Hot Mess Hanover sets sale record in opening session of Harrisburg mixed sale

The dam of Jiggy Jog S sold for \$1 million out of the Preferred consignment. Meanwhile, All American's dispersal netted nearly \$6.2 million.

A second million-dollar horse hit the Standardbred Horse Sales Company auction in Harrisburg – this time for the opening session of the 2024 mixed sale on Thursday (Nov. 7). Hot Mess Hanover, listed as Hip #1178 and in foal to a full-sister to triple-millionaire Jiggy Jog S, became the most expensive in-foal standardbred broodmare ever sold at auction.

Bidding opened stoutly at \$300,000 and in a blink reached half a million. She soon soared to \$900,000, flirting with and eventually hitting the \$1 million mark. After a bid for \$1,025,000 backed out, the auction lasting barely two minutes stopped at the bang of a hammer and the ticket for \$1,000,000 descended through the center lane of the sales arena to the team of Winning Key Farm – Patty Key, widow to prolific harness racing owner Bob Key, and farm manager Eric Crocker.

“That’s exactly where we thought she’d go,” Crocker said of the price; the mare sold in foal to Walner, who remains 2024’s most in-demand stallion. From the 2024 SHSC yearling sale, Walner offspring grossed over \$4 million grossed from 16 sold – an average of \$258,063 – and \$8.9 million from 51 sold at this year’s Lexington Selected Sale, an average of \$175,216.

“That was what sold us, carrying a full sibling to Jiggy Jog,” Crocker said. “If it’s a filly, we’ve got a broodmare, but whatever it is, it will sell. We can keep breeding her from there and get more. So, we’re excited. I wish we spent less, but it’s what it is.”

The lofty sum just adds to Patty Key’s ongoing pursuit to build a boutique operation with Winning Key Farms, all to honor the legacy of her late husband. She earned headlines – and applause around the sale arena – when topping the opening session of the 2022 mixed sale with a \$750,000 winning bid on a stallion share for Walner as part of \$1.6 million spent by Winning Key at that sale. In 2023, the operation spent nearly \$800,000 building its broodmare band.

“It’s nerve-wracking to spend the money, but Patty is all-in so it’s fun,” Crocker said. “Totally different direction, but buying these maiden mares, it’s going to pay off. We know we’re producing better yearlings than we ever have, so we’re very excited for the future.”

Hot Mess Hanover, consigned by Preferred Equine, is the second most expensive horse sold at a mixed sale in standardbred history. The record was set 22 years ago when 2-year-old trotting filly Cameron Hall became the first harness horse to sell for seven figures. She sold for \$1.1 million to Erkki Laakkonen, who previously owned her in partnership with Walnut Hall.

“If there’s one mare that’s going to have an opportunity to bring a million dollars, it would be her,” said David Reid, president of Preferred Equine. “She’s 10 years old, she’s a queen. Her three foals are all stakes performers, including Jiggy Jog, who has made \$3 million, and she’s carrying a full sibling. I was happy to see it. It shows good confidence in the marketplace. She’s in foal to Walner, and I’m the syndicate manager for Walner. He’s just had a tremendous sale season between Lexington and here. He’s rolling and I’m just happy to see Mrs. Key get it. She’s a great asset to the breeding business and I’m happy to see her continue.”


PHASE ONE FOR ALL AMERICAN COMPLETE

Fred Hertrich III’s All American Harnessbreds began the two-year process to disperse its assets on Thursday. The consignor offered many in-foal broodmares from its band and stallion shares as well as the Hertrich-owned Buy A Round, who finished second to Warrawee Michelle in the 2024 Hambletonian Oaks. From 58 sales, the first phase of the All American dispersal grossed \$6,198,000.

All American sold 19 of the 28 highest-priced horses on Thursday, including four of the top five.


“I think there’s going to be some great buys out of there for some people,” said Rob Tribbett, farm manager for All American Harnessbreds. “I think, like any sale, there’s some that were higher than expected and some that were lower. I think it showed the demand for some of the top trotting stallions – mares that were in foal to them.”

A pair from the All American dispersal drew a half-million dollars each. Cindy Stewart of Hunterton Farms struck first winning the auction on Hip #1056, a Cantab Hall mare named On Your Tab

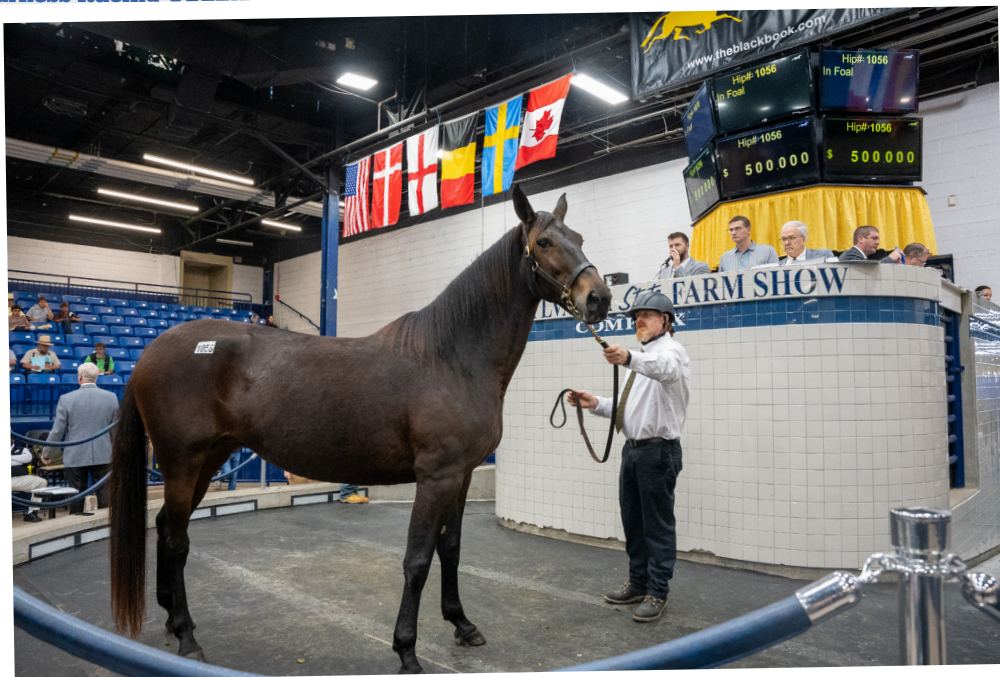

who comes from a family including stakes winners Smoke And Mirrors and In The Mean Time. She also is the dam of stakes winner Buy A Round, a daughter of Walner. She sold in foal to Walner.

Climb The Pole, selling as Hip #1060, also left the ring for \$500,000. The Kadabra mare, selling in foal to Chapter Seven, was one of several purchases made by Armitage Farm, a group who made a splash in the 2023 Mixed Sale when they made nearly \$2 million in purchases. Led by Jim McLane and his wife Rita Armitage, and managed by longtime thoroughbred manager Dale Holly, they aimed to construct a high-class broodmare band with their acquisition of a farm in Kentucky previously owned by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's Shadwell Stud.

"I think we're surpassing expectations," Dale Holly said. "We had zero horses at this time last year because we had just bought the farm Sept. 1st. Today, we've got just under 80 horses. So, we're really moving along very quickly. I love the

mares that we have bought. We got lucky last year in the dispersal that there were quite a few quality individuals. This year, we've also found some very good mares to add to our program."

Armitage scored the winning bid on two other mares in the All American dispersal. They bought Hip #1067 Dramatra, a Trixton filly who is a half-sister to 2013 Hambletonian winner Royalty For Life, for \$200,000. She sold in foal to Walner. Armitage also placed the \$350,000 winning bid for Hip #1055 Buy A Round, and Holly confirmed the filly will retire from racing and head straight into the farm's broodmare band.

"We look forward to breeding her and selling foals out of her for years to come," Holly said. "She's a fantastic race mare, beautiful individual. We were looking to get her and we're very excited about the prospects."

As Armitage continues its expansion and prepares to send its first yearlings to auction in 2025, All American Harnessbreds

will ready the remainder of its yearlings and broodmares for sale next year before closing the operation 40 years after it started.

“I’m sure when we get done, especially after next year, it’ll be a little bit bittersweet,” Tribbett said. “We are still going to be around and we’re still selling yearlings next year and be following the horses that we bred, so bittersweet is probably a good way to put it.”

MIXED SALE, GREAT NUMBERS

“I was pumped up about the mixed sale from the beginning,” said Dale Welk, president and director of operations for the Standardbred Horse Sales Company. “Maybe I thought I was over-pumped, but I couldn’t have expected it to go any better than it did today. Even the feel of the crowd was different, everybody was excited. It was an exciting day and I think tomorrow is going to be exciting, too.”

Day 1 of the 2024 SHSC mixed sale, with 42 fewer sales this year over last, grossed \$15,976,000 – a 6 per cent increase. The opening session, as it did in 2023, propelled the cumulative gross through four days closer to 2022’s gangbuster numbers. From four days, the 2024 Black Book Sale has grossed \$53,067,000 from 1,210 sales, a just 2.6 per cent difference from the 2022 gross through four days of \$54,510,000 from 1,177 sales.

“You couldn’t wipe it off now,” Welk said of his smile, having sold two million-dollar horses in one sale – a feat only achieved by the 2019 Lexington Selected Sale with two seven-figure yearlings selling. “But I still feel for yesterday. I spent most of

the night last night thinking about the yearling sale, you know, what do we do to fix it. As we all say, let’s talk between all of us. If I could fix it, I’d be a genius and I wouldn’t be here. We’ve got some things to finish up, but we’ll get it together, though.”

Today’s (Nov. 8) session, the final day of the 2024 sale, features purely racehorses along with the “Fabulous Fillies” section, which showcases racehorses that are broodmare prospects. It also will see 2024 Canadian Trotting Classic winner and Hambletonian third-place finisher Amazing Catch go through the ring.

“It’s a little reduced from years past, but it very high-quality individuals that are going to bring you solid prices,” David Reid said. “There’s a lot to offer for everybody – trotters and pacers. I’m looking forward to tomorrow. I think Amazing Catch is really going to be an interesting story, because he was one of the better 3-year-olds this year. He’s a son of Walner. He’s still a [stallion]. The trotting ranks next year, you know, you’ve had a lot of horses retire – Jiggy Jog being one of them. Sig Sauer, Karl, It’s Academic is going to Canada. So next year is going to be a shifting of the guard and who’s going to be that top performer? I think he’s probably one of the more interesting racehorse prospects that we’ve offered in a long time. I’m really looking forward to selling him tomorrow. He’s a grand horse and we look forward to representing him tomorrow.”

Today’s session begins at 10 a.m. (E.T).

Maryland looks for Kindergarten graduation before winter recess

It's a common quandary at the end of the year: To race or not to race?

For Courant Inc's Anders Ström, majority co-owner of 2-year-old male trotting sensation Maryland, it wasn't a tough decision to race in the Kindergarten Classic final on Saturday (Nov. 9) at The Meadowlands.

"After the Mohawk Million win, Maryland had a month's break with only one qualifier since he had a bye into the Breeders Crown final," Ström said. "With the BC win under his belt, his form is sustained or even better. This was at least how [trainer] Marcus [Melander] described his workouts during the last week.

"So, we think it's fair to race him on Saturday rather than call it a season. I think he will go off a big favorite and am willing to take the chance. No matter what, he will have his winter holiday after this."

It has been quite an incredible year with Maryland for Ström and partners PCW Racing LLC (Peter Weisberg), Holly Lane Stud East LTD (Melander), and SStewartRThorn Stable (Steve Stewart and Robin Thörn).

The colt, then known as Charlie K Hanover, was bought for \$475,000 at the 2023 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Ström was unable to attend the sale in person, so Melander served as his boots on the ground.

"It was our No. 1 in the book since we liked the dam Crucial a lot and were underbidder on her," Ström said. "Obviously, I am also a big fan of Chapter Seven, so we kept a close eye on this colt. When we can't attend in person, we still do the work on conformation, etc. with the help of others, especially Marcus Melander."

Although it could seem like a bargain since the colt has earned slightly over \$1.145 million – the most in North America for 2024 – with a record of 5-1-1 in eight starts, the final bid was more than Ström said he was looking to spend.

"I don't remember exactly what the original limit was but we exceeded that when the horse was up in the ring," Ström said.

Although Ström does not have partners on some of his horses, he had some in mind for this colt.

"In the midst of bidding, Melander said he could take a piece since he liked the horse so much," Ström said. "We have a long-standing relationship with the Stewarts [Steve and Cindy], so I asked them and our accountant Peter Weisberg was also interested in a piece, so I suggested him, too. There is also a breeder from our home town, Sala, in Sweden, Robin Thörn, participating on a piece, which is nice.

"Generally, I always own my fillies 100 per cent and have partners on one-to-two colts per year. I have developed an interest in the thoroughbreds and there, it is much more common to have partnerships, so I actually don't mind, especially if the object is expensive and you want to share some risk. But it is very important to have partners that are aligned with the strategy we have."

The majority of Ström's horses race in Europe and therefore a name change for Charlie K Hanover was necessary.

“I like to follow my naming system with roughly 250 horses to keep track of, and Steve Stewart came up with the good compromise and name Maryland,” Ström said. “My, or actually my son’s, original proposal Mandalorian had been refused and then it was easy to go with Maryland instead. As always, if the horse becomes good, the name becomes great!”

Ström also suggested Metallica, Megadeath and Metalhead. “It doesn’t matter but sometimes a music related name sounds nice,” Ström said.

According to Steve, a naming discussion took place amongst the owners on WhatsApp in January.

“I wrote, ‘One thought, but it goes against the rock band theme, name him Maryland,’” Steve said. “My thought is

Hanover named him Charlie K Hanover, Charlie K after a great man, Charlie Keller, of Yankeeland Farms fame. I don’t have to list all the great Yankee-named horses the farm is responsible for. Maryland is the state Charlie Keller [had Yankeeland Farms].

“I don’t even know if [Maryland] is available, but my 10 per cent vote is to try and connect the future star to a great name that Hanover Shoe Farms I’m sure saved for what they hope is a great horse. Also, if bad idea, I will be quiet.’ And then Anders wrote, ‘Great idea.’”

Steve, along with his wife Cindy, were friends with Charlie Keller, and looking back at that January text conversation, he recognized that it was pretty presumptuous to use the phrase future star, but apparently it ended up being accurate.

When they checked on the availability of the name, there was a Maryland by Peter The Great born in 1912, but when Weisberg checked, the name was available.

“My feeling was, it was important if you’re going to take away Charlie K Hanover to try to attempt to leave some connection to Charlie Keller,” Steve said. “And naming him Maryland accomplished it, at least in my mind, being that he was from Maryland.

“So, I thought it was very appropriate that it worked out that now he’s a top, top horse and there’s still a

connection to, instead of a rock band name which starts with an M, Charlie Keller in one form.”

Steve jokingly said when Anders approached him about taking a piece of Maryland, he felt it was more like an offer he couldn't refuse, which he is so thankful for.

Owning horses is not something that Steve and Cindy, owners of Kentucky's Hunterton Farm, generally would do. In fact, Steve said he could probably count on one hand the number of top horses he's owned a piece of.

So, when Ström approached the Stewarts, had he asked in a more traditional way, they probably would have said no.

“And I made the joke and I've told [Ström] this, I said 'Cindy, when you write that check for \$47,500 for 10 per cent of a yearling, you can take that check and throw it right out the window because what's the chances? So, you know, it's a dream come true.

“To me, he's more than just a top 2-year-old the way he races and how. Because normally you have a 2-year-old that is winning and everybody's wowing and then everybody will always say, 'Well, let's see what he does when somebody looks him in the eye,' right? And nobody can say that about Maryland.

“He put away Go Dog Go at the top of the stretch [in the Breeders Crown final] because to me it was like we're beat, because a normal horse says, 'Okay, I'm done, you caught me, you kind of put a nose in front of me at the top of the stretch.'

“But that's just the way he races, he just digs in and says, 'No, you're not going to beat me.' And I don't know if you've seen him up close, but gosh, what a beautiful horse he is. You know, he's pretty much got it all.”

Maryland drew post 2 in race 8, the Kindergarten Classic for 2-year-old colt and gelding trotters, on Saturday night and is listed as the 3-5 morning-line favorite.

Purses exceeding \$1.5 million on tap for Illinois' Night of Champions

The event for Illinois-bred standardbreds will go Saturday at Hawthorne Race Course.

Hawthorne Race Course will shell out \$1,577,437 on Saturday (Nov. 9) when it presents the main event in Illinois harness racing, the Night of Champions for Illinois-bred pacers and trotters.

The pacers will compete in the four most lucrative races: the \$226,545 Incredible Finale for 2-year-old colts and geldings, the \$224,623 Incredible Tillie for 2-year-old fillies, the \$189,701 Plum Peachy for 3-year-old fillies and the \$155,244 Robert F. Carey, Jr. Memorial for 3-year-old males.

The four races for trotters that have the biggest pots are: the \$144,637 Fox Valley Flan for 2-year-old fillies, the \$132,858 Kadabra for 2-year-old males, the \$130,744 Erwin Dygert Memorial for 3-year-old colts and geldings and the \$109,658 Beulah Dygert Memorial for 3-year-old fillies.

Completing the 12-race program will be the \$80,000 Carl Becker for older mare trotters, which will have only four contestants, and three \$60,000 races: the Plesac for older male trotters, the Phil Langley Memorial for older male pacers and the \$60,000 Tony Maurello for older mare pacers.

The Incredible Finale will showcase Cash Money Twenty, a gelding with a 10-race resume consisting of nine triumphs and a second and a career best time of 1:50 at Springfield that is significantly better than that of any of his nine adversaries. Trained by Mike Brink and driven by perennial Hawthorne champion Casey Leonard, Cash Money Twenty won his elimination race by 5½ lengths.

In the Beulah Dygert Memorial, Leonard will be at the reins of another marquee horse, Whiskey Lou, a daughter of state champion trotting sire Lou's Legacy who

was bred and is owned by Randy Wilt and trained by Curt Grummel. In 2023 Whiskey Lou was chosen the 2023 state champion 2-year-old filly trotter.

"Her lines [13 12-0-0, 1:53.1 at DuQuoin] pretty much speak for her," Leonard said. "She drew well [post 3 in the field of 10] and she has been racing well [winning her last four starts with authority after finishing fourth at Springfield on Sept. 11]."

Leonard has another horse with nice numbers [11 7-1-1] and a favorable history named Lous Private Eye, going for him in the Erwin Dygert Memorial. Last year the colt won the Kadabra for trainer Steve Searle on the Night of Champions and went on to be selected the Illinois-bred champion 2-year-old male trotter.

However, Lous Private Eye is winless in three starts since going to the winner's circle at DuQuoin in a State Fair championship race on Aug. 27. The son of Lou's Legacy was scratched because of sickness on Oct. 19 and when he returned to action in his last start on Nov. 1 he tired after leading at the half-mile call and came in a distant eighth as the 6-5 favorite.

"He has been a tough luck horse," Leonard said. "Steve does a good job of getting him ready for big races. If he's right [physically] he's good enough [to win on Saturday]. If he's right he's one of the best."

Another son of Lou's Legacy, Sunburnt Silverado, will be trying to make amends in the Kadabra after finishing fourth as the 4-5 favorite last time out in an elimination. It was the first time in his 10-race career that the five-time winner was worse than third for Grummel and Leonard.

Leonard blamed himself.

"I probably should have had him in a better spot," he said, looking back on a race in which Sunburnt Silverado never was a factor. "The others in there with him [in the Kadabra] are starting to come around but with the right trip I think he's one of the best."

Louise's Legacy, another gelding by Lou's Legacy, has been racing well in the last two months and won the elimination by a head in a lifetime best time of 1:57.4 for trainer and co-owner Erv Miller and his driver son Marcus Miller.

Leonard, Searle and Lou's Legacy also are an integral part of the plot in the Fox Valley Flan, thanks to Lou's My Number. Never worse than third in nine starts for Searle, her trainer, co-owner and breeder, Lou's My Number won for the first time on Aug. 27 in a DuQuoin State Fair championship race, then was second three-straight times before winning in compelling style in her last start, last weekend.

Hawthorne's defending champion trainer, Amy Husted, and her driver husband, Kyle Husted, have a high-class act named Thebeautifulthings going for them in the Incredible Tillie. She is going into the second richest race of the night with seven-straight victories following a loss in her debut.

Thebeautifulthings was scratched for two races in a row because of illness last month before returning to prevail by 4½ lengths in a powerful performance last weekend.

"Sickness went through our barn and it hit us pretty hard," Amy said. "We scratched about eight horses and one weekend we raced only two horses.

"We weren't able to train her much; we didn't want to train her when she was sick. We were planning on racing her easily [last weekend]. The way she won gave me chills because she did it so easily."

The Incredible Tillie doesn't figure to be an easy race. Foremost among Thebeautifulthings' challengers are Robintino, who has won four in a row for trainer Nick Prather and will have Wyatt Avenatti, at the reins and Wildcat Abby, who has three wins and a game second in her last four outings for Leonard and trainer Roshun Trigg.

"She's been ultra-consistent," said Leonard, looking back on a 16-race composite consisting of nine wins, five places and two shows, capped by an impressive triumph last weekend.

Leonard will have another filly who figures to be a factor when he takes the reins of Dandy's Ms Swifty for his father, trainer and co-owner Terry Leonard, in the Plum Peachy.

Casey said, "It's probably the most wide-open event of the races for pacers. Hypeyourbestieup [seven-for-12] has shown she's probably the best one in there and Fox Valley Sadie [also seven-for-12] is going to be tough. On occasion, 'Swifty' has jumped up and beaten the good ones."

Fox Valley Sadie is trained by Amy Husted and driven by her husband, Kyle. After winning two in a row at Springfield she became sick and had to be scratched from an Oct. 19 elimination race. She returned on Nov. 1 and recorded her seventh victory in 12 starts this year, winning by an impressive 4¾ lengths.

"She was another who got sick but bounced back nicely," Amy said. "She had a horse outside of her almost the whole way and then drew away in the stretch. Coming off being sick it was very impressive. She loves to win."

The Robert F. Carey, Jr. Memorial flaunts another superstar in Saturday night's galaxy, Gorgeous Big Guy, who was victorious in last year's Incredible Finale and equaled the track record time of 1:52.1 for age, sex and gait, en route to being crowned

Illinois-bred champion 2-year-old male. Picking up where he left off after recording seven wins and four places in 11 races in 2023, Gorgeous Big Guy has done even better this year for trainer Erv Miller and driver Marcus Miller as reflected by an 11-race resume adorned by 10 firsts and 1 second.

Goomster, last year's Illinois-bred Horse of the Year and champion 3-year-old male trotter, will seek to win a Night of Champions race for the third-consecutive year when the gelding moves up to the older male group in the Plesac.

He has been having a hard time living up to his sky-high 2023 standards that saw him take 16 trips to the winner's circle and finish second four times in 21 races for trainer Desirae Seekman and her driver husband Travis Seekman. After being scratched for illness on June 20, Goomster didn't return to competition until October. Since then he has recorded two of his three victories in 12 starts but finished eighth and a distant fifth in his other two races.

The Phil Langley Memorial boasts three of the biggest names in Illinois racing: Fox Valley Gemini, He'zzz A Wise Sky and Fox Valley Landen.

The 9-year-old Fox Valley Gemini has established himself as one of Hawthorne's all-time great horses after winning Night of Champions races for six-straight years for owner Jim Ballinger, trainer Terry Leonard and driver Casey Leonard before finishing third in this race last year.

According to Casey, Fox Valley Gemini's age is starting to "catch up with him."

Casey said, "He has had an okay year [16 4-3-5]. He raced really well at DuQuoin one week and we thought we had him back. In the DuQuoin State Fair finals he disappointed us and then he raced just okay at Springfield but his last two starts [a second and a third at Hawthorne] have suggested he might be coming around."

"But we don't have real high expectations because He'zzz A Wise Sky and Fox Valley Landen are extremely impressive. He'zzz A Wise Sky is a well-traveled professional. It's really a shame that Fox Valley Landen ran into the starting gate last time out [finishing sixth as the even-money favorite]."

Pacesetting He'zzz A Wise Sky was first in that race, hanging on to win by a head at the expense of Fox Valley Langley, another opponent in Saturday's encounter. It was the seventh victory on a 28-race past performance sheet this year that includes several races at out-of-state tracks.

Last year when He'zzz A Wise Guy was selected the state champion older male pacer he won this race – then known as the Robert Molaro Memorial – for trainer John Filomeno and driver Kyle Wilfong.

Fox Valley Landen is moving up to an older age group following an outstanding 2023 campaign that saw him win the Carey Memorial for the Hustedts and become the state champion 3-year-old male pacer. That 6½-length victory was the most decisive of the night.

After going 11-for-14 last year Fox Valley Landen is seven-for-14 this year.

"He was one of the first of our horses to get sick," Amy said. "We tried him at Hoosier [where he was scratched because of illness on Oct. 12 and finished fourth the following week]. Then, we brought him back to Hawthorne where he won [on Oct. 25] and ran into the starting gate and made the break last week. He still managed to come back on stride and after the wire he passed all of the other horses."

"In the State Fair final at DuQuoin he won in 1:47, setting the track record and equaling My Boy David's record for the fastest ever time for an Illinois-bred that was set at Springfield. The wife-husband trainer-driver team has another sky-high profile horse, the 7-year-old mare Fox Valley Exploit, in the Tony Maurello. She was a four-time Night of Champions winner before having to settle for third last year.

"Every single year she has raced hard and now she's close to \$500,000 in career earnings [with a 110-race bankroll of \$496,638]," Amy said. "We're hoping she will pass that milestone on Saturday."

Last year's Plum Peachy winner and Illinois-bred champion 3-year-old filly pacer, Fox Valley Leah, is seemingly the most formidable of her nine foes. In 2023 she was 10-for-11 for driver/trainer and co-owner Todd Warren but this year she has made

frequent out-of-state forays for open races and her resume reads four-for-14.

The Carl Becker Memorial is the most unique of the 12 races because of the ultra-short field.

Loulita, a 6-year-old mare bred and owned by Flacco Family Farms, trained by Searle and driven by Leonard, and Marvelous Mystery, a 4-year-old who will have Miller doing the driving for Grummel, look like the best of the four contestants. Both are daughters of Lou's Legacy; Loulita has won six of her 14 races this year, while Marvelous Mystery has won two of her six.

Swayzee looks to turn tables on rival Leap To Fame in New Zealand Cup

It must be one of the most audacious feature race plans of all time.

First came the shocking late change of mind from trainer Jason Grimson to pay a \$28,000 late entry fee so Swayzee could defend his crown in Tuesday's \$1 million New Zealand Cup at the Addington track in Christchurch.

Grimson had previously repeatedly ruled out taking Swayzee back to NZ from his Menangle base near Sydney.

But uncertainty over plans with Down Under's champion pacer Leap To Fame – Swayzee's half-brother and arch-rival – renewed Grimson's interest in the race.

Now comes the remarkable part.

Swayzee will race at Young in country New South Wales tonight. It's a seven-hour round trip from Grimson's Menangle stables.

The 6-year-old will get back home in the early hours of Saturday morning and then board a flight from Sydney to Auckland on Sunday.

But that's the first leg.

Once Swayzee arrives in Auckland, NZ's North Island, he has to go through quarantine and spend a few hours on the tarmac before another flight from Auckland to Christchurch.

All going well, Swayzee will arrive in Christchurch the day before the New Zealand Cup.

And he will contest the New Zealand Cup less than four days after he has raced in a different country in the Cherry City Cup at Young.

So, given the late focus on NZ, why will he still race at Young you might ask? It's a fair question given the Young race is worth just \$60,000.

But there is a bigger payday at play.

Swayzee won the first of five legs of the New South Wales Carnival of Cups at Parkes in September.

Young is the second leg and there is a \$1 million bonus should he win all five legs.

Effectively, skipping Young would "kill" the bonus. Albeit there is still a \$500,000 bonus for winning four of the five legs.

Grimson and owner Mick Boots want to keep the \$1 million bonus alive and, looking at Swayzee's rivals at Young, he should beat them without raising a sweat.

This New Zealand Cup is more than just a two-horse race, as young Kiwi stars Merlin and Dont Stop Dreaming are serious horses, but Leap To Fame and Swayzee are the headline acts, the proven elite race performers.

And they are the story of the race.

Their rivalry started 16 months ago and runs deep – very deep.

While the horses are somewhat different, their trainers are complete opposites.

Grimson is a confident, brash and polarizing young fella, while Leap To Fame's trainer/driver Grant Dixon is an old-school "let the horses do the talking" kind of guy.

Grimson fired the first shot in the days before their first clash in last July's Group 1 Blacks A Fake at Albion Park.

"I'm not afraid of Leap To Fame," he said after the barrier draw. "I guess we'll find out who the better brother is."

Swayzee went on to lead throughout in a stunning time to beat Leap To Fame, but the latter copped a flat tire in the last lap and the tube wrapped round the rim, seizing the wheel for the last 250 meters. To finish second was monstrous.

Leap To Fame then gained revenge on an even bigger stage when he won last December’s Inter Dominion final at Albion Park. Swayzee was a brave third after sitting parked.

They’ve met twice since and Leap To Fame has taken a 3-to-1 advantage, most recently in their Blacks A Fake reunion at Albion Park on July 27.

Leap To Fame was \$1.20 (for a \$1 bet) to make it 4-to-1 in last month’s Group 1 Victoria Cup at Melton, but a race eve virus forced him out of the race.

It’s been a roller coaster ride for connections since.

“We thought that setback probably ended his New Zealand Cup trip, too,” owner Kevin Seymour said. “But he recovered so quickly we raced him at Menangle last Saturday night. He won so well and came through it so well; he seemed right back on track [for NZ].”

Just hours before Leap To Fame was scheduled to board a flight from Sydney to Auckland last Sunday, a precautionary blood test sparked alarm bells.

“His blood was out, not a lot, but enough for us to pull him off the plane and reassess everything,” Seymour said. “Grant [Dixon] couldn’t fault the horse at all, but we’d never take even the slightest risk with him.

“We knew there was another flight [Sydney to Auckland on Nov. 10], so we took another blood from him on Monday.”

That blood test came back all clear, Leap To Fame worked “superbly” that morning and Seymour locked the trip in.

So, all going well with Swayzee at Young and Leap To Fame in his final workout, they will share the flight to Auckland on Sunday.

Despite everything Leap To Fame has achieved, Dixon said the New Zealand Cup was the most daunting yet.

“I believe it’ll be his toughest test yet,” he said. “Beating the Kiwis when they come to Australia is hard enough and this is on their own soil.

“We don’t have a lot of long-distance races in Australia and the Kiwis have traditionally had the wood on us, but it’s levelled out a bit now.

“It’ll still be a super hard race to win. It’s a two-mile race with lots of moves. Only great horses win it. But I’m sure we’ve got the right horse to do the job if he runs up to his best.”

Papis Pistol fires for DePinto

For much of this season, trainer Sam DePinto told people that his 2-year-old male pacer Papis Pistol was going to put it all together one day and go a big mile.

This past Saturday, Papis Pistol won a division of the Kindergarten Classic Series at The Meadowlands in gate-to-wire fashion in 1:49.3.

“That was the one,” DePinto said with a laugh. “I told my partners, I know this horse will pace [1]:48, [1]:49 this year. I know he will. But until he does it, and he finally did it and I don’t look like a fool.

“I didn’t expect him to do it on the front end, I thought he would do it off a helmet. That really surprised me. That was even more special. It was 51 degrees and there was a wind blowing. It wasn’t like a perfect night. But every quarter was 27 [seconds] and a tick and he did it very comfortably. He’s a good colt. He’s definitely one of the top ones.”

Only five freshman male pacers have gone faster than 1:49.3 this year. On Saturday, Papis Pistol will look to put it all together again when he faces nine rivals in the \$148,500

Kindergarten Classic Series final for 2-year-old male pacers at The Meadowlands. The colt will leave from post 6 with driver Andy Miller and is the 6-5 morning-line favorite.

Papis Pistol led the series in points, with two wins and a second among four starts in the five preliminary rounds. Manolete, who was second in points with a win and two seconds among four outings in the series, is the 5-2 second choice in the final. He will leave from post 8 with Scott Zeron driving for trainer Bruce Saunders.

“I think we have a real good chance,” DePinto said. “If [Papis Pistol] races like last week, he’s going to be tough to beat. Manolete is a good colt. You can’t count him out. It should be a good race.”

Papis Pistol is a son of Papi Rob Hanover—Bang Bang, and his family includes the likes of millionaires Kikikatie, Kissin In The Sand, Heston Blue Chip, and Sunfire Blue Chip. The colt was bred by Anthony Perretti Farm, Joseph Davino, and Brad Shackman. He is owned by Shannon DePinto, Chris Arvanitis, and Anthony Perretti.

From early on, DePinto believed Papis Pistol was a talented colt.

“I’ve been doing this my whole life,” DePinto said. “I’m 69 and I started when I was 13. I was fortunate enough to have some good horses along the way, and he compared to those horses when I was training him. You can just tell when you train a good horse versus an average horse. You can feel it. I knew when I was training him that he was a special horse.”

Papis Pistol won his career debut, which came in the Kindergarten, before second-place finishes in the second leg of the Kindergarten and a division of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes. From there, his campaign went through some ups and downs, including making a break in the final of the Metro Pace after finishing third in his elimination. He also made a brief break in the final of the Breeders Crown, where he finished sixth despite a :26.1 last quarter.

“He had some kinks in the road, but hopefully they’re all behind us now,” DePinto said. “I think it’s been more mental with him. He still acts like a baby. He likes to go out and go up on his hind legs. I feel like the Lone Ranger sometimes sitting behind him. He’s just very playful. Once he gets that he’s a racehorse, he’s going to improve on what he’s doing right now. [Last week] he came back, and he couldn’t blow out a match. He had his ears up and his nostrils weren’t even moving. It was like he was saying, are we going to go another heat here, what’s going on?”

“That’s what I like about this colt, he doesn’t get tired. He’s got a great set of lungs. He’s got a big motor on him, and he’s a beautiful colt. One night we’re going to knock a big one off. We’ll get our turn. If not this year, next year.”

For this season, Papis Pistol has hit the board in seven of 12 races, winning three and earning \$85,283.

“The other miles he was putting in, they weren’t shabby; he was pacing in [1]:50, [1]:51,” DePinto said. “He just wasn’t where Andy could really drive on. Andy did a great job with him. There were a lot of times where Andy would just steady him a little bit, he couldn’t really give him his head and let him go full boat.

“Now, he’s perfect. Last week he was great gaited, smooth. Andy could do anything he wanted. I was really pleased with that.”

The Big M will host **all four Kindergarten finals** for 2-year-old pacers and trotters Saturday. First-race post time is 6:20 p.m. (EST). For free programs, visit the track’s [website](#).

Cumberland Run meet comes to a close

Cumberland Run concluded its second harness meet Tuesday (Nov. 5) with a sensational card that included eight \$100,000 finals of the Kentucky Sires Stakes.

Todd McCarthy, in his first year racing at Cumberland Run, won four of the 12 races to capture the driving title with 18 wins out of 56 starts. That was two victories more than his brother, Andrew McCarthy, and Hall of Famer David Miller. The Australian-born Todd – who also won the meet earnings title with \$624,430 in purses – is among harness racing’s brightest stars, including winning the 2022 Hambletonian with Cool Papa Bell at record odds of 52-1.

Tony Dinges went 11-for-27 to take the trainer’s title, two wins more than Ron Burke, whose \$347,050 earned by his horses led in purses. Burke is harness racing’s runaway all-time leader, including 15,213 victories and more than \$343.6 million in purses.

“We’re thrilled to have so quickly become a must-stop for harness racing’s leading trainers and drivers and being part of a Kentucky circuit that is making huge strides, thanks to legislation passed by the General Assembly three years ago,” said Ted Nicholson, vice president of racing for Cumberland Run and its sister thoroughbred track Kentucky Downs.

The \$100,000 finals were for 2-year-olds and 3-year-olds, with each age having male and female divisions for trotters and pacers. In addition, there were four Kentucky Sires Stakes for the various divisions of 4-year-olds, which had three \$50,000 legs instead of a final.

The 4-year-old trotting mare **Railee Something** went four-for-four at the meet for owner/breeder Ronald Mersky of Paris, KY, trainer Roger Cullipher and driver Andrew McCarthy. Railee Something won a \$25,000 open trot in the meet’s opening days before sweeping the Sires Stakes legs.

Seven horses went three-for-three at Cumberland Run by taking their Sires Stakes final and two \$40,000 preliminary legs. They included the 2-year-old trotting filly **Yo Tillie**, who is driven, trained and owned by Verlin Yoder of Columbia, KY. The others were: **Hard Seven**, **Caviart Delight**, **Once In A Lifetime**, **Admiral Hill**, **Fearless Bettor** and **Bourbon County**.

Favorites ruled the day, with only the 3-year-old filly trotter **Tove Palema** paying double digits to win at \$22.18, with

Andrew McCarthy driving for trainer Julie Miller.

Finals for the Sires Stakes increased to \$100,000 apiece from \$70,000 last year.

Cumberland Run’s 2025 racing dates are Sundays, Mondays and Tuesdays Oct. 12-Nov. 4. The track has the option to race Saturdays Oct. 11, 18, 25 and Nov. 1. Check themintcumberlandrun.com next year for any additional dates.

Dave Palone gets career win 21,000 at The Meadows

Already harness racing's all-time "winningest" driver, Dave Palone passed yet another milestone Thursday (Nov. 7) at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows when he notched career win 21,000. The historic win came with **Green Magic** in the fifth race.

Although Palone sets a new record with each victory, he indicated milestone wins remain special to him.

"I never had any number etched in stone, but I'm pretty proud of that number," he said. "It's nice to reach it. I feel like I maybe haven't been pushing myself as hard. I've had a lot of half days, a lot more golf this year."

Palone, who got his first win in 1982, has now been among harness racing's elite drivers for more than three decades. He's achieved at least 400 wins in each year since 1990 (except for the pandemic season of 2020), and his UDR throughout that lengthy period never was lower than .337. For his career, he's logged more than 81,000 starts, and he's earned nearly \$162 million in purses. He was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2010.

Among his career highlights, he won the 2005 Little Brown Jug with Kelly O'Donnell's P-Forty Seven, and he's also captured

three Breeders Crowns (In Focus, Sweet Lou, Uncle Peter) and a pair of Jugettes (Numeric Hanover, Maudlin Hanover). Yet he says his most memorable win may be his lone victory in the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids at his home track. He took the 1999 edition with Washington VC for trainer Ron Coyne, Jr.

"It was before family and friends, and I'd barely heard of the horse," Palone said. "There weren't many expectations there."

These days, at 62, Palone drives mostly locally – and why not? He's closing in on his 35th consecutive driving title at The Meadows.

"I started off racing in a completely different era," he said, "but the drivers here today are a great group of guys. I really enjoy the camaraderie."

Palone said he'll continue to try to grind out wins as long as the effort remains challenging to him.

"I enjoy trying to figure out a new horse and a new race," he said. "I guess when that fire's gone, it will be time to find something else to do. Whatever that something is, it will be with horses."

And his advice to young drivers who hope someday to dethrone him?

"Show up for qualifiers," he said. "Stick around for late races, and make yourself available for them. And when you're not driving a race, pay attention to it."

Aaron Hall wins five, business records smashed on Bangor Raceway's closing day

Driver Aaron Hall provided the fireworks on Wednesday (Nov. 6) as Bangor Raceway brought down the curtain on its record breaking 2024 meeting, scoring five wins on an ultra-competitive 13-race program, under the bright lights of historic Bass Park.

Hall's five-pack performance included three rousing gate-to-wire victory marches while driving horses from his father Craig's roster. The father/son pacesetters included, **Ibteaskdoug** (1:58.3, \$9.40), who sped through a :58 back-half while securing his fourth career win; **Matt So Sure** (2:00.2, \$4), who was one of only two winning favorites to come in on the closing day program; and **Mr Blissfull** (1:58, \$31.60), who won his second in a row while taking his 47th career bow.

Hall also utilized the pike route while claiming the fastest win of the evening as he zoomed around the oval behind **Forrest Blu** (1:57, \$5.20) for trainer Hunter Lofthus, securing the ninth seasonal win for the 5-year-old son of Roll With Joe.

Hall's lone off-the-pace score came with **KP's Magic Mary** (1:59, \$18), who rode an extended second-over journey, traveling from next-to-last to first while hitting the wire a measured head the best for trainer Kandace Niles.

In other news, Bangor Raceway continued its recent trend of posting record business numbers, closing out the 2024 season by realizing the largest daily handle and average daily purse numbers in the racetrack's history.

Overall, during the course of its just concluded 38-day meet, Bangor Raceway's average daily handle experienced a hefty 17 per cent growth, increasing from \$73,432 in 2023 to \$88,985 in 2024.

The upward trend in handle continued to show strong growth into the 14-day fall portion of the meet when the average daily handle expanded to \$93,687 in 2024 as compared to \$68,957 in 2023, a 26 per cent year-to-year increase.

Bangor Raceway generated daily handle in excess of \$100,000 on a record 12 of its 38 race days in 2024, compared to only two such occurrences in 2023, while distributing daily average purses of \$45,734, up from \$44,733 in 2023, yet another record for the state of Maine racing venue.

"The 2024 Bangor Raceway live meet was a huge success with both live and simulcast handle on the rise," said Bangor's racing operations manager, Thomas Smith, "The increase was due to many contributing factors, including ample horse supply which allowed for full fields, strategic post times, a great family atmosphere here at the track and the hard work of all our employees. Thanks to everyone who made the 2024

meet a success and we are excited to build off that momentum as we plan for 2025."

Finally, in Bangor racing news, Drew Campbell walked away with the 2024 drivers' championship, posting 67 local wins over the course of the 38-day meeting. Heath Campbell secured the runner-up placing with 51 top tallies, while Hall, on the crest of a late season surge, powered his way into the third-place spot with 48 scores.

The battle for the top trainers' title ended in a dramatic tie as Jeff Deslandes sent two winners to the post on closing day to catch Valerie Grondin on the leaderboard with each accomplished trainer notching 32 wins over the course of the meet. Mark Harris capped off a career year, finishing third in the standings with 27 wins.

The Maine Harness Racing Commission is expected to award 2025 race dates on Nov. 19, at which time Bangor will be able to announce next year's racing schedule.

Big nights at Big M continue as winter draws near

While it's true the Breeders Crown is now in the rearview mirror, the 2024 stakes action is anything but concluded at The Meadowlands, as just two weeks after hosting the 12 Crown events, The Big M is back this Saturday (Nov. 9) with four Kindergarten Classic finals for 2-year-olds of each sex and gait for purses totaling \$730,200.

Beyond that, the mile oval will then have one more monster night at the races before settling in for five months of winter action, when Fall Final Four/FanDuel Championships Night takes place on Saturday (Nov. 30).

"We are in the midst of a great run here at The Meadowlands," said track chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. "We came back from our five-week layoff with two weeks of Breeders Crown action, then, last week and this, the Kindergarten, and then, we'll dole out over \$2.5 million in purses on Fall Final Four/FanDuel Championships Night three weeks from Saturday. It is a great time for all harness fans to be watching and wagering on our races, as many of them will determine divisional honors."

SUPERSTAR ON STAGE: While there are many talented colts and fillies racing Saturday, one mega-star will be making his final start of the season in the Kindergarten colts and geldings trot.

Maryland is the third-ranked horse in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown Standardbred Top 10 Poll, behind only Horse of the Year favorite Twin B Joe Fresh and the generational talent Jiggy Jog S, who retired earlier this year due to injury after winning all six of her seasonal outings.

A son of Chapter Seven—Crucial, Maryland is the top money-earning horse in the sport this year with a bankroll of \$1.145 million. He's won five of eight starts this season, with four of those wins coming in the division's biggest dashes: the Breeders Crown, Mohawk Million, Peter Haughton and William Wellwood.

Owned by Courant Inc, PCW Racing LLC, Holly Lane Stud East LTD and S. Stewart/R. Thorn Stable, Maryland, the early favorite for the 2025 Hambletonian, is trained by Marcus Melander and has been driven in all of his starts this year by Dexter Dunn.

PICK-6 CARRYOVER: There were no winning tickets sold on the 20-cent Pick-6 last Saturday, creating a carryover of \$7,689 for tonight's (Nov. 8) program. These are the type of scenarios multi-leg players love. In the event \$40,000 of "new money" is bet into the pool, only that portion of the total pot would be subject to the already low 15 per cent takeout.

Thus, if \$40,000 is the number, the total pool would be just over \$41,000, precisely \$1,000 more than what was wagered, creating a "negative takeout," where winning tickets will pay out more money than what was wagered.
