That's crazy."

"In France, we are not boring." She pointed at the trotters approaching the starting gate and said, "Sometimes we use the mobile starting car. We refer to this as the AutoStart, with two tiers of horses behind the gate. However, many of

us prefer la volte to begin the race."

"La volt?"

"La volte is translated into the flip."

"The flip?"

"Many races at Vincennes are flips. The horses emerge from a gathering area parallel to the starting stripe. When every horse is on the track surface, they turn and start the race."

"What if a driver jumps the gun?"

She gave another eye arch, "My dear Trey, we frown on guns in France. If a horse turns too fast or breaks a laser beam before the actual start of the race, a false start is declared."

"Monique, that seems like a mess. Lots of horses, every driver looking for an edge, and then they just step onto the track and go. That sounds like a factory parking lot at five o'clock on a Friday."

"We find these false starts and regathering of trotters exciting. Post position or racing or racing from the front is far less critical in France. In the la volte, with longer races, post positions do not automatically create impossible races for some trotters."

"Well, if you find Cirque du Soleil entertaining, we are on different tracks. I caught a show in Vegas. The tickets cost two hundred dollars to see a guy in blue tights wearing a mask head somersault with a hula hoop. My pals at the *O Yeah Bar* would somersault for a free beer. Besides, that random volte start would put a crimp in reading the charted lines on a race program."

"Our races are listed in Paris-Turf where they show only the lifetime record and earnings, results of the most recent three races, and the classification. The listing shows if the race is attele or monte and the equivalent kilometer rate."

"Do you French folks race claimers?"

"Very few and," She nodded at the screen, "and to us, racing two-and three-year-old trotters is ridiculous; they are still growing."

I asked, "What about wagering, and... be franc."

"My dear Trey, a noble effort at a pun. Alas, it is outdated. You know, of course, that the French franc ceased to be legal tender 20 years ago."

"Of course," I lied.

"Our wagering is similar with different names. The couple is much like your exacta, but you can pick 2 of the top 3 finishers. The trio is like your trifecta box. The tierce is a straight trifecta. Should Trey ever visit France, he will find many ways to lose his Euros on Equidia."

"Equidia? What's that, a slow trotter?"

"Equidia are horse racing channels. It is live racing from

morning to mid-evening — trotting, gallop, and obstacle races. Le Pari Mutuel Urbain coordinates the starting times of the races. Our system is marvelous. I miss the excitement."

I sighed, "Everything in France is complicated, the language, the politics, and the food. You even screw up simple stuff like the circus and horse racing."

She cracked a smile, "We know others consider the French complicated; we consider ourselves to be complicated. We tend to argue about everything. Arguing is close to trotting racing as a national sport.

I asked, "How is the travel situation for returning to France?"

"Terrible, the virus restrictions are still in effect and show no signs of easing up. Which reminds me, I have some sad news to share with you gentlemen," She paused, "I have made arrangements to relocate to New York City where I will stay with an acquaintance who owns an art gallery."

"How sad, we will miss you," I said. Surprisingly, I sort of meant it.

Standing out of her vision, David made the sign of the cross.
